



PEDIGREE PLAY FOR GLEN HILL

A young Storm Cat mare from one of the most active families in the stud book brought \$435,000 to lead the way during Saturday's fifth session of the Keeneland November Sale in Lexington, which largely held steady from a year ago. The session average of \$42,576 was down 10.4%, from \$47,507, while the median of \$35,000 was up 9.4% from \$32,000. The RNA rate was 21.5%.

It was Glen Hill Farm's Craig Bernick who came away with the session-topping **Atrea**, a winning 5-year-old daughter of New Dice (Capote) and a half-sister to the

"It's the family of Get Lucky, which is probably one of the most important American pedigrees out there," said Bernick after signing the ticket. "This is a lot of money for a horse in Book 3, but we thought she was out of place. Or maybe it was smart--she really stood out in here. That pedigree was pretty obvious, and she'd look good in any broodmare band. These families are really hard to get into. We've been waiting around for three days to target her, but we're really excited." **Cont. p3**



Bernick said the fact that Atrea was carrying a foal-determined to be a filly by fetal sexing--by a son of A.P. Indy held a lot of appeal. "Super Saver and Bluegrass Cat were out of A.P. Indy mares, and Girolamo was by A.P. Indy, so it's the right cross," he said.

Asked if that was about what he expected to spend, Bernick admitted, "No, it's about \$100,000 more. But I couldn't help myself."

Bernick said he'd probably breed her back to an A.P. Indy-line stallion, possibly Malibu Moon. Glen Hill Farm has about 30 mares.

Bernick has a history of unearthing gems deep into Keeneland November's catalogue. Last year, he was still around on Day 8 to land a session-topping Indian Charlie filly from the immediate family of Broodmare of the Year Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister) for \$130,000. -Lucas Marquardt

In Lingerie Full Goes to Besilu...

This year's top 3-year-old filly In Lingerie (Empire Maker) was led out of the unsold at Fasig-Tipton earlier in the week, but a full-sister to the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. heroine will soon have new digs. That after Dr. Jorge Gomez, representing the interests of Benjamin Leon's Besilu Stables, purchased the 7-year-old **Sekmet** for \$310,000, who, like In Lingerie, is a daughter of the Grade II winner Cat Chat (Storm Cat).

"It's a very good family, and the full-sister just RNA'd for \$2.2 million," said Gomez, the head veterinarian of Besilu. "[In Lingerie] is staying in training, and so there's an opportunity to improve the pedigree even more. We think it was a good deal all around."

Offered in foal to City Zip by Winter Quarter Farm, Sekmet sold as hip 1433.

Besilu's attraction to Empire Maker mares doesn't need much explanation. The expatriated stallion is the sire of Besilu's dual GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic winner Royal Delta, whom Leon purchased for \$8.5 million here a year ago.

"We like Empire Maker, and the horse is not here anymore," added Gomez. "Plus the dam of Empire Maker, Toussaud, is one of the best mares of the breed."

Asked if Sekmet reminded him of Royal Delta, Gomez shook his head and said, "This filly has the size of the Empire Makers, but with the body of the Storm Cats [her dam sire]."

Besilu, which currently has a broodmare band numbering 15, was making its first official purchase of the November sales.

A granddaughter of champion juvenile filly Phone Chatter (Phone Trick), Sekmet was purchased by Jerry and Ann Moss for \$525,000 as a KEESEP yearling in 2006. She didn't win in two starts, but looked to have some ability, running third in a 2009 maiden special that produced Grade I winner Mona de Momma (Speightstown).

The Mosses bred two foals out of Sekmet, a yearling Mizzen Mast filly and a weanling El Corredor filly. *-Lucas Marquardt*

WinStar Along for the Ride...

Kenny Troutt's WinStar Farm has enjoyed success buying weanlings as racing prospects--this year's GI Wood Memorial S. winner Gemologist (Tiznow) was a \$310,000 acquisition at this sale three years ago--and has secured at least two youngsters from the current renewal. That includes yesterday's highest-priced weanling, a \$220,000 Candy Ride (Arg) colt from Lane's End's consignment. Bred by G. Watts Humphrey, Jr., Susan Keller, Victoria Oliver, and G. Watts Humphrey III, the colt sold as <u>hip 1323</u>.

"Just a beautiful colt," said WinStar President Elliott Walden, who did his bidding from the back row of the pavilion. "Obviously standing Sidney's Candy, we have an affinity to Candy Ride, and he was just very nice. He had a lot of quality."

