



BAFFERT TRIO DRAWS OUTSIDE, TIZ THE LAW TWO IN LOADED CLASSIC

Continuing a trend of short-priced horses drawing outside at Monday's Rood & Riddle Breeders' Cup Post Position Draw, the potent trio of Bob Baffert contenders in the GI Longines Breeders' Cup Classic drew next door to each other in the three widest posts in a loaded 10-horse field for the 1 1/4-mile test.

Given a slight nod on the morning line at 5-2, **Improbable** (City Zip) was parked in the eight-hole when pills were pulled. The 'TDN Rising Star', who had an up-and-down 3-year-old season, has come into his own at four, scoring three straight Grade I tallies in the Gold Cup S., Whitney S. and Awesome Again S.

One slot to his outside is Baffert's GI Kentucky Derby winner **Authentic** (Into Mischief). The last horse standing for his powerhouse barn in the Run for the Roses after several of Baffert's top contenders dropped away through the season, Authentic went wire to wire and gamely repelled odds-on favorite **Tiz the Law** (Constitution) to score. Given a 6-1 chance, he comes off a narrow runner-up finish to the game **Swiss Skydiver** (Daredevil) in the GI Preakness S.

Widest out is 7-2 **Maximum Security** (New Year's Day). The biggest lightning rod of a horse in recent memory, the Gary and Mary West homebred was famously disqualified from a victory in last year's Kentucky Derby for interference before going on to win an Eclipse Award as champion 3-year-old male. *Cont. p3*

PRINCESS SECRET DENIED ENTRY INTO BREEDERS' CUP JUVENILE FILLIES

Princess Secret (Khozan), winner of the Susan's Girl S. and My Dear Girl S. for owner and trainer Daniel Pita, was denied entry into Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies after testing positive for a banned substance. An Oct. 26 blood test administered by the Breeders' Cup Out-Of-Competition program turned up the presence of Stanozolol, an anabolic steroid expressly prohibited by Breeders' Cup under its conditions of entry.

According to Breeders' Cup constructs, any horse that tests positive for anabolic steroids or any ARCI-prohibited substances in any out-of-competition sample within six months of participation in the Breeders' Cup is ruled ineligible to participate. *Cont. p4*

He started his 4-year-old campaign by annexing the inagural \$20-million Saudi Cup, then was mentioned by name in an FBI indictment of his trainer Jason Servis earlier this year that

alleged widespread doping of Servis's horses. Transferred to Bob Baffert since, he scored in the GII San Diego H. and GI TVG Pacific Classic before finishing a wellbeaten second to Improbable in the Awesome Again.

Tiz the Law, victor of the GI Curlin Florida Derby, GI Belmont S. and GI Runhappy Travers S., seemed well on his way to a divisional title and possible Horse of the Year crown before coming up short in the Derby. Passing on the Preakness, he has trained up to the Classic for Barclay Tagg and

drew post two as a 3-1 proposition. The only other horse in single digits on the morning-line is **Tom's d'Etat** (Blame), who annexed the GII Stephen Foster S. earlier this year and was pegged at 6-1.

LA LIES JACINES (

Monomoy Girl winning the 2018 Distaff | Coady

In the draw for the GI Longines Distaff, champion **Monomoy Girl** (Tapizar) took the worst of it, pulling the widest draw in a field of 10 as the 8-5 chalk. Victress of the 2018 Distaff at Churchill, she is set to clash with ascendant sophomore filly

Swiss Skydiver (post five) in one of the most anticipated battles of the weekend.

Other notable horses who drew outside posts Monday include **Complexity** (Maclean's Music). Made the 2-1 favorite for the GI Big Ass Fans Dirt Mile, the GII Kelso S. winner is in post 10, a highly disadvantageous starting point for a race that will feature an extremely short run before horses bend into the first turn. **Golden Pal** (Uncle Mo), the 8-5 favorite for the GII Juvenile Turf Sprint, drew widest of all in post 14. **Got**

Stormy (Get Stormy, post 12 in the GI Turf Sprint, 7-2), **Vekoma** (Candy Ride {Arg}, post 14 in the GI Sprint, 3-1), and **Ivar (Brz)** (Agnes Gold {Jpn}, post 11 in the GI Mile, 4-1) are also in double-digit posts as the morning-line favorites in their respective races.



