



KHAADEM DOES IT AGAIN IN THE QEII JUBILEE

Swooping to record back-to-back successes in Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes at Royal Ascot, Fitri Hay's **Khaadem (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) proved himself a true horsesfor-courses sprinter with Oisin Murphy the recipient of the ultimate thrill this time around. Let go at 80-1 getting the full Jamie Spencer treatment 12 months ago, the Charlie Hillstrained 8-year-old--who had been in the wilderness since--was always travelling like the winner tanking in behind doing it all on his own.

Finally given the command to go get the filly **Swingalong (Ire)** (Showcasing {GB}) approaching the final furlong, he was by her 100 yards later en route to a half-length win. **Mill Stream (Ire)** (Gleneagles {Ire}) was 1 1/4 lengths behind in third, with the 3-1 favourite **Believing (Ire)** (Mehmas {Ire}) a further length back in fourth.

"It was a pretty easy ride," Murphy said of the first 8-year-old to triumph and the first back-to-back winner since Right Boy in 1958-59. "I knew for the majority of the last two furlongs he would win and so I was able to enjoy it a little bit. There was a lot of speed on, particularly after a furlong, but when it began to slow down late on he came alive. I just wanted to copy Jamie Spencer from last year! TALKING POINTS: SHEPHERD BAGS EMOTIONAL BREAKTHROUGH ROYAL ASCOT

Isle Of Jura (GB) (New Approach {Ire}) stormed to a memorable Hardwicke victory on Saturday to provide trainer George Scott and rider Callum Shepherd with a breakthrough Royal Ascot success.

The win was a timely one for Shepherd, who endured a hammer blow when losing the ride aboard Ambiente Friendly (Ire) (Gleneagles {Ire}), who would go on to finish second in the Derby.

Naturally, Shepherd was overcome with emotion after crossing the winning line in front aboard Isle Of Jura, who is owned by Bahrain's Victorious Racing and racked up a series of wins in that country over the winter.

"With all the emotions coming out I'm going to struggle to compose myself," Shepherd told ITV Racing after bagging his first Ascot win at the 66th attempt.

Khaadem's career saga is a colourful one, having burst onto the scene early for Shadwell when winning Goodwood's prestigious Stewards' Cup as a 3-year-old. Fourth in this in 2020 prior to his first prolonged spell in the doldrums, he was snapped up by the Hays before the 2022 season and while he provided reward for that investment with wins in the G3 Palace House Stakes and G2 King George Stakes back at Goodwood, he planted himself in the stalls before this meeting's G1 King's Stand Stakes.

By the time he went into the starting stalls for his race last June, he had suffered a run of heavy defeats and while his four efforts in between his two Jubilees were more respectable, none yielded a placing and the latest resulted in him beating one rival in the G2 1895 Duke Of York Clipper Stakes. Jamie Spencer was given much credit for what happened last year as the scramble to make sense of an 80-1 winner got underway, but Murphy was just as much a passenger this time and it is clearly this contest that lights the veteran's fire.

"He is a very good horse to win two of these, plus a Palace House, a Stewards' Cup and a King George at Goodwood," Charlie Hills said. "He got a fantastic ride off the pace and he never looked like he was going to get beat--he travelled beautifully through the race."



"He loves the place and I think fast ground is key to him--it's the first time he's had this ground pretty much since he ran here last time."

"He's a wonderful horse, but he's different at home one day to the next," he added. "One day he'll pick up the bridle and you think he's Nijinsky, the next you think he's like a selling plater. He knows more about the game than any of us, I think."

Dr Jim Hay added, "He doesn't know he's eight years old, he thinks he's three or two or something and he just keeps going. Last year I couldn't believe he was 80/1--I just thought they were the most stupid odds I'd ever seen in my life and today he will still quite long odds for a horse of his ability. You cannot underestimate him."

Karl Burke said of Swingalong, "I am gutted to be beaten, but she's run her heart out and I can't complain. She loves this track, it plays to her strengths. She is in the July Cup, but I'm not sure that track plays to her strengths. It might be a case of we have to go, as she was kept in training to run in these group 1s and to try and win one."

Mill Stream's trainer Jane Chapple-Hyam said, "We are very pleased with that. William [Buick] said it was a good run, a fair run and it is his best to date, so we can't complain. We will head to Deauville for the [G1] Prix Maurice de Gheest."

Pedigree Notes

Khadeem, whose sire Dark Angel's runners excel at Ascot and who was also the damsire of the afternoon's sensational Chesham winner Bedtime Story (Ire) (Frankel {GB}), is a fullbrother to the similarly-fast son Log Out Island (Ire) who took the Listed Two-Year-Old Trophy and was placed in the G2 Norfolk S. and Mill Reef S.

