You know, it's almost like they're family.

Okay, maybe that's not terribly helpful. As we've learned from others kindly sharing their experiences for this series, the only right way is the one that works for you. That's always a pretty good starting point, anyway, with horses. And given this additional variable, where the directors stage board meetings around a kitchen table, then different families must find their own ways to meet the challenges of succession. Some hire consultants; some transition with parallel businesses; some, no doubt, never get past the screaming and shouting stage. But sometimes, it seems, a family business can thrive simply because of a felicity that always keeps that dimension of their shared lives in due perspective.

"Full credit to my parents, but there are never arguments," says Gray Lyster of Ashview Farm. "I swear to God. There are times you're aggravated, or have to run something by somebody. But I swear we're all so much on the same page with our program. And that roots back to my father and my mother. Because you already know the answer.

"If you're super confident in making a decision or change, you do it. And if you're wrong, nobody is going to complain."

INTO MISCHIEF'S ACCEDE MAKES THE GRADE IN BED O' ROSES

Accede (Into Mischief) dug down gamely to post a first stakes victory in Saturday's GII Bed o' Roses S.

Off as the 4-1 second choice, the Juddmonte homebred veered out sharply at the start and was quickly corrected by Irad Ortiz, Jr. to lead early. Third, but traveling nicely on the inside on the far turn, Accede split horses with authority in the stretch and fended off the longshot runner-up for a career best.

"She broke with good intent and I was happy with her on the lead, but if somebody wanted to go, it was fine to let them go," winning trainer Chad Brown said. "That's what we [Irad Ortiz, Jr.] talked about in the paddock. He worked out a great trip and the filly cooperated. The team at Juddmonte did a great job with her."



"It's very, very lucky," continued Gray, "because I don't know that I could necessarily work with anybody else and have that. But I know I can with my dad and my brother."

It's not as though the Lysters automatically agree on everything: that wouldn't be true of any family, never mind one immersed in something so resistant to consensus as Thoroughbreds. But there's no mistaking how they make things work, professionally, by concentrating first and foremost on domestic fulfilment. Lysters work together the same way they ski or hunt together.

Wayne and Muffy Lyster started Ashview, just outside Versailles, from scratch even as they raised three children--all of whom have found their own paths to where they want to be, sometimes via unexpected twists. And it's surely no coincidence that a farm of relatively modest scale should have achieved such remarkable success, for instance breeding the first two in the GI


Belmont S. in 2022, while resolutely prioritizing the bigger picture. Of the three siblings, Gray has emerged front-of-house despite long presuming that his vocation lay elsewhere; Meredith, though still involved, is raising a young family over in Louisville; and Bryan recently answered the summons of his other great passion, the mountains, with a fresh start in Jackson Hole real estate.

All this happened by unplanned increments. Their many friends in the Bluegrass community will recall the terrifying spinal infection that flattened Bryan during the 2017 September Sale. His wife had delivered their third child the previous week. You don't need a management consultant to tell a family its priorities when something like that happens. But then nobody has really had to tell anyone anything.

"Our parents never pushed us to the business," stresses Gray. "It was like, 'Find what you want to do, and go do it.' And I'll admit, I probably didn't even know I had a love of the horse until my 20s. I took it all for granted. We grew up on the farm, and its life was second nature. But we were never pushed to it. Quite the opposite."

"There wasn't the first thing deliberate," Wayne confirms.

"Not any deliberate feelings or thoughts from a first-time
Thoroughbred owner-breeder/landowner in Central
Kentucky." *Cont.*



"I always wanted to raise horses, but never thought about my children following in my footsteps. Did I want them to? I mean, sure, it would be great. But it was never like, 'Oh, I was a doctor,

or in the services, you need to be as well."

When Gray went to Vanderbilt, to study economics, he knew only that he had a vocation for business.

"I just didn't know what kind," he says. "And it ended up being the family business. I always assumed that I was going to do something else, I really did. And probably the number one reason I came back was because I wasn't pushed to."

After a stint on the backside, with Rusty Arnold, Gray began

to get a feel and relish for the marketplace.

"I got into the trading," he recalls. "And, for me personally, the sales aspect kicked it into the next level. But what made all the

difference is that in the history of family operations there has probably never been less of a micromanager than my father. He immediately acknowledged that if he wanted help from us, he was not going to micromanage. He was not going to just make

> us do all the hard work and leave him to do the fun stuff."

Wayne had no need for a consultant there, then--except perhaps for one.

"My wife actually reminded me a couple of times," he recalls. "She said, 'If the children may want to do this, you can't override everything that they decide.' And she said that once or twice, because sometimes I could dominate conversations at home. So I really thought about that. I wanted to be really careful, to let them find their own way, learn for themselves. I think overall I

was pretty good about giving them that opportunity. Because a lot of times you find success by the mistakes you make. And I knew that if they made mistakes, well, so had we." Cont.

"Oh my gosh, he let me make so many: buying horses, buying breeding stock," Gray says. "But man, I learned so much. If you make mistakes not just with your own money but with the farm money, with family money, that's pressure you've never had before. And I just see so many people that aren't as lucky as I was. Because I got to make decisions when I didn't know anything--and the best way to learn is by seeing the wrong way to do it."

But part of the reason all this has come together is that the younger generation proved integral to the evolution of Ashview. As the farm kept thriving, not least following the advent of a cherished partner in Colts Neck Stables, everyone could just trust the process.

"When I first came back, we were primarily a boarding business," Gray reflects. "And Dad said that he'd always dreamed of not just consigning for other people but investing for ourselves. So when Bryan and I came back, he was willing to make that transition. He said, 'I'll put up most of the money, you give me the sweat equity, and we'll put it up together.' That was just such a unique thing to do. And frankly, a very risky thing to do. We didn't make money on all of them, I can promise you that. But over a period of time, we built a nice broodmare band with that specific business plan."

Its bedrock was fillies claimed off the track, an enterprise tailor-made for Gray's market flair.