The shortest-priced favorite of the two days on the morning line is 7-5 **Jackie's Warrior** (Maclean's Music), who dodged a bullet in the GI Juvenile draw when pulling post seven while 13 and 14 were still unfilled with just five pills to go.

Overall, 184 horses were entered in the 14 races, seven of which feature overflow fields. The action kicks off Friday at 2:30 p.m. ET at Keeneland with the Juvenile Turf Sprint.

"Breeders' Cup out-of-competition testing is done to the highest world standards and is vital to ensuring the integrity of the World Championships," said Breeders' Cup President & CEO Drew Fleming. "All horses pre-entered for the Breeders' Cup are subject to our stringent medication and testing protocols and must meet these requirements in order to compete. Breeders' Cup will continue its work to ensure the safety and the integrity of our sport, including our strong support of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act and other progressive reforms for Thoroughbred racing in the U.S. through our involvement in the Thoroughbred Safety Coalition."

The field for the Juvenile Fillies now stands at seven.

BILL TO AUTHORIZE FIXED-ODDS WAGERING INTRODUCED IN NEW JERSEY

New Jersey moved one step closer to becoming the first state in the country to allow fixed-odds wagering on horse races when a bill that would authorize that form of betting was introduced in the New Jersey Legislature Thursday.

The bill was introduced by New Jersey State Senator Vin Gopal and an identical bill has been sponsored by Assembly Gaming Committee Chairman Ralph Caputo and Deputy Republican Leader Assemblyman Ronald Dancer. With the bill enjoying bipartisan support, expectations are that it will pass and will be signed into law by New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy some time before the beginning of the 2021 meet at Monmouth.

In February, it was announced that Darby Development LLC., the operator of Monmouth Park, had entered into a 10-year agreement with the Australian firm BetMakers in which BetMakers would manage and distribute fixed-odds betting on Monmouth's races. Monmouth had hoped to offer fixed-odds betting during the 2020 meet, but the review process conducted by the Attorney General's office dragged on longer than expected.

AT THE TOP OF HER GAME, BODHICITTA TO SELL AT FASIG-TIPTON NOVEMBER

It shouldn't take long for Bodhicitta (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) to reward whoever purchases her at the Fasig-Tipton November sale. The 4-year-old filly, who is Hip 243 for

Ballysax Bloodstock, is coming off a win in the GII Yellow Ribbon H. and, before that, was second in the GI Gamely S. for trainer Richard Baltas and owner Calvin Nguyen. In the Yellow Ribbon, she defeated Grade I winners Keeper ofthe Stars (Midnight Lute) and Lady Prancealot (Ire) (Sir Prancealot {Ire}) and Grade II winner Beau Recall (Ire) (Sir Prancealot {Ire}).

Bodhicitta has improved dramatically since arriving here from Europe as a maiden, suggesting that the best may be yet to come. At any level, she is clearly capable

of winning stakes in 2021, if not before.

Regular rider Flavien Prat has been so impressed that he called Bodhicitta his "next Vasilika," a reference to the mare who won the Gamely and the GI Rodeo Drive among eight stakes victories.

After a brief freshening, Bodhicitta returned to the work tab Sunday at Del Mar, breezing four furlongs in 49.20 seconds.

Bodhicitta is by the hot stallion Showcasing, himself

a son of the leading sire and broodmare sire Oasis Dream, and is linebred to her own family of the tap-root mare Sorbus. Her dam Solfilia was a winner at two, and has produced three winners from her first four foals. Showcasing has sired no fewer than 45 stakes winners, 22 of them group or graded. The list includes Mohaather (GB), the winner of this year's G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood., and Advertise, the winner of the 2019 GI Commonwealth Cup.

Should the legislation pass, it is expected that fixed-odds wagering can begin without any further delays and without the requirement that it be approved by the Attorney General's office.

"The Company is pleased that the legislation has been introduced and supported by both sides of the aisle, and that it provides a clear framework for Fixed Odds horse racing in New Jersey," BetMakers CEO Todd Buckingham said in Monday's press release. "The introduction of the Bill is an important step for providing a regulatory pathway for the introduction of Fixed Odds Betting in the U.S. and places New Jersey as the front-running State in the U.S. to pursue this opportunity."

