Isolate (Mark Valeski) gave trainer Doug Watson a truly Festive Friday, leading home stablemate and G2 Al Maktoum Challenge Round 1 winner **Golden Goal (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) in the AED1-million G2 Al Maktoum Mile at Meydan Racecourse.

Already a winner over track and trip in the G2 Godolphin Mile on Dubai World Cup night at the end of March, the bay, making his first start back, settled in a good rhythm in second under Tyler Gaffalione for a few jumps. He took over a handful of strides later while shadowed by Listed UAE 1000 Guineas and G3 UAE Oaks heroine **Mimi Kakushi** (City Of Light), with Golden Goal to his outside in third. Cont. p3

JOINT COOPERATION COMMITTEE FORMED BY JAPANESE, BRITISH AND IRISH RACING INDUSTRIES

A partnership to encourage international initiatives and working practices between the Japanese and British and Irish horseracing industries was announced by the British Horseracing Authority (BHA), Horse Racing Ireland (HRI) and Japan Racing Association (JRA) on Friday.


The creation of the Joint Cooperation Committee is to serve as a formal platform for members within the British and Irish horseracing industries to engage with their counterparts in Japan via the JRA. It will consist of agreed representatives from key shareholders in the respective territories including the BHA, HRI, Racecourse Media Group (RMG), and principal courses like The Jockey Club Racecourses, York, Ascot, Goodwood, and Leopardstown.

The group's earliest groundwork includes a variety of schemes, and marketing and media initiatives to promote Japanese horses and connections travelling to Great Britain and Ireland, and vice versa by raising awareness of those markets among domestic participants, media, bettors, and fans. Another goal is to create a direct regulatory partnership which will perform its duties but not cut across pre-existing arrangements. Ultimately, the goal is to further internationalise the sport of horse racing and support the breeding industries. Cont. p5

At the half-way point, he appeared to be just putting in a paid workout, with most of his rivals being asked to keep pace.

Barely extended, he surged away from his pursuers with a mere tap from Gaffalione, and won with every appearance of more to come. Golden Goal stayed on for second 3 1/2 lengths back, with **Celtic Prince (GB)** (Shamardal) getting up for third, 2 1/4 lengths to the good of **Desert Wisdom (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who rallied past Mimi Kakushi for fourth.

"It's a pleasure to be here and thanks to connections for bringing me over," said multiple Grade I-winning jockey Gaffalione. "He took control early and he seems a lot stronger this year. I have a ton of confidence in this horse and the way he ran today I don't think stepping up in distance would be a problem."

"I take everything with a little bit of pressure, so I'm glad it's over," added Watson. "He showed today that he's pretty classy and he should improve for the run. I'll leave it up to everyone else to decide if we go to Saudi [in February]."

A winner of the Tale of the Cat S. by six lengths at Saratoga last August, Isolate ran second by a nose in the Louisville Thoroughbred Society S. in September prior to packing his bags for the desert. He filled the runner-up spot in both the G3 Al Shindagha Sprint in February, and the G3 Mahab Al Shimaal in

March, prior to his Dubai World Cup night heroics in the G2 Godolphin Mile.

Pedigree Notes

One of four stakes winners and two Pattern race winners for his Arkansas-based sire, Isolate is one of six winners from seven to race out of Tranquil Song (Unbridled's Song), who won as a 3-year-old. Since foaling her star progeny, her 3-year-old filly My Aunt Snookie (Cloud Computing) has won, while her Enticed juvenile colt For Your Pleasure has been placed. Her latest is a weanling colt by Tacitus, and she was bred to Cyberknife this spring.

His second dam, Travelator (A. P Jet), was a six-time stakes winner on the East Coast, before foaling two stakes winners in Hollywood Jet (Uncaptured) and Stone Silent (Adios Charlie). Another half-sister, the Forestry mare Fantasy Forest, is the dam of GIII Challenger S. winner Last Judgment (Congrats).

MEASURED TIME AN EIGHTH AL RASHIDIYA WINNER FOR GODOLPHIN by Heather Anderson

The bred-in-the-purple Measured Time (GB) (Frankel {GB}-Minidress {GB}, by Street Cry {Ire}) gave the boys in blue their eighth AED850,000 G2 Al Rashidiya winner when drawing off to win by 3 1/4 lengths in the 1800-metre grass contest on Friday. One of two group races on the nine-race Meydan card, the Al Rashidiya featured 10 rivals for the lightly raced 3-year-old, who was receiving a break in the weights.

