

MCKINZIE'S JOURNEY FROM JUVENILE STAR TO THE GAINESWAY ROSTER

Since his maiden-breaking '**TDN Rising Star**'-worthy juvenile debut, McKinzie had caught the eye of Gainesway Farm.

But according to Gainesway's Director of Stallion Sales and Recruitment Sean Tugel, the son of Street Sense had the attention of nearly every top stud farm in the country.

"He was on everybody's radar from the very beginning," he said. "Any time you see one win first time out from Bob Baffert's barn, you have to recognize it."

McKinzie's resume only improved from there over the next three years before he retired in October of this year, cementing his place on the Gainesway stallion roster.

A \$170,000 Keeneland September purchase by Karl Watson, Michael Pegram and Paul Weitman, McKinzie was named in honor of Brad McKinzie, an executive at Los Alamitos and longtime friend of Baffert.

Following his maiden victory, a disqualification elevated the colt as the winner of the GI Los Alamitos Cash Call Futurity S., leaving him undefeated as a juvenile.

While he continued the winning streak in his next start in the GIII Sham S. at three, the bay was later shelved and forced off the Classic trail, but returned with a vengeance for the second half of his sophomore season in the GI Pennsylvania Derby, and later a near five-length win in the GI Malibu S. **Cont. p3**

FINITE BACK TO HER BEST IN CHILUKKI

Finite (Munnings), a leading contender for the GI Longines Kentucky Oaks earlier this year after capping a five-race win streak in the GII Rachel Alexandra S., returned to her best form Saturday to annex the GIII Chilukki S. over a one-turn Churchill mile that proved right up her alley. Backed as the even-money choice coming off a close second in the GII Lexus Raven Run S. at Keeneland going seven panels Oct. 17, the blaze-faced chestnut settled well off the pace early while drafting behind rivals. Asked for more after a hot half in :45.59, she circled up out wide heading for home and wore down a stubborn **Sanenus (Chi)** (Scat Daddy) by midstretch en route to a 2 1/2-length tally.

"We had a great trip rating behind the pace," said winning rider Ricardo Santana, Jr. "I think at this stage of her career she is just getting better. She's only three years old and today was her first time against older horses. We went one turn today but she's maturing and going to be really nice at longer distances, too." **Cont. p8**

"He showed his extreme ability when he won the Pennsylvania Derby at a mile and an eighth, and then came back and won the Malibu at seven furlongs, showing that versatility," Tugel said. "The Malibu was certainly one of his marquee victories. He exploded down the lane at the eighth pole and separated himself from a deep group of horses. You see very few horses able to separate themselves from a field going seven furlongs like that, and it just showed his brilliance."

McKinzie got his signature win as an older horse last year in the GI Whitney, earning a 111 Beyer Figure and defeating the likes of eventual Breeders' Cup Classic winner Vino Rosso (Curlin) and Grade I winner Yoshida (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}).

"He ran 11 triple-digit Beyer Speed Figures, but his Whitney victory was his career best. He defeated multiple Grade I winners, and he did it easily," Tugel said.

With Grade I wins at two through four, McKinzie came back this year at five and added the GII Triple Bend S. to his resume. He retired with earnings of well over \$3 million, running either first or second in all but two of his 10 Grade I starts and retiring as a seven-time graded stakes winner.

"I think in today's world, we're so quick to put horses up on a pedestal," Tugel observed. "This is a great opportunity for our industry to breed to a horse that maintained the highest level of performance over three full racing years."

Bred by Jane Lyon's Summer Wind Farm, McKinzie is out of Runway Model (Petionville), a dual Grade II winner and \$2.7-million Keeneland November purchase.

Tugel said he believes McKinzie's pedigree will give the new sire every chance at success.

"He is the fastest son of Street Sense, and to be the best of a sire line is something special," he said. "He has the bottom side to make us believe that he's going to have fast, precocious 2year-olds. He brings that soundness, that size, that scope and versatility. And that's something we need in this breed. I think it sets him up for a big chance to be a very successful stallion in the future. He's certainly one of the most exciting stallion prospects we've had at Gainesway in a long time, and we're very excited to see what he can produce for us."

Breeders are now getting their first looks at the new stallion, and Tugel said he's been well received.

"He's an elegant horse. He comes out and shows all the class he showed on the racetrack. He stands there like an absolute picture. You can see in his movement when he walks across the ground, it's the same movement he had to make him a multiple Grade I winner. Even though he is a big-framed horse, that athleticism and lightness of his feet is a great attribute. He's extremely popular and we're very excited for the book of mares he's going to get this year."

Fresh off a comfortable score in the Sept. 12 Ruling Angel S., Artie's Princess collected her fifth career victory, and her first in graded company, while defeating her elders in Saturday's GII Bessarabian S. at Woodbine.

Forwardly placed in the early going, the Ken and Sarah Ramsey homebred prompted Jakarta (Bustin Stones) and Souper Escape (Medaglia d'Oro) through an initial quarter in :22.31. Sprinting past Souper Escape exiting the backstretch, the Ontario-bred wrested the led from the tiring Jakarta leaving the quarter pole, sprinted clear and had enough left in the tank to hold off the oncoming Boardroom by a head at the wire. Our Secret Agent was third, while Amalfi Coast (Tapizar), who won last year's renewal of the race, rounded out the superfecta.

