HOMECOMING KING BIDS TO RULE CALIFORNIA

ARCADIA, USA — We may be biased over here in the European edition, but for the turfistes out there, the race of this weekend is the GI Longines Breeders' Cup Turf.

Primarily there's the scintillating prospect of a rematch between the first two home in the Derby, Auguste Rodin (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and King Of Steel (Wootton Bassett {GB}), who between them have picked off the Irish Derby, Irish Champion S., King Edward VII S., and Champion S. since Epsom.

To that duo we can add the top-rated horse still in training in Europe, Mostahdaf (Ire) (Frankel {GB}), whose victories in the Prince of Wales's S. and Juddmonte International have made a significant contribution towards Sheikha Hissa's Shadwell operation being named champion owner in Britain in 2023.

Then, for France, there's Onesto (Ire) (Frankel {GB}), who featured in these pages on Tuesday, plus the Japanese Derby winner of 2021, Shahryar (Jpn), another son of Deep Impact who added victory in the Dubai Sheema Classic to his travelling portfolio and has looked picture of poise and contentment these last few mornings during trackwork.

If he handles the step up to a mile and a half for the first time, the hugely consistent Up To The Mark (Not This Time) shouldn't be overlooked as the best of the home-based challengers either, coming into the race off three straight Grade I wins for Todd Pletcher. Cont. p3

THE ANTARCTIC TO STAND AT CASTLEHYDE STUD FOR COOLMORE

Multiple group winner **The Antarctic (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}--Anna Law {Ire}, by Lawman {Fr}), a full-brother to crack sprinter Battaash (Ire), has been retired and will stand under the Coolmore banner at Castlehyde Stud in 2024, Coolmore announced on Wednesday. A fee for the G1 Middle Park S. second and G1 Prix Morny third will be announced later.

"He's fast, a very good-looking individual and his own-brother Battaash is probably the best five-furlong sprinter of recent times," said Castlehyde's Paddy Fleming. "On a mark of 113 as a 2-year-old, the Antarctic was rated the equal of Havana Grey (GB)--who is out of a Dark Angel mare--and just a pound below his own sire Dark Angel."

Bred by Paul McCartan of Ballyphilip Stud, the grey was a 750,000gns Tattersalls October Book 1 purchase by Coolmore's MV Magnier. Trained by Aidan O'Brien for a Coolmore partnership, the February foal won his first two starts and was second in the G2 Prix Robert Papin later in his juvenile season prior to a victory in the G3 Prix de Cabourg. Two Group 1 placings followed--with a third in the Prix Morny to stablemate Blackbeard (Ire) (No Nay Never) and a second to that foe in the Middle Park. Cont. p7

Of these leading contenders, arguably the horse who brings

the biggest buzz with him is King Of Steel, who left the United States as a yearling but appears to be enjoying his homecoming of sorts as he strolls and struts about Santa Anita Park in the morning. The man who helped create the buzz on Champions Day, Frankie Dettori, has not been allowed back aboard him yet: that pleasure belongs to Robson Aguiar, who oversaw King Of Steel's early days of pre-training and has been in the saddle the last two mornings since the horse was released

The unmissable European breeding stock sale

Why not indeed. While his Epsom conqueror Auguste Rodin is nestled in among his nine stable-mates out on the track each morning, King Of Steel has been going out solo and is certainly a

quieter fellow than Mostahdaf, who left the quarantine barn moments before him on Wednesday and is clearly rehearsing for his future career in the stallion barn.

Varian said, "He's got a great constitution and he takes it all well. It was his second morning out on the track and he didn't turn a hair.

"It's a good race with some good horses, but it's a \$4-million race so it should be a strong contest. These are the races we want to be involved in, and in every run this year he's never run a bad race and

he's looked a Group 1 horse. It's fair to say that he's still improving. A return to a mile and a half will suit him and I think a return to better ground will suit him."

King Of Steel initially had two Breeders' Cup entries, with the

Classic having been ruled out last week in favour of the Turf option, which will be a much firmer surface than he encountered at Ascot.

Varian continued, "He probably doesn't have the gate speed to

consider the dirt at the moment but he might have the constitution for it, so I wouldn't rule it out one day.

"He found a way to win at Ascot but I'm not sure he enjoyed the conditions. He never looked that happy from when the gates opened but Frankie was so good on him and left him alone. On a day of racing when pace was favoured throughout he was brave enough to leave the horse alone and let him find his feet and find a way to win. I think he's a better horse on better ground. He's a beautiful-moving

ground here and he should improve for going around here."

King Of Steel's owner Kia Joorabchian had signalled his keenness to bring the horse to California but Varian said that the decision was ultimately left to him.

"Kia wants to be here, yes, there is no hiding that fact," he said. "But, equally, he was saying that unless I was 100 per cent happy with the horse then we shouldn't come. In a conservative way, I suppose I was looking for a reason not to come. Was he flat? Was there any reason? We could have finished on a high, waited for next year. But the horse has ticked every box since Ascot. We talked about it every day, myself and Kia. We could have easily said 'let's not go'. But he just got better and better through the week.

"We could have waited for next year but this is horse racing and next year doesn't always come. They can stand on a stone, they can get hurt in their stable, they can not be in as good form. But, in my opinion, he looked like he could run again, and that's why we are here. We won't be proven right or wrong until the dav."

Despite the build-up to what was in theory Dettori's final ride in Britain aboard King Of Steel in the Champion S., Varian admits that he was caught off guard by the rousing reception given to horse and rider as they returned to the winner's enclosure.

"Of course I knew it was his last ride but I hadn't prepared myself for what it would be like on the day. Maybe nobody had," he said. "Who knew it would build into that final crescendo? I was caught out in the paddock. I didn't speak to Frankie. Of course I had spoken to him on the day but in the paddock I was 10 deep behind everyone else. I was just worried that the noise in the paddock would set the horse off. There were camera guys running up alongside him, I was trying to keep people quiet. Really, everything I did was on instinct as it could have unraveled.

"The horse kept himself under control, the jockey kept himself under control - just about! Thankfully it all ended well and the aftermath was something I will never forget. Nobody will. It was incredible."

BIG UP FOR BIG EVS

ARCADIA, USA -- Tom Marguand arrived at Santa Anita on Wednesday morning in the company of his wife Hollie Doyle, and while she has been ruled out of riding Bradsell (GB) (Tasleet {GB}) in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint through a suspension incurred at home, Marquand is relishing his participation aboard Big Evs (Ire).

The GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint favourite has shot straight to the top of the class among an exciting batch of first-crop runners for the top sprinter Blue Point (Ire). The son appeared to be made very much in his father's mould as he sped along the turf under Marquand as the sun was coming up, and the jockey was ebullient in his praise of the youngster on his return to the guarantine barn.

Marquand said, "It's my first time here and I've just been trying to take it all in. It's one of the most picturesque tracks in the world. I've always loved Goodwood, but this is a bit different. It's great to be here, especially with a horse like him. He looks in great shape and feels in great shape. He'll have to be fast but he is fast."

Big Evs is also the first Breeders' Cup starter for his trainer Michael Appleby, who has prepared the colt beautifully for his debut season, in which he broke his maiden when winning the Listed Windsor Castle S. at Royal Ascot after finishing runner-up on debut at Redcar at the end of May. From Ascot he landed the G3 Molecomb S. at Glorious Goodwood before one disappointing run when down the field against his elders in the G1 Nunthorpe S. However, he bounced back three weeks later to post a decisive victory in the G2 Flying Childers S.

Appleby is set to appear at Santa Anita on Thursday morning, and Marquand's post-breeze report will surely have been music to his ears while he was en route to America.

The jockey added, "You almost want to try to pick a hole in a horse when you ride them, but to be honest you can't really. He looks to have taken the travel well and he's taken it all in his stride. He has a good draw and he'll have to be very good to win, but he is very good. That's the reality.

