# ALMANZOR COLT THE STAR OF THE SHOW AT ARQANA NOVEMBER

Mandore International Agency only purchased one yearling at the Arqana November Yearling Sale on Saturday, but they made it count, selecting the day's top lot, a colt by Group 1 sire Almanzor (Fr) for  $\leqslant$ 85,000.

Sold as lot 186 and already named **Override (Fr)** to Mandore International's Nicolas de Watrigant, the Haras des Capucinesconsigned bay is out of Zarza (Fr) (Charm Spirit {Ire}), herself a half-sister to His Highness The Aga Khan's undefeated Arc heroine and top-level producer Zarkava (Ire) (Zamindar).

"He's a lovely colt," said the agent. "He walks well and has a very good temperament. He's a son of Almanzor from the great family of Zarkava and Zarak (Fr)."

Lot 132, **Galicove (Fr)** (Galiway {GB}), caught the eye of Witold Miedzianowski at €40,000. The filly is out of the multiple stakes-placed Hidden Cove (Ire) (Nayef) from the Haras de l'Hotellerie draft.

Two other yearlings brought €20,000 or higher on the day—one of them was another Capucines draftmate, a filly by Sottsass (Fr) (lot 162) from the family of young sire City Light (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}), was knocked down to Hyde Park Stud for €25,000. Cont. p6

#### First-Season Sires At The Foal Sales Cont. from p1

The best part of the whole thing is you get to put your money where your mouth is and there will be countless men and women hoping to be handsomely rewarded by their opinions on the matter at the Goffs November Foal Sale next week.

Be it sniffing out a bargain to try and offer for resale next year or breeding to what you hope could be the next Mehmas (Ire) or Blue Point (Ire), the opportunities are there.

It might seem as though it wasn't long ago that A'Ali (Ire) was scorching to Norfolk S. glory or that St Mark's Basilica (Fr) swept all before him in a spellbinding three-year-old campaign, but both stallions feature among a list of 13 who have their foals going under the hammer this winter.

Space Blues (Ire) is bound to be one of the most popular of the youngsters with progeny on offer next week. Blue Point lived up to his billing as a potentially explosive first-season sire by how well his progeny performed on the track this year and things could get even better for the Darley roster with yearlings by Pinatubo (Ire), Earthlight (Ire) and Ghaiyyath (Ire) going down a bomb at the sales.

This wonderful production line, which is becoming the envy of many of the top independent stallion farms across Europe, isn't showing any signs of slowing down with triple Group 1 winner

Space Blues expected to be well-received by the market at Goffs next week.

Darley's nominations manager Eamon Moloney commented, "We're pinching ourselves. These are homebreds coming through the system who have started off life at either Dalham Hall or Kildangan. They have made their way through the racing operation and then it has come full circle and now they're in the stallion yard. It makes it all extra special."

He added, "We're looking forward to seeing what Space Blues can do. I haven't heard anybody say anything negative about them, which is extraordinary. Everyone knows you get a mixture of foals but, no matter who we speak to, all they keep telling us is how delighted they are with their Space Blues foals. Without much help, he has advertised his abilities as a stallion and has done a lot of his own legwork.

"He's a racier version of Dubawi (Ire). We were a little bit concerned that he might get more feminine foals but people counteracted that with the mares they sent him. I haven't heard a single person say 'my Space Blues is too small' and I think Noverre has had a good say in that. I wouldn't be surprised if they look a bit more sharp than your typical Dubawi. We've seen plenty of sharp Dubawis but these are going to be sharp. I've seen plenty and I feel people will perceive them to be early."

At the opposite end of the spectrum, you have a man like Jerry Horan taking his first steps into the stallion game through his

part-ownership of the Capital Stud-based Alkumait (GB). Connections of the Mill Reef winner got the mother and father of updates in the spring when Alkumait's half-brother Chaldean (GB) (Frankel (GB)) landed the 2,000 Guineas and they have already enjoyed some promising results with the young sire at the Tattersalls Ireland Sapphire Sale when a foal sold for €22,000. Not bad going for a stallion who stands for just €5,000 and the expectation is that there is more to come next

week.

Horan said, "Alkumait got off to a good start at Tattersalls Ireland on Saturday and there's definitely a better group of foals on offer at Goffs so we're excited. When the Capital Stud lads bought Alkumait, they asked me if I fancied getting involved in the horse, and it's always been something I have loved the idea of. I jumped at the opportunity. That was two years ago now and, while I was pretty green about the whole thing at the start,

> it's been great to learn about a whole different side of the game in terms of marketing a stallion and attracting mares for covering."

