



REBEL'S ROMANCE A SHOCK SHEEMA WINNER AS AUGUSTE RODIN DISAPPOINTS



Rebel's Romance | Dubai Racing Club

On a day where connections worldwide were treated to the very best racing in the UAE, **Rebel's Romance (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) ran out a shock 28-1 winner of the G1 Longines Dubai Sheema Classic at Meydan for Charlie Appleby and William Buick.

It was a race of contrasting emotions for two of the powerhouse stables in Europe as Aidan O'Brien's dual Derby winner **Auguste Rodin (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), sent off a 5-4 favourite, trailed home in last.

But the day belonged to Rebel's Romance, who was placed prominently by Buick throughout. Appleby revealed after the race that his big-race jockey set out to ride the GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner handily, knowing that there was a lack of pace in the contest, and the plan was pulled off to perfection.

The trainer said, "Rebel's Romance is a Breeders' Cup winner and a four-time Group 1 winner coming into the race and we were a 28-1 shot so that shows you the strength and depth of this race. William said he had a plan and we were confident the right thing to do was go forward on him." Cont. p3

FACTEUR CHEVAL UPENDS DUBAI TURF, LORD NORTH OFF THE BOARD by Jill Williams

After knocking on the door so many times--finishing second or third in four Group 1 events in his four most recent starts--Team Valor and Gary Barber's Facteur Cheval (Ire) (Ribchester {Ire}--Jawlaat {Ire}, by Shamardal) got one of his own in an ultra-competitive renewal of the \$5-million G1 Dubai Turf at Meydan Racecourse on Saturday. Lord North (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), winner of the Dubai Turf the last three years and seeking an historic four-peat, broke a bit awkwardly, but despite recovering quickly, finished off the board. The U.S. hope Catnip (Kitten's Joy) went wrong in late stretch, with rider Christophe Lemaire thrown hard to the ground and removed from his final mounts on the card after being taken to hospital. While he reportedly suffered a broken collar bone and rib, Catnip's injuries necessitated euthanization shortly after the race.

Under Maxime Guyon, who won this race in 2015 with Solow (Singspiel {Ire}), Facteur Cheval bided his time far back, midfield but in the clear, as Feb. 25 G2 Nakayama Kinen winner **Matenro Sky (Jpn)** (Maurice {Jpn}) went to the early lead with three-time Group 1 heroine **Nashwa (GB)** (Frankel {GB}) a close second.

Appleby added, "I was very confident down the back that

William was in the right spot because the fractions just weren't that quick and William knows this track so well. Most importantly I'm delighted for His Highness Sheikh Mohammed and to have a winner tonight is a great relief. It was a great ride by William."

Buick echoed the sentiments of his trainer in his post-race debrief and showered the winner with praise.

"He showed in Qatar what a versatile horse he is," Buick said. "His best form has usually been when he's held up but in Qatar I tried something new. I

was keen today to adopt a similar tactic and I got a lovely slipstream from the leader.

"He's a very good horse on his day and he showed that today. I'm absolutely delighted; he's a great horse and I'm so glad he's back to his best."

Reflecting on the importance of Godolphin registering a win on

the biggest day of the year in Dubai racing, Buick said, "You know His Highness wants to see the best horses come to Dubai and the best horses are here. These races are incredibly hard to win so of course I'm incredibly happy.

"It's great for the team, great for everybody. It's great to be here and it's great to ride a winner. It's an amazing training performance and a great job by the whole team. I'm in the fortunate position to be able to ride these horses."

Meanwhile, O'Brien was left scratching his head as to why

Auguste Rodin failed to fire. The multiple Group 1 winner never managed to land a blow with the master of Ballydoyle labelling the race as a "non-event".

O'Brien said, "It was a bit of a non-event really. The race just developed into halves so we just want to put a line through the race really. Ryan just said he felt he wasn't happy where he was or anything. They just never activated at all so it was a bit of a non-event. It was just one of them where it didn't happen."

Pedigree Notes

Saturday was a big day in the desert for the Listed Height Of Fashion S. runner-up Minidress (GB) (Street Cry {Ire}), as her 4year-old son Measured Time (GB) (Frankel {GB}) was only just over a length away from providing her with a Group 1 feature double in the Dubai Turf. Already successful in the G1 Jebel Hatta and G2 Al Rashidiya, that fellow Appleby trainee is adding further gravitas to the dam's burgeoning reputation among the Godolphin broodmare ranks.

Also responsible for the listed-placed Petticoat (GB) (Cape Cross (Ire)), Minidress is a full-sister to the G3 Nad Al Sheba Trophy winner Volcanic Sky (GB) with their dam being John Greetham's G3 Musidora S. winner and G1 Oaks and G1 Yorkshire Oaks-placed Short Skirt (GB) (Diktat {GB}). Bought by the operation for 1.4million gns at the 2006 Tatts December Mares Sale, she is a daughter of the excellent producer Much Too Risky (GB) (Bustino {GB}) whose four stakes winners are headed by the G2 Prix de Pomone winner and Yorkshire Oaks runner-up Whitewater Affair (GB) (Machiavellian).

Whitewater Affair is herself the dam of the multiple Group 1-winning Victoire Pisa (Jpn) (Neo Universe {Jpn}), another from the family to excel on this card having won the Dubai World Cup, as well as the G1 Yasuda Kinen winner Asakusa De'nen (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}). Minidress has a yearling colt by Dubawi (Ire) to come.

The field was cluttered up early with Japanese hope and multiple Group 1 scorer **Do Deuce (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) unlucky and in receipt of a rough trip.

Facteur Cheval tipped out into the lane, hooking up with diminutive Japanese Group 1 heroine Namur (Jpn) (Harbinger {GB}), who commenced an even-wider run from even further back than the eventual winner. The two finished so close a photo was required to determine the gold medallist, who got there by a short head. **Danon Beluga (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}), runner-up in this event last year, finished third. The final time for the 1800 metres was 1:45.91.

"It's just amazing, I have no

words," said trainer Jerome Reynier, a graduate of the Godolphin Flying Start program. "I see a horse here that has been prepared the best way possible by [work rider] Gregory [Davignon] and it's just amazing, I can't believe it.

"I said to Maxime I've never seen this horse go backwards at the finish, he is always going forward and giving his best. I had no doubts about the distance and Maxime has given him a

> perfect ride; he had Lord North to follow and he switched off during the race.

"He switched him to the outside and then waited long enough to save something for the end and that's just amazing. I am so happy for all my team."

Reynier also said Facteur Cheval would likely stay in Dubai, where he has reportedly thrived, and would possibly train up to the Apr. 28 G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Sha Tin in Hong Hong.

The Dubai Turf winner won the first four starts of his career in France in 2022 before finishing

that year with his first group score in the G3 Prix Perth at Saint-Cloud.

Although he failed to visit the winner's circle in 2023, he was never worse than third and placed in four consecutive Group 1 events. He was last seen finishing second in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot Oct. 21. The Dubai Turf victory marked the kickoff of his 2024 campaign.

