# 'HE WAS FIRING ON ALL CYLINDERS TODAY': BUICK HAILS SUSSEX HERO NOTABLE SPEECH

Putting his G1 St James's Palace Stakes flop firmly behind him, Godolphin's **TDN Rising Star Notable Speech (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}--Swift Rose {Ire}, by Invincible Spirit {Ire}) rattled home in style to dominate Wednesday's G1 Qatar Sussex Stakes at Goodwood, a "Win and You're In" for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. On the limit in William Buick's hands following the pace set by **Henry Longfellow (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), the Charlie Appleby-trained G1 2,000 Guineas hero was able to relax once placed in a pocket behind that 11-10 favourite and **Sonny Liston (Ire)** (Lawman {Fr}).

Seizing the advantage up the inside with 150 yards remaining, the 3-1 second favourite surged clear for a 1 1/2-length success from the closer **Maljoom (Ire)** (Caravaggio), with last year's runner-up **Facteur Cheval (Ire)** (Ribchester {Ire}) a neck behind in third and Henry Longfellow paying for his early exertions in fourth.

"He was firing on all cylinders coming in here today," Buick said. "He was a brilliant Guineas winner with a turn of foot you very rarely see and we saw that again today." Cont. p3

#### **BIG WINS...BIG OFFERS**

Goodwood, UK -- In a near-repeat performance of last year, a Mick Appleby-trained 'Big' horse by a first-season sire, running in the red and blue silks of Paul and Rachael Teasdale's RP Racing Ltd, scorched to success in the G3 Molecomb Stakes.

What came next for Big Evs (Ire) (Blue Point {Ire}) was several victories moving up through the grades and rounding off his juvenile season in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint. It is a pretty safe bet that with each new victory came larger and larger offers from stallion studs. The phone is probably already starting to ring for his successor, Big Mojo (Ire) (Mohaather {GB}), too.

Big Evs, who runs in Friday's G2 King George Qatar Stakes has been strongly linked of late to the name of Tally-Ho Stud, one of the best in the business for getting fast young stallions off to a speedy start in their second career. Sensibly, his owner is preferring to focus on the racing season and would not be drawn as to the eventual location for Big Evs once his racing days are over. Cont. p5

"Full credit to the team," he added. "They've done such a fantastic job to get him back after a disappointing run in the St James's Palace Stakes, where we knew it was too bad to be true. He's a horse that really excites you and it's a real privilege to ride him."

Becoming the first colt since 1938 to win the Guineas without having raced at two, Notable Speech had nevertheless served notice that he was a serious piece of kit with displays that showcased his dramatic surge of acceleration in three Kempton Polytrack starts in January, February and April. His final act before his turf debut saw him close out the old "Easter Stakes" with fractions of :10.81 and :10.98 and so he went to Newmarket less an unknown quantity and more a lurking dark horse.

Perfectly suited by the bold early pace in that Classic and by the premature strike of Rosallion (Ire) (Blue Point {Ire}), the homebred picked off rivals one by one but at Royal Ascot he was too far out of his ground behind a moderate tempo and could only run hard into a pace that was already quickening ahead of him. What factor the outsider Sonny Liston had on Henry

Longfellow as he harrassed him throughout the early stages is hard to quantify, but where Ballydoyle's colt emptied late the Appleby runner was full of fuel.

As it was, the race was set up ideally for Rosallion but he wasn't here much to the dismay of his connections, who mentioned he is a possible entry for the G1 Prix Moulin on Sept. 8. At least the purists will get to see the rematch in a more balanced form now that Notable Speech will be re-engaging with the Hannon star with confidence restored. Appleby was quick to send a message to Hannon in the immediate aftermath. "First and foremost, I feel for Richard and all the team there with Rosallion, we wanted the 'duel on the Downs' and to have had two Classic winners coming here would have been fantastic," he said.

"There was still plenty of strength in depth there with the three-year-old in Henry Longfellow and the older horses and was a race that still had to be won," he added. "Disappointment always kicks in when you have an unbeaten horse and a Guineas winner beaten, but as I've always been taught, never look back, always look forward."

Appleby is understandably keen on the Breeders Cup. "Going forward, will he stretch any further? I don't think so," he continued. "There's no reason to go beyond a mile, people might mention the Breeders' Cup Mile." Cont. p4

He added, "The one thing about this horse is that he's maturing and from January onwards, he was running once a month and straight into a Guineas, so it was a quick and steep learning curve for him. We could see there was immaturity there going into Ascot, but today he's become more of a man."

Mauren Haggas said of Maljoom, who was running a careerbest and returning to the kind of form that had seen him be a luckless fourth in the 2022 G1 St James's Palace Stakes, "That was very good and each run this year he's got better. He's always slow away from the gates and you can't give these good horses ground, but he ran on very well. I'd like to try him over a mile and a quarter. He is a beautiful horse and I hope there's more to come."

Michael Tabor said of Henry Longfellow, "The horse alongside him early in the race hustled him up and Ryan said he was never comfortable on this track. He has to be a lot better than that, but only time will tell."



"We're talking to a few people about that and they're one of [the studs]. They're great people there but nothing has been decided yet," said Paul Teasdale. "Realistically he could have four more runs this year and we're looking forward to that."

He continued, "Now we'll have the same situation again but it's a nice problem to have and we're just delighted to have won this race two years running."

A maiden coming into Goodwood, Big Mojo had finished runner-up at Beverley on his racecourse debut earlier this month and he holds an entry for the G2 Gimcrack Stakes at York, which is run on the same day as the G1 Nunthorpe, in which Big Evs could also reappear.

Conor Quirke bought Big Mojo for the Teasdales at the Tattersalls December Yearling Sale for 175,000gns from the draft of his co-breeder Ringfort Stud.

The owner said, "Conor buys all our horses and he's bought another good one here. We bought him just after the Breeders' Cup. We are in racing to race and win and that's what we want to do. We are not in this to buy horses and sell them. We bought four two-year-olds at the end of last year and three of them are fantastically talented. The fourth we haven't really tried yet.

"Big Mojo is bred for six furlongs, so the Gimcrack Stakes will be the perfect race for him. We attended the Gimcrack dinner last year and have had a long-standing joke that I would like my wife to do the speech."

That joke looks a little more serious now, as does the current form of Mick Appleby, who had the first and third in the Molecomb, with Mr Lightside (Ire) (Earthlight {Ire}) finishing just a head behind the runner-up Aesterius (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}). He also enjoyed a double on Tuesday - at Goodwood and Beverley.

Appleby said of his Molecomb duo, "They could both go to America for the Breeders' Cup but Big Mojo will go to the Gimcrack first."

After Mick came Charlie with his returning Guineas hero Notable Speech (GB), who gave a welcome boost to the Classic form with his rousing victory in the G1 Qatar Sussex Stakes. He too nominated the Breeders' Cup at Del Mar as a suitable end-of-season for the Dubawi (Ire) colt, and he knows a thing or two about winning the Breeders' Cup Mile. Appleby has landed it for Godolphin for the last three years running with Space Blues (Ire), Modern Games (Ire) and Master Of The Seas (Ire) - all three of whom are also by Dubawi. May the fourth be with him.

#### **BACK-TO-BACK MOLECOMB WINS FOR CONNECTIONS OF BIG EVS AS BIG MOJO EDGES THRILLER** by Sean Cronin

The RP Racing-Michael Appleby axis annexed last year's edition of Goodwood's G3 Jaeger-Lecoultre Molecomb Stakes, with GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint hero Big Evs (Ire) (Blue Point {Ire}), and connections struck again as the maiden Big Mojo (Ire) (Mohaather {GB}--Jm Jackson {Ire}, by No Nay Never) edged a three-way thriller in this year's renewal of the five-furlong dash.

The 175,000gns Tattersalls December foal, who posted a debut second going five furlongs at Beverley earlier in the month, raced off the tempo in rear through the early stages. Making a smooth transition into contention once past halfway, the 25-1 outsider came under pressure to launch his bid entering the final furlong and kept on in resolute fashion to

prevail by 3/4-of-a-length and a head from Aesterius (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}) and stablemate Mr Lightside (Ire) (Earthlight {Ire}), becoming the second black-type winner for his freshman sire (by Showcasing {GB}).

"I couldn't split Big Mojo and Mr Lightside, I worked them together on Saturday and couldn't pick between them," Appleby explained. "They are both very good and wouldn't be far behind Big Evs either as two-year-olds. They could both go to America for the Breeders' Cup, but Big Mojo will go to the [G2] Gimcrack first. The owner [Paul Teasdale] wants his wife to do the speech as the winning owner at the Gimcrack dinner and, to be fair, this was our main target with him. It's good to get some good twoyear-olds because we can't train them apparently."

