He's like the clean-cut, wide-eyed rookie sent into the lines, trying to read the expressions of the relieved troops. What might the likes of **Charlatan** (Speightstown) and **Nadal** (Blame) tell this star cadet, as they hand over the trenches, to steel him for the challenges ahead? **Cezanne** (Curlin) probably thinks they could do with a shave, and shouldn't be smoking on duty. But then he will notice the medals on their chests, and start to ask himself whether he too will step up; whether he will live up to everything his instructors thought they could see on the parade ground.

Charlatan and Nadal won Grade I skirmishes, of course, before being forced out of the GI Kentucky Derby trail, but their general Bob Baffert has already ordered reinforcements into the breach. **Uncle Chuck** (Uncle Mo) is evidently going after the East's leading colt next weekend, and meanwhile he deploys Cezanne against the premier sophomore on his home front.

Having previously professed faith in the calm genius of his trainer, we will defer for now what would otherwise seem the obvious concern about **Honor A.P.** (Honor Code): that he will be required to beat more horses in a single race, come Derby day, than he will have encountered in his whole life outside maiden company. Instead we'll focus not just on Cezanne, but on another Baffert sophomore who likewise weaves a fascinating sub-plot into an epic Saturday. *Cont. p3*

Cezanne and Eight Rings (Empire Maker) have very different profiles, to this point, but they do have one important thing in common. The critical tests they undertake, on either coast, will go a long way to determining the yield (or otherwise) on hefty investment made by John Magnier and various partners.

For Magnier, having brought consecutive Triple Crown winners to Ashford out of his barn, has shown his faith in the Baffert program by seeking its next champions at a rather earlier stage of their development.

Cezanne topped the Gulfstream Sale last year, at \$3.65 million; and it's safe to assume that pretty giddy stakes were also required to complete a deal to stand Eight Rings, on his retirement, just days before he lined up for the GI TVG Breeders' Cup Juvenile. An Eclipse Award was plainly in the offing that day, but he blew what hindsight suggests to have been a golden opportunity and fared no better when resurfacing at Oaklawn in the spring.

Since returning to the worktab, however, Eight Rings has teased his ownership group--a formidable assembly, even before the advent of Coolmore--that he may yet turn things round. In his four latest breezes, he has clocked a guicker time than 209 of 212 other animals going the same distance. Cont. p4

And it's not as though his reputation ever depended only on what he did in the mornings. Juveniles don't make all in Grade I races, roaring away by six lengths with the eventual class champion toiling in third, unless they have a ton of natural talent.

We know that Thoroughbreds are complicated creatures, seldom with a single lock taking a single key. But if Baffert has figured out where the real Eight Rings has been hiding, his latest comeback in the GI Allen Jerkens S., presented by Runhappy, could yet intrude on back-to-back weekends potentially showcasing sons of Violence--No Parole succeeding Volatile--as the fastest of their respective crops.

Cezanne, for his part, holds rather more appeal for romantics (whose instinct is naturally to root for the underdog) than tends to be the case with sale-toppers. Apart from anything else, we do occasionally need our beliefs regarding pedigree, conformation and so on to work out sufficiently for this business to be sustainable and, if Cezanne is to prove one of the poster boys, then that's a gratifying prospect for the many friends of the late J.J. Crupi.

Nobody cherished Crupi more than Vinnie Viola of St Elias Stables, who co-bred Cezanne and retained a stake after his sale. Not merely because he acquired Liam's Map (Unbridled's Song) through Crupi as a yearling, and also shared in the success of Always Dreaming (Bodemeister), but primarily because of an exceptional personal rapport.

On losing his friend, just weeks after the Fasig-Tipton sale, Viola's tribute was pitch-perfect. Anyone can achieve a superficial eloquence by sheer craft, by an intelligent sense for the weight or rhythm of words. But you can only introduce that authenticating, third dimension when you also talk from the heart, as Viola did then. Even as he grieved Crupi, he made him live again. For most of us, even everyday situations tend to leave us only groping towards what we wish to convey.

But here was an occasion when the usual poverty of language was rendered equal to the richness of a human life. So while firmly committed to Honor A.P., I do wish Mr. Viola and his partners well with Cezanne in the Shared Belief S.

Besides, he is out of a Bernardini mare. It is only a few days since we celebrated this extraordinarily precocious broodmare sire, but already yet another of his daughters has since produced a Grade I winner in **Paris Lights** (Curlin). This year, of course, Bernardini also has a colt in play for the Derby---and the people behind Art Collector certainly command respect and affection, too, as we'll be reiterating in the days ahead.

In the meantime Cezanne can seek a chink in the Honor A.P. armour that seems likely to close up once he gets a chance to use that low, unrelenting stride over a longer distance. Whatever he may lack in seasoning, Honor A.P. at least seems sure to relish the stamina demands of the Churchill cavalry charge.

One way or another, it's a day when Coolmore's chips with Baffert are piled pretty high. Eight Rings was named for the Super Bowl accomplishments of football coach Bill Belichick, who was apparently also in mind (though I'm straying well beyond home ground here) in Bon Jovi's Bounce: 'I'll take the hit but not the fall' etc. Though some may have counted Eight Rings out, this is the day he could well come bouncing back again.

Keeneland, Fasig-Tipton Lobbying for

Overseas Buyers (cont. from p1)

Foreign nationals traveling from Europe--as well as Brazil, Iran and China--are currently not permitted to enter the U.S., but Keeneland Vice President and Chief Operating Officer Vince Gabbert said that Keeneland and Fasig-Tipton are working together with government officials in an effort to allow foreign buyers to gain entry for the sales. Gabbert said he is "cautiously optimistic" that they will reach an agreement.

"The way we've approached this has been a combination between what we're seeing with the sports leagues and what we know from a business interest side," Gabbert said. "We've been working very closely with homeland security and we've essentially engaged every person we can get a hold of to help us with this, from Congressman [Andy] Barr, who has been extremely helpful from the outset--Senator [Mitch] McConnell, Ambassador [Kelly] Craft and Commissioner [Ryan] Quarles through his relationships with the USDA and Secretary [Sonny] Perdue [of the USDA]. All of them have been really willing to help us and to foster these conversations with homeland security because there are specific waivers that we will have to fill out for our customers who want to travel to make sure they're able to get over here. All of our conversations with them have been, 'Tell us what protocols you need us to follow for you to have confidence that we're not going to create an issue, and we'll do that.'



