

VIBRANT OPENER TO FASIG MIDLANTIC SALE



Session-topping Hip 118 in the ring | Fasig-Tipton

TIMONIUM, MD - The Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale opened Monday in Timonium with the specter of uncertainty in the industry caused by the pandemic and the havoc it has wreaked on the global economy hanging over all participants, but the session was punctuated by vibrant bidding across the board and concluded with a sparkling 20% buy-back rate. A colt by Uncle Mo brought the day's highest price when selling to Michael Lund Peterson for \$1.1 million.

"I don't think anybody really knew what to expect, including us," Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning admitted at the close of business Monday. "I thought today was tremendous, exceptional and reassuring. If you didn't observe the activity in the pavilion with the masks and the seats marked off and signs on the floors that say social distancing and so forth, it seemed very similar to what we experienced in 2019 here and in past years."

At the end of the session, 152 juveniles had sold for \$12,632,500. The average was \$83,109 and the median was \$40,000. Of the 274 horses catalogued Monday, 190 went through the sales ring and 38 were reported not sold.

Last year's opening session, held under markedly different circumstances, saw 156 horses sell for \$11,402,500. The session average was \$73,093 and the median was \$43,000. The buy-back rate was 25.7%. **Cont. p3**

“I am astonished at a 20% RNA rate today and I am going to hope and pray it is in that range tomorrow, but there was certainly activity at most every level, including some at the lower end, and the middle was stronger than I would have anticipated coming into the sale,” Browning said. “I’m not saying it’s easy or a walk in the park, there is still polarization that exists in the market, but we had a market today. And I think you could see it and feel it if you were in the pavilion or bidding online. I am very encouraged by the resiliency of the participants in the Thoroughbred industry in the sales side and the racing side. It never ceases to amaze me and today was another example of that.”

Monday marked Fasig-Tipton’s first foray into online bidding and Browning reported seven horses were purchased online and there was bidding on a further 30 to 40 horses throughout the day.

“It was very seamless,” Browning said of the online bidding process. “We are working with professionals in that regard and they did a really good job. And our auctioneers have experience in other markets of selling stuff on line and I thought they handled it very well. We would have had between 40 and 50 horses that people bid on out of 190 through the ring. That’s pretty encouraging activity.”

The Midlantic sale continues with a final session Tuesday with bidding beginning at 11 a.m.

Petersen Makes Big Splash Again

Michael Lund Petersen, who went to a record-setting \$1.8 million to acquire future Grade I winner Gamine (Into Mischief) at last year’s Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale, struck again Monday in Timonium, bidding \$1.1 million to acquire a colt by Uncle Mo (hip 118) from Al Pike’s consignment. Bloodstock agents Steve Young and Murette Farrell, bidding on behalf of Speedway Stable, were among the underbidders on the colt who shared the furlong bullet of :10 flat at last week’s under-tack preview. The colt, like Gamine and Petersen’s former graded winner Mucho Gusto, will be trained by Bob Baffert.

“Of course it’s very exciting to buy a horse for that amount of money, but most importantly I am excited because Bob is excited,” Petersen said. “He was excited about buying Gamine, he was excited about buying Mucho Gusto. I’m just happy I am part of an unbelievable team. I am fortunate that I am.”

Petersen and bloodstock agent Donato Lanni did their bidding out back of the pavilion. Lanni compared the juvenile to another colt currently trained by Baffert.

“He looks very similar to a horse we have now called Uncle Chuck,” Lanni said. “He’s kind of a similar-looking Uncle Mo.”

Owned by Karl Watson, Mike Pegram and Paul Weitman, Uncle Chuck aired by seven lengths in his June 12 debut at Santa Anita.

Hip 118 is out of Miss Ocean City (Indian Charlie) and is a half-brother to graded stakes winner Azar (Scat Daddy).

“He’s a horse that Bob is going to take his time with,” Lanni said.

Lanni admitted his biggest concern was his owner getting to the sale in time Monday.

“We’re happy for Michael. This is his sale—he lives in Baltimore,” Lanni said. “It was only a 10-minute drive for him, but I saw there were a bunch of outs and I called him and told him to hurry up. He said, ‘Don’t worry about it.’”

Of the colt’s seven-figure price tag, Lanni said. “He’s a good horse and everybody saw that and that’s what the good ones cost. Horses like that are so hard to find and they are very rare. You just have to stretch a bit more to get them.”

For his part, Petersen admitted it was tough bidding that high.

“Last year was a lot worse,” he said with a laugh. “Somebody asked me what it is like to buy the most expensive horse and I said, ‘It sucks.’ It’s not actually that much of a thrill, I would like to buy the least expensive horse. But obviously I am excited having Gamine. It’s fun being in horse racing right now.”

Petersen has six horses in training at the moment. He purchased two juveniles at the recent OBS Spring Sale, going to \$700,000 to acquire a colt by Not This Time (hip 1283) and to \$375,000 for a colt by Twirling Candy (hip 1226).

Petersen credited the private sale of his multiple graded stakes winner Mucho Gusto (Mucho Macho Man), purchased for \$625,000 at the 2018 Midlantic sale, with his bullish bidding at recent juvenile sales.

“I bought two down in Ocala only because I sold Mucho Gusto,” he said. “A prince [Faisal bin Khaled Abdulaziz] came and he asked if he was for sale and I said no, but he kept coming back. And eventually Bob said sell him. I am lucky to have the best horse trainer in the world and I am not making myself believe just because I’ve been successful in something else I know what I am doing here. I am humble about being part of the team and I follow what they say and it’s been going pretty good so far. So that’s what I intend to do.”

Gamine, who romped by 18 3/4 lengths in the June 20 GI Acorn S., worked four furlongs at Santa Anita Monday morning.

“She breezed today and Bob said she was happy and did really, really well. That was the text message I got,” Petersen said.

“Where she is going next, I don’t know. I think Bob doesn’t necessarily make plans. He lets the horse talk to him. If she looks like she is ready to go, he will let her go. Everybody wants to know if she will go to the Derby. Gamine will tell us if it’s going to be the Oaks or the Derby. I am happy either way.”

SF Bloodstock signed the ticket at \$450,000 on Miss Ocean City with the Uncle Mo colt in utero at the 2017 Keeneland November sale. The juvenile was bred in Virginia by William Backer Revocable Trust.

Al Pike purchased the colt privately after he RNA'd for \$185,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale. Following the juvenile's bullet work last week, Pike said yearling consignor Frank Taylor had convinced him to buy the colt

"I guess I owe him dinner at Malones," Pike said following the seven-figure sale Monday. "Frank took me over and said, 'I think this is a really good horse and you'll be happy with him.' And bless his heart, he was right. He's been a special horse since we got him. Hopefully we will be seeing him at the big races. He's in good hands."

