CURTAIN FALLS ON BOUTIQUE HONY-HOF OPERATION AT GOFFS

There will, rightly, be much attention paid to the Niarchos draft at the Goffs November Sale as the family operation undergoes restructuring, but there is one boutique dispersal which also deserves proper perusal.

Manfred and Edith Hellwig of German-based Gestut Hony-Hof bring 11 mares and nine foals to market though the Castlebridge Consignment, many of whom offer access to one of the best German families of recent decades.

In 2000, the Hellwigs bought from Gestut Karlshof a yearling filly by Monsun (Ger), a full-sister to that year's G1 Deutsches Derby winner Samum (Ger), who would later be named Salve Regina (Ger) and go on to claim her own Classic laurels in the G1 Preis der Diana. The family's place in German bloodstock history has been even more deeply carved since then. In 2006, another full-brother, Schiaparelli (Ger), brought a second Deutsches Derby home, and while their sister Sanwa (Ger) didn't make it to the track herself, she atoned for that by producing yet another Derby winner, Sea The Moon (Ger) (Sea The Stars {Ire}).

SEA THE MOON COLT SIMPLY WONDERFUL

IN GERMANY by Sean Cronin

Markus Klug trainee **Wonderful Boy (Ger)** (Sea The Moon {Ger}--Wonderful Gorl {Ger}, by Areion {Ger}), who was last seen shedding maiden status at Cologne in September, stamped his authority on Sunday's G3 Herzog von Ratibor-Rennen at Krefeld and hit the line with a wide-margin buffer for a career high in the 8 1/2-furlong test.

The 17-5 chance, who had earlier poster an Aug. 26 debut third at Baden-Baden, was swiftly into stride from the inside stall and claimed an immediate lead. Allowed an inch of rein soon after turning for home, he was beyond recall approaching the final furlong and geared down in the closing stages to easily outclass **Novemberrose (Ire)** (Camelot {GB}) by 10 lengths. Gestut Park Wiedingen's 13-5 favourite **Flamingo Moon (Ger)** (Sea The Moon {Ger}) was unable to land any kind of blow and finished 16 lengths adrift in third. **Cont.**, **p5**

Hony-Hof, cont. from p1

Salve Regina herself has established a dynasty at Hony-Hof, the central German farm "close to nowhere", which includes the GII Ballston Spa H. winner Salve Germania (Ger) (Peintre Celebre), whose full-sister Salve Haya (Ire) is catalogued as Lot 1148. Six of the 11 mares to be offered at Goffs are Salve Regina's descendants, as are four of the foals.

"That whole family has been so good to us, and also to Karlshof," says Simon Minch, the longstanding manager of Gestut Hony-Hof. "The number of group runners they've brought out of it and black-type horses, it's like a gift that keeps on giving. It's a family that just doesn't seem to go out of fashion."

He adds, "The one thing you have to say about that family is that it gets good, honest, tough horses. They don't wilt easily, they normally go on and have good, long careers to them. You know, the rarely-see-a-vet type."

Leading the draft of mares on the Friday of the sale is Sea The Sunrise (Ger) (Lot 1139), a Sea The Stars granddaughter of Salve Regina offered in foal to Gleneagles (Ire), and her weanling filly by Arizona (Ire) will be sold as Lot 525 on the Tuesday.


Minch continues, "A lot of that family aren't that big are very, very good. Like Salve Regina herself."

"She was the height of the average coffee table. Same with the dam of Sea The Moon, she was even smaller. Salve Del Rio was a two-year-old winner for us, and he was fourth in the German Derby, and third in a Group 2. He was barely 15 hands, but he was as tough as nails.

"And Sea the Sunrise, she's also an interesting outcross as well. She's a lovely mare and she's got a lot of potential to her. You're buying a lot of good stallion stuff in there." **Cont**.

It's not all about the Salve Regina clan in the Hony-Hof draft though. For a start, the horse that has brought the farm the most acclaim in recent years is the G1 Prix du Cadran winner Princess Zoe (Ger) (Jukebox Jury {Ire}). She too isn't that big and is as tough as they come, but she's from a different family altogether.

Her half-sister Palace Girl (GB) (Areion {Ger}) sells as Lot 1142


and is in foal to Churchill (Ire) with a yearling by Adlerflug (Ger) on the ground. Her filly foal by Isfahan (Ger) is Lot 524.

Then there's the German champion two-year-old, Ocean Fantasy (Fr) (Make Believe {GB}), a rare foal purchase by the stud who went on to win the G3 Preis der Winterkonigin and finish placed in the G2 Diana Trial. Selling as Lot 1141, she is in foal to Lope De Vega (Ire) while her filly foal from the first crop of St Marks's Basilica (Fr) could bring some interest late in the day on Tuesday as the final lot in the ring (532). Her dam's half-sister La Mehana (Fr) (Al Wukair {Ire}) is a treble Listed winner who was placed in the G1 Prix de Royallieu since the catalogue was printed.

"There's another very interesting family we have though, that shouldn't be overlooked," says Minch. "It's been my pet project, and that's Wish You Well and Westfalica family."

Those two named mares (Lots 1140 and 1149), by Soldier Hollow (GB) and Areion (Ger) respectively, are both great-granddaughters of the Oaks winner Jet Ski Lady (Vaguely Noble).

He continues, "We decided to go a different direction with that family. To go back to 1,600, 1,400-metre horses, with One Cool Cat and Areion and things like that. And the bit of speed back on it has paid dividends, and it has started giving black type for us again." Cont.





Fee for 2024: **€50,000**

"Westfalica's two-year-old [Wikinger] won the big €200,000 sales race in Baden-Baden. So that was pleasing, and also from that family is Words Of Peace, who was fourth in the Winterkonigin, the top two-year-old race for fillies in Germany.

"So that's coming alive again, and then Wish You Well is a listed winner herself and her first foal by Caravaggio had one start and ran a grand race to be second. But interestingly the winner came out from that and won the sales race down in Munich recently. So the form of that race is looking pretty solid. They're both very young mares with plenty going for them. Westfalica has a foal by Sioux Nation and Wish You Well has a Starspangledbanner filly."

The advancing age of the Hellwigs, who have had broodmares for 35 years, has prompted the dispersal of the operation which has been conducted in the true tradition of owner-breeders.

"Everything was bred for their own racing stable," Minch explains. "It was only in the last one or two years we started selling a couple because we kind of knew it was coming to the end, but unfortunately it's come a bit quicker than anyone expected or wished for.

"They started off in North Germany and they were having a bit of fun, a hobby really, with a cattle farm and a few broodmares," says Minch, who has managed Hony-Hof since 2005. "And then Salve Regina who won the Oaks for them. Mr Hellwig wanted to sell her, because of course there were offers, but Mrs Hellwig basically put her foot down and said, 'No, we're going to start breeding properly now.' They bought Gestot Hony-Hof in the late nineties."