"It was about 'out-appraising' people and working hard to move money around," he recalls. "Today there's so much information, it's all so quick. I still pursue a few here and there, but the claiming game, for breeding, is very difficult now. But it was a lot of fun at the time. Man, I learned the names of racetracks I'd never heard of before. *Cont.*

"And trading those horses, there's nothing more emotional. If you can sell in a minute and a half, at public auction, going up in

\$10,000 bids? And you're walking up the back ring, and worrying if the horse is acting right, or if that person's off him, on him? I mean, there's no greater thrill. I'm a junkie for it."

There was trial and error, as usual, but there was also the \$5,000 claim at Delaware Park of a Broken Vow filly who became the dam of Runhappy, subsequently sold for \$1.6 million. Ashview has proved similarly ahead of the curve by in-house production of organic

hay and bedding. One way or another, things have tended to work so well that there was seldom much need to formalize function.

"I've had friends ask me how it all worked out, and I always said that it just evolved," Wayne says. "I don't know. We're a

very loving family. There was never, 'Okay, you're the broodmare manager, you're the foal manager.' We did it all together. They wanted to participate, and I wanted them to. We

all love our farm, the land, our horses, our dogs, and we get to love it together. Sometimes we'll see things differently, as all people will, but never so much that we couldn't put it together."

But if that comes with nurture, and values of upbringing, there was always that other ingredient of nature as well. Gray is a sixth-generation horseman and, who knows, maybe someday that pedigree will tell in a seventh. None of Wayne and Muffy's grandchildren will be placed under any more pressure than



were Gray, Bryan and Meredith. But Gray does want the industry to ensure that continuity is at least an option.

He has brought energy and imagination to service on several industry bodies and cautions against undue haste in the face of undoubted challenges. *Cont.*

"In the last couple of years, with HISA and HIWU, we've seen the most drastic changes to our industry in my lifetime," he remarks. "A lot of people have made big sacrifices, at every level. It's not an easy process. There's going to be hiccups on the way. Zero catastrophic breakdowns, zero people taking an edge: maybe that's not be attainable, but we have to try. It's just that after those rough experiences last year, I really worried that all of a sudden people wanted to change everything on a moment's notice."

Though as heartbroken as anyone by those two breakdowns at Saratoga, he was dismayed by the implication that we owe a

higher duty of care to some horses than others. Losing a claimer at Finger Lakes is no less of a tragedy; it just doesn't generate equivalent hysteria.

"Optics are important, but we've got to look at the entire picture and not base decisions on a couple of emotional situations," Gray says. "We already have this major, long thought-out plan. Whether you like it or not, it's here, and we all need to try to make it work."

Indeed, Grey confides that he was himself actually opposed to federal intervention, when first on the table. Finding himself to be in a minority among his peers, however, he now implores everyone to stop yelling or demanding further drastic change. He's particularly alarmed by those, often not themselves horsemen, demanding replacement of dirt tracks. For one thing, since it would not be viable to install synthetics coast-to-coast, doing so only at premier tracks would drive a wedge right across the pyramid. But Gray candidly says that a sport without dirt would lose his interest.

"American dirt racing is unique in itself," he says. "I watched Keeneland, my home track, flip to synthetics. I tried my hardest. I watched my father stop attending the races because he didn't like it as a handicapper. I quit watching two of my favorite racetracks, Golden Gate Fields and Arlington Park—and now, unfortunately, they're gone or almost gone. So I hope there's no knee-jerk reaction. We've seen Santa Anita, Keeneland and Del Mar achieve some outstanding safety records by transition to newer dirt surfaces with different sub-surfaces."

A sense of obligation to their community was inculcated in their children by Wayne and Muffy, themselves recognized for conservation of the Bluegrass environment. But commitment starts at home, including for the siblings whose lives are now principally spent elsewhere. Certainly Bryan's familiar face is welcomed back by clients visiting their consignment at the major sales.

"When Bryan decided that he wanted to make a life change, that actually came as no surprise to me," Wayne says. "He has always loved Jackson Hole, and I couldn't be happier for him. He's done very well with his new vocation, and is still tremendously involved with Ashview Farm, with horses and mares that we own together. And our daughter, similarly, though her three young children take a lot of her time.

"We've all of us always worked hard. My brother works hard, my sisters work hard, my wife does, my entire family has that ingrained. But if you're happy in what you're doing, it's not hard work at all. Does that make any sense?"

Yes, sir, it does. This, after all, is someone who's reminded how it all began every time he comes to Keeneland.

"I was 15 and used to hitchhike from Paris to walk hots," he recalls. "A barn right under the water tower. I'd walk eight hots a

morning, a dollar apiece. So that made \$8 a day, and pretty much the afternoon off. Where the alternative had been tobacco, at 60 cents an hour. So a 10-hour day was \$6. And I did the math!

"That was 60 years ago now. I've had difficult days: banking, and money, and trying to grow a farm. We started with eight acres. We're now 1,050, and I'm very proud of that. But I never got up in the morning and worked, not the way some people do, who don't like what they're doing. I feel sad for them because my business has never been work to me."

"It's an old-school mentality," Gray concludes. "Our long-term staff have utmost respect for mom and dad. They ask for a lot, and everybody works their butts off. But on a bad day, they would do anything for their staff." *Cont.*



"That's why it's not all about compensation in one form or another. When you have that trust and respect, you know you're getting your best from people. Someone makes a mistake, you acknowledge it and move on. Sounds simple. It's not. It all comes from my folks. Really, it's so easy to work with them. I think we're very fortunate. People tell me that all the time. But we're not just fortunate. It feels unique."

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY, VRC

Located in the Richmond, Virginia area, this full time position is responsible for the daily operations of the state agency regulating pari-mutuel thoroughbred and standardbred racing in Virginia. The Executive Secretary reports directly to the five member Racing Commission which is appointed by the Governor of the Commonwealth. The Virginia Racing Commission (VRC) is responsible for sustaining, promoting, and growing the native horse racing industry in Virginia, including control of all horse racing with pari-mutuel wagering conducted in the Commonwealth.

These locations include thoroughbred and steeplechase racing at Colonial Downs, steeplechase at Great Meadows, and harness racing at Shenandoah Downs. All facilities host two meets per year.

