



KING GEORGE SHOCK AS GOLIATH PREVAILS FOR FRANCE

Virtually ignored ahead of Saturday's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth QIPCO Stakes, Philip Baron Von Ullmann's Goliath (Ger) (Adlerflug {Ger}--Gouache {Ger}, by Shamardal) had a sting in the tail for his revered fellow contenders as he dominated the Ascot GI Breeders' Cup Turf "Win and You're In" feature. Only second in the course-and-distance G2 Hardwicke Stakes at the Royal meeting, the Francis-Henri Graffard-trained 4-year-old thrived off the strong pace set by the Ballydoyle contingent and was travelling notably powerfully under Christophe Soumillon straightening for home.

Committed 1 1/2 furlongs out, the 25-1 shot bounded clear for an emphatic 2 1/4-length success from Bluestocking (GB) (Camelot {GB}), with another 3 1/4 lengths back to Rebel's Romance (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) in third. The 7-4 favourite Auguste Rodin (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) was a well-beaten fifth, having held every chance turning for home. This was the first Frenchtrained winner of the race since Hurricane Run (Ire) in 2006 and Soumillon, who also partnered that past luminary, was able to appreciate the experience this time.

MQSE DE SEVIGNE BIDS FOR ROTHSCHILD DOUBLE by Tom Frary

Sunday sees Deauville's August Festival get underway and with it Baron Edouard De Rothschild's Mqse De Sevigne (Ire) (Siyouni {Fr}) as she bids for back-to-back renewals of the G1 Prix Rothschild. Also successful in the G1 Prix Jean Romanet and in this term's G1 Prix d'Ispahan at ParisLongchamp, the Andre Fabre-trained homebred is the logical choice here having had her most recent form boosted by Horizon Dore (Fr) (Dabirsim {Fr}) at Royal Ascot. She looks a solid proposition re-opposed by Yeguada Centurion's increasingly disappointing Blue Rose Cen (Ire) (Churchill {Ire}), who was fifth behind her in the d'Ispahan, and the Wertheimers' G1 Prix de la Foret heroine Kelina (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) who has to step up.

"There was a big fight in the straight that day and today was a different feeling because I was travelling up the straight without anyone by my side," he explained. "It was a very comfortable race and I knew at the two-furlong marker the game was over for the others. When I came in the straight I was cruising and when I took him out he just accelerated on the bit very easily and just switched gear. Everything was perfect today and he won like the best horse in the race."

This appeared a straightforward case of Hans Andersen (GB) (Frankel {GB}) and Luxembourg (Ire) (Camelot {GB}) and ultimately Auguste Rodin and Rebel's Romance going too hard in the middle part of the race, but the latest eclipse of the favourite was believed by Aidan O'Brien to be related to ground conditions on the inside. Whatever the reason for his tame effort in the straight, Goliath was able to enter the fray without any pressure and when released passing two out surged away from the Juddmonte homebred who was coming from further back.

The slowed-down race finish percentage tells its own tale, with stamina required in abundance once again in what is always a

gruelling affair. "I know my horse likes running off a good pace and can quicken like this and last time at Royal Ascot he was still too keen," Graffard explained. "He travelled so nicely and when he was like that, I knew he was able to quicken strongly. When you come and you are around 28-1, you feel you might look like a fool and you don't want that, but I think some punters will be happy now."

Goliath, who was winning the Listed Grand Prix de Clairefontaine on this Saturday last year, entered this a lightly-raced type whose sole black-type win had come in ParisLongchamp's G3 Prix d'Hedouville in May. Subsequently fourth in the G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly and 3 3/4 lengths behind the absent Isle Of Jura (GB) (New Approach {Ire}) in the Hardwicke, he had an unlikely King George-winning profile coming here and the way the main contenders folded so far out will lead this race to be scrutinised for some time.

Aidan O'Brien was unhappy with the conditions in the immediate aftermath. "When we walked the track, we were very worried then. It was good, good-to-soft in places," he relayed. "Nowhere was it good-to-firm and it was cut up on the rails, it was full of sand. We knew we had no choice, that's where we were, we had to go down there and with the benefit of hindsight, we should have come off the bad ground and out onto the quicker ground." Cont. p4

"That's the way it is and that's the way it fell for us today," he added. "There will be other days. We were going to go to the Japan Cup and maybe give him a run in between somewhere, so

we will see how he is and what the lads want to do."

Juddmonte's European racing manager Barry Mahon said of Bluestocking, "She ran an absolute stormer, we're over the moon and she's beaten some proper horses. It was a breakneck pace from start to finish, she was able to relax and Rossa [Ryan] was able to get her into a nice position and we knew she would finish off well--she did, but there was one too good for us today."

"We'll just see how she is and that is two hard races in a month

now. Ralph will see how she comes out of it and races like the Yorkshire Oaks, Prix Vermeille and Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe are all on the cards and we'll let her tell us where she wants to go."

Charlie Appleby said of Rebel's Romance, "It was a solid run again and realistically, on some paper form, this is the strongest depth of race he has been in. Will said he got a great run round there and he's gone to win his race and found the length he

would normally find, but there are younger, potentially classier horses coming over the top of you nowadays. In respects to where we go, we will be back on our travels, needless to say, with a horse who maintains plenty of enthusiasm to be competing at the top level. There are going to be opportunities abroad for him and that was a solid run against some of the best he will have faced for a few years. He might join the American team or he might go to Germany and then to the (Hong Kong) Vase."

Goliath, who like his similarly

impressive Ascot-winning stablemate Calandagan (Ire) (Gleneagles {Ire}) cannot contest the Arc, could also be sent overseas for more major prizes. Cont. p5

"We will look at international races like the Breeders' Cup, the Japan Cup--all options are open to him," he said. "We'll see how he comes back, but I can't say for definite at this moment."

Pedigree Notes

Goliath, who becomes the third German-owned horse to win this since 2012 after Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) and Novellist (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}) and Adlerflug's first after Torquator Tasso (Ger) went close two years ago, is the ninth Group 1 winner for his late sire. He is the second foal out of the Listed Hoppegartener Stutenpreis winner Gouache (Ger) (Shamardal), herself kin to the triple group-winning Guardini (Fr) (Dalakhani {Ire}).

Their dam is the dual listed-winning Guantana (Ger) (Dynaformer), a daughter of the G1 Oaks d'Italia heroine Guadalupe (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) whose progeny list is headed by the three-times Group 1-winning Guignol (Ger) (Cape Cross {Ire}) and the G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis hero Guiliani (Ire) (Tertullian). Guadalupe is a full-sister to the G1 Grosser Pries von Baden-winning sire Getaway (Ger) from the immediate family of the G1 Gold Cup hero Royal Rebel (GB) (Robellino). Gouache's unraced 3-year-old filly by Cloth Of Stars (Ire) is named Galaxy

(Ger), while she also has a 2-year-old full-sister to the winner named Go Flying (Ire) and a yearling filly by Magna Grecia (Ire) named Grande Merci (Ire).

FROM DAVID TO GOLIATH

ASCOT, UK — By now, the breeding world is wise to the fact that we only realised almost all too late that Adlerflug was a stallion who should have been treated with the utmost respect. The team at Gestut Schlenderhan knew, but then they bred Adlerflug, who died in 2021 just months after he had been crowned Germany's champion sire for the first time and not long after Schlenderhan had celebrated its 150th anniversary.

Adlerflug has been kind to Francis-Henri Graffard, who trained his son In Swoop, also for the Ullmann family of Schlenderhan, to win the Deutsches Derby and finish second in the Arc. This victory for another son, the largely unheralded Goliath, in the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Stakes takes it to another level, however. Nobody who follows international racing can be in any doubt as to the talents of Graffard, especially not the Aga Khan, who installed him at Aiglemont on the retirement of Alain de Royer Dupre. But he has kept on his own stable in tandem and has now produced what could be deemed a pivotal win for Baron Philip von Ullmann in England's summer middle-distance showpiece.

Before Goliath had even returned to the winner's enclosure with his pronounced stringhalt gait, Philip was on the phone to his father Baron Georg von Ullmann, the previous owner of those famous colours which had been carried to glory around Europe and beyond by such illustrious names as Manduro (Ger), Shirocco (Ger), and Getaway (Ger). The dam of the last-named in that trio can be found as the fourth dam of the four-year-old Goliath. Succession matters here, both for horses and humans.

