



KELLY THOMAS Q&A: 'SOME BREEDERS HAVE TOLD ME THAT I AM THEIR INSPIRATION'

Kelly Thomas enjoyed a banner year with Vandeek (GB) (Havana Grey {GB}), who she bred at her Maywood Stud, going unbeaten in a spellbinding two-year-old campaign that featured Group 1 wins in the Prix Morny and Middle Park S.

In this week's Q&A, Thomas revealed how some people in the industry have shared with her that she has become an inspiration for smaller breeders. She also lifted the lid on her own hopes and dreams for Vandeek this season and explained her philosophy to breeding.

BS: You have had lots to dream about over the past few months. Where is the ceiling with Vandeek?

KT: Gosh, who knows? Everybody is excited about what could be. What he has shown so far, if he can carry on the same trajectory for a little bit longer, you don't know where he will end up.

In your heart of hearts, could you see him staying a mile or is he pure unbridled speed? Cont. p3

SIZE HOLDS STRONG HAND FOR HONG KONG CLASSIC MILE by Alan Carasso

One of the best trainers in Hong Kong history, John Size is a three-time winner of the Hong Kong Classic Mile, a 1600-metre event that serves as the first of the three legs of the Classics series restricted to 4-year-olds from both the Northern and Southern Hemispheres. The 12-times champion conditioner, who is approaching 1500 career victories, has two bonafide chances to add a fourth Classic Mile Sunday in the form of Helios Express (Aus) (Toronado {Ire}) and Howdeepisyourlove (Aus) (Deep Field {Aus}).

Helios Express is the lone member of the nine-horse field rated north of 100, and he has earned it with four wins from his six starts dating back to last June, including a powerful 2 3/4-length victory in a Class 2 over Sunday's distance Jan. 7. That effort has stamped him as the \$1.40 (2-5) jolly overnight and Hugh Bowman has the call before beginning a suspension.

"He made the adaption to 1600 (metres) more or less straight away, he seemed to travel not too bad," the always matter-of-fact Size said of his latest effort. "He was a little bit strong, I guess, but still managed it in a slow-run race and he sprinted well off a slow speed, that's about all we expected from him.



KT: I think that, if a race was run to suit, the mile wouldn't bother him. If he is dilly-dallying at the back, he's not going to waste an ounce of energy and, then if it came down to a turn of foot at the end, you could almost see him doing it. He's a tall horse, has a really good stride and he relaxes in his races so I suppose you could say, from that perspective, he might be able to do it. His grandmother won over a mile in France so it's in the pedigree. But, what's he best at? Probably the distance he has been racing at, which is over six furlongs.


There's nothing wrong with fast horses.

There's not. I like speed horses and that excites us. It seems to be what we have managed to do quite well with over the years so we stick to it. That's not to say we don't look outside the box as well when it comes to stallion choices and to buying mares. But speed is generally the way we tend to go and we try to breed commercially as well. You need to be able to bring something to the sales that will be attractive to buyers; something that is precocious, early and fast. That's the way we have been heading.

The big thing I would say about your success story with Vandeek is that it would have given a lot of smaller breeders huge encouragement to keep going despite what was a very difficult year.

Absolutely. I've had so many text messages and phone calls from some people that I have never even met before. Some people have told me that I am their inspiration! All I could say, was, 'thank you very much.' It definitely has given a lot of people hope. But it's very difficult. Financially, it's a hard thing to do. We do all of the work ourselves and it's only recently that I have managed to get somebody in to help with the mucking out on the days that I am not here. That will help to take the pressure off my husband a little bit. We've always done it on a bit of a shoe-string.

I did my Masters in Equine Science and I tend to draw on that knowledge a lot as well. I think it helps in keeping horses healthy and in their best condition which, in the long run, makes them more efficient. The biggest gamble you are ever going to take in this industry is breeding because you never know what you are going to get. If you are lucky, you get a nice foal but, if you are unlucky, you might get something that won't even make it through the sales ring. My Dad is in a different business to us and often says that this is the only profession where, often the product you produce might not be worth what went into producing it. That can put you in a very difficult position, especially if you have invested heavily. Cont. p4

And given the current economic climate, have you made any changes to how you run your operation with regards to reinvesting in the broodmare band or maybe not putting some of your mares in foal?

We try to be economical and efficient in everything we do and we've never really spent a lot of money on stud fees. If we have wanted to use some of the more expensive stallions, we have tended to do foal shares. But, with regards to covering and not covering mares, when you only have five mares like we do, you have to keep plugging away. If you don't breed anything you don't have a chance of making any money. You have to keep the wheel turning otherwise you will have nothing to sell. If you were to leave one mare off for a year, you are guaranteed that one of the mares you did choose to breed from won't go in foal, so then there's two mares who aren't producing for you in a year.

And Mosa Mine (GB) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}), the dam of Vandeek, could be viewed as a triumph for perseverance with

regards to giving your stud a major payday given her Starspangledbanner (Aus) colt sold to Coolmore Stud for 450,000gns at the Tattersalls December Foal Sale last year.

The triumph of that is for a little stud like ours to produce a horse that will be trained at Ballydoyle. I think that is amazing. For us to have a horse trained at Ballydoyle and the prospects of Vandeek becoming a stallion in the same year, it's a dream come true really. A result like that is nice because we can invest a bit into facilities and look at buying our next broodmare. I haven't really felt the rain on my back this winter. It does put a spiring in your step, that's for sure.

