BORN OF GRAFT, TOUCHED BY GENIUS: TWIN TRIUMPHS FOR THE MOORE CLAN

Around eight hours before Ryan Moore gave Auguste Rodin a lethally cold ride under a radiant Californian sky, his father Gary was winning a Grade 1 hurdle at rainy, mucky Wetherby.

On a day of coverage that stretched from the drenched English provinces to the honeyed light of Santa Anita, Luke Harvey, the ITV commentator, happened to make a point about trainers born without silver spoons and licences and yards handed down by right. Gary was never one of those. And his son Ryan might have spent his career slogging round Plumpton and Fontwell as Gary did in his riding days, before rising in painful increments to be one of our best National Hunt trainers.

Botox Has was a nice winner for Gary in Wetherby's Bet 365 Hurdle, worth £28,475. But Auguste Rodin's victory in the Longines Breeders' Cup Turf was a whole other kind of 'nice.' This was global spectacle, a statement win, and (best of all, for us), a door into a possible four-year-old career for Auguste Rodin, who shot round the inside rail on the home turn to take the shortest way home for Moore.

INTELLO'S JUNKO DOMINATES MUNICH

Alain and Gerard Wertheimer's **Junko (GB)** (Intello {Ger}--Lady Zuzu, by Dynaformer), who hit the board in July's G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud earlier this term, encountered just three rivals in Sunday's 12-furlong G1 Grosser Allianz Preis von Bayern at Munich and made virtually all to claim a career high in Europe's final Group 1 contest of the season.

Last term's G3 Prix Noailles and this term's G3 Prix de Reux victor, third in ParisLongchamp's Oct. 15 G2 Prix du Conseil de Paris when last seen, was uncomfortable with an early crawl and immediately upped the tempo when seizing control approaching the judge first time. Comfortable on the lead until nudged along in early straight, the 13-10 second favourite was beyond recall once stretching clear passing the quarter-mile marker and stayed on relentlessly in the latter stages to easily account for Assistent (Ger) (Sea The Moon {Ger}) by three lengths. Two calculated risks were in play: one, that the route would close, and two, that his mount would strike the front too soon and fall prey to a counter-attack.

We should have known Moore would guess right. Like all great pilots at this level, where tactical miscalculations are brutally magnified, Gary's son has the eyes, the brain, the hands and the confidence of a jockey who can feel pace and position as if they were his own heartbeat.


Far away in England, the people of Sussex delivered a knowing nod as he landed the £1.7m first prize for Aidan O'Brien, whose need for a world-class rider with a negligible error ratio is obvious. The sheer volume of Classic and Group 1 winners emanating from Ballydoyle requires steering on a level beyond the capabilities of most merely good jockeys. Moore is Coolmore's dependable finisher: in technical terms, the modern-day Lester Piggott, who will almost never get in the way of the best horse in a race winning.

Yet Ryan Moore arrives at those finishing posts with beautiful precision carrying a story that transcends Group 1 prize money, private jets, plutocrats and bloodstock valuations. He is the superstar emissary of the whole Moore family - arguably the most remarkable and redoubtable in British sport, rooted in National Hunt racing and no strangers to ambulances and hospital beds. The Moores are frequently on the canvas, but never stay on it for long.

Decades ago for *The Independent* I interviewed Charlie Moore, father of Gary, a wisecracking gaff track trainer who told me about swapping piles of tractor tyres for horses and "nailing

them together" to win a bad race at Plumpton. Gary meanwhile was often to be found at the bottom of a fence or hurdle.

Years later the job took me to Gary's yard near Horsham, where he could be found feeding, mucking out and attending to every tiny task in horse management before the interview could begin. He had the wiry, weathered look of a man who had been figuratively thrown against a wall for his art. In 2015 he found himself in intensive care after being kicked in the back by a horse and was profoundly ill.

And where should we start with Jamie, Josh, Hayley, Candy and Jayne, his phenomenal wife - all Moores, all stalwarts of the winter game. In April 2022, Josh was lucky to survive a fall at Haydock that put him in critical care for weeks after he developed a complicated chest infection to go with his broken leg, ribs and punctured lung.

A filmic family history of the Moores would be framed as a tale of bravery: modest, hard-working folk refusing to be broken by the vicissitudes of the sport they love (Gary has trained a Queen Mother Champion Chase winner, Sire De Grugy, with Jamie on board - so it's not all 'Only Fools and Horses.')

