### GRAND PRIX DE PARIS NUMBER 14 FOR FABRE AS SOSIE STRIKES



Sosie | Scoop Dyga

Winning ParisLongchamp's G1 Grand Prix de Paris for the 14th time, Andre Fabre was also ending a drought of 10 years since the last as the Wertheimers' **Sosie (Ire)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}--Sosia {Ger}, by Shamardal) prevailed at ParisLongchamp on Saturday evening. Third in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club last time, the homebred became the latest to emerge to bestow extra gravity on that Chantilly Classic as he swept by his contemporaries up this hallowed straight.

Ideally placed in fourth early by Maxime Guyon, the 5-2 second favourite took over 1 1/2 furlongs from home and stayed on powerfully to emerge the two-length winner. Ballydoyle's G2 Queen's Vase scorer Illinois (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was second, a neck in front of Coolmore's previously-unbeaten favourite Delius (GB) (Frankel {GB}).

Sosie, who beat the operation's subsequent G3 Prix la Force winner Atlast (Fr) (Farhh {GB}) on debut at Chantilly in September before running second in the Listed Prix Isonomy back there the following month, had his Jockey Club prep in this track's Prix de Ferrieres conditions event in April where he beat the useful Rouget colt Arrow Eagle (Fr) (Gleneagles {Ire}). # 'HE SHOWED HIS TRUE GRIT': BUICK HAILS JULY CUP WINNER MILL STREAM

Peter Harris's **Mill Stream (Ire)** (Gleneagles {Ire}--Swirral Edge {GB}, by Hellvelyn {GB}) had been coming of age so far this season and his big moment duly came in Saturday's G1 My Pension Expert July Cup at Newmarket. Successful in the G2 1895 Duke of York Clipper Stakes and third in Royal Ascot's G1 Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes on his last two starts, the 11-1 shot was held up early by William Buick with the pace strong up front. Staying on powerfully down the wing to wear down the QEII Jubilee runner-up **Swingalong (Ire)** (Showcasing {GB}) inside the final 50 yards, the Jane Chapple-Hyam-trained 4-year-old was driven out to assert for a neck success, with **Vandeek (GB)** (Havana Grey {GB}) 1 3/4 lengths away in third. The 11-8 favourite **Inisherin (GB)** (Shamardal) was fifth after finding this test too sharp.

"We were doing cartwheels when it rained, as it just took the sting out of the ground midweek," Chapple-Hyam said. "I think that is all he needs. You knew there was going to be a lot of speed and when they were doing 10 and change at halfway and he was sat in behind, I just knew he'd pick up and I'm thrilled."



Without clear racing space in the straight when push came to shove in the Classic itself, the homebred stayed on behind Look De Vega (Fr) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) looking for all the world as if

this mile-and-a-half trip was going to be his forte.

The Eclipse third of
Ghostwriter (Ire) (Invincible
Spirit {Ire}) and Irish Derby
second of Sunway (Fr) (Galiway
{GB}) had franked that form and
this was further proof that the
latest renewal was up to scratch.
"Beforehand, you could think
that this horse would do well
over a mile and a half, he is an
uncomplicated horse, sound and
easy to train," Fabre said. "Is he
good enough for a race like the
Arc? We don't know, but we will
prepare him for the race. He is

lightly-raced, has improved with every run and there could be more to come."

The owner-breeders' racing manager Pierre Yves Bureau added, "He looked great before the race and has run the race we hoped for after his good performance in the Jockey Club. We will think about the Arc in time, but it is a nice problem to have."

Hermine Bastide, representing Coolmore, said of the runner-up and third, "Illinois has run a great race again. You have to be very happy with the performance. Delius has lost nothing in defeat--he is a very nice horse and really caught the eye with his run in the straight."

She added, "Peter [Harris] has a good team in the yard, he supports them and he supports me, so to go and win a group 1 for him, that's what he wants and what the yard needs, so it's good."

Mill Stream's first visit to this track came as a 2-year-old when second to Godolphin's smart Noble Style (GB) (Kingman {GB}) in a novice. Cont. p5

His second resulted in a nose defeat by Quinault (Ger) (Oasis Dream {GB}) trying to give that prolific winner a stone in a heritage handicap at this meeting last year. Going on from there to take Deauville's Listed Prix Moonlight Cloud and G3 Prix de Meautry in August, he was given wind surgery after failing to fire in the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup and G1 British Champions Sprint Stakes and returned with a second in the Rowley Mile venue's G3 Abernant Stakes prior to heading to York and Royal Ascot.

William Buick, who was riding his 100th Group 1 winner, was happy to wait while River Tiber (Ire) (Wootton Bassett {GB}) and Inisherin raced in the heat of the front line and that proved the right tactic with the pace a demanding one. As the forwardlyridden 3-year-olds wilted, it was Swingalong who stayed strong in the teeth of the gallop with the more conservatively-placed Vandeek briefly threatening but Mill Stream had built serious

momentum coming down

and up out of the dip with his reserve of energy.

"Jane and the team were adamant that he was in better shape

"Jane and the team were adamant that he was in better shape for this race than for Ascot--I know the 3-year-olds looked a strong bunch of horses today, but he's a hard-knocking sprinter and when I needed him he was there and showed his true grit," Buick said. "It went perfectly, as he's a horse who prefers not to have any pressure put on him and to build up in his own time and we were able to do that with the race unfolding in front of us. It's probably an open year for the sprinters where the small

margins make a difference and the one thing that you get with Mill Stream is he's straightforward and tries very hard."