His dam White Daffodil is kin to three black-type performers headed by the Listed Carnarvon S. and Listed Prix Saraca scorer Lady Links (GB) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}), in turn the dam of the Listed Oh So Sharp S. winner Selinka (GB) (Selkirk) who produced the G3 Curragh S. and G3 Mercury S. winner Hit The Bid (GB) (Exceed And Excel (Aus)) and the stakes scorer Ruthin (GB) (Ribchester {Ire}). From the family of the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest-winning sire Bold Edge (GB), White Daffodil's unraced 2-year-old full-sister to Khaadem and Log Out Island is named Daffodil Day (Ire), while she also has a filly foal by Supremacy (Ire).



Bedtime Story Or Fairy Godmother?

Wow. If anyone was feeling sleepy coming into the final day of what has been a mammoth week of racing, Bedtime Story (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) did her bit to awaken those people from their slumber.

What she did in the Chesham was seriously impressive. Juveniles are not supposed to win races of that nature by close to double figures.

However, did she deserve to usurp her stablemate Fairy Godmother (Ire) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}), who was arguably just as impressive in overcoming a troubled passage in Friday's Albany, for next year's 1,000 Guineas?

The bookmakers seem to think so and have installed Bedtime Story as the clear number one for Aidan O'Brien for next year's Classic at odds of 11-4. You can get 6-1 in places about Fairy Godmother.

Yes, Bedtime Story was extremely impressive but it shouldn't be lost what Fairy Godmother achieved 24 hours previously. Those odds seem a little reactionary.

Good Old Dark Angel Enjoys Week To Remember

Dark Angel (Ire) did his bit to remind people just how good he is this week. After starting the meeting with a bang with Charyn (Ire) in the Queen Anne, the Yeomanstown Stud resident proved he can get top-class horses at every discipline when Khaadem (Ire) made it back-to-back victories in the Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes. It's been a week to remember for the stallion.

Quality Of The Older Sprinters A Worry

It must be said, however, that the Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes lacked strength in depth. Given Tuesday's King Charles III Stakes went for export with Asfoora (Aus) (Flying Artie {Aus}) beating the best of the European sprinters, the Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes didn't do anything to change the opinion that we are lacking a top-class older sprinter in this jurisdiction. You'd have to fancy Commonwealth Cup winner Inisherin (GB) (Shamardal) in the July Cup, should that be the path connections chart.

Divine Intervention

Hand Of God (GB) (Churchill {Ire}), named after that infamous Diego Maradona goal against England in the World Cup quarter-final 38 years ago to the day, sprouted wings to take the Golden Gates Stakes.

It came as some deserved compensation for owner Mohammed Jaber, whose King's Gambit (Ire) (Saxon Warrior {Jpn}) was an unlucky loser earlier in the week.

But Hand Of God was by far the best horse in the Golden Gate and was by no means in need of divine intervention to hit the back of the net.



Unfortunately, having sat through a couple of sleep-inducing performances by Gareth Southgate's boys, the same cannot be said for England in the Euros. They'll need every bit of help they can get!

Haatem An Ideal Type For The Breeders' Cup

How good was Haatem (Ire) (Phoenix Of Spain {Ire}) in the Jersey Stakes? Reverting in trip and running under the penalty proved no barrier to the classy colt registering a fourth success for Wathnan Racing this week and paying a handsome compliment to his Irish 2,000 Guineas conqueror and stablemate Rosallion (Ire) (Blue Point {Ire}).

Okay, Wathnan clearly shelled out a lot of money to buy Haatem in the build-up tp the Jersey--probably a couple of million at least--but lest we forget that Haatem was initially bought for 27,000gns as a yearling by Peter and Ross Doyle. These horses are out there.

Haatem would look an obvious type to go for the Breeder's Cup Turf Mile, which would be huge for the Irish National Stud, whose young stallion Phoenix Of Spain continues to go from strength to strength.



Credit Where It's Due

We are starting to repeat ourselves here, but what Wathnan Racing achieved in returning to the winner's enclosure four times this week has to be celebrated. For context, Godolphin managed just one winner all week while Amo Racing left Ascot empty-handed.

Tough Week For The Irish

Don't be fooled by Aidan O'Brien running riot and claiming yet another leading trainer award at the royal meeting, because this week has been extremely tough for the raiding party. Outside of Aidan, only his sons Donnacha and Joseph along with Willie Mullins managed to bag themselves a winner apiece.

ISLE OF JURA SECURES EMOTIONAL WIN FOR SHEPHERD IN THE HARDWICKE

Victorious Racing's Isle Of Jura (GB) (New Approach {Ire}--Falls Of Lora {Ire}, by Street Cry {Ire}), who enjoyed a lucrative winter campaign snagging four of five starts in Bahrain, made a winning European comeback in last month's Listed Festival Stakes and stepped forward to secure an emotional victory for rider Callum Shepherd in Saturday's G2 Hardwicke Stakes at Royal Ascot.

The 16-1 chance was positioned fifth through the initial strides and improved one spot after the opening exchanges of this 12-furlong contest. Easing closer on the home turn and moving into second passing the quarter-mile marker, he seized control approaching the final furlong and was driven clear to secure a career best on pattern-race debut.