He continued, "All of those folks have been extremely helpful, and each individual I've mentioned has assigned a specific staffer to our issue so we have specific folks in each of those offices that we're working with to make sure we get as many people over here as possible."

Gabbert said ensuring government has an understanding of the importance and economic impact of the Thoroughbred industry is a priority for the Keeneland staff even during normal times, and so the foundation was already laid.

"I feel good about the conversations we've had," he said. "I feel really good about the effort that our government officials are putting in on our behalf. A lot of it is just working through that bureaucracy that just automatically exists within government. I'm cautiously optimistic; we feel like we have a good plan in place for the entirety of the sale and we're working in concert with Fasig-Tipton as well so we have the same protocols in both places and we're working together with them on this request as well, so this has been a joint request on behalf of both sales companies. We have an unprecedented partnership with how we're working together and I feel good about the request and what we've put in place. We just have to continue to navigate it and make sure we're talking to the right folks."

While overseas visitors may be faced with quarantines upon returning to their home countries, Gabbert said that doesn't seem to have dampened enthusiasm.

"A lot of our international buyers, especially the Europeans, have expressed a strong, strong interest in coming over here regardless of what happens when they get back," he said. "We are very excited about the amount of enthusiasm that people are showing in wanting to be here. We're doing everything we can and we're fortunate there are still a number of countries that are not on that prohibition. Japan, Australia, and a number of the South American countries that are our markets as well, people are free to travel to and from. They may have different requirements when they return to their home countries, but we are going to do everything we can from a protocol standpoint and everything we can to provide a safe and secure facility so people can come over here with confidence and return home with confidence."

Gabbert said at this stage that it doesn't look as if visitors will be required to quarantine when arriving in Kentucky, but COVID testing may be a part of the process.

"We don't have everything finalized but we're working very closely with our local health department and both us and Fasig-Tipton are working very closely with local health professionals to make sure that we're following all the recommendations from the CDC and the local health department," he said. "Right now we would not anticipate any need for a quarantine or for people to isolate once they get here, but we are looking at what might be available from a testing standpoint, how we monitor that-our goal is to give everybody the confidence that they're coming onto the grounds in a safe and secure manner, and what all does that entail? Testing is part of that, enforcing social distancing and requiring a mask, reducing capacity in the sales pavilion, but still providing other opportunities for people to bid on horses. Those are the things we're working through."

Gabbert acknowledged that the presence of overseas buyers is "extremely important" and that the Keeneland and Fasig-Tipton teams will continue to lobby for their presence and update their customers along the way.

"I can't emphasize enough how much we need and want everybody that can get here to get here," he said. "Especially when you look throughout the sale, each book essentially has a really different feel to it and it's imperative that we maintain that strength and that buying bench throughout the entire sale, and the international presence is a tremendous part of that. We're going to keep working on it until we get definition and we'll be communicating out to our customers and if there is paperwork they have to fill out, we'll be in a spot to assist them to navigate that process."

CDI SEEKS TO SELL ARLINGTON LAND

The long-term future for Churchill Downs, Inc. (CDI) to continue racing in Illinois involves selling its Arlington International Racecourse land for another purpose and transferring the corporation's racing license to another location.

Bill Carstanjen, the chief executive officer of CDI, outlined the gaming company's desire to rid itself of Chicago's premier Thoroughbred venue in a July 30 conference call with investors. His comments came six days after Arlington's delayed 2020 season opening (because of the pandemic and a bitter contract dispute with local horse people) and one day before 2021 dates applications were due to be filed with the Illinois Racing Board.

Carstanjen was responding to a question from an investment analyst who asked about the gaming corporation's "broad Illinois strategy" with respect to Arlington.

"We reached an agreement with the horsemen [and] we're running the race meet right now," Carstanjen said, according to an edited transcript of the call posted on Yahoo! Finance. "We'll run a 2020 race meeting. We have an agreement to run a 2021 race meet if we elect to do so. That's not a long-term viable solution for the Arlington Park license."

Carstanjen continued, "Long-term for Arlington Park, as we've explained on these calls, and [as] we've explained to the state, it doesn't work. The economics don't work. It's not a viable solution. We'd like to give the state, given everything that's going on, an opportunity to help us find a better long-term solution. But the long-term solution is not Arlington Park. That land will have a higher and better purpose for something else at some point.

"But we want to work constructively with all of the constituencies in the market to see if there's an opportunity to move the license or otherwise change the circumstances so that racing can continue in Illinois. But for us, we've been patient and thoughtful and constructive with the parties up in that jurisdiction.

"But long term, that land gets sold, and that license will need to move if it's going to continue," Carstanjen said. "And the time frame for doing that is not something I'm going to comment on this call today, and it's not definitive. But certainly, certainly, it's something that's on our mind on a week-to-week basis, if not a day-to-day basis."

The relationship between Arlington and the horse people who race on the Illinois circuit has been contentious for several years now. The split widened considerably last August when Arlington management stunned Illinois stakeholders by intentionally missing a deadline to apply for a racino license after more than a decade of working with the Illinois Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (ITHA) to get the Illinois Gaming Act passed as a way to boost purses via other forms of betting.

Arlington's decision not to pursue slot machines and table games at the track took on heightened controversy because Arlington's corporate parent, Churchill Downs, Inc. (CDI), has an ownership stake in a nearby competing casino and is aiming to open another near Chicago. Horsemen have stated a belief that CDI doesn't want Arlington competing with its own (and potentially more lucrative) venues. Last summer, CDI cited the racino law's requirement of having to contribute gaming revenues to the Thoroughbred purse account as a competitive disadvantage it did not want to undertake.

The Daily Herald of suburban Chicago obtained a statement on Thursday from the ITHA that stated, "For Churchill's CEO to say preposterously that Churchill has been 'patient' with other stakeholders speaks to the height of Churchill's contempt for the elected officials and working families of Illinois. The very least that Churchill could do is be honest about its true intention. The company cares only about maximizing profit and is happy to sacrifice the spirit of Illinois law and the livelihood of working Illinoisans to serve its greed."

