Whether you're a trainer, a pre-trainer, a breeder or just a general racing nut, it seems as though the Irish Stallion Trail was the place to be on Friday and Saturday. But how much can be gleaned from two days of stallion parades? Quite a lot, actually.

Relationships have been forged and business has been done on the Trail and luminaries of the industry Johnny Murtagh, Dick Brabazon, Guillaume Vitse and Craig McCracken were left singing the praises of Irish Thoroughbred Marketing [ITM] for what proved to be another stellar weekend.

Vitse was a notable force on the Trail. Breeder of Unquestionable (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}), winner of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, the master of Normandie Breeding was at Coolmore Stud on Friday where the Frenchman promised to make the most of his visit to Ireland.

Vitse said, "It was lovely to see Wootton Bassett. We tried to see him last year but obviously he wasn't here because he was in Australia. We also went to Rathbarry, Castlehyde, Coolmore and Ballylinch today. We are going to Yeomanstown, Kildangan, the Irish National Stud and Tally-Ho Stud on Saturday."

He added, "I am a big fan of Blackbeard (Ire). He is a stunning horse. I really fancy him. He is just what my wife [Camille] and myself love in a horse. He's the perfect mover and he has everything. I love him." Cont. p3

RECORD NUMBER OF MILLION-DOLLAR YEARLINGS AT MAGICS

A spirited week of selling on the Gold Coast ended with Magic Millions posting yet another record number of million-dollar yearlings by the close of trade on Day 5.

At A Glance:

- At the close of trade on Saturday evening, Book 1 of the 2024 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale had grossed A\$223,475,000, a fraction under a\$5,000,000 short of the 2023 figure.
- After a sensational week of selling, the very top end of the market appears to be in rude health, with Magic Millions breaking their record of million-dollar sales for the fourth year in succession. A total of 23 yearlings fetched seven-figures, up three from the auction house's previous record of 20 set 12 months ago. Cont. p10

Said Vitse, "I like quality horses and this guy, from my point of view, has so much quality. I really like Sottsass (Fr) as well. He's another really good mover. He has a short back and is very strong and was a champion racehorse as well. Sottsass and Blackbeard are very different horses but we like both of them."

While France offers the Route des Etalons, the Irish Stallion Trail is a slightly newer phenomenon with over 30 stallion farms opening its doors to visitors across the two days and Vitse voiced his support of the initiative.

He said, "This is my first time doing the Stallion Trail. It was pretty cool to go around and see the stallions. I think the Stallion Trail, just like the Route des Etalons, provides you with a good opportunity to meet a lot of people. I think it's a very good initiative and now we have a good idea about the stallions we like. When we get back home, we will discuss with our partners the right pick for our mares."

Asked what stallions he was most looking forward to viewing on Sunday, Vitse added, "Mehmas (Ire). I am really looking forward to seeing him. I am looking forward to seeing Good Guess (GB) and Kodiac (GB) as well. It is probably the last few years we can use Kodiac so it will be good to see him."

Leading Irish breeder Craig McCracken of McCracken Farms, top trainer Johnny Murtagh and renowned pre-trainer Dick Brabazon were others who reported to have gotten huge value from the two-day event.

McCracken said, "I've been to Coolmore, Yeomanstown, Tally-Ho, Starfield and Kildangan. Of the cheaper stallions, I'd give Dubawi Legend (Ire) a chance. I have a breeding right in the horse but he did finish second in a Dewhurst and he is a son of Dubawi (Ire) so I can't see him not working. He has every chance at a price. Good Guess (GB) was one of the main takeouts of the weekend for me. He's a very slick horse, a lovely cross between Kodiac (GB) and Pivotal (GB). He could be what the market is looking for. He's a very obvious one for me. At our level, and of the stallions we can afford, I'd be weighing in behind Good Guess, Little Big Bear (Ire) and Native Trail (Ire). Those are the ones who have caught our imagination."

He added, "I'd be a big fan of the weekend. I mean, in what other industry would you get it? Would the manager of your local football club get the opportunity to pick the brains of Pep Guardiola? The answer is no. Take Mrs Tally-Ho [Anne O'Callaghan] for example. That woman could run the country. For me to have the opportunity to run my thoughts through some of the best in the business, that has to be worth something, so the weekend is of huge value to me."

It wasn't just the breeders who were out in force. Murtagh and Brabazon were other notable figures to be getting the miles in with the latter revealing the weekend provided a huge networking opportunity. Cont. p4

Brabazon said, "I have one mare and, while I am unlikely to be using some of the top stallions, my clients are using the stallions and it's very important for me to be able to talk to them and say that I have seen the stallions. That's what's important. You see

the good points and the bad points and you're clued in to what traits they might pass on to their progeny.