Remind us how Mosa Mine joined your broodmare band?

We bred Mosa Mine to begin with. She was a beautiful foal; in fact, we named her Bonny because she was a bonny wee thing. It was back in the days when we had just moved to this property and we had no stables at the time. She was a May baby and we foaled her in the field because the weather was kind. We sold her as a yearling but she probably didn't reach her potential on the track. We loved her and decided that we wanted her back. We thought she wouldn't make much money at the horses-in-training sale, and she didn't [£800], so that was great for us.

And what does the future hold for her?

She's not in foal at the moment but she is going back to Havana Grey (GB). It's kind of an obvious choice but then again, you think can lightning really strike twice? But it's a proven recipe at the highest level and Havana Grey seems to be progressing all the time so it suits. When you look at the other proven stallions, you could be looking at the likes of No Nay Never, which is at a much higher price and therefore we'd have to consider a foal share. With Havana Grey, we could possibly think of retaining the next filly out of the mare if we wanted to.

I know you said that you have a penchant for speed but what sort of stallions are your mares in foal to?

We've got a sister to Mosa Mine by Compton Place (GB) and she is in foal to Twilight Son (GB). We've gone for speed there in the thinking that the progeny could end up becoming quite a nice breeze-up prospect as Twilight Son had quite a good time of it at the breeze-ups last year. The family is quick and it might just suit. Then we have a Medicean (GB) mare in foal to Masar (Ire), so that is something a bit different. But then again, Masar showed guite a bit of

speed as a two-year-old as well, so that helps. She has already produced a lovely horse by Masar called Move On In (GB), who is trained by Ralph Beckett, and it was off the back of him that

we sent the mare back to the stallion. She had an Ardad (GB) in between and he's gone to breeze. We also have a mare in foal to Perfect Power (Ire), so speed again. We have done well with first-season sires in the past.

Could you put your philosophy towards breeding into words?

Wow. That is a tough one but you have to enjoy it. This doesn't feel like work to me. I might be mucking out all day long but it doesn't really feel

like work. It's a lifestyle. You have to take the highs and the lows and you mustn't take the lows personally. If you talk to other breeders, everybody suffers the lows. Not everybody gets to enjoy the highs, but we all suffer the lows. When you get the highs, you have to enjoy them without looking at them like a pleasure plane. You have to do your best by your horses; look

after them, keep them healthy and well fed. We've a good team of vets, farriers and local feed merchants and that all helps. Above all else, you need the help and support of your friends and family. When it comes to deciding on your stallions, you

have to go with what you like, what you can afford and what you hope will work, and you must make your own decisions. When I first started, there were times when I took advice on stallion choices. If it didn't work out, then that person would get the blame and I don't like that. I'd prefer to live and die by my own decisions and remain positive. I'm an optimist at the end of the day.

It's a refreshing story, especially in a year where

You are very lucky when it

there was a lot of doom and gloom. And, who knows, maybe you can inspire one more breeder to keep going and maybe they will breed a champion like Vandeek.

happens to you but, you must remember, you can breed the best to the best and get the worst. I was talking to John Deere before and he was explaining how, you put a bunch of genes from the stallion and the mare into a bucket and you take a handful of each and, what you're left with, that's what you get. It's true, really, isn't it? In saying that, I have chosen the mares I want to

breed from so it's not exactly random but, when you do put the ones you like together, there is no predicting what you might get.

Heaven's Sake (GB) (13, Cape Cross {Ire}), going to Without Parole (GB)

I am a small breeder with only one broodmare trying to get myself going commercially. My broodmare is named Heaven's Sake, by Cape Cross out of a Giant's Causeway mare. Due to her own middle-distance pedigree, and my personal ambition to breed a nice middle-distance racehorse, and being based in the UK this year I am sending her to Without Parole. He's a Group 1 winning son of Frankel (GB) over a mile and the potential foal would be very exciting. He's also terrific value at £8,000 and his stock looked very athletic and really caught the eye at the yearling sales. In my case, it was a no-brainer.

BAAEED'S HALF-BROTHER BACK AT NEWCASTLE

18.30 Newcastle, Novice, £16,000, 3yo/up, 8f (AWT) WALEEFY (IRE) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) bids to build on his encouraging debut third at Lingfield two days before Christmas with the eyes of the world watching as is inevitable when you are a half-brother to Shadwell's brilliant Baaeed (GB) and his fellow Sea The Stars-sired sibling Hukum (Ire). Like that pair under the tutelage of William Haggas, the homebred was slowly away on debut but has that experience under his belt meeting a newcomer of note in Ballylinch Stud's 250,000gns Tatts Book 1 purchase Las Ramblas (GB) (Lope De Vega (Ire)), a Roger Varian-trained half-brother to the G1 1000 Guineas heroine Legatissimo (Ire) (Danehill Dancer (Ire)).

HK Classic Preview Cont.

The gelding has four wins to his credit, all over the 1200-metre distance and each at Happy Valley, and he'll need to lift here to make his presence felt.