Carlisle Busy Bidding for Tramontin

Greg Tramontin, founder and CEO of GoAuto Insurance, enjoyed his first-ever Grade I success as co-owner of the June 20 GI Woody Stephens S. winner No Parole (Violence) and added a pair of high-priced juveniles to his stable Monday. Bidding on behalf of the Louisiana owner, bloodstock agent Lauren Carlisle kicked the auction into high gear with the \$500,000 purchase of a filly by Into Mischief (hip 4) from the consignment of Hoby and Layna Kight and returned later in the session to secure a colt by Not This Time (hip 213) for \$650,000 from the Classic Bloodstock consignment. Both will be trained, like No Parole, by Tom Amoss.

"We have tried on some other horses at some other sales and haven't gotten lucky," Carlisle said. "We bought yearlings last year and we are trying to get more involved."

Of Tramontin's racing stable, Carlisle added, "We have two 2-year-olds, No Parole, and some horses in Louisiana. We bought a 2-year-old at OBS March in partnership with Maggi Moss and we bought the two today. And I'm not done yet. I'll be here all day tomorrow."

Hip 213, who worked a furlong in :10 1/5 last week, is out of Sanctissima (Indian Charlie). He was purchased by Classic Bloodstock's Danzel Brendemuehl on behalf of Lambe Bloodstock for \$40,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Fall Yearling Sale.

"We thought he might be a little higher than that, but I'm delighted that he is getting a good home," Brendemuehl said. "For me, that horse breathes other air and he's a bargain at that price. In the right hands, we will see him next May and in the Breeders' Cup and every big race. He's that kind. He shows up every day."

Hip 4, who worked a quarter-mile at last week's under-tack preview in :21 3/5, is out of graded placed Global Hottie (Dixie Chatter).

"I loved everything about her," Carlisle said. "We wanted to buy a nice filly and I think we did."

As for the youngster's price just three hips into the two-day auction, Carlisle said, "For an Into Mischief, that's not bad. Especially compared to last year."

The bay filly was purchased by the Kights for \$150,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale.

"She was a good filly and did everything right," Hoby Kight said. "She vetted good, worked good and trained well. I hope to see her in Saratoga."

Kight admitted he had been surprised to be able to purchase the filly last fall.

"I really wanted to buy something by that sire and it's just hard," he said. "She was big and stretchy. I couldn't believe I bought her actually. She was kind of big and pretty then, too. Maybe there were a lot of them through the days and she just slipped through."

The Kights have had success selling at the Midlantic sale, but usually send their horses north with the Hartley/DeRenzo Thoroughbreds consignment. Of hip 4's placement in the Maryland auction, Kight explained, "[Fasig President] Boyd [Browning] told me when he came to look at my horses to go to Miami, 'Just bring one to Maryland that you wanted to take to Miami and I promise you you'll be rewarded.' And it worked."

Upstart Filly Rewards Frommer

Cary Frommer is annually a busy shopper at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Fall Yearling Sale and the horsewoman was rewarded for her efforts when selling a filly by first-crop sire Upstart ([hip 173](#)) for \$400,000 Monday in Timonium. Frommer had purchased the dark bay for \$120,000 as a yearling. Nick Sallusto and Hanzly Albina, bidding on the phone, purchased the filly, who shared last week's bullet furlong breeze time of :10 flat, Monday.

"As soon as I saw her, I fell in love with her," Frommer said of the juvenile. "I thought she was the epitome of a beautiful filly, elegant, long and scopey and athletic."

Bred in Maryland by Dark Hollow Farm, hip 173 is out of stakes winner Plum (Pure Prize).

The filly was the co-sixth-highest priced yearling at last year's Midlantic yearling sale and was one of 15 individuals Frommer signed for at the auction.

"I do find it surprising and I'd like to keep it a secret," Frommer said of her success buying out of the auction. "Every year, that's where I buy my best horses."

As much faith as she had in the filly, Frommer did admit she had concerns over the uncertainties in the market caused by the global pandemic.

"Obviously, everything is imploding," she said. "I felt like we had the goods with her, but I didn't know if it would be appreciated in this world today. So I am very happy with the price."

Sackatoga Strikes for Tonalist Filly

Sackatoga Stable, on the Triple Crown trail again with GI Belmont S. winner Tiz the Law (Constitution), purchased a filly by Tonalist for \$290,000 early in Monday's first session of the Midlantic sale. The juvenile ([hip 27](#)) was consigned by Kirkwood Stables and, like the Belmont winner and Sackatoga's 2003 GI Kentucky Derby winner Funny Cide, is a New York-bred.

"[Sackatoga operating manager] Jack Knowlton just uses New York-breds. That's all he does," said trainer Barclay Tagg.

The filly is out of Holiday Apple (Harlan's Holiday), a half-sister to multiple graded stakes winner Lady Apple (Curlin). She worked a quarter-mile during last week's under-tack preview in :22 1/5.

"She's a very attractive filly," Tagg said. "I liked everything about her when I went over and watched her here for a couple of days. We didn't want to spend that much money, but I think she'll be worth it."

Asked if Tiz the Law's exploits made the partnership more likely to bid higher than they might normally do, Tagg smiled and said, "Maybe he gave them a little more money."

Of the Belmont winner, Tagg added, "He's doing well, very well. He came out of his last race great and we're very pleased with him."

Speightster Colt Turned Back, Joins Baffert Barn

A colt by Speightster ([hip 1312](#)), purchased by Larry Best for \$1.1 million at the OBS Spring Sale, has been returned to previous owner Solana Beach Sales and has joined the Southern California barn of trainer Bob Baffert.

"Larry Best purchased the colt and after the sale he sent him to Taylor Made," explained consignor Tom McCrocklin. "I discussed post-sale management of the colt with Frank Taylor because he was not familiar with the horse and I was. And I think they chose to pull his back shoes and put him in a paddock for a post-sale rest. We sold the colt on a Friday and on day seven, at 2 in the afternoon, I got a call that they had put him in a paddock and he was cribbing on a fence board. We made every attempt with Larry Best to resolve the issue. We offered him a discount and at the end of the day, he chose to pass on the horse."

McCrocklin continued, "We were devastated and disappointed. But the people who own the horse were happy to keep him and we sent him to Bob Baffert."

Solana Beach Sales is the pinhooking division of the Little Red Feather racing partnerships. McCrocklin purchased the colt on behalf of the partnership for \$110,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga New York-bred Sale last year.

"There were a lot of moving parts of people wanting to stay in and people wanting to get out," McCrocklin said. "But at the end of the day, they were really excited to have the horse. We feel like we have never had a horse of that caliber and they were happy to keep him."