"Basically, if I could go to the front I wanted to go to the front, but I knew that just the two horses wanted to go to the front, and it looked a little bit fast that's why I was just patient, watched from behind," said winning rider Kazushi Kimura, who won the GIII Ontario Derby S. with Field Pass earlier on the card. "She was just so comfortable today. I felt [jockey Luis Contreras and Boardroom coming] but she wasn't that tired and kept going. I felt I could win."

A winner in a pair of Woodbine sprints last season, Artie's Princess rounded out the season with a close-up second in the seven-furlong Frost King S. in November. Back on top in her seasonal return going five panels against allowance foes June 6, the bay crossed the wire fourth as the favorite, but was subsequently demoted to seventh for causing interference in the grassy Coronation Cup S. at Saratoga July 31. Heading into this race, the Wesley Ward trainee most recently posted a bullet five-furlong work in :58.60, the fastest of 27 at the distance, at Woodbine Nov. 15.

With the victory in Saturday's Bessarabian, Artie's Princess becomes Grade I winner We Miss Artie (Artie Schiller)'s first graded winner of his career. We Miss Artie, also owned by Ken and Sarah Ramsey, won the 2014 Plate Trial at Woodbine before finishing third in the Queen's Plate. Stormkeeper produced a Maclean's Music filly last season and followed up with a fullbrother to Artie's Princess this term and was bred back to the Ramsey stallion.

The lightly raced but plenty talented Ride a Comet played main spoiler Saturday as he defeated ageless Canadian hero Pink Lloyd in that one's quest for a third Kennedy Road trophy.

Ride a Comet dropped back to last in the early going as Pink Lloyd was hung wide in midpack while seeming to be struggling a bit to keep pace. The chalk went for a wide run after a :44.79 half, but Ride a Comet was able to save more ground before slicing out into the clear for an unencumbered run. He mowed down the leaders with ease before being wrapped up late over stablemate Souper Stonehenge. Pink Lloyd trudged into third without ever seriously threatening for the win.

"He's my favorite horse of all time... He went a good race, he showed he's all class," said rider Patrick Husbands of the winner.

"The last time I rode him, it was the first time we sprint and his first time in two years going seven-eighths. And he broke sharp, you know, and I eased him back because it was his first time in a long time so after the race I said to Mark, 'he left there running and I eased him back.' He said 'alright, we're going against Pink Lloyd next start.'

"Pink Lloyd, you have to respect him. He's a legend at Woodbine, and it's a great honor to run against him and try to beat him. When you beat him, you've got to be really happy, but you have to respect him." **Cont. p6**

Ride a Comet came to hand during the summer of his 3-yearold season, taking the Charlie Barley S. over the local lawn in June of 2018 before finishing third in Saratoga's GII National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame S. and making the grade in the GII Del Mar Derby that September. He missed all of 2019, but returned in a main-track allowance over an additional furlong here Oct. 16 and showed off the same strong late kick he had in the past to win by a good-looking two lengths.

Candy Ride (Arg) is the sire of Ride a Comet and 92 other black-type winners, 46 of which are graded. Perennially among the top 15 active leading sires in North America, his other runners this year include Vekoma, winner of both the GI Met Mile and Carter H. this summer. Ride a Comet's damsire, Successful Appeal, has 24 stakes winners out of his daughters, including MSW & GISP Trigger Warning, also by Candy Ride. Ride a Comet is out of the accomplished mare Appealing Zophie, winner of the 2006 GI Spinaway S. and the 2007 GIII Silverbulletday S. Appealing Zophie has twice sold for seven figures at public auction--for \$1.1 million as a broodmare prospect at the 2007 Fasig-Tipton November sale and for \$1.2 million while in foal to Tapit in 2018 at the same sale. In the years between, she would produce not only Ride a Comet, but also \$1.2-million Saratoga yearling Tapwrit (Tapit), who would go on to win the 2017 GI Belmont S. and has his first weanlings as a sire this year. Appealing Zophie's most recent foals include 'TDN Rising Star' Inject (Frosted), a winner this year, as well as a yearling filly by Tapit, who RNA'd at Keeneland September for \$185,000, and a weanling colt by Justify. She was bred back to Justify for next term.

Field Pass, whose prior try on a synthetic surface resulted in a victory in the GIII Jeff Ruby Steaks Mar. 14, bested the winners of all three legs of Canada's Triple Crown under a gutsy ride by Kazushi Kimura.

The Kentucky invader broke alertly from the fence and settled into a good rhythm in third as Queen's Plate and Prince of Wales S. hero Mighty Heart (Dramedy) took up pacesetting duties. Breeders' S. hero Belichick split foes and tipped out while passing the seemingly hard-ridden Field Pass leaving the turn for home. Field Pass kept pace with the leaders, but needed running room at the top of the lane. Mighty Heart dropped back at the rail, and with Malibu Mambo locked in battle with Belichick, there was an opening for Field Pass. The grey squeezed through that seam inside with a sixteenth to run, and kicked on from there to prove best while flirting with the track record.

"My planning was that I didn't want to get too forward, but I didn't want to send him to the front," said Kimura. "That was the perfect position, just waiting for room."