Carstanjen also disclosed on the call that despite applying for a sports betting license in March, Arlington no longer plans on pursuing it.

"Currently, we're not planning on doing sports wagering there through the Arlington license. We're happy to play heavily in Illinois and sports wagering through our Rivers [Casino] license," he said. That venue is about 10 miles from Arlington and CDI owns a 61% stake in it.

The Daily Herald quoted a rebuke from Tom Hayes, the mayor of Arlington Heights, where the track is located.

"It's very disappointing to hear," Hayes said. "Certainly, I've never felt Churchill Downs was all that concerned about Arlington Heights and our community at all. I think they're concerned about the bottom line."

CODE OF HONOR SEEKS TRAVERS-WHITNEY DOUBLE

Last year's GI Runhappy Travers S. hero **Code of Honor** (Noble Mission {GB}) looks to become the first horse since Medaglia d'Oro in 2002/2003 to complete the Travers-GI Whitney S. double Saturday at Saratoga and secure a spot in the starting gate for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Capturing the GIII Dwyer S. last term prior to his Travers score, the W.S. Farish homebred came up a nose short of champion Vino Rosso (Curlin) in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup S. in September, but was promoted to first via DQ. Seventh to that rival next out in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic in November, the chestnut captured his seasonal bow in Belmont's GIII Westchester S. June 6 and was third last out in the GI Runhappy Met Mile July 4.

"It won't be easy, but I just hope Code of Honor runs a monster race," Shug McGaughey told the NYRA notes team. "It will be kind of interesting to see what the tactics are with only five [horses]. I know where I'm going to be, but I'm not sure what the others are going to do or how much they're going to press."

Tom's d'Etat (Smart Strike) is leading the handicap division at the moment and enters this test on a four-race win streak. Winner of Keeneland's GII Hagyard Fayette S. in October, the bay followed suit with his first top-level success in the GI Clark S. in November. Denying **Improbable** (City Zip) by 3/4 of a length in the Oaklawn Mile Apr. 11, Tom's d'Etat romped by 4 1/4 lengths in the GII Stephen Foster S. at Churchill June 27.

"You can see from his PPs that when the pace is fast, he comes from off the pace and if it's slow, he's right on top of it," said trainer Al Stall. "That's a good thing for us. [The compact field is] not my problem. That's for [jockey] Joel Rosario and it's 100% in his hands. Joel is undefeated on him." The Stephen Foster runner-up was **By My Standards** (Goldencents), who kicked off 2020 with a trio of victories, starting with a Feb. 9 optional claimer at Fair Grounds. The bay went on take both the GII New Orleans Classic S. Mar. 21 and GII Oaklawn H. May 2.

Improbable, on the other hand, rounded back into his best form last time out. Off the board in the GI Pennsylvania Derby in September and the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile in November, the chestnut was second in the aforementioned Oaklawn Mile and returned to winning ways in the 10-furlong GI Hollywood Gold Cup S. at Santa Anita June 6.

Rounding out the quintet is hometown hero **Mr. Buff** (Friend or Foe). The native New Yorker is an eight-time stakes winner, including the Jazil S. in January and Haynesfield S. in February. Runner-up in the Commentator S. at Belmont Jun 12, the chestnut was fifth last time in the GII Suburban S. July 4.

'BISOU' LOOKS TO DEFEND PERSONAL ENSIGN TITLE

Champion **Midnight Bisou** (Midnight Lute) will attempt to successfully defend her title in Saturday's GI Personal Ensign S. at Saratoga. Winner of seven of eight starts last year, including three Grade Is, the bay followed her win in this event with a facile score in the GI Beldame S. at Belmont in September. She suffered her sole loss last season in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff Nov. 2, but had still done more than enough to secure the Eclipse Award as top older mare. Running last most of the way in the \$20-million Saudi Cup Feb. 29, the dark bay made a bold late run up the fence to finish a valiant second behind champion Maximum Security (New Year's Day). Midnight Bisou returned to winning ways last out in the GII Fleur de Lis H. at Churchill Downs June 27. Grade II winner **Point of Honor** (Curlin) finished second in both the GI CCA Oaks and GI Alabama S. at the Spa last summer. Kicking off this term with a second at Tampa Mar. 7, the chestnut was third in the GI Apple Blossom H. Apr. 18 and rallied to be second by a nose behind She's a Julie (Elusive Quality) in Belmont's GI Ogden Phipps S. June 13.

Off the board in an Apr. 30 allowance at Oaklawn, the bay was third in a June 6 test at Churchill and was best of the rest when second to champion Monomoy Girl (Tapizar) in Belmont's GII Ruffian S. July 11.

STEPHENS TOP FOUR RETURN IN JERKENS

Four out of the five runners from the GI Woody Stephens S.-topped by winner **No Parole** (Violence)--will face off again Saturday in a loaded renewal of the GI H. Allen Jerkens S. at Saratoga. '**TDN Rising Star**' No Parole won his first three races against fellow LA-breds by a combined 34 lengths. Facing defeat for the first time when trying two turns in the GII Rebel S. Mar. 14, the bay returned to the winner's circle when cut back to six panels in an Oaklawn optional claimer Apr. 24 and was last seen scoring a decisive victory in the Woody Stephens June 20.

Fellow '**TDN Rising Star' Echo Town** (Speightstown) captured a Churchill optional claimer May 25 prior to a runner-up effort in the Woody Stephens. The third-place finisher in that test, **Shoplifted** (Into Mischief) is also a '**TDN Rising Star**' and winner of the Springboard Mile S. at the end of last year. Woody Stephens fourth-place finisher **Mischevious Alex** (Into Mischief), won the GIII Swale S. Feb. 1 and GIII Gotham S. Mar. 7.

Eight Rings (Empire Maker) looks to return to his juvenile form in this test. Winner of the GI American Pharoah S. last term, the '**TDN Rising Star**' could only manage sixth in the Nov. 1 GI TVG Breeders' Cup Juvenile S. and was fifth in his seasonal bow in Oaklawn's Bachelor S. last time Apr. 25.

