



TRUE TIMBER RELISHES THE SLOP IN CIGAR MILE ROMP

True Timber (Mineshaft) has been knocking at the door of a Grade I win throughout his career, including in-the-money finishes in the last two renewals of the GI Cigar Mile H. The Calumet Farm runner broke through at the highest level in a big way at Aqueduct Saturday, romping in the mud to take this year's edition of the prestigious Cigar Mile.

With his last victory coming in a Belmont optional claimer in September of 2018, True Timber was overlooked at 7-1 in this event, which lost three contenders Saturday morning due to track condition, including second-choice **Firenze Fire** (Poseidon's Warrior). Racing two-wide, the bay stalked from third as comebacking sophomore **King Guillermo** (Uncle Mo) and hard-knocking New York-bred **Mr. Buff** (Friend Or Foe) battled through a :22.89 first quarter. Mr. Buff edged ahead of his younger foe through a half in :45.82 with True Timber maintaining his position in third and favored **Performer** (Speightstown) trailing the field.

Ranging up outside the top two approaching the far turn, True Timber turned for home in front and splashed clear of the field in the lane under confident handling from Kendrick Carmouche to pull off the upset by 5 1/2 lengths. **Snapper Sinclair** (City Zip), a 13-1 shot, completed the exacta and Performer got up for third.

"I've got to give credit to True Timber, the farm, the incredible staff I have, and of course Kendrick [Carmouche]," said winning trainer Jack Sisterson. "I had all the confidence in the world when Kendrick texted me, 'I got you brother, don't worry', with a little peace sign." *Cont. p3*

VARDA STEALS THE SHOW IN THE STARLET

Bob Baffert was favored to win his fourth straight renewal of the GI Starlet S. at Los Alamitos Saturday...just with a different horse. Grade I-winning 'TDN Rising Star' Princess Noor (Not This Time) was favored to rebound off a fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Nov. 6, but instead was pulled up and her stablemate Varda (Distorted Humor) took up the baton, springing a 17-1 upset. It was also the fourth consecutive Starlet victory for winning pilot Drayden Van Dyke and the second for Susan and Charlie Chu's Baoma Corporation, which campaigned last year's victress Bast (Uncle Mo).

Purchased by Donato Lanni for \$700,000 at the delayed OBS April Sale after breezing in a sharp :20 4/5, Varda was a decisive debut winner going six panels at Del Mar Aug. 30. She was a well-beaten second behind Princess Noor in the GII Chandelier S. going two turns at Santa Anita last time Sept. 26. *Cont. p5*

He continued, "As soon as I got the horse [this spring], the Cigar Mile was a year-end goal. A lot of emphasis has to be put on how good a trainer Kiaran McLaughlin is. He had this horse before I did and had him sent him to me in such good shape. This really shows how good of a trainer he really is."

The Cigar Mile was the first Grade I score for the popular Carmouche, who currently sits atop the fall meet standings with one day left in the meet.

"I owe it all to my fans, my wife and kids and how much they stuck with me and kept me pushing and fighting in this game," said Carmouche. "This means so much to me. This is the biggest win of my career and I hope I have many more blessed ones."

As for his trip aboard True Timber, Carmouche said. "We got an outside position this time with the horse being inside the last two times that I rode him at Saratoga and Belmont. I was very pleased with the draw we got and we had a couple scratches because of the sloppy track. I had perfect position leaving the gate and all the way around there. Right before we got to the quarter pole, I pulled the trigger and I knew they were going to have to run me down from here."

Second in the 2018 Cigar Mile and third to champion Maximum Security (New Year's Day) in last year's edition, True Timber kicked off 2020 with an eighth-place finish in the GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational S. Jan. 25 and was fourth in the GII Gulfstream Park Mile Feb. 29. Transferred to Sisterson after McLaughlin retired from training to take the book of jockey Luis Saez Apr. 1, the 6-year-old was third behind subsequent MGSW C Z Rocket (City Zip) when cut back to a sprint distance in a Keeneland optional claimer July 12. Completing the trifecta in a sloppy renewal of Saratoga's GI Forego S. Aug. 29, True Timber was fourth to Firenze Fire in Belmont's GII Vosburgh Invitational S. Sept. 26 and was second in the Lafayette S. at Keeneland on Breeders' Cup Saturday Nov. 7.

Pedigree Notes:

True Timber is the seventh Grade I winner, 22nd graded victor and 52nd black-type scorer for Mineshaft, who, along with Honor Code, looks to carry on the legacy of his legendary late sire A.P. Indy at Lane's End. The winner's dam Queen's Wood (Tiznow) was purchased by Haymarket Farm for \$47,000 in foal to Quality Road at the 2016 Keeneland November Sale as part of the complete dispersal of VinMar Farm LLC. The resulting foal is the now-3-year-old gelding Motown Music, a \$250,000 KEESEP acquisition by China Horse Club and WinStar Farm, who won two of his three starts this year. Her unraced juvenile colt by Into Mischief was purchased by the same connections for \$560,000 at KEESEP and is named Floodgate. Queen's Wood did not have a foal in 2019 and aborted her Malibu Moon foal this year. The 12-year-old mare was bred back to Omaha Beach earlier this term. True Timber hails from the family of MGISW stallion Pleasantly Perfect (Pleasant Colony); European champion Elusive Kate (Elusive Quality); and Group 1-winning sire Distant View (Mr. Prospector).