Goliath's status as a gelding, which he shares with Graffard's Juddmonte International challenger Calandagan, will open up another debate for the breeding world. Cont. p7

But that is a topic of discussion for another day, for this was a day of international glory which is yearned for at Ascot: a German homebred winner trained by a Frenchman and ridden

by a Belgian. Moreover, this was a top-flight win for the next generation of the family which has, almost exclusively since 1869, presided over Schlenderhan, the former home of the great Monsun (Ger) and the oldest stud farm of its kind in Germany.

Philip von Ullmann has just Goliath in training in France with Graffard and a two-year-old with Victoria Head, but he means business when it comes to maintaining his family name in the annals of racing and breeding.

"I'm the sixth generation involved with the stud," he said in the aftermath of what was viewed by

those outside the camp as a shock win. "I'm hoping I can take it to the seventh, eighth or ninth generation."

It was two decades ago that Shirocco landed the Deutsches

Derby for his father before going on to glory in the following year's Breeders' Cup Turf – the horse's first win with Christophe Soumillon in the saddle. Together they would also go on to win the Coronation Cup.

Ullmann continued, "When we knew that Christophe was going to ride Goliath, I told him, 'Let's do it like 19 years ago in the Breeders' Cup.' But I can't believe it. My god, we always knew he was an amazing horse and for the first time he really got a quick pace. I'm speechless."

When the power of speech had returned and a giant trophy had been collected from the Queen, he added, "My parents are obviously very, very proud. A homebred horse, and by Adlerflug, who in my opinion was one of the three best stallions of the 21st century, just very underrated, and who left

sadly too soon. Goliath showed that even on good to firm ground that he can get a top-class horse." **Cont. p8**

Graffard had spoken to TDN earlier in the week about his designs on both the King George and the Juddmonte International but he said in the winner's circle, "When I saw he was 28/1, I thought 'Oh my god, nobody believes in him'."

He did though, and so did Soumillon, who was literally riding high as he swung into the straight in a canter behind Auguste Rodin, Luxembourg and Rebel's Romance – the winners of 15 Group 1 races between them – whose jockeys were hunched in a hard drive for home. With Soumillon barely shifting until the furlong marker, Goliath sauntered past these weakening rivals as if out for a Sunday stroll. His rider, a little more restrained now than in his days of youthful arrogance, still could not resist a leisurely look over his shoulder as the winning post loomed, as if to say, "Where are you all?"

Where indeed. Only Bluestocking could put up anything close to a challenge as she ran on resolutely from out the back to narrow Goliath's margin of victory to a little over two lengths. But that only tells half the story, for this was an absolutely joyous romp for the visitors from the continent. It may not have been what we expected to see, but it was nevertheless a wonder to behold.

joint-favourite made continued headway under pressure and was driven out inside the final quarter-mile to deny the long-time leader by a half-length nearing the line. The 10 1/4-furlong heat became a four-furlong sprint, with fellow 9-4 joint favourite Passenger (Ulysses {Ire}) unable to strike a telling blow and finishing 3/4-of-a-length back in third, a half-length in front of Royal Rhyme (Ire) (Lope De Vega {Ire}).

"He's an absolute star and he'd be better off with a faster pace, but everything that ran in that race would have been," said Burrows. "Two furlongs down I thought that he was going to come and win and a furlong down I thought maybe second, but he just kicked in. He's so game and such an honest horse. The manoeuvre [taking closer order] on the bend was probably the difference between winning and losing. If they'd have kicked where he was sat [at the back] I don't think he'd have got there and that was a great move from Jim [Crowley]."

Looking ahead, the trainer added, "I'll have to have a chat with Sheikha Hissa [about the G1 Juddmonte International], but he obviously does love it here. It's the third time he's won here, so it does suit him. We'll see what everybody thinks and then make a plan." Cont. p9

ALFLAILA RETAINS G2 YORK STAKES TITLE IN GAME FASHION by Sean Cronin

Shadwell's **Alflaila (GB)** (Dark Angel {Ire}--Adhwaa {GB}, by Oasis Dream {GB}) was highly tried after posting a career high in last term's G2 Sky Bet York Stakes, finishing just off the podium behind Auguste Rodin (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in September's G1 Irish Champion Stakes and last month's G1 Prince of Wales's Stakes on seasonal return, and secured back-to-back renewals in a tactical affair on the Knavesmire.

The Owen Burrows trainee employed patient tactics and raced under a firm hold, behind all three opponents, through the initial fractions as **King's Gambit (Ire)** (Saxon Warrior {Jpn}) led at a crawl. Easing into third at the top of the straight, the 9-4

In the aftermath, the Niarchos family's racing manager Alan Cooper reported Passenger had suffered a condylar fracture to his off fore.

Cooper told the PA news agency, "Unfortunately, he has suffered a fracture to his cannon bone, he was pulled up safely after the winning post by Richard Kingscote.

"He is on his way home and he will be seen by veterinary surgeons, he is stable and he will be treated. It is a non-displaced fracture, so hopefully all will be well."

Alflaila, one of his sire's 62 pattern-race winners, is one of three winners from as many foals out of Listed Montrose Fillies' S. runner-up Adhwaa (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}). Adhwaa's dam, Listed Cheshire Oaks winner Hammiya (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}), also produced Listed Nereide-Rennen victrix Shaqira (GB) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) and is the leading performer for Listed Prix Herod winner Albacora (Ire) (Fairy King), herself a half-sister to G3 Prix de Saint-Georges winner and G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches runner-up Pont-Aven (Ire) (Try My Best). Pont-Aven produced a quartet of black-type winners headed by dual G2 Prix du Gros-Chene victrix Sainte Marine (Ire) (Kenmare {Fr}), G2 Gimcrack S.-winning sire Josr Algarhoud (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}) and the stakes-producing Listed winners Traou Mad (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}) and Cap Coz (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}).

TOO DARN HOT'S SIMMERING JUSTIFIES AL SHAQAB INVESTMENT IN THE PRINCESS MARGARET by Tom Frary

Compensating for her agonising reversal in the Royal meeting's G3 Albany Stakes, Al Shaqab Racing's acquisition **Simmering (GB)** (Too Darn Hot {GB}--Cashla Bay {GB}, by Fastnet Rock {Aus}) got up late to break her maiden in style in Saturday's G3 Princess Margaret Stakes back at Ascot. Third on debut at York behind the high-class **Arabie (GB)** (Dandy Man {Ire}) prior to her standard-setting Albany performance behind Fairy Godmother (Ire) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}), the 11-8 favourite was held up early by Ryan Moore who had already ridden the opening race's winner.

Staying on strongly as **Mandurah** (**Ire**) (Kingman {GB}) took over inside the final two furlongs, the star of the Ollie Sangster stable overhauled **Betty Clover** (**GB**) (Time Test {GB}) close home for a neck success, with half a length back to **Tales Of The Heart** (**Ire**) (Mehmas {Ire}) in third and the tiring Mandurah in fourth.

"It's a real privilege to have Al Shaqab in the stable and great to get off to a good start for them," Sangster said. "She's a filly we've always held in high regard and this is a fantastic result. We've got a small team and everyone works really hard."

Sangster, who had enjoyed listed success in Thursday's Star Stakes with Celestial Orbit (GB) (No Nay Never), added, "I think she has won it nicely in the end, despite having a few traffic problems and hopefully she will take another step forward-Ryan said he thinks she will and said she was still a bit green coming through horses there. Ryan said he would advise going up to seven furlongs next time, so we will have to have a look at the schedule."

"Both Simmering and Celestial Orbit showed up sort of together in the spring and did a lot of work together, so that gave me a bit of extra confidence coming into today after the filly won well on Thursday. They are both different types of filly, but it's nice to have them in the yard and connections like that in the yard--it will be nice to see them get their heads in front again."

Of the Al Shaqab purchase investment, he added, "The ownership changed at about half past nine on Thursday and it was pretty manic in the office. I've grown up watching Al Shaqab and Sheikh Joaan's good horses like Toronado and Treve and all those other good horses, so for them to buy into a horse in our yard is a privilege."