A maiden Royal victory was some measure of compensation for Shepherd, who was relieved of riding duties aboard Ambiente Friendly (Ire) (Gleneagles {Ire}) in the build-up to this month's G1 Derby. The immediate aftermath provided a moment of release for the rider, who was in tears as he commented, "We took him over for that series in Bahrain and he

just kept improving. Isle Of Jura has been amazing, he's never let us down and has got better with every start. He has become very straightforward and he has a real desire to win as well. He was rusty at Goodwood, but you still saw that innate desire to pass the post in front, which is so important. It's so wonderful for his owner, Sheikh Nasser. It was lovely he went over there [to Bahrain] so they could enjoy him on home soil, so to speak, and he's come back and continued to climb. He loves quick ground and stays a mile-and-a-half very well. Six weeks ago I thought I'd found my diamond [Ambiente Friendly] and that wasn't to be, but Isle Of Jura has certainly blossomed into one."

Trainer George Scott was also basking in the glory of a first Royal winner and added, "Isle Of Jura is a special horse, he has improved all the time and has been a pleasure to train. He is the most ginormous horse and has just kept improving physically. He is a beautiful mover and a lot of hard work has gone into him at home. The finish was a moment I will never forget. Everything stopped for a minute and I could enjoy the last half-furlong. Most best-laid plans go to pot, but this has been a long-term plan. This was an obvious race for him. We knew Goodwood would bring him on, and it has, and we knew he would get the ground, and he has. It was a scintillating performance, so we shall enjoy it. Callum gave him a perfect ride. He sat nice and tight to a slow pace. He was in pole position and able to make use of his position, kick nice and early and put the race to bed. All roads lead to the [G1] King George [& Queen Elizabeth S.], 100 percent."

Goliath's trainer Francis-Henri Graffard was disappointed with a lack of tempo, but ultimately satisfied with the 4-year-old's performance. "We came here because we wanted to avoid the French style of racing, with no pace, and unfortunately today they decided to do a little bit of the same," he said. "Goliath was a bit too keen through the race and, usually, he's difficult to manage, but he wasn't too bad today. I walked the course and there was a good cover of grass and I thought it was safe ground for him, but he's probably better with a bit of cut."

"He has to settle in his races to be able to stay and to produce a good turn of foot, but we are very pleased with the run. He's a very nice horse and we beat some very nice horses, too. He's entered in the King George, but we'll see what the weather forecast is. It is a long journey and a tough race, but why not?"

Oisin Murphy was not satisfied with Middle Earth's positioning during the early stages, but was pleased with the third's effort in the home straight. "I didn't want to be back at the field, but Middle Earth is a bit of a slow starter," he commented. "He travelled and finished very well. He ran home the last three furlongs in, I'd imagine, the quickest time of the race, so you have to be grateful for that. He's probably run up to his rating. It wouldn't surprise me if he went to the King George, but it would be lovely to win a Group 2 on the way to more difficult races."

Pedigree Notes

Isle Of Jura, who becomes the 39th pattern-race winner for his sire, is the fifth of eight foals and one of six scorers from as many runners produced by G3 UAE Oaks victrix Falls Of Lora (Ire) (Street Cry {Ire}), herself a daughter of stakes-winning G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches second Firth Of Lorne (Ire) (Danehill). The February-foaled bay is a full-brother to four-time Australian Group 1 winner Cascadian (GB) and kin to GI Summer Stakes victor Albahr (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), a 2-year-old colt by Night Of Thunder (Ire) and a yearling colt by Dubawi (Ire). Firth Of Lorne's quintet of black-type performers also includes GI Breeders' Cup Mile, GI Woodbine Mile and GI Maker's Mark Mile hero Master Of The Seas (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) and stakes-winning G1 St James's Palace Stakes runner-up Latharnach (Iffraaj {GB}). She is also the second dam of G1 Metropolitan victor Just Fine (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}).

HAATEM IS THE JERSEY BOY BY A WHISKER

Wathnan Racing's dual Classic-placed acquisition **Haatem (Ire)** (Phoenix Of Spain {Ire}--Hard Walnut {Ire}, by Cape Cross {Ire}) went postward for Saturday's G3 Jersey Stakes at Royal Ascot lumbered with a three-pound Group 3 penalty and defied that impost in game fashion to register a narrow victory in the sevenfurlong test.

Haatem was swiftly into stride and settled into a comfortable rhythm slipstreaming fellow Wathnan contender **Native American (Ire)** (Sioux Nation) in a prominent fourth from the outset. Tanking forward on the bridle to lead approaching the quarter-mile pole, the 7-2 second favourite came under pressure as threats loomed with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and was driven out to bravely hold the late surge of **Frankel**'s half-brother **Kikkuli** (**GB**) (Kingman {GB}) by a short-head. Johnny Murtagh trainee and 80-1 outsider **Chicago Critic** (**GB**) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) recorded a career best of his own and finished one length adrift in third.

Formerly owned by Sheikh Abdullah Almalek Alsabah, Haatem was battle-hardened by a nine-race juvenile campaign which yielded a win in Goodwood's G2 Vintage Stakes. He also chased home City Of Troy (Justify) in the G2 Superlative Stakes and G1 Dewhurst Stakes and opened this year with a daylight score in Newmarket's Apr. 18 G3 Craven Stakes. He has since found a new nemesis, in the form of Rosallion (Ire) (Blue Point {Ire}), and was one place adrift of that stablemate when hitting the board in the G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas.

