



QUEEN ANNE 'MOST LIKELY' FOR INSPIRAL

Racing returns to Newmarket's July Course later this month but prior to that John and Thady Gosden took advantage of the fresh turf to give three of their stable's Royal Ascot runners a racecourse gallop on Saturday morning, including the Breeders' Cup victrix Inspiral (GB) (Frankel {GB}).

Now five, the Cheveley Park Stud homebred was fourth behind her stable-mate and fellow Thompson family colour-bearer Audience (GB) (Iffraaj {GB}) on her return in the G1 Lockinge S. on May 18. She now looks likely to have another attempt at the G1 Queen Anne S., having been beaten just a neck in that contest last year when second to Triple Time (GB) (Frankel {GB}). Inspiral, who won the G1 Coronation S. at the royal meeting of 2022, also holds an entry for the G1 Prince of Wales's S., along with her work-mate on Saturday morning, Lord North (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}). The pair was joined by Juddmonte's G1 Sun Chariot S. runner-up Laurel (GB) (Kingman {GB}), who has been absent since last year's Lockinge.

After watching the trio work over a mile, John Gosden said of Inspiral, who was ridden by Kieran Shoemark and appeared to travel easily alongside Lord North, "She's worked well. She'd had a long time off since the Breeders' Cup and she definitely needed her race in the Lockinge. I'm sure it will bring her on a lot." Cont. p3

QUEEN OF THE PRIDE IN CHARGE AT HAYDOCK by Tom Frary

Qatar Racing through-and-through, **Queen Of The Pride (GB)** (Roaring Lion) gave the operation a moment of celebration in Saturday's G3 Lester Piggott Fillies' S. at Haydock. Out of their G1 St Leger and G1 British Champions Fillies & Mares S. heroine Simple Verse (Ire) (Duke Of Marmalade {Ire}), the Gosdens' 4-year-old who had finished runner-up in the Listed Daisy Warwick Fillies' S. at Goodwood last month quickly took up prominent rank in this extended 11-furlong contest.

Sent to the fore approaching the furlong pole, the 9-2 shot stuck to her task gamely to see off the challenge of **Lady Boba (GB)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}) and prevail by a short head.

"Both her parents were Group 1 winners, so she means a lot to us," jockey Oisin Murphy said. "She's obviously been slow to come to hand, but she's been looked after and now we are reaping the rewards. I think she'll get further, but whether she needs to go further than a mile and a half I don't know yet. When I was pulling up I was thinking of the [G1] Prix de Royallieu, the mile and six race on Arc weekend, but I'm sure John, Thady and Sheikh Fahad can think about that." Cont. p4

Of the Lockinge, he said, "I thought Audience did exceptionally well and was ignored. He had a nice track up the middle and she came across, just like she did in the Jacques le Marois when

Frankie was riding her. She had to move a long way across from stall one but she picked up well and then just needed the race, definitely in the last furlong and a half. But she's breezed at home and has done a nice piece of work here today and hopefully that will set her up nicely for Ascot."

Inspiral, who was on her toes on arrival at the July Course, will again face Audience if she heads to the Queen Anne on the opening day of Royal Ascot. Gosden added, "She's a big five-year-old mare now and, as you can see, she has a strong

mind of her own. Basically you play to her, you don't tell her what to do.

"[The Queen Anne] looks the most likely place to be going but she's in both races and we know that a mile or a mile and a quarter are fine for her."

The trainer, who has earlier watched Gold Cup hope Gregory

(GB) (Golden Horn {GB}) in action on the gallops on the other side of Newmarket, also confirmed that Lord North will head to the Prince of Wales's S., while Laurel is set to return from more than a year away from the racecourse in the G2 Duke of Cambridge S. on the Wednesday of the meeting.

He said, "Laurel just slightly needed the work but she'll come on a lot for it. She went back to the farm [after last year's Lockinge] but she worked well today. She just needed the work, the last furlong up the hill, but she has had a good blow and all

being well we'll go to the Duke Of Cambridge."

Maureen Haggas was on hand to give the lowdown. "He's a tough horse and as he gets older he's probably getting a bit better," she said. "There's the Wokingham for him at Ascot but probably not, he's won a good race today and I'm sure William and the owners will work it out."

Also at Haydock, the Listed Achilles S. witnessed a command performance from Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's 4-year-old filly **Believing (Ire)** who was extending her sire Mehmas's hot streak. While the G1 Nunthorpe S. hero **Live In The Dream (Ire)** (Prince Of Lir {Ire}) was only fifth, the George Boughey-trained winner who had been ninth in the G1 Chairman's Sprint Prize at Sha Tin in April got her ticket to Royal Ascot.

"I was really disappointed after Hong Kong when nothing really went right for her, but the key to her is good ground," her trainer said. "She'll definitely run in the five-furlong race [the G1 King Charles III S. at Royal Ascot]. "It wouldn't be the biggest surprise in the world if she also ran on the Saturday over six [in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee S.] as well."

Navan staged the other black-type race on Saturday, where

Ballydoyle's **Everlasting (Ire)** (Kingman {GB}) led a 3-year-old domination of the Listed Darley Irish EBF Kooyonga S. The homebred half-sister to last year's G1 Irish Derby and G1 Grand Prix de Paris runner-up Adelaide River (Ire) (Australia {GB}) may swerve Royal Ascot, with connections looking to take it step-by-step. "She's in a few races at Ascot, but we'll see whether we give her a bit of time and look towards the summer, let her go up the grades and look to a group three," stable representative Chris Armstrong said. "She's a filly with an awful lot of talent and she's still putting everything together."

SEA JUST IN TIME TAKES TO GOODWOOD



Sunday's black-type action is spread across Europe, with Goodwood's Listed Weatherbys/British EBF Agnes Keyser Fillies' S. one of the lesser of its kind in terms of status but possibly the most interesting of all given that it acts as the platform for the second act of **TDN Rising Star Sea Just In Time (Ire)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}). Sunderland Holdings' homebred impressed on debut at Newmarket's Guineas Festival and holds an entry in the G1 Irish Oaks.

"She's taking a while to come to herself and still looks a bit backward in her coat," William Haggas said. "The race at Newmarket took the stuffing out of her and I've wanted to run her before now to see if she was a Ribblesdale type. We missed those because I wasn't happy with her, but she's fine now. She won't run in the Ribblesdale and we will just see how we go on Sunday, she might not even win on Sunday but hopefully she will run a good race. We will take one step at a time with her."

ParisLongchamp boasts five black-type events, with the pick being the G3 Prix Paul de Moussac where Nurlan Bizakov's winning machine Lazzat (Fr) (Territories {Ire}) goes again.

PASSENGER TO MISS PRINCE OF WALES'S STAKES AFTER SETBACK

Niarchos runner Passenger (Ulysses {Ire}), favoured for the G1

Prince Of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot later this month, will not participate after sustaining a setback according to the owner's racing manager Alan Cooper.

Third in the G2 Dante S. and a winner of the G3 Winter Hill S. at three, the 4-year-old colt returned with a 1 1/2-length victory in the G2 Huxley S. at Chester on May 10 for Sir Michael Stoute.

Cooper said, "He has an infection and it would be a race against time to have him spot on for Ascot. Hopefully he will be ready for the Eclipse, but that will be up to Sir Michael.

"We'll get the horse right first and then we will make a plan when everybody is happy."

Replacing Passenger in the advance markets is Auguste Rodin (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) who ran second to the re-opposing White Birch (GB) (Ulysses {Ire}) in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup on May 26.