"Also, when you see horses on the racetrack, it's fascinating to see how they have developed as stallions. Paddington (GB) for example, he's a fine-looking horse but you can still see the racehorse in him, and I can't wait to go back and see him next year when you will see the stallion in him. The other thing I became very aware of is that Siyouni (Fr) is becoming a very important influence. You have Paddington

He added, "I did quite a bit of small bits of business on the Trail. I bumped into clients at Ballylinch and we got to talk about their horses. It's an important networking opportunity and I think it's wonderful. We should open up the training yards, open up the studs, and open up the industry more going forward.

"I'd be a big fan of the weekend. I mean, in what other industry would you get it? Would the manager of your local football club get the opportunity to pick the brains of Pep Guardiola?...Take Mrs Tally-Ho [Anne O'Callaghan] for example. nobody rushing them through or That woman could run the country." -- Craig McCracken

We're building up the interest in the industry in the sport over those two days and that can't be a bad thing.

"The studs are great that way. I'll give an example, I was down at Coolmore and, the group in front of us, a lot of the visitors had special needs. There was anything like that. They got the same treatment as everyone and it wasn't a case of Coolmore selling a breeding right or anything like that. I think that shows a bit of class from Coolmore and fair play to them

and St Mark's Basilica (Fr) at Coolmore. If you went back a few years, he didn't exist. Now, he's a very important influence. We're slowly seeing the changeover from Galileo (Ire)."

Murtagh has won some of the best races around the world as a jockey. Think Sinndar (Ire), Yeats (Ire) and High Chaparral (Ire).

In his role as a trainer, he was busy scouting some of the new kids on the block and he wasn't disappointed.

He said, "We have one mare here belonging to us and I just went down to Kildangan Stud to have a look at some of the stallions I never saw before. I never saw Blue Point (Ire) before and, given he had a phenomenal year, I was keen to see him. On the Friday of the tour, you probably get more of the breeders in attendance while the Saturday is more of a casual racing fan. But, listen, as

trainers, we probably don't get around to see these wonderful stud farms as much as we'd like. There were a lot of nice horses on show and we'll probably go and see some of the stallions at the Irish National Stud on Saturday as well."

Asked about his thoughts on some of the younger sires coming through, Murtagh said, "We've a King Of Change, an Arizona, an Earthlight and a few others by first-season sires. We try to buy a

few first-season sires because you never know who is going to be the next superstar. We buy the yearlings on spec. We went last year to the sales with the idea of buying two-year-old types and we bought Havana Greys, Kodiacs, Mehmases, Ardads and Oasis Dreams, You know, we have two-year-old types and we go and buy as many as we can on spec then we try to sell them when we get back. It's a tough business and we put our own money up front but we buy the horses we like and you need to have those

two-year-old types."

Proudest moment of 2023?

Of the team at Commonstown throughout the year. They all worked so hard in 2023 to finish third in the trainers' championship. We had more winners in 2023 than we did in 2022 and we all know the winners helped Mum beat cancer.

What is your biggest ambition for the new year?

Helping Jessica Harrington to train as may winners as possible in 2024.

Give us one horse to follow and why?

Givemethebeatboys (Ire). We definitely haven't seen his full potential on the racetrack yet.

And a young person in the industry to keep an eye on...

Keithen Kennedy. He is a 7lb claimer who rode three winners for us at the end of last season from very few rides. He could be going places.

Who do you think will be champion first-season sire this year?

Even though we haven't got one in the yard yet, I love Pinatubo (Ire). I loved his stock at all the sales. He was a champion two-year-old himself and I think he has bred his precociousness into his stock.

And the best value stallion in Europe?

It has to be Calyx (GB). He's operating at an impressive strike-rate with his first runners and had three Group-winning

juveniles last year. He looks good value to me.

What's the one horse you wish you'd bought in 2023?

If we had an open cheque book the, the Frankel (GB) filly out of Millisle (Ire). Out of a Group 1-winning two-year-old and by a champion, she was a beautiful filly and from a family we know very well at Commonstown. I can't see why she won't be a superstar.

Biggest regret?

Have no regrets. Whatever happens, happens, and tomorrow is a new day.

Biggest influence on your career?

Aidan O'Brien. I spent three years working at Ballydoyle and that experience left a lasting impression on me.

If you could sit down for dinner with three people (dead or alive) who would they be and why?

Johnny Harrington. There are too many questions I never got to ask him when he was alive and he was always one for a good story. Kevin Prendergast would have to be there as well. He's just an absolute legend. Then the third guest would be Amy Marnane as you'd be guaranteed not to have silence at any point in the evening!