Part of the early pace discussion, the near-black colt was keen and tugging as he tracked **Wirko (Ger)** (Kingman {GB}) down the backstretch. Buick finally had him relaxed next to **Goemon (GB)** (Dark Angel {Ire}), and that duo moved up to challenge Wirko on the far turn. Those two went on with it with 550 metres to travel, with Measured Time edging ahead before storming home

a 3 1/4-length victor. **Erzindjan (Ire)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}) closed up the inside to run second, 3/4 of a length ahead of Godolphin's **Ottoman Fleet (GB)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}).

"He's a horse full of promise and it's great to have a winner here on the first night," said Buick. "Today was a new test for him; first time away from England; first time at Meydan. I still think he's a horse full of potential."

Flawless in his first three starts for Charlie Appleby and Godolphin at Kempton in February and August, and at Newmarket on Aug. 25, Measured Time lost his unbeaten tag with a second-place finish in the Listed Floodlit S. back on the Kempton all-weather on Nov. 6.

ARIMA KINEN AN EARLY CHRISTMAS FEAST

With the recent retirement of the world's top-rated racehorse Equinox (Jpn) (Kitasan Black {Jpn}) and with Triple Tiara heroine Liberty Island (Jpn) (Duramente {Jpn}) spelling with destinations unknown for 2024, Sunday's G1 Arima Kinen is missing its top two votegetters. But the 2500-metre event, which easily attracts the largest single-race betting in the world on an annual basis, is certainly not lacking for quality.

While Equinox is not back to defend his title, a good deal of how to solve the contest from a pari-mutuel perspective goes through him. Cont. p9

Do Deuce (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) is one of four runners pressing on to the Christmas Eve feature from the G1 Japan Cup, where Equinox had four lengths on Liberty Island. In the estimation of many, the 4-year-old--one of just two horses to finish ahead of the reigning Horse of the Year, in his case in the 2022 G1 Tokyo Yushun--would have been the one to beat in the G1 Dubai Turf in March, but was scratched and missed seven months. The bay was disappointing when seventh behind Equinox in the G1 Tenno Sho (Autumn) in October and fell a bit short of expectations when only fourth in the Japan Cup. His connections still have not lost faith.

'[Jockey Yutaka] Take rode work last week and, as I'd thought, they really looked good together," said trainer Yasuo Tomomichi. "Take said the horse had moved really well as usual. This will be his third start of the fall season but I don't think he's tired at all. I'd say he has improved quite a bit and there is no need for more work. Equinox is out of the picture now and I think any horse has a chance."

Do Deuce is one of three Derby winners in the race, joining 2021 hero Shahryar (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and Tastiera (Jpn) (Satono Crown {Jpn}). The former was a cracking third to Auguste Rodin (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the GI Longines Breeders' Cup Turf Nov. 4 and was an intended runner in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase two weeks ago, but was a vet scratch. In spite of his obvious quality, the 5-year-old is no better than a 50-1 chance ante-post. Tastiera dropped a narrow decision to the sometimes mercurial Sol Oriens (Jpn) (Kitasan Black {Jpn}) in April's G1 Satsuki Sho before turning the tables in the Derby. He exits a second--with Sol Oriens third--in the G1 Kikuka Sho (Japanese St Leger) over 3000 metres Oct. 22.

No fewer than six fillies and mares feature in the 16-strong field, but two most-fancied have drawn the widest gates in a race that is run around three turns at Nakayama. Through Seven Seas (Jpn) (Dream Journey {Jpn}) put a bit of a scare into Equinox when flashing home for second in the G1 Takarazuka Kinen in June, after which it was announced that she'd be programmed for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. A highly creditable fourth to Ace Impact (Ire) (Cracksman {GB}), she is capable if able to work out out a trip from barrier 15. Drawn widest is the oft-unlucky Stars on Earth (Jpn) (Duramente {Jpn}), who was unfortunate not to complete the 2022 Triple Tiara and looks to snap a frustrating streak of placings, including a latest third in the Japan Cup. Her late sire is also responsible for Titleholder (Jpn), a pacesetting ninth in this last year. Win Marilyn (Jpn) (Screen Hero {Jpn}), victorious in the 2022 G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup and an outstanding fourth to Inspiral (GB) (Frankel (GB)) in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf Nov. 4, makes the final start of her career and is the longest price at north of 115-1.