The 11 mares going to sale represents the largest number the farm has ever had at one time. The mares have been in Ireland to foal at Joe Hernon's Castletown Stud and have remained there in anticipation of their sales date.

"I'm very grateful to Joe, who I've known for years since I worked at Castle Hyde Stud, and to everyone at Goffs for their help in arranging everything," Minch says. "And Theresa Lotz has been working here at Hony-Hof since she was 18. She did her apprenticeship with us and then she stayed on for the last 12 years. She's been absolutely magnificent in the amount of work she's put in. The whole operation just wouldn't run without Theresa."

There will be poignant days for himself, too, as the sale gets underway.

Minch says, "People have asked me, 'what are you going to do after the last mare goes to the ring?' And I said, 'I'm going to go down to the bar and have a double whiskey.' That's what I'll probably do. It's going to be an emotional moment, but we've known it's been coming for a year now and our job is to get this done and organised for the Hellwigs with the best possible result for them."

"I was hoping to be placed and am a bit surprised just how well he ran," said winning rider Andrasch Starke. "He worked well enough at home, but not to suggest this kind of performance. He is still developing and, on this heavy going, he ran like a really good horse. He was quite keen in the early stages, but then settled well and eventually responded beautifully. I always thought he was a horse for next year and I think we can really look forward to 2024 with him."

Wonderful Boy, who becomes the 18th pattern-race winner for his sire, is the lone reported foal produced by Listed Grosser Soldier Hollow Preis runner-up Wonderful Gorl (Ger) (Areion {Ger}), herself kin to MGSW G2 Union-Rennen victor Wonderful Moon (Ger) (Sea The Moon (Ger)). The March-foaled chestnut's third dam Wonderful World (Ger) (Dashing Blade (GB)), who produced G3 Prix Chloe victrix Wunder (Ger) (Adlerflug {Ger}), is a full-sister to three black-type winners headed by MGSP Listed Gran Premio d'Italia victor Winning Dash (Ger). His fourth dam Wonderful Lady (Ger) (Surumu {Ger}) ran third in the G2 German 1000 Guineas and is kin to the stakes-winning G1 Deutsches Derby runner-up Winwood (Ger) (Surumu {Ger}).

BREEDERS' CUP BONANZA FOR TEAM EUROPE

In this series, the TDN takes a look at notable successes of European-based sires in North America. This week's column is highlighted by the victories of Team Europe at the Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita.

Auguste Rodin Paints BC Masterpiece

Already a four-time Group 1 winner including both the Derby and the Irish version, Coolmore partners' **Auguste Rodin (Ire)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) delivered another win in the GI Longines Breeders' Cup Turf last Saturday (*video*) for Aidan O'Brien.

The 'TDN Rising Star' had been bred by Coolmore, and he is the first foal out of triple Group 1 winner Rhododendron (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). His weanling half-brother is by Dubawi (Ire). Rhododendron is a full-sister to the multiple Group 1 winner Magical (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), the duo are out of Broodmare of the Year Halfway To Heaven (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}), herself a decorated runner and winner of the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas and two other top-flight races.

Shadai Stallion Station's late Deep Impact has sired five winners from just 10 runners (50%) in the U.S. Two of that quintet are Grade I winners, with Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf heroine Loves Only You (Jpn) his first in America.

Cheveley Park's Inspiral Best At Santa Anita

Cheveley Park Stud homebred **Inspiral (GB)** (Frankel {GB}), racing beyond a mile for the first time in her career, won the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf last weekend for trainers John and Thady Gosden (*video*).

The six-time Grade/Group 1-winning daughter of Starscope (GB) (Selkirk) is a half-sister to the stakes-placed Celestran (GB) (Dansili {GB}). Starscope, herself a half-sister to stakes winner Solar Magic (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), was second in both the G1 1000 Guineas and the G1 Coronation S. Her latest produce are colts by Siyouni (Fr) and Ulysses (Ire)--named Megastar (GB) and Stetchworth Friend (GB), respectively--and a weanling full-sister to the winner. Stetchworth Friend was a 160,000gns buy by Stetchworth and Middle Park Studs out of Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale.

Juddmonte's Frankel has sired 26 winners from 50 runners (52%) in America. Of his 11 stakes winners there (22%), Inspiral is his second Grade I winner after McKulick (GB).

Godolphin One-Two In BC Mile

Master Of The Seas (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), a Godolphin homebred for trainer Charlie Appleby, got the bob to win the GI Fanduel Breeders' Cup Mile over fellow Godolphin runner Mawj (Ire) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}) last weekend (video).

Already a Grade I winner in Canada, the gelding was also second in the G1 2000 Guineas in 2021. A half-brother to a trio of stakes winners including the UAE Oaks heroine Falls Of Lora (Ire) (Street Cry {Ire}), herself the dam of two Group 1/Grade I winners in Cascadian (GB) (New Approach {Ire}) and Albahr (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), Master Of The Seas is also related to Classic winner Dupont (GB) (Zafonic). Firth Of Lorne (Ire) (Danehill)'s last foal is the winning Dark Angel (Ire) 3-year-old filly Sithchean (Ire).

On an international scale, Dubawi has 266 stakes winners (175

group/graded) to his credit. The gelding counts as one of 57 top-draw winners worldwide.

Unquestionable Stars In Juvenile Turf

Al Shaqab Racing and the Coolmore partners' **Unquestionable (Fr)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}) earned his first black-type victory in style when taking the GI Prevagen Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at Santa Anita on Saturday for Aidan O'Brien (*video*).

The 'TDN Rising Star' was bred by Guillaume and Camille Vitse with their two daughters, and he brought €340,000 as a yearling at the Arqana August Sale. His dam, Strawberry Lace (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}), has Almanzor (Fr) colts born in 2022 and 2023 as her latest produce. This is the extended family of Group 2 winner and sire Bated Breath (GB).

Coolmore sires sired the winners of three of the five Breeders' Cup races on Friday, and Wootton Bassett now has 15 winners of 23 (65%) runners in the U.S. Of his seven American stakes winners, Unquestionable is his second Grade I winner and Breeders' Cup winner after Audarya (Fr) won the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf in 2020.

Blue Point Colt Fastest In The Land At Breeders' Cup

Big Evs (Ire) (Blue Point {Ire}), raced by RP Racing, Ltd. from the yard of Mick Appleby, returned to the form that saw him win the G3 Molecomb S. in the summer with a victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint in Arcadia (*video*).

