



SARATOGA NOTEBOOK: STALL OFF TO STRONG START AT SARATOGA

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.--Last summer, we hardly knew Kentucky-based trainer Al Stall Jr.

During the 40 days of the 2023 Saratoga meet, Stall came up with one win in 12 starts.

It's a little different a year later.

Four days into the Spa season and Stall has started three horses. He has won with two of them and finished second with the third.

"This pays the bar tab and the food tab," Stall said inside his office at his barn on the Saratoga backstretch Sunday morning. "We have to start working on the rent."

Stall's success started on opening day when **Strong State** (Tom's d'Etat) broke her maiden by a neck. That was a special win because Stall trained Tom's d'Etat, who won 11 of 20 career starts and was a multiple graded stakes winner.

Strong State was the second winner for the freshman sire.

"Tom had a lot of things going for him," Stall said. "He was a freak talent."

On the second day of the meet, 4-year-old **Over and Ollie** (Cairo Prince) gave Stall his second win, in a maiden claiming event at 1 1/16 miles on the inner turf. **Cont. Pg 3**

STAR OF MYSTERY BEST AGAINST THE BOYS IN QUICK CALL

Scratched as the morning-line favorite from Friday's Coronation Cup against her own gender in favor of taking on the boys Sunday, 'TDN Rising Star' Star of Mystery (GB) (Kodiac {GB}) responded in kind with an easy win in the GIII Quick Call Stakes at Saratoga.

A Godolphin homebred from the Charlie Appleby barn, the 3-year-old filly began her racing in 'Rising Star' style, winning at second asking by 11 lengths in her native England just over a year ago. A stakes runner now in three countries, Star of Mystery placed in the G2 Duchess of Cambridge Stakes last July before shipping to the Middle East to win both the Al Wasl Stakes and the G2 Blue Point Sprint before wrapping up her international time with a game second, beaten just three-quarters of a length, in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint in Meydan in March. Over and Ollie was ridden by Frankie Dettori, someone Stall said he had never met until that day.

"I had to flag him down in the paddock," Stall said. "But he did his homework and he got him running."

In his other start so far, Stall was second with 3-year-old filly **Lord I Wonder** (Twirling Candy), who made her career debut in a maiden special weight on Friday.

"The key to this game is having maidens who can run," Stall said. "You give yourself a pretty good chance if you have maidens that can run. We brought a few live maidens up here."

Stall has 10 horses stabled at Saratoga and the number won't get bigger than that. He will likely move some horses up from Kentucky and send some back.


"That is why I come here," Stall said when asked why Saratoga is special. "You win on opening day, and you can tell by your phone how special. I came out of the winner's circle and the text messages are just exploding on a Thursday afternoon. That doesn't happen at Fair Grounds or Churchill."

Lukas Would Prefer To Run Seize The Grey In Jim Dandy

Nothing is official yet, but it looks like GI Preakness Stakes winner **Seize the Grey** (Arrogate) will be staying put and running in the \$500,000 GII Jim Dandy Stakes at Saratoga July 27. The other option is the \$1 million GI Haskell Stakes at Monmouth Park on Saturday.

"I think my vote is pretty strong," Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas said in his office on the Oklahoma Training Track Sunday morning. "I would prefer the Jim Dandy. I'll ask them [representatives from the ownership group MyRacehorse] one time for my opinion, but I will do what the check writers want to do."

Seize the Grey is coming off a seventh-place finish in the GI Belmont Stakes at Saratoga June 8. After that, Lukas took the grey/roan colt back to his base in Kentucky and then shipped him back to the Spa at the end of June. **Cont.**

Lukas worked Seize the Grey five furlongs on the Oklahoma last Monday and he went :59.22 (1/1).

"His work the other day was as good as he has ever worked," Lukas said. "He is really doing good. He has filled out. He had that little hiccup in the Belmont where he didn't run well over the race track."

The Belmont was Seize the Grey's sixth start of the year and Lukas said the campaign may have caught up with his colt a little bit. Since the Belmont, Lukas said Seize the Grey has thrived.

"He has been sharp lately," he said. "Very sharp."

The advantage of running in the Jim Dandy is an obvious one, not having to ship to New Jersey. On the other hand, the Haskell has a higher grade and a bigger purse.

