BELMONT WINNER DORNOCH COULD RUN NEXT IN HASKELL

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY–A steady rain Sunday morning wasn't going to put a damper on the mood at the barn of trainer Danny Gargan on the Saratoga backstretch.

When you have the winner of the GI Belmont S. in one of your stalls, a lousy morning isn't going to feel so bad. And **Dornoch** (Good Magic), the upset winner of the Belmont, does indeed live in Gargan's barn.

"My phone had 290 text messages on it," Gargan said, standing outside his office. "My phone hasn't stopped ringing. He came out of the race great; he's standing around biting everybody today."

Dornoch, a full-brother to 2023 GI Kentucky Derby winner Mage, backed up Gargan's confidence in the Belmont when he won the 1 1/4-mile race by a half-length over **Mindframe** (Constitution) at odds of 17-1.

In his two prior starts, Dornoch ran a non-threatening fourth in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. then was nowhere in the Kentucky Derby, finishing 10th.

"I kept telling everyone you can throw the Derby out," Gargan said. "He had no chance. He drew the one hole and 100 yards into the race, he got checked and it was over. I got him beat in the Blue Grass." **Cont. p3**

Gargan continued, "We wanted to take him off the lead in the Blue Grass and school him and toughen him up for the Derby. That was our decision. I was never frustrated with the horse. I

was frustrated with his trips." Dornoch has been in Saratoga since right after the Kentucky Derby and he will continue his stay here, repeating the routine from last year when he was at the Spa from April to October.

The main summer goal is the GI Travers S. Aug. 24. Gargan said Dornoch could run in the GI Haskell S. at Monmouth July 20 or the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga July 27. After that, Gargan said Dornoch could run in the GI Pennsylvania Derby at Parx Sept. 21.

Gargan said he never felt any pressure training Dornoch, even though he had an attractive pedigree that suggested he could be special. of [Mystik Dan]. Obviously, we wanted to run better, but, again, it's part of the game. That's what makes it so difficult."



"No, because I knew he could run," Gargan said. "Two months before he ever ran, I said he was the best horse I ever trained. I knew what I had."

McPeek Had an Up and Down Couple of Days

There was euphoria and disappointment in a span of 24 hours for trainer Kenny McPeek. On Friday, super filly **Thorpedo Anna** (Fast Anna) dominated the GI Acorn S., winning by 5 1/2 lengths.

The next day, GI Kentucky Derby winner **Mystik Dan** (Goldencents) was never a factor in the GI Belmont S., finishing eighth in the field of 10.

"It's part of the sport," McPeek said Sunday by phone. "It's never easy. We asked a lot out McPeek said Mystik Dan did not handle the Saratoga track very well and, in hindsight, said maybe he should have trained him more over it in the days leading up to the Belmont. Mystik Dan did most of his pre-Belmont work on the Oklahoma Training Track.

Next up for Mystik Dan is some rest. The summer goal is the GI Travers at Saratoga Aug. 24.

"With all the races he has had [six this year] and all the training, I think he deserves a big break," McPeek said.

The long-range schedule for Mystik Dan, McPeek said, also includes the GI Pennsylvania Derby at Parx Sept. 21 and the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Del Mar Nov. 2.

As for Thorpedo Anna, don't expect to see McPeek run her any time soon against males.

McPeek said she will be pointed to the GI Coaching Club American Oaks and GI Alabama S. at Saratoga. She has won five of six career starts, and is three-for-three this year, including the GI Kentucky Oaks.

"Look, I like challenges, but I also think this filly is so good that she could run the table in the 3-year-old filly division," McPeek said. "If she were to win the GI [Breeders' Cup] Distaff, would that make her Horse of the Year? The conservative approach would probably be the wise one as opposed to putting her in deeper water that she doesn't have to go into."

Lukas will Return with Seize the Grey

By 10 a.m. Sunday morning, the GI Belmont S. and Saratoga Race Course had long disappeared from Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas' rear-view mirror. He and GI Preakness S. champ **Seize the Grey** (Arrogate) were on the way home to Louisville.

The sting of Saturday's sixth-place finish in the Belmont had begun to subside as the travel party barreled through Erie, Pa. They departed Saratoga at 6:45 Sunday morning.





"He gave me every indication he was going to run a big one," Lukas, riding shotgun in the truck ahead of the van transporting Seize the Grey, said by phone. "I thought he would run a lot stronger race. He flattened out in that last quarter and that surprised me."

Seize the Grey set swift early fractions [:22.99, :47.25] as he set the pace, but then tired after being overtaken by Dornoch (Good Magic), who had followed him throughout.

"It was a little quick, but the eventual winner was right there, too," Lukas said.

Lukas said he will be back in Saratoga with a full barn later this month. Seize the Grey will also return with an eye on the 40-day summer meet's biggest prize, the GI Travers S. Aug. 24.

Whether Seize the Grey runs before the Midsummer Derby has yet to be decided. Lukas said Sunday that he is considering running in the GI Haskell S. at Monmouth July 20.

"We'll look at the Haskell," Lukas said. "It's a million-dollar race, so it's not exactly off the radar."

He will also consider the GII Jim Dandy S., which is run at Saratoga July 27.

Seize the Grey, Lukas said, came out of the Belmont OK. He did have a "some nicks and cuts" on a hind leg.

"We'll deal with that," Lukas said. "Nothing serious. He is all right."

Mott Still Needs an Answer

Going into the GI Belmont S., Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott said he needed to find out if **Resilience** (Into Mischief) could handle a mile and a quarter.

After Resilience finished last--beaten 33 1/4 lengths--in the 10-horse field, he still doesn't know.

"I learned nothing," Mott said outside his barn at the Oklahoma Training Track Sunday. "The race was too bad to be true."

Resilience finished sixth in the GI Kentucky Derby and Mott decided to give his colt another chance at the 1 1/4-mile distance in the Belmont. He stormed into contention in the Run for the Roses while running wide and then retreated.

In the Belmont, Resilience, who won the GII Wood Memorial, didn't do much of anything.

"He was done at the half-mile pole," jockey Junior Alvarado said Sunday morning. "It was not his day; he just didn't show up. We are just scratching our heads. Eventually, he might not want to go [1 1/4 miles], but I can't judge him from this race."