The Feb. 15-foaled colt is the first produce from the stakes-placed 7-year-old Magical Theater (Smart Strike). Magical Theater is herself a daughter of the SW & MGSP Moments of Magic (Danzig) and a half to the California Grade I performer Zann (Dynaformer). G. Watts Humphrey purchased Moments of Magic for \$140,000 at the 1996 Keeneland September Sale and campaigned her to a nearby win in Keeneland's Dowager S.

Earlier in the sale, WinStar purchased a Street Cry (Ire) weanling half-sister to GI Jockey Club Gold Cup hero Haynesfield (Speightstown) for \$250,000. James Keogh (Grovendale) consigned that daughter of SW Nothing Special (Tejabo) as hip 264.

WinStar stands the Grade I winner Sidney's Candy for a fee of \$15,000 in 2013. - Lucas Marquardt

McDonald Makes Major Wager...

Had the Doug O'Neill-trained South Floyd (Any Given Saturday) lined up as planned in last Friday's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint at Santa Anita, his dam Major Wager (Valid Wager--Amidst, by Icecapade) may have caused more of a bidding war yesterday at Keeneland November. Instead, South Floyd, a debut winner at Fairplex Park Sept. 22 and runner-up in the Tim Conway S. Oct. 6 at Santa Anita, was scratched at the gate after, and his dam, who went through the ring as hip 1326 during the sale's fifth session yesterday, brought a final bid of \$260,000 from Eaton Sales' Reiley McDonald.

In addition to her stakes-placed 2-year-old, the 14year-old Major Wager, who was consigned by Taylor Made in foal to More Than Ready (Southern Halo), is the dam of multiple graded stakes winner and young sire J Be K (Silver Deputy). A \$125,000 yearling at Keeneland September in 2006, J Be K was picked up by Ahmed Zayat for \$350,000 the following February at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Winter Mixed Sale. He broke the track record at Saratoga in his debut victory as a 2-year-old before annexing the GII Woody Stephens S., the GIII Bay Shore S. and the GIII Jersey Shore S. as a sophomore in 2008. He retired to stand his first season at Gainesway in 2009 before relocating to Vinery Florida in 2010 and to Trophy Club Training Center in Arkansas for the 2012 season, and he will stand the 2013 season at Haras Santa Ana in Argentina, J Be K is the sire of five winners from his first crop of 26 named 2-year-olds this year, including the multiple graded stakes-placed Baby J.

"She's the dam of J Be K, who was a hell of a horse and should have been a Grade I winner, but more than anything, he's a beautiful specimen," noted McDonald, who purchased the mare for an undisclosed client. "The mare gets great foals, she's in foal to More Than Ready, and [South Floyd] is a good colt. She's a mare we know can get both sales horses and runners."

Also the dam of winners Major Momentum (Speightstown) and Call in Rich (Vindication), Major Wager, who was multiple stakes placed and earned nearly \$200,000 on the racetrack herself, has a yearling by Candy Ride (Arg) and a weanling by Malibu Moon. McDonald did not indicate who she would be bred to next year.

Moments after signing the ticket on Major Wager, McDonald went to \$110,000 for hip 1327, the 5-yearold Makoma (Malibu Moon). A two-time winner out of the graded stakes-winner Rhapsodic (Dixieland Band), Makoma was sold carrying her first foal, by Awesome Again, from the consignment of Winter Quarter Farm. --by Kelsey Riley

Huckabays Extend for Well-Bred Villa...

Jody and Michelle Huckabay of Elm Tree Farm have been busy at the Keeneland November sale, as both consignors and buyers under the banner of their Paris, Kentucky farm. After parting with a handful of sixfigure horses during the earlier sessions of the sale, including Tamboz (Tapit), the 6-year-old full sister to last weekend's GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile winner Tapizar for \$440,000, the Huckabays joined the fray as buyers, going to \$250,000 yesterday during the sale's fifth session to secure the 4-year-old mare Villa (Bernardini--Critical Crew, by Dr. Blum), consigned as hip 1502 from the draft of Bluewater Sales.

A \$300,000 Keeneland September yearling in 2009, Villa was winless in three starts last year while racing in the colors of Darley Stable for trainer Tom Albertrani. The half-sister to multiple Grade I-winner Critical Eye (Dynaformer) was sold yesterday in-foal to Darley stallion Elusive Quality (Gone West). Jody Huckabay admitted that he spent a bit more than he wanted to on the bay mare, but that she is just what he looks for in a broodmare prospect.