And yet, watching Auguste Rodin's win at Santa Anita it was obligatory to marvel that a family of brilliant and hardy operators in the jump racing sphere should also have bequeathed the world's best jockey in Flat racing, where Ryan displays the unwillingness to boast or emote that runs right through his remarkable clan. Cont.

That modesty will have cost him, commercially; but, as Piggott maintained, to be drawn into self-promotion is to jeopardise the thing that made you good in the first place. Moore's focus and consistency locate him in the highest echelon of world sport. Without him, Coolmore's business model would be far more prone to the winds of human error.

And he was not put there by privilege, family tradition, robotics or Artificial Intelligence. Ryan Moore is his own special talent, an ambassador for his family - their devotion and persistence. People of such distinction deserve a splash of genius to go with the everyday skill and graft. Auguste Rodin was the bearer of that tale, 5,000 miles from Wetherby.

Gestut Ittlingen's G1 Preis von Europa heroine and 11-10 favourite **India (Ger)** (Adlerflug {Ger}) was unable to land a telling blow and finished 2 1/2 lengths adrift in third, four lengths clear of the whipper-in **Best Of Lips (Ire)** (The Gurkha {Ire}). Junko will now point to the G1 Hong Kong Vase.

"He is a very big horse who needs time to get going and the slow early pace was not ideal, so I let him canter to the front," Bauyrzhan Murzabayev told *GaloppOnline*. The jockey, who will ride for the Peter Schiergen stable next season after spending a year based with Andre Fabre, added, "I was sitting on the best horse in the race, so I could risk letting him take the lead and make his own race. He loved the soft ground, the trainer knows exactly what he's doing and I am grateful for the opportunity of riding him today."

Junko, kin to a yearling colt by Siyouni (Fr) and a weanling colt by Uncle Mo, hails from the family of elite-level winners Dancing Spree (Nijinsky), Furlough (Easy Goer), Heavenly Prize (Seeking The Gold) and Oh What A Windfall (Seeking The Gold).

GALILEO'S FALCON EIGHT ROUTS LOUGHBROWN RIVALS by Sean Cronin

Dermot Weld trainee Falcon Eight (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}--Polished Gem {Ire}, by Danehill) was winless in six starts since annexing last year's Amateur Riders Derby at the Curragh and halted that streak with a wide-margin romp for a career high in Sunday's G3 Comer Group International Loughbrown S. back at the Co. Kildare venue.

Last month's Irish Cesarewitch H. runner-up went postward as the 11-4 second favourite and lobbed along within range of the leader racing fourth through halfway. Moving into second off the home turn, he hit the front with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and was driven clear to defeat **Echoes In Rain (Fr)** (Authorized {Ire}) by 6 1/2 lengths.

"He's as tough as teak and is unlucky not to win the last two runnings of the Irish Cesarewitch, so he deserved a nice win here," said Weld. "He's been a great dual-purpose servant and his full-sister Search For A Song won this race two years ago. He might go over hurdles at Leopardstown at Christmas or he might go to Dubai for the two-mile race [G2 Dubai Gold Cup]. He has stacks of enthusiasm, but he is a character."

The Week in Review, by Bill Finley

More often than not, when the horses hit the finish line for the last Breeders' Cup race of the day, we know who the Horse of the Year is. Usually, someone has done enough to separate themselves from the pack: Flightline (Tapit), Knicks Go (Paynter), Authentic (Into Mischief). Or no one stepped up to unseat the leading contender going in.

We have nothing of the kind this year. There were plenty of standout performances on Breeders' Cup Day, but that's part of the problem. The leading contenders are so evenly matched on paper that this has turned into one of the most wide-open races for the title in memory.

There are five horses that deserve consideration for Horse of the Year: White Abarrio (Race Day); Cody's Wish (Curlin); Arcangelo (Arrogate); Up to the Mark (Not This Time); Idiomatic (Curlin).

Here are their credentials:

White Abarrio: He won the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and the last three winners of that race have been named Horse of the Year. He has two Grade I wins and they came in two huge spots, the Classic and the GI Whitney S. The knock on him is that's really all there is to his resume. He has just three wins on the year and the third was in an allowance race at Gulfstream.