Dismissed at the windows in this five-horse affair, Varda raced in tandem with previously unbeaten second-choice Astute at the

back of the pack through the opening strides, but bulged out three wide turning for home as that rival cut the corner. The bay trailed the quintet as stablemate Kalypso (Brody's Cause) clicked off early fractions of :22.91 and :46.43 with Princess Noor in tow. Princess Noor swept to the front as three-quarters went in 1:10.15 with Varda still at the rear of the field with plenty of work to do. Princess Noor stumbled exiting the bend and was quickly pulled up and taken out into the clear by pilot Victor Espinoza. Kalypso resumed

command and continued strongly down the lane, but Varda unleashed a powerful late kick, inhaling her stablemate in the final sixteenth to win by 1 1/2 lengths. Nasreddine (Nyquist), the longest shot on the board at 25-1, filled the show spot and

Astute was fourth. Varda was the third New York-bred graded winner of the day, following GII Remsen S. victor Brooklyn Strong (Wicked Strong) and GIII Go For Wand H. heroine Sharp

Starr (Munnings) at Aqueduct.

"She always tries hard," said Van Dyke. "She broke well and we just waited. She needed every bit of that long stretch."


"[Varda] had been working really well and she looked like the kind of filly that the farther the better with her, so that's why we've been waiting and waiting with her," Baffert said. "I'm so upset about [Princess Noor] it's hard to focus."

As for that injured favorite, the Hall of Famer said, "Victor [Espinoza] said he pulled her up right away. He said it didn't look

Later in the day, TVG's Britney Eurton tweeted an update on Princess Noor, saying, "I just spoke with Bob Baffert regarding Princess Noor who was pulled up in the GI Starlet. He said she X-rayed clean, but has some inflammation in her left front tendon and stated, 'she was much better when she got back to the barn."

Varda is the 17th Grade I winner, 68th graded scorer and 159th black-type victor for WinStar stalwart Distorted Humor. Her dam She'll Be Right (Sky Mesa) is also responsible for GSP Big Family (Any Given Saturday) and MSP Geouttamyway (Cross Traffic). The 14-year-old mare's recent produce uncludes a yearling colt by Lookin At Lucky and a weanling colt by Maclean's Music. She was bred back to Accelerate. BROOKLYN STRONG UPSETS THE REMSEN

Native New Yorker **Brooklyn Strong** (Wicked Strong) earned his black-type badge against fellow Empire-breds last out in the Oct. 24 Sleepy Hollow S. and took his career to the next level Saturday with a gritty victory in the GII Remsen S. at Aqueduct.

Away alertly under Joel Rosario, the 7-1 shot raced two wide near the back of the quintet as favored **Ten for Ten** (Frosted) clicked off early splits of :23.67 and :47.86. Inching up into third alongside GIII Nashua S. victor **Pickin' Time** (Stay Thirsty) on the backstretch run, they bay overtook that rival approaching the bend and set his sights on the pacesetter. Pulling away from the rest of the field in the lane, the pair slugged it out in the slop with Brooklyn Strong forging clear of a determined Ten for Ten in the final strides to win by a neck.

"I was very confident going in," said trainer Daniel Velazquez, who registered his first graded win in the Remsen. "I knew the distance was key and I was confident about the off track. I was happy with his performance. He really dug in. Today was a big showcase for him against tougher competition and I couldn't be happier."

"I broke well and it looked like they were running away from me a little bit, so I had to ride him to get position," said Rosario. "I didn't want to let him fall back, so I rode him to stay within a couple of lengths. I was happy with how he was progressing and I was confident he was going to have something left for the end."

Purchased for just \$5,000 at the delayed OBS April Sale after breezing in :10 2/5, Brooklyn Strong was dangled for a \$40,000 tag in his career bow at Delaware Sept. 12, which he won by three lengths. Third next out in the state-bred Bertram F. Bongard S. at Belmont Oct. 2, the gelding scored a decisive victory in the one-mile Sleepy Hollow at Belmont last out.

Pedigree Notes:

Brooklyn Strong is the first graded winner and one of three black-type victors for second-crop sire Wicked Strong, who scored a career high at the Big A when winning the 2014 GI Wood Memorial S. His SP dam Riviera Chic produced a Keen Ice colt last year and a Practical Joke colt May 4 of this year.



MALATHAAT LEADS HOME CURLIN TRIFECTA IN DEMOISELLE

'TDN Rising Star' Malathaat (Curlin) did not look like a winner through the first mile of Aqueduct's GII Demoiselle S., but turned things around late with a surprisingly strong rally to keep her perfect record intact.

Away well from her rail draw, the 2-5 favorite settled in a ground-saving third as an eager Traffic Lane took control, clicking off a :23.69 first quarter with Juddmonte homebred Millefeuille (Curlin) pressing from second. Losing some traction as the half went in :48.50, the \$1.05-million KEESEP buy was passed by Malibu Curl (Curlin) and looked like she was not taking to the muddy surface as another foe went by her on the backstretch. Splitting horses at the hope of the lane, Malathaat came alive in the lane, swallowing up ground late to nail Millefeuille just before the wire for a 3/4-length score. Malibu Curl completed a trifecta for leading sire Curlin.

A debut winner going seven panels at Belmont Oct. 9, Malathaat romped by 7 3/4 lengths next out in the one-mile Tempted S. at Aqueduct Nov. 6.