He added, "Such a classy horse. I've watched him many times, winning replays. He's nice, a nice horse."

Field Pass kicked off his sophomore season with a narrow victory in Gulfstream's grassy Dania Beach S. Feb. 1 before taking to the Turfway Poly.

He had been campaigned exclusively on turf thereafter, with highlights including victories in Churchill's Audubon S. June 20 and Keeneland's GIII Transylvania S. July 12. More recently, he was third in the GII American Turf S. back in Louisville Sept. 5 and again at Santa Anita in the GII Twilight Derby S. Oct. 18.

Pedigree Notes:

Veteran Lane's End sire, Eclipse champion, and Classic winner Lemon Drop Kid can still get a good one. The 24-year-old's annual crop size may not be as big as it used to be, but he is just shy of a milestone 100 black-type winners with 97. Field Pass is one of the 46 graded winners among his progeny, who also include an additional 91 stakes performers. Field Pass is one of only two foals to live out of his dam, a Florida-bred who campaigned from three to seven and visited the winner's circle eight times. She hails from an old New Zealand family that was exported from Great Britain in the 1870s and spent 10 generations in the southwestern Pacific nation until coming stateside in the 1970s when New Moon II (NZ) (Pakistan II {GB})--Field Pass's fourth dam--won the GIII Autumn Days H. at Santa Anita and stayed.

A third-out graduate sprinting at Kentucky Downs last September, Finite returned to the dirt to annex the track-andtrip Rags to Riches S. by six lengths that October before adding the GII Golden Rod S. in the slop at the end of the Churchill meet. She carried her momentum to Fair Grounds for wins in the Silverbulletday S. and over champion 2-year-old filly British Idiom (Flashback) and yet-to-emerge superstar Swiss Skydiver (Daredevil) in the Feb. 15 Rachel Alexandra S., but could only manage fourth at short odds-on in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks Mar. 21 behind Bonny South (Munnings). She hit the sidelines after that, reemerging to finish last of 11 back at Kentucky Downs for the Sept. 15 Music City S. before earning a careerbest 96 Beyer Speed Figure when just missing in the Raven Run to another talented daughter of Munnings in Venetian Harbor.

"She's a really quality filly," said Hall of Fame trainer Steve Asmussen. "We had a really nice win last year at Churchill in the Golden Rod and going one turn in the Rags to Riches. I think she had five wins in a row at one point last year. It was a disappointing race in the Fair Grounds Oaks and after that is when this year was sort of turned upside down. We gave her some time off after that race and she didn't really handle the going in her last start at Kentucky Downs. In the Raven Run, she ran really well against some nice fillies that day."

Finite is a fourth-generation homebred for the Winchell family, who first got into Finite's damside when they purchased her fifth dam, Debs Angel (Raise a Cup), through their long-time association with agent David Fiske out of the 1991 Keeneland November sale for \$190,000 while she was carrying a filly by Capote. The Winchells resold Debs Angel at the same sale seven years later for just \$55,000, but they still own a number of the family members these few decades later and runners have included Tapiture (Tapit), a MGSW and now a second-crop sire at Darby Dan.

Tapiture had three stakes-winning full siblings, including Remit, dam of Finite and of a yearling colt and weanling filly, respectively, by another Winchell runner in Gun Runner. The mare has been bred back to that stallion for next term. Finite is one of 40 black-type winners out of his daughters to date.

Finite is also one of the top runners by Munnings this year, who currently ranks in the top 10 leading sires by earnings in North America for 2020. Munnings, who stands at Ashford Stud in Kentucky, has 10 black-type winners this year amongst his 42 stakes winners in seven crops to race. Finite is one of 17 graded winners for the Speightstown sire.

North Dakota came from off the pace to collect his first taste of black-type in the GIII Red Smith S. at Aqueduct Saturday.

Overlooked while dropping back a furlong here, the Shug McGaughey trainee was taken back to a ground-saving sixth as 99-1 shot Real Factor (The Factor) raced out to an early quarter in :24.67. Still unhurried as Real Factor led by double digits heading down the backstretch, the field began to close on the loose-on-the-lead frontrunner exiting the far turn and into the home turn. As the tiring longshot faded fast down the lane, Ziyad (GB) was the first to reach the front, while a slew of runners threatened, including a five-wide North Dakota who was closing with purpose down the center of the course.

Red Smith S. cont.

Moving fastest of all with Red Knight pinned to his inside hip, the half-brother to graded winner and leading sire War Front (Danzig) took over in the final sixteenth and proved a half-length best over Red Knight. Ziyad rounded out the trifecta.

"I watched the replay and last time, I think he had a little bit of trouble," said winning rider Jose Lezcano. "I tried to give him a clean trip the whole way and not lose any momentum. He progressed. Every pole was progress. As soon as he got to the three-eighths pole, he switched gears. I hit him a couple times and he really took off and went on with it and won the race. I think he's a very nice horse. He's kind of one paced, but the longer he can go, the better for him."

On the board in three of four starts at three, the Joseph Allenbred broke through with a win going 8 1/2 furlongs at Tampa in March before adding another while stepping up over that course and trip in April. Fifth in a Belmont optional claimer July 4, the dark bay rebounded to score going nine panels at Colonial Downs July 28. Given some time off, the 4-year-old returned in his latest to finish fourth in the 12-furlong GIII Sycamore S. at Keeneland Oct. 15.