In the aftermath of collecting a 17th Glorious Goodwood win, Silvestre De Sousa added, "Big Mojo is an exciting horse. he's improved a lot since his last run in a maiden and it was a nice way to break his maiden in a Group 3. He has a lot of speed, I'd like him over six furlongs as well and he is only going to improve. I think he is a quality horse going forward. He is strong physically, but his mind is not there yet."

Teasdale revealed part of the winner's backstory and said, "We bought him just after the Breeders' Cup last year and wanted to call him Mojo, but we couldn't so we called him Big Mojo. We went to Beverley first time out and he was a little green, but he ran really well and then we've seen such an improvement. We were going to run in the maiden yesterday, but we said to Mick 'put him in the Molecomb and we'll see if he's good enough.' It's only his second race, but we're in racing to win, so that's what we are going to do. We are not in this to buy horses and sell them. We bought four two-year-olds at the end of last year and three of them are fantastically talented. The fourth we haven't really tried yet. Big Mojo is bred for six furlongs, so the Gimcrack Stakes will be the perfect race for him. We attended the Gimcrack dinner last year and have had a long-standing joke that I would like my wife [Rachael] to do the speech."

Archie Watson was not too downhearted reflecting on the runner-up finish of Aesterius. "You can't be unhappy," the trainer said. "He's just raced away from the winner a bit and these things happen in these big fields. He didn't really get to race against the winner there, but he's run a huge race and got his head down on the line to win the photo for second. He's very exciting, he's very professional and he's growing up race to race. Five furlongs I think is his trip and we'd love to finish off the year in Del Mar [for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint], if he can get there. I think that sort of race, a quick turning five on quick ground would suit him. Soldier's Call went from the [G3] Prix d'Arenberg on to the [G2] Flying Childers, and I would imagine we will do something along those lines as long as we are happy. So it will probably be Chantilly next." Cont. p7

## BLUE POINT'S RAQIYA AWARDED OAK TREE STAKES IN THE STEWARDS' ROOM

Shadwell's homebred Listed Cathedral Stakes victrix and G3 Summer Stakes sixth Raqiya (Ire) (Blue Point {Ire}--Rihaam {Ire}, by Dansili {GB}) flashed past the post a head adrift of Jabaara (Ire) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}) in Wednesday's G3 Visit Qatar Oak Tree Stakes at Goodwood, but was awarded the seven-furlong distaffers' heat in the stewards' room after that rival was deemed to have caused interference in the closing stages.

The Owen Burrows trainee, sent postward as a 7-1 chance, found a smooth rhythm along the fence in a handy third through halfway. Responding to pressure inside the final quarter-mile, she was forced to angle off the rail as Jabaara cut across her path with 100 yards remaining and lunged late to finish a head shy of that subsequently demoted rival.

"Roger [Varian] is one of my best mates and it is never nice to win one like that," said Burrows. "Jim [Crowley] felt we would have won with a clear run and, watching it a few times on the big screen, we probably felt we would have been an unlucky loser, but that is the way it goes here sometimes. It was there for all to see and it would have been a bit gutting not to get it. The most positive thing, even if we didn't get it, is that we learned seven furlongs on fast ground is her bag. That was a big positive to take out of it."

Crowley's enquiry evidence included, "I've had to wait until the cutaway and my filly is picking up. We've got the rail to run against and we've got plenty of clear room to go. The horse in front has just shifted across her and I've had to switch. I think she's lost a bit of momentum, I've had to check, then obviously she has stayed on again. I feel that, if that hadn't happened, she probably would have won. I stopped for about three strides and there's no question we have had to stop. With a clear run and, without losing her momentum, she would have won."

Varian commented, "I have only seen the race once and I don't want to comment on the interference or the stewards' decision. They have had the luxury of watching it many more times and from more angles than we have and they have come to that decision and we have to congratulate the winner. It's a shame. I think our filly was on top for most of the race, and maybe she just threw it away. I don't know what else to say. She ran well."



#### **'IT'S GOING TO BE REALLY INTERESTING':** O'BRIEN KEEN TO STRETCH OUT OPERA **SINGER IN THE NASSAU** by Tom Frary

Like stablemate Henry Longfellow (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), there is a sense that Ballydoyle's Opera Singer (Justify) is only just beginning to get her season underway as she steps up to a mile and a quarter for the first time in Thursday's G1 Qatar Nassau Stakes at Goodwood. Reportedly ring-rusty when third in the G1 Irish 1,000 Guineas at The Curragh and looking in need of further than a mile when runner-up in Royal Ascot's G1 Coronation Stakes, last year's impressive G1 Prix Marcel Boussac heroine has the opportunity to truly express herself once again.

"Obviously she is stepping up to a mile and a quarter from a mile for the first time and we think that is going to be really interesting," Aidan O'Brien said. "We were delighted with her at Ascot, really." Cont. p9

#### **Thursday's Preview Cont.**

The master of Ballydoyle continued, "That was just her second run and, to be honest, we couldn't believe how well she'd run first time in the Irish Guineas, given the setback she had in the spring. We thought her Ascot run was very good and obviously the form has been franked as Donnacha's filly came out and won the Falmouth at the July meeting. She's an exceptional filly, so she lost little in defeat."

#### What Next For Emily Upjohn?

While this trip could bring out the best in Opera Singer, it may be that she is simply not as good as the seasoned **Emily Upjohn (GB)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}) whose fortunes it is fair to say have been mixed since storming on to the scene early in her 3-year-old career. Brilliant despite being narrowly denied in the 2022

Oaks and in capturing the G1 Coronation Cup last term, she is unbeatable when things fall right but has yet to convince this trip is her thing and needs to race with more restraint than when suffering another reversal in the G1 Pretty Polly Stakes.

While the winner of that Curragh contest, Bluestocking (GB) (Camelot {GB}), has thoroughly franked the form in the King George and the third Content (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was probably the moral winner of the Irish Oaks in the interim, the Gosdens' mare showed a

tendency to overdo it there once again and a similar tendency on this tricky circuit could compromise her.

"She wasn't entered originally, because the plan was to go for the Pretty Polly and then maybe go on to Ascot for the King George, but we decided after the Curragh to stay at a mile and a quarter and go against the fillies again, then step her back up to a mile and a half again in the Yorkshire Oaks," John Gosden explained. "She's a top-of-the-ground filly and she ran a great race at the Curragh, but that rain came and she's not happy on it. She's won on it, but it's not her best surface. All being well, she'll run a big one."

#### Plenty To Offer...

The Nassau has drawn the G1 Prix de Diane winner every year since 2019, with two completing the double and it falls to **Sparkling Plenty (Fr) (Kingman {GB})** to attempt the feat this

time. Now part-owned by Al Shaqab Racing, Jean Pierre Dubois's homebred needs to improve on that but showed dramatic acceleration which will serve her well in this affair. Interestingly, despite the speed advantage of the Patrice Cottier-trained Chantilly Classic heroine, Al Shaqab have supplemented the Ralph Beckett-trained **Doha (GB)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}) as a possible pacemaker.

#### More To Come From Elmalka?

Like Opera Singer moved up from a mile for the first time, Sheikh Ahmed Al Maktoum's G1 1,000 Guineas heroine Elmalka (GB) (Kingman {GB}) has strong claims as a daughter of the middle-distance star Nahrain (GB) (Selkirk). Fourth in the Coronation, trainer Roger Varian thinks the step up in trip will bring about further improvement from the homebred who remains dangerously unexposed. "We're looking forward to

running Elmalka, she's really well and she looks like she is ready to step up to 10 furlongs," he said.

"It will give us some direction for the autumn and we entered her for the Prix de la Opera this week and she will probably have an entry back at a mile in the Sun Chariot. She's in great form and has done nothing wrong all year, even her run at Ascot was a great run under the circumstances, so we're very excited to run her. It looks a strong race but we decided to get her out again."

#### Strikin Impression...

To say that Thursday is a big day in the life of Hamad Al-Jehani is an understatement, with the Qatari-based trainer preparing to saddle Wathnan Racing's acquisition **The Strikin Viking (Ire)** (Inns Of Court {Ire}) in the G2 Richmond Stakes. Off the mark in a warm contest at York in mid-June, he was second to Ballydoyle's Henri Matisse (Ire) (Wootton Bassett {GB}) in The Curragh's G2 Railway Stakes later that month so has the previous required to make an impact.