"I have never known a horse get such a following from the general public with emails, Instagram messages and the like," revealed trainer Richard Hannon. "Haatem is a pleasure to have around and I would love to think we will have an association for a few years to come. He deserved his day in the sun and hopefully there will be many more. He carried a three-pound penalty today, he got to the front very easy and I'm just delighted for the horse. It's a Group 3, but I think this Jersey was an awful lot more than it normally is. He has credit for a lot more than that and I'm sure a Group 1 is coming very soon. There are some very good races for him in Australia, America and France, but we'll take him home first. I just don't think there is any need for him to take on Rosallion, it's not a race I would enjoy watching and it seems a little unfair. Haatem is a horse that deserves everything he gets. He cost just £27,000, and that says a lot about our sport, a lot of it good. He's here taking part with a penalty at the top level. It shows it's possible, which you can't say about many sports."

It was nip and tuck inside the final 100 yards, with Kikkuli a nostril in front just strides from the line, but Haatem found the necessary stretch under a powerful James Doyle drive to inch ahead where it mattered. "I had no idea if we'd won, I had my head down," the rider admitted. "Oisin [Murphy aboard Kikkuli] asked me if I'd got back up, so that kind of showed me that he had an idea. Haatem's an absolute warrior, it wasn't his ideal set-up today, but we've come up with a plan and it worked. If he had got beat, he would have been robbed because he responded well. Oisin quite smartly challenged away from me and he did spot him late on and he responded well. What a horse." Cont.

"Jamie Spencer told me that he quickened really smartly in Ireland, so I wasn't surprised by the way he picked up. We were trying to put a square peg in a round hole today and, because he's such a versatile horse, it worked."

Reflecting on Kukkuli's oh-so-near miss, trainer Harry Charlton said, "Oisin said it was a bit of a head up, head down. He rode him to follow Haatem and Oisin said he's run great. It is a shame to be second twice, but we won't take anything away from the horse and we are delighted with him. He has run great against a hardened Group 1 horse who's had a lot more experience than him. It's a proper race, there are a lot of 110-plus [rated] horses and he's run outstandingly. He travelled probably the best of them, he enjoyed the pace and the quick ground. He's from an exuberant family, but this lad is absolutely bombproof."

Chicago Critic's trainer Johnny Murtagh was overjoyed with the performance of the 80-1 outsider and said, "We are absolutely delighted, that was fantastic. We came over because we thought we had a nice horse on our hands, but it was a very deep race. Ben [Coen] gave him a great ride. We got excited there for a couple of seconds and we thought he was coming, but he just couldn't get there. No fault of the horse, he ran brilliantly. Today was the plan and, now we know we have a horse of this level, we will think about what's next. He'll stay at seven [furlongs] or a mile and I think he'll get a mile no problem."

Haatem is the fifth of six foals and one of three scorers out of a dual-winning half-sister to G3 Premio Carlo Vittadini and G3 Premio del Giubileo runner-up Father Frost (Ire) (Rip Van Winkle {Ire}) and Listed Prix Pelleas, Listed Doncaster Mile and Listed Foundation Stakes placegetter Born To Be Alive (Ire) (Born To Sea {Ire}). His second dam Yaria (Ire) (Danehill), herself a daughter of G1 Phoenix Stakes runner-up Yara (Ire) (Sri Pekan), is a winning sibling of dual stakes scorer Emirates Gold (Ire) (Royal Applause {GB}), Listed Prix Melisande victrix Yarastar (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) and the stakes-placed Yario (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). Haatem, half-brother to a yearling filly by Inns Of Court (Ire), hails from the family of Group 1-winning sires Homme De Loi (Ire) (Law Society) and Mister Majestic (Ire) (Tumble Wind).

COOLMORE, O'BRIEN AND MOORE RETAIN LEADING OWNER, TRAINER, JOCKEY TITLES

Six victories across the week saw Coolmore, Aidan O'Brien and Ryan Moore sweep the leading owner, trainer and jockey titles at Royal Ascot for a second successive year.

O'Brien received a thirteenth leading trainer award at Royal Ascot and increased his lead as the most successful current trainer at the meeting, ending the week on 91 career victories. Moore, crowned leading jockey at the meeting for an eleventh time, surpassed Frankie Dettori as the most successful current jockey at Royal Ascot. His career haul of 85 places him second on the all-time list behind Lester Piggott, who rode 116 winners at the meeting.

Coolmore partnerships that included Derrick Smith, Sue Magnier, Michael Tabor, Westerberg, Moyglare Stud Farm and Peter Brant helped clinch the leading owner award for a fifth time since its introduction in 2017.

"It's very special," O'Brien summed up. "We feel grateful and privileged, we are just so lucky to have so many special people. The lads obviously at the top run the whole show and that's where it comes from, but a lot of people put in a lot of hard work day in, day out--there are so many names I can't mention. They are the people that make it happen.