Delivered to take a narrow lead approaching the furlong pole, the €460,000 Arqana May Breeze Up purchase belied inexperience to hold the previous winner Moving Force (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}) and score by a short head.

"He was a little tardily away and they were going quick in the first few hundred yards, so they got a bit of a break on me but we were just keen to try to make it as smooth as possible with him," jockey James Doyle said. "He's quite racy this fellow and when he got a slow start, he just fired up a little bit and took time to settle back into a rhythm. He moved into the race super and when he popped his head in front, he just got a bit lost and jumped the winning line but I was pretty happy he was always going to hold off the other runner. It was our first day at school, so you'd have to be pleased. He is a smart-looking horse." Trainer Karl Burke added, "I'm relieved as much as anything, as he's a horse with a big reputation and he was very good at the breeze-ups, but the breeze-ups are a long way from galloping two furlongs on a flat track to five furlongs up a hill here. We knew we had a good horse, but it's nice to get the job done and I'm delighted with his attitude. We've only had him three weeks, we haven't had a good run at him really and we haven't got a lot of time going into Ascot. Today was just planning to see if he was good enough to go to Ascot--we thought he was on his home work and I think he's just shown there that's he's plenty good enough." The unraced dam, who has been bred to Street Sense, is a daughter of the listed winner Ronaldsay (GB) (Kirkwall {GB}) and a half to the G3 Jersey S.-winning sire Gale Force Ten (GB) (Oasis Dream (GB)) who was also placed in the G1 Irish 2,000 Guineas, G1 Middle Park S. and G2 Norfolk S. Also kin to the listed scorer and group 3-placed Rousay (Ire) (Muhaarar {GB}), her family also features the G1 Moyglare Stud S. winner Bianca Nera (GB) (Salse), the G1 Fillies' Mile and G1 Falmouth S. heroine Simply Perfect (GB) (Danehill) and her G1 Criterium International-winning son Proud And Regal (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Finishing third was the local runner **Miss Joelene (Aus)** (Russian Revolution {Aus}). For punters who had faith in Socks Nation she paid a healthy \$126.

Maher told *Sky Racing*, "It's phenomenal. The team has done a super job. This filly (Socks Nation) has been in training for around 13 months, but she just keeps going really well.

"I didn't tie Ryan (Maloney) down to anything. He's very casual, laidback at the best of times. I was surprised how far forward she was early in the race, actually.

"She's just a tough filly."

Maloney added, "The race couldn't have panned out any better for us. I was actually surprised nobody came to put any pressure on us because she was very fit and can stay.

"You couldn't knock her form down south and it was a great training effort."

Pedigree Notes

Socks Nation bred by IV Millard and the first foal from the Commands (Aus) mare Tahnee Tiara (Aus), a victress of seven races. She is from the family of the Listed winner Evalina (Aus) (I Am Invicible {Aus}) and the Group 1-producing sire Worthy Cause (Aus).







MAGE'S FULL-BROTHER DORNOCH UPSETS THE BELMONT

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY--Coming into this year's GI Belmont S., **Dornoch** (Good Magic) had the credentials to be a good one. As a full-brother to last year's GI Kentucky Derby winner Mage, the pedigree was certainly there. His rider, Luis Saez, is one of the leading jocks in the country, having registered his first victory in a Classic with Essential Quality in the 2021 GI Belmont S. Not to mention that the colt had already won a pair of graded stakes-last season's GII Remsen S. in addition to the GII Fountain of Youth S. this year. But most did not believe, as reflected by the 17-1 odds that the colt was given while facing nine others in the final leg in the Triple Crown. But standing staunchly in his corner and never wavering was trainer Danny Gargan.

"I never lost faith in him," the New York-based trainer said. "He had tremendous works up here. He's a big powerful horse. You just have to be patient and not lose focus and just grind away, and hopefully, you get lucky and win one of these. And today, we did."

Favored by a clean break from post six, Dornoch slid to the front as GI Preakness S. winner **Seize the Grey** (Arrogate), **Resilience** (Into Mischief) and the well-backed **'TDN Rising Star' Mindframe** (Constitution) rushed up to argue the issue in the early going. **Cont. p4**

Meanwhile, favored fellow 'Rising Star' Sierra Leone (Gun Runner) broke slightly outward, precipitating a chain reaction that caused him to bounce off Mindframe, who was being hustled into position from his high draw, and then slamming into Honor Marie (Honor Code) and Protective (Medaglia d'Oro) to his inside.

As the front rank cut out a legitimate initial guarter in :22.99, Dornoch remained a close second to Seize the Grey through a slightly softer half in :47.25, as Mindframe, Resilience and **Antiquarian** (Preservationist) tracked that group from just over a length behind. With little change up front through threequarters in 1:10.67, Sierra Leone was still far back, over a dozen lengths from the pacesetter. Dornoch was given the cue to go on, and he stuck his neck in front leaving the far turn and was running easily as Seize the Grey fought back to his inside while Mindframe wouldn't let up on the outside. Slipped over to the rail by Saez for the stretch drive, Dornoch continued to show the way as the early leader retreated with Mindframe seemingly poised to run by. However, the lightly raced colt appeared to have his sights set on a hot dog because he drifted out markedly, losing valuable real estate in the process. Making up ground but not having a better time of it behind, Sierra Leone exchanged bumps with Protective, causing both horses to lose momentum. Despite the difficulties behind, Dornoch continued to roll up front, and despite the best efforts from Mindframe and pilot Irad Ortiz, Jr. in deep stretch, it was Dornoch who held on to a half-length score. Mindframe, sent off at 5-1, was a length ahead of the late-surging Sierra Leone, who finally unfurled his long legs, but as was the case when nosed out in the Kentucky Derby, it was too late to land the main prize.

"It was a pretty good race," said Saez, who has been aboard Dornoch in six of the colt's seven prior starts. "The horse broke pretty sharp. The position we were looking for. He did everything right. He came to the top of the stretch, I still have a lot of horse and he fights. He fights to get there first. He's a horse that really has a big heart and man, he ran the perfect race."

Redemption is sweet and Gargan, who has remained high on his charge since the colt's 10th-place finish in the Derby, reveled in a victory well earned.

"I'm still just taking it in," said Gargan, winning his first Classic. "It's pretty exciting. It's a special thing just to be a part of these races, not to mention to win one with a horse you bought at Keeneland and have had it for its whole [racing] life. I spend so much time with him and my staff has done such a great job with him."

Immediately following the race, trainer Todd Pletcher indicated that he thought the Repole Stable and St Elias Stableowned runner-up would get up in time, but his errant ways likely cost him the win.

"[Irad Ortiz, jr.] said he drifted out on him a little bit and it felt like [Mindframe] lost focus for a moment," said Pletcher. "He angled him back inside so he could see Dornoch and he re-engaged and was closing but just ran out of time."

Regarding the **'TDN Rising Star's** inexperience, he added, "If he could have run a straight course down the lane, that would have been the difference. Irad felt like he just lost that little bit of focus. He was still coming at the end."

However, despite the disappointment in not getting the win, Pletcher was complimentary of the winner.

"Obviously, I know he is a full brother to a Derby winner and I know Danny and his team have always thought strongly that he is a top horse," Pletcher said. "I think maybe he got sidetracked a little bit along the way trying to figure out his running style, but he has always shown quality."

After a pair of admirable efforts by his colt in his last two starts, including a last-out second in the Preakness, trainer Kenny McPeek was pragmatic about Mystik Dan's effort.