"We just loved her," he revealed. "We thought she was an absolutely gorgeous mare. She ticked all the boxes. There are a lot of really good fillies under her first dam. We've been waiting to pick up a mare like that. A client and I bought her."

Villa's dam is a half-sister to the Canadian Classicplaced Sounding Off (Silent Screen), who is responsible for Grade III winner Time Off (Time for a Change). Huckabay said no future plans have been made for his newest mare. "I'm not sure who exactly we're going to breed her to next year, but we'll have to breed her to someone nice," he said.

Huckabay also purchased hip 607, the 5-year-old mare Sister Dawn (Indian Charlie--Joi's Flame, by Strawberry Road {Aus}), for \$260,000 during the sale's third session Thursday. A stakes winner and multiple graded stakes-placed, Sister Dawn is carrying her first foal, by first season sire Eskendereya (Giant's Causeway).--by Kelsey Riley

Siena Secures Seeking the Gold Mare...

Anthony Manganaro, Ignacio Patino and David Pope's Siena Farms hit a home run at the Fasig Tipton November sale last week when their mare Pilfer (Deputy Minister), the dam of multiple Grade I winner To Honor and Serve (Bernardini), sold for \$1.95 million to Borges Torrealba Holdings. Last night, the trio took on the buyers role at Keeneland, securing the 4-year-old mare **Deja Blu** (Seeking the Gold--Purrfectly, by Storm Cat) for \$230,000.

Deja Blu, who went through the ring as hip 1604, placed once in four starts, but is a half-sister to two graded stakes horses: the GII Hollywood Breeders' Cup Oaks winner and multiple Grade I-placed Santa Catarina (Unbridled), and Power World (Distorted Humor), who placed in both the GII Sanford S. and GIII Bashford Manor S as a juvenile. She is also from the family of English champion 2-year-old filly Culture Vulture (Timeless Moment), and the graded stakes producer Rubies From Burma (Forty Niner).

Patino indicated that part of the appeal of his acquisition was her late sire.

"She's a Seeking the Gold mare, and she's a young mare," he noted. "There aren't too may Seeking the Golds left."

Founded in 2008, it hasn't taken Siena Farms long to experience success. The Paris, Kentucky based partners purchased Pilfer, a stakes winner herself, for \$650,000 at this sale in 2008, the year that To Honor and Serve was foaled. They bred two foals from her, namely Common Bond (Hard Spun), a \$200,000 Keeneland September RNA which they raced themselves, and Elnaawi (Street Sense), who sold for \$500,000 to Shadwell Stable at Keeneland September. Neither were winners, but thanks to To Honor and Serve, Siena was able to successfully sell the mare last week.

In addition, Siena owns Grand Cru Cruzian, an unraced 6-year-old full sister to Grade I winner Brilliant Speed (Dynaformer), and their homebred Dewey Square (Bernardini) has stamped himself as a standout juvenile this year, romping in two career starts.

Patino said that he has found the market very competitive while shopping for mares this week at Keeneland.

"We've tried for four or five mares already, and this is the first one we've got," he said.

Patino added that Deja Blu, who was sold carrying her first foal by Discreetly Mine (Mineshaft), may be bred to Arch (Kris S.) next year. The cross of Arch with Seeking the Gold mares has produced Grade I winners Blame and Pine Island.

This mare actually represents two Nothing But Nets. At last year's Keeneland November Sale, she was sold open for \$32,000 to Machmer Hall's Carrie Brogden. About 10 minutes after Brogden signed the winning slip, however, she agreed to resell the mare to the Canadian-based Denny Andrews for \$40,000, netting her \$800 for every minute she owned her. "[Trainer] Chad [Brown] was *so* confident," Zerolo said. "There was not a doubt in that man's mind. He uses the sheets quite a bit, which he inherited from his Bobby Frankel days, and his exact quote was, 'She's going to run a four and she will win the race.' Trip obviously makes the race, but she's such a handy filly. There isn't a whole lot of her, but she's all heart."

Consigned by Oceanic Bloodstock on behalf of owner Martin Schwartz, Zagora brought \$2.5 million from Mandore International Agency at Monday's FTKNOV sale.

"All things considered, it was a good price," Zerolo said. "Mr. Schwartz and I agreed on the reserve, and I suppose if she had been by Empire Maker and a little bit bigger, she would've made more money. But she is who she is and she's going to a great home. I'm delighted."