Adding further intrigue are the half-brothers Justin Palace (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), winner of the G1 Tenno Sho (Spring) over 3200 metres and third in the Tenno Sho (Autumn), and Iron Barows (Jpn) (Orfevre {Jpn}), who punched his ticket to this with a victory in the G2 Stayers S. going 3600 metres of this course Dec. 2. The pair are half-brothers to recent Darley Japan import Palace Malice (Curlin).

Listed Business Bay Challenge Cont.

A winner of the Listed Guisborough S. at Redcar in October, Vafortino doubled his stakes tally with a game win over G1 Al Quoz Sprint winner Danyah in the Listed Business Bay Challenge on Friday. It was trainer Kevin Philippart de Voy's first win at Meydan.

Forwardly placed from the bell, Vafortino was able to save some ground while glued to the rail as Shadwell rivals slugged it out on the lead. Poised to make his bid at the 400-metre mark, a hole slammed shut between Danyah and Zainhom (Street Cry {Ire}), forcing James Doyle to steer his charge off the back of their hooves and go around towards the outside. Vafortino did not give up, and re-rallied in between rivals to pass the new leader Danyah in the shadow of the post.

"That was a worry today--it can get a bit messy today in these big fields and Kevin told me that he can take a bit of time to warm to the task," said Doyle. "So I was trying to look for a bit of room at the top of the straight. Thankfully, he got me out of trouble."

Regularly found in handicaps from Kempton to York and Ascot, the consistent gelding was making his eighth start of the year, and, with his victory, it was his sixth top-three finish. Also stakes-placed in Ireland, the 5-year-old is one of two winners from three to race for Arbaah. Her latest produce is a 3-year-old filly by Zoustar (Aus).

Second dam Alshadiyah (Danzig), who won the Listed Firth Of Clyde S. and was third in the G3 Fred Darling S., is the dam of group winners Haatheq (Seeking The Gold) and Farhaan (Jazil). Her dam in turn, the Shadeed mare Shadayid, was top of her class in Europe, England and France as a juvenile, and took the G1 1000 Guineas in 1991. The 1990 G1 Prix Marcel Boussac winner was also placed in another five Group 1 races, including the Oaks, before throwing a trio of stakes winners, among them G3 Prestige S. winner Bint Shadayid (Nashwan), second in both the G1 Fillies' Mile and 1000 Guineas. Ponntos, a group winner in France last year, padded his stakes resume with an all-the-way victory in the Listed Dubai Dash. Racing for Dr. Eva Nieslanikova, the bay became the first winner for the Czech Republic at Meydan.

Breaking on top, the dark bay motored straight to the top of the vanguard while being tracked by Miqyaas (GB) (Oasis Dream). Still traveling sweetly, he rebroke at the 300-metre mark and withstood the strong challenge of Bilhayl in determined fashion to register another stakes victory.

"It's nice to be back with a bang!" said Fresu. "I was thinking, going to the gate, that the horse was more relaxed than last season. He is very speedy and always runs to the wire, so I'm just very happy for connections—they deserve it."

A winner in both the Czech Republic and Italy, the 5-year-old gelding also won the 2022 G3 Prix de Saint-Georges, ran third in this race on Jan. 6, and was also second in the G3 Prix du Petit Couvert later this year. He entered Friday's contest with a ninth-place run in the G3 Prix de Seine-et-Oise at Chantilly on Oct. 27.

His winning dam is a full-sister to the dual listed winner Bounty Box (GB) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}), while a stakes-placed Acclamation (GB) half-sister produced triple group winner Rohaan (Ire) (Mayson {GB}), who was third in the G1 Betfair Sprint Cup S. Named Uruguay's Champion Stayer in 2021, Atletico El Culano put his stamina to good use in a come-from-behind victory in the Listed The Entisar over 1900 metres on Friday.

Breaking from the widest stall in the eight-horse field, the chestnut was soon outfooted and running by his lonesome spotting his rivals almost 10 lengths at times. Still well off his foes as the field entered the turn, the chestnut had caught up to the backmarkers by the 500-metre mark. He unleashed a strong turn of foot to reach the front with only 100 metres remaining and defeated Military Law by a narrow margin in dramatic fashion.

