'IT MEANS EVERYTHING TO US' - GHAIYYATH COLT ON TOP FOR FINEGANS AT GOFFS

Goffs has been a lucky place for the Finegan family of Milltown House Stud given they sold a foal at this complex for \le 250,000 in 2018 and the County Meath outfit reached similarly dizzying heights on Tuesday when a Ghaiyyath (Ire) colt fetched \le 200,000 to Tally-Ho Stud.

The buyer in this story came in for special mention from Jack Finegan, the third generation of Finegans working on the family farm, who is under no illusions about the role the O'Callaghans of Tally-Ho Stud have played in their success in producing quality foals. The relationship, which was forged between Tony O'Callaghan and Finegan's grandfather Noel years back, continued on Tuesday when Tally-Ho Stud stuck their neck out for the quality Ghaiyyath colt.

Jack, who is in his final year of Biomedical Science at University, led the €200,000 sale-topper around the ring and revealed how he wouldn't have missed the sale for anything.

He said, "The O'Callaghans have always been amazing to us, always helpful with advice, even when we were much smaller than we are now. The O'Callaghans have always been there for us and Kodiac has been pivotal to our success and our growth.

HAYLEY TURNER BECOMES FIRST WOMAN IN EUROPE TO RIDE 1,000 WINNERS

Hayley Turner, Britain's most successful female jockey, received a standing ovation from her fellow members of the weighing-room when becoming the first woman in Europe to ride 1,000 winners.

Turner, 40, reached the notable landmark at Chelmsford City on Tuesday evening aboard Tradesman (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) for Khalifa Dasmal and David Simcock. The same owner-and-trainer combination was responsible for Turner's first Group 1 win aboard Dream Ahead in the July Cup of 2011.

Back in 2008, Turner also became the first female jockey in Britain to ride 100 winners in a year. She retired from race-riding in 2015 and turned her attention to broadcasting. After reappearing in August 2016 to captain the winning all-female team in the Shergar Cup at Ascot, she returned to the saddle full time in 2018. Cont. p9



We are great family friends. There are three generations working on our farm-my grandfather Noel, who is now the great age of 93, my mother Jill and myself.

"It's great that the three of us can work together on the farm but the O'Callaghans have always been amazing to us. We're delighted the horse has gone to Tally-Ho. He couldn't have gone to a better place."

Finegan added, "This is up there with our best days. We sold Isle Of May (Ire), who was by Kodiac (GB), for €250,000 at this sale in 2018. This is probably our second-best sale and, for a small stud farm, it means everything to us. We're very, very lucky.

"I'm still in University. I'm in my final year of Biomedical Science. I couldn't miss the sales. Even if I had labs or exams, the sales are top priority. Wouldn't miss it for anything."

The Ghaiyyath colt hails from the unraced High Chaparral (Ire) mare Experte (Fr), already a proven producer, given she is the dam of recent Legacy S. winner Pipsy (Ire) (Kodiac), who looks a smart filly in the making for trainer Ger Lyons.

Roger O'Callaghan commented, "We've been lucky with Ghaiyyath. A great pedigree and a great farm. We've been doing business with the Finnegans since before my time. Dad and Jill's father Noel, who is 93, go back a long way."

Not only did Tally-Ho Stud sign for the top lot on Tuesday, but they have also been the busiest buyers at Goffs in terms of the aggregate, with nine foals bought for €611,000 so far this week.

When it was put to O'Callaghan that trade was strong, he responded, "Proper order. We've bought nine so far and trade has been seriously good. I am delighted to see it--everyone getting a few quid. That's the name of the game."

IRISH NATIONAL STUD

JC Bloodstock and Pier House Stud were also involved in the battle for the Ghaiyyath colt and were involved in the bidding from €170,000 upwards.

Of the 250 foals offered on Tuesday, 2016 were sold, which represented a clearance rate of 82%. The aggregate was down 9% on the corresponding day's trade last year to $\[\in \]$ 7,608,500 while the average fell 4% to $\[\in \]$ 36,935. Similarly to the Monday figures, the median rose 3% on Tuesday to $\[\in \]$ 31,000 on what was overall another solid day of trade.