A product of the storied Rabbah Bloodstock breeding programme, the son of Hana Lina (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) brought just 50,000gns from breeze-up pinhooker Mickey Cleere out of Book 2 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale. Consigned to the Tattersalls Craven Breeze-Up Sale, Big Evs was then withdrawn and sold privately. His placed dam has a yearling filly by Ribchester (Ire) to come and a weanling colt by another son of Shamardal in Earthlight (Ire). Cont.

Off to a bright start with his first crop of juveniles, Darley's Blue Point has 44 winners internationally. Already the sire of French Group 1 winner Rosallion (Ire), the bay has an additional five black-type winners worldwide. Big Evs was his first runner in America.

Have I Got A Deal For You

On the Breeders' Cup Saturday undercard, **Salesman (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) demolished the G2 Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance S. by 8 1/4 lengths for trainer Richard Mandella and owner/breeder Wertheimer et Frere (*video*).

The son of High Maintenance (Fr) (Highest Honor {Fr}) is a fourth generation Wertheimer et Frere homebred. Listed-placed in France, Saturday's win was his first stakes. His G3 Prix Gladiateur-placed dam is also responsible for the five-time Group 1 winner Solow (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) and the stakes winner Lunch Lady (GB) (Shamardal), who was also twice third in a pair of French Group 3s. Second dam Fabulous Hostess (Fabulous Dancer) is best known as the winner of the G2 Prix de Royallieu.

One of 21 stakes winners (27%) and 16 graded winners (21%) in the U.S. for his Darley sire, Salesman is also part of a 39-strong battalion of winners (51%) there for Dubawi. The son of Dubai Millennium (GB) has been represented by 77 runners in the U.S.

Dandy Man Gelding Strikes At Del Mar

Dandy Man Shines (Ire) (Dandy Man {Ire}) won his second race in a row for Red Baron's Barn, LLC and Rancho Temescal, LLC at Del Mar on Thursday for trainer Jeff Mullins (*video*). Placed at the graded level in 2022, the Let It Ride S. was his first stakes win.

Bred by John Frances Keegan in Ireland, the 3-year-old gelding was a €75,000 Goffs November foal turned €90,000 Goffs Orby

yearling. He brought 105,000gns from his owners out of the Tattersalls Craven Breeze-Up Sale. In two European starts, he was unplaced for Rancho Temescal's Tim Cohen and trainer William Jarvis before traveling Stateside.

The son of Zehrah (Ire) (Raven's Pass) is a half-brother to Scandinavian champion Mystery Night (Ire) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}), and his second dam won at listed level in England besides taking third in the G2 Cherry Hinton S. A juvenile filly by Kodiac (GB) and a weanling filly by Bated Breath (GB) are Zehrah's latest foals.

Dandy Man, who stands at Ballyhane Stud, has now sired two stakes winners from 25 runners in America (8%). His first is GI Frank E. Kilroe Mile S. hero River Boyne (Ire), who is a stallion at Tara Stud. Dandy Man Shines is one of 13 winners (52%) in that jurisdiction.

Night Of Thunder Filly Proves Dynamic in NY

Klaravich Stables and Chad Brown combined to take a maiden race at Aqueduct last weekend with first-time starter **Dynamic Pricing (Ire)** (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) (*video*).

The Epona Bloodstock-bred filly was a 170,000gns Tattersalls October Book 1 purchase by Mike Ryan on behalf of her current connections. She is the third--and last--known foal and second winner out of Shemda (Ire) (Dutch Art {GB}). This is the female family of G1 Prix de Diane heroine Shemaka (Ire) (Nishapour {Fr}).

Her Darley sire has tallied eight winners from 14 runners (57%) in the U.S. His three American stakes winners are anchored by Grade III winners Sopran Basilea (Ire) and Pocket Square (GB).

BLUE BRESIL COLTS SHINE ON DAY 1 OF NOVEMBER NH SALE

The first session of the Tattersalls Ireland November NH Sale kicked off on Sunday with progeny by Blue Bresil (Fr)--sire of the six-time Grade 1 winner and November NH Sale graduate

Constitution Hill (GB)--in high demand as two of his colts took the top two spots, as well five of the day's top ten prices overall.

Lot 89, a bay colt out of the Shirocco (Ger) mare Bee Yanka (GB), brought €68,000 online from Timmy Hillman to be the day's highest price. The March foal was consigned by Clonmult on behalf of breeders Richard and Mai Nolan of Old Court Stud.

"We were advised by Donal [White] to send Bee Yanka to Blue Bresil and she has visited the sire three times now," the couple said jointly. "The stock that has come from her has been so magnificent, and we just kept going back to the stallion--she is an amazing breeder."

Kieran Shields and his daughter Kate went to €67,000 for Lot 20, the Blue Bresil colt out of the Listed-placed Rolanna (Ire) (Strategic Prince {Ire}), from the Thistletown Stud consignment.

"He is a good walker, by the right sire, is a good size and he has been bought as a pinhooking prospect," Kate said.

Coolamurry Stud consigned Lot 80, a colt by Walk In The Park (Ire) out of the Aura About You (Ire) (Supreme Leader), who was bought by pinhook purchaser Michael Fitzpatrick, signing as J C Bloodstock, for €60,000.

LORD KANALOA'S BREDE WEG ON TOP IN QUEEN ELIZABETH CUP by Heather Anderson

It was a stakes double for Lord Kanaloa (Jpn) on Sunday, as Ho O Emmy's (Jpn) won the G3 Fukushima Kinen, and **Brede Weg** (Jpn) became his latest Group 1 winner with a victory in the Queen Elizabeth Cup in Kyoto. She is the first 3-year-old filly to win the race since Mozu Katchan (Jpn) (Harbingers {GB}) in 2017, and also became the QEC victress with the fewest starts with five.

Despite the presence of last year's winner **Geraldina (Jpn)** (Maurice {Jpn}), the Sunday Racing 3-year-old garnered favouritism at 7-5 in her first start beyond 2000 metres. Hopping at the start, Brede Wag perched next to the fence as **Art House** (**Jpn**) (Screen Hero {Jpn}) carved out fractions of :49 for the first 800 metres and 1:37.50 for the 1600 metres while pressed by **Roselite (Jpn)** (Kizuna {Jpn}).

Like the winner, Geraldina was not cleanly away from the stalls, but unlike Brede Weg's small hop, she attempted to kickstart her career over jumps, catching a fair bit of air. As a result, the intended frontrunner was instead briefly last and Ryan Moore had his hands full as she was three deep into the first turn. By the 600-metre mark she was just behind Brede Weg's, but several paths deeper into the course.

Brede Weg came off the fence for her run entering the straight, but treaded water for a bit before shifting gears. By the 200-metre mark she had dead aim on Art House, with **Harper** (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) also rallying strongly on her outside.