Al Shaqab's racing manager Alison Begley added, "We have had an eye on her since Ascot and then it was a case of getting our ducks in a row. The form was there in the book and she was sort of the obvious one, so I'm delighted it's worked out well for everybody. Ryan was saying there that he thinks the Breeders' Cup would be ideal. She's got speed, but he thinks she will be better again stepping up to seven furlongs--obviously Del Mar is

a very sharp mile. That would be very long term and we would have to speak to the Al Shaqab team and everything and see where we go, but I think quick ground will be key to her."

Simmering, who is the eighth group winner for her second-crop sire, is out of Cashla Bay whose dam Rose Blossom (GB) (Pastoral Pursuits {GB}) annexed the G3 Summer Stakes. Her yearling colt by Time Test (GB), while she also has a filly foal by Harry Angel (Ire).

"We did a lot of checking her out as well and couldn't find anything wrong and gave her lots of time off, as she is still an immature filly and she has done it in good style."

"She is the type of filly who will get better as the year goes on and she will be a lovely filly next year," he added. "That is a stiff mile and it rises a lot and I think a mile and a quarter is her proper trip--I wouldn't want to go a mile and a half."

Entering this test as the most exposed juvenile, Al Qudra had scope for improvement stepping up to seven furlongs from the Charlie Appleby stable successful three times since 2019 and bossed things from the front to gain his black-type breakthrough. Off the mark on his third start and first over six furlongs on Lingfield's Polytrack in June, he was staying on when fifth in the G2 Coventry Stakes and showed here that this extra distance is what he has been crying out for. Followed by New Century from the outset, he was able to kick away from that rival approaching the furlong pole while TDN Rising Star Chancellor never threatened having reportedly lost his left-fore shoe.

"He came in today with a lot of experience under his belt--he's run twice over five, stepped up to six in the Coventry and up to seven today. He had the experience and we utilised that," Appleby said. "Will was keen to go out there and just use his experience. You know what it's like against some of those horses, they only had the one run, so it was a big step to change gears moving up to this level."

"Take nothing away from what we've beaten, but he's just a good, solid horse and I think he might make up into a Breeders' Cup horse as he ticks a lot of boxes for the profile of horse that I like to take over there. Experience counts over there and he has plenty of that. I'm sure we will find another run before we go over to the Breeders' Cup, although I haven't really pinpointed one just yet."

Al Qudra is the first foal out of the Listed Harry Rosebery Stakes winner Piece Of Paradise (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), a half-sister to the listed scorer Magical Dreamer (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}) and granddaughter of the G2 German 1,000 Guineas winner Dakhla Oasis. Also related to the sire Dyhim Diamond (Ire) (Night Shift), Piece Of Paradise's yearling filly is by St Mark's Basilica (Fr).

CHAMPION FIERCENESS BOUNCES BACK, FENDS OFF SIERRA LEONE IN THRILLING JIM DANDY

Last year's champion 2-year-old colt and 'TDN Rising Star' Fierceness (City of Light), a very disappointing 15th as the favorite in the GI Kentucky Derby last out, showed up in a big way Saturday, defeating favored 'Rising Star' Sierra Leone (Gun Runner) by a length in a fantastic renewal of the GII Jim Dandy Stakes at Saratoga. It was another 5 3/4 lengths back to Batten Down (Tapit) in third.

Drawn widest of all in post six, the 9-5 second-choice exited the stalls running beneath John Velazquez and was perfectly placed in second throughout behind longshot pacesetter **Pony Express** (Gun Runner). Last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner and this year's GI Florida Derby winner made his move and took command around the far turn as narrow Kentucky Derby runner-up and GI Belmont Stakes third-place finisher Sierra Leone began to wind up from last.

The Repole Stable homebred left the door wide open off the turn, however, kicking for home in the five path. Guided to the fence by Flavien Prat, Sierra Leone came rolling along the inviting opening along the inside and the stage was set.

Fierceness began to drift badly down the lane and Sierra Leone had all the momentum and looked well on his way. **Cont. p3**


McPeek made the announcement during the Fox Saratoga Saturday broadcast.

Fierceness had plenty left in the tank though and was able to knuckle down gamely to get the money.

"Super pleased," winning trainer Todd Pletcher said after recording a record-extending eighth Jim Dandy win. "He kind of got the trip we were hoping for. We knew what our strategy was, the thing is you don't know what everyone is else is going to do. It looked like there were a couple of other horses with potential speed, so we had to break, get to the first turn in good position and get in a good rhythm, and that is what we were able to do."

After bypassing the Belmont Stakes to give Fierceness more time following his dismal performance on the first Saturday in May, it isn't exactly a guarantee that we see the talented bay return in the GI DraftKings Travers Aug. 24, Pletcher warned.

"I don't know," Pletcher said of the Travers. "We kind of talked about this horse seems to do better with a little bit of extra time in between races, so we won't make any decisions right away, but just play it by ear."

Velazquez added, "I expected Sierra Leone to come out, so I went out. I just let him do it. I wanted to get him out there, and when I looked, the other horse came inside so I came back in a little bit just to make sure he saw him. I had horse left. He is incredible. This was just incredible."

Pedigree Notes:

The Jim Dandy winner is one of three graded winners and nine black-type winners from the first two crops of Lane's End stallion City of Light, a four-time Grade I winner who finished second to champion Whitmore in the 2018 GI Forego Stakes in his only lifetime start at Saratoga. City of Light exited the Forego to win his next two, also his final career starts, in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile and the GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational Stakes.

Fierceness's dam, Nonna Bella, is a half to 2016 GI Wood Memorial Stakes winner and WinStar stallion Outwork, while his granddam is a half to MGSW and Airdrie stallion Cairo Prince. Nonna Bella's 2-year-old Mentee, a full-brother to Fierceness, set a new track record (:56.97 for five furlongs) at the Belmont at the Big A meet June 16 in his lone start to date and was scratched the morning of the GIII Sanford Stakes with a fever as the morning-line favorite two weeks ago.

Nonna Bella has a yearling filly by Caravaggio and a 2024 colt by Uncle Mo born Mar. 24. All, like Fierceness, are Repole Stable homebreds. The mare was bred back to Curlin for 2025. She is by Stay Thirsty, another Repole runner and winner of the 2011 GI Travers Stakes, who now stands in California. Stay Thirsty has two stakes winners out of his daughters; both are by City of Light.

NAKATOMI RUNS DOWNS SKELLY IN VANDERBILT

Qatar Racing and Mrs. Fitriani Hay's **Nakatomi** (Firing Line), a longshot third in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Santa Anita, broke through with a career-best effort to capture Saturday's GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt Handicap at the Spa.

Backed at odds of 7-2, Nakatomi broke smartly from his rail draw and, somewhat surprisingly, showed good early speed while chasing favored 10-time winner **Skelly** (Practical Joke) from second through an opening quarter in :22.20.

Traveling nicely approaching the quarter pole, Nakatomi set his sights on Skelly at the top of the stretch and powered on by to win going away by 1 1/2 lengths. It was another 3/4 of a length back to longshot **Twisted Ride** (Great Notion) in third.

Nakatomi, winner of Keeneland's Bowman Mill S. back in 2021, made two starts since his aforementioned effort at the



Championships, finishing third as the favorite in Tampa's Pelican Stakes Feb. 10 and third in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen at Meydan last time Mar. 30. Nakatomi made two previous starts at the Spa. He finished third as a 2-year-old in the GII Saratoga Special Stakes and won an optional claimer in the slop during last year's meeting.

Wesley Ward was pleased to keep training Nakatomi after he was purchased for \$205,000 at the 2023 Fasig-Tipton July

Horses of Racing Age Sale. Ward selected Nakatomi as a yearling (\$25,000 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearling Sale graduate) and he's been in the barn since.

"Everything came together today," Ward said. "We're lucky he was fresh because the track was playing speed, and he broke so well and he was up a lot closer than he would if he had been running all the time. Everything just worked out--that happens rarely, especially in a Grade I, but it happened today."

