



## **WOOTTON BASSETT UP TO €200,000; PADDINGTON TO STAND AT €55,000**



Wootton Bassett's fee has been increased to 200k | Coolmore

Coolmore has introduced three new names to its Irish roster for next year with **Paddington (GB)** heading the list of newcomers at €55,000. The son of Siyouni (Fr) won six of his eight races this year, including four Group 1 victories in the Irish 2,000 Guineas, St James's Palace, Eclipse, and Sussex S.

**Little Big Bear (Ire)**, winner of the G1 Phoenix S. at two followed by the G2 Sandy Lane S. this year before finishing runner-up in the G1 Commonwealth Cup, will stand for €27,500. **The Antarctic (Ire)**, a dual Group 3-winning brother to Battaash (Ire), joins Castle Hyde Stud at €6,000.

Of the current Coolmore residents, Wootton Bassett (GB), who covered 218 mares this year, leads the field at €200,000, up from €150,000 in 2023. He was represented with a new Grade I winner at the Breeders' Cup by Unquestionable (Fr) in the Juvenile Turf. His other top-level winners this year include King Of Steel and Bucanero Fuerte (Fr).

No Nay Never, who stood at  $\[ \le \]$ 175,000 in 2023, is advertised at  $\[ \le \]$ 150,000 for next season. He stands alongside four of his sons on the roster: Arizona (Ire) ( $\[ \le \]$ 5,000), Blackbeard (Ire) ( $\[ \le \]$ 20,000), Little Big Bear, as above, and Ten Sovereigns (Ire) ( $\[ \le \]$ 17,500). ## TEOFILO'S WITHOUT A FIGHT PREVAILS IN MELBOURNE CUP by TTR AusNZ

On a sunny Tuesday, 84,492 patrons were on hand to witness the Anthony and Sam Freedman-trained **Without A Fight (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) win the 163rd G1 Melbourne Cup.

There were so many layers to the victory of Without A Fight. The 7-year-old gelding has arguably been in career best form, winning the G1 Caulfield Cup S. last start and joined a rare collection of Thoroughbreds to claim both Cup races in the same season--the latest being the great mare Ethereal (NZ) (Rhythm).

The victory also served as back-to-back victories for jockey Mark Zahra, who partnered Gold Trip (Fr) (Outstrip {GB}) to success in 2022 for Ciaron Maher and David Eustace.

Zahra made the tough decision to jump off **Gold Trip (Fr)**Outstrip {GB}) after riding in the G1 Cox Plate to stick with
Without A Fight. There were opinions aplenty over the matter,
but ultimately, Zahra's judgment was proven correct. **Cont. p11**

#### Coolmore's 2024 Roster & Fees Cont. from p1

The European champion 2-year-old and 3-year-old **St Mark's Basilica (Fr)** will have his first foals for sale from later this month and his fee has been trimmed to €50,000. He has stood at €65,000 in his first two seasons at stud. Another son of Siyouni, the Arc winner **Sottsass (Fr)**, will have his first runners on the track next year and will remain at €25,000.

Coolmore's David O'Loughlin told *TDN Europe*, "We're delighted to have three new exciting prospects for the coming season in the shape of Siyouni's brilliant son Paddington, No Nay Never's European champion 2-year-old Little Big Bear and Battaash's well-performed own-brother The Antarctic. Many of our stallions have enjoyed fantastic seasons but, in line with prevailing market conditions, we've decreased the fees of 10 of the 18 which remain on the roster from last year."

A decision on whether Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner Auguste Rodin (Ire) remains in training next year at four or retires to stud will be made next week.

## CLASSIC SIRE MUHAARAR'S FEE ANNOUNCED

Champion sprinter **Muhaarar (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), who has moved to Haras du Petit Tellier for the 2024 breeding season, will stand for €14,000, co-owner Haras des Capucines announced on X.

Now owned by Shadwell and a consortium of French breeders including Haras des Capucines, and Haras de Saint-Pair, the bay is managed by Capucines Bloodstock, with Eric Puerari taking point.

The 11-year-old's year was highlighted by the victory of his son Marhaba Ya Sanafi (Ire) in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains. That runner would go on to place third in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club. Since the start of the year, he is responsible for nine stakes winners, with other three other Pattern horses among in G2 Princess Of Wales's S. hero Israr (GB) and two-time graded winner Motorious (GB) and G3 Bengough S. hero Annaf (Ire).

In total, Muhaarar has sired 24 stakes winners, half of them at group level. His other Group 1 winner is G1 British Champions Fillies & Mares S. heroine Eshaada (GB).

He bred 124 mares at Haras des Faunes in 2023.

**Kendargent (Fr)**, who is the broodmare sire of Sunway and sire of the Group 1 winner Skalleti (Fr), has been trimmed to  $\in$ 15,000 from  $\in$ 17,000, while his son **Goken (Fr)** remains at  $\in$ 15,000.

Dual-purpose stallion **Soft Light (Fr)** (Authorized {Ire}) also remains unchanged at  $\in$ 5,000 for his third season at stud.

## DUTCH ART RETIRES; CHEVELEY PARK STUD FEES ANNOUNCED

Cheveley Park Stud's **Ulysses (Ire)**, sire of three Group 3 winners this year including the Derby-placed White Birch (GB), has been trimmed to a fee of £9,000 in 2024, having been at £10,000 for the last three seasons.

His fellow resident **Twilight Son (GB)** will stand at £6,000, which is also a small reduction from his fee for this year. The Group 1-winning sprinter was responsible for seven black-type performers this season, including the listed winner Vetivier (GB). Twilight Son covered 35 mares this year, while Ulysses covered 50.

The G1 Prix Morny winner **Unfortunately (Ire)**, who is based at Springfield House Stud in Ireland and is the sire of the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye runner-up and dual listed winner Perdika (GB), is priced at €3,000 for 2024.