Chapple-Hyam is intent on heading back to Deauville now. "He likes three weeks between races if you look back, so we'll go to Deauville next for the Prix Maurice de Gheest," she said. "He'll love the six and a half furlongs there--as a young horse, he got six there very well so six-and-a-half, bring it on!"

Swingalong was narrowly denied for the second time in succession in a major sprint and trainer Karl Burke was hoping it

will be a case of third time lucky at Haydock in September. "I am gutted that we got beat, but she is such a game filly and wears her heart on her sleeve and everyone knows how she is going to run," he said. "I think there are two things--there was the extra rain which suited the winner and the fact that Art Power took us on, but they are things you can't control and she has run a fantastic race. She will go to Haydock now for the Betfair Sprint Cup and we'll pray it doesn't rain, as that

could be a brilliant race for her."

Of Vandeek, Simon Crisford said, "He has run a really good race. He was just lacking match practice and in effect that was like his first run of the season, which has caught him out. Missing Ascot was a huge problem for us as he has come here today in a championship race without any warm-up. He has acquitted himself with great credit and we'll get busy for the rest of the season now. We will talk to Sheikh Khaled and think about the Prix Maurice de Gheest in a couple of weeks." ### 'I'D HAVE BEEN DISAPPOINTED IF HE'D GOT BEATEN TODAY': TDN RISING STAR ANCIENT TRUTH WINS THE SUPERLATIVE by Tom Frary

It was a case of business as usual at Newmarket on Saturday with Charlie Appleby saddling his fifth G2 Superlative Stakes winner in **TDN Rising Star Ancient Truth (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}--Beyond Reason {Ire}, by Australia {GB}). Having won on debut over six furlongs on the Rowley Mile in May and over this sevenfurlong trip and course last month, the 4-6 favourite faced a depleted field with three non-runners and had to wait behind rivals early as William Buick anchored him under cover.

Picking up impressively to take control approaching the furlong pole, the homebred readily asserted to score by 1 1/2 lengths from Seagulls Eleven (Ire) (Galileo Gold {GB}), with two lengths back to Wimbledon Hawkeye (GB) (Kameko) in third.

"It's what we were hoping to see, but it wasn't very easy for him--he had to come back and around them and then quicken up and he had a look in front," Buick explained. "Hopefully he'll follow in some of the others' footsteps, as this race has served Charlie so well."

Perhaps it is because Dubawi won this in 2004, but also maybe because it is the biggest 2-year-old event of the summer in his local town that Appleby prioritises the Superlative with his Classic hopefuls. Dubawi's sons Quorto (Ire) and Master Of The Seas (Ire) are two of his winners, with the former going on to capture the G1 Vincent O'Brien National Stakes. Cont. p7

That feat was emulated by Native Trail (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) three years ago and so it is no surprise that the trainer is looking at another trip to The Curragh.

"I'm delighted, he's still learning and learning plenty," he said. "I couldn't see any pace in the race, so I did say to William we might have to make our own running and see where we are but he made the right decision in trying to get some cover. There was a bit of pace but when that collapsed, he almost had to take him back to come round so full credit to the horse."

"Shane Fetherstonhaugh rides him and he's ridden enough good horses of ours for me to trust him," Appleby added. "Coming into the first run, he said he wasn't quite happy but he ran and won. Going into the second, he still wasn't quite happy and he went and won, but this morning he said he was delighted, so I said I was a bit nervous!

"He's a horse I feel a mile will be his maximum and we will definitely work back from the Guineas. We'll let the horse settle down and make a decision as a collective, but our previous winners of this have tended to go on to the National Stakes in Ireland and that has worked quite well. He's happier with a bit of cut in the ground, he hung a little bit on quick ground on his first two starts. He looked happier today. He's always been up there in our pecking order and I'd have been disappointed if he'd got beaten today."

### SURVIE WINS THE MALLERET

Sent off the 11-10 favourite for Saturday's G2 Prix de Malleret at ParisLongchamp, Gerard Augustin-Normand's G1 Prix de Diane runner-up **Survie (Ire)** (Churchill {Ire}) justified that faith to record a notable black-type breakthrough win. Content to follow the pace early, the Nicolas Clement-trained homebred was asked to take control 300 metres from the finish as **Candala** (**Fr**) (Frankel {GB}) became ensnared in traffic to her right and needed no second invitation en route to a 1 1/4-length success from **Mosaique (Fr)** (Dubawi {Ire}). Candala, who met with abundant trouble in running, was a further 3/4 of a length away in third.

"She deserved that after her brilliant effort in the Prix de Diane," Clement said. "It's a great job from the team and I am happy for the owner and his manager. It was a tactical race, but Stephane was in the right place and this filly knows how to quicken. She is in the Arc, she will have a break and could possibly run in the Prix Vermeille first." # SUMMER MILE WIN FOR KINGMAN'S QUDDWAH by Tom Frary

Maintaining his unbeaten record in straightforward fashion, Sheikh Ahmed Al Maktoum's **Quddwah (GB)** (Kingman {GB}--Sajjhaa {GB}, by King's Best) registered a career-best on Saturday in Ascot's G2 Anne Cowley Memorial Summer Mile. Held back from the Royal meeting with an abnormal blood count having won the Listed Paradise Stakes in May, the Simon and Ed Crisford-trained homebred travelled sweetly tracking the leaders on this return. Committed by Callum Shepherd passing two out, the 5-4 favourite had a comfortable half-length margin to spare over **Ancient Rome** (War Front) at the line.