"Brian [Hernandez Jr.] said he was kind of spinning his wheels over this track," he said. "It looked to me that the racetrack was a little deeper than normal. I thought it might have changed over the course of the day. We thought some of the others would go [to the lead] and they did but the speed held. Dornoch was right on the lead with Seize the Grey, and he backed up too."

Asked whether he thought the Triple Crown might had taken its toll on the colt, he said, "The horse had acted really good coming into this race. He was training well and eating well and I didn't see a difference. Maybe tomorrow morning we'll see something different.

"Look, we've had a great season with him. We'll back off of him and give him a little bit of a break and regroup."

Hernandez was also disappointed by the result, with Mystik Dan finishing out of the money for the first time since January.

"He didn't leave there as sharp as we would have liked him to but he has run two really hard races in the Derby and Preakness," Hernandez said. "Around the first turn, he wasn't traveling as I would have liked him to, but, at the same time, I was still kind of hoping he would pick it up. Around the second turn, he picked it up nicely and I was like, 'ok, we are going to be in good shape.' But when he turned, for home."

Back Form Holds the Answer

While many judged Dornoch based on his two latest starts, a fourth in the Apr. 6 GI Toyota Blue Grass S. and 10th in the Kentucky Derby, the striking bay never finished worse than second in his first five career starts. Runner-up in the slop here last July, he filled the same spot next time out in Monmouth's Sapling S. in August. A resounding 6 1/2-length winner in a Keeneland maiden in October, the \$325,000 Keeneland September purchase bested Sierra Leone by a nose in the Remsen before adding another win at Gulfstream in the Fountain of Youth. Since his Derby disappointment, Dornoch recorded two official four-furlong works--the first in :48.48 at Saratoga May 24 and the latest a :48.68 work June 1.

"We got up here three days [after the Derby] and we were pointing toward this race," said Gargan. "We tried to do the best we could and keep him as happy as we could. He was training phenomenal and worked great here a couple of times. They overlooked him here because he ran one bad race but they'll probably give him a little more of a look next time."

Looking for something to occupy himself with following his

retirement, he launched Two Eight Racing in 2021 (Werth wore number 28 during his days as a ball player), and what he lacks in experience and numbers, he has more than made up for with quality, highlighted by Dornoch.

"I didn't find racing, racing found me," he said moments after Dornoch's Classic win.

Werth owns the colt in partnership with longtime owner Randy Hill, West Paces Racing LLC, Belmar Racing and Breeding and Pine Racing Stables.

"I didn't do anything. That's what these guys are for," said Werth pointing to Gargan and Hill. "I've got good partners and a good trainer, and a great horse. I'll put this up there with anything I've ever done. This is the top of sports. Horse racing is the most underrated sport there is. This is as big as it gets. The emotions you feel when you play in a playoff game, when you

win a World Series game, it is the top of sports, and this is where we're at."

According to Werth, he met Gargan at Keeneland and the pair hit it off, with the trainer convincing the former baller to invest in racehorses.

"After I retired, I went to the
Keeneland sale to buy some fillies and I
ran into Danny and his guys. And he
said, 'You should get in on this horse,
he's going to be a Derby horse.' And I
said, 'Yeah right.' But I was in the mood
and saying yes to a lot of things so
bought a few horses that day.' But the
first horse I bought was Dornoch, Danny
convinced me to buy him, and 'lo and
behold we ran in the Derby and won the

Belmont. It's unbelievable. Let's keep going!"

Gargan, who felt he missed out on purchasing Mage when he went through the sales ring, was determined to get his brother Dornoch, landing the colt for \$325,000 at the Keeneland September Sale in 2022.

"At the time we had bought him, Mage hadn't won," he recalled. "But I had seen Mage work in Maryland at the [Fasig-Tipton Midlantic] 2-year-old in Training Sale and I regretted not buying him because he didn't sell for crazy money. So at Keeneland, I really wanted to buy this horse. So we were lucky enough to buy him and it's been a great ride."

Pedigree Notes:

'TDN Rising Star' Puca already produced 2023 GI Kentucky Derby winner Mage and now adds Mage's full-brother Dornoch as another Classic winner. While Puca is believed to be the ninth mare in history to produce two separate winners of two American Classics, she is only the second to produce individual Kentucky Derby and Belmont winners, following the legendary 1885 mare Cinderella, whose Hastings won the 1896 Belmont and whose Plaudit won the 1898 Derby. Only two other mares in modern history have produced two separate American Classic winners: Better Than Honour (Rags to Riches and Jazil, both in the Belmont) and Weekend Surprise (Summer Squall in the Preakness and A.P. Indy in the Belmont).

John Stewart of Resolute Racing, relatively new to the sport, purchased Puca in 2023 from the Case Clay consignment at Keeneland November for \$2.9 million post-sale.



She produced a full-brother to Mage and Dornoch for Stewart Apr. 4. Both Mage and Dornoch were bred by Robert Clay's Grandview Equine, who originally purchased the former 'TDN Rising Star' for \$475,000 at the 2018 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale. Including her first foal, Gunning (Gun Runner), Puca has three stakes performers from the same number of starters.

Puca also has the unraced 2-year-old colt Baeza (McKinzie), who sold to Mayberry Farm for \$1.2 million at Keeneland September. She was bred back to Good Magic for 2025.

Dornoch is one of the nine graded winners from 17 black-type winners by Hill n' Dale's Good Magic, who sends just his third crop to the races this year. In addition to his two Classic winners, Good Magic also has additional Grade I winners in Muth and Blazing Sevens, both also 'TDN Rising Stars.' The son of Curlin was the leading first-crop sire of 2022 and is currently second to Justify on the leading third-crop sire list. --Jill Williams

Good Effort for Mindframe, But Not Good Enough to Win Belmont By Tim Wilkin

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY -- Everyone who had anything to do with the young horse from the barn of Hall of Fame trainer Todd Pletcher knew this was going to be a tall order.

The task put in front of 'TDN Rising Star' Mindframe (Constitution) was a biggie. With just two starts under his halter, Pletcher, jockey Irad Ortiz, Jr. and co-owner Mike Repole were asking the colt to beat some of the best 3-year-old horses in the country in Saturday's GI Belmont S. at Saratoga Race Course.

Kind of like a rookie being asked to guard LeBron James in the NBA or a 19-year-old being put on the mound against the New York Yankees.

And, you know what? Mindframe darn near pulled it off. When the 156th running of the Belmont--at Saratoga for the first time ever because of construction at Belmont Park--was done, Mineframe had beaten all but one in the field of 10.

He finished a half-length behind upset winner **Dornoch** (Good Magic) in front of a raucous capped crowd of 50,000.



"He ran super," Pletcher said, standing on the track after conferring with Ortiz while the connections of Dornoch were starting to rev up their celebration in the winner's circle. "Just his third start and first time at the distance. It was the first time he has really been challenged...all the things we were concerned about."

And, if he didn't make a freshman mistake, he might have won the 1 1/4-mile race.

Just inside the three-sixteenths, Mindframe, racing on the outside, got a head in front of the game Dornoch and it looked like he might just go right on by and write another chapter of his impressive, but short, career.

When Ortiz went to use his riding crop on the left side, the horse shied away and drifted four to five paths just before the eighth pole. With Mineframe gliding toward the clubhouse, Dornoch took command of the race.

Pletcher, Ortiz and Repole weren't going to say Mindframe would have won if he didn't pull that stunt, but it sure didn't help.

"When I hit him once, he didn't do anything," Ortiz said outside the jockeys' room. "I went to hit him a second time and, when I did, he reacted and he came out a little bit. It took some time to correct, and I hit him right-handed, and he came back. He just kept trying." **Cont. p10**

He ran hard to the wire, just could not catch Dornoch.