"He's a big, imposing colt and it's not just about this year with him," Richard Brown said. "He was on our radar after he won at York and I thought he was impressive at the Curragh. He's a thoroughly likeable colt with a big engine and he gave James a great feel last week. We're looking forward to running him in Wathnan's colours for Hamad." Cont. p10

Further pattern-race form is provided by Teme Valley Racing's Andrew Balding-trained maiden Tropical Storm (GB) (Eqtidaar {Ire}) who chased home Wathnan's Shareholder (Not This Time) in Royal Ascot's G2 Norfolk Stakes, while the Eve Johnson Houghton-trained Billboard Star (GB) (Advertise {GB}) was second to the Norfolk fourth Whistlejacket (Ire) (No Nay Never) in Newmarket's G2 July Stakes. There is added intrigue in the presence of Eleanora Kennedy's Fairyhouse maiden winner **Black Forza**, a son of first-season sire Complexity whose son Mo Plex flew his flag at Saratoga earlier this month.

Teme Valley 's racing manager Richard Ryan said of the former, "It was a great run in the Norfolk and he was caught a little wide on the wing and was a bit lonely, but he put his head down and kept on it really well. Oisin [Murphy] has ridden him on two occasions and on both occasions fed back to us he was keen to ride him over six furlongs, so it looked a logical race for him based on rider comments and he's trained really well leading up to it. He's got a very good mind, he's strong and has an admirable attitude and hopefully those attributes will be useful at Goodwood."

Johnson Houghton said of Billboard Star, "He's a lovely horse and it wasn't a surprise he ran really well in the July Stakes. I think he'll go close in the Richmond. He's run at Goodwood before, so we know he handles the track and we're very hopeful."

#### Gordon Test For Jan Brueghel

With an eye on the St Leger, Thursday's G3 Gordon Stakes offers the chance to further assess the merit of Ballydoyle's TDN Rising Star Jan Brueghel (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) who followed an eight-length debut win at The Curragh in May with a defeat of

his elders in that track's G3 International Stakes. Up from a mile and a quarter for the first time, the full-brother to Sovereign (Ire) should be more at home tackling this 12-furlong trip with Aidan O'Brien stating after his last outing that he is viewed as a staying type. He faces Australian Bloodstock Stable's recent purchase Sayedaty Sadaty (Ire) (Anodin {Ire}), who is out for the first time since finishing fifth in the Derby.

#### **GERMAN 1000 GUINEAS HEROINE** DARNATION HEADS FULLY SUBSCRIBED FIELD FOR SUNDAY'S G1 GERMAN OAKS

Newtown Anner Stud's homebred **Darnation (Ire)** (Too Darn Hot {GB}--Monday Monday {Ire}, by Galileo {Ire}) will make a second visit to Dusseldorf this Sunday--for an enticing renewal of the €500,000 166th G1 Henkel-Preis der Diana (German Oaks)--and May's G2 German 1000 Guineas heroine is set to encounter 15 rivals as part of a fully subscribed cast of 16 in the Grafenberg venue's 11-furlong annual highlight. The Karl Burketrained G3 Prestige Stakes and G2 May Hill Stakes winner ran second when stepping up to 10 furlongs for Newcastle's G3 Hoppings Stakes last month and is set to make first start beyond that trip. Adrie de Vries, in the plate for her 2 1/4-length Classic win, renews his association with the 3-1 morning-line favourite, who will bid to become the third elite-level winner for her Dalham Hall Stud-based sire (by Dubawi {Ire}) from stall five. The two lowest-rated of the 18 overnight nominees, Ninna Best (Ger) (Best Solution (Ire)) and Fang Mich (Fr)

(Starspangledbanner {Aus}), didn't have their entries franked.

#### **German Oaks Draw Cont.**

Darnation is part of an international quartet also featuring the Fabrice Chappet-trained G1 Prix de Diane sixth **Bubble Gum (Fr)** (Cloth Of Stars {Ire}), recently acquired from breeder Rashit Shaykhutdinov by the shrewd operators of Australian Bloodstock. The Luke Murrell and Jamie Lovett vehicle has a perfect three-for-three tally and its prior renewals have come by way of Salomina (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}), who won sporting the Gestut Bona silks in 2012, Turfdonna (Ger) (Doyen {Ire}) in 2015 and Toskana Belle (Fr) (Shamalgan {Fr}) in 2022. Jamie Spencer is booked to become the filly's fifth different rider in as many starts.

"We are incredibly excited about Bubble Gum's prospects in the German Oaks," revealed Murrell. "Our success in this race has been unparalleled, and we have high hopes that she will continue this tradition. Fabrice Chappet has done an exceptional job in preparing her for this moment, and we are confident she will deliver a strong performance. Bubble Gum is one of the most exciting and promising horses we have purchased in the last four to five years. She was behind Sparkling Plenty in the French Oaks and that horse has since been sold for a fortune. Importantly, other runners in that French Oaks have won, franking their form, this shows you the level of racing she has performed at."

Chappet added, "Bubble Gum has shown tremendous promise and has been in excellent form leading up to Sunday. We are looking forward to a competitive race and are hopeful for a successful outcome. Barrier draws will be crucial at Dusseldorf. She is still in the [G1 Prix de l'] Arc [de Triomphe], so we have a big opinion of her." Connections' hopes for a favourable berth were dashed as Bubble Gum drew stall 12.

Kirsten Rausing's **Lingua Franca (GB)** (Study Of Man {Ire}), a Sir Mark Prescott trained-homebred who broke through at stakes level when saluting in one of two prior runs over this race's 11-furlong distance, is drawn in seven while Joseph O'Brien's well-travelled G2 Ribblesdale Stakes fifth **Je Zous (Ire)** (Zoustar {Aus}) completes the foreign raiding party and gets stall 11.

The domestic defence is headed by Gestut Rottgen's G3 Diana-Trial victrix Erle (Ger) (Reliable Man {GB}), who has been allocated the inside gate and will be joined by Rottgen's Maxim Pecheur stablemate and G1 Deutsches Derby ninth Weltbeste (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}). Andreas Suborics was successful aboard Amarette (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) in 2004, but is thus far winless in the role of trainer. His two entries are German 1000 Guineas seventh and G3 Diana-Trial runner-up Lady Mary (Ger) (Lawman {Fr}) and G3 Hamburger Stutenpreis runner-up Diamond Crown (Ger) (Cracksman {GB}). The latter is drawn widest of all in stall 16. Andreas Wohler, the leading active conditioner with six prior victories, will send out Spanish Eyes

(Ger) (Zarak {Fr}), Hope And Believe (Ire) (Make Believe {GB}) and Night Of Laki's (Ger) (Lord Of England {Ger}). The line-up is completed by Princess Valentina (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}), Sweet Summer (Ger) (Waldgeist {GB}), the Sarah Steinberg duo Diya (Ger) (Dubawi {Ire}) and New York City (Ger) (Sea The Moon {Ger}) and Listed Dusseldorf Diana-Trial winner Ashana (Fr) (The Grey Gatsby {Ire}). Ashana will have the assistance of Andrasch Starke, who has garnered a record six prior renewals.

## TRIBUTES FLOW FOR 'COMPLETE SPORTSMAN' OWNER-BREEDER DERMOT

Trainers Edward O'Grady and Jessica Harrington have led the tributes to leading owner and breeder Dermot Cox following the death of the successful businessman on Tuesday.

A pillar of the community in Kildare, Cox owned many leading lights over jumps, including Cheltenham Festival hero Back In Front and Paddy Power Gold Cup winner Tranquil Sea.

Father to David of Baroda Stud, Cox played an instrumental role in the development of Punchestown racecourse. He has been attributed to being the driving force behind forging and developing relationships with overseas trainers, the fruits of which were on show when the Nicky Henderson-trained reigning Champion Chaser Sprinter Sacre lit up the track with victory over Sizing Europe in 2013.

His role within the track was acknowledged this year when Cox, along with champion national hunt trainer Willie Mullins and leading owners Sean and Bernadine Mulryan, were inducted into Punchestown's hall of fame. Cont. p12

Harrington supplied one of Cox's most recent big-race wins, the family's homebred mare Madam Bovary, who landed a valuable handicap chase under Robbie Power at that same meeting.

She said, "Dermot was just a lovely person--great fun to be around. He lived life to the full. I know he was a great sportsman and loved his hunting and shooting as well. He obviously loved his racing and something that was also dear to his heart was the Kildare Hunt and Punchestown races--he absolutely loved Punchestown."

Along with Back In Front and Tranquil Sea, O'Grady sent out 2002 Troytown Chase winner Takagi on behalf of Cox, who the trainer described as "a real sportsman."

O'Grady said, "Back In Front, Tranquil Sea and Takagi--we had many great days. Dermot loved his hunting, racing, shooting, rugby and generally loved his sport. He was a real sportsman. If I had to think of our best day together, perhaps it would be Tranquil Sea winning the Paddy Power at Cheltenham [in 2009]. That was a superb race. Obviously winning the Supreme Novices' in 2003 with Back In Front would also have to rank up there as well. You'd have to describe a man like Dermot as a complete sportsman."