Ward continued, "He's really coming into his own. He's a lightly raced 5-year-old. We only run him a few times a year as I try to give my horses winters off and this guy is a really special horse to be around. Fergus Galvin [Hunter Valley Farm] brought me over to the barn and when he led him out I said, 'that's the one I want.' I picked him out as a yearling and to have him since a yearling until now and win a Grade I and be with him nearly every day just makes it ever so special."

"He went through the sale last year and I said, 'You've got to buy this horse.' Sheikh Fahad [Al Thani, Qatar Racing] stayed in for his half and he bought out the other partners, so I'm just elated my great friend Alex Cole [racing manager for the Hays] came in for me, otherwise I wouldn't be standing here today. I can't thank Jim Hay and Alex and Fergus Galvin and Sheikh Fahad enough for leaving me with the horse because it really paid off for everybody today, especially me."

As for a potential start in the GII Phoenix Oct. 4 at Keeneland, a race Nakatomi finished second in as the favorite last year, Ward said, "This guy likes spaces in between races, so we'll go ahead home and get together with Fergus and Alex and make a plan. I'd really like to win the Phoenix, which is opening day at Keeneland and gives him good spacing. From there, we have to wheel right back to the Breeders' Cup, but at least we go from his home track and then we ship out to California."

Pedigree Notes:

Nakatomi becomes the first graded stakes winner for Firing Line. He is the sire of two other black-type winners. Nakatomi is the fourth top-level winner for broodmare sire Flatter. Applelicious, a maiden of nine career starts, is also responsible for 2-year-old filly Apples Redline (Timeline) and a colt by Prince of War of this year. Applelicious is a half-sister to K. D.'s Shady Lady (Maria's Mon), the dam of GISW Lady of Fifty (After Market). Applelicious brought \$2,000 from Maynard Thompson at the 2019 KEENOV sale.

"I spoke to David O'Rourke last Sunday or Monday, reached out to him, you know how do we approach this if we do this? I'm a big believer that the sport needs stars. It needs to be promoted, it needs to be lifted. She can do that and we're lucky that she's there to do that. The Alabama was a race that is going to be really boring if I run in it. Nobody is going to run against me, I'm pretty sure of that. She could go out there and knock out a third one for us, but I don't think that's a big enough challenge for her."

McPeek said that Thorpedo Anna had worked against future

Kentucky Derby winner Mystik Dan (Goldencents) all winter long. "She made him huff and puff on a regular basis. She helped him win the Kentucky Derby because she got him ready. He would come back and go, `woah, what is that?' And then she's worked against Gould's Gold (Goldencents) and he can't handle her at all. She gallops out way in front of him. So we're going to get a little bit of a barometer on that today (in the Jim Dandy). It's a challenge, it hasn't been done in a long time, she's a great eater, she loves what she does every day and she's here on what I'm going to call her home track now, with two wins over the track. So let's give NYRA a chance to prepare for everything, let's give the Alabama (time) to draw enough entries because it's still a great race and let's see if we can do something magical."

At 6:30 Saturday morning, McPeek schooled Thorpedo Anna in the starting gate at the Oklahoma Training Track. He said then that he would huddle with owners Nader Alaali, Mark Edwards, Judy B. Hicks and his wife Sherri (Magdalena Racing) later in the day before announcing the decision.

Thorpedo Anna has won all four of her starts this year--all against fillies--by a combined 18 3/4 lengths. She was last seen winning the GI Coaching Club American Oaks by 4 1/2 lengths at Saratoga on July 20. She won with ease despite hopping at the start.

"There is a little bit of added pressure," McPeek said Saturday morning about running against males. "But she is such a superstar. She is so great to be around. (Jockey Brian Hernandez) hasn't laid the whip on her all year. We really don't know how good she is."

In her seven career starts, Thorpedo Anna has won six times. The last filly to run in the Travers was Wonder Gadot, who finished 10th, and last, in 2018. In the 154 prior editions of the Midsummer Derby, fillies have won it four times. It hasn't happened since 1915 when Lady Rotha did it.

McPeek said he also considered keeping Thorpedo Anna with her own kind. The \$600,000 GI Alabama is the biggest race for 3-year-old fillies on the Saratoga calendar. The Alabama, like the Travers, is run at $1\,1/4$ miles.

"If we were to run her against the fillies, the Alabama probably would be a bit of a non-event, which is wonderful, I suppose," McPeek said. "But is it good for the sport? The (Travers) purse is twice as much and I get five pounds. I'm not scared to do it."

McPeek said one of the reasons he schooled Thorpedo Anna in the starting gate was because of the start in the CCA Oaks. He said he will take her to the gate again a couple more times before the Travers.

Thorpedo Anna is scheduled to work next Saturday, McPeek said.

"I think it's fun doing this kind of stuff," he said. "It just makes the sport more interesting, doesn't it?"

SARATOGA NOTEBOOK: IT'S POST TIME FOR RUSSELL IN WHITNEY STAKES by Tim Wilkin

SARATOGA SPINGS, N.Y. - It's 'Post Time' for the 97th running

of the \$1-million GI Whitney Stakes.

Well, actually, the race is still a week away, but if you are trainer Brittany Russell, you're darn right it's Post Time.

As in **Post Time** (Frosted), the 4-year-old colt that will make a return trip to Saratoga Race Course. Last month, Post Time, owned by Hillwood Stable, LLC, won the race for second in the GI Metropolitan Handicap. Post Time beat **Hoist the Gold** (Mineshaft) by a neck.

No one was going to beat **National Treasure** (Quality Road), who won the Met Mile by 6 1/4 lengths for Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert.

Assuming National Treasure goes in the Whitney--Baffert said he would make a final decision after his colt works Sunday in California--Russell would welcome the chance for the rematch.

"National Treasure is a very good horse," Russell said by phone from Maryland. "We are going to have to really put our running shoes on. (National Treasure) will be hard to beat. We will show up and we'll give it our best."

Post Time, a Maryland-bred, has eight wins, two seconds and a third in 11 career starts. The Met Mile was his first start in Grade I company. He has a pair of graded stakes wins on his resume in the GII Carter Stakes at Aqueduct and the GIII General George Stakes at Laurel.

Russell knows that when she gives a leg up to her husband/jockey Sheldon Russell, she is going to get the absolute best that Post Time has. He has never disappointed her.

"He is just a good, honest horse," Brittany Russell said. "He loves his job, he trains, he doesn't miss a beat. He just shows up to the track and does his work every day. Sometimes we wonder if we are doing enough with him."

Post Time had his final Whitney work Saturday at the Fair Hill Training Center, going four furlongs in :49 (7/28) with Russell's assistant Emma Wolfe on board.

"He went very good," Russell said. "He's ready to go."

And he will go to Saratoga on Tuesday. Russel said that Wolfe will accompany Post Time on the trip to the Spa and expects that he will go to the track on Wednesday.


Brightwork Ready to Get Back to Work in Test

Last year, **Brightwork** (Outwork) had herself a summer at Saratoga.

As a 2-year-old, the filly romped to a five-length win in the six-furlong GIII Adirondack and then won the 6 1/2-furlong GI Spinaway by a half-length.

Trainer John Ortiz and owner Bill Simon hope a return to the Spa will bring more success to the filly. She will make her first start since November in the \$500,000, GI Test Stakes next Saturday. The Test is seven furlongs.

Once she left the Spa last year, there was a fizzle as Ortiz

stretched her out. Brightwork was fifth in the GI Alcibades Stakes at Keeneland and then sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Santa Anita. Both of those races were at 1 1/16 miles.

Those two losses followed four straight wins to start her career.

"We tried her at two turns twice and she didn't seem to want to do that," Simon, the former President and CEO of Walmart, said outside Ortiz's barn on the Saratoga backstretch Saturday morning. "She decided she wanted to be a sprinter."

And here she is in the Test. Ortiz didn't flinch when deciding this would be the landing spot for Brightwork. Since the Breeders' Cup, she was given designed time off and then had a minor issue (bone bruise) that kept her out a little longer.

After working at Keeneland earlier in the spring, Brightwork

has had two works at Saratoga and is scheduled to have her final pre-Test breeze on Sunday.