In releasing the fees for the stallions, Cheveley Park Stud also confirmed the retirement of **Dutch Art (GB)**. The former top-class 2-year-old and winner of the G1 Prix Morny and G1 Middle Park S. turns 20 in January. He is the sire of Group 1 winners Starman (GB), Garswood (GB) and Slade Power (GB) and also features as broodmare sire of this year's 2000 Guineas winner and new Juddmonte stallion Chaldean (GB).

Matthew Sigsworth, Cheveley Park Stud's bloodstock manager and head of nominations, said, "We feel our stallions offer both outstanding value and opportunity for anyone wanting to breed either a Classic performer or a precocious Royal Ascot 2-year-old. As always, we invite breeders to contact us directly to discuss their mares' mating plans for 2024.

"Dutch Art has now being retired from stallion duties, and will enjoy a happy retirement at Cheveley Park Stud, where he will see out the rest of his years."

## WORLD POOL YEAR-ON-YEAR TURNOVER INCREASES BY 24 PERCENT TO HK\$7.4B

The World Pool season has ended with a 24% year-on-year turnover increase to HK\$7.4 billion, the Hong Kong Jockey Club (HKJC) announced on Tuesday.

The largest globally commingled horse racing pools created and powered by the HKJC, the World Pool started and finished the year at Flemington Racecourse in Australia. In total, there were 222 races--up from 154 races in 2022--in eight countries. World Pool was active in Germany, Saudi Arabia, Argentina and Australia for the first time and expanded its imprint with extra races from the UK and Ireland. Cont. p6

Cox Plate Day in Australia amassed HK\$60 million in bets and was one of the top five World Pool highest single-race turnovers. The G1 Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot, set a new single race turnover record at HK\$66.2m. King George Day at Ascot saw the biggest jump in turnover for a UK or Irish raceday, rising from HK\$253m to a new record of HK\$287m, an increase of over 13%, while 2,000 Guineas Day as well as days one and three of Royal Ascot also posted year-on-year increases. Dubai World Cup night saw the second highest growth, with turnover up from HK\$280m to HK\$315m this term.

Michael Fitzsimons, executive director, wagering products of the HKJC, said, "World Pool was created to unite the world's best racing events and provide racing fans with a value product that has never been seen before.

"We are absolutely delighted with how World Pool has performed in 2023. We've not only seen records broken and growth in countries where World Pool was already in operation, but a very promising reception in new jurisdictions too.

"We'd like to thank all of our partners around the world for their commitment and passion in helping us to grow World Pool. This is just the beginning."



## NATIONAL RACEHORSE WEEK, IN THIRD YEAR, A SUCCESS

The third annual National Racehorse Week, from Sept. 9-17 in the UK, has been deemed a success after a record number of open days and community events, Great British Racing (GBR), who funds the initiative alongside the Racing Foundation and Horserace Betting Levy Board (HBLB), announced on Tuesday.

Over 15,000 free places were made available across the seven days across the country for the public to come and experience a day in the life of a racehorse. From training facilities and studs, to aftercare and rehoming centres, 209 different events took place showcasing the care and attention racehorses receive every day. The week provided a platform to create a lasting impact on those who are not familiar with racing or who don't have the opportunity to get close to a horse in everyday life.

In research undertaken after the week had finished, 94% of people said the experience had left them with a better understanding about and a positive impression of welfare. And 92% of attendees who were new to racing said their opinion had been positively changed about the lives racehorses lead.

There were also a total of 60 dedicated community events focused on outreach, a 300% uplift from last year. These events were supported by Racing Together and Racing to School with more than 3,000 people from schools, charities, urban equestrian centres and community groups getting involved with behind-the-scenes access to racing facilities.

The events included:

- Paul Nicholls hosted a special visit for Dame Kelly Homes Trust beneficiaries, NHS and Emergency Service workers
- Ian Williams hosted members of the RMF Group, an organisation that offer industry focused training courses to ex-offenders, veterans, the homeless, and residents who are long-term unemployed
- Jo Foster took racehorse Sigurd to eight community events including schools, care homes and to charities like Mind and dementia groups
- Aftercare centres including New Beginnings, HEROS, BTRC, Greatwood and Yorkshire retraining and rehoming centre took their retired racehorse ambassadors out to schools and care homes
- Dan Skelton and Oliver Greenall & Josh Guerriero hosted children with serious illnesses from the Barrie Well's Trust Box4Kids initiative
- Godolphin, Ben Case and Dave Loughnane hosted urban equestrian centres including Summerfield Stables from Birmingham, Park Lane Stables from London, and Park Palace Ponies from Liverpool.

Rod Street, CEO Great British Racing, said, "National Racehorse Week creates a unique opportunity for the British Racing industry to unite and showcase to the public the high levels of care that our equine stars receive throughout their entire lives. It also allows racing to open its doors and welcome people of all ages and backgrounds to experience the joy of getting close to a racehorse.

"There are so many highlights from the week, but the ones that stand out for me include the significant increase in young people attending open days this year, especially those aged between 10-14 years, and the impact we had on visitors. Our research shows that 94% of people who came to an open day now have a positive impression of equine welfare, and 92% of those who were new to racing or not regular racegoers said their opinion had been positively changed by the experience. This shows the power of what racing can achieve when it comes together.

"We must thank everyone involved in this special week for showing off the very best of British racing and hopefully helping to inspire a new generation of racing fans."

Queen Aminatu annexed last season's edition of this contest, before closing her 2022 campaign with a win in Deauville's Listed Prix Miss Satamixa, and an Apr. 7 Newcastle conditions victory on seasonal return was the lone success in seven prior outings this term. The 11-4 joint-favourite, who also ran third on the turf here in May's G3 Chartwell Fillies' S., trailed all 11 rivals through the early fractions of this 11th black-type start. Picking off rivals on the home turn, she was ridden into sixth passing the furlong pole and thundered home under a drive to nail Potapova on the line in her farewell race.

"She does have an electric turn of foot and I thought she had maybe just got up, but she had to come from a long way back," said Maureen Haggas. "She seems to love the all-weather, but she doesn't seem to like the grass that much. I think that is her [retired] now and I think she'll go off and have children. I think that's the plan."