Staying home might outweigh the money and the prestige.

"You always have a little bit of a grey area that everything goes right with the ship," Lukas said. "Some horses can go into a strange stall and get to looking around and not settling and they don't really dive into the feed tub. Coming out of your own stall is a plus."

Jose Ortiz Happy With Decision To Relocate To Kentucky

Jockey Jose Ortiz, a three-time leading rider at Saratoga, is back in the Spa City for the summer. But the long-time New York-based rider doesn't call the Empire State home anymore.


Earlier this year, Ortiz decided to relocate and ride in Kentucky. He had a successful first full spring at Churchill Downs as he tied for the jockey title with Tyler Gaffalione. Both had 45 wins.

"I talked to my wife (Taylor) and we decided we wanted to go and raise our kids there," he said referring to his young children Leilani, Derek and Nikolai. "I liked the vibe. It's more country and we like it. The kids are having fun there." Cont.

Ortiz won the Saratoga riding title in 2016-17 and 2019. His brother, Irad, has won it five times, including the last two.

After the first four days of racing, Jose Ortiz has five wins, two behind leader Flavien Prat. He is tied with his brother for second.

"I was (in New York) 12 years," Jose Ortiz said. "You are going to lose some horses. It is what it is. I'm just going to keep working. Some doors close and other doors open."

In her first North American start just last month, the filly ran third just 3 3/4 lengths behind record-setting Cogburn (Not This Time) in the GI Jaipur Stakes on Belmont Stakes day June 8.

Still favored in this spot Sunday against the boys again at 3-5, Star of Mystery broke mid pack but was quickly outrun as **No Nay Mets (Ire)** (No Nay Never) rocketed out and opened up a sizeable gap right from the first furlong.

Taken back to race fifth a path off the fence, the favorite bided her time as the field raced in pairs behind the loose leader into the far turn through a quarter in :21.16. The seven runners began to bunch up past the quarter pole as the real running began and Star of Mystery swung to the five path and easily clicked through her gears, swarming up on the outside and outrunning only a mild challenge from Irish import Mansa Musa (Ire) (Ten Sovereigns {Ire}) to come home alone on the line.

'TDN Rising Star' Fandom (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) was the best of the Stonestreet runners to come home a clear third.

"She was a handful last time, so I took my time and we went straight behind the gate and she just switched off so nice," said winning jockey Flavien Prat. "I was a bit worried she was going to sleep, but she was just an old pro today. I was good with the position. She jumped forward where I wasn't going to be too far back. She was traveling well all the way around and when I tipped her out, she [responded]. She just ran very well. She gave me a good kick. [Her kick] was strong enough today."

Chris Connett, assistant to Appleby added: "Charlie spoke with Flavien [Prat] yesterday and said, 'you've rode the filly before and ideally, we'll be a bit handy, but if you want to let them roll along you can. You know the filly now, so sit the way you're happy with it.' You saw that on the TV she was quite the handful [ahead of the Grade 1 Jaipur]. She was like that in Dubai before her runs as well, but thankfully today she was a little more relaxed and Flavien even mentioned he thought she was a little too relaxed beforehand. She comes alive when the gates open though and she sure finished off really nicely. It's a big thing for these European horses coming over here. Their first runs can be a little bit intense for them, but that's why Charlie picks the horses he does and they do acclimatize themselves really well."

Pedigree Note:

Star of Mystery is one of 98 stakes winners for Irish-based Kodiac (GB) who stands at Tally Ho Stud. Out of a stakes-winning dam in Mistrusting (Ire), the filly is a half to MGISW Althiqa (GB) (Dark Angel {Ire}) who scored in both the GI Longines Just A Game Stakes and the GI Diana Stakes along with multiple other group wins and placings in England, France and the Middle East. Dark Angel is responsible for another sibling in Mysterious Night (Ire) who also saw victory at the highest level in America with a win in the GI Pattison Summer Stakes at Woodbine. In fact, all five runners produced by Mistrusting have been to the winner's circle. Sent to Dubawi (Ire) for consecutive visits, she produced colts by the Darley legend in both 2022 and 2024.