Day To Remember For The Donworths As Earthlight Continues To Shine

The husband-and-wife team of John and Mary Donworth, along with their daughter and Goffs employee Orla, enjoyed a day to remember when their Earthlight (Ire) homebred hit the heights when selling to Camas Park Stud for €115,000.

Consigned by Galbertstown Stud, the colt out of Zebedee (GB) mare Stone Roses (Ire), who John bought shortly after retiring back in 2016, provided a special day for the family.

"I didn't expect him to make the money he made," John said after the sale. "You could say we are shocked by how much he made but we always knew he was a terrific foal. From the moment he was born, he was a very friendly foal who caused no issues and did well all summer.

I need to thank my wife Mary, who is the heart behind the breeding operation and obviously my daughter Orla, who assists in making the big decisions.

"Our mare was bought in 2016--I had retired at 65 on the 16th of November and two days later I spent a chunk of money here on two mares. The rest is history as one of those mares was Stone Roses."

Asked what attracted him first to Stone Roses, who Donworth bought for €22.000, he added, "We were looking for a young mare and she was a winner so she ticked two boxes. We liked Zebedee and the mare had a nice head, was a good mover and was an athletic mare. That's basically why we bought her. She'd four good feet and could walk well."

The sale represented yet more joy for those rowing in behind Earthlight, with the Kildangan-based stallion building on a strong yearling sale season with his foals. A day on from an Earthlight colt topping the opening session at \in 80,000, a total of four Earthlight foals sold for a combined \in 301,000.

Donworth commented on the stallion, "Selecting sires can be like Russian roulette at our level because we're not in it very high. We need to choose our sires very carefully and Earthlight will have runners next year, but we always liked Shamardal and he has produced very good stock.

"Obviously, Earthlight has been lucky from the point of view that Blue Point (Ire) has done so well. I have to thank Orla for selecting Earthlight as she reckoned he was an up-and-coming sire."

Orla Donworth wasn't the only Goffs employee to land a touch on the day. Conor Wixted, the Senior Bloodstock Executive with the sales company, sold his Earthlight filly for €42,000 through Clare Manning's Boherguy Stud.

Wixted, 27, enjoyed a good payday at Part 2 of the Orby Sale when an Equiano (Fr) colt he sourced alongside Joan Tyner for \in 6,500 made \in 26,000. Well, he proved he's no one-trick pony here on Tuesday with the Earthlight given he sourced the mare for just \in 4,000.

Commenting on the success, he said, "I only have two mares and I suppose all of the credit has to go to Clare Manning as she did all of the work. This particular mare only cost €4,000 so it's a good result."

Wixted added, "Earthlight has a very good profile. He was a smart racehorse and his yearlings sold well. It's good to see his foals are similarly popular here this week. The mare is back in foal to Sottsass (Fr)."

' I Love The Sire' - Havana Grey Keeps On Delivering

It seems as though pinhookers can't' get enough of Havana Grey (GB). And who could blame them given the supersonic time of things the stallion has enjoyed in the ring and on the racetrack?

A colt by the Whitsbury Stud-based sire created a buzz on Tuesday before eventually being knocked down to Frannie Woods of Abbeylands Farm for €130,000. Lot 393 was bred by Whitsbury and consigned by Olive O'Connor Bloodstock.

According to Woods, the colt will be offered for resale next year.

Top pinhookers Pier House Stud also struck for a colt by Havana Grey for €90,000 earlier in the session and there was an interesting little backstory to the sale.

Jerry Horan snapped up the dam Style And Grace (Ire) (So You Think {NZ}) in foal to Havana Grey for just 12,000gns at the Tattersalls December Mares Sale last year.

The County Wicklow-based operator, who also consigned the Havana Grey colt under Ballynure Park Stud, commented, "Sure what can you say about the sire? I bought three mares in foal to Havana Grey and I have four yearlings by him as well. I love the sire. He's a sire sensation. This is a good individual and thankfully he went down well."

A total of seven Havana Grey foals have sold on Monday and Tuesday for a total of \in 484,000 and an average of \in 69,143.

Gestut Hony Hof Adds Layer Of Intrigue

The Gestut Hony Hof provided an extra layer of intrigue deep into the Tuesday session. Owned by Manfred and Edith Hellwig, the operation is perhaps most famous for producing Prix du Cadran winner Princess Zoe (Ger) (Jukebox Jury {Ire}), and offered nine foals through The Castlebridge Consignment towards the end of the sale.

