



# BIG EVS BACK IN CHARGE IN THE KING GEORGE

Taking his revenge on his Royal Ascot conqueror **Asfoora (Aus)** (Flying Artie {Aus}), **Big Evs (Ire)** (Blue Point {Ire}--Hana Lina {GB}, by Oasis Dream {GB}) returned to winning ways in Friday's G2 King George Qatar Stakes on Goodwood's fast downhill fivefurlong strip over which he had won the 2023 G3 Molecomb Stakes. Third to the Australian runner in last month's G1 King Charles III Stakes, last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint hero was sent off the 13-8 favourite and raced in second early with **Ponntos (Ire)** (Power {GB}) blazing the trail.

Picking off that raider before two out, the Mick Applebytrained 3-year-old saw out the distance strong enough to hold the penalised Asfoora by a short head, with **Believing (Ire)** (Mehmas {Ire}) 3/4 of a length behind in third. **Cont. p3** 

# HAIRDRESSER-TURNED-BREEDER IN DREAMLAND WITH BLACK FORZA

Full-time hairdresser and small-time breeder Ashley Hillyard admits to having been left dumbfounded by the victory of Black Forza in Thursday's Richmond Stakes at Goodwood.

Why so? Well, the Kentucky-based 38-year-old snapped up Harlee Honey (Harlan's Holiday), the dam of Michael O'Callaghan's bright young star, for just \$11,000 at Fasig-Tipton Digital from Legacy Bloodstock last August.

It's a purchase that even the most shrewd of breeders would be proud of. And in less than a year, Hillyard is now fielding offers that she admits would be life-changing to her and her young family.

"My phone has been very busy since Black Forza crossed the wire," she said on Friday. "I have been watching out for Black Forza ever since I bought the mare. I saw his first race and I was really impressed. When he won second time up, his rider [Seamie Heffernan] said that he felt Black Forza was a horse with a bit of a future. I got a little nervous when I heard that. What he said mattered the most to me."

Hillyard added, "We had started to get calls about the mare after Black Forza won his maiden. But I said, 'you know what, I think I want to wait.' I bought her because I wanted to breed a Classic runner and he looks like he could be that. She's a step up for me." Cont. p3

Both the front two will re-oppose in the G1 Nunthorpe Stakes next month.

"I thought she was coming to do him at the end, but he's very tough and Tom gave him a great ride," Appleby said. "The finish is completely different here to Ascot and the fast ground helped too. I'll have to have a chat with [owner] Paul [Teasdale] to see where we go, but we've got the Nunthorpe and the Abbaye if the ground comes quick which is probably unlikely. I'd imagine that whatever happens we'll be back to America."

Henry Dwyer said of Asfoora, "She is a quick mare, but they went a bit quick for her early. Big Evs was able to control his own destiny, whereas we were stuck behind a couple and got a bit of a bump at around the 300. I think that's probably cost her the win, but she's run great. The leaders here just have such an easy time of it early, because they run downhill for the first 400. It levels out a bit after that, but if they're going quick early, they get an easy time. She's gone terrific--I couldn't have hoped for her to go better, just disappointed not to win, having gone so well. Everyone has been so great to us, and we've very much enjoyed the experience."

#### **Pedigree Notes**

Big Evs's dam Hana Lina , who also has a 2-year-old filly by Ribchester (Ire) and a yearling son of Earthlight (Ire), is a daughter of the G1 Cheveley Park Stakes-winning European champion 2-year-old filly Queen's Logic (Ire) (Grand Lodge) who also produced the G2 Diadem Stakes and G3 Princess Margaret Stakes winner Lady Of The Desert (Rahy). She is in turn responsible for Queen Kindly (GB) (Frankel {GB}), who like Queen's Logic captured the G2 Lowther Stakes and produced Queen Me (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) who was second in that York contest.

Queen's Logic is a half-sister to Danehill's multiple Group 1-winning Arc hero Dylan Thomas (Ire), with the family including the fellow Classic-winning luminaries Homecoming Queen (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) and Serpentine (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

She added, "That's one of the reasons why we were so nervous watching the race at Goodwood. When he appeared, we just started jumping around the living room. We were speechless. We didn't know what to do."