Tap It To Win (Tapit) should relish this cut back in trip. Capturing a six-panel event at Gulfstream May 9, the bay wired the field when stretched to 1 1/16 miles at Belmont June 4 and was wheeled back just 16 days later in the nine-furlong GI Belmont S., where he faded to fifth after setting the pace.

ILLUSION TAKES ON ELDERS IN CROSBY

The lightly raced sophomore **Collusion Illusion** (Twirling Candy) will try to give his elders a run for their money Saturday in Del Mar's GI Bing Crosby S., a "Win and You're In" for the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint S. Opening his account with a pair of wins, including the GII Best Pal S. last summer, he was pulled up when trying two turns in the GI American Pharoah S. in September. Returning May 17, he scored a decisive victory in a six-panel optional claimer at Santa Anita and repeated that performance in the GIII Lazaro Barrera S. there June 20.

Fashionably Fast (Lucky Pulpit) won six straight races, including four Cal-bred stakes over the winter. The chestnut enters this off a second-place finish behind MGISW McKinzie (Street Sense) in the GII Triple Bend S. last time June 7. McKinzie was the morning-line favorite in this event at entries, but he is expected to be scratched.

Dual Grade III winner **Law Abidin Citizen** (Twirling Candy) takes a crack at the highest level here. Victorious in the GIII Longacres Mile H. last August, he was fourth I the GII San Carlos S. Mar. 7 at Santa Anita and missed by a head behind stakes winner Ax Man (Misremembered) in an Arcadia optional claimer May 16 and won a 6 1/2-panel event there last time June 14.

HONOR A.P. SQUARES OFF WITH BAFFERT DUO IN SHARED BELIEF

Honor A.P. (Honor Code) looks to add more GI Kentucky Derby points to his collection in Saturday's Shared Belief S. at Del Mar. An impressive second-out graduate when extending from six panels to a mile at Santa Anita in October, the \$850,000 FTSAUG buy was runner-up to recent GI Haskell S. victor Authentic (Into Mischief) in the GII San Felipe S. Mar. 7. The dark bay turned the tables on that rival last time with a decisive score in the GI Santa Anita Derby June 6.

Bob Baffert had three set for this test, but undefeated '**TDN Rising Star**' and GIII Los Alamitos Derby winner **Uncle Chuck** (Uncle Mo) has been re-routed to the GI Runhappy Travers S. Aug. 8. That leaves **Thousand Words** (Pioneerof the Nile) and **Cezanne** (Curlin) to represent the Hall of Famer. Opening his account with a trio of wins, including the GII Los Alamitos Futurity and GIII Robert B. Lewis S., Thousand Words was fourth in the San Felipe and faded to 11th in the Oaklawn S. Apr. 11. Given a brief freshening, the \$1-million KEESEP buy ran second to his stablemate in the Los Al Derby last time.

Cezanne puts his undefeated record on the line here. A debut winner sprinting in Arcadia June 6, the \$3.65-million FTFMAR topper captured a one-mile event at Los Alamitos last time July 2.

Also defecting from the field is Santa Anita Derby fourth-place finisher **Anneau d'Or** (Medaglia d'Oro), who will instead contest the Aug. 9 Ellis Park Derby. **Kiss Today Goodbye** (Cairo Prince) rounds out the now four-horse field. Breaking his maiden at fifth asking at Santa Anita Feb. 22, he was 10th last time in an optional claimer there May 17.



Ed DeRosa of Brisnet.com takes on TDN's Steve Sherack and Brian DiDonato as they handicap Triple Crown prep races plus the big three races themselves. The three will make \$100 Win/Place bets in the preps and \$200 in/Place bets in the Belmont, Kentucky Derby and Preakness. Highest bankroll at the end wins.

DeRosa - Haskell Result - Longshot Jesus' Team was fourth. Bankroll: \$4960.

Shared Belief S. - The Shared Belief could provide needed points to **Cezanne** and lagniappe to Honor A. P., so we'll go with the horse who actually needs the points to compete in the GI Kentucky Derby presented by Woodford Reserve. There's more to it than that, of course, as Cezanne has both a tactical (front-end) and weight (-6 pounds) advantage over his chief rival in what has become a compact field. **Selection: #6 Cezanne** (7-2).

Sherack - *Haskell Result* - Not exactly how you want to see a 3-5 shot win, but **Authentic** just hung on for a narrow decision after having a pretty easy time of it up front. *Bankroll: \$3425.*

Shared Belief S. - With the expected late scratches of a couple of contenders, this can turn into an oddly run race for the remaining field of four. That being said, it's awfully hard to make a case against who I firmly believe is the best 3-year-old in the country, even at a short price. *Selection: #5 Honor A. P. (8-5).*

DiDonato - **Haskell Result** - How in the world did they let Authentic get so loose? **Dr Post** always seemed under a ride and settled for third. I was a little surprised to see them choose the Haskell over Runhappy Travers given his grindy style, and would expect him to run a bit better at Churchill, though not sure he can beat the top few. **Bankroll: \$5125.**

KENTUCKY JUDGE VACATES LASIX LAWSUIT RULING

Franklin County Circuit Court Judge Thomas Wingate on Friday vacated his own ruling from June which dismissed a lawsuit filed by the Kentucky Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association against Churchill Downs and Keeneland for implementing rules prohibiting the race-day use of Lasix in 2-year-olds, according to published reports. The KHBPA had sought a temporary injunction to prevent the rules from being implemented, but Wingate ruled June 1 that the organization lacked standing to bring the litigatation. In his Friday ruling, Wingate agreed with the KHBPA's argument that it had not been given sufficient time to address the issue of its standing in the matter. His ruling paves the way for the lawsuit to continue with a date for oral arguments expected to be announced within the next 10 days.

NEW OWNERS CONSIDER RUNHAPPY TRAVERS FOR SOUTH BEND

South Bend (Algorithms), purchased privately by a partnership group that includes Gary Barber, Adam Wachtel, Peter Deutsch and Leonard Schleifer of Pantofel Stable following a runner-up effort in the June 27 GIII Ohio Derby, could make his first start for the new connections in the Aug. 8 GI Runhappy Travers S.

"We're leaning toward the Travers," confirmed the colt's new trainer Bill Mott. "The partnership group wants to have a good look at that. He'll work probably the first part of the week."