The draft was headed by a Sioux Nation colt out of Westfalica (Ger) (Areion (Ger), who was twice placed at listed level in Germany. The Sioux Nation colt was the penultimate horse into the ring but it didn't hold him back as many of the top buyers stuck around, with Goodwill Bloodstock winning out at €125,000.

Meanwhile, a Galiway (GB) colt from the draft was similarly well-received, with JC Bloodstock snapping him up for €120,000. The Galiway colt boasts a nice pedigree being a son of listed performer All For Rome (Ger) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}).

Lucky Vega Capturing The Imagination

The strength behind Lucky Vega (Ire)continued on Tuesday with 12 foals selling for an average of €38,917. Under the banner of the imaginatively-named Lucky Vega, Yuesheng Zhang, whose colours were carried by the Group 1-winning juvenile, supported his stallion further by snapping up two more foals by the Irish National Stud resident.

The Lucky Vega partnership, which has been headed this week by Sam Fairgray, chief operating officer for Yulong, have now bought three foals by their stallion this week to the tune of €172,000.



Buy of the Day

If it's good-walking foals you are into, well then feast your eyes on lot 391, an Australia (GB) colt bought by Apollo Bloodstock for €72,000. Out of a black-type performer Coeue d'Amour (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}), the Australia colt is from the family of the ultra-consistent and classy Oscula (Ire) (Galileo {GB}). He was bought from Norelands to be resold and looks just the type to rock into six figures back at the Orby next year.

Thought of the Day

It never ceases to amaze the appetite among the younger generation to get involved in the bloodstock game, perhaps no more so in the pinhooking side of things. The amount of new and young faces on the sales ground on Tuesday was encouraging.

"I did drag it out a little bit but I got there eventually," said Turner on Racing TV. "It's taken me plenty of time, and it's nice to see the girls coming through behind me that are up and coming, the likes of Hollie [Doyle], Saffie [Osborne], Nicola [Currie] and Josephine [Gordon] all riding so well every day. Although it's taken me 20 years to do it, hopefully it will take them half the time."

She added, "Unfortunately, Khalifa Dasmal is not here but hopefully he is watching at home. I've had a lot of fun on his horses over the years."

A month after her breakthrough success on Dream Ahead, Turner landed her second Group 1 victory in the Nunthorpe S. on Margot Did (GB) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}) for her former boss Michael Bell. She also won the GI Beverly D S. for Simcock with I'm A Dreamer (Ire) (Noverre).

She said, "It was particularly nice to have a Group 1 winner for Michael Bell with Margot Did in the Nunthorpe as he was really responsible for getting my career going as an apprentice. He put his neck on the line when girls weren't that popular.

"It feels like a bit of a relief now that I've done it. I'm chuffed." In 2016, Turner received an OBE from Queen Elizabeth II for services to horseracing.

A slimmed down section of stores and National Hunt yearlings nevertheless brought an aggregate close to last year's tally as the Argana Autumn Sale continued in Deauville.

Haras du Mesnil's immensely popular stallion Doctor Dino (Fr) provided the top two lots and the only six-figure sales of the session, for a yearling and 2-year-old respectively. At €120,000 the day's leader was the yearling filly named Cherry Berry (Fr), consigned by Mesnil's sister stud Haras de Maulepaire and bought by Ecurie de Launay. The May-born filly (Lot 572) is out of Snow Berry (Fr) (Dream Well {Ire}), a half-sister to the prolific chasing duo of Le Berry (Fr) (Gemix {FR}), whose 11 wins included the G1 Prix Maurice Gillois, and 13-time winner Berryville (Fr) (Poliglote {Fr}). This is also the further family of one of Maulepaire's most famous Flat graduates, the Melbourne Cup and Hong Kong Vase winner Dunaden (Fr). Jerome Glandais conducted the bidding and said afterwards of the half-sister to this season's Auteuil Listed winner Funny Berry (Fr) (Bathyrhon {Fr}), "She was bought for Sofiane Benaroussi. We are looking for well-bred fillies by good stallions. The objective is to find the right profile for racing and also for breeding."