"It is a real privilege to be here with such great horses. The atmosphere, the track, the people, the facilities, are just absolutely unbelievable. You have to come here to see it to believe it. It's like nowhere ever could be in the world."

Alastair Warwick, chief executive of Ascot Racecourse, said, "Congratulations go to Aidan O'Brien and Ryan Moore as the leading trainers and jockeys once more, as well as the Coolmore partners as the leading owners. Auguste Rodin [Prince Of Wales's Stakes] and Kyprios [Gold Cup] were particular highlights winning their Group 1 races.

"Ascot Racecourse Supports committed this year to donate $\pounds 5,000$ to Retraining of Racehorses for every winner that Ryan rode and we are thrilled that his six victories will result in $\pounds 30,000$ for such an important charity within the sport."

Reflecting further on events at Ascot, Warwick added, "It has been a fantastic week and Royal Ascot 2024 really has delivered on all levels. From the moment Their Majesties The King and Queen led the Royal Procession on Tuesday, we have been treated to some brilliant moments and wonderful memories, helped of course by glorious weather.

"The racing has been world-class throughout. It was brilliant to see Asfoora win for Australia on Tuesday and then Calandagan for France on Friday. We also welcomed runners from America, while the spread of success across participants has made for some rich and varied stories.

"The planning and preparation for Royal Ascot 2025 begins almost straightaway and we look forward to welcoming everybody back again next year."

BEDTIME STORY ELECTRIC IN THE CHESHAM

Turning the Listed Chesham Stakes into her own Royal Ascot procession on Saturday, Ballydoyle's **TDN Rising Star Bedtime Story (Ire)** (Frankel {GB}--Mecca's Angel {Ire}, by Dark Angel {Ire}) recorded the widest-margin win of the week by some way to enter the 2025 Classic conversation. Content to follow the leaders in the group racing up the centre, the 11-8 favourite who had won a Leopardstown maiden earlier this month was let loose by Ryan Moore two out and surged clear for an emphatic 9 1/2-length success. **Pentle Bay (Ire)** (New Bay {GB}) was next, with **Brian (Ire)** (Shaman {Ire}) half a length back in third. "She's a very good filly," Moore said. "She travelled very easily and they've gone too slow for her really. When I moved the race was over very quickly. She is a level above all of them. A performance like that, you don't see normally."

Bedtime Story's sensational performance was as impressive on the clock as it was to the eye as she surpassed the eight-length winning margin of Three Valleys (Diesis {GB}) in the 2003 G3 Coventry Stakes and the seven-length success of Lady Aurelia (Scat Daddy) in the 2016 G2 Queen Mary Stakes. Closing out with sectionals of 11.38 and 11.57, she hit 35.14 for the last three furlongs which readily eclipsed the 36.05 of the 4-year-old English Oak (GB) (Wootton Bassett {GB}) in Thursday's Buckingham Palace Stakes over the same trip.

Aidan O'Brien, who like Moore was welcoming his sixth winner of the meeting, said, "We never let Bedtime Story go before and this was the first time she was asked to stretch. Ryan said he couldn't believe it--he said everyone fell away, he said 'go on' and she just took off. He didn't even give her a slap down the shoulder.

"We thought she was probably a Group 1 filly, but we hadn't looked--thinking is one thing and seeing is another, so everyone saw it together today. It was the first time she was ever dropped down, really. She's got an unbelievable pedigree, she's a homebred. She's very special, isn't she?"

O'Brien is keen to keep Bedtime Story and Thursday's G3 Albany Stakes winner Fairy Godmother apart for now. "Bedtime Story will be staying at seven furlongs," he added. "It is unusual on fast ground to do that."

George Boughey said of Pentle Bay, who had been purchased for £400,000 by Teme Valley Racing and Ciaron Maher at the Goffs London Sale on Monday, "The winner looks a superstarshe's by a champion, out of a champion. I expected Pentle Bay to run as he did today. He has shown plenty at home and did the race the right way round, which was really key--it's really key for him to relax. He's a horse with a big future."

"Ciaron Maher and his team are going to have a really fun horse when he does get down to Australia," he added. "He's still very raw. I think a race that stands out immediately is probably the [G2] Vintage at Goodwood. Not many New Bays feature this early in the season. He's out of a Galileo mare and the pedigree would suggest that he's going to be a miler, possibly a 10-furlong horse."

ONE WORLD SETS NEW RECORD FOR SOUTH AFRICAN FIRST-CROP WINNERS



One World | Drakenstein Stud

Drakenstein Stud's **One World (SAf)** broke the South African record for individual winners by a first-crop stallion when third-time starter One Party (SAf) became the 8-year-old stallion's 23rd winner Saturday over 1450 metres at Turffontein. The previous record was set by One World's own sire Captain Al (SAf) during the 2004-2005 season.