With a fourth Dubai Turf not in the cards, Lord North appeared to exit his eighth-place finish well.

"He had a great spot, great cover," said regular Dubai partner Frankie Dettori. "He travelled great into the straight, but he just didn't have the gears that he had in the past. We are all getting older, right?"

Pedigree Notes

Facteur Cheval is the first Group 1 winner for France's Ribchester, a resident of Darley's Haras du Logis, and one of nine black-type winners for the son of Iffraaj (GB) worldwide, which include two group winners in Australia. A four-time Group 1 winner himself between England and France, Ribchester also was third in the 2017 Dubai Turf. Facteur Cheval, one of 102 stakes winners out of a daughter of the late Shamardal, is a member of his sire's first crop.

The unraced Jawlaat, a Shadwell-consigned 18,000gns purchase in 2016 at Tattersalls February by McCracken Farms-breeder of Facteur Cheval--has a yearling colt by Sottsass (Fr). She is a half-sister to multiple group winner Tantheem (GB) (Teofilo {Ire}) and hails from the same family as Shadwell's multiple Group 1 winner Tamayuz (GB) (Nayef).

Jawlaat was a third-generation Shadwell-bred whose fifth dam, Allegretta (GB) (Lombard {Ger}), produced both 2000 G1 2000 winner King's Best (Kingmambo) and the immortal Urban Sea (Miswaki). The latter--herself winner of the 1993 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe--is responsible for a breed-shaping dynasty, not least through her sons Galileo (Ire) and Sea The Stars (Ire).

POIGNANT WIN FOR CALIFORNIA SPANGLE

IN AL QUOZ SPRINT by Heather Anderson

Saturday's G1 Al Quoz Sprint resulted in a track record-setting victory for Hong Kong, with one of their star gallopers--

CALIFORNIA SPANGLE (IRE) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}--

Pearlitas Passion (Ire), by High Chaparral (Ire))--running out an emotional winner in more ways than one. Originally racing for Howard Liang, the Michael Enright-bred 6-year-old gelding now races for Liang's estate, as he died several months ago. Cont. p7

It was also the first victory for Hong Kong in the race since Amber Sky (Aus) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}) captured a 1000-metre version 10 years previously.

The winner cruised up to track the early leader **Ponntos (Ire)** (Power {GB}) in this straight test. Always moving freely well off the fence, California Spangle seized the baton with 400 metres to travel, while in a smooth rhythm under Brenton Avdulla. Not asked for much while just ahead on the front end, the bay nevertheless was holding his rivals safe, despite never opening up daylight. **Star Of Mystery (GB)** (Kodiac {GB}), a '**TDN Rising Star'** in the capable

hands of Frankie Dettori, was weaving her way toward the Hong Kong raider while in receipt of 13 pounds, but no matter how hard she tried, she was unable to bridge the gap and settled for second, three-quarters of a length behind. It was the same margin back to **Diligent Harry (GB)** (Due Diligence), who had also made up ground to be third.

The time of 1:07.50 lowered the course record of 1:07.61 set

by Wildman Jack (Goldencents) in the 2020 G3 Nad Al Sheba Turf Sprint.

Winning trainer Tony Cruz said, "I knew it would happen sooner or later. I got this opportunity and I came with a lot of confidence that we would win this race today.

"The family--the 'California family'--is here today. Howard Liang, whose horses usually are named California, passed away recently so I would like to dedicate this win to him. We are over the moon with this, the owner's wish was always to win

these big races. I wish he was here tonight but his whole family is here and we're going to celebrate together."

Representing the owners, Chester Liang said, "The horse means a lot to my family and I and I'm really happy that we were able to win. Tony said if he won last time in Hong Kong,

then we'd come. He did, we decided the horse was in good form, so we came. This was my dad's favourite horse, so he always means a lot. He is probably looking down on us."

An €150,000 yearling out of the Goffs Orby Sale in 2019, the bay was later bought by Badgers Bloodstock for the late Howard Liang. He first began accruing group victories in 2022, and signed off that campaign with a neck victory in the G1 Hong Kong Mile over Hong Kong superstar Golden Sixty (Aus) (Medaglia d'Oro) that December. consistent gelding continued to burnish his resume with scores in the G2 Chairman's Trophy and G2 Sha Tin Trophy H. last term. However, he would go winless in his next four starts, until claiming the G1 Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup by a length earlier this month.

"I think we'll go into sprint races back in Hong Kong, that's the end of April [the G1 Chairman's Sprint Prize]," Cruz added. "We'll

take on Lucky Sweynesse (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}). He's always been a sprinter-miler and I believe he's more a sprinter than a miler."

Asked about Royal Ascot, he said, "It's a possibility. I've got to try to work it out."

Pedigree Notes

A winner of the G1 Golden
Jubilee S. just like his sire,
Starspangledbanner has sired 38
stakes winners (25 group)
worldwide and spends his time
shuttling between Coolmore Stud
in Ireland and Coolmore
Australia. With his Al Quoz Sprint
victory, California Spangle has

now taken four top-level races, which puts him on par with his sire's other four-time Group/Grade 1 winner--Rathbarry Stud stallion State Of Rest (Ire). Cont. p9

Other Group 1 winners sired by Starspangledbanner include G1 Prix Morny hero The Wow Signal (Ire) who was bred on the same Starspangledbanner--High Chaparral cross, G1 Cheveley Park S. heroine Millisle (Ire), GI American Oaks victress Rhea Moon (Ire), and G1 Prix Jean Romanet winner Aristia (Ire).

The late High Chaparral did his best work at stud from the Southern Hemisphere. Already the sire of 75 stakes winners (42 group) internationally as a broodmare sire, High Chaparral has 14 Grade/Group 1 winners worldwide. California Spangle is his best runner in that sphere.

The deceased Pearlitas Passion delivered nine foals, and five of them are winners anchored by Saturday's winner. The Lope De Vega (Ire) gelding Wychwood Warrior (Ire) was placed in both the Listed Platinum S. and Listed Patton S. in Ireland, as well as once at that level in the UAE. The 4-year-old filly Alchimia (Ire) (Fast Company {Ire}) has yet to race, as does Pearlitas Passion's final foal--a full-brother to the winner who just turned two. The last-named horse did not meet his reserve when unsold for €400,000 at the Goffs Orby Sale in 2023.

Under the placed second dam Paimpolaise (Ire) (Priolo) is the G2 Hungerford S. and G3 Solario S. hero Shakespearean (Ire) (Shamardal). However, Paimpolaise is a half-sister to three

stakes horses, with the best of them the four-time stakes producer Pont-Aven (Ire) (Try My Best), a winner of the G3 Prix de Saint-Georges, who played bridesmaid in the 1990 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches.

"HE WAS IMPRESSIVE" - TOWER OF **LONDON ALL CLASS IN DUBAI GOLD CUP**

Class came to the fore in the G2 Dubai Gold Cup as Tower Of **London (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) ran out an authoritative winner for Aidan O'Brien and Ryan Moore.

