Blood will out, so they say, and in the case of Onesto (Ire) this is certainly true. The most cursory glance at his pedigree gives you two of the most talked about and revered racehorses of the modern era--his sire **Frankel (GB)** and broodmare sire **Sea The Stars (Ire)**. But it pretty much goes without saying when it comes to **Frankel's** offspring that there's an awful lot more going on as you take a closer look at his page.

Bred by American-based Adam Bowden of Diamond Creek Farm, Onesto could just as easily have appeared in the Juddmonte studbook. [Cont. p3](#)

PLENTY OF DIVERSITY IN ARQANA FEBRUARY CATALOGUE

The [catalogue](#) for the Arqana February Mixed Sale on February 13-14 was released by the sales company on Friday. Featuring 363 horses comprised of horses-in-training on the Flat and over jumps, broodmares, maidens, 2-year-olds and yearlings, with eight wildcards still to be announced, sessions will begin at 11 a.m. daily.

The Arqana February Sale, which last year sold the G2 Prix du Petite Couvert winner and G1 Prix de l'Abbaye-placed Air De Valse (Fr) (Mesnil des Aigles {Fr}) as a broodmare prospect, this year offers a trio of fillies-in-training who achieved black type in 2023, including Haras de la Beauvoisiniere's **Pepete (Fr)** (Attendu {Fr}) (lot 1), listed-placed as a 2-year-old and from the family of the multiple Group 1 winner Peintre Celebre (Nureyev); **Princess Child (Fr)** (Dariyan {Fr}) (lot 6), last seen filling the runner-up spot in a listed race at Saint-Cloud in November and out of a half-sister to the G3 Prix la Force winner Chilean (GB) (Iffraaj {GB}); and **Vasda (Ire)** (Shalaa {Ire}) (lot 10), listed-placed at Milan in September and a half-sister to four black-type winners, including G3 Prix d'Aumale winner Rocques (Fr) (Lawman {Fr}) and listed winner Mea Domina (Fr) (Pivotal {GB}).

The Wertheimer et Frere homebred **Adeliade (Ire)** (**Australia {GB}**) (lot 79), a winner at two and out of a half-sister to the multiple Group 1 winner Solow (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}), is another name to note among the fillies-in-training. [Cont. p7](#)

In fact, just one generation back his family does just that. His dam Onshore (GB) was sold to Bowden by Juddmonte as a three-year-old for 320,000gns.

"Her pedigree was the huge draw for me," Bowden said in a [TDN interview](#) back in 2022. It is easy to see why. Onshore is a daughter of Kalima (GB) (Kahyasi {GB}), who is a full-sister to the celebrated Hasili (GB), dam of the stallions Dansili (GB), Champs Elysees (GB) and Cacique (GB) as well as the top racemares Banks Hill (GB), Intercontinental (GB) and Heat Haze (GB).

He added, "We had circled the mare and my agent Mike Akers went to see her and said, 'well if you're willing to spend what it takes to buy her, then I think she is the type of filly that we want.' And it worked out."

Indeed it did. Onesto was stopping the clock even before his first race, with an eye-catching breeze in Ocala, Florida which

sent agent Hubert Guy running almost as fast to ensure that he could assemble a syndicate to buy and race Onesto.

That team, which contributed to him being bought for \$535,000, consisted of the former champion trotting trainer, driver and breeder Jean-Etienne Dubois, his father Jean-Pierre-Joseph Dubois, Ecurie Hunter Valley, Ecurie Billon, Onesto's trainer Fabrice Chappet and Guy himself. Crucially, too, Haras d'Etream was involved from the start and now, after a Group 1-winning career, that is where Onesto finds himself as he embarks on his second career as a stallion.

Nicolas de Chambure of Haras d'Etream recalls, "We got a funny phone call from Hubert Guy after he breezed, and he

said that he saw something special from a horse that was not meant to do what he did that early in his career, and because of his breeding. And he said he had a lot of faith in the horse since he saw him breeze." [Cont. p4](#)

The best yearling/weanling you saw at the 2023 sales (that someone else bought)?

The **ST MARK'S BASILICA** filly out of Talent, bought by Jill Lamb, was a deserving sale-topper at Tattersalls, and I believe still good value at 575,000gns.

Chantilly trainer Tim Donworth

The best yearling/weanling you saw at the 2023 sales (that someone else bought)?