Bred by Klawervlei Stud, One World was trained for a partnership by Vaughan Marshall and won 10 times from 14 trips to the races, including a pin-up performance in the Grade 1 Sun Met (2000m) in 2020, following which he was named South Africa's champion older horse. Prior to that victory, he was also second in the Grade 1 Queen's Plate over 1600 metres.

One World has been represented to date by 50 runners, including One Stripe (SAf), winner of three of his four starts to date, including the Grade 3 Winter Nursery Stakes and G3 Cape of Good Hope Nursery Stakes. Lion Rampant (SAf) is the other black-type winner, having annexed the Listed Somerset 1200 Stakes at Kenilworth, with One World's Miss World (SAf) third in the same event.

Purchased by Marshall for the equivalent of US\$32,000 at the 2015 Cape Premier Yearling Sale, One World is out of Aquilonia (Ire) (Giant's Causeway), a daughter of the multiple French group-placed Leonila (Ire) (Caerleon). The latter is a sister to 1991 G1 Prix de Diane heroine Caerlina (Ire).

One World stood the most recent breeding season at a fee of R60,000.

THIS WAS A BLAST': TAYLOR ON ROYAL ASCOT HIGH AFTER PORTA FORTUNA WIN

In 2023, when **Porta Fortuna** (Caravaggio) went to Ascot for a shot at the G3 Albany Stakes, which she would go on to win, the other partners in the ownership group tried to convince Mark Taylor to come along on the trip. Taylor Made's Medallion Racing had bought Porta Fortuna along with Barry Fowler, Steve Weston and Dean Reeves after her two-year-old debut win at the Curragh last April, and had already been rewarded with three graded stakes wins, including the G1 Juddmonte Cheveley Park Stakes, and a second in the G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf and the G1 Qipco 1000 Guineas.

The hard-working Taylor demurred, citing his busy schedule. This year, as she was pointing towards the Group 1 Coronation Stakes at Ascot, Taylor said he realized these experiences don't come along every day, and he decided to make time.

"I was always getting cajoled to come (to England)," he said, "going back to when we had consignments at Tattersalls a few years before Covid. A lot of people were telling me I had to come and it just never worked out for me."

JUDDMONTE'S BATTEN DOWN WIRES THE OHIO DERBY

You could say Batten Down has a little bit of family legacy to live up to. The son of champion Close Hatches took a step towards doing just that Saturday at Thistledown with a gate-to-wire win in the GIII Ohio Derby. "So this year, with Porta Fortuna running, I just thought, 'you know, you are busy, but this may never happen again to have a

horse with this kind of a chance to actually win a Group 1 at Ascot.' So I made it happen."

And how was it? Taylor was asked. "It was beyond my wildest expectations," he said.

Not only did the filly come away with her second Royal Ascot win, but Taylor will head home Sunday ready to apply lessons learned at Ascot to his sales consignments at Taylor Made.

Anyone who knows the Taylors knows their commitment to customer service, and of the many Ascot experiences he appreciated, it was their care for

their customers that resonated most strongly with him.

"However they have it done it, everybody who works there genuinely takes an interest in the customer experience," he said.

"Sometimes, the server at your table is really trying to do a great job and is really professional, but the people you meet on your way to the restroom when you're confused about where you're

going have no clue what they're talking about." That wasn't the case at Ascot, and Taylor said he will try to replicate that depth of helpfulness at Taylor Made.

"What I really took away from it for our organization is more training and spending more time getting each level (of employee) to really put themselves in the customer's shoes, and say, `how can I make this an incredible experience for them and let the person know I care. Even if I can't solve your problem, I'm doing everything I can.' It just really jumped out at me. A couple of times we were a little

confused about where to go and the people we ran into grabbed us like they were our personal ambassadors. They would say, `okay, I'm not 100% sure, but I'm going to figure this out for



you.' So even if we hadn't won the race, it would have been a great learning experience for me."

But of course...they also won the race.

The Medallion partnership gathers one group of around 25 investors every year, asking them to put up a minimum investment of \$50,000. Around a dozen Medallion partners were able to attend Ascot, along with Reeves and Weston. "It was a bucket-list experience for them," said Taylor. "It was young people. It's older people. It's a hodgepodge, but everyone was like-minded that they like to travel. They like to bet horses. They like to learn more about every aspect of racing. It's a great entrance to the sport or a next level from where they have been before. Winning at Ascot and then having the King present the trophy? That's delivering on the promise of the brand. We're going to try to take you to the highest levels of Thoroughbred racing, and there was never a day that put an exclamation point on it like Friday."

With only six people allowed up on the stand for the presentation with King Charles, Taylor "abdicated" his spot, he said, momentarily unaware of the pun. "I wanted to get every customer I could up there," he said. "The customer is king. That's another bad pun, but it's true. That's what we have build our whole brand on. That comes from my dad, and it comes from Duncan. It's all about putting the customer first."

Taylor is conducting his interview by phone as he stands on the streets of London's West End after taking in a production of Mamma Mia. "I'm so backwards and unexposed to anything Broadway," he said. "Every time I go to New York, I'm always at the races or at a track. So my wife kind of dragged me here, but it was really fun. It was great. We don't get away that much, especially with my schedule, and anything we're doing is usually revolving around racing, which this was, too, but we actually got a day to just check out and do whatever we wanted to do. So it was nice."