With the passage of HB 1609 in 2018, the VRC also oversees the licensing and compliance, associated with historical horseracing (HHR) machines. There are currently eight Rosie's Gaming Emporiums located around the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Qualifications include:

Demonstrated management skills; experience in working with the administration of government and the legislative process; knowledge of horse racing, and pari-mutuel wagering; a basic knowledge of accounting and budget development; communications skills enabling good working relationships with Commissioners, State Administration Officials, business and political leaders, members of the horse racing industry, the media, and the public; college degree preferred.

With two Grade I winners and two 'TDN Rising Stars' comprising half the GIII Salvator Mile S. field at Monmouth Park Saturday, it was Repole Stable and St. Elias Stables LLC's Bright Future--one of the former Grade I winners who was also coming off a seven-month layoff--who got the win after a tight trip on the rail. Fellow GISW Shirl's Speight (Speightstown), who has done his best running on the lawn but was third in this race in 2022, tired to sixth.

The winner broke alertly, but was outfooted to the front and got locked into a joint-third inside spot with Shirl's Speight behind Charles Town star Coastal Mission and Gulfstream stakes winner Oscar Eclipse (Oscar Performance) through :24.05 and :48.16 fractions. Surrounded on all sides with no where to go and shuffled back to sixth on the far turn, Bright Future miraculously had the seas part in front of him just after the announcer noted him "plodding in place" coming off the turn. The chestnut accelerated sharply at the top of the stretch, found

yet another gear late in the lane, and blasted right by Coastal Mission and last-out Parx allowance victor Movisitor for a 1 3/4-length triumph.

"That was a big performance," said Anthony Sciametta, assistant to winning trainer Todd Pletcher. "We're very pleased. The horse was training well at Belmont so I'm really not surprised. They obviously liked him. When he started falling back a little bit we got a little worried but then he came running again. It's a big win for him. He is coming off the bench and it's really good for him going forward."

Bright Future has been off since a sixth-place finish behind White Abarrio (Race Day) in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic last November, a spot he earned on the merits of a GI Jockey Club Gold Cup S. win in the waning days of the Saratoga meet in September. Those two starts followed an open daylight allowance win at Saratoga, the first in a string of three consecutive races that netted triple-digit Beyer Speed Figures for Bright Future. His last several works upon returning have been very sharp, including a :47 3/5 move over four furlongs (3/172) on Belmont's training track June 8.

Bright Future is one of 59 graded winners from 105 black-type winners for Hill 'n' Dale's super sire Curlin, who has 10 stakes winners (six graded) on the year thus far. Bright Future's win also marks the third consecutive weekend Curlin has had a graded winner, starting with GIII Blame S. winner Highland Falls June 1 and continuing with GII Suburban S. winner Crupi June 8.

Sophia's Song, a listed winner at Laurel who was also GSP at Charles Town, sold at last November's Fasig-Tipton 'Night of the Stars' sale on the heels of Bright Future's Jockey Club Gold Cup win. Shadai Farm picked her up in foal to Jackie's Warrior for \$1.35 million and promptly shipped her to Japan. *Cont.*

The mare had several headlining months. In addition to Bright Future's GI win in September, her debuting 2-year-old, Booth (Mitole), was named a 'TDN Rising Star' at Keeneland in October and, in December, her sophomore daughter Musical Mischief (Into Mischief) finished third in the GI American Oaks. Sophia's Song currently has a juvenile colt by Tiz the Law and a yearling colt by Maxfield. The mare is out of an unraced full-sister to dual champion sprinter Housebuster from the same family as last year's GI Hopeful S. winner Nutella Fella (Runhappy). Damsire Bellamy Road, the 2005 GI Wood Memorial S. winner, has an even dozen black-type winners out of his daughters.

At the bell, Fort Washington drafted Running Bee from the third flight, as the pair settled to the outside into the first turn and continued up the backstretch. *Cont.*

With a three-way battle ensuing for the top spot into the far turn, this allowed both 5-year-olds to fan to the outside entering the lane. Powering forward, Fort Washington pulled alongside Running Bee with a furlong left and they traded blows all the way to the photograph with Tawny Port a close third.

Coming into the Monmouth S., Fort Washington's form might not have looked the best on paper. The dark bay was last seen finishing a well-beaten 10th against optional claimers over a 'good' Churchill Downs turf course May 9. However, his 3-year-old and 4-year-old campaigns included some challenging stakes competition. When he visited Monmouth two years ago for the Tale of the Cat S., he rallied nicely for the win.

"He has run some decent races before his first start this year. I don't have any idea why he was that kind of a price [35-1]," said trainer Shug McGaughey. "If you look back all he had to do was catch a firm turf and I thought he would run well. He just did not like the turf at Churchill his last start. I'm not surprised he ran the way he did. I'm surprised he was as big a price as he was. We'll see how he comes back, but I would think the [Grade II] United Nations S. [on the Haskell day undercard] is a possibility. I think he can go even long. He waits on his rider, like he did today, so I think he can handle a little longer distance."

As for Running Bee, the bay accrued some graded back class himself when he was the runner-up in the GIII Tampa Bay S. in early February and last out when third in the GIII Dinner Party S. on the Preakness undercard. In between those races, the Chad Brown trainee won against allowance types at Keeneland Apr. 6.

"I thought this horse would run good if he broke well and he did break well," said Brown assistant Luis Cabrera. "I expected he would be close and he was able to work out a good position. He has run against some good horses. I thought his last race [third in the Dinner Party] was a good race. It's up to Chad to decide if he wants to go forward in the United Nations S. I don't know about the distance [a mile and three-eighths]. We'll see what Chad thinks."

Fort Washington is the 70th graded winner for War Front (by Danzig). The winner's dam is responsible for a 2-year-old filly named Sumerian (Speightstown) and a yearling colt by Munnings. Azaelia foaled a full-sister to Fort Washington Apr. 11.

An impressive debut winner over the local course in late 2022, the daughter of Mehmas (Ire) has since gone 0-for-7 on the NYRA circuit but continued to give a good account of herself, failing to hit the board only twice in that span.