Where Quddwah's limit is remains hard to quantify, with two novice wins at Salisbury and Newmarket behind him last spring alongside his two black-type successes this term. As a son of the G1 Dubai Duty Free, G1 Jebel Hatta, G2 Balanchine and G2 Cape Verdi winner Sajjhaa with considerable size and scope, he could yet make into a genuine Group 1 horse and connections are understandably keen to try him at that level.

"He never does much in front and is still a bit immature, but he's learning to race now and he's got tons of ability," Ed Crisford said. "He travels extremely well and put the race to bed pretty quickly really and was always doing enough in front, even though he idles a bit. I think there's plenty more to come; he's unbeaten, he's only had four runs in his life and I think a stronger pace will suit him. We'll have to see what Sheikh Ahmed wants, but he's in the Prix Jacques le Marois as well as the Sussex and that is an option."

Callum Shepherd added, "He's got that stargazing sort of head carriage, but I never felt vulnerable up to the line, which is a good feeling as a rider. I feel if he'd been given a real challenge late on, he'd have responded to it, but he did everything right. He was probably handier than he's been in some races in the past, but he makes it very simple for his rider and he's a top-notch horse."

### **Pedigree Notes**

Quddwah is currently the last known foal out of the aforementioned Sajjhaa, a granddaughter of the owner's G3 Lancashire Oaks scorer and G1 Oaks runner-up Noushkey (GB) (Polish Precedent). The family includes the G1 Prix Jean Prat and G1 Japan Cup hero Alkaased (Kingmambo).

### DOUBLE MAJOR RULES IN THE MAURICE DE

### **NIEUIL** by Tom Frary

Back to winning ways in ParisLongchamp's G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil on Saturday, the Wertheimers' **Double Major (Ire)** (Daiwa Major {Jpn}) led at every step to add to his G1 Prix Royal-Oak success of last year. Always in control under Maxime Guyon, the 14-5 second favourite had plenty in the locker as **Shembala (Ire)** (Cracksman {GB}) battled to shed her bridesmaid status and wrapped up a length success.

"He had a long break this winter, maybe too long and the races

came quickly and it took him time to reach his best," trainer Christophe Ferland said, referring to the winner's efforts when third in the G3 Prix de Barbeville and G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier here in April and May. "He ran well in the spring, but we knew he could do better. The rain that fell during the fourth race certainly helped and when he can dictate in front and lengthen he is hard to beat. Goodwood could be next, we will see, if not the Prix du Cadran in the autumn will be the major target."

Double Major, who also captured the G2 Prix Chaudenay here in September, is one of two pattern-race winners out of Dancequest (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) alongside the G3 Prix de Guiche scorer Flop Shot (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}). She is in turn the dam of the G1 Prix Vermeille winner Left Hand (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), while Plumania's four black-type performers are headed by the G2 Prix du Muguet scorer Plumatic (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}). Dancequest's unraced 3-year-old filly by Lope De Vega (Ire) is named Tyra (GB), while she has a 2-year-old filly by Dubawi (Ire) named Rooba (Ire), a yearling colt again by Lope De Vega named Vegetarian (Ire) and a colt foal by Saxon Warrior (Jpn).

# NIGHT OF THUNDER'S DESERT FLOWER SECURES TDN RISING STAR TAG AT

### **NEWMARKET** by Sean Cronin

Newmarket's G1 July Cup card began in style when Godolphin's hitherto unraced **Desert Flower (Ire)** (Night Of Thunder {Ire}--Promising Run, by Hard Spun) powered away from nine rivals to earn a '**TDN Rising Star**' rosette in Saturday's £21,000 Rossdales British EBF Maiden Fillies' Stakes over seven furlongs.

The homebred daughter of four-time Group 2 victrix Promising Run (Hard Spun) was a touch hesitant at the break and chased the leaders in fourth through the initial fractions. Nudged along soon after passing halfway, the 5-2 second favourite bounded to the fore approaching the final furlong and lengthened clear on the climb to easily account for long-time pacesetter Flight (GB) (Siyouni {Fr}) by an impressive 3 1/4 lengths. Desert Flower becomes the third Rising Star by Night Of Thunder and a fifth winner in the last eight renewals of this contest for trainer Charlie Appleby.

"They've done a great job with her at home because we couldn't get her in the stalls a couple of weeks ago and, when she did eventually go in, she didn't want to come out," commented Appleby. "She's a filly that has obviously got natural ability, but is still very raw. William [Buick] said he was surprised she was able to win today. He sat on her the other day and said he liked her and she was ready to run, but he was surprised how she came into the race. I don't want to say anything too bold, but she'll appreciate stepping up to a mile. She appreciated the conditions and we might work back from something like the [G2] May Hill [at Doncaster], but there's water to go under the bridge before then. It was a nice performance and there will be marked improvement because she's been so raw at home. It was nice to see her pick up when she met the rising ground and go away. There's a lot of potential there." Cont. p11

### **VETERAN REINSMAN GERALD MOSSE RETIRES TO BECOME A TRAINER**

Jockey Gerald Mosse, who has ridden for 41 years, has called time on his career after his weekend rides, he announced on Saturday. He will begin his next career, as a public trainer based at Chantilly, on Sept. 1.

A winner of more than 90 Group 1 races worldwide, including all of the French and Hong Kong Classics, the Marseille native has found success in Hong Kong, Bahrain, Dubai, and Singapore, as well as England and Italy. Early in his career, he rode for Jean-Luc Lagardere and His Highness The Aga Khan, for whom he was retained jockey in the 1990s.