The **SOTTSASS** filly out of Up in Time was a nice buy (bought by Howson & Houldsworth Bloodstock for Chris Stedman for 110,000gns). She had a lot of class.

Kate Harrington, assistant trainer to her mother, Jessica Harrington.

And the best value stallion in Europe?

It has to be **CALYX**. He's operating at an impressive strike-rate with his first runners and had three Group-winning juveniles last year. He looks good value to me.

Breeder, pinhooker and TBA vice-chair Kate Sigsworth, who manages her family's West Moor Stud in Yorkshire.

And the best value stallion in Ireland, England, and France?

CALYX...

Martin Buick, bloodstock consultant for De Burgh Equine.

And the best value stallion in Europe?

Proven value is hard to find so I'll go with **CHURCHILL** at €30,000... he has had two champions from his first two crops in Vadeni (Ire) and Blue Rose Cen (Ire) and that fee could look cheap down the line. He is still a young stallion that I suspect we'll hear plenty more about in the years to come.

He adds, "So it was mainly him and Jean-Etienne Dubois at the time that put a syndicate together. And we participated because we agreed that we saw something a bit different, a bit special. And that's how it all started."

Having returned to Europe to begin his training at Chappet's Chantilly yard, the chestnut colt made his winning debut over a mile at Chantilly that September.

"Onesto got a Rising Star from the *TDN* when he won first time out," de Chambure says. "He arrived in Chantilly in June with Fabrice Chappet. Fabrice was taking his time with him. He didn't want to rush him into fast work too early, but you know, the more he was doing with him, the more he was seeing things that the breeze-up suggested. And it was excitement and relief and a bit of a mix when he won so well in a very good

maiden in Chantilly. And the way he did it, with that great turn of foot. The dream was really alive then."

A below-par run when eighth in the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau on his first start at three may have felt like a setback at the time, but Onesto soon put that behind him when winning another important Classic trial, the G2 Prix Greffulhe, on his next start three weeks later.

His wide draw in gate 14 did not help his chances in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club, in which Onesto was fifth behind **Vadeni (Fr)** but he again bounced back, this time for his first start in the colours of his new part-owner Gerard Augustin-Normand in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris. Following that first success at the top level, Onesto returned to the land of his birth to run a fine second to Luxembourg (Ire) in the G1 Irish Champion S., with **Vadeni** just behind him that time.



...It was Paddington, though, who captured hearts and minds. His inexorable progress saw him obliterate Chaldean, the Newmarket Guineas hero, when they went head-to-head in the St James's Palace Stakes at Royal Ascot. His name helped endear him to the broader public, but cold racing aficionados loved him as well. Here was a top-quality colt who had pace, was tactically versatile, went in all sorts of ground, possessed devastating acceleration and a terrier-like racing attitude.

"His career has been [a mixture of] great results and unlucky moments as well. He got some bad draws, sometimes it was the wrong ground," says de Chambure in reference to the heavy conditions the horse encountered in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe of 2022. "But, you know, every time things went his way, he showed how good he was, with that turn of foot, and that he was a true Group 1 horse and Group 1 winner.

"The Grand Prix de Paris is becoming one of the main race days in France of the year because it's Bastille Day, so there is a big concert and a lot of people at the races and a great atmosphere. He beat a really good field that day."

Remaining in training as a four-year-old, Onesto warmed up

with a fourth-place finish over a mile in the G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois and also took third, beaten just a length and

three-quarters when making his second appearance in the Arc last season.

De Chambure continues, "In France you have to have that tactical speed to quicken and that's his main attribute, I think. His last 600 metres in the Arc were amazing and he was only beaten a head for second. His last 200 metres were the quickest of the race."

Onesto's team of owners, a number of whom are also noted breeders, remains fully behind him at stud.

"It was good because there were some new owners in the game, so it was great for them. There were some older people

that have been involved in racing all their life. So it was a good mix," de Chambure adds. [Cont. p6](#)

"All of the people that were involved in his career are staying involved for his stallion career," he says. "And you know, he's got such a good pedigree, he could really make it as a stallion, and the journey continues because the group is the same. We've opened the horse for syndication but they all stayed involved at a level in the horse."