> He added, "It's all about getting in on a small share and trying to give the stallion a chance. The way the Capital lads have approached it is, the more people they can get into the stallion the better because it gives the horse a proper chance. There are so many horses retiring to stud, so, to give him the best possible chance, you need to get as many mares into

them as possible. There's no money in stallions unless they click so if everyone rolls in behind a stallion, that's half the battle."

When you hear Tally-Ho Stud and Yeomanstown Stud outlining just how tough it is for independent farms to get their hands on the raw material, it drills home how getting involved in a stallion is not for the faint-hearted. However, anyone who has ever had anything to do with Horan knows that there is not much he wouldn't turn his hand to, and the well-liked 31-year-old explained how Chaldean winning the Guineas provided everyone associated with Alkumait with a helpful shot in the arm.


"That was class," he recalled. "In fairness, Alkumait has a proper stallion's pedigree now and the dam has produced five individual black-type horses and is an up-and-coming blue hen. Alkumait was a very good two-year-old himself and won the Mill Reef in the fastest time ever. You'd like to think he has every chance. He's a good first crop [86] and has an even bigger second crop [121] coming. The foals are speedy-looking types but they have good scope to them. They are all good walkers, which is good to see, and they all have a bit of scope and size—they're not your typical small sprinter."

Tally-Ho Stud's Starman (GB) and Yeomanstown Stud's Supremacy (Ire) will make their respective debuts next week as well. Some of the top consignors in the game–Boherguy Stud, Castlebridge, the Irish National Stud and Baroda Stud--feature among those offering the 52 foals by the July Cup winner Starman, with Tally-Ho's Roger O'Callaghan quietly optimistic.

"They all look like himself," O'Callaghan said. "They've got size, scope and action. It's an exciting time of year but every bit of this game is exciting. Going to Royal Ascot with a two-year-old is exciting, so is waiting for a horse to breeze, or for a vet to trot up your horse the morning after the breeze–every aspect of this game has its own story to tell and this is just another part of it all. But you just never know."

He added, "We were here a good few years ago with Bushranger and everyone was delighted but, when they hit the track, one was slower than the next. You just never can tell in this game. Until they hit the track, it's all a bit of a guessing game."

Tally-Ho has managed to add at least one new stallion to the roster each breeding season in recent times, with Group 1 winner Good Guess (GB) the latest addition for 2024, but O'Callaghan revealed that searching for the next Kodiac (GB) or Mehmas does not come cheap.

"There are only so many stallions you can buy nowadays," he said. "It's hard work. And then when you find one, you have to pay for one."

O'Callaghan's thoughts were echoed by cousin Rob O'Callaghan of Yeomanstown Stud. The search for the next Dark Angel (Ire) goes on at Yeomanstown and O'Callaghan shared hopes that Supremacy could prove just the ticket given he boasts a similar profile to the daddy of Yeomanstown.

He said, "The last Middle Park winner we stood was Dark Angel so, if Supremacy could follow in his footsteps it would be great. From what we have seen so far, he is getting nice foals--very strong, good movers and correct. They should go down very well next week at Goffs, hopefully." Cont. p6

He added, "Everyone is very happy and he has gotten a lot of repeat business. He covered over 150 mares this year and that's a great sign. That's how you know you have a stallion who is going down well, when people come back to use the same stallion in year two and three. He's got over 150 in year one and two so he's had a great start."

There are 39 foals by Supremacy on offer at Goffs next week, but as of yet, Yeomanstown hasn't got its hands on a new stallion for next year.

O'Callaghan commented, "It's incredibly hard. Between Juddmonte, Darley and Coolmore, they are retiring the majority of the stallions rather than the independent guys like ourselves. Then, when the few horses who could stand at the independent studs come up for sale, they are extremely hard to buy because the demand is much greater than the supply. You have to be careful though. For the likes of us, who would be supporting a stallion with 30-odd mares in a year, we have to make sure that we definitely want to use the horse.

"Supremacy ticked all the boxes in that he was a Group 1 winner at two and is by a top stallion in Mehmas and is from a very nice family—the family of Harry Angel (Ire), who is doing well as a stallion. You need to have the credentials behind a stallion and he has them."

Other stallions with their first foals on offer at Goffs next week include Japan (GB), Khalifa Sat (Ire), Lope Y Fernandez (Ire), Nando Parrado (GB), Palace Pier (GB), Ubettabelieveit (Ire), Victor Ludorum (GB) and Lucky Vega (Ire).

#### Where Is the Money Going?

So who are you siding with? Space Blues is the obvious one but St Mark's Basilica brings an abundance of class to the table being the highest-rated son of Siyouni (Fr) to have joined the stallion ranks.