A product of the storied Annemarie O'Brien breeding programme, the 3-year-old rattled off a trio of group placings at two in her colours when third in both the G2 Debutante S., and G3 Newtownanner Stud S., and second in the G3 Prix d'Aumale for former trainer Joseph O'Brien in September. Sold privately to these connections, the filly is a half-sister to G2 Ridgewood Pearl S. second Emphatic Answer (Ire) (No Nay Never) and G3 Silver Flash S. third La Dolce Vita (Ire) (Caravaggio). The trio are out of placed runner Ask Me Nicely (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), who is a half-sister to G1 Dewhurst winner Beethoven (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}).

Kalispera is one of two winners from five (40%) to race in America for her Coolmore sire whose eldest foals are now 3-year-olds. The winner Irish Gent (Ire) was second in the Listed Atlantic Beach S., while the placed Loterie (Ire) was runner-up in the Listed Del Mar Juvenile Fillies Turf S.

By Any Other Name

Reeves Thoroughbred Racing and MyRacehorse's **Forever Rose (Ger)** (Cracksman {GB}) won at Tampa for trainer Greg Sacco this month (*video*).

Making her third start, the Gestut Etzean-bred bay was a €49,000 Baden-Baden yearling turned €420,000 Arqana May 2-year-old when picked up by Stephen Hillen. Her dam Forever Beauty (Ger) (Dashing Blade {GB}), a winner at two and listed placed over a mile in Germany at four, has a juvenile filly named Fabulous (Ger) (Areion {Ger}) and a yearling colt called Fawkes (Ger) (Protectionist {Ger}) still to come. Forever Beauty is a half-sister to a trio of stakes winners led by G1 Deutsches Derby winner Feodora (Ger) (Lord Of England {Ger}).

Darley's Cracksman is now best known as the sire of French wunderkind Ace Impact (Ire), an undefeated Classic-winning

victor of the 2023 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. However, Cracksman is not a one-horse sire, as he has six other stakes winners worldwide including G2 Premio Dormello victress Aloa (GB). In the U.S., Forever Rose is the first winner from two to race for her sire.

Long Live The King

Boardshorts Breeding and Racing's **King Julien** (Kingman {GB}) graduated at Gulfstream Park at second asking on Jan. 7 (*video*).

Trained by Brian Lynch, the Glen Hill Farm-bred dark bay sold for \$300,000 as a Keeneland September yearling when picked up by Taylor Creek. Dam Deer Valley (Speightstown), who won Monmouth's Crank It Up S., is already responsible for stakes winner Wide West (Ire) (Frankel {GB}), and she was covered by Good Magic last spring. Crisp (El Corredor), a half-sister to Deer Valley and a winner of the GI Santa Anita Oaks, is the dam of star Japanese dirt performer Danon Pharoah (Jpn) (American Pharoah).

Juddmonte's Kingman has sired 36 winners from 59 runners (61%) in the US and Canada. His eight stakes winners are anchored by Domestic Spending (GB), a winner of three Grade I races; and Grade II winners Technical Analysis (Ire), who was second in the GI Diana S. and GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup, and Serve The King (GB), who was second in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic S.

Repeat Winners

Cheyenne Stable's **Ozara (Ire)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}) added a first listed victory to her resume in the Ginger Brew S. at Gulfstream Park at the beginning of the year for trainer Christophe Clement (*video*). She first featured in this column after a win at Saratoga in August. **Cont.** p8

GLOBETROTTER FALBRAV DIES AT 26 IN JAPAN

Group 1-winning globetrotter Falbrav (Ire) (Fairy King-Gift Of The Night, by Slewpy) died at Shadai Stallion Station in Japan on Friday, Netkeiba reported on Saturday. The eight-time Group 1 winner, who was pensioned in 2015, was 26.

"Falbrav passed away at the age of 26 in Shadai Stallion Station, Japan," the Japanese news site posted on X. "Rest in peace."

Eisuke Tokutake, manager of Shadai Stallion Station, told Sanspo.com, "He had a little colic and was a little sick since the end of last year."

Bred by Azienda Agricola Francesca and raced by Scuderia Rencati originally, the bay won one of four starts at two in Italy for trainer Luciano d'Auria. At three, he ran second in the G1 Derby Italiano, however it was at four and five that he truly shone. The G1 Premio Presidente della Repubblica and G1 Gran Premio di Milano went his way in consecutive starts in the late spring of 2002, and his first start outside of Italy was a third in that September's G2 Prix Foy. His final appearance at four was a nose victory over Sarafan (Lear Fan) in the G1 Japan Cup.