BROWN, PLETCHER LOOK FORWARD AFTER BIG OPENING WEEKEND AT SARATOGA

Trainer Chad Brown, who won his 150th Grade I race Saturday with repeat winner **Whitebeam (GB)** (Caravaggio) in the GI Diana Stakes, is already looking forward to the next starts for his stable's biggest runners. Of note, **Gina Romantica** (Into Mischief), just edged out for second in the Diana, could be headed to face the boys in the GI Fourstardave Handicap Aug. 10 along with stablemates **Chili Flag (Fr)** (Cityscape {GB}) and Whitebeam.

"Chili Flag and Whitebeam are certainly horses you could consider for the Fourstardave depending who is running and such," said Brown. "Gina Romantica was only beaten a little over a length in the Breeders' Cup Mile by Master of The Seas, so I guess it's in play - we'll see."

Another Brown-trained runner targeting the Fourstardave could be GIII Kelso Stakes winner and 'TDN Rising Star' Carl Spackler (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}).

"He ran terrific. I was so happy to see him come back into form. Now that I was able to observe this race yesterday and tie it into his training and his affinity for Saratoga, I have to believe that his race during Belmont Stakes week here where he didn't fire must have been a bit of a hangover from that challenging trip off a layoff at Churchill."

Another 'Rising Star' for Brown, Sierra Leone (Gun Runner) continued preparations over the weekend for the GII Jim Dandy Stakes with a solo half-mile work over the Oklahoma training track in :48 2/5.

"It was more of the same," said Brown of Sierra Leone. "I'm liking what I'm seeing. He worked super - very similar to his last couple of works and he galloped out with a lot of energy. I couldn't be happier with the way he's moving."

Brown continued, "In observing the horse as he's changed and matured with more races under his belt, I wanted to change a couple things about my approach with him - minor changes - and that [working solo] was one of them. I wanted to see how he reacted to it and I'm very pleased with how it's going."

The Jim Dandy will serve as a prep for the GI Travers Stakes where Sierra Leone will join another stablemate on the day's card in **Domestic Product** (Practical Joke) who targets the GI H. Allen Jerkens Memorial and took the GIII Dwyer Stakes July 6 at Aqueduct off short rest.

"I subbed him in there [the Dwyer] and he ran the best race of his career, certainly. It makes sense to keep him at one turn at this point. Now that he has had two races in three weeks, I'll freshen him up and run in the Jerkens - it worked with the sire."

Also coming off a noteworthy weekend at Saratoga is trainer Todd Pletcher who saddled **Illuminare** (City of Light) and **Miss Justify** (Justify) to wins but was forced to scratch the morning-line favorite for the Sanford in **Mentee** (City of Light) due to a fever Saturday morning.

"He's much better this morning," said Pletcher on Sunday. "His temperature was normal, so knock on wood with a little bit of good fortune, he'll be back on track pretty soon."

Pletcher has a trio of runners looking towards the GI Haskell Stakes at Monmouth including 'TDN Rising Star' and champion 2-year-old male Fierceness (City of Light), 'TDN Rising Star' Mindframe (Constitution) and Tuscan Sky (Vino Rosso).

"As of right now and speaking to the connections, the plan is to enter all three in the Haskell. We'll take that next step and then assess how everything is shaping up."

TWIRLING CANDY'S KIMCHI CAT MAKES ALL THE RIGHT MOVES IN SECOND START

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N. Y. – The first time trainer Tom Amoss sent 2-year-old filly **Kimchi Cat** (Twirling Candy) to the races, he was expecting something good to happen.

"We were very excited," Amoss said. "She had been doing very, very well in the mornings."

That was June 14, a Friday, at Churchill Downs. The optimism waned a bit when they got to the paddock.

"There was a very mature, good (Steve) Asmussen in there, and I was like, 'oh, God, we're in trouble," Amoss said.

He was right. Viggiedal (Vekoma), the 2-year-old filly from Hall of Fame trainer Asmussen's barn, was also making her debut, and she rolled, winning by five lengths over Kimchi Cat.

Amoss knew there would be other days. That came Sunday and Kimchi Cat put a beating of her own on in the Saratoga opener, a \$100,000 maiden special weight event.

Ridden by Tyler Gaffalione, Kimchi Cat, breaking from the rail, took the lead right out of the gate and was never headed.