Haras d'Etreham's long history of standing stallions includes the recent extraordinary turnaround of **Wootton Bassett (GB)**, from a one-time €4,000 sire to his eventual sale to Coolmore and his current place as the joint-second-most expensive stallion in Europe. It would be no easy feat to emulate that story but de Chambure feels confident that Onesto has enough qualities to at least pique breeders' interest at this crucial early stage.

"When you talk to breeders, you feel that the last few years, some good horses have done it coming from lighter pedigrees and it was more the racing and the [horse's] sire that were important," he says. "Then a horse like Onesto retires, coming from one of the best Juddmonte families. And suddenly, breeders come to us and say they're so excited about this horse because he's so well bred. So it is very important to breeders, and it gives him credit. It gives him, I think, more chance than just another horse."

Onesto's next test comes when the doors of the Haras

d'Etreham stallion unit are thrown wide to welcome visitors during this weekend Route des Etalons. He's bound to be busy, but de Chambure is not worried about him coping with the extra attention.

He says, "He's travelled the world. He's been to Japan, he's been to America, he's been to the breeze-ups in Florida. So, you know, he's got a great mind and he has settled really well here."

CHELMSFORD SIGNS MEDIA RIGHTS EXTENSION, BECOMES RMG MEMBER

New long-term media rights extensions were completed between Chelmsford City Racecourse, Sports Information Services (SIS) and Racecourse Media Group (RMG), with the course becoming a member racecourse of RMG.

All betting and media rights across retail and digital channels are covered under the agreement, with racing continuing to be shown on the Racing TV channel and in betting shops via the SIS service. The Coursetrack system will also be utilised in order to provide live, in-race timing information at the Essex course, which is set to become the first venue in Britain to stage both turf and all-weather racing under floodlights. Substantial capital improvements are also planned, including an £85-million multipurpose grandstand.

Director of racing, Neil Graham said, "We are looking forward to working closely with SIS and RMG to strengthen our existing racing programme and to work on new initiatives. These deals give us the certainty by supporting ambitions for the racecourse to be bolder and more ambitious in its plans going forward."

SILVER LADY THE LATEST STAKES WINNER FOR SEA THE STARS IN CAPE VERDI

It was a stirring game of jockeyship, as Mickael Barzalona and **Silver Lady (GB)** (**Sea The Stars (Ire)**--Lumiere {GB}, by Shamardal) fended off the finishing rush of William Buick and **English Rose (Ire)** (**Frankel (GB)**) to win by a measured neck in the AED850,000 G2 Cape Verdi Presented by DP World CGG at Meydan on Friday. The Godolphin runners are both trained by Charlie Appleby. The duo had closed on stablemate **Shining Jewel (GB)** (**Siyouni (Fr)**) who had set the pace for much of the race until midstretch.

Just off the leaders and tossing her head leaving the stalls, the bay eventually relaxed as Shining Jewel showed the way. Well covered up heading into the turn, positions were largely unchanged on the bend, and Barzalona cued his charge just before the quarter-pole. She promptly collared Shining Jewel to take the advantage. Meanwhile, the formerly undefeated English Rose was winding up with her run to the subsequent winner's outside, and gave every appearance of edging past, but her greenness told late, as Silver Lady proved game to the line.

"She's got a mind of her own, a bit of temperament," said Barzalona of Silver Lady. "I took her down steady and she settled well during the race--it was rough the first part--but then she took a big breath and picked up well."

A winner of a Newmarket maiden when unveiled last April, Silver Lady was promptly third in the Listed Michael Seely Memorial Fillies' S. in May. Given some time off, she returned to take sixth in another listed race at HQ in September and failed to menace when unplaced in the G3 Pride S. there in October, her final appearance prior to Friday's triumph.

Pedigree Notes

The 4-year-old is the 116th stakes winner and 70th Pattern winner for her sire, who stands at Giltown Stud in Ireland under the banner of The Aga Khan Studs. The much-missed Shamardal now has 102 stakes winners and 52 group winners as a broodmare sire. The cross is also responsible for three other stakes winners led by four-time Group 3 winner Al Aasy (Ire).

Lumiere (GB) claimed the G1 Cheveley Park S. and was also placed in the G2 Lowther S., G2 Challenge S. and G3 Sceptre S. throughout her career. She hit black-type pay dirt with her first foal, the G3 Darley S. winner Highland Avenue (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), and Silver Lady is her second group winner. She has a full-sister to Highland Avenue named Dazzling Jewel who just turned three, a juvenile filly by **Siyouni (Fr)** and a yearling colt by Dubawi still to come.