"We really wanted to give her a good break," Ortiz said at the barn. "We really squeezed the lemon on her for her 2-year-old year. She really has not missed a beat since we got her back. Look at her, she is as tight and fit as you want a horse going into a race like this."

Simon, who was preparing to feed Brightwork some carrots on this gorgeous Saturday morning, marveled at the way she looked. He has owned horses since 2017 and Brightwork is easily the best he has ever had.

"She is a dreamboat," he said. "You want to see a horse improve from two to three and she has. You want to see them get bigger and she has. She has given us every indication that she will be a better version of herself this year than last year."

Jockeys Ready To Stretch The Vocal Chords For

No one is ever going to confuse Hall of Fame jockey John Velazquez with Frank Sinatra.

Johnny V and the rest of the jockey colony at Saratoga will swap their goggles and riding crops for microphones and duets Sunday night when the annual Jockey Karaoke event is held at Vapor Night Club in the Spa City.

It is the biggest fundraiser of the season for the Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund.

"It means a lot," Velazquez, also the President of the Jockey Guild, said while making the rounds on the Saratoga backstretch Saturday morning. "I am a horrible singer, but I do it for a great cause."

Velazquez said he will perform with his wife, Leona (who, Johnny V says, carries the duo). He would not give away the song they'll sing but did drop a hint when he said it will be a number from the movie "Grease." And there will costumes. **Cont. p10**



John Travolta? Olivia Newton-John? Johnny V would only smile.

General admission tickets for the event are still available at \$75. The event begins at 8 p.m.

"Every year we get a good crowd and it's fun," said Velazquez, who said Junior Alvarado and Jose Ortiz might be the best crooners in the group. "We're hoping to continue to have a great show and raise more money for a good cause."

Clerical Error Leads to Late Scratch

The John Ortiz-trained **Master of Arms** (Mastery) was scratched from Saturday's third race, a \$25,000 claimer, due to a clerical error. "Based on the conditions of the race, Master of Arms was required to carry 123 pounds," NYRA spokesman Patrick McKenna said in a statement. "Due to a clerical error, the horse was provided the first allowance of three pounds and was weighted at 120 pounds in today's program. Upon discovery of the incorrect weight, the horse was scratched by order of the stewards."

BRIGHT FUTURE LEADS WHITNEY WORKERS

Stakes at Monmouth June 15, posted his final work in preparation for next Saturday's GI Whitney, covering a half-mile in :48.75 (32/104) Saturday over the Saratoga Race Course main track.

Trained by Hall of Famer Todd Pletcher, last year's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes winner went in company with MGSW and Whitney possible **Charge It** (Tapit).

"He worked well and I'm happy with him," Pletcher said.

"Charge It also went well. I think Bright Future is training great and his works have all been solid. He's enthusiastic in his gallops."

Pletcher could also be represented in the Whitney by **Crupi** (Curlin). He made the grade two starts back with a strong victory in the GII Suburban June 8 and followed with a runner-up effort to Next (Not This Time)--the marathon division's clear leader--in the 1 3/8-mile GII Brooklyn July 5 at Belmont at the Big A.

"We're leaning towards running, but we haven't committed yet," Pletcher said. "I'll talk to the owners, and we'll see if we take a shot with him."

MGSW and last out GI Stephen Foster Stakes third **Skippylongstocking** (Exaggerator) worked a half-mile in company in :49.97 (77/104) Saturday over the Saratoga Race Course main track in preparation for a possible start in the Whitney.

"It was a good breeze. We had him sit off his workmate a little bit and just come up inside him and finish up together," trainer Saffie Joseph, Jr. said. "We let him go out a little bit on his own and we got that--just a chance to build his confidence and let him blow some air."

MGSW **II Miracolo** (Gun Runner) breezed five furlongs in 1:02 (15/26) Saturday over the fast main track. Trainer Antonio Sano confirmed the chestnut for the Whitney after the solo breeze under Hall of Famer John Velazquez.

"Yes," Sano said regarding entering the Whitney tomorrow. "I hope the horse is good in the Whitney. No easy race, but our horse has a very good chance and I'll try."

He added, "I liked the gallop out. John Velazquez rode the horse very easy and let him loose in the last two furlongs."

THE CHOSEN VRON DOES IT AGAIN IN BING CROSBY

In defending his title in Del Mar's GI Bing Crosby Stakes, **The Chosen Vron** (Vronsky) showed why he's the most popular California-bred in years, harkening back to other multiple Grade I winners from the Golden State the likes of California Chrome, Tiznow, and Best Pal. The Bing Crosby is a 'Win and You're In' for the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint in November, giving the popular chestnut another try and a fees-paid berth into the six-furlong championship race after finishing fifth last year. **Closethegame Sugar** (Girvin), who shipped in off of two straight black-type wins and 99 Beyers at Churchill Downs, was second while previously two-for-two **Jackstown** (Speightstown) got up for third in his first stakes attempt.

Last year, The Chosen Vron endured a rough trip in the Bing Crosby, including checking off heels, and still gutted out a win by a determined head. This year, he had no such issues despite

facing a salty field. He hopped out of the gate, quickly finding company to his inside, and ranged up four wide early as the first quarter clicked by in :22.73 while **Anarchist** (Distorted Humor)—a MGSW who finished second last year in the Bing Crosby—showed the way narrowly. It wasn't long, prior to the half registering in :45.36, before The Chosen Vron tired of tracking and snatched the lead for himself. Kicking clear in the stretch, he was never threatened and sailed under the wire by 2 1/4 lengths a much-the-best winner. Regular rider Hector Berrios simply shook the crop at him down the lane before pumping his fist in jubilation repeatedly before the wire.

"He was marvelous, really comfortable on the outside," said Berrios. "From the three-eighths [pole] I let him go and he went himself. It's a Grade I; you don't always win these. It pays to have a good a healthy horse. I hope he continues for Breeders' Cup."

Winning trainer J. Eric Kruljac added: "[Berrios] got out and had him in the thick of it. When it was time to move his hands, the rest was history. The other horses tried to keep up with him. He just wouldn't let them. It's one of his best races."

Undefeated in six starts since that out-of-character fifth in last year's Breeders' Cup and last seen capturing the May 25 Thor's Echo Stakes at Santa Anita, The Chosen Vron has won 14 of his last 15 starts, dating back to the late summer of 2022. The gelding has raced exclusively in black-type events for his entire career with the exception of his debut in a statebred maiden in 2020. He's won 19 of 24, only once took an extended break (the first half of 2022), and has five graded wins among his 17 stakes wins. He races for the partnership of trainer Kruljac, Sondereker Racing LLC, Robert S. Fetkin, and Richard Thornburgh.



Pedigree Notes:

The Chosen Vron is one of five graded winners out of 14 black-type winners for the late Vronsky, who was one of California's leading active stallions until he passed away in 2021 of an apparent heart attack after covering a mare at Harris Farms. Despite modest crops, the son of Danzig is responsible for both The Chosen Vron and additional GISW What a View, as well as MGSW & GISP Closing Remarks.

Former Spendthrift stallion Tiz Wonderful is the broodmare sire of the Bing Crosby winner and has 11 stakes winners out of his daughters, including champion and \$3.2-million Fasig-Tipton mare Wonder Wheel (Into Mischief). Tiz Wonderful spent a decade standing in Korea before his death was reported in March of this year.

The Chosen Vron's winning dam, Tiz Molly, sold for \$1,200 to The Chosen Vron's co-owner Dick Thornburgh at the CTBA January mixed sale in 2019. From the same family as 2010 Canadian champion 2-year-old filly Delightful Mary (Limehouse) and MGSW & GISP Delightful Kiss (Kissin Kris), she has produced fillies by Clubhouse Ride the last three years. Her unraced 2-year-old has been named Clubhouse Cutie.

DR. VENKMAN CRUISES EN ROUTE TO SAN **DIEGO HANDICAP VICTORY**

In a race featuring the return of heralded 'TDN Rising Star' Arabian Knight (Uncle Mo), it was the lightly raced 4-year-old **Dr. Venkman** (Ghostzapper) who stole the show en route to a win in the GII San Diego Handicap Saturday at Del Mar. A winner last year of his first two starts at Del Mar by a combined 10 3/4 lengths, the Mark Glatt runner shipped east to just miss by a head in the Perryville Stakes at Keeneland in October. Off a long layoff, he reappeared in California to contest the GII Triple Bend Stakes at Santa Anita June 1, running second in a four-horse field as the favorite to Happy Jack (Oxbow).