Second by just a neck facing allowance horses to open her 4-year-old season at Aqueduct, she was last third as the favorite over course and distance in the Miss Liberty S. May 26. Breaking from the outside in her third-straight go over the 1 1/16 miles, the 7-2 shot was out-sprinted by a trio of runners and sat fourth past the wire the first time by. Spirit And Glory, setting the tempo, led through leisurely fractions of :25.74 and :51.16 with no one moving up to pressure her until the field began to swing into the far turn. In what wound up being a three-furlong dash to the finish, Tax Implications tipped outside of the leading trio and stormed up the center of the track to win over her closing stablemate.

"I think this filly likes a little softer turf," said Luis Cabrera, assistant to Chad Brown. "The turf today is a little soft in my opinion. You can see by some of her past races on softer turf where she ran well against graded stakes company. We also didn't have to ship her since her last start was here and we kept her here. That can make a difference. I was a little worried about the slow fractions but she was close to the leaders. I was worried it wouldn't help the other one [the Brown-trained Maman Joon, who closed to be second]. There was no pace for her. But she ran well. I think the plan is to go forward in the [GIII] WinStar Matchmaker S. [on the NYRA Bets Haskell S. card]."

We'll enjoy this race tonight and look forward to what could be next for her."

Webslinger returned to the winner's circle for the first time since winning the Audubon S. at this venue last June with a sharp effort in the Chorleywood S. under the lights at Churchill Downs Saturday.

A frequent face at the nation's highest level of racing in the last couple seasons, he was most recently seen running third May 4 in the GI Old Forester Bourbon Turf Classic S. over this course, and had claimed the last board position in the GII Muniz Memorial Classic S. Mar. 23 at Fair Grounds before that effort.

The 7-5 favorite settled in sixth after the jump as multiple Group/Grade I-placed Stone Age (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) surprisingly outfooted Sugoi to the lead. That frontrunner put up :24.47, :48.38, and 1:13.72 splits as the field ambled along in the turf marathon, and was still in control as the field closed ranks behind him to mount their challenges. Still with work to do when they swung in for the homeward drive, Webslinger had to muscle his way into clear sailing from four wide but was closing fast outside the sixteenth pole. Driving past Sugoi late, a half-length separated them with Bold Act (Ire) closing from last to claim third.

"He broke well today and he never really shows much speed early," Jose Ortiz said. "I dropped to the rail and tried to save as much ground as I could. He's pretty easy to ride, so I was confident whenever I needed to tip him out that I'd be able to."

Ortiz added, "I knew the pace would be fast when I saw tonight [jockey] Brian [Hernandez Jr.] go to the lead [on Stone Age] over Sugoi, who had an easy lead in the Louisville S. when he went :50 for the half-mile. I just let my horse travel well within himself."

The most accomplished for his dam, who was exported to South Korea after producing the unraced 3-year-old Sister Slinger (Outwork), Webslinger is the fourth winner from as many to the make it to the track.

Tuscan Sky, who had finished a disappointing seventh as the 5-2 second choice in the GII Wood Memorial S. when last seen Apr. 6, restored his reputation by prevailing in a prolonged fiveway battle for the lead and kicking well clear from a quintet of accomplished 3-year old rivals in the NYRA Bets Pegasus S.

Running with the addition of blinkers for his fourth career start, the grey broke well under Javier Castellano and dueled for the lead through fractions of :23.35, :46.94 and 1:11.38. Hades maintained his third position the way around.

Castellano said, "I think getting the rail trip was the key to winning the race. We had the inside post and held it. The blinkers helped a lot keeping him forward. All Todd told me was to get position and save ground. I think this horse deserves a shot in the [GI] Haskell the way he won this race. The pace was quick and he was chasing and still finished good. That's a good sign going forward."

VANDEEK 'TOPS UP' FOR ROYAL ASCOT ON THE LIMEKILNS

NEWMARKET, UK--Vandeek (GB), who is currently co-favourite for Friday's G1 Commonwealth Cup at Royal Ascot, was put through his paces by James Doyle on Newmarket's Limekilns gallop on Saturday morning. Easing clear of his two older work-mates, the son of Havana Grey (GB) galloped over six furlongs in what co-trainer Ed Crisford described as "a nice topping-up bit of work".

Unbeaten last season in four starts, including the G1 Prix Morny and G1 Middle Park S., Vandeek, who is owned by KHK Racing, ended 2023 as the highest-rated juvenile in Britain. He returned to action on May 25, finishing third in the G2 Sandy Lane S. behind Inisherin (GB) (Shamardal), who now shares the top spot in the Commonwealth Cup betting.

"We just came somewhere different today and it was lovely ground," said Crisford. "James didn't need to ask him too many questions; he just galloped out nicely, not doing too much before Friday.

"He's never been on the Limekilns before so we just wanted to take him somewhere without overdoing it." **Cont. p3**

With all three of France's Classics staged so far in 2024 falling to unexposed types, Sunday's 175th edition of the G1 Prix de Diane Longines at Chantilly could be poised for more of the same as the fast-improving **TDN Rising Star Gala Real (Fr)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}) is asked her biggest question. Going from an 11-length win at Lyon-Parilly in November to a 3 1/2-length defeat of the subsequently listed-placed Wootton Zi (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}) in Saint-Cloud's Prix Durban in April, Scuderia Dei Duepi, Ecurie des Charmes and Ballylinch Stud's girl wonder was not done there.

It was her defeat of the Wertheimers' fellow **TDN Rising Star Aventure (Ire)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}) in ParisLongchamp's Listed
Prix de la Seine last month that marks the Alessandro and
Giuseppe Botti-trained filly as ready-made for Classic success.
She is also owned by the football world's icon Carlo Ancelotti,
who after the kind of season he has had with Europe's best Real
Madrid will be hoping that his aura of success rubs off on his
equine representative in racing's equivalent of the Champions
League. Maybe it's that unstoppable momentum that led to the
fates determining that she was handed stall one in the draw
lottery. **Cont. p3**

Bred in Wales by Kelly Thomas at Maywood Stud, Vandeek topped last year's Tattersalls Craven Breeze-up Sale at 625,000gns. He was a sizeable colt even at two but appears to have improved again physically through this winter and spring. "He's a bigger, stronger horse," Crisford said. "He has filled out and he has a lot of quality."