There are 34 stakes races held each season in Hong Kong, and the Classic Mile is the only one to have thus far eluded champion jockey Zac Purton. He takes the reins on **Helene** Feeling (Ire) (Sioux Nation) for Danny Shum and actually exits a try at group level when he was third as the favourite in the G3 January Cup H. at the city circuit Jan. 10. Winner of four from 10 in Hong Kong, he raced in England as Indian Dream and was a two-time scorer in the lower grades while under the care of Michael Bell.

Beauty Crescent (Ire), whose sire Acclamation (GB) was responsible for 2022 Classic Mile and now multiple Group 1 winner Romantic Warrior (Ire), won the Listed Blenheim S. in 2022 while under the care of Ger Lyons, and though he may not quite be up to winning this, can contend for a minor award. He exits a pair of luckless runs in Class 3 over 1400 metres and attacked the line on both occasions. Andrea Atzeni rides for the legendary Tony Cruz.

HOLY SMOKES! HADES PULLS OFF FRONTRUNNING SHOCKER IN HOLY BULL

All eyes were on Eclipse Award and runaway GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero **Fierceness** (City of Light) making his seasonal debut in Saturday's GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream Park.

The tote read 1-5 on the champ, but the Repole homebred and 'TDN Rising Star' was out of gas when push came to shove, and, in a bit of an oddly run race, D J Stable and Robert Cotran's unbeaten Hades (Awesome Slew) controlled a moderate tempo, slipped away from Fierceness in the final furlong and held off Domestic Product (Practical Joke) by two lengths for a 9-1 upset and 20 points on the Road to the Kentucky Derby.

"This is what you hope for," D J Stable's Jonathan Green said. "You hope you have a horse that's this good that can carry your dreams into another level for the Florida Derby and then the Kentucky Derby. The thing that was so exciting to me about this race was not only the way that (trainer) Joe (Orseno) campaigned the horse, which was outstanding. He knows how to handle a horse and get him into the Triple Crown races. But I was so happy that our horse went eyeball-to-eyeball with a champ and put him away. To me, that really shows something." NYS-E AND EASY IN THE ROBERT B. LEWIS

Things may not have gone strictly according to script for undefeated 'TDN Rising Star' Nysos (Nyquist) in Saturday's GIII Robert B. Lewis S., as he was perhaps a half-step slowly away, and with a trio of rivals hellbent on being part of the pace battle, was forced to sit farther off the speed than he'd done in either of his previous towering victories. At the end of the day, it mattered very little, as the Bob Baffert trainee came with a bold run three wide into the lane and went on to treat his six other rivals to a 7 1/2-length beating.

Though Nysos did lay fourth early on before bolting up in the GIII Bob Hope S. at Del Mar Nov. 19--having earned 'Rising Star' accolades when graduating by better than 10 lengths the previous month--those were sprinter-type splits ahead of him at Del Mar and he would need to prove he could switch off behind fractions that were sure to be slower on balance. Making his two-turn debut Saturday, Hades, a \$130,000 OBS April purchase, was driven away from his rail draw by Paco Lopez, and Fierceness was also given a dig by John Velazquez in an effort to gain some forward position, but Fierceness did get fired up a bit as a result. Hades made the running from Inveigled (Enticed) and a three-wide Fierceness, and sensing a slow pace, Velazquez sent Fierceness into the lead a good three furlongs

from home.

Right alongside and in with every chance, Fierceness and Hades appeared to lightly brush inside the eighth pole and while Fierceness had no more to give, Hades kicked on to cause the surprise. Domestic Product, making his first start since a well-beaten seventh in the GII Remsen S. Dec. 2, sat an inside trip and got through at the fence into the stretch before going on to claim second.

Hades rallied from last of seven to win at first asking going 5 1/2 furlongs in a \$50,000 maiden optional claimer (not in for the tag) at Gulfstream Park Dec. 9. He dueled free from his rail draw to win by daylight in a first-level state-bred allowance going seven furlongs at Gulfstream last time Dec. 31.

"The plan was to go to the lead, but if somebody was pushing him he was going to rate him," Orseno said. "It looked like he started to do that when that one horse went up to him, and then Paco had to go. He knew it. When the horse accelerates, he's just got another gear at the top of the stretch. He showed it to us last time. Of course, a champion eyeballs him and he dug in and took off. He ran away from a very good horse. It was our day today. We'll see next time, but right now we'll enjoy the moment."

Orseno added, "I'm going to let the horse tell us (what's next). Right now, I would say no (to the Fountain of Youth), but if the



horse is sharp... he's lightly raced. He's run five and a half and seven furlongs. It's not like he's been pushed."

It wasn't the easiest of journeys for Fierceness, who was defeated by 3 1/2 lengths following a wide trip after getting pinballed at the start. His resume also includes a puzzling seventh as the heavy favorite in last fall's GI Champagne S.

"He didn't get off to a very good start," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "The inside horse bumped him pretty good and then he got sandwiched and kind of had to shove him into the race and try to get the position we wanted, which we eventually did. But, he had to overcome a pretty rough start to get there. It seemed like he got into a good rhythm and straightened away for home and just kind of flattened out a little bit. Disappointed in the outcome. I think if you watch the replay of the start, it was a pretty rough start, kind of similar to what happened in the Champagne. If he doesn't get away well, he doesn't get into the flow of the race the same way."

He continued, "I don't think we're going to change any plans. We'll obviously assess how the horse comes out of the race. We know he's better than that, so we've got to regroup a little bit and do better next time. He's shown that he can recover from a sub-par performance with a good one."