She won by 3 1/2 lengths in the field of eight and covered the 5 1/2 furlongs in 1:06.04. Sent off at odds of 4-1, Kimchi Cat returned \$10.

"She ran a good race that first day, she learned a lot," Amoss said. "She learned to rate, she learned to wait. Today, she was sharper. She is not married to having the lead, it just turned out that way. No one wanted it. Through the first 100 yards, the way it was unfolding, it looked very good for us."

It was a popular victory in Columbus, Ohio, the home of Dr. Joel Politi, the owner of Kimchi Cat. He watched the race on television with his wife Julie and a handful of others.

"There were five of us," Politi said by phone. "As soon as she crossed the finish line, there were plenty of text messages."

Politi, an orthopedic surgeon, has been involved with Amoss since 2008. Their biggest success together came with Serengeti Empress (Alternation), winner of the 2019 GI Kentucky Oaks and 2020 GI Ballerina Stakes.

Kimchi Cat, out of the Sky Mesa mare Winter Dawn, was a \$185,000 purchase at the 2023 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. Amoss put together a team to observe and analyze yearlings at the sale. The group included former assistants Brent Sumja and Chris Richard and former trainer Ron Faucheux.

They honed in on the yearling by Twirling Candy, who had won seven of 11 of his career races and was a four-time graded stakes winner. She was bred in Kentucky by Coffee Pot Stables.

"Tom put together a really good team," Politi said. "To me, (Kimchi Cat) I thought she was a very fast looking, athletic filly when I saw her. She stuck out to me. She was one of my 'really want to have.' I wasn't looking to buy in the million-dollar range. I thought she was something maybe we could afford. Sometimes things work out and sometimes they don't. So far, she has worked out great."

"She had great balance," Amoss said. "A very pretty filly. Believe me, she is not full grown yet. There is more to come with her."

Amoss and Politi were not going to say what is next for Kimchi Cat. The GIII Adirondack Stakes at 6 1/2 furlongs on Aug. 4 and the GI Spinaway Stakes on Aug. 31 are the two big races remaining in the meet for juvenile fillies.

"She just broke her maiden," Amoss said. "Obviously, whatever is next will be bigger and better."

When Politi goes about naming his horses, he relies on his family. He has five daughters--Rachel, Annie, Leah and Ninaranging in age from 19 to 27 and they have played the name game. For Kimchi Cat, wife Julie got the call.

Kimchi is a traditional Korean dish of salted and fermented vegetables. Translation: healthy. Julie Politi is also a fan of cats.

"Joel's wife is very responsible when it comes to nutrition," Amoss said. "No French fries."

I began working with this filly in the beginning and I told him he had a really good filly here. She can do anything. She can go to the front, or she can come from behind."

Charlene's Dream won three of four starts last term, including the Pike Place Dancer Stakes and Golden Gate Debutante Stakes. In her first start after leaving Northern California, she was a well-beaten fourth going seven panels in Churchill's Leslie's Lady Stakes June 9.

"I have 16 horses at Turfway, and she is one of them," noted Moger Jr. "She's not Cal [California] bred, so there are a lot more opportunities for her here. I've been high on her ever since the first time I ran her, so this win doesn't surprise me today."

Greenhills Far and Away

Katie Walsh took only two horses to the Tattersalls Craven Breeze-up Sale this year under her Greenhills Farm consignment - a colt by New Bay (GB) and a filly by Havana Grey (GB). Both were bought for Anthony Stroud, at 525,000gns apiece, and while those are hefty price tags, one is already a Group 2 winner and the other is unbeaten in two starts and looks a Group winner in waiting.

Arabian Dusk (GB) was bought by Stroud for Shaikh Duaij Al Khalifa of Bahrain and is trained by Simon and Ed Crisford. Having run placed in both a maiden and the Listed Maureen Brittain Empress Fillies' Stakes, she returned to the July Course on Friday for a storming victory in the G2 Duchess of Cambridge Stakes. The win was also notable as a first Group success for Harry Davies, one of the rising stars of the weighing-room.

The previous week, Anno Domini, the New Bay colt bought for Godolphin, landed his second win in a Sandown novice contest for Charlie Appleby. **Cont.**

The half-brother to this season's Poule d'Essai des Pouliches runner-up Kathmandu (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) looks destined for Pattern company next.