Mindframe had come into the Belmont as perhaps the most intriguing horse. He had blitzed lesser competition with ease, winning a maiden an allowance by a combined 21 1/4 lengths.

Was this horse ready for prime time?

"We could have been laughed out of here," Repole said, making his retreat from the track through the clubhouse with part of his entourage of 70. "You hear, 'look at these idiots; they are taking a chance with a good horse."

Mindframe didn't make anyone look foolish. The decision was the right one. He ran, for the most part, a race that could have won the last leg of the Triple Crown.

"We are very proud of the horse, very proud of his effort," Pletcher said. "For him to do that in only his third start speaks volumes about his quality. We are looking forward to going on to some more big races."

The GI Travers S. at Saratoga during the regular 40-day summer meet at the Spa is an obvious goal. Pletcher said he would have to figure out a way to get him there. In the coming days and weeks, he will also be looking at what is next for **Antiquarian** (Preservationist), who was fifth, and **Protective** (Medaglia d'Oro), who checked in sixth.

Also, though, as summer beckons, the Belmont effort put in by Mindframe will be remembered and the team may wonder might have been.


"The bottom line is we can't run it again," Repole, who owns the colt with Vinnie and Teresa Viola, said. "We came in second. I will watch the replay 100 times and I am going to come in second 100 times. You can't change that."

Another Frustrating Day At the Office For Sierra

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY -- From the start almost to the end, GI Belmont S. 8-5 favorite **Sierra Leone** (**Gun Runner**) encountered a host of problems at Saratoga Race Course Saturday that resulted in a third-place finish.

Pretty much everything that could go wrong did for the 'TDN Rising Star', who was two noses away from starting his career with a 5-0 record. There was the stumble at the start of the 1 1/4-mile Belmont under new jockey Flavien Prat. From that awkward beginning leaving post nine, he banged into Mindframe (Constitution), who was to his outside. Sierra Leone ricocheted off that collision and banged into Honor Marie (Honor Code) to his inside. Meanwhile, GI Preakness winner Seize the Grey (Arrogate) led the field through the first quarter in :22.99 and got the half-mile in :47.25. Cont. p11



The horror show continued for furlong after furlong until Sierra Leone finally found his form near the top the stretch and made a solid but belated move into contention.

"He got knocked back pretty far and then he didn't really engage the bit until the quarter pole," trainer Chad Brown said. "It looked like he wasn't going anywhere and he just grabbed the bit late and he came on and just missed."

Sierra Leone, last of 10 at one point on the second turn, ended up 1 1/2 lengths behind longshot winner **Dornoch** (Good Magic) and a length behind Mindframe, who ran greenly in the stretch. Brown changed jockeys and Sierra Leone's bit after he lugged in badly and bumped with Forever Young in the stretch run of the Kentucky Derby. The sales-topping \$2.3 million Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling purchase co-owned by Mrs. John Magnier, Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith, Westerberg, Rocket Ship Racing and Peter Brant, lost the Derby by a nose with his erratic finish. Though he appeared to lug in a bit in the Belmont stretch, that did not cost him the race. Brown noted that the track conditions worked against late-runners.

"It's a hard track to close ground on," Brown said. "Really, only one race today someone closed. This would be the second one that closed. It's disappointing the way they had the track today, to be honest with you. It doesn't surprise me that a speed horse won the race."

After the rough start, Brown said that Sierra Leone was unable to deliver the type of strategic acceleration he needed to get back into the race.

"My horse, he had an opportunity to improve his position on the backside and he really didn't do it," Brown said. "It was a tough beat."

Once he got Sierra Leone settled and running into the first turn, Prat figured things were OK.

"They were going quite fast so I was happy where I was," he said. "I wish I could have gotten myself a little closer down the backside, but I was not able."

Passing the quarter pole, Sierra Leone was on the move, but he found trouble again when Protective (Medaglia d'Oro) forced him to go very wide.

"The horse inside kept pushing me out," Prat said. "I wish I could have just cleared him and get going. I was not able to do that. We got to the turn and I took him back to the inside and he came running, but he ran out of room."

Inaugural Belmont at Saratoga Generates Record Handle for Non-Triple Crown Year Edited Press Release

Saturday's blockbuster Belmont Stakes Day card, highlighted by Dornoch's victory in the 156th running of the GI \$2-million Belmont S. presented by NYRA Bets, generated all-sources handle of \$125,748,941, a New York Racing Association, Inc. (NYRA) record for a non-Triple Crown year.

The 2024 all-sources handle figure is an increase of more than 6.3% over the previous non-Triple Crown record of \$118,283,455, which was set in 2023.

On-track handle for the 14-race Belmont Stakes Day card, which included six Grade 1 races among nine total stakes, was \$14,854,311.

All-sources handle for the Belmont S. itself, which was carded as race 12 was \$60,904,557.

A sellout crowd capped at 50,000 witnessed history as the Belmont Stakes Racing Festival was held at Saratoga Race Course for the first time to allow for the uninterrupted construction of a new Belmont Park, the Long Island home of the Belmont S.

NATIONAL TREASURE ROMPS IN HILL 'N'

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY--The morning-line odds may have suggested that a showdown between Classic winning **National Treasure** (Quality Road) and GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner **White Abarrio** (Race Day) could be in the offing in the GI Hill 'n' Dale Metropolitan H., a 'Win and You're In' for the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile. After the dust had settled, however, it proved to be more of a procession for the Bob Baffert runner, who streaked home a much-the-best 6 1/4-length winner over **Post Time** (Frosted).

Getting away in good order, the 6-5 choice went straight to the front as **Hoist the Gold** (Mineshaft) pressed the issue with 8-5 second choice White Abarrio and **Castle Chaos** (Palace Malice) five lengths farther back through an opening quarter in :23.52. Narrowly in front through a :45.75 half-mile, the GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational winner didn't show any signs of slowing down passing the quarter pole. Spurting away from Hoist the Gold as if that one was tied to a post, the favorite was given a couple of reminders in the stretch, but it was too little too late for the rest as he strolled home an uncontested winner over Post Time, who managed to fend off Hoist the Gold by a neck at the wire. White Abarrio crossed the wire in fifth.

"The first part of the race, I had to keep him engaged" said Flavien Prat. "But then once I got down the backside, it felt like I was going to be able to get away from Johnny [Velazquez, aboard [Hoist the Gold]. Then after that, when I tightened my rein, he just went on."

Prat added, "He has always shown talent. There's one thing about him is he always shows up and runs his race. It was a great run today."

When asked about any pre-race instructions for his jockey, Baffert explained, "I talked to [Flavien] Prat about it [past pressure] earlier and I knew [Hoist the Gold] would be pressure, but we've learned about this horse that you have to let him run. That's his weapon--his speed--and if you take it away from him, he won't run well. That's just him. Sometimes, you just have to go for broke."

Of White Abarrio's performance, Irad Ortiz, Jr. said, "I mean, they went fast. He broke good and I was happy where I was. They went a little quick in front of me. I was about four or five lengths off of them. I felt great and started to pick it up, but I couldn't catch any of them. He didn't fire today. It was not his day."