"In our stable this was probably the horse that most deserved a win," said trainer Julio Olascoaga after his third success of the campaign. "He got the job done today with his characteristic of coming from behind from a strong pace. It was a well-timed ride by Jose [da Silva], who also suggested to remove the blinkers during the week."

A winner of the G1 Gran Premio Jose Pedro Ramirez in his native land, the 7-year-old entire has been knocking on the door of a stakes victory in seven lifetime starts at Meydan. Third in the G2 Godolphin Mile behind today's G2 Al Maktoum Mile winner Isolate (Mark Valeski) in March, he ran fifth first up in the Listed Dubai Creek Mile over 1600 metres here on Nov. 24.

The fifth of eight foals out of the winning Yagli mare Alegre Baby, the winner is a full-sibling to group winner Pacholli (Uru) (Alcorano {Brz}) and the group-placed La Dernieri (Uru) (Alcorano {Brz}). to place this year. His latest start was a sixth in a handicap over
this course and distance in early February. Bearing the white cap

on Friday, the 5-year-old gelding secured a good position in midfield against the rail, although he was more than a touch keen a half-mile into the race. Still well covered up on the final bend, William Buick gave Dhahabi his cue, and he dove through a gap at the 250-metre mark before gliding home an 2 1/4length winner over Scottish Anthem (GB) (Lope De Vega {Ire}). The winner is a half-brother to stakes winner Eastern Belle (GB) (Champs Elysees {GB}), who placed thrice at graded level in the U.S. prior to throwing G3 Diomed S. and G3 Sovereign S. winner Megallan (GB) (Kingman {GB}); and the incomparable Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}), who won both the G1 Derby and the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe among other star prizes. Still to come from Fleche D'Or is a weanling colt by Sea The Stars (Ire). Kept off the fence as Frost At Dawn (Frosted) made the running, the Louisiana-bred was keen to go on rounding the bend and Adrie de Vries had his hands full keeping her content. She tackled the leader at the head of the straight, and ground determinedly past her 250 metres from home, before going on to win a shade cozily. "This is a bit what I expected," said the winning jockey.

He added, "She trialled really well; trained on from then, got more professional and she's a very clever filly. She was having a nice look at the winning post. I always like it when a horse is having a look around, it often means there's a bit left in the tank." Originally sold for \$100,000 as a Keeneland September yearling, the chestnut caught the eye of Oliver St Lawrence after breezing a furlong in :10 1/5, and was knocked down for \$200,000 out of the OBS April Sale. Charged Cotton, who won the All Brandy S. at Laurel, has already foaled the stakes-placed Sethamee Street (Street Sense), and multiple stakes winner Ova Charged (Star Guitar), who was second in the GIII Victory Ride S. at Belmont Park. DARLEY'S NEW SIRES OFFER GRADE I APPEAL

After playing a starring role in a story that the racing worldand many circles outside the equine industry--will not soon forget, **Cody's Wish** will now work toward cementing his legacy as he takes up stud duty at Darley's Jonabell Farm.

With a \$75,000 initial fee, the son of Curlin is the priciest newcomer to join the Kentucky stallion ranks this year, but also the only one to boast five Grade I victories. NEW YORK GAMING COMMISSION ISSUES UPDATE ON GREAT WHITE WAY STAKES DQ, BUT ONLY ADDS TO THE CONFUSION

The New York Gaming Commission issued a statement Friday regarding the controversial disqualification of **Brick Ambush** (Laoban) in the Dec. 16 Great White Way S. at Aqueduct that was meant to bolster the argument that the stewards made the right call, but it included a photo that could be construed as doing the exact opposite.

The *TDN* and other news outlets received an email from New York Gaming Commission Director of Communications Brad Maione that included six screen shots from the race taken at the point where there was contact and horses were steadied. One of the shots included arrows pointing to four jockeys, Ruben Silvera, Manny Franco, Junior Alvarado and Jose Lezcano. Alvarado was aboard Brick Ambush, who, though disqualified after crossing the wire second and placed last, appeared to be free of the trouble while racing outside and clear of the horses who were bothered. The arrow pointing to what was supposed to be Alvarado's mount was instead **The Big Torpedo** (Big Brown), who was ridden by Javier Castellano.