Porta Fortuna will head back to trainer Donnacha O'Brien's home base to regroup for this year's ultimate goal in the Breeders' Cup, and the team will "work backwards" from there on the rest of her schedule, Taylor said.

As for Taylor, he'll fly home Sunday to return, he says, to his day job. And next time, his partners might not have to try so hard to persuade him to travel.

"This," he said, "was a blast."




Already clear as the scratched-down field went under the wire the first time by, the Bill Mott trainee raced well in-hand and just off the rail with Gould's Gold and the pair of Charleston (Tapiture) and Catching Freedom) all in chase mode. Taking the shortest way around, Batten Down was allowed to run completely alone up front and cruised through opening fractions of :22.86 and :46.82. It was only into the far turn that the field began to make some headway, reeling the leader back to a more manageable gap with both Catching Freedom and Gould's Gold poised to strike past the quarter pole. And with a furlong to run, it seemed to be anyone's race with the leader tiring on his wrong lead against the rail and the closers coming on. But Batten Down would not be denied and, as his rivals faltered in their final efforts, he stayed away to earn the win.

Pedigree Note:

The 104th graded/group winner for Tapit, Batten Down is one of nine foals born from champion older mare Close Hatches (First Defence). Of four to the track, all four have won topped by his aforementioned full-siblings: MGSW/MGISP Tacitus and GSW Scylla. Close Hatches herself is a full-sister to SW/MGISP Lockdown who will be recognized by readers as the dam of another champion in last year's Eclipse-winning older dirt female Idiomatic (Curlin). First Defence earns another feather in his cap in this family with G1 Tattersalls Irish Two Thousdans Guineas winner Siskin coming under the third dam. Juddmonte bought into this family all the way back with Batten Down's fourth dam Silver Star (GB) (Zafonic) who brought a final bid of just 38,000gns from the 2011 Tattersalls December Mare Sale. Close Hatches has an unraced 2-year-old filly by Constitution named Resurge and a yearling Uncle Mo filly. She foaled a filly by Gun Runner this year.

VAHVA TOO TOUGH IN CHICAGO

Ultimately it was Vahva for trainer Cherie DeVaux who wore down her rival late in the stretch to post her second-straight win.

Defeated by just a half-length in her seasonal debut by Alva Starr (Lord Nelson) in the GI Madison Stakes at Keeneland April 6, Vahva turned the tables on that runner in a decisive

two-length win under the TwinSpires in the aforementioned Derby City Distaff. But Saturday's 2-5 favorite would need to contend with the inside speed of Society and the pair broke in stride before Vahva just took back and let the 2-1 shot go on with the lead as they left the chute and linked up with the main track. With both runners racing several paths off the fence, there was plenty of room inside for longshot Royal Spa (Violence) to come through and she joined Vahva for second as the quarter went in :22.44. With Society clear up front into the far turn, it was the embattled duo in a joint second who needed to work to keep up and once jockey Irad Ortiz, Jr. gave the favorite her head, she began to eat into the lead. Society was going strongly under Tyler Gaffalione past the half in :44.61 but was challenged at the furlong marker by Vahva who seemed to lug in several times as the pair exchanged bumps for several strides. As the pair hit the sixteenth pole, it was Society who ultimately blinked first and began to drop back even as 17-1 longshot Positano Sunset drove home from the back to steal second. No claim of foul from either jockey was posted nor did the stewards hang the inquiry sign as Vahva returned victorious to the winner's circle.

"She loves this long stretch here at Churchill Downs and is 4-for-4 over the surface," said DeVaux. "We knew how talented she was but when you have a nice horse like Society being the lone speed, it does make you a little nervous. Irad gave her a great trip and she was very impressive running her down. We mapped out her campaign with three targets. She passed the first one with the [GI] Derby City Distaff. Then the [Aug. 24] GI Ballerina Stakes at Saratoga and eventually the [Nov. 2] GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint at Del Mar. We'll play things by ear on what races we use to get to these targets but this was an important one for us today in helping us continue our path to the Breeders' Cup."

The dam is a half-sister to MSW/GSP Marquee Prince (Cairo Prince) and to the dams of SP Miss Justify (Justify) and SP Boreas (Upstart). This is the family of MSW/GSP Fuerteventura (Summer Front). Champion 2-year-old colt and 'TDN Rising Star' Fierceness (City of Light) worked a half-mile in :51 flat Friday for trainer Todd Pletcher over the Oklahoma training track at Saratoga in preparation for a start in the GI NYRA Bets Haskell Stakes July 20 at Monmouth Park.

Joining the GI Curlin Florida Derby winner on the work tab Friday was Repole Stable and St. Elias Stables recent GII Suburban Stakes winner **Crupi** (Curlin), who covered a half-mile in :52.85 in company with **Talk of the Nation** (Quality Road).

"Both works were probably better than the times suggest - finished up well and galloped out strongly," said Pletcher.