Mott said he might have to dig deeper as to what contributed to such a poor performance in the Belmont.

"When they run that poorly, we need to look and see if there is something wrong that we are missing," he said. "Something is out of whack."

BREEDERS' CUP CLASSIC

SARATOGA, NY–Sunday morning brought a stark contrast to the previous day, with the skies opening up for several hours over the region. Like many others, the Todd Pletcher squad went out for some light work given the challenging conditions, creating a far more sedate overall atmosphere as opposed to the frenetic activity raging through Saratoga only a day earlier.

In Saturday's GI Belmont S., Pletcher saddled a trio of runners in the Triple Crown's final jewel, with **'TDN Rising Star' Mindframe** (Constitution) just falling short by a half-length to winner **Dornoch** (Good Magic). According to Pletcher, all of his Belmont runners exited the race in good order.

With only two races under his belt--both won by wide margins--the Repole Stable and St Elias Stable representative Mindframe handled his toughest assignment to date admirably, however, couldn't quite get the job done under Irad Ortiz, Jr. when drifting out in the late stages of the 10-furlong Classic. He went off at 5-1 for his stakes debut.

"[His inexperience] was our concern going in, that he's lightly raced and he's going up against much more seasoned horses," said Pletcher.

"It looked like when Irad hit him left-handed the first time, it didn't do anything. But the second time is when he drifted out and he lost a little bit of momentum and focus. [Ortiz] had to angle him back in and straighten him out. I think it could have been the difference in the outcome."

Offering a possible explanation for the drifting, Pletcher explained, "I don't think he ever felt the crop prior to that. I guess one of the disadvantages of winning so easily in his first couple of starts is that he didn't get a lot of education. They really weren't the experience-building races that some of the others might have had."

While the result was a bit disappointing, Pletcher said he was pleased with the result overall.

"We're super proud of the race that he ran and the effort that he gave," he said. "He showed his talent was what we thought it was going in and aside from winning, did remarkably well."

Pletcher was also represented by Centennial Farms' Antiquarian (Preservationist), winner of the May 11 GIII Peter Pan S. in his most recent race. Accompanied by his regular rider, Hall of Fame jockey John Velazquez, the colt finished fifth at odds of 12-1.

"I thought he got a good trip and Johnny was pleased with the position he got," Pletcher said. "He was just behind Mindframe and between horses. Johnny said he was handling the kick back really well. When they started to pick up the pace on the far turn, he held his position, but he couldn't really quicken the last part. He just stayed on steadily through the lane."

He added, "If you go by Beyer figures, he ran a 92 Beyer, which is essentially what he ran in the Peter Pan. We need to find a little more improvement there. He's still a pretty lightly raced horse and there is room for improvement. He ran a credible race, but not quite good enough." Rounding out the Pletcher trio was Repole Stable's **Protective** (Medaglia d'Oro). Sent off at 19-1 under Tyler Gaffalione, the maiden finished third in his two latest races--the GII Wood Memorial in April and in the Peter Pan.

"He was angled out in the clear in the stretch and had to alter course when [race favorite] Sierra Leone [Gun Runner] came in in front of him," said the Hall of Famer, explaining the colt's trouble in the latter stages of the race. "I don't think that cost him a position quite frankly. Like Antiquarian, he was running on evenly in the stretch and put forth a credible effort, but needs to improve. Obviously, we have all our conditions available with him. So we'll back up and regroup."

Pletcher indicated that he will come up with a plan for all three horses in the coming days/weeks. He also confirmed that Leslie's Rose (Into Mischief), runner-up to Thorpedo Anna (Fast Anna) in Friday's GI Acorn S., exited her race well.

The winner of Keeneland's GI Ashland S. in April, the Whisper Hill Farm runner was making her first start since a 13th-place finish in the May 3 GI Kentucky Oaks.

"She ran terrific," he affirmed. "We were very pleased with her effort. She was second-best on the day, but she ran great and seems to have come out of it well."

Pletcher indicated that the majority of his barn will remain in Saratoga, with a few shipping downstate depending on their upcoming engagements at Aqueduct.

"We're fortunate in that it doesn't change much for us," he said of this year's changes to the Belmont venue and schedule. "We're stabled here and have been for many years for the spring and summer and even the fall so the entire thing was pretty seamless for us. It might be a little more challenging for trainers that don't already have a stable set up at Saratoga. But for those of us that are, it was pretty easy." Looking back at the maiden voyage of the Belmont at Saratoga, Pletcher said, "Going in, I thought it was going to be well received and well attended and it was. Saratoga is a remarkable place and people love coming to the races here. There is so much history and tradition here. You'd have to call it a tremendous success at this point."

WHITE ABARRIO SENT BACK TO JOSEPH

After a disappointing showing in Saturday's GI Metropolitan H. at Saratoga, the owners of **White Abarrio** (Race Day) have decided to send last year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner back to trainer Saffie Joseph, Jr.

Dave Grening of the *Daily Racing Form* was first with the story. White Abarrio was with Joseph until last spring when the trainer was temporarily suspended by Churchill Downs after two of his horse died around the time of the Derby. Joseph's situation in New York was also in limbo and owners Clint and Mark Cornett wanted to run him in last year's Met. With Joseph's status up in the air, they turned the horse over to Rick Dutrow. For Dutrow, he ran third in the Met before winning the GI Whitney S. and the Breeders' Cup Classic.

But he has not been the same horse this year as a 5-year-old. He was beaten 15 lengths in the G1 Saudi Cup and then was fifth, beaten 10 1/4 lengths in this year's Met in a dull effort.

"There's not too much to say other than we were very disappointed in his effort Saturday," said Mark Cornett, who owns the horse along with his brother Clint. "For whatever reason, he didn't fire in the race. Obviously, when he was running so well in the Whitney and in the Breeders' Cup, that was not the time to make changes. Now seemed like the right time to do it, to get him back in Saffie's hands and go a different direction with him at this point.

"Saffie is thrilled to be getting him back and his whole barn is happy about the decision. They had the horse longer than Rick had him, so they are very excited to get him back."

White Abarrio will be pointed to the \$200,000 GII John Nerud S. at Aqueduct July 6 at seven furlongs.