Previously campaigned by Sagamore Farm and trainer Stanley Hough, South Bend won last year's Street Sense S. over the main track at Churchill Downs and his three stakes placings over the turf include a third-place finish in the Feb. 29 GIII Palm Beach S.

Of the colt's versatility, Mott said, "I think that's one of the reasons they bought him. He looks good on both surfaces." In his first work for Mott, South Bend went four furlongs in :49.12 (5/31) at Saratoga July 27.

"We breezed him the one time. We like the horse, he's doing well," Mott said. "He's a nice horse to train. He moves well and he worked well for us. I'm happy with him."

Trainer Mike Stidham confirmed that Godolphin homebred **Mystic Guide** (Ghostzapper), most recently a closing third in the July 16 GIII Peter Pan S., is also under consideration for the Travers.

"The Travers is a possibility. He'll work [Saturday] and we'll know more after he works," said Stidham. "Ultimately, he has to put himself in a better position early. You can't win those types of races with that much to do late in the race. Our goal was to try blinkers on him and see what type of response he gives, so we can try to be a little bit closer."

Happier (f, 3, Street Sense--On My Way, by Giant's Causeway), a \$800,000 KEESEP yearling graduate, ran to the money in her unveiling for Hall of Famer Bob Baffert at Del Mar Friday evening, earning **'TDN Rising Star'** honors.

The 6-5 favorite shot out to the front from her inside draw and led through fractions of :22.71 and :45.89. She widened the margin as they turned for home and kept on rolling down the stretch to graduate by 3 1/4 lengths over stablemate **Himiko** (American Pharoah).

Happier was the most expensive of 61 yearlings by Street Sense to change hands in 2018. Baffert, of course, also trains Street Sense's four-time GISW and fellow 'Rising Star' McKinzie.

On My Way, a \$32,000 KEENOV purchase by breeder Waymore's F. Thomas Conway in foal to Cape Blanco (Ire) in 2012, also produced King Zachary (Curlin), GSW, \$366,120; and has a yearling colt by Frosted. She was bred to Vino Rosso for 2021.

The winner's granddam is a half-sister to the dam of recent Hong Kong champion Golden Sixty (Aus) (Medaglia d'Oro) and her great-granddam is a half-sister to the mighty Korveya (Riverman), whose foals included European champions Bosra Sham (Woodman) and Hector Protector (Woodman), as well as additional G1 winner Shanghai (Procida).

With no trainer hotter at Saratoga these days than Christophe Clement, who also won the allowance just prior to the Coronation Cup S., the only surprise surrounding the victory of She's My Type was that the public let her go at 4-1. Positioned third-last behind fractions of :21.74 and :44.25, She's My Type was covered up mid-pack and looked beaten in early stretch. Right around the time the leader covered five-eighths in :55.80, the waters parted like the Red Sea for She's My Type, who burst through an impossible hole, shrugged off some interference, and powered to the front, getting to the wire a half-length in front of Miss J McKay, who had also come on late to erase Shippy's three-length lead only strides before the line.

"Sometimes we are lucky, sometimes we are not," Clement said. "Today was lucky. She has a very good turn of foot. When she had the chance to finish, I thought she ran very well. I thought the way she was going at Gulfstream that she could go

from seven-eighths to a mile. Her brother [Tour To Paris] won a Group 2 [Prix du Gros-Chene at Deauville] in France a few months ago going five furlongs. That was one of the reasons we went back to sprinting with her and it seems to have worked out very well."

Now a two-time stakes winner, She's My Type broke her maiden last December at Gulfstream in her only start as a 2-year-old, then captured the Ginger Brew S. Jan. 20. Placings in the Mar. 28 Sanibel Island S. and the June 21 Lady Shipman S. marked her last two starts. The Coronation Cup was her first time going as short as 5 1/2 furlongs.

Theoricienne (Fr) has a juvenile full-brother to She's My Type named Sensible, who sold at last year's Osarus sale as a yearling for the equivalent of \$19,748. The mare has a yearling filly by Anodin (Fr). **Click for Equibase.com chart or VIDEO, sponsored by Fasig-Tipton.**

The gray found a seam at the rail on the turn, bumped hard with favored Lady T N T (Justin Phillip), forcing that one to check, then abruptly took up in the stretch. Unholy Alliance then took a right-hand turn to swing behind rivals, moving out several paths, and came on strong, flying down the lane to prevail in the last strides by a half-length over Pacific Gale (Flat Out). She paid \$15.20 as the longest shot in the field. Multiple stakes-placed at two and three for former trainer Brad Cox, Unholy Alliance made her debut for the Saffie Joseph, Jr. barn last October. After mixed success in Florida, including a last-out eighth-place finish in the GIII Hurricane Bertie S. Mar. 14, she rewarded Joseph with his first win at the Spa this year. Dam Canticle has not produced a foal since the 2017 gelding Calculate (Tale of the Cat), who broke his maiden by 8 1/4 lengths at Evangeline Downs July 24. BATTAASH CRACKS TRACK RECORD WITH FOURTH KING GEORGE



Battaash (Ire) | Racing Post

His odds were 2-7 and that proved generous as early as halfway as Shadwell's **Battaash (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) pulled off a historic fourth victory in Goodwood's G2 King George Qatar S. on Friday. Recording his fastest time (:55.62) in the race in the process, the G1 Nunthorpe S., G1 King's Stand S. and G1 Prix de l'Abbaye hero was shadowed by last year's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye winner **Glass Slippers (GB)** (Dream Ahead) but was comfortably on top at the line to score by 2 1/4 lengths, with **Ornate (GB)** (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) a neck away in third as he replicated his position in this 12 months ago. Dragged along by the fastest horse in Europe, the next two home also broke his previous track record.

"He was good, just getting a bit lonely out in front but it's very hard to find horses quick enough to lead him," Jim Crowley commented. "He was in front a long way and was just idling, so I had to give him a couple of taps just to keep his mind on the job. He's so fast and very consistent now. If a horse wants to take him on in a race then good luck to them. He's so quick he burns them off from halfway."