Rouge Eveil (Jpn) (Just A Way (Jpn)) also flashed home strongly up the inside as the wire neared. At the line it was Brede Weg by three-quarters of a length over Rouge Eveil, who was a neck to the good of Harper. Geraldina's run flattened late and she ran on to be fifth, a half-length behind Lilac (Jpn) (Orfevre {Jpn}).

"I was a bit worried about the soft ground but it was no problem for her," said pilot Christophe Lemaire. "We couldn't break well but were able to travel in good position behind Harper. She was calm, responded well throughout the race and pulled away strongly with her explosive kick."

Second on debut last August, she graduated by six lengths at Tokyo in February and added another victory, this time over 2000 metres, at that venue in June. Brede Weg was runner-up in the G2 Rose S. at Hanshin in September.

Pedigree Notes

Brede Weg is the 46th stakes winner and 32nd group winner for her sire, who stands at Shadai Stallion Station. She is also his ninth top-level scorer and one of four Group 1 winners by the son of King Kamehameha (Jpn) out of mares by Sunday Silence or one of his sons.

Inner Urge missed to Lord Kanaloa for 2021, but currently has a Saturnalia (Jpn) yearling filly and foaled a colt by Harbinger this term. Inner Urge is also a full-sister to the Japanese Champion 3-Year-Old Filly Mikki Queen (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), who won both the G1 Yushun Himba and G1 Shuka Sho.

The winner's second dam is the well-traveled Musical Way (Fr) (Gold Away {Ire}), who won a brace of French group races and was also placed in two editions of the G1 Premio Lydia Tesio as well as the 2007 G1 Hong Kong Cup. Musical Way brought 300,000gns from Katsumi Yoshida out of the Tattersalls December Mares Sale in 2008.

An increase of 189 offerings year on year has ensured that the 2024 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale will be the biggest in the auction house's history.

With the catalogue featuring half or full relations to the likes of Griff (Trapeze Artist), Attrition (Churchill {Ire}) and Imperatriz (I Am Invincible), all of whom have won Group 1 races in the past month, there is plenty for buyers to get excited about this year.

No less than 20 yearlings fetched seven-figure sums in 2023, spearheaded by the auction-record \$2.7 million spent by Coolmore's Tom Magnier to secure the first foal out of the multiple Group 2-winning juvenile Anaheed (Fastnet Rock).

With a record 1020 lots in Book 1 for 2024, Barry Bowditch is hopeful that there will be plenty more fireworks at this year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, especially in light of the recent slew of major race wins from past graduates.

"We have been overwhelmed with support, which I guess is off the back of some outstanding results out of the sale for vendors in recent years," Bowditch told *TTR AusNZ*. "We have an extraordinary line of graduates at the moment, you've only got to look at Imperatriz, Militarize, Ozzmosis, In Secret. These are some of Australia's most elite racehorses, and the sale that is consistently providing stars on the racetrack more than any other in our part of the world is the January sale."

"This year, to be able to have a bigger Book 1 than ever and a huge increase in Book 2 numbers as well, is a reflection of where the vendors think they have been getting rewarded in the sales ring. "It'll be our job now that they have promised us more horses to ensure we have a buying bench that credits the horses they have given us to sell."

Jewels In The Crown

Bowditch was at pains to single out any particular yearling from the vast array of regally bred offerings, which is understandable given the depth of quality set to go under the hammer during the seven days of selling on the Gold Coast.

Just some of the many standouts from a pedigree perspective include the first foal out of \$3.2 million broodmare purchase Arcadia Queen (Pierro), a colt by reigning Champion Sire I Am Invincible, who will be offered by Arrowfield Stud as Lot 442. Another multiple Group 1-winning mare set to have her first foal pass through the ring is Avantage (Fastnet Rock), whose filly by Wootton Bassett (GB) will be offered shortly after by Coolmore as Lot 454.

The full siblings to Group 1 winners will be spearheaded by the sister to this year's G1 Lightning S. heroine Coolangatta (Written Tycoon), who will be offered as Lot 47 by Milburn Creek, and the sister to fellow multiple Group 1-winning mare In Secret (I Am Invincible), who will be offered by Segenhoe Stud as Lot 623. Other highlights among Segenhoe's star-studded draft, which produced last year's \$2.7 million sale-topper, include the three-quarter brother to dual Group 1-winning 2-year-old and now Coolmore stallion King's Legacy, who has 43 of his first-crop yearlings catalogued for sale, the most of any freshman sire.

For those looking to secure some of the more precocious offerings on the Gold Coast, the half-sister to Espionage (Zoustar) and the half-brother to Bodyguard (I Am Invincible), both of whom were purchased for seven figures by James Harron at last year's sale and have already won 2-year-old stakes races this season, are sure to prove popular.

The half-sister to Espionage is by Snitzel and will be offered for sale as Lot 786 by Baramul Stud, while the half-brother to Bodyguard is by Capitalist and will be offered by Emirates Park as Lot 316.

There will also be half-relations to some of the stars of this year's spring in the shape of Saturday's G1 Darley Champions Sprint heroine Imperatriz (I Am Invincible), The Everest winner Think About It (So You Think {NZ}) and G1 Caulfield Guineas hero Griff (Trapeze Artist).

Those with arguably the most global appeal include the half-sister to Hong Kong Champion Golden Sixty (Medaglia D'Oro {USA}) and the half-brother to this year's dual-Group 1 winner in Europe Warm Heart (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)), the latter of which will be the first foal out of three-time Group 1 heroine Sea Siren (Fastnet Rock) to be offered for sale in Australia.

Other lots sure to command plenty of interest include the Extreme Choice half-sister to King's Gambit (I Am Invincible), who remains one of the most exciting young sprinters in Australia, and the three-quarter brother to star sprinter Sunlight (Zoustar), whose family has lit up the Magic Millions auditorium on several occasions in the past few years. They will be offered as Lots 256 and 181 by Newgate and Emirates Park respectively.

No Place Like The Coast

"This is our grand final for Magic Millions," Bowditch said. "We're excited to get our vendors and buyers to the Gold Coast and provide them with a great market to sell and buy upon, and to do it in such a beautiful place as the Gold Coast, where we're going to have a lot of fun along the way, is very exciting."

"The quality of the horse we get here sets the tone, the race series is a huge component and then there is the depth and diversity--there is no sale that has that depth like the January catalogue. To be able to provide all of that, in one of the most beautiful places in the world, the Gold Coast, is what I'm most excited about."

"There is just so much incentive around this sale, and I feel anyone that's in this game, whether you have got a big budget or a small budget, you just have to be there."

Selling at the 2024 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale will commence at 11am AEST on Tuesday, Jan. 9 and will continue through to the final Book 1 session on Saturday Jan. 13, which will remain in its traditional evening slot after the running of the lucrative \$14.25 million Magic Millions Raceday at the Gold Coast Turf Club. Book 2 will then be held on Monday Jan., 15 and Tuesday Jan. 16 following a designated day of inspections on Sunday, Jan. 14.