Cody's Wish: He had another stellar year, topped by his repeat win in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile. *Cont. p3*

ARROGATE'S GRADE I-WINNING DAUGHTERS ON DISPLAY AT FASIG-TIPTON

With his third and final crop wrapping up their juvenile season, Arrogate has a narrow window remaining to make his mark as a sire, and yet his legacy is far from being fully written as his offspring now begin their careers as producers.

Arrogate, the son of Unbridled's Song who delivered one jaw-dropping performance after another on the racetrack, began his stud career at Juddmonte with seemingly limitless potential until he suddenly and tragically passed away the summer before his first crop sold as yearlings. Since then his progeny have succeeded at the highest level and Arrogate is now responsible for more Grade I winners than any other third-crop sire aside from Gun Runner.

Among his five Grade I winners, three daughters of Arrogate will begin the next chapters of their careers this week as And Tell Me Nolies, Fun to Dream and Secret Oath go through the ring at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale. *Cont. p6*

Cody's Wish was 4-for-5 on the year with three Grade I wins and another in a Grade II. Was a feel-good story, which probably should count for something. His lone setback on the year came when he tried nine furlongs in the Whitney and was whipped by White Abarrio, losing by 10 lengths.

Arcangelo: The colt and his trainer, the well-spoken and charismatic Jena Antonucci, gave the sport a lift when it really needed one, winning the GI Belmont S. He came right back to win the GI Travers S. and needed one more win, in the Classic, to lock up Horse of the Year. That didn't happen when he had to be withdrawn from the race with a foot issue. Missing the Classic puts him at a disadvantage because so many Breeders' Cup winners have strong credentials. Also the winner of the GIII Peter Pan. S., he has

three stakes wins and two Grade I wins on the year.

Up To The Mark: Had he won the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, he would have wrapped up Horse of the Year. But he didn't, losing by three-quarters of a length. He was unlucky to lose. On the winner, **Auguste Rodin (Ire)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), jockey Ryan Moore turned in one of the best rides in Breeders' Cup history, saving every inch of ground and daring to go through what was a tight opening on the rail. Even in defeat, Up to the Mark

tight opening on the rail. Even in defeat, Up to the Mark deserves credit for his performance in the Turf. He was beaten by a horse who had won three of the biggest races in Europe in the G1 Irish Champion S., the G1 Irish Derby and the G1 Epsom Derby. Up to the Mark was 5-for-7 on the year and won three stakes, all of them Grade I's.

Idiomatic: Capped off a stellar year by defeating a strong field with a win in the

It probably wasn't even her best race as she had to grind every step of the way in the stretch to win in a blanket finish in which four horses were separated by little more than a length at the wire. She got a 96 Beyer, her lowest figure since she was second in the May 6 GI Ruffian S. at Belmont. She was 8-for-9 on the year, won three Grade I's, a Grade II and a Grade III. The Distaff was her fifth straight win. The only knock is that she spent the first part of her year running in allowance races and in the Latonia S. at Turfway Park.

And the winner is?

With apologies to Cody's Wish, Arcangelo, White Abarrio, my vote goes to Idiomatic. Like Cody's Wish and Up to the Mark, she won three Grade I races. No one won more. Like White Abarrio and Cody's Wish, she is a Breeders' Cup winner. What sets her apart from the rest is her overall body of work. Horse of the Year shouldn't always be about who won the Classic or who had the best performance on Breeders' Cup Day. Voters need to give consideration to who had the best year, from start to finish. In an era where five races on the year from a White Abarrio can be considered a full campaign, what Idiomatic did was remarkable. She ran nine times, won eight races and made starts in all but two months, April and September. Top-level horses just don't do that anymore.

It's not easy for a filly or mare to be named Horse of the Year. No one has done it since **Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam) in 2011 and it's only been done six times since the inception of the Eclipse Awards in 1971. It only happens when there's no nobrainer candidate among the male horses, which was the case this year.

It's a tough call and I have no problem with any of the five horses I've mentioned being named Horse of the Year, but Idiomatic deserves to be recognized for a year unlike anything we've seen in a long time.



As is the case with Idiomatic, you have to look at a horse's overall body of work and Up to the Mark was the best turf horse this country has produced since Bricks and Mortar (Giant's Causeway), the 2019 Horse of the Year. He is the turf champion.

The Amazing Irad Ortiz Jr.

Irad Ortiz Jr. won three more Breeders' Cup races, giving him 20 for his career and moving him to second place behind Mike Smith, who has won 27 races. What Ortiz has done in such a short period of time is remarkable, and he is on pace to blow apart all Breeders' Cup records for jockeys.