"With his pedigree, being a half-brother to War Front, this means a lot in that respect," said McGaughey. "When he broke his maiden at Tampa this year I didn't think he'd be winning a Grade III this fall. He's got the pedigree to do it and wants a distance of ground. Jose is a patient guy and I said just take your time with him and that's what he did and it worked out for him."



Gone for the next nine months, he was fifth in a local optional claimer going a flat mile Aug. 22 before scoring over the same trip in Arcadia Sept. 26.

Extra Hope was away without incident as his stablemate Royal Ship (Brz) (Midshipman) broke in a tangle and bumped with Midcourt. The favorite, whose best races have come on the engine, was forced to relegate pacesetting duties to Extra Hope as that one doled out splits of :23.86, :47.79 and 1:11.45. Extra Hope faced challenges heading for home by Midcourt to his outside and Combatant down on the fence, but finally switched leads in midstretch and found more thereafter to post the mild upset.

"That's what we planned with Extra Hope," said trainer Richard Mandella of the tactics employed on the winner. "I told [Juan Hernandez] to spin the tires out of the gate a little bit. Oct. 7 at Keeneland. Bruce Lunsford's Designer Ready broke slowly debuting over 1 1/16 miles on the local grass Oct. 3 before going from last to first to triumph by 2 1/2 lengths in a race that's featured three next-out winners.

Caracaro was dominant breaking his maiden at Gulfstream Park and was labeled a '**TDN Rising Star**'. He followed that up with a pair of runner-up finishes at Saratoga in the GIII Peter Pan and \$1million Travers. Caracaro has a lot to offer breeders as a Grade I performer by Uncle Mo, out of a War Front mare."

A \$95,000 Keeneland September yearling, Caracaro is a grandson of Grade II winner and GI Kentucky Oaks runner-up Santa Catarina (Unbridled).

SANTA ANITA TO INCREASE OVERNIGHT PURSES BY 10% FOR 2020-21 SEASON

Santa Anita Park announced Saturday that overnight purses for its 2020-21 season, which begins in its traditional Dec. 26 card, will be raised by 10% to a daily average of \$533,000. The meet will run through June 20, 2021. Six stakes on opening day include the GI Malibu S., GI La Brea S. and GI American Oaks. Other meet highlights include the GI Santa Anita H. Mar. 6 and GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 3. Click for a complete stakes schedule, pending approval by the Thoroughbred Owners of California.

"Building Santa Anita's aggressive overnight purse schedule is a reflection of the confidence that we have in California racing even in the midst of a pandemic," said Craig Fravel, CEO of 1/ST Racing. "Nothing has been easy about this past year, so we are thankful to the horsemen who have continued to support our program on a daily basis. We've missed the fans who have been absent from our track since March 12th, but we are grateful to be able to bring them the consistent top-quality racing that has been synonymous with Santa Anita since 1934."

Santa Anita will also be unveiling a new turf chute when the meet begins which will allow for sprints up to 6 1/2 furlongs to be contested over flat ground.

GOLDEN GATE, HEALTH DEPARTMENT ISSUE COVID UPDATE; 200 POSITIVE TESTS

Golden Gate Fields and the City of Berkeley Public Health issued the following update Friday evening with regards to a COVID-19 outbreak at the track which has shut down racing at least through November:

City of Berkeley Public Health continues to work closely with Golden Gate Fields on a significant outbreak where more than 200 people living or working on-site at the racetrack have tested positive for COVID-19. 1/ST RACING, which operates the track, is following all of the City's recommendations for testing, quarantine and isolation. The steps they have taken include the following:

Every person living or working on-site has been tested and additional testing will be done.

All those who have tested positive are isolated off-site, following federal, state and City guidelines. The track is assisting with off-site housing for those who have tested positive and has arranged for twice daily food delivery to ensure that those individuals do not have to leave isolation and have the essential items they require.

Golden Gate Fields' on-site medical director, an infectious disease expert, is providing medical consultation to those who live and work at the racetrack.

For those close contacts who have tested negative but still need to quarantine for 14 days, the track is providing daily food delivery and access to medical support as well as the means to safely quarantine, including additional bathrooms and handwashing stations.

Golden Gate Fields continues to implement health and safety measures including strict social distancing, masking policies and regular COVID-19 testing with isolation requirements for any positive cases or identified close contacts.

Both Berkeley Public Health and 1/ST RACING will be closely monitoring the situation to follow all local, state and federal guidelines. Should testing identify more cases, further investigation and tracing will be done by Berkeley Public Health and additional isolation and quarantine will be required.



A \$10,000 first prize was awarded along with \$1,000 to each of the two finalists, with all three receiving Tipperary crystal trophies in the form of Castleton Lyons' iconic stone tower.

