



### AFTER 80-DAY ABSENCE, NEW YORK RACING SHINES AGAIN



Rushing Fall wins the Beaugay at Belmont | Coglianese

The race was just a \$20,000 maiden claimer, but the importance of the moment was not lost on Belmont track announcer John Imbriale, who welcomed racing back to New York Wednesday.

"We can finally say...they're off and running at New York's Belmont Park," Imbriale called out as the field burst from the gate. And as Star of the West (Flashback) crossed the wire to win the opener, Imbriale once again recognized that this race was something special. "It's now official. New York sports is back and beautiful Belmont Park is back," he said.

Imbriale could hardly be blamed for hamming it up a bit. It had been a long time.

For the first time since a Mar. 15 card at Aqueduct, racing, which had been shut down due to the coronavirus, was held at an NYRA track.

"It means the world to me [to be back racing in New York]. I grew up watching NYRA racing," said Reylu Gutierrez, rider of Star of the West and New York native. "I stayed here throughout the pandemic. I stayed working. I was galloping, jogging and breezing horses. Whatever it takes to earn my place here at NYRA. Winning the first race back means the world. I'm just battling to earn my place here. I shed a little tear after the wire because it really does mean a lot to me." *Cont. p3* 

# SPENDTHRIFT ACQUIRES MAJORITY INTEREST IN AUTHENTIC

B. Wayne Hughes's Spendthrift Farm has acquired a majority ownership interest in 3-year-old colt **Authentic** (Into Mischief-Flawless, by Mr. Greeley), the undefeated GI Kentucky Derby contender who is set to go postward as the likely favorite in Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby.

Spendthrift joins forces with Starlight Racing and Madaket Stables, which have both retained an ownership interest in the undefeated colt. SF Racing, Fred Hertrich, John Fielding and Golconda Stables--all part of the original ownership group--have sold their respective interests in Authentic.

"We are very excited to join an accomplished team on such a talented and promising colt as Authentic," said Ned Toffey, general manager at Spendthrift. "We believe Into Mischief is still in the early stages of his successes, and we are hopeful Authentic can be a significant part." *Cont. p4*

### New York Racing Shines Upon Return cont. from p1



**Horses turn for home in the opener** | *Coglianese* 

Even New York's tabloids, which usually ignore racing, got in on the act. The back page of the *New York Post* featured Belmont and the headline, "And They're Off."

Prior to the first race, the jockeys gathered in the paddock and a moment of silence was held in honor of those who lost their lives due to the pandemic. They then kneeled as a group in solidarity with peaceful protestors.

What followed was a card that went off without a hitch and was well received by bettors.

"It's exciting," said NYRA CEO Dave O'Rourke. "It's been 80 days since we last actually raced. To get back is a little bit of normalcy during what has been a really weird time."

Even the weather cooperated. The forecast called for showers throughout the afternoon, but it rained only briefly and all the races stayed on the grass.

The total handle was \$10,972,254, the most ever for an opening day to the spring meet. Belmont did not race on this Wednesday in 2019. A day later, Thursday, June 6, the handle was \$9,739,279. On opening day in 2019, the handle was \$5,409,231.

"The handle numbers in the industry are strong," O'Rourke said. "The channels are different and the margins are different, but our expectations are that handle should be strong on the gross numbers. We want to demonstrate that we can do this.

On the racetrack, a sentimental favorite was beaten as Fauci (Malibu Moon) finished a distant second as the even-money favorite in the third race. In the first 2-year-old maiden race of the year in New York and the first without Lasix in decades, the Todd Pletcher-trained, Mike Repole-owned Prisoner (Violence) was the winner.

There will be a stakes race on every day of the abbreviated 25-day meet, which kicked off with the GIII Beaugay S., won by Rushing Fall (More Than Ready). The riding star was Irad Ortiz Jr., who had five wins.

"We have fresh turf and fresh horses," O'Rourke said. "So far as the racing goes, it should be a great meet."

Between Fox Sports and MSG+, there will be 127 hours of live television coverage for the meet. But the broadcasts came at the cost of losing TVG, which will not be showing the New York races during this meet. But O'Rourke said that he expected the increased coverage on Fox and MSG+ will help drive handle.

"Our TV presence will be greater than we've ever had and that will help handle," he said. "A lot of how we do at this meet will depend on our TV platform."

Looking forward, O'Rourke said he was hopeful that owners would be allowed to attend the races in Saratoga.

"We're still working with the state," he said. "Everything will be about numbers and our demonstrating that we can run safely. Our hope would be at Saratoga we can get owners and connections in. We're not ready to ask for that and they're not ready to grant it. We'll have to see how the COVID-19 numbers for the state look in early July before we get any kind of answer on that."

Starting next week, Belmont will run on a Thursday-through-Sunday schedule before racing shifts to Saratoga July 16.

"This colt possesses all the signature attributes we have come to know from Into Mischief, and we feel strongly that those attributes are going to carry on through his sons in the breeding shed," Toffey added.



Authentic won on debut as a juvenile going 5 1/2 furlongs at Del Mar and jumped onto the Derby trail with runaway victories in the GIII Sham and GII San Felipe S. at Santa Anita in his two starts thus far as a 3-year-old. Trained by Bob Baffert, Authentic breezed a bullet six furlongs in 1:12.40 last Sunday in his final workout before the Santa Anita Derby. *Cont. p5*

The colt is currently ninth on the Kentucky Derby leaderboard with 60 points. Saturday's Santa Anita Derby is worth 100 points to the winner.

"Authentic was a beautiful yearling, an unfurnished May foal at the time but with a wonderful presence and way about him," said Tom Ryan of SF Racing. "Watching Bob and his team develop this colt, with his 2-year-old win at Del Mar and two more domineering wins as a 3-year-old, has been a great experience. Authentic is the very best of Into Mischief, with brilliance in abundance and an effortless running style that should carry him the distance."

Donato Lanni, who signed for Authentic as a yearling for \$350,000, described his impression of the colt at the 2018 Keeneland September Sale: "He was a very athletic mover, a fast-looking colt with the size and scope to carry his speed."

Instead, Rushing Fall easily put away her main rival and kicked clear to triumph for the ninth time in 12 career starts, while Got Stormy faded to finish a disappointing fourth.

Victress of the 2017 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf, the 'TDN Rising Star' went three-for-four in a sophomore campaign that culminated in a conquest of the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. and kept it rolling in her first two outings at four, capturing the GI Coolmore Jenny Wiley S. and GI Longines Just A Game S. Second behind stablemate Sistercharlie (Ire) (Myboycharlie {Ire}) in the GI Diana S., she closed her season with a fourth in the GI First Lady S. Oct. 5 at Keeneland, the first time she'd been out of the exacta.