Ortiz didn't have his first Breeders' Cup mount until 2012 and his first Breeders' Cup winner until 2014. He's just 31 and should have at least 20 more good years in front of him. Smith didn't ride his 20th Breeders' Cup winner until he was 48 and it took him 23 years to get there. Ortiz is going to blow right past him on his way to setting records that may never be broken.


"Arrogate was honestly one of the most talented racehorses I think any of us have witnessed," reflected Fasig-Tipton's Boyd Browning. "The name Juddmonte is synonymous with the highest caliber and Arrogate certainly achieved that as a racehorse. He has clearly passed that on to his offspring with their desire to win and to compete. When you look at the success that he's had at the highest levels, it's pretty remarkable. We all mourn his loss because I think we're going to see that we had an opportunity to witness another great stallion in the making, but his influence will continue on through these outstanding daughters as well."

The first to claim Grade I status for her sire, **Secret Oath** won an unforgettable edition of the Kentucky Oaks when she handed legendary conditioner D. Wayne Lukas his fifth Oaks win in her two-length score over a field that featured champions Nest (Curlin) and Echo Zulu (Gun Runner).

Secret Oath's career was nothing short of a fairytale story for her owners and breeders, Robert and Stacy Mitchell of Briland Farm. Out of their stakes-winning, Grade I-placed homebred Absinthe Minded (Quiet American), Secret Oath was a winner at two and her 3-year-old season included two standout performances against males with a third-place finish in the GI Arkansas Derby and a fourth-place effort in the GI Preakness S. She also claimed the GIII Honeybee S. by seven and a half lengths and was second to Nest in both the GI Coaching Club American Oaks and GI Alabama S.

This year at four, Secret Oath scored in the GII Azeri S., defeating MGISW Clairiere (Curlin), and was runner-up in three more Grade I contests. She placed in 14 of her 18 career starts and earned over \$2.4 million.



And Tell Me Nolies wins the GI Del Mar Debutante | Benoit

"She was a picture of consistency," Lukas said upon her retirement in October. "She showed up every time. Whenever I ran her she was right there. Secret Oath was good every time we started her. She always hit the board."

And Tell Me Nolies was the first to prove Arrogate's ability to produce a top-level juvenile with her victory in the 2022 GI Del Mar Debutante, but the next day Cave Rock followed her effort up with a win in the GI Del Mar Futurity. A month later, the pair claimed headlines on the same day as Cave Rock got his third straight win in the GI American Pharoah and And Tell Me Nolies stumbled at the start but rallied to win the GII Chandelier.

A \$230,000 2-year-old purchase out of a Grade III-winning half-sister to GISW Macho Again (Macho Uno), And Tell Me Nolies went on to claim two runner-up efforts behind Faiza (Girvin) this year in the GIII Santa Ysabel S. and GII Santa Anita Oaks and later run third in her turf debut in the GII San Clemente S.

Arrogate's third Grade I-winning daughter **Fun to Dream** was a debut winner at three and she followed that effort with a near 10-length victory in the Fleet Treat S. Trained and co-bred by Bob Baffert, the Cal-bred filly boasted a near perfect five-for-six record as a sophomore when she concluded the year with a win in the GI La Brea S. This year at four, Fun to Dream claimed the GII Santa Monica S. and lost by a narrow head to A Mo Reay (Uncle Mo) in the GI Beholder Mile S.

Arrogate's influence continued to grow this year with the achievements of Arcangelo, winner of the GI Belmont S. and GI Travers S. Withdrawn from the Breeders' Cup Classic due to a foot issue, Arcangelo will be the first son of Arrogate to go to stud as he retires to Lane's End Farm.



Although dual Grade I winner and Breeders' Cup Juvenile runner-up Cave Rock sadly died of laminitis, Arrogate could perhaps have another potential heir from his final crop in Liberal Arts, winner of the GIII Street Sense S. on Oct. 29.

"It's a continuation of a sire line that has been a really important influence in North American racing over the last 25 years in Unbridled's Song," said Browning. "Arrogate is out of a Distorted Humor mare, so you've got really some of the 'who's who' of North America racing assembled in terms of a pedigree perspective and they've achieved the success on the racetrack."