Twenty-one horses stood their ground at Saturday's confirmation stage for the Commonwealth Cup, while Inisherin has been supplemented for the race.

The trainer added, "It's a proper race: there's the horse who beat him (Inisherin), Elite Status, who looks very good this year; Kia [Joorabchian]'s horse Bucanero Fuerte won well in Ireland. It's as you would expect, really. It's a proper Group 1 field and he will need to be on his A-game. He seems in good order and he's versatile ground-wise, he's won on soft, heavy and on good to firm."

"Gala Real is very well behaved and has an impeccable mindset," Alessandro said. "It's almost certain that a sound surface won't bother her, although we know that she acts on soft ground. If the ground rides good, I hope she'll be just as effective on it as on soft because it will open up a lot of opportunities for us further down the line. There's no doubt that we're going to get a properly-run race with the presence of British and Irish fillies and I'm hoping for that proper gallop. Christophe Soumillon has carte blanche--he knows her better than me."

Une Aventure Fabuleuse?

Aventure has just a short neck to make up on Gala Real from the Prix de la Seine and has since bounded forward with an impressive seven-length win in the 12-furlong G3 Prix de Royaumont here. The question mark is the drop back in trip, but trainer Christophe Ferland is unconcerned about that factor. "For me, the 2,100-metre trip won't be a worry," he said of the half-sister to the Diane runner-up Left Hand (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) from the family of Plumania (GB) (Anabaa), who was third in this.

"After the Prix de Royaumont, everyone asked me if she would heading to the Prix de Diane. It also depended on how she recovered from the Royaumont," he added. "The overriding consideration was how she recovered and, since then, she's been doing her normal daily work in the form of some gentle



canters on the all-weather, combined with a very short piece of work on grass to see if her action was still fluid and there were no problems on that score."

What Of Menuisier's Zarkava?

Where Aventure has to contend with an unfavourable high draw in 10, the apple of David Menuisier's eye Tamfana (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}) has struck lucky with stall four. Along with the fellow British-based contender Dance Sequence (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), she boasts prior Classic form having been a probably unfortunate fourth in the G1 1000 Guineas. She also has previous at Chantilly, having captured the seven-furlong G3 Prix Miesque last term and her trainer is not holding back. "She makes me think of Zarkava, which is a big statement," he said. Uh, you could say that.

Before the heretic labellers get to speak out, the French-born handler with bullish tendencies elaborates. "She shows similar traits, in that she can be ridden very cold and win a race within a few yards because of her massive turn of foot," he explained. "She looks more like a colt than a filly, she is a very powerful horse and I'm sure she will keep on improving physically." He's not finished yet. "I've maintained that Tamfana is the best filly that I've ever trained--she's exceptional." Cont. p4

"She has a pedigree that oozes stamina, there is some proper stamina on the dam's side. On her pedigree, we shouldn't have

any doubts about stamina, rather speed, but that's something she's had from when she started to come to herself in September last year," he added. "If you compare her to [the Oaks third] War Chimes, it is like comparing a diesel to a petrol car. War Chimes is very good, but Tamfana has so much more speed."

the way to go since her stirring effort at Epsom. Second-best at that mile-and-a-half trip, the homebred nevertheless produced the sharpest sectional to threaten from three out to two out and this 10 1/2-furlong trip is made for her. "Dance Sequence

appears to have come out of Epsom in good shape," her trainer said. "It's always a bit tricky in terms of timing running in both races, but we feel that she is showing the right signs. We feel dropping back in trip will suit and hopefully some ease in the

ground won't do her any harm. We are applying cheekpieces just to hopefully keep her concentration at the business end of the race. She has a sensible draw in seven and, if she can reproduce her Epsom form, she is going to be a big player."

A Classic Treble For The Aga Khan?

With the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and G1 Oaks in the bag already in 2024, what price a third fillies' monument for The Aga Khan in a matter of weeks?

Certainly his Francis-Henri Graffard-trained G3 Prix de la Grotte winner **Candala (Fr)** (Frankel {GB}) has all the credentials to garner a record-extending eighth renewal for her owner-breeder. **Cont. p5**

If only she had a better draw than 12, but there is something about this special blend of speed and stamina that says she is one of the select few that could overcome.

Graffard also saddles Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Thani's lightly-raced and unproven **Paraiba (Fr)**, another daughter of Soldier Hollow, and he said, "Candala is indifferent to the state of the ground. We have rediscovered the filly we know and love and are very happy with her." Of Paraiba, he added, "We've always rated her, but her preparation has been hindered somewhat by the weather at the beginning of the year as she's a top-of-the-ground filly. We've got the work into her and she's ready, but if the ground is soft, she won't run."

Bubbling Under...

Also carrying the Wertheimers silks is the Carlos Laffon-Pariastrained G3 Prix Cleopatre winner **Halfday (Fr)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}), who is looking to provide her sire with the Jockey Club-Diane double. The operation's racing manager Pierre-Yves Bureau said, "It was very much part of the game plan to head straight to the Prix de Diane after winning the Prix de Cleopatre, avoiding a detour via the Prix Saint-Alary which would have been her only other option. She is a light-framed filly who needs time between her races and is very much a late developer. She will blossom over the trip in time."

Looking for the fairytale is the Finnish-born Chantilly-based Laura Vanska, who is here with Alain Jathiere and Christine Guilbert's G2 Prix Saint-Alary winner **Birthe (Ire)** (Study Of Man {Ire}). Having worked in show jumping before taking in Godolphin's Flying Start, she has a tiny string compared to most of her peers represented here and is dreaming big with the €12,000 purchase. "In the Prix Saint-Alary, she proved her

ability to act on soft ground, so I'm not worried about rain," she said. "She's changed a lot since the beginning of the year. As a 2-year-old, she didn't have the required strength to handle bad ground. It's quite incredible to be pitching at this level in this race of such magnitude, given that I only train ten horses!"

By Daylight Again?

Also on Chantilly's card is the G3 Prix du Bois Longines for 2-year-olds, with the distinct possibility of Earthlight (Ire) having a first black-type winner from his first crop via his daughter **Daylight (Fr)**. Gousserie Racing and Sandrine Gavrois's Patrice Cottier trainee may only have to replicate her debut performance when winning by 4 1/2 lengths over this track and six-furlong trip last month, but in all probability she will need more with Karl Burke involved with his York novice winner **Arabie (GB)** (Dandy Man {Ire}).