Returning as an odds-on chalk, the bay broke sharply from her rail draw and was allowed to dictate terms under Javier Castellano while Got Stormy kept close watch from second beneath Tyler Gaffalione. Always traveling comfortably while loose down the backstretch, Rushing Fall felt her challenger draw closer midway around the far turn and spun for home just narrowly in front. Not long after straightening, however, she started to clearly do the better work of the two and drew clear into the final furlong. Call Me Love, a MGSW in Italy making her North American debut, produced a strong late bid to get into second, but never threatened the winner, who registered her eighth graded stakes success. Got Stormy never found another gear in the lane and was overtaken for third late by Passing Out.

"I have to give a lot of credit to the crew at Stonestreet Farm. Ian Brennan and his team rehab a lot of our horses and they did an excellent job with her over the winter," said winning trainer Chad Brown. "I also give credit to [owner] Bob Edwards. He had her entered in the sale last year and he scratched her. She would've brought a lot of money. I'm so happy for him and his family. She came back better than ever." *Cont. p7* 



"I'm so happy she's back. Today, she was much the best and she proved that she belongs with the best Grade I fillies in the country," said Castellano. "She was so relaxed, when I asked a little bit at the three-sixteenths pole, she took off again. She put me right where I wanted to be. I wrapped her up in the last part. I'm looking forward to her next race."

Castellano, who tested positive for coronavirus in March, added, "I'm so happy to be here. I've been through a rough time these past couple months with quarantine for the COVID-19. It was pretty rough. Thank God we're home."

### **Pedigree Notes:**

One of 202 stakes winners, 91 graded stakes winners and 24 Grade I winners for More Than Ready, Rushing Fall is the third black-type performer out of Autumnal, a \$260,000 purchase at Keeneland November in 2007. The 18-year-old mare produced a full-brother to Rushing Fall Mar. 24.

### STARS KEEPING GLITTER IN MIDNIGHT SKY

A "headline" horse will cover a multitude of sins for a stallion; very often, too many. If a single flag-bearer gets too far ahead, however, people tend to start asking what might have happened to the rest of the army.

In the case of Midnight Lute, there's no doubt that **Midnight Bisou** has helped to keep him in the game. On the other hand, her \$7.25 million in earnings might seem to rebuke her sire for his failure, thus far, to come up with a second millionaire. His two previous Grade I winners, after all, both graduated from a first crop foaled a decade ago. Yet the belated arrival of his fourth elite scorer, **Keeper Ofthe Stars**, is a welcome cue to recall how sturdily Midnight Lute has meanwhile held his ground

in that commercial no-man's-land between fashionable but unproven younger stallions and the established big hitters.

Midnight Lute's record actually gives him parity, in various indices, with several of the latter category. Across the board, for instance, his stats make him pretty much the same stallion--at \$15,000--as the venerable Tiznow or the flourishing Twirling Candy. Those two both stand at \$40,000, as does Flatter without quite matching Midnight Lute in graded-stakes ratios. In terms of graded-stakes and Grade I performers, indeed, Midnight Lute is barely a tick behind the \$75,000 cracker Street Sense. (All these comparisons, clearly, should elevate his own standing rather than diminish the demonstrable excellence of his rivals.)

Midnight Lute is now 17 and it feels a long time since he launched his career at Hill 'n' Dale with a group of sophomores so exciting--besides two Grade I winners, he had a Classic-placed colt, a Queen's Plate winner, and a memorable day at Sunland Park when a son and daughter both broke track records in winning the local Derby and Oaks by an aggregate 13 lengths-that his book of 186 mares the following year was exceeded by just three other American stallions. Because while the resulting crop included Midnight Bisou herself, her sire was not permitted to tread water in the meantime and dwindled to 106, 76 and 56 mares in the next three years.

The emergence of Midnight Bisou gave him renewed currency, with books of 93 and 118, and the GI Gamely S. success of Keeper Ofthe Stars at Santa Anita a couple of weekends ago set a seal on her maturing talent at four. Moreover, Midnight Lute will be strongly represented in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup this Saturday by **Midcourt**, who comes from the same crop as Midnight Bisou, but took rather more time. Already an emphatic winner of the GII San Pasquale S. this year, Midcourt was beaten barely half a length in his Grade I debut over track and trip last time. *Cont. p8* 

With her decisive Gamely success, Keeper Ofthe Stars is now looking a formidable force in the distaff grass division. Until the shutdown in California, she had shown soundness and sustained improvement through 11 starts in 11 months since breaking her maiden on her sophomore bow last April. Her half-dozen wins in that time included a graded stakes breakthrough in the GIII Autumn Miss S., and ultimately a shock defeat of Brazilian flyer Jolie Olimpica (Brz) (Drosselmeyer) in the GII Buena Vista S.

As a turf miler, moreover, Keeper Ofthe Stars adds another dimension to her sire's diverse repertoire. For while himself a dual winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, Midnight Lute's pedigree has a Classic/two-turn flavor that has filtered into his stock from the outset.

Though **Shakin It Up** (GI Malibu S.) and **Midnight Lucky** (GI Humana Distaff/GI Acorn) whizzed round a single turn for their Grade I wins, another of his first-crop stars, **Mylute**, came from far back for fifth in the GI Kentucky Derby and third in the GI Preakness. Midnight Bisou herself, of course, has repeatedly pounced from off the pace through a second turn.

Nonetheless, Midnight Lute has never had much margin for error. His sheer scale, at fully 17 hands, is notorious. Likewise, the throat surgeries that not only interrupted his racing career, but also shaped it--Bob Baffert having adapted him as a sprinter primarily as a pragmatic way of managing his wind. And his sire, while one of the most brilliant Classic runners of his era, was never treated as a likely Classic influence at stud.

Yet Midnight Lute is a far more elegant and flexible consort for mares than his height implies, blessed as he is with all due balance and proportion. Certainly he is far more than a siphon of the type of crude speed we typically associate with a specialist sprinter.

And while this is one of those sire-lines that has now dangled on a horsehair through three generations, it is definitely one worth salvaging. The challenge for Midnight Lute, in the remainder of his career, is to find an heir equal to the task he performed for his own sire, and Real Quiet previously performed for Quiet American. (Of his best males to date Midcourt is a gelding, while Shakin It Up is confined to Oklahoma traffic.)