A fourth graded stakes winner by Arrogate will be offered at Fasig-Tipton on Nov. 7. Campaigned by AMO Racing and trained by Graham Motion, **Affirmative Lady**, who is out of stakes winner Stiffed (Stephen Got Even), was a contender on the Kentucky Oaks trail as she ran second to Julia Shining (Curlin) in the GII Demoiselle S. at two and this year claimed the GII Gulfstream Park Oaks, defeating GISP Sacred Wish (Not This Time).

"We've now got four daughters that are of the highest level of success and I think it gives people the opportunity to have a piece of history and continue the legacy of Arrogate as he makes his mark for future generations."



For many, breeding horses is a numbers game. The more mares one might have, the more chances to hit paydirt on the racetrack. However, Maureen Merkler is not one of those who prescribes to that school of thought. Merkler, who with her husband Edward and son Derek operates Clifton Farm, retains a small but select group of horses at their 50-acre Stamping Ground, Kentucky nursery. Merkler admits that is more than enough for the family-owned business.

"It's strictly a family-run operation. We don't have any outside help," said Merkler. "My husband and I foal the mares and he does all the maintenance. But the day-to-day chores of taking care of horses belong to me."

Armed with over 30 years in the racing and breeding industry, the Merklers purchased Clifton Farm after returning to Kentucky in 2006, and since then, the operation has produced several stakes winners, highlighted by Tyler's Tribe (Sharp Azteca), the winner of his first five races at two--including a quartet of stakes. An earner of over \$324,000, Tyler's Tribe is out of Impazible Woman (Elusive Quality--Handlewoman, by Elusive Quality), who will be offered in foal to Not This Time as Hip 140 at the Fasig-Tipton 'Night of the Stars' November Sale Nov. 7.

Also selling at that venue, the 9-year-old mare's third foal, a filly by freshman sire Enticed, will be offered as Hip 2.

"We decided to sell both the filly and the mare because we really wanted to show what this mare can produce," explained the New Jersey native. "She has already produced two quality horses in 'Tyler' and [2yo] Austin Strong. But this [filly] is just another example of what this mare is capable of producing."

Further extolling the virtues of the mare, she opined, "The mare is exceptional. And she is very pretty. I just like being around her. My veterinarian kept telling me that she was a lovely mare. You can take that with a grain of salt but she truly is."

And for the mare's latest foal, Merkler added, "She is really a lovely big filly. Her dam Impazible Woman is 16.2, so she's a big mare herself."

Impazible Woman, a \$70,000 F-T New York bred yearling purchase by Whisper Hill Farm in 2015, was claimed at Aqueduct for \$16,000 in 2018 before being purchased privately by the Merklers in December of 2019. For her first round in the breeding shed, she visited Sharp Azteca and was subsequently sent to lowa to take advantage of the valuable breeders' incentives in the state, where the Merklers called home for an eight-year period prior to their arrival in Kentucky.

Merkler explained, "[Impazible Woman] produced her first foal in Iowa. I send 3-4 mares a year to foal in Iowa every year and I have been doing it for a while. I sell in Iowa and have clients up there. They had instituted the New Mare Bonus Program. It was a nice incentive. And I thought she would be a nice mare for the Iowa program."





The resulting foal was Tyler's Tribe, a \$34,000 yearling purchase by Tom Lepic and trainer Tim Martin at the Iowa Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners Association Fall Mixed Sale purchase in 2021.

The colt kicked off his career in 2022 with five consecutive victories, including the Prairie Gold Juvenile S. and Prairie Meadows Freshman. The Iowa bred also finished third in Oaklawn's Advent S. during what would prove to be a truncated sophomore season.

"'Tyler' did exactly what I would have hoped and we won the incentive last year because he was the highest earner of his group," she said. "It was totally unexpected but sometimes things just work out."

Impazible Woman, a daughter of MSP Handlewoman, is also represented by a Good Samaritan colt who sold to Legion Bloodstock for \$100,000 at the Fasig-Tipton October sale in 2022. The unraced colt [Austin Strong] is currently in training at Churchill Downs.

Explaining the decision to part with some of her most prized stock, Merkler said, "I try to keep the numbers down to what I am physically capable of taking care of. Also, with Tyler's success on the track, there was a lot of buzz around that. And then we got to breed her to Not This Time which is phenomenal because he's a very hot stallion. So the timing seemed right to sell."