DIVERSITY IN RACING

However, we absolutely need more diverse boards and organizations and we need more women to put themselves forward and actively campaign for executive positions.

Horse racing is so interconnected. More women should be using their expansive networks to their advantage and more men should be actively engaged in making space for them and ensuring their voices are heard. I started with the Breeders' Cup in 1983 as an administrative assistant and I pursued every opportunity, took on more responsibility, and asked for every seat at every table. There is no shortage of talented women in this industry, and I encourage them all to pursue those seats in our industry's board rooms.

In terms of racial diversity, we have a lot of work to do to cultivate a more diverse ownership group and a more diverse industry organization. As we work to change our sport for the better, we should be continuously engaging the Black and Latino communities in conversations about their opinions of the racing industry. It is important that we don't make any assumptions as we seek to diversify our fan base and the talent in our industry. Until we fully understand the problem, we won't find the solution.

It is also important for us to recognize that our sport's history certainly presents its challenges and likely fosters unconscious biases. For example, there may be a tendency to assume that because people of color have traditionally filled the roles of the grooms and the hotwalkers, they would not want to participate now. We need to do more to ensure that our sport is a safe space for people of color and to recognize the parts of our culture, past and present, that may make people uncomfortable.

When hiring, the racing industry often looks within, emphasizing industry experience as a prerequisite. The net effect of that practice is a failure to open our doors to those outside our bubble, assuming that those outside the industry won't understand horse racing and breeding and its unique position in sport. The foundation for a more diverse and inclusive structure at all levels is educating and exposing young people to the sport through job-credit opportunities, integration with sports marketing classes, and more internships at organizations that are leading the Thoroughbred industry.

Horse racing is one of the few sports in which children do not participate in organized youth leagues. Unless they grow up with horses, the likelihood of children finding their way to a racetrack, a breeding farm, or a sales pavilion is extremely remote. If we are to truly diversify our fan base, and therefore

our talent pool, this has to change. For example, Thoroughbred organizations could sponsor local pony clubs that are open to everyone (not just those who can afford the breeches, the boots, and the pony), we should be recruiting at all schools and youth organizations for club members, and racetracks and farms should provide safe and secure environments to learn about horses and understand the sport. Only then will opportunity exist for a more diverse group to explore, join, and follow this sport.

I believe an important first step in this process is engaging our existing owners in conversations around diversity and inclusion and encouraging them to bring people of color to the sales, to the races, and into important conversations about our sport. The owners are the ambassadors of Thoroughbred racing and they are well aware that it can no longer be an exclusive club. Over the last 10 years, ownership has dropped by 30%. We aren't bringing new owners into the sport fast enough to counter the decline, and we aren't looking in the right places for new and diverse faces.

In other businesses, researchers have noted that customers who believe they are interacting with people different from themselves experience less satisfaction in the interaction. Therefore, building a workforce that reflects the different types of customers engaged by the organization may result in more positive customer service experiences. I believe the same holds true for racing. If I were a person of color and I looked at Thoroughbred racing, who would I see? Almost exclusively people who don't look like me.

I join with leaders across our industry in advocating for real change that begins with having these tough conversations now, both in private and in public forums.

PERSONAL ENSIGN NEXT FOR MIDNIGHT BISOU; BC CLASSIC A POSSIBILITY

Coming off a smashing win in the GII Fleur de Lis S., **Midnight Bisou** (Midnight Lute) will ship to Saratoga Wednesday, where she will prepare for the Aug. 1 GI Personal Ensign S.

“After she gets settled in in Saratoga we will start gearing her up for her summer campaign with the expectation that she will run next in the Personal Ensign,” said Jeff Bloom, whose Bloom Racing Stable is the majority owner of the Eclipse-Award winning 5-year-old.

Bloom said the main goal after the Personal Ensign will be to get Midnight Bisou to the Breeders’ Cup, but which Breeders’ Cup race she competes in has yet to be decided. Bloom confirmed that the GI Breeders’ Cup Classic is a possibility.

“Our goal, ultimately, is to get her to the Breeders’ Cup and when I say Breeders’ Cup I am not being specific about a race,” Bloom said. “We will keep our options open. That lends itself to potentially going against the boys again. At the end of the day, the goal is the Breeders’ Cup. So far as which race, we will see how things play out over the course of the summer.”

Midnight Bisou, the 2019 champion older filly or mare, has had a brief but highly successful campaign so far this year. She was second behind Maximum Security (New Year’s Day) in the Saudi Cup and then came back to win the Fleur de Lis by 8 1/4 lengths. Bloom is confident his mare can handle just about anything.

“We know where she stands,” he said. “She is proven. She has shown her abilities and her level of success. She has answered those questions on the racetrack. Obviously, she has shown that she’s capable of running with the best in the world. She did it in the race in Saudi Arabia.”

As well as she ran in Saudi Arabia, the Fleur de Lis may have been her best ever performance.

“I wouldn’t say I was surprised, it was more that I was in awe of her,” Bloom said of the Fleur de Lis. “She was off for four months, she traveled across the world and went up against a quality group of fillies and then dominated them. I simply was awestruck watching it. Coming home, she was under a wrap, just under complete wraps. Mike Smith’s comments to me following the race was that as good as this filly has been, she has never felt any better than she did in this race. He said that he had so much left in the tank. It was pretty exciting.”

With Midnight Bisou pointing to the Personal Ensign and with Monomoy Girl (Tapizar) set to go in the July 11 GII Ruffian S. at Belmont, the two rivals remain on different paths. That doesn’t mean that Bloom wouldn’t relish the opportunity to square off with and beat Monomoy Girl.

“As a racing fan, how could you not want to see a match up between those two fillies and watch them go head to head?” Bloom said. “It’s incredible that they were able to get Monomoy Girl back to the races off such an extended time period and to bring her back to a top level is great. It certainly lends itself to a potential for a match-up between Midnight Bisou and Monomoy Girl in the not too distant future. It would be a really good thing for horse racing and for fans to see them to run again and see how it plays out.”

Bloom is also keeping an eye on Saudi Arabia. Maximum Security was trained at the time by Jason Servis, one of the trainers indicted for allegedly giving performance-enhancing drugs to his horses. Saudi racing authorities have said they are investigating the race and Servis and are withholding paying out the purse. If Maximum Security is disqualified Midnight Bisou would be declared the winner. Bloom said he has not been given any updates by the Saudis.

SADLER FINED, SUSPENDED FOR MEDICATION VIOLATIONS

In a settlement agreement and mutual release with the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB), leading California trainer John Sadler has been fined \$15,000 and handed a 60-day suspension—45 days of which are stayed—for three medication violations dating from 2019. The suspension runs June 29 through June 13.

