NY TIMES NAMES GAMINE AS OAKS-DAY POSITIVE; ROBERTSON EXPRESSES CONCERN

The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) is conducting a follow-up investigation of a class C medication positive detected in a sample returned from Kentucky Oaks day, according to a KHRC statement Thursday. Joe Drape of *The New York Times* reported in a story published at 6:43 p.m. that it was the GI Longines Kentucky Oaks third-place finisher **Gamine** (Into Mischief) who returned the positive test, citing "two people familiar with the results of the drug test who requested anonymity because they were not authorized to discuss the issue publicly."

"The Derby day samples were 'cleared,' showing no irregularities," the statement from the KHRC read. "The Oaks day samples returned a finding for a class C medication in one primary sample."

The Kentucky Oaks was run at Churchill Downs Sept. 4. The results "should be available" in November, a KHRC spokesperson confirmed. This year's Breeders' Cup is scheduled for Nov. 6-7.

According to the statement, "the KHRC will follow its established regulatory process in conducting a follow-up investigation of this matter. **Cont. p3**

DAREDEVIL TO STAND AT LANE'S END

One of the top second-crop sires **Daredevil** (More Than Ready --Chasethewildwind, by Forty Niner) will relocate to Lane's End Farm for the 2021 breeding season. The GI Champagne S. victor will stand for \$25,000.

Sire of 3-year-old sensations Swiss Skydiver and Shedaresthedevil, Daredevil is third on the North Americanbased, second-crop sire behind only American Pharoah and Constitution with just over half as many starters.

Daredevil is the only first-crop sire to ever sire an individual winner of the GI Kentucky Oaks and the GI Preakness S. in the same year. Swiss Skydiver is only the sixth filly to win the second leg of the Triple Crown in its 145 years. Shedaresthedevil was her sire's first Classic winner in 2020 and led home the exacta for her sire in the most prestigious 3-year-old fillies race of the year. **Cont. p4**

The name of the horse, trainer and owner will not be released at this time, "in accordance with that process," the statement read.

Gamine is trained by Bob Baffert, whose attorney Craig Robertson expressed concern over Drape's story and the fact that the result had been leaked. He released the following statement:

"The current reporting on Gamine is inaccurate and needs to be cleared up. First, Betamethasone is a legal, commonly used anti-inflammatory medication. It is not a `banned substance.' Second, the medication was administered to Gamine on Aug. 17 by her veterinarian and on the veterinarian's recommendation. Importantly, the veterinarian followed established medical and regulatory guidelines in administering the medication. The withdrawal guidelines published by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission recommend that the medication not be given within 14 days of a race. In this instance, as an additional layer of protection, Gamine's veterinarian last treated her with Betamethasone 18 days before the Oaks.

"Gamine's test revealed 27 picograms of Betamethasone. The current threshold in Kentucky is 10 picograms. The situation with Gamine highlights two issues that are very troubling and must be addressed by the racing industry. First, the thresholds for many lawful medications such as Betamethasone are way too low. A picogram is a trillionth of a gram. Twenty-seven picograms is a minuscule amount that would not affect a thousand pound animal. The regulations governing racing must be ones that are related to pharmacology in a horse as opposed to how sensitive labs can test. Second, trainers and veterinarians must be able to rely on guidelines given them by racing officials. If they are told by regulators that a medication will clear a horses system in 14 days, they must be able to rely on that Introducing COMPLEXITY

information."

Robertson said he was also troubled by the fact that the results of the initial sample had again been leaked to *The New York Times*.

"It's very troubling," said Robertson in an email to the *TDN*. "There are good reasons why the rules require confidentiality until the split sample comes back and the stewards make a decision. The fact that racing commissions, with increasing frequency, do not abide by their own rules and information is wrongly leaked, poisoning an individual's right to due process, is inexcusable. The rules are applicable to all parties and racing commissions must abide by the very rules they seek to enforce."

The KHRC's official laboratory, Industrial Laboratories in Colorado, conducted the initial analysis.

Churchill Downs carded 13 races on Kentucky Oaks day, including six stakes. The headline act was the Oaks, won by Shedaresthedevil (Daredevil), with subsequent GI Preakness S. winner Swiss Skydiver (Daredevil) in second and the favorite, Gamine, back in third.

"We are extremely honored that the Jockey Club of Turkey is entrusting us with the continuation of Daredevil's stallion career in America," said Bill Farish. "What he has accomplished is nothing short of remarkable. I would like to personally thank Murat Sancal for his ongoing efforts, the board members of the TJK, and especially the President Mr. Serdal Adali. This is the beginning of a very fruitful relationship with them and we are very grateful."

Daredevil is in quarantine in preparation for his departure to Kentucky. He will arrive at Lane's End near the end of November and be available for inspection shortly after.

UNCLE MO TOPS ASHFORD'S 2021 ROSTER ON FEE RAISE TO \$175K

Leading Coolmore's Ashford Stud's 2021 roster is North America's top sire by graded stakes winners, **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie), who will stand for \$175,000 in 2021 after being priced at \$125,000 for 2020. The Eclipse winner has had 19 black-type winner so far this season, led by Girl Daddy, Harvest Moon, Yaupon and Bast.

Ashford's two Triple Crown winners, **Justify** (Scat Daddy), whose first foals are weanlings, and **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile), who leads the second-crop sire list by graded stakes winners, will stand for \$125,000 and \$100,000, respectively. Justify stood for \$150,000 in 2020 and the reduction is in keeping with what many farms are doing for the upcoming breeding season in response to the economy's reaction to the COVID-19 pandemic. officially listed as private in 2020.

New sires for the Versailles location include champion and multiple Grade I winner **Maximum Security** (New Year's Day), as well as **Echo Town** (Speightstown), who won the GI H. Allen Jerkens S. this summer at Saratoga. Their fees will be determined upon retirement. In addition, Coolmore announced Thursday that popular Ireland-based **Caravaggio** (Scat Daddy) will relocate to Kentucky for the upcoming breeding season.

"Our established sires have enjoyed great success on the racetrack this year, but in recognition of the challenging times we find ourselves in, we have reduced the fees of all of our sires yet to have runners with the one exception of Mendelssohn, who we have probably under-priced all along," said Ashford's Director of Sales Charlie O'Connor. "We have three exciting new additions to our roster and we look forward to watching Echo Town and Maximum Security continue to show their brilliance on the racecourse before they retire."