The CBS news program "60 Minutes," which aired Sunday evening included a segment that covered horse racing's worst problems, horses breaking down and dying and the use of performance-enhancing drugs on horses. 60 Minutes often reaches as many as 12 million viewers. The segment was hosted by correspondent Cecilia Vega.

Though the program gave ample time to Jockey Club Chairman Stuart Janney III, Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority CEO Lisa Lazarus, Meadowlands owner Jeff Gural, and others who have been working to solve the problems, it left no doubt that the sport has pressing issues that if left unsolved threaten its existence.

"Horse racing has reached its moment of reckoning and we wanted to know, `can the sport really be reformed or is it too late?'" Vega said.

What followed was a recantation of the rash of fatalities that surrounded the GI Kentucky Derby and other major events, which included graphic footage of horses dying on the track.

"People who are not in your world see this headline of more than a dozen dead horses and they think, `what is going on in that industry?'" Vega asked Lazarus. **Cont. Pg. 3**

BOOK 3 CONCLUDES WITH NUMBERS DOWN AT KEENELAND NOVEMBER

LEXINGTON, KY - The two-session Book 3 section of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock sale concluded Sunday evening with figures well off the corresponding section from the 2022 auction. During sessions at Keeneland Saturday and Sunday, 494 horses grossed \$30,888,000 for an average of \$62,526 and a median of \$50,000. The average is down 22.1% from the 2022 Book 3, while the median declined 16.7%. There were 15 horses to sell for \$200,000 or over during the two sessions, down from 25 a year ago.

"It is quiet," Sarah Sutherland of Indian Creek said of the market Sunday at Keeneland. "But I don't think it's unfair. Obviously, we are seeing a little bit of a correction, but I think if you are willing to accept that and adjust how you're valuing horses, there are plenty of people here to buy them and you can get them sold." **Cont. Pg. 4**

"My response is that HISA is here now and we're going to address it," she said.

She continued: "There's clearly a problem that needs to be addressed and now we have some tools to fight it. We really owe it to those trainers who have spent their lives in this sport who have an incredible amount of integrity to get rid of those who tarnish this sport."

It was not hard to get industry leaders to admit that doping is a major issue that has yet to be brought under control.

"(Doping) is a big problem," Janney said. "It strikes at the integrity of the sport. There's nothing about it that is acceptable."

Asked how the sport can clean itself up, Janney replied: "You put people away. You send them out of the sport and some of them go to jail."

That very process began in March of 2020 when more than 33 veterinarians, trainers and drug distributors were charged by the Justice Department for using and manufacturing performance-enhancing drugs.

"The FBI said this led to broken legs, cardiac issues and in some cases death," Vega said.

The show played wiretaps of conversations between convicted trainer Jorge Navarro and a another trainer in which Navarro bragged about how the drugs he was using made his horses run faster.


"I (expletive) gave it to this horse and this horse (expletive) galloped. He galloped," Navarro said to the unidentified trainer. "Amino acids?" the other trainer asked.

"Yeah, some amino acid injectable. Small bottle," Navarro replied.

They also played wiretaps from harness trainer Nick Surick in which he spoke of how he was put in charge of disposing of horses that Navarro had killed.

The FBI was assisted by 5 Stones Intelligence, which was hired by The Jockey Club and Meadowlands owner Jeff Gural. Janney said 5 Stones was told to not be afraid to go after the biggest names in the sport, like Navarro and Servis.

"I said I'm not interested in you going in an finding a relatively unimportant person working in someone's barn who has made a bet they shouldn't have made or has done something immaterial to what we're talking about," he said. "I want you to go after the important people that I think are corrupting the sport."

Before they were arrested, Servis and Navarro were clearly worried they could be caught and that the penalties could ruin their careers. A wiretap caught them saying the following:

Servis: We can't do it in broad daylight, we got to do it like..." Navarro: "I know. I'll keep it at my...I'll keep...I'll keep it in my car. I ain't worried about that."

Servis: What about, what I am–I don't want people to see that (expletive). We are dead. We are dead."

Shaun Richards, who was the lead FBI agent on the case that nabbed Navarro, Jason Servis and others, spoke a hopeful note, that the progress made with the arrests has put investigators, HISA and others on the right trail.

"We're right where we need to be," he said. "We have a really good subject identified and we are getting fantastic evidence."

Vega asked Lazarus "How long will it take to clean this up?"

"It will probably take years to be truly confident that we've got a fully clean sport," she said.

"Obviously, the top is the top and it's always strong, but we've been very realistic with our reserves and we've had no trouble selling horses."

Indian Creek sold the top-priced weanling of Sunday's session when a colt by Maxfield sold for \$240,000 to Avocet Bloodstock. KatieRich Farms was responsible for the session's top mare when Dixiana Farms paid \$270,000 for **Taking Aim** (Trappe Shot).

Taylor Made Sales Agency was the leading consignor at Sunday's session and continued to lead through five sessions of the auction with 148 head sold for \$20,714,500.

"I've read a lot in the press--and it's fact--that the mares are down and the buy-back rate has been up," said Taylor Made's Mark Taylor. "But just on the days that I've been selling, like today and the second day of Book 2, I actually thought the market was pretty fair. If you bring up anything with any quality-we just sold a mare for \$250,000--there is money there."

During Saturday's session of the November sale, Peter O'Callaghan, annually a major buyer of weanlings, lamented a lack of quality foals on offer at the auction.

"I do agree with what Peter O'Callaghan was saying, that, for us internally, we had fewer foals," Taylor said. "I think there are fewer really high-quality foals on offer and a lot of the pinhookers that are here want quality. So if you are trying to get a \$20,000 foal moved, there doesn't seem to be a big crowd around looking for it. Now, if you have one that is a legitimate \$150,000 foal, everybody is gonig to follow it up and you might get \$225,000."

Taylor said he saw some evidence that breeders are holding on to their best foals while hoping for a home run at the yearling sales next fall.

"The market is polarized at the yearling sales also," Taylor said. "So you might get \$750,000 for a [yearling] that you have raised for \$350,000 before the sale. A lot of these breeders don't want to give up that opportunity. So they are keeping the one that they can sell next year for all the money and they are going to move along some of the ones that they know there is no huge home run on the end of it. They would rather cull those out and cut expenses and keep those gold nuggets hoping to cash them in next September or at Saratoga or wherever it is."

Taylor continued, "At the beginning of the day in session 2.2, a lot people were saying the sky is falling. There is definitely an adjustment going on cheaper mares, but I think the market for anything with quality is actually pretty solid."

The Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale continues through Thursday with sessions beginning daily at 10 a.m.

