HIGH CHAPARRAL'S SONS BOXING CLEVER ACROSS THE GLOBE

Flat and jumps, north and south, in many ways Boxing Day belonged to the late High Chaparral (Ire), whose sons Karaktar (Ire) and Contributer (Ire) were responsible for group/graded doubles, one under each code, in Britain, Ireland, New Zealand and Australia. It is beyond dispute that High Chaparral was a brilliant racehorse. Retired to stud in the era of Galileo (Ire) and Montjeu (Ire), the horse who won two Derbys, two Breeders' Cup Turfs, an Irish Champion S. and a Racing Post Trophy perhaps never received quite the level of support he might otherwise have enjoyed but he was a good stallion nonetheless, and was notably successful in Australia. For his southern hemisphere stints, High Chaparral stood initially at Windsor Park Stud in New Zealand before his good results prompted him to be brought 'in house' to Coolmore Australia. Among his good runners in Australasia, he sired the outstanding multiple dual-hempishere Group 1 winner So You Think (NZ), six-time Group 1 winner Dundeel (NZ), Australian Derby winner Shoot Out (Aus), and the VRC Derby winners Monaco Consul (NZ) and Ace High (Aus). The latter won the Derby at Flemington just three days before High Chaparral's British-foaled son Rekindling (GB) won the Melbourne Cup for Joseph O'Brien in 2017.

TDN HORSES OF THE YEAR: MOSS TUCKER

We all have our favourites, and this week members of TDN Europe's editorial team each select a horse who provided particular enjoyment in 2023. Kicking off the series, Brian Sheerin puts forward the case for the sprinter whose victory in the G1 Flying Five was made all the more special by his human connections.

Another of his sons from 'the north', Contributer, who was bred by the late Lady Chryss O'Reilly's Petra Bloodstock Agency, raced initially in Britain for Ed Dunlop and George Bolton before joining Godolphin's Australian stable of John O'Shea. To his two Listed wins in England, he added four group victories in Australia, including the G1 Chipping Norton and G1 Ranvet S.

Syndicated by Darley in partnership with Mapperley Stud, Contributer has stood in New Zealand since 2016, two years after High Chaparral died at the relatively young age of 15. Already the sire of G1 Randwick Guineas winner Lion's Roar, Contributer's tally of Group 1 winners was doubled on Boxing Day when Campionessa (NZ) landed the Cambridge Stud Zabeel Classic at Pukekohe Park. Two hours later the aforementioned Lion's Roar won the G3 Schweppes Summer Cup in Sydney. Both horses are now six and are members of Contributer's first crop.

In Europe at this time of year, the major action is of course all about the jumps and while it was 'King George Day' at Kempton Park, there was a three-way tie for the top race of the afternoon, with lovable underdog Hewick (Ire) landing the feature contest but receiving strong competition for top billing from the return of the best hurdler in training, Constitution Hill (GB), and French raider II Est Francais (Fr), who won the G1 Kauto Star Novices' Chase.

It is no faint praise for the man who has won 13 King George Chases, Paul Nicholls, to compare II Est Francais to his mighty former stable star, Kauto Star, whose name is now attached to the race formerly known as the Feltham Novices' Chase. A scintillating prospect, the five-year-old II Est Francais is from the first crop of Karaktar, an Aga Khan Studs-bred dual Group 3 winner on the Flat.

On his retirement, he found his way to Haras de Cercy, where he was always likely to be given an excellent chance to succeed on the roster at one of the best National Hunt stallion studs in France. As a side note, the final race won by Karaktar was the 2015 G3 Prix du Prince d'Orange. Behind him that day in third was the indefatigable Not So Sleepy (GB), who is now 11 and won the G1 Fighting Fifth Hurdle earlier this month.