In 1990, he was aboard Saumarez (GB) (Rainbow Quest) when he won the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Other big names the jockey was associated with include Nuclear Debate (Geiger Counter) who won the G1 Nunthorpe Stakes (2000), the G2 King's Stand Stakes (2000), and the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup (2001); Americain (Dynaformer), the 2010 G1 Melbourne Cup winner; and Gold Splash (Blushing Groom {Fr}) and Immortal Verse (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}), who both won the G1 Coronation

Stakes in 1993 and 2011, respectively.

Announcing his retirement on Saturday, he said, "My family, and in particular my father Armand, gave me a real leg up when I was very young. Thanks to them, I took the road to success. In the course of my long career, I have had the privilege of becoming an international jockey, wearing countless silks and riding champions on the world's finest racecourses.

"Above all, I have been lucky enough to meet and rub shoulders with some wonderful people, without whom I wouldn't have been able to fulfil my childhood dreams. I would like to extend my warmest thanks to my racing family: owners, trainers, breeders, agents, managers, riders, stable lads, travelling lads, starters, valets, transporters, stewards, racecourse staff, racegoers and so on. I owe them everything. I would also like to thank my former jockey colleagues who have shown me a great deal of respect."

Mosse obtained his trainer's licence in 2022, and then purchased and renovated the Manoir des Sangliers, located in Gouvieux. The 40-box yard has direct access to Les Aigles course in Chantilly.

"At Chantilly, we work in a very special environment offering extraordinary conditions," he added. "I think it is the best place on the planet to train.

"I'm now approaching the second act of my career with enthusiasm and determination. I can't wait to welcome my first owners and their horses at the Manoir des Sangliers."

Victorious Racing's Group 2 winner Isle Of Jura (GB) (New Approach (Ire)) has sustained a setback and will miss the rest of the year, trainer George Scott announced.

Currently sporting a five-race winning streak, including the Bahraini Triple Crown this winter and Goodwood's Listed Festival Stakes in May, the 4-year-old gelding won the G2 Hardwicke Stakes at Royal Ascot last out. He carried entries in both the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Stakes at Ascot later this month, and the G1 International Stakes at York on Aug. 21.

"Unfortunately, Isle of Jura has met with a setback and will miss the remainder of 2024," said Scott. "Naturally this is disappointing news for his owners Victorious Racing and everyone at Eve Lodge.

"However, we unite in the feeling of gratitude towards him. In little over a year, he's shown himself to be a winning machine including the Bahrain Triple Crown and of course the Hardwicke Stakes at Royal Ascot.

"There's every reason to believe he will make a full recovery and with low mileage his best days may yet be ahead of him."

After making his debut for breeder Godolphin in November of 2022, Isle Of Jura was gelded last January, and was picked up for  $\mathfrak{L}150,000$  out of the Tattersalls Ascot March Sale that March. He has made the remainder of his starts in Victorious Racing's red colours.

# KITASAN BLACK COLT REMAINS UNBEATEN IN HAKODATE NISAI by Heather Anderson

A winner over 1400 metres versus newcomers on June 22, **Satono Carnaval (Jpn)** (Kitasan Black {Jpn}) defended his perfect record with a 1 1/4-length win in the G3 Hakodate Nisai Stakes at Hakodate on Saturday.

Sporting lather along his neck in the preliminaries, the bay sat in fourth position early in this cut back in trip. The 12-5 favourite, who moved fluidly throughout, took dead aim on long-time leader **Nishino Lavanda (Jpn)** (Satono Aladdin {Jpn}) at the furlong pole and easily edged ahead of the filly by the line. **Endless Summer (Jpn)** (Al Ain {Jpn}) rallied to take third, a head back, while **Yankee Barows (Jpn)** (Epiphaneia {Jpn}) was fourth. The victory was the first group win for 20-year-old jockey Daisuke Sasaki.

### **Pedigree Notes**

The winner is the ninth stakes winner and sixth group winner for his Shadai Stallion Station-based sire. Colts by the sire topped both sessions of the recently concluded JRHA Select Sale earlier this week, with the top yearling making \$3.66 million on Day 1. During the second session, a colt foal out of German Oaks winner Serienholde (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}) was knocked down for \$2.59 million. Cont. p17

### SARATOGA NOTEBOOK: THE BEAT GOES ON FOR THORPEDO ANNA

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. – With apologizes to the rest of the horse population spending the summer at Saratoga Race Course, the most popular Thoroughbred on the grounds is the dominating 3-year-old filly **Thorpedo Anna** (Fast Anna).

Winner of all three of her starts this season--by a combined 13 1/4 lengths--Thorpedo Anna took her next step towards the July 20 GI Coaching Club American Oaks at Saratoga early Saturday morning.

With regular rider Brian Hernandez, Jr. on board, Thorpedo Anna worked five furlongs in 1:01.55 (5/20) on the Oklahoma Training Track. She hit the track at 5:30 a.m. along with stablemate **Gould's Gold** (Goldencents), a 3-year-old colt who is being pointed to the GII Jim Dandy at Saratoga on July 27.

"She is a total pro," trainer Kenny McPeek said right after the work. "I wanted her to go eyeball-to-eyeball with another horse. And (Gould's Gold) is a good horse. She needed someone to keep her interested."