"In her first two wins, she was pretty straightforward and didn't get a lot of dirt in her face or anything like that," conditioner Todd Pletcher said. "She was on-and-off the bridle and a little bit green, still, and there was a little bit of traffic, but in the end, she found more and showed the quality filly that she is. Some lesser quality horses might have thrown in the towel at some stage, but when she got rolling, she was impressive."

He continued, "She wasn't comfortable inside. I think she was unsure of the footing early on. Sometimes drawing the rail is great and this time it seemed to have backfired on us a couple of times. In the final eighth of a mile, she was able to get into her comfort zone and rhythm and that's when she showed what she's all about."

"Her class was what kept her going and got here there on time," said Hall of Fame rider John Velazquez. "She was never comfortable and not running into a spot I wanted. She never really put that much effort into keeping a spot. Finally, when I tipped her out heading to the quarter-pole, she started running."

Pedigree Notes:

Malathaat is the 35th graded winner for leading sire Curlin and one of 72 black-type scorers by the Hill 'n' Dale kingpin. She is also one of two graded winners at Aqueduct Saturday out of an A.P. Indy mare, following GIII Go For Wand H. heroine Sharp Starr. Malathaat is a daughter of Grade I winner and fellow 'TDN Rising Star' Dreaming of Julia (A.P. Indy), who was campaigned by Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Stables with Pletcher and Velazguez. Out of dual Grade I victress Dream Rush (Wild Rush), Dreaming of Julia is a half-sister to 'TDN Rising Stars' Dream Pauline (Tapit), a two-time Grade III winner, and Atreides (Medaglia d'Oro), a stakes-winning young stallion. Malathaat is the third foal out of Dreaming of Julia, but the first to make the races. The 10-year-old mare has since produced a yearling colt by Medaglia d'Oro and a weanling Curlin filly. She was bred back to Medaglia d'Oro.

ANOTHER NY-BRED 'STARRS' AT AQUEDUCT IN GO FOR WAND

Sharp Starr (Munnings) became the second New York-bred to defeat open company in a graded event at Aqueduct Saturday, defeating her elders in the GIII Go For Wand H. Co-favored at 6-5, the Barry Schwartz homebred pressed from second, glued to the outside hip of leader **Portal Creek** (Shanghai Bobby) through opening splits of :23.26 and :46.72. Scrubbed on by Jose Ortiz turning for home, the bay was the only one chasing after Portal Creek in the stretch as they pulled well clear of the others. Sharp Starr dug deep to collar the pacesetter late for a neck success. It was the first graded victory for her trainer Horacio DePaz.

"She definitely likes the track, but I think she likes the one-turn mile a little bit better," said DePaz. "It set up for her. I was happy she could repeat that last effort. Even in her two-turn races, she wants to put herself there, but she has those bad starts and afterwards she can't get up there. She's breaking so much better and getting herself into the race. The way she breaks and gets herself close, she's able to finish up nicely."

"They were running her two turns and she was breaking a little slow," said winning pilot Jose Ortiz. "Last time, when we brought her back to a one-turn mile, she broke well and that suited her better. They stuck with that racing style today. She broke sharp. She was there for me every time I asked her." Cont. p10

Breaking her maiden at fourth asking in a state-bred event at Belmont July 2, Sharp Starr was second in an NY-bred allowance at Saratoga 20 days later and was third next out in the Empirebred Fleet Indian S. at the Spa Sept. 4. Seventh in the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. at Pimlico Oct. 3, she demolished a New York-bred allowance over track and trip Nov. 7, winning by 15 3/4 lengths.

Sharp Starr is the 43rd black-type winner and 18th graded stakes winner for her sire Munnings. The victor is a half-sibling to MSP Papa Shot (Distorted Humor). Their dam Mindy Gold (A.P. 
NYRA ANNOUNCES JOCKEY PROTOCOLS FOR AQUEDUCT WINTER MEET

The New York Racing Association released their COVID-19 health and safety protocols for jockeys during the 2020/21 Aqueduct winter meet, which will open Thursday, Dec. 10 and run through Sunday, Mar. 28.

In order to mitigate risk and reduce the spread of COVID-19, Aqueduct will be closed to riders that are not regular members of the NYRA jockey colony as of Dec. 31. To account for NYRA's 10-day holiday break from Dec. 21 through Dec. 30, jockeys interested in being included in the regular NYRA jockey colony must contact NYRA for consideration by Dec. 31.

Members of the regular NYRA jockey colony who travel to ride at any other racetrack during the Aqueduct winter meet will be required to provide two negative COVID-19 tests taken within a five-day window in order to return to ride at Aqueduct. Jockeys traveling out of state who have completed the required testing will then be physically isolated in the jockey quarters for three additional calendar days. All COVID-19 testing must be performed in New York state.

In addition to race day safety protocols which include standard health screening and temperature checks, the jockey quarters at Aqueduct have been substantially altered to provide maximum social distancing and reduce density. All areas accessed by jockeys during the regular course of a race day are closed to outside personnel, including credentialed media, and are cleaned and disinfected throughout the day.

Jockeys are not permitted access to the barn area at Belmont Park. Jockey agents must produce a negative COVID-19 test in order to gain access to the barn area. Races will continue to be drawn via Zoom. Valets working in the jockey quarters are not permitted in the barn area.