Through her family's Iowa breeding program, Merkler has already achieved success, having produced 2018 GIII Iroquois S. Cairo Cat (Cairo Prince), whose half-brother by Maxfield sells as Hip 9 at Fasig-Tipton Tuesday. Clifton is also responsible for another stakes-caliber homebred, Shimmering Allure (Enticed), who became her sire's first stakes winner with a win in the Tempted S. at Aqueduct Sunday. The filly finished second at the Spa Aug. 13 and broke her maiden at Churchill Downs Sept. 20 before finishing fourth in the Oct. 6 GI Darley Alcibiades S.




"The first two stakes winners to come off the farm were Shock Hazard and Reno Rebel [who sold at the Fasig November sale in 2011]," Merkler said. "In 2018, we had Cairo Cat (Cairo Prince) who went on to be a Grade III winner. And of course, Tyler's Tribe has been the highlight for us. We actually have another filly, a leading earner for Enticed named Shimmering Allure."

Of Shimmering Allure, Merkler added, "It's exciting because she is by Enticed and Impazible Woman's filly is also by Enticed."

"I'm a big supporter of [Enticed]. I love that he is by Medaglia d'Oro. I also love that he is a big, strong horse at 16.3. When I was breeding Shimmering Allure's dam [Shimmering Tale] to him, she was an older, Wild Again mare that needed length of leg and that's what attracted me to Enticed the first year. I got the length of leg I so desired with Shimmering Allure, and she's turning out to be a nice athlete."

Shimmering Tale also has a yearling colt by the Darley stallion. "When I bred 'Woman' to [Enticed], I didn't know anything about Tyler's Tribe--I didn't know what the future held," said Merkler. "So you just go with what you think might be a good match."

Another Clifton Farm alum, Glengarry (Maximus Mischief), was raised by the operation and sold on behalf of client Highpoint Bloodstock for \$55,000 at Fasig-Tipton July in 2022 before reselling for \$150,000 at Fasig's 2-year-old in training sale in May. The Iowa-bred grey won his first two starts at Prairie Meadows by open lengths, and most recently took Keeneland's Bowman Mill S. Oct. 28.

"We've just had our fifth stakes winner come off the farm with Glengarry. I didn't breed him but I raised him for a very good friend of mine," she said. "So the last couple of years have been really nice for the farm."



In addition to the trio of offerings at Fasig-Tipton, Clifton Farm also offers a pair in Book 5 at Keeneland--Bombarra Gold (Street Sense--Finding Forestry) (Hip 3075) and a weanling by Maximus Mischief out of Casting Call (Hip 3092).

With a limited number of mares residing at the familyoperated farm in any given year, Clifton appears to have overcome the odds as a small breeder, having already achieved enviable success over the past few years with its homebreds.

While hoping the recent success on the racetrack can translate to the sales ring this fall, Merkler is confident that the family's involvement in racing will continue, both on the racetrack and back at the farm.

"[Derek] was in the military and he got involved in the farm after he came back to Kentucky," Merkler explianed. "He was involved in small partnerships over the years, but now that he's back at Georgetown, he's become a more integral part of [the family business]."

"I don't race at all, but my son will be. He kept an lowa-bred yearling and he has a Kentucky-bred filly turning three. He's venturing into that area. I'll just stick to my end of it."

"You couldn't have written a better script on how Cody's Wish would end his sensational career," said Darley Sales Manager Darren Fox. "He always, always, left all he had on the track. And the human component of this story makes it all that more special. And with the addition of the ever-consistent, Grade I-winning Proxy to our roster, we once again have two more excellent homebreds joining us for the 2024 breeding season."

Cody's Wish, who captured hearts through his relationship with Cody Dorman, won 11 of 16 starts and was never off the board. His three other Grade I wins were in the Met Mile, Forego S. and Churchill Downs S. and the 5-year-old will retire with earnings in excess of \$3 million. A day after his victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, trainer Rick Dutrow was already mapping out a plan to take White Abarrio (Race Day) to the Feb. 24 G1 Saudi Cup. Dutrow said he hopes to leave the 4-year-old at Santa Anita for a while and probably will take him to Saudi Arabia to be prepared for the race.

"From all the horses we've seen run, I think that it's going to take a big effort for a good horse to beat him in his next start," the trainer said. "It's going to take a good horse to run a big race to beat them because this next race seems like it is absolutely tailor-made for him, a mile and an eighth around one turn."