Dixiana Aims True at Keeneland Sunday

Taking Aim (Trappe Shot) (hip 1735), a half-sister to GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile winner Tapizar (Tapit), will be relocating from Larry Doyle's KatieRich Farms to Dixiana Farms after selling for \$270,000 Sunday at Keeneland.

"She looked like a nice mare," said Dixiana Farm Manager Robert Tillyer. "She produced a graded-stakes placed horse and it's a nice family, so we took a shot with her." **Cont.**

KatieRich purchased the mare for \$200,000 at the 2019 Fasig-Tipton February sale. Her first foal, the now-3-year-old Taking Candy (Twirling Candy), won the GII Saranac S. this year. She also has 2-year-old filly by Into Mischief, Rascality, who sold for \$190,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton October Sale. The mare sold Sunday in foal to sprint champion Jackie's Warrior.

"I think she might have been a diamond in the rough here," said KatieRich manager George Barnes. "We thought she had a lot of quality and she might stand out here pretty well in Book 3, which proved to be the case. She has a lot of upside. Her first foal is graded-stakes placed and still has his 4-year-old year ahead of him. We've only gotten later foals--two May foals and an April foal--out of her, so I think if the buyers get an early foal out of her, they will do very well commercially."

KatieRich, which is currently home to some 26 mares, is in the midst of a reduction, according to Barnes.

"Everybody asks why we are selling her and it's just a reduction and trying to get income into the farm," he said. "We've slowly been reducing over the last couple of years, so we will plan to foal out 26 mares next year."

Rock Ridge Thoroughbreds Charms Them

The Guffey family's Rock Ridge Thoroughbreds, which sold Holiday Soiree (Harlan's Holiday) (hip 23), the dam of recent GII Raven Run S. winner Vahva (Gun Runner) for \$300,000 during Book 1, restocked Sunday at Keeneland, going to \$250,000 to acquire **Charmingly** (Curlin) (hip 1845) from the Taylor Made Sales Agency consignment.


Out of Goldfield (Yes It's True), the unraced 3-year-old is a half-sister to Grade I winner Complexity (Maclean's Music) and a full-sister to graded winner Valadorna (Curlin). She sold in foal to Maclean's Music.

"She is bred on a similar cross to Complexity and she is a full-sister to that great Curlin mare," Codee Guffey said of the mare's appeal.

The family also purchased **Arrifana** (Curlin) (hip 183) for \$450,000 Wednesday at Keeneland and came back later in Sunday's session to acquire **Easy on the Sugar** (Frosted) (hip 1888) for \$155,000.

While the operation parted with Holiday Soiree, it is taking home **Lemon Belle** (Lemon Drop Kid) (hip 249), the dam of GIII Gotham S. winner Raise Cain (Violence), who RNA'd for \$485,000 Wednesday.

"We keep 15 mares, that's kind of the number that we want," Guffey said.



"We are trying to keep a boutique broodmare band."

Of the market, Guffey said, "I think for the better mares, you are having to step up and pay for them. But there is not a lot of middle. It seems like the top end does really well and that's all there is."

Maxfield Colt in Demand at Keeneland

A colt from the first crop of Maxfield (hip 1528) went to the front of the weanling class at Keeneland Sunday when selling for \$240,000 to Bill Betz's Avocet Bloodstock. Bred by Bob Edwards's Fifth Avenue Bloodstock, the weanling is out of In It for the Gold (Speightstown), who is a daughter of Grade I placed All Due Respect (Value Plus). He was consigned by Indian Creek.

"That was fantastic," Indian Creek's Sarah Sutherland said of the result. "We knew coming over that he was one of the better foals that we had in on the day. We've loved him from the very beginning on the farm. I think the Maxfield cross with the Speightstown mare worked really, really beautifully. He had a lovely way about him and great balance. And his movement was really effortless. I think all of the activity at the barn was evidenced in the result."

Winner of the 2021 GI Clark S., Maxfield stands at Darley for \$35,000. In addition to hip 1528, he was also represented at Keeneland this week by a \$300,000 colt (hip 724).

The stallion has had six sell at Keeneland for an average of \$164,500.

Of the weanlings she has seen from Maxfield's first crop, Sutherland said, "We have a handful of the Maxfields at home. And we like them a lot. He's done well with mares that we bred where we had to stretch them out and get a little bit of scope and leg. Hopefully, we have more results like this when we bring them to the market next year."

DuBois on the Board at Keeneland

French bloodstock agent Louis DuBois has been scouring the grounds at Keeneland this week searching for precocious-looking weanlings for trainer Wesley Ward. DuBois was outbid

on a Curlin colt (hip 233) earlier in the week, but got his weanling Sunday when bidding \$200,000 to secure a colt by McKinzie (hip

1738) from the Gainesway consignment.

"I've been working with Wesley for a while now at the sales,"
DuBois said. "I've been looking at all the horses on the grounds-mainly the foals. I am looking at the pedigrees and the physicals that [Ward] is looking for-early and speedy looking to make them an early 2-year-old. So I've been looking at a lot of them."

DuBois, who was supporting Ward at the European yearling sales over the summer, admitted the team just missed out on its favorite weanling of the November sale.

"I sent [Ward] a short list--a very short list--every day," DuBois

said. "Our favorite of the sale so far was the Curlin colt who sold for \$600,000. Our last bid was \$500,000, but we had to let him go. Our second favorite came up today, the beautiful McKinzie colt from Gainesway. He was an outstanding-looking horse. He

had a great walk and a great physical. He looks fast. Wesley told me when they look like a yearling, that's a good sign. So he was exactly what we were looking for. I knew when I showed him to Wesley, that we would not leave the sale without him. I am very happy that we secured him."

Born into a racing family, horses have taken DuBois around the world.

"My family have been closely involved in racing as owners or trainers," DuBois said. "My dad is a blacksmith, so all my life I've

been around horses. I started riding at a young age doing all kind of thing in horses--show jumping--and I quickly turned to Thoroughbreds." **Cont.**



DuBois has worked in the sales industry in New Zealand and spent time in Dubai with trainer Charley Appleby before moving to the U.S. to work with Ward.

The Frenchman will be continuing his search for precociouslooking weanlings at the European sales in the coming weeks.

"Now our eyes are on the catalogues in Europe for the weanlings," he said. "We will go to Tattersalls and Argana and look for a couple to bring back to the U.S."

DuBois plans to spend time in the winter with Ward in Florida. "I will come up for the sales and spend a couple of months in Florida in the winter," DuBois said. "And then wherever [Ward] needs me, mostly in Europe, with the Ascot contenders--fingers crossed. But the sales keep me busy. That's my focus now. So far, Wesley has been very helpful. So thanks to him and let's see how it goes."