BetMakers Head of International Operations Dallas Baker said the takeout on fixed odds betting has yet to be determined but "will be pretty similar to what you see with the tote or maybe a little bit more competitive."

At this stage in the process, fixed-odds wagering will be available for New Jersey residents only and only on New Jersey tracks. However, Dennis Drazin, the chairman and CEO of Darby Development, said that BookMakers will look to expand and sign up tracks outside of New Jersey. In order to do so, they will have to comply with the Interstate Horseracing Act, which requires consent from the racetrack operators and a local horsemen's

group. He added that there is a possibility that fixed odds betting could begin before the Monmouth meet and at one of the two harness tracks in the state, the Meadowlands and Freehold.

BetMakers will attempt to expand the form of wagering outside of the tracks themselves and ADW companies and bring the many firms that accept sports betting on board, as well.

Fixed-odds wagering has proved to be extremely popular in Australia. Baker said that it was introduced in Australia about 10 years ago and is the primary reason handle in that country has doubled since that time.

"If you study the model of Australia, it has really grown the business there," Drazin said.. "And our business over here has stagnated a little bit. This is a new opportunity to grow the market."

One of the advantages of fixed odds wagering is that it prevents what is a growing problem in American racing, large odds drops in the pari-mutuel pools on horses after the race has begun.

"As a racetrack operator who talks to people, talks to our customers, one of the biggest complaints I get is when someone says they bet a horse at 8-5 and by the time they broke out of the gate and went a little bit the horse was 3-5," Drazin said.

"They think something has to be wrong with this picture. This way the bettor will have clarity on what the odds are and they're not going to change. It will result in better satisfaction for the person making the wager."


This will not be New Jersey's first foray into fixed odds wagering. New Jersey had been the only state to allow wagering on the betting exchange Betfair. The exchange allows customers to set prices on horses and bets are matched when two bettors agreed on the odds. After a run of four-plus years, Betfair pulled the plug on the New Jersey exchange at the end of September, saying that handle was so low that they couldn't justify continuing on. One of the problems with Betfair is that it never reached agreements with most of the major tracks that would have allowed New Jersey customers to wager on them Drazin said he hopes that BetMakers does not run into the same problem.

"This is going to be good for our business if everybody gets on board," he said. "If only a few tracks offer it and it's not the major tracks it will suffer the same growth problems exchange wagering had."

BetMakers is also behind the \$1-million BetMakers Bonanza, a \$1-million bonus that combines the GI Haskell S., the GI Kentucky Derby and the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Having already won the Derby and the Haskell, Authentic (Into Mischief) will earn the bonus if he wins the Classic.

"One of the things we want to do is give back to the industry," Baker said. "This is a good opportunity and we jumped on the chance to sponsor it. It's exciting to see that Authentic is alive for the bonus going into the Breeders' Cup."

Bluewater Sales, agent, consigns hip 286, a weanling colt by leading sire Into Mischief out of Greenfield d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro), whose dam Maryfield (Elusive Quality) won the 2007 Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint en route to Eclipse Award honors.

BC-BOUND TEX SUTTON FLIGHT GROUNDED IN NY

The second of two Lexington-bound horse transport flights operated by Tex Sutton did not depart Stewart Airport in Newburgh, New York, as planned Monday morning, Larry Ulrich, a New York-based representative for the company confirmed.

The morning's first Tex Sutton flight departed Republic Airport in Farmingdale, New York on Long Island at 7:49 a.m. EST, 49 minutes behind schedule, and landed at Lexington's Blue Grass Field at 9:21 a.m. EST, 44 minutes late.

As the morning wore on in greater New York, the winds intensified, causing a trailer ban across the area bridges, including the Mario Cuomo Memorial Bridge, and the horses en route via horse trailer could not make it to the airport. According to Ulrich, "10 or 11" horses were supposed to board the flight.

According to the Tex Sutton website, a flight is scheduled to depart Farmingdale for Lexington early Tuesday morning. Horses entered for the 'Future Stars Friday' program are required to be on the grounds at Keeneland by 10 a.m. Tuesday.