Granted nobody in *TDN* towers has had a glimpse of any of these foals, but certainly on paper at least, Space Blues would have to be a leading candidate to have an abundance of earlier and speedier types while St Mark's Basilica is a genuine class act who will be fascinating to follow. If there's one that could surprise a few, how about Lucky Vega being the one to do exactly that? He didn't lack for support in terms of the mares he covered and it looks as though he will have every chance.

#### **Sweet Success For Zelzal Filly**

Madaket Stables, Michael Dubb, Robert LaPenta and Michael Caruso's **Dolce Zel (Fr)** (Zelzal {Fr}) padded her stakes resume with a victory in the Kathryn Crosby S. at Del Mar last Saturday (*video*). The Phil D'Amato trainee was bred by Scuderia Micolo di Nicola Galli and C. SNC.

The winner of both the GIII Florida Oaks and GIII Lake George S. is a daughter of Dolce Attesa (GB) (Dr Fong). She won both of her French starts for Scuderia Micolo SNC and trainers Alessandro and Giuseppe Botti before changing hands and traveling to the U.S. Her winning dam previously foaled the listed winner and multiple group-placed Pure Zen (Fr) (Zoffany {Ire}). The second dam, Lady Gin (Saint Ballado), set a new course record for five furlongs at Hawthorne Park in the Wooden Star S. Lawrence Goichman's Alluring Angel (GB) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) checked another mark in her win column at Aqueduct last weekend for trainer Mike Maker (video). She has been placed in two stakes to date.

The 48,000gns Tattersalls December foal buy for Goichman was bred by Michael Wates, CBE out of the Teofilo (Ire) mare All Of Me (GB), herself a half-sister to G1 Queen Elizabeth S. second I Can Fly (GB) (Fastnet Rock (Aus)). Her latest offspring are a €300,000 Goffs Orby yearling colt named Point Spread (GB) (Earthlight {Ire}) and a weanling filly by Ardad (Ire). Landseer (GB) (Danehill), a winner of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and GI Keeneland Turf Mile, is under the third dam.

Coolmore's Fastnet Rock has 18 winners from 37 runners (48%) to his credit in America. Five of those (13%) have won stakes including GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf heroine Pizza Bianca and GI Man o'War S. victress Zhukova (Ire).

#### **Repeat Winner:**

Big Everest (GB) (The Gurkha {Ire}), who races for Reeves Thoroughbred Racing, Steven Rocco and William Branch, won the Artie Schiller S. at Aqueduct for trainer Christophe Clement last Sunday (video). He was previously featured in April when winning the Danger's Hour S. at that track.



# SWEET SYMPHONY AT TOKYO FOR MAURICE COLT by Heather Anderson

The blaze-faced **Strauss (Jpn)** (Maurice {Jpn}) attained his first stakes victory under Joao Moreira in the G2 Tokyo Hai Nisai S. at Tokyo on Saturday.



A winner on debut over 1600 metres locally in June and a solid third in the G3 Saudi Arabia Royal Cup on Oct. 7, he was sent off at 4-1 in this return to group company. Content to track Teleos Lulu (Jpn) (Al Ain {Jpn}) from a wide third down the backstretch, he was eager to improve his position through the first half-mile in :47.30. Finally settled down under Moreira rounding the bend, Strauss swung off the fence and set sale for the pacesetter with Schwarze Kugel (Jpn) (Kizuna Jpn)) continuing his stalking trip in second. On even terms with a quarter mile remaining, he edged away as Schwarze Kugel tried to match strides. Fervent (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) closed strongly from midpack as well, but it was too little too late. Strauss was 1 1/2 lengths to the good of the persistent Schwarze Kugel in second, with Fervent just a nose back in third. Favoured Forlanini (Jpn) (Epiphaneia {Jpn}) raced near the rear of the field and was never a factor, finishing eighth of 10.

#### **Pedigree Notes**

Now the sire of 23 stakes winners with Strauss's victory, Shadai Stallion Station-based Maurice is responsible for 16 group winners. His best are Group 1 winners Jack d'Or (Jpn), Geraldina (Jpn) and Pixie Knight (Jpn) in Japan, and G1 Australian Derby hero Hitotsu (Aus) and Mazu (Aus), who won the G1 Doomben 10,000 in Australia. # MCDONALD AND WALLER GO BACK-TO-BACK IN THOUSAND GUINEAS

After claiming the G1 Thousand Guineas with Madame Pommery (Aus) (No Nay Never) in 2022, the champion jockey James McDonald and trainer Chris Waller were back in town with the Zoustar (Aus) filly **Joliestar (Aus)**.