Live racing during the Aqueduct winter meet will generally be conducted Thursday through Sunday until the end of February with the addition of special Monday cards Jan. 18 for Martin Luther King, Jr. Day and Feb. 15 for Presidents' Day. Live racing will be held Friday through Sunday through the month of March.

VETERAN TRAINER BOB HESS, SR. DIES OF COVID-19

Bob Hess, Sr., who began training in the late 1950s and saddled his last horses in November, passed away Saturday due to the effects of COVID-19. He was 86.

Golden Gate Fields, where Hess was based, was closed in mid-November and is not set to reopen until after Christmas due to a rash of COVID positives. Hess was hospitalized with the virus around the same time the track was closed, eventually released, and then readmitted when his symptoms returned.

According to The Stronach Group, owner of Golden Gate, Hess was born Oct. 10, 1934, and began training in Washington State in the 1950s after serving in the U.S. Army. He was part of the Agua Caliente training ranks in the 1960s and finally moved to Golden Gate in 1971, where he remained based for the past five decades. He was consistently among the Northern California leaders. Hess saddled 1,592 winners from 10,448 starters, with his runners earning more than \$17.2 million. His final winner was in an Oct. 29 claimer with 3-year-old Just Like Fred (Ultimate Eagle).

"Our hearts and prayers are with the entire Hess family at this time," said David Duggan, General Manager at Golden Gate. "To lose a longtime trainer and friend is simply heartbreaking to our entire horse racing family."

Golden Gate's Director of Racing, Patrick Mackey, added: "Bob was a wonderful horseman who was always there for his fellow race tracker. His stories were legendary. He was a wealth of knowledge and imparted that knowledge to many over the years. He was a great man and his presence here at Golden Gate Fields will be sorely missed."

Hess is survived by his wife Maria, to whom he was married for 56 years, and four children: Bob, Jr. (who is also a trainer), Howie, Erica, and Anna. Services are pending.

SOLID CAST OF OVERACHIEVERS SHINES IN CLAIMING CROWN by T.D. Thornton

Short-money favorites getting class relief while dropping out of graded stakes company set the tone in the nine-race Claiming Crown (CC) series Saturday at Gulfstream Park.

Luis Saez won six races overall (five in CC stakes), and trainer Mike Maker was one of nine separate trainers to hit the winner's circle in the CC races, posting his 18th career CC win to lead the series that began back in 1999 as a blue-collar version of the Breeders' Cup.

Conducted under starter-allowance conditions pegged to previous-race claiming prices, the CC is designed to honor and reward horses who compete in the types of races that form the backbone of day-to-day American racing. The annual event is a partnership between the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (NHBPA) and the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association (TOBA), and Gulfstream has evolved into the host track over the past nine years while slotting the series as the opening-weekend focal point of its championship winter meet.

As usual, many of Saturday's CC winners could have been had at the claim box earlier in their careers for relatively low asking prices prior to rounding into higher-profile overachievers.

Jesus' Team (Tapiture), the grind-it-out 2-5 winner of the featured \$150,000 CC Jewel S. over nine furlongs, is the prime example. The 3-year-old colt broke his maiden for \$32,000 at Gulfstream last March and was then dangled for a \$25,000 tag with no takers when airing at the NWL2 level. He consistently punched above his weight during 2020 while earning top-four placings in Grade I and II stakes, including a 40-1 third in GI Preakness S. and second at 62-1 in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile.

Saez kept Jesus' Team parked at the rail behind legitimate splits, tipping out at the head of the lane for a length-of-stretch reeling in of the pacemaker and a three-quarters of a length score.

Trainer Jose D'Angelo said post-win that the Grupo 7C Racing Stable color bearer will now target the Jan. 23 GI Pegasus World Cup over the same Gulfstream surface that has accounted for all three career wins for Jesus' Team.

Jakarta (Bustin Stones), the 4-5 victress of the \$90,000 CC Distaff Dash S. over five furlongs on the turf, is another admirable rise-through-the-ranks tale. She toiled at the \$16,0000 claiming ranks at Penn National as recently as 15 months ago, then improved enough to take a crack at tougher graded company in New York, Kentucky, and Canada during most of 2020.

Jakarta customarily heads straight to the front (on top at first call in 13 of 17 lifetime races), but she came away tardily on Saturday before rallying behind a 23-1 sacrificial speedster to open up late and win by 2 1/4 lengths for owner Three Diamonds Farm, trainer Maker, and jockey Saez.

Krsto Skye (City Zip) wired the \$75,000 CC Express S. over six furlongs as the 3-5 favorite, continuing Saturday's "dominant dropping faves" trend after second- and fourth-place efforts in two recent Grade III sprints. He registered a 1 1/4-length win for owners Daniel Feit and Carlos David, with David training and Irad Ortiz, Jr. in the saddle. That's a sharp score for a gelding who started 2020 claimed in back-to-back \$16,000 races.

While the above winners all represented bygone chances on the part of rivals who missed out on claims at lower asking prices, several CC winners on Saturday were the products of bigger-ticket purchases after initially racing for more modest claiming prices. *Cont. p13*



Fiya (Friesan Fire) began his career in November 2019 as a \$25,000 maiden-claimer in Maryland but was purchased for \$400,000 at the Wanamaker's July 2020 online sale after a sizzling 98-Beyer win that was .25 seconds off the Laurel turf course record. He has since won three straight turf sprints, including an allowance, a division of the Maryland Million stakes, and now the \$90,000 CC Canterbury S. at 1-2 odds for owner Robert Masiello and trainer Tom Albertrani. Saez was up for the 1 1/2-length wire job, which ran Fiya's record to five-for-five in 2020.