As part of the agreement, Sadler has been placed on probation for one year, ending June 28, 2021. If he incurs any medication violations during that period, the 45 days of stayed suspension will be imposed following a noticed hearing.

As first reported in the *Paulick Report*, the CHRB stewards delivered their ruling Sunday, June 28. **Cont. p11**

The three violations occurred in April and May of last year. **Jasikan (Ire)** (Bated Breath {GB}), who finished third in the Singletary S. at Santa Anita Apr. 28, and **Field Bet** (Sidney's Candy), fifth in a maiden claiming at Santa Anita Apr. 14, both tested positive for gabapentin. **Sneem (Ire)** (Sir Prancealot {Ire}), who won a maiden special weight at Golden Gate Fields May 10, tested positive for clenbuterol.

The Association of Racing Commissioners International lists both gabapentin and clenbuterol as Class 3/Penalty B medications.

Sadler finished the recently concluded six-month Santa Anita meet in sixth place on the trainers' standings, with 18 wins and over \$1.7 million in earnings, including the \$360,000 that Combatant earned for winning the GI Santa Anita H.

Sadler provided the following statement on the CHRB stewards ruling:

"Trainers are liable for the condition of their horses regardless of the acts of third parties. The imposition of the trainer insurer rule requires only the detection of a prohibited substance in an official sample and identification of the trainer of the horse. The trainer insurer rule is not based on actual administration of a drug or negligent care. Fault is not an element of liability under the trainer insurer rule.

"The incidents covered by the settlement agreement and the penalties imposed under the agreement reflect the fact that these incidents resulted from circumstances beyond my control but which nonetheless are my responsibility. Two of these cases involved the passive transmission by a groom of a medication prescribed for his own medical condition. The other involved detection of a prohibited substance in a horse over which I did not have actual custody or control.

"I want to thank the CHRB for their consideration of the mitigating circumstances underlying these complaints in

reaching this agreement. My decision to enter into the settlement agreement was based upon the costs involved in defending against these allegations and recognition of the impact of the trainer insurer rule. Over my 40 years as a trainer, I can unequivocally state that I neither administered nor had knowledge of the administration of any prohibited substance to any of my horses."

CANADIAN HOF RIDER DON SEYMOUR DIES

Canadian Hall of Fame jockey Don Seymour, who stamped himself one of the nation's leading riders after riding two Triple Crown winners, died June 26 at his home in Barrie, Ontario. Surrounded by his family, including his mother Mary, at the time of his death, he reportedly had been suffering from chronic obstructive pulmonary disease since earlier this year. He was 59.

Born and raised in Hamilton, Ontario, Seymour was a leading rider in Alberta in the 1980s before relocating to ride at Woodbine Racetrack in Etobicoke, Ontario. Best remembered for sweeping consecutive Triple Crowns in 1988-89 with Kinghaven Farm runners With Approval and Izvestia--both horses would go on to be named Horses of the Year--he also accompanied Canadian champion Play The King, who finished second behind subsequent U.S. Sprint Champion Gulch in the 1988 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint en route to Canadian Horse of the Year honors.

Voted the Sovereign Award winning rider in 1985, 1987, 1989 and 1990, he was honored with the Avelino Gomez Memorial Award in 1995 and was inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame in 1999.

After an early retirement from the saddle in 1994 with 2,141 career wins, including 171 stakes wins, Seymour served as a placing judge and official clocker before leaving the track for good in 2002.

A private family service will be held followed by a public celebration of Seymour's life at a later date. In his memory, donations may be made to the Heart and Stroke Foundation.

RESERVED SEATS AVAILABLE FOR ELLIS MEET; NO GENERAL ADMISSION

Tickets for reserved seating for the RUNHAPPY Summer Meet at Ellis Park, conducted from July 2 to Aug. 30, are available at www.ellisparkracing.com. As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, racetracks may host up to 50% capacity and general admission seating will not be available to spectators for the meet, with the exception being horse owners. Spectators are required to have a ticketed seat, with food and beverages delivered by servers to designated seating areas. The Dade Park Grill on the first floor of the Clubhouse will be the only concession stand open. Racing will run July 2-5 before taking a week off for the five-day Keeneland meet before resuming its Friday through Sunday format July 17 through Aug. 30.

For opening week, the smoke-free Sky Theatre will have 47 tables available, mostly four-tops, for a total capacity of 196 people, with 62 tables in the Clubhouse (for two, four and six people) for an additional 234 individuals. Clubhouse options include the Terrace Lounge area (racetrack view), the adjacent Thoroughbred Room and the Gardenia Room. Expanded parties of up to 25 people will be accommodated in The Turf Club. Concession areas at the track will not be open during the meet.

"We are opening seating to the public in a safe and prudent manner that adheres to state protocol," said Ellis Park general manager Jeff Inman. "With this methodology, we have control over where people are during the races and can make sure they are safely separated. Additionally, protocol dictates that we must have the name and contact information for every guest coming to Ellis this summer. That's why we can only have reserved seating this meet. If one of our guests should subsequently test positive for COVID-19, we will know who was at the races that day, where they were seated and how to get in touch with them."

Additional Guidelines for 2020:


- Admission to the track for live racing is by reservation only, and race-day reservations will be accepted as space allows.

- An entire table must be purchased, with no partial tables sold due to social-distancing requirements. During the initial week of the meet, the minimum age for reserved seating is 18 years old. Ellis will review plans to allow additional guests and younger race fans later in the summer.
- Access to Historical Horse Racing on the Clubhouse first floor is available on a first-come, first-served basis with gaming terminals adhering to the state's social-distancing standards.
- Guests with reserved seating, along with Historical Horse Racing players, must enter through the main gate and have a non-invasive thermal screening before being admitted.
- Horse owners licensed by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission may watch their horses run from the racetrack apron, where media members will also be allowed. Media members must make arrangements with Ellis Park staff prior to arrival, as there is limited space available each racing day.
- Owners and the media should enter through the paddock pavilion entrance, where they will undergo thermal screening and have their name and contact information recorded.

Ellis Park hopes to add two additional outdoor seating areas in phases as the summer progresses; 40 grandstand box seats opening in July in addition to boxes, which will accommodate four people each, will be sold as reserved seating and also have food and beverage delivered by servers. A third phase could see six-seat picnic tables on the racetrack apron sometime in early August.



BREEDERS' CUP EXTENDS NOMINATION DISCOUNT DEADLINE FOR HORSES OF RACING AGE

Due to changes in racetrack schedules and auction sales dates as a result of COVID-19 restrictions, the Breeders' Cup announced Monday that it's extending the discount deadline for horses of racing age to Saturday, Aug. 15.

All horses must be Breeders' Cup-nominated in order to compete in the Breeders' Cup World Championships, which is scheduled to be held at Keeneland Nov. 6-7.