"Obviously we've a couple of days to go but he's absolutely where you'd want him to be."

VIA SISTINA RETURNS TO THE DECEMBER SALE A GROUP 1 WINNER

With the benefit of glorious hindsight it seems scarcely

believable that Via Sistina (GB) could have been sold at the December Yearling Sale four years ago for just 5,000gns by her breeder Laundry Cottage Stud. One thing is certain: when the Group 1 winner returns to Tattersalls in a few weeks among the elite Sceptre Sessions of the December Mares' Sale, her price will have many more zeroes on the end.

A big, scopey mare who took some time to fill her statuesque frame, the five-year-old daughter of Fastnet Rock (Aus) is bred on what has come to be regarded as a golden cross. Her dam is the Galileo (Ire) mare Nigh (Ire), who, though unraced herself, is a half-sister to the top-class sprinter Kingsgate Native (Ire) (Mujadil).

"She's a big girl but a very sound horse in training and one who I'm sure is a massive racing prospect as well as a broodmare. She's peaking at five," says George Boughey, who has trained Via Sistina since the retirement of her initial trainer, Joseph Tuite, and most recently saddled her to finish second in an epic battle with King Of Steel on QIPCO British Champions Day at Ascot.

Even from her first season, Via Sistina showed plenty of class, rounding out her three-year-old season with two wins from five starts and a rating of 97. Cont. p6

Bigger and better was to come, however.

At four, she landed her first Pattern success, taking the G3 Prix Fille de l'Air in Toulouse after being beaten only a neck in the G3 Pride S. at Newmarket. This season, she picked up the baton again in the spring for a six-length victory in the G2 Dahlia S. on Guineas weekend at Newmarket

"The plan was always when she won in France as a four-year-old to go to the Dahlia, and arguably that was her best performance," Boughey recalls. "She was pretty devastating that day. The rain obviously helped, but she's very versatile."

From Newmarket, Via Sistina travelled to Ireland for her first attempt in Group 1 company, this time winning the Pretty Polly S. from Stay Alert (GB) and Above The Curve. In three subsequent runs, in the Falmouth S., the Prix Jean Romanet and the Champion S., she has never been out of the first three, including going down by just a nose to Mqse De Sevigne (Ire) in Deauville.

"She hit every target that we wanted her to, and to a tee," Boughey says. "I think she very easily could have won in France as well, she just got a bit lonely in front. She's been brilliantly ridden through a career by some world-class jockeys and she needs putting there on the line. She's got a pretty good turn of foot for a big mare over that trip. There are a lot of good horses, but not many have a turn a foot and can sit last and quicken for 300 metres.

"She's a very consistent Group 1 performer and certainly the best I've trained."

That's high praise indeed from the trainer who was also represented by his first Classic winner last season in Cachet (Ire) (Aclaim {Ire}). The winner of the 1,000 Guineas will also be offered in the Sceptre Sessions.

"I'm very proud of that, selling two Group 1 winners at Tattersalls," Boughey says.

"I never really dreamed of having a Group I winner, certainly not so early, and to have two selling within half an hour of each other is is pretty cool."

He adds of Via Sistina, "She came here as a bit of a project and has turned into our star. So it will be a good day but it will be a sad day. It's hard to lose good horses and they do leave a big hole. You've got to go and find another one, but it's hard to find them when they're that good."

"We always said Battaash was the best-looking horse that we'd bred but I think this guy is better, no doubt about it," said McCartan after The Antarctic joined the Coolmore fold at the sales.

The fifth foal out of Anna Law, herself a half-sister to G2 Champagne S. Etlaala (GB) (Selkirk), The Antarctic is also related to group sire Tasleet (GB) (Showcasing {GB}).

SEA THE MOON LEADS LANWADES ROSTER

Sea The Moon (Ger) will stand for an increased fee of £32,500 in 2024, Lanwades Stud announced on Wednesday.

Previously priced at £25,000, the sire of 31 stakes winners overall enjoyed a great year on the racecourse with his progeny, with seven stakes winners--all at group level--since New Year's Day. Leading the way are German Classic winners Fantastic Moon (Ger) and Muskoka (Ger), who took the G1 Deutsches Derby and G1 Preis der Diana, respectively. The 2014 German Derby winner covered 140 mares this season.

Joining him is **Study Of Man (Ire)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) who has sired seven winners from 24 runners with his first juveniles. His best has been the G2 Beresford S. hero Deepone (GB). The 8year-old was visited by 78 mares in 2023. His fee has remained unchanged at £12,500.

The third and final stallion at Kirsten Rausing's Newmarket stud is Breeders' Cup winner Bobby's Kitten at £5,000. The son of Kitten's Joy has sired four-time group winner Sandrine (GB) has his best progeny.

ALGIERS KNOCKED OUT OF BREEDERS' CUP WITH A FOOT ISSUE

G1 Dubai World Cup second **Algiers (Ire)** (Shamardal) will miss an intended start in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile with a foot issues, according to trainers Simon and Ed Crisford. The 6-year-old sustained bruising on his right front leg.

"Unfortunately Algiers won't be able to run in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile," the Crisfords' Gainsborough Thoroughbreds tweeted on X (formerly Twitter). "He is going to have to miss a few days training due to a minor foot issue. He will now be prepared for a winter in Dubai."

The Shamardal gelding enjoyed a fruitful Dubai campaign beginning in January. The G2 Al Maktoum Challenge Round 1 went his way that month, as did the G2 Al Maktoum Challenge Round 2 in February. He was 2 3/4-lengths behind GI Breeders' Cup Classic runner Ushba Tesoro (Jpn) (Orfevre {Jpn}) in the Dubai World Cup proper in March and was last seen taking second in the G3 Durham Cup S. at Woodbine on Oct. 7.

Added Ed Crisford at Santa Anita on Wednesday morning, "It's really annoying to have lost Algiers from his race, he had bruising on his right front leg. It doesn't look serious."

KAMSIN ON THE MOVE TO HARAS DE LA BAIE

Dual-purpose stallion **Kamsin (Ger)** (Samum {Ger}) will move to Haras de la Baie for the 2024 breeding season, *Jour de Galop* reported on Wednesday. The 2008 G1 Deutsches Derby hero will stand for €2,500. The deal was brokered by Paola Beacco and Richard Venn.

The 18-year-old started his career in Germany, prior to moving

to France in 2017. He has spent the past three seasons at Annshoon Stud in Ireland. His runners have excelled under both codes, and he has a sextet of stakes winners on the Flat including group winners Nica (Ger), Ladykiller (Ger) and Lips Queen (Ger). The bay has also sired several stakes winners under NH rules, among them multiple Grade 1 winner On The Go (Fr). Other jumps stars include G1 Future Champions Juvenile Hurdle Final second Adjali (Ger) and G1 Tolworth Novices' Hurdle runner-up L'Astroboy (Ger).

INNS OF COURT FILLY SHINES AT GOFFS AUTUMN

An Inns Of Court (Ire) half-sister to Group 3 winner Caught U Looking (Ire) (Harzand {Ire}) topped the first session of the Goffs Autumn Yearling Sale on Wednesday.

Part of The Castlebridge Consignment, the bay (lot 385) is out of Wild Mix (GB) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) and sold to Johnny Murtagh and Linehan Bloodstock for €50,000. Since the catalogue was published, Caught U Looking won the G3 Park S. Under the second dam are group winners Double Or Bubble (Ire) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}) and Mix And Mingle (Ire) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}).

Lot 447, a colt by Sottsass (Fr) offered by Treadstone Bloodstock, brought €37,000 from Hana Polednikova to take second place on the leaderboard. He is a half-brother to the GIII Sweet Life S. third Nimbostratus (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}).