After breaking his maiden first time out at Del Mar in September of 2022, it took four more tries before National Treasure would return to the winner's circle, that victory a frontrunning score over **Blazing Sevens** (Good Magic) in the GI Preakness S. at Pimlico. Off the board in both the 12-furlong GI Belmont S. and the 1 1/4-mile GI Travers S., he was fourth when returning west for Santa Anita's GI Awesome Again S. over nine furlongs in September. Cutting back for the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile at Santa Anita, he found only Cody's Wish (Curlin) too good, having to settle for second by a nose behind the eventual champion sprinter. Favored at Gulfstream when stretching back out in on Pegasus Day, National Treasure came home the narrow winner over Senor Buscador, but saw the tables turned on him next time out when a battling fourth behind that colt in the G1 Saudi Cup at King Abdulaziz Racecourse.

"He's royally bred and a beautiful horse, but it's about the excitement of winning these big races for these clients," said Baffert when asked about the colt's stallion career.

"That's why they're in the business--to play on the big stage. The stallion part of it he'll have to prove down the road, but we know he's a tremendous racehorse."

When asked about a potential start in the nine-furlong GI Whitney S. Aug. 3 at the Spa, offering a "Win and You're In" berth to the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, Baffert said, "If he tips me off, it's very possible."

MEASURED TIME GETS GODOLPHIN ON THE BOARD IN THE MANHATTAN by Alan Carasso

For an operation so accustomed to success on these shores, the first two-plus days of the Belmont Stakes Racing Festival proved surprisingly and disappointingly fruitless for Godolphin, trainer Charlie Appleby and jockey William Buick.

Siskany (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) was flat as the heavy favorite in Thursday's GII Belmont Gold Cup, while English Rose (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) was last but one as the pick in Friday's GI New York S. Mischief Magic (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) was a fair fifth in Saturday's GI Jaipur S. to add insult to injury, but sent away at a fairly generous 3-1 in Saturday's GI Manhattan S., the immaculately bred Measured Time (GB) (Frankel {GB}) proved the right elixir, as he came away late to best a classy field.

"It's been a long weekend," Appleby admitted. "Things didn't go right with our other horses. At the end of the day he [Measured Time] was a class horse going into a Grade I. They're all finding their way in the Grade Is. As we know, at this level you can't really have any faults.

"We've earmarked this for some time thinking that the American tracks would suit him. Obviously, we saw what he did in Dubai. That kind of tracks, nice level tracks, suit him."

Ridden aggressively from gate nine, this year's G1 Jebel Hatta hero--a latest fourth and beaten just over a length in the G1 Dubai Turf Mar. 30--led the Manhattan field under the wire for the first time, but Buick had left the inside open and longshot **Strong Quality** (Quality Road) clipped the hedge to take up the running at the first corner. Buick was content to cede the advantage, all the while keeping Measured Time at the saddle towel of Strong Quality, and the pace dropped away a bit through the middle stages.

Favored **Program Trading (GB)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}) slipstreamed his chief market rival and when Buick allowed Measured Time to assume command at the three-eighths, Flavien Prat began to feel for the last-out GI Turf Classic winner and produced him three deep into the lane with every chance if good enough. Measured Time cornered wide into the stretch as stablemate **Nations Pride (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}), winner of the GI Saratoga Derby here two summers ago, began to find his best stride, but Measured Time was kept to task and raced clear. **Far Bridge** (English Channel) and **Ohana Honor** (Honor Code) deadheated for third.

"It was always the plan to go forward, sit forward," Buick remarked. "He's a horse you never feel like you are going quick enough, so I was happy where I was. He was a bit competitive early on, but I always felt he was in a nice rhythm, and he's a real powerful galloper, as you saw there. He's still got a bit to learn, like he ran out on the home bend and it doesn't feel like he's a finished article just yet, but he sure has the raw talent."

Appleby indicated that Measured Time could potentially take in a race like the GI Arlington Million at Colonial Downs in a couple months' time. **Cont. p15**

"We were confident stepping up to the [9 1/2 furlongs] today," said Appleby. "We feel he could stretch out to a mile-and-a-half. We'll take the [GI] Breeders' Cup [Turf] into consideration."

That race is also a strong possibility for Measured Time's globetrotting half-brother Rebel's Romance (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), winner of the 2022 Turf at Keeneland and a Group 1 winner in Dubai and Hong Kong this season. Rebel's Romance is expected for Saratoga's GI Sword Dancer S. in August.

RANDOMIZED TURNS TABLES ON IDIOMATIC IN THRILLING OGDEN PHIPPS

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY--Favored **Idiomatic** (Curlin) towered over her competition both in stature and on paper in Saturday's GI Ogden Phipps S. Despite her imposing presence, however, it was Klaravich Stables' **Randomized** (Nyquist) who stole the show when holding on to a head victory over last year's champion older mare in the 'Win and You're In' event for the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff at Del Mar in November.

Breaking from the rail, Randomized, sent off at generous 6-1 odds for trainer Chad Brown, scooted to the front several strides in while a slightly slow-starting Idiomatic was caught several paths wide rounding the first turn. Randomized, in front by a length over **Tizzy in the Sky** (Sky Kingdom), was also pursued by last season's GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Pretty Mischievous (Into Mischief) and Idiomatic matching strides not far behind the leading pair. Following opening splits of :24.34 and :48.99, the pacesetter was still moving under her own power as Idiomatic loomed to her outside leaving the quarter pole. Randomized seemed like she would get swallowed up by her powerful rival. However, despite Florent Geroux's best intentions to get his mammoth mare up, it was Randomized who proved gamest late, holding off the 3-5 choice to win the bob at the wire. Pretty Mischievous, a 6-1 chance, was 4 1/2 lengths back in third with Raging Sea (Curlin), also trained by Brown, a nose back in fourth.

"She's quick out of the gate. She maintained the speed, so that was good," said winning rider Joel Rosario. "I was begging for the wire because [Idiomatic] was coming. So I was sweating a little bit, but she got the job done. She kind of waited until the last part. My horse, she responded."

As for the beaten favorite, trainer Brad Cox said, "She ran well and was the best horse. She lost a tremendous amount of ground around the first turn and second turn. The winner didn't really have any pace pressure. Excited about the rematch. Can't wait."

Of the third-place finisher, Brendan Walsh added, "I think she ran well enough. Tyler [Gaffalione] said she could have benefitted maybe from a little more pace. It looked like they weren't going very fast and I don't think that really helped. She was down inside for a long time. But, listen, we can't make excuses. Hopefully, she comes out of it OK."

Having shown an affinity for the Saratoga main track, Randomized won a pair of stakes here last summer--the restricted Wilton S. over a mile followed by a career-high win in the 1 1/4-mile GI Alabama S. Making it three straight with a victory in the nine-furlong GII Beldame S. at the Big A last October, the bay found Idiomatic a half-length too good in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff at Santa Anita Nov. 4. Given some time off following that effort, she resumed with a second--beaten 4 3/4 lengths-- by Soul of an Angel (Atreides) in the one-mile GII Ruffian S. May 4.

In regard to her next race, Brown, winning his first Ogden Phipps, was non committal.

"I haven't thought about anything for her next race yet," he said. "I just wanted to see her get right back on track. Last time, even though she was off the layoff, I thought it was a disappointing loss because she was the class of the field. As it turns out, she just needed that race."

Randomized had to play bridesmaid to Idiomatic in last fall's Breeders' Cup, but she was able to turn the tables on champion, with some racing luck, this time.

"These two were going at it in the Breeders' Cup last year and we came out on the wrong side of that one. Idiomatic is a deserving champion. She's an outstanding horse," said Brown. "I think we were very fortunate to save more ground than her. She was pitched three-deep the whole way and still almost won the race. I'm taking nothing away from her. She ran an equally good race. We were able to just get our nose down. I've said, the photos go both ways, so I keep that in mind when I lose them."