Quiet American represents a tenuous tributary of the Fappiano line, in contrast with the mighty river flowing through Unbridled, and the lively torrent of Candy Ride (Arg). Yet it contains a rare genetic gold, in the bold symmetries contrived in Quiet American by John Nerud and Tartan Farms. Famously, both Quiet American and his sire Fappiano were out of a Dr. Fager mare, and both these mares were granddaughters of the linchpin Cequillo. So Quiet American replicates two of the great 20th Century matriarchs, Cequillo and Aspidistra, into both sides of his pedigree. (Besides Dr. Fager, Aspidistra also gave us another iconic dasher in Ta Wee plus the unraced Magic, whose granddaughter's date with Fappiano produced Unbridled.)

The value of this package has become especially evident in Quiet American's record as a broodmare sire. One of his daughters produced Bernardini (A.P. Indy), who is doing very well as a distaff influence himself; while another produced both Saint Liam (Saint Ballado) and the dam of another Horse of the Year in Gun Runner (Candy Ride {Arg}). But the only son eligible to develop a sire-line was his outstanding runner Real Quiet, the nearest miss in all Triple Crown history.

Real Quiet likewise introduced illustrious maternal blood. His dam was out of a full sister to Majestic Prince, and traced to the same Boudoir II as did Flower Bowl (along, therefore, with her sons Graustark and His Majesty). But while his accomplished daughters included multiple Grade I winner Pussycat Doll, Real Quiet's only son eligible to extend the line was Midnight Lute.

The fact was that breeders had always sooner recalled the notorious anatomical challenges of Real Quiet's youth than the amazing things he proved able to do on the racetrack. He was never going to get them commercial balls of muscle and was always going to remain that \$17,000 yearling. Real Quiet soon ended up touting his wares in Uruguay and Pennsylvania, and died in a paddock accident at 15.

But while Midnight Lute's dam Candytuft was unraced, she was evidently correct. She was also by a copper-bottomed broodmare sire in Dehere, and, no mean achievement, she managed to give Sir Cherokee a son placed in four Grade II races. And while her own graded stakes-winning mother was by the forgotten Blue Times (one of many dead ends for the Man o' War line), the next two dams are by two resonant European exports.

The first, by Sea-Bird II (Fr), was Berkut. A sister to Gyr, who chased home Nijinsky in his Derby, Berkut produced three stakes winners from six foals--notably Alydar's Best who was a Group 1-winning juvenile and Classic-placed in Europe.

Gyr was a notoriously substantial beast, and the next dam Feria II (Ity) was by Tesio's imposing champion Toulouse Lautrec (Ity). Here, no doubt, lurk the physical foundations of the Midnight Lute skyscraper; not to mention another layer of class. Feria II was an Italian Oaks winner out of an Italian Oaks winner, and bred on somewhat similar lines to Ribot (GB).

Sea-Bird II and Ribot together mean only one thing in Kentucky: Darby Dan. And the late Olin B. Gentry, whose grandfather and namesake managed Darby Dan, is listed alongside Omar Trevino and Anthony Cappola as breeders of Keeper Ofthe Stars.

Gentry signed a \$55,000 docket for her unraced dam, Sociable (Run Away And Hide), out of his shared consignment

(VanMeter-Gentry Sales) when she was offered, as a 5-year-old in foal to Midnight Lute, at Keeneland in November 2015. VanMeter-Gentry then processed the weanling Keeper Ofthe Stars through the same ring the following November, to Zayat Stables for \$60,000. She proved a good pinhook, sold through Lane's End for \$180,000 back at Keeneland in September to Tommy Town Thoroughbreds (whose silks she carries as Keeper Ofthe Stars).

Sociable herself realized just \$32,000 from Atlantic Bloodstock when VanMeter-Gentry again put her into the ring, with a Classic Empire cover, at the January Sale last year. But the initial emergence of Keeper Ofthe Stars, in the meantime, meant she could be cashed in for \$155,000 to Hunter Valley Farm when recycled (in foal to Mor Spirit) through Taylor Made Sales back at the same auction this time round.

The continued progress of her daughter since means that there are now Grade I winners under three consecutive dams. For Sociable is a half-sister to none other than The Factor (War Front), whose stud career at Lane's End goes from strength to strength. And their dam Greyciousness (Miswaki) is a half-sister to GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Chief Seattle (Seattle Slew), the pair out of a hard-knocking Icecapade mare.

There's plenty of Mr. Prospector floating around here. Sociable loads him 4 x 2--her sire Run Away And Hide being by his grandson City Zip and her dam being by his son Miswaki--while the top line, of course, goes through his son Fappiano. Moreover Real Quiet's granddam, the sister to Majestic Prince already noted, was by Mr. P.'s sire Raise A Native.

So while it remains to be seen whether her "hot" connections can maintain their current pace through 2020--her trainer Jonathan Wong is somehow pushing a 30% clip for the year; while Abel Cedillo is the jockey story of the Californian spring--there's no question that the genetic foundations of Keeper Ofthe Stars go top to bottom. *Cont. p10* 

Midnight Lute had a pretty slow time at the yearling sales last fall, but these were the graduates of much the weakest book of his life. The Midnight Bisou effect will kick in now, and it's worth remembering that he had achieved an average and median of \$76,000 and \$60,000 at the previous round of yearling sales. Those are both extremely creditable yields for a stallion at this level of the market, and a measure of the physical standard he reliably meets in his stock.

At his fee, Midnight Lute surely represents some of the best value around--especially for those whose strategy for the tough markets ahead is to build up families with what should be the most commercial asset of all: winners. The underlying quality of his pedigree should also make Midnight Lute attractive to breeders who would not mind retaining a filly.

The bottom line is that this was a pretty extraordinary racehorse, able to adapt his Classic bloodlines to sprinting by dint of sheer, freakish ability. The author of a 124 Beyer, unprecedented for a sprinter, Midnight Lute was able to express his speed and quality through the kind of theatrical acceleration you love to see round two turns. In the slop at Monmouth, he burst past the Breeders' Cup field to win by daylight—or what passed for daylight, that stygian afternoon. The margin, 4 3/4 lengths, was a race record; as was the time of 1:07.08 he set, in a vastly different racing environment, when retaining the trophy

on Californian synthetics the following year. He also set a stakes record in the GI Forego, which disturbed some pretty historic dust.

His best runners have had corresponding flair. Remember Midnight Lucky thrashing champion Close Hatches (First Defeat) by six lengths in the Acorn? Sadly she was confined to five starts, but Midnight Lute won his Breeders' Cup prizes at four and five and we now see horses like Keeper Ofthe Stars, Midcourt and, of course, Midnight Bisou thriving with maturity.