After the conclusion of the first day's trade, 173 horses sold of 246 offered (70%) for a gross of \in 1,367,600. Both the average and the median dropped by 16% and 17%, respectively. The average was \in 7,906 and the median was \in 5,000.

The sale continues on Thursday and begins at 10 a.m.

PAIR OF KODIAC COLTS ANCHOR THOROUGHBID ONLINE YEARLING SALE CATALOGUE

A pair of colts by Kodiac (GB) and 34 other yearlings will go under the hammer at the ThoroughBid Online Yearling Sale on Wednesday, Nov. 8. Bidding for the first ever online-only yearling sale by a UK auction house will begin at 9 a.m. and will last approximately three hours. The catalogue is available here.

Yearlings by sires like New Bay (GB), Gleneagles (Ire), Farhh (GB), and Highland Reel (Ire) will also feature among the consigned horses. Each lot is sold with the opportunity to win the £5,000 Every 1's A Winner Bonus, to qualify for which the horses sold must win on debut aged two or three in a Flat race in any IFHA territory.

CEO of ThoroughBid, James Richardson, said, "It's a real pleasure to be the first UK-based auction house to host an online-only yearling sale. The reception this sale has had from established figures in the industry, like David and Mick Easterby, has been positive and we're delighted with the catalogue, which features some very nice pages.

"The fact that the catalogue has a host of well-proven, quality stallions represented and plenty of black-type running through the pedigrees is testament to the appetite for online sales. The importance of horse welfare as well as the ease and economy of selling online for our consignors is clear.

HORSETRADER AVAILABLE AS AN AUDIOBOOK

The iconic *Horsetrader*, the 324-page tale of Robert Sangster and the genesis of the Coolmore Throughbred breeding empire, is now available as an audiobook, the Sangster family announced.

Horsetrader covers the pivotal shift in the racing industry between 1974 and 1990 when bloodstock prices skyrocketed from \$135,000 to over \$13 million. This era reshaped the history of bloodstock breeding, prompting even governmental attention, and adjustments in US tax rates during President Reagan's administration to accommodate the sport's transformation.

Swettenham Stud's Adam Sangster, Robert's son, commissioned English recording artist Christopher Tester to convert *Horsetrader* into an audiobook this spring, retaining every page and word from the original text.



If a tree falls in the forest and there's nobody there to hear it, does it still make a sound? We'll leave their old teaser to the philosophers, to debate whether noise still qualifies as "sound" if it doesn't reach anyone's ear. But for a long time now our own industry has been puzzling over a still more perplexing version: if a tree falls in the forest, or indeed if a war breaks out in Europe, or a pandemic sweeps the planet, or central banks have to douse the fires of inflation.... How does anyone ever know, if they're all at a horse sale?

Our trade has in recent years appeared mysteriously impervious to many of the economic dramas afflicting the outside world.

In 2023, however, many keynote auctions have experienced what felt like an inevitable and possibly overdue moderation of the tempo. Nothing too dramatic, in the main: the kind of thing that might be described as a "correction," often measuring up more than respectably to what had seemed extremely robust figures in 2021, prior to a notably giddy spike at the elite auctions last year. But those trends are internal: they are measured, year to year, in the same ring and in the same currency.

GEAUX ROCKET RIDE SUCCUMBS TO INJURIES

GI Haskell S. winner and GI Breeders' Cup Classic contender Geaux Rocket Ride (Candy Ride {Arg}--Beyond Grace, by Uncle Mo), who was pulled up with an open condylar fracture earlier this week in routine morning work at Santa Anita, has been euthanized, his connections announced Wednesday afternoon. He had undergone successful surgery Sunday evening, but did not recover as well as hoped, owner Pin Oak Stud had originally said in a Monday update.

Pin Oak gave a final update on X, formerly known as Twitter, late Wednesday, saying, "Our hearts are broken but Geaux Rocket Ride is at peace. We will miss you forever, Rocket."



Now that we can more or less close out the data on the 2023 yearling market, however, we're in a position to take a step back and assess its overall performance in the kind of transnational terms that match the perspective of its principal investors.


And, with only a couple of minor European sales still to be entered on the ledger, it turns out that the aggregate value of the yearling market either side of the Atlantic in 2023 has almost precisely matched even the historic landmark of last year. Then, for the first time, we were able to acclaim "Billion Dollar Babies." This time round, the headline figure has inched up 0.3% from \$1,001,529,828 to \$1,004,465,043.

When you think of the huge spectrum of yearlings to come under the hammer from each crop, this virtual parity feels almost freakish, especially when so closely matched by the numbers entering the ring: 12,731 this year, compared with 12,674 in 2022. One of the few conspicuous wedges between the two years is a slippage in the clearance rate, from 83.3% to 80.7, translating into a 2.75% drop in overall sales to 10,268 from 10,559. Sure enough, then, the average cost of every yearling in the combined transatlantic market has actually advanced 3.1% to a new high of \$97,825 from \$94,851.

That headline positive duly contains a mild negative, in that the average achieved from essentially unchanged turnover goes up because there have been more RNAs. *Cont.*

But the bottom line is that those that did change hands made more money than ever.


Nonetheless there are a couple of caveats to that statement. The most important is that the European element must always be assessed through the prism of fluctuating exchange rates. Last year, for instance, the dollar value of a soaring internal market in Europe actually weighed in 2.4% lighter than in 2021. This time round, European trade converted to \$404,163,529, up 3.3% from \$391,241,817, on the face of it a wholesome contrast with a marginal slip (1.6%) in the American gross from \$610,288,011 to \$600,301,513.

But much of that gain in European trade reflects the anaemic condition of sterling last year. During Book I at Tattersalls it traded at \$1.13, and there had been little change by the time the global data was reported for a similar examination this time last year. By the start of the year, sterling had hauled its way up a few rungs to \$1.21 and--following a mild midsummer swell--that's pretty well where it remains today. So while an American buying a Book I yearling this year might regard the extra cost of a "guinea" this time as no big deal, the difference was comfortably more than the increase in the dollar value of the European yearling market.

We're a still a long way from pre-Brexit values, however. In October 2015, sterling at \$1.52 meant that the Book I average converted to almost exactly \$355,000. *Cont.*

This time round, when the local value of a Book I yearling was 9.7% higher than 2015, the dollar value remained 12.7% lower. Domestic vendors should not deceive themselves, then, that it is

only the caliber of their stock that might have been tempting American investors since the great Brexit tantrum.

Of course, if you're trading within that market none of this will matter. A domestic pinhooker, or a breeder who pays a local stallion fee, will be paying electricity bills and wages in the same currency. Within that trading environment, in Europe, a few factors together conspired to take some of the heat out of the market compared with 2022: just one of the final crop of yearlings by

Galileo (Ire) surfaced in Book I, for instance, even as his premier son Frankel (GB) becomes increasingly the resort of top breed-to-race programs. (And then there was the fact that one

of the biggest contributors to turnover in 2023 never actually paid up!).

As for the American market, perhaps the key indicator is the decline in clearance to 78.7% sold, from those entering the ring,

down from 82% last year and 83% in 2021. We've already noted the impact on the overall figures, the European rate having held up a good deal better at 83.3%, after registering frantic demand (84.9 and 85.9%) over the two previous years. As a result, at \$105,095, the average North American yearling transaction in 2023 fell only just short of last year's breakthrough figure, when the six-figure barrier was breached for the first time at \$106,808. In other words, people appear to have been a little "pickier" in

their shopping while being prepared to go harder at their final shortlist. A little tougher to sell, then; but a little tougher to get that hammer to fall, too. *Cont.*

But don't forget that a clearance rate touching 79% is still way better than 74% in the year before the pandemic.