With two homebreds joining the stallion barn on the heels of champion Essential Quality and MGSW Maxfield getting started last year and Grade I winners Mystic Guide and Speaker's Corner coming in for 2023, there will be plenty of activity at Jonabell once the shed doors open for 2024.

"For our operation to have produced two homebreds that hit these high notes on the racetrack and then complete the circle and come to the stallion barn is hugely gratifying and hugely exciting," said Darley Sales Manager Darren Fox.

There was no shortage of demand as Fox and the rest of the team fielded calls from eager breeders when Cody's Wish arrived at Jonabell following his hard-fought Breeders' Cup victory. The back-to-back Dirt Mile champ who was never off the board in 16 career starts quickly accumulated plenty of high-caliber race mares and producers.

"We are very pleased with breeders' reception to him and the book of mares he has assembled," said Fox. "It is going to be a very strong book of young mares, a lot of graded stakes winners and producers, and Grade I winners. It certainly is going to set him up for every success going forward."

Over his three-year career Cody's Wish earned eight tripledigit Beyer Speed Figures including a standout 112 in this year's Met Mile, so breeders were more than familiar with the multimillionaire's race record. Fox said that breeders studying the horse during the busy open house season at Jonabell over the past few weeks only served to further interest.

"Cody's Wish is just an imposing, jaw-dropping physical," he explained. "He's quite a good-sized horse--16'3 and three quarters. So he's a substantial horse, but he is so well balanced and so well proportioned. From afar, you would be forgiven for

not thinking he was that big at all. He is just so well made with the depth of his shoulder, the strength of his hip, the length of his limbs and how he carries himself."

The only son of Curlin on the Darley America roster, Cody's Wish's pedigree suggests an appealing blend of speed and stamina. His dam Dance Card (Tapit) won the 2012 GI Gazelle S. as a 3-year-old going a mile and an eighth but turned back to finish third in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint the next year. While Cody's Wish didn't break his maiden until October of his 3-year-old year, his half-brother Endorsed (Medaglia d'Oro) won on debut at Saratoga as a juvenile and has been a presence for the last six seasons since, this year claiming the GIII Fred W. Hooper S. and GII Gulfstream Park Mile S.

"Curlin as a sire of sire is one of the most sought-after lines in North America currently, so it's very exciting to add a son of Curlin to our roster both for our own broodmare brand and our clients and to complement our existing roster," said Fox. "Being by Curlin out of a Tapit mare, he certainly is a little sharper in terms of his distance aptitude than one might initially expect based on a cursory glance of his pedigree. But when you delve a little deeper into his dam's race record and you watch his replays and see the speed he had from seven furlongs to a mile, it makes him a very exciting stallion prospect to mix that stamina and speed crossed with some of the best mares in the country. It really sets him up to have a very exciting stallion career going forward."

Across the barn aisle, Cody's Wish's new studmate Proxy has also garnered plenty of looks during open houses.

Breeders will recall the talents of not only his dam, but also his half-sister Micheline (Bernardini), a Grade II winner for Godolphin who was runner-up in the 2020 GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S., as well as Panty Raid's full-sister St. John's River (Include), who was second by a neck in the 2011 GI Kentucky Oaks.

"Proxy is a horse who has definitely attracted a lot of fans from people viewing him in person," said Fox. "He is a stunning-looking horse. 16'3, a lot of class and quality, very sharp and attractive with a lot of shoulder and a lot of shape. I've said repeatedly during our open house season that anyone who brings a yearling version of Proxy to the sales will be very handsomely rewarded. He is just that commercial type and breeders have recognized that and supported him accordingly. He's got the multiple Grade-I winning race mare, he's a half to a really good filly and he is a very high-performing racehorse in his own right."

Fox said that many might forget how Proxy showed brilliance at two, breaking his maiden in November and following that effort with a two-and-a-half length allowance win at Fair Grounds a month later.

A presence on the Triple Crown trail early on at three and the winner of the GI Clark S. over GISW West Will Power (Bernardini) at four, Proxy continued his upward trajectory this year with scores in the GII Oaklawn H. and GIII Monmouth Cup, a pair of runner-up efforts in the GI Santa Anita H. and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, and a fast-closing third to conclude his career in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

All in all, the competitive son of Tapit placed in all but four of his 20 lifetime starts and earned over \$2.7 million. Plus, Proxy holds an interesting record at Jonabell.