It's easy to say of a horse that he could have done anything, with a following wind: short, long; dirt, turf. But it's not hard to believe of Midnight Lute. It's the grail of equine athleticism, to match dirt and turf assets—speed as well as stamina; power as well as fleet-footed acceleration—and his own pedigree entitles him to just that balance.

Yes, he is now approaching the evening of his career. But Keeper Ofthe Stars suggests that new constellations will continue to spread her sire's trademark sparkle across the midnight sky.

# REVIEW OF CURRENT INVESTMENT INCENTIVES AS SALES SEASON RESUMES

### 1. Three-year Racehorse Depreciation

 Three-year depreciation has been reinstated for all racehorses retroactive to 2018 and through 2020.
 This schedule allows taxpayers to now depreciate, on a three-year schedule, racehorses 24 months of age and younger when purchased and placed into service, as opposed to the previous seven-year schedule for racehorses of that age.

### 2.100% Bonus Depreciation

- 100% bonus depreciation for qualifying horse, farm equipment and farm depreciable asset (land improvements, fencing, barns) purchases through 2022
- Bonus depreciation is phased down by 20% per calendar year in taxable years beginning after 2022

### 3. Section 179 Expense Deduction

- Expense allowance for horse, farm equipment and depreciable asset (land improvements, fencing, barns) purchases is <u>permanent</u> at \$1.04 million for 2020 (having started at \$1 million and indexed for inflation beginning after December 31, 2018)
- Reduced by one dollar for each dollar of eligible property purchased that exceeds \$2.59 million in 2020 (having started at \$2.5 million and indexed for inflation beginning after December 31, 2018)

# LIAM'S MAP, THE BIG BEAST FILLIES SHARE BULLET AT OBS WEDNESDAY

A colt by Lemon Drop Kid and a filly by Majesticperfection turned in the fastest furlong works and fillies by The Big Beast and Liam's Map shared the fastest quarter-mile time during Wednesday's fourth under-tack preview for next week's Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Spring Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training.

Randy Miles sent a son of Lemon Drop Kid (hip 701) out to work a furlong in :9 4/5 Wednesday in Ocala. The gray colt is a half-brother to stakes placed La Dame Blanche (Point

of Entry). His unraced dam Adjudication (Giant's Causeway) is a daughter of multiple graded stakes winner Criminologist (Maria's Mon) and a half-sister to multiple graded winner Inspector Lynley (Lemon Drop Kid).

"We were expecting something good, but you never expect a :9 4/5," Miles said. "I was in the back chute when he did his breeze and I could see all the way across the track that he was

just running. He took off and he was happy to do it. You wouldn't expect a Lemon Drop Kid out of a Giant's Causeway mare to be your bullet of the day, but he's a very attractive, racy-looking colt."

The juvenile was purchased as part of Miles's Royal Flush pinhooking partnership for \$85,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale.

"When I saw him at Keeneland when we bought him as a yearling, he was my favorite of all of our purchases," Miles said. "So I was very excited to get

him. And he never let us down, not one day. He's always been a very attractive horse. He's always trained very well and he didn't let us down." *Cont. p12*

Hip 701 was the second to hit the :9 4/5 mark for Miles. The consignor sent out a filly by Munnings (hip 318) to work in :9 4/5 Monday.

"We love her, but she's supposed to do that," Miles said of the filly. "She is built like that. She is built like a sprinter and she's always been fast. We were expecting that. We even took her in the third set that day, so you can see how much confidence we had in her. She has the temperament of a pony. She's the quietest one in the barn, but boy when you ask her to go, she just goes. She's the barn favorite."

While the Munnings filly worked in the final set Monday, Miles said he thinks the OBS track tends to be slower later in the day.

"If you take a fast horse, they go plenty fast and stay true to their form," he said. "But the horses that need a little help, it hurts them. I have noticed just watching horses gallop out, they look like they are more tired than usual. I don't think it's the heat. I think the track later in the day pulls them down. It gets a little sticky later in the day."

Miles said he has been inundated by people looking at horses following the breeze show each day.

"We were not prepared for the activity. When they showed me the amount of cards we had yesterday, I was really shocked," he said. "It's great. It's not a complaint. It's nice to see. You sleep good at night with all of the activity around the barns. I hope these guys aren't just going through the motions. I hope they really have orders to fill."

A daughter of Majesticperfection (hip 634) shared Wednesday's :9 4/5 bullet time. Consigned by Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables, the bay filly is out of Very Few Details (Great Notion), a full-sister to stakes-placed Details R Sketchy. The juvenile was purchased by Dunne's Waves Bloodstock pinhooking partnership for \$70,000 at last year's inaugural Fasig-Tipton California Yearlings Sale.

A filly by Into Mischief owns the fastest furlong work of the preview so far, covering the distance in :9 3/5 Tuesday. Through four sessions of the under-tack preview, seven horses have worked the furlong in :9 4/5.

A filly from the second crop of The Big Beast (hip 558) shared Wednesday's quarter-mile bullet time of :20 4/5. Bred and consigned by Ocala Stud, the bay filly is out of stakes-placed Take Me to Zuber (Toccet).

"We expected her to breeze very well, but you never know until you get down to it," said Ocala Stud's David O'Farrell. "We are very ecstatic with the breeze, she looked good doing it and she came back good."

Among the fillies in The Big Beast's first crop to race are Grade I-placed Inspiressa, stakes winner Hear My Prayer and the talented Up in Smoke.

"I think she is similar," O'Farrell said when asked to compare hip 558 with other well-regarded fillies by the Ocala Stud stallion. "She is very athletic. She is a medium-sized filly, but just has a lot of quality about her. I think she is typier than some of the other ones we've had, but she is just a solid filly."

O'Farrell sees plenty of upside to The Big Beast, who won the 2014 GI King's Bishop S.

"I think he's done really well," O'Farrell said. "He wasn't a 2-year-old himself per se, so I think they are going to be better as 3-year-olds and going on. I think it's a bonus that they performed well at the 2-year-old sales, but I think they are able to carry their speed a little bit from what we've seen with his first crop. I think the best is yet to come with him."

Ocala Stud is offering the first 2-year-olds by its resident Jess's Dream next week at OBS. The regally-bred freshman stallion is by Curlin out of champion Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro).