Lumiere is a full-sister to GI E. P. Taylor S. heroine Sheikhha Reika (Fr) (Shamardal), herself the dam of the stakes-placed Arabic Legend (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}).

The Victorious runner, trained by Fawzi Nass, raced in between rivals on the front end from the chute and dropped back for a breather rounding the bend as fellow front-runner **Lahfaty** (Mitole) asserted while pressed by **Frost At Dawn** (Frosted). Adrie de Vries urged his mount to quicken at the head of the straight and she duly obliged with a strong turn of foot, as they shifted out into the centre of the track to challenge in the lane. The chestnut forged past the leading duo and strode clear to win with authority. Three-and-a-half lengths separated the second, Lahfaty, and third, **Kibo Misaki** (Girvin).

"I got a little bit of pressure on the turn; it got a little bit tight," said de Vries. "But once Jim's horse [Crowley, Frost At Dawn] came past me then it was just a matter of straightening up and she did the job pretty easy.

"I didn't want to be too hard on her, but I wanted to teach her something. Once she hits the front she doesn't do much--she's just having a look around. I guess that's a good thing."

Part of the Taylor Made consignment at the **2022 Keeneland September Sale**, the chestnut caught the eye of Lane Richardson, who shelled out \$100,000 on behalf of Kevin Knuckley. **Cont. p14**

'RISING STAR' NASH FACES TRACK PHANTOM IN LECOMTE REMATCH HEADLINING SATURDAY GRADED RACES

Like one of those old split-flap mechanical signs at train stations, everyone knows that in the new year the 'Run for the Roses' leaderboard will fluctuate. Week-to-week, the top points begin to compound--from 20 to the winner Saturday and going as high as 100 to the winner come April.

The trail to Derby 150 begins a much steeper ascent on Saturday at Fair Grounds in New Orleans as the GIII Lecomte S. offers 3-year-old colts 20-10-6-4-2 that can be applied to Bank of Churchill.

This year's edition pits a field of eight against one another with the central question being: what happened to **Nash** (**Medaglia d'Oro**) in the December running of the **Gun Runner S.**?

The heavy favorite was unable to build on his Nov. 12 '**TDN Rising Star**' performance under the Twin Spires at second asking when he powered to the lead, torched a field of maidens by 10 1/4 lengths and posted a 97 Beyer for trainer Brad Cox.

The race shape in the **Gun Runner** was nothing of the sort for the Godolphin homebred, as he was forced to watch **Track Phantom** (**Quality Road**) take control toward the end of the backstretch and never relinquish the lead.

Taylor continued: "Those are two of the best horses we ever raised, so it's really exciting to have this filly on the farm."

Bred by Fred W. Hertrich III, Juju's Map was a \$300,000 Keeneland September purchase for the Albaugh family. She broke her maiden in her second start for Brad Cox and went on to claim the 2021 GI Darley Alcibiades S. and run second to **Echo Zulu (Gun Runner)** in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. A winner and three times graded stakes placed at three, Juju's Map was sent through the ring at the Keeneland November Sale in 2022, but she RNA'd for \$1.9 million and stayed with the Albaugh family.

Taylor said the mating of **Flightline** and Juju's Map produced a good blend of both Grade I-caliber horses.

"The filly has the looks of **Flightline**, but she also has some of the mare," he explained. "The mating matches up well physically

and pedigree-wise, and you're just breeding the best to the best and hoping for the best."

Taylor added that Juju's Map will visit **Curlin** in 2024.

As for the foal, Taylor hypothesized that for now, it's a coin toss as to whether the youngster would one day see the sales ring or race in the Albaugh silks. The filly's broodmare sire and his family carry a well-known story on just that subject.

"We had **Liam's Map** here as a yearling and the Albaughs really never sold many of their horses," Taylor recalled. "He was by Unbridled's Song and he was the best yearling on the farm, so we talked them into selling him. He brought \$800,000 and we were all very excited about the way he

was sold until he won the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile and they syndicated him for a lot more than \$800,000. Then fast forward and Mr. Albaugh was back here and we were showing him the Giant's Causeway colt out of the same mare and we said, 'Man, this one could bring maybe \$1 million or \$2 million.'" **Cont.**

Taylor continued: "His response was, 'Not this time.'"