DF: Well, this is my first Breeders' Cup as the CEO, but I've been working for the company since 2016. And then I was a lawyer for a couple of years prior to that. But I am very fortunate to have a fantastic team, as well as a great board. And we've all been in lockstep and it's been great team building, morale is great, and we're excited to have Breeders' Cup very shortly and showcase the best racing in the world.

SF: I'm sure it's going to be hard to pick just one, but what has been the most challenging thing about organizing the event this year?

DF: We're very lucky that Keeneland is our host track partner, because they're about 10 miles from our office, and they've been fantastic teammates. But every single aspect of the World Championships we've had to reevaluate and make sure that we're doing things within COVID protocols. We're consulting with physicians, infectious disease specialist Richard Greenberg, and local and state government officials to make sure that we do everything by the book and that we put the health and safety of our fans first and foremost, which has caused us to reevaluate pretty much everything. And while it's taken a lot of time and effort, obviously it's very important to do things right.

DREW FLEMING ON A CHALLENGING FIRST **BREEDERS' CUP**

In his first year as CEO of the Breeders' Cup, 38-year-old Drew Fleming has found himself trying to stage a global event in the midst of a global pandemic. In a socially-distanced phone call with TDN Publisher Sue Finley, he discusses the challenges and the triumphs of Breeders' Cup 2020.

SF: You picked a heck of a year for this to be your first Breeders' Cup.

SF: Was there ever time in the late summer or early fall, you saw other events opening up to fans, and thought, "Maybe we can have fans"?

DF: Yes. It was a very sad decision to make. And we held out as long as we could, because our fans are the backbone of the business. They bring so much excitement and energy to the races, and it's not a decision that anyone wants to make. But knowing that many of our fans travel from all over the United States and around the world, we needed to be fair to them and make the announcement when we did so that they could have time to readjust accordingly. But also I think that was another driving force for Breeders' Cup returning to Keeneland in 2022. Because we wanted to be fair to the fans that had bought tickets, and we gave them a refund and they have the right to purchase those similar seats for 2022. But also the local community and the central Kentucky breeders, because we wanted to come back as soon as we could to be as fair to them so that they could see the Breeders' Cup in its full glory.

But one thing that I'm really proud of as a company is that we've doubled down our efforts in innovation and technology, knowing it was more likely we wouldn't have fans. We spent a lot of time and effort and investment to make sure that the at-home experience is world-class. This year we're going to have the most robust onsite production for a horse racing event ever. NBC will have up to 80 cameras for their coverage.

We're also going to have two jockey cams during the two days. It will give fans an increased access to views of the racetrack in the pack. From a digital side, we have done a multicast new video player on breederscup.com that really puts the fans in control of that viewing experience. And part of that will include up to 14 live streams, and this is really, I think, specifically important for the betting public. So by the time the horses enter the paddock and they walk to the starting gate, you'll be able to see a second screen experience. You can go to breederscup.com/live and be able to watch all those horses and specific ones that you have a particular interest in. So while you might not be there in person, we're trying to replicate as much of that in person experience as possible.

SF: You'll have all of the 14 cameras up on your screen and you can choose which ones to watch?

DF: Yes. So you could watch, if you like the one horse and the five horse, you could just pick the two of those and watch those exclusively from the paddock to the starting gate, or you could put up all 14. Because we know with betters they like to look at the horses in the paddock, how they're acting, and so we wanted to take that experience at home. And it's never been done before and we're pumped about it.

SF: That's really cool.

DF: It's really neat. We're encouraging people to watch both NBC and the multicast video player, and that's why we call it the second screen. We've got extensive television coverage (Friday Nov. 6 from 2-5:30 p.m. ET on NBCSN, Saturday Nov. 7 from 12-2:30 on NBCSN, and NBC from 2:30-5:30). NBC has been great partners. We have the back cam, which will be a camera that goes up to 100 miles per hour on the backstretch. And we've all doubled down and are really investing in this product to make it right for the fans that can't be here.

SF: The last time the Breeders' Cup was in Lexington, in 2015, there was such an electric atmosphere, with downtown and the restaurants packed with fans. What is it like to be there now?


DF: Well, we know the size and the scope of the Breeders' Cup is certainly going to be different. And some of the parties that we were able to do in 2015 aren't possible this year because we're putting safety first. But there's still a definite buzz of energy, because we do know the best horses from all over the world are coming, and there will definitely be world-class racing. I think everybody is excited. Unfortunately, most will be watching from

home, but nonetheless, the world will be watching central Kentucky.