Richard and Connie Snyder's Cove Springs acquired French Passport, a half-sister to MGSW/MGISP Smooth Air (Smooth Jazz), GSW Overdriven (Tale of the Cat) and the dam of MGISW Got Stormy (Get Stormy), for \$200,000 in foal to American Pharoah at the 2018 Keeneland November Sale. Following a 12 3/4-length victory by New Jersey-bred **Book'em Danno** (Bucchero) in the seven-furlong Pasco S. at Tampa on seasonal debut back in January, trainer Derek Ryan got social media all fired up by almost blasphemously suggesting that a trip down the Triple Crown trail--one he'd traversed before with Musket Man (Yonaguska)--was not necessarily an appropriate course to chart for his trainee.

"I have no Derby dreams," Ryan told TDN's Bill Finley at the time. "I think the Derby is overrated, but that's just me. We were never really considering the Derby trail. You put the horse under alot of pressure."

"Kind of bummed that the best Jersey-bred 3yo in years won't point towards the first Saturday in May," lamented another apparently frustrated observer.

Instead, Ryan was using the Pasco as something of a trial for the G3 Saudi Derby, contested over a more suitable one-turn mile for a cool million and a half dollars.

"This is a great position to be in," said New Jerseyan Jay Briscione, part of the Atlantic Six Racing ownership group. "There are rewards and risks. The reward in Saudi is the money. The only issue is that once you come back, you'll probably need about three months before you're ready to race."

In Riyadh, Book'em Danno would face a colt from Japan by the name of Forever Young (Jpn) (Real Steel {Jpn}), theretofore perfect in three starts at home and using the Saudi race as a part of a two-race prep for a possible appearance at the Kentucky Derby. The clearest betting alternative to that Yoshito Yahagi trainee on that Saturday evening, Book'em Danno was sent for home fairly early by Irad Ortiz, Jr. and he opened up, as very little went right for Forever Young. But the raider from the Land of the Rising Sun finally got untracked, albeit on the wrong lead, and managed to drop his nose on the wire.

Forever Young would be heard from again, in Dubai in victorious fashion in the G2 UAE Derby at the end of March and at Churchill, when controversially third in the Run for the Roses.

The GII Pat Day Mile was mooted as a possible comeback spot for Book'em Danno, but when it became clear he wouldn't be ready in time for that Derby undercard event, the next logical option was the GI Woody Stephens S. The gelding returned to the worktab at Tampa at the end of April and had a pair of breezes at Ryan's summer base at Monmouth Park, including a swift five-eighths from the gate in :58 1/5 May 30. And it was game on at Saratoga.

A well-backed and arguably overbet 5-2 given his most recent formline, Book'em Danno fell into a perfect trip from the inside gate and settled in midfield, but he was well and truly outrun, as GIII Chick Lang S. winner **Frost Free** (Frosted) and **Barksdale** (Street Sense) matched motors--and burned each other's out-through an opening quarter-mile in :21.37.

Slipped a bit of rein after the pacesetters continued to engage in suicidal tactics through a half in a merciless :43.08, Book'em Danno made stealthy inside progress, was pulled out three wide nearing the stretch and had the first crack at the spent paceduelers. Firmly in front with a furlong and a half to go, he kept on well as 'TDN Rising Star' Prince of Monaco (Speightstown), a Grade I winner at two and having his first run since a fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, gained menacingly after being pinballed around and pinched back at the break. Ortiz, Jr. kept after Book'em Danno right-handed and was on the winning end of the photo this time around. Prince of Monaco was a gallant second and lost nothing in defeat, while Nutella Fella (Runhappy), making his first start since winning last year's GI Hopeful S. over the course and distance, spiced up the triple at 20-1.

"They were going fast," commented the winning jockey, taking the race for the first time since 2015. "The horse relaxed. When I started moving, he started finding really well on the turn. He started responding really, really good on the turn, so that helped a lot. Turning for home, I was still in a hold, then I asked him, and he gave me a good kick at the end. That was great. He is a nice horse."

Ryan, unsaddling the first Grade I winner of his career, indicated that all roads likely lead back to Saratoga for the GI Allen Jerkens S. over the same course and trip in August.

Of the runner-up, assistant trainer Jimmy Barnes said: "[Jockey] Flavien [Prat] said the horse to the inside of us [No. 6, Reasoned Analysis] stumbled and kind of knocked him out of it. He galloped out very strong. We just needed a place to start racing again with him. This was our return race. We will find something else for him down the road."

Pedigree Notes:

The most prolific of his sire's 74 individual winners, Book'em Danno is the first graded winner of any variety for Bucchero, who covered his first book of mares at nearby McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds this season after proving popular with the Florida breeding community at Pleasant Acres Stallions near Ocala. Book'em Danno is the sixth Grade I winner out of a daughter of Ghostzapper, four of which are by Storm Cat-line stallions, including Book'em Danno.

Breeder Greg Kilka purchased the unraced Adorabella for \$14,000 in foal to Fast Anna at the 2020 Keeneland January Sale, and that foal, Girl Trouble, did her part in improving the page with a pair of juvenile stakes scores in 2022. When factoring in Book'em Danno's emergence late last year, the family became even more valuable, as the now-juvenile colt by Classic Empire topped the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic October sale on LC Racing's bid of \$135,000 and that same operation added Adorabella to the fold when paying \$550,000 for the mare in foal to Medaglia d'Oro after she was supplemented to the Fasig-Tipton November Sale. Adorabella subsequently aborted the foal.

The stakes-placed second dam produced snythetic stakes winner Alydiva (Quality Road) and she is a daughter of Esprit d'Escalier, the dam of GSW & MGISP Gastronomical (Sunshine Forever). Alydorable was purchased by Thomas & Mitchell Bloodstock for \$5,000 in foal to Sir Winston at last year's Keeneland November Sale.

COGBURN SETS COURSE RECORD, LEADS NOT THIS TIME 1-2 IN JAIPUR by Alan Carasso

Clark Brewster and Bill and Corinne Heiligbrodt's **Cogburn** (Not This Time) continued his assault on the American turf sprint division with a jaw-dropping, front-running success in Saturday's GI Jaipur S. at Saratoga, a 'Win and You're In' qualifying race for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint at Del Mar in early November.

And if holding the form he's in currently, he will be a very difficult nut to crack.

Drawn eight in a full field for the Jaipur, normally a six-furlong contest downstate, but shortened to 5 1/2 panels to accommodate the layout of the Mellon Turf Course at the Spa, Cogburn was bumped lightly at the break, but knifed through between 33-1 Coppola (Into Mischief) and Godolphin's 3-year-old filly Star of Mystery (GB) (Kodiac {GB}) to take up the running and was by the opening quarter in :21.33.

Pressed along on the turn by longshot **Sosua Summer** (Summer Front), Cogburn still traveled ominously well on the turn and cornered for home with Irad Ortiz, Jr. high in the saddle, looking every inch a winner. The teletimer read :43.07 for the half-mile, and skipped clear unchallenged in the final furlong, stopping the timer in :59.80, lowering the course record of 1:00.21 set by Carotari in 2019. Equibase reports that it a North American record for the distance. **Arzak** completed a **Not This Time** Grade I exacta. **Cont. p20**

The performance left his Hall of Fame trainer awestruck.

"I've had some of the fastest horses in the world, some of the fastest horses of all time, and he's still the first one I've ever had run 5 1/2 furlongs in under a minute," said trainer Steve Asmussen, who won the 2011 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint with Regally Ready (More Than Ready). "Five and a half furlongs in under a minute. That's not five-eighths five, that's five-and-a-half. That's basically a sixteenth of a mile faster than a fast horse."