Away from racing, Cox ran a successful cash and carry business [Cox's Cash & Carry] in Newbridge, which was sold in 2022. He lived at Rosetown Stud, which is beside his son David's Baroda Stud, of which he is understood to have been immensely proud

But it was his exploits at Punchestown that were revered among those who knew him best on Wednesday, including racecourse manager Conor O'Neill, who said days like Sprinter Sacre winning at the festival wouldn't have been possible without Cox.

"On behalf of all at Punchestown, we extend our deepest condolences and sincerest sympathies to the Cox family," O'Neill said. "Dermot played an instrumental role at Punchestown for many years. He was a former vice chairman of Punchestown racecourse, he was a proud member of the Kildare Hunt Club and was also a master of the Kildare Hunt Club. His significant contribution to the track was acknowledged at this year's festival.

"He leaves behind him a number of legacies and played a pivotal role in establishing a tradition of UK-trained horses coming to Punchestown after Cheltenham. He created that tradition--more or less single-handedly to be fair to him--and also played a massive role in the redevelopment of the racecourse in 1998. He is a massive part of Punchestown's history, there is no doubt."

Husband to the late Ann, and much loved father of David, Louise, Aoife and Patrick, Cox is also survived by daughters-in-law Tamso and Vicky, son-in-law Kevin, and grandchildren Dermot, India, Isla, Sarah, Patrick, Louis and Tiger.

His son, Joseph, also sports a victory in the fledgling showpiece and has left in **And So To Bed (Ire)** (Kodiac {GB}), **Elzem (Ire)** (Elzaam {Aus}), **Midnight Strike** (**Ire)** (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) and **Pompano Beach (Ire)** (Ten Sovereigns {Ire}).

Zhijun Zhao secured Group 1-winning sprinter **Espiona (Aus)** (Extreme Choice {Aus}) for A\$4.15 million (€2,490,512) at a standalone virtual sale held by Magic Millions on Wednesday. Arrowfield Stud was the underbidder.

Trained by Chris Waller for Denise Martin's Star
Thoroughbreds, Espiona won seven of her 24 starts and earned
over A\$3.3 million in prize-money during her illustrious career,
with her biggest success coming in 2023 when she defeated the
multiple Group 1 heroine Pride Of Jenni (Aus) (Pride Of Dubai
{Aus}) by a nose to win the G1 Coolmore Classic at Rosehill.

Offered by Glenesk Thoroughbreds on behalf of her ownership group at Magic Millions, Espiona attracted strong interest from online and phone bidders before being bought by Zhao, who in May partnered with Yulong to purchase the 10-time Group 1 winner Imperatriz (Aus) (I Am Invincible {Aus}) for a record A\$6.6m (€4,039,810) at the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale.

"We are elated," Martin said of the sale. "We were hoping for A\$3 million but to get A\$4.15 million is beyond our expectations. "We had 10 of her ownership group together in Sydney along

"We had 10 of her ownership group together in Sydney along with trainer Chris Waller to watch the sale and it was just amazing. I don't think any will be heading back to work or home soon!"

Espiona was purchased for A\$190,000 by Star Thoroughbreds and Randwick Bloodstock Agency's Brett Howard from the Torryburn Stud draft at the 2020 Gold Coast Yearling Sale. She is out of a full-sister to the Listed-winning Bonny O'Reilly (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}), while her second dam is a half-sister to the multiple top-level winners Glamour Puss (NZ) (Tale of the Cat) and Vision And Power (NZ) (Carnegie {Ire}).

"She had everything that the breeders want," Waller said of Espiona, who was also placed at the top level on multiple occasions. "She had performance, she has the pedigree and the type and that's what Star Thoroughbreds buy.

"It's a bitter sweet moment, but she won't be lost to the industry and now we can go back to Magic Millions and buy some more Espionas."

Barry Bowditch, Magic Millions managing director, added, "We are so thrilled for Denise Martin and her ownership group. The mare was a sensation on the track and we now hope she can do likewise at stud for her new connections."

## TOO DARN HOT NAMED CHAMPION AUSTRALIAN FIRST-SEASON SIRE

Darley's **Too Darn Hot (GB)** has been crowned as the Champion Australian First-Season Sire by earnings, becoming the first British-bred stallion to achieve that feat.

Too Darn Hot was represented by 12 individual winners of 18 races from 41 runners. His progeny earned a total of A\$4,151,305, with his standout performer, Broadsiding (Aus), contributing A\$1,944,675. Broadsiding's victories included the G1 Champagne Stakes and G1 J J Atkins, while Arabian Summer (Aus) was another flagbearer for Too Darn Hot as the winner of the Listed Magic Millions National 2YO Classic, the Ballarat Magic Millions 2YO Classic and the Gold Pearl on the Gold Coast.

Too Darn Hot will not be returning to Darley's New South Wales base for the upcoming breeding season, though he will be available to cover on Southern Hemisphere time at Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket for £50,000.

**Tassort (Aus)**, who sired the Group 1 winner Manaal (Aus), was runner-up to Too Darn Hot with A\$2,159,935 in prize-money, while **Pierata (Aus)** rounded out the top three with A\$1,917,525.

Meanwhile, Yarraman Park Stud's I Am Invincible (Aus) has been crowned the Champion Australian General Sire for the third time. I Am Invincible was represented by 175 individual winners of 290 races from 375 runners during the latest season, with 15 individual stakes winners across 29 stakes races. In total, his progeny amassed A\$32,117,645 in prize-money.

Finishing behind I Am Invincible on the Leading Australian General Sires table were Widden Stud's **Zoustar (Aus)** (A\$23,955,179) and Coolmore's **So You Think (NZ)** (A\$21,265,152).

## \$2,000 MARE IN IOWA HITS GRADE I UPDATE

"My friends thought I was nuts when I got back into the horse business," says Maynard Thompson. "But when those babies are about three to five days old, and you take them outside and turn them loose for the first time, every one of them thinks he's the toughest thing out there. And if that doesn't put a smile on your face, you're not breathing."

Which is why Thompson perseveres on 15 acres of gently undulating terrain, a few miles south of Tama on the Iowa River.

"I'm 71 years old, and supposed to be retired," he says. "But I still fool with the horses. That's all I've got anymore, is the horses. Some cats, couple of dogs. But I am just an old Iowa farm boy that likes horses."

There's obviously something in the blood. His father used to tell him about traveling a Percheron stallion around as a kid, spring and early summer. And his uncle had a flair for horses, too.

"He was one of those types that if he heard of one in the neighborhood that was kind of an outlaw, he had to go trade for him," Thompson says. "Because he just wanted to prove to everybody that he could make that horse work."

Well, that will seem a familiar trait by the time we are done. But one step at a time.

"In its role as a not-for-profit corporation franchised by New York State, NYRA's mission is to conduct world-class racing for the benefit of the state's economy while growing the sport and creating opportunities for horsemen and breeders to compete for robust purses throughout the year."



When they put the interstate straight through the family farm, about 20 miles farther south, his brothers opted to go off to college. A couple became mechanical engineers. "They liked cars

and stuff," Thompson says. "If I took a car apart, I would put 10 pieces back together and have 50 left over. But the cows and the horses, I got along a lot better with them. I always liked being with the livestock."

So for most of his life Thompson would make no more claim for himself than being "a hired man for a farmer." Then, when Prairie Meadows reopened in the late 1990s, he decided to buy the odd Quarter Horse-and found that to be "just a good way to go broke."

The final straw was when he

sent a favorite mare to be bred, and she died in an accident.

"I just sold out then," he recalls. "All the horses, the saddles, hauler, everything. Figured I'd never owned another horse in my life."

"But you never lose the itch, and in 2019 it got so it was a pretty good scratch. So I bought three mares from Texas. And the day they came up, it was 55 below zero here. It was January

> and, the guy who delivered them, I tried to talk him out of it. He said, 'It's the only weekend my boy can come with me.' And when they got here, with that windchill factor, they couldn't believe that anybody could live in that kind of weather."

One of the mares had herself only recently changed hands, in foal to Flat Out at the 2018 Keeneland November Sale, for just \$1,000.

"My idea was, I was keeping none of the babies," Thompson

says. "They were strictly going to be sold. Well, the girlfriend and I fell in love with her filly, we called her Flat Out Stormin. And she's now made over \$200,000 up at Prairie Meadows."

Another of the mares had similarly made a bare \$1,000 at the November Sale, in foal to an unproven Constitution.

Unfortunately she died shortly after foaling. But her baby was one that Thompson did return to Keeneland, as a short yearling. Consigned by Ballysax, and buoyed by Constitution's first juveniles, he made \$135,000. "To me, that was hitting the lottery," Thompson marvels. "I mean, I didn't know there was that much money."