The original horses of racing age nomination discount deadline was July 15.

"Although most Breeders' Cup nominated horses join the program as weanlings, there are a few each year that didn't get the Breeders' Cup advantage as a foal," said Dora Delgado, Breeders' Cup Executive Vice President and Chief Racing Officer. "We created the horses of racing age nomination program to make sure all runners have a chance to compete in our racing programs including the Breeders' Cup World Championships. Now that racing has resumed in most locations, we believe our one-month extension will allow horsemen to better evaluate their racing stock and nominate to the Breeders' Cup program, providing eligibility for their entire racing career."

The nomination discounts are as follows:

- 2-year-olds by a nominated Breeders' Cup stallion can join the program for US\$12,000. This one-time nomination fee makes the racehorse Breeders' Cup-eligible for its entire racing career.
- Runners which are 3-year-olds and older that were foaled in the Northern Hemisphere and sired by a nominated stallion will receive a 50% discount off normal racehorse nomination fees. Three-year-olds and older which were born in the Southern Hemisphere can be nominated for 25% of their regular nomination fee. **Cont. p14**

Following the Aug. 15 deadline, the price for all non-nominated runners reverts back to the standard racehorse nomination fee of US\$100,000 or more until Oct. 26, when all runners must be pre-entered for the Breeders' Cup World Championships races. It has been quite a week for the old boys. Continuing a fine season, **Way To Paris (GB)** (Champs Elysees {GB}) finally notched a deserved Group 1 victory for himself and his trainer Andrea Marcialis in the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. At seven, he is a year younger than the sprinting duo of **Limato (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}) and **Judicial (Ire)** (Iffraaj {GB}) who respectively recorded their 14th and 15th victories in Group 3 contests at Newmarket and Newcastle on Saturday.

Then of course there's the redoubtable **Caspian Prince (Ire)**, who ran his 101st race that same day, chalking up his 20th win at odds of 28-1. The biggest head-scratcher is how this remarkable 11-year-old, by Dylan Thomas (Ire) out of the unraced Crystal Gaze (Ire) (Rainbow Quest), has ended up winning the majority of his races over five furlongs. Now in his 10th season in training, Caspian Prince was an inspired purchase at 11,000gns at the Tattersalls December Yearling Sale and yet another credit to the skills of bloodstock agent Gill Richardson, whose bang-for-buck ratio with the horses she selects is as good as any out there. The horse has had seven different trainers in his career, with his highest-profile success coming for Tony Coyle when Caspian Prince beat Judicial's half-sister, the dual Group 1 winner Marsha (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}), in the G2 Friarstown Stud Sapphire S. almost three years ago. **Cont. p2**

INVESTEC DERBY ATTRACTS 17 AT THIS STAGE

Listed winner and ante-post favourite **English King (Fr)** (Camelot {GB}) is among 17 entries for Saturday's G1 Investec Derby at Epsom. The mile-and-a-half Classic finds itself in an unusual position on the calendar this year, coming a month later than normal and after both Royal Ascot and the Irish Derby, because of the late start to the campaign. That will not matter one iota to the winning connections come this weekend, though--and for Ed Walker, trainer of Lingfield Derby Trial winner English King, it would be the realisation of a childhood ambition.

"Anyone who says they don't think about winning the Derby is surely lying," said Walker. "I've been thinking about it since I discovered horseracing when I was 13 years old, so of course you think about it in this position." **Cont. p5**

The Italian Way

Way To Paris may have the perfect name and sire to win a Group 1 in the Parisian suburbs, but both he and his connections have their roots firmly planted in Italy. Bred by Franca Vittadini's Grundy Bloodstock, he races in the colours of nonagenarian Paolo Ferrario and is trained in Chantilly by Italian ex-pat Andrea Marcialis. Moreover, Way To Paris's dam Grey Way (Cozzene), from whom he inherits his grey coat, was herself the winner of the G2 Premio Lydia Tesio among her five victories on Italian soil. Twelve years prior to Way To Paris, who was born when Grey Way was 20, the mare had produced the dual G1 Premio Presidente della Repubblica winner Distant Way (Distant View), who later served his time at stud in Italy.

Champs Elysees, a perfectly capable Flat stallion who was massively popular with the jumps brigade in the three seasons he stood at Castle Hyde Stud, died in 2018, the year his daughter Billesdon Brook (GB) won the 1000 Guineas. The brother to Dansili (GB) and Cacique (GB) also featured among the Italian group-race winners over the weekend via his German-bred and -trained son **Durance (Ger)**, who beat French raider **Royal Julius (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB}) by a neck to land the G2 Gran Premio di Milano for owner-breeder Gestut Ebbesloh.

The other group race on Sunday's card at San Siro, the G3 Premio Carlo Vittadini, is named in honour of the father of Way To Paris's breeder, who was himself the owner of the outstanding triple Classic winner of 1975, Grundy (GB) (Great Nephew {GB}).

It brought up a double not just for German runners but also for sons of Hasili (GB) as the race was won by the Juddmonte-bred **Runnymede (GB)**, (Dansili {GB}), who is now trained by Sarah Steinberg for Stall Salzburg having been bought for 75,000gns at Tattersalls in February 2019.

A further feather in the cap for Italian breeding over the weekend came in Ireland, where **Speak In Colours (GB)** (Excelebration {Ire}) recorded his sixth triumph in the G2 Weatherbys Ireland Greenlands S. Bred by Paolo and Emma Agostini, the 5-year-old raced initially in their Scuderia Archi Romani silks at two when trained by Marco Botti (who also trained his sire). Following his win in the Listed Doncaster S. at two, Speak In Colours was sold to Chantal Regalado-Gonzalez and transferred to Joseph O'Brien, subsequently adding another four stakes victories to his record.

The Derby Cross

The main event of the weekend, the Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby, produced the novel result of a Coolmore-owned winner whose sire and damsire both stood as Darley stallions. However much the Irish Derby's reputation regrettably continues to be devalued, there is much to like about the newest name on the roll of honour, **Santiago (Ire)** (Authorized {Ire}), not least his ability to have bounced back so soon after winning the G2 Queen's Vase at Royal Ascot. **Cont. p3**

Then there is his pedigree, and the fact that his fifth dam, Allegretta (GB), also pops up in the backgrounds of plenty of top-class horses, most notably as the grandam of Galileo (Ire) and Sea The Stars (Ire).

Santiago's Classic victory further embellishes the late Cape Cross's record as a broodmare sire, a position he also occupies in the pedigrees of Derby winners Australia (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) and Masar (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}), Japanese Derby winner Logi Universe (Jpn) (Neo Universe {Jpn}), South Australian Derby winner Russian Camelot (Ire) (Camelot {GB}), G1 Zabeel Classic winners Authentic Paddy (NZ) (Howbaddouwantit) and Consensus (NZ) (Postponed), and six-time Group 1 winner Laurens (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}).