He added that both Fierceness and fellow 'Rising Star' GI Belmont Stakes runner-up **Mindframe** (Constitution) are likely to start in the Haskell.

"I'll talk to Mike [Repole] but right now we're pointing Fierceness and Mindframe towards the Haskell."

Pletcher said Mindframe has exited the Belmont Stakes in good order.

"He's been galloping well this week. He looks good and his overall condition is excellent coming out of the race. We'll look for a breeze next weekend."

Pletcher won Monmouth's local prep for the Haskell last weekend with Spendthrift Farm's **Tuscan Sky** (Vino Rosso), who captured the Pegasus Stakes by 6 3/4 lengths over **Domestic Product** (Practical Joke). The top two Pegasus finishers received free entry and start fees for the Haskell.

Pletcher noted that Centennial Farms' **Antiquarian** (Preservationist), who ran fifth in the Belmont Stakes, is enjoying a freshening, and further said that he will re-group with Repole Stable's Belmont Stakes sixth-place finisher **Protective** (Medaglia d'Oro) and target a maiden event at the Spa.

Pletcher indicated that Crupi is pointing to the GII Brooklyn Invitational July 5, which could serve as a bridge to the "Win And You're In" GI Whitney Stakes August 3 at Saratoga.

Stretching out to 1 1/8 miles for trainer Chad Brown versus four overmatched rivals in a first-level allowance in South Ozone Park, the 1-5 favorite tracked the early leader from second through an opening quarter in :23.72 and a half mile in :47.10. The dark bay turned up the heat on the far turn, kicked for home as the one to catch and opened daylight in the stretch to win going away by 5 3/4 lengths. Grandpa's Kid (Lemon Drop Kid) was second.

Unmatched Wisdom, a \$25,000 KEESEP yearling turned \$450,000 OBS March breezer (:10), becomes the fourth 'Rising **Star'** for Cairo Prince. The winner's unraced dam produced a filly by Classic Empire in 2023. This is the extended female family of GISWs Bandini (Fusaichi Pegasus), Out For a Spin (Hard Spun), Lord North (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), et al. Unmatched Wisdom is bred similarly as Cairo Prince GSWs Cairo Cat, Kiss Today Goodbye and New and Improved.

A running-on fourth in a second-level allowance over five furlongs May 18, Dancing Duchess appreciated the extra threesixteenths of a mile in Saturday's Alywow Stakes and raced away to her second career black-type victory.

A firming favorite in the last couple of clicks, Beauty of the Sea survived an eventful trip en route to a second career stakes victory in Saturday's Goldwood S. at Monmouth Park.

Off at 9-10 after chasing Queen of the Mud from a pari-mutuel perspective for most of the betting, Beauty of the Sea--who made the Blue Sparkler Stakes over this course and distance her first black-type win last summer--was outsprinted early and settled in a share of third, but made sound contact with the inside rail for two or three strides hooking up with the course proper. Continuing on undaunted and tracking the pace from a length or two off it, the Florida-bred was ridden for luck into the lane, but when a gap between horses failed to materialize, Paco Lopez shifted Beauty Of The Sea down towards the inside, found the daylight she needed at the chute and edged away to score a touch cozily in the finish. Queen of the Mud was an alibi-free second.

"My filly was traveling nicely the whole way," said Lopez. "I had to wait for room turning for home and when the rail opened she shot right through and finished up strongly."

Unplaced in turf sprints at Saratoga and Aqueduct following the Blue Sparkler, Beauty of the Sea was highly impressive in winning an Apr. 28 overnight handicap at Gulfstream. When a similar spot in Florida failed to fill a few weeks later, she was rerouted for a stakes-quality Churchill allowance June 7 and she set a good pace before being chinned on the wire by Grade II winner Tony Ann (Cairo Prince).

One of three stakes winners for her now New York-based sire, Beauty of the Sea is bred on the same cross over Gone West-line mares as this owner's 3-year-old colt Mattingly. From the family of GISW Any Given Saturday, GSW Second of June and GSW Bohemian Lady, Beauty of the Sea has a 3-year-old half-brother named Little Starships (Gone Astray). Who Da Boss, sent off at 20-1 in a seven-horse field and making his first start around two turns on dirt, produced a sustained rally from last to mow down two-thirds of the heavily favored Tim Hamm-trained entry in the stretch.

Despite being carried out to the seven path by the wayward runner-up, Who Da Boss registered a 3/4-length win under a jubilant Barbaran.

Who Da Boss, who finished fourth on the Belterra Park turf in the 1 1/16-mile Green Carpet S. June 7, made amends Saturday after chasing home the winner Spellcast and third-place finisher Shadowy on that occasion. The \$45,000 in earnings garnered by Who Da Boss put his trainer Robert Gorham back atop the Thistledown standings exactly two months into their current meet.

As a 3-year-old, Who Da Boss's dam, Come Sunday, won the 2010 Femme Fatale S. at Penn National. She is also the dam of Someday Soon, a winner of Ohio-bred stakes races as both a 2year-old and a 3-year old and a third-place finisher in the 2017