But it now turns out that Thompson had done something more remarkable still, in between, at the 2019

November Sale. He was on his way home when Connie Brown, who helps him at the sales, called about a Flatter mare in the dregs of the auction: Hip 4424. Though only nine, Applelicious was making her seventh appearance in a sale ring. How typical of the way commercial breeding operates!

Connie to buy her."

She had been an \$11,500 weanling; pinhooked as a \$50,000 yearling; and made \$120,000 as a Timonium 2-year-old. But she failed to win in nine starts, once managing second in a maiden

claimer, and her price had been steadily dwindling as various people tried to eke a few dollars out of her pregnancies. Her first foals had been plainly sired, with her latest weanling--a Firing Line colt--selling at the same auction for \$18,000.

"Connie said she probably wasn't going to cost me a lot," Thompson says. "And that she wouldn't hurt me any. Connie knows what I like: those big Quarter Horse types, not those tall greyhounds. And she knows what I can spend too. So I told

Applelicious cost only \$2,000, but this time things did not appear to work out so well. Two of the three mares he shipped up from that sale "got in a real scuffle" and both aborted. And then, the following year, they lost her first lowa-bred foal.

In the meantime, however, her Firing Line colt was coming to life. Resold to Marc Detampel as a yearling for \$25,000, he had won on debut for Wesley Ward at the Keeneland Spring meet and later that year added the Bowman Mill Stakes. Racing for a new partnership after a \$205,000 transfer through the HRA Sale at Fasig-Tipton, last year he reached the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint with four graded stakes placings to his credit. He added a fifth when beaten just a couple of lengths by champion Elite Power, secured another elite podium in Dubai, and last weekend made his Grade I breakout with success in the Alfred G. Vanderbilt Stakes.

For this son of Applelicious, of course, is none other than **Nakatomi**. And suddenly the \$2,000 mare is hot property. He's been urged to try a digital sale, though at present he's leaning to sending her back to Keeneland in November. She's 14, admittedly empty this year, but duly primed for an early cover--and there's more in her pedigree than might be expected, in terms of explaining Nakatomi: her half-sister by Maria's Mon is the graded stakes-placed dam of four stakes scorers, including GI Clement L. Hirsch Stakes winner Lady of Fifty (After Market). Significantly, moreover, Nakatomi is the image of his mother.

"If you were 100 yards away, you could switch horses and nobody would know," Thompson says. "It has been exciting, following Nakatomi along. I thought it was a big deal last year, when he ran at the Breeders' Cup. I know I got lucky here. Like I said, I'm just an old Iowa farm boy. I don't know what she's worth—but I do know she's worth a hell of a lot more since last Saturday."

Whatever happens next, Thompson has meanwhile made his own contribution to the Applelicious story, with a show of exactly the same maverick belief that made him purchase a \$2,000 reject in the first place.

For Nakatomi has two lowa-bred siblings. The first, a 2-year-old filly by Timeline, is training at Prairie Meadows. "I'm not a big believer in trying to get a lot out of a 2-year-old, but she has some motor on her," Thompson said. "The trainer is very, very happy with her. He just gets this gleam in his eye. 'Next year,' he says, 'you've got something special.""

And then there is a young colt by a stallion that Thompson stands himself. Prince of War finished down the field as favorite for his only racetrack appearance, but he's a half-brother by Cairo Prince to Instagrand. He was another find at the November Sale, a year after the one that produced Applelicious.

As usual, Thompson had asked Connie Brown to take a look, and she loved him too.

"There's one thing wrong, Maynard," she said. "You can't afford this horse."

"Well," he replied. "It doesn't cost me anything to watch him go in."

In the event, he made a single unanswered bid. When he called her, Brown thought Thompson was kidding.

"You didn't buy that horse! What did you give for him?" He had cost \$450,000 as a yearling; Brown thought him still worth six figures. Thompson had paid \$12,000.

"And his oldest babies are 2-year-olds now," he reports. "I took three of his daughters to this lowa sale last year, and they all looked the part. Some friends came up and said, 'If these babies can run anything like they look, you hit a goldmine on that stallion.' He has no race record, obviously, so people don't like that. But like I told them, 'If he'd won \$1 million, he wouldn't be here.' So he's going to have to prove it himself, this no-name, shot-in-the-dark-stallion. But I think this mare's baby is awful nice myself."

Of course, Thompson has the option of keeping the colt to promote Prince of War at the track--while either cashing out the mare, or setting a reserve that leaves him the option of a foal share to a top Kentucky stallion.

"I can part with the mare if I have to," Thompson admits. "It's the baby that's bothering me, because I think he's kind of special. So that's where the dreaming part comes in. Maybe he's the big-time horse that'll prove your stallion, and show you had the right idea when you bought him."

He hasn't forgotten something his dad always used to say: "If you buy something, always be able to give it a better home than where it's been."

"And some of these horses you see down in Keeneland, there's no way I could do that," he admits. "They're so beautiful, not a hair out of place. So I tell you what, it's kind of hard on the sleep at night."



He continued, "I go to bed about 10 o'clock and at two in the morning I'm still awake thinking. I've had some friends say, 'Keep the mare, Maynard, she's what everybody wants from this game.' But maybe she's worth more than I should be fooling with."

But the bottom line is that he has put himself in a win-win situation, and should be proud of what he has done. After all, he's similarly confounded expectations with other mares that nobody wanted. Whatever he decides, he has earned the right to his own decision--and, above all, to enjoy the ride.

"My daughters think I'm crazy for working at it as hard as I do," Thompson says. "But it seems to me, the old farmers that I knew, they quit, they were going to move to town and relax.. And, hell, in three months they were dead of boredom. They'd worked hard all their lives and then suddenly had nothing to do.

"Last year I had to have major back surgery. I went out to do chores one morning, and I'm taking steps eight inches apart. I'm all bent over. I got tears running down my face. I mean, I was a hurting unit. So we go to the surgeon, and he wanted to do it right away. And I said, 'I can't.' And my daughters were with me, and my girlfriend, and they all said, 'Why ever not?' I said, 'I've mares going to have babies. And I got to get those mares bred back.'

"So I suffered through it, and then went and had the surgery. And for the first three months I thought, 'I don't know if this is the smartest decision I ever made.' But hell, I'm getting along pretty good for an old man. And with these horses, there's always something to look forward to."

To fulfill those goals, NYRA will continue negotiations with TwinSpires to increase funds flowing to the sport and its stakeholders in New York."

In its own statement in response to the impasse, Churchill Downs' CEO Bill Carstanjen said, "Following NYRA's disturbing recent pattern of demanding significant new economics from ADWs for no additional value in return, NYRA has elected to terminate TwinSpires's access to its Saratoga signal today. While we hope to resolve this dispute quickly and amicably, make no mistake that we will continue to advocate for and invest in our customers and this industry. NYRA's reckless pattern reflects an increasingly misguided understanding of how to best serve the racing industry in New York. Their actions are bad for horse racing and negatively impact our fans."

In response, David O'Rourke, NYRA President & CEO explains, "The COVID-19 pandemic supercharged the shift from brick and mortar wagering to the largest national ADWs, and fundamentally changed the economics of horse racing in New York State. Accordingly, NYRA asked these ADWs to pay an additional source market fee of just 1 percent on wagers from New York, bringing that number inline or significantly lower than several other jurisdictions. Unlike their counterparts, CDI has refused to add this source market fee to an agreement struck in 2018. As a not-for-profit responsible for growing the sport while supporting our horsemen and backstretch community, this is untenable for horse racing in New York."

After a brief impasse between NYRA and FanDuel/TVG in early July, a new contract was reached in time for that platform to offer pari-mutuel wagering on opening day of the Saratoga meet.

#### NY GAMING COMMISSION SUGGESTS THAT SARATOGA SHOULD HAVE SYNTHETIC

**COURSE** by Bill Finley

The New York Gaming Commission (NYGC) has released its 2023 report regarding the high rate of fatalities upstate last year. Between May 26, 2023 and September 4, 2023, there were 17 equine fatalities at Saratoga Race Course, which again put the track's Thoroughbred safety record under scrutiny.

Several suggestions were made by the NYGC, none more surprising than the recommendation that NYRA should install a synthetic track at Saratoga. With the Spa already having two turf courses and main dirt course, it remains to been seen if there's any room to fit in still another course.

"The degree of inclement weather during the 2023 Saratoga Race Meet had a profound negative impact upon the safety of racehorses and confounded the ability of NYRA to complete its full racing program," the report read. "Sixty-five surface changes during the 2023 Saratoga Meet disrupted much of the turf racing schedule. In many cases field size was severely compromised as the result of these surface changes with commensurate decrease in handle. Despite the use of extraordinary efforts and use of best practice racetrack surface management, it was extremely difficult to maintain safe and consistent racing surfaces.

The report went on to state, "The total number of fatalities at Saratoga was not out of the ordinary. What was out of the ordinary was how many broke down in races."