The 3-year-old proved too hard to catch with a 1.5l victory over the fellow Sydneysider **Kimochi (Aus)** (Brave Smash {Jpn}), while the favoured Victorian pair of **Skybird (Aus)** (Exosphere {Aus}) and **Coeur Volante (NZ)** (Proisir {Aus}) finished third and fourth respectively.

McDonald told *Racing.com*, "To have these famous silks on [Cambridge Stud] is an added pleasure. I had a really good feeling about the filly today [Saturday].

"She's a good filly and I've felt she's just been building towards something as her run last start was good. We drew a good gate [barrier one] and were able to get a good economical run, in transit, and we were able to produce.

"The barrier played a really important role especially because the circle track has been playing a bit to those on speed. It had us grinning from ear to ear."

Mike Moroney added on the performance of the hot favourite Coeur Volante, "Blake Shinn wasn't disappointed in her performance, but she was under pressure a long way from home, and that's unlike her. Maybe she has just come to the end of her preparation? She's a pretty fragile sort of filly, there's not much off her.

"Considering that she boxed on gallantly to finish fourth, but she'll definitely head to the paddock now."

Joliestar was placed in the Listed Desirable S. at Flemington behind Roll On High (Aus) (Shamus Award {Aus}) and before that was second to the fifth-placed Thousand Guineas runner, Arctic Glamour (Aus) (Frosted) in the Listed Reginald Allen S.

#### **Pedigree Notes**

Joliestar is the 47th stakes winner for her Widden Stud-based sire Zoustar, who also enjoyed his 46th stakes winner in France courtesy of Zoum Zoum (GB). Now a seven-time Group 1-winning sire, Zoustar was also trained by Chris Waller when active, providing a unique connection for the champion trainer.

The filly is the fifth foal from the Fastnet Rock mare Jolie Bay, a full sister to the G1 Coolmore Stud and Royal Ascot hero, Merchant Navy (Aus). Fastnet Rock has sired three winners of the Thousand Guineas. Cont. p16

Jolie Bay and Merchant Navy are progeny from the grand mare Legally Bay (Aus) (Snippets {Aus}), who won the G3 Sweet Embrace S. and the Listed Brian Crowley S. alongside placing in a host of stakes races, including the G1 Oakleigh Plate.

Joliestar was a \$950,000 purchase by Cambridge Stud from the draft of Segenhoe Thoroughbreds at the 2022 Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale. She was bred by Chris and Jane Barham, who have enjoyed continual success with this family, primarily thanks to grandam Legally Bay.

Also dam of the stakes-placed city winners God Of Thunder (Aus) (More Than Ready) and Emperor (Aus) (I Am Invincible {Aus}), Jolie Bay foaled a full-sister to Joliestar in early September.

Slipping to Zoustar the previous season, she has another full sister; the yet-to-race 2-year-old Legacy Bay (Aus), in the Peter Moody and Katherine Coleman stable.

Bred on a 4 X 3 cross of Danehill with a duplication of the wonderful mare Best In Show (Traffic Judge), Joliestar is the sixth Thousand Guineas-winning descendant of the great mare Chelandry (GB) (Goldfinch {GB})--the others being Gallica (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), Serious Speed (Aus) (Royal Academy), Lady Of The Pines (Aus) (Bluebird), Reveille (Aus) (Star Kingdom {Ire}) and Brimses (Aus) (Brimstone {GB}).

And Zoustar is line-bred to Chelandry via strains of Clarion (Fr), Blockbuster (Aus), Magpie (GB) and Heroic (Aus).

# MOLLY BLOOM PREVAILS IN NEW ZEALAND 1000 GUINEAS

The Lance O'Sullivan and Andrew Scott-trained **Molly Bloom** (NZ) descended on her rivals from a long way back in the field, securing a maiden stakes win for her sophomore stallion, Ace High (Aus) in Saturday's G1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas.

Positioned a long way off some of her key rivals when turning into the Riccarton straight, jockey Joe Doyle didn't panic, getting his filly through her gears to take her rivals in the final strides. It was a slashing performance from Molly Bloom, who finished 0.7l off **Impendabelle (Aus)** (Impending {Aus}) in the G2 Soliloquy S. at her last outing. The tables were turned on this occasion, Impendabelle running second from **Tulsi (Aus)** (The Autumn Sun {Aus}) in third.

#### **Pedigree Notes**

A NZ\$150,000 purchase at the 2022 New Zealand Bloodstock Karaka National Yearling Sale, she was sold by Seaton Park to her trainers Lance O'Sullivan and Andrew Scott.

#### G1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas Cont.

The son of High Chaparral (Ire) was an exceptional 3-year-old in Australia, recording victories in the G1 VRC Derby and the G1 Spring Champion S.