"I want to go back to the basics," Cornett said. "This is what we did last time when he was coming off that horrible effort in the Pegasus. We're not pointing to anything other than the one race. We're trying to get him back on track. Whatever happens after that happens. We want to get a confidence-building race in him and go from there."

Had she made the Belmont S. line-up, it sure would have added a whole lot of spice to the race. But you can't begrudge her trainer Kenny McPeek the decision to burnish his filly's resume with such a pedigreed prize. And McPeek is nothing if not an adventurous explorer--as evinced by his steering of Kentucky Derby hero **Mystik Dan** (Goldencents)--holding the promise of juicier assignments later on in the season for his latest muse.

The big, strapping magnificent mare **Idiomatic** (Curlin) lost nothing in defeat in Saturday's GI Ogden Phipps S. against her more vertically challenged rival **Randomized** (Nyquist). They're one-all in a match up. Here's hoping theirs turns into the sort of rivalry that lures warm bodies through the turnstiles as the rest of the season unfurls.

And then there was the Argentinian-bred **Didia (Arg)** (Orpen), who took the GI New York S. on the Friday in fine style, making her a Grade I winner in both hemispheres. Her trainer Ignacio Correas, IV sure knows how to manage a top-drawer Argentinian mare, epitomized by the careful lid he kept on the bubbling cauldron that was **Blue Prize (Arg)** (Pure Prize), a few years ago.

Blue Prize lost out on Eclipse Award plaudits to Midnight Bisou (Midnight Lute). Five years later, Didia tosses a beret into a crowded ring for champion female turf horse for possible recompense.

Louisiana About-Turn

Louisiana Racing Commission's hastily passed and just as hastily rescinded "emergency" medication changes proved once again that no exercise in futility is beyond racing's leadership.

At the end of May, the commission voted through "Active Emergency Rules of Racing," raising the permissible dosage and shrinking the allowable withdrawal times for several medications, most notably the bronchodilator Clenbuterol and corticosteroid Depo-Medrol.

This prompted significant push-back from within and without the industry, most notably among several high-profile trainers rightfully concerned about the potential consequences for shipping horses out of the state to race in states with much stricter drug rules.

On Tuesday, the commission heeded the calls--sort of. It rolled the rules on Clenbuterol and Depo-Medrol back to match the Association of Racing Commissioners International's (ARCI) model rules. But it still left the looser rules for numerous other drugs unchanged.

On Wednesday, the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority (HISA) sent a memo to owners, trainers, regulatory veterinarians, and track management advising that horses coming out of Louisiana must be placed on the vets' list--what would have proven a major headache for trainers. Churchill Downs threatened to cancel a suite of big races at Fair Grounds, including the Louisiana Derby.

On Friday the commission capitulated fully, rolling back the rules changes for all remaining drugs.

What this farcical episode has highlighted is that such ill-considered changes do a disservice to the many participants of this sport trying to do right by their horses, their teams and their clients.

The advent of federal safety and medication rules has come with all sorts of growing pains. For some, these growing pains have been eye-watering indeed.

Just this week, a lawyer representing three veterinarians facing potentially lengthy suspensions for possession of prohibited medications in their trucks argued that HISA representatives had told them this was okay, provided the drugs were used to treat animals in their practice outside HISA's jurisdiction (as the veterinarians are claiming).

While HISA can only be applauded as it continues to tweak its rules in response to calls for more common sense approaches to commonplace drug and medication-related issues, a regulatory landscape marked by constantly shifting goalposts is a difficult one to navigate, to say the least.

Just as it's incumbent upon the sport's participants to familiarize themselves with the rules, it's just as incumbent upon those writing the rulebooks to make their directives readily understood and supported by both science and reason.

Goodbye Golden Gate...

By the time you're reading this, the last race will have run at Golden Gate Fields, the last stragglers in the grandstand will have trickled out through the doors, and the horsemen and women who remain will be left in the chilly silence that follows to confront a painfully uncertain future.

"I don't know why they close this place. But what can we do?" Octavio Saldana, who works for trainer D. Wayne Baker, told the *TDN* this past week, capturing the sense of powerlessness that many in Northern California feel.

Most of the horsemen and women there will, if they haven't already, start preparations to make the move to Pleasanton at the Alameda County Fair in Pleasanton, some 35 miles away, give or take. First up on the calendar is the regular California fair meets. Then comes the new 10-week meet this fall at Pleasanton, events at which will have a huge bearing on whether the Northern portion of the state can maintain a viable circuit in Golden Gate's absence.

All the while, tough economics for horse racing in California will prove ever more keenly felt. This reality drives a budgetary fight to be thrashed out at the upcoming California Horse Racing Commission (CHRB) meeting. At the heart of it all is a simple equation: The pie being carved up is currently too small to feed every hungry mouth.

Where California leads, the rest of the country follows. And many in the industry have said that California is too big to fail. But now is crunch time to see just how moved these individuals are to help sustain a year-round sport out West. A few more horses wouldn't hurt. A radical reshaping of the system would be better.

JOSE ORTIZ WINS 3,000TH CAREER RACE

Jose Ortiz rode the 3,000th winner of his career when Save the Trees (Preservationist) captured the third race at Churchill Downs Sunday. The 30-year-old, who began his riding career in his native Puerto Rico, moved to the New York circuit in 2012 where he competing against his brother, fellow leading rider Irad Ortiz, Jr. Five years later, he earned the Eclipse Award for Outstanding Jockey. Ortiz won the 2022 GI Preakness S. aboard Early Voting (Gun Runner) and the 2017 GI Belmont S. aboard Tapwrit (Tapit). He has also ridden the winners of five Breeders' Cup races.

"I'd say the top wins that come to mind throughout my career have been in the Triple Crown races--those have been pretty special," Ortiz said. "It's hard to narrow it down. I've ridden so many talented horses for so many great people. It is such a great accomplishment to win this many races." 2024 Stud Fee: \$125,000 LFSN

Recently, Ortiz moved to Kentucky with his wife, retired jockey Taylor Rice Ortiz, and their three young children Leilani, Derek and Nikolai.

"Winning races here in Kentucky or New York is great, but we chose to move circuits this year to raise our children in a more rural setting," Ortiz said. "I talked to my agent [Steve Rushing] and he thought my business would continue to do well in Kentucky and we made the move this year. It's been great to be here at Churchill Downs."