Not This Time, who was runner-up in the 2016 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile for Dennis Albaugh and his family, stands for \$150,000 this year as a fifth-crop sire at Taylor Made and is now embarking on a career as a sire of sires with 3-year-old champion **Epicenter** beginning his second year at Ashford Stud and MGISW **Up to the Mark** debuting at Lane's End.

Plenty of superbly bred horses will hit the ground at Taylor Made in the coming weeks, but Taylor said there is no denying that having the first foal by a horse like the undefeated **Flightline**--who stood for \$200,000 and covered 152 mares in his debut season--is a special honor.

"You dream about these horses becoming great racehorses and this filly is really bred to go a distance, so maybe someday we'll see her in the Oaks," he said. "That'd be a dream come true."

"It was great to see him [Track Phantom] win the race against a talented field, but especially with going as fast as they did early and showing enough quality to still respond," said the winner's trainer Steve Asmussen. "I love how he's doing, very happy with him and how he's trained since the **Gun Runner**. I feel good about the draw and excited to run him again. Past success from there so we'll see what we can do."

Of course, the pair will have others to contend with in this spot and chief among them is **Lat Long** (**Liam's Map**). The dark bay trained by Ken McPeck was never out of the money in all five of his juvenile starts against maiden special weight company starting at Churchill back in September. **Cont.**

Facing the likes of GSW **Dornoch** (**Good Magic**) and Track Phantom himself, Lat Long broke through at Oaklawn Dec. 17 against his stablemate and next-out winner **Common Defense** (**Karakontie {Jpn}**).

"[Lat Long] has been a horse who is still trying to figure it out a bit," McPeck said. "He's not all there yet. But we're going to try him at a higher level and see how he handles tougher company."

Also after points is **Can Group** (**Good Samaritan**), who was last seen running fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at Santa Anita for trainer Mark Casse. Joining him will be two more Cox runners in **Ethan Energy** (**Uncle Mo**), who broke his maiden by 5 1/4 lengths at second asking over this surface Dec. 23, and **Awesome Road** (**Quality Road**). Bred by Claiborne Farm, the latter was a \$600,000 Keeneland September purchase by Albaugh Family Stables and Donegal Racing.

Saudi Crown Kick Starts His 4-Year-Old Campaign

Preceding the Lecomte is the GIII Louisiana S. for 4-year-olds and up going 1 1/16th miles on the main track. This race marks the return of **Saudi Crown** (**Always Dreaming**). Now a 4-year-old, the gray debuted a winner by 4 3/4 lengths at Keeneland last April, then won against allowance company at Churchill Downs a month later.

Finishing over the summer as the runner-up by a nose in the GIII Dwyer S. at Belmont Park and in the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga, the Brad Cox trainee set the pace en route to the winner's circle in the GI Pennsylvania Derby at Parx in September. A popular pick in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, the colt finished a well-beaten 10th to close out his year.

"I'm not treating it like he has to be on the lead," Cox said. "He's a smart horse. He's capable of sitting off." **Cont.**

Cox continued: "When he broke his maiden, he sat off horses. I really don't think he has to be on the lead. It probably will be a situation where he will have to take a breath at some point, you can't just run all-out throughout."

After Cox watched Saudi Crown drill five furlongs behind Nash Jan. 13 (1:00.20, 3/51), the trainer said, "It didn't quite set up as well as we expected. There were other horses out there and we got caught up with a little more company than we wanted. I was very, very happy with the breeze. He was a little wide through the lane and around the turn. Plenty fit. He had a good work the week before last. We just wanted him to cruise along the other day and he did. I think he's set up for a big spot."

Opposing him in New Orleans are a number of seasoned challengers looking to set the tone for their own campaigns.

Smile Happy (Runhappy) has not been seen since he ran fifth in the GI Stephen Foster S. at Ellis Park in July. The **'TDN Rising Star'** has a resume which includes a pair of Grade II wins in the Kentucky Jockey Club S. as a juvenile and in last year's Alysheba S.--both at Churchill Downs.

Making the gate is deep closer GSW **Red Route One (Gun Runner)**, defending winner and GISP **Happy American (Runhappy)** and GII Rebel S. hero **Confidence Game (Candy Ride {Arg})**.