Ace High enjoyed a double on Saturday, with his son Leroy Brown (NZ), breaking through at start four for Stephen Ralph at Tauranga. To date Ace High has had six individual winners of seven races from 21 runners. While the filly has been the standout by winning the New Zealand 1000 Guineas and finishing fourth in the G2 TR Soliloquy S. Ace High is standing the 2023 breeding season at a fee of NZ\$10,000 (plus GST).

She is the first foal for the lightly raced Dancilla (NZ) (Iffraaj {GB}) who won a 2000-metre New Plymouth maiden from just seven starts. Her second foal is a full-sister to Molly Bloom but she missed the following season, last year served by Proisir (Aus).

Dancilla is out of the stakes-placed, three-time winner Nordic Dancer (NZ) (Generous {Ire}) who produced another four winners including the dual Group 3 winner Decorah (NZ) (Pins {Aus}).

Nordic Dancer's two-time Moonee Valley-winning dam Danish Habit (Aus) (Danehill) is a half-sister to the wonderful galloper Rough Habit (NZ) (Roughcast) whose 11 Group 1 victories earned him two New Zealand Horse of the Year titles.

His dam Certain Habit (NZ) (Ashabit {GB}) also produced the two-time Group 3 winner Citi Habit (NZ) (Citidancer {Ire}) and the dam of the G1 Livamol Classic winner Addictive Habit (NZ) (Colombia {NZ}) and the G3 Canterbury Gold Cup winner Branson (NZ) (Personal Flag).

Bred on a 4 X 4 cross of Danehill, Molly Bloom also boasts crosses of that stallion's grandam, third dam and fourth dams - Spring Adieu (Buckpasser), Natalma (Native Dancer) and Almahmoud (Mahmoud {Fr}). Heavily favored to run his unbeaten streak to three, West Point Thoroughbreds and Woodford Racing's **Integration** (Quality Road) made his off price of 4-5 look like an early Christmas gift, as he parlayed a perfect trip into a dominating victory in Saturday's \$250,000 GII Hill Prince S. at Aqueduct.

Away without incident from the three hole, the \$700,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga graduate fell into the ideal spot from third, racing in clear air, as 65-1 Laurel Valley (Laoban) set a solid pace in advance of a headstrong Equitize (GB) (Kingman (GB)), the 5-1 second pick making his first start since breaking his maiden in impressive fashion at Tampa in mid-March. Settled well off that leading duo down the backstretch, Integration began to take closer order and edged out into the three path for a clean shot at the leaders around the turn. Three wide on the swing for home, the bay drifted out several paths into the middle of the course, but kicked on decisively to put the Hill Prince well and truly out of reach. The well-backed I'm Very Busy (Cloud Computing) made a middle move passing the halfmile to race inside of thee eventual winner, but was no match late and finished runner-up ahead of Toofareastiswest (Street Sense) in third. According to DRF Formulator, Integration sprinted his final eighth of a mile in a wicked: 10.85.


The Hall of Fame conditioner said the GI Pegasus World Cup Turf in early January is a potential objective.

Integration is one of two winners from two to race from the mare, whose current 2-year-old Catch a Wave (Curlin)--a \$400,000 Keeneland September graduate--is in training at Fair Hill, where he worked three-eighths of a mile in :38.40 earlier Saturday. Behind that is the yearling filly Castanet (Nyquist), a weanling colt by Gun Runner and Harmonize is expecting a foal by Flightline next season.

Given all his success with his dirt runners, it might be easy to overlook the fact that Quality Road has been a sire of high-class turf horses. Four of his 14 elite-level scorers have achieved that designation on the turf: Bleecker Street, Hootenanny--whose dam was by Hennessy--Illuminant and Spring Quality. The likes of Astronaut, Cairo, Cowboy Culture and Lonely are among his additional graded/group winners on the grass.

Al Qahtani continued: "All of the bloodlines here are very prominent so we are here to buy some foals and some mares. We will bring them back to Saudi to race them there. I found very nice quality here--different horses for all different buyers."

Najd Stud purchased 18 horses for a total of \$1.23 million during the breeding stock portion of the sale. In addition to 16 weanlings, the operation bought Ceci Valentina (Prospective), a stakes winner in foal to Jackie's Warrior, for \$115,000 and Join the Dots, a Medaglia d'Oro mare carrying her first foal by Charlatan, for \$65,000.

While Najd Stud was active during Books 1 and 2, they continued their buying spree through the final days of the auction and landed on their most expensive weanling purchase during the sixth session, going to \$155,000 for a May-foaled

Vino Rosso colt out of a daughter of GISP Warbling (Unbridled's Song). The colt was the top-selling weanling of Book 4.

Al Qahtani said he found that the market provided plenty of quality offerings even in the later sessions for those willing to put in the research.