"He defeated 18 Grade I winners throughout his career, which is a record for the barn," Fox shared. "For context, Medaglia d'Oro lies second on 17. So it really tells you how good of a racehorse this guy was. He kept top company throughout his career and was so consistent. He has that toughness, soundness and durability and certainly has high level form as well. He is a very well-rounded, high-performing horse to bring into the stallion barn."


When the *TDN* notified Maione that there was an error concerning the identification of the horses and their riders, he sent a new version of the original statement that fixed the mistake. However, with Alvarado now properly identified, the pictures offered no evidence that he was at fault.

The second version of the statement included the following explanation: "Please note the first screenshot in the previous version incorrectly identified the riders on specific horses. Please disregard those reference screenshots. Corrected versions are attached and included below. The narrative remains unchanged."

The disqualification set off a controversy that has yet to die down and the consensus in the sport is that, for whatever reason, the stewards simply DQ'd the wrong horse by mistake. Many believe that the horse that caused the bumping and deserved to come down was actually the race winner, **Antonio of Venice** (Laoban).

The statement made the case that the stewards carefully reviewed the race after the decision was made to disqualify Brick Ambush and that they stood by their decision. The stewards officiating the race were Braulio Baeza, Jr. (N.Y.S. Gaming Commission), Juan Dominguez (The New York Racing Association, Inc.) and Samantha Randazzo (The Jockey Club).

"The three Stewards' attention was focused on the field as it arrived near the quarter-pole, where several horses converged and were in close contact," the statement read. "As evident in the below/attached screenshots, horse Brick Ambush (#12), ridden by Junior Alvarado, came up on three horses that were crowded together--Antonio of Venice (#1) ridden by Manuel Franco, The Big Torpedo (#7) ridden by Javier Castellano, and Solo's Fury (#11), ridden by Jose Lezcano--and made disruptive contact. The Stewards were concerned that Castellano's contact with the other horses and their riders could have impacted the results of the race."

According to the statement, the stewards examined six separate camera views of the area of concern and conducted telephone interviews with Franco, Castellano, Lezcano and Alvarado. Castellano told reporters after the race that he attempted to claim foul, but the stewards have said they were unaware that he wanted to file an objection.

"After review of the footage and interviews with the jockeys, the Stewards unanimously concluded that Alvarado's movement of Brick Ambush to the inside at quarter-pole pole caused a chain reaction that impacted the race. Accordingly, the Stewards disqualified Brick Ambush for interference," the statement continued.


Alvarado was hit with a three-day suspension for careless riding.

"The following morning, all four jockeys were required to participate in a film review of the race and discussed the event with all three Stewards," the statement continued. "At the conclusion of the review, State Steward Baeza issued a 3-day careless riding suspension to Mr. Alvarado, to be effective January 1 through January 5, 2024. Mr. Alvarado accepted the penalty and declined to appeal."

The Midwestern sage, Mark Twain espoused, "The secret of getting ahead is getting started." Nothing could be more apropos when considering joining a Thoroughbred racehorse partnership.

Getting started is the hardest part for most prospective owners. The world of Thoroughbred racing can seem as inaccessible as the Churchill Down's Turf Club on Derby Day. The good news is joining a partnership makes getting started easier.

In the first part of this series, we provided basic information such as investment levels, tax considerations and the entertainment value partnerships offer.

In Part 2, we will provide insights into the experiential considerations that can make your personal journey into ownership more valuable.

Owning More That 5%

You should always begin by considering what is going to be financially comfortable for you. If your investment level is below \$1,000, your focus should be directed toward micro-share opportunities like MyRacehorse, Wasabi Venture Stables, or a racing club at your local racetrack. These vehicles offer participation for as little as a couple hundred dollars and generally offer less than 1% interest in a horse. Micro-share partnerships rarely present any financial windfalls, but do give

you the excitement of participation and a friendly conversation starter at your next social event. They also make great gifts for a horse lover in your life.

If you are comfortable in investing \$1,000 or more, look for an opportunity where you can buy in for at least 5%. Truth be told, percentages have their privilege in Thoroughbred ownership. We all know that 5% of a \$10,000 claimer is quite a bit less than 5% of a \$1 million yearling.