Midnight Memories Faces Desert Dawn Once Again

Swinging out to Santa Anita Park on Saturday afternoon, the GIII La Canada S. has MGSW **Midnight Memories (Mastery)** taking on MGISP **Desert Dawn (Cupid)**. The last time these two met as 4-year-old fillies in the GIII Bayakoa S. at Los Alamitos Dec. 15, it was Midnight Memories who got the best of her rival by a length. Favored at 6-5 on the morning line, the Bob Baffert trainee will also have to contend with, among others, GISP **Musical Mischief (Into Mischief)** and **Coffee in Bed (Curlin)**.

C2 RACING STABLE SELLS AN INTEREST IN WHITE ABARRIO TO HRH PRINCE FAISAL OF SAUDI ARABIA

Brothers Mark and Clint Cornett, who race under the name of C2 Racing Stable, have taken on HRH Prince Faisal Bin Khaled Bin Abdul Aziz Al Saud of Saudi Arabia as a partner in the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic winner **White Abarrio** (Race Day). The 5-year-old will make his next in the Feb. 24 running of the G1 Saudi Cup. Mark Cornett said that C2 remains the majority owner, but declined to say how big of a percentage was sold.

The story was first reported by the *Daily Racing Form's* Mike Welsh.

Prince Faisal is the owner who lured trainer Jimmy Jerkens to Saudi Arabia to train a string of his horses.

"Winning the Saudi Cup is very important to them," Mark Cornett said. "It's in his backyard and he'll be representing his country in an international race. You're going to have four or five Japanese horses, horses from all over the world. It's very important to them that they represent the Saudi people."

Cornett said the deal has been in the works for about four weeks.

"We've been working on this for about a month," he said. "They've flown over a couple of times to watch the horse breeze. Their vet has come over twice from France to do his due diligence. They ended up pulling the trigger on it and we consummated the deal this week. They're going to be great partners for us and we will be great partners to them. We look forward to doing additional things with them in the future."

White Abarrio has remained at Santa Anita since winning the Breeders' Cup Classic there. Cornett said the gray will board a plane from LAX to Miami Feb. 13. From there, he will be joined by South Florida-based horses who will also be running on the Saudi Cup card before heading straight to Riyadh.

Though the owners have not committed to any races beyond the Saudi Cup, Cornett said the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 30 is definitely a possibility.

"The Dubai World Cup is definitely on our list of races," he said. "He'll have to run the right way in the Saudi Cup and come out the race the right way. All the stars are going to have to line up. If that happens, we'll go in the Dubai World Cup. If not, we'll bring him back to New York and take a look at the Met Mile."

White Abarrio worked four furlongs (:47.60, 6/73) on Friday morning at Santa Anita.

"The horse is doing better than he's ever done," Cornett said. "I talked to [trainer] Rick [Dutrow] this morning. He breezed a half in :47 3/5 as good as he ever has and came out of the work great. The horse is definitely on his game."

As an owner and breeder, Janney has campaigned numerous top-class horses, including homebred graded stakes winners **Coronado's Quest** (Forty Niner), winner of the GI Haskell S. and GI Travers S. in 1998, **Air Support** (Smart Strike), **Celestial City** (**Uncle Mo**), **Data Link** (**War Front**), **Hymn Book** (Arch), **Ironicus** (Distorted Humor), **Norumbega** (Tiznow) and **On Leave** (**War Front**). Janney, in partnership with the Phipps Stable, was co-owner and co-breeder of 2013 GI Kentucky Derby winner **Orb** (Malibu Moon) as well as of GISW **Carriage Trail** (Giant's Causeway).

Born into a Maryland racing family, Janney was raised with an appreciation of the sport through his parents and grandparents. The former, Stuart and Barbara Janney, bred and owned the Eclipse Award-winning champion and Hall of Fame inductee Ruffian. In the 1990s, the younger Janney began owning and breeding Thoroughbreds on his own and has continued to do so for more than three decades.

Janney's reach and influence extends well beyond the winner's circle into many of Thoroughbred racing's most important organizations. Janney has been a member of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association since 1992, serving as chairman from 1997 to 2001 and having served multiple terms on the board of trustees. He also served as a board member of the Maryland Horse Breeders Association from 1992 to 1997 and president of the Maryland Million Ltd. from 1994 to 1997. He was appointed by Maryland Governor Parris Glendening in 1999 to chair the Maryland Commission to Study Ways to Improve the Financial Viability of the Racing Industry. Additionally, Janney served on the board of Keeneland from 1998 to 2015. He currently serves on the board of the New York

Racing Association, the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation, Equibase Company and BloodHorse LLC.