Pedigree Notes:

Hades is the second stakes winner and first at the graded level for Awesome Slew. The win gave broodmare sire Quality Road his 11th black-type winner and fifth graded/group winner worldwide. D J Stable went to \$130,000 (:21 1/5) to recruit Hades from the 2023 OBS April Sale. The year prior, his halfsister Devious Dame (Girvin) brought \$240,000 from One Up Bloodstock out of the OBS March Sale. Devious Dame won her first two races by a combined 10 3/4 lengths and lived up to heavy favoritism with a sharp victory in the Astoria S. at Belmont Park. She brought \$185,000 from Woods Edge Farm at the 2023 KEENOV sale. Hades's third dam is GISW Pretty Discreet (Private Account), herself the dam of GISWs Discreet Cat (Forestry) and Discreetly Mine (Mineshaft). Their unraced dam The Shady Lady is a half-sister to MSW & MGSP Courtesan (Street Sense). She is also represented by a 2-year-old full brother to Hades and a yearling filly by Girvin. She visited Win Win Win for 2024.



Indeed, stretching out to a route of ground for the first time Saturday, Nysos settled nicely enough for Flavien Prat, about five lengths away from the hard-sent **Scatify** (Justify), his stablemate **Wine Me Up** (Vino Rosso) and **Mc Vay** (Constitution) down the backstretch and past the half-mile in :46.67.

Still fourth as they raced into the final three-eighths of a mile, Nysos gained inside of Mc Vay with under three furlongs to travel, was switched out wide under a full head of steam at the quarter pole and kicked home in a race of his own. Wine me Up won the battle for second over Scatify.

It was the sixth win in a row and 12th in the race for trainer Bob Baffert, who trained Silver Charm for Bob and Beverly Lewis to win the 1997 GI Kentucky Derby. General Challenge provided him with his first back in 1999, when the race was contested as the Santa Catalina S. It was renamed for Lewis following his


passing in 2006. Nysos is ineligible for this year's Derby, having been left with Baffert at the Jan. 29th deadline.

"He stumbled a bit leaving there, but he was in a good spot," the winning trainer commented. "Prat rode him with a lot of confidence, he knows the horse well. I love the fact that he has speed and he proved he can do two turns. He has a great mind. He is a really good colt. You can just sit there and push the button at any time. It makes it so much easier for the riders, but I still get a little nervous."

Pedigree Notes:

One of 22 stakes winners and 11 graded winners for his Kentucky Derby-winning sire, Nysos is bred on the same cross that produced GI Summer S. hero Gretzky the Great from Nyquist's first crop to the races in 2020, and the cross over A.P. Indy and his stallions sons has resulted in fellow Grade I winner Vequist and Grade II victress Turnerloose. Bernardini dams have produced Grade I winner Mo Town and other graded scorers Modernist and Mopotism when bred to Nyquist's sire Uncle Mo.

The unraced Zetta Z, a granddaughter of GI Breeders' Cup Distaff upsetter Unbridled Elaine, is the dam of four winners from five to race and she has become increasingly popular from a commercial standpoint. Before Hades blossomed from a \$130,000 Keeneland November weanling and \$150,000 Fasig-Tipton October yearling into a \$550,000 OBS April breezer, the mare's now 2-year-old Street Sense filly was a \$70,000 KEENOV purchase turned \$170,000 FTKOCT acquisition after Zetta Z changed hands for \$35,000 at KEENOV in 2021. Zetta Z's colt by Uncle Mo's son Yaupon was knocked down for \$450,000 at Keeneland last November, the priciest of 44 of the stallion's foals reported as sold in 2023. Zetta Z was covered by Cyberknife last year.



Asked to improve approaching three furlongs from home, the Butch Reid-trained Uncle Heavy appeared to be running in place as El Grande O and Khanate began to separate themselves at the quarter pole.

the final eighth of a mile, pinched a break and looked on his way to victory, but Uncle Heavy kept plugging away and was shoved across the line first. El Grande O was second ahead of even-money favorite **Lightline** (City of Light) in third.





One of four Kentucky Derby preps run Saturday, the \$800,000 GIII Southwest S. at Oaklawn Park was the richest. It also promised to be the most wide-open betting contest and it didn't disappoint as a mud-splattered 11-1 **Mystik Dan** (Goldencents) pulled the upset for trainer Kenny McPeek. Last fall's Ed Brown S. winner **Just Steel** (Justify) got up for second while GIII Street Sense S. winner **Liberal Arts** (Arrogate) secured third. The Southwest offers points on a 20-10-6-4-2 scale for the Road to the Kentucky Derby.

Out from the 10 post in the mud, Mystik Dan broke sharply only to angle over to the rail and settle midpack under Brian Hernandez, Jr. **Otto the Conqueror** (Street Sense), winner of the

Springboard Mile S. in December, set a :23.56 and :47.95 pace up front with his ears pricked while previously undefeated race favorite and 'TDN Rising Star' Carbone (Mitole) pressured him from the outside. Meanwhile, Mystik Dan bided his time on the rail, with Hernandez carefully concealing the power about to be unleashed. Just Steel, keen early in fourth, collared Otto the Conqueror from the outside off the turn and looked to be running easily while Mystik Dan, so close to the rail he could have scraped paint, found a seam and burst through. The two spent the briefest of moments on even terms before Mystik Dan thumbed his nose at the competition, simply forgetting to stop as he looked stronger with every stride and sailed home eight lengths to the good after being geared down late. It was a visually impressive performance as Just Steel held for second, a neck over a closing Liberal Arts, who was nine lengths clear of the rest.