Santiago's dam Wadyhatta (GB) was bought from Shadwell at Arqana's Summer Sale when carrying Santiago for €275,000. Sheikh Hamdan has himself enjoyed plenty of success with the family over the years, notably through Tamayuz (GB) (Nayef), a half-brother to Santiago's grandam Thamarat (GB) (Anabaa).

The 2007 Derby winner Authorized will probably end up being best remembered as the sire of dual Grand National winner Tiger Roll (Ire) and, like so many sons of Montjeu (Ire), he has had decent success with his jumpers, which include Nichols Canyon (GB) and Goshen (Fr). But Authorized is also a Flat sire of some note, his chief earner being the evergreen Hartnell (GB) who, like Santiago, won the Queen's Vase before he was exported to Australia.

Authorized served 12 seasons at Darley's British, Irish and French wings before being sold to stand in Turkey for the Turkish Jockey Club for the 2020 season.

Fairy's Story

In a good week for former Derby winners, the 2014 hero Australia (GB) was represented by a third group win for his first-crop son **Buckhurst (Ire)** in the G3 Alleged S., as well as a runner-up finish for 3-year-old daughter **Cayenne Pepper (Ire)** in the G1 Pretty Polly S.

An interesting runner of Australia's on the pedigree front was Saturday's Hamilton maiden winner **King Fairy (Ire)**. Trained by William Haggas, he was making his second start in the colours of his breeder, the Tsui family's Sunderland Holdings, and the 3-year-old colt is inbred 3x3 to their Arc winner and brilliant broodmare Urban Sea (Miswaki) through his grandsires, the half-brothers Galileo (Ire) and Sea The Stars (Ire).

King Fairy's dam My Fairy (Ire) was unraced but is a sister to My Titania (Ire), who was Sea The Stars's first group winner back in 2013. The family has also been kind to Haggas who trained another of the mare's half-siblings, the triple Group 2 winner Muthmir (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). [Cont. p4](#)

Rude Awakening

The international barriers are slowly lifting and Thursday saw the first English runners in French group races this season. The prizes for both contests were duly smuggled back across the Channel by Hughie Morrison and Charlie Appleby after last year's G2 Dante S. winner **Telecaster (GB)** (New Approach {GB}) ran out the easy winner of the G3 La Coupe followed by the triumph of **Space Blues (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) in the G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot.

Following a run of solely domestic contests since racing resumed in France on May 11, these interlopers were clearly not welcomed by all. The next day's *Journal de Galop* bore the front-page headline 'Rude Britannia' and went on to grumble about 'Des Anglais sans pitie'.

But really the only rude thing about the day's racing was the start time: the Weekly Wrapper was still mucking out when Telecaster romped home at 8:40 a.m. Newmarket time. The French don't usually like to let racing interrupt lunch, let alone breakfast.

More Joy For Darley Matriarch

Eastern World (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) has an awful lot to live up to in following his high-flying siblings onto the racecourse but the 3-year-old looks set to uphold the family honour following his comfortable maiden win at Newmarket on Sunday.

At the very least he has kept a clean sheet for his dam, the celebrated Darley mare Eastern Joy (GB) (Dubai Destination). Eastern World is her sixth winner from as many runners and all those who have gone before him—all by Darley sires—have notched black-type victories. Heading the list is the Dubai World Cup winner Thunder Snow (Ire) (Helmet {Aus}) and he is followed, in ratings order, by Always Smile (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), Ihtimal (Ire) (Shamardal), Winter Lightning (Ire) (Shamardal) and First Victory (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}).

Great Heavens

As we look ahead to the most exciting weekend of action since racing returned, with the Derby, Oaks, Eclipse, Prix du Jockey Club and Prix de Diane all being staged within two days, we must first acknowledge the welcome return of the great mare **Magical (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who extended her Group 1 record to five wins with significant ease in Sunday's Alwasmiyah Pretty Polly S. at an almost deserted Curragh.

In a more normal season, we might have been expecting her to line up again at Sandown on Sunday to try to reverse the 2019 placings with Enable (GB) (Nathaniel {Ire}) in the Coral-Eclipse. As it is, she had a pretty easy hit-out for her seasonal debut and we may see her next instead in the 'King George' at Ascot, where she completed her magnificent 4-year-old season with victory in the G1 QIPCO Champion S.

Magical's celebrated dam Halfway to Heaven (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}) was not the only mare of that name to have produced a top-flight winner of the weekend. This is where country suffixes come in handy. Halfway To Heaven (SAf), a daughter of Jet Master (SAf), is the dam of Sheikh Hamdan's **Hawwaam (SAf)** (Silvano {Ger}), who won Saturday's GI Premier's Champions Challenge at Turffontein, his second Grade 1 victory of the month and, like Magical, fifth in total.

The Irish Halfway To Heaven had already produced a multiple Group 1 winner in Rhododendron (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) but her South African namesake has her matched there, too, as her 5-year-old son **Rainbow Bridge (SAf)** (Ideal World) is also a dual Grade I winner in South Africa.

And Finally...

Well done to the BHA for persuading the government to allow owners to return to the racecourse in time for a belated Derby day. A well-timed decision indeed.

He added, "It would be a great day if it happened. "It's been quite nice that we booked our ticket very early--it was only the fifth day of the season. It's been nice watching all the other trials and seeing who else is putting their hands up as Derby contenders.

"I always vowed I wouldn't run a horse in the Derby who didn't deserve his place, because we've all seen nice horses get ruined in the race. I'm very hopeful and confident he genuinely deserves to take his chance. Whether he's good enough, we'll find out, but I think he ticks a lot of boxes--and I think that's why he's at the top of the market."

Aidan O'Brien had mooted turning G1 Irish Derby winner Santiago (Ire) (Authorized {Ire}) out again quickly after he added to his Royal Ascot win at The Curragh, but his name was not on the list. Instead the seven possible Ballydoyle runners are another Ascot winner in **Russian Emperor (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who won the G3 Hampton Court S., G1 Irish 2000 Guineas runner-up **Vatican City (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), G2 Champions Juvenile S. victor **Mogul (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), **Amhran Na Bhfiann (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), MGSW & MG1SP **Armory (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud third **Mythical (Fr)** (Camelot {GB}) and **Serpentine (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}).

Andrew Balding's **Kameko** (Kitten's Joy) was a clear-cut winner of the G1 QIPCO 2000 Guineas at Newmarket and he takes a leap up in trip, with stablemate and Goodwood listed winner **Khalifa Sat (Ire)** (Free Eagle {Ire}) also set to take his chance.