FOUR SHARE FURLONG BULLET AT OBS

UNDER-TACK FINALE by Jessica Martini

Three colts and one filly shared the furlong bullet time of :9 4/5 during the final session of the under-tack show for the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's June Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training Sunday. The quartet all took to track within the first half-hour of the session, with a colt by Tapiture (hip 993) getting the day started with his bullet work for Navas Equine. The colt is out of Union Queen (Union Rags) and his third dam, Above Perfection (In Excess {Ire}), produced GI Kentucky Derby winner Always Dreaming.

Next up, Top Line Sales sent out a colt by Practical Joke (hip 945) to put up his :9 4/5 work. The bay colt is out of Mo's Song (Uncle Mo), a half-sister to multiple stakes winner She's My Gem (Into Mischief). He was a \$185,000 Keeneland September purchase.

A colt by Honest Mischief (hip 906) joined the :9 4/5 parade some 10 minutes later. The juvenile was bred by Robbie Harris and is consigned by his Harris Training Center. "We felt he would work good," Harris said. "I bred and raised him. He was foaled in New York and he came to the farm [in Williston] after he was weaned. He's been a real straightforward horse. We had him in one of the earlier sales, but we hit a little bump in the road, nothing major, but we felt like we needed to give him more time, so we did and it's paid off for us."

The colt is out of Memories of Mom (Include), a mare Harris purchased for \$9,000 at the 2015 Keeneland September sale.

"I didn't give anything for her," Harris said of the purchase. "She could really run. I ended up partnering up with Mr. [Alex] Lieblong on her. She got hurt in her second or third start and he told me he would give me his half back."

The colt is from the first crop of Honest Mischief (Into Mischief). The stallion, who stands at Sequel Stallions for \$6,500, has had 15 juveniles sell this year for an average of \$104,200. The group is led by a filly who sold for \$310,000 at the OBS March sale and includes a colt who sold for \$260,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May sale.

"[Sequel Stallion's] Becky [Thomas] talked me into him," Harris said of the decision to send the mare to Honest Mischief. "Becky is a dear friend and she told me I really needed to breed to him. I just listened to her. She's pretty sharp. So we bred the mare to Honest Mischief basically because of Becky."

Memories of Mom died shortly before her Honest Mischief colt was weaned.

"We lost the mare, so he will probably go on and win the Kentucky Derby or something," Harris said with a wry chuckle.

With the loss of Memories of Mom, Harris has just one broodmare.

"I'm down to just one," he confirmed. "I've got one in Kentucky. I had as many as eight or nine over the years, but we've been scaling back and scaling back." A filly by Complexity (hip 996) became the last of the undertack show to work the furlong in :9 4/5. Consigned by Old South Farm, the bay is out of Will Ye Go Lassie (Trappe Shot), a halfsister to graded winner Venus Valentine (Congrats). The youngster was purchased by Greg James for \$70,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton October sale.

Through the six-session under-tack show, 11 horses worked the furlong in :9 4/5.

A filly by Munnings (hip 1009) turned in the fastest quartermile work of Sunday's session, covering the distance in :21 flat. Out of stakes-winner Desert Duchess (Hard Spun), she is consigned by Hoppel LLC and was purchased for \$130,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton October sale.

From the horses of racing age section, **Just a Gem** (Court Vision), an unraced 3-year-old filly (hip 1115) worked the fastest three furlongs Sunday, covering the distance in :33 4/5. She is consigned by Silvestre Chavez Thoroughbreds.

The OBS June sale will be held Wednesday through Friday. Bidding begins each day at 10 a.m.

Society Man capped a big weekend for trainer Danny Gargan and Hill 'n' Dale stallion Good Magic with a powerful victory in the GIII Matt Winn S. at Churchill Downs Sunday. Like his GI Belmont S.-winning stablemate Dornoch (Good Magic), Society Man was making his first start since the May 4 GI Kentucky Derby, where he was 16th. The chestnut gelding was unhurried and settled near the back of the pack while racing along the rail and avoiding traffic on the first turn. Favored Who Dey rushed between foes to take charge into the backstretch. West Saratoga was first to take on the favorite, striding to the lead midway on the far turn, but his advantage was short lived as Rocketeer stormed to the lead three wide to take over into the lane. Society Man, meanwhile, was guietly making progress while saving ground the whole way and tipped out two paths to rally outside Who Dey and Rocketeer. He powered to the lead at midstretch and kicked clear as the gritty Who Dey clawed his way back into second just ahead of the late-closing Next Level.

"He was on the bit and looked great in the paddock," said winning rider Corey Lanerie. "I could tell he was ready to go. I was a little bit further back than I thought we'd be, but around the three-eighths pole, I lowered my hands and he took me where I needed to be. I was able to get clear at the eighth-pole and he took off. He was fun to ride. He's shown he's been able to do a couple of things in his career and has some different dimensions. The way he was able to relax today, it showed me he doesn't have a problem with longer distances than this. I'm very grateful to Danny and his whole team for the opportunity to ride him. He and his team had a big weekend. I'm glad to have played a small part in it."

Aboard the beaten favorite, Brian Hernandez, Jr., said, "Down the backside, he was traveling really well and within himself. He took me to the spot between horses on the lead and was doing it on his own." Hernandez continued, "When Tyler [Gaffalione, aboard Rocketeer] engaged us he dug in and tried to fight back against him. He ran a good race."

Society Man, who opened 2024 with an eighth-place effort while still seeking his first career win in the Feb. 3 GIII Withers S., made it to the winner's circle next time out with a three-length score going one mile at Aqueduct Mar. 9. He earned his spot in the Kentucky Derby with a runner-up effort behind Resilience (Into Mischief) in the GII Wood Memorial S.

Pedigree Notes:

Good Magic, who was represented by his second Classic winner when Dornoch came home first in the GI Belmont S. Saturday, now has 10 graded stakes winners to his credit. His three Grade I winners include last year's GI Kentucky Derby winner Mage, GI Champagne S. winner Blazing Sevens, and GI Arkansas Derby winner Muth.

Colonel John is also the broodmare sire of Derby winner Mystik Dan.

Stakes-placed You Cheated, in foal to Yoshida (Jpn), sold for \$12,000 at the 2022 Keeneland January sale and produced a colt that year. She produced a colt by American Anthem this year.