A brother to St Leger hero Capri (Ire), Tower Of London came into the Group 2 contest at Meydan off the back of a cheeky victory in the G3 Longines Red Sea Turf H. in Saudi Arabia.

Tower Of London built on that victory to post a career best at odds of 2-1, storming home from the rear to run out two lengths too strong for 80-1 shot Al Nayyir (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), with Trawlerman (Ire) (Golden Horn {GB}) just over a length further behind in third.

Tower Of London's victory represented the perfect start at Meydan for O'Brien and Moore, who had Auguste Rodin to look forward to in the G1 Longines Dubai Sheema Classic later on the card.

All roads will lead to Royal Ascot for Tower Of London, according to O'Brien, who revealed the G2 Hardwick S. rather than the G1 Gold Cup could be the plan.

O'Brian said, "He's an Ascot-type horse, he could go for the Hardwicke--or something like the [G1] Coronation Cup. Ryan was very adamant he doesn't need to go two miles. I don't think Ryan thought he'd get the Gold Cup trip. He's classy."

ORCHESTRAL SOARS IN VINERY

New Zealand's star filly **Orchestral (NZ)** (Savabeel {Aus}) got the job done in the G1 Vinery Stud S. at Rosehill on Saturday.

Arguably, the margin was shorter than many expected, with the Australian-trained representatives **Tutta La Vita (Aus)** (The Autumn Sun {Aus}) and **Zardozi (Aus)** (Kingman {GB}) serving it up to the Roger James and Robert Wellwood-trained filly.

However, champion jockey and expat Kiwi James McDonald remained poised aboard Orchestral, as the Chris Waller-trained Tutta La Vita, ridden by Nash Rawiller, made a bold move before the turn, as the Godolphin filly, Zardozi, with 'Aussie Tom' Marquand stalked her every move.

It took the length of the Rosehill straight for Orchestral to beat off Zardozi before zoning in on Tutta La Vita, eventually getting a 0.70l margin on that filly.

Co-trainer Robert Wellwood debriefed with *7HorseRacing* post-race, "My heart rate is still coming down. Tutta La Vita gave us a real fright there. She took off, and I thought she had gotten the break over us (Orchestral).

"Orchestral had to fight hard to win, but class does prevail." Wellwood indicated there is no plan for whether Orchestral will contest the G1 ATC Oaks or the G1 Australian Derby, "Look, we will trot her up tomorrow (Sunday) and chat to the connections. We will decide after that. It was a great effort coming back from a Derby (G1 New Zealand Derby, 2400 metres) to the 2000 metres here (Rosehill).

"She's a Group 1 winner on both sides of the Tasman now."

Pedigree Notes

Bringing her New Zealand Group 1 form to Australia, Orchestral had to dig deep late but she did just that. One of the 143 stakes winners and 33 Group 1 winners for her Waikato Stud-based sire, she is the first live foal for her Group 3 placed four times winning dam Symphonic (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}) who foaled another Savabeel filly last spring--again served by him. Symphonic is out of a half-sister to the G1 Ellerslie Sires Produce S. winner Good Faith (NZ) (Straight Strike), dam of the stakes winners Tully Dane (Aus) and Mygoodgrace (Aus) (Royal Academy).

CASCADIAN MAKES HISTORY AT

History was made on Saturday at Flemington when the popular Godolphin campaigner **Cascadian (GB)** (New Approach {Ire}) stormed down the straight to notch consecutive victories in the G1 Australian Cup.

The Group 1 2000-metre feature was billed as a showdown between the gun milers **Mr Brightside (NZ)** (Bullbars {Aus}) and **Pride Of Jenni (Aus)** (Pride Of Dubai {Aus}).

They were joined by an all-star cast, with the likes of **Atishu** (NZ) (Savabeel {Aus}) and **Legarto** (NZ) (Proisir {Aus}) also taking their place in the barriers.

As expected, the Ciaron Maher-trained Pride Of Jenni found the lead and looked to break her opposition's hearts, as she had done in The All-Star Mile last start. Turning into the long Flemington straight, the daughter of Pride Of Dubai looked to have Mr Brightside and co. off the bit, struggling to reel her in.

However, there was one horse left, the tenacious mare had yet to burn off, and that was Cascadian, under Ben Melham. The gallant 9-year-old ate into the mare's margin and had his head in front when they dipped their necks for the finish line.

Recording his first run since taking out this same race last year, the popular, flashy and classy 9-year-old Cascadian finished too strongly for the brave leader Pride Of Jenni. One of the 62 stakes winners for his multiple Group 1 winning Dalham Hall-based former shuttling sire, Cascadian is a Godolphin home-bred. He is one of the six winners (from as many to race) for the G3 UAE Oaks winner Falls Of Lora (Ire) (Street Cry {Ire}), also dam of the G1 Woodbine Summer S. winner Albahr (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and Isle Of Jura (GB) (New Approach) who won a Listed race in Bahrain just a couple of weeks ago.

'TDN Rising Star' Thorpedo Anna (Fast Anna), off since a second Nov. 25 in the GII Golden Rod S., shook off any cobwebs with aplomb to notch a four-length score in the GII Fantasy S. at Oaklawn.



JUDDMONTE JUGGERNAUT! LAUREL RIVER WINS DUBAI WORLD CUP BY IMPOSING MARGIN



DUBAI, UNITED ARAB EMIRATES -- When the late Arrogate overcame a world of trouble to win the 2017 G1 Dubai World Cup, many racing fans said it was the best performance in the history of the race. To some, it rates right up there with some of the best performances ever seen.

It's entirely possible that Juddmonte's **Laurel River** (Into Mischief) managed to upstage him Saturday with an absolutely stunning, front-running tour-de-force in the \$12-million G1 Dubai World Cup at Meydan, a result that even those closest to him may not have anticipated.

Winner of the 2022 GII Pat O'Brien S.--where a horse called **Senor Buscador** (Mineshaft) was third--Laurel River was somewhat controversially withdrawn from that year's GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, a race for which he was likely to be favored. Sidelined for a spell, Juddmonte elected to transfer their homebred from Bob Baffert to the Dubai-based stable of leading trainer Bhupat Seemar in the summer of 2023.

To say things were off to an inauspicious beginning in the Emirates would be an understatement of monumental proportions. Laurel River faded tamely to finish seventh in the G3 Al Shindagha Sprint on local debut in late January, but as disappointing as that effort was, he bounced back to post an equally emphatic 6 3/4-length victory in the G3 Burj Nahaar on



Super Saturday to punch his ticket to World Cup night.

Conventional wisdom dictates that winning the Burj Nahaar leads to a start in the G2 Godolphin Mile over the same course and distance on the big night, but Seemar and the Juddmonte braintrust called an audible and routed the six-year-old to the G1 Dubai World Cup instead: a race 12 times as valuable, but incrementally more challenging on a few levels, not least the 2000-metre distance of the race. Additionally, the Godolphin Mile was likely to attract the speedy Saudi Crown (Always Dreaming) and defending champion Isolate (Mark Valeski), and opting for the World Cup would eliminate the possibility of a suicidal pace duel.