As good a turf sprinter as he has become, Cogburn was something other than an abject failure on dirt, amassing a record of 3-2-0 from eight starts, including a runner-up effort in the GIII Chick Lang S. at three. Switched to the grass around this time last year, Cogburn saluted in a pair of six-figure sprints at Lone Star before handing future BC Turf Sprint victor Nobals (Noble Mission {GB}) a 3/4-length defeat in the GIII Troy S. at this track last August. The final time over soft turf on that occasion? 1:03.70, nearly 20 lengths slower. A close fifth in the GII Turf Sprint at Kentucky Downs Sept. 9, Cogburn was sidelined and resumed with a facile success in the GII TwinSpires Turf Sprint on Derby Day May 4.

Pedigree Notes:

Cogburn is the sixth elite-level winner for Not This Time, who was coincidentally represented by his first European winner when Shareholder won his maiden impressively at Beverley on Saturday.

Bellary Bloodstock acquired the stakes-winning In a Jif for \$26,000 carrying the colt that would become Cogburn at the 2018 Keeneland November Sale. A half-sister to a pair of blacktype horses, In a Jif is the dam of Cogburn's yearling full-brother and a colt foal by Epicenter.

Off a two-month layoff returning from a poor effort in the G1 Dubia World Cup, Crupi put in a strong finish Saturday to take the GII Suburban S.

A back-to-back stakes winner at Aqueduct at the end of last year, the son of Curlin did well to finish third behind National Treasure (Quality Road) and next-out G1 Saudi Cup winner Senor Buscador (Mineshaft) in the GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational S. Jan. 27. A trip to Dubai proved fruitless as he was came home a tired 10th, but the Todd Pletcher trainee regrouped and was more than ready to tackle Saturday's field that was impacted by the morning scratch of last year's winner in stablemate 'TDN Rising Star' Charge It (Tapit).

Drawn in gate seven, the 5-2 shot broke just inside of race favorite Bendoog and the pair bumped briefly before Crupi took back, letting the entire field pass him by the wire for the first time.

Kept off the rail up the backstretch under jockey Irad Ortiz, Jr. through fractions of :23.70 and :47.85, he sat at the back until the field began to bunch up into the far turn and Ortiz began to move, swinging Crupi three wide to join a calvary charge of runners at the head of the lane. Bendoog held a narrow lead with a furlong to run but had no fewer than five challengers bearing down on him with Crupi coming widest of the line and producing the strongest final sixteenth of the bunch.

"He's still kind of putting things together," said Pletcher. "You could see him coming by the wire the first time when he was getting his head out of the kickback and trying to get his face clean. The good thing was even though he was climbing a little bit from the kickback, he was a little more engaged and got a little closer. My concern was that I didn't see a whole lot of pace, on paper, and he's not the kind of horse where you can change his style. He's a horse that wants to make one late run. We had to sacrifice some ground around the far turn to get him in the clear, but he kept coming. He showed a lot of courage in the lane. He fought hard for the win."

Pedigree Note:

Curlin certainly needs no introduction as the sire of 105 stakes winners to date with 59 coming at the graded stakes level.

Don'tforgetaboutme, last sold in foal to Blame for \$550,000 at Keeneland November in 2022, counts five foals of racing age and three winners to her credit including GSP Royal Spirit (Into Mischief), also a Repole Stable/St. Elias venture along with Crupi. The dam is also a half to a pair of talented runners in GSW Mo Tom (Uncle Mo) and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and GI Spinaway S. runner up Beautician (Dehere) along with MGSW Red Ruby (Tiznow). Don'tforgetaboutme foaled a colt by Blame last year and produced a Candy Ride (Arg) filly this spring.

On paper, Ice Chocolat had one race that might have made him a threat in Saturday's GIII Poker S. at Saratoga, a close third to Casa Creed (Jimmy Creed) in the GI Fourstardave H. over this course and distance last summer, where he rallied from last behind sound fractions to round out the trifecta. Few would have seen him as a pace factor--let alone a win candidate--Saturday afternoon, but he was ridden for speed by Jose Ortiz and he forgot to stop, returning a \$50 bill to those who backed him.

Quarter-horsed away from gate four, the Brazilian-bred secured the front without having to do too much work to get there and led out from third choice Talk of the Nation, as Mysterious Night rode the rail from third. Favored 'TDN Rising Star' Carl Spackler (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) was three deep into the first turn, but was able to slot in to the one out and one back position with cover behind the China Horse Club/Joe Allenowner runner turning up the back.

But back up front, it was as soft as you like for Ice Chocolat, as he went past halfway in a hassle-free :48.17, and Ortiz managed to up the tempo on the turn, but now had the three market leaders bearing down on him passing the quarter pole. Talk of the Nation launched his bid in earnest in upper stretch, perhaps nosing in front for a stride or two, but Ice Chocolat had something left and covered his final two furlongs in a slick :22.63 (:11.18, :11.45) to register the upset.

"You have to give a lot of credit to [jockey] Jose [Ortiz]. I don't give instructions," said winning trainer Mark Casse. "I told him to just play the break and see what happens. He said he broke running and from there, catch me if you can. This horse doesn't run on the lead usually, but one thing about this horse is he does get himself in a little trouble so he's actually a better horse than he looks. Today, obviously making the lead, Jose won it in the first half-mile. And he had nothing to get in his way. He's a pretty good horse."

Casse indicated that Ice Chocolat could return to the Spa for this year's Fourstardave Aug. 10.

Fifth in the GI Ricoh Woodbine Mile following his
Fourstardave effort, Ice Chocolat went close in the grassy
GII Nearctic S. and in the GII Kennedy Road S. on the Tapeta-both over six panels--before calling it a season. A Gulfstream
allowance winner back at this distance Jan. 27, the dark bay was
third in the GIII Canadian Turf S., a troubled seventh in the
Mar. 30 Appleton S. and most recently finished eight lengths

A fan-favorite upstate, Baby Yoda stole the show as he collected the first stakes win of his career in the GII True North S. on Saturday.

Three years ago, the Spa was the site where Baby Yoda posted a gaudy 114 Beyer while facing allowance types. However since then the dark bay was either unlucky or outmatched over the course of several black-type attempts, including runner-up finishes in the GI Malibu S. late in 2021 and GII Kelso H. in 2022, and when well-beaten in the Russell Road S. at Charles Town last August.

After that, it took the gelding six attempts to clear the optional claiming ranks, which he accomplished after a two-month break during the Belmont at the Big A meeting May 3.

Drifting upwards on the tote from 6-1 on the morning line to 9-1 at post time, the Florida-bred tracked just to the outside of Gun It (Tapit) up the backstretch. Taking the lead around the far turn, the 6-year-old shrugged off a brief challenge from Rotknee at the top of the lane and he kicked on to collect the hardware.

"He likes this racetrack," said trainer Bill Mott. "He's done his best running up here. I was a little surprised he was as close as he was. I thought there was maybe a little more speed in the race than that, but he broke well and he put himself right there. He didn't like the Gulfstream track [over the winter]. He likes it here."

Pedigree Notes:

This is the first graded winner and seventh stakes winner for sire Prospective (by Malibu Moon). Baby Yoda was his dam's last registered foal, until she produced a colt by Charlatan Mar. 4. More Than Speed was purchased for \$50,000 by Town and Country Horse Farms at last fall's Keeneland November Sale with that offspring in utero. Baby Yoda's unraced second dam is responsible for MSW Spring Steen (Maclean' Music), while his extended female family includes the George Strawbridge homebred who was an English Group 1 stakes winner, Selkirk (Sharpen Up {GB}).