The win by Queens Embrace (Real Solution) in the \$95,000 CC Tiara S. also had an "immediate return on investment" ring to it. The 3-year-old filly broke her maiden for a \$16,000 tag Jan. 1 at Tampa Bay Downs. Four additional wins and eight months later, she was claimed for \$80,000 at Belmont Park by the partnership of Spedale Family Racing LLC and Flying P Stable. It appears as if the CC was the optimal target for trainer Danny Gargan, and Queens Embrace delivered as the 23-10 second choice with a four-wide late kick under Saez that put her 2 3/4 lengths clear at the wire.

Earlier this year, **Avant Garde** (Tonalist) required five starts to break his maiden for a tag, and he was claimed along the way for \$10,000 by trainer Jesus Lander on behalf of owner Gelfenstein Farm. That change of barns ignited a five-of six win streak, during which the gelding's only loss was a fourth in the GIII Oklahoma Derby. Back to the track where he now owns a five-for-six record, Avant Garde shot up the rail in deep stretch on Saturday to earn a half-length win at 6-1 odds under Leonel Reyes in the \$85,000 CC Rapid Transit S. over seven furlongs.

Descente (Bodemeister) was the only CC stakes winner cut from the mold of being claimed repeatedly while earning her oats with gaudy, open-length victories at the lower end of the totem pole. Since Dec. 4, 2019, the 4-year-old filly has been

claimed no fewer than six times, including for \$6,250 in her most recent start at Gulfstream Park West 48 days ago.

Her 4 1/2-length win at 7-2 odds in the \$80,000 CC Glass Slipper over a mile for Walder Racing and trainer Peter Walder marked the second consecutive victory in that stakes for Walder, who has now won five CC races during the 22-year run of the series. Miguel Vasquez rode.

High Noon Rider (Distorted Humor) was the bomb-thrower of the CC bunch. He orchestrated a 55-1, half-length upset of the \$95,000 CC Emerald S. for lifetime win number 15. GenStar Thoroughbreds owns, Saffie Joseph, Jr. trains, and Edgard Zayas rode. This 9-year-old gelding had never gone off at odds that high in 55 career tries (34-1 previous high), and had recently been sent postward favored or close to it while competing in the starter-allowance ranks.

The nose win by Frost or Frippery (Lewis Michael) in the finale on the card, the \$75,000 CC Iron Horse S., was the tightest finish on the day, barely earning jockey Saez his six-pack of victories. The 3-1 shot owned by Steve Landers Racing LLC and trained by Brad Cox registered lifetime score number 21 and win number eight during this calendar year, which puts Frost or Frippery in a three-way tie for most victories in North America in 2020.

Rousted along after breaking just fairly from gate one, the Gil Campbell homebred covered her opening two furlongs in :21.89 before taking token mid-race pressure from Gatsby (Brethren). Asked to sprint after a half in :44.70, Poppy's Pride pinched a break and was never in danger as Al Heybay made belated progress up the fence.

The New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund on October 29, 2020 adopted new rules concerning the residency requirements for dams of New York-bred foals, including certain mares that were purchased at public auction on or after November 1, 2019. It is anticipated that these new rules will become final upon publication in the State Register of New York on or about November 18, 2020.

Non-Resident Mares: In order for her foal to be eligible to be registered as a NY-bred, a non-resident mare must FOAL in New York State, remain in the state for a total continuous period of 90 days (including the time before and after foaling) AND be BRED BACK to a registered New York stallion before leaving the state.

Mares purchased from auctions can instantly become "Resident" mares in New York State if they follow these conditions:

- 1.) Purchase an in-foal mare from public auction for \$50k or more
- 2.) Bring the mare to New York within 15 days of the sale
- 3.) The 2021 foal is born in New York (this foal will be NY-bred eligible)
- 4.) The mare can leave to be bred out of state
- 5.) The mare has to return within 120 days of the last cover, stay in NY until 2022, and deliver that foal in NY

DURANCE HEADS ARQANA AT €750,000

Under tight restrictions similar to those experienced in Newmarket over the previous fortnight, Arqana's Breeding Stock Sale began its four-day run in Deauville on Saturday with a strong international feel to proceedings. Participation at this select session from owners and breeders in America and Japan in particular ensured that trade held up pretty well in extraordinary circumstances as the French lockdown continued. The clearance rate was down slightly, but was a healthy 79%, and the turnover of €18,716,000 dipped 18% on last year, when 10 more horses were sold. This time around, the 154 lots to have found a buyer returned an average price of €122,961 (-12%), while the median remained unchanged at €75,000.

German Influence

As highlighted in Friday's *TDN*, the German entry for this year's sale was strong, particularly through the draft of Ronald Rauscher, and it was **Durance (Ger)** (Champs Elysees {GB}) who proved the most desirable of the fillies in training, with the 4-year-old Gestut Ebbesloh homebred eliciting the day's top price of €750,000 from James Delahooke.