As one might expect, Karaktar has a decent pedigree behind him and is from a family which includes the group-winning stayers Kasthari (Ire) and Kargali (Ire), as well as the G2 May Hill S. winner Karasta (Ire) who is now the dam of Listed-winning hurdler Karasenir (Ire). And with the weight of Cercy and its strong clientele of National Hunt breeders, he is making a noteworthy start to his stud career. Il Est Francais, who was already a Grade 1 winner in France, heads a list which includes his fellow French graded winners Incollable (Fr), Janeiro Verde (Fr) and Ile O Vent (Fr).



Ten minutes before the victory of II Est Francais in England, Karaktar was also represented by Kala Conti (Fr), who won the G2 Mercedes-Benz South Dublin Juvenile Hurdle at Leopardstown. Karafon (Fr), who is by the same sire, was less than six lengths behind him in fifth.

Both wins will have brought not just reflected glory to the Aga Khan Studs but also plenty of enjoyment to the team there as Fanny Cyprés, who works in nominations and client relations at Haras de Bonneval, is the daughter of Jacques and André Cyprés who are both heavily involved in the co-operative behind Haras de Cercy, while Amanda Zetterholm, who co-trains II Est Francais with Noel George, also worked for a number of years for the Aga Khan Studs in France.

Moreover, the victory of II Est Francais was the first winner in his homeland in seven seasons for jockey James Reveley. The grandson and son respectively of trainers Mary and Keith Reveley, James left England in 2016 to pursue a career in France, initially working for champion trainer Guillaume Macaire. It was clearly a sensible decision as he is the reigning French champion jump jockey, a title he has won on three occasions, and is currently second in the table for 2023 behind fellow Brit Felix de Giles.

The tables have turned. It seems as though the smaller trainers and owners can now hold genuine hopes of coming across a horse capable of mixing it at the highest level on the Flat. It's just not the same over jumps any more.

Take Moss Tucker (Ire) winning the Flying Five for example. Already a Classic-winning trainer, Ken Condon is hardly what you would describe as a smaller trainer, but this is a result that resonated with many given that the horse was bred by his owner and former Munster rugby legend Donal Spring. Part of the Munster side which famously took the scalp of the All Blacks in Thomond Park back in 1978, Spring has a history of producing sporting shocks.

Moss Tucker, named in honour of Spring's teammates, the late Moss Keane and Colm Tucker, was said to have about as much chance of winning the Flying Five as the experts gave that fabled Munster side of blindsiding the All Blacks. But therein lies the beauty of sport.

Moss Tucker embodied everything that is brilliant about the

game, chewing up the script and spitting out high-class sprinters like Highfield Princess (Fr), Bradsell (GB) and Art Power (Ire) in the process.

It must be said, the heavy rain that fell before the race was in Moss Tucker's favour. But take nothing away from Condon's charge, who fought tooth and nail for his big day and was thoroughly deserving of a breakthrough win at the highest level. But it's the human side of this story that propels Moss Tucker to being one of the results of the year. You will be hard pressed to find a man who is as well-liked and respected universally as Condon. One of racing's good guys, Condon goes about his business in an understated manner and Moss Tucker proved once again that he is deadly when given the ammunition.

By Excelebration (Ire) and out of a mare who won twice over hurdles as well as on the Flat, where she reached a modest mark of 76, Moss Tucker would have raised few predictions of Group 1 aspirations, not least over sprint distances. But here is a horse who has benefited from Condon's softly-softly approach, culminating with that big-race triumph at the Irish Champions Festival on his 30th racecourse start.

It should also be noted that Moss Tucker winning the Flying Five came off the back of a below-par season by Condon's high standards.

He has trained just nine winners in 2023, down from 17 in 2022 and 18 in the Classic-winning season the Curragh operator sent out Romanised (Ire) to land the Irish 2,000 Guineas in 2020. To produce a result like Moss Tucker winning the Flying Five, one of the most fiercely-contested sprints in Europe, off the back of a difficult season is a measure of what a good trainer Condon is.