It is easy to think of Stroud simply as 'Godolphin's man' but he has long had a wide range of clients to look after, and his good week got even better when Mill Stream (Ire) (Gleneagles {Ire}), whom be bought for former trainer and breeder Peter Harris as a yearling, became the latest Group 1 winner for his talented trainer Jane Chapple-Hyam in the July Cup. Stroud also bought the third home in that race, last year's dual Group 1 winner Vandeek (GB) (Havana Grey {GB}), who had topped the Craven Sale of 2023.

Gleneagles a Versatile Option

Gleneagles has been at stud for nine seasons now, so it is not as if he has burst onto the scene, but it always better to burn slowly for longer, and that is exactly what the 12-year-old son of Galileo (Ire) is doing.

Within seven days, he has been responsible for last Sunday's Deutsches Derby winner Palladium (Ger) followed by the July Cup victory of Mill Stream.

Few stallions are capable of such high-class versatility. It calls to mind a memorable 2006 for Mark Of Esteem (Ire), the year in which he was represented by both the Derby winner Sir Percy (GB) and the Nunthorpe and Haydock Sprint Cup winner Reverence (GB). (Let's not forget what a mighty horse Reverence was for his owner-breeders Gary and Lesley Middlebrook and trainer Eric Alston: in 42 starts he won 10 times, adding the G2 Temple Stakes and G3 Flying Five to his

Credit must also be given to Mill Stream's dam, Swirral Edge (GB) (Hellvelyn {GB}), the pride of the Murphy family's Redpender Stud. With her first foal she produced the G2 Richmond Stakes winner Asymmetric (Ire) (Showcasing {GB}), who now resides at Starfield Stud in Ireland. Mill Stream has now taken the family to the next level.

two Group 1 wins. Splendid.)

Gleneagles also has several more of the top three-year-olds in Europe in the Aga Khan's Calandagan (Ire), who blitzed his rivals in the G2 King Edward VII Stakes at Royal Ascot, and Ambiente Friendly (Ire), who was second in the Derby and third in the Irish Derby.

Mill Stream's July Cup win means that two members of Steve Parkin's Branton Court Stud broodmare band have benefited from a Group 1 sprint update in during the past year after they were both bought relatively inexpensively on the same day in 2022. On Parkin's behalf, Joe Foley bought Swirral Edge's dam Pizzarra (GB) (Shamardal) for 30,000gns as well as Approaching Autumn (GB) (New Approach {Ire}) for 35,000gns. The latter is now better known as the dam of last year's G1 Nunthorpe Stakes winner Live In The Dream (Ire) (Prince Of Lir {Ire}).

Having already enjoyed a homebred Classic winner this year in Fallen Angel (GB) (Too Darn Hot {GB}), Branton Court Stud could also bask in further glory at York on Saturday as the breeder of Fitri Hay's Listed City Walls Stakes winner Starlust (GB) (Zoustar {Aus}). His half-sister and fellow Listed winner Queen Of Desire (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) was sold in foal to Dullingham Park's first-season stallion Shaquille (GB) last week at Tattersalls for 42,000gns. Stallions in the News

It has also been a notable week for Kingman (GB), Lope De Vega (Ire) and Caravaggio. The latter, who now resides at the Japan Bloodhorse Breeders Association stallion stud, had a transatlantic Group/Grade 1 double when Porta Fortuna (Ire) continued her merry romp through the season by winning the Falmouth Stakes, followed a day later by Juddmonte's Whitebeam landing back-to-back triumphs in the Diana Stakes at Saratoga.

Lope De Vega was also represented on the Saratoga card by Carl Spackler (Ire), winner of the GIII Kelso Stakes. The four-year-old, bred by Fifth Avenue Bloodstock, clearly has a liking for the Spa as he won two graded stakes at Saratoga in 2023.

A handicap it may be, but the John Smith's Cup, which was run at York on Saturday, is one of the most coveted and competitive races of the season, and Lope De Vega duly provided the one-two in that race when Shadwell's Enfjaar (Ire) led home Sheikh Mohammed Obaid's Botanical (Ire), both of whom are trained by Roger Varian.