AFTER 83 YEARS, THE CURTAIN COMES DOWN AT GOLDEN GATE FIELDS by Bill Finley

Let the record show that the very first horse to win a race at Golden Gate Fields was a mare named Skookumchuck, who won the inaugural race on Feb.1, 1941 before a crowd of 30,000. The last horse to win a race there was **Adelie (Ire)** (Ardad {Ire}), who got to the wire first in Sunday's eighth, the last race ever at a track.

In between, there was a lot of history, a lot of memories...Citation, Russell Baze, Lost in the Fog, Noor. That's history that cannot be erased, but it will surely start to wither away as Golden Gate, the latest track where it did not make economical sense to keep going, ran for the final time Sunday.

Bay area racing fans said a fond goodbye Sunday. The place was so crowded they had to find extra parking spaces to accommodate the crowds and before the first race, people were lined up around the grandstand waiting to get in.

Golden Gate was never what Santa Anita, Del Mar and Hollywood Park were, but for 83 years, it has served its purpose, giving Bay Area gamblers a place to play among a beautiful setting by the San Francisco Bay and a place for the horses that just couldn't make it in Southern California to go.

But Golden Gate, which was purchased by Magna Entertainment, the predecessor of The Stronach Group, in 1999, had been struggling for years. With nothing in the way of casino or slot money to support the purses, horses were running for paltry pots, which created horse shortage problems. On the penultimate day of racing, they ran just seven races that attracted 43 starters. That's a gambling product that appeals to absolutely no one. So handle keep declining and fields kept getting smaller. It was a never-ending cycle.

"I'm more disgusted with the way things went there," said trainer Ed Moger, who has trained at the Northern California tracks for 47 years. "Things could be viable, but things weren't done the right way. Everyone was fighting against us, from the TOC, the CHRB to the racetrack itself. Nothing was going good for them."

Moger won the sixth race with **Dad's Jubilee** (Dads Cap), but was nowhere to be found at Golden Gate Sunday. He has moved 15 horses to Kentucky and plans to race there year-round.

"We've been racing here for so many years," said trainer Steve Sherman. "I grew up here and now to see that this place is closing down, it's kind of a drag. I'm a little sad and a little angry. This is a great racetrack. It's just a shame that people here couldn't get together and find a way to make things work."

Sherman will be taking his horses to Pleasanton, which is part of the Northern California fair circuit. The hope among local horsemen is that the fair tracks will start running longer meets and will give Northern California trainers a place to run throughout much of the year. No one seems quite sure if that is going to work.

"They're going to make a run at it," Sherman said. "People are at least enthusiastic about it. They have a race office that knows what they need to do. I'm really hoping it works. All of California needs this. They need a circuit in the North to keep owners in the game. Will this work? I hope so. That's all we can do is hope."

"Although we are sad that Ide has left us, we are also filled with gratitude that Harvey Peltier and the Ide Group allowed us to share this friendly and accomplished horse with tens of thousands of people throughout the years," said John Nicholson, President and CEO of Old Friends. "Ide was a special part of Old Friends and a great ambassador for the sport of Thoroughbred Racing."

Harvey Peltier was also sad to hear about the loss of Ide.

"I was saddened to hear of Ide's passing, but I was thrilled that Michael Blowen accepted Ide to live out his days at Old Friends," said Peltier. "Ide got lots of attention at Old Friends where he was fed treats and carrots on a regular basis.

"I'd be remiss if I didn't give thanks to Clear Creek Stud for the wonderful job of caring and promoting Ide at stud," he continued. "Also, I'd like to give thanks for all the breeders for their support, and all the people at Old Friends for their care and a special thank you to Michael Blowen." Racing for Willmott Stables, Ide won the 1995 GIII Kentucky Jockey Club S. and GIII Iroquois S. The following year, he won the GIII Southwest S. and GIII Rebel S. He suffered a careerending injury while preparing for the GI Arkansas Derby and began his stud career in 1997 at the Lavin family's Longfield Farm in Goshen, Kentucky. In 2003, he was purchased by the Ide Group and moved to Clear Creek Stud in Folsom, Louisiana for the rest of his stud career.

Ide sired 16 stakes winners, including Louisiana-Bred Horse of the Year Ide Be Cool, and champion colt Ide Like a Double. He was pensioned in 2015.

"Ide was as kind as any Thoroughbred at Old Friends," said Blowen, founder of Old Friends. "He graced us with his confident demeanor and, even though he lived a long, full life it wasn't long enough."

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY, VRC

Located in the Richmond, Virginia area, this full time position is responsible for the daily operations of the state agency regulating pari-mutuel thoroughbred and standardbred racing in Virginia. The Executive Secretary reports directly to the five member Racing Commission which is appointed by the Governor of the Commonwealth. The Virginia Racing Commission (VRC) is responsible for sustaining, promoting, and growing the native horse racing industry in Virginia, including control of all horse racing with pari-mutuel wagering conducted in the Commonwealth.

These locations include thoroughbred and steeplechase racing at Colonial Downs, steeplechase at Great Meadows, and harness racing at Shenandoah Downs. All facilities host two meets per year.

With the passage of HB 1609 in 2018, the VRC also oversees the licensing and compliance, associated with historical horseracing (HHR) machines. There are currently eight Rosie's Gaming Emporiums located around the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Qualifications include:

Demonstrated management skills; experience in working with the administration of government and the legislative process; knowledge of horse racing, and pari-mutuel wagering; a basic knowledge of accounting and budget development; communications skills enabling good working relationships with Commissioners, State Administration Officials, business and political leaders, members of the horse racing industry, the media, and the public; college degree preferred.

Since breaking his maiden at third asking in late 2022, Drake's Passage has put together a run of consistent form, winning or hitting the board in all but one of six starts since. Though second in each of his last two, the 4-year-old has paired up 99 Beyer Speed Figures in one-mile races at Aqueduct to end 2023 and begin his 4-year-old season May 4. The 4-5 favorite found himself on the lead Sunday and set a relaxed tempo, going the half in :48.88 while mostly unchallenged into the turn. Donegal Surges chased him from second throughout but was always a clear second best as Drake's Passage ran off for the decisive win.