Billy Lee riding Moss Tucker sugar-coated what was one of the sweetest successes of the year. Criminally under-appreciated, Lee is pound-for-pound one of the best riders in Britain and Ireland and would almost certainly have been crowned champion in his native country by now had God blessed him by being an inch or two shorter.

DEUCE'S WILD IN ARIMA KINEN

The second betting choice to--finally--build on a championship season in 2021 and a Classic-winning campaign last season, **Do Deuce (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) was produced wide into the Nakayama straight by the ageless Yutaka Take and outbattled the positively ridden 4-year-old filly **Stars on Earth (Jpn)** (Duramente {Jpn}) to take out Sunday's G1 Arima Kinen, the fanvoted 'Grand Prix' of Japan. **Titleholder (Jpn)** (Duramente {Jpn}) made the majority of the running, but where he weakened out to finish down the field 12 months ago, held courageously for third in his final career start.

Outfooted and relegated to the tail of the field, with 5-2 pick **Justin Palace (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn})--runner-up to Equinox (Jpn) (Kitasan Black {Jpn}) in the G1 Tenno Sho (Autumn)--bringing up the rear, the 2022 G1 Tokyo Yushun hero traveled strongly for Take, as Titleholder opened a long lead through the middle stages as was widely expected. Keeping his mount out wide and out of harm's way, Take slipped Do Deuce some rein as they took the rise with 800 metres to race, but Titleholder wasn't coming back to the field just yet and carried a healthy advantage into the final 600 metres.

But the swoopers began to chime in, as Do Deuce got underway at the midpoint on the turn and was four deep, but gaining on the front-runner nearing the entrance to the straight as Stars on Earth plugged on at the fence. Titleholder was brave on the lead and stuck on well into the final furlong, but he just couldn't quite see it out, as Do Deuce rolled home to outfinish the 2022 G1 Yushun Himba heroine, giving Take an 81st elite-level success on the JRA. Next in was Justin Palace followed by 2021 Derby winner **Shahryar (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), while reigning Derby winner **Tastiera (Jpn)** (Satono Crown {Jpn}) was sixth.

Last but one in last year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, Do Deuce resumed with a cracking victory in the G2 Kyoto Kinen Feb. 12, an effort that propelled him in most circles to favourite's status for the G1 Dubai Turf. Forced to withdraw from the contest in the days leading up to it, the bay was somewhat disappointing when a first-up seventh to Equinox in the Tenno Sho and was a latest fourth to the now-retired Horse of the Year in the G1 Japan Cup Nov. 26. The two most recent efforts came with Keita Tosaki on his back, but it was Take renewing acquaintances Sunday, having recently returned from an injury-enforced absence.

"It's great to comeback with Do Deuce to win this race against some really strong opponents," said Take, winning his fourth Arima Kinen, three of which have occurred on Christmas Eve. "He was in good shape coming into this race and although the colt was a bit keen, I had to keep him in hand and maintain a good rhythm and not let him rush and gave him the go from about 700 metres out. His response was very good rounding the last corner and gave a terrific late charge to the wire. We did have our struggles after winning the Kyoto Kinen early this year, but I was determined to show his true strength and prove what he was really made of in this big race."

Pedigree Notes:

Two-time graded-stakes winner Dust and Diamonds, also runner-up to Groupie Doll in the 2012 GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint for Padua Stables and Richard Santulli, changed hands for \$900,000 at that year's Fasig-Tipton November Sale and won the GIII Sugar Swirl S. in a single racetrack appearance for Borges Torrealba Holdings and Three Chimneys Farm. The mare foaled MGSP Much Better (Pioneerof the Nile) for that operation before being purchased by Katsumi Yoshida for an even \$1 million in foal to Pioneerof the Nile at the 2016 Keeneland November Sale.