Consigned by Hartley/De Renzo Thoroughbreds, agent, she was previously a \$775,000 KEENOV weanling purchase by Baccari Bloodstock. Grade I winner My Conquestadory (Artie Schiller) brought \$1.5 million from SF Bloodstock & Newgate Farm while carrying Miss Tapirado at the Conquest Stables dispersal at the 2016 Keeneland November Sale. Miss Tapirado's 4-year-old full-brother Bourbon War was second in the 2019 GII Xpressbet Fountain of Youth S. Miss Tapirado, drawn widest of all in post seven for this debut run, worked a bullet four furlongs in :47 4/5 (1/100) over the training track at Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott's Belmont base back on Oct. 11. **TJCIS PPs**

Merveilleux lived up to her name with another impressive victory in Saturday's Ontario Damsel S. at Woodbine. Avie's Samurai shot to the front out of the gate, but was quickly headed by longshot Justleaveitalone (Creative Cause) while Merveilleux raced in between rivals in third as Afleet Katherine ranged up to her outside down the backside, through an opening quarter in :24.91. The 2-1 chance, who drew closer to the front as Avie's Samurai inched ahead of Justleaveitalone following a half in :48.68, was soon joined by the fast-moving even-money chance Curlin's Voyage (Curlin), who made a brief but futile bid leaving the backstretch. As the favorite quickly faded, Merveilleux found herself three abreast of the leading pack turning for home, and despite veering out wide in early stretch, she proved much the best to race away to a 3 1/4length score over Amie's Samurai, who held third over Afleet Katherine.

"I just wanted to make sure to get the right move, at the right time," said winning rider Rafael Hernandez. "I didn't want to get it too early and then flatten out in the lane, but everything worked good in the whole race. We sat behind the speed horse, relaxed good and everything worked perfect today."

Victorious in a Woodbine allowance in June, Merveilleux was fourth in the GIII Selene S. in July before coming home third in the Aug. 15 Woodbine Oaks. Sixth in the 10-furlong Queen's Plate S. Sept. 12, the bay bounced back to score in the Wonder Where S. Against fellow Ontario-bred fillies Oct. 25.

Added trainer Kevin Attard, "She was kind of misfortunate earlier in the year to have some rough trips and some bad racing luck, but she's really put it together lately and I'm just happy to see it for the owners," said Attard, via a video call after watching the race from home.

A granddaughter of dual Grade I-winning By Land By Sea (Sauce Boat), Breech Inlet is a half-sister to Grade II scorer Bauble Queen (Arch), herself the dam of graded winner Blitzkrieg (War Front). Breech Inlet dropped a filly by Palace Malice in 2018 followed by a Practical Joke filly last season. BOYLAN FLYING HIGH WITH THE LIR JET FAMILY

As an aviation executive who is accustomed to spending some 250 days a year away from his home in the West of Ireland, life has been much different in 2020 for Donal Boylan. Thankfully, Boylan--who has been involved with the founding and execution of some of the most successful aircraft leasing companies in the world--has a twin passion in the form of his five-strong broodmare band, and while he and many of his jets have been grounded this year, Boylan was given quite a lift when the colt he bred, the aptly named The Lir Jet (Ire) (Prince Of Lir {Ire}), caused a stir in the summer when breaking the Yarmouth track record on debut before winning Royal Ascot's G2 Norfolk S.

Boylan bred The Lir Jet when he mated his bargain mare Paper Dreams (Ire) (Green Desert) with Ballyhane Stud's then firstseason sire Prince Of Lir, another Norfolk winner. Boylan sold The Lir Jet to Ballyhane master Joe Foley for \bigcirc 9,500 at the Tattersalls Ireland flat foal sale of 2018, after which Foley sold him on to Robson Aguiar for £8,000 at Goffs UK as a yearling.

Aguiar had the colt slated for the Tattersalls Ascot Breeze-Up sale, but when COVID-19 turned the world upside down Aguiar sold The Lir Jet privately to Nick Bell, son of trainer Michael Bell. Bell sold the colt onto Qatar Racing for a presumably much larger sum after The Lir Jet's debut victory. Reflecting on the highs and lows of 2020, Boylan–who typically spends most of his time in Asia but has been in Ireland this year since March--said, "Economically, this year was a disaster. The main positive of this year is that I've had six months with my family. So The Lir Jet was a great lift. The smartasses out there will say, 'aren't you the dumb so-and-so that sold The Lir Jet for eight grand?' But isn't that the story of this industry? The horse fairs in Ireland that we all went to as kids, particularly the traveling community, they always talk about the luck money, where you spat in your hand and left a pound or a dollar for the buyer. Everybody loves to see something they sold do well and you have to wish them luck, but ultimately I believe I'll be beneficiary of that."

Boylan could see his windfall as early as Friday, when he sends Paper Dreams's colt foal by Footstepsinthesand (GB) (lot 957) through the ring at the Tattersalls December Foal Sale through The Castlebridge Consignment. The 12-year-old Paper Dreams herself will go through the ring next Monday on the first day of the Mare Sale also with The Castlebridge Consignment as lot 1387.

Boylan–who was raised in Dublin but said his love of horses blossomed from summers spent on his mother's family's farm in North Tipperary–got into racehorse ownership some 25 years ago through syndicates. **Cont. p2**

He later branched out to own some racehorses and mares with a group of friends including former National Hunt jockey Ronnie Beggan and racecourse commentator Simon Holt. In 2011, the group was perusing lower level races looking for underpriced breeding stock when they landed on Paper Dreams, a 3-year-old filly trained by Kevin Ryan. By Green Desert, Paper Dreams was out of Pickwick Papers (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}), an unraced daughter of Italian champion mare Papering (Ire) (Shaadi). Paper Dreams had broken her maiden on her 3-year-old debut and won another seller two months later, both over six furlongs, before being plucked by Boylan and co from a Wolverhampton seller that September.