2021 FEES FOR LANE'S END; QUALITY ROAD DOWN TO \$150,000

On the heels of the announcement Friday that top three leading second-crop sire Daredevil will return to the U.S. from Turkey to stand at Lane's End Farm, the Versailles nursery and stallion station released its full roster and stud fees for 2021. A total of 21 stallions will make up the roster, led again by stalwart **Quality Road**, who gets a fee cut from \$200,000 to \$150,000. A majority of key breeding sheds are cutting 2021 stud fees due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Candy Ride (Arg) will also see his fee slashed from \$100,000 to \$75,000. A number of the other stallions on the roster are also getting breaks on fees. A few will stay at the same level as in 2020, including the popular **City of Light**, whose first foals are weanlings this year, and **Twirling Candy**. Both will continue to stand for \$40,000.

Lane's End has three young horses retiring to its stallion barn this year: champion and Breeders' Cup winner **Game Winner**, who will stand for \$30,000; this year's GI Runhappy Santa Anita Derby winner **Honor A. P.**, who will stand for \$15,000; and GI Santa Anita H. winner **Gift Box**, who will bring \$10,000. All three of the new retirees will stand alongside their sires at Lane's End: Candy Ride, Honor Code, and Twiring Candy, respectively.

In addition, **Liam's Map's** fee of \$30,000, a cut from \$35,000 for 2020, is only locked in until Nov. 5, with changes possible after that date due to Breeders' Cup results. Among his runners who may contest the Breeders' Cup Nov. 6-7 are Runhappy Debutante S. winner and GI Darley Alcibiades S. runner-up Crazy Beautiful and GIII Miss Preakness S. winner Wicked Whisper.

IN MARES BRED CATEGORY, UNCLE MO BACK ON TOP

In both 2019 and 2020.

According to The Jockey Club, which released its annual Report of Mares Bred (RMB) Friday, Uncle Mo covered 257 mares this year, the most among any stallion standing in North America. That puts Uncle Mo back on top for the first time since 2016 when he was bred to 253 mares. He was bred to 241 mares in 2019.

With the year winding down, it was the latest positive development for the 12-year-old Coolmore sire. His progeny have accounted for 19 graded stakes wins in the U.S. on the year and he has shown that he is a sire of sires as the first-crop stallions Nyquist, Outwork and Laoban, all sons of Uncle Mo, are among the leading first-crop sires in North America.

Uncle Mo edged out Into Mischief, who was second with 248 mares covered. Into Mischief is a perennial leader in this category, having topped it in 2017 and 2018 before finishing third last year behind Justify and Mendelssohn.

For 2020, Mendelssohn came in third, covering 242 mares. The Spendthrift stallion and GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner His G1 winners Vequist and Gretzky the Great are Breeders' Cup bound. NYQUIST: YOU'RE WITNESSING HISTORY.

Vino Rosso was fourth, covering 238 mares. He was tops among all first-year stallions.

As has been the case over the last several years, Coolmore and Spendthrift stallions dominated the list. Eight of the top 10 on the list stand at either Coolmore or Spendthrift, with each having four sires among the top 10.

Their dominance, however, was challenged this year by WinStar, which had two horses place in the top 10. Constitution checked in fifth with 231 mares and Audible was eighth with 219. With GI Florida Derby, GI Belmont S. and GI Runhappy Travers S. winner Tiz the Law leading the way for Constitution on the racetrack, he went from 85 mares to the 231 in a year's time. Audible is a first-year sire. Last year, the top sire on the list among WinStar's group was 2017 GI Kentucky Derby winner Always Dreaming, who came in 19th place after being bred to 165 mares.

The horses in the top 10 represented a number of different levels when it comes to stud fees. While Uncle Mo, whose 2020 stud fee was \$125,000, and Into Mischief, whose stud fee this year was \$175,000, took down the top two spots, several modestly priced stallions were also among the leaders. That list includes three sires that stood for \$35,000 or less in Mendelssohn (\$35,000), Vino Rosso (\$30,000), Mitole (\$25,000) and Audible (\$25,000).

Darby Dan had a good showing, with three sires in the top 20, all of them standing for \$10,000 or less. The list consists of Tapiture (186 mares, \$7,500), Flameaway (183 mares, \$7,500) and Klimt (172 mares, \$10,000).

As expected, Kentucky-based sires dominated the list. Khozan, who stands in Florida at Journeyman Stallions, was the leading

non-Kentucky sire. Having been bred to 181 mares, he was in 17th place.

In the years ahead, the list of sires who have covered the most mares will change drastically. In May, The Jockey Club adopted a rule that will limit the number of mares a horse can be bred to to 140. There is, however, a grandfather clause, and the rule will only cover horses born in 2020 or later. A total of 42 stallions exceeded the 140 number in 2020. In 2019, 41 stallions covered 140 mares or more.

In terms of individual state RMB leaders beyond Kentucky and Florida, the following stallions topped the covers list for their respective states/provinces:

New York--Solomini, 123 California--Stay Thirsty, 108 Pennsylvania--Hoppertunity, 107 Maryland--Golden Lad, 103 Oklahoma--Flat Out, 85 Ontario--Frac Daddy, 76

The Jockey Club disclosed a total of 1,067 individual stallions covered 27,970 mares in North America this year, with an estimated 2,500-3,500 additional mares having not yet been reported. The 200 reported stallions in Kentucky covered 16,391 mares (58.6% of all mares reported), a decrease of 4.3% compared to this time last year. Of the top 10 states and provinces (by number of mares bred), stallions in Louisiana, Maryland, Pennsylvania and New Mexico covered more mares in 2020 than in 2019.

ONE HORSE MAY STAND BETWEEN MIGHTY HEART AND THE CANADIAN TRIPLE CROWN, AND IT'S HIS STABLEMATE

The tale of a one-eyed horse who has come from nowhere to sweep the first two legs of the Canadian Triple Crown has been the feel-good story of the year at Woodbine, but the next chapter could end with an uncomfortable twist. **Mighty Heart** (Dramedy) is the even-money favorite in Saturday's Breeders S., a role he earned after decisive victories in the Queen's Plate and the Prince of Wales S. But there's a rapidly improving, dangerous horse in the field named **Belichick** (Lemon Drop Kid) who should relish the mile-and-a-half on the turf and is the second choice at 7-2 in the morning line. Like Mighty Heart, Belichick is trained by Josie Carroll. That means that the Canadian Hall of Fame trainer will be in the unenviable position of perhaps costing herself and Mighty Heart a Triple Crown sweep.