There were also plenty of doubts over the son of Teofilo's (Ire)

ability to stay the 3200 metres, having finished 13th in the Melbourne Cup last year. However, Without A Fight has proven to be an improved horse this season, racing with great zest in the winter. The gelding added the G3 Lord Mayor's Cup at Eagle Farm and followed that up with a devastating victory in the G2 The Q22.

All those doubts were put to bed when Without A Fight ran away to win by 2.25l from the Chris Waller-trained pair **Soulcombe (Ire)** (Frankel {GB}) and the charging **Sheraz (Fr)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}).

Co-trainer Sam Freedman was on course to celebrate becoming a Melbourne Cup-winning trainer, telling *Racing.com*, "Credit to the old man [Anthony Freedman]. He's been incredible through all this. He went to Queensland and looked after Without A Fight, and when he won The Lord Mayor's Cup and The Q22, we set our sights on the Cups. "There's a lot of little moments, and I'm a lot younger, so I can get pretty worked up sometimes, whereas Dad [Anthony] is more relaxed, calm and collected. He's been a constant support at home. All the team behind the scenes need to be thanked. We couldn't get Without A Fight here without everybody's help."

He added, "Without A Fight has continued to learn and improve; he was a fierce-going horse. Queensland helped him, but he's a horse that just loves to work, and he was fit and well up there. He genuinely loves his work and pins his ears back every time you train him."

Zahra, becoming the seventh jockey to win the Melbourne Cup on more than one occasion, was understandably jubilant and told *Racing.com*, "My whole objective and well I thought my biggest opposition was my horse himself (Without A Fight). He can be pretty keen, and I went and worked with him the other day and he was keen. So, going to the gates, he was relaxed, which was a good sign.

"But I really wanted to find the fence, and if I could at any stage, he's a horse that relaxes much better on the fence. Slowly, I gained ground up the inside, and Ollie (Damien Oliver, Alenquer), Gold Trip and Ryan Moore (Vauban) were in front of me. and that was a tick, and felt if I could stay here as long as I can and wait for these three to make their moves, I'm going to follow them.

"I was able to travel and smoke up behind the right horses, and this horse has a good turn-of-foot. I got to the front, but I felt there was no way anything was coming from behind me, and boom! Away we went.

"For it to pay off, it's justified."


Without A Fight, a son of Teofilo, continues the outstanding influence that stallion has held over the Melbourne Cup, siring three of the past six Cup winners.



The first time we did \$100 million [in 2021], I told you it was something I never thought we'd be able to achieve. And coming into this year, we would never have dreamt it would happen again. I'm really proud of that."





We want to make sure that is something we are constantly doing. It is our job to create as good a marketplace as possible for the stock we have on the grounds. I think we're making real traction in that regard."

Among the headliners in this season's catalog is Puca (Big Brown) (Hip 191), carrying a full-sister to GI Kentucky Derby winner Mage (Good Magic), and Grade I winner Dalika (Ger) (Pastorius {Ger}) (Hip 223), in foal to 2022 Horse of the Year Flightline.

"Keeneland is excited that Case has chosen us to offer these two exceptional broodmares in Book 1 of the November Breeding Stock Sale--and mark the debut of Case Clay Thoroughbred Management," said Lacy. "While at Three Chimneys Farm, when it was owned by his family, Case oversaw the sale of a large number of million-dollar-plus broodmares over many years, including the great Take Charge Lady here at Keeneland in 2004. Along with this experience at the top end, he has an extraordinary amount of connections and relationships with domestic and international buyers."



sale last year when a fractional share in the champion brought \$4.6 million.

"You have a stallion that gained a lot of focus because of what he did on the track and also finished off his career here at Keeneland. We were fortunate enough to sell that fractional interest here and this year we offer some very high-quality mares in foal to him. That is a great continuation. We're very excited about the mares, it is a select group and it's not overflooding the market. It is going to gain serious attention, not just from domestic buying base but also from the international breeders as well because he is a fascinating stallion."


Also making an appearance with their first in-foal mares are a trio of champions Corniche (Quality Road), Jackie's Warrior (Maclean's Music), Epicenter (Not This Time), and GI Preakness and GI Belmont S. winners Early Voting (Gun Runner) and Mo Donegal (Uncle Mo).

"We have a lot of nice individuals. Obviously, we have Caravel. She was one we had in the sale last year and she's back this year. We've had a few defections like Zeezee Zoomzoom (dam of Caravel). They just felt they wanted to hang on a little longer, which is fine. What is good in a healthy market and is difficult in November is that sometimes feel like they don't need to sell because they had a good yearling market. We have some really nice stock in here, very high-class mares that people are attracted by.

"Midnight Bisou last year was a nice late addition that really stood out. I think this year, there is a broader range of highquality stock and Grade I winners and producers.

"We're looking at long term. We're looking to build a solid foundation as we go forward. We're more focused that the whole structure of our sale's process is developing. That we are moving forward year over year."

A bevy of sires also enter the stage with their first weanlings, highlighted by GISWs Yaupon (Uncle Mo) (46) and GISW Silver State (Hard Spun) (37), in addition to Horse of the Year Knicks Go (Paynter) (27) and champion and Classic scorer Essential Quality (Tapit) (10).

Last year's sale was topped by champion older dirt female Midnight Bisou (Midnight Lute), who brought \$5.5 million from Katsumi Yoshida. On Day 1 in 2022, a total of nine head brought seven figures or more, in addition to Flightline's fractional share. The initial session generated \$68.53 million in gross revenue (including post sales) for 142 horses sold.

Launching its nine-day run Wednesday, the sale begins with 250 head catalogued on its opening day, with bidding commencing at 1:00 p.m. The remaining eight sessions start at 10:00 a.m. The November sale concludes with a single-session Horses of Racing Age Sale Nov. 17.

A year ago, 169 horses grossed \$101,214,000 for an average of \$598,899 and a median of \$250,000. The 2022 buy-back rate was 29.3%.