One tends to think of the offspring of Kingman as being best at up to around 1m2f but the doughty Alsakib (GB) showed true grit when winning the 1m6f G3 John Smith's Silver Cup for PJ McDonald and Andrew Balding. It has been a terrific week for the Balding team, with 10 winners including two Group 3s at York - Flora Of Bermuda (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) won the Summer Stakes - and a Listed win at Chester for Al Shabab Storm (GB) (Advertise {Ire}).

On Saturday, Kingman's son Quddwah (GB) remained unbeaten when continuing a good week for the Crisfords by winning the G2 Summer Mile under Callum Shepherd, who gained some compensation for the disappointing news earlier that day that his G2 Hardwicke Stakes winner Isle Of Jura (Ire)

had been ruled out of the remainder of the season through injury.

Quddwah, now four, is only lightly raced, having run twice last year and twice this, but the colt out of the G1 Dubai Duty Free winner Sajjhaa (GB) (King's Best) has clearly inherited plenty of ability from both sides of his pedigree. Kingman has now passed the marker of 50 Group winners.

Whistlejacket Rides Again

The 2nd Marquess of Rockingham, whose various achievements included being Lord of the Bedchamber to George II and twice being elected prime minister of Britain, was also the owner of the original Whistlejacket, a grandson of the Godolphin Arabian. Foaled in 1749, the chestnut stallion is the subject of one of the most arresting paintings by George Stubbs which now hangs in the National Gallery in London. The huge portrait was originally commissioned by the Marquess of Rockingham for his stately home in Yorkshire, Wentworth Woodhouse, which has its own 'Whistlejacket Room'.

Along with his political duties, Rockingham, also known as Charles Watson-Wentworth, was a noted art collector and racehorse owner, which means he would have had plenty in common, had their paths crossed, with Peter Brant, the owner of the horse who most recently has been bestowed with the name Whistlejacket. Appropriately, he too is a chestnut, and the Irish-bred son of No Nay Never is, fortunately, also a good 'un.

The original Whistlejacket was famed for winning over four miles at York and being retired to stud at the age of 10. His namesake, trained by Aidan O'Brien, is just two but has so far won the Listed First Flier Stakes and G2 July Stakes, so the brother to Little Big Bear is at least proving worthy of carrying such an historic name.

Long may he run, though perhaps not over four miles, or for the next eight years.

Classic Family to the Fore Once More

Sosie (Ire) became not only the 14th winner of the Grand Prix de Paris for his trainer Andre Fabre but the Wertheimer-bred son of Sea The Stars (Ire) is also the latest Group 1 winner for a tremendous family which boasts at least four German Classic winners since the turn of this century.

Samum (Ger), Schiaparelli (Ger) and Salve Regina (Ger), three full-siblings all by Monsun (Ger), collectively won the Deutsches Derby twice and Preis der Diana once. (The filly Salve Regina was also second in the Deutsches Derby). Their dam Sacarina (GB) (Old Vic {GB}) was mated with Monsun at least six times and two further full-siblings to the afore-named have also made their mark at broodmares. The unraced Sanwa (Ger) is the dam of wide-margin Deutsches Derby winner Sea The Moon (Ger) who in turn is the sire of last year's Deutsches Derby and Preis der Diana winners, Fantastic Moon (Ger) and Muskoka (Ger). Sea The Moon shares his sire with Sosie, whose dam Sosia (Ger) is out of Sahel (Ger), yet another daughter of Monsun and Sacarina.

Mamma Mia!

Extraordinarily, there was no Flat racing in Britain or Ireland on Sunday, but at Chantilly the G2 Prix Robert Papin felt more British than French. Six of the seven runners had been sent across the Channel from English stables, with the other, Korisa (Ire), trained in Italy by Melania Cascione.

The juvenile contest was won by Arabie (GB), trained by Karl Burke, who makes easy work of mopping up French group races, but the entries beg the question: where on earth are the French two-year-olds?

Arabie delivered a posthumous hurrah for his sire Dandy Man (Ire), and he is the son of a tremendous broodmare in Robert Cornelius's Mamma Morton (Ire) (Elnadim), who has produced 12 winners from 13 runners, including last year's G3 Nell Gwyn Stakes winner Mammas Girl (GB) (Havana Grey {GB}).