In the 12-furlong G3 Prix du Lys Longines, Coolmore and Westerberg's unbeaten TDN Rising Star Delius (GB) (Frankel (GB)), who beat the Diane contender Paraiba in the course-and-distance Prix du Puits aux Chiens conditions event last month, takes the next step towards a crack at the G1 Grand Prix de Paris his trainer Andre Fabre loves so much to win. Also on Sunday, Cologne stages the G2 Grosser Preis der Badischen Wirtschaft, where last year's G1 Deutsches Derby hero Fantastic Moon (Ger) (Sea The Moon (Ger)) looks to get back on track and the contenders for Hamburg's 2024 domestic Classic shape up in the G2 Sparkasse Kolnbonn 189th Union-Rennen. Watch for another Sea The Moon here, Gestut Schlenderhan's Listed Dusseldorf Derby Trial runner-up Any Moon (Ger) who is a half-brother to the G1 Melbourne Cup hero Almandin (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}).

THE LOWDOWN: PRIX DE DIANE LONGINES

Per usual, entrants in the latest Classic on the European calendar run the gamut from blueblooded homebreds and auction purchases at a range of prices. The luckless Tamfana is returning off her fourth in the G1 QIPCO 1000 Guineas, and is one of the leading fancies, and there are several fresh shooters that will be trying Group 1 company for the first time from France and farther afield. Last year, Churchill's Blue Rose Cen took the G1 Prix de Diane Longines, and the Coolmore stallion is represented by the group-placed Survie.

CANDALA (FR)

Frankel (GB)--Candarliya (Fr) (Dalakhani {Ire})

Pedigree/form notes: This Aga Khan homebred has won her last two starts, including the G3 Prix de la Grotte at ParisLongchamp in May. Cont. p6

The dam won the G2 Prix de Royallieu, and G3 Prix Minerve with a second in the G1 Prix Vermeille at three and was back in the winner's circle in the G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil at four. Her renowned owner/breeder has won this event a record seven times, most recently with Valyra (GB) (Azamour {Ire}) in 2012. A half-sister to the stakes-placed Carini (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}), Candala will be one of the likelier winners in this return.

PARAIBA (FR)

Soldier Hollow (GB)--Pearls Or Passion (Fr) (Monsun {Ger})

Pedigree/form notes: After a debut win, this full-sister to G3 Prix de Royaumont scorer Pelligrina (Ire) ran second to Delius (GB) (Frankel {GB} at Chantilly on May 11. Her dam won the Listed Prix Panacee and this is the famed 'Pearl' family developed by Haras de Saint Pair and headed by Group 1 winner Pearly Shells (GB) (Efisio {GB}), the granddam of Paraiba. The trip should hold

no fears for this Al Shahania Stud-bred filly, especially as the ground was very soft in that 2400-metre affair.

SURVIE (IRE)

Churchill (Ire)--Sotteville (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire})

Pedigree/form notes: Bred and raced by Gerard Augustin-Normand under his Franklin Finance banner, the relation to G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud herone Seralia (GB) (Royal Academy) is out of a two-time French group winner. She has

been knocking on the door of a black-type win with a pair of group placings behind Dare To Dream (G3 Prix Vanteaux) and Birthe (G2 Prix Saint-Alary), but this is a tough ask.

SPARKLING PLENTY (FR)

Kingman (GB)--Speralita (Fr) (Frankel {GB})

Sales info: This filly was a €600,000 buy-back when offered by Haras des Capucines at the Arqana August Sale in 2022. Pedigree/form notes: A last-out winner of the G2 Prix de Sandringham, the Jean-Pierre Dubois homebred is a full-sister to G3 Jersey S. scorer and G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere Grand Criterium second Noble Truth (Fr). Her dam is a half-sister to the great six-time top-tier winner Stacelita (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}). Regardless, Sparkling Plenty holds a live hand.

DANCE SEQUENCE (GB)

Dubawi (Ire)--Tearless (GB) (Street Cry {Ire})

Pedigree/form notes: The third black-type horse produced by listed winner Tearless, Dance Sequence is the sixth foal out of her dam, and her elder half-sister Romantic Song (Ire) (Shamardal) won at listed level in Germany. Hailing from one of the best families in the stud book as a great granddaughter of Magnificient Style (Silver Hawk), this Godolphin homebred was already second in the G1 Betfred Oaks. Dance Sequence is aiming to go one better in the French equivalent and she just might do it.

ROCK'N SWING (GB)

Camelot (GB)--Ragsah (Ire) (Shamardal)

Pedigree/form notes: The sixth foal out of G3 Firth of Clyde S. victress Ragsah, herself a half-sister to the ill-fated star Dubai Millennium (GB), Rock'n Swing is part of the iconic Fall Aspen

family and counts GII Goldikova S. third Richmond Avenue (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) as a half-sister. Yet another filly bearing the royal blue of Godolphin, this Andre Fabre trainee sports two wins, but was soundly beaten when seventh in the G1 Emirates Poule d'Essai des Pouliches in May. Never say never, but this appears to be an uphill battle.

L'EQUILIBRISTE (FR) Dream Ahead--Delinda (Fr) (Sea The Stars {Ire})

Sales info: Troy Steve Bloodstock plucked this daughter of the unraced Delinda out of the Arqana October Yearling Sale for €10,000 when offered by Ecurie d'Auge.

Pedigree/form notes: Yet to test the waters at group level, this Listed Prix Finlande-winning filly and half-sister to fellow listed winner Iznik (Fr) (Zarak {Fr}), was bred by Haras de Gratte Panche, Michel Dardenne and Samy Torgeman. Although by a standout sprinter in Bearstone Stud's Dream Ahead, this filly has a better chance of lasting the trip than is first apparent, as her first three dams are by Sea The Stars (Ire), Selkirk and Doyoun (Ire), with the latter a full-sister to European/American champion Daylami (Ire), and a half-sister to fellow Euro champ Dalakhani (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}). Has heaps of potential, but it remains to be seen whether she can mix it up with fillies of this calibre. Cont. p7

BIRTHE (IRE)

Study Of Man (Ire)--Barakaat (Fr) (Lope De Vega {Ire})

Sales info: Tara Stud consigned the bay to the Goffs Autumn Yearling Sale, where she brought €10,000 on the bid of JD Moore. She later breezed at the Arqana Summer Sale, where she was bought by Tina Rau and her trainer Laura Vanska for €12,000.