Normally, Thorpedo Anna works by herself. When asked when the last time Thorpedo Anna worked in company, he laughed. "In the (GI) Acorn," he said, referring to her last start, a 5 1/2-length romp at Saratoga on June 7. **Cont. p3** 

# WHITEBEAM REPEATS IN DIANA, BROWN WINS 150TH GRADE I

In the first Grade I of the 2024 Saratoga meet, Juddmonte homebred **Whitebeam (GB)** (Caravaggio) repeated in the Diana Stakes, giving trainer Chad Brown a record ninth win in the race and eighth in the last nine years. It also marked his 150th career Grade I win. Canada's 2022 Horse of the Year and Queen's Plate winner **Moira** (Ghostzapper) was second, while MGISW **Gina Romantica** (Into Mischief) finished third.

In a textbook front-running ride from Flavien Prat, Whitebeam lulled them to sleep on the front end, cruising effortlessly to the front while under a snug hold through :24.26 and :49.49 fractions. The field of nine others, including four Brown stablemates, spread out neatly behind her with a mere 10 lengths or so covering the field. The tempo quickened as they turned for home, but Whitebeam had plenty left and held her ground as a tracking **Ewie Jets** (Twirling Candy) and **Didia (Arg)** (Orpen) gave way to Moira and Gina Romantica. **Cont. p5**

This was the fourth work since the Acorn for Thorpedo Anna, who has also won the GI Kentucky Oaks at Churchill Downs and the GII Fantasy Stakes at Oaklawn Park this year.

"She just cruised around there and galloped out well," Hernandez said back at the barn. "We went off in :13 and change and going into the turn, she switched leads and I let her pick it up and, from there, she was in hand the whole way. She is one of those rare fillies that is just so naturally fast that she wants to get pretty quick."

McPeek has not ruled out a run against colts in the GI Travers Stakes on Aug. 24. First though, he wants to see how she does in the Coaching Club American Oaks.

### Pletcher's Haskell Trio Put In Final Works At Spa

Right now, the plan is to run three horses in the GI Haskell Stakes at Monmouth Park on July 20. Hall of Fame trainer Todd Pletcher said he will make a final decision early next week on whether or not all of them--Fierceness (City of Light), Mindframe (Constitution) and Tuscan Sky (Vino Rosso)--make

the trip south to the Jersey Shore.

Saturday, the trio made their Haskell cases to the boss as they had their final works before the \$1-million race on the main track at Saratoga.

Fierceness, the GI Florida Derby winner and a failure as the favorite in the GI Kentucky Derby (15th place), worked five furlongs under exercise rider Danny Wright and was timed in 1:00.47 (2/19) while working in company with 5-year-old multiple graded stakes winner Emmanuel (More Than Ready).

"I thought Fierceness was really impressive, like he can be when he is in good form," Pletcher said outside his barn at the Oklahoma Training Track. "Not so much the time, but how effortlessly he was going around there. He looked fantastic." Fierceness and Emmanuel came on the track after the 6:30 a.m. renovation break

Mindframe and exercise rider Carlos Quevedo worked a half-mile in company with 5-year-old mare Surprisingly (Mastery) after the 8:30 a.m. renovation break. They were timed in :49.49 seconds (49/100).

Tuscan Sky, who won last start, Monmouth's Pegasus Stakes on June 15--which brings an automatic bid to the Haskell-worked four furlongs in :49.85 (69/100) right after the Fierceness move.

Hall of Fame jockey Javier Castellano was aboard for the move, which came in company with 3-year-old maiden Artempus (Real Solution).

"I was looking for more maintenance works for them," Pletcher said of Mindframe and Tuscan Sky. "They have run more recently. Tuscan Sky is, historically, not a real ambitious work horse. I thought he did everything well in hand. Javier was on cruise control throughout. Mindframe looked like he was just galloping. He could not have done it any easier."

Besides figuring out who will be heading to Jersey, Pletcher has to decide when his horses will ship to Monmouth.

"They lifted the requirement of having to be there three days in advance," he said. "I probably don't want to chance (going on race day) that. We do it for other races all the time, but I don't know if I want to do it for that one." *Cont.*


With jockey Luis Saez on board, Dornoch worked four furlongs in :47.88 (12/100) on the main track while working in company



"Very proud of her effort today," said Prat. "Everything went well the first part of the race and when I squeezed her, she was there for me. Nothing more you can ask for. She is one of the best mares in the country and it was great."

First trained across the Atlantic by Harry and Roger Charlton, Whitebeam was second in a listed stakes at three before shipping stateside to Brown's barn for her 4-year-old campaign. Winless since last year's Diana, which had followed a GIII Gallorette Stakes victory, Whitebeam was kept in training this year and was first seen in May with a second to re-opposing Neecie Marie (Cross Traffic) in the GIII Beaugay Stakes and then another runner-up finish, this one to stablemate Chili Flag (Fr) (Cityscape {GB}), in the GI Just A Game Stakes June 7. Every single U.S. start for Whitebeam has netted a Beyer Speed Figure in the 90s or higher, including a triple-digit number in last year's Diana.

"It means a lot to me. It means a lot to my team," said Brown about winning the Diana for a record ninth time. "There's a very short list of races when I left [as assistant to Bobby] Frankel that it was just instilled in me that he held in high regard and pointed towards. The Diana was way up on that list. For him to hold it in high regard, it really must have meant something." Cont.

Brown continued: "So, I thought if I ever had good enough horses, this is a race I really need to focus on because he's not wrong much. I'm very fortunate to have horses good enough to run in this race, really."

Caravaggio had one heck of a weekend. Porta Fortuna (Ire) won the GI Falmouth Stakes at Newmarket Friday and Whitebeam won the Diana on Saturday. The pair are among 11 graded winners from 17 black-type winners for the son of Scat Daddy, who was the leading European first-crop sire of 2021 and initially stood at Coolmore in Ireland before a brief stint in Kentucky. He has since been acquired by the Japanese Bloodstock Breeders Association (JBBA) and has stood at Shizunai Stallion Station since the 2023 season.