"We have one that works on the last day (hip 1150) that we love," O'Farrell said of his offerings by the stallion. "And we have another filly that we really love that is unfortunately going to miss the sale due to a minor setback. But the ones that we have tend to have a little more quickness than I anticipated. I think he's a horse that they are not going to be really designed for quarter-mile or eighth-of-a-mile breezes. They are going to want to go a route of ground, I believe. But the ones that we have are showing some early speed and I think that's kind of exciting because I wasn't really expecting it. I am very hopeful, given Jess's Dream's pedigree, that they can certainly show some of the quality that's in the pedigree line."

After all the disruptions to the sales season, O'Farrell is excited to see things returning to normal around the industry.

"I am optimistic about the sale," he said. "I think the breeze show has gone on very well. I think it's been very well attended. People seem upbeat and back in the routine. I think people are starting to relax a little bit. We will see if the money shows up and how well the market can sustain this. But I want to be optimistic. I am happy with how the week has gone so far."

Also working in :20 4/5 Wednesday was hip 1275, a filly by Liam's Map consigned by Hartley/DeRenzo Thoroughbreds. She is a half-sister to stakes winner Our Caravan (Daaher). Her unraced dam Alwaan (Elusive Quality) is a daughter of multiple Grade I winner Jersey Girl (Belong to Me) and a half-sister to Grade I winner Jersey Town (Speightstown). She was purchased by Hoby Kight for \$130,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale and had been catalogued in the canceled Fasig-Tipton Gulfstream Sale.

A filly by Not This Time owns the fastest quarter-mile time of the breeze show so far, covering the distance in :20 1/5 Monday. Four juveniles have worked in :20 3/5 and 15 have gone in :20 4/5.

The under-tack show continues through Saturday with sessions beginning daily at 7:30 a.m. The Spring Sale will be held next Tuesday through Friday with bidding commencing each day at 10 a.m.

# SECOND CHANCES: ROYAL ASCOT TARGET FOR SPEIGHTSTER MAIDEN

In this continuing series, TDN's Senior Editor Steve Sherack catches up with the connections of promising maidens to keep on your radar.

**Sheriff Bianco** (c, 2, by Speightster--Summer Rules, by Perfect Soul {Ire}), a strong second after a tardy beginning and wide trip on debut for trainer Wesley Ward at Churchill Downs May 22 (video), will look to earn his diploma at the prestigious Royal Ascot meeting.

Drawn on the extreme outside in post 11 going 4 1/2 furlongs over the main track beneath the Twin Spires, the Qatar Racing colorbearer was off a beat slow and rocketed his way forward with an eye-catching, three- and four-wide blitz to stick his head in front as they hit the quarter pole. Head and head with the well-meant firster Cowan (Kantharos) and looking a serious

threat, Sheriff Bianco couldn't quite keep pace down the lane after his early efforts and had to settle for second, 2 3/4 lengths adrift of the 3-5 favorite.

"He ran a great race," said Hunter Valley Farm's Fergus Galvin, who serves as a U.S. advisor to Qatar Racing's Sheikh Fahad. "Surprisingly for one of Wesley's, he broke last out of a field of 12 and rushed up and probably used up a lot of energy getting to the front. It looked like maybe turning in he was going to go on. But I think that middle quarter of the race probably hurt him a bit, I'd say."

Sheriff Bianco made the trip across the pond Tuesday evening and will target either the G2 Norfolk S. June 19 or the Listed Windsor Castle S. June 17 for his grass debut.

"Sheikh Fahad met Wesley at the airport while he was leaving [last year] and told him to find him a yearling that could possibly go to Ascot," Galvin said. "Wesley shortlisted four of five--he goes for a certain type--and he was the one we landed on. He was a lovely horse."

Bred in New York by SF Bloodstock, LLC, Sheriff Bianco went through the ring twice, bringing \$135,000 from Rascal Bloodstock as a KEENOV weanling and \$120,000 from Fergus Galvin, agent, as a KEESEP yearling. Hailing from the first crop of freshman sire Speightster, Sheriff Bianco is a half-brother to two-time stakes winner and Grade III-placed Never Gone South (Munnings). He was produced by a half-sister to MGISW Peace Rules (Jules).

Previous standouts featured in 'Second Chances' include: MGISW and 'TDN Rising Star' Paradise Woods (Union Rags), GSW Backyard Heaven (Tizway), MSW and 'TDN Rising Star' Gidu (Ire) (Frankel {GB}), the highly regarded GII San Felipe S. runner-up Honor A. P. (Honor Code) and GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. runner-up Candy Tycoon (Twirling Candy).

# KTDF IN 'FRAGILE' STATE; ELLIS 'MOVING HEAVEN AND EARTH' TO HAVE RACE MEET

As the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund (KTDF) closes in on the three-month mark without being able to generate money via historical horse race (HHR) gaming and on-track wagering, Bill Landes III, the chairman of the fund's advisory committee, warned in a public teleconference meeting Wednesday that the money that gets allocated to pay a portion of purses on the state's racing circuit is running dangerously low.

Although no specific dollar amounts were mentioned about how dry the funding is because of the recent COVID-19 business closures, a real-life example of just how dire the situation is emerged when executives from Ellis Park were asked several times by KTDF advisory committee members to address allegations that the track might be planning on scrapping its summer race meet over a lack of money.

"Maybe it's time for a state of the union address," said Landes, who represents the Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association (KTOB) on the advisory board. "And the state of the union for the KTDF is fragile. It's fragile, and it's obvious why it's fragile, because our funding sources have been suspended."

At a later point in the meeting, Landes underscored that "The bottom line and the fact of the matter is, if we don't get [revenue sources] opened up, this is the last KTDF meeting we need to have."

Yet there was enough KTDF money remaining for the advisory committee to unanimously recommend approval to the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) to allocate purse money to Keeneland Race Course, Ellis, and Kentucky Downs for their upcoming race meets.

And board members also agreed to draft a letter to the KHRC asking, as Landes put it, "to advocate for our case with Kentucky government" to get racetracks and HHR establishments reopened to the public as soon as possible.

The KTDF is funded by three-quarters of 1% of all money wagered on both live Thoroughbred races and HHR gaming, plus 2% of all money wagered on Thoroughbred races via inter-track wagering and whole-card simulcasting.

Rick Hiles, the president of the Kentucky Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, is also a KTDF advisory committee member. At the June 3 meeting, he wanted Ellis officials to go on the record as to whether or not they are committed to running a summer race meet under a schedule that has already been curtailed because some July and September dates have been ceded to Churchill Downs and Keeneland.