Pedigree/form notes: Bred by Sabah Mubarak Al Sabah, the first foal out of her winning dam triumphed in the Listed Prix Caravelle and G2 Prix Saint-Alary in succession in April and May, respectively. From the same family as GI Santa Anita Oaks heroine Ariege (Doneraile Court), she undoubtedly will continue to thrive as she matures. Could grab a piece of the action.

DARE TO DREAM (FR)

Camelot (GB)--Debutante (Fr) (Gold Away (Ire))

Sales info: This March foal was offered by co-breeder Ecurie des Monceaux at the Arqana October Yearling Sale, and was knocked down to Gavin Hernon for €67,000. Monceaux, Meridian International and Scuderia Waldeck SNC are the breeders on her page.

Pedigree/form notes: She is one of three winners for her multiple stakes-placed dam, herself a half-sister to German Horse of the Year and Arc scorer Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {Ger}). Stubbed her toe as the favourite in the Saint-Alary, but the G3 Prix Vanteaux winner could easily rebound here.

TAMFANA (GER)

Soldier Hollow (GB)--Tres Magnifique (Fr) (Zoffany {Ire})

Sales info: A mere €20,000 BBAG September yearling from the

draft of Gestut Etzean, the bay was purchased by Jeremy Brummitt.

Pedigree/form notes: The winner of the G3 Prix Miesque is kin to GI Beverly D. S. winner Sea Calisi (Fr) (Youmzain {Ire}) among other turf luminaries. Absolutely luckless in the running of the G1 QIPCO 1000 Guineas when lacking room but eventually able to snatch fourth, the Etzean and Hans-Helmut Rodenburg-bred is one of the major players here.

GALA REAL (FR)

Wootton Bassett (GB)--Cala Violina (Fr) (Lope De Vega (Ire))

Sales info: Meridian International shelled out €270,000 for this filly from the Haras de la Louviere consignment during the Arqana August Yearling Sale.

There are currently 11 possibles for the race now, with Coolmore's Opera Singer (Justify), third in the Irish 1000

Guineas, set to be the new ante-post favourite.

FRIDAY FIELDS TAKE SHAPE FOR ROYAL **ASCOT WITH PAIR OF COMMONWEALTH SUPPLEMENTS**

As expected, G2 Sandy Lane S. hero Inisherin (GB) (Shamardal) was supplemented to Friday's G1 Commonwealth Cup at Royal Ascot, as fields for the fourth day of the meeting were revealed on Saturday.

G3 Horris Hill S. hero **Orne (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}) has also been supplemented at a cost of £46,000 to bring the current field to 22. The two late entries face dual Group 1 winner and co-favourite Vandeek (GB) (Havana Grey {GB}) in the six-furlong race. Other notables signed on include G3 Prix de Cabourg scorer and May 18 Listed Carnarvon S. hero Elite Status (GB) (Havana Grey {GB}), Amo Racing's G1 Phoenix S. victor Bucanero Fuerte (GB) (Wootton Bassett (GB)) who just won the G3 Lacken S. on May 19, one for Aidan O'Brien in Group 2 winner and three-time Group 1-placed River Tiber (Ire) (Wootton Bassett (GB) and the G1 Cheveley Park S.heroine Porta Fortuna (Ire) (Caravaggio).

The latter also holds an entry in the G1 Coronation S., which will be run without Classic winner Fallen Angel (GB) (Too Darn Hot {GB}). Of the 11 remaining fillies, G1 QIPCO 1000 Guineas heroine Elmalka (GB) (Kingman {GB}) makes her first start since her Classic win for Roger Varian. Third to Elmalka that day was multiple group winner and two-time Group 1-placed Ramatuelle (Justify) from France from the Christopher Head yard. It is another daughter of Justify that garners favouritism with a week until the race in the form of Coolmore's Opera Singer. The Group 1 winner was third to Fallen Angel in the G1 Tattersalls Irish 1000 Guineas. Cont. p9

The winner of the French equivalent, His Highness The Aga Khan's **Rouhiya (Fr)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}), will be making her first start since that May 12 Classic at ParisLongchamp.

In the G3 Albany S., 24 fillies have stood their ground, like the undefeated stakes winner Hot Darling (Ire) (Too Darn Hot {GB}). Joining the Amy Murphy trainee are a trio from Ballydoyle. G3 Fillies Sprint S. heroine Fairy Godmother (Ire) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) is one of the trio, as are the winners Heaven's Gate (Ire) (Churchill {Ire}) and Truly Enchanting (Ire) (No Nay Never). The final group race on the Friday card is the G2 King Edward VII S. run over 1 1/2 miles for 3-year-olds, and 21 remain in the running. A total of nine hail from Ballydoyle, with winner and G3 Chester Vase runner-up Agenda (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) showing the way. Diego Velazquez (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) will be hoping for some redemption and the Group 2 winner last emerged victorious from the G2 Champions Juvenile S. at Leopardstown in September, but has three unplaced runs since. G3 Gallinule S. hero Chief Little Rock (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) is also among the current entries.

Dual Group 3 winner Calandagan (Ire) (Gleneagles {Ire}) was last seen winning the G3 Prix Hocquart for His Highness The Aga Khan. Juddmonte's Macduff (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) also appears to fit with these on paper and was second in the G3 Classic Trial S. at Sandown earlier this spring before running off-the-board in the G1 Betfred Derby. Brook Farm Bloodstock's War Rooms (Ire) (Churchill {Ire}) is also aiming to progress after a third in the G2 Dante S. at York in mid-May.

Next week's G1 St James's Palace S. features an intriguing clash between the English, Irish and French 2000 Guineas winners, with **Notable Speech (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) leading the trio on ratings, Timeform announced on Saturday.