Under his leadership, 5 Stones intelligence was engaged to investigate horse racing, resulting in federal prosecutions and significant penalties. Before his racing involvement, Janney had a career in the federal government, practiced law, and served as a managing director at Alex Brown & Sons. He is chairman emeritus of Bessemer Trust Company and is involved in various organizations, including serving on the board of King Ranch Inc.

Janney, a graduate of the University of North Carolina and the University of Maryland School of Law, is married with two children and resides in Butler, Maryland.

In addition to his Jerome win, Drum Roll Please was third behind Dornoch (**Good Magic**) and Sierra Leone (**Gun Runner**) in the GII Remsen S. in December. His next target was reportedly the Feb. 3 GIII Withers S.

looks like an **Uncle Mo**, with that hip and balance and long legs. He has that look to him."

Mo Donegal joined **Nyquist** as Classic-winning sons of leading sire **Uncle Mo** when he captured his biggest win in the 2022 GI Belmont S. Campaigned by trainer Todd Pletcher and owners Repole Stable and Donegal Racing, Mo Donegal also won the GII Remsen S. and the GII Wood Memorial S. over Classic winner **Early Voting** (**Gun Runner**).

Mo Donegal retired to Spendthrift with earnings of \$1,511,800. He bred 186 mares in his first book in 2023 and is set to stand his second season for a fee of \$15,000 S&N.

Aqueduct Racetrack will remain open for simulcasting on Saturday and online wagering is available through the NYRA Bets website. Saturday’s featured race, the Listed \$150,000 Interborough S., will be brought back Saturday, Jan. 27 with entries to be taken Wednesday, Jan. 24.

Live racing is scheduled to resume on Sunday with a nine-race card featuring the \$100,000 Rego Park S. First post is 12:20 p.m. ET.

Shortly thereafter, poor weather conditions due to the ongoing winter storm in the Mid-Atlantic region caused the Maryland Jockey Club (MJC) to cancel Saturday’s 10-race program at Laurel Park, the club said in a Friday release.

Laurel, Pimlico Race Course, Rosecroft Raceway and the MJC OTB network will remain open Saturday for simulcasting. Live racing is scheduled to resume Sunday at Laurel with a post of 12:25 p.m. ET.

Earlier on Friday, the Maryland Jockey Club cancelled Laurel Park racing after the same winter storm dropped several inches of snow across Northern and Central Maryland.

Oaklawn Park and Turfway Park were also forced to cancel their weekend programs due to inclement weather.

BAFFERT STABLEMATES STAR AT SANTA

A pair of pricey Bob Baffert stablemates make their anticipated debuts Saturday to open the card at Santa Anita. **NORMANDY LANDING** (*Gun Runner*), out of a daughter of MGISW and Kentucky Oaks heroine Flute (Seattle Slew), brought \$1,050,000 from the 'Avengers' as a yearling at Keeneland. Dam Perfect Flute, who has already produced this runner's winning full-sibling, is herself a half to GSW/MGISP Filmbi (Mizzen Mast) and to the dams of GSW Current (*Curlin*) and GISW Weep No More (*Mineshaft*).

He'll break outside of stablemate **Maymun** (*Frosted*), a successful pinhook who brought a top-five price of \$900,000 from Zedan Racing Stables at last year's OBS April sale after selling for just \$50,000 as a yearling at Keeneland the year prior. The son of *Frosted* seems to have plenty of speed, tuning up for this debut with a best-of-65 drill Jan. 13 (four furlongs in :47).