Battaash's achievement in bringing up four wins in this is nothing short of remarkable and history bears that out as fact. Cont. p2

TILSIT ON TOP AFTER THOROUGHBRED ENQUIRY

Tattersalls

Khalid Abdullah's Tilsit (First Defence) followed up a June 4 debut second at Newcastle with a breakthrough score--by a whopping 19 lengths--back there June 27 and survived a lengthy stewards' enquiry to be confirmed the winner of Friday's G3 Bonhams Thoroughbred S. at Goodwood. The 10-1 chance was steadied to race in third behind a modest tempo set by My Oberon (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) and remained there through halfway in this turf bow. Quickening to launch his challenge at the quarter-mile marker, he edged in front entering the final eighth, but suddenly veered right to force that rival into the farside fence with 150 yards remaining before returning on an even keel to hit the line with a 1 1/2-length advantage. My Oberon somehow managed to remain upright for second place, finishing 2 1/2 lengths ahead of 4-7 favourite Khaloosy (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) in third. As expected, Ryan Moore was sanctioned for the final-furlong incident which impeded My Oberon and incurred a five-day suspension for careless riding in the debrief.

"Tilsit had two runs at Newcastle, which is a completely different track to Goodwood, and it was his first start on turf so he has really stepped up and done so well," commented trainer Charlie Hills. "It was a good step forward really and he has beaten two very nice horses. We knew coming into today that we would know where we would stand after the race and we are all very excited now. Tilsit has come a long way and the guys at home have done a great job. [NH jockey] Will Kennedy has been coming in most days to ride and he has done a fantastic job. A lot of thought has gone into this horse. We'll see how he is tomorrow morning and go from there. We could maybe come back here for the [G2] Celebration Mile."

Teddy Grimthorpe added, "That was a huge step forward, but he is still very babyish and has to mature. You could see that slightly in the paddock beforehand, but he was much better than he was the previous two times. He has handled the race pretty well, but he did wander a bit, no doubt about that. He has some talent, no question, and I think fast ground is the key to him as well." **Cont. p4**

Battaash wins fourth King George cont.

Of all the current Group 1 and Group 2 sprints in operation, he is the only one to garner that amount of successes in the same race with only Fine Art (Fr) bettering it with his five victories in the Prix du Gros Chêne from 1942 to 1946. Post-war, he is out on his own and this was all the more meritorious in that he was slicing a decent fragment off his prior track record on terrain made to measure for his style. There have been very few who could go with him once he had done the damage travelling downhill and it took a fast Australian mare to make any kind of impact as Houtzen (Aus) (I Am Invincible {Aus}) became the sole rival to get within a length of him at the finish of this race last term. When you are this good, the only one left to beat is yourself and in his younger days Battaash was guilty of doing that on the occasions that his hot temperament got the better of him. Each year, with consistent tender handling and love and attention, he has become ever more the finished article in terms of maturity and now wanders around the parade ring like an old sage. Having finally conquered York's flat Knavesmire to win the Nunthorpe in August, he annexed a first King's Stand on his latest start June 16 and has now set this benchmark which is unlikely ever to be met. He does not even need to blast from the outset any more, with Crowley opting to coast through the first

1 1/2 furlongs without the lead as the free-running French raider **Ken Colt (Ire)** (Kendargent {Fr}) managed to outspeed Ornate. Charlie Hills was revelling in the moment as he tried to find expression for what he just seen. "He's so talented and we're very proud of him. To have a horse like him in the yard at six is amazing, to be involved with him means everything," he commented. "Four consecutive Group 2s takes some doing, he's not the biggest horse in the world but is so fast and wellbalanced. He's a true athlete. Further Flight, who my dad trained, is the only horse to win a pattern race five years on the trot so we might come back next year!"

Hills is looking at the familiar European sprint options now, but was also not ruling out a tilt at the Breeders' Cup. "He's not overly-raced and will have maybe two more runs this year," he added. "We're looking forward to the [G1] Coolmore Nunthorpe now and then probably the Abbaye, but it's a strange year and no-one really knows what the future holds. He'll go on until he tells us he's not the horse he was today. I love America and it would be tremendously exciting if he did go."

Kevin Ryan said of runner-up Glass Slippers, "She has run a blinder. I thought for a minute she was going to give him a race, but it is a great achievement by Battaash to win this race four years running. I'm delighted with our filly."

Looking ahead, Ryan said, "It is a possibility we could look at the Nunthorpe, but she is in the [G1] Flying Five in Ireland and we wouldn't mind going back up to six furlongs again in the [G1] Sprint Cup at Haydock. We always planned to run in the Sprint Cup, as she is as effective over six as she is over five furlongs. That could be an interesting race."

Grimthorpe continued, "I think he is still a bit goofy and immature and I wasn't at all optimistic we would keep the race. He was the best horse, no doubt about that, but it always worries me. Ryan [Moore] had his whip in his right hand, so that was good, and he has just dived in. He was always going to win so from that point of view the rules are spot on, but it is always a nervous moment. This was Tilsit's first race on turf and part of the learning curve for him, but he is pretty progressive by the looks of things. The Celebration Mile here could be a possibility and it is always nice to have a few thoughts about where we go and what to do. He looks on an upward curve and, trip-wise, I think we will stay at a mile."

William Haggas admitted after Friday's G3 L'Ormarins Queen's Plate Glorious S. that he may have made tactical errors with Hussain Alabbas Lootah's **Pablo Escobarr (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in the past, but it all came together as he captured a tight renewal of the 12-furlong Goodwood contest. Having been made too much use of when third in Newbury's Listed Steventon S. over a mile and a quarter July 19, the 9-2 shot enjoyed waiting in behind the leading group this time as Tom Marquand put the anchor down. Looming on the front end approaching the furlong pole, the bay had first run on last year's winner **Desert Encounter (Ire)** (Halling) and made that count as he prevailed by 3/4 of a length, with a head back to **Le Don De Vie (GB)** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) in third.

"That's the first time in ages we have given him a chance to drop in and get organised, so I owe an apology to his owner but we got it right today," Haggas said.