"I think I would have really mixed emotions if that were to happen," she said. "Putting it in human terms, it would be like you coaching two kids and one has a chance to do something extraordinary but it's the other one that you are bringing along who steps up. You are proud of both of them but there's going to be a bittersweet factor, of course."

Owned by NK Racing and LNJ Foxwoods, Belichick is still a maiden after three starts, but showed dramatic improvement when second behind Mighty Heart in the Queen's Plate when he was beaten 7 1/2 lengths. Carroll kept him out of the Prince of Wales and should have a fresh horse who has continued to get better as the races have gotten longer.

"Belichick is a strong, athletic horse.," she said. "He is a horse I



expected from his first start would be a dominant horse on this circuit. It ended up taking him longer to come around than I expected. Certainly, he's just coming into his own."

Neither of Carroll's horses were considered serious Queen's Plate contenders as late as early July. After finishing out of the money in his first two starts, both of them at the Fair Grounds, Mighty Heart broke his maiden July 11 at Woodbine. After finishing third in an allowance race, he was dismissed at 13-1 in the Queen's Plate and was overshadowed by still another Carroll horse, **Curlin's Voyage** (Curlin). A filly, she finished fifth as the 5-2 favorite as Mighty Heart ran away from his competition.

"He really enjoys running and once he figured out what it was all about he just steadily improved," Carroll said. "I don't think it was one thing that suddenly turned him around. He just got better."

Seventeen days later and now the 4-5 favorite, Mighty Heart, who is a homebred owned by Lawrence Cordes, had no problem winning the second leg of the Canadian series, the mile-and-three-sixteenths dirt race at Fort Erie. That put him within one win of a Triple Crown sweep. The Canadian Triple Crown has been won seven times and not since 2003 when won by Wando (Langfuhr).

Mighty Heart became an easy horse to root for. He lost his left eye in a paddock accident when he was just 2-weeks-old, but has overcome that setback for Carroll and Cordes, a small owner/breeder. His sire, Dramedy, stood in two different states,

Kentucky and Oklahoma, during four years of study duty in North America before being shipped off to Saudi Arabia. Mighty Heart is one of only 17 foals from his first crop.

Mighty Hearty grew to be so popular that Woodbine set up a special media day for the horse on the backstretch Monday and Carroll, Cordes and jockey Daisuke Fukumoto were on hand to answer questions.

"It's wonderful when our sport gets a horse that captures the public's imagination," Carroll said. "It lets people see the human side of racing, that it's more than just a sport. It is these wonderful animals and the wonderful people that are involved with them. You've got this horse that came into Queen's Plate as the underdog and won it decisively. He overcame the one eye. He's got as small owner who only owns a couple of horses but is intense about racing. I think the whole story has caught on with everybody. And the name. The name is exactly who he is."

There is some question as to how Mighty Heart will handle the switch to the turf. He has raced on the surface once, in a Mar. 21 maiden at the Fair Grounds where he finished 11th. He bore out badly in that race, which Carroll said, was due to the fact he has just the one eye.

"He got some kickback in his face," she said. "He has only the one eye, so I think when it hit his blind side it really startled him and he ran to the outside. Since then has had a lot of schooling in behind horses and after that race we put a one-eyed blinkers over that eye. There's a cup we put on that covers the sensitive area and that helped turn him around a lot. I don't think it was the surface that time. I think it was the kickback."

While Carroll isn't too worried about the turf, she admitted that Mighty Heart's schedule is a concern. Just as was the case with the American Triple Crown, the Canadian races had to be rescheduled because of the pandemic and there are just six weeks between the first leg and the last.

"We are asking a horse who is very young in his career to do a great deal," she said. "Certainly, it's a concern. He's acting great going into the race and his blood work is great. Everything says he is on go but you really don't know how much those two races took out of him."

If they did take something out of Mighty Heart that could set things up for Belichick, who has had six weeks off. Carroll will be seeking her second win in the Breeders. She won the race in 2014 with Ami's Holiday (Harlan's Holiday). She could get her second Saturday, but the question is, with which horse?

MGISW **Tiz the Law** (Constitution) continued his preparations for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic with a six-furlong breeze in 1:13.20 over a fast track at Keeneland Friday.

With regular rider Heather Smullen aboard, the NY-bred colt worked in fractions of :26, :49.60, 1:13.20 and galloped out seven furlongs in 1:25.80.

"I wanted to get him used to the track, and I think he gets over any track better than Churchill," trainer Barclay Tagg said in reference to Churchill Downs, where Tiz the Law suffered the only two losses of his stellar career. "If he shows improvement next week, even better."

"The first time he works at a track, he looks around," Smullen said. "Today he went out and did his job and galloped out nicely. His next work he'll be more aggressive and that should set him up nicely for the race."

BREEDERS' CUP WORKERS OUT IN FULL FORCE AT CHURCHILL

MGISW **War of Will** (War Front) kicked off the Breeders' Cup action Friday morning at Churchill Downs. With jockey Declan Carroll in the irons, the bay went in fractions of :11.60, :23.40, :34.80 and :46.80. They galloped out six furlongs in 1:12.20, seven furlongs in 1:24.80 and a mile in 1:38.40, according to Churchill Downs clocker John Nichols. War of Will has made all three of his starts this season on turf, most recently finishing third in the GI Ricoh Woodbine Mile, but is being pointed for the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile.

"I was just the passenger along for the ride," said Carroll. "I've always loved how this horse trains over the dirt. He's very versatile and can run on dirt or turf, but he's always trained great over the dirt."

Next up from the Mark Casse barn was War of Will's MGISW stablemate **Got Stormy** (Get Stormy) (:47.20), who was second in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile last term, but is pointing for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint this season. With Kim Carroll aboard, the chestnut went in splits of :11.80, :23.20 and :34.80.

Brad Cox breezed four Breeders' Cup contenders, including GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity S. hero '**TDN Rising Star**' **Essential Quality** (Tapit), who is pointing to the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. With Florent Geroux up, the Godolphin runner started his work one length behind multiple graded stakes winner Mr. Misunderstood (Archarch) through splits of :13.20, :36.80, :48.80 and 1:00.60. Essential Quality finished even with Mr. Misunderstood at the wire.