A quick scan through Black Forza's sales history will show you that he has been offered under the hammer three times in his

life. But that isn't necessarily the full story.

Before Black Forza sold as a breezer, a yearling and even a foal, he had gained some experience of the sales when Harlee Honey gave birth to him at Fasig-Tipton back in February 2022.

That didn't stop the Elm Tree Farm-consigned mare, who herself has seen her fair share of the sales ground action, going on to fetch \$50,000 at the Kentucky Winter Sale to Dash Goff.

"I think we had three or four mares in that sale," Elm Tree's Jody Huckaby recalled. "My wife Michelle was very upset with me because she didn't want to put her in there. Harlee Honey sold that afternoon to Dash Goff [for \$50,000], who I have known since I was a kid, and given the foal was born on the same day, he is down as being the breeder."

You could say that Black Forza has already overcome the odds. And while he has helped Hillyard fulfil her dream in finding a genuine black-type producing mare, she admits that Harlee Honey is likely to be better served by moving to a bigger farm.

She explained, "People want to know what we're going to do with her and whether we would sell her or not. I grew up in horse racing but I work as a hairdresser. I have two other mares that I raced so they are sentimental to me. I wanted something that I could complement what I have and grow the business and Harlee looks as though she can do that. When I bought her for \$11,000, that was my top budget, so that tells you about how small our farm is. That was all I could do. She was a stretch for us and it was the first time where we purchased a mare with the view of trying to grow our business."

She added, "We are interested in selling because it's life-changing and would mean a great deal to my family. It would also help us to grow our breeding business and help to support our stud fees for our girls [mares]. Also, selling her would help her. When you sell a mare for a large amount of money, it guarantees that she will be in a good place and somebody is going to spend money on her and will breed to a stallion that will do her justice. So, for that reason, we would consider selling her. That is my big goal; setting my girls up so that they can go on and do bigger and better things."

There remains only one question left to answer in this unorthodox, if not slightly bonkers success story; has Michelle forgiven Jody for selling Harlee Honey in the first place?

"Well, yes and no," comes the response from the stud owner. "She's quite upset that we got rid of the mare but we're happy that a friend of ours, Ashley, has ended up with her. She called us and was all excited after the race. I know Ashley is going to make a lot of money so we're glad to have played a role."

# JUDDMONTE'S LEAD ARTIST MAKES ALL FOR THOROUGHBRED STAKES TRIUMPH AT

**GOODWOOD** by Sean Cronin

Juddmonte's homebred 3-year-old **Lead Artist (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}--Obligate {GB}, by Frankel {GB}) hit the board behind the reopposing **Al Musmak (Ire)** (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) in last month's Listed Sir Henry Cecil Stakes at Newmarket and made a smooth transition up to pattern-race level with a polished display in Friday's G3 Bonhams Thoroughbred Stakes at Goodwood.

The John and Thady Gosden trainee, sent postward at odds of 9-2, was swiftly into stride from the inside gate and gained an immediate lead. Unflustered on the front end shaken up with 2 1/2 furlongs remaining, he surged clear approaching the furlong pole and was driven out in the closing stages to hold the late bid of King's Gamble (Ire) (Kingman {GB}) by 3/4-of-a-length for a career high. The winner's fellow Juddmonte representative Task Force (GB) (Frankel {GB}) kept on well inside the final quarter-mile and finished a half-length further adrift in third for the Ralph Beckett stable.

"I think the ground was a bit too soft at Newmarket last time and he possibly needed the run too," reflected rider Kieran Shoemark after registering a 500th career success. "He's always been talented, he has come on for that last run and the quick ground today has certainly suited. When he won at York [in May] I thought that he was quite special, so it's nice to see him get his group-race success today. He's still very unexposed, he's a lightly raced three-year-old and the future is bright. I've had a bit of a stop-start career so I wouldn't be gloating about it, but it's a nice milestone to reach. Juddmonte are one of the most important owner-breeders in the industry and they have a lot of horses in with John and Thady so it's important to ride them winners." Cont. p6

John Gosden added, "When you're drawn one here and the cutaway has gone, you better get out and get a position. It's the easiest place to get boxed in, but he controlled the race and dominated it very well. He didn't like that ground at Newmarket as it was too soft. Hopefully he's good enough to come back for the [G2] Celebration Mile here. He missed all of last year, he started first time out this year in the Wood Ditton and he's very much a horse on an upward curve. The good thing is you've got August, September and October and there's plenty of racing to come. Time will tell, but if he gets better and better he'll be a lovely four-year-old."