"When you start in Book 1, you see very good pedigrees and good quality," he explained. "Then you start to go back to Book 3 and Book 4, you will find one horse in every hundred horses."

"The one I bought in Book 4 for \$155,000 was a late foal, but he looks like a very good foal--very correct and a good pedigree. You always have to try and keep going until you find the one

you're looking for and I think this is a good market for that."

Najd Stud was also active during Friday's Horses of Racing Age Sale. They purchased Phelpsy, a 3-year-old son of Into Mischief, for \$170,000. The colt out of GSP Secret Someone (A.P. Indy) was a \$1-million Keeneland September yearling and he broke his maiden in his most recent start for Chad Brown on Oct. 15. They also went to \$100,000 for Digitize (Maclean's Music), a 4-year-old gelding out of a half-sister to GISW

operation has plans to start building a foundation in the U.S. as well. He said the goal is to return to Kentucky for next year's Keeneland September Sale and send some purchases to Saudi Arabia, but keep others to race in the U.S.

Prince Faisal has already found success racing here in the U.S. In 2019 he purchased Mucho Gusto (Mucho Macho Man), a four-time graded stakes winner trained by Bob Baffert who ran second in the GI Haskell S. Mucho Gusto won his first start for Prince Faisal in the 2020 GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational S. and went on to finish fourth in the inaugural running of the Saudi Cup.

Winning at Saudi Arabia's marquee race meet, Al Qahtani said, is an ever-present goal for Prince Faisal. Last year Najd

Stud purchased dual Group 1 winner Saffron Beach (Ire) (New Bay {GB}) for 3.6-million guineas at the Tattersalls December Mares Sales with the hopes of sending the filly to the Saudi Cup.



196 days? No problem.

If there was any rust, Hot and Sultry didn't show it. Off since a fourth behind MGISW Matareya (Pioneerof the Nile), MGSW & MGISP Wicked Halo (Gun Runner), and two-time Breeders' Cup winner Goodnight Olive (Ghostzapper) in the GI Derby City Distaff S. May 6 over the same Churchill Downs surface, Hot and Sultry put on a front-running extravaganza Saturday in the GIII Chilukki S.

After breaking from the outside nine hole, Hot and Sultry burst to the lead and never looked back in a sharp effort. Following :23.03 and :45.88 early fractions, she was still several paths wide and in front by daylight. The dark bay shook completely loose on the turn, kept clear of the noses-apart Nostalgic and Oeuvre by eight lengths, and blasted home in a facile victory to crush the field despite a wide trip all the way.

"She broke pretty good and she's a very fast filly," said winning jockey Ricardo Santana, Jr. "We went quick early but she was doing it very easily. She's a very nice filly."

Trainer Norm Casse added: "I was a little worried today. This really wasn't the first plan. We knew going the one-turn mile at

Churchill is always a little more difficult off the layoff. This was a tough race, but it was a little bit of class relief from her last start in the Derby City Distaff."

The Chilukki was Hot and Sultry's first graded score, although she'd won the listed American Beauty S. at Oaklawn in January and was third behind GISWs Clairiere (Curlin) and Secret Oath (Arrogate) in the GI Apple Blossom H. at that same track in April. Casse said the 4-year-old would likely point to the stakes schedule at Oaklawn this winner, as her owners, the Lieblongs, are based in Arkansas.

#### **Pedigree Notes:**

A half to three stakes winners, all with graded black-type wins or placings, Hot and Sultry was a \$475,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase by Alex Lieblong in 2020. Her unraced dam is a granddaughter of the remarkable champion 3-year-old filly Xtra Heat. Known as much for her small size as for her unyielding fight in competition, Xtra Heat won 25 black-type races, including the GI Prioress S., and was runner-up against the boys in the 2001 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint.

A daughter of Darley's inimitable Medaglia d'Oro, Hot and Sultry's dam, Hot Water, has a Feb. 3-foaled weanling filly by Charlatan, who is by Speightstown, the sire of Speightster. Hot Water's juvenile filly, Hot Beach (Omaha Beach), won the Ellis Park Debutante S. this summer and was third in the GIII Pocahontas S. The mare was bred back to Life Is Good for next term. Medaglia d'Oro has 99 stakes winners out of his daughters.

Late stallion Speightster sired Hot and Sultry and 10 other black-type winners. She is the second graded winner for Speightster, who died early in 2022 after a stall accident.