The 3-1 second choice Saturday behind Arabian Knight's 2-5 offering, Dr. Venkman, who was trying two turns for the first time, broke on even terms with that rival but let him go on with things, taking back to sit second into the first turn and up the backstretch through fractions of :23.06 and :46.95 as the field seemed content to sit single file. Things began to tighten up amongst the leaders and Dr. Venkman, under a motionless Antonio Fresu, drew alongside the pacesetter and quickly stuck a head in front. As they came past the quarter pole, it quickly became evident that Arabian Knight had little response to offer and the eventual winner was left to fend off only a late challenge from a closing Katonah (Klimt), who outran his 20-1 odds to finish second.

"He has speed, so the plan was to use it," said Fresu. "The question was going to be if he could go this far. We stayed close to the favorite, then on the turn we picked him up. When my horse made the lead, he waited. I switched sticks and hit him left handed and he responded. Good win for sure."

Mark Glatt added: "He relaxed beautifully. Antonio (Fresu) pushed the button at the right time. I was pretty confident around the quarter pole. I thought he had more horse than the pacesetter, then it was just the question of getting on by him. He kind of got to wandering a little bit in the stretch but he ran great."

Pedigree Notes:

Dr. Venkman becomes the 58th graded/104th stakes winner worldwide for Ghostzapper. The Ghostzapper/Arch cross is also responsible for MGISW Contested and GSWs Proctor's Ledge and In Good Spirits. Dr. Venkman is the first graded winner for broodmare sire Archarcharch. Theory of Change, a \$45,000 purchase by Hidden Brook, agent, at the 2017 KEENOV sale, is also responsible for the 2-year-old colt Cracking Connor (Street Sense) (\$190,000 KEESEP yearling purchase by Christophe Clement, agent) and a Maxfield colt of this year. She was bred to Cody's Wish for 2025.

A top vote-getter back in April for the office of Canadian champion 3-year-old, Paramount Prince once again proved his affinity for Woodbine's all-weather surface as he took home the GII Seagram Cup.

Owner of last year's Plate Trial--King's Plate double, in his latest form cycle in Toronto the chestnut was third in the GII Eclipse Stakes June 1 and won in front-running fashion by 3 3/4 lengths the Dominion Day Stakes June 29.

Backed as the 6-5 choice here, the gelding broke alertly from outside gate and surgically cut to the front pointing into the first turn. Making every pole a winning one, the 4-year-old faced a brief challenge before the far turn from Stanley House, but quickly shrugged that off to take a commanding lead turning for home. On cruise control, Paramount Prince proved best to secure his second piece of graded hardware.

"I just can't believe this horse," said co-owner Mike Langlois. "He's got character, a personality of his own. I love that guy to death. I visit him every week. I talk to him. He's like a family pet

The result for the 100th running of the GIII Monmouth Oaks is now entered in Oceanport's historical ledger and the race went to Scalable, who proved best in the final sixteenth to take home her first graded stakes win.

The gray began her 3-year-old campaign at Gulfstream Park by breaking her maiden by six lengths at second asking in early January. The filly then missed the board when she was fourth in the GIII Forward Gal Stakes a month later in Hallandale and finished fifth in the Gulfstream Park Oaks Mar. 30. Switching to the grass at Churchill Downs, the Todd Pletcher trainee was well-beaten on the GI Kentucky Oaks undercard in the GII Edgewood Stakes. Back on the dirt in her latest start, Scalable delivered a win by a head in an optional claimer in Louisville June 29.

Off as the third choice on the tote at 3-1 here, she allowed a trio of would-be leaders to duke it out into the first turn. Finally, Little Jamie wrangled the top spot heading up the backstretch, but was tracked closely by favorite Gun Song. As the pair began to separate themselves from the rest of the field around the far turn, Scalable was on the move as she tipped to the outside by the top of the lane. Taking on the chalk past the eighth pole, the filly showed her mettle as she took control at the sixteenth marker and got her picture taken.

"She's been here a while now and has been training really good," Pletcher assistant Anthony Sciametta said. "Once she was able to get to the outside, that's really all she needed. It was an impressive race from her."

Pedigree Notes:

This is the 66th graded stakes winner for the now deceased sire of sires Speightstown (by Gone West). Scalable is the first registered foal out of Passion Flower, who is also responsible for

A winner on both turf and Tapeta, Time to Dazzle made her first start Saturday off a four-month layoff dating back to a sixth-place finish in the GIII Herecomesthebride Stakes at Gulfstream in early March. Returning to the course and distance which gave her a three-length win on debut, the 11-1 shot took some money down off her 20-1 morning line to contest her third straight stakes race.

Breaking from the outside, Time to Dazzle out-jumped the field and was headstrong on the front, opening up a clear gap back to Tripolina (Constitution) and Sabatini (Uncle Mo). Still loose heading into the far turn, the longshot cruised through a half in

:47.07 with an sizeable advantage and it was clear off the turn that the race would be only for second. Under a hand ride, Time to Dazzle strolled home an easy winner with only Simply in Front making up any ground on her late.

"I wasn't expecting her to be on the lead," said winning rider Sahin Civaci. "But she popped up really good and she was comfortable up there. The fractions were decent. They weren't slow by any means, but she was going easy, and she held on."

Pedigree Note:

The 36th stakes winner and 16th graded winner for Not This Time, Time to Dazzle is out of the Unbridled's Song mare Staria, who has produced MSW Sir Genghis (Tale of the Cat) and SP Holiday Song (Harlan's Holiday) among her four winners. This is the family of Canadian dual champion Irish Mission (Giant's Causeway). Staria has not produced a foal since Time to Dazzle despite being reported as bred to Sharp Azteca for this year.

'NO-EFFECT' THRESHOLDS TO PURSE ACCOUNTS ROUND OUT FINAL DAY OF NATIONAL HBPA CONFERENCE

On Friday--the final day of the National HBPA Conference at Prairie Meadows--a panel entitled "Establishing No-Effect Thresholds and the Importance for the Industry" was led by practicing equine veterinarian and researcher Dr. Clara Fenger.

She cited the Horseracing Integrity & Safety Authority's enabling legislation that HISA-covered horses "should compete only when they are free from the influence of medications ..." (her emphasis added).

Fenger's point: Testing many substances to limit of detection-if the lab can find it, it's a violation, no matter how tiny the amount and whether it impacts the horse's performance or not - -actually goes against the federal law that set up the HISA corporation. She said HISA has justified not having more threshold levels by saying that certain substances have no business being in a racehorse at any level.

Also on the panel were Dr. Thomas Tobin, a pioneer in equine testing, and Dr. Rob Holland, another equine practitioner who globally consults on infectious diseases. The discussion also featured horse trainer Ron Moquett, who shared his own story on environmental transfer.

All four made the case that horse racing must adopt "no-effect" thresholds in racehorse testing for substances that are readily present in the environment. Such policy requires science-based testing levels, below which any trace level findings are disregarded because they have no pharmacological effect on a horse. Tobin for years has been using the term "irrelevant" findings.

The National HBPA and its CEO Eric Hamelback have been the leading advocates for no-effect thresholds, saying it is unfair to sanction trainers and penalize their owners when horses are disqualified from purse money for the presence of a tiny amount of a substance they couldn't have prevented. The National HBPA currently has a petition before the Federal Trade Commission asking the federal agency, which is tasked with overseeing HISA, to enact such policies.

Tobin has been working on no-effect thresholds since 1994. That work includes this year publishing documentation and recommendation of a methamphetamine threshold of 1 nanogram per milliliter of plasma. He referenced research published in 2019 that showed blood levels testing as high as 88.4 ng/mL with no signs of neuron-stimulation or cardio effect. A coalition of researchers that includes Tobin and Fenger has published research recommending testing thresholds for a dozen substances that have been showing up in horses seemingly through environmental or human transfer.