One way or another, the market plainly remains robust. A mild loss of momentum in some indices feels somewhat overdue, if anything, a prolonged bull run having suggested bloodstock to be immune even to the most alarming economic and geopolitical tremors. But it may be that those whose affluence has been consolidated even through times of plague and war are not quite so indifferent to an altered fiscal landscape.

It was always contentious that the cash doping of panicked economies persisted so long after the banking crisis, but for a while now we've found ourselves back in a forgotten world of high interest rates. And central banks still aren't getting enough patches of blue sky to put away the umbrella. Meanwhile the

S&P 500 is heading toward its third negative month in a row, which hasn't happened since the start of the pandemic in 2020. There's new instability in the Middle East, compounding the ongoing crisis in Ukraine, and a turbulent election year ahead. Those are some of the trees falling in the forest.

Our own world persists in its insularity, albeit without a great deal of coherence. Demand for racehorses can only be described as healthy, if the transatlantic yearling market can maintain the \$1-billion breakthrough of last year. But supply continues to diminish, with a declining foal crop ever less eligible to service the betting windows and so, ultimately, purses. In the meantime, we have slot boomtowns even as storied venues are closing; extremes that make our sport's very survival bitterly contentious, including within our own community. Above all, we persist in placing the cart of commercial breeding in front of the horse itself. (We've just come within a couple of shifts of a totally unproven sire covering 300 mares!)

There remain many things we can be positive about, as we hope to be reminded at our principal showcase this weekend. But we can't take this resilience of investment, remarkable as it is, for granted. As and when it dries up, we need to be ready with a resilience of our own: with a breed, and a sport, equipped to last.


Bred by OXO Equine LLC in Kentucky, Geaux Rocket Ride was a \$350,000 purchase on behalf of the Pin Oak team at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Select Yearling Sale in 2021. Sent to Hall of Famer Richard Mandella, he burst onto the scene this January with a 5 3/4-length maiden special weight win at Santa Anita. After winning the Affirmed S. in June, he shipped across the country to Monmouth Park and won the TVG.com Haskell S. He also placed in both the GI Fanduel Racing Pacific Classic and the GII San Felipe S. His final record was 5-3-2-0 with earnings of \$980,200.

The Breeders' Cup also released a statement late Wednesday, saying: "The immense effort that went into Geaux Rocket Ride's medical care following Saturday's injury is a testament to his team's deep commitment to his wellbeing. Our thoughts are with Pin Oak Stud LLC, Richard Mandella, and everyone affected by his loss."

GEORGE KRIKORIAN JOINS TDN WRITERS' ROOM PODCAST BREEDERS' CUP PREVIEW **SHOW**

George Krikorian has been around the game of racing for a long time and has owned a lot of good horses. But a win in the Breeders' Cup has eluded him. He's 0-for-11.

He has two strong candidates this year in Just FYI (Justify) in the GI Juvenile Fillies and War **Like Goddess** (English Channel) in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, where she will tackle males for the second straight year.

Will this be Krikorian's year? Those were among the questions our team asked

Krikorian on this week's TDN Writers' Room podcast presented by Keeneland. He was the Green Group Guest of the Week.

"I'm pretty excited to be here and to have this opportunity and with two horses," he said. "This is the first time that's happened

for me. So it's going to be a pretty special weekend."

In War Like Goddess, Krikorian owns one of the biggest over achievers in the sport. She sold for \$1,200 as a weanling before

> RNA'ing for \$1,000 at Keeneland September 2018. She showed up next at the 2019 OBS June Sale, where bloodstock agent Donato Lanni convinced Krikorian to take a shot on the filly. He bought her for \$30,000. All she's done since is earn \$2,495,184 and win eight stakes, including three Grade I's.

"You have to give kudos to Donato Lanni because he called me one day and said. 'I've seen this horse and she should not be in this sale and she's going to be overlooked," Krikorian said.: He said, 'I see in the future that she could be a very special horse.' I

told him that I knew that he didn't mind taking the time it takes for a horse to develop. And so that's exactly what we did. We took our time. Just as he predicted, she turned out to be an incredible horse." Cont.

Just FYI is two-for-two and coming off a win in the GI Frizette. Despite her strong credentials, this might be a tough spot for her and only because she'll have to take on **Tamara** (Bolt d'Oro), considered by many to be the most likely winner of any Breeders' Cup race.

"I know that Tamara is going to be a tough, tough horse," Krikorian said. "The bottom line is you're challenged by any horse that's in a race like this. I think that Just FYI has shown to be a incredibly talented horse and I think that she's going to be a very tough competitor in that race."

Elsewhere on the podcast, which is also sponsored by the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association, Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders, West Point Thoroughbreds, WinStar Farm, XBTV.com and 1/ST Racing, the team of Zoe Cadman, Bill Finley and Randy Moss went through all the Breeders' Cup races, offering their insights and handicapping opinions.

Both Moss and Finley loved longshot Roses for Debra (Liam's Map) in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint. Moss had a less positive take on the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, calling this one of the weakest Classic fields ever assembled. Yet, everyone agreed that this might be the best field ever assembled for the Breeders' Cup Turf. Moss also made a compelling case why Elite **Power** (Curlin) should turn the tables on **Gunite** (Gun Runner) in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint.

BREEDERS' CUP OUTLINES COMPREHENSIVE SAFETY AND INTEGRITY MEASURES IN PLACE FOR 2023 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Edited Press Release

The Breeders' Cup World Championships at Santa Anita Park will be conducted according to industry-leading safety and integrity protocols to ensure the wellbeing of all human and equine athletes. As previously announced, Breeders' Cup introduced an enhanced pre-screening protocol in the lead-up to this year's World Championships, upholding its ongoing commitment to putting safety first.

This year also marks the first time the Breeders' Cup World Championships will run under the full jurisdiction of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority (HISA), including the Anti-Doping and Medication Control (ADMC) Program, which took effect in May. Cont.

Breeders' Cup runners are subject to strict anti-doping and medication control requirements, including out-of-competition, pre-race, and post-race testing administered by the Horseracing Integrity and Welfare Unit (HIWU). Additional safety and

integrity protocols include equine security and surveillance measures, enhanced veterinary exam procedures, injury management protocols and racing surface maintenance and testing in the leadup to the event.

Early Preparations: Out-of-Competition Testing, Veterinary Coordination & Racing Surface Oversight

Beginning in July 2023, a list of potential Breeders' Cup contenders was developed. The

list included a combination of graded stakes winners, Challenge Series winners, and other horses on the possible starter list. HIWU then performed out-of-competition (OOC) testing for banned substances on those potential contenders. Blood samples were taken by HIWU-trained collection personnel and sent for testing to HIWU-accredited labs. Breeders' Cup OOC testing administered by HIWU concluded Oct. 30 and resulted in the collection of 226 samples.

The Breeders Cup Veterinary
Team also began holding
coordination meetings with
counterparts from 1/ST Racing,
HISA, HIWU and the California
Horse Racing Board (CHRB) in
July. Through a regular cadence
of meetings in the ensuing
months, the group outlined
veterinary exam schedules, OOC
testing, safety and medication
regulations, injury management
and diagnostic tool
implementation.

Dr. Mick Peterson, Program Director of the University of

Kentucky Racetrack Safety Program, has worked in collaboration with 1/ST Racing Track Consultant Dennis Moore throughout the year. *Cont.*

Both surface experts have also consulted with HISA's new Track Surfaces Advisory Group throughout their evaluation and

maintenance operations of the racing surfaces at Santa Anita Park.

Safety & Integrity Protocols: October through World Championships Week

The five-member Breeders' Cup Veterinary Review Team completed its initial phase of enhanced pre-screening protocols on Oct. 23. This included:

- veterinary and treatment records as well as training and racing patterns associated with more than 200 potential contenders;
- Physical examinations conducted by veterinarians in relevant racing jurisdictions around the world; and

 The use of advanced diagnostic tools in the event additional scrutiny was required.