Transferred to Luca Cumani, he started his 5-year-old season with a third in the G1 Prix Ganay in the spring and won the G1 Prix d'Ispahan in May, with new co-owner Teruya Yoshida signed on. Successful in the G1 Eclipse S. in England in July, he added the G1 International S. two starts later in August and would never be out of the money in four more appearances that season.

Second to High Chaparral (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in the G1 Irish Champion S. in September of 2003, Falbrav cut back to a mile and landed the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. later that month. At the Breeders' Cup, held that year in California, he was only a head behind GI Turf deadheaters High Chaparral and Johar (Gone West) at the end of October. His career swansong was a twolength victory in the G1 Hong Kong Cup at Sha Tin that December. His record stands at eight Group/Grade 1 wins in five different countries with a mark of 26-13-5-5 and \$5,825,517 in earnings.

Falbrav spent the majority of his career at Shadai Stallion Station in Japan, although he did stand at Cheveley Park Stud in England at one point and also shuttled to Australia. A total of 18 of his 819 foals were stakes winners, with 12 making the grade at Pattern level. His best progeny included Fravashi (Aus), I'm Yours (Jpn), Fanunalter (GB), A Shin Virgo (Jpn), and Brava Fortune (Aus), who won Group 2 races in Australia, Japan, the UK, Japan, and Australia, respectively.

As a broodmare sire, Falbrav is responsible for 18 stakes winners overall and 11 group winners, with Group 1 winners Kenedna (Aus), a dual Group 1 winner in Australia, and Harp Star (Jpn) and Stelvio (Jpn) flying the flag for his daughters.

Out of the Slewpy mare Gift Of The Night, who ran second in the Listed Prix Herod, Falbrav was a half-brother to the stakesplaced Fattsota (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), and three of his halfsisters are black-type producers.

- The median dropped another point to A\$200,000 during Saturday night's fifth and final Book 1 session, down from A\$215,000 last year, whilst the clearance rate of 85.84%, while still healthy, was down slightly on last year's figure of 88.48% at the same juncture.
- The 23rd and final million-dollar lot of the week came early in Saturday night's session, with Kingstar Farm's Extreme Choice (Aus) colt out of the Shamardal mare Mischief Night (Aus) selling to Highway Farm for A\$1.4 million to top the session.
- Segenhoe Stud got the better of Newgate Farm in a thrilling race to be crowned leading vendor by gross, with just A\$50,000 separating the two industry giants at the close of trade on Day 5. Segenhoe also set a new benchmark of million-dollar lots for one vendor with an astonishing seven yearlings fetching seven figures throughout Book 1.
- I Am Invincible (Aus) ended Book 1 as the leading sire by gross for the seventh successive year, while Frankel (GB) stole his crown in the leading sires by average metric, having seen four of his yearlings sell at an average of A\$825,000.
- A number of first-season sires posted memorable results with their first crop of yearlings, but none more so than Coolmore's Wootton Bassett (GB), who sold two million-dollar lots and was responsible for the A\$2.1 million sale-topping filly from his first Southern Hemisphere crop. He ended Book 1 as the leading first-season sire by both gross and average.
- Fresh from winning the R. Listed Magic Millions 2YO Classic with Storm Boy (Aus), Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott, together with Bruce Slade's Kestrel Thoroughbreds, ended Book 1 as the leading buyer by gross for the first time since 2019, parting with A\$8,520,000 for 23 yearlings. Cont. p11

At the conclusion of Book 1, Magic Millions Managing Director Barry Bowditch spoke of his pleasure at the continued strong results of their headline sale.

"I'm incredibly pleased with how it's all come together, I think we'll reflect on this sale as a great sale as the year goes on.

"To have an increase in million-dollar lots to 23, the highest we've ever had here, that's something my team should be enormously proud of.

"To have an average of A\$280-odd thousand, which is the third-highest average we've ever had, with only the last two years beating it, it's a fantastic result.

"We had a very acceptable clearance rate of 86%, which I think will only increase in the next 24 to 48 hours while we're working with buyers for Book 2.

"There wasn't a buyer in their own right that spent anywhere near A\$10 million overall, there's generally a A\$10-million buyer at our sale.

"So, it just shows that to gross around the same number, there's over 50 buyers that spent over A\$1 million at the sale, it just shows you the spread. That's trainers, syndicators, who took home big, big numbers. There was agents and colt funds (as well), so it was a very diverse buyers bench that was needed because of the depth and diversity in our catalogue."

Lot 942 - Extreme Choice (Aus) x Mischief Night (Aus) (Shamardal), colt, A\$1.4 million

The most spirited bidding battle of the night came in the early stanza of selling, with a son of Extreme Choice (Aus) drawing in bidders from all sides of the auditorium, but it was Highway Farm, a name previously used by Yulong, who won the war for the colt at a cost of A\$1.4 million.