Earlier, the two-year-old AQPS gelding Lascar du Mathan (Fr) (Lot 514) had sold to Guy Petit for €100,000.

"For me, he is the horse of the sale, he really has everything going for him," said the agent. "He's a beautiful horse and a son of Doctor Dino. I bought him for my client David Maxwell and he will be trained in France."

Of the 114 horses on offer on Tuesday, 84 were sold to lift the clearance rate slightly to 74%. The average of \le 26,025 was a 15% improvement on last year's figures, and the median rose from \le 15,000 to \le 20,000. Turnover was down by 5% at \le 2,191,000 but from 16 fewer horses sold this time around.

KITASAN BLACK'S FEE DOUBLED FOR 2024

Kitasan Black (Jpn), Japan's busiest stallion in 2023 and the sire of the world's top-rated racehorse Equinox (Jpn), has had his covering fee doubled for next season to ¥20 million (approximately £108,000/€124,000).

Kitasan Black is a son of Black Tide (Jpn), a full-brother to the late Deep Impact (Jpn), and he was kept busy at the Shadai Stallion Station last spring when covering 242 mares. It remains to be seen whether his most famous son, who is favourite to extend his Group 1 winning streak to six in Sunday's Japan Cup, will join him on the roster in Hokkaido next year.

This season's leading first-season sire, the 2019 Japan Cup winner Suave Richard (Jpn), has also had his fee increased for next year to ¥15 million (£80,000/€93,000). This will also be the fee commanded in 2024 by his stud-mates Epiphaneia (Jpn) and the Triple Crown winner Contrail (Jpn), whose first foals proved immensely popular at the JRHA Select Sale in July.

Lord Kanaloa (Jpn) looks set to become Japan's champion sire for the first time at the end of the year, thus ending the long reign of Deep Impact. About to turn 16, he has had his fee maintained at ¥12 million (£65,000/€74,000), which is also the price set for Kizuna (Jpn), who currently sits third in the Japanese sires' table.

STUD FEES CENTRAL TO CORRECTING NOVEMBER POLARIZATION

So we're hearing it at last: the dreaded "C" word. Correction. After a bull run as long as the one we've seen in international bloodstock, we're now hearing this and other words chosen to discourage undue alarm. Last week, on the conclusion of their November Sale, Keeneland officials resorted to adjectives as queasy as "pragmatic" and "solid" to describe trade. "Correction" has a bolder implication: that if the market's down, then so it jolly well should be; values had reached an unsustainable

Even if that happens to be true, however, it's only human to hear the word with nervousness. In the cycles of boom and bust, there's always the chance that it is only the beginning of a long period of penitence. In the Lexington neighborhood, indeed, horsemen may associate the whole concept with driving past the nearby Blackburn Correctional Complex.

high, and have merely been rocked back onto an even keel.

True, one veteran breeder made me chuckle, as we left one of the auctions staged locally over the past couple of weeks, by declaring that fewer criminals were accommodated in that forbidding institution than in the pavilion behind us. But the fact is that after a frenzied start to the week at Fasig-Tipton, the deeper and wider market across town at Keeneland intimated that our unfettered bull run may finally have come to an end. *Cont. p3*

ACCELERATE LEAVES LANE'S END FOR KENTUCKY HORSE PARK

Champion Accelerate (Lookin at Lucky--Issues, by Awesome Again), one of the top racehorses of his generation, will be relocated to the Hall of Champions at the Kentucky Horse Park, Lane's End Farm announced Tuesday. Accelerate was a five-time Grade I winner on the racetrack with over \$6.6 million in earnings. His victory in the 2018 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs capped off a season in which he also won the GI Santa Anita H., GI Gold Cup at Santa Anita, GI Pacific Classic S., and GI Awesome Again S. and was named Eclipse champion older male.

Accelerate had stood at Lane's End Farm since his retirement in 2018, starting at a fee of \$20,000, which dropped to \$10,000 for the 2023 season. He sired one stakes winner and three stakes-placed horses in his first three seasons at stud. *Cont. p7*

Stud Fees Central to Correcting November Polarization (cont. from p1)

A relatively boutique catalogue, like the one staged at

Fasig-Tipton, is always a precarious gauge of wider trends, in that its data will be heavily skewed by the successful recruitment and sale of elite mares. But just as Keeneland effectively spans the entire yearling market in September--accounting for \$2.08 of every \$3 spent on yearlings in America this year--so its breeding stock sale, extending to nine sessions, gave us a far more penetrating sense of where we stand.