"It was very impressive," said winning trainer Christophe Clement. "Great trip. He was in form, comfortable. He's a nice horse. I know he got beat in New York in the allowance races, but they were actually spectacular allowances races if you look at the numbers. When he got to an easy lead, I thought he'd be very dangerous, because I know he stays a mile and an eighth, and he's probably the closest horse I've ever trained by Tonalist, because he looks like Tonalist."

A classy debut winner at Saratoga last summer, Emery immediately stepped up to contest the GI Frizette S. at Aqueduct in October, checking in fourth behind eventual champion 2-year-old filly Just F Y I (Justify). Off a six-month freshening, she returned a winner at Keeneland last out, winning by 5 1/4 lengths against allowance runners Apr. 19. 

As much as this personality trait tends to make me more comfortable with people, in this particular situation I was worried that the whirlwind weekend she has just been through would have left Joelle feeling overwhelmed with media solicitations and my request could appear as a nuisance.

Then her answer popped up on my telephone screen: "When an exceptional event drags you out of anonymity in spite of you, you must make yourself available to share your experience." I suddenly felt grateful to the world for carrying such a charming person.

And indeed, as we chat on a sunny terrace facing the Deauville beach, the joint-breeder and owner of an unbeaten Classic winner, whose racing colours were first carried by this horse's dam only nine years ago, proves consistently prompt to dismiss any credit for Look De Vega's faultless path.

"I haven't had a linear trajectory," she starts. "It has only been made of encounters. My husband and I were low-key leisure riders. Our children did the pony club circuit, and one of our daughters became a very keen rider. At some point we moved to Belgium due to my husband's professional commitments."

Gerard Mestrallet, a graduate of France's most prestigious engineer and public administration school, was in the top-tier of management of water and gas supplier Suez, later renamed Engie, for 30 years. He acted as CEO from 1995 until his retirement in 2018.

His wife continues, "I had been working as an engineer in the oil and gas sector for 15 years. It was a very technical and slightly dry job. When my husband's career took us to Belgium, I resigned and found myself with more spare time on my hands. I brought my mare with us, a lovely eventer with whom I had some fabulous rides. I was keen to get a foal out of her, and this is how I first got interested in breeding. After multiple attempts, she wasn't getting in foal and I ended up spending a lot of time in veterinary clinics. With my scientific brain, I wanted to understand why it wasn't working out and I had the chance to meet some very kind vets who were very good teachers. It was scientific curiosity that got me started."

Far from restricting herself to the sanitised atmosphere of veterinary hospitals, however, Mestrallet also became very hands on.

"My daughter Caroline was in high school and competing at international level in showjumping, so I got more closely involved. I took out my heavy vehicle driving licence, went inspecting horses for her, looking up vet checks, etc."

In hindsight, such a trajectory looks an extremely wise way of establishing grass-roots foundations for a breeder's career, yet the unassuming Mestrallet prefers to praise coincidences.

She says, "Everything happened as a succession of encounters and opportunities. I wasn't even that passionate in the first place. It really came gradually." **Cont. p4**

Another of these in-spite-of-her opportunities happened on New Year's Eve 2002.

"We were celebrating New Year's Eve with my daughter's

coach Thierry Paillot and his family, at their Haras de la Morsangliere," she recalls. "My daughter had spent many holidays there to train with her horses and our families had become close. Upon our return to France, we had settled in Oise [the Chantilly region] but I was short of land to keep my Warmblood mares and couldn't find a property to buy. And then Thierry Paillot told me 'We are moving to Switzerland, the farm is up for sale and it would make me very happy if it went to

someone we are close to.' Six months later, we moved in at La Morsangliere. I tell you, It is all about encounters, always."

As a breeder of showjumpers, Joelle Mestrallet made it to the highest level, notably producing Obiwan de Pilliere (Diamant de Semilly) who won an epic renewal of the Nations Cup at CSIO5* Calgary in 2011. And yet, she would soon feel some frustration, which would eventually prompt her transition to thoroughbreds. "Breeding showjumpers didn't quite satisfy my scientific,

> rational brain," she says. "When you are looking to build from solid foundations, access to information is a struggle. Stallions keep breeding after they die, there is no registry of broodmare progeny, etc. On the other hand, when I stepped into Thoroughbred breeding, between the databases of France Galop and Argana, I thought it was heaven on earth! It is like having France's national library to yourself. Frankly, I find that Argana does an outstanding job. It must be very tedious

work, but the information they produce for breeders is invaluable. You have a multitude of data to make your decisions, which for a scientist if very satisfying."

"And of course," she adds with a smile, "careers are shorter, which as I was getting on in age was an asset."

Yet again, she pays tribute to an encounter and the assistance of others for the switch. "My husband has a very close friend who races trotters and is friendly with Lucien Urano [who operates Ecurie des Charmes, a prominent breeding and racing operation in both harness and thoroughbred racing].

"One day he told me, 'Joelle, you can see that breeding showjumpers is complicated and doesn't make economic sense. You should meet Lucien Urano and look into Thoroughbreds.' He introduced me and we bought three yearling fillies together. Everything started from there. I was extremely lucky to stumble upon such an outstanding mentor."

Among these initial purchases was a High Chaparral (Ire) filly bred by the late Lady O'Reilly from the family that had produced the Classic winning siblings Latice (Inchinor) and Lawman (Invincible Spirit).

"I was quite clueless with Thoroughbred pedigrees and the whole selection process, so I got help from [Ecurie des Monceaux's] Henri Bozo," she says. "It was him who introduced me to Lady O'Reilly when we went to inspect her yearlings ahead of the sale, and I became very fond of this particular filly." The filly, Lucelle (Fr), was the first foal out an unraced half-sister to Lawman's dam Laramie (Gulch) and cost €85,000 at the 2013 August yearling auction. Sent to Jean-Claude Rouget, she was the first horse to race in the colours of Haras de la Morsangliere, winning three races and achieving a mark of 90. When she retired to the lush paddocks of La Morsangliere, the family had gained extra black type thanks to Lucelle's half-sister The Black Princess (Fr) (Iffraaj {GB}), who won the 2017 G2 Lancashire Oaks and G3 Prix Allez France.

"Initially we tried to reproduce the mating that had resulted in The Black Princess by sending Lucelle to Iffraaj and his sons," Mestrallet recalls.