"On two occasions, if not three, [Ellis executives Jeff Inman and Ken Mimmack] have just flat told me that they have no intentions of running if they don't have a revenue stream from instant racing machines and live fans," Hiles said. "And I'm just wondering if that's still the case."

Inman, the Ellis general manager, was granted the floor to explain his track's position.

"You know, it's going to be tough. We're working to get you a race meet. But again, if we don't have any [revenues] at all, it's going to be tough. With that being said, we're very, very hopeful that come mid-June or so [the business climate is] going to break loose," Inman said. "We are moving heaven and earth to have a race meet."

Doug Hendrickson, who represents the KHRC on the KTDF advisory committee, stressed the need for all of the tracks to keep working together so the year-round state circuit doesn't fall apart.

"Please hang in there Ellis. You're very important to Kentucky racing. We're behind you and want to support you," Hendrickson said.

In other business, Tom Minneci, the senior director of finance at Churchill Downs, Inc., reported on purses for the meet's second condition book, which goes into effect with the June 6 races.

"We looked at our condition book for the second half of the spring meet, and overall purses are going to be commensurate with the first condition book," Minneci said. "We did, however, reduce the amount of KTDF [funding] and we increased the association purses ... Unfortunately, as of this point in time, Derby City Gaming has not been reopened, and that was really our only source of KTDF funds that we were counting on for this spring meet."

Bob Elliston, Keeneland's vice president of racing and sales, got his track's \$426,000 KTDF request approved by the committee while noting that 25% of purses at Keeneland's upcoming July 8-12 meet would be funded by KTDF money. He said that's up from the usual 20% funding level.

Keeneland's maiden special weight races will be carded for \$70,000. "That is down from where we were planning to be at the April race meeting, but we were planning on generating a heck of a lot of revenue stream from our on-track handle and on-track business as well," Elliston said. He added that the July condition book could be online within the next day or so.

In consideration for Ellis agreeing to give Keeneland those July race dates, the committee also approved Keeneland's request to transfer \$125,000 of its KTDF money into the Ellis horsemen's purse account.

Ellis's request for \$1.15 million in KTDF funding includes the Keeneland transfer but does not yet factor in a potential settlement with Churchill in exchange for September dates. Dan Bork, the racing secretary at Ellis, said that figure is being negotiated.

Bork said maiden special weight purses at Ellis project to be in the \$20,000 to \$25,000 range, "so it's not looking that great right now. Hopefully we'll get something up and going soon to generate some more revenue."

Kentucky Downs had a KTDF request approved by the committee for up to \$4.7 million for its September turf meet.

Ted Nicholson, Kentucky Downs's senior vice president and general manager, said maiden special weight races would go for \$90,000. "That's a 30% decrease from last year, and our allowance races will probably take a 30% haircut as well," he added.

For part of the committee meeting, advisory board members batted around various ideas about how to phrase the advocacy request letter to the KHRC that Landes proposed. The opening-up strategy touched on three issues: Allowing owners to watch their horses race, opening tracks to some spectators, and opening the HHR facilities.

Hiles said he met with Jonathan Rabinowitz, the newly appointed KHRC chairman, and "he iterated to me last week that he wanted to start having owners with horses in races back at the races on Friday and Saturday at the latest. But that did not happen."

Hiles explained that he's okay with that decision for the time being because, "It's really not much fun to be on the [Churchill] front side right now. There's nobody there and it's vacant. Everything's closed up. There's no concessions. It's hard to find a bathroom. If the owners were allowed to come watch their horses, I'm sure they wouldn't hang around, because they would watch their horse and leave. With that being said, they don't

have any betting windows open. So if they can't make any bets, there's still not going to be any KTDF money generated."

J. David Richardson, who represents the KTOB on the KTDF advisory committee, said it is his belief that spectators could safely return to the races under proper protocols, but he pointed out that getting HHR venues open first should be the higher priority.

Richardson made reference to the anti-police brutality protests in Louisville and other cities nationwide over the past week, seemingly trying to make the point that social distancing precautions are already being ignored by people gathering in public places.

"As we've seen, there's an awful lot of failure of social distancing in a lot of places in Kentucky in the last few nights," Richardson said. "And compared to that, lord god, this [creating protocols to host bettors] ought to be the safest thing in the world."

Richardson continued: "But then you get into issues like cleaning the machines or having mutuel clerks and face-to-face contact in the lines and that kind of thing. To me, what we really need to get online is HHR, frankly. That's where we're going to get more bang for the buck."

Richardson noted that he owns horses currently stabled in Louisiana, where gaming facilities are getting set to reopen, and another committee member pointed out that gaming in Arkansas is also being rolled out ahead of Kentucky.

"If we want to call ourselves the horse capital of the world, we can't be last to do everything," Richardson said.

### PLEASANTLY PERFECT DIES IN TURKEY

Pleasantly Perfect (Pleasant Colony--Regal State, by Miswaki), who completed a historic Breeders' Cup four-timer for trainer Richard Mandella in the 2003 GI Classic and went on to sire a trio of top-level winners, passed away Wednesday in Turkey. He was 22 years old and died of natural causes.

Bred in Kentucky by Clovelly Farms, Pleasantly Perfect was purchased by Gerald Ford's Diamond A Racing Corp. for \$725,000 at the 1999 Keeneland September sale. Turned over to Mandella, the strapping bay won back-to-back runnings of the GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. in 2002 and 2003 before upsetting Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado {Ire}) at 14-1 in that year's Classic (video) at Santa Anita, adding to Mandella's victories by Action This Day (Kris S.) in the Juvenile, Halfbridled (Unbridled) in the Juvenile Fillies and Johar (Gone West) in the Turf (deadheat). There were just eight Breeders' Cup races run at that time. *Cont. p16*

Pleasantly Perfect slugged it out again with Medaglia d'Oro in the 2004 G1 Dubai World Cup, prevailing by a hard-fought three-parts of a length (video) before adding the GI Pacific Classic. He was retired to Lane's End after finishing third to Ghostzapper in defense of his Classic title with nine wins from 18 starts and earnings of nearly \$7.8 million.

Pleasantly Perfect sired 10 U.S. crops, good for 18 black-type winners, including GISW Whitmore and GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf upsetter Shared Account, dam of reigning GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' Turf winner Sharing (Speightstown). Rapid Redux, a member of his first crop of foals in 2006, was the recipient of the Eclipse Special Award in 2011 after compiling a 22-race winning streak. Pleasantly Perfect was exported to Turkey in late 2014, where he has sired 25 winners, including two black-type winners, from two crops to race. He was pensioned from stud duties in the summer of 2019 and his final crop of foals was born this year.