What you may not know, there are significant benefits of being at least a 5% partner. Owning 5% means that most racing jurisdictions will require you to become a licensed owner. Once you are licensed, you now have access, and access is where the real fun begins.

With a state-issued owner's license, you typically will have access to the stable area and your horse. Watching morning workouts, spending time in and around a functioning training operation, and gaining insight into how the stable area operates are a handful of the most fascinating activities an owner can experience. Feeding carrots and treats to your horse can be worth the price of your investment alone.

On race day, you will have access to the paddock area to see your horse prepare to head out to the racetrack. The paddock is where you can interact with your jockey, trainer and other partners. Most racetracks also offer owner privileges like free admission, free programs, reserved seating areas and invitations to special events. These perks are part of your return on investment and an enticing incentive to own at least 5% of a racehorse and becoming a licensed owner.

The Partnership Personality

You are now at the point where you are hungry to get started. Do not make the mistake of buying the proverbial sizzle of a partnership... you want the steak. What a partnership portrays in advertising or by the general partner may not be what is served. You need to learn about the partnership's personality, in other words, where the meat is. How does the partnership communicate with its owners? How often does the partnership send out updates on horses? Do they use social media, e-mail, or other platforms? What level of input will you have?

Some general partners are great at taking input, others prefer to remain focused and rely on their own experience and skills. If you are a person that likes to socialize, do not hesitate to ask what events, or get togethers, are typically planned. Talk to current partners and get their feedback while simultaneously gaining a sense of whom you will be sharing the experience. Part of your return on investment are the relationships you develop. Simply make sure you get the steak and not just a bunch of sizzling mushrooms.*

Geography

Most partnerships run their horses at specific racetracks or on a circuit. You need to determine if you are ok with watching your horse race on the computer or if you want to go to the racetrack and enjoy watching your horse race live. There are racetracks that are great for bringing friends and family with you and others that do not make the greatest first impressions.

Where you live or where you are willing to travel is important in how immersed you can get into ownership. Living in Missouri does not mean you should not own a racehorse, it just means you may have to travel more vs. someone that lives in Southern California. Conversely, if you are solely interested in a financial return on your investment or are allergic to hay and hate the smell of manure, seeing your horse in person may not matter. The bottom line is: know where your horses are most apt to race and determine it if falls in line with what you are seeking.

The Mission

There are partnerships for breeding, buying yearlings, pinhooking, buying two-year-olds, claiming and everything in-between. What is best for you is a choice. Start by asking yourself if you like action or if you are willing to be patient and potentially end up with a Kentucky Derby horse. Most new owners benefit from getting involved in a claiming partnership first.

With these partnerships, you can make your investment one day and be at the races to watch your horse run within weeks. Typically, new owners start in a claiming partnership, move to buying into unraced younger horses, then yearlings and down the road becoming part of a breeding opportunity. All are available to you with partnerships, and you will be learning and becoming more adept along the way.

The Cherry on Top

An area that has become especially important to new owners coming into the sport, and rightfully so, is aftercare. Prospective new partners should ask, "What will happen once our horse is done racing? Can we still follow our horse after it retires?" Do not hesitate to ask these questions about any partnership you are looking to get involved in.

Some partnerships have aftercare programs in place, some have aftercare organizations they work with, and others unfortunately have no answer to this question. When you buy a Thoroughbred racehorse, you will discover an intrinsic connection to the horse, it is inevitable. Making sure you participate in a partnership that cares for their horses after their racing career is over is to be applauded and supported.

The path to becoming a Thoroughbred racehorse owner has never been easier. Partnerships have led the way in making ownership more accessible to everyone that loves horse racing or horses.

Finding the right partnership for you is a process, a process that hopefully has been made simpler by knowing what to ask, what to look for, and what really matters to you personally.

Note: a mushroom is a term in racing is often referred to an owner who is kept in the dark and fed manure.

A pair of graded stakes races will signal that the Gulfstream Park Championship season is officially underway on Saturday.

First, the GIII Sugar Swirl S. for older females going six furlongs on the main track includes veteran mare **Bluefield** (Field Commission), who won by a neck against state-breds in a Tampa black-type race Dec. 9.

"She went up to Tampa and it was nice to get a stakes win on her resume at this age," said trainer Saffie Joseph, Jr. "She came to us late but she just keeps getting better and better. She's never run back this quick, but she's in good order so I think she should run well. Hopefully she has a good week leading up to it."