"Mares were selling for silly prices at the sales, and we were always looking for mares that we thought, by pedigree and otherwise, we might get out of a seller or claiming race in the UK," Boylan said. "That's where we found Paper Dreams. We had seen her race and she was moderate enough, but she had won a couple races over six furlongs."

Even with hindsight in his favour, Boylan doesn't claim to have had any grand premonitions about Paper Dreams.

"Paper Dreams, is she a beautiful mare? No, except her head," he said. "The two reasons we bought her were Green Desert and the head. I can't say in hindsight that we looked at Paper Dreams and she ticked all the boxes back in 2011; we mainly bought her because she was a basic winner, she was by Green Desert with a reasonable pedigree page and we thought Singspiel, even though he's a bit of a staying pedigree, we thought he was a solid damsire. And she had a beautiful head. That was it." **Cont. p3**

"But every foal she's turned out has been a decent size and has probably been at the top end of what that stallion produces, so she [improves her stallions]. We've had five foals out of her and she has gotten into foal at first cover every time. Her dam had nine foals out of 10 years, so one thing they don't seem to have a problem with in her line is production. I have rested her three years out of the last seven or eight just because we had late foals."

Boylan said his modus operandi has been mating his mares with stallions in their first or second season, or well-proven sires, as he has done with Paper Dreams to produce The Lir Jet and her latest Footstepsinthesand colt. Boylan said, however, auction ring trends have him leaning towards rolling the dice on a sire that will have his first runners at the time of sale.

"What I've found the last three or four years is that things have been difficult in the market," he said. "If you have what would appear to be moderate mares, like a lot of small breeders have, you're on a bit of a hiding to nothing with first-season stallions, because you're marrying a moderate mare to an unproven stallion. You get to the sales and you have no choice but to sell or give them away. We had one very nice filly from Paper Dreams called Fast Dreams, who is being sold at the same sale [lot 1577 with Jamie Railton]. She was a yearling in 2016, and we had two Fast Companys, a colt and a filly. We ended up selling them both for less than 5,000. They both went to Italy and they both won multiple times.

"So I've been moving towards trying to get progeny that when I go to sell, the sire has had their first season on the track. You can be a loser from it, but I've found that unproven first-season stallions don't help more moderate mares. We went early on with Society Rock and Dandy Man, they were two stallions we used a reasonable amount. I got both of those at a point where they'd had their first runners and had done quite well, and I think that's better than being absolute first-season." Cont. p4

The Lir Jet is a distinct example of a colt whose moderate pedigree and unproven sire put an automatic ceiling on his value in the ring.

"As a foal The Lir Jet looked the part, but the problem is when you're sitting there at the sales with a first-season stallion with a moderate enough mare-and we didn't know what Prince Of Lir was going to become, and we still don't-The Lir Jet was going to be a foal you had to sell no matter what he looked like at a very moderate price," Boylan said. "So well done to everyone involved, and the good news for small breeders like myself is if you're fortunate enough to have The Lir Jet, then you're fortunate enough to have the mare and the siblings afterwards. You might ask, 'why would you put the mare into the sales?' But the challenge is first of all if you don't and she doesn't repeat it again, you've missed an opportunity. But I think the second issue for someone like myself is that I'm not one of the bigger breeders with access to high quality stallions. I'm not going to invest in stallions that cost me 50,000 to 250,000. A mare like this, I think she has proven herself. In her first two years she visited Approve and Gale Force Ten, two stallions who didn't make it, but once we put her to an established stallion like Fast Company she produced a solid winner. And with Prince of Lir we took a chance again."

Before The Lir Jet came along and prompted Paper Dreams's

entry into the sale, Boylan tried his latest tactics with El Kabeir, who will have his first runners next year. The son of Scat Daddy won graded stakes in the U.S. at two and three and his first yearlings have been well received this year, averaging £26,382/€29,562 off an €8,000 stud fee and selling for up to 180,000gns.

"There were probably three reasons for choosing El Kabeir," Boylan said. "The first is the Scat Daddy commerciality. In Europe people have been getting very excited about No Nay Never, and I think in general there is a degree of excitement about Scat Daddy's progeny and the fact that we don't have him with us anymore. The second is El Kabeir himself, from a speed point of view. Scat Daddy, not unlike Green Desert and others, has been a very versatile producer; he can produce quick horses and middle distance horses, but El Kabeir had plenty of speed. And when we went to look at him, I think from Paper Dreams's perspective, El Kabeir is a good size but she doesn't want a massive stallion. She produces a big foal even from a smaller stallion."

Paper Dreams faces another upward battle that will resonate with small breeders in the fact that some of her key family members have been exported to smaller racing nations, like her aforementioned daughter Fast Dreams and her dam Pickwick Papers, who is in India. Cont. p5

"That's a problem for a lot of small breeders is that your stock disappears off into India or Italy," Boylan said. "In the sales, people don't even want to admit it; you'll often see, 'won three times abroad' rather than say it was in Italy or Turkey or wherever. With Paper Dreams's dam, Paper Dreams was her first foal and she was moderate enough. The second foal was a colt by Choisir and he won over six furlongs first time out. So her first two foals were both winners over sprint distances."