Should everything go to plan in Saudi Arabia, Dutrow said White Abarrio could head to the G1 Dubai World Cup in March before returning stateside to defend his titles in the GI Whitney S. and Classic.

Harris Farms homebred Closing Remarks swept to the lead late to secure her fourth graded score of the year in the GII Goldikova S. at Santa Anita Sunday. Allowed to settle into stride from her inside post, the chestnut filly rated near the back of the pack as Hammwood Flier set the pace while tracked by favored Queen Goddess. Hammwood Flier was in control through fractions of :22.67 and :45.38. Queen Goddess moved up to take charge at the top of the lane, while Closing Remarks was still last but starting to roll while three wide as the field bunched up heading for home. Closing Remarks found her best gear with a furlong to run and bound to the lead in the final strides, completing the mile in 1:32.69.

"This mare, she tries all the time, she's a really nice, honest mare," said winning jockey Juan Hernandez. "She knows what she is doing on the track, she is a professional and always shows up. Today the race set up really good for her. [Trainer] Carla [Gaines] brought her ready today because she was feeling really good in the post parade and she showed up in the race. When I asked her turning for home around the three-eighths, she picked it up really well and she switched leads. At the end, we got the win."



Making her ninth start of 2023 Sunday, Closing Remarks won the GII Royal Heroine S. over this course and trip in April and had a productive Del Mar meet with victories in the Aug. 12 GII Yellow Ribbon H. and Sept. 9 GII John C. Mabee S. She was most recently fourth when stretched to 1 1/4 miles in the Oct. 7 GII Rodeo Drive S.





Woodslane Farm homebred Wolfie's Dynaghost became a first-time graded stakes winner at the ripe old age of five when he went wire-to-wire to take the GII Autumn S. at Woodbine Sunday. The gelding broke on top and was in hand while taking the field down the backstretch through a quarter in :24.71 and a half in :48.44. They were all bunched up behind him as he turned for home in front and Wolfie's Dynaghost skipped clear to win with authority.

"I felt like he had a nice, high cruising pace, and I just kept him steady and just kept it going from the beginning," said winning rider Kazushi Kimura. "He was really relaxed on the backstretch and just took off from the three-eighths."

Wolfie's Dynaghost won the Kentucky Cup Classic over the synthetic surface at Turfway in March and, after off-the-board finishes in the May 6 GI Old Forester Bourbon Turf Classic and June 4 GII Eclipse S., returned to the winner's circle with a turf allowance victory at Kentucky Downs Aug. 31.

Wolfie's Dynaghost is a son of the unraced Dynaire (Dynaformer), also the dam of Grade I winner Sadler's Joy (Kitten's Joy) who won the 2017 GI Sword Dancer S. and earned over \$2.6 million in the Woodslane colors. The mare, who was purchased by Woodslane for \$360,000 at the 2009 Keeneland September sale, has an unraced 2-year-old colt by Kitten's Joy, who sold for \$250,000 at the 2022 Keeneland September sale, as well as a yearling filly by Ghostzapper who sold for \$550,000 at that auction this year. The mare also has a weanling colt by Munnings and she was bred to Not This Time this year.

The winner's third dam is Beaconaire (Vaguely Noble), who produced multiple Grade I winner Sabin (Lyphard).

Ghostzapper, whose daughter Goodnight Olive captured her second straight GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint Saturday at Santa Anita, now has 54 worldwide graded stakes winners. Spendthrift Farm's Ruby Nell ran away with the GIII Autumn Miss S., scoring by an emphatic 3 1/4 lengths at Santa Anita Sunday. Sent off at 5-2, the bay filly stumbled from her outside post and was last in the early strides, but rushed up and over to take charge heading into the first turn. The dark bay filly was well held while opening some 10 lengths on the rest of the field while setting fractions of :22.61 and :45.46. Favored Anisette attempted to reel in the pacesetter down the lane, but Ruby Nell was never threatened.

"She's really gifted, a very good filly," said trainer Richard Mandella, who was celebrating his 73rd birthday. "...She stumbled leaving the gate today and was off terrible [but] she looked so relaxed. I thought well, maybe he will tuck her right in there and she got a head of steam and when she does, she's pretty strong."



Ruby Nell was on the board in her first three career starts over the winter before graduating going one mile over the Santa Anita turf in May. She added a Del Mar optional claimer July 22 in her next outing. Jumped up to Grade I company and stretched out to nine furlongs, she settled for fourth after setting the pace in the Aug. 19 Gl Del Mar Oaks. Cut back to 6 1/2 furlongs, she captured the Unzip Me S. down the hill last time out Oct. 1.