During Tuesday's auction, 25 mares sold for seven figures, with 16 selling for two million or more and 10 selling for \$3 million or more.

According to the rule changes, a non-resident mare purchased in foal through public auction is deemed a resident mare provided the mare is purchased for at least \$50,000 in the public auction; is present in the state of New York within 15 days after a sale in North America and 60 days at any public auction sale abroad; the foal is foaled in New York; and the mare thereafter is continuously in residence in New York from within 120 days after her last cover in the year of conception of another foal and remains in residency until foaling.

days ago won her second GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint at Santa Anita.

Earlier in the auction, Mike Repole bought out his partners to retain Nest for \$6 million with plans to return the champion to the racetrack as a 5-year-old next season.

Also representing strength in the domestic buying bench, Spendthrift Farm purchased five mares for \$7.7 million, led by the \$3-million acquisition of GI Kentucky Oaks winner **Secret**


"It's plenty strong," Spendthrift's Ned Toffey said of the market Tuesday. "They are not giving them away, that's for sure. I think there are plenty of people here with deep pockets."

Japanese buyers were out in force at Newtown Paddocks Tuesday, with nine seven-figure purchases led by Emmanuel De Seroux's \$4.2-million acquisition of Group 1 winner **Sauterne (Fr)** (Kingman {GB}) on behalf of Grand Stud.

"There was great international participation tonight--it probably wasn't as reflected on the sheets because of the number of people who got outbid consistently," Browning said. "But there was great competitive bidding throughout the evening, particularly on the quality mares in-foal and the quality fillies and mares coming off the racetrack. It's remarkable what happens when you are entrusted with fillies like Goodnight Olive, Nest and Wonder Wheel and mares in-foal like Queen Caroline. I could go and on, because there were so many that sold remarkably well. It all comes down to the horses."

The Fasig-Tipton November sale opened with an offering of 135 weanlings and the group was topped by a filly by Munnings who sold for \$500,000 to Shadwell Racing. Shadwell also purchased a weanling filly by Gun Runner for \$400,000.

That \$500,000 price tag was matched with a pair of supplemented weanlings late in the sale when the En Fuego

Stables pinhooking partnership purchased a son of Maxfield and Cherry Knoll Farm purchased a filly by Into Mischief. Both weanlings were consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency.

"We thought we had strengthened our weanling group this year," Browning said. "And clearly the overall weanlings were better this year than last year."

Browning said the Fasig-Tipton November sale has established a trusted record of success among buyers across the globe.

"I think we have clearly established, A) a lot of wonderful relationships and B) the trust and the confidence in the marketplace," he said. "The buyers know they are going to be able to come here and have the opportunity to buy the best horses on offer anywhere in the world."

#### **Repole Buys Out Partners for Nest**

Mike Repole, sitting with his team in the pavilion, jumped in the bidding around the \$4-million mark and eventually saw off all challengers to purchase out his partners on champion **Nest** (Curlin) (hip 163) for \$6 million Tuesday at Fasig-Tipton. The 4-

year-old filly was consigned by Highgate Sales.

"I wasn't sure if I was going to get her or not," Repole said. "At that price, I thought I wanted to give her another shot. If she had gone to \$7 or \$8 million, I probably would have let her go. But considering I own 50% of her, I feel like I just bought her for \$3 million, not \$6 million. My family CEO thinks we sold her for \$6 million. He's got bad news coming, but I am not going to hurt his feelings right now."

Racing for Repole, Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners and Michael House, Nest put together a championship season as a 3-year-old in 2022. The bay filly won the GI Alabama S., GI Ashland S. and GI Coaching Club American Oaks and finished second in the GI Belmont S. and GI Kentucky Oaks.

During an abbreviated 4-year-old campaign, she won the GII Shuvee S. in July, was third in the GI Personal Ensign S. and fourth in the GI Spinster S.

"I am going to try my best to bring her back [to the races]," Repole said. "Hopefully, she will be 100%. If not, I own a couple of stallions, one Uncle Mo. She could have a date with him. But I really think the goal will be to bring her back. I think she has unfinished business."

Repole continued, "I think last year she had a fever and got started late. And then she had that race at Saratoga where she was spectacular. I really think that took a lot out of her. I think if we get off to a better start, and space her properly this year, I think she is good for four or five good starts. Hopefully, she will run in May, June, and August and maybe in the Distaff and









hopefully be a champion again."

Nest, who was purchased by Repole and Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners for \$350,000 as a yearling at Keeneland September, is a daughter of Marion Ravenwood (A.P. Indy), who sold to Coolmore's M. V. Magnier for \$2.6 million at Fasig-Tipton last November while carrying a full-sibling to the champion. The mare produced a colt this year and was bred back to Into Mischief. @JessMartiniTDN

#### **Laymon Says Emotional Goodbye to Olive**

After watching champion **Goodnight Olive** (Ghostzapper) (hip 237) sell for \$6 million Tuesday night at Fasig-Tipton, Steve Laymon admitted, "It's hard not to have a tear in my eye."

Laymon and his First Row Partners, through bloodstock agent Liz Crow, had purchased the filly for \$170,000 at the 2019 Fasig-Tipton October sale. Then watched as the dark bay mare won back-to-back renewals of the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint and \$2,196,200 on the racetrack.

"I followed her all the way around [the sales grounds]," Laymon said. "And it was just like going to the paddock and to the races, and just like Olive, she never turned a hair. She's such a smart mare. Her intelligence level was just amazing. She came in the ring and she showed who she was. You never dream of buying a horse and selling her for \$6 million. I do not know John

Stewart, I spoke to him tonight. But I am so thrilled to have him in the business. These mares need to stay in the U.S.--no disrespect to international buyers. But it's hard not to get possessive of one of these and want to keep them in the country."

Laymon, an optometrist from North Carolina who founded First Row Partners five years ago, said it was an easy decision to send the 5-year-old mare through the sales ring.