"I feel like the 10 furlongs is a stretch for him, but that is a speed-favoring track and he might be the lone speed," Juddmonte's Garrett O'Rourke told the *TDN* when World Cup plans were confirmed Mar. 7.

After drawing 12 of 12 at Wednesday's barrier draw at the Armani Hotel in the Burj Khalifa, many would have further downgraded the chances of Laurel River, reasoning that a horse already questionable to see out the trip would have to go hard-perhaps too hard-in order to secure the front. After all, another speedball--Panthalassa (Jpn) (Lord Kanaloa {Jpn})--had similar misfortune at the draw last year and dropped away to finish well down the field.

But there would be no such repeat Saturday evening, as Laurel River decisively surged into a clear lead with a half-mile to travel and went on to score by 8 1/2 lengths, the largest winning margin for a World Cup at Meydan.


"I'm still coming to terms with what's happened," Seemar said. "I think it'll probably sink in in another day or two. It's absolutely amazing. [Jockey] Tadhg [O'Shea] said this morning 'we're drawn 12, I'm not going to be two-minded about it, I'm going to go forward."

And go forward he did, sliding over to lead three off the inside with a circuit to travel as he had **Military Law (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) and **Dura Erede (Jpn)** (Duramente {Jpn}) for early company. As they turned towards the backstretch, **Defunded** (Dialed In) circled up so as not to sit wide the trip, and the two of them controlled the pace through the middle stages.

They put the better part of a half-dozen lengths on Dura Erede and the rail-skimming international favorite **Kabirkhan** (California Chrome) rounding the turn, and by the time Laurel River passed the 600-meter pole, it was really all over but the shouting. Showing no signs of stopping as he hit the top of the lane, Laurel River opened up by perhaps as many as 10 lengths and jogged it in from there.

Senor Buscador got first run on defending champion **Ushba Tesoro (Jpn)** (Orfevre {Jpn}), but was run down on the wire for

second while adding another \$1.2 million to his \$10-million grab in the G1 Saudi Cup Feb. 24.

"He brings it every time, he ran a really good race," said trainer Todd Fincher. "He might have started his run a little early trying to catch Laurel River and maybe that cost us a placing. Hats off to Laurel River, he freaked on everybody there."

Of the winner, Seemar added, ""He's got so much natural pace. He comes out of the gate and this is why we ran him over six furlongs [in the Al Shindagha].

"Tadhg was able to get some easy fractions and then I saw Defunded coming on his outside but he just kept on going further. I expected to see all the closers flying at him but he kept going."

For the better part of two decades, O'Shea has pounded the pavement on the Emirates Racing Authority, and he was basking in the afterglow of his Saturday achievements. He also guided Tuz (Oxbow) to an open-lengths success in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen, his second in three years after missing by a nostril with defending champion Switzerland in 2023.

"I've been fortunate enough to have had Dubai World Cup night winners but you don't get many opportunities and I'm going to be forever grateful to Juddmonte for keeping me on the horse, they could use anyone and they're a worldwide operation that's really successful," said O'Shea.

"When he had his first run for the stable, we thought he'd disappointed, but we never lost faith. He was explosive last time and I said the other morning to Bhupat, I pulled him aside and said I'd never ridden a horse with his ability ever. And he'd just done an easy work on his own.

"With the dirt you can't be half-hearted, you have to go forward. If he didn't stay, he didn't stay. We were aware of that. The main thing that won the race, it's easy to say when you win, but I was able to keep filling him up and filling him up."

Kabirkhan sat a good inside trip, but failed to go on in the lane and finished eighth, beaten over 18 lengths.

"He was beaten a long way out," commented his jockey Pat Dobbs. "I knew leaving the back straight he wasn't the same horse as before."

Of the remaining Americans, **Newgate** (Into Mischief), **Crupi** (Curlin) and **Clapton** (Brethren) finished a distant eighth, ninth and 10th, respectively.

Pedigree Notes:

Laurel River is the 20th Grade I winner for Into Mischief and is bred on the same cross over Empire Maker responsible for 'TDN Rising Star' and GI Kentucky Derby winner Mandaloun, while other top-level winners from Fappiano-line mares include champion Covfeve, Gina Romantica, Doppelganger and Atone. Additional stakes winners by Into Mischief out of Empire Maker dams include Grade III scorers Occult and Center Aisle and Juddmonte's late Taraz.

On paper, Laurel River is bred to stay the mile and quarter and perhaps further, as his first two dams are by Belmont S. winners. Juddmonte purchased Laurel River's second dam Soothing Touch for \$550,000 at the 2005 Keeneland September sale, and while she didn't work out as a racemare, she's excelled in the breeding shed.

The mare is the dam of six winners from 10 to race, including her first foal Emollient (Empire Maker), victorious in the 2013 GI Central Bank Ashland S. and the Juddmonte-sponsored GI Spinster, and her four winners as a broodmare include G2 Prix de Malleret winner Raclette (GB) (Frankel {GB}) and French listed winner Ardent (Frankel {GB}). Soothing Touch has also accounted for Hofburg (Tapit), a stakes winner and third in the GI Belmont S; and stakes winner Courtier (Tapit).

The second foal from Soothing Touch, Laurel River has a

THE REAL FIERCENESS SHOWS UP IN FLORIDA DERBY

Now that's much more like it.

Last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner and champion 2-year-old colt 'TDN Rising Star' Fierceness (City of Light), a head-scratching third after getting pinballed at the start in the GIII Holy Bull S. Feb. 3, put on an absolute show to win by daylight in Saturday's GI Curlin Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park. It was a record-extending eighth Florida Derby win for Todd Pletcher and sixth for John Velazquez.

"That was a pretty awesome performance," Pletcher said.
"That's what we see in the mornings when we breeze him, a special talent. That's why it was so perplexing his two races that he didn't run brilliantly. He's three times brilliant and two times has had off days."

Pletcher continued, "From a talent perspective, he has it all. Like everyone else in the Derby, you've got to hope you draw a

good post, you get a good trip, and you like Churchill Downs--all those things."

Winning owner/breeder Mike Repole added, "It's just special. I got 70 family members and they wanted it for me as much as I wanted it for them. It's just very special. I said before, we forget he's only had four races. He had a layoff. That was just really special. I told Todd if he wins by five or is beat by five, I wouldn't be surprised. How could you be?"


Ridden for speed by Velazquez from his outside draw in post eight, the Repole Stable homebred cleared the field rounding the clubhouse turn and the race was pretty much over from there. The bay, favored at even-money, got into a nice rhythm and clicked off fractions of :24.06 and :47.50. He began to shake free without being asked on the turn for home and dropped the hammer in the stretch to win by a record-setting 13 1/2 lengths. Catalytic (Catalina Cruiser) was second; Grand Mo the First (Uncle Mo) was third.

"We weren't committed to being on the lead," Pletcher said. "We were committed to being forward and getting a good position on the first turn. We talked about we might be on the lead, we might be lying second, we might be lying third. But we just wanted to get away from the gate and get in a good position. It turns out he made the lead and got into a good rhythm, and just kept going."