An open-daylight maiden sprint winner at Churchill in November, Mystik Dan brought a field-best 96 Beyer Speed Figure into the Southwest. Last seen finishing fifth behind Catching Freedom (Constitution) in Oaklawn's Smarty Jones S. on New Year's Day at his first try at the Southwest distance, he had faded in the stretch that day after pressing the pace.

McPeek and Hernandez also teamed up to win Oaklawn's Kentucky Oaks points race on Saturday--the \$250,000 Martha Washington S.--with longshot Band of Gold (Preservationist). The pair of victories marked the first wins by each of the veterans in both of the races.

FIRST STAKES WIN FOR LIFE'S AN AUDIBLE IN SWEETEST CHANT

Her Todd Pletcher-trained sire was fond of Gulfstream, getting the two biggest wins of his career in the GI Florida Derby and the GII Holy Bull S. at the Hallandale oval, and now Life's an Audible (Audible) is following suit, also for Pletcher. Showing a flair for drama, Life's an Audible waited until late and made it close in victory over last-out maiden winner Style Points (Oscar Performance) in the GIII Sweetest Chant S. at Gulfstream Park Saturday. Dynamic Pricing (Ire) (Night of Thunder {Ire}) was third.

The chestnut Life's an Audible lingered second from last behind: 23.59 and: 47.06 early fractions while Macanga (American Pharoah) showed the way up front. Macanga didn't run out of steam until the top of the stretch, when a stalking Style Points found room on the rail. At the same time, on the turn from the back, Irad Ortiz, Jr. had woken up Life's an Audible and swung the filly to the far outside for her rally, meeting Style Points for the closing strides. Despite the latter getting the first jump, Life's an Audible at 9-5 and still several paths out wore her down to prevail by about a neck after a brief battle.

"The filly broke a little slow today," said Ortiz. "After that, we went to Plan B and let her be her and let her relax. She did well. The mile and a sixteenth helped her today because she wasn't that close early. Last time she was finishing. Today, she got time to get there."

Pletcher added: "I thought it was great... It seems like she's

kind of found her groove just wanting to settle and make a late run. She really delivered a good turn of foot."

With an off-the-board finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf sandwiched between a runner-up placing in the Oct. 4 GII Miss Grillo S. at Belmont at the Big A and a second last out in Gulfstream's Jan. 6 Ginger Brew S., Life's an Audible was winning her first black-type event in the Sweetest Chant. She was a \$200,000 OBS March 2-year-old purchase last year by West Bloodstock, agent for Repole Stable, after working in :10 1/5. Ortiz has been up for all six of her lifetime starts.

The same connections--with the addition of Town and Country Racing as part of the ownership team--also took the Sweetest Chant last year with Cairo Consort (Cairo Prince).

Pedigree Notes:

Life's an Audible is the first graded winner for WinStar Farm's Audible, a son of Into Mischief, who also has three black-type winners and five additional stakes performers from his first crop to race. In addition to breaking new ground for her sire, Life's an Audible is also the first stakes winner as a broodmare sire for Data Link, a Grade I-winning son of War Front who was pensioned at Claiborne after siring five crops.

Breeder Susan Moulton bought Catkins, dam of Life's an Audible, for \$100,000 at the OBS Spring 2-year-old sale in 2017, campaigned her to one win at Churchill Downs, and bred her to Audible for her first foal. The mare has since produced juvenile colt Catman Tomkins (Tom's d'Etat) and a yearling filly by Liam's Map who brought \$130,000 as a Keeneland November weanling to the bid of Solano Bloodstock. She was bred to Nashville for 2024.



R HARPER ROSE BASKS IN FORWARD GAL

R Harper Rose (Khozan) represented her fellow Florida-breds well, dropping the hammer in Saturday's GIII Forward Gal S. at Gulfstream Park.

She made her debut a winning one as she streaked to a gate-to-wire score by 6 1/4 lengths at Gulfstream Park in early August. Stepping into optional claiming company over the same surface Sept. 22, she was equally as potent winning by 5 3/4 lengths.

On her home floor again last fall, the bay took on Florida sire stakes company and won going seven furlongs in the Susan's Girl S. Oct. 21, but ran out of steam at a mile and sixteenth finishing second in the My Dear Girl S. last time Dec. 2.

Cutting back to seven furlongs and off as the 2-1 second choice here, the 3-year-old was content to allow **Fiona's Magic** (St Patrick's Day) to show the way up the backstretch. R Harper Rose kept close tabs on the leader and was given her cue around the far turn. With a fluid, sweeping move, she took control at the quarter pole and ran on professionally to collect her first graded stakes win as the early pacesetter held second.

"She's so fast, but she can settle, and back doing what she wants to do going one turn," winning trainer Saffie Joseph, Jr. said. "I'm just proud of her today. Everything went right into this race, and she showed it today. Edgar [Zayas] was very patient. They broke well, [Fiona's Magic] wanted the lead and he didn't force the issue. I think the first three-eighths of the race it worked to our advantage. It wasn't a crazy pace.