New York Equine Medical Director Scott Palmer noted that the total number of equine fatalities during the 2023 Saratoga Meet was similar or less than that of meets in the previous five years. However, the number of racing fatalities during the 2023 Meet was three-times greater than the number of racing fatalities during the 2022 Meet.

The 179-page report also suggested that NYRA should support and participate in research efforts to critically evaluate current best practices to achieve improved consistency of the moisture content of the racing surface and to eliminate excessive moisture. The proposal aims to develop a "smart" watering truck that would measure moisture in the track surface and apply water to those areas in need of water and not in areas that did not need additional water, using control technologies, GPS data fusion and system integration

The commission would like to see NYRA test horses pre-race more than they do now. Their recommendation is that NYRA passes a house rule that all horses must be examined by their attending veterinarian between 72 and 24 hours of a race.

Among the other points included in the report are the use of wearable biometric sensors to minimize the incidence of equine fatalities going forward.

The NYGC report suggests that if these recommendations are followed there will be tangible results, including reduction of equine fatalities; fewer surface changes during the Saratoga meet; increased overall handle at Saratoga; improved attendance at Saratoga and improved public perception of Thoroughbred racing. As has been the case when there is a rash of breakdowns followed by a study, investigators could not come up with the source of the breakdowns. But they believed

that an exceptionally wet meet played a part.

"The most obvious environmental variable of the 2023 Saratoga Race Meet was the unprecedented amount of rainfall that occurred during July and August. Although the fact of relentless rainfall was not in dispute, the actual significance of this unusual weather event was among the primary focuses of this review," the report read.

#### MINDFRAME SIDELINED DUE TO BONE **BRUISING**

TDN Rising Star **Mindframe** (Constitution), runner up in both Grade I attempts, is expected to be sidelined because of bone bruising through the remainder of this year, according to DRF Wednesday. Campaigned by Repole Stable and St. Elias Stable, the Todd Pletcher trainee was sent to Ocala, Florida earlier this week and was examined by Dr. John Madison.

With the defection of Mindframe, Repole also indicated that recent GII Jim Dandy Stakes winner Fierceness (City of Light) is a possibility to run in the Aug. 24 GI Travers S.

"He's clear go to back into training in 60 days," Mike Repole told DRF. "If Todd and I want to give him 90 days we can do that. In all honesty, we were probably skipping the Travers anyway with him. He's had four incredible races in about 3 1/2 months."

Following a jaw-dropping 13 3/4-length win at Gulfstream in March, Mindframe returned to gallop home a winner in a 1 1/16-mile optional claimer on the Kentucky Derby undercard. A half-length shy of victorious Dornoch (Mage) in the June 8 GI Belmont Stakes in Saratoga, the Maryland-bred colt finished in the same spot behind that rival in the GI Haskell Stakes at Monmouth July 20.

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.--Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert, who has won the GI Travers Stakes three times, could be going for No. 4 in this year's Midsummer Derby

Baffert, speaking from his summer base at Del Mar in California, said that one of his 3-year-olds--Parenting (Justify) or Muth (Good Magic) who were both tabbed as 'TDN Rising Stars'--could represent him in the \$1.25 million race at Saratoga Race Course Aug. 24.

"Potentially," he said.

Parenting, owned by Wathnan Racing, was a \$750,000 purchase at the 2023 Ocala 2-year-olds in training sale. He has

won all three of his starts, including the listed Affirmed Stakes and an allowance last Sunday where he won by a neck in a race for 3-year-olds and up.

"This is a very good horse," Baffert said. "I was very impressed with what he did. We missed the window with the (GI) Haskell and, luckily, this race was in the book. He got a good education. He could have gotten beat. They double teamed him from everywhere and he handled it well."

Unraced as a 2-year-old, Parenting has won all three of his starts. The allowance race was a mile. The Affirmed Stakes, which he won by 7 1/2 lengths, was 1 1/16 miles and his maiden score, which saw him face 10 rivals, produced a 2 3/4-length victory.

"I am not going to rule it out," Baffert said of the Travers. "Let's see how he comes out it. We have the Travers, we have the (GI) Pacific Classic. And we also have Muth."

Parenting has never raced outside of California; Muth has. Muth hasn't been seen since winning the GI Arkansas Derby on March 30. He was the 8-5 morning-line favorite for the GI Preakness Stakes but was scratched the Wednesday before the race at Pimlico when he spiked a fever. Baffert said it took a while for Muth, owned by Zedan Racing Stables Inc., to recover.

"He was really sick," Baffert said. "We had to keep him on antibiotics for two weeks before he fully got over it. He is getting back slowly. The endgame for both of these horses is that I want them to be ready for the Breeders' Cup. They will let me know when they are ready to roll."

Baffert won the Travers in 2001 with Point Given, 2016 with Arrogate and 2017 with West Coast. He has run three horses since then with Mucho Gusto's third place finish in 2019 the best. He was fifth last year with National Treasure, who is running in Saturday's GI Whitney Stakes.

### Pletcher Has A Trio For Saturday's Whitney

Hall of Fame trainer Todd Pletcher will have three chances to win Saturday's GI Whitney Stakes for a record-tying fifth time.

Bright Future (Curlin), Crupi (Curlin) and 'TDN Rising Star' Charge It (Tapit) will be in the starting gate for Pletcher, who last won the prestigious race for older horses in 2022 with Life Is Good. His other Whitney wins came in 2013 (Cross Traffic), 2007 (Lawyer Ron) and 2002 (Left Bank).

John M. Gaver Sr. holds the record for most Whitney victories with five.

Bright Future looks to have the best chance of getting Pletcher to the winner's circle as he is 5-1 third choice on the Whitney morning line behind **National Treasure** (Quality Road, 9-5) and **First Mission** (Street Sense, 9-2).

Bright Future, owned by Repole Stable, has won both of his career starts at Saratoga, including the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup last year. He then finished sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Classicbeaten 3 3.4 lengths--and then was not seen until last month.

He won the GIII Salvatore Mile Stakes at Monmouth by 1 3/4 lengths.

"He showed last year that he is a legitimate Grade I horse," Pletcher said outside his barn at the Oklahoma Training Track. "He didn't seem to fire his 'A' race in the Breeders' Cup for whatever reason. I think he fits with the top of the division. I like the way he has trained since (the Salvator Mile) and he seems to like this track. Hopefully he has another move forward in him."

### **Giddings Savors First Training Win At Saratoga**

The first one is always the most special. Or so they say.

Melanie Giddings, in her second full year as a trainer, finally got to the winner's circle at Saratoga when **Scaramanga**(Munnings) won Sunday's eighth race, a \$30,000 claimer, by a length. It was her first win in 16 career starts at Saratoga spanning two seasons.

"That race was a lot of fun," Giddings said Wednesday morning at her barn on the Oklahoma Training Track. "There was really no pressure. I own half the horse and we were kind of a longshot (13-1). I thought he had been doing better and, he obviously showed that."

Scaramanga, a 3-year-old New York-bred gelding, was claimed after the race and is now in the barn of trainer Jimmy Ferraro.

"That's OK," Giddings said with a smile. "That's the game."
Giddings was the trainer of Maple Leaf Mel (Cross Traffic),
who tragically broke down in the shadow of the wire in last
year's GI Test Stakes on Whitney weekend. Giddings, of course,
still holds a soft spot in her heart for the brave Maple Leaf Mel,
but life moves on.

She has 18 horses at Saratoga and another 14 at Belmont Park. And now she has her first winner.

What made it even more special was Scaramanga was ridden by her boyfriend, jockey Shaun Bridgmohan. It was his first win at the Spa since Break Even won the Coronation Cup Stakes on July 14, 2019.

He had had just 18 mounts over the last two seasons before Sunday's win.

"I never found a winner's circle that wasn't special," Bridgmohan said, smiling, at the barn.

"It was even better having Shaun up," Giddings said. "I don't ever worry when he rides a horse for me. He has had plenty of winners here in the past. He is still a very good rider; he just doesn't ride a lot."

Giddings had two runners on Wednesday's card but was not able to duplicate Sunday. She'll keep trying.

"This is a tough place for anybody," she said. "It doesn't matter ... jocks, trainers ... it's hard to win here. It was nice to finally get it off my back."

# BAFFERT HOPING FOR A SARATOGA ENCORE WITH NATIONAL TREASURE

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.--Just over seven weeks ago, **National Treasure** (Quality Road) made his claim as the best older in the country when he rolled in the GI Metropolitan Handicap at Saratoga Race Course.

Trained by Hall of Famer Bob Baffert, National Treasure dominated five others on the way to a 6 1/4-length win.