Whitebeam is a sixth-generation homebred for Juddmonte from the spectacular Best in Show family. The Diana winner descends from Monroe's branch of the 1982 Broodmare of the Year. Whitebeam's winning dam, Sleep Walk, has an unraced 2-year-old colt named Nightwalker (GB) by Juddmonte's Frankel (GB) and a yearling colt by No Nay Never.

## WITH MENTEE OUT, MO PLEX ROLLS IN SANFORD

When GIII Sanford Stakes morning-line choice **Mentee** (City of Light) was scratched Saturday morning, it might have been assumed the race had lost some of its luster, but apparently no one told **Mo Plex** (Complexity), who was featured in *TDN*'s Saratoga Notebook Friday. The New York-bred Jeremiah Englehart trainee went gate to wire to stay undefeated and give his freshman sire (by Maclean's Music) his first graded win. **Studlydoright** (Nyquist) and **Three Echos** (Echo Town) each suffered bumps at the break, but kicked on well for second- and third-place honors, respectively.

"I was 0-for-70 in my first 70 starts at Saratoga," said Englehart, "so I was humbled very quick, and I learned winning any race at Saratoga is amazing. I set up shop here year-round from April to November with the young horses, and when you can showcase them here and they've done what he's done, it's special."


Sent hard from his outside post position and hustled straight to the front, Mo Plex cleared the field and relaxed despite swift :22.51 and :45.92 first quarters. Winning rider Irad Ortiz, Jr. keep busy on him in the stretch and the colt dug in to hold his advantage as Studlydoright revved up from the rear with a late charge to his outside.

"We broke on top, he broke sharp today, a lot more sharp than last time," said Ortiz. "I tried to keep him together, he was looking around a little bit and playing around, I think. He is a young horse, so I tried to keep him focused all the way to the wire.

"When we turned for home, I asked him, and he responded well. I had to keep him busy to keep his attention to get the job done. He is a really nice horse, he has talent." *Cont.*

JCE Racing and Legion Bloodstock purchased Mo Plex for \$45,000 at the OBS April Sale after the bay worked a quarter in :21 1/5. Englehart immediately brought him to Saratoga for R and H Stable--the nom de course of Howard Read and Rick Higgins--and put him to work over the Oklahoma track. Mo Plex has been on a steady worktab since May 2, debuting June 20 in a state-bred 5 1/2-furlong maiden special weight at Aqueduct. He won by 10 lengths that day and stayed undefeated with the Sanford victory.

### **Pedigree Notes:**

Mo Plex is the first black-type winner for Airdrie Stud's first-crop sire Complexity, who also had debut winner Tough Catch on Saratoga's Saturday card. Remarkably, 12 of Complexity's 16 juvenile starters are winners, with the winning French Horn also a stakes performer after a third-place finish in the June 6 Astoria Stakes. Complexity leads all freshman sires of 2024 by both winners and earnings.

The unraced Mo Joy, a granddaughter of 1997 GIII Florida Oaks winner and GI Ashland Stakes runner-up Anklet, has also produced a yearling colt by Maximus Mischief and a Mar. 13 colt by Improbable. Mo Joy is a daughter of Uncle Mo, whose 21 stakes winners as a broodmare sire include 2024 MGISW Thorpedo Anna (Fast Anna).

Saturday's GIII Kelso Stakes lost a fair bit of its intrigue when Godolphin's Mysterious Night (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) was declared from the race, and it was eFive Racing's 'TDN Rising Star' Carl Spackler who proved the chief beneficiary, defeating Talk of the Nation in what more or less amounted to an eightfurlong match race.

Call Me Harry (Street Sense), easily the longest shot in the field of four, led under the wire for the first time, but was content to let the second betting choice go on with it at the entrance to the backstretch run. Carl Spackler had proved in previous runs that he is adaptable to any race shape and lay third with six furlongs to run and was determined to not allow Talk of the Nation a lonely lead through the middle sections of the race.

Quietly ridden and kept right at the front-runner's hind quarters entering the second turn, Carl Spackler poured in the pressure in earnest approaching the stretch and the battle was joined. Shoulder to shoulder passing the eighth pole, the oddson pop had all the answers and inched clear for a third win at the graded level. Northern Invader rallied for third.

Off-the-pace winner of the GII Hall of Fame Stakes here last August, Carl Spackler raced handier to the speed in the GIII Saranac Stakes before rolling home at long odds-on. Sidelined thereafter, the homebred pegged back a game Talk of the Nation in a graded-stakes quality renewal of the Opening Verse Stakes at Churchill May 2, but he couldn't go with them late in n the GIII Poker Stakes June 8 and settled for a fifth-place effort.

"I didn't really react to the [Poker] result," said winning trainer Chad Brown. "I just got him back to his normal training routine and he redeemed himself today." *Cont.*

"Tyler [Gaffalione] rode a beautiful race. I know it's only a four-horse field, but it was a little tricky into that first turn to figure out where he's going to be. When [Call Me Harry] took back, he had to call an audible and it was a winning move, for sure."

### **Pedigree Notes:**

On behalf of Bob Edwards's operation, Mike Ryan acquired Zindaya for \$550,000 at the 2015 Keeneland November Sale and she was turned over to Chad Brown. A decision to keep the mare in training at five was rewarded when Zindaya won the Intercontinental Stakes and later the GII Goldikova Stakes at Santa Anita.