And we should all be proud as an industry that we're able to do this. The resiliency of our sport is incredible. We're so thankful to the breeders, the nominators, the participants from around the world that have supported this event. And thanks to our board and nominators we were able to keep the purses at \$31 million. And I think it's a testament to racing that we had 201 horses pre-enter, which tied for the second highest in the history of the Breeders' Cup. We have 39 international horses pre-entered despite travel challenges. And we've also had 48 Challenge winners that will be here and five returning champs. So this racing is going to be top top-notch, and we're really excited about it.

SF: How has COVID impacted participants who are coming to this from abroad?

DF: I know some of the European trainers said on a call a couple of days ago that they won't be coming in person, but they're sending their team. And I think some owners obviously will be coming and some won't be. But for our owners that aren't able to come, we're sending a care package to them where we've partnered with Blackberry Farm. **Cont. p11**

SF: You took over this role at the Breeders' Cup just a few days after the Mongolian Groom tragedy last year. How much of your early tenure was consumed by that, and what additional measures have you added this year to provide the safest environment possible?

DF: We always spend a lot time ensuring that we have extensive safety and integrity protocols. And those were in place during the last World Championships, but we're always continuing to enhance those. And we worked with Dr. Larry Bramlage, who had an independent thorough investigation, and that investigation was transparent that we published to the public. And in that investigation, Dr. Bramlage came up with six recommendations that we have adopted. And so we continue to place a major focus on safety and we'll continue to work with the best vets in the world, have the most stringent protocols in place to make sure that we have the most safest racing possible.

SF: You're probably too young for this, but they used to say in the Peace Corps commercials, "It's the toughest job you'll ever love." Do you ever feel that way, especially this year?

DF: I wake up every morning and excited and energized for the day and looking to do what's best. We're thankful to our nominators and breeders, because it's been a trying year for all of us, and without them, their support, this wouldn't be possible. And this is, again, the World Championships and we're so excited for the industry to come together to showcase the best product in the world.

FOREMAN, PALMER TO OFFER UPDATE ON MID-ATLANTIC APPROACH TO EQUINE **FATALITIES**

Alan Foreman, chairman of the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, and Dr. Scott Palmer, the Equine Medical Director for the New York State Gaming Commission, will offer a progress report on the Mid-Atlantic Strategic Plan to Reduce Equine Fatalities Wednesday, Nov. 11.

Foreman and Palmer, the architects of the plan, will provide background and report on the progress of reforms that have been undertaken in the seven states that host racing in the Mid-Atlantic region: Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Virginia and West Virginia.

The Plan, adopted in 2019, is the product of a collaboration of the region's racetrack operators, horsemen's organizations, breeders' organizations, racing commissions and regulatory and racetrack veterinarians, and many phases of the plan stem from the 2012 New York Task Force Report on Race Horse Health and Safety. The Plan incorporates five key goals: the establishment of regional safety best practices, improved methods to identify horses at increased risk of injury, the implementation of protective factors to reduce the risk of injury, information sharing and communication, and improvement of the general health and welfare of the horse. Members of the Strategic Plan have been working together over the past year to enact regulatory reforms and adopt best practices in line with the Strategic Plan's mission.



HANDLE JUMPS AT BELMONT FALL MEET

The Belmont Park fall meet generated \$9,923,813 in average daily handle from all sources, a 33.6% increase over the 2019 fall meet, the New York Racing Association announced. Despite running 10 fewer days than in 2019, all-sources handle of \$267,942,961 was down just 2.5% compared with 2019.

The Belmont Park fall meet has traditionally opened on the Friday following Labor Day. Due to the continued impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, NYRA adjusted the fall schedule by adding a one-week break following the conclusion of the summer meet at Saratoga Race Course. As a result, the 2020 fall meet was contested over 27 days compared to 37 days in 2019, a 27% decrease in race dates.

A total of 267 races were run during the fall meet with 148 on the main track and 118 over the grass. Average field size over those 267 races was 7.88, an 8.7% increase over 2019. Twentyfour races were taken off the turf due to weather.