- Book 3 concluded with figures well off the 2022 Book 3 section. With 494 horses sold for \$30,888,000, the average was down 22.1% to \$62,526 and the median declined 16.7% to \$50,000.
- Through five sessions, 1,058 horses have sold for \$154,748,000. The average of \$146,265 is down 16.54% from the same point at last year's sale and the median is \$80,000, down 20%. The cumulative buy-back rate is 27.39%. It was 25.38% a year ago.
- A colt from the first crop of GI Clark S. winner Maxfield was Sunday's top weanling when selling for \$240,000 to Avocet Bloodstock. The colt was consigned by Indian Creek on behalf of Bob Edwards's Fifth Avenue Bloodstock.
- Dixiana Farms acquired Sunday's top-priced mare when going to \$270,000 to acquire Taking Aim (Trappe Shot) from Larry Doyle's KatieRich Farms. The mare, in foal to Jackie's Warrior, is a half-sister to GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile winner Tapizar (Tapit).
- Taylor Made Sales Agency continues to lead all consignors at the November sale, with 148 head sold for \$20,714,500.

BAFFERT 2-YEAR-OLD HORSEPOWER EVIDENT ON DEL MAR OPENING WEEKEND

The Week in Review by T.D. Thornton

Trainer Bob Baffert went 0-for-9 in Breeders' Cup races, and four months ago he received his dis-invitation to the 150th GI Kentucky Derby in the form of an extension of his original two-year suspension from properties owned by the gaming company Churchill Downs, Inc. (CDI).

But neither the Breeders' Cup blanking nor the Derby banishment should be taken as indications that the Hall-of-Fame conditioner is running low on horsepower, particularly in the 2-year-old division.

A pair of Baffert juveniles on the first two days of the Del Mar meeting this past weekend underscored that his stable will continue to churn out a deep rotation of Triple Crown aspirants, although it remains to be seen how they might arrive at the first of the spring Classics, whether in the form of a switch to another conditioner, or under Baffert's own name if and when another court fight against CDI materializes.

Second-time starter **Coach Prime** (Quality Road) caught the eye and earned '**TDN Rising Star**' status with a 7 1/4-length blowout victory over a mile Nov. 10. The \$1.7-million KEESEP colt for Zedan Racing Stables was pinballed at the break from post nine, but the 7-5 favorite settled into a comfortable midpack stalking spot while three wide through the clubhouse turn behind quick opening fractions of :21.44 and :44.94.

Flavien Prat guided Coach Prime to within two lengths of the lead while on the inside a half-mile from home, and the colt continued "on hold" while waiting for running room as multiple pace-pressers took turns chipping at the lead. He shifted out to the three path at the quarter pole, just before a wall of four at the front split into two turning for home, and Coach Prime sliced on through between them while still in hand.

Beyond a single crack of the crop after cresting the eighth pole unopposed, Prat largely hand-rode Coach Prime through the final furlong. The 1:37.18 final clocking and low-looking 75 Beyer Speed Figure can be chalked up as artifacts of this colt not nearing full extension and being geared down in the late stages.

Stablemate **Pilot Commander** (Justify), a \$145,000 KEEJAN RNA and a \$700,000 OBSMAR buy for CSLR Racing Partners, impressed with a debut six-furlong win at 13-10 odds under Juan Hernandez the following afternoon.

This Baffert trainee shot straight to the front, conceded the lead to an inside challenger a half-mile out, reclaimed it with ease a furlong later, edged away at the top of the stretch, and successfully repulsed a challenge from the third-favorite in the betting while building his winning margin to 2 1/4 lengths in 1:09.82. Pilot Commander's Beyer fig was not yet available at deadline for this column.

Juvy Jock Streak Stopped At 13...

The target at the top of the totem pole for the 2024 Derby, is, of course, 'TDN Rising Star' Fierceness (City of Light), who trounced the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile field by 6 1/4 lengths en route to a 105 Beyer victory.

In the six months between now and the first Saturday in May, prepare to be frequently reminded how poor a metric winning the 1 1/16-miles championship race for 2-year-olds is in predicting prowess at age three going 10 furlongs.

Since the advent of the Breeders' Cup in 1984, Juvenile winners have accounted for only two Kentucky Derby wins from 39 runnings (Street Sense in 2007 and Nyquist in 2016).

Second- and third-place Juvenile horses don't fare much better. Those 78 horses have produced just two Derby victories, by **Alysheba** (third in the 1986 Juvenile) and **Spend A Buck** (third in the 1984 Juvenile).

Oddly enough, another "drought" type of streak in the Juvenile--this one relating to jockeys--was snapped when John Velazquez scored aboard Fierceness in this year's edition.

Dating to 2010, when Velazquez last won the Juvenile aboard Uncle Mo, 13 different riders had taken turns winning the championship dirt race for 2-year-old males. Of all the Breeders' Cup races, that was the longest such active streak of different jockeys winning without a rider repeating in the sequence.

You'd have to be a true trivia wizard to recount the complete list from memory. Following Velazquez in 2010, the winning Juvenile jockeys were, in order, Ramon Dominguez, Rosie Napravnik, Martin Garcia, Kent Desormeaux, Mario Gutierrez, Julien Leparoux, Jose Ortiz, Joel Rosario, Flavien Prat, Luis Saez, Mike Smith and Irad Ortiz, Jr.

Bravo Homecoming

Joe Bravo has switched his tack back to Florida after being based in Southern California the past several seasons. It's a homecoming in terms of where the 52-year-old veteran first started riding (at Calder Race Course in 1988), and also in terms of the house Bravo owns in Ft. Lauderdale.

"I loved racing in California," Bravo told the Del Mar notes team. "I was really grateful to be around some good people, but I just got a little homesick and wanted to come back and be closer to my family."

After stints at Calder and Philadelphia Park, Bravo made his mark for 30-plus years as "Jersey Joe," dominating the standings at Monmouth Park and the Meadowlands. He generally rode at Gulfstream Park during the winter months when New Jersey racing went dark for the season.

"I've been away from family and friends I grew up with my whole life and that was behind the decision as a whole," Bravo said. "I just hope everyone understands it's more of a personal than a business decision. I might regret it. I might be thankful."

That "Whatever will be, will be," attitude was evident--quite literally--in Bravo's second mount back at Gulfstream.

That's because Bravo won the third race Sunday aboard **Whateverwilbewilbe** (Tapiture), a second-time starter who paid \$13.80 to win.

R CALLI KIM STAYS PERFECT ON THE YEAR WITH EASY WIN IN LONG ISLAND S.

Coming into Sunday's GIII Long Island S. on a three-race winning streak, **R Calli Kim** (Revolutionary) looked to make it four-for-four in 2023 since returning off a year layoff earlier this summer.