Velazquez added, "It was pretty easy. This is what I expected last time out of him. He had been working lights out. He broke well today and I just let him have it. I let them come and get him, and he dominated the whole race. When he got to the backstretch and switched to the turn, he picked it up and so I let him do it. He was comfortable. Then at the quarter pole, I gave him a little smooch and he picked it up right away. It was pretty easy. This is why we're here. This is what we work for, for opportunities like this. It's exciting."

Fierceness is one of two graded winners for young sire City of Light. MUTH LAYS SIEGE TO ARKANSAS, DELIVERS WIN BUT NO DERBY POINTS

A pair of 'TDN Rising Stars' in Muth (Good Magic) and Timberlake (Into Mischief) squared off on an overcast but warm Saturday afternoon at Oaklawn Park to contest the 88th running of the GI Arkansas Derby.

What the race turned out to be was a strong statement issued by Muth, as Zedan Racing's colt kicked for home, won by two lengths and collected the purse money. Of course--since the 3-year-old is a trainee in Bob Baffert's care--he will not receive his 100 Kentucky Derby points.

This was the Hall of Fame trainer's fifth Arkansas Derby win-with the last coming when he won both halves of the split Derby with Nadal (Blame) and Charlatan (Speightstown) during Covid in 2020.

Muth's road to Oaklawn started when he broke his maiden impressively by 8 3/4 lenghts at first asking last June at Santa Anita. That effort earned him a 'Rising Star' badge. However, in his next start, the \$2-million OBS March grad took on fellow 'Rising Star' and stablemate Prince of Monoco (Speightstown), and finished as the runner-up by 4 1/4 lengths in the GIII Best Pal S. at Del Mar in mid-August.

Baffert scratched him from the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga because he thought his colt needed more recovery time after his race at the seaside oval. Back at 'The Great Race Place,' the colt stretched out to two turns successfully when he won by 3 3/4 lengths in the GI American Pharoah S. in early October, then was second over the same surface in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile when he could not catch champion 2-year-old **Fierceness** (City of Light).

After a two-month break, Muth returned to the Arcadia races Jan. 6 and took home the seven-furlong GII San Vicente S. Over

the next month, as Baffert weighed his options for where to go next, he contemplated shipping the 3-year-old to Hot Springs for the GII Rebel S. However, a final workout shelved the trip and the trainer opted to wait for a potential shot at the Arkansas Derby.

Made the 8-5 morning-line favorite and saddled on behalf of Baffert by Rodolphe Brisset, Muth went off as the 2-1 second choice here with Timberlake garnering 1-1 favoritism. At the break, it was **Time for Truth** (Omaha Beach) who sped to the lead past the grandstand, but Muth was quickly into stride and tracked just to the outside of the early pacesetter into the first turn.

Suddenly at the top of the backstretch, Timberlake shot between the two frontrunners, but Muth responded quickly and went with his rival. Posting fractions of :23.43 for the first quarter mile and :47.46 for the half-mile, it was the son of Good Magic who gained the upper hand around the far turn, which signaled that Timberlake was in trouble. Muth chopped up the ground down the lane and scampered home over Just Steel (Justify), who ran a game race in defeat followed by Mystik Dan (Goldencents).

"He got away and then he was in a good spot," said Baffert.
"The track--speed really wasn't playing well today--but he was in a good spot there. Down the backside, when I saw Timberlake sneak up in there, I thought maybe he was going to control the race from there because I figured he was the horse to beat. But Muth, he's just ... the only that beat him was Fierceness and we saw what he did today (winning the Florida Derby). I'm just happy for everybody. It (Arkansas Derby) is very important. It's a very prestigious race, winning that. You know how we feel about Oaklawn."



JAPAN'S FOREVER YOUNG REMAINS UNDEFEATED IN UAE DERBY, ON TO

KENTUCKY by Jill Williams

Veni, vidi, vici. He came, he saw, he conquered. Like Julius Caesar, Susumu Fujita's **Forever Young (Jpn)** (Real Steel {Jpn}-Forever Darling, by Congrats) came prepared for battle and lived up to the hype, stamping himself as a potential superstar and giving Japan a third consecutive victory--and fourth since 2016-in the \$1-million G2 UAE Derby at Meydan Racecourse on Dubai World Cup Day. The pacesetter **Auto Bahn (Arg)** (Asiatic Boy {Arg}) held second, while the sole U.S. representative, **Pandagate** (Arrogate), was third. The UAE Derby offers GI Kentucky Derby points on a 100-50-25-15-10 scale, essentially guaranteeing Forever Young a spot at Churchill Downs, a route trainer Yoshito Yahagi said he intends to pursue. Final time for the 1900 meters was 1:57.89.

It was the first UAE Derby win for both Fujita and Yahagi, as well as for rider Ryusei Sakai. The win was particularly poignant for Yahagi, whose father had passed away in Japan just hours earlier.

"My teacher, mentor, and father passed away this morning and I want to dedicate this win to him," an emotional Yahagi said following the race.

Forever Young overcame a wide break from Meydan's stall 11 Saturday and sat outside but prominently in the early first flight before settling into a wide fifth, feeling the breeze while in the clear. Little changed up front as Southern Hemisphere stablemates **Oasis Boy (Arg)** (Asiatic Boy {Arg} and Auto Bahn (Arg) showed the way until heading into the homestretch, when Auto Bahn put away his fellow Julio Olascoaga trainee as Forever Young loomed menacingly to his outside. Sakai gave the bay winner a few right-handed taps of the whip as Auto Bahn

yielded. Forever Young drew clear by two lengths under a late hand ride with his ears pricked as conditioner Christophe Clement's last-out Gander S. winner Pandagate closed from his penultimate running spot with long, easy strides to wind up several lengths back in third.

Yahagi reiterated several times the Kentucky Derby will be the next target for the winner.

"Of course it will be very difficult to manage the horse's condition from Dubai to Kentucky, but I really believe my team will be able to get him in good order," said Yahagi.


Kentucky is not an option for Auto Bahn, as he is a 4-year-old on Southern Hemisphere time.

Jockey Dylan Davis, Pandagate's rider, indicated he felt his colt may benefit from a longer distance than the 1900 meters of the Saudi Derby. "We found some good rhythm. When they punched, they just had a better kick than me and my horse just kept fighting for third and he managed to prevail for third. Shipping all the way and performing on this stage--he showed that he improved again. He got there well, he is kind of a stayer. He hasn't got a big turn of foot but getting further should be no problem."



Forever Young, who made his first two career starts at nine furlongs, has never been beaten. He made three trips to the starting gate as a 2-year-old in Japan, getting started last October at Kyoto and reeling off three consecutive victories at three different tracks, culminating with listed wins in the JBC Nisai Yushun and the Zennippon Nisai Yushun. With performances of a caliber that made him the highest-rated dirt juvenile in Japanese history, Forever Young tackled the world stage next, where word was already out that this colt might be something special. He didn't disappoint despite a less-than-ideal trip in the \$1.5-million G3 Boutique Group Saudi Derby at Riyadh's King Abdulaziz Racecourse Feb. 24. The head victory









may have been his only winning margin shy of daylight, but it was in such a manner--where he ran down what looked to be a clear winner--that he was clearly the horse to beat in the UAE Derby.