Attending veterinarians for all potential Breeders' Cup

runners were required to submit 30-day treatment records--a nationwide requirement under HISA that will inform the Breeders' Cup Veterinary Review Team's second review--upon pre-entry. 24-hour surveillance began following the mandatory equine security check-in at 10:00 pm PT on Sunday, Oct. 29 for international runners and 11:00 am PT on Tuesday, Oct. 31 for domestic runners. All horses entered in a Breeders' Cup race underwent an

additional round of HIWU-administered pre-race blood testing for banned substances on Tuesday, Oct. 31, with results set to be returned by race day. *Cont.*



- Comprehensive onsite veterinary exams, including jog
 - exams and the use of diagnostic technology as needed, beginning Wednesday, Oct. 25;
- Random physical examination at the determination of the Breeders' Cup Veterinary Team;
- In-stall and on-track veterinary oversight during training and schooling;
- Mandatory jog-up veterinary exams before exiting any racing or

training surface at Santa Anita Park starting Friday, Oct. 27;

 Pre-race veterinary examinations in the barn and veterinary monitoring of horses in the paddock and during warm-up on race day;





"It's kind of a microcosm of this industry: when you think you have it figured out, you don't have it figured out. He was born at Vinery, then went to Tom Van Meter. We got him in December of his weanling year; he stayed with us through the Saratoga sale, so we had him December through August."

"This is no revisionist history; he was not the highestregarded yearling on our farm."

Taylor continued: "He was a very, very nice horse, very well balanced. Great body, great muscle, very correct, huge walk, touch long in his pasterns. I've looked back on our notes and he got into Saratoga on his physical. He was a nice horse, but he went up there and, really, everybody looked and said, 'Zayat Stables bred this horse, they're not going to give him away. I'm not really going to risk that much on a Pioneerof the Nile right now.'

"If you look back on it, Pioneerof the Nile had 2-year-olds when he was a yearling. We must have had 20 people ask what the Zayats would take for this horse; they really did want a lot for the stage Pioneerof the Nile was at in his career and we didn't get him sold.

"In the end, we had the Triple Crown winner right there in front of us, right in front of all the best judges of horseflesh, and no one took a swing. It was amazing. It's a cautionary tale that you have to give every horse a chance." --Jill Williams





A CLASSIC SEASON FOR CASTELLANO

ARCADIA, CA – As Javier Castellano gets ready to ride three mounts on Breeders' Cup Saturday, the recently turned 46-year-old is amidst one of the best years of his career. And it almost never happened.

A pair of Breeders' Cup wins at the 2019 Championships put an exclamation point on the Hall of Famer's eighth straight season with more than \$20 million in earnings. But, the year 2020, like it was for so many, was more about overcoming adversity for the native of Venezuela.

Castellano was the first jockey to test positive for COVID-19-he wasn't symptomatic, thankfully-during the beginning of the pandemic in March and was on the sidelines again after undergoing hip surgery at the end of the year.

"It was tough, not just for myself, but for everybody in the world in 2020," Castellano said. "I only missed three months. And it seemed like it was forever."

Castellano returned to action in 2021, but wasn't exactly welcomed back with open arms. Competing in pound for pound the deepest jockey colony in the nation in New York, Castellano rode 105 winners that season, good for \$9,804,024 in earnings. After going just 13-for-142 at the prestigious Saratoga meeting, Castellano's career was suddenly at a crossroads.

"I was devastated. I was ready to give up," said Castellano, a winner of four straight Eclipse Awards as Outstanding Jockey between 2013-16.

"I just came back from everything and people didn't give me an opportunity. One moment I thought, 'I think this is it. I can't keep doing what I'm doing.' I was really really depressed."

He continued, "They didn't care about who you are or what you did in the past. It's amazing. I was a Hall of Fame rider, a four-time leading jockey in the nation in back-to-back years, had six Travers then, 12 Breeders' Cups and won more than 5,000 races. And it didn't mean anything. You have to prove yourself and that you belong."

Castellano picked himself up off the mat and hired longtime former racing official P.J. Campo to handle his book. He began to right the ship with 163 victories in 2022. By comparison, Castellano rode a total of 212 winners combined the previous two years.

How did he power his way through?

"Mentally, I had to be strong," said Castellano, a married father of three. "A lot of discipline and dedication. Do the homework every single day. Regroup and try to be very positive."

The momentum began to build for Castellano after he won three races on Saratoga's opening day card that summer.

"In 2022, we started rolling a little bit in Saratoga," Castellano said. "I also went out of town for the right people and won some races. I knocked a little bit and the door began to open a little here and there."

Castellano is no longer the one doing the knocking this year. He put to bed an 0-for-15 mark on the first Saturday in May with a 15-1 upset aboard Mage (Good Magic) in the GI Kentucky Derby, and, just five weeks later, secured his first GI Belmont S. victory with Arcangelo (Arrogate). Castellano became the first jockey to win two Triple Crown races on two different horses in the same year since Calvin Borel did so in 2009. He's won 16 graded races so far this year, including seven at the top level.

"Thank God, I've been very blessed and very fortunate to have one of the best years of my career," Castellano said. "It was a great achievement to win the Kentucky Derby and the Belmont Stakes, two Triple Crown races in the same year. I was always missing something on my resume."

With Castellano's two Classic winners on a collision course this summer, he stuck with the recently retired Arcangelo, who followed up with a convincing win in the GI Travers S., the rider's record seventh victory in the 'Mid-Summer Derby.' The gray, unfortunately, was scratched from the Breeders' Cup Classic--a race Castellano won aboard the sensational Ghostzapper in 2004--earlier this week after developing a foot issue.

"He gave me an opportunity to regroup in my career, and, in my life, and enjoy these beautiful moments with my family," Castellano said.

As for Arcangelo missing the Classic and now off to begin his career at stud at Lane's End, he said, "This is hard, but one decision I fully support. Arcangelo is safe and sound and that's all I can really think about. He has given me so much and I'm so blessed to have been part of the team."

Castellano's mounts on Saturday's Championship program at Santa Anita include: GI Beverly D. S. winner and GI E.P. Taylor S. winner Fev Rover (Ire) (Gutaifan {Ire}) in the GI Breeders' Cup

Filly & Mare Turf; GII American Turf S. winner and narrow GI Saratoga Derby Invitational S. runner-up Webslinger (Constitution) in the GII Twilight Derby; and Time for Trouble (English Channel) in the 15/8-mile GII Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance S.

"It could be a good example for anybody," Castellano concluded. "You never give up. When you want something in life, you have to work for it. When you work for it, you get it."

Two years ago, the last time the Breeders' Cup was held in California, Japan came away with a historic double when

Marche Lorraine (Jpn) won the GI Distaff and Loves Only You (Jpn) took the F/M Turf. The country may have its first Classic winner Saturday with Ushba Tesoro (Jpn) (Orfevre {Jpn}). By the same sire as Marche Lorraine, the 6-year-old is already a winner on the world stage after his draw-dropping last-to-first victory in the G1 Dubai World Cup in March. Given the summer off, the bay returned with what proved to be a paid workout in a listed race at Funabashi in September. Ushba Tesoro, who takes a six-race win





streak into the Classic, impressed onlookers with his unofficial four-furlong work in :49 2/5, as well as strong gallop-out, at Santa Anita Sunday. While his gate schooling session Monday

proved to be an adventure, connections plan to utilize mats on race day to avoid the big horse rubbing against the gate.