"We are a racing partnership," he said. "We keep a few mares. But at this level, you just have to part with them if you want to continue to race. Unfortunately, you make mistakes in this business. You try to learn from those mistakes, but you just have to have a horse so often that pays for some of those mistakes."

Laymon's proceeds from the auction weren't his only winnings Tuesday.

"There are six First Row partners," he said. "We were at dinner after the Breeders' Cup Saturday and I asked each one of them to get a one hundred dollar bill out and put their initials on it and put down the number they think she will bring. Guess who won that? I did. I put \$5.95 million."


Asked if he planned to reinvest some of that \$6 million price tag in racehorses, Laymon smiled and said, "Slowly. We are in the racing business and this will keep us in the business a long time. We have been so blessed. First Row Partners is in its fifth year of racing and we've sent 15 horses to Chad in the last five years and we've won four Grade Is, four Grade IIs and three Grade IIIs and three Grade I placings. That's not supposed to happen in this business. It's the team. Liz Crow, she buys them, and her team is phenomenal. [Trainer] Chad Brown, I've been with him since the Frankel days. He is so focused. He is so darn smart. And he wins races because of his brain and his dedication." @JessMartiniTDN

#### Stewart a Man on A Mission at Fasig-Tipton

With her Breeders' Cup blanket barely having lost its fragrance after last weekend's victory in the GI Filly & Mare Sprint, Goodnight Olive (Ghostzapper) (Hip 237) added a slam-dunk in the sales ring, drawing a gaudy \$6-million final bid from the redhot John Stewart. While many had wandered away during the later stages of the sale, an expectant horde began to gather again along the perimeter of the pavilion in the moments





leading up to the champion's arrival into the ring. With intermittent volleys being lobbed in rapid succession, Stewartsurrounded by his own entourage including bloodstock advisor Gavin O'Connor--was resolute. Reeling off counterbids without missing a beat, he saw off all competitors to land the session's co-topper at \$6 million.

Stewart also secured a pair of mares for \$3 million during the session: Pizza Bianca (Fastnet Rock {Ire}) (Hip 168), and Queen Caroline (Blame) (Hip 171), the dam of champion Forte (Violence).

The two-time Breeders' Cup champion was consigned by Elite Sales, who enjoyed a stellar day with 12 head grossing \$18.5 million.

Bred by Stonestreet, Goodnight Olive was purchased by Liz Crow for \$170,000 at the 2019 Fasig-Tipton October Sale. Campaigned by First Row Partners and Team Hanley, the filly enjoyed a spectacular 2022 season, winning all four starts, including the GI Ballerina S. in addition to her Breeders' Cup victory. This season, she added wins in the GI Madison S. and GII Bed 'O Roses S. before defending her title at the World Championships.

Crow said, "The owners enjoyed every moment with her. Our team [Elite] got to go along for the ride. And then to get to showcase her here, every major buyer is here at this sale, and to

see her bring what she was worth, she is really a once-in-a-lifetime horse."

The 5-year-old mare joins champion Groupie Doll as only one of two horses to win two Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprints.

"I think she was the best horse in the sale," Crow opined. And Stewart certainly agreed.

"She was on my agenda from the beginning," he said. "I knew there was a lot of foreign interest and I was determined that she was going to stay here."

"With all the success she's had to date, I think she still has some opportunity to still run. To add what she's already done, we need to keep those horses here. That was my main objective. Once I decide I am going to buy them I buy them, they can bid whatever they want, but this horse is going home with me."

Stewart confirmed that he is about a month away from closing on Shadwell Farm's Shadayid Stud in Midway.

"That's what's great about this sport," he said. "I was just at the Breeders' Cup, and this horse wins four days ago and then you have the opportunity to actually buy it. What other sport can you actually do that? It's like Lebron James wins the NBA Championship and then you can buy Lebron or the team. This is really a great sport."

During Tuesday's session, Stewart purchased seven head in

total, including a pair of weanlings, for \$13.35 million.

"We got the dam of Forte, we got Pizza Bianca and we got this horse, which I think is one of the best horses we've seen here for a long time," he said. "I couldn't be happier right now."-@CbossTDN

#### Stewart Full Tilt Ahead for \$3-Million Pair

Firing in quick succession, Stewart, seated alongside by Gavin O'Connor at the back of the pavilion, went to \$3 million Pizza Bianca before extending to the same price for Queen Caroline. The former was consigned by Elite Sales, while the latter was offered by Bluegrass Thoroughbred Servies on behalf of South Gate Farm. Queen Caroline represented a major score for Amy Moore, who purchased the Virginia-bred for a mere \$170,000 at Keeneland September in 2014.

"Those were a lot cheaper than I thought they would be," admitted Stewart. "I was thinking \$5-5.5 million on Queen Caroline. I bought every horse that I bid on."

He added, "And I would have paid a lot more for Queen Caroline. I am really excited with what we have bought and now we have some new horses to put on our farm.

A multiple stakes winner on the track, Queen Caroline hit paydirt in the breeding shed, producing champion juvenile colt Forte (Violence) in her first go around. She sold in foal to Horse of the Year Flightline.

"Queen Caroline is the whole reason we came to the sale," added Stewart. "It's a funny story. As we were looking through the weanlings in the catalog, we were looking for something *out* of Queen Caroline. And then I saw that Queen Caroline herself was in the book and thought 'This is amazing!' Once we saw her, it was a done deal. She was 100% on the list. So I was very glad to walk away with her."--*@CbossTDN* 

#### 'Pizza' to Go

Campaigned by celebrity chef Bobby Flay and trained by Christophe Clement, Pizza Bianca earned over \$792,947 on the track, and counts the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf among her career highlights. The 4-year-old mare was offered in foal to Into Mischief.

Flay secured Pizza Bianca's dam White Hot (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) for 1.25 million guineas at Tattersalls October in 2014. Pizza Bianca was the first foal produced by the unraced mare. Offered at this sale last year, Pizza Bianca RNA'd for \$3.45 million.