"He did not travel well from Japan to Saudi Arabia so he was not in great condition but he still performed very well," said Yahagi. "After traveling from Riyadh to Dubai he improved and he has so much potential, I always have a lot of confidence in him."

Winning owner Fujita concurred that Forever Young will travel next to Kentucky. "This is only my third season as an owner with the Japan Racing Association and I have already found a champion racehorse. He continues to attract international attention for the Kentucky Derby, which tells me that he should have a good chance. Looking forward I would like to underline that I would like to win the Dubai World Cup."

Pedigree Notes:

Shadai Stallion Station's Real Steel, himself a big winner in Dubai when he took the G1 Dubai Turf in 2016, is also a full-brother to U.S. and Japanese champion Loves Only You (Jpn), winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf in 2021. With just two crops to the races thus far, Real Steel has three black-type winners, all in group company. Forever Young is his first stakes winner outside of Japan. Forever Young is also one of 26 black-type winners worldwide out of a daughter of Congrats, a son of A.P. Indy who was pensioned from stud duty at WinStar Farm after the 2021 season.

Forever Darling, winner of the 2016 GII Santa Ynez S., was exported to the UK in 2017, bred to Frankel (GB), and shipped to Japan, where she has remained. She has a 2-year-old filly by Kizuna (Jpn) and a yearling filly by Epiphaneia (Jpn). Bred for 2024 to Rey de Oro (Jpn), Forever Darling is a half-sister to 2017 GI Darley Alcibiades S. winner Heavenly Love (Malibu Moon), dam of \$2.3-million Fasig-Tipton Saratoga topper and 'TDN Rising Star' Sierra Leone (Gun Runner). The latter most recently won the Feb. 17 GII Risen Star S. and is pointing to Keeneland's GI Toyota Blue Grass next week. Other members of the family include 2004 Japanese Horse of the Year Zenno Rob Roy (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), a half-brother to Forever Young's granddam, MSW & MGISP Darling My Darling.

STREAKING POWER SQUEEZE UPSETS WAYS AND MEANS IN GULFSTREAM PARK OAKS

The streaking **Power Squeeze** (Union Rags) punched her ticket to the GI Kentucky Oaks while upsetting heavily favored 'TDN Rising Star' Ways and Means (Practical Joke) in Saturday's GII Gulfstream Park Oaks.

The Cash Run S. Jan. 1 and Suncoast S. Feb. 10 heroine, off at odds of 11-1 while looking for her fourth straight victory here, stayed out of trouble on the inside while Ways and Means, making her first start since a second-place finish in Saratoga's GI Spinaway S., was bounced around in between rivals and shuffled back on the clubhouse turn.

Traveling nicely in an inside fourth down the backstretch, Power Squeeze was in no hurry as Ways and Means slingshotted her way near the front with a flashy move on the outside

beneath Irad Ortiz, Jr. Ways and Means poked her head in front at the top of the stretch and looked well on her way as she kicked for home. Power Squeeze, however, was just getting going. She set her sights on Ways and Means in the stretch and rolled right on by to get the money by a length.

The Gulfstream Park Oaks was worth a total of 200 qualifying points to the top five finishers for the Kentucky Oaks.

"We always thought very highly of her. We never felt like she was [11-1]. We felt like she was 1-1," winning trainer Jorge Delgado said. "We felt like we had a really good chance. We believed in the filly, and she responded for us."

He added, "I believe the stretch at Churchill is going to be really good for her. Hopefully everything comes back in order and we're going to plan a trip to go there."

As for the runner-up, trainer Chad Brown said, "[Jockey Irad Ortiz Jr.] said the first turn cost him. It got tight in there, he was bounced around a bit, and he got wide. And then when she saw daylight, she kind of pulled herself up to the front, a little premature move. He said he didn't really want to do that. She ran really well. I think without the layoff, she probably could have encountered some trouble like that and still had enough to go, but she had a lot to do today. And then when you add the trouble in the first turn and the wide trip and all, it maybe took just enough out of her to get caught by the wire."

Pedigree Notes:

Power Squeeze, a \$50,000 KEESEP yearling and \$90,000 OBSAPR juvenile, becomes the 16th graded winner for Union Rags. The winner's three-time, stakes-winning dam Callmethesqueeze, a \$50,000 purchase by Athens Woods at the 2022 KEENOV sale, is also responsible for a 2-year-old filly by Street Sense and a yearling colt by Liam's Map. FAST ANNA'S THORPEDO ANNA STYLISH IN FANTASY WIN OFF LAYOFF

'TDN Rising Star' Thorpedo Anna (Fast Anna), off since a second Nov. 25 in the GII Golden Rod S., shook off any cobwebs with aplomb to notch a four-length score in the GII Fantasy S. at Oaklawn under a hand ride Saturday. West Omaha (West Coast) and Tapit Jenallie (Tapit), who filled out the trifecta in the reverse order behind Lemon Muffin (Collected)--seventh here--

in the Feb. 24 GIII Honeybee S., finished second and third, respectively. The Fantasy is a Kentucky Oaks points race on a 100-50-25-15-10 basis, giving Thorpedo Anna a certain spot in the starting gate the first Friday in May.

Breaking from the outside 12th gate, Thorpedo Anna left her post in razor-sharp fashion to immediately join the first flight. Rider Brian Hernandez, Jr. kept her quiet and on the outside in third as previously unbeaten **Recharge** (Gun Runner), winner of the Sunland Park Oaks in her stakes debut Feb. 18, and Candy Aisle (Gun Runner), second at in that same race at Sunland, showed the way through :23.45 and :47.90 fractions. Still third on the turn, the Kenny McPeek trainee moved up on the outside with no visual urging, took control with ease long before Hernandez showed her the stick once to keep her mind on business, and left no doubt about the best filly in the race on the day. Her ears pricked, she eased up before the wire with a final time for the 1 1/6 miles of 1:44.24.

The Fantasy marked the fourth win on the card for the duo of McPeek and Hernandez.

McPeek, who has a long list of savvy buys to his credit, picked up Thorpedo Anna for \$40,000 at the 2022 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October yearling sale. Bred by Judy Hicks in Kentucky, who stayed in on the filly, the ownership team also includes Mark Edwards, Brookdale Racing, and the McPeek family's Magdalena Racing. She is reportedly named for a relative of Edwards who shares the name 'Anna' with the filly's sire and is a swimmer. 'Thorpedo' is a well-known nickname of multiple gold medalist Ian Thorpe, an Australian swimmer who is now retired.

The Fantasy winner debuted at Keeneland last October in a maiden special weight restricted to fillies who sold or RNA'd for \$50,000 or less and promptly blew the field away by open daylight. She wowed again just over two weeks later in a Churchill optional allowance, netting her the 'Rising Star' tag.