Flotilla, a close fourth in the G1 Criterium des Pouliches at Longchamp Oct. 7, unleashed a devastating stretch rally to pull off an 11-1 upset at the Championships. She is out of GIII Miesque S. heroine Louvain (Ire) (Sinndar {Ire}), who is currently in foal to Dansili (GB). Zerolo is hopeful that the 10-year-old will be able to obtain a nomination to the mighty Frankel (GB). Flotilla, bred by the aforementioned duo and Ariane Gravereaux, was a \in 120,000 ARQAUG yearling.

"I had a sneaky suspicion that Flotilla would run very well because I thought that she was victimized in France in her last two starts in slowly run races and very heavy ground," Zerolo offered. "Most Americanbred or sired horses just don't like it. She always had a huge reputation at home--it was only a matter of time before she came through."

Morandi, a 12-length winner in the G3 Prix de Conde Oct. 13, was geared down late while making it three straight wins in his seven-length triumph at Saint-Cloud yesterday. According to Zerolo, his 12-year-old dam Vezina (Fr) (Bering {GB}) was sold privately.

"I think he's a very good horse," Zerolo said of Morandi, who brought €65,000 as an ARQAUG yearling. "I'm not going to get into hyperbole yet, but he definitely looks like a Derby candidate for next year."

Zerolo and Puerari's 400-acre Normandy-based operation is currently home to approximately 50 mares. Half of them belong to clients. Zerolo, who began his career in the industry working for trainers in France, secured an internship with His Highness the Aga Khan in the mid-1970s before enjoying stints in the Bluegrass at Wintergreen, Spendthrift and Margaux. He went out on his own in the late 1980s.

"It's a labor of perseverance and love," concluded the 56-year-old, who is based in the U.S. "We didn't start with a lot of money [in 1995], so we've had to constantly upgrade. At first, the results were average at best. I'm blessed with a very good partner who really watches over things on a regular basis and we also have a really great staff. We truly have a fantastic team." -SS



Winner of the 2011 GII Fair Grounds Oaks on the main track, Daisy Devine (Kafwain) has proved a revelation since being switched to the grass and recorded her fifth win from seven tries on the lawn with this ultra-game effort. A 43-1 upset victress of the GIII Valley View S. in her first try on the infield last October, the bay proved that was no fluke with subsequent scores in the Pago Hop S. Nov. 26 and in the Feb. 21 Mardi Gras S. She got away with a very soft lead in the GI Jenny Wiley S. and held on to best a field including Zagora (Fr) (Green Tune) by a length, but regressed to be fifth in the GII Distaff Turf Mile at Churchill May 5. Rested off that effort, Daisy Devine resurfaced in the GI First Lady S. at Keeland Oct. 6, showing the way to deep stretch before getting run down late by Tapitsfly (Tapit).

Ridden away from the gate by Calvin Borel, Daisy Devine raced keenly, but within herself, and led by as many as a half-dozen lengths after covering the opening four furlongs in a sensible :47.32. Borel tried to get his filly a bit of a breather, and accomplished that to some

degree to the threeeighths pole, but Julie's Love (GB) (Ad Valorem) loomed boldly and set the stage for a stretch throwdown. The latter drew to within a head as they entered the final furlong and looked to have dead aim, but Daisy Devine kept finding at the fence



RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Trio Works Towards Clark...

Three high-profile horses turned in Saturday morning workouts at Churchill Downs as they prepare for the GI Clark H. Nov. 23. Take Charge Indy (A.P. Indy), this year's GI Florida Derby winner who returned from a five-month absence with a third in the GII Favette S. at Keeneland Oct. 27, breezed a bullet three furlongs in :35.60 with Calvin Borel in the irons. "This horse is doing so good," Borel said. "The race at Keeneland was an awesome race. I'm not scared of anyone right now, especially after this morning. He's just going to get better and better." Bourbon Lane Stable and Wayne Lynn's Bourbon Courage (Lion Heart) went five furlongs in 1:00, the second-fastest of 48 moves at the distance. "He's really doing good right now," said trainer Kellyn Gorder of the GII Super Derby hero, a last-out second to Neck 'n Neck (Flower Alley) in the GII Indiana Derby Oct. 6. "I can't wait for the race." Adele Dilschneider and Claiborne Farm's Cease (War Chant), most recently the nose runner-up in the GII Hawthorne Gold Cup H. in Chicago Oct. 6, tuned up for the Clark with a smooth five-furlong move accomplished in 1:02.40. "The horse is doing really well," trainer AI Stall Jr. said. "Maybe it's his turn."