Pickwick Papers was sold to Indian interests for \in 10,000 in foal to Excellent Art (GB) in 2010.

"Excellent Art wound up in India and the Indians love him, so the mare was sold to a stud in Jaipur, and her next seven foals or something have been born there, and I think five of them have been winners in India. But you disappear off the map."

As such, the initial financial blow of giving a horse away or selling it cheaply to local interests may make for the best outcome for the breeder in the long run.

"It is a consideration as a breeder, if you had to give a horse away to somebody who is going to potentially train it or train it well, that may be a better thing to do for your mare," Boylan said. "When the market is so bad, and I hear this a lot with small breeders now, they're keener to see their animal end up with somebody who will have a view of getting it to the racetrack [locally]. Because that is the only way they can enhance the value of their mare. Having horses go abroad doesn't really help you as a breeder."

While he prefers his horses to stay close to home, Boylan has forged a career that has taken him around the world. He has been involved since the late 1980s in aircraft leasing, a business that he says was largely developed in Ireland. **Cont. p6**

"There are about 25,000 commercial airliners flying out there with all the airlines you know, and about 40% of them are leased or rented to the airlines," Boylan explained. "Aircraft fly for about 25 years and the operating leases tend to be for the first 10 to 12 years and then they get rented for shorter periods as they get older. The prime airlines would tend to keep their operating leased aircraft for about a dozen years, then get rid of them." Boylan can look forward not only to seeing Paper Dreams and her Footstepsinthesand colt go through the ring at Tattersalls, but also to The Lir Jet's impending 3-year-old campaign.

"Is he actually a sprinter, or could he stay a mile?" Boylan mused. "You can't make that judgement from the Breeders' Cup because that's not a true mile in the European sense, and he had a bad draw and I don't think he particularly got a good ride. So it'll be interesting to see what he is next year, and does he

Boylan started out working for one of the pioneers of the aircraft leasing trade, Tony Ryan, at Guinness Peat Aviation. In fact Ryan–also an astute horse breeder in his time and founder of low-cost airline Ryanair--is from the same North Tipperary town, Kilboy, as Boylan's mother.

"A lot of us worked for Tony and he spawned off a series of replica leasing companies," Boylan said. "I was a co-founder of a company that was about the


fourth or fifth largest aircraft leasing company [SMBC Aviation Capital]. We've since sold it but that company is still on the go and it's about number six in the world now. I got involved with the Chinese about 10 years ago and was the guy effectively who brought Chinese investment into commercial aircraft leasing.

"We developed another leasing group [Bohai Leasing, owner of Avolon]. They had about 20 airlines in the group and a lot of hotels. At one stage we bought 30% of Hilton Hotels and we bought the Radisson Group and we had a Chinese hotel group and so forth. But I ran the whole of their aircraft activities. That company now is about number three in the world, and to give you a sense of the size of those businesses, they'd have about 500 aircraft and the value of those aircraft would be about \$25billion."

Boylan had spent much of his time over the past 10 years in Hong Kong including as chief executive officer of Hong Kong Aviation Capital, but has more recently turned his focus to Vietnam.

"I'm on the board of the Vietnamese low-cost airline called VietJet, run by a really inspiring woman, Madam Thao," Boylan said. "She is Vietnam's first US dollar billionaire and I do a lot with her; I'm trying to convince her to get involved with horses but I haven't managed yet."

While the aviation industry, like all others, still has some turbulence to withstand as the world is shaken by COVID-19,



progress over the winter. I think he might actually be a better colt next year than he ended up ratings wise this year. And it'll be interesting for Joe to see whether Prince Of Lir can put his stamp on a few more horses next year. Prince Of Lir has had a very good start and I liked him from the first time I saw him."

For breeder Boylan, then, and those that buy into The Lir Jet's family at Tattersalls next week, there are plenty of reasons to keep dreaming.

CATHY GRASSICK

On the back of the eagerly anticipated stallion fee announcements in Europe, Gary King spoke with a number of leading industry figures about value. Today we hear from Cathy Grassick.

GK: Who have you identified as a first-year stallion at an appealing opening fee?

CG: Earthlight (Ire) is excellent value retiring to stud at \in 20,000 for a dual Group 1-winning 2-year-old by Shamardal. First season with runners, for me **Ribchester (Ire)** (Iffraaj {GB}) is really good value considering his sales results and the type of yearling he produced. He is standing at \in 17,500 down from \in 30,000 for his first year at stud. He was such a good 2-year-old, breaking his maiden in the G2 Mill Reef and his father Iffraaj was himself a top first-season sire.

GK: Best value proven stallion, and why?

From The Experts: Cathy Grassick Cont.

CG: I think **Zoffany (Ire)** (Dansili (GB}) is really great value at €20,000. He is capable of getting performers at the highest level, both colts and fillies, such as Thunder Moon (Ire) and Fleeting (Ire). He is a solid source of 2-year-olds and is even starting to look like a broodmare sire of note with the likes of Tiger Tanaka (Ire).

Kendargent (Fr) (Kendor {Fr}) in France is also super value at \in 10,000 for very much similar reasons. He is an excellent source of top class racehorses and is becoming a broodmare sire of note.