With the demand for progeny of Extreme Choice roaring along throughout Book 1, it was little surprise to see that continue with this precocious chestnut, with such a strong family

bolstering the quality of the sireline.

General Manager of Yulong, Vin Cox, told *The Thoroughbred Report* minutes after signing the dotted line, "Nothing like a good old-fashioned battle in the sale ring.

"He's a beautiful colt out of a Shamardal mare who has already thrown a stakes winner and we're delighted to get him.

"We expected him to be up there somewhere [in price]. He was a much talked [about] horse that we identified fairly early and we saw him in December when we went through the Hunter Valley looking at yearlings and it is great to come away with him.

While Mischief Night (Aus) (Shamardal) was unraced, she is a half-sister to emerging stallion Pierata (Aus), as well as the G3 Skyline S. winner Ashokan (Aus) (More Than Ready).

Her career as a producer has gotten off to a strong start, with the G3 Vain S. winner Our Playboy (Aus) (Sebring {Aus}) consistently proving his quality across the journey, with six wins in his career so far.

Lot 931 - Deep Field (Aus) x Merited (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), colt, A\$800,000

With a delayed start to selling on Day 5, buyers had ample opportunity to consider their strategy, with a number diving straight in to try and purchase a handsome son of Deep Field (Aus) from the draft of Silverdale Farm.

It was the Hong Kong Jockey Club, bidding through bloodstock agent Craig Rounsefell, that showed their pockets and love for the stallion, going to A\$800,000 in order to ensure he has a chance to race for riches in the revered jurisdiction.

Lot 931's grandam is the elite racemare Jeu De Cartes (NZ) (Stravinsky), who took out the G2 Counties Cup when in training. He is also a relative of the G1 ATC Derby winner Mon De Jeu (NZ), who was crowned Champion Stayer of 2009/10 in his homeland. Cont. p12

Speaking to *The Thoroughbred Report*, Rounsefell highlighted the value of Deep Field for Hong Kong buyers, with this colt a member of his penultimate crop.

"There's obviously not too many left of these and with the physical, he was just bang on.

"We had to wait all week for him--we've already bought two of them--and he was up there with the best colts here for us, that suited Hong Kong.

"[He's got a] super temperament, the farm that he's come off has already produced some really top horses in the last few years out of nice, young, fast Danehill-lined mares.

"For us, he was tailor-made.

"We've got three Deep Fields going up for the Hong Kong International Sale in March and some of them we bought here.

"Tim Boland who prepares them at Limitless Lodge loves them. He just loves their temperament, how sound they are and their speed.

"He's obviously a target stallion for us and there's not many of them left, so when the right one like him steps up you've got to take advantage of it."

QUINTESA DIGS DEEP IN CLASSIC

On Saturday, the Te Akau Racing operation won their third consecutive G1 Levin Classic with the classy **Quintessa (NZ)** (Shamus Award {Aus}) at Trentham.

Champion jockey Opie Bosson won his fifth edition of the Levin Classic. Partnering with the Mark Walker and Sam Bergerson-trained mare, the pair dug deep in the concluding stages of the mile feature to hold off a charging **Zabmanzor (NZ)** (Almanzor {Fr}) and a game **Impendabelle (Aus)** (Impending {Aus}).

Quintessa followed in the footsteps of her champion stablemate Impertartiz (Aus) (I Am Invincible {Aus}), who won the Levin Classic in 2022. The daughter of Shamus Award continued the dominance fillies have had in the feature, with the last five editions of the Levin Classic going the way of the girls and the last three trophies heading to the Te Akau Racing operation.

Pedigree Notes

The last colt or gelding to salute in the race was Madison Country (NZ) (Pins {Aus}) in 2019.

Bred by Peachester Lodge and sold to David Ellis by Wentwood Grange for NZ\$170,000 at the 2022 New Zealand Bloodstock Karaka Yearling Sale, she is the sixth Group 1 winner--and one of the 24 stakes winners--for her Rosemont Stud-based G1 WS Cox Plate and G1 Australian Guineas-winning sire.

Her dam is the multiple city winner Chaquinta (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}), half-sister to the stakes-placed Our Heir Apparent (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) and to the dam of the G3 Waikato Queen Elizabeth II S. winner Dionysus (NZ) (Ocean Park {NZ}).

Her metropolitan-winning third dam Lottey (Aus) (Bellotto) produced the Encosta De Lago (Aus) stakes winners Besamo Mucho (Aus) and Gold Lottey (Aus)--both of whom have also been represented by stakes winners, the former by Essington (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) and Frespanol (Aus) (Choisir {Aus}) and the latter by Iconoclasm (Aus) (Toorak Toff {Aus}).