He added, "This is it for her, one turn. We're not going to experiment. Last time things didn't go right but we're going to keep her to one turn. There's a lot of races for her at one turn."

Pedigree Notes:

This is multiple leading Florida sire Khozan's fourth stateside graded stakes winner. The winner's dam produced a filly by Leinster last year, but was not bred for this season. Her half-siblings include MSW Cherokee Triangle (Cherokee Run) and GSW Hierro (Hard Spun), who Stonestreet acquired for \$350,000 at the OBS Select 2-Year-Old Sale in 2011. True Bliss brought just \$1,500 from Las Palmas Farm in foal to Leinster at the 2023 OBS January sale.

FIRST WORLD WAR IMPRESSES IN RETURN TO TURF WITH KITTEN'S JOY WIN

One could hardly blame trainer Brendan Walsh for trying First World War (War Front) on the main track. After all, the colt had shown promise breaking his maiden on debut over the undulating Kentucky Downs turf course in September before finishing a narrow fourth in the GII Bourbon S. Oct. 8 behind a trio of horses who'd all seen stakes success on either the dirt or the all-weather. He made a good show of himself by checking in second on both attempts over the dirt--first to 'TDN Rising Star' Parchment Party (Constitution) and then to Otello (Curlin) by just a half-length in the Mucho Macho Man S. Jan. 1. But off a best-of-40 four-furlong drill Jan. 28, Walsh opted to place the Qatar Racing/Hunter Valley Farm entry back on the grass and was rewarded with a win in Saturday's GIII Kitten's Joy S. at Gulfstream Park.

While he took a chunk of early money, First World War wound up second choice at 5-2 behind the Repole Stable/Todd Pletcher runner **Noted** (Cairo Prince). Away clearly from the middle of the gate, Tyler Gaffalione positioned his mount towards the front just off the heels of longshot pacesetter **Tocayo** (Always Dreaming). Racing two wide around the first turn, First World War began to pick up a clear second as the half went in :47.97. Still under a hold past the quarter pole, Gaffalione finally gave

his mount a shake of the reins and First World War responded in earnest, charging up outside of Tocayo to strike the front and holding off a closing **Hammerstein** (Oscar Performance) to earn the win.

"All the credit goes to Brendan and his team," said Gaffalione. "They brought the horse over ready and he fired big for us. Everything went to plan. The speed horse jumped out in front and my horse settled great behind him. He got into a great rhythm and he responded well for me down the lane."

"He's a tremendous talent," Gaffalione continued. "He's still learning, but the sky's the limit for him. If he keeps developing the way he is, I think we'll have a pretty nice horse down the road."

Claiborne stalwart War Front picked up his 116th stakes winner worldwide Saturday. Out of GIII Indiana Oaks S. runner-up Sundaysatthebeach, First World War is also the 101st stakes winner for Medaglia d'Oro as a broodmare sire.

Florida-based Three Witches became a West Coast winner Saturday with a confident open-lengths score in the GII Santa Monica S. at Santa Anita. After running seven consecutive times at Gulfstream Park, she broke the streak and put in a valiant third late last year in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint

at Santa Anita behind Eclipse champion Goodnight Olive (Ghostzapper). Each of those starts, made out of the Saffie Joseph Jr. barn, were for e 5 Racing Stables, who placed the then 4-year-old into the Keeneland November sale. Hammered for \$1,700,000 to RIFA Mustang Europe and now owned by Yuesheng Zhang, Three Witches returned to the track as a 5year-old to continue her career under the care of Mike McCarthy.

With a sharp break under Flavien Prat, the 8-5 favorite cofavorite was outrun to the lead by Hot Peppers (Khozan) from her outside. Always stalking just off the flank of that runner, Three Witches raced a solo second and really began to eat into the leader's advantage heading into the far turn as Juan Hernandez was already scrubbing aboard Hot Peppers. The top pair opened up a sizable gap on the rest of the field as Three Witches came right alongside her rival and blew past into the top of the stretch. Chimosa did well to close from the pack for second but was ultimately no match for the winner who came home under wraps while fellow Breeders' Cup runner and cofavorite Kirstenbosch filled out the trifecta.

"She trained very nicely, I can't say thank you enough to [owner] Mr. Yuesheng Zhang and everybody involved with him, for sending her to us," McCarthy said. "Quite a nice surprise. This filly has trained well all along, a little bit workman like in the morning. We put some blinkers on her a couple of works back and she really stepped up her game. Today I think the big difference was Flavien was able to kind of get her to ease off of Hot Peppers and get outside of her. She found a nice kind of rhythm to get into up the backside, relax, and Flavien called upon her around the turn and she responded."

Super Chow hit the board in five straight non-graded stakes races in 2023 after scoring in the Hutcheson S. in March. He was last seen finishing a close second against optional claimers in Hallandale Dec. 24.

With three January drills under his belt, the 4-year-old powered to a comfortable lead up the backstretch and controlled the pace around the far turn. Manny Wah chased into the lane and inched closer before the eighth pole. The Jorge Delgado trainee drifted out towards the center of the course, but his speed won out from there.