"He seems like he's really matured over the summer into where he is now," Geroux said. "He's one of those horses where he keeps getting better as he gets more experience."

Geroux also breezed undefeated '**TDN Rising Star**' **Aunt Pearl** (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}). The GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf contender worked in company with Emro (Point of Entry), covering five panels in 1:00.80 (22/44).

Also on the worktab were MGSW duo of **Mr. Money** (Goldencents) and **Silver Dust** (Tapit), both of whom are scheduled to run in the Dirt Mile. Mr. Money breezed a best-of-44 five panels in :58.80. With Gabriel Saez in the irons, the bay cruised through early fractions of :11.60, :23.40, :34.80 and :46.80.

"It was kind of an almost must-win situation in the Ack Ack to get him back on track," trainer Bret Calhoun said. "Mentally I think it was good for him and I can tell a difference with his training. He seems happier after the race. He hasn't had a lot go right for him this year in his races so coming into the race off a win is crucial."

Silver Dust worked with jockey Adam Beschizza in the irons through fractions of :11.60, :23.40, and :35.60 and completed five furlongs in 1:00.20 (9/44).

"He's sort of been a challenging horse his entire career," Calhoun said of the 6-year-old son of Tapit. "He's continued to get better mentally and he's been more consistent with age. I know it's in him to come out of his shell."

GI Derby City Distaff heroine **Bell's the One** (Majesticperfection) continued her preparations for the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint Friday, working five panels in company in 1:00.40 (11/44) with jockey Corey Lanerie up.

"She likes to have a target in front of her, so we typically work her this way," conditioner Neil Pessin said. "Her race against Serengeti Empress (Alternation) [in the Derby City Distaff] was so thrilling. She dug in really hard that day to get up just in time."

Dale Romans sent out his contenders for the juvenile dirt races Friday morning, starting with the 2-year-old colt **Sittin On Go** (Brody's Cause), winner of the GIII Iroquois S. With exercise rider Faustino Herrarte aboard, he went in :11.40, :22.40, :34.80 and :47. Moments later, GIII Pocahontas S. winner **Girl Daddy** (Uncle Mo) breezed with jockey Joe Talamo up through splits of :11.80, :23.80 and :48.40. She galloped out six furlongs in 1:13.60.

PLETCHER BREEDERS' CUP TROOPS GEARING UP AT BELMONT

Trainer Todd Pletcher breezed a quintet of Breeders' Cup contenders over the past two mornings at Belmont Park.

Halladay (War Front) (Mile), winner of the GI Fourstardave H. last out Aug. 22 at Saratoga, worked five-eighths in company Friday in 1:00.60 on the fast dirt training track. He was scratched out of the GI Shadwell Turf Mile Oct. 3 at Keeneland with a hind leg infection.

"I thought it was a good work. We normally don't work him in company, but seeing as we're a little rushed for time between races, I wanted to get a good solid work into him today in company," said Pletcher. "He's a very willing work horse on his own but the fact that we missed the prep race we wanted to get a good solid company work into him and we got what we were hoping for. He responded quickly to antibiotics and everything has gone according to plan so far."

Valiance (Tapit) (Distaff) made the grade last out in the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. Oct. 4 at Keeneland. She clocked a half-mile in :48.04 on the dirt training track Friday.

"I thought it was an excellent work," said Pletcher. "She seems to be in really good form at the moment. I was really happy with the work and gallop out. This is another step up but she seems to be in the best form of her career."

Fellow Breeders' Cup hopefuls **'TDN Rising Star' Mutasaabeq** (Into Mischief) (Juvenile Turf), **Likeable** (Frosted) (Juvenile) and **Union Gables** (Speighstown) (Juvenile Fillies Turf/Juvenile Turf Sprint) worked on Thursday at Belmont.

Pletcher added that the undefeated **'TDN Rising Star' Happy Saver** (Super Saver), a last-out winner of the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Oct. 10 at Belmont, will not enter the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

"We're going to pass on the Breeders' Cup with him and make a decision in the next week on whether we'll give him some time off or focus on a Plan B towards the Pegasus. I think the Classic is coming up a little too soon," said Pletcher. "He's a horse we plan to race next year and I felt like for the long term skipping this race and focusing on 2021 is the right move for him. He has a lot of talent and we want to make sure we keep him fresh for next year."

DEL MAR RELEASES PROTOCOLS FOR OWNERS ATTENDING FALL MEET

For the Del Mar Fall meet, which begins Saturday, Oct. 31, all CHRB licensed owners will be permitted on track for both morning workouts and afternoon races. Unfortunately, due to state and local guidelines, non-licensed guests are still not permitted. Owners wishing to attend the races should email or call Mary Forney, Executive Director of TOC (mforney@toconline.com) to secure access, and reservations can be made up until 24 hours before race day. To attend morning workouts, no advanced reservation is required.

On race days, owners must show their license when entering the track and park in the designated area just outside the clubhouse. Owners will enter through the gate on the east side of the track across from the receiving barn. Owners will be required to be on the owner reservation list, provide their CHRB owners license, and undergo a full COVID-19 health screening, including a temperature check. Masks will be required to be worn at all times, and owners must respect social distancing guidelines.

On non-race days owners attending morning workouts must use the vehicle gate adjacent to the fire-station off Jimmy

Durante Blvd. The first come, first served seating is located in the spacious clubhouse box seat area. At this time, owners must remain in the clubhouse seating area and may not enter the paddock or the winners circle. Owners are still not permitted to access the backstretch. She is also responsible for the 2-year-old filly Amalfi Sky and a weanling colt by Midnight Lute. NIGGE ON THE BRIDGE FOR INTERNATIONAL SUCCESS

DEAUVILLE, France—Stephanie Nigge may have been born and bred in Deauville, the town in which she now trains, but she has travelled a long way to get there. And in many ways, her two major patrons reflect both her roots and her stints on the international racing circuit.

Gerard Augustin-Normand, one of France's biggest owner-breeders and a fellow Norman, has had a long association with the Nigge family, having initially had horses in training with Stephanie's father Markus, who also trains in Deauville. Augustin-Normand now has 10 horses in training with Stephanie, as does Australian Gerry Ryan, whose most notable previous association with a French-trained runner was as the co-owner of top stayer Americain (Dynaformer).