Edwards had Carl Spackler consigned through Ballylinch Stud to the 2021 Tattersalls October Sale, but elected to retain him when bidding stalled out at 350,000gns (\$499,172), a choice while looks very wise in retrospect. ### MENTEE SCRATCHED FROM SANFORD

**Mentee** (City of Light), the full-brother to champion Fierceness who was the 6-5 morning-line favorite for Saturday's GIII Sanford Stakes at Saratoga, has been scratched, owner Mike Repole posted on X early Saturday morning.

"[Trainer] Todd [Pletcher] will be scratching Mentee from the Sanford," Repole posted. "This morning at 4:15, Mentee's temperature was checked and unfortunately he has a fever of 102.2. This is very disappointing, but in this game it can always be a lot worse. I wish it would have been Todd or I with a 102.2 temperature instead of Mentee."

Mentee was part of an entry favored at 1-2 on debut at Aqueduct June 15 and cut out a sharp pace after breaking from a high draw, carried a formidable advantage into the final furlong and just held on, a fact attributed to his inexperience, according to Pletcher. The 88 Beyer Speed Figure earned for that effort was tops in the Sanford field.

"It wasn't the way we wanted to start our morning," Hall of Fame Pletcher said outside his barn at the Oklahoma Training Track Saturday morning. "Welcome to Saratoga and training babies."

Pletcher said one of the first warning signs given by Mentee was that he left some grain in his feed tub, something that is uncharacteristic of him. When the colt's temperature was taken, it came back 102.2 and Pletcher had no choice but to keep Mentee in the barn.

"It's frustrating," he said. "It's frustrating. You hate to miss an opportunity like this, but it could be worse, I suppose."

Pletcher said if Mentee is able to recover from this fever quickly, the next logical spot for him would be the \$200,000 GII Saratoga Special Stakes on Aug. 10 at the Spa. That is run at 61/2 furlongs.

With the scratch, Tremont Stakes winner **Studlydoright** (Nyquist) and **Three Echoes** (Echo Town), third in the Tremont, should vie for favoritism.

A two-time winner and Group 2 placed at two in England, the homebred filly wintered in Dubai, defeating a very good horse in the form of Ponntos (Ire) (Power {GB}) in the G2 Blue Point Sprint Jan. 26 before finishing second in the G3 Nad al Sheba Turf Sprint on Super Saturday and third to California Spangle (Ire) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint on the Dubai World Cup undercard Mar. 30. Less than 5-1 for the GI Jaipur Stakes over this course and trip June 8, the bay was third to the record-setting Cogburn (Not This Time) on that occasion and should take all the beating here after opting out of Friday's sex-restricted Coronation Cup Stakes.

Fandom (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) was a splashy debut winner over the Keeneland turf last April, but was only 11th in the G2 Coventry Stakes at Royal Ascot and went missing. A 7-1 gamble returning in a competitive renewal of the Palisades Stakes at Keeneland Apr. 7, the Stonestreet runner narrowly defeated Mansa Musa (Ire) (Ten Sovereigns). The latter has since finished a troubled fourth in the May 1 William Walker S. ahead of a track-and-distance allowance victory June 8.

# COMPLEXITY COLT DELIVERS STRONG PERFORMANCE AT THE SPA By Mike Kane

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. - Well-named Tough Catch (Complexity) could not be caught Saturday, leading every step of the way to capture the seventh race, a \$100,000 5 1/2-furlong maiden special weight contest for 2-year-olds at Saratoga Race Course.

Tough Catch's victory added to Complexity's (Maclean's Music) remarkable start with his first crop of runners. According to the TDN's Sire List, Complexity, who stands at Airdrie Stud, entered the day with 11 winners from 15 starters, 73.3 percent. The Tough Catch score for trainer Dallas Stewart made it an even dozen and sent his connections, On Our Own Stable, Sport of Kings Racing, Gervais Racing, Zak Stables and Stewart, to the winner's enclosure at America's oldest racetrack for a round of smiles, laughter and photos.

Under Luis Saez, the gray or roan colt out of the Broken Vow mare Try to Catch Her, won by three-quarters of a length in his career debut over Innovator (Authentic) in 1:04.63. Sent off a 6-1 in the field of nine, he paid \$15 to win.

Though bumped a bit at the start by Moment's Notice (More Than Ready) leaving from the inside post, Tough Catch quickly was in front and held that position at every call of the race. He had a three-length lead at the top of the stretch, but had to hold off Innovator, who was prominent throughout from his outside

post position. Tough Catch turned in a smoking first quarter in 21.75 seconds and turned in a second quarter in 23.25.

With 50 percent, Sport of Kings is the majority partner in the group that owns Tough Catch, who brought \$280,000 at the OBS April 2-year-old in training sale. Some 90 days after the purchase, the group had a Saratoga winner, who may be headed to the GI Hopeful Stakes on closing day, Sept. 2.

"It's [by] Complexity, so it's got a pretty good pedigree," said Michael Kares, a founding partner of Sport of Kings. "After we bought the horse, Complexity really started to develop and has a bunch of winners this year. We just liked the girth and the depth of the horse. He's extremely fast. He had great workouts down at OBS. We bought the horse with Dallas and Dallas had some partners, who we formed a great partnership with a bunch of people who live around the country. It's just been a great experience."

Kares grew up in the New York City area and was first introduced to racing by his grandfather with visits to Yonkers Raceway. He has owned horses - off and on, he noted - for about 30 years. Now a resident of Traverse City, Mich., he was in on the formation of what he described as a "boutique partnership" less than two years ago. Kares was at the sale when Tough Catch was purchased.