> Zedan Racing Stables' Arabian Knight (Uncle Mo) was considered a major Kentucky Derby contender, following a 'TDN Rising Star'-worthy debut at Keeneland on the Breeders' Cup undercard last fall with an effortless victory in the GIII Southwest S. in January. But the \$2.3-million OBS April graduate was knocked off the Triple Crown trail and was away from the races for six months. Trainer Bob Baffert called his return effort in the GI Haskell S. in July "a disaster" after the colt failed to rate on the lead.

He proved he was back on track with a determined victory in the GI Pacific Classic Sept. 2 and is the leader of a depleted group of sophomores in the Classic.

LONGINES BREEDERS' CUP TURF

He'll be among the lesser-fancied of a seriously strong European contingent for this year's GI Longines Breeders' Cup Turf, but **Onesto (Ire)** (Frankel {GB}) gets the upset nod in his career finale before heading off to stud at Haras d'Etreham in 2024.

Bred in Ireland by Adam Bowden's Diamond Creek Farm, the 185,000gns Tattersalls October yearling turned \$535,000 OBS April juvenile won last year's G1 Grand Prix de Paris and was unlucky to have not finished closer than seventh in the G1 Japan Cup to close the season. The chestnut resumed with a useful fourth behind GI Filly & Mare Turf favorite Inspiral (GB) (Frankel (GB) in Deauville's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois over an insufficient mile trip Aug. 13 before finishing a better-than-it-looks seventh to Auguste Rodin (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the G1 Irish Champion S. the following month. No better than a 55-1 outside in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, Onesto settled at the rear

on the back of the ultimately victorious Ace Impact (Ire) (Cracksman {GB}) and attacked the line to just miss second behind the high-class Westover (GB) (Frankel {GB}). He is tactically versatile and can take down his sexier market rivals on his very best.

Off his body of work this season, Mostahdaf (Ire) (Frankel **(GB)** is a deserving ante-post favorite at 5-2. After demolishing the field in the G2 Neom Turf Cup in Saudi in February, a race in which the highly touted Missed the Cut (Quality Road) was basically a no-show, the homebred was thrashed--like the rest of the field--by Equinox (Jpn) (Kitasan Black {Jpn}) in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic, finishing seven lengths adrift in fourth.

The dark bay has been carefully managed since, winning the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot by four lengths June 21 and made all in taking the G1 Juddmonte International S. at York Aug. 23.

Withdrawn from the G1 QIPCO Champion S. due to the unsuitably easy ground, Mostahdaf is likely to be consigned to a midfield trip over a 12-furlong distance he has not won over and at which he owns a single placing from four runs.

Auguste Rodin, a son of 2017 GI Filly & Mare Turf runner-up Rhododendron (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was well-beaten in the G1 English 2000 Guineas on seasonal return May 6, but atoned in no uncertain terms with a half-length defeat of the comebacking King of Steel (Wootton Bassett {GB}) in the G1 Derby at Epsom in early June. More workmanlike than spectacular in the Irish equivalent 29 days later, he was eased home last of 10 in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot July 29, but again bounced back with a victory in the G1 Irish Champion S. Sept. 9 where he enjoyed a perfect trip and just outbattled his stablemate and defending champ Luxembourg (Ire) (Camelot {GB}). The hulking King of Steel, a close fourth at Leopardstown, overcame the desperate underfoot conditions to take out the Champion S. and wheels back on two weeks' rest.

Wild Cards...

Up To The Mark (Not This Time) is the likely Eclipse Awardwinning turf male with Grade I victories this year at eight, nine and 10 furlongs--a remarkable accomplishment. Connections opt for this spot over the Mile, for which he'd be among the top few choices. He's a player here if he handles this trip, but offers little to no value at or near his 5-1 morning line. On the flip side, **Shahryar (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) may represent the value play. Just one spot behind Mostahdaf at Meydan, the son of 2010 Filly & Mare Sprint heroine Dubai Majesty (Essence of Dubai) was 11th to recent G1 Tenno Sho (Autumn) third Prognosis (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the G2 Sapporo Kinen Aug. 20, but has since undergone a procedure for a breathing issue. -- Alan Carasso


With a bevy of top tier winners lining up for this divisional championship deciding contest, this year's Distaff is shaping up to be one for the ages. Team Godolphin enters with a pair of Classic-winning fillies-TDN Rising Star Pretty Mischievous (Into Mischief) and Wet Paint (Blame). The former, trained by Brendan Walsh has shown remarkable consistency throughout her career, having annexed seven of 10 starts, highlighted by four graded victories, including three at the Grade I level. Victorious in the GII Rachel Alexandra S. in February, the daughter of GISW Pretty City Dancer kicked off a three-race winning skein in the May 5 Kentucky Oaks, also adding the GI Acorn S. and GI Test S. over the summer. Catching a soggy edition of Parx's Cotillion S. Sept. 23, she had to settle for second--beaten a half-length--by the loose-on-the-lead Ceiling Crusher. Godolphin's other challenger, Wet Paint, enjoyed a three-race win streak of her own to launch her sophomore season. Skipping through Oaklawn's spring filly series--the Martha Washington S., GIII Honey Bee S. and GIII Fantasy S.-with relative ease, she showed solid closing ability but had to settle for fourth behind her stablemate in the Oaks. Runner-up behind the pace-making Hoosier Philly (Into Mischief) in Ellis Park's Monomoy Girl S. in June, the Brad Cox trainee bounced back to take the nine-furlong GI CCA Oaks by a neck over Sacred Wish (Not This Time) at the Spa July 22. Favored while stretching to 10 panels for her latest, the daughter of GSP Sky Painter gave a good account of herself to finish second, beaten four lengths by winner and subsequent GII Beldame S. scorer Randomized (Nyquist) in the GI Alabama S. Aug. 19.

Sporting an all-important home-court advantage, Adare Manor (Uncle Mo) has been on a tear of late, having won her last five trips to the post. Having shown some sparkle early on in her juvenile campaign--highlighted by a scintillating debut win at Santa Anita in January followed by a 13-length demolition of her rivals in the GIII Las Virgenes S. the following month--the Bob Baffert trainee finished runner-up in graded company while under the care of a pair of former Baffert pupils over the spring. A lack-luster sixth in Parx's Cotillion in September all but assured she would get some time off and regroup for the 2023 season.

Second in her seasonal bow going seven panels at Santa Anita in February, she won going a mile in Arcadia Mar. 31, adding four graded wins, including Del Mar's GI Clement L. Hirsch S. Aug. 5 and GII Zenyatta S. back in Arcadia Oct. 1.

The 5-year-old Clairiere (Curlin) has several things going for her as she tries to recapture some of the earlier flash in her form. A four-time Grade I winner at 8 1/2 furlongs, the impeccably-bred daughter of MGISW and TDN Rising Star Cavorting (Bernardini) has also shown the ability to excel while adding some yardage, as evidenced by her 2022 GII Shuvee S. score and placings in the 10-furlong GI Alabama S. and ninepanel GI CCA Oaks during her sophomore season. A narrowly beaten third in last year's renewal of this race, the Stonestreet Stables homebred won this spring's GI Apple Blossom S. before successfully repeating in the GI Odgen Phipps S. in June. Favored to defend her title in the July 23 Shuvee S., she had to settle for second behind the classy Nest and could be excused for an uncharacteristically poor showing when fifth in a sloppy renewal of Saratoga's GI Personal Ensign S. Aug. 25. "We're very happy with her," said Hall of Fame trainer Steve Asmussen. "She's an unbelievable mare. She's doing extremely well right now. She's acclimated very well and is in a really good rhythm."

Given her potent connections, Asmussen who has eight wins and jockey Joel Rosario with 15, in addition to her come from off-the-pace style that should help in a race laden with speed types, Clairiere may be poised to rebound come race day. -Christina Bossinakis

The all-conquering Into Mischief has been represented by 31 Breeders' Cup starters, with seven winners and at least one of his progeny has been draped with the blanket of flowers at each

of the last four renewals of the championships. But only four of those 31 runners came on the turf and none has succeeded--to this point--but giving Peter Brant's **Gina Romantica** a puncher's chance to make some history in the GI FanDuel Breeders' Cup Mile this weekend.