Carrying the distinctive Shadai black-and-yellow stripes, Heart's Cry was runner-up to King Kamehameha (Jpn) in the 2004 Tokyo Yushun and ninth in this event behind Zenno Rob Roy. He ran with credit, albeit without winning, early on at four in 2005, but blossomed really and truly at the back end of the season, missing by a nose to the Luca Cumani-conditioned Alkaased in the G1 Japan Cup before famously handing Deep Impact (Jpn) his only domestic defeat in that year's Arima Kinen. Heart's Cry became the second Japanese-based winner of the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic in 2006 and was third to Hurricane Run (Ire) and Electrocutionist in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot, but was well held behind Deep Impact in that year's Japan Cup.

Do Deuce is one of a dozen top-level scorers for his sire, whose daughter Lys Gracieux (Jpn) was brilliant in winning the 2019 Arima Kinen. Heart's Cry passed away this past March aged 22, but was represented posthumously by Continuous (Jpn), victorious in this year's G1 St Leger. Heart's Cry's recently repatriated American dual-surface Grade I winner Yoshida (Jpn) is out of the Grade I-winning Hilda's Passion, whose sire Canadian Frontier was a son of Gone West and Borodislew (Seattle Slew).

Kieffers purchased the Real Steel (Jpn) half-brother to

Do Deuce for a sales-topping ¥94.6 million (approximately \$664,000) at the 2022 Northern Farm Foal Sale and Dust and Diamonds foaled a filly by Silver State (Jpn) this past Mar. 20 before visiting Triple Crown winner and Horse of the Year Contrail (Jpn).

CAMPIONESSA OVERCOMES TROUBLE TO WIN ZABEEL CLASSIC

Brilliant mare Campionessa (NZ) (Contributer {Ire}) had to force her way into the clear to make her dash for destiny in the G1 Zabeel Classic, eventually getting out and clinging on in a thrilling finish to the feature of the day.

Jockey Opie Bosson looked to have a few nervous moments as Campionessa (NZ) was held in a pocket by Mazzolino (Savabeel), but the pair showed their class and composure to surge to the front and withstand a late dive from No Compromise (NZ) (Pins) to win the G1 Zabeel Classic at Pukekohe on Tuesday.

Sent out a warm favourite in the public market, the 6-year-old mare was positioned prominently by Bosson as Kelly Coe (NZ) (Proisir) set a genuine speed, and once the speed dropped off and clear air was obtained, she shot to the lead and held out No Compromise, who had one last crack at spoiling the party.

Trained by Mark Walker and Sam Bergerson for Te Akau Racing, Campionessa has enjoyed a spectacular career to date, winning 10 of her 27 career starts, with the Zabeel Classic her first Group 1.

SPEED BOAT BEACH GIVES THREE AMIGOS FIRST MALIBU VICTORY

Favored **Speed Boat Beach** (Bayern) led home a one-two finish for Bob Baffert in the GI Malibu S. at Santa Anita Tuesday, putting away stablemate **Hejazi** (Bernardini) down the lane to give the trainer his record-tying sixth win in the race--and third in the last four years--and longtime owners Mike Pegram, Paul Weitman and Karl Watson their first victory in the Arcadia track's traditional opening-day feature.

"Turning for home I knew I was going to win it," Baffert said. "I wasn't sure which one it was going to be, I would have liked to run one, two, three. Speed Boat Beach has always shown since his first out that he was something special, hopefully he can build from this."

Hejazi, who topped the 2022 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale on Gary Young's bid of \$3.55 million on behalf of Amr Zedan, won the break and had the lead in the early strides, but Speed Boat Beach, last seen finishing fourth after setting a quick tempo in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, rushed up to prompt his stablemate through fractions of :22.21 and :44.42. He took a narrow lead into the far turn, but Hejazi came right back and looked to be traveling with authority only to have Speed Boat Beach cut the corner into the lane and scamper clear, leaving Hejazi to chase in vain.

She was pressed by favored **Howl** (Practical Joke) through a quarter in :22.21, but opened a clear lead as the favorite--unbeaten in a pair of lifetime starts coming into the La Brea--faltered after a half in :44.49. Daddysruby was still in front at the top of the lane and looked home free, but Big Pond loomed a threatening presence to her outside and closed with determination under Frankie Dettori to just miss on the line.