"He just looked extremely athletic and talented," Kares said.

"Really looked the part. Acted well. Mature. We didn't really feel like we had to do too much work to him. We bought him, got this opportunity and things just fell into place. No injuries.

Feeling real sound. We got Saez and he did a fantastic job. He got a little tired at the end, but that's to be expected first time out."

Kares said his group is involved in other 2-year-olds and said it is looking forward to a start by Eighty West (Speightstown) who was second in his debut at Churchill Downs on June 23. **Cont.**


Tough Catch's quick start did not surprise Kares and the rest of the ownership group.

"We expected that," he said. "We didn't know if it would hold up, but we definitely expected the speed, which we got. The rest was history."

TOUGH CATCH (c, 2, Complexity--Try to Catch Her, by Broken **Vow)** broke like a seasoned veteran from the inside stall on his career debut and showed his rivals a clean set of heels throughout to become a 12th first-crop winner for his Airdriebased stallion (by Maclean's Music). A check of the May 2 foal's worktab shows a couple of very strong works from the gate, including a half in :46 4/5 (2/27) at Churchill Downs July 2 prior to shipping to the Spa, and he went well under-tack at OBS this April, covering a furlong in :10 flat. Sent off at 13-2, the grey colt shot to the lead in the opening exchanges and covered his first quarter-mile in :21.75. Maintaining a safe margin around the turn, Tough Catch was by the half in :45 flat and was never in danger as Innovator (Authentic), a \$900,000 KEESEP grad, ran an improved race second time out to complete the exacta. A halfbrother to Unique Factor (The Factor), SP, \$219,173, Tough Catch is out of a daughter of Pin Oak Stud's GI Selene Stakes winner See How She Runs (Maria's Mon), also the dam of MGSW Don't Leave Me (Lemon Drop Kid). Canadian champion turf horse Hasten To Add (Cozzene) appears under the third dam. Try to Catch Her produced a filly by Cyberknife this past Feb. 8. ## CHANGES FINALLY MAKE REYNOLDS CHANNEL A WINNER By Tim Wilkin

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.--After five career starts without a win, enough was enough. It was time for a change for 3-year-old colt Reynolds Channel (West Coast).

Or two. Or three.

Co-owner Lee Einsidler huddled with Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott and the following modifications were made: new distance, new jockey, and an equipment change.

"I'm just glad he didn't change trainers," Mott said late Saturday afternoon. Mott could laugh and so could Einsidler because they were both standing in the winner's circle at Saratoga Race Course. Reynolds Channel finally got there.

He won Saturday's eighth race, a \$100,000 maiden special weight event for 3-year-olds and up with a solid two-length victory. Reynolds Channel, a \$300,000 purchase by Einsidler's LRE Racing LLC and partner Mike Francesa's JEH Racing Stable LLC, had a total makeover for Saturday.

After running at 1 1/8 miles in his last three races, Reynolds Channel shortened up to seven furlongs. He had worn blinkers in his last two starts. They came off Saturday. Jockey Junior Alvarado, Mott's go-to rider, was in the saddle for the first time.

Mott and Einsidler made all the right moves.

"I don't let racing frustrate me," Einsidler said. "It is so special. If you are going to let it bother you, you shouldn't do it. We were a little disappointed in the (prior) results because he trained like a horse that was going to handle two turns. It just didn't work out. When we came here today, I thought it would be his day."

Alvarado kept Reynolds Channel in close contact in the field of 12 and made his move heading into the stretch.

His long stride gobbled up pacesetter Hurricane Nelson (Khozan) just outside the eighth pole and Reynolds Channel won going away. He went off at odds of 9-1 and paid \$21.60 while being timed in 1:23.12.

Reynolds Channel is named for a Long Island body of water which was frequented by both Einsidler and Francesa, New York natives. Einsidler fished there. Francesa swam and clammed there.

On a trip back home from Florida after a race a few years ago, they made a pact to name this horse after a favorite place they had on common.

Reynolds Channel was picked out for Einsidler by bloodstock agent Mike Ryan at the 2022 Keeneland September Yearling Sale.

"(Ryan) said that if he had a bigger pedigree, if he was by a big-time sire, he is a \$2-million horse," Einsidler said. "(West Coast) is not exactly on fire, but physically, Mike said we should own this horse. When you want to picture what a racehorse should look like, he should look like him. Big. Long neck. Big behind. That doesn't necessarily mean he is going to go 1 1/8 miles. Very few of them do."

Reynolds Channel was bred by Edwin Anthony in Kentucky. He is out of the mare Noelle's Mischief by Into Mischief. Mott saw a horse that might have a future from the start. When he began working him, Reynolds Channel showed a stride that suggested distance would be no problem.

"But when we put him to the test, and actually asked him to do 1 1/8 miles, he didn't do it," Mott said. "So, we shortened him up. Seven furlongs can be a very difficult race in itself, but he was fit enough to do it."

Yearlings

"If I have a horse that is not winning, I put him where I believe he can win," said Einsidler said.


That happened Saturday. And now, Reynolds Channel is a maiden no more.

Having resisted the urge to take up an assignment at Royal Ascot after making a successful racecourse debut in the May 11 Royal Palm Juvenile Turf, D J Stable's Bullet switched to a synthetic surface for Saturday's My Dear S. and posted an equally eyecatching success.

Drawn gate seven, the \$425,000 Keeneland September yearling raced in a share of fourth and four off the inside into