Arabie was bought for 92,000gns by Federico Barberini on behalf of Mohamed Saeed Al Shahi, who also owned his Listed-winning half-brother Master Of War (GB) (Compton Place {GB}).

ARABIE LEADS BRITISH 1-2-3 IN THE ROBERT

PAPIN By Tom Frary

He had to cover Chantilly's straight six furlongs in a time over a second faster than when taking the G3 Prix du Bois last month, but what would prove too difficult for others is far from a test for the highly progressive Arabie (GB) (Dandy Man {Ire}--Mamma Morton (Ire), by Elnadim) as he enhanced his portfolio in Sunday's G2 Prix Robert Papin. In a renewal absent of any French-trained juveniles, it was the fellow British raider **Celandine (GB) (Kingman {GB})** who pressed on from the outset but Mohamed Saeed Al Shahi's 11-10 favourite always had that Rockcliffe Stud homebred covered and when Jim Crowley sent him forward to edge it approaching the final furlong the writing was on the wall. Strong to the line, the latest successful Karl Burke cross-channel raider had 3/4 of a length to spare there over the strong-closing Shadow Army (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) as he denied Celandine the runner's-up spot by a short neck.

"He's an improving horse and is getting better and better," Crowley said. "He doesn't do much when he's in front and is tough with a great mind--he's almost too relaxed and shut down on me in front, so it might look like he had a hard race there but he keeps something up his sleeve and galloped out very well."

Burke said, "He's a tough, progressive horse who is very idle and always has been. It amused me when they said he had a hard race, because I knew Jim would say he has not had a hard race. He's as hard as nails and hopefully there is plenty more to come."

"He has definitely improved since his last run in his homework and I think he showed that today, it was a good run."

Arabie is set to join his G2 Norfolk Stakes-winning stablemate Shareholder in the G1 Prix Morny at Deauville Aug. 18 according to the trainer. "I don't know how much improvement he has in him, but he will go to the Morny and will run very well I'm sure," he added. "I couldn't see a reason why we wouldn't go there and there's the Gimcrack with a penalty, but you may as well have a crack at the group 1."

"I'm sure his owner will be keen to do that and the biggest danger will be one of his stablemates unfortunately. Maybe the two will work together leading into the Morny, but it is very hard to compare. They are two different characters of horses-one is very lazy and the other is very forward-going. It will be very interesting and you can't take anything away from Arabie, he is a tough horse and has a lot of ability."

Arabie is the third black-type winner and fourth black-type performer for Mamma Morton (Ire) (Elnadim), with Mamma's Girl (GB) (Havana Grey {GB}) having been successful in last year's G3 Nell Gwyn Stakes, Master Of War (GB) (Compton Place {GB}) having taken the Listed Rose Bowl Stakes and finished runner-up in the G2 Richmond Stakes and G2 Mill Reef Stakes and Life In Colour (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) placing in the Listed Waterford Testimonial Stakes.

The second dam is the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches third Gharam (Green Dancer), whose leading performers were the G3 Sagaro Stakes runner-up Shaya (GB) (Nashwan) and the G3 Prestige Stakes-placed Elshamms (GB) (Zafonic). The latter is the dam of the G2 Rockfel Stakes-placed Desert Blossom (Ire) (Shamardal), in turn the dam of the Listed Valiant Stakes winner Duneflower (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}). Elshamms's half-sister Naazeq

(GB) (Nashwan) produced the GI Spinster Stakes runner-up Tamweel (Gulch) and is the third dam of the G3 Summer Stakes winner and G1 Cheveley Park Stakes and G1 Commonwealth Cup-placed Flotus (Ire) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}). Mamma Morton's yearling colt is by Ardad (Ire).

NOTABLE SPEECH EXPECTED TO DELIVER AT GOODWOOD AFTER ROYAL ASCOT DISAPPOINTMENT

Charlie Appleby has issued a positive bulletin on **Notable Speech (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) as the Classic winner continues his preparation for the G1 Sussex Stakes at Goodwood on Wednesday, July 31.