Speed Boat Beach Wins Malibu (cont. from p1)

"He was really sharp early," said winning jockey Flavien Prat, who rode Flightline to victory in last year's Malibu. "I got him to relax and we took a little breather. Around the turn, he really went well. He didn't mind being on the inside. He was really in a good rhythm today."

Speed Boat Beach stretched out to a mile to win the GIII Cecil B. DeMille S. over the Del Mar lawn last December, but was sidelined nearly 10 months after that effort. He returned with a gallant runner-up effort in the six-furlong GII Santa Anita Sprint Championship Sept. 30, earning a berth in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint where he settled for fourth after setting the pace.

"His issue is that he has always been very aggressive," Baffert said of Speed Boat Beach. "He's aggressive in the mornings and aggressive in his races. We have been working on getting him relaxed, a lot of schooling. I've got a great team, my riders and my assistants they have been working him a lot. Prat worked him for me today and he actually worked really well with Prat. He got along with him really well, got him to come off the bit a little bit."

Of the runner-up, Baffert added, "Hejazi is a serious horse. He was a little bit keen today. Juan [Hernandez] was telling me he couldn't get him to relax very well so he used himself up a little bit. I see big things for him down the road."

The mare, a daughter of multiple graded placed Amie's Dini, RNA'd for \$390,000 at the 2022 Fasig-Tipton November sale and was bred to Not This Time this year. Her 2-year-old daughter Midnight Snack (Distorted Humor) sold to Alistair Roden on behalf of MKW Racing and Breeding for \$485,000 at this year's OBS April sale.





"That was a close one, I didn't know who got it," Barber said. "It was really tough. It looked like we were going to come second but winning like that, it's thrilling and were very happy."

Winning jockey Juan Hernandez said, "We just wanted to get a good position because we were on the rail. I watched the other horses break and I knew we didn't need to go right to the lead. We broke quick. She's so game. She gave me a couple of more jumps in the lane. I wasn't so sure when we crossed the wire, but when my number went up, I was so happy."

ANISETTE PROVES FAR TOO STRONG IN AMERICAN OAKS by Alan Carasso

Crunched into 3-5 favoritism to complete the Southern California turf Oaks double, Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners' Anisette (GB) (Awtaad {Ire}) sat the perfect trip just behind the pace and quickened up decisively in the final eighth of a mile to stamp her authority on Tuesday's GI American Oaks at Santa Anita.

The dark bay, who swept the GII San Clemente S. and GI Del Mar Oaks over the summer, was content to lay third against the rails as Irad Ortiz, Jr. tried to make all the running aboard 'TDN Rising Star' Be Your Best (Ire) (Muhaarar {GB}), who got away with some pretty cheap fractions on the engine. The Mike Ryan colorbearer was given every conceivable chance to finish the task at hand once heads were turned for home, but the chalk pushed away from the fence beneath Umberto Rispoli in upper stretch, easily gathered up the front-runner at the eighth pole and ran out a facile winner. Be Your Best settled for second, while pace-pressing Musical Mischief (Into Mischief) re-rallied for third after appearing destined to finish off the board. It was the second win in the race in the space of three years for Aron Wellman's operation, who campaigned 2021 winner Queen Goddess (Empire Maker) in partnership in a race rained onto the main track.

Though this race, the brainchild of longtime bi-coastal racing office maestro Martin Panza, was celebrating just its 22nd running, Anisette is the second to complete the Del Mar/ American Oaks double, joining Lady of Shamrock (Scat Daddy) in 2012, when the races were run back-to-back and in reverse order in July (at original host site Hollywood Park) and August.

"She's the goods," said winning trainer Leonard Powell. "Aron Wellman and I have chosen to give her plenty of time in between races and that's probably the key of keeping her at the top of her game. She is happy and healthy, so that is the main thing."

Nov. 5.