As an example: One recommendation awaiting publication is for the heavily prescribed painkiller Tramadol, with Tobin observing a Kentucky trainer served a suspension for a finding of less than 3 ng/mL of urine.

"There was absolutely no possibility of pharmacological effect," Tobin said. "I have proposed that anything below 50 nanograms per mL of Tramadol as a metabolite in urine should not be considered of any significance."

Holland said every horse that races could potentially pick up trace levels of a prohibited substance from 20 to 30 different-and routine--contact points. Those might include not just the trainer or groom but a van driver, a horse drinking out of another horse's water bucket in the test barn, the prior horse in that stall in the receiving barn, pony riders and outriders, the test-barn employee known as the "pee-catcher", veterinarians

and many others. Even dogs and cats around a barn.

Holland also said as part of an investigation into the risks of environmental contamination, they swabbed 12 stalls at a track that has a large yearling sale and all 12 tested for Dexamethasone and Acepromazine, which are not allowed to be in a horse's system for a race. He said one of the swabs was high enough that it would have triggered an adverse finding in a racehorse. Even with thorough cleaning, he said the honeycomb design of the stall floor mats made it impossible to eliminate all the dirt.

"That stall should be subject to a \$25,000 fine and two years where you can't compete," Moquett joked, "if they treated the racetracks like they treat the trainers."

Added Holland: "That's why we have to explain these things to people: There are things that are out of your control as a trainer. Like the stall they assign to you. You clean it the best you can, but sometimes you're still going to have a problem. And this is what the data is showing."

He said the diabetes medication Metformin, for which HIWU has called a number of adverse findings, lends itself to environmental transfer. Metformin is given daily to humans in large doses and is excreted in its original form. That's a problem given a backstretch habit of humans urinating in a stall when a bathroom isn't handy, he said.

"The fact that 20 to 30 individual contacts could occur, and that's the No. 3 drug in the world to treat humans, your odds of getting urine environmental transfer are getting higher and higher with Metformin," Holland said. "I give a lot of tracks credit. They saw there weren't enough bathrooms so they put Port-A-Potties everywhere. The problem with Port-A-Potties is how do you wash your hands?"

Holland also is involved in a project testing the water at racetracks. "Metformin, caffeine, codeine, Tramadol--many of

these medications at low levels are coming out of your water sources, because they can't get it out of the treatment plant areas," he said. "We're building a database for this. It could have added meaning. If (your horse) came in contact with Metformin from an individual but you're also drinking low-levels in your water, that could be enough to get you over the threshold level for a test in a racing situation."

Moquett, who is on HISA's Horsemen's Advisory Group, learned the hard way how easy it can be for a horse to pick up a substance banned for racing.

He was cited in November by the Horseracing Integrity & Welfare Unit (HIWU) for his horse Speed Bias having a post-test finding for a local anesthetic. Through spending a lot of money and effort, Moquett was ultimately held blameless, though the horse remained disqualified from purse money. What happened is that Moquett had a different horse castrated in a stall nine days earlier, with the veterinarian using the same anesthetic to inject the testicles--all duly reported to HISA--before Speed Bias shipped in to run out of the same stall.

Fortunately for Moquett, the track's barn video documented the effort the trainer's crew underwent to strip, clean and sanitize the stall--on three separate occasions, he said.

Moquett said his big concern is the erosion of confidence in the sport by treating irrelevant levels of substances common in the environment as major rule violations.

"We're trying to explain to the people in charge to set levels, to where you're not catching and accusing for things that have no effect on racing," he said.

Moquett stressed that trainers also must make it clear to employees that "it's not OK to urinate in the stalls. It's not OK to take your Red Bull in (the stall) with you. It's not OK to put your coffee cup in a feed tub.... I hate to say this, but if there's someone on Metformin for blood pressure (working for him or asking about a job), I'm going to have to try to find someone who may not be."

Fenger praised the National HBPA and its affiliates for providing funding for the threshold studies. Moquett encouraged HBPA affiliates to keep the money coming, saying, "Probably more than anything going on today, the work they're doing has the biggest effect on the outcome of our sport."

Regarding Purse Accounts: Trust But Verify

The presentation called "Show Me The Money" featured Gunner LaCour, president of CHRIMS Inc., which specializes in pari-mutuel distributions, settlements, editing and reporting and the only independent provider of settlements in the United States. LaCour, who started the company in California with the Thoroughbred Owners of California as a stakeholder, said that whether horsemen's groups opt to use his non-profit or another

company, they should enlist a company that can provide daily audits to ensure horsemen are getting all the purse money to which they are entitled in an increasing complicated environment.

LaCour said it's important for horsemen to know all their revenue streams and every aspect of those streams--or they risk literally leaving money on the table. He said roadblocks to achieving that knowledge can be lack of data, relying on a racing commission, alternative gaming revenue can be tougher to determine, lack of time and resources and simply long-standing relationships with tracks might make such accounting seem unnecessary.

"All of these can lead to potential of distribution discrepancies, even if there is no intent," he said. "Trust but verify. You can have these great relationships with these tracks... or maybe just get rid of the first two words, just verify. Make sure your horsemen are getting everything they're entitled to... Be proactive, instead of reactive. Know the data. If you understand your data, that's power. Make sure you're staying on top of it."

'Living Legend' Poindexter Interviewed

Also on Friday during the National HBPA awards luncheon, lowa HBPA executive director Jon Moss interviewed owner-breeder Allen Poindexter for the National HBPA's Living Legend series.

Poindexter's runners include multiple stakes-winning horses at Prairie Meadows and other tracks across the country, with his stable earnings exceeding \$18 million. In 1991, Poindexter started a plumbing, heating and air-conditioning business called Allen's Mechanical.

"It was very successful from the start," he said. "So, I was able to buy a horse out of the field, and his name was No Tomorrow. I took him to Oaklawn and got Scooter Dickey to be my trainer. We ran him the first time for \$8,000 claiming. He went wire to wire with Pat Day aboard. So I was hooked. We ran him back for \$16,000 claiming. He goes wire to wire once again. So, now I'm really hooked."

DR. DOUG DANIELS RE-ELECTED NATIONAL HBPA **PRESIDENT**



The RHSA would replace HISA with a system that accomplishes the same goals but with full transparency, much more input by horsemen, science-based regulations and with a far cheaper price tag. Daniels is a member of HISA's Horsemen's Advisory Group.

CONSTITUTION'S SPEAK EASY BACKS UP DAZZLING DEBUT WITH 'TDN RISING STAR' WIN AT SARATOGA

Unraced since a gate scratch in the GII Coolmore Fountain of Youth Stakes in March, **Speak Easy** (Constitution) returned to the races off a six-month layoff Saturday to become the newest '**TDN Rising Star**'. A dazzling debut winner going seven furlongs at Gulfstream in January, the WinStar and Siena Farm-owned colt tossed up a 100 Beyer Speed Figure in a race that has since produced Sir Barton Stakes winner Corporate Power (Curlin) and GIII Ohio Derby victor Batten Down (Tapit).

Shortened to six furlongs for his first start back, Speak Easy was outrun by runners on all sides from the middle of the gate and quickly found himself in the second flight while kept just to the outside of the field to avoid the kickback. A solo fifth into the far turn as Mariachi (Maclean's Music) paced the leaders, the 3-5 favorite had plenty to do to keep up but began to eat into the gap midway around the turn and fanned out five-wide past the quarter pole. Under only a shake of the reins from Irad Ortiz, Jr., Speak Easy began to gobble up the ground down the center of the track, drew past an embattled Mariachi at the sixteenth marker and won going away with his ears pricked on the line to stay perfect in his young career.

The 11th 'TDN Rising Star' for WinStar stallion Constitution, who was a 'Rising Star' himself, Speak Easy is the second foal and only winner to date out of GI Darley Alcibiades Stakes third Fun (Harlan's Holiday) who was purchased by WinStar Farm for \$400,000 at FTKNOV in 2017. Fun is a half to stakes winner Home Run Maker (Into Mischief) and to the dam of stakes-placed colt Open Road (Quality Road). She has an unraced 2-year-old filly named Geaux Amy (Improbable), a yearling

Twirling Candy colt and foaled a filly by Jack Christopher this year before visiting American revolution for 2025.