It's a very strange time for people who breed and sell commercially because there are so many unknowns. The cancelled Saratoga sale is the most disheartening thing of all because it's always like a big party. Everyone you talk to throughout the year by phone, you finally get to see in person. And now that's not even possible. I don't know when I'm ever going to start shaking hands again, if ever.

On the other hand, it was a blessing that the biosecurity measures required for coronavirus weren't a big deal for us. At the farm, we already have everything– hazmat suits, gowns, masks, slippers, and gloves, because we're so used to biosecurity with our foals. It was really life as usual.

I've always heard that the government has warehouses full of clothing, blankets, tents, and anything you could imagine in case of war. So I think we have to think of coronavirus as a war. We need to be ready and do everything we can to be prepared. When you're prepared, you don't feel as vulnerable. You don't feel as overwhelmed by the things you can't control.

It's funny because sometimes people ask me what my game plan will be this year. And I tell them that it's just the same old thing. Pray you have healthy, perfectly-constructed foals, and then bring them up properly. Sell them for a decent price, don't go for the moon, and then make sure they go to good people that give them a chance to do their best. When they do their best, that reflects on your mare and her family. As far as making a fortune, that's not the point. Your heart has to be in it and you have to have the desire and the willingness to work really hard. But it's well worth it.





### BERLIN TANGO TAKES THE CLASSIC TRIAL

There were some burst bubbles and dented reputations at the end of Wednesday's G3 Classic Trial moved from Sandown to Kempton, but a clear-cut winner nonetheless as George Strawbridge's Berlin Tango (GB) (Dansili {GB}) dominated upped in trip. With a run under his belt in 2020, albeit pre-lockdown when second in the "Road To the Kentucky Derby" Conditions S. over a mile here on Mar. 4, the homebred son of Fantasia (GB) (Sadler's Wells) travelled enthusiastically in a share of fourth under David Probert racing over 10 furlongs for the first time. Quickening up smartly on the home turn, the 7-1 shot who was twice placed at listed level at two jumped on the 15-8 favourite Hypothetical (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) to lead two out and gave extra as Pyledriver (GB) (Harbour Watch {Ire}) threatened. At the line, he had 1 1/4 lengths to spare over that rival, with 2 3/4 lengths back to Bright Melody (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) in third.

Probert was impressed. "He is definitely one for the future and saw out the mile and a quarter well," he said. We got a nice sit and it was a good gallop which then steadied up down the back."

Probert continued, "He over-raced between the four and the five, but it didn't seem to stop him and he hit the line nice in the end. He's a pretty straightforward ride at home and did it just right today--he got into a good rhythm and he's a professional. I think he will get a mile and a half and he's taking his racing well."

Fifth behind Pyledriver on his debut in a Salisbury novice over seven furlongs in July, Berlin Tango made no mistake at the second attempt when making all at Ffos Las later that month before moving into black-type company. Third behind the leading Derby prospect Mohican Heights (Ire) (Australia {GB}) in the Listed Stonehenge S. tackling a mile back at Salisbury in August, the bay was on the premises when filling that same position behind the smart duo Molatham (GB) (Night of Thunder {Ire}) and Wichita (Ire) (No Nay Never) in Doncaster's Listed Flying Scotsman S. reverting to seven at the St Leger meeting. Only the unbeaten Chares (Ger) (Ivawood {Ire}) was able to subdue him on his seasonal bow here Mar. 4, but it was clear from an early stage that he relished this opportunity to reengage in competitive action.

Trainer Andrew Balding is not convinced that the winner is tailor-made for the G1 Epsom Derby set to be staged this year July 4. "David [Probert] seemed to think he will stay further, but there are so many options as it's an unusual year and we'll have to discuss it with Mr Strawbridge and give him all the options and ultimately let him make the decision," he commented.



"He would need to be supplemented which might be a brave shout, but we'll certainly look for something at Royal Ascot if it doesn't come too soon and he should have a good summer. Depending how the other trials work out, I wouldn't rule out the Derby, but it's a big plunge to be supplementing."

### **Pedigree Notes**

Berlin Tango is the best progeny out of the high-class Fantasia, whose seven-length success in the 2009 G3 Nell Gwyn S. marked her out as a surefire Classic winner. Subsequently only third as the 8-11 favourite for the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches, the G3 Prestige S. winner and G1 Fillies' Mile runner-up went on to join Jonathan Sheppard and garner the GIII Modesty H. and finish runner-up in the GI Just a Game S. A granddaughter of the European champion 2-year-old filly Blue Duster (Danzig), she is a half-sister to the G3 Give Thanks S. scorer Pink Symphony (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) and the dam of the smart multiple group winner Western Hymn (GB) (High Chaparral {Ire}). Fantasia's 2-year-old is the filly Fantalope (GB) (Lope de Vega {Ire}).

He faces a quartet from Ballydoyle headed by Ryan Moore's mount **Arizona (Ire)** (No Nay Never), with Frankie Dettori on the G3 Tattersalls S. winner Wichita (Ire) (No Nay Never). Arizona will break from stall 13 alongside Julian Richmond-Watson's 'TDN Rising Star' Kinross (GB) (Kingman {GB}) in 12, with Qatar Racing's Kameko (Kitten's Joy) another notable to be drawn in the high numbers widest of all in 15. Godolphin's two other representatives, the G3 Autumn S. first and second Military March (GB) (New Approach (Ire)) and Al Suhail (GB) (Dubawi (Ire)), are drawn three and five, respectively. Saeed bin Suroor has booked Hector Crouch for the former, while Al Suhail adds to Appleby's already-strong hand with James Doyle on board.

Kinross created a sensation when recording an eight-length debut success over seven furlongs on Newmarket's Rowley Mile track in October, but was hampered early on when fifth in the rearranged G1 Vertem Futurity Trophy on Newcastle's Tapeta the following month. Jockey Harry Bentley has the task of steering the homebred as he bids for an initial Classic success.

"I can't wait to get back on him. I've sat on him a few times at home and he feels really good," he said. "I've not had many feel like he did on their debut. He gave me all the feelings that day of a very good horse. We've put him in the deep end once before, as we don't doubt that the ability is there. We think there is a lot of potential there."

Bentley is not downhearted about outcome of the Futurity Trophy. "At Newcastle he got a big bump off one of the Aidan O'Brien horses and I don't think people realised how much of a bump it was. That didn't help us trying to get in the right rhythm," he added. "He didn't get a clear run at a crucial stage and I'm not saying he would have won, but he would have been closer. You have to remember that was only his second run and the likes of Kameko were more battle-hardened than he was."