What can he do for an encore? We'll find out Saturday when Baffert saddles National Treasure--the 9-5 morning-line favorite--in the 97th running of the \$1 million GI Whitney Stakes at the Spa. The race is a "Win and You're In" for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Del Mar in November.

Baffert doesn't ship a horse across the country unless he thinks he has a big chance. And National Treasure certainly has that. He arrived in Saratoga on Tuesday.

"We are in the business to have these top-quality horses," Baffert said by phone from his summer base at Del Mar in California. "There are a lot of expectations, coming out of my barn, when you have a horse like that. That's why we are in the business, to play at that level. The same goes for all those other big trainers back there."

Owned by SF Racing, LLC, Starlight Racing, Madaket Stables LLC, Robert E. Masterson, Stonestreet Stables LLC, Jay A. Schoenfarber, Waves Edge Capital LLC and Catherine Donovan, National Treasure is at the top of several lists when it comes to the older male division.

He has had just three starts this year but has two big wins. Beside the Met Mile, he also won the GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational at Gulfstream Park in his first start as a 4-year-old. What followed was a fourth in the Group 1 Saudi Cup at King Abdulaziz Racecourse in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia.

"His Pegasus was terrific," Baffert said. "We shipped him probably a little bit too soon (to Dubai), but we had to take a crack at it."

In the Met Mile, National Treasure had little resistance as Flavien Prat let his mount do his thing. Baffert is not too concerned about the added distance in the Whitney. That race is 1 1/8 miles.

The Pegasus World Cup Invitational was also run at 1 1/8 miles. In three other attempts at the distance in his career, National Treasure has finished fourth in all of them.

It's no secret that National Treasure does his best running on the front end--"pace makes the race," Baffert said--and that is likely where he'll be in the Whitney.

"We are going to stretch his speed out a little bit further and see if he can handle it," said Baffert, who won back-to-back editions of the Whitney in 2019 with MCKinzie and 2020 with Improbable.

There are 11 other signed up to challenge National Treasure, three of them from Hall of Fame trainer Todd Pletcher. He will saddle Bright Future (Curlin, 5-1), Crupi (Curlin, 15-1) and Charge It (Tapit, 30-1).

"I think (the division (is pretty wide open)," Pletcher said outside his barn on the Oklahoma Training Track. "National Treasure is certainly the divisional leader, but I don't think he has a death grip on it."

Last year, National Treasure only won once in seven tries, but it was a big one. He went gate-to-wire to win the GI Preakness Stakes and then finished the year with four straight Grade I races.

He was sixth in the Belmont Stakes, fifth in the Travers Stakes and fourth in the Awesome Again before closing the season with a gut-wrenching loss by a nose to Cody's Wish in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile.

Losing that race might have done more for National Treasure than winning the Preakness. Heading into 2024, National Treasure got on more people's radar. Of course, it has helped that the brown colt, who went for \$500,000 at the 2021 Fasig-Tipton New York Yearling Sale, has won some major races.

"He was a whisker away from beating Cody's Wish," Baffert said. "He has always been a good horse, but people didn't pay attention to him. Once you win a sexy race like the Pegasus or the Met Mile, you start getting paid attention to."

### ROSARIO, JUSTIFY, GUN RUNNER REACH HALL OF FAME IN A HURRY by Mike Kane

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.- When Joel Rosario arrived in California as a virtually unknown jockey from the Dominican Republic in 2006, his mission was simple: survive. Eighteen years after his first races at Fairplex and Golden Gate Fields, Rosario will be inducted Friday into the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame. He was elected in his first year of eligibility.

"I never thought I was going to be where I am today," Rosario said. "I thought I would come here and try to make a living. Riding horses and trying to make a living."

Rosario, 39, has done that, for sure, and much more. In California, he quickly emerged as one of the premier riders of his generation and since 2012 has been primarily based in the East.

Through Sunday, he ranks just outside the top 100 in career victories at 3,632, but with \$322,237,757, he is fourth on the career earnings list. He was 95 Grade I victories.

Forevermore, he is Hall of Fame jockey Joel Rosario.

"It means a lot for me," he said. "For me and my family and the

other people in Dominican Republic who follow me and follow the racing, it's great. I'm the first from my country to become a Hall of Fame jockey, so it's even more special."

Triple Crown winner Justify (Scat Daddy) and 2017 Horse of the Year Gun Runner (Candy Ride), also elected the first time they were on the ballot, join Rosario as the group of contemporary division inductees this year. Also being saluted and welcomed into the Hall of Fame in the nine-member

class are: jockey Abe Hawkins and racehorses Aristides and Lecomte, selected by the Pre-1900 Historic Review Committee; and from the Pillars of the Turf Committee, Harry F. Guggenheim, Clement L. Hirsch, and Joe Hirsch.

Gun Runner was bred by Ben Leon's Besilu Stables, acquired by Three Chimneys Farm as part of major bloodstock purchase with Leon and raced in a partnership with Winchell Thoroughbreds LLC. Trained throughout his career by Hall of Famer Steve Asmussen, he won 12 of 19 starts, six of them Grade I, and earned \$15,988,500.

Brazilian Goncalo Borges Torrealba and his family bought a controlling interest in Three Chimneys Farm in the summer of 2013. Torrealba said the first task was to change the farm's focus away from being a boarding operation. A year later, he and Leon had reached an agreement on the sale of the Besilu holdings.

"Slowly but surely, we got into the market to buy a good, respectable broodmare band and so on," Torrealba said. "This was, very frankly speaking, a turning point for us.

"He was going out of the business. He had put together, in a very short amount of time really, an amazing bunch of horses. We did the deal by which we bought all 52 horses of his. Gun Runner was a yearling. His dam (Quiet Giant) was there. His

granddam (Quiet Dance) was there. And the sisters to him. It was a stellar group of horses really. He's stayed in. I liked him. He was a good friend."

The agreement with Besilu was finalized on Aug. 4, 2014, 10 years to the week before Gun Runner's induction. Three Chimneys was intending to sell Gun Runner as a 2-year-old in training, but reached a private deal with owner-breeder Ron Winchell.

"Winchell came to us and made the proposal for us to be partners," Torrealba said. "Him being the owner of Tapit fit 100% the description of what we're looking for in a partner, someone who's invested in the deal. And it turned out really great, because as part of the deal, he went to Steve."

Torrealba said he could spend a couple of hours praising the way Asmussen trained and managed Gun Runner.

"He did a great job," Torrealba said.

Gun Runner was a top 3-year-old in 2016, but became an elite runner in 2017. He finished second in the G1 Dubai World Cup when Arrogate turned in a jaw-dropping performance after stumbling leaving the gate. Arrogate was never the same, but Gun Runner finished the year with four straight Grade I wins--by a total of 24 3/4 lengths--capped by the Breeders' Cup Classic. Torrealba said the championship-clinching win at Del Mar was a very proud moment.

"But the wins at Saratoga were fantastic, when he won the older horse races, the Whitney and the Woodward," Torrealba said. "It was incredible. When he came back from Dubai, the amount of confidence we had on him, he just couldn't lose."

Gun Runner closed his career with a score in the \$16.3-million 2018 GI Pegasus World Cup and went home to Three Chimneys, where he has quickly become a standings-topping stallion.

"Well," Torrealba said, pausing ever so slightly to make his point, "I think he's as good as they come." John Gunther and his daughter Tanya bred Justify, who finished first in all six of this career starts for the ownership group of China Horse Club, Head of Plains Partners LLC, Starlight Racing and WinStar Farm. Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert developed the 13th Triple Crown winner--the second he handled in a span of four years--whose purse earnings were \$3,798,000.

The Gunthers's 2015 foal crop was beyond-belief amazing. Not only did they have Justify arrive that spring, but Grade I winners Vino Rosso (Curlin) and Without Parole (Frankel) were dropped, too. Vino Rosso won three Grade I races, topped by the Breeders' Cup Classic, and earned \$4.8 million for Repole Stable and St. Elias Stable. The Gunthers raced Without Parole, winner of the G1 St. James's Stakes at Royal Ascot and he is now

standing at stud for them in England.

Gunther said that Justify was a standout from the start.

"As a foal, he did a lot with Vino Rosso in the same paddock, and Justify knew he was the king between the two of them," Gunther said. "He was always anxious to go out. He was just an unbelievable foal. We had both of them at the yearling sale and my daughter didn't want to sell either one of them."

Gunther said he put high

reserve prices on the colts, figuring they would take them home. He was wrong. WinStar bought Justify for \$500,000 and Repole-St. Elias paid \$410,000 for Vino Rosso.

"My daughter, she actually cried when we lost both of them," he said. "It was quite a year."

Gunther said his son thought he was crazy when he predicted that the colts, unraced at the time, would both run in the Derby. He was correct and after the Derby win, he said publicly that Justify would win the Triple Crown.