Sugar Fish, the longest shot at 5-1 in a short field of four, looked to lose all chance when she tumbled out of the gate as the sophomore fillies were sent on their way Saturday in the GII Summertime Oaks at Santa Anita. She immediately lost at least three lengths on the field in the first few seconds and trailed as early fractions were clocked in :23.80 and :47.41. Previously unbeaten Jane Austen, like Sugar Fish trying stakes company for the first time, showed the way as MGSW Nothing Like You loomed menacingly in third with Juddmonte homebred Show Card (Into Mischief) in between as Sugar Fish hugged the rail from behind and regrouped.

"I thought we were done," said winning trainer Jeff Mullins. As the temp quickened on the turn, Nothing Like You collared Jane Austen as Show Card threw in the towel, but it was Sugar Fish who suddenly shot through on the inside to annihilate the race in the blink of an eye. She left the field far behind in the stretch, easing up late to finish 9 3/4 lengths the best. Nothing Like You outfinished Jane Austen by three-quarters of a length for the runner-up spot. Nothing Like You had been unbeaten in two previous tries at 1 1/16 miles: the GII Santa Anita Oaks Apr. 6 and last December's GII Starlet S. The 8 1/2 furlongs of the Summertime Oaks was Sugar Fish's first start at the distance.

"We were taking a big chance going into this race, but we've always known that she is a good filly," said Mullins. "To stumble then overcome and win like she did. Down the backside I felt confident and when [jockey] Tyler [Baze] made the move on the turn and got through and nobody was coming, I said, 'It's over.'"

Previously trained as a 2-year-old by Librado Barocio, who got the first graded winner of his career a month ago with Visually (Enticed) in the GIII Senorita S. at Santa Anita, Sugar Fish moved to Mullins's barn for her 3-year-old campaign. After a second in February under a \$40,000 tag sprinting 5 1/2 furlongs in Arcadia, she was entered for a \$62,500 price at seven panels and romped by 10 lengths. She faced older at a mile in her first try against winners Apr. 26 and won again. The Summertime Oaks marked her first try in black-type as well as her third consecutive win.

Pedigree Notes:

Sugar Fish is the first graded winner for 2018 champion older male Accelerate, who also has three additional black-type winners. Although he originally stood at Lane's End, the GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner was pensioned last November and moved to the Hall of Champions at the Kentucky Horse Park. Sugar Fish's broodmare sire, Langfuhr, also stood at Lane's End until his death at 31 last October. He has 83 stakes winners out of his daughters.

Madeira Park, winner of the 2013 GIII Ballerina S. at Hastings, is a full-sister to the dam of MSW Lookin At Lee (by Accelerate's sire, Lookin At Lucky), who finished second in the 2017 GI Kentucky Derby and placed in five other graded events. That mare also produced MGSW Blended Citizen (Proud Citizen) and SW & GISP Battlefield Angel (Proud Citizen). The latter is the dam of GSW Manny Wah (Will Take Charge). Madeira Park's most recent foal is a 2-year-old colt by Mitole named Mitole Park.

FRANK STRONACH ARRESTED ON MULTIPLE SEXUAL ASSAULT CHARGES

Eclipse Award-winning owner/breeder and founder of The Stronach Group Frank Stronach was arrested Friday and charged with mulitple criminal offenses according to a press release by the Peel Regional Police in Ontario, Canada. The 91-year-old Stronach has, according to the release, been charged with committing five crimes including rape, indecent assault on a female, sexual assault and forcible confinement and has been released on conditions to appear at the Ontario Court of Justice in Brampton at a later date. The release also notes that the assaults "spanned from the 1980's to as recent as 2023."

The investigation was carried out by Peel's Special Victims
Unit

Peel Regional Police Constable Tyler Bell told the *Associated Press* that there was more than one accuser, but did not specify how many there were. "Obviously, this is a high-profile case," he told the *AP*. "Our special victims unit is bound to protect the victims and in doing so, that's why we're being so vague. There is more than one victim, but we won't confirm the number yet."

Police are asking members of the public to come forward with any relevant information by calling investigators of the Special Victims Unit at 905-453-2121, extension 3460.

Brian Greenspan, the lawyer representing Stronach, told *Reuters* that Stronach denied all charges. "He looks forward to the opportunity to fully respond to the charges and to maintain his legacy as a philanthropist and as an icon of the Canadian business community," Greenspan told *Reuters*.

Stronach was born September 6, 1932, in Austria. He emigrated to Canada in 1954, and went on to found Magna International, an automotive parts company based in Canada. He founded The Stronach Group with his daughter Belinda in 2011, but resigned as a trustee in 2013 to run for office in Austria. The group owns racetracks such as Santa Anita, Gulfstream, and Pimlico, along with wagering systems. In 2018, Stonach filed a lawsuit against Belinda and other family members, charging mismanagement of the group. As part of the settlement, Belinda Stronach retained control of the racing, gaming and real estate ends of the business, since rebranded as 1/ST Racing. Frank and his wife Elfriede assumed control of the stallion and breeding business.

The Stronach Group released a statement late Friday, which read: "The Stronach Group is aware of the serious charges that have been brought against Frank Stronach. Frank Stronach has not held a formal role or been involved with company operations in any capacity for several years. This matter is now before the courts and will be dealt with in the appropriate forum. The company has nothing further to add."

Reached Saturday morning, a public information officer for the Peel Regional Police said, "The matter is under investigation. We do understand the significant public interest in this investigation, however, to maintain the privacy of the victims and judicial integrity, we will not be providing further information at this time."

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY, VRC

Located in the Richmond, Virginia area, this full time position is responsible for the daily operations of the state agency regulating pari-mutuel thoroughbred and standardbred racing in Virginia. The Executive Secretary reports directly to the five member Racing Commission which is appointed by the Governor of the Commonwealth. The Virginia Racing Commission (VRC) is responsible for sustaining, promoting, and growing the native horse racing industry in Virginia, including control of all horse racing with pari-mutuel wagering conducted in the Commonwealth.

These locations include thoroughbred and steeplechase racing at Colonial Downs, steeplechase at Great Meadows, and harness racing at Shenandoah Downs. All facilities host two meets per year.

With the passage of HB 1609 in 2018, the VRC also oversees the licensing and compliance, associated with historical horseracing (HHR) machines. There are currently eight Rosie's Gaming Emporiums located around the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Qualifications include:

Demonstrated management skills; experience in working with the administration of government and the legislative process; knowledge of horse racing, and pari-mutuel wagering; a basic knowledge of accounting and budget development; communications skills enabling good working relationships with Commissioners, State Administration Officials, business and political leaders, members of the horse racing industry, the media, and the public; college degree preferred.

From the rail, Bello (Speightstown) will carry the Kaleem Shah colors to post. The half-brother to SP Appraised (Shanghai Bobby) is out of a half-sister to GISP Realm (Haynesfield) and SW North Freeway (Jump Start), who herself produced SW & GISP Take The One O One (Acclamation). TJCIS PPs

You just have to let the horse kind of dictate and stay out of their way."

Candied picked up her biggest career win in the GI Darley Alcibiades S. at Keeneland last Oct. 6 in what was her second lifetime start, and went on finish third in the Nov. 3 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, beaten just 3/4 of a length by champion 2-year-old filly Just F Y I (Justify). She was entered but did not draw in to the field from the also-eligible list for the May 3 Kentucky Oaks.