Heavily favored Almendares looked to have the upper hand as they hit the final furlong of Tuesday's GII Mathis Mile S., but 9-2 third choice Watsonville refused to follow the script and was thrown across the wire first by the in-form Antonio Fresu to cause a mild surprise.

Calm Sea (Mendelssohn) bounced best of all and took his five rivals along at only a steady gallop as Watsonville set up shop just off his flank with Almendares securing good cover on the latter's back in the one-out and one-back spot. Flavien Prat aboard the favorite launched the first attack, moving off heels and three wide at the three-eighths, but Watsonville countered in kind and the duo matched strides into the final furlong and a half. With Watsonville down inside, Almendares clung to a tenuous advantage as time was ticking away and the two nearly brushed on multiple occasions very late before Watsonville proved narrowly best.

Watsonville came from midpack to break his maiden in his first try around two turns over the Del Mar turf July 28 and proved that effort was no fluke with a first-level allowance score Sept. 4. After drawing widest in the field of 13 in this track's GII Twilight Derby Nov. 4, the chestnut led into the final furlong before giving way to be sixth, but beaten just over a length, and was a latest fourth when apparently free of excuses in the GI Hollywood Derby at the seaside oval Dec. 2.

Favored Easter came flying late to win his third straight stakes victory in the GII San Gabriel S. at Santa Anita Tuesday. The bay gelding was well held while racing at the tail of the field through fractions of :24.64 and :48.76 and, as the field bunched up down the backstretch behind the pedestrian pace, Easter was caught three wide heading onto the far turn. Let loose approaching the stretch, the favorite closed furiously down the center of the course to win going away.

"This horse was fantastic in the final eighth," said winning rider Antonio Fresu. "I was a little concerned about the pace because we only had six horses. He was really relaxed today and I took him to the outside in the last quarter. I tapped him once and he really quickened. I'm really happy with his performance. He is not an easy horse to trainer or to ride, but I really think there is a lot more there."

Easter, who began his racing career in his native France, transferred to the East Coast barn of trainer Graham Motion in the spring of 2022 after selling for €150,000 at the 2021 Arqana October sale. He capped his time with Motion with a win in the one-mile Lure S. over the Santa Anita turf Oct. 28.



He overcame a slow start to win the Nov. 25 GII Seabiscuit H. at Del Mar in his first start for trainer Phil D'Amato.

"I think two things helped today, when he won under Graham [Motion] he got his confidence up," said D'Amato. "We also learned that he liked the firmer turf courses over here. Between those two things and getting to know his quirks, he is a very quirky horse and just knowing what he likes to do and just keep him happy. I think hopefully sky is the limit."

Less than two hours after taking the GII San Gabriel S. on the turf with Easter (Fr) (Exosphere {Aus}), trainer Phil D'Amato got his second graded score of Santa Anita's opening day with Newgrange on the main track in the GII San Antonio S. It was the 4-year-old's first visit to the winner's circle since the GII San Pasqual S. over this surface in January and third start back following seven months on the bench. He'd also won the GIII Sham S. and GIII Southwest S. in January nearly two years ago while under the care of Hall of Famer Bob Baffert.

"This horse is starting to round into form," said D'Amato. "I think the long layoff did him some good. I know he likes Santa Anita. He was better the other day and he put it all together today. Irad [Ortiz, Jr.] rode a perfect race. He stayed right behind Brickyard Ride and when it came time to run, he did the rest. I think we will point him toward [a repeat in] the San Pasqual next."

When the gates flew, MGSW Brickyard Ride hustled to the front while Newgrange stalked from second. The compact field of five stayed closely bunched through :23.26 and:47.31 early fractions as Brickyard Ride and Newgrange served as beacons up front. Newgrange drew on even terms with the leader on the turn and, despite drifting a bit coming into the lane, the dark bay scooted clear to win decisively by 2 1/4 lengths over a closing Mixto, who just caught Brickyard Ride late for the place.