Olver. She said, "Out of the gate, you kind of have to remind him that, 'Hey, it's time to go.' Once he gets the lead, he gets into such a beautiful rhythm and you can get him to relax and he takes a breath for you. He gets very brave on the front end and he wants it just as much as you do. He wants to take it all the way. At the last eighth [I knew I had it], because I couldn't really hear them. I heard something behind me, but it's distant, it's not close enough. Since I'm out in the middle of the racetrack, I could see to the left side of me--I didn't see anyone coming."

Walkathon, winless since capping a three-race winning streak in the 2022 GIII Regret S. at Churchill Downs, got back on track with an upset victory here.

Sent to the front, she carved out early fractions of :24.40 and :49.33. The Whitham homebred kicked for home as the one to catch and kept finding down the lane despite drifting in deep stretch to get the money. Runner-up Be My Sunshine was forced to check as Walkathon wandered a furlong from home, but the result stood after a claim of foul by her rider.

Walkathon failed to find the mark in four attempts last season, including a well-beaten fifth-place finish in the GIII Cardinal S. at Churchill Downs Nov. 23 and a fourth-place finish in the GIII Suwannee River S. at Gulfstream Park last out Dec. 30.

A consistent runner throughout his 2023 campaign, Never Explain spent most of the season contesting graded stakes races for Courtlandt Farms and trainer Shug McGaughey. Debuting at this level with a win in the GIII Dinner Party S. at Pimlico on Preakness weekend May 20, he stayed in form with a pair of onthe-board finishes in the GIII Monmouth S. and the GII Bowling Green S., respectively. Goliad runs them off their feet | Benoit

Goliad completed a bi-coastal graded stakes double for War Front, as Kazushi Kimura audaciously stepped on the gas right out of the machine and led them a merry chase in Saturday's GIII Thunder Road S. at Santa Anita.

Soon in front, the Bass homebred took the Thunder Road field under the line with a circuit to travel and covered the opening couple of furlongs in :23.36 while being pursued closest by Time To Party (Kantharos). Committed to an all-the-way effort, Goliad passed the half-mile marker in :46.07 and he was tossing up few distress signals, as he put the better part of a dozen lengths on his rivals rounding the far turn. Kazushi went for the crop turning for home, slapping Goliad down his right shoulder, imploring him for another furlong and a half. Dandy Man Shines began to slice into the big margin at the eighth pole, but it was all too little and too late, as Goliad had enough for the victory.

Only lightly raced, with 15 starts under his belt at age seven, Goliad wired a one-mile Del Mar allowance in July 2022, but made just five starts over the next 17 months, the best effort being a second-place finish in Del Mar allowance company last August. With Kimura at the controls for the first time, Goliad posted fractions similar to those he doled out Saturday and snapped the skid with a half-length defeat of the re-opposing Great King (Fr) (Shamardal) over this track and trip Jan. 7.

"He was much more improved than last time," said the winning rider. "He is a natural headstrong horse, so I was just trying to

take it easy, as much as possible. I think he is a natural highcruising horse. He had his ears up and I think I was able to get him to relax a bit, that's why today he finished up strong."

Pedigree Notes:

Following on First World War's success in the GIII Kitten's Joy S. earlier Saturday at Gulfstream Park, Goliad was becoming the 117th worldwide black-type winner and 69th group/graded winner for War Front. The Basses have tasted additional success with the 22-year-old stallion in the form of GISW 'TDN Rising Star' and new Claiborne sire Annapolis, fellow elite-level scorer Avenge and 2023 GII Twilight Derby winner Seal Team (GB). Dynaformer is now the broodmare sire of 169 stakes winners and 66 graded/group winners worldwide.

Things could have gone very differently for Bellabel (Ire), who might have been retired instead of brought back to the races after a 15-month layoff. She also might have sold two months ago at Keeneland November, but was instead listed as a \$425,000 buyback. No matter what turns her career could have taken, surely the most thrilling for her connections was another graded victory for her CV, this one in Saturday's GIII Megahertz S. at Santa Anita.

The dark bay broke nicely and went straight to the lead, ears pricked while under a hold by Flavien Prat. Doing it easily, she set :23.86 and :48.59 fractions, came off the turn a bit wide, and kicked it into gear down the lane. While she never secured a huge margin, she could not be caught and held sway to win by a length. Ellis Park Turf S. winner Mouffy (Uncle Mo) was a brave second after a troubled trip while 'TDN Rising Star', SW, and MGSP Justique (Justify) was third.

"I was licking my chops when I saw them open up at the top of the lane by a couple, she kind of showed that old turn of foot," said winning trainer Phil D'Amato. "You never know. It's her first time against older after a long lay off and she showed she still has it."

After beginning her career in Ireland for Jessica Harrington, Bellabel debuted on U.S. soil for D'Amato two years ago last month. She reeled off a win in the Blue Norther S., took a sixmonth hiatus, and came back for a GII San Clemente S. win that summer. It was after a second in the GI Del Mar Oaks and a third in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. that she went to the sidelines for the extended period before Saturday's triumphant return.

Pedigree Notes:

Bearstone Stud's Belardo (Ire) is the sire of Bellabel and eight other black-type winners worldwide in his four crops to race. Despite standing in the UK, his two most accomplished runners are in the U.S.: Bellabel and last year's GI Frank E. Kilroe Mile S. winner Gold Phoenix (Ire), who also has three additional graded wins in California. Belardo sports seven graded/group winners in total.