The pinhooking arm of Little Red Feather purchased Rich Love, with the filly in utero for \$70,000 at the 2020 Keeneland January sale and sold the weanling as part of a foal share agreement for \$80,000 at that year's Keeneland November sale. Bloodstock agent Tom McCrocklin purchased the filly back on behalf of Solana Beach for \$85,000 at the 2021 Keeneland September sale. Following a bullet breeze in :20 2/5, she sold for \$1.2 million at the 2022 Fasig-Tipton Gulfstream Sale.

Rich Love, who sold for \$140,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton November sale, produced a filly by Good Magic in 2022 and a colt by that stallion in 2023. According to the rule changes, a non-resident mare purchased in foal through public auction is deemed a resident mare provided the mare is purchased for at least \$50,000 in the public auction; is present in the state of New York within 15 days after a sale in North America and 60 days at any public auction sale abroad; the foal is foaled in New York; and the mare thereafter is continuously in residence in New York from within 120 days after her last cover in the year of conception of another foal and remains in residency until foaling.

Claiborne Credits will only be applied to the top three finishing horses, but may be transferred with the horse if the ownership were to change. The credits will expire at the end of the 2025 breeding season.

"He was sort of humbled by it all," Welch said of the post-race presentation. "We are both rodeo cowboys and H.B. does an outstanding job breaking babies. He did tell me that evening that reaching the milestone would never have been possible without the support of his owners."

Johnson concurred with Welch, citing Dennis Milligan, Jerry Myers, Greg Hoffman, Jerry Chiles, David and Susan Bunn, as well as Paul and Marianne Phillips as a few of his longtime owners.

"I have been fortunate to have great owners who understand the importance of patience," acknowledged Johnson.

Prior to his training career, Johnson was a rodeo competitor specializing in-bull and steer riding. In a training career that spans four decades, Johnson has saddled 6,486 horses with earnings over \$15 million. Top earners included Albert's First (\$477,318); Wa Bert (\$356,488); Political Whit (\$347,190); Icy Gentleman (\$320,795) and Jimi's a Star (\$314,060).

Johnson credits his wife, Jinnie, who is a major part of his operation, assistant trainer Jose Gomez and Oscar Nunez, who he hails as the "backbone" of the stable's grooms.

Retirement is not on the immediate radar for Johnson, who will turn 83 in January.

"I like doing what I do and can't think of anything else I would enjoy as much as this," Johnson said.



MULLION, FULL TO MANDALOUN, MAKES TRIUMPHANT 'RISING STAR' 3YO DEBUT

Juddmonte homebred **MULLION** (c, 3, Into Mischief–Brooch, by Empire Maker) made a triumphant return to the races Sunday to graduate in 'Rising Star' style at Churchill Downs.

The full-brother to fellow 'Rising Star' and Juddmonte stallion Mandaloun raced just once as a juvenile but was denied the win by the slimmest of margins at Ellis Park last August. Un-raced since that start, Mullion got back on track for trainer Brad Cox with a tour-de-force win against an over-matched bunch. Squeezed just slightly at the break, the son of Into Mischief never let early pacesetter Nyquick (Nyquist) get comfortable, pressing that rival through a quarter in :22.98 before taking command under his own power with a wide move around the turn. From there, it was only a matter of who would finish second as Mullion opened up at will to the line, building up a double-digit lead when all was said and done.

Brooch, no slouch herself as a dual group winner in Ireland, hit it out of the park when her second foal, Mandaloun, took the GI TVG.com Haskell S. and came second in the GI Kentucky Derby only to be upgraded to first upon the disqualification of the late Medina Spirit (Protonico). The dam is a half to SW/MGSP Caponata (Selkirk) and to MGSP Raymonda (Lonhro {Aus}). A fourth generation homebred for Juddmonte, Mullion also traces back to highweight older mare and G1SW Emulous (GB) (Dansili {GB}) and to her daughter, MG1SP Bluestocking (GB) (Camelot {GB}). While Brooch was sadly lost last year, she still has 2-year-old son of War Front and a yearling full-brother to both Mandaloun and Mullion to represent her. Mullion is the 41st 'TDN Rising Star' for leading sire Into Mischief.