VAUGHAN TO TRAIN IN KENTUCKY

Ed Vaughan confirmed via Twitter on Saturday that he will continue his training career in the U.S. from a base at Keeneland in Kentucky. Vaughan announced in July that he was winding down his Newmarket stable of around 25 horses, citing concerns about the financial viability of training in the UK.

"As everyone is aware, with the reductions in prize-money and the cost of running a business being so high, the economics of training in Britain are not good," Vaughan said at the time. "I'm taking this decision now because I can see things getting worse in the next year."

Vaughan, whose best runner was this year's G2 Princess of Wales's S. and last year's G2 Prix de Pomone scorer Dame Malliot (GB) (Champs Elysees {GB}), told *Owner Breeder* magazine recently, "I came out ahead of the sales at Keeneland. I bought one there and received another for an English-based syndicate. If I started with around a dozen horses I'd be very pleased." Vaughan said he expects to have his first U.S. runners around the end of January.

The winner of last year's G3 Mehl-Mulhens Trophy in her native country for Peter Schiergen, Durance (lot 174) followed that up with victory in the G2 Gran Premio di Milano this season

and the half-sister to seven black-type performers is now under American ownership, with Delahooke acting on behalf of Bryant Prentice's Pursuit Of Success LLC.

"She was the one that I really wanted in the sale," said the agent. "Her family has really produced with sires that I'm ashamed to say I've never even heard of. The first dam fills the entire page: that's rare these days. She herself has an admirable race record. I bought her for a very nice American

gentleman who has mares in Kentucky and England. Durance will head to stud and her offspring will go to the sales."

He added, "The sale is very strong for the right profiles despite so few people around the ring. A lot of people must be bidding from offsite."

Another of the Rauscher draft, the Group 2 winner **Satomi** (**Ger**) (Teofilo), was bought by Michel Zerolo of Oceanic Bloodstock on behalf of breeder Andreas Putsch for €300,000.

Trained by Markus Klug to win three times and to finish fourth in the G1 Preis der Diana, the 4-year-old (lot 197) is a daughter of German champion juvenile Swordhalf (GB) (Haafhd {GB}).

While G1 Preis Von Europa winner Donjah (Ger) (Teofilo {Ire}) was bought back by her owner Dr Stefan Oschmann of Darius Racing at €720,000, this year's G2 German 1000 Guineas runner-up No Limit Credit (Ger) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) was knocked down to



Carson Wants Truth

The offspring of Prudenzia (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) have long ruled over Arqana's August Sale, and one of the great mare's daughters again played a leading role in December when **Truth (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) brought the hammer down at €580,000. Again it was James Delahooke doing the bidding but this time he was acting on behalf of Willie Carson's Minster Stud.

Now eight, the sister to Group 1 winner Magic Wand (Ire) and half-sister to Classic winner Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) had been sold for €1-million as a yearling and raced in a partnership for Al Shaqab and Coolmore. Her one placed finish for Aidan O'Brien may have been disappointing but she has plenty of black-type earners for relations and she was sold in foal to Siyouni (Fr) as lot 178. Thus, a member of the celebrated family returns to England, where her grandam Platonic (GB) (Zafonic) was bred by the Cumani family's Fittocks Stud before being bought as a foundation mare for Ecurie des Monceaux by Henri Bozo and Patricia Boutin.

Another of Platonic's grand-daughters, **Psara (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), also brought one of the day's highest prices when sold to Ghislain Bozo's Meridian International for €500,000. The 4-year-old mare (lot 148) is a daughter of the G3 Prix de Lutece winner Pacifique (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and, a winner herself last year, is now in foal to Churchill (Ire). As a yearling she was bought for €250,000 by Monceaux partner Victor Langlais.

"She's a lovely mare from a very good family," said Bozo. "She is carrying to Churchill and the mating should suit her. Certain partners have come out and the sale has allowed new partners to come in."

Japan Calling

All three Yoshida brothers of Japan's leading racing family were represented during Argana's opening session. Spinning Memories (Ire) (Arcano (Ire)) has been a highly consistent campaigner for Pan Sutong and Pascal Bary since her impressive maiden win on debut in Ireland and subsequent purchase from Andy Oliver's stable. Her tally of two Group 3 and three listed wins over the last two seasons vouch for her talent and, though her first two dams were unraced, she traces back to another talented and consistent race mare, the dual Grade I winner Memories Of Silver (Silver Hawk), who has in turn also proved to be a classy producer. Now five, Spinning Memories (lot 134) has thus earned her place among the illustrious broodmare band of Teruya Yoshida, who bought her online for €500,000. She will be joined on the flight to Japan by Mageva (Fr), the 3-year-old daughter of Wootton Bassett (GB) who was trained by Fabrice Chappet to take third in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and was picked up for €430,000, also by the Shadai Farm principal.

Katsumi Yoshida had already bought the winner of that French Classic, Dream And Do (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}), in a private deal earlier this season to join his own equally impressive collection of broodmares at Northern Farm, and he was also a prominent buyer in Deauville.

"She has been bought for breeding purposes and she will join Northern Farm," said de Seroux. "There is a very strong chance that she will head to Japan in the new year to be covered."

Petite Folie, who ran just once for her breeder Diane Wildenstein's Ballymore Thoroughbred Ltd, was sold as lot 150 through La Motteraye Consignment and she continues the European spending spree for Katsumi Yoshida, who also bought

five mares at Tattersalls last week for 1.6 million gns.