Chad Brown posted 22 wins to earn the status as top trainer for the Belmont Park fall meet for the ninth consecutive year, while Jose Ortiz registered 40 victories to lead all riders. Klaravich Stables campaigned 13 winners, six more than the second-closest competitor in Repole Stables, to pace all owners.

The 2020 fall meet at Aqueduct will begin Friday, Nov. 6 and continue through Sunday, Dec. 6.



EURO RAIDERS BREAK THE ICE AT KEENELAND

LEXINGTON, KY--With temperatures plunging into subzero depths overnight on Sunday, there was a truly wintery feel at Keeneland on Monday morning to coincide with the release from quarantine–a concept that many more of their human custodians can relate to in 2020--of most of the European Breeders' Cup raiders. As tractors worked over the main dirt course attempting to thaw it, training was restricted in the early morning hours to Keeneland's training track, and the Jessica Harrington-trained fillies Cayenne Pepper (Ire) (Australia {GB}) and Oodnadatta (Ire) (Australia {GB}) were the first to step onto the track at 6:30 a.m. for one lap at a trot. They were followed shortly thereafter by John Gosden's trio of Lord North (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), Mehdaayih (GB) (Frankel {GB}) and Terebellum (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}), who completed a similar exercise.

G1 2000 Guineas winner **Kameko** (Kitten's Joy) appeared in rude health as he completed a lap each at a trot and a canter, and his work rider Maddy O'Meara said, "He seems in really good form. He traveled over well and is settled. I think he was pleased to get out onto the training track for a leg stretch."

Kameko--who is now a stone's throw from where he was born and raised at Calumet Farm bordering Keeneland and the sales pavilion where he was bought by Qatar Racing for \$90,000 two years ago—is looking to continue his renaissance in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. Cont. p2

TATTERSALLS EXPLORING ALL OPTIONS FOR UPCOMING DECEMBER SALES

Following the UK government's announcement of a nationwide lockdown on Oct. 31, all possible options and dates will be considered for the upcoming Tattersalls December Sales, Tattersalls announced on Monday. The COVID-19 cases in the UK and abroad have been rising, and, as a result, the lockdown will begin on Nov. 5 and last through at least Dec. 2, interfering with the current sales dates.

"As has so often been the case this year, we are having to respond to events and decisions entirely outside our control, but we would like to assure vendors and purchasers alike that our overriding priority is to stage the 2020 Tattersalls December Sales prior to Christmas," said Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony. "Naturally our preferred option is to stage the December Sales on the existing scheduled dates and we are currently seeking clarity from the government as to whether bloodstock auctions are allowed to take place during the lockdown period. In the meantime in consultation with both Goffs and Arqana, we will be looking to establish viable alternative dates with the joint aim of providing the industry with workable solutions to the challenges we all face." That lean and leggy bay enjoyed a canter around the training track in the slipstream of Roy and Gretchen Jackson's formidable mare **One Master (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) just before 8 a.m.

The Frederic Rossi-trained Sealiway (Fr) (Galiway {GB}) looks to make it back-to-back Group 1 wins in the Juvenile Turf off an eight-length score in the G1 Prix Jean Luc Lagardere in what was one of the most eye-catching performances on Arc day, and his jockey Mickael Barzalona was on course to watch the colt train. Barzalona, who won the Breeders' Cup Turf aboard Talismanic (Medaglia d'Oro) in 2017, said, "I flew over on Friday and I'm delighted to be here. The weather is colder than I expected but its brilliant to be out at the training track to see Sealiway. I'm very much looking forward to riding him and the plan is to sit on him tomorrow or Wednesday."

The winner of the last three editions of the G1 Prix de la Foret on the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe card, the 6-year-old One Master just doesn't seem to know how to run a bad race and was beaten a half-length in the G1 British Champions Sprint S. when backing up to six furlongs over the soft ground at Ascot on Oct. 17. She lines up on Saturday in the Mile, the race in which she was fifth, beaten a length, two years ago at Churchill Downs behind Expert Eye (GB) (Acclamation {GB}).