Though not necessarily bred to excel on the grass, the good ones run on anything, and this \$1.025 million Keeneland September yearling improved markedly with the surface switch, with a record of 3-2-0 from six

starts to date. Her victory in last year's GI QE II Challenge Cup came at the expense of her Filly & Mare Turf-bound stablemate McKulick (GB) (Frankel {GB}) and she returned with a fourth in the GIII Eatontown S. June 17, a race she was likely to need. Second to loose-on-the-lead Fev Rover (Ire) (Gutaifan {Ire})-who also rates a look in the F/M Turf--and in front of recent GIII Dowager S. heroine Romagna Mia (GB) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) in the GI Beverly D. S., the bay defeated fellow Chad Brown trainee and 'TDN Rising Star' In Italian (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) fair and square in the GI First Lady S. at Keeneland Oct. 7, sprinting home in a slick :22.71. She projects to sit a similar trip here and if her last race is for real--granted, it's a significant 'if'-she's in the mix at a juicy price.

Japan's top miler of either sex is **Songline (Jpn)** (Kizuna {Jpn}), making her second overseas trip for the Mile after plans to come to Keeneland last year were scuppered.

A no-show 10th in defense of her title in the G3 1351 Turf Sprint in Saudi Arabia in February, the Sunday Racing runner returned home to best fan-favorite Sodashi (Jpn) (Kurofune) in the

> G1 Victoria Mile in May before landing the G1 Yasuda Kinen for the second straight season the next month. She just missed in the G2 Mainichi Okan over 1800 meters, but her best efforts have come at Tokyo with its near three-furlong straight, while Santa Anita is a tighter track with a much shorter run home. Treading cautiously.

Master of the Seas (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) has victories in Dubai (G2 Zabeel Mile), Ascot (G2 Summer Mile) and Woodbine, where he was

tons the best in the GI Ricoh Woodbine Mile and 'TDN Rising Star' Shirl's Speight (Speightstown) was a distant second. Pipped on the post by Up to the Mark (Not This Time) in the GI Keeneland Turf Mile last time, he was certainly done no favors by drawing widest, but it should be noted that Lure, Six Perfections (Fr), Goldikova (Ire) and Karakontie (Jpn) each overcame double-digit gates to win at Santa Anita. Godolphin also has QE II heroine Mawj (Ire) (Exceed and Excel (Aus)), the half-sister to last year's Mile winner Modern Games (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}).

Casa Creed (Jimmy Creed) tries the Mile for the third time in his fourth Breeders' Cup appearance overall and is in the best form of his career. Once again just beaten in Saudi Arabia, he returned to be a close third looking for a GI Jaipur S. three-peat, but has since won the GIII Kelso H. and GI Fourstardave H.

The last time the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf was held at Santa Anita in 2019 it was Joseph O'Brien trainee Iridessa (Ire) (Ruler of the World {Ire}) as an 13-1 shot who brought home the trophy. It's been 10 years since a favorite won this race when Dank (GB) (Dansili {GB}) pressed the pace over this same course to get her picture taken. Flashing forward, all 12 of this year's entrants were bred outside of the United States, and O'Brien returns with another potential big price with G1SP Lumiere Rock (Ire) (Saxon Warrior {Ire}).

When it comes to favoritism, that will most certainly fall on the strong shoulders of Inspiral (GB) (Frankel (GB)) who has done little wrong in three successive campaigns for trainer John Gosden. Highlights for this 4-year-old filly include her win in last season's G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot and when she returned to successfully defend her title in the G1 Jacques Le Marois S. at Deauville this past August. Buoyed by a last out win in the G1 Sun Chariot S. Oct. 7, Gosden obviously feels strongly that the perennial miler owned by Cheveley Park Stud can stretch out and get this distance. Regular rider Frankie Dettori will once again take the mount.

If Inspiral isn't up to the task, then there are a number of talented runners that are waiting to hoist the crown.

Chief among them is Aidan O'Brien trainee Warm Heart (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) who is actually cutting back after traveling 12 furlongs in her last four races this year. Three of those attempts were wins including the G2 Ribblesdale S. at Royal Ascot June 22 and against older females in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks Aug. 24 and the G1 Prix Vermeille S. at ParisLongchamp Sept. 10.

Chad Brown has collected four wins in this race, with the last coming with Sistercharlie (Ire) (Myboycharlie {Ire}) in 2018. MGISW In Italian (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) returns for another chance after she ran second to Tuesday (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) at Keeneland last year. The Peter Brant-owned 'TDN Rising Star' will set the pace early, while her stablemate, GISW McKulick (GB) (Frankel (GB)), will try to muster a rally late for Klaravich Stables.

In the mix is Didia (Arg) (Orpen {Lure}) who won over this course and distance Oct. 7 in Santa Anita's GII Rodeo Drive S. for trainer Ignacio Correas IV and Lindy (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}) who was second to GI Breeders' Cup Mile entrant Mawj (Ire) (Exceed And Excel (Aus) in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Keeneland Oct. 14.

Also present are the top three finishers from the GI E.P. Taylor S. Oct. 8 at Woodbine. Fev Rover (Ire) (Gutaifan {Ire}), who has won group/graded races in three different countries, took home the prize that afternoon in Toronto for trainer Mark Casse. She bested With The Moonlight (Ire), a multiple group winner from Dubai for trainer Charlie Appleby, and Canadian Horse of the Year **Moira** (Ghostzapper) from the barn of Kevin Attard.

Japanese entrants in the Breeders' Cup, especially when the event is held on the West Coast, will be considered legitimate threats to win by some, but probably most would agree that they personify what it means to be a wild card. Lest we forget what happened two years ago at Del Mar when Loves Only You (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) surged to capture the F&M Turf at Del Mar.

Win Marilyn (Jpn) (Screen Hero {Jpn}) might not possess the same form coming into this year's race as Loves Only You did then, but she has some class lines that speak to being able to compete at a high level. She's been unlucky after winning the G1 Hong Kong Vase at the end of her 5-year-old campaign in 2022.

Trainer Takahisa Tezuka shipped her to Dubai to contest the G1 Sheema Classic where she finished sixth behind international Japanese sensation Equinox (Jpn) (Kitasan Black {Jpn}). After a roughly five months away, she was well-beaten ninth in both the G2 Sapporo Kinen S. Aug. 20 and the GII Sankei Sho All Comers S. Sept. 24 at Nakayama. Coming to Santa Anita might be just the trip she needs to get to the winner's circle at the Breeders' Cup.--J.N Campbell

BIG ASS FANS BREEDERS' CUP DIRT MILE

The Dirt Mile was hit by tragedy Tuesday morning when GI Santa Anita Derby winner Practical Move (Practical Joke) suffered a suspected cardiac event and passed away suddenly. Later the same day, G1 Dubai World Cup runner-up Algiers (Ire) (Shamardal) was scratched due to heat in his right front foot, slating the Dirt Mile as the shortest field in this year's Breeders' Cup with a mere seven contenders.

But what a seven they are. Top of the bunch is undoubtedly Bill Mott's Cody's Wish (Curlin), responsible for one of the most moving stories in racing of the last few years. You'd have to be living under a rock if you're in racing and don't know the story-the four-time Grade I winner is named for Cody Dorman, who suffers from Wolf-Hirschhorn Syndrome and shares an otherworldly connection with the horse. The Godolphin homebred carries Dorman on his back every time he runs and has been undefeated at a mile or less since May, 2022. His lone loss during that streak came when stretched out to nine furlongs in the GI Whitney S. two back in a less-than-ideal trip.