Casse Points Trio Towards Clark...

Trainer Mark Casse is pointing last year's GI Stephen Foster H. hero **Pool Play** (Silver Deputy) towards Churchill Downs' GI Clark H., but the 7-year-old may not be the only member of his barn to line up for the Nov. 23 contest. The Bill Farish colorbearer, who was eighth in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic last out Nov. 3, might be accompanied by fellow Casee trainees **Stealcase** (Lawyer Ron) and **Delegation** (Speightstown). "Pool Play loves Churchill Downs," Casse said. "It's coming back a little quick [from the Breeders' Cup], but I think he just kind of went around the track in California. Also, this race is hard to pass up when we know he likes it here. We'll nominate Stealcase to the Clark and the [GI] Cigar Mile, as well," Casse said. "It's possible we'll run two, but we won't run all three."



Unquestionably, Rob Whiteley has been an asset to the racing industry, and I was disheartened to read in his <u>November 5 op/ed</u> in the *Thoroughbred Daily News* that he is leaving the sport. His top 10 "To Do" list is something each of us in the industry should actively address and for which we must seek consensus.

Specifically, his call to "Provide proper care for our injured human athletes (click <u>here</u>)" is greatly appreciated. That is the exact issue that the Jockeys' Guild has been asking the industry to address for many years. As National Manager of the Guild, and also a member of the Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund (PDJF) board, this is what our organizations work to achieve on a daily basis.

Why is this a serious issue?

The Guild is notified daily about jockeys getting injured at race tracks. On average, nearly one in five jockeys was on temporary disability at some point during the year, and the average time they are unable to ride is approximately eight weeks. If they are not riding, they are not making money to support themselves and their families. They rely on the money that they receive from the on-track accident policy (\$200 per week) and if they are members of the Guild, they receive a temporary disability benefit (\$250 for the first eight weeks and then \$200 per week, up to 104 weeks). Yet there are still tracks which refuse to contribute to the Guild to help pay for jockey disability benefits. There are a number of tracks in the last decade who have elected to opt-out of the previous TRA agreement contributing to the Guild, which dated back to 1968. Many of these race tracks see no moral obligation to assist with the jockeys who ride at their meets.

Since 2007, the Jockeys' Guild has paid over \$4.6 million for benefits on behalf of its active and disabled riders, which includes our temporary and permanently disabled members. This money comes from jockeys themselves, plus the generosity of some of the tracks who do their part.

Most jockeys cannot qualify for, or afford, insurance on their own. With the median salary of \$38,000 per year, many jockeys and their families simply exist from paycheck to paycheck. Yet some tracks, most notably "Racinos", are more interested in increasing the bottom line than improving the standard of living of jockeys who help make this great sport possible.

When a jockey is temporarily disabled, the Guild is able to provide some assistance to its members, but because of financial restrictions, is not able to provide all that is needed. When the disability is permanent, again, the Guild has a mechanism to assist those members, but not anywhere near the extent necessary. In addition, the PDJF which also works to aid those with catastrophic injuries, exists entirely on donations. There is no guaranteed funding for this organization, even though when it was created in 2006, there were many industry participants who assured they were going to do their part, including race tracks and the horsemen's organizations. Due to the generosity of only a few, the PDJF has been able to continue. However, it will only be able to do so as long as the funding is available.

The tracks who are not contributing to the Guild for the jockey benefits, argue, "We have an on-site insurance policy, and these are independent contractors...." Unfortunately, when a catastrophic injury occurs, that insurance of either \$500,000 or \$1 million dollars, can be exhausted in weeks. And even if the funds are not exhausted, the insurance policies only provide benefits for either two or three years. The exception to the insurance dilemma is those four states where the jockeys are covered under workers' compensation.

I concur with Rob Whiteley when he said, "there are basically two types of people in the business; stakeholders and those who make a living off stakeholders. And within each group, there are two more groups: those who actively work to improve the industry and those who operate from narrowly focused selfish interests without regard for the long term welfare of the business of our sport."

It's sad that selfishness and the quest for bottom line corporate profits is forcing some men and women who have given their life to the sport to live, in essence, hand- to-mouth with debilitating injuries. And yet people seem to forget, that without jockeys, our sport of horse racing would not even be able to exist. The industry has failed in its obligation to take care of its human athletes.