Quintessa is the first foal for Chaquinta who was served last spring by Shamexpress (NZ) and King Of Comedy (Ire) with her two previous foals being a son and a daughter of Preferment (NZ).

Foxette is a half-sister to the G3 Hobart Cup winner Zacielo (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) out of a half-sister to the Listed Gibson Carmichael S. winner Fuji Dancer (Aus) (Fuji Kiseki {Jpn}) from one of New Zealand's favourite families--that which produced Sovereign Red (NZ), Gurner's Lane (NZ) (Sir Tristram {Ire}), Trichelle (NZ) (Sir Tristram {Ire}), Foxwood (NZ) (Centaine {Aus}), Purple (Aus) (Commands {Aus}) and Mr Brightside (NZ) (Bullbars {Aus}).

Mercurial sire has the relations Nureyev and Val De Loir (Fr) whilst his dam has further Val De Loir as well as Reform (Ire) from the same family--and two strains of Nureyev's three-quarter brother Sadler's Wells.

He is the 23rd stakes winner and seventh Group 1 winner bringing together Zabeel (NZ) and Tavistock (NZ); a combination which boasts a 72% strike rate.

BC CLASSIC WINNER WHITE ABARRIO TRAINING UP TO SAUDI CUP

Horse of the Year candidate and GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner **White Abarrio** (Race Day) will kick off his 5-year-old campaign in the \$20-million G1 Saudi Cup at King Abdulaziz Feb. 24. A subsequent start in the \$12-million G1 Dubai World Cup at Meydan Mar. 30 could be in the cards as well.

The Rick Dutrow, Jr.-trained C2 Racing Stable LLC and La Milagrosa Stable, LLC colorbearer has breezed three times at Santa Anita since Christmas Eve, including a five-furlong move in 1:00.40 (9/58) Jan. 8.

"He's gonna go over (to Saudi Arabia) from Santa Anita basically 10 days before," C2 Racing Stable's Mark Cornett said. "That's when the plane goes over there from Miami. So, he'll fly into Miami from L.A., then he'll get on the flight with the rest of the horses from the U.S. going over to Riyadh."

Cornett continued, "He's on his game, I'll tell you that. We backed off him a little bit (after the Classic). He's been working very good. They're easy works, nothing serious yet. The horse is such a good work horse."

The Saudi Cup will be White Abarrio's first start since concluding his 2023 season with a powerful win as the 5-2 choice in the Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita Nov. 4. Cont. p3

The longshot runner-up that day **Derma Sotogake (Jpn)** (Mind Your Biscuits) could potentially return for a rematch in the Saudi Cup.

Was a prep race--i.e., the \$3-million GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational S. at Gulfstream Park Jan. 27--ever in play for White Abarrio before heading to the Middle East?


"Not really," Cornett replied. "The timing, I don't understand why the Pegasus doesn't move their race and give you some more time to the Saudi Cup. It just isn't enough time with flying and everything else. You can't justify going to that race when you've got \$20 million on the table."

White Abarrio's seven-career victories have come at six different distances ranging between 6 1/2 furlongs to 1 1/4 miles. The 1 1/8-mile distance of the Saudi Cup is contested around one turn. The handsome gray's resume includes two wins at the Saudi Cup distance, albeit both around two turns, in the 2022 GI Curlin Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park and last summer's GI Whitney S. at Saratoga.

"We think that's gonna be what he really wants to do," Cornett said. "He can do pretty much everything--he can sprint, he can go seven furlongs, he can go a one-turn mile, he can go 1 1/4 miles, etc. The one-turn 1 1/8 miles could be his absolute best."

As for the appeal of the Saudi Cup, Cornett continued, "It's the distance and the purse money. It's those two factors and you combine them. Plus, it leaves the door open for the Dubai World Cup. It's possible. Obviously, we would be over there already. But the horse has to come out of the race the right way. He has to run the right way, too. If he has to run too hard, we'll pass and get him back over here and get him ready for the Saratoga meet."

In addition to a runaway win in the Whitney with a career-best Beyer Speed Figure of 110 and a decisive victory in the headliner

at the Championships three months later, White Abarrio's 2023 season also featured a better-than-it-looked third-place finish after stumbling at the start in the prestigious GI Hill 'N' Dale Metropolitan H. at Belmont Park June 10. Previously campaigned by Saffie Joseph, Jr., White Abarrio was transferred to Dutrow prior to the Met Mile.

White Abarrio is a finalist for champion older dirt male at the upcoming 53rd Eclipse Awards to be held at The Breakers Palm Beach Jan. 25. Horse of the Year finalists won't be announced until that evening.