On Saturday, the 33-year-old Nigge will saddle her first Group 1 runner when Normandy Bridge (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}) lines up for the Criterium International at Saint-Cloud. Given the name and the sire of the colt, it would be easy to jump to the conclusion that he races in the colours of Le Havre's owner Augustin-Normand, but in fact he is owned by Ryan and was selected for him by fellow Australian John Foote at last year's Arqana October Sale. JUVENILE ENDGAMES FEATURE ON SATURDAY

Saturday sees some leading Classic prospects for 2021 look to cement their claims, with intriguing 2-year-old action at Saint-Cloud, Doncaster, Newbury and Leopardstown. The French venue gets it all underway, with the G1 Criterium International playing host to Godolphin's unbeaten 'TDN Rising Star' La Barrosa (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) who tackles an extra furlong having gone through the motions in Ascot's "Future Stayers' Maiden" on Sept. 4 and the G3 Tattersalls S. at Newmarket on Sept. 24. Charlie Appleby said he has no concerns about the distance, with this race restored to its original trip from seven furlongs as part of a two-year trial.

"La Barrosa is stepping up to a mile for the first time, which we feel will suit," he said. "He brings a nice profile going into the race, having won both his starts to date. It's going to be very testing ground at Saint-Cloud, but we are confident with his pedigree that should suit him. He did show his class to win from the position he was in at Newmarket, but he has got to improve again stepping up to a Group 1." **Cont. p6**

Bred by Haras du Mezeray and Ecurie Skymarc Farm, Normandy Bridge was bought for \in 80,000 and is unbeaten in his two starts to date. He has already had a positive experience

on the Saint-Cloud turf through his victory in the G3 Prix Thomas Bryon earlier this month. It was through the 2010 Melbourne Cup winner Americain that Nigge first met Ryan, when she was working for the horse's trainer Alain de Royer Dupre.

"I had worked a while in Germany for Christian von der Recke and then I spent a winter in Dubai for Mario Hofer before going to Alain de Royer Dupre for three years," recalls Nigge, whose parents Markus and Sabine are both German.

"Americain arrived around the

same time and I had the chance to travel with him. I stayed with him for a year in Australia when he was with David Hayes and then I took him to Calumet Farm to say goodbye."

She added, "I was 23 at the time and was on my own in

Australia, so Gerry and his family took me for lunches and dinners and really looked after me."

Five years ago, Nigge started training in partnership with her father before taking out a licence in her sole name in February, a

month before France went into lockdown. Her father is now assisted by her brother, Daniel.

"When racing stopped I was just wondering how I was going to survive the year," she says. "Thank God I had Mr Ryan and Mr Augustin-Normand as owners. They left the horses in the yard and they have been very supportive."

Nigge has been swift to repay that support. Normandy Bridge may be the flagship horse of her stable but she has also been in the winner's enclosure this season with Ryan's Zealandia

(Fr) (Sea The Moon {Ger}), while the current good form of her stable was highlighted at a sundappled Deauville on Thursday when two Augustin-Normand runners, both by Le Havre, acquitted themselves well on debut.

HEY DOC ON TOP WITH G1 MANIKATO WIN

Hey Doc collects his second G1 Manikato S. win with a trackrecord breaking performance Friday. Click or tap here to go straight to TDN Aus/NZ. Millebosc (Fr) got the better of Godolphin's Mond (Ger) (Sea The Moon {Ger}) to win the opening Prix de Saint-Desir, while the filly Vrigny (Fr) ran home in eye-catching fashion to take second in the Prix d'Hotot-en-Auge. Both will now be put away ahead of their 3-year-old campaigns.

For Nigge, training in Deauville isn't just a good excuse to come home but it also offers her a number of additional benefits, not least the fact that her stable, with its pair of goats roaming free among the boxes, is, for anyone with a good pitching arm, a stone's throw from the racecourse.

"I was born here and I like to take my horses to the beach," she says. "I worked in Chantilly, which is a great training facility, but for me I like to train on the racecourse. I think it is good for the horses to learn to breathe on the final turn, and to change legs, and I think it's much easier to do that on the racecourse. We are all struggling to find good riders and when you train on the track the horses do it on their own. In Chantilly you train in straight lines, and it is beautiful, but if you don't have the experienced riders who can help the horses to change their legs and to take a breath it is not so easy."

She continues, "The fact that we have all the big studs around here also means we can spell the horses. There is racing now from Jan. 1 to Dec. 31 and for me I feel the horses need at least four weeks off every year. We have 100 race days a year in Deauville, so there is nearly one day of racing for every three or four days. We really focus on the meetings in Deauville so we don't have to travel too much, and there are races for every class of horse here. It's so easy to go from my stable to the races."

It is also easy for her to get to the sales. Our interview is conducted on the final day of the week-long Arqana October Sale where Normandy Bridge was unearthed by Foote last year. Nigge, who race-rode for several years, had already ridden out with her string before walking around the corner to try to find her next star among the current batch of yearlings. Her mind can't help but wander to Saturday afternoon, however.

"It's a big day for all of us," she admits. "I was planning not to run him in the Group 1 but he is so well—in fact he was so much better after the [Prix Thomas Bryon] than he was before. For me, this is a race to prepare for next year because though he has won twice he has never really had much competition."

Following his purchase last October, Normandy Bridge was broken in by Philippe Prevost-Barratte and joined Nigge's stable before Christmas.

"We saw quickly that he was a great mover," she says. "He is a big horse so we took our time. He had a light canter or two on the grass in the spring but we didn't really work him. By August we felt he had matured a little and so we gave him three gallops and I nominated him for the Prix de Fontenoy at Longchamp. He hadn't really had that much work for that but I know my horses and first time out they are very relaxed. They tend to wake up a bit for the second race so I wanted him to stay at the same distance [1600 metres]. My jockey [Theo Bachelot] had walked the track beforehand and said that the outside was firmer than inside. I asked him to take his time and if he had enough petrol left to go on the outside. He went wide and he just flew home."

Despite such a major race looming, the trainer's thoughts are also already straying into next year, and she has plenty of options with Normandy Bridge whom she feels will "stay for sure." In many respects, the Criterium International is merely the next stepping stone for the colt who potentially has a big future but so far little experience.