O'Brien's other fillies in the mix are the G1 Tattersalls Irish 1000 Guineas heroine **Peaceful (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), **Ennistymon (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Passion (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who were second and third, respectively, in the G2 Ribblesdale S. at Ascot.

Love's main market rival is the Ribblesdale winner **Frankly Darling (GB)** (Frankel {GB}), trained by John Gosden. LATEST ENTRIES REVEALED FOR FRENCH DERBY/OAKS

Andre Fabre's **Victor Ludorum (GB)** (Shamardal) will attempt to do the French Guineas and Derby double which stablemate Persian King (Ire) (Kingman {GB}) so nearly pulled off last season, as the latest entries for the G1 Prix du Jockey Club and G1 Prix de Diane were announced on Monday. One of 27 in the males' Classic, he turned around previous form with **The Summit (Fr)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}), who had beaten him in the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau in May, his only defeat in his career.

Fabre could also run the promising 'TDN Rising Star' **Ocean Atlantique** (American Pharoah) while Christophe Ferland's **Pao Alto (Fr)** (Intello {Ger}), who beat Ocean Atlantique in the G3 Prix la Force, is another major contender.

John Gosden's **Mishriff (Ire)** (Make Believe {GB}) was an impressive winner of a Newmarket listed race on his return to action, beating better fancied stablemate Waldkonig (GB) (Kingman {GB}), Gosden favoured keeping him at 10 furlongs rather than stepping up in trip for Epsom. The only other entry from Britain is Paul and Oliver Cole's **Celtic Art (Fr)** (Mastercraftsman {Ire}), runner-up in a Deauville listed race last October.

Aidan O'Brien has left in four, headed by MGSW & MG1SP **Armory (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), while Joseph O'Brien can choose from seven, including G1 Irish Derby also-ran and GSW **Crossfirehurricane** (Kitten's Joy).

Jessica Harrington's impressive G1 Coronation S. winner **Alpine Star (Ire)** (Sea the Moon {Ger}) is among 17 in the G1 Prix de Diane. Donnacha O'Brien's **Fancy Blue (Ire)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) could make the trip along with his brother Joseph's **New York Girl (Ire)** (New Approach {Ire}), who ran in the G1 Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby on Saturday, while their father Aidan has left in G1 Tattersalls Irish 1000 Guineas winner **Peaceful (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}).

The home team is headed by Jean-Claude Rouget's duo of **Raabihah** (Sea The Stars {Ire}) and G1 Prix Saint-Alary victress **Tawkeel (GB)** (Teofilo {Ire}).

Peter Chapple-Hyam's **Bharani Star (Ger)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}) and David Simcock's **Oriental Mystique (GB)** (Kingman {GB}) could make the trip.

ENABLE RETURNS IN VINTAGE ECLIPSE

Juddmonte's **Enable (GB)** (Nathaniel {Ire}) is set for a stern test on her eagerly-awaited return to the track on Sunday, with **Ghaiyyath (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) one of her key rivals in an eight-strong entry for the G1 Coral-Eclipse at Sandown. The dual Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner is set to reappear for the first time since she lost her 12-race unbeaten sequence when runner-up to **Waldgeist (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) in pursuit of her hat-trick in Paris last October.

John Gosden's brilliant mare will be defending her Sandown crown, having begun her campaign last summer with an odds-on victory in the Eclipse. At six, she is due to face a tough challenger in Charlie Appleby's Ghaiyyath--a year her junior and a dual winner since finishing only 10th of 12 at ParisLongchamp last October. Ghaiyyath made virtually all for emphatic victories in the G3 Dubai Millennium S. at Meydan and then the re-routed G1 Coronation Cup at Newmarket earlier this month. William Buick is set to team up with the Dubawi horse again and he is anticipating a thorough test for his mount.

Buick said, "It is obviously a tough race, but he is a horse I'm looking forward to riding again as he was great at Newmarket last time in the Coronation Cup. It looks like a real highlight, but that is the Eclipse for you. It has been billed as that before and it is a great race. I know it is only a small field, but it is a very select field and there are world champions in there. This could be the race of the season." [Cont. p7](#)

CURTIS RECEIVES DERBY RIDE ON HIGHLAND CHIEF

Ben Curtis has been handed a first G1 Investec Derby ride on Royal Ascot winner **Highland Chief (Ire)** (Gleneagles {Ire}). Trained by Paul and Oliver Cole, the colt was ridden to victory at Ascot by Rossa Ryan but was due to be partnered by Andrea Atzeni at Epsom. However, with Atzeni claimed to ride David Simcock's **Mohican Heights (Ire)** (Australia {GB}), Curtis has been called up after a brilliant start to the season.

"Andrea didn't foresee that he had to ride for someone else and he's got to ride for some Hong Kong owners for David Simcock," Oliver Cole told *Sky Sports Racing*. "So, we got Ben Curtis this morning. He's had 96 winners this year--two Group 3 winners, including a Royal Ascot winner. He's really riding well, with confidence, so we thought he would be perfect."

Of the horse, Cole added, "I wouldn't say he's improving all the time, he's always been a good horse. He was third to Pinatubo (Ire) (Shamardal) in the Chesham last season and would have been closer with a clear run. In the Royal Lodge we don't know

why he ran so badly, his tail was sticking out quite high.

"We went into Ascot quietly confident, although he had top weight, but he made up lots of ground and did it well. He should stay, but you never know until they run."

OWNERS ALLOWED BACK AT ENGLISH RACECOURSES ON JULY 4

Owners will be able to start attending race meetings in a safe and risk-managed way in the UK on July 4, under plans agreed by the Racecourse Association (RCA), Racehorse Owners Association (ROA) and the British Horseracing Authority (BHA), the BHA announced on Monday. There will be two test fixtures--July 1 at Southwell and Kempton Park--to pilot protocols and allow for a thorough review of the processes in place to facilitate a smooth implementation, with [guidelines to help owners adjust to new protocols and procedures available here](#). Owners will be notified directly via email about how to register for test events once their horse is declared to run. The protocols only apply to racecourses in England, and not all racecourses will be able to accommodate owners immediately.

The following measures will apply to all race meetings able to facilitate the return of owners until further notice:

- A maximum of two owners (or representatives) per horse can attend for their race(s) only.
- Pre-registration ahead of all race meetings using the RCA's Privilege Access Swipe System (PASS) and only confirmed attendees will be granted access to the racecourse. Owners will be emailed automatically with details on how to register once their horse is declared to run.
- A health screening process, which includes the BHA's COVID-19 online learning module and a personally administered health assessment in advance of raceday, followed by health questions and a temperature check upon arrival.
- Owners to arrive no earlier than 45 minutes before their first horse is due to run and leave the racecourse within one hour following the final race in which they have a confirmed runner.
- Dedicated 'owner zones', which will separate owners from raceday workers (trainers, stable staff, jockeys, officials, media etc.) for infection control purposes. No movement will be permitted between the two areas.