"I really felt that way at the time," Gunther said. "Then he won the Preakness and we flew to New York for the Belmont and I just knew he was going to pull it off."

Rosario grew up on a farm in a massive family--he said his mother Angela had 15 children--and like many of the boys in his country, spent a lot of time playing baseball. He was introduced to racing as a young teenager by a brother and attended his country's jockey school. He said his parents had to sign papers that permitted him to begin his professional riding career as a 14-year-old.

"My mom didn't want me to go and do it," he said. "She had seen me riding horses all the time, but it's a little bit different, racing and riding on the farm. She was a little bit worried about it, but in the end, she was fine with it."

Rosario rode for six years in the Dominican Republic and was

the leading jockey the last four seasons. With Dominican trainer and bloodstock agent Herbert Soto providing some guidance, the 20-year-old Rosario made the move to the U.S. He started out at the Northern California tracks, Bay Meadows and Golden Gate Fields and on the fair circuit. In less than a year, veteran jockey agent Vince DeGregory convinced Rosario to move to Southern California and the top-level tracks of Hollywood Park,

Del Mar and Santa Anita Park.

Riding morning works and DeGregory's years of contacts helped introduce Rosario to the trainers in Southern California to get him mounts in the afternoon. Rosario credits John Sadler with putting him on horses and getting him rolling.

"He was my main guy,"
Rosario said. "If it wasn't for him, I wouldn't have been able to make it to where I am today. He really gave me a big chance with his horses. He gave me the first call on his horses that had a good

chance to win. That helped. When you have somebody like that, it helped."

Sadler was well aware of what Rosario was doing at the San Francisco-area tracks.

"I sent a horse up to Northern California and he rode it for me," Sadler said. "I think the horse got beat a nose, but I was very impressed with him even before he got here. When he came down, I think one of the very first horses I put him on he won and he got going from there."

Sadler recognized what other top trainers like Bobby Frankel were seeing and Rosario was an immediate hit. In 2007-08, he finished fourth in the Santa Anita standings.

"He was just so strong, such a good rider, and looked so good on a horse right away he caught my eye," Sadler said. "When he came down to Southern California, when he made the transition down, I started riding him more and more and more. He rode a lot of great horses for me."

The Sadler-Rosario team has compiled some notable statistics. According to Equibase, Rosario has ridden 245 winners from 1,030 starts for Sadler, a 24.7% rate, finished in the money at a 58.4% clip and earned \$21,361,905 in purses. In stakes, they are 48 for 227, 21.1%. Rosario has won 14 Grade I races on 10 different horses for Sadler.

In 2008, his first full year in California, Rosario jumped to 20th

nationally in purse earnings. He was fifth in 2009 and has not been lower than sixth since. He led the nation in 2021 and earned the Eclipse Award as the outstanding jockey. In 2013 on Orb (Malibu Moon), he won the GI Kentucky Derby for trainer Shug McGaughey. Earlier that year he won the G1 Dubai World Cup on Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}). Rosario has two wins in the GI Belmont Stakes and 15 victories in the Breeders' Cup.

Success has not changed Rosario, Sadler said, that he is the same friendly, upbeat, humble man he met nearly two decades ago. Rosario said he has maintained the same habits that he developed in the Dominican Republic, where he realized that he was too small to be a major league baseball player and embraced another sport.

"There was a lot of hard work, a lot of dedication and a lot of help from people that I appreciate," he said. "They give me the horses to get me there. So many people. At my young age, I never thought so early, I was going to be in the Hall of Fame. It's very exciting. The hard work paid off and I'm very excited about it."

The ceremony at the Fasig-Tipton sales pavilion will begin Friday at 10:30 a.m.

It's been a magical year for jockey Brian Hernandez, Jr., who rides the best 3-year-old filly in the country in **Thorpedo Anna** (Fast Anna) and one of the best 3-year-old males in **Mystik Dan** (Goldencents). For the veteran rider that has meant wins in the GI Kentucky Oaks, the GI Kentucky Derby, the GI Acorn S. and the GI Coaching Club American Oaks. Thorpedo Anna will take on the boys in her next scheduled start, the GI DraftKings

Travers S.

Appearing on the *TDN* Writers' Room Podcast, presented by Keeneland, Hernandez said his good fortune has yet to sink in. He was this week's Green Group Guest of the Week.

"It's still surreal," the 38-year-old jockey said. "I don't think it's ever going to sink in. I've talked to other jockeys that have won the Derby before and they say that, no, it doesn't ever sink in. Then you're sitting somewhere by yourself and you're like, 'man, wow, we really won the Kentucky Derby.' It's a life goal achievement."

Can he add a Travers win onto his growing list of 2024 accomplishments?

"It's going to be another tough goal for her," he said. "But at the same time, she's done everything we've asked of her so far. So, we're going to go into the Travers thinking she's the best 3-year-old in the country right now. We'll be very hopeful and excited. It's one of those situations where, when you get a great filly like she happens to be, that you have to go ahead and give her the test. She's dominated the fillies so far. So you have to kind of up the game on her. Just let her show how good she really is."

Hernandez has won all the aforementioned races for trainer Kenny McPeek, who rides him whenever he can. McPeek's confidence in Hernandez has clearly given him a big boost to his career.

"My relationship with Kenny has to go back to a guy that hasn't gotten a whole lot of credit so far. It's my agent, Frank Bernis," Hernandez said. "He and Kenny work so well together that he does all the entries for Kenny. He's doing all the entries right now for Kenny at Saratoga and Ellis, and he's handling all this business. They just work so well together. And then I've been fortunate enough to have Kenny in my corner. It helps in my situation where I know I'm going out there that I am riding these good horses and these better races. I don't have to worry about getting taken off."

In our breeding spotlight section, we took a look at the WinStar stallion Nashville (Speightstown).

Elsewhere on the podcast, which is also sponsored by the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders' Association, West Point Thoroughbreds, WinStar, XBTV.com, Stonestreet Farm and the KTOB, the team of Randy Moss, Zoe Cadman and Bill Finley reviewed last weekend's racing action, including the win in the GII Jim Dandy by Fierceness (City of Light) and the feel-good story of The Chosen Vron (Vronsky) winning the GI Bing Crosby for the second straight year. We also previewed the huge Saturday card at Saratoga, which includes three Grade I races.

### ETERNAL HOPE RETURNS TO ACTION IN **GLENS FALLS**



Eternal Hope inside of her Group 2-winning stablemate English Rose Sarah Andrew

Unbeaten in two starts in this country as a 3-year-old last season, Godolphin's Eternal Hope (Ire) (Teofilo (Ire)) makes a belated seasonal debut in Thursday's \$250,000 GII Glens Falls Stakes at Saratoga.

A stakes winner going 12 furlongs over the Lingfield allweather last May and third in the G2 Prix Alec Head, the homebred was the even-money pick for the GIII Jockey Club Oaks Invitational Stakes at Aqueduct last September and was a long way out of her ground before a late flourish saw her score by a neck. She backed up that performance with a half-length success in the GII Sands Point Stakes downstate the following month, but the hurdles here are not insignificant given the layoff and the presence of some talented turf distaffers.

"She hasn't been seen since her American starts last year, but her preparation has gone well," said trainer Charlie Appleby, fresh off a bounce-back victory in Wednesday's G1 Sussex Stakes at Goodwood with Notable Speech (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}). "We feel that, at that trip, she's a filly we saw who can get to a good level in America. We're looking forward to getting her back out. There will be a bit of improvement for the run, but she goes there in great shape."

McKulick (GB) (Frankel {GB}) upset heavily favored War Like Goddess (English Channel) in this event 12 months ago and added this year's GIII Orchid Stakes over the winter at Gulfstream Park. Fourth as the 3-4 favorite behind her frontrunning stablemate Royalty Interest (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}) in the GIII Sheepshead Bay Stakes at the Big A May 3, the Klaravich runner exits an even fifth to Didia (Arg) (Orpen) in the GI New York Stakes over an insufficient 9 1/2 furlongs June 7.

**Chop Chop** (City of Light) hasn't missed the exacta in six outings this term and defeated **Atomic Blonde (Ger)** (The Grey Gatsby (Ire) in the Apr. 26 GIII Bewitch Stakes at Keeneland before the latter turned the tables in the Keertana Stakes at Churchill May 25. The 4-year-old was a latest runner-up to the aforementioned War Like Goddess in the GIII Robert G. Dick Memorial Stakes at Delaware July 7.

Trainer Fernando Abreu has been suspended for seven-days and fined \$1,000 after one of his trainees, Scat Tu Tap, tested positive for two controlled substances: Magnesium Sulfate, which can be used as a calming agent in horses, and the non-steroidal anti-inflammatory Methylsalicylate.

The remaining races on the program continued after a short delay at Horseshoe Indianapolis.