Nigge says of his 3-year-old campaign, "He will run first time probably in April and maybe we would have to educate him all over again. On Saturday we have barrier two and I want him to be among the field and in competition with the others to prepare him for next year. If he's very good, as we think he is, he probably will have one or two races before a big one—I don't know if we will go for the Guineas or the Derby."

Winning a Classic in her home country is doubtless high on the young trainer's wish list, but she has also the desire to revisit some of the countries she has experienced on her racing travels.

"My parents are the first generation in my family to be involved with horses. Forty years ago they came here and couldn't speak any French. They were both just passionate about horses," she says. "I have had the chance to travel a lot so I have picked up little things from everywhere that I think help me in what I am doing now."

She continues, "The first horse I bought, Treviere (Fr), was for Mr and Mrs Colin Bamford and Mr Ryan, the same owners as Americain. I took him to Australia for the G1 Toorak H. and he finished second. That was my first runner, though I didn't have my training licence so he ran for my dad. "I have also been to Dubai with horses for different trainers. I love travelling and I am really keen to travel my horses." In the meantime, however, the clients have travelled to her, and a first Group 1 winner for a major Australian owner would do Nigge's international profile no harm at all.

ARQANA OCTOBER CONCLUDES



DEAUVILLE, France—A numerically enhanced Arqana October Sale drew to a close in Deauville on Friday with encouraging figures in a year which cannot shake off the spectre of Covid-19. As 9 p.m. curfews are about to be reinstated across the regions of France where the virus is spreading most quickly, the curtain has come down just in time on the major yearling sales of the season. What the situation will be come the breeding stock sales is anyone's guess but, for now, Arqana has managed to stage its October Sale in its usual slot, with the number of yearlings and sessions increased to accommodate those horses which would originally have been earmarked for the Osarus September Sale in La Teste de Buch, which wasn't able to be staged in situ this year.

The October Sale in Deauville has been conducted over four days in the recent past and, as a guide only rather than for a direct comparison, 414 yearlings were sold in last year's edition for a total of \in 17,465,500 at an average of \in 40,959. **Cont. p5**

Twelve months on and the five days of trade brought turnover of €18,474,000 for 578 horses sold, at a consistently encouraging daily clearance rate about 80%, which levelled out to 82% for the week, with an average of €31,249 and median of €20,000. The final day boasted the strongest clearance of all at 84%, with an aggregate of €1,142,500 from 83 horses sold at an average of €13,765 and median of €12,000. The top lot of the final session of the Arqana October Sale will be joining trainer Philippe Decouz who, with agent Laurent Benoit of Broadhurst Agency, bought the Dark Angel (Ire) colt for €70,000 on behalf of footballer Antoine Griezmann, who already has 11 horses in training with Decouz. Lot 685 was the final lot through the ring for Lady O'Reilly's Haras de la Louivere, and is out of the winning Lawman (Fr) mare Larose (GB), a half-sister to the Listed Prix Finlande winner Monroe Bay (GB) (Makfi {GB}).

Commenting on the week's business in Deauville, Arqana's President Eric Hoyeau and Executive Director Freddy Powell said in a joint statement, "We are immensely grateful towards our vendors, who have maintained their faith in Arqana and showed tremendous resilience throughout the season. It has been a long week and we are very much aware of the uneasy financial situation breeders and pinhookers are faced with due to the high production costs, but their adaptability has allowed the market to play its role and all these yearlings can now move on to the next stage of their career. We also wish to thank all buyers and underbidders, on the grounds on online, for their relentless competitiveness. It is specifically heartening to see a new generation of trainers step forward--there is no doubt that the measures recently announced by France Galop to bolster 2-year-old racing in France will have encouraged them even further. Finally, our heartfelt gratitude goes to all members of the Arqana team, who have been on deck every day with a positive attitude, as well as to our partners headed by caterer Henri Morel and his staff, who keep doing their best to serve our clients in spite of the logistical constraints."

FILLIES' MILE RESULT OFFICIALLY AMENDED

The British Horseracing Authority has officially amended the result of the G1 Fillies' Mile, where Aidan O'Brien's fillies Snowfall (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and Mother Earth (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}) had been saddled incorrectly, wearing each other's saddle cloths and riders. It appeared that Snowfall had finished third and Mother Earth eighth, but it was actually the reverse. An investigation remains ongoing in relation to the incorrect saddling of the horses. Grounds for disqualification in the BHA's rules of racing do not include horses starting from the wrong stalls or carrying the wrong jockey. Because the horses that ran in the race were duly entered and carried the correct weight, the only possible disqualification ground would be if the horses were the subject of fraudulent practice. O'Brien said in the immediate aftermath of the race that the switch was a mistake borne from the fact that British-based staff unfamiliar with the fillies had been handling them due to COVID-19 travel restrictions. O'Brien was not at the race.

LATROBE JOINS ETREHAM JUMPS ROSTER

After his Irish Derby win Latrobe would go on to be second in the G1 Irish St Leger and the G1 Mackinnon S. in Australia that season. He was a consistent pattern race performer in Europe last year at four, winning the G3 Ballyroan S. and placing in the G3 Alleged S. and G2 Curragh Cup.

Etreham's Nicolas de Chambure said, "We are very pleased to acquire Latrobe for his stallion career. We were searching for a top-class flat performer following the arrival on the French breeding scene of several Auteuil performers such as Goliath du Berlais. It is important to offer a variety of complementary stallion profiles to breeders. For example, the success of Poliglote demonstrated the value of Derby horses bringing an influence of speed and acceleration to French jumps broodmares. Latrobe fulfills this demand perfectly. He is a magnificent son of Camelot, who ran at two years old before winning the Irish Derby at three. He displayed great courage and a wonderful temperament when travelling successfully abroad. We invite breeders to view the stallion at the Haras de la Tuilerie."

Also unbeaten is Gerard Ryan's Oct. 2 G3 Prix Thomas Bryon scorer **Normandy Bridge (Fr)** (Le Havre {Ire}), while others with proven pattern-race form are Haras du Logis Saint Germain and Pia Brandt's Sept. 10 G3 Prix des Chenes winner **Policy of Truth (Fr)** (Siyouni {Fr}) and Ballydoyle's Aug. 6 G3 Tyros S., Sept. 12 G2 Champions Juvenile S. and Oct. 10 G3 Autumn S. runner-up **Van Gogh** (American Pharoah). Aidan O'Brien said of the latter, "We were delighted with Van Gogh at Newmarket. We took our time on him and he came home very well. It was a good performance--he looked like he was finishing his race off well and we are looking forward to seeing him run."