Haruya Yoshida also made his presence felt with the purchase of another wild card (lot 170) in the recent G3 Prix Fille de l'Air winner Directa (Fr). The half-sister to German listed winner Mc Queen (Fr) (Silver Frost {Ire}) was bought for €470,000 through Satoshi Kobayashi and will join the breeder's Oiwake Farm in Hokkaido.

Kobayashi said of the 3-year-old, "The filly has been

bought as a breeding prospect and she won't race again. She may be covered by a European stallion before she travels to Japan."

Another mare on the way to Japan from Arqana is **Considerate (GB)**, a Dansili (GB) half-sister to Enable (GB), who was bought by Keisuke Onishi of JS Company for €65,000. The 10-year-old mare (lot 32) was sold by Haras d'Etreham in foal to Enable's sire Nathaniel (Ire). She also has a colt foal by the Newsells Park Stud stallion on the ground among her four offspring to date.

Euclidia Joins Select Local Team

Owner Jean-Louis Bouchard is turning his success on the track into a boutique breeding operation and, acting though agent Gerard Larrieu, went to €525,000 to buy the listed winner **Euclidia (Fr)** (Maxios {GB}) from the Wertheimer consignment (lot 172).

"Jean-Louis Bouchard has just started a little farm here near Deauville," Larrieu explained. "He doesn't want to have many mares, just eight or 10 maximum, and he wants to improve the quality of his broodmare band. This is a lovely Wertheimer family and they cover their mares with top sires."

The 3-year-old Euclidia is a half-sister to G3 Prix d'Aumale

winner Soustraction (Fr) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) and G1 Prix Marcel Boussac runner-up Matematica (Fr) (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}) from a deep Wertheimer family which includes the Arc heroine Solemia (Fr) (Poliglote {GB}) and Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner The Gurkha (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

From Trotting to Galloping

Malevra (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}) was one of the young in-foal mares to sell well on Saturday, and she will remain in France to become the foundation mare for an unnamed breeder from the world of trotting.

Offered as lot 90 by Haras d'Etreham, the 4-year-old is in foal for the first time to that stud's former stallion Wootton Bassett (GB). A half-sister to listed winner and Group 3-placed Moonlife (Fr) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), Malevra gained her own black type last season when runner-up in the G3 Prix de Royaumont on the back of two wins at Deauville and Lyon-Parilly.

Bloodstock agent Frederic Sauque signed the ticket on behalf of his client from and

said, "I have bought her for a new investor and she will be his first Thoroughbred mare. We liked both her conformation and her form on the track, and she is carrying a foal by a good stallion."

American Engagement

Along with the day's top lot, two well-credentialed 3-year-old fillies piqued the interest of Americans, one to remain in training and one to join the broodmare band at Gainesway Farm.

Conte De Fee (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) has already earned black type through her victory in the Listed Prix Occitaine this summer. Bought as a yearling by Tina Rau for 100,000gns for owner Alexis Adamian, the grand-daughter of Irish Oaks winner Petrushka (GB) (Unfuwain) was sold on by her trainer Nicolas Clement for €410,000 to Newmarket-based agents Mark McStay and Jamie Piggott as lot 109.

"I bought her with Jamie Piggott on behalf of Medallion Racing and a client of Jamie's in America," explained McStay of Avenue Bloodstock. "She'll go to the United States. Medallion is Taylor Made's racing arm and both Jamie and I felt she was a lovely filly. She's been really well trained by Nicolas Clement and she looks to be progressing the right way."

Piggott added, "I've had a lot of luck at this sale over the years and you only need to look at the recent success of French-bred horses in America to see what fillies like this can do over there."

Also heading across the Atlantic is the unraced but well-bred Lasy W (War Front) (lot 144), who was bought online for €320,000 by Alex Solis acting on behalf of Gainesway's Antony Beck and Andrew Rosen.

"It's a great American family," said Solis. "It's very rare to have a Grade I winner who is out of a Grade I winner and there are so many current stakes horses on the page. We're excited about that; she's a beautiful War Front filly. I had some people look at her over there for me and the report was out that she was very, very good-looking."

This particular branch of the family ended up in the care of the Wertheimer brothers after they bought Lasy W's dam Zaftig (Gone West) for \$1.4 million at Fasig-Tipton in November 2011. The mare's most accomplished runner to date is the GII Louisiana Derby runner-up Spinoff (Hard Spun), and she is also the dam of listed-placed Rugbyman (Tapit).

Solis added, "Antony Beck and Andrew Rosen bought her together and the plan will be to breed her to Tapit next year. The mare [Zaftig] has a yearling colt by Tapit right now and Rugbyman is a Tapit and he's a nice horse, so we figured that made a lot of sense for us."

Double Handed

The demand for the stock offered by the Wertheimer brothers continued with **Right Hand (GB)**, a Lope De Vega (Ire) half-sister to G1 Prix Vermeille winner Left Hand (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), who was bought by Victor Langlais for €370,000. The 3-year-old (lot 168) was acquired on behalf of a partnership that will include Henri Bozo and Bertrand Le Metayer, and we will doubtless hear more of her in the Arqana ring in years to come as she will reside at Ecurie des Monceaux, the perennial leading consignor

at the August Yearling Sale.