"We were very excited about buying [Pizza Bianca] as well," Stewart said. "She had an impressive list of accomplishments. If you look at everything we've been buying, it's all about quality."

He added, "We looked at a lot of horses, but to find the pedigree and the accomplishment level, that's what we're looking for. We're not just looking for the bloodline. And Pizza

However, the operation made somewhat of a surprise appearance on the leaderboard with Faiza (Girvin) (Hip 228), who was purchased by the 'Boys in Blue' for \$4 million. The Grade I stakes winner was consigned by Hill 'n' Dale.

"She was a very good racehorse and had a lot of quality about her," said Godolphin's Michael Banahan. "She was a nice type to be able to bring back."

Faiza brought \$90,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Select sale in 2021 before blossoming into a \$725,000 Fasig Midlantic juvenile purchase by agent Donato Lanni for Michael Petersen in 2022. Trained by Bob Baffert, she won her first five starts, including the GI Starlet S. and GII Santa Anita Oaks.

"Bob Baffert and Donato Lanni buy beautiful horses that win Grade I races," said Hill 'n' Dale's John Sikura. "I am really so happy for Michael Petersen and for the entire team. It was a great result for us, too. I am happy for everybody."

Out of MGSW and MGISP Sweet Pistol (Smart Strike), Faiza's dam Sweet Pistol is a half-sister to two-time grades stakes winner Thousand Words (Pioneerof the Nile). The 10-year-old mare was purchased for \$33,000 by Faiza's breeder Brereton Jones at Keeneland November in 2016.

Sikura added, "Those Grade I winners as mares are hard to find and the Japanese buyers are particularly interested in and respect that Grade I form and they really chase those mares.

Godolphin enjoyed another fruitful Breeders' Cup with Cody's Wish (Curlin) repeating in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, while completing the exacta in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile with Master Of The Seas (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire)) and Mawj (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}).

Named after Cody Dorman, the colt repeated at this year's World Championships with another Dirt Mile win. The victory was bittersweet as Dorman passed away traveling back to his home in Kentucky Sunday.

"It was a fantastic story and a wonderful family," said Banahan. "It was so special that we had that opportunity with them the last five years. I hope the [Dorman] family gets a lot of strength from the people both in and outside the industry while they go through their grieving process. It's heartbreaking for them, I'm sure. 



The 3-year-old, who was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency on behalf of the Green family's D J Stable, won last year's GI Darley Alcibiades S. and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. She is out of multiple stakes winner and multiple Grade I placed Wonder Gal (Tiz Wonderful).

"Her appearance was very good and she's a champion 2-yearold, so we know she's very good," said Shingo Hashimoto, who signed for the broodmare prospect. "We will take her back to Japan and keep her as a broodmare."

Wonder Wheel was purchased by the Greens for \$275,000 as a Keeneland September yearling and earned \$1,591,857 on the racetrack.

"We were very confident bringing her here that she was going to bring a good amount of money," Jon Green said after

Green continued, "From the moment that we bought her, Kim Valerio picked her out, Mark Casse trained her, Tyler Gaffalione did a phenomenal job riding her. And of course, Taylor Made and Fasig-Tipton did an absolute perfect job of marketing her. Everyone along the way added value. And I can't thank everyone enough for what they've done."

Yoshida's shopping spree at Fasig-Tipton Tuesday also included **Armony's Angel** (To Honor and Serve) (hip 207), who was acquired for \$1.8 million from the Taylor Made Sales Agency consignment.

In foal to Gun Runner, the mare is already the dam of this year's GI Arkansas Derby winner Angel of Empire (Classic Empire).

Late in the sale, Yoshida concluded his Fasig purchases with Ceiling Crusher (Mr. Big) (hip 265) acquired for \$750,000.

Asked if he was able to purchase the mares he was aiming for, Hashimoto said, "Some of them, yes. Not all of them. That's always a part of the game. It's always tough." @JessMartiniTDN



grass, it doesn't really matter. They have to have some ability and they have to be in foal to something that can give them a good start."

Highlighting the early swath of weanlings on offer at Fasig-Tipton's November Sale Tuesday, Shadwell emerged at the forefront, purchasing a pair of fillies, including Hip 62, a daughter of Munnings for \$500,000.

Consigned by St George Sales, the Ontario-bred foal--bred by Narola and Anderson Farm--is out of Grade III winner Summer in Saratoga (Hard Spun). Out of MSW Diversa (Tabasco Cat), the 7year-old mare, a \$630,000 purchased by Anderson Farms at Fasig-Tipton at this venue in 2021, is a daughter of GI Vanity S. heroine Love Theway Youare (Arch).

"She was just a beautiful Munnings, I have never seen a Munnings like that, so we are happy with her," said Shadwell's Jonny Smyth. "I spoke Sheikha Hissa and made some budget decisions, so we were happy to get her."

Back in action later in the session, Smyth--bidding from inside the pavilion--extended to \$400,000 for Hip 109, a filly by Gun Runner. Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, the dark bay is a daughter of Classofsixtythree (Include). The 10-year-old mare is also responsible for GSW and GISP Gunmetal Gray (Exchange Rate) and Grade III-scorer Sixtythreecaliber (Gun Runner).

Offered at Keeneland January in 2019, Classofsixtythree had failed to meet her reserve at \$385,000 while carrying Sixtythreecaliber.

Of Shadwell's purchases Tuesday, Smyth added, "Both are from beautiful families, so they have some nice residual value."

Commenting on the overall quality of the weanlings on offer at Fasig-Tipton Tuesday, he said, "It's a nice group. Fasig has put together a nice group of weanlings. We've had a few on our list and we were very happy to get them."

Active both in the sales arena and the racetrack both domestically and abroad this season, Smyth indicated there was also plenty to look forward to on the farm as well.

"It's been an exciting year. We have [six-time Grade I winner] Malathaat [Curlin] on the farm and she is in foal to Into Mischief," he said of the two-time champion. "We're looking forward to what she will produce. And it's also been a phenomenal year in Europe, so we're very happy with the entire program overall."