One Master will have to contend with not only the 2000 Guineas winner Kameko in the Mile, but also this year's winner of the Irish equivalent, **Siskin** (First Defence), who was fresh on the training track on Monday, shying slightly as he jogged past the assembled railbirds before settling into a professional canter. Juddmonte homebred Siskin—a talented by quirky individual who has some questions to answer after playing up in the stalls last out prior to finishing fourth in the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp—is a first Breeders' Cup starter for trainer Ger Lyons. Mile contender **Safe Voyage (Ire)** (Fast Company {Ire}), likewise, is a first runner at the meeting for trainer John Quinn, and the gelding is, remarkably, rounding into his best form at age seven with wins in this season's G2 City of York S. and G2 Boomerang S. followed by a close third behind One Master in the Foret.

There are, then, quite a number of European raiders who will be writing exciting new chapters for their trainers should they emerge victorious, and another of those is the rapidly progressive **Audarya (Fr)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}). She is the first Breeders' Cup starter for her Newmarket-based trainer James Fanshawe, and while many of the other European-based trainers will arrive in the Bluegrass over the coming days, Fanshawe and his wife Jacko were on hand to oversee their G1 Prix Jean Romanet winner's exit from quarantine and subsequent canter on Monday morning. **Cont. p4**

Alison Swinburn's Audarya was beaten a nose in her lone start at two and showed plenty of promise last year at three when winning twice at novice and handicap level and finishing second a further three times, including in the Listed Prix Coronation going a mile at Saint-Cloud. After a pair of off-the-board finishes over that same trip at listed level to start her current campaign in June, Audarya flourished when stepped up to a mile and a quarter, winning a Newcastle handicap prior to the Romanet at 48-1. She showed that effort was no fluke when finishing a length behind Tarnawa in third in the Prix de l'Opera.


"After she won the Prix Jean Romanet at Deauville we thought 'if she comes out of it in one piece we'll go to the Prix de l'Opera and then the Breeders' Cup," Fanshawe said of the filly's path to Keeneland. "This season has been completely different with COVID disrupting everything, but her owner Alison Swinburn was also keen to go for it, and she's got a lot of attributes that should suit the race."

"She's a very good-looking filly; from the moment she came in she was a very good-looking yearling and she always showed ability," Fanshawe added. "She was a little bit quirky in some ways but she's quite a big, rangy filly and she's taken time to come to herself. She nearly won at two and at three she took a while to get going, and I think a lot of it comes down to the fact that she's been much better going a little bit further than the mile; she likes a strongly run mile but she was a bit keen as a 3-year-old, so we went to a mile and a quarter then came back. And since we stepped her back up to a mile and a quarter for her prep race for Deauville she's been more effective. And I think she's got stronger as well."

Fanshawe has been training for over 30 years and has orchestrated the careers of Group 1 winners like Soviet Song (Ire), The Tin Man (GB), Seal of Approval (GB) and Society Rock (Ire). He said he has always hoped to have a runner at the Breeders' Cup, and a myriad of factors collided to make it happen with Audarya, including perhaps the later start to the racing season necessitated by COVID.

"I think anyone who trains racehorses would aspire to have a runner at the Breeders' Cup," he said, "It's something you always have in the back of your mind, but it always comes quite late in our season and it's not a meeting you can go to as an afterthought. We'd been thinking about it for a while and hopefully everything goes smoothly for her.

"Keeneland is more European; it has a similar climate to what we'd have at home this time of year. I had a walk of the course this morning and it looked in really good nick. In theory conditions should be good for the European horses, the weather and the track." Cont. p5

Another British-based trainer already on hand was Nigel Tinkler, who put his GI Juvenile Turf Sprint contender **Ubettabelieveit (Ire)** (Kodiac {GB}) through his paces himself. Tinkler, a former jumps jockey and successful trainer both on the flat and over jumps, like Fanshawe sends out his first Breeders' Cup starter. Ubettabelieveit, the winner of the G2 Flying Childers S. over five furlongs at Doncaster on Sept. 11, is one of two representatives at the meeting for breeder Ringfort Stud in addition to GI Juvenile Fillies' Turf contender **Miss Amulet (Ire)** (Sir Prancealot {Ire}), who was also on track on Monday. Both subsequent pattern-race winners that were bought for €35,000 and €1,000, respectively, as foals, the Ringfort-bred runners do, indeed, give smaller operators a reason to believe.