The Godolphin runner earned a mark of 125p for his defeat of Rosallion (Ire) (Blue Point {Ire}), who would go on to win the G1 Tattersalls Irish 2000 Guineas and be ranked 121. Next on the leaderboard is Henry Longfellow (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), a winner of the G1 National S. at two, at 120. Listed winner Almaqam (GB) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) has been ranked at 115p, which edges

the 115 given to **Metropolitan (Fr)** (Zarak {Fr}) for his win in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains.

Timeform handicapper Patrick Jupp said, "The early signs are that this year's Classic crop of milers are a strong bunch and, as is often the case when looking at the St James's Palace, the 2000 Guineas at Newmarket looks the key piece of form.

"Connections of Rosallion may feel entitled to get closer to Notable Speech than on that day, as their charge didn't have the benefit of a recent run, whilst he has since gone one better at the Curragh when doing well to peg back Haatem.

"Notable Speech looks a potentially top-class miler, though, possessing both a high cruising speed and a sharp turn of foot, weapons that are sure to stand him in good stead with conditions next week likely to place the emphasis on speed, and it's hard to see anything that finished behind him at Newmarket reversing form."

The G1 St James's Palace S. takes place on Tuesday, June 18, the first day of Royal Ascot.

FIRST GROUP 1 FOR BOOM YOUNG JOCKEY LLOYD IN STRADBROKE by Renee Geelen

Apprentice jockey Zac Lloyd added to his already impressive resume with his first Group 1 win in Saturday's G1 Stradbroke Handicap on Bjorn Baker-trained 3-year-old filly **Stefi Magnetica** (Aus) (All Too Hard {Aus}) who won by 0.25l from tough racemare **Bella Nipotina** (Aus) (Pride Of Dubai {Aus}) with favourite **Vilana** (Aus) (Hallowed Crown {Aus}) 2l back in third.

"It is really good just to get that Group 1 on my resume. I've had some great opportunities in the past year or so and I haven't been able to capitalise. To get the job done today in a very big race, it is very special," said Zac Lloyd who rode his first winner at Dalby, Queensland, back in November 2020, and rode Steffi Magnetica at the light weight of 50kg.

"I was very confident pre-race. She galloped enormous on Tuesday. My dad and I went through the race thoroughly and we honestly thought we were on the right horse. The first furlong or two went perfect. She was in a good rhythm, she wasn't overracing.

"Just as a couple of horses started dropping back in our face I had to make a decision to go around with the pack but I ultimately thought there'd be too much traffic so I thought I was travelling so well I was happy to go inside of them.

"She was tough. I saw Bella Nipotina and I thought that was one horse you don't want to be in a finish with, but she was great." Stefi Magnetica was coming off a last start third in the G3 Fred Best Classic over the same 1400 metre trip, and all up has three wins and six placings from 13 starts with earnings over A\$2.1million. This was her first stakes win, although she did run second in the G1 Surround S. in March behind Tropical Squall (Aus) (Prized Icon {Aus}).

"She's an amazing filly. She won a Wellington 2-year-old race at the back end of the season, she won a BM58 at Orange in December, she was just chinned in the Surround," said stable representative Jim Clark.

"Bjorn opted to give her a short break and set her for the winter. Her run in the 10,000 was amazing. She was in the wrong part of the track, I think everyone saw that. It was an amazing ride there. To win Queensland's greatest race with a filly that (Gary... and Mitch Cunningham) bought as a yearling and trained by one of my best mates and one of my best supporters in Bjorn, is the biggest thrill of my career and I'm just so pleased."


BROADSIDING DEMOLISHES THE G1 JJ

Godolphin have uncovered another star colt with **Broadsiding** (Aus) (Too Darn Hot {GB}) who raced away from the 300-metre mark to smash the rest of the G1 JJ Atkins field by 4.75l for jockey James McDonald, who said, "Champion 2-year-old that one."

Broadsiding has now won four races in succession, all in black type, and this was his second Group 1 win after winning the G1 Champagne S. in April. "He's such a good colt, so he certainly deserved his chance but great credit to the team who have managed through a big campaign," said trainer James Cummings.

Broadsiding was first seen at the races in February and has had

seven starts without a break. "The only real doubt throughout the week for some was a dry track or perhaps even a long prep but I've got such a good team that I've been able to keep not only fit but also healthy, well, growing, and loving his training."

In second place was G2 Spirit Of Boom Classic winner **Bittercreek (Aus)** (Snitzel {Aus}) with **Bosustow (Aus)** (Blue Point {Ire}) in third.

"He's what you love to look for in a 2-year-old and yet he's got that dynamic motor, the way he cruised up into that race was effortless and James just rode him like he was the best horse in the race - he was full of confidence in the horse," continued Cummings. "He paraded like a colt that was thriving and he got the big salute there from James McDonald. He sort of had that feel about perhaps being the best two-year-old in the country this season. He's just been so good. He's been a horse that has been able to keep improving and being by Too Darn Hot out of a Street Cry mare, he's got his future well and truly assured on the roster at Darley."

Pedigree Notes

By first season sire Too Darn Hot who was a Group 1-winning juvenile himself, Broadsiding is the second Group 1 winner for his sire who has also sired dual Group 1 winner Fallen Angel (GB) in the Northern Hemisphere. Cont. p17

From his first Australian Crop, Too Darn Hot has 12 winners, obviously led by Broadsiding as well as stakes placed winners Arabian Summer (Aus), Too Darn Lizzie (Aus), while Silmarillion (Aus), Trembles (Aus), and Superalloy (Aus) are stakes placed.

"He's a ball of muscle. He knows he's really good. He's a character but James (Cummings) has done a phenomenal job. I can't stress how good a job he's done, to be fair," added McDonald. "He keeps raising the bar but he's got a good colt on his hands. He's special. He is a fair dinkum 2-year-old and he will get stronger as he gets older. It is a pleasure to ride him."

Broadsiding is the third foal and first winner for winning mare Speedway (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) and she is a half-sister to Group 1 winner Flit (Aus) (Redoute's Choice) and a full-sister to Group 3 placed winner Flow (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}).