These temporary measures will be eased gradually subject to government guidance, and are in line with British [racing's protocols for behind closed doors racing](#). They are approved by the UK government and underpinned by specific government guidance around the return of [elite domestic sporting competition behind closed doors](#). [Cont. p8](#)

“As with our wider approach to resumption, the return of owners is predicated on a phased, risk-managed plan, which establishes infection control protocols that are essential for the safe continuation of racing during the ongoing COVID-19 situation,” said BHA Chief Medical Adviser Dr. Jerry Hill. “These include pre-entry screening for owners and segregated areas to facilitate social distancing at no closer than two metres--measures that prioritise the safety of our attendees, are consistent with government guidance for elite sports fixtures behind closed doors, and are supported by the UK Government.”

Added RCA Chief Executive David Armstrong, "We are delighted to be able to welcome back owners to the racecourse, albeit in limited numbers for now. Owners are critical to our sport and their patience and support during lockdown has been vital. The special measures that are set out in the new protocols should enable owners to enjoy the racing experience again but to do so in a safe and responsible fashion."

“It’s great to have owners back on the course and I’d like to thank the BHA, the racecourses and the team at the ROA for their hard work since the resumption of racing to put in place protocols for owners to attend,” said ROA Chief Executive Charlie Liverton. “Owners contribute so much to this sport and it has been frustrating not to be on the track to see their horses run. Their patience and loyalty has been very much appreciated during this challenging period. There is still more work to do and we will continue to work with owners and racing’s stakeholders to get our sport back up and running in full with people across the UK able to enjoy a day’s racing on course when it is safe and appropriate to do so.”

Not far from the Baltic Sea, Tilsit was a contested town of many names, in different languages: it was Tilsit in German, Tilžė in Lithuanian, Tylza in Polish, and now Sovetsk in Russian, since 1945. Napoleon signed two treaties in Tilsit in 1807, at the apex of his power: first with the Russian Czar Alexander I (on a raft in the river Neman) and then with the Prussians two days later. A first foal out of very promising mare Multilingual, 3-year-old colt Tilsit, who won at Newcastle by 19 lengths last Saturday, carries a name that is inspired and inspiring.

TRAILBLAZER DANZERO REMEMBERED

G1 Golden Slipper S. winner and successful stallion **Danzero** has passed away peacefully at Rosemont Stud in Victoria at age 28.

Danzero was a trailblazer for his sire Danehill (USA) in Australia, becoming his first Australian-bred stakes winner when claiming the Listed Maribyrnong Trial on debut in October 1993 and then etching his name as his first Group 1 winner in the world when he won the 1994 Golden Slipper for trainer Lee Freedman and jockey Greg Hall.

He was retired to Arrowfield Stud after his 3-year-old campaign, which included another stakes win in the McNeil S. and became the first son of his sire to stand in Australia.

As a stallion, he would sire 669 winners, 40 of them at stakes level, including the Group 1 winners Niconero, Jymcarew, Danni Martine, Danglissa, Fairway and Dance Hero.

Dance Hero would not only emulate his sire in winning Australia's richest and most prestigious 2-year-old race, 11 years on, but would also claim the 2-year-old Triple Crown in adding both the G1 Sires' Produce S. and the G1 Champagne S to his Golden Slipper success.

Danzero was at the vanguard of the Danehill-revolution, which saw the bloodlines of his superstar sire become the most dominant in the Australian thoroughbred industry for the past 25 years.

He was bred by Arrowfield Stud from the stakes-placed mare Confidentially (Kaoru Star) and was sold as a yearling for \$55,000 to a group of owners including David Kobritz.

He would return to the farm where he was bred, reportedly for nearly 50 times his original price, where he stayed, with the exception of one year at Chatswood Stud in Victoria, before he moved to Rosemont Stud in 2011 to be its foundation stallion.

Crowned Champion First-Season Sire in 1998/99, Danzero finished top five in the Australian Sires Table on two occasions. The first time was in 1999/2000, where his first-crop pair Danglissa and Fairway gave him multiple Group 1 successes, in what was just his second season with runners to the track.

Thanks largely to Dance Hero's heroics, he would finish fourth on the Sires' table in 2003/04. As a measure of the tremendous consistency of his progeny, he had multiple stakes winners for 14 straight seasons.

Danzero also shuttled three seasons to Cheveley Park in Great Britain, with the champion 2-year-old filly Soar (GB), his best horse among 34 winners there. All in all, he had winners in 26 different countries.

"There is no doubt he is one of the finest stallions we have produced," Arrowfield's John Messara said when he moved to Rosemont. "He was bred by us, sold by us, bought back by us and was Danehill's first Group 1 winner."

A Foundation for Rosemont

Danzero spent three seasons at Rosemont before he retired due to fertility issues.

"He was the first stallion to stand at Rosemont and was in fact the only stallion to stand at our original farm at Ceres," Rosemont Principal Anthony Mithen said. "He helped set in motion the stallion business for us and ultimately the purchase of Rosemont Gnarwarre from Tony Santic which is now home to our five-strong stallion roster."

Mithen said the farm would owe a debt of gratitude to Danzero, who changed the nature of the business forever.

"It is fair to say he changed the course of what we do at Rosemont. We had an itch to scratch and try the stallion game and he got us off the mark. While his fertility let him down, the horse didn't disappoint us," he said. "It was an honour to have him on the farm and he was revered by all that got to lean over his fence and give him a pat. He helped teach us the stallion game and was a true gentleman."

"He has been in the best health for the nine years he's been with us. He refused to be boxed at night. We built him his own expensive box before he arrived, only to learn he hated being cooped up and just wanted to spend his days and nights outside-rugged and roaming. I think he spent only three nights in that box ever.

"Our longest serving employee Suzanne Mowat who has looked after him for the best part of a decade found him Sunday morning, resting peacefully. He will now be buried just outside his paddock. May he rest easy."

While his impact as a sire of stallions himself was limited to his sons Masked Assassin and Marechal, he leaves a significant legacy through his daughters, who have produced 31 stakes winners, including Group 1 winners Exosphere, Kolding (NZ) (Ocean Park {NZ}), Danzdanzdance (NZ) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}), Julius (NZ) (Swiss Ace) and December Draw (Ire) (Medecis {Ire}).

Along with Darley's Exosphere and Argyle Thoroughbreds Marechal, Kingstar Farm's new stallion Unite And Conquer, a maternal grandson of Danglissa, is the other active sire to carry Danzero's blood in Australia.