"It's nice to be in the conversation," Cornett said. "In my opinion, he won the two most prestigious route dirt races in the U.S.--the Whitney and the Breeders' Cup Classic. Obviously, he doesn't have the storyline of a Cody's Wish. But it just depends how much the voters are gonna factor that into the equation."

Cornett concluded, "We're not in it to win these things. We're in it to manage the horse the right way. Things that are out of our control, whatever happens, we're ok with that."


He added, "He needed plenty of time, but it wasn't something that should hinder him going forward. He's got a really good mind on him, so he's been a good patient. Knock wood, everything has gone to plan to this point. I don't want to jinx anything, but he's on schedule."

A well-beaten sixth in a live maiden special weight on debut at Churchill Downs May 18, Rhyme Schemes won his next two starts with the addition of blinkers by a combined margin of 19 lengths. He was a daylight, front-running winner with a gaudy 94 Beyer Speed Figure at second asking at Ellis June 15, then showed a different dimension by rallying powerfully from fourth after bumping with a rival at the start in the 6 1/2-furlong Saratoga Special.

"We'll let him tell us when he's ready," Greathouse said. "We'll probably just give him an a-other-than (allowance), and if that goes to plan, then look at stakes."

Rhyme Schemes, one of 54 graded stakes winners worldwide for Ghostzapper, brought \$210,000 as a Keeneland September yearling. He is the second foal out of the winning Distorted Humor mare and \$575,000 OBS April breezer Katherine, who hails from the extended female family of GISWs Dream Rush (Wild Rush), Dreaming of Julia (A. P. Indy), Malathaat (Curlin), et al. The Ghostzapper x Distorted Humor cross is also responsible for GISWs Guarana and Molly Morgan. Rhyme Schemes was bred in Kentucky by Parks Investment Group, LLC.

"He's such a cool horse," Greathouse said. "With his pedigree

to go long, and as deep as that family is, we couldn't be more excited. Now, we just gotta keep our fingers crossed and hope that he comes back the same horse that he was. Physically, there's no reason for me to think that he's one of those early 2-year-olds that won't develop into a 3-year-old."

Greathouse concluded, "It was obviously heartbreaking not getting to go to those big races at the end of his 2-year-old-year. Hopefully, it's for bigger and better things down the road."

Skippylongstocking breezed a bullet five furlongs in 1:00.25 (1/21) ahead of his first start since finishing third in the Nov. 4 GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile at Santa Anita.







CONQUEST WARRIOR LIVES UP TO HIS NAME IN 'RISING STAR' GRADUATION

Despite enduring a season's worth of trouble in Saturday's ninth race maiden at Gulfstream, Courtlandt Farm's Conquest Warrior (c, 3, City of Light--Tea Time, by Pulpit) snatched victory from the jaws of defeat and with it, became yet another 'TDN Rising Star' for his Lane's End-based sire in jaw-dropping fashion.

Pinched back badly and pinballed around in the opening strides, the \$1-million Keeneland September graduate was relegated to a detached last early on, but began to improve his position and finally entered the picture as they passed the halfmile marker in :46.84. Committed to an inside run around the turn, the 7-2 chance--a debut third to big-figure El Capi (Maclean's Music) at Aqueduct Dec. 2--was traveling very strongly beneath Jose Ortiz, but found himself in a jackpot while stuck behind horses at the quarter pole and Ortiz was forced to snatch up, with just a furlong and a half ahead of him to try to make up for lost time. Finally pulled out into the clear with a furlong to race, the colt steamed down the middle of the track and grabbed Centennial Farms' Antiquarian (Preservationist)-who raced prominently throughout in a debut that was promising in its own right--for a highly improbable victory.

"I was surprised he broke the way he did. I knew he'd be back and then finish," McGaughey said. "I was surprised by the effort he put in today with the trip he had for a young horse."

The conditioner won't be rushing Conquest Warrior into stakes company right away and will seek out a first-level allowance, he said.

Conquest Warrior's dam raced for the partnership of the late Jon and Sarah Kelly and Helen Groves and made 18 starts from ages two to five for trainer Michael Matz, earning her first stakes win at two before following up with a pair of addedmoney tallies at three. She retired with five wins and four minor placings for earnings of just shy of \$280,000.

Acquired by Betz Thoroughbreds for \$250,000 in foal to Union Rags at Keeneland November in 2019, Tea Time is out of Asian Empress, a full-sister to GISW Acoma and kin to five other winners, including GISW sire Arch, MSW Alisios and UAE Group 3 winner Festival of Light. This is also the family of multiple champion Covfefe (Into Mischief) and the closely related Japanese MGSW/G1SP Albiano (Harlan's Holiday). Conquest Warrior's fourth dam is champion Althea (Alydar).