The last of the European contingent to arrive at Keeneland will be the Aidan O'Brien-trained runners, who were scheduled to touch down around 8 p.m. on Monday and will therefore not make an on-track appearance until Thursday.

John Oxx, who announced his retirement earlier this fall, sent out his final runners on Monday. The trio of Monday runners contested a maiden at The Curragh, with the Oxx-trained Earlswood (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) finishing third in what would be the trainer's final race. Curraghglass (GB) (Zoffany {Ire}) and Safecracker (GB) (Golden Horn {GB}) also ran for the Oxx yard, but were unplaced. The day prior, Storm Legend (Ire) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) had won at Naas.

"Those are my last runners and they all ran well," said Oxx, whose remembered as the trainer of the tremendous Sea The Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}). "I thought the horse in third was coming to win, but he just got a bit tired. They are three nice horses and hopefully we hear more of them next year.

"The die is cast now and we're looking forward to retirement. We've been very lucky, we've had a great run and have no complaints. We're happy with the way life turned out.

"There comes a time when it's the right time to stop, and we've been thinking about it for a few years, as you have to have a viable business and there is no point going on when you don't.

"The more we think about it, the happier we are. What's the point in going on forever at it? I'll still go racing as I'd miss the people and the chatting. That's really what it's all about, the communication with people. I'd miss that if I became a recluse. I'll be doing a few bits for people although I won't be over busy. I'll be busy enough, I hope."

"The horse that won yesterday [Storm Legend] is going to Fozzy Stack and he'll have a bit of fun with him. He could go for a Guineas trial."



REMOTE UK PHASE OF GODOLPHIN FLYING START BEGINS

"It has been important for us to be reactive to the everchanging environment presented by COVID-19, but it brings me great satisfaction that despite the challenges, the groups of trainees in both Australia and Ireland have adopted well and have been able to achieve many of the same learning outcomes as previous year groups," said Godolphin Flying Star Director Clodagh Kavanagh.

CHOISIR PENSIONED FROM STUD DUTIES



Choisir | Coolmore

Coolmore stalwart **Choisir** has been pensioned from active stud duty aged 21. The son of Danehill Dancer (Ire) was a champion sprinter for trainer Paul Perry, having won on debut in the Listed Breeders' Plate and placing at stakes-level on nine occasions. He took out the 2003 G1 Lightning S. before embarking on an international campaign that saw him win the G2 King's Stand S. (now a Group 1) and G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot before finishing second to Oasis Dream (GB) in the G1 July Cup at Newmarket.

He then returned to Australia and began his stallion career at Coolmore and began shuttling to Europe the following year, where he would stand four seasons at Castle Hyde Stud and six at Coolmore Ireland. He is responsible for 97 stakes winners including 11 Group 1 winners such as 2015 G1 Coolmore Stud S. winner Japonisme, G1 Caulfield Guineas winner Divine Prophet and G1 Champagne S. winner The Mission.

His Northern Hemisphere progeny include four-time Group 1-winning Haras de Bouquetot resident Olympic Glory (Ire), G1 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint winner Obviously (Ire) and G1 Middle Park S. winner The Last Lion (Ire) who now stands at Darley's Kildangan Stud.

As a broodmare sire, Choisir has 18 stakes winners and four Group 1 winners including this year's July Cup winner Oxted (GB) (Mayson {GB}). While he won't be directly available to breeders anymore, his bloodlines are still available through

several sire sons standing in Australia with the most obvious being dual hemisphere Group 1-winning sprinter Starspangledbanner who resides at Rosemont Stud.

"Choisir was a wonderfully tough and talented racehorse who did great things for the Australian industry by winning two races in a week at Royal Ascot in 2003," Coolmore's Tom Magnier said. "He has been a great stallion at Coolmore for many years, siring stakes winners from each of his 14 Southern Hemisphere crops and 11 individual Group 1 winners amongst 97 stakes winners worldwide.

"Even in 2020 his yearlings sold for up to \$450,000 and we are hopeful that his 100th stakes winner is just around the corner (currently on 97 stakes winners). He has developed into a leading broodmare sire and successful sire of sires, so we will be seeing his name in pedigrees for many years to come. He is happy and healthy and will live out the remainder of his days in the stallion barn at Coolmore where he loves his routine."