O'Brien's day is expectedly busy and 10 minutes after the Criterium International the stable's Oct. 11 G3 Anglesey S. runner-up Lipizzaner (Uncle Mo) takes part in the six-furlong Listed Doncaster S. and then it is on to the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud. Rosegreen's representative in this 10-furlong contest is last Friday's impressive Leopardstown mile maiden winner Bolshoi Ballet (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), who puts his 'TDN Rising Star' status on the line against some high-class domestic runners headed by Miguel Castro Megias's Aug. 16 G3 Prix Francois Boutin and Oct. 4 G1 Prix Marcel Boussac heroine Tiger Tanaka (Ire) (Clodovil {Ire}). "He ran green at Newmarket first time out, but then he won well at Leopardstown the next day," O'Brien said of the full-brother to Southern France (Ire). "There's lots of stamina in the pedigree, so you wouldn't be too worried about stepping up to 10 furlongs. Hopefully he runs well." Tiger Tanaka's now-famous jockey Jessica Marcialis told Le Parisien, "Apart from the Marcel Boussac, Tiger has often run against the colts," she said. "We don't yet know her limits, so this will be an opportunity for us to learn more."

His Highness The Aga Khan's unbeaten **Makaloun (Fr)** (Bated Breath {GB}) handled both nine furlongs and heavy ground with ease when registering a five-length success in the G3 Prix de Conde at Chantilly on Sept. 28 and will be a tough nut to crack attempting to provide Jean-Claude Rouget with a third renewal. Godolphin supply **Botanik (Ire)** (Golden Horn {GB}), who hails from the Andre Fabre stable successful six times and he looked one to relish this trip when scoring by three lengths in a mile maiden at the track Sept. 23. The operation's Lisa-Jane Graffard commented, "Botanik is in great form and his work has been encouraging leading into this. He seems at ease on this type of ground, but with young horses it is always less certain. We don't yet know if he has the level of ability to win a Group 1 race, but Andre has prepared him for this and couldn't be happier with his condition."

Hot on the heels of the Criterium de Saint-Cloud is the G1 Vertem Futurity Trophy, which features another Ballydoyle-Godolphin clash as the Sept. 13 G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. and Oct. 10 G1 Dewhurst S. runner-up Wembley (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) bids for compensation. One more win for Aidan O'Brien would see him tie with Sir Henry Cecil on 10 and the stable's sole representative looks well up to standard, particularly on his latest piece of form in what was rightly heralded as a top-class renewal of the Newmarket contest. "Obviously he ran a great race in the Dewhurst and before that the National S., so he's got Group 1 form," the Ballydoyle handler said. "He seems to have been in good form since. He is stepping up to a mile for the first time, but we don't think that is going to be an issue. Hopefully the ground isn't that soft--the better it is, the more he'll like it."

The daughter of the G1 Coronation S. winner Fallen For You (GB) (Dansili {GB}) earned that tag on the same card as the Criterium International protagonist La Barrosa and looks very much a potential Classic prospect, but has heavy ground to deal with

Charlie Appleby again provides the main opposition, with One Ruler (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) impressing when brushing aside Van Gogh in the aforementioned Autumn S. over this mile trip at Newmarket. "He has handled the juice well at Newmarket and will be going there as a serious player," his trainer said. "He is out of a French family and generally they run on the slower side of good, so the ground wouldn't worry me. Getting the trip last time and seeing that

She came out of the race at Newmarket really well. She's fresh and well, she deserves the chance to get some black-type. That's what we're trying to do. I'm not saying she's definitely going to win, but she'll put up a good show."

Also at Newbury, the G3 Molson Coors Beverage Company S., or Horris Hill as it is known, will see Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum's Laneqash (GB) (Cable Bay {Ire}) start a warm order having split the subsequent G2 Royal Lodge S. winner New Mandate (Ire) (New Bay {GB}) and One Ruler when second in Doncaster's Listed Flying Scotsman S. on Sept. 11. It may not be plain sailing, however, with three of the unexposed types being the unbeaten Percy's Lad (GB) (Sir Percy {GB}) from Eve Johnson Houghton's yard and a pair who scored at Salisbury at the start of the month in the David Menuisier-trained Autumn Twilight (Ire) (Buratino {Ire}) and Gary Moore-trained Champagne Piaff (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}).

Menuisier, whose career has taken off in the last month, said of Autumn Twilight, "He won first time out and he looked very professional. He seems to have come out of the race well. He's entered in the horses-in-training sales next week, so rather than take it steady, steady, I prefer to run him in a race like this and see how he goes rather than take the easy route. He'll be going to another yard, so I might as well see how he good he is now. He should really enjoy the ground. We've been happy with him, so we feel there's not much excuse really. We go there with no pressure. Let's hope he runs well."

At Leopardstown, another Ballydoyle maiden winner with Classic pretensions is **Carlisle Bay (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) who scored with authority over nine furlongs at Tipperary on Oct. 3 and lines up in the G3 Eyrefield S. over the same trip. Shadwell's 'TDN Rising Star' **Wuqood (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) is in opposition, but needs to settle better than when seventh in the G2 Beresford S. over a mile at The Curragh on Sept. 26.

Of the other pattern races across Europe, the G3 Prix Perth at Saint-Cloud sees Gestut Schlenderhan's **Alson (Ger)** (Areion {Ger}) return to the scene of his emphatic success in the G1 Criterium International 12 months ago, while the fillies and mares take in the 10 1/2-furlong G3 Prix de Flore. The Aga Khan's unbeaten **Zaykava (Fr)** (Siyouni {Fr}), a prized possession as a daughter of Zarkava (Ire) (Zamindar), took the Oct. 9 Listed Prix Charles Laffitte over a mile and a quarter at Compiegne last time and is an exciting prospect on a day replete with them.

A JAPANESE TRIPLE CROWN DOUBLE?

One week removed from Daring Tact (Jpn) (Epiphaneia {Jpn})'s Fillies' Triple Crown-sealing score in the G1 Shuka Sho, **Contrail (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) will on Sunday attempt to provide Japanese racing with a unique double when he goes for the colts' Triple Crown in the G1 Kikuka Sho. He looks to join a list of just seven other colts, including his sire, and in fact his path this season has been almost identical to Deep Impact's: Contrail, who is unbeaten in six starts, justified champion 2-yearold honours with a first-up victory in the G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas) in April before adding the G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) six weeks later. After a traditional summer break, Contrail warmed up for this assignment with a seamless victory in the G2 Kobe Shimbun Hai, one of the key prep races for the Kikuka Sho.