Runner-up to Anthony Van Dyck (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the Listed Lingfield Derby Trial last May, Pablo Escobarr underwent wind surgery after his subsequent fifth in Royal Ascot's G2 King Edward VII S. in June and returned with a second to Lord North (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) in the Listed James Seymour S. over 10 furlongs at Newmarket in November. Gaining his first black-type win in the Listed Wild Flower S. over this trip on Kempton's Polytrack in December, he was gelded following a fourth in the Mar. 7 G2 Dubai City of Gold at Meydan and third in

Newmarket's Listed Fred Archer S. June 28. This was a more fluent performance from Pablo Escobarr and he has the pedigree to make a mark in better company.

"We've always felt there was that little more to go to with this horse and today we changed things up and rode him with a touch more patience," Marquand said. "It paid to fill him up on the way round and get him enjoying it again."

Settled in a midfield seventh along the rail after an alert getaway from the inside stall, she was caught in a pocket--a la Kameko in Wednesday's G1 Sussex S.--passing the quarter-mile marker and engaged turbo after weaving a passage into second with 100 yards remaining to nail 12-1 chance Valeria Messalina (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) by a shorthead on the line for her first pattern-race success on home soil. A GLORIOUS SEND-OFF

Goodwood's Qatar Festival has lived up to its "Glorious" tag all week and Saturday sees the culmination with the G2 Qatar Lillie Langtry S. the key race for the staying fillies and mares. Despite there being only four participants, they are all notable

performers in the category and last year's winner Enbihaar (Ire) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) will have to be at or near her best to bring up the repeat. Twelve months ago, the Shadwell representative gave a stone and a five-length beating to Manuela de Vega (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}), defying the anchor of a combination of weight-for-age and a penalty here prior to adding Doncaster's G2 Park Hill S. to her tally. Perhaps undone by testing ground when third in

the G1 Prix de Royallieu at ParisLongchamp and fourth in the 12-furlong G2 Princess of Wales's S. on her seasonal bow at Newmarket July 9, she has ideal conditions again here. Shadwell's racing manager Angus Gold is looking for improvement from her comeback effort.

"I thought she stayed on well in the last part of the race at Newmarket," he explained. "It was her first run of the year, the trip was a bit short and the ground was soft enough for her as well. Hopefully, the ground will be on the quick side on Saturday, which will certainly help her. She is showing incredible enthusiasm and has this extraordinary action. You can never take anything for granted, but I would hope she'll put her best foot forward."

Since her heavy defeat in this last year, Manuela de Vega has come back at four a different proposition but had soft ground to suit when taking Haydock's G3 Pinnacle S. June 7 and G2 Lancashire Oaks July 5 over a mile and a half. She gets the threepound penalty as a result this time, which makes it all the harder for her to deal with Enbihaar but trainer Ralph Beckett is willing to give it a go.

"She's in very good shape and we're hoping she can go one better than last year," he said. "We think she's pretty adaptable ground-wise--I don't think it makes too much difference to her. It won't be easy giving the penalty away, but it's feasible."

Aside from that duo, the 3-year-olds **Snow (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Cabaletta (GB)** (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) are worthy of respect with the former coming in on the back of a fifth in the G1 Irish Oaks at The Curragh a fortnight ago and Cheveley Park Stud's **TDN Rising Star** Cabaletta also backing up quickly having won Newbury's Listed Aphrodite S. over a mile and a half on the same day.

Deauville ramps up the action as the August Festival gets

underway in earnest, with the G3 Prix Six Perfections Sky Sports Racing and G3 Prix de Psyche Sky Sports Racing enjoying a share of the focus. In the former for 2-vear-old fillies, Sean Mulryan, Linda Shanahan and Susan Magnier's unbeaten See The **Rose (Ire)** (Kendargent {Fr}) returns to the scene of her smooth six-furlong conditions success July 12. She has to deal with Godolphin's Wedding Dance (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), a member of Charlie Appleby's academy which always does

well here and she impressed with a 3 1/4-length success in a Newmarket maiden over this seven-furlong trip July 11.

"We were very pleased with Wedding Dance last time out, when she won nicely and she came out of the race well. This looks a nice opportunity for her to step up in grade," her trainer said.

"Alkandora is in good form and has done really well since her last race," Godolphin's Lisa-Jane Graffard said. "She will appreciate a step up in trip in time, but Andre is very happy with her condition and she deserves a try at this level."

Also in the mix is Tweenhills Fillies and Meridian International's impressive June 7 Listed Pretty Polly Fillies' S. winner **Run Wild (Ger)** (Amaron {GB}), who will be more at home back at that trip having finished last in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot June 20.

The British government on Friday morning withdrew permission for Goodwood Racecourse to host 5,000 spectators on Saturday as part of a pilot project for the return of fans to sporting events. A joint statement from the British Horseracing Authority, the Racecourse Association and Goodwood said it is believed the cancellation of the event is due to concerns about the national infection rate of coronavirus and is not a reflection of any concerns about Goodwood or the measures taken there. Racing will take place on Saturday behind closed doors.

David Armstrong, chief executive of the RCA, said, "The RCA is very disappointed to learn that the pilot event at Goodwood Racecourse scheduled for tomorrow has been postponed. We understand and respect the issues raised within the Prime Minister's announcement and have always maintained that public health has been paramount to any event, be it racing resuming behind closed doors or with crowds. The work undertaken by the sport, and especially the Goodwood team, to bring the safety protocols to life has been very thorough and detailed. It is worth reiterating there were no concerns with the protocols put in place by the sport and Goodwood Racecourse and we wish them the very best for the final two days of the Qatar Goodwood Festival which will take place behind closed doors. The RCA will continue to work closely with government to plan future pilot events to welcome back crowds subject to the latest public health advice."

SILVANO COLTS DOMINATE NATIONAL OPENER

Bloodstock South Africa's National Yearling Sale, delayed from its original April calendar date, at last got off and running for its two-day stand on Friday. Topping trade during the opening session was Wilgerbosdrift Stud's Silvano (Ger) colt out of local wondermare Halfway To Heaven (SAf) (Jet Master {SAf}) (lot 185), whose first two foals are the triple Group 1 winner Rainbow Bridge (SAf) (Ideal World) and champion 3-year-old and five-time Group 1 winner Hawwaam (SAf) (Silvano {Ger}). Hawwaam had been a R1-million yearling purchase by Shadwell South Africa, but his full-brother far outpointed that pricetag when bringing R7-million (£312,679/€347,508) on Friday from Summerhill Equestrian.