Book I at Keeneland more than emulated Fasig's hot trade the previous day, the median catapulting 21.8% on 2022, from

\$275,000 to \$335,000. These figures have been updated to include post-sale transactions, of which there were plenty: 21 out of 141, compared with just six of 142 the previous year. That

strongly corroborates the suspicion that fireworks at Fasig the previous day (nine-figure turnover that was virtually unchanged, only from fewer horses, yielding rises of 18 and 10.4% respectively in median and average) had emboldened some

ambitious reserves.
Keeneland's Book I average
was admittedly down seven
percent, from \$482,606 to
\$448,511, but the inclusion last
year of a \$4.6 million Flightline
share had much to do with
that. (Without that exotic
offering, the 2022 average
would have been \$453,404.)

One way or another, then, the two elite sessions either side of town showed that the top end remains extremely strong, the median at both smashing what had seemed

very robust yields the previous year. But it turned out that the rest of the Keeneland market would somewhat match the weather: a bewildering 81 degrees on the opening Wednesday, reverting to 36 degrees by dawn on Saturday.



By the end of the sale, an increasingly familiar narrative of polarization had been reinforced.

Now things were actually nothing like as alarming as appeared the case when Keeneland issued its own data at the close of the sale. This initially indicated a slump in the overall median as steep as 20%, and 17% in the average.

Given the panic this must have caused many people, it was startling to discover that this data only measured the nine sessions staged this year against what had only been the first nine in 2022--when a similar volume of horses, in the overall catalogue, had actually been distributed across a 10th day of trade. In other words, the data omitted the weakest element of the whole 2022 sale, which naturally diluted the median: from \$40,000 after nine sessions last year, to \$35,000 after completion of the extra day. Updated to compare the two completed sales, the median had slipped far less seriously, from \$35,000 to \$32,000. As a headline figure, a drop of 8.6% should prompt much less unease than one of 20%.

The initial report on the average proved similarly misleading. By meanwhile incorporating not only the omitted session that completed the 2022 sale, but also post-sale trade, the overall sale average was down no more than 8.5% from \$92,928 to \$85,048. Nothing like as drastic, again, as had been haplessly relayed by the press on the close of the sale.

Pretty cold comfort, no doubt, for many. Putting that avoidable muddle to one side, the tables below show that top quality is still commanding top dollar, but that the going is indeed tougher away from that rarefied zone. For by combining Fasig and Keeneland Book I turnover--a useful exercise, for historic comparisons, given the way the Fasig auction has grown in recent years--and breaking off the rest of the Keeneland catalogue, we see that the former eked out a 2.5% gain in average (\$557,698 from \$544,292) even on last year's vintage trade. In contrast the average through remainder of the Keeneland catalogue shed 10.7%, from \$67,627 to \$60,421.

But let's keep that in perspective. If we rewind to before the 2020 pandemic, we see that the typical commercial experience for those operating after Book I (the majority, obviously) remains pretty healthy. In 2019, their average transaction was \$51,352 at a clearance of 77.6%. This year, it was \$60,421 at 81.8%. Nor has the relative performance of this sphere lost value relative to the elite market. This year, the average sale after Book I represented 10.8% of one in the Fasig/Book I market; in 2019, it was worth...10.8%!

Last year, admittedly, the average from Book 2 onward represented 12.4% of that set in Fasig/Book 1; and it had weighed in at 11.4% in 2021. In 2018, however, it was only 9.8%. So the market then was actually a little more polarised than it is today, suggesting that this sector was perhaps more vulnerable to "correction" than the heat in the elite tier might have led us to expect.

None of this trade happens in a vacuum, of course. If you're a pinhooker, a soaring weanling/yearling market means simply that you require the same growth to carry through into the yearling/2-year-old sales to make the same profit. And other costs, of course, are going up all the time. In our recent assessment of what superficially proved a very stable yearling market in North America, we should have stressed that point: if your sales are stable, but inflation is ballooning your overheads, your profits are anything but.