GK: Who would you consider to be an under the radar stallion?

CG: I think **Equiano (Fr)** (Acclamation {GB}) in his new home at the Irish National Stud for just \in 3,000 is really great value and a stallion very much under the radar. He had such a good year in 2020 and provides a good source of solid speed to Irish breeders.



PIKE'S TRIUMPHANT RAILWAY RETURN

Star jockey William Pike made a triumphant return home from three months in Melbourne at Ascot on Saturday, to claim an amazing hat-trick on **Inspirational Girl** (Reliable Man {GB}) in the \$1-million G1 Railway S.

Pike, known as the Wizard, was at his magical best ducking and weaving his way through runners before storming past **Too Close The Sun** (Carlton House {USA}) and win by a comfortable 1.75I.

Uni Time (Universal Ruler) thundered home to from the back end of the capacity 16-horse field to claim the minor end of the trifecta, with **Red Can Man** (Gingerbread Man) turning in another honest performance to run fourth.

Pike only came out of two weeks home quarantine at midnight on Saturday morning. He had to forfeit the Group 1-winning ride on Arcadia Queen (Pierro), ridden by Luke Currie, in the G1 Mackinnon S. at Flemington on Nov. 7 to be available to ride Inspirational Girl.

Pike joins Jimmy Miller, Hint (1929), Coette (1930) and Comparador (1931), as the only other jockey to win a hat-trick in WA's most prestigious race. Pike claimed his first win in the Railway on Elite Belle (Canny Lad) in 2014. He sits equal with Frank Treen, Beau Temps (1951), Maniana (1954), Tudor Mak (1966) and Kilrickle (1970), on four wins, as the jockey to have scored the most wins in the Railway. Pike's four Railway winners Elite Belle (2014), Galaxy Star (Fastnet Rock) (2018), Regal Power (Pierro) (2019) and Inspirational Girl, have been for leading WA owner-breeders Bob and Sandra Peters.

The Peters won their first Railway with Old Comrade (Old Spice) in 2001. Pike rode two Group 1 winners in Melbourne on Arcadia Queen in the Caulfield S. and Ole Kirk (Written Tycoon) in the Caulfield Guineas.

Girl on the Ball

"I was very lucky that she (Inspirational Girl) was really on the ball today," Pike said. "She jumped really keen which was good as she had been a bit sluggish out of the gates recently. I had to jostle a bit to hold my spot so I didn't get washed backwards.

"I was going to head out on her at the bend but the run didn't eventuate. And lucky for me there was run up ahead.

Pike returned to a hero's applause from a massive crowd gathered along the parade fence to cheer him back to scale.They broke out into a chant of "Pikey! Pikey!"

"The quarantine was okay because I was at home and I had my cows and animals to keep me company," Pike said. "Some days I didn't do anything but watch Netflix or others I would just poke about."

Peters paid NZ\$190,000 for Inspirational Girl at the New Zealand Bloodstock Premier Yearling Sale but the 5-year-old mare has been a work in progress, having only 11 starts for nine wins and two placings.

First Winner

Pike's first winner back at Ascot was on a close relation to Inspirational Girl called **Midnight Blue** (So You Think {NZ}) in the Better Your Bet H. Midnight Blue is from Midnight Special (Zabeel {NZ}) a sister to the dam of Inspirational Girl, Be Inspired.

"It is important to have William on all of our horses," Bob Peters said. "We target this carnival every year and we have a lot of rides for him. It was important to me to buy this mare as we have her sister and it is such a great New Zealand family.

"Midnight Special has produced two stakes winners and now this mare has won a Group 1. The family is building and Inspirational Girl feels like part of our family.

"I bought Midnight Special (three wins) just to breed with because she did not have good legs. Her pedigree was just so outstanding I wanted her blood.

"I have also been using Reliable Man as a stallion so it all came together for me. Inspirational Girl is one of the taller ones for Reliable Man. She took time to develop because she was very immature. I knew she had ability so I just looked after her."

Peters owned Midnight Blue's half-sister Neverland (Big Brown {USA}), who won a Listed Challenge S. and awarded the family a Perth Cup quinella, finishing second to Star Exhibit in the 2016 edition.

Pedigree Notes

Purchased by John Chalmers Bloodstock for NZ\$190,000 at the 2017 New Zealand Bloodstock Karaka National Yearling Sale, the mare is out of placed Zabeel (NZ) mare Be Inspired, making him a half-brother to Listed winner Ruettiger (Duporth).

Be Inspired is herself a daughter of three time-winning Done That (NZ) (Centaine) and she is a sister to Group 3 winner Rainbow Styling (NZ), while she is also a half-sister to Zingaling (Redoute's Choice). Done That Herself is a grandam of Group 2 winner Demonetization (All Too Hard) and listed winner Neverland (Big Brown).

Be Inspired's only filly since Inspirational Girl is a 3-year-old by Hinchinbrook who was purchased by Chris Waller Racing and Brae Sokolski for \$300,000 at the 2019 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale and she is now called Brookspire and is unraced. Inspirational Girl is the third Group 1 winner for Westbury Stud shuttler Reliable Man (GB), who is also responsible for G1 VRC Oaks winner Miami Bound (NZ) and G1 New Zealand Oaks scorer Miss Sentimental (NZ).