Bluefield will be joined by her new stablemate **Intrepid Daydream** (Jess's Dream). Purchased privately just last week, the filly rides in on a four-race win streak at the Mid-Atlantic tracks.

Also entered is **Napa Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}). The chestnut prepped for this spot when she came from off the pace to win an optional claimer at Churchill Downs Nov. 22. Joining her will be **Headland** (Paynter), who was third last out in the Garland of Roses S. at Aqueduct Dec. 9, while AMO Racing's SP **Olivia**

Darling (Palace) will look to improve after a fifth-place finish in the GIII Princess Rooney S. in Hallandale Oct. 7.

The other half of the graded stakes Saturday offering is the seven-furlong GIII Mr. Prospector S. for older males. Last year's edition was used as the springboard for **Sibelius** (Not This Time) as he won three straight, including traveling to Dubai to collect the G1 Golden Shaheen S.

"Maybe it's the time of year where he's best, I don't know," said trainer Jeremiah O'Dwyer. "We'll find out this year. It's going to be his second year in a row trying to take the same path. We're looking forward to it. I couldn't be happier with the horse."

Sibelius might not have such an easy task ahead with the presence of MGSW **Long Range Toddy** (Take Charge Indy). After winning both of his starts at Gulfstream over the summer, the 7-year-old returns here with the capability to run this field off their feet.

Trainer Brendan Walsh sends **Gilmore** (Twirling Candy) back to the post to finish off what could be considered a consistent year for the 3-year-old colt. The gray was the runner-up in the GIII Bay Shore S., then was third in both the GII Pat Day Mile S. and GI Woody Stephens S.

An entry who could be a pace factor is AMO Racing's **Hurricane J** (Nyquist). Formerly under Paulo Lobo's care, the dark bay colt made his first start for Jorge Delgado over the Gulfstream main track against optional claimers and won by 2 3/4 lengths Nov. 19.

FINAL LEG OF THE PENNSYLVANIA STALLION SERIES ON TAP NEXT WEEK

The final leg of the \$1,000,000 Pennsylvania-Sired/Bred Stallion Series is set for Wednesday, Dec. 27th at Parx Racing with the Miss Behaviour S. and the Wait for It S.--both purses are \$200,000.

Initially, four races were carded for the inaugural series in 2022, while this year saw the expansion to six. Following the conclusion of the Stallion Series, a \$50,000 trainer's bonus will be split among the conditioners of the horses who accumulated the first, second and third highest number of points over the six series races.

The first leg kicked off on PA Day at the Races in August. Gamboling Ghost (Weigelia) took home the \$100,000 Whistle Pig S. and Jody's Ruby (Talent Search) topped the \$100,000 Miss Blue Tye Dye S. for fillies.

The series continued with the second leg on the Pennsylvania Derby Day undercard. **Notice of Action** (Hoppertunity) held on to take the \$150,000 Prince Lucky S. and filly Aoife's Magic (Smarty Jones) romped in the \$150,000 Imply S. Both winners return for the final leg of the series.

NEW TRAINING TRACK AT SANTA ANITA ON COURSE FOR MID-JANUARY OPENING

As part of a larger \$32 million improvement plan, Santa Anita's training track should re-open in mid-January after it was closed for construction Nov. 12, as it changes from a sand-based surface to an all-weather synthetic one, the track said in a release Friday afternoon.

Constructed by Tapeta Footings, the new surface is designed to improve safety while also helping to limit weather-related training disruptions.

"The main thing is having synthetic will alleviate a complete stoppage of training because of weather," said Jason Egan, Santa Anita Director of Racing and Racing Secretary.

This week has provided a perfect example of the potential impact of a synthetic training track at Santa Anita. With back-to-back rainstorms hitting the area, the main track was "sealed" on Tuesday and has since been closed entirely for training.

"We have some unique situations in California with rules as it relates to weather," Egan said. "Like with the rain this week. It either closes our racetrack entirely or limits what our training activities can be."

With the worst of this week's rainstorms having passed, Santa

Anita's main track is expected to be unsealed Friday. Per rules of the California Racing Board, only joggers will be allowed on the track Saturday. Full training is slated to resume on Sunday given the current forecast.

"Having a synthetic training track, we can continue on with workouts, gallops, that sort of thing. I think it will be a big assist," Egan added.