The mare's first foal, a colt later named Titian (Fr), was sold for €195,000 to Avenue Bloodstock at Arqana. He won two races for William Haggas and as a six-year-old gelding won at Ripon just two days before his little brother propelled the family into a radically different league. Next came the Ribchester (Ire) filly Graine De Pastel (Fr), who was knocked down to Meridian International for €85,000 as a yearling. She went on to win a couple of races in the care of Francois Rohaut, achieving a personal best of 85. In hindsight, her owners Laurent Dassault and Carsten Baagoe-Schou probably feel quite relieved to have taken her back home after bidding on the four-year-old stopped at €22,000 at last year's Arqana December sale.

"For Lucelle's third mating, we thought we would give her a proper chance and send her to a top-tier stallion," Mestrallet says. In the spring of 2019, a nomination to Lope De Vega cost €100,000. Mestrallet remembers Look De Vega as a handsome foal with a strong temperament but says, "As soon as he started the yearling prep, he accepted the authority and became a very well-behaved colt."

This is when an even more coincidental encounter took place, involving someone who carries the same surname as Joelle.

She explains, "Back in the 1990s on a pony trials eventing competition in Belgium, my daughter came up to me and said, 'There is another Mestrallet in the line-up.' This is how we met Julie Mestrallet and her mother Francine. We never quite dug out the family tree but my father-in-law reckons we are cousins. Julie and my daughter Caroline became best friends, and I became close to Francine. When we bought La Morsangliere, Julie had already set up her operation Haras de l'Aumonerie, and we started working together. She preps all our yearlings for the sales, and we have a few mares together. She is also a genuine encyclopedia when it comes to breeding, which helps me a lot."

When Look De Vega walked into the ring at the 2022 August Yearling Sale, consigned by Haras de l'Aumônerie, his winning dam could claim to have produced two winners from as many foals of racing age. Still, the page would appear slightly light in black type to the most demanding buyers and the colt's reserve wasn't met.

"I remember walking back to the box a little disappointed, and then Carlos Lerner, whom I had never met, came up and said he would be interested in buying 50 per cent of the colt. I rang Lucien Urano and the deal was done." Unsurprisingly, the father-and-son combination of trainers join the long list of professionals whom Mestrallet feels blessed to have come across on her winding path.

"Carlos and Yann Lerner have been another beautiful encounter", she enthuses. "I love their work ethic, they are extremely caring to their horses. It is a great sense of security for an owner."

When asked if partnering with a trainer is their common policy with unsold yearlings, she pauses for a moment and remarks, "But it hadn't happened to us many times before. We are only small breeders and were lucky that almost all our previous yearling offerings had sold." And indeed, Look De Vega is only the second colt to have raced in the Morsangliere colours, having been led out unsold at a yearling auction.

That slight disappointment has now turned into disbelieving relief that Look De Vega didn't change hands as a yearling.

"It is quite extraordinary," Mestrallet says with a smile. "It certainly wouldn't have been the same feeling if I had 'only' been in the breeder's position. I am very conscious that some people try for years before they can taste such unique emotions, and I feel like I am a very lucky person."

A scientist who leaves room for chance is how she views her journey with horses.

"Everything in life is useful. There is always something you can learn out of every experience," she says. "But you need to be patient, and not necessarily try to control everything. This is the golden rule for a scientist: accepting that there are things that you can't turn into an equation."

LAZZAT CONTINUES HIS STREAK IN THE PAUL DE MOUSSAC

Showing courage as well as a fair amount of ability at ParisLongchamp on Sunday, Nurlan Bizakov's Lazzat (Fr) (Territories {Ire}) maintained his unbeaten record in the feature G3 Prix Paul de Moussac. Enjoying a lead throughout the early stages, the Jerome Reynier-trained G3 Prix Djebel and Listed Prix de la Californie winner was in front and there to be shot at from 2 1/2 furlongs out. Tenacious for Antonio Orani as TDN Rising Star Havana Cigar (GB) (Havana Grey {GB}) emerged from the pack late, the 6-5 favourite dug out a short-neck verdict.

"It's just amazing to keep him unbeaten--we couldn't quite manage five straight wins for Facteur Cheval, so we wanted to do better than that and we hope he has the same future," Reynier said. "We've got the [G2] Lennox or the [G1] Sussex at Goodwood or we could keep him in France for the [G1] Maurice de Gheest, where he would face some really good sprinters."

Reynier added, "He's not eligible for the [G1] Prix Jean Prat, as he's a gelding, and the more he races, the faster he gets--he won over the straight course in the Djebel at Deauville and that's why we are thinking Maurice de Gheest. He could have gone for the Jersey at Royal Ascot, but he has the French premiums here so it made sense."

Pedigree Notes

Lazzat is the first and so far only foal of a granddaughter of the G1 1000 Guineas heroine Sleepytime (Ire) (Royal Academy), who produced six stakes performers headed by the G3 Superior Mile winner Hathal (Speightstown). Along with her fellow group 1-winning full-brother Ali-Royal (Ire), Sleepytime helped her dam Alidiva (Ire) (Chief Singer {Ire}) to the title of Broodmare of the year in 1997, while she is also kin to the multiple group 1-winning sire Taipan (Ire) (Last Tycoon {Ire}), the GII Louisville Breeders' Cup H. and GII Rampart H. winner Oonagh Maccool (Ire) (Giant's Causeway) and to the dams of the G1 Doncaster Mile hero Somewhat (Dynaformer) and this owner-breeder's G3 Oh So Sharp S. winner and G1 Falmouth S. and G1 Sun Chariot S.-placed Altyn Orda (Ire) (Kyllachy {GB}).

FOOTSTEPSINTHESAND'S TOMIKO THUNDERS HOME TO STEAL ITALIAN OAKS

Silvestre de Sousa gained his third European Classic victory of the year on Sunday as he produced the Paolo Aragoni-trained **Tomiko (Ire)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) with a strong late run to land the G2 Oaks d'Italia Tattersalls at Milan's San Siro Racecourse, working the oracle on a filly who was remarkably gaining the first win of her career on her eleventh start.