In producing Bellabel, Fashion Line (Ire) is responsible for one of the 91 stakes winners out of daughters of the late Cape Cross (Ire). The mare also has a yearling full-brother to the Megahertz winner, as well as a 2-year-old filly named Miss Birkin (Ire) (Profitable {Ire}), who was shipped to the U.S. last year after selling at the Goffs Orby sale for €140,000 to Peter and Ross Doyle Bloodstock.

TIMBERLAKE POINTING FOR REBEL

'TDN Rising Star' Timberlake (Into Mischief), winner of last fall's GI Champagne S., could potentially launch his sophomore season in the GII Rebel S. at Oaklawn Park Feb. 24. The Siena Farm and WinStar Farm colorbearer was last seen finishing a well-beaten fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Santa Anita Nov. 3.

"He's pointing for it," trainer Brad Cox said. "We've got to see how our works go over the next several weeks, but he's doing well. Hopefully, we can get him there."

Timberlake worked four furlongs in :48.60 (10/92) at Fair Grounds Saturday.

"The other race in play for him would probably be the (GII) Gotham at Aqueduct (Mar. 2)," Cox said. "He did win up in New York. He won the Champagne there at Aqueduct, so that could be something that is in play as well. We'll see how he performs over the next few weeks breezing."

BARN 15 AT BELMONT PARK PLACED UNDER QUARANTINE DUE TO POTENTIAL EHV CASE

The New York Racing Association, Inc. (NYRA) and the New York State Gaming Commission (NYSGC) have placed Barn 15 at Belmont Park under a precautionary guarantine until further notice due to a potential case of Equine Herpesvirus (EHV) in that barn.

Cute Curls (Tapiture), an unraced 3-year-old filly trained by Danny Gargan, exhibited acute neurological symptoms on Saturday and was subsequently euthanized. As of Saturday afternoon, no additional horses in Barn 15 have presented symptoms.

Samples are in-route to Cornell University for analysis with results expected within 48 hours.

Barn 15 was placed under quarantine at 3 p.m. with standard precautions and biosecurity measures now in effect. The guarantine procedures are overseen by Dr. Sarah Hinchliffe, the director of NYRA's veterinary department, in consultation with the NYSGC.

There are 34 horses currently stabled in Barn 15, which is home to stalls for Jim Ryerson, Gustavo Rodriguez and Gargan. All horses in Barn 15 will be closely monitored for fever and other signs of illness.

During the initial quarantine period, horses stabled in Barn 15 will not be permitted to enter races or train among the general horse population. Afebrile/asymptomatic horses stabled in Barn 15 will have isolated training hours at Belmont Park following the closure of training for the general horse population.

Two horses stabled in Barn 15 (Ryan's Cat, Society Man) shipped to Aqueduct for races on Saturday prior to the identification of Cute Curls as a potential EHV case. As such, both horses were permitted to run on Saturday afternoon.

Neither horse has presented symptoms and Society Man will be transported to Belmont Park in isolation. Ryan's Cat was transported to Belmont Park following Race 1 prior to the identification of the potential EHV case.

THIS DATE IN HISTORY...

The 24-1 longest shot in a field of nine for Saturday's Martha Washington S. at a soggy Oaklawn Park, Dixiana Farms LLC's Band of Gold became the first black-type winner for her young Airdrie Stud-based sire (by Arch) with an irresistible late run to best heavily favored Denim and Pearls.

Content to drop down onto the fence from her low draw, the \$70,000 Keeneland November weanling switched off nicely behind midfield for Brian Hernandez, Jr. and remained within striking distance for the run around the turn. In hand and going well nearing the stretch, she split horses a quarter-mile from home, angled out into the center of the rain-affected strip and did her best work through the line to cause the boilover.

"It's one of those deals, looking at it on paper, a lot of us were coming out of sprints, so there was going to be quite a bit of speed," said Hernandez. "We ended up being 24-1. We had the two hole, so our advantage was just going to be to save every inch of ground. And if she was good enough from the head of the lane [coming] home, she was going to get there. That's what happened."

Band of Gold became one of 14 first-crop 2-year-old winners for Preservationist when dropping her nose on the line to graduate over Churchill's one-turn mile in a race taken off the grass Nov. 25, but she never factored in her juvenile finale, a distant fifth in the Dec. 23 Untapable S. at Fair Grounds.

Band of Gold is out of a half-sister to 2018 GIII Southwest S. hero My Boy Jack (Creative Cause) and her third dam was a winner of the GIII Fleur de Lis S. and runner-up in the GI CCA Oaks in 1996 for the late John Franks. The 2-year-old fullbrother to Band of Gold, Chunk of Gold, was purchased for \$2,500 at last year's Fasig-Tipton October Sale. Play for Gold is due to Airdrie's Upstart for 2024. Skelly put 3 1/4 lengths on Tejano Twist by the wire, who closed from last to overtake Excess Magic for runner-up honors.

"That's a nice horse, man. I've ridden so many fast ones, but this horse is getting is getting better and better and better," said Santana. "How the track was, he went [a]:44 [half-mile] and was comfortable. Turning for home, I asked him just a little bit to give me his best. He's a tough horse."

A half-brother to Chaparella, a stakes-placed runner turned winner producer, Frankie's Empire also claims SP Streetlady (Street Boss), a winner producer in England, as a half-sibling.