Later in the session, a colt by Maxfield (Hip 213) and Hip 268-a colt by Into Mischief-also reached that mark. Both top weanling colts were consigned by Taylor Made Sales. The former was purchased by Cherry Knoll Farm and the latter was secured by Enfuego Stables--@CbossTDN

- For the third consecutive year, the one-session 'Night of the Stars' sale grossed over \$100 million.
- Noted breeder Godolphin LLC made the organization's first purchases at this sale in five years, going to \$4 million for Faiza (Girvin) and \$1.5 million for Higher Truth (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). The last time Godolphin bought at Fasig-Tipton November, they picked up Pretty City Dancer (Tapit) for \$3.5 million in 2018. She has since produced 2023 GI Kentucky Oaks winner Pretty Mischievous (Into Mischief).
- The joint \$6-million toppers, Nest (Curlin) and Goodnight Olive (Ghostzapper), were bought by Repole Stable and Gavin O'Connor, agent for John Stewart, respectively.

- The first mares in foal to Horse of the Year Flightline sold, with three of the four successful purchases each hammering for seven figures. Flightline's average as a covering sire after this initial sale is more than \$1.6 million, topped by the \$3 million for Queen Caroline.
- Spendthrift Farm LLC and Shadai Farm were both active at the top tier. Spendthrift will take home \$3-million Secret Oath (Arrogate), \$2-million Merneith (American Pharoah), and \$2-million Travel Column (Frosted), while Shadai is leaving with \$2.3-million Ain't Easy (Curlin), \$1.35-million Sophia's Song (Bellamy Road), and \$1.3-million Shantisara (Ire) (Coulsty {Ire}).
- Katsumi Yoshida also purchased multiple seven-figure mares, including \$3.6-million Search Results (Flatter), \$3.2-million Wonder Wheel (Into Mischief), and \$1.8million Armony's Angel (To Honor and Serve). A total of 25 offerings, or nearly one-eight of the catalogue, brought \$1 million or more.

## GUNITE RETIRED TO ASHFORD; STUD FEE SET AT \$35K

**Gunite** (Gun Runner--Simple Surprise, by Cowboy Cal), a two-time Grade I winner and runner-up behind champion Elite Power (Curlin) in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Santa Anita, has been retired from racing and will stand at Coolmore America's Ashford Stud for 2024. His fee has been set at \$35,000.

Trained by Steve Asmussen, the Winchell Thoroughbreds homebred defeated the aforementioned two-time Breeders' Cup Sprint winner in this summer's GI Forego S. at Saratoga. Gunite also won the GI Hopeful S. during his 2-year-old season and the GII Amsterdam S. at three, both at Saratoga. His loaded resume also includes a close second to Elite Power in this summer's GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H., a runner-up finish in the 2022 H. Allen Jerkens Memorial S. and a third-place finish in this year's G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen.

"Gunite is extremely important to horse racing in the current climate," Asmussen said. "He was Gun Runner's first starter for us in April of his 2-year-old year and ran six times in his juvenile campaign and won the Grade I Hopeful at Saratoga. He then travelled to California to work with the brilliant Echo Zulu because he is the only thing that I had that could be comparable company for her, and he won four stakes races at Churchill, Keeneland and Saratoga. As a 4-year-old, he then travelled to Saudi Arabia and Dubai and competed at the highest level and returned to the U.S. to beat his rival Elite Power in the Grade I Forego S. at Saratoga. He is a very special horse to race at the level he has for as long as he has and do it consistently."

Asmussen added, "I'm a walking infomercial for Gunite. I apologize in advance. I am such a huge fan of his. The story of Gunite is so unique as in the first crop of Gun Runners, in Laredo, I laugh at it to myself because you want Gun Runner to

do well, and you're nervous as to whether they'll be any good when they're yearlings. They all look good, but we all know how looking good and running can be different. And looking around the barn at my dad's place over the holidays at the Gun Runners, and Gunite's out of a nice precocious family we've had success with, and I immediately identify him as the Gun Runner you're going to come out with. He was our first starter for Gun Runner, in April of his 2-year-old year. He ends up running six times as a 2-year-old, second in the Saratoga Special, wins the Hopeful at Saratoga, and I reward him off of six runs and a Grade I win at Saratoga by taking him to California because I don't want to change Echo Zulu's workmate leading into the Breeders' Cup. So not only does he have the six runs as a 2-year-old, he's got three stiff works with her, because he's the only thing good enough to work with her leading up the Breeders' Cup, and then as a 3-year-old, he wins three stakes, at Churchill, Keeneland, and another graded stake at Saratoga. And then as a 4-year-old, he goes to Saudi, Dubai, wins another Grade I at Saratoga against Elite Power, finishes off 21 races with 17 firsts and seconds at the highest level, running I believe a 2 3/4 Rag in the Breeders' Cup Sprint, and is enough horse to pass the regulatory veterinarian scenario that we're racing under now. That's how important a horse to racing he is now. He's unbelievable. Needless to say, I am a huge fan of his. He's still running 3 Rags at this stage of his career. Incredilble."

What qualities will make him a good stallion?

"First and foremost, his ability," Asmussen said. "He's obviously got a tremendous amount of ability. He's extremely attractive. He's very correct. He's unbelievably sound. He is everything horse racing needs right now. For me, he's got tremendous balance. He's very smooth. He's a very athletic horse, smooth as can be, great balance. He looks a picture from all angles. Just great constitution. Always a tremendous appetite, no matter where in the world he is, day before the race or the day after. He's very strong mentally and physically. Unbelievably honest. Extremely straightforward, has a ton of confidence about him, not overly aggressive, but always, always capable if needed. How important he is under the current climate is what's amazing. Six runs as a 2-year-old, starting in April racing at that level, running his fastest he's ever run on his 21st run, on seven or eight different surfaces at the highest level."