For commercial breeders, the key cost tends to be a covering fee. (And a key differential, too, bearing in mind that keep, labor and veterinary costs are essentially the same for a cheap horse as for an expensive one.) And the stallion farms certainly seem to have been dovetailing their demands to the profits presumed for their clients in recent years.

Now, you can get a legitimate sense of the cost to access a new sire--which is obviously "Main Street" for most commercial breeders--by taking a median fee among the top 10. (Which prevents a Flightline kind of fee skewing the equation.) You can then get a speculative handle on the kind of overall investment you might need, to make your debut as a commercial breeder, by adding that median fee to the average price of a mare (i.e. excluding weanling trade) after Book I at Keeneland.

And the bottom line is that entry into commercial breeding appears rather more intimidating now than it did before the pandemic. In 2019, the median fee for a top 10 freshman was \$22,500; last year it was \$40,000, and this year \$35,000. A mare outside Book I would cost an average \$75,709 in 2019, and even in a slower market than last year (\$112,505) the equivalent purchase in 2023 was \$96,882.

The aggregate mare-plus-cover cost today is therefore 28% higher than in 2019. Breeders are supposed to find that out of their own increasing profits, but the rise in average for a Keeneland September yearling in the same period, from \$125,201 to \$141,489, is only 13%. Even what felt like a buyer's market last week, then, will take a long time to alleviate the impact of higher stallion fees. That feels absolutely central to how things may develop from here.

Admittedly this is a fairly random snapshot. Our table shows that you would get markedly different outcomes if you compared 2018 and 2023, say, or 2019 and 2022. And, to be fair to the stallion farms, the cost of a typical commercial cover relative to the price of mares has maintained a remarkably even pitch, given the inevitable fluctuations. In four of the past six years, in fact, it has worked out between 55.2 and 56.6%.

Stallion farms also have wider responsibilities, of course, in an age when the foal crop is diminishing even as book sizes soar. That's a debate for another day, however. In this context, let's just take a quick look at the early dividends achieved at the weanling market by the latest intake of young sires.

It must be acknowledged that the agents and advisers tend to be pretty obedient when presented with these debutants: sires launched at the higher fees tend to achieve the highest averages at the sales. Only rarely does a market "discovery" punch above fee.

Sure enough, after their opening skirmishes, the top four spots in the weanling averages have duly been filled, in order, by the sires launched with the first, second, third and joint-fourth highest fees. Albeit from samples of varying size, Essential Quality, Charlatan, Maxfield and Yaupon have so far obliged with an almost mechanical yield: the first three at 4.1, the well-signalled Yaupon (176 live foals!) at 4.4. on those measures it's been a slower start for the next two, Knicks Go and Silver State, but there is an awfully long way to go for all of them.

As for the weanling market overall, the indices at Keeneland were generally positive. The average achieved from a rather smaller offering was, to a nearly freakish degree, virtually identical to last year. (TABLE C, page X). True, that was powered this time round by more demand at the top end: there were 19 hips sold at \$400,000 or more, up from 10 last year. The median was duly down somewhat, and considerably so on 2021, when fewer sales at the top end translated into a very strong median as well as a competitive average.

Again, however, trade remains much healthier than before the pandemic: average (up 15.6%), median (up 40%) and clearance (79.1% from 73 %) all remain significantly ahead of 2019; and comfortably in front, as well, even of what had been a stronger sale the previous year.

All in all, then, it feels way too early to relate any slippage in the middle market to the wider economic or political environment. Bloodstock, after all, has proved mysteriously immune to all manner of external provocations in recent years.

Yes, we see plenty going on out there that might affect confidence, and not just in the economy. By this stage, for instance, we are surely all aware that we can't be complacent about the social glamor our sport enjoyed in eras past. But sales of this kind are about the long haul: whether you're a trader trying to build a commercial portfolio, or an end-user striving to underpin your own program.

Such buoyancy at the elite level is no small comfort, then. As for the rest of us mere mortals, it feels like we could primarily do with a break on covering fees. Yes, stallions are expensive to recruit, and their window of opportunity is cruelly brief. But if the sales ring is really facing one, then it may be the stallion farms that must next embrace a "correction."