Australian import Flag Of Honour (Aus) settled midpack on the inside in a tightly bunched GII Kennedy Road S. field Saturday at Woodbine as 24-1 Jazz Hands (Square Eddie) led through a :21.73 first quarter. Coming off the turn after a sizzling :43.85 half, Jazz Hands found himself surrounded as Flag Of Honour burst through on the rail and this summer's GI Fourstardave H. third Ice Chocolat (Brz) attacked from the outside. Flag Of Honour had jumped first and held his position by a head at the wire, while GSW & GISP Dream Shake attempted to make it a three-horse race late only to finish 1 3/4 lengths in arrears. MGSW Patches O'Houlihan (Reload), who was trying to make it seven wins in a row, finished well back in fifth.

"I knew everybody would rush out at the beginning," said winning pilot Kazushi Kimura. "It was a great trip. As soon as we made room, he exploded from there."

After five-eighths in :56.25, final time for the six furlongs was 1:08.86. The Kennedy Road was run under lights.

# CHAMPION SPRINTER WORK ALL WEEK PASSES AWAY

Work All Week (City Zip), upset winner of the 2014 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint and that year's champion sprinter, died at Old Friends in Georgetown, Kentucky, Monday, Nov. 13. According to Old Friends equine veterinarian Dr. Bryan Waldridge, the 14-year-old suffered a fatal paddock accident. A full necropsy is pending.

Bred in Illinois by Richard and Karen Papiese's Midwest Thoroughbreds, the likeable chestnut was trained throughout

his career by the late Roger Brueggemann. During the summer of 2013, Work All Week embarked on an eight-race winning streak that included open-company stakes victories in the Hot Springs S. at Oaklawn and in the Iowa Sprint H. at Prairie Meadows. He was upset in an Illinois-bred stakes in the summer of 2014, but bounced back to validate favoritism in the GIII

Phoenix S. at Keeneland ahead of a half-length victory in the Breeders' Cup Sprint at Santa Anita, joining Buck's Boy as the

only Breeders' Cup winners bred in the Land of Lincoln. As a 6year-old in 2015, Work All Week added the Byrd Memorial S. at Mountaineer Park and was third to Runhappy (Super Saver) in defense of his title in the Phoenix

Over the next five years, Work All Week became a stable pony before the Papieses donated him to Old Friends for his retirement.

"Even though I bet on secondplace finisher Secret Circle in the 2014 Breeders' Cup Sprint, I fell in love with Work All Week

and his owners, Richard and Karen Papiese, who supported him and his pal, The Pizza Man, ever since they arrived at Old Friends," said Old Friends President and Founder Michael Blowen.

### RAMOS, GARCIA, SPEISS/KLOPP SECURE HORSESHOE INDIANAPOLIS HONORS



Joe Ramos was the leading jockey at Horseshoe Indianapolis | Coady

Jockey Joe Ramos, trainer Genaro Garcia and the team of Roger Speiss's Speiss Racing and trainer and co-owner Randy Klopp were atop the standings in their individual categories when the 2023 racing season concluded at Horseshoe Indianapolis Friday, Nov. 17.

In the closest of the contests, Ramos scored his second consecutive leading jockey title by one win (109-108) over Fernando de la Cruz in a battle that came down to the final race of the season. The Puerto Rico native bettered the 106 victories he posted in 2022.

"There are a lot of people that work hard for me," Ramos said. "I worked hard for this, and I dreamed of this, but it wouldn't be possible without all the people around me. My agent, Bones [Kerry Wirth], deserves the credit. He is the one that gets my business going and when we struggle, he takes me out of that and gets me back going."

Garcia earned his first title as leading trainer in 2017 and proved best for a fifth time, winning 73 races during the 123-day meet with earnings of better than \$1.7 million. Garcia has now trained 495 winners in his career.

"I'm always surprised with our 2-year-olds," said Garcia. "That's what excites me every year. They give you hope each year and it's real exciting to see them. And you are always looking for the next 2-year-old. That's exciting. We start with our babies in September and work with them for 60 days, then we give them a break and start back with them."

The Speiss/Klopp partnership was leading owner for the third straight season, with 33 wins from 168 runners and earnings of more than \$834,000.

"Randy and his crew did a great job again," said Spiess. "Our partnership goes well beyond 20 years and the entire barn works hard. A special thanks goes out to everyone in the barn and all the jockeys. It was another great year."

The 2024 meeting at Horseshoe Indianapolis kicks off Monday, Apr. 8 with a special program to coincide with the total solar eclipse in the area that afternoon. The season ends Nov. 14.

Second dam MGSP Wildwood Flower (Langfuhr) produced GI Florida Derby champ Materiality (Afleet Alex) and GI Kentucky Oaks runner-up My Miss Sophia (Unbridled's Song), who is responsible for 'TDN Rising Star' GI Coolmore Turf Mile S. hero Annapolis (War Front). For the second straight year, Nothing Better played catch me if you can in the Aqueduct Turf Sprint Championship, and catch him they could not over a rock-hard course playing very kindly to speed over the last few afternoons.