In fact, it was sons of Silvano who dominated trade on the day, in the end responsible for the top four prices. Jehan Malherbe of Form Bloodstock signed for the session's second and third highest-priced colts at R4.5-million (£201,008/€223,384) and R1.8-million (£80,390/€89,353): lot 106, a grandson of multiple champion mare Dancer's Daughter (GB) (Act One {GB}), and lot 186, whose dam is a half-sister to Horse of the Year Futura (SAf) (Dynasty {SAf}).


John Freeman purchased the fourth Silvano colt, the only other yearling in the session to crack seven figures: lot 109, the third foal out of Group 2 winner Demanding Lady (SAf) (Dynasty {SAf}) and half-brother to the G1 Cape Derby second Charles (SAf) (Trippi) made R1.3-million (£58,059/€64,533).

From 230 yearlings catalogued on the day, 158 were offered and 121 sold for an aggregate of R37,250,000

(£1,663,640/€1,849,127), an average of R307,851

(£13,749/€15,283) and a median of R150,000 (£6,700/€7,447). Comparative statistics will be published after Saturday's second session of the sale.

FERNRIGG BOLSTERS BROODMARE BAND

Fernrigg Farm has added lustre to its broodmare line-up with some significant purchases over recent months, while expanding its facility with the lease of an adjoining 150-acre property next to its Denman-based farm.

Rae-Louise Kelly, former yearling manager at Widden Stud, and Coolmore Australia head veterinarian Padraig Kelly established Fernrigg Farm in mid-2017 on a 70-acre farm just outside of Denman.

As their broodmare band continues to develop with strong investment at recent sales, the couple has also acquired more land to expand capacity and resources.

"As Fernrigg continues to grow, we are fortunate to have acquired a long-term lease of the former Collingrove Stud in Sandy Hollow to complement the Denman Farm," Rae-Louise Kelly said. "It is a quiet, tranquil environment and the mares have been thriving there over the past few months.

"The farm has undergone pasture improvement and has had new horse rail fencing installed. Padraig (Kelly) has also developed his veterinary hospital on site, so it is a peace of mind to have experienced vets on the farm 24/7 during the breeding season."

Fernrigg Purchases

The emerging Hunter Valley operation made an impact on the buyers' bench at this week's Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale on the Gold Coast, securing the well-related Tremor (Commands) in foal to I Am Invincible for \$600,000--the second highest price on the final day of the Sale.

Offered by Aquis Farm Operations, Tremor is a three-quarter sister to the Champion 2-year-old Earthquake (Exceed And Excel), the winner of the G1 Blue Diamond, G2 Reisling S., G3 Blue Diamond Prelude and G3 Thoroughbred Club S. and placegetter in the Golden Slipper.

Other siblings include the stakes performers Palomares (Commands) and Pandemic (Sepoy), while her dam Cataclysm (Marauding) placed in the G3 Sapphire S. and the Listed Birthday Card H. and Doveton S.

"She is an absolute queen, and we are delighted to be able to secure a part of one of Godolphin's great families," said Rae-Louise Kelly.

"She is a three-quarter sister to Earthquake, who was one of the best race fillies in Australia in recent years, winning the Blue Diamond and coming second in the Golden Slipper.

"She is also a full sister to the stakes-winning Palomares, who herself has produced the stakes horse Almanzora, along with the stakes-placed Pandemic. So it is a really active page that should continue to improve.

"Her I Am Invincible yearling filly this year is a beauty and is currently in training with Peter Moody. We are very excited to be foaling down a full sister or brother this season at Fernrigg."

Fernrigg's other purchase at the National Broodmare Sale was Unreal Deal (Redoute's Choice), a three-quarter sister to the Group 1 winner Dealer Principal (Flying Spur). She was a \$70,000 purchase from the draft of Lime Country Thoroughbreds.

"She is a nice, young Redoute's Choice mare, in foal to one of our favourite stallions, Lonhro," Kelly said. "She is a three-quarter relation to the Rosehill Guineas winner Dealer Principal."

Earlier in the year, Fernrigg paid \$550,000 to purchase Arabian Gold (Dubawi {Ire}) from Mill Park Stud's draft during the online Inglis Chairman's Sale in May. Like Tremor, she is carrying a foal by I Am Invincible.

Arabian Gold won nine races in a quality racing career, headed by the G2 Doomben Roses, G3 Golden Pendant, G3 Adrian Knox S., G3 Frank Packer Plate and Listed Ethereal S.

She was runner-up in the G1 Queensland Oaks and G2 Tea Rose S., and finished fourth in the G1 Flight S., G2 Wakeful S. and G2 Tramway S.

Arabian Gold's first foal Lakia (Redoute's Choice) has been a winner in Sydney this season for Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott.

"I am a sucker for grey horses and I fell in love with this mare when I inspected her," Kelly said. "She was a quality race filly who won \$1 million in prizemoney. She claimed five stakes races, including the Doomben Roses, and came second in the Queensland Oaks.

"Unfortunately, she had a bit of bad luck, and her I Am Invincible will only be her second live foal. She is currently in the foaling unit, being watched night and day."

These high-profile broodmare acquisitions are the latest in a long line of developments for the fast-growing and still young Fernrigg operation, which has also made an impact as vendors with yearlings selling for up to \$480,000.


"We are now into our third year of operation and we are thrilled at what we have been able to achieve in that short time period," Kelly said.

"The feedback from trainers who purchased yearlings from the farm in the past couple of years has been extremely positive, and we are starting to see some very promising results on the track.

"Two of our Inglis Premier draft from last year have won impressively at their first time out as 2-year-olds in recent weeks --Sure Am Invincible for John McArdle and Bravado for John O'Shea.

"Excellent Proposal is another very promising horse who was purchased from our very first Magic Millions yearling draft by Bill Mitchell. He won his first two races as a 2-year-old in Sydney before moving to Hong Kong, where he finished second in his only start there to date.

"Kaarchi is another filly from our first draft who won first time out as a 2-year-old for Joe O'Neill, so hopefully that early success can continue, as our oldest graduates are still only 3-year-olds."