Don Adam's operation bought the Union Rags filly that Tea Time was carrying in 2019, Soul Play, for \$200,000 at KEESEP in 2021, and the mare is also responsible for the 2-year-old colt Brodeur (Nyquist)--a \$110,000 purchase by co-breeder D J Stable. She is due to Justify this season.

Conquest Warrior is the second 'Rising Star' in two weeks for City of Light, whose son Crimson Light turned in an equally unlikely debut success at Aqueduct Jan. 7. Among City of Light's three other 'Rising Stars' is champion-elect and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero Fierceness, who also has a second dam by Belmont winner Empire Maker.



Fan favorite The Chosen Vron, subject of a *TDN* feature earlier this week, added another feather to his cap with victory Saturday in Santa Anita's Don Valpredo California Cup Sprint S. "We own his mother and she's been quite the mare," said Kruljac after the race. "Breeding in California is the best thing that I have ever done. This horse has made it worth it all by himself. With 20 points to bank towards the GI Kentucky Oaks starting gate, Gin Gin collected that haul by winning her first black-type race of her career.

Donning cap and gown at second asking by 2 1/4 lengths at Churchill Downs back in September, the bay was the runner-up in the Rags To Riches S. in Louisville Oct. 29 before finishing a well-beaten fifth in the GII Golden Rod S. over the same course Nov. 25. "I thought she ran great," said trainer Brad Cox. "Trevor [McCarthy] gave her a great trip. She sat behind the leader and when he tipped her out turning for home, she responded well. Once she cleared off, she was kind of looking around a little bit, but overall I'm proud of the effort.

"I was a touch concerned if she would want to go a mile and an eighth and she put my doubts to rest today with her performance. She's a very good-looking filly and has always trained well in the mornings. I'm glad she was able to add a stakes win to her resume. It's a big update for her and Calumet."

On a potential start in the nine furlong GIII Gazelle S. at Aqueduct in April, which offers 100-50-25-15-10 Kentucky Oaks qualifying points, Cox said, "I think so. I'll talk it over with Mr. Kelley and Eddie Kane from Calumet and come up with a game plan, but I don't see why we would ship her anywhere right now with her settling in and training well at Belmont. She schooled Thursday and handled the ship over well. My assistant Dustin [Dugas] did a good job with her. She can be a little fractious in the paddock but she handled the schooling session well and shipped over well again today. I'm excited about what she accomplished today and look forward to what the rest of the year holds for her."

A half-sister to the dam of reigning GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf champ Hard To Justify (Justify), Before You Know It is responsible for unraced 2-year-old colt Quick City (City of Light), and she was bred to Hightail and Lexitonian for 2024.

Book'em Danno was a tough-luck loser of Aqueduct's one-mile Nashua S. when last seen 2 1/2 months ago, but atoned for that first career defeat in no uncertain terms with a thoroughly dominating victory in Saturday's Pasco S. at Tampa.


Hovering around 2-5 and 1-2 for the bulk of the wagering, the tote showed 1-9 when the gates flew and the New Jersey-bred was content to take back off the pace of debut winner Banded Rocket (Malibu Moon) and El Principito (Accelerate), who matched motors through decent fractions of :22.53 and :45.75. Kept intentionally wide by Samuel Marin, who had ridden Book'em Danno to his state-bred maiden romp and the Smoke Glacken S. at Monmouth last sumnmer, the gelding sauntered up to the leaders while five deep around the turn and had his head in front as GIII Iroquois S. winner West Saratoga tried to make a race of it up the fence. But Book'em Danno quickly widened in upper stretch and ran up the score while under a long hold in the final sixteenth of a mile. **Cont.**

A pair of seemingly frivolous objections from the connections of West Saratoga and El Principito were ultimately dismissed.

Breeder Greg Kilka purchased the unraced Adorabella for \$14,000 in foal to Fast Anna at the 2020 Keeneland January Sale, and that foal, Girl Trouble, did her part in improving the page with a pair of juvenile stakes scores in 2022. When factoring in Book'em Danno's emergence late last year, the family became even more valuable, as the now-juvenile colt by Classic Empire topped the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic October sale on LC Racing's bid of \$135,000 and that same operation added Adorabella to the fold when paying \$550,000 for the mare in foal to Fast Anna's sire Medaglia d'Oro after she was supplemented to the Fasig-Tipton November Sale.

Book'em Danno holds an entry for the \$1.5-million G3 Saudi Derby in Riyadh Feb. 24, and connections have publicly expressed an interest in the 1600-meter contest. Click for the Equibase.com chart or VIDEO, sponsored by FanDuel TV.