"What can I say about the horse? He did everything," said winning rider Irad Ortiz, Jr. "I was a good passenger. He was going perfectly the whole way and when I asked him to get, he responded. Honestly, I didn't know the horse, but I talked to [D'Amato], and he told me exactly what I had to do, I think, because everything went the right way."

Anthropomorphization: Maybe we've always done it, but not to the extent as it appears to be taking over our collective consciousness in the 21st century. The attribution of human form or personality to things not human in the case of small animals has seen an expansion of the pet industry to something which would have been inconceivable 30 or 40 years ago.

In parallel, the place of the horse in society has diminished, since the invention of motorised vehicles at the turn of the 20th century. Horses became less and less relevant to everyday life, to where today the majority of people living in our cities have possibly never actually seen a horse up close and personal. They have no connection, "so what," you might say, but what you forget is we have had a relationship with horses for over 6,000 years, in the words of John Moore

"Wherever man has left his footprint in the long ascent from barbarism to civilisation we will find the hoof print of the horse beside it."

We would not be here without the horse, and it is only in the last 100 or so years there has been an ever increasing disconnect. Even with that disconnect, people still recognised there was something in what the Greeks prescribed many centuries ago, and by mid-20th century Riding for the Disabled had been established around the world. Since then using horses

as therapeutic facilitators has gained more and more momentum, to where today there are thousands upon thousands of programmes around the world using horses to help people.....and it IS Life changing.

What we in the racing industry fail to recognise is the connection mankind has to horses. They are hard wired into our DNA, and as such the Horse is the most potent drug on the planet. We need to tell our story, yes, but we also need to package this beautiful gift we are lucky enough to spend our lives involved with, and to market it.

We also need to realise we are living in a very different world today, where the horse has zero relevance to most people's lives, and anthropomorphization is the new norm. So when animal rights activists say racing is cruel, they are addressing a very different demographic from times past. Telling our story, showing how well we treat our horses and what a great game it truly is, is a fantastic start, but we need to do much more to resonate with today's population. Racing has survived through war, strife, famine, economic hardship, social unrest for over 2,000 years, but today it is facing the Grim Reaper of changing attitudes. One of which is "All use of horses is abuse." We have to show how horses not only enrich those involved in the various equestrian fields, but society in general.



Romagna Mia made it two in a row in America with a Boxing Day win in Gulfstream's Via Borghese S. Always appearing comfortable on the synthetic, she settled kindly in a clear fourth behind temperate :25.23 and :49.61 fractions. After the 1:40.54 mile marker, the gray tipped out, effortlessly tackled the leaders, and won by seven widening lengths under Hall of Famer John Velazquez. The 2:28.69 time for the 1 1/2 miles set the track standard for a little-used distance over Gulfstream's synthetic after the race was taken off the turf.

Winner of the G2 Premio Lydia Tesio last fall in her final of six starts in Italy, Romagna Mia joined the barn of Jerome Reynier after selling for €500,000 at Argana last December. She spent the first part of this year chasing others home in France and Qatar, then transferred again to Graham Motion's barn stateside. She perked up with a third in the summer's GI Beverly D. S. at Colonial Downs in her American debut and proved it was no fluke with a follow-up win in Keeneland's GIII Rood and Riddle Dowager S. to sport a 98 Beyer. The Via Borghese was Romagna Mia's first start since.

"I would have been surprised if she hadn't [handled the Tapeta], although the synthetic is a bit of an unknown. She kind of won for fun," said trainer Graham Motion. "She's an absolute pleasure to train. She's a lovely filly."

Washington Blue has a 2-year-old filly named Aretha Star (GB) (Postponed {Ire}), who is a maiden winner in Italy. The mare's yearling is a colt by Expert Eye (GB) and her weanling is a filly by Magna Grecia (Ire). Washington Blue fetched €30,000 at Goffs February from Gordian Troeller and Team Valor, while the nowyearling was a 15,000gns RNA at the 2022 Tattersalls December Foal Sale. 