Intricate (Gun Runner), who has since been beaten twice by GI Kentucky Oaks favorite Tarifa (Bernardini), bested Thorpedo Anna in the Golden Rod and is the only horse to finish in front of the dark bay in her four starts. It was soon after the Golden Rod that McPeek indicated Thorpedo Anna needed time off due to a bruise on her hip. She began working again in earnest in February and had posted six works coming into the Fantasy, all at Fair Grounds, including a most recent 1:01 2/5 for five furlongs (17/36) Mar. 23. She is a regular work partner of Mystik Dan (Goldencents), the Feb. 3 GIII Southwest S. winner who was third in the GI Arkansas Derby one race after the Fantasy.

Pedigree Notes:

Thorpedo Anna is the first graded winner for the late Three Chimneys stallion Fast Anna, whose five modest-sized crops have netted 14 black-type winners, all in North America. The son of Medaglia d'Oro, second in the 2014 GI King's Bishop S., was out of 2006's champion 2-year-old filly Dreaming of Anna (Rahy). He lost a battle with laminitis just prior to the 2021 breeding season.

Thorpedo Anna is not the first prominent 3-year-old this season for Uncle Mo as a broodmare sire, as fellow 'TDN Rising Star' Muth (Good Magic), who won the GI Arkansas Derby one race later on the Oaklawn card, is also out of one of his daughters. Uncle Mo, who stands at Coolmore America, has a total of 18 stakes winners as a dam sire.

Sataves is unraced, as is her dam, Pacific Sky. However, the latter is a half-sister to GISW Eskendereya (Giant's Causeway) and to English G1SW Balmont (Stravinsky). Sataves has a 2-year-old Cloud Computing colt named McAfee, who sold to Maddie Mattmiller for \$40,000 at Keeneland September, and a Known Agenda filly born Mar. 15 and already named After the Storm.

FROM PYATIGORSK TO DUBAI, TUZ STORMS **AWAY IN GOLDEN SHAHEEN** by Alan Carasso

DUBAI, UNITED ARAB EMIRATES -- Tuz (Oxbow), who like Kabirkhan (California Chrome) was purchased on the final day of the Keeneland September sale and overwhelmed his competition in Russia to earn a call up to Dubai, took a gap at the fence with 200 metres to run and bolted clear to take Saturday's G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen Sponsored by Nakheel by a record-setting 6 1/2 -length margin.

Tuz won three starts at Pyatigorsk Hippodrome by the better part of 50 lengths and was making his fourth straight appearance on World Cup night, finishing well-beaten in the G2 Godolphin Mile in 2021 and 2022 before finishing seventh in last year's Golden Shaheen. Victorious on that occasion was Sibelius (Not This Time), who just outfinished the Bhupat Seemar-trained defending champion Switzerland (Speightstown).

A disappointing 10th to the re-opposing Remake (Jpn) (Lani) when last seen in the G3 Riyadh Dirt Sprint Feb. 24, having previously impressed in the G3 Dubawi S. over course and distance Jan. 5, Tuz bounced well from gate two beneath Tadhg O'Shea and fought out the early fractions with the 1305-pound Japanese monster **Don Frankie (Jpn)** (Daiwa Major {Jpn}), with Colour Up (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}) close in tow.

Somewhat hesitant to take a gap inside of Don Frankie, who set the pace from the two path, Tuz pinned his ears, went through the hole at the fence and powered home to a comprehensive success. Nakatomi (Firing Line), third in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, was last into the straight, but finished willingly for third ahead of a slow-starting Remake.

"He's got so much natural speed; his weapon is his speed," said Seemar. "He's always been a fast horse and it's like Switzerland-he ran poorly in Saudi and then won the Shaheen. Sprinters mature and they know what to do. I had some confidence."

Added O'Shea, "He's very fast. We had a great gate number [two] but we were getting pressured a long way out. He had to be good and tough. There wasn't much room to manoeuvre down the inside, but I had a good, willing partner. He's a big horse. When he straightened up, he went through the eye of a needle. I was a length down off Cristian [Demuro] on the home turn. I gave [Tuz] a squeeze and the response was immediate."

Pedigree Notes:

With the victory, Tuz becomes the second elite-level winner for his sire, whose GI Pennsylvania Derby-winning son Hot Road Charlie was runner-up to Country Grammer in the 2022 G1 Dubai World Cup.

Bluegrass Hall acquired dam Suede Shoe, a daughter of Grade II winner Grande Melody, for \$42,000 carrying to U S Ranger at the 2012 Keeneland November Sale and Tuz, who sold for just

TWO RIVERS OVER ARRIVES LATE TO SNATCH GODOLPHIN MILE by Heather Anderson

Todd Cady and Ty Leatherman's **Two Rivers Over** (Tamarkuz) closed resolutely to pip dueling leaders **Walk of Stars (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) and **Isolate** (Mark Valeski) and win the \$1-million G2 Godolphin Mile. Walk Of Stars was 3/4 of a length back in

second, only a nostril in front of a very game Isolate. It was the first group win for the 2023 Listed Zia Park Derby winner.

Both defending Godolphin Mile winner Isolate and G2 Al Maktoum Classic second Walk of Stars flashed good early speed and that pair soon slugged it out on the front end with G1 Saudi Cup third **Saudi Crown** (Always Dreaming) sitting third and the eventual winner just off their heels with rivals to either side. Walk of Stars prevented Isolate from taking the inside path, and pressed that foe doggedly as they rounded the bend.

Edwin Maldonado gave Two Rivers Over a right-handed tap at the 600-metre mark and he soon edged closer with Saudi Crown to his immediate outside. Making ground with every stride after Saudi Crown folded, he closed resolutely on the leading pair down the lane, shifted to the outside for his attack and inched ahead to win well and give trainer Doug O'Neill his second winner of the race since sending out Grade I sire Spring At Last (Silver Deputy) to victory in 2007.

"He is not a horse that takes the kickback well so I was hoping he would be close in the run and he was." said Maldonado. "When he came into the stretch I was confident I would get there because I had him in the clear, outside of kickback. He's very genuine. He gave me everything."

Co-owner Cady said, "What an experience! We were happy to be a part of the occasion but we knew it would be hard to win with the likes of Saudi Crown and Isolate in the field. He was so tough and classy in the finish.

"What a job by Edwin and Doug and Leandro [Mora, assistant trainer]. We are so thrilled."

Speaking from California, trainer O'Neill said, "I am so proud of this horse. The owners are the ones who picked him out to claim. They have been super-patient and supportive. He's a young 4-year-old on the rise."

Winless from three starts at two, the bay was eventually

claimed for \$30,000 by O'Neill on behalf of his current connections at Ellis Park last June. After taking a starter allowance at Del Mar one start later in July, Two Rivers Over won a Del Mar optional claimer in September, prior to a twolength win going 1 1/16 miles in the Derby at Zia. He was most recently fourth in the GII San Pasqual S. to Newgrange (Violence).