De Sousa--who'd already won the G1 1,000 Guineas on Elmalka (GB) (Kingman {GB}) and the G2 German 2,000 Guineas on Devil's Point (Ire) (New Bay {GB})--was riding Tomiko for the first time on Sunday and soon had her settled at the rear of the 10-strong field, some way off the pace set by **Nikkei (Ity)** (Affaire Solitaire {Ire}) in the early stages.

It looked like being a two-horse race for much of the straight as **Sun Never Sets** (Karakontie {Jpn}) moved up to challenge Nikkei at the head of affairs, but Tomiko was gradually making headway under De Sousa and there was no stopping her once she was switched to the outside after briefly meeting trouble. Relishing the step up to 2,200 metres for the first time, she powered home to secure the lion's share of the €388,300 prize fund, beating Sun Never Sets by a short neck at odds of 182-10, with Nikkei over a length further back in third. German raider **Isfand (Ger)** (Isfahan {Ger}), sent off the odds-on favourite, could manage only fourth.

As part of their sponsorship, Tattersalls offered vouchers of 15,000 guineas, 5,000 guineas and 2,500 guineas to the owners of the winner, runner-up and third, respectively. The vouchers can to be spent at the 2024 Tattersalls October Yearling Sale or Tattersalls Somerville Yearling Sale, or at the 2025 Tattersalls Craven and Guineas Breeze-Up Sales. The winner, runner-up and third are also offered free entry to the Tattersalls December Mares Sale. **Cont. p8**

Tomiko is already a Tattersalls graduate having sold to Marco Bozzi Bloodstock for 20,000gns when offered by breeders Awbeg Stud at Book 3 of the October Yearling Sale. She'd produced several good efforts in defeat despite failing to get off the mark in her 10 starts prior to the Oaks d'Italia, notably gaining black type as a two-year-old when finishing third in the G2 Premio Dormello and runner-up in the Listed Premio Repubbliche Marinare.

Pedigree Notes

Tomiko is the second winner from three runners out of the unraced Lawman (Fr) mare Testimony (GB), a half-sister to the 10-time winner--including at Listed level--Saltonstall (GB) (Pivotal {GB}). Her second dam is the G2 Prix de Pomone heroine and G1 Prix Royal-Oak runner-up Macleya (Ger) (Winged Love {Ire}), who is in turn kin to the G3 Prix de Barbeville winner Montclair (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), plus the Listed-placed trio of Macassar (GB) (Tertullian), Mahnaz (GB) (Dansili {GB}) and Miramare (Ger) (Rainbow Quest), dam of the G1 Prix Ganay winner Mare Australis (Ire) (Australia {GB}). The third dam, Minaccia (Ger) (Platini {Ger}), was a dual Listed winner in Germany.

RELIABLE MAN'S ERLE POUNCES LATE IN DIANA-TRIAL THRILLER By Sean Cronin

Gestut Rottgen's homebred 3-year-old filly **Erle (Ger)** (Reliable Man {GB}--Kizingo {Ire}, by Oasis Dream {GB}), who ran fourth at Baden-Baden in her one run for the Markus Klug stable last year, broke through for new trainer Maxim Pecheur at Dusseldorf on sophomore return in April and continued on the upgrade with a last-gasp win in Sunday's G3 Diana-Trial at Hoppegarten. Her victory provided trainer with a maiden pattern-race success.

The 7-2 chance went forward from the outside gate to stalk the pacesetting **New York City (Ger)** (Sea The Moon {Ger}) in second and was bustled along at the top of the straight. Coming under sterner urging inside the final quarter-mile, she engaged in a thrilling four-way tussle in the closing stages and dug in for one last thrust to outbob **Lady Mary (Ger)** (Lawman {Fr}) on the line. The winning margin was a short-head with a pair of necks back to **Egina (Ger)** (Soldier Hollow {GB}) and New York City.

"That was, by far, the toughest finish I've ridden in this year, with the young English jockey [Billy Loughnane] at my side and the best German, Bauyrzhan Murzabayev, on the other side," winning rider Martin Seidl told *GaloppOnline*. "That was really exhausting, but it's great for the trainer Maxim Pecheur and I'm just so happy for the whole team behind Erle." **Cont. p9**

SUNDAY'S BLACK-TYPE REVIEW By Tom Frary

Despite Lazzat (Fr) (Territories {Ire}) justifying favouritism in Sunday's G3 Prix Paul de Moussac, this was a day of surprises across the board in Britain and France with the likes of Zarir (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) and Sea Just In Time (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) failing to fire in their respective races. The latter, who had lined up for Goodwood's Listed Weatherbys/British EBF Agnes Keyser Fillies' S. with a TDN Rising Star badge having won so impressively on debut at Newmarket, beat only one rival in the 10-furlong contest won by Elwick Stud's homebred Lava Stream (Ire) (Too Darn Hot {GB}).

Lava Stream, whose half-brother Iron Lion (GB) (Roaring Lion) had won a valuable handicap at Haydock the previous day, is from the family of the G1 British Champions Fillies & Mares S. winner Journey (GB), the G2 Park Hill S. winner Mimikyu (GB) and the G2 May Hill S. scorer Indigo Girl (GB) by Too Darn Hot's sire Dubawi (Ire).

Zarir, who had gone so close to winning the G1 Prix Ganay in April, came up short behind the 20-1 scorer **Calif (Ger)** (Areion {Ger}) and the returning **AI Hakeem (GB)** (Siyouni {Fr}) in ParisLongchamp's G3 La Coupe, where the winner provided a notable result for Victorious Racing after their €400,000 investment at the Arqana Arc Sale. A big noise in Germany last term, there was no hint of fluke about the 5-year-old's authoritative success under the excellent Alexis Pouchin for Carlos and Yann Lerner's stable which has enjoyed a fair share of the limelight in recent days.

Also at ParisLongchamp, the Listed Prix Ridgway went to the Wertheimers' gelding **Hamavi (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) who had chased home the subsequent G1 Prix du Jockey Club hero Look De Vega (Fr) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) in the track's Prix de Croissy conditions event last month, while the Devin family's love affair with Doctor Dino (Fr) continued as they scooped the Listed Prix Melisande with **Rose Jaipur (Fr)**. She is the last known foal out of Affaire Du Moeurs (Fr) (Kaldounevees {Fr}), who also produced the stable's G1 Prix de Diane runner-up Physiocrate (Fr) by Doctor Dino.