CHANCER MCPATRICK A FIRST 'TDN RISING STAR' FOR MCKINZIE

A \$725,000 2-year-old out of OBS April, **Chancer McPatrick** (McKinzie) became his freshman sire's (by Street Sense) first 'TDN Rising Star' and third overall winner with a come-from-behind win in Saturday's seventh race at Saratoga.

The 2-1 favorite broke with the field but was outsprinted early and plummeted back off of heels to the back of the pack as **T Kraft** (Connect) and **Invictus** (Into Mischief), the first foal out of GI Kentucky Oaks winner Serengeti Empress, led up the backstretch. Nearly last of the 10-horse field, Chancer McPatrick was left with a lot of work to do and a wall of runners in front of him as the half went in :45.34. With a massive effort off the far turn, he circled the field while six wide under Flavien Prat and roared home down the middle of the track to nail T Kraft, who looked home free, in the shadow of the wire despite switching back to his left lead late to win by a length.

MGISW McKinzie, who stands at Gainesway for \$30,000, now has three winners from his first crop to the races. Bernadreamy, a winning daughter of leading broodmare sire Bernardini and out of GISW Dream Empress, now has two winners from as many to race as Chancer McPatrick joins his 5-year-old half-sister Split Decision (Daredevil). Bernadreamy has a yearling colt by Liam's Map who is her youngest reported offspring.

GIVE JOHN KIMMEL AN ASSIST FOR BROWN'S MAIDEN WIN WITH CHANCER

SARATIOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.--Give an assist to trainer John Kimmel for fellow conditioner Chad Brown's latest 2-year-old win at Saratoga Race Course.

Come again?

Well, after the seventh race at the Spa was complete Saturday afternoon and Chancer McPatrick (McKinzie) was getting his picture taken, it was rival trainers Kimmel and Brown who were huddled together. They shared some laughs and a handshake.

While Brown got Chancer McPatrick ready for his debut, a 6 1/2-furlong \$100,000 maiden special weight, it was Kimmel who got the horse to Brown's barn.

Chancer McPatrick is owned by Sean Flanagan's Flanagan Racing. It was Kimmel who bought the horse--along with Nick Sallusto--at the 2024 Ocala Breeders' Spring Sale of 2-year-olds in training. The price tag was \$725,000 for the freshman stallion. Besides training, Kimmel is a bloodstock advisor.

"I feel lucky that John found this horse and sent him to us," Brown said as he walked through the clubhouse after the race.

Sean Flanagan, who is from Boston, was not at the Spa to see his rookie run. Wherever he was, suffice it to say, it must have felt like St. Patrick's Day

"I've been buying horses for Mr. Flanagan and Flanagan Racing," Kimmel said, "We thought [Chancer McPatrick] had a fabulous breeze and he passed all our examinations and the other stuff you go through. Really, really nice horse." Cont.

Since coming to the Brown barn, Chancer McPatrick has had nine workouts, all at Saratoga. He tuned up for his career debut with a four-furlong breeze in 47.89 seconds (3/138) on July 21.

Chancer McPatrick was the 2-1 favorite in the field of 10, which also included Invictus (Into Mischief), a \$1.2-million purchase at the 2023 Keeneland September Sale. He finished seventh.

It was not a great start for Chancer McPatrick and jockey Flavien Prat, who had plenty to do after some early trouble.

"Flavien said he lost his action on the backside when coming out of the chute area," Brown said. "He was going to be about mid-pack and horse slipped and lost his action. He was way back further than he wanted to be."

As he watched Chancer McPatrick fall 10 lengths behind at the half, Brown was resigned to the fact that perhaps it wasn't his day. But, when Prat got Chancer McPatrick into the clear, he took off and gobbled up all the ground in the stretch.

He passed the pacesetter T Kraft (Connect) and won by a

Chancer McPatrick was timed in 1:17.99.

"[Prat] said once he got his feet up underneath him and took him out of the kickback, he made a move you don't see very often in young horses," Kimmel said.

"Once he got into gear, and from what I have seen from in the morning, I knew he had a serious turn of foot," Brown said. "We like this horse a lot."

'VETERAN' SIMULATE SHOWS THE WAY IN SARATOGA MAIDEN SPECIAL By Mike Kane

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.--A pinch of seasoning produced a maiden-breaking recipe for Simulate (Kitten's Joy) Saturday in the opener at Saratoga Race Course.

Making his second career start for Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott, Simulate was in front from gate to wire on the inner turf course to win the \$100,000 maiden special weight for 2-year-olds by a head over State's Rights (Constitution). The son of Camou (War Front), a half-sister to GI winner Lea, completed the 1 1/16 miles contest in 1:45.46. He paid \$19.60 as the 8-1 fourth choice in the field of 10.

Mott prepped the Claiborne Farm-Adele B. Dilschneider homebred on June 23 at Aqueduct and said that the no-factor sixth in a six-furlong sprint had him ready for round two.

"We just wanted to get a race in him for experience," Mott said, "because we knew we were coming to Saratoga and a lot of the horses that win in Saratoga have had a race under their belt."

Mission accomplished. Simulate got what he needed.

"Yeah, absolutely," Mott said. "It worked out today."

State's Rights, who finished well after stumbling at the start, and fourth-place West Beach (Omaha Beach) were the only horses in the race with a previous start. West Beach missed third by a neck.

Simulate was Mott's sixth victory of the meet and his first in an open maiden special weight for 2-year-olds.

Under Jose Lezcano, Simulate broke well from his inside post and grabbed the lead. They covered the first quarter mile in :24.38 and put themselves in an enviable position with a dawdling second quarter in :27.13.

"They slowed the pace down," Mott said. "The rail's out. They cut the corner. Speed's tough if they go slow enough in the first part. That was good."

Before going out to the paddock to saddle a horse in the second race, Mott watched two replays of Simulate's win. The pan and head-on shots gave Mott more insight into what he had seen live through his binoculars. Cont.

"Just that he's got some acceleration," Mott said. "He kind of re-broke off a slow pace. He turned for home and he asked him to kick and he gave him a few good strides where he accelerated. He got away from them and that's all it took."

Simulate also showed some grit when Warlander (Kitten's Joy) and then State's Rights served up some pressure.

"He got hooked up at the quarter pole," Mott said. "They ran to him."

Simulate spurted away a bit at the top of the stretch and then dug in approaching the wire.

"I'm not overly surprised," Mott said. "We've liked him in his training. He's done nothing wrong."

An impressive 6 1/4-length debut winner last June at Santa Anita Park, the Repole color bearer would pick up a stakes success in her second career start when she took the state-bred restricted California Thoroughbred Breeders' Association Stakes gate to wire, and beating Grand Slam Smile to boot. She faded to seventh in the GI Del Mar Debutante Stakes that September to wrap her 2023 season and started 2024 with a runner-up effort July 4 at Los Alamitos in an optional claimer.

The 5-2 second choice as she sped through :21.93 and :44.31 opening splits with the race favorite Grand Slam Smile glued to her hip. The two fillies cleared away from the group and Pushiness had given her pressure the slip passing the three-eighths pole, and had opened up a margin she only extended to the wire. It was 3 1/2 lengths between them in the end while Safa came on strongly from the back to claim third.

"Always with her the question mark was 'Can she do the distance?'," said Umberto Rispoli. "She is a fast filly and she has some good gate speed. The track has been very fast, so we were wishing that her gate speed would help. It did, and she had a good blow out around the turn and she kept on for the finish. I leave it to Michael on where she goes from here."

Trainer Michael McCarthy added, "We made it real simple and told him [Rispoli] to bounce out of there and hopefully find yourself on the lead and that's exactly what she did. The filly has a lot of natural speed. At the quarter pole when [Grand Slam Smile] wasn't making up any ground, I had a decent feeling that she'd hold on."

Out of a multiple stakes-placed daughter of Graded-winner Apple of Kent, who also ran third in the GI Hempstead Handicap in her day, Pushiness is the most accomplished of her siblings to make the races. Their dam has two fillies in the wings--a yearling by Known Agenda and a 2024 Bodexpress. Imperial Pippin visited Arabian Lion for 2025.