Langlais also bought lot 154, Light Dream (Fr) (Anodin {Ire}), the three-part-sister to G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud winner Plumania (Fr) (Anabaa), from the Wertheimer draft and said, "I bought her for a partnership. Henri Bozo and I are both among those involved. The idea is to find good mares and to then sell their yearlings at the sales. She comes from a great family and is from a very good breeding operation."

The Arqana Breeding Stock Sale continues on Sunday at 10 a.m. local time.



TRULY GREAT WINS WITH EASE



Truly Great | TDNAusNZ

Premiership leading jockey Chris Parnham celebrated his biggest day in the saddle, when breaking eight Group 1 placings on **Truly Great** (Dundeel {NZ}) with an outstanding victory in WA's weight-for-age championship--the \$1 million Peoplestart Kingston Classic.

Parnham was exuberant waving his whip and standing high in the irons on passing the post, after beating the heavily-backed \$2.10 favourite and stable-mate Inspirational Girl (NZ) (Reliable Man {GB}) by two lengths in the 1800 metre Ascot feature.

It was almost three lengths back to 3-year-old Dom To Shoot (Shooting To Win), who led the chase of the other 13 runners for third place.

Parnham's win was in front of his father and leading trainer Neville, mother Carolyn and brothers Steven (who is sidelined because of a broken collar-bone) and Brad, who rode Kay Cee (Playing God) for his father, to finish 10th in the same race.

Parnham has been an avid racing fan since he was a small boy. He revealed he had worn out the tape of his father's Perth Cup win with Luna Tudor (Military Plume {NZ}) in 2000.

"I just watched that tape over and over," the 23-year-old said. "I have been going to the races for as long as I can remember. I loved watching dad's horses race and watching my brothers Steven and Brad ride every Saturday.

"Kids at school would be doing their homework and I would be

watching race replays. To win a Group 1 now on my own is pretty special.

"To ride my first Group 1 for Bob and Sandra [Peters] also is special. They have been my second most strong supporters [behind his parents]) since I started riding.

"Trainers Grant and Alana [Williams]) have supported me since I started as a 16-year-old too."

Parnham rode his first stakes winner for the Peters family on Moonlight Bay (Catbird) in the 2013 Ascot Gold Cup over 1800 metres.

Parnham, who rode a feature double, leads the country, having won the most metropolitan races on 51 wins, ahead of James McDonald, who rode four winners at Rosehill, on 45 wins.

Parnham is perched at the top of WA's city title 23 wins ahead of Clint Johnston-Porter.

The Kingston Town

Truly Great became the Peters family's sixth winner in the Kingston Town, following the deeds of Old Nick (Old Spice) (1998), Old Comrade (Old Spice) (2000 and 2001), Perfect Reflection (More Than Ready {USA}) and Arcadia Queen (Pierro).

Grant Williams is now level with David Hayes; Credit Account (Imposing) (1993), and Nicconero (Danzero) (2006-08); and Neville Parnham, Playing God (Blackfriars), (2010/11) and Kay Cee (Playing God) (2019), as having trained the most winners on three wins.

Williams shares the credit of his past two wins with his wife and training partner Alana.

Truly Great only qualified for a start in the Railway S., where he ran an eye-catching seventh to Inspirational Girl a fortnight ago, in winning the G3 R J Peters S. on November 14.

Peters rates Truly Great as one of the most perfectly built horses he has ever bred in over 40 years.

Work in Progress

But the 5-year-old has been a work in progress to get him to perform at the top of his game.

"He got a good run and [Inspirational Girl] got caught well back, that was the difference," Peters said. "I said all along he

was the best foal I had ever bred. I have had to wait a long time for him. A lot of things went wrong, but I always maintained my confidence in him.

"He had silly little things go wrong that seems to haunt his family. There was nothing dramatic, but we would bring him in and turn him back out again."

Grant Williams, who won the G1 Caulfield S. and Mackinnon S. with Arcadia Queen during the spring was back on track to celebrate, after completing a mandatory fortnight in quarantine.

"Alana trained these ones (Perth) and that is rightfully so," Williams said. "It has been a good few months. Truly Great was a bit quirky early. Bob would keep taking him off us and putting back in the paddock to mature.

"He was just a big baby more than anything. Now he is not. He has grown into a magnificent animal."

Truly Great is the second stakes-winner for the Peters-owned mare Truly Special (Jeune). Special Alert (Not A Single Doubt) won the G3 2018 WA Oaks, 2400 metres.

Another half-brother Truly Gold (Nicconi) won the Esperance Cup among his seven wins.

Truly Great is entered for the \$400,000 Tabtouch Perth Cup, 2400 metres, on January 2.

A start is now doubtful because he will receive a hefty penalty for his Kingston Town win.

"He could go into the Ted Van Heemst S in a fortnight, because that is weight-for-age," Peters said.

"At the moment I am fifth on the Thoroughbred Global Owners' Rankings and a G2 win in the Van Heemst would help me. "That is the highest I have ever been. I would say a Perth Cup start would be out because he will go up to high in the ratings."

Truly Great is from the Jeune (GB) mare Truly Special, who was bred at Lindsay Park Stud and sold at the 2008 Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale for \$130,000. She has produced two stakes winners in Special Alert (Not A Single Doubt), winner of the 2018 G3 WATC West Australian Oaks, and Truly Great, her fourth foal and now two-time stakes winner. Truly Great's Kingston Town win is Arrowfield Stud sire Dundeel's (NZ) fifth individual Group 1 winner.