Owner/breeder Ron Winchell added, "Like many of the Gun Runners, Gunite got better and better throughout his racing career and gave us many great days. We also raced his first and second dams and they were both stakes winners at Saratoga. Gunite has retired sound and I very much look forward to supporting him at stud."

"He was unusual in that he was top class at two, three and

four, he was one of the best sprinters in the country and had top Beyer figures of 108 at both Saratoga and Churchill," said Ashford's Director of Sales Charlie O'Connor. "He's a very good-looking horse and we can't wait for breeders to see him." Gunite retires with a record of 21-9-8-2 and earnings of \$2,493,009.

#### GISW ZANDON RETIRED TO SPENDTHRIFT **FARM**

Grade I winner Zandon (Upstart--Memories Prevail, by Creative Cause) has been retired and has arrived at Spendthrift Farm in Kentucky ahead of stallion duty in 2024, the farm announced. The dark bay will stand for \$12,500 stands and nurses and will participate in Spendthrift's "Share the Upside" program on a limited basis for a fee of \$15,000 for two years.

"We are excited about Zandon and the ability to offer a Grade I winner with his physical through our Share The Upside program. He's what they should look like," said Ned Toffey, Spendthrift general manager. "You won't find many Grade I winners in town that look and move the way he does. He's a big, classy individual with a beautiful, smooth gait, which is likely why he was able to remain so sound through the rigors of competing against the best of his generation for two straight years. We believe breeders are really going to like him, and we invite them to come out and see for themselves."

Bred by the late Brereton Jones, the dark bay brought \$170,000 as a Keeneland September yearling and was put into training with Chad Brown. A winner of his Belmont debut, the Jeff Drown runner was also second in the GII Remsen S. as a juvenile and was third in the GII Risen Star S. in his 3-year-old bow. A winner of the GI Blue Grass S., he was third in the GI Kentucky Derby. Throughout the rest of the year, he would add three more graded placings in the GII Jim Dandy S., GI Travers S., and the GI Pennsylvania Derby.

He rolled a trio of twos in his first three starts this term, in the GIII Westchester S., GI Metropolitan H. in June, and in the GI Whitney S. at Saratoga in August. The GII Woodward S. went his way in October, and he was retired after a start in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic with a record of 14-3-6-3 and \$2.2 million in earnings.

The second foal and one of three winners for his unraced dam, Zandon is a half-brother to Panamanian champion 2-year-old colt Sol Principe Gris (Summer Front). His dam is a half-sister to MGSW and MGISP Cairo Memories (Cairo Prince), as well as the SW Cariba (Cairo Prince). Under the third dam is Grade II winner Hello Liberty (Forest Camp), who was second in the GI Acorn S.

Spendthrift announced in September that Zandon would join Taiba (Gun Runner) and Arabian Lion (Justify) as new stallions at their Kentucky base in 2024.

#### **BUCCHERO RELOCATING TO MCMAHON OF** SARATOGA THOROUGHBREDS

**Bucchero** (Kantharos), the sire of the current 2-year-old stakes winners Book'em Danno and Mattingly and of the stakes-placed and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint fifth-place finisher Shards, will take up residence at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds for the 2024 breeding season for a fee of \$7,500. After breeding 471 mares while standing for five seasons at Pleasant Acres Stallions in Florida, Bucchero will join Central Banker and Solomini in New York.

"Traditionally, New York breeders have not had the opportunity to breed to a new stallion who was already on the upswing with proven runners on the ground, but that certainly should be changing in the future with the exceptional program New York has developed and actively improved," said Bucchero Managing Partner Harlan Malter. "We have broken the mold a bit with Bucchero and we feel we are doing it again with our move to New York."

Bucchero has celebrated a breakout season in 2023. His second crop has produced two unrestricted juvenile stakes winners, taking his total to three overall, and he has been represented by nine stakes-placed horses from 84 starters. Bucchero is the sire of 52 individual winners, a percentage of 62% that is second-best among his peers with 50 or more runners and higher than the likes of Justify and Good Magic. His runners have finished in the top three in over 47% of their combined appearances.

Bucchero is currently the second-leading sire of 2-year-olds by earnings outside the state of Kentucky (\$856,604). In New York, his current 2-year-old progeny earnings would make him the #1 juvenile sire in the state and his total 2023 progeny earnings of \$2,291,021 would make him the third-leading sire overall in New York behind only Central Banker and Tourist.

Led by Shards, who sold for \$175,000 at the 2023 OBS March Sale, Bucchero has excelled in the 2-year-old market, with consistently quick under-tack previews that have translated to the sales ring. From a \$5,000 stud fee, Bucchero averaged nearly 10 times his stud fee with a \$48,595 average from 21 sold in 2022 and built upon that in 2023 with an average of \$51,133 from 30 sold.

Bucchero has quickly become a "trainers" stallion as many went right back to the well in the second crop after campaigning first-crop runners. Joe Orseno, the trainer of first-crop stakes winner Beauty of the Sea and second-crop stakes winner Mattingly (85 Beyer in his most recent stakes start) commented, "I have now trained eight of them and they do nothing but run. Mattingly is a perfect example, a stakes winner on synthetic, stakes placed short on the turf and seven furlongs on dirt and I am now pointing him to the \$300K In Reality Stakes going 1 1/16 miles on the dirt. They are fast and smart, versatile and racy."

"We are thrilled to bring Bucchero to McMahon and the New York program as we feel Bucchero is built for a program like this," added John McMahon. "He has shown he produces fast, precocious and, most importantly for New York breeders going forward, runners that can win on anything."

Malter, who campaigned Bucchero along with the current ownership group added, "All of us involved with Bucchero started as small breeders looking to survive in a very difficult market segment. Bucchero has proved he can get a breeder a quality sales horse and possibly even more importantly, a runner who will keep them looking forward to that 'mailbox money' small breeders depend on to succeed."

On his way from Florida to New York, Bucchero will make a pit

stop in Lexington during the second week of the Keeneland November Sale for a stallion show on Nov. 14 from 1-4 p.m. at Kesmarc at 258 Shannon Run Rd, Versailles.