The impressive 2,000 Guineas scorer ran no sort of race when last seen forfeiting his unbeaten record in the G1 St James's Palace Stakes at Royal Ascot, ultimately finishing seventh of eight runners in a race won by the Newmarket runner-up, Rosallion (Ire) (Blue Point (Ire)).

That performance was simply too bad to be true according to Appleby, who is expecting his charge to bounce back at Goodwood after he came through his latest piece of work with flying colours.

"He worked on Saturday and I was pleased with him," the dual champion trainer said of Notable Speech. "It was on soft ground which was testing for him but he worked well. It's all systems go towards the Sussex now.

"I sat in the office the other morning with William [Buick, jockey] and we spoke in depth about him. We've been through him with a fine toothcomb and we've not found anything. Horses that campaign at that level, you often find something that needs a little bit of work because those at that level try harder, but he was as clean as a whistle.

"We've just got to put a line through it and we'll see where we are come the Sussex, but he pleased in his work and we're looking towards the Sussex. It's a track that we feel would suit our fella--he's a traveller.

"We've seen him at Kempton, we've seen him at Newmarket, but I thought Ascot's turning mile would suit him as well. But we'll probably never get to the bottom of it and now we move forward. If he'd finished third you just say 'that's as good as he is' but we've just not turned up. All the form, as we know, is rock solid."

RECORDS BROKEN AS HONG KONG BRINGS CURTAIN DOWN ON 2023/24 SEASON

The Hong Kong Jockey Club (HKJC) reported record commingling turnover of HK\$28.8 billion as the 2023/24 season concluded at Sha Tin on Sunday, with 26 countries and more than 70 partners now commingling on Hong Kong racing.

That total represented a 13.7% increase on the 2022/23 season, while overall turnover on simulcasting for the season was also up by 8.7% to HK\$12.8 billion as Hong Kong continued to offer wagering on the very best of world racing through the World Pool. This year the number of World Pool races increased from 175 to 258, with the highlight being the expansion of the World Pool to Australia. World Pool turnover was up by 57.1% on last season.

In total, Hong Kong racing fans enjoyed 88 race meetings this season, including seven twilight fixtures, comprising 831 Hong Kong races and 368 overseas simulcast races. Total racing wagering turnover for the season was HK\$134.7 billion--a 4.5% decrease on the 2022/23 season--with the Hong Kong market being impacted significantly by the economic downturn according to Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges, chief executive officer of the HKJC.

"Under such a challenging economic situation, our overall season racing turnover is satisfactory," Engelbrecht-Bresges summed up. "While the Club will continue to grow and expand its overseas customer base, the decline in local racing wagering turnover underlines that it must constantly engage and re-engage with Hong Kong racing fans."

Local racing fans were treated to some outstanding action on the track during the 2023/24 season, including a thrilling battle for the Hong Kong trainers' championship between Francis Lui and Pierre Ng which went right down to the wire.

Trailing 67-66 at the start of Sunday's action at Sha Tin, Lui turned the deficit around by saddling four winners on the card to Ng's two, with the final scoreline standing at 70-69 in Lui's favour after his Patch Of Theta won the concluding race of the season.

"Finally," Lui, 65, said of winning his first championship.

"Racing is full of excitement. In the middle of the season, everybody would think Pierre--he has won so many races--that he would not be easy to catch.

"Luckily, I had a couple of three-year-olds with good quality who can win a race. It was very hard, whenever I got close with Pierre, he ran again. Like today, I thought I had good chances, but Pierre still won two races."

Asked how he would celebrate, Lui added, "I can take a sleep first."

On Friday, Romantic Warrior (Ire) (Acclamation {GB})--the winner of five Group 1 races in three different jurisdictions in 2023/24--was named Hong Kong's Horse of the Year, while Zac Purton was crowned champion jockey for the seventh time following a six-timer at Sunday's season finale, taking his overall tally to 130 wins. Angus Chung won the Tony Cruz Award for the best-performed homegrown jockey with 46 wins, edging out four-time winner Vincent Ho (41).

Reflecting further on the season, Engelbrecht-Bresges said, "Our world-class racing is truly an international brand in Hong Kong. I am deeply satisfied to see the joy and pride our champion horses, jockeys and trainers bring to racing fans not just in Hong Kong but around the world.

"These achievements are only possible because of the significant investment of our owners." **Cont.**