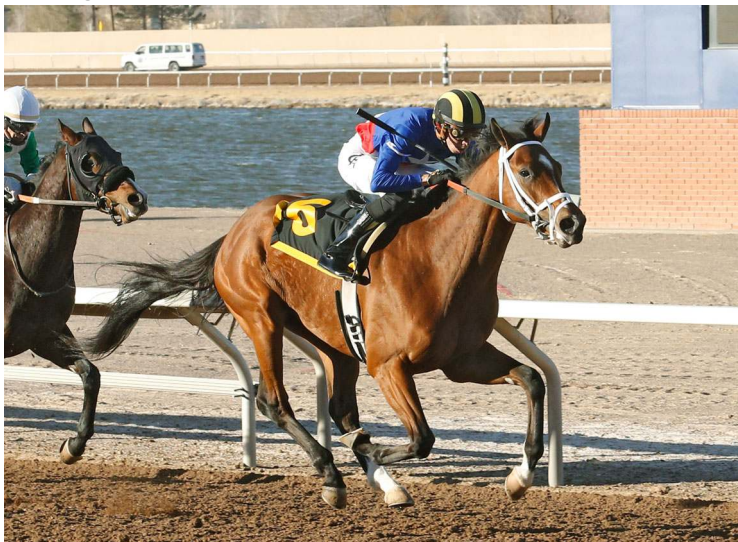

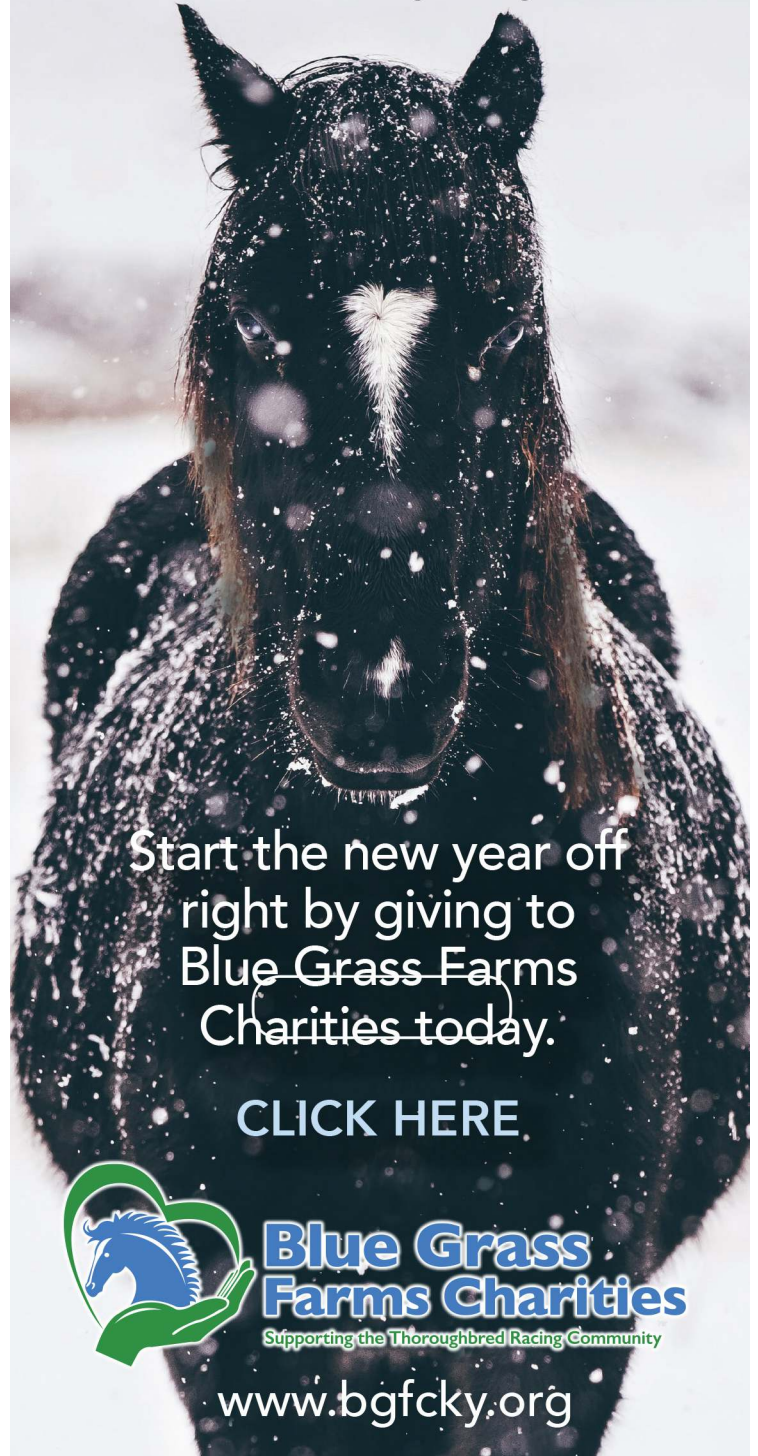