Confidence is emanating from Contrail's stable, with Assistant Trainer Yusaku Oka saying, "It was a good win last time and we were relieved by that. That race was enough to get him switched on and so we don't need to worry about anything. He's come out of it well and has been at the stable in the three-week period since."

On paper it seems that either Contrail will need to regress or any of his 17 rivals will need to take a step forward to dethrone him over this 3000 metre trip. Among those looking to play the spoiler are **Weltreisende (Jpn)** (Dream Journey), who was eighth behind Contrail in the Satsuki Sho but third and second, respectively, in the Tokyo Yushun and Kobe Shimbun Hai. Weltreisende, however, has not won since taking a listed stake at Kyoto last October.

Another coming into this race off a win streak is **Babbitt (Jpn)** (Nakayama Festa {Jpn}), who has won all four starts at three. Babbitt didn't break his maiden until after the Satsuki Sho had been contested, and has since progressed up the ranks, most recently winning the G2 Asahi Hai St. Lite Kinen over 2200 metres on Sept. 21 from **Satono Flag (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), a Group 2 winner earlier this year who was putting in an improved effort after faltering in the earlier Classics.

HEY DOC DOES IT AGAIN IN MANIKATO

Hey Doc (Duporth), the McEvoy stable and jockey Luke Currie put a week of considerable drama behind them, with the grand campaigner winding back the clock with a track record-breaking win in the G1 Manikato S. at Moonee Valley on Friday night.

After the predicted wet weather failed to materialise, the 7-year-old relished the Good 3 track and perfectly ridden by Currie, pounced on the lead at the top of the Moonee Valley straight before seeing off a late challenge from race favourite Trekking (Street Cry {Ire}) to secure his second upset victory in the race, having previously won it in 2017.

In doing so, he was able to set a new track record for the 1200 metres around Moonee Valley, breaking the old mark, set by Runson (Delzao) two years ago, by just a hundredth of a second in 1:08.76. He withstood Trekking by 0.75I on the line, with the margin enough to dissuade John Allen, aboard the James Cummings-trained runner-up, from firing in an objection for minor interference late in the race.

Hey Doc's conqueror last start in the G2 Schillaci S., Dirty Work (Written Tycoon), surged into contention along the rail late on, but only got within 0.95l of the winner on the line. That trio were well clear of the rest of the field, headed by the fast-finishing Brooklyn Hustle (Starspangledbanner), who was beaten 2.7l. With his fourth Group 1 victory was surprisingly straight-forward for Hey Doc, the build-up to the race had been anything but. Currie was lucky to escape serious injury in a pre-race barrier incident at Geelong on Wednesday, while his usual strapper, and the giant gelding's constant companion, Camille Piantoni, was unable to fulfill her normal duties as she injured her shoulder during a trackwork mishap on the same day.

She was overcome by emotion as her beloved Hey Doc defied the betting market to post a second win in this race and his fourth Group 1 overall, having won the G1 Winterbottom S. last year and the 2017 Australian Guineas.

Calvin McEvoy, who trains with his father Tony, could not have been happier with the win.

"It's bloody emotional. What a great old horse he is. He has just been a pin-up horse for our stable. He was dad's first Group 1 winner under the McEvoy Mitchell brand, and he was my first Group 1 winner in partnership with dad," he said.

"For Luke to have the scare he did on Wednesday, and for Camille, his regular track rider, who unfortunately had a tumble off a young one this week, it's just a big team effort and I'm just so thrilled.

"She has ridden him every day that he has been in work for the last few years. He's very special, When I got her off the ground when she fell this week, she looked in pain, and she said 'I'm not crying because of the pain, I'm crying because I can't lead up Doc'."

McEvoy said a second victory in the race was always the spring target with the burly 7-year-old, who had finished eighth in the G1 Moir S. and fourth in G2 Schillaci S. on the way into this race.

"He needed those couple of runs, He's an older and bigger horse now. Even on Tuesday morning, we brought him here and gave him a good piece of work. He was a bit casual in his work, but he had a bit of a puff, and we knew that would clean him up for this race. It's great to have pulled it off," he said.

"There are not many horses that can win four Group 1s and it is a very special moment."

Currie's Scare of His Own

It was also a very special moment for Currie as well, who has spent a long part of 2020 sidelined through a neck injury and has been on board Hey Doc in all four of his top-flight successes.

"He's a beauty isn't he? He puts himself on the speed and he tried his heart out. He just brings it every time he comes to the races," he said.

The experienced hoop thought at one stage, he wouldn't be able to take the ride on the horse, after another McEvoy-trained runner, Xilong (Deep Field), flipped him over just two days ago.

"It was a bit of a worry, I landed on my head and neck in the exact same spot that I have just come back from. A lot of people helped by out this week at the hospital at Geelong, especially my physio Andrew Wilson. He keeps looking after me and he has got me to the races today," he said.

"At one stage, I didn't think I'd be back this quick for the other injury. I've been lucky to get the stable support from the McEvoys and everyone else and that has helped."

A one-time \$85,000 buy from the Rosemount Stud draft the 2015 Inglis Melbourne Premier Sale, the son of now Aquis-based stallion Duporth was bred by Yarram-based cabinet maker Adrian Hall, who is among the big ownership in him. Hey Doc has now won over \$3 million in prizemoney in a 28-start career which has yielded 10 wins.

Pedigree Notes:

Bred by Adrian Hall in Victoria, Hey Doc was a 2015 Inglis Premier Yearling Sale graduate. Offered by Rosemont Stud, he was sold for \$85,000 to McEvoy Mitchell Racing. He is one of only two foals from the ill-fated General Nediym mare Heyington Honey, with her other foal Heather Honey (Congrats {USA}), a winner over 1400 metres.

Hall is now breeding with Heather Honey, and she has a 2-year-old colt by Street Boss (USA), while she visited Written Tycoon on a late cover last year. His second dam, Noble Glow (Jeune {GB}), produced seven winners and is a sister to the stakes-placed Jurlique, while multiple stakes winner Excel Pilot (Champion Pilot (USA}) also features on the pedigree page.