Pinatubo will be on everyone's mind and Bentley is no exception as he ponders tactics ahead of Britain's first Classic of 2020. "I know Pinatubo is clearly an exceptional talent, but we

are all having our first run of the season as 3-year-olds and anything can happen from two to three," he said. "We don't know if he still has that definite advantage or if we have made up the gap, all I can say is that I'm very happy with Kinross and he is in good form."

Newcastle stays at centre stage on Thursday, with the G3 Betway Pavilion S. the feature as it deviates from its traditional home of Ascot during this period of moveable feasts. Among the sprinters being aimed at the Royal meeting's G1 Commonwealth Cup or G3 Jersey S. is Earle Mack and Les Boyer's Malotru (Ire) (Casamento {Ire}), who looked a bright prospect when taking the seven-furlong Listed Spring Cup on Lingfield's Polytrack on Feb. 29. Unable to contest Monday's G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen due to travel restrictions, last year's G3 Premio Primi Passi scorer has changed course. "We were planning to go for the German Guineas, but unfortunately we weren't allowed to run, so we had a discussion and were thinking of going straight to Royal Ascot," trainer Marco Botti explained. "The horse has been so well, he's already won this year and the initial plan was to go up in trip with him to a mile but if we are dropping back, Newcastle is the track to do it. It's a stiff six furlongs there and there will be plenty of speed in the race--he's guaranteed to stay further than that."

Attempting to give four pounds away to all is last year's G2 Norfolk S., G2 Prix Robert Papin and G2 Flying Childers S. winner A'Ali (Ire) (Society Rock {Ire}), who represents Simon and Ed Crisford. Others of note include Abdullah Menahi's Norfolk S. runner-up Ventura Rebel (GB) (Pastoral Pursuits {GB}), who returns after a near 11-month lay-off, and Troubador (Ire) (Poet's Voice {GB}) who was a highly creditable second attempting to give the smart Summer Sands (GB) (Coach House {Ire}) nine pounds in the Listed Redcar Two Year Old Trophy in October.

# INGLIS MILLENNIUM GETS SLIPPER QUALIFICATION BOOST

Inglis has confirmed a raft of changes to its \$6 million Race Series, highlighted by its agreement with the Australian Turf Club that prizemoney from the \$2 million R. Listed Inglis Millennium will count toward qualification for the G1 Golden Slipper S.

In a significant move, the Millennium will now become the only auction house-restricted race to have a portion of its prizemoney count toward the official Golden Slipper Order Of Entry.

The ATC has agreed that \$69,500 of the winners' prizemoney will count toward the Golden Slipper ballot, which is the equivalent of a Sydney minimum Listed race for 2-year-olds.

It will make the race a much more attractive path to Australia's richest 2-year-old race for Inglis graduates, while it has also been confirmed that the race will be shifted to Randwick from Warwick Farm from 2021.

"This is something we have been working toward since even before the inaugural Inglis Millennium had been run and with the hard work of the ATC and Racing NSW, this is a great result for all breeders, owners, trainers and overall racing participants," Inglis Managing Director Mark Webster said. "The Inglis Millennium has already announced itself as one of Australia's primary 2-year-old races and a key lead-up to the Golden Slipper, Inglis Sires' and Champagne S. and the fact a portion of the prizemoney will now be treated as official qualification for the Slipper is a fantastic outcome."

Webster said Inglis has worked closely with the ATC's Jamie Barkley and James Ross to get the changes made and mirror the agreement that is in place in Victoria when it comes to the Inglis Banner and qualification for the G1 Blue Diamond S.

The Millennium was introduced in 2019 as a highlight 2-year-old race for Inglis sale graduates and to provide greater support for Inglis' clients.

The inaugural edition was won by subsequent G1 Champagne S. and Rosehill Guineas winner Castelvecchio (Dundeel {NZ}) for young trainer Richard Litt at just his second start. He was a \$150,000 Inglis Classic Sale buy in 2018.

The 2020 race, which was initially postponed because of rain, was won by Prime Star (Starspangledbanner) for Richard and Michael Freedman. A \$55,000 buy for China Horse Club at the 2019 Inglis Classic Sale, he hasn't raced since that race in February having suffered an injury.

Inglis has also confirmed that the Inglis Millennium will stay at \$2 million in prizemoney in 2021 while the Inglis Sprint will again be run for \$1 million in what will be the last time that race will be run in Sydney.

### *Sprint on the move*

The Inglis Sprint will move to Flemington from 2022 and be run on G1 Australian Guineas day in a major boost for Victoria.

Flemington will also host a brand-new race, the Inglis Bracelet, a \$250,000 contest for fillies and mares over 1600 metres, on Oaks Day in November starting in 2020.

Other changes to the Race Series see the 2YO Inglis Challenge at Scone doubling its prizemoney to \$200,000 from 2021. It will be open to all yearlings sold at Scone, the Highway Session at Inglis Classic, the Showcase Session at Inglis Premier, the Melbourne Gold Sale and online through Inglis Digital.

"The Race Series is a hugely rewarding part of our business and gives our clients - breeders, vendors, buyers, trainers and owners – the chance to compete for big money against other Inglis horses," Webster said. "These changes we announce today will have a positive impact on so many of those clients. I would also like to thank the Victoria Racing Club for their enthusiasm in accepting our new initiative, the Inglis Bracelet on Oaks Day as

well as hosting the Inglis Sprint as a feature race on what is already a magnificent day's racing on Australian Guineas Day, a day before the start of our Premier Yearling Sale at Oaklands each year."

The Inglis Race Series is open to all registered horses which have been offered for sale at Inglis' full catalogue of sales. The 2020 list of Sales includes those already sold through the Classic, Premier or Easter Sales, and any registered horses offered at the upcoming Easter Round 2, Scone, Melbourne Gold or Ready2Race Sales, as well as weanlings purchased at the 2019 Australian Weanling or Great Southern Sales. It is also open to any yearlings sold through the Inglis Digital online platform from January 2020 to July 2020.

Registrations for 2020 close on July 31, with fees of \$3300 (inc GST) for yearlings offered at Easter Round 1, Easter Round 2, Premier and Classic or \$1650 (inc GST) for yearlings offered at Classic Highway Session, Premier Showcase Session, Melbourne Gold, Scone and Inglis Digital, 2YOs from the Ready2Race Sale and weanlings sold at the 2019 Australian Weanling or Great Southern Sales.