A winner over distances only up to a mile earlier in her career, the now 6-year-old mare showed promise when stretching out in late Spring 2022, taking a 1 1/4-mile off-the-turf race at Churchill in May and coming in third at Belmont over 1 3/8 miles before going to the sidelines. Laid up until July of this year and now racing out of trainer Brendan Walsh's barn, R Calli Kim returned a winner in the \$32,000 claimer at Saratoga July 23 and has only upped the ante in each start since. An allowance winner at both Kentucky Downs and Keeneland to begin the Fall, she looked to add graded-stakes success to her resume Sunday.

A touch slow from the gate as a wall of horses closed in ahead of her, R Calli Kim under Jose Ortiz was guided down to the rail in near-last position as the field stacked up into the first of three turns. Paced up front by Whatlovelookslike (English Channel) and Vergara (Noble Mission {GB}), the seven runners took their time past the wire the first time by as the opening half went in :49.12. Racing alone near the back, the 6-5 favorite began to improve her position as the runners in front of her slowed up the backstretch. She came three wide with Vergara now alone on the lead but needed running room as she was caught back down inside of runners turning past the quarter pole. Vergara, now re-engaged with Whatlovelookslike at the top of the lane, kicked on but R Calli Kim found a seam outside the furlong pole and showed an impressive turn of foot late to inhale the leading group with a sixteenth to run and sprint right on by despite lugging in and switching back to her left lead. Rhombique (Ghostzapper) outran her 41-1 odds to chase the winner in second but R Calli Kim was long gone and won going away.

"She's really exceeded expectations this year," said winning trainer Brendan Walsh. "We had to stop on her last year. We weren't sure where she was going to go from there, but she came back and has gone from strength to strength through the year. To win a Grade III like she did today--if you had told me six months ago she was going to do that, I'd have told you that you were absolutely crazy. But she's gotten better and better as the year has gone on and my hat's off to her."

Pedigree Note:

Keeping it in the family, R Calli Kim is a half-sister to last year's GIII Long Island S. winner and \$600,000 KEENOV broodmare purchase Temple City Terror (Temple City). The dam, a producer of four winners from as many foals, has not reported any offspring since the now 5-year-old Silent Steve (Dominus). Sire Revolutionary, who stood at Kentucky's WinStar Farm before being exported to Korea in 2019, now has a fourth stakes winner to his credit while broodmare sire More Than Ready has now sired the dams of 165 stakes winner around the world.

"I just want to go because I've never gone out of California," Cedillo says. "I'm still young so I don't want to wait until I'm too old to make the move. I'll take my chance right now."

Cedillo, who has captured riding titles at Golden Gate, Santa Anita and Del Mar, returned to racing after a riding accident sidelined him early during this summer's Del Mar meet. He suffered a broken bone in his neck and was sidelined for the remainder of the meet. He avoided having surgery and instead went through a rigorous rehab.

"It took six weeks," Cedillo says. "I was working out in the gym by myself and doing my routine. Sometimes in the morning I get up and I'm a little sore. But soon as I start working I feel better. I feel a hundred percent now."


TAA HOSTS SECOND ANNUAL HOLIDAY GIVING **CAMPAIGN**





NASH POWERS TO TDN RISING STARDOM

AT CHURCHILL by Christina Bossinakis



Nash becomes a TDN Rising Star at Churchill Sunday | Coady

While there may have been a few unanswered questions heading into Sunday's seventh race at Churchill Downs, there seemed to be none afterward. Installed the second betting choice behind the 7-5 choice, GISP **Be You** (Curlin), **Nash** (Medaglia d'Oro) completely dismantled his competition with seemingly little effort, cruising home an eye-catching 10 1/4-length winner while stamping himself a TDN Rising Star in the process.

Sent screaming to the front in the blink of an eye, the 9-5 chance cut out an opening quarter in :23.83 and a half in :47.93. Still moving powerfully through the quarter pole, the Godolphin homebred was cut loose in the stretch, and flew down the lane in complete command, winning by a gaudy margin while well in hand under Florent Geroux. Longshot Justifreak (Justify) was second, while Resilience (Into Mischief) rounded out the trifecta. The favorite came home fifth.

Sent off the 8-5 choice in his career debut at Keeneland Oct. 7, Nash came home fifth behind 5-1 chance Booth (Mitole) in the six furlong event. He had been working steadily over this surface, including a pair of :49 flat moves Oct. 28 (40/95) and Nov. 4 (41/96).

Out of three-time graded winner Sara Louise, the winner is a half to Sara Street (Street Sense), GSP, \$216,100. Sara Louise is also responsible for Mrs. Hudson (Street Cry {Ire}), dam of SW Airosa (Uncle Mo) and Coronation Street (Street Cry), dam of GSW Kalik (Collected). Subsequent to Sunday's Rising Star, the mare produced a colt by Street Sense in 2022 and was bred back to Nyquist this season.

Already a two-time stakes winner over this turf course, Big Everest added his third black-type score in New York--his fourth overall--with a come-from-behind victory in the Artie Schiller S. at Aqueduct Sunday.

Masen went to the front from Post 8, leading through opening fractions of :23.22 and :47.53 while Big Everest bided his time in a rail-skimming third with Exact Estimate and St Anthony (Noble Mission {GB}) in pursuit just to his outside. With Exact Estimate starting to turn the screws on the frontrunner, and St Anthony beginning his retreat turning for home, Big Everest found the daylight he so desperately need in early stretch, wore down Masen in the final sixteenth and had enough in the tank to hold off Exact Estimate by 3/4 of a length. It was another 3/4 of a length back to Masen, who nosed out the late-running Pioneering Spirit (American Pharoah).

"In the paddock, I told [winning rider] Joel [Rosario], 'If they leave you alone, great. If they take you on, it's OK,'" trainer Christophe Clement said. "He's been on the lead but it's not like he has to be on the lead. If you look back at the races where he was on the lead, he was never going that fast. But if there's no pace, he's a perfect horse to dictate his own pace. He's a touch strong and Joel gave a great ride."

Big Everest kicked off a four-race winning skein in an optional claimer at the Belmont at the Big A meet in 2022 before adding a score in this event last November. Back on top in the Danger's Hour S. in his seasonal return at this venue, the gelding added a win in Monmouth's Cliffhanger S. in May before coming home fifth in the GIII Kelso S. at Saratoga July 15. Returned to Monmouth for the Aug. 13 Oceanport S. for his latest, the 5-year-old tired late to be fourth behind Highest distinction (Point of Entry), who returned two win his next two, including the GIII Baltimore/Washington International Turf Cup S. In regard to a possible next start, Clement added, "I spoke to Joel about it and a mile and an eighth is really pushing it. I wish there was a nice mile race somewhere, but I haven't found it so far.