About 24 hours after Lady Milagro (First Dude) bossed the Atlantic Beach S. from the front to the tune of a \$104 mutuel, Nothing Better was aggressively ridden by Dylan Davis and found his way to the lead without too much stress, covering the opening quarter-mile in :21.90. Still going great guns afer a half in :44.38, the Colts Neck runner kicked it into yet another gear in the stretch and was never truly in danger.

Nothing Better set the course-and-distance record of 1:06.80 when wiring an Apr. 13 allowance and missed by a neck in the Jim McKay Turf Sprint at Pimlico May 20 before weakening to fifth behind Caravel (Mizzen Mast) in the June 10 GI Jaipur S. at Belmont. A disappointing fifth to Alogon in Monmouth's Wolf Hill s. July 22, he was run down in the shadow of the wire in a Sept. 22 allowance by Today's Flavor (Laoban), who returned to win the Belmont Turf Sprint in the slop Oct. 7.

"He loves this track," said winning trainer Jorge Duarte, Jr. "We got lucky there was no rain this week and it was a firm turf course. He's sharp. He likes the colder weather. He ran his race. Dylan [Davis] put him on the lead and that was the plan."

One of his sire's 72 black-type winners, Nothing Better is out of a winning half-sister to Godolphin's Folk Opera (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}), winner in France of the G2 Prix Jean Romanet ahead of a victory in the 2008 GI E.P. Recovering from a troubled start, Works for Me gamely outran Detective Tom to win his first career black-type race in the Notebook S. by a head.

Only once off the board in his career for two trainers--he moved from Daniel Leitch to Joseph Lee after his debut--in a fourth place effort in the restricted Funny Cide S. at Saratoga in August, Works for Me was a distant second two back in the listed Futurity S. to MSW Book'em Danno (Bucchero) but finished ahead of another stakes winner in Where's Chris (Twirling Candy). After running third in the Atlantic Beach S. on the grass last out Nov. 4 at this venue, he returned to state-bred company for this listed jump. **Cont.** 

The 6-5 favorite would have to work for this victory, bobbling at the start and having to chase three wide as Detective Tom put up the early fractions. Closest to that long-time leader as the quarter pole sailed by, he saved a bit of ground coming into upper stretch before locking horns through the final furlong. Neither colt would give an inch until the final jumps when Works for Me gave just enough to get his head down first. Aggelos the Great came on well to round the trifecta.

"It looks like the track is a little deep today with the time being a little slow there. He prefers something that's faster and harder under his feet--that's why I thought he would like the turf better, especially since he has a foot that's more like a turf foot, there's not a lot of cup to it," said Lee afterwards. "I was glad we finally got him on the turf and he ran so well on it. But, it's great [he runs well on both]. He's just a neat horse to be around and he's going to give you 110 percent either way."

He added: "I'll speak to the owners, of course [about a potential start in the Gander S. during the winter meet] and they'll make a decision on what to do with him. He's shown he can run on the dirt, so if they decide to stay with New York-breds, it's the winter so it would be on dirt. I'll speak to them and leave it up to them."

The first to the races for Bella's Game, the victor only has a 2023 half-sister by Beau Liam thus far, and no cover is on record for the 2024 season. The dam is a half-sister to SP She's Like Thunder (Astern {Aus}). This is the extended family of GI Kentucky Derby runner-up Invisible Ink (Thunder Gulch); GSP Hearts of Red (Lion Heart); and SW & MGSP Dyna's Lassie (Dynaformer), whose half-sister SW Princess Arabella (Any Given Saturday) went on to produce MGSP Ulele (Candy Ride (Arg)) and the dam of GSW Hoosier Philly (Into Mischief). Meant for the turf on debut, Tricky Temper won that rainedoff event at Saratoga by 4 3/4 lengths but failed to find the winner's circle in her three starts since while facing open company in both the off-the-turf Matron S. Oct. 8 and the Chelsey Flower S. on the grass Oct. 27. Purposely entered for the dirt in this spot and shortened back to six panels off the 1 1/6-mile Chelsey Flower, the 9-5 favorite tucked in behind early leader Cara's Time and gave chase from second into the far turn. Given her head with a quarter to run, Tricky Temper ran down the pacesetter into the final sixteenth and nailed her in the final jumps to pick up the stakes win.

"She broke well and put me in a beautiful spot," said winning rider Irad Ortiz, Jr., who picked up his fourth win of five on the day "I just bided my time. The horse in front of me [Cara's Time] is a nice filly, so I just used her like a target and got there on time. Jeremiah [Englehart] did a great job with her.