Cody's Wish is also the defending winner of the 2022 edition of the Dirt Mile, has won seven of his last eight, and has the highest Beyer Speed Figures of the field (twice up to 112). He's also been breathing fire in the mornings training at Santa Anita. He's at the top of his game and will likely--and deservedly--be a single on multiple tickets Saturday. Tears flowed unabashedly across the Keeneland grounds when he won the Breeders' Cup last year. Four returning winners from Breeders' Cup 2022 and one from 2021 will go to post this year; there's no one the sport collectively pulls for more than this horse. Cody's Wish is unbeaten in seven starts at a mile.

Although Cody's Wish positively towers over this field, GI Preakness S. winner National Treasure (Quality Road) will get some attention. He fired a bullet :46 1/5 half (1/49) on Oct. 20, is on his home track for Bob Baffert, and is shortening up considerably. He's dropped three straight since the Preakness, but just might relish this trip.

Whisper Hill Farm homebred and Todd Pletcher trainee Charge It (Tapit), a 'TDN Rising Star', is capable of jaw-dropping brilliance--his 23-length GIII Dwyer S. last year is testament to that and his GII Suburban S. this year was stellar--but he's inconsistent. Butzow homebred and fellow 'TDN Rising Star' **Zozos** (Munnings) is coming into this sharp, signaled by a bullet Oct. 21 at Churchill in :59 1/5 for five panels (1/58), and Brad Cox knows how to win these. Winner of the GIII Ack Ack S. at this distance Sept. 30, he's a consistent horse with a big upside that anyone would love to have in their barn. But can anyone beat Cody?

QATAR RACING BREEDERS' CUP SPRINT

Reigning Sprint champion Elite Power (Curlin) saw his eightrace winning streak end at the hands of familiar foe Gunite (Gun Runner) at the Graveyard of Champions this summer. That GI Forego S. saw Gunite turn the tables on his elder rival after finishing just behind him in both the G3 Riyadh Dirt Sprint to open the year back in February and more recently over a sloppy track in Saratoga's GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. Ironically, the pair will line up next to each other in the gate Saturday in what stands to be Elite Power's final start before retiring to stud at Juddmonte for 2024. The \$900,000 yearling, trained by Bill Mott, will look to add to his over \$2.7 million in earnings in the iconic green and pink silks. The 9-5 morning-line favorite has not one but two titles to defend as last year's winner of his race locked up his end-of-year honors.

Gunite, no slouch in the earnings category himself at just shy of \$2.2 million, shortens back up to the sprint distance for owner/breeder Winchell Thoroughbreds off a second-place performance in the one-mile Parx Dirt Mile Sept. 23. Steve Asmussen's had his runner at Santa Anita since early October and he's been on a steady work tab ever since.

Joining those rivals on the outside of the gate is **Speed Boat** Beach (Bayern), a Bob Baffert trainee who just switched off the turf last time out to miss the newly-announced Taylor Made stallion Dr. Schivel (Violence) by a head in the GII Santa Anita Sprint Championship Sept. 30. After beating Hejazi (Bernardini) to break his maiden at Del Mar last Fall, the \$200,000 OBSMAR grad picked up a pair of turf sprint victories out west. The Sprint Championship was his first start however since winning last December's GIII Cecil B Demille S. at Del Mar.



BREEDERS' CUP TURF SPRINT

Since its inception in 2008, the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint has been contested a total of seven times at Santa Anita. The first six

of those runnings were conducted on the downhill turf course over the about 6 1/2furlong trip, and it was shortened to five panels when Belvoir Bay (GB) (Equiano (Fr)) scored in 2019. In those seven renewals, foreign horses have come close without winning, while just one horse--the fastfinishing Bobby's Kitten in 2014--was based outside of California. That local domination stands a reasonable chance of continuing in the form of Motorious (GB) (Muhaarar (GB)) in the

penultimate event of the afternoon.

Owned by Anthony Fanticola, who campaigned 2016 winner Obviously (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}) in partnership with Joseph

Scardino, the 5-year-old likes this course, having amassed a record of 2-2-1 from five starts, including a 2 1/4-length success

in the Mar. 5 GIII San Simeon S. down the hill. A slashing second to Nobals (Noble Mission {GB}) in the GII TwinSpires Turf Sprint on Derby day May 6, the gelding was a comprehensive winner of Del Mar's GIII Green Flash H. when last seen Sept. 2. Flavien Prat is a notable upgrade in the saddle.

Mizdirection (Mizzen Mast) and Stormy Liberal (Stormy Atlantic) have already been repeat winners of the Turf Sprint and Caravel (Mizzen Mast) will try to join that list Saturday. Last of 12

She has won three from five this year, including the GII Shakertown S. and GI Jaipur S. against the boys, but was defeated by Tony Ann (Cairo Prince) at 72 cents on the dollar in defense of her crown in the GIII Franklin S. in Lexington Oct. 15.

Europe's top sprinter Highfield Princess (Fr) (Night of Thunder {Ire}) was a low-odds fourth at Keeneland last fall, but connections have opted for a trip to the Far East for December's G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint over another try here. The 3-year-old Bradsell (GB) (Tasleet {GB}) outfinished that mare to cause a 14-1 upset in this year's G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot in June and was a creditable third to coast-to-coast winner Live In The Dream (Ire) (Prince of Lir {Ire}) in the G1 Coolmore Nunthorpe S. over the straight five furlongs at York in late August. Making his first start around a turn, the bay, who will have Luke Morris in the irons for the suspended Hollie Doyle, was a latest seventh in the G1 Flying Five S. at the Curragh Sept. 10. Live In The Dream set a furious gallop in Keeneland's GII Woodford S. Oct. 7 and was found out late, finishing fourth to the re-opposing Arzak (Not This Time), who is not without a shot here, albeit from a tricky draw.

Wild Card...

The Machmer Hall and Godolphin-bred Jasper Krone (Frosted) further fortifies the Japanese Breeders' Cup challenge this year and there will be little suspense where it comes to gameday tactics. The blaze-faced chestnut took them all the way to win the G3 CBC Sho at Chukyo in July and backed that up with another front-running tally in the G3 Kitakyushu Kinen at Kokura in August, besting Mama Cocha (Jpn) (Kurofune), who would return to take out the G1 Sprinters' S. Oct 2. Jasper Krone will find this slight turnback to five furlongs on a tight-turning track to his liking. --Alan Carasso



Olive (Ghostzapper) will be favored to double up in Saturday's renewal at Santa Anita. Since its inception in 2007, only the brilliant Groupie Doll (Bowman's Band) has put them back to back in the seven-furlong contest.

Last year's champion female sprinter has faced the starter four times for Chad Brown since concluding her 2022 season with a powerful victory over Echo Zulu (Gun Runner) at Keeneland last fall. Goodnight Olive returned to the site of her biggest career

victory and successfully launched her 5-year-old campaign with a win in the GI Madison S. Apr. 8. With absolutely nowhere to run down the stretch, her seven-race winning streak, however, came to a frustrating end after finishing a luckless third in the GI Derby City Distaff S. on the GI Kentucky Derby undercard. Goodnight Olive got there in time with a neck victory in the GII Bed o' Roses S. at Belmont June 17, then earned a careerbest 108 Beyer Speed Figure while finishing 2 1/2 lengths adrift the aforementioned recently retired 2021 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies heroine while failing to repeat in the GI Ballerina H. at the Spa Aug. 26, a race she won impressively in 2022.



Her two career wins have come in Arcadia and her trainer Michael McCarthy upset this race at 6-1 with Ce Ce (Elusive Quality) in 2021. She'll need to up her game on the speed-figure scale, but has every right to move forward here. -- Steve Sherack