Pedigree Notes:

Two Rivers Over's sire Tamarkuz won the 2015 edition of this race in the Shadwell silks and, a year later, took the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile. Based first in Kentucky and then in Louisiana in 2022, Tamarkuz moved to Ballycroy Bloodstock in Ontario beginning in the 2023 season and he currently stands for C\$4,000. His three stakes winners include Red Flag, successful in the GIII Bob Hope S., and stakes winner Lady Lottie.

The first foal for his winning dam, Two Rivers Over is also the only known produce for American Cowgirl. She, in turn, is a fullsister to MSW Special Relativity, who was second in the GIII Ontario Fashion S. and third in both the GI Ballerina S. and GII Bessarabian S.

Making his U.S. debut here, Kertez rallied late to take home the GII Pan American S. at Gulfstream Park.

The 6-year-old previously competed under the care of Andre Fabre--where he was a mark of consistency--hitting the board in six group races in France, including the G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly in June. He was last seen winning an allowance at Saint-Cloud Sept. 11.

Under new ownership after bringing €150,000 at the Arqana Saint-Cloud "The Arc" Sale, Kertez began to get back to work for Christophe Clement beginning in January. Off as the 2-1 second choice here, he trailed from the bell, but was clearly keen heading past the grandstand for the first time. As the pacesetter continued to lead into the first turn and up the backstretch, Kertez tried to improve his position along the rail, and finally found a seam around the far turn. Fanning to the extreme outside, Kertez uncorked his rally and got up in the shadow of the wire.

"I've been lucky in this race for quite a while, and I'm just delighted," Clement said. "It's a new purchase for the stable. We got him at the sale in France and I always liked the horse. He's a beautiful-looking horse, a very good-moving horse. He was trained by Mr. Fabre in France. I'm just delighted it worked out."



Favored McKulick bided her time before pouncing to the lead in upper stretch and held off the late-closing Surprisingly to narrowlly win the GIII Orchid S. at Gulfstream Saturday. The bay filly rated off the pace as longshot Viva La Red (Texas Red) was loose on the lead. She rolled up three wide entering the far turn, took over into the stretch and was clear with a furlong to run before holding on late for the victory.

"I had a beautiful trip," said winning rider Irad Ortiz. "She broke good. I helped her out of there to get good position. I dropped in a little with a couple of horses outside of me. I took my time and saved some ground and she relaxed. She waited for me and I let her do her thing by the half a mile and she was pretty good and kept going to the wire."

The consistent McKulick has now finished on the board in 13 of 15 lifetime starts. She won last year's GII Glens Falls S. at Saratoga in August and the GIII Waya S. at Aqueduct last October. She was making her first start since finishing a non-factor 12th in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf at Santa Anita in November.

Winning trainer Chad Brown is looking forward to a productive year with McKulick.

"The timing was good," Brown said. "I like that Gulfstream has this race right here on this big Florida Derby weekend. It's a good launching pad for some good races that I have ahead for her."

JUSTIFY'S 2018 SANTA ANITA PURSE MONEY TO BE REDISTRIBUTED, RECORD TO BE ADJUSTED

The long-standing saga of the 2018 GI Santa Anita Derby may finally be at a close, as the \$1-million purse was formally redistributed Saturday, according to a report in *Daily Racing Form*. Undefeated Triple Crown winner Justify (Scat Daddy) won the 2018 Santa Anita Derby, but later tested positive for scopolamine and Mick Ruis, owner of the second-place finisher Bolt d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro), persevered with his attempts to have the results overturned. More on the background of his efforts can be found here.

This past December, Ruis released a statement claiming legal victory in the matter and, earlier this month, a Los Angeles County Superior Court judge ordered the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) to disqualify Justify and pay \$300,000 to Ruis while also redistributing the purse. During his racing career, Justify was campaigned by a partnership consisting China Horse Club International Ltd., Head of Plains Partners, Starlight Racing, and Winstar Farm.

According to *DRF*, a board of California stewards issued a ruling Saturday ordering Justify's ownership to relinquish the \$585,000 in first-place prize money. Trainer Bob Baffert and jockey Mike Smith must also return their portion of the purse, which is typically 10% of the winnings. The money must be forfeited by Apr. 29, with all trophies also returned.

Justify, who is now a successful sire standing at Coolmore America, will also see his race record adjusted from six-for-six to five-for-six. California stewards Ron Church, John Herbuveaux, and Kim Sawyer signed Saturday's order.

Linda Rice continued to assert her dominance on the New York Racing Association, Inc. (NYRA) circuit when capturing the Aqueduct Racetrack winter meet training title with 23 wins at the 45-day meeting which ran from Jan. 1 through Mar. 30.

Rice has now won the training title at six of the last seven NYRA meetings, along with year-end honors last year as the circuit's top trainer with a record-tying 164 wins. She also came out on top at last year's Big A winter meet with 37 wins.

"It's great," said Rice. "Frankly, I love New York winter racing and it's a good place for my clients. They enjoy it, I enjoy it, and it's been a good winter. It's pretty surreal."

Rice, 60, posted a record of 137-23-27-23 with \$1,471,414 in earnings, good for a win rate of 16.79 percent and in-the-money rate of 53.28 percent.

Jockey Dylan Davis clinched his second Aqueduct winter meet riding title when posting 54 wins. In all, Davis' mounts banked \$2,699,061, with a win rate of 22.31 percent and in-the-money percentage of 50.41.

"I've won this title before and [it's] great to win it again," said Davis. "My business has improved every year along with the quality of horses I'm riding."

David Jacobson claimed his first owners' title at NYRA since

capturing the 2017 Aqueduct inner track meet. The veteran owner and conditioner secured 18 wins at the meet, including four races on Closing Day.

"We were anticipating a big debut," said winning trainer Todd Pletcher. "I thought that was something special there. He trained outstanding coming into the race. He's been doing everything right. Everything has come very easily for him. I wasn't sure if he was fit enough until his last gate work. It surprised me. He hasn't had much of a body of work leading into it, so much of this is on natural talent."

Walk of Stars, a half-sister to multiple stakes-winner and multiple graded-placed Strike the Moon (Malibu Moon), has a 2-year-old colt by Maclean's Music. She was bred to Jack Christopher last year.

Girl. Cairo Consort, who won the GIII Sweetest Chant over track and trip last February, ended a six-race losing streak with a sharp

four-wide stretch rally on Saturday in Gulfstream's Sand Springs S. Cont.

Biding her time under a snug hold by jockey Irad Ortiz, Jr., she commenced her bid on the far turn after tracking heavily favored Marketsegmentation (American Pharoah) for the initial six furlongs. Sent off as the 7-2 second choice in the field of nine, Cairo Consort surged past a quartet of rivals and was going away at the finish to register a 1 3/4-length tally over the 13-1 Fast as Flight. Marketsegmentation, defending winner of the Sand Springs and victorious in the GI New York S. at Belmont last June, proved no match for the winner's bid and faded to fifth in her first race since July 15.