Ralph Beckett, trainer of both second and third, said, "I'm delighted with both of them. I think King's Gamble is still learning on the job. It's only his fifth start, he's run on conventional tracks so far and to come here is a test. From his draw [in eight] he had to drop in. He rolled around coming down the hill and finished really well. Task Force looks like he's back on track. I think the tongue strap encourages him to breathe properly and he enjoyed being ridden like that. I'd say one of them will show up in the Celebration Mile, one or both. Other than that, I'm not sure."

#### **Pedigree Notes**

Lead Artist is the first of four, and one of two surviving, foals thrown by G2 Prix de Sandringham victrix and G1 Prix Rothschild third Obligate (GB) (Frankel {GB}), herself a granddaughter of storied blue hen Hasili (Ire) (Kahyasi {Ire}). The February-foaled bay is a full-sister to a weanling filly. Hasili's honour roll includes a quintet of elite-level winners, namely Banks Hill (GB) (Danehill), Cacique (Ire) (Danehill), Intercontinental (GB) (Danehill), Champs Elysees (GB) (Danehill) and Heat Haze (GB) (Green Desert). She is also the dam of the Group 1-placed duo Dansili (GB) (Danehill) and Deluxe (Storm Cat).

Goodwood's Qatar Festival winds down on Saturday, with the feature G2 Qatar Lillie Langtry Stakes looking an open affair for the staying fillies and mares. George Strawbridge's Free Wind (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was only fourth behind the re-opposing first and second Sumo Sam (GB) (Nathaniel {Ire}) and River Of Stars (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) in this 12 months ago and Thady Gosden is hoping she can regain the winning thread that she lost after last year's G2 Middleton Stakes.

"Last year in the Lilly Langtry, it was unfortunate there were thunderstorms during the day and unpredictable levels of rain and understandably that didn't suit any of them," he said. "It's a premier staying-fillies race of the summer and of course it's a very competitive field."

Francis-Henri Graffard is looking for more high-profile British success with Wathnan Racing's 2023 G2 Prix de Pomone winner and G1 Prix Vermeille runner-up **Melo Melo (GB)** (Gleneagles {Ire}). Cont. p7

#### MILLSTREAM, PUCHKINE AND KHAADEM **ALL STAND GROUND FOR SUNDAY'S 16-**STRONG G1 PRIX MAURICE DE GHEEST

Sunday's €380,000 G1 ARC Prix Maurice de Gheest shares this weekend's European top billing with Dusseldorf's 166th G1 Henkel-Preis der Diana (German Oaks) and, while the field for that Classic was finalised on Wednesday, declarations for the Deauville highlight were not confirmed until Friday morning. There were no defectors from the overnight set of 16 nominees as all main characters--G1 Prix Jean Prat victor Puchkine (Fr) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}), G1 July Cup hero Mill Stream (Ire) (Gleneagles (Ire) and dual G1 Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes winner Khaadem (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire})--stood their ground for Sunday's renewal of the 6 1/2-furlong dash.

**TDN Rising Star Puchkine**, drawn in stall two, is joined by Jean Prat runner-up and fellow Jean-Claude Rouget-conditioned TDN Rising Star Havana Cigar (GB) (Havana Grey {GB}), who gets stall 11. Jean Prat third **Beauvatier (Fr)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}), another **TDN Rising Star**, has been supplemented at a cost of €27,360 and has drawn stall nine. Bermuda Racing's G3 Summer Stakes victrix Flora Of Bermuda (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}), the second of two supplemented, will depart from stall seven. Khaadem was not on one of his going days when finishing behind Mill Stream and beating just one of 10 rivals at Newmarket. He will emerge from stall one while Mill Stream, undefeated in two prior visits to the Normandy track, is drawn in eight.

Others high on the list of potential winners include last year's hero King Gold (Fr) (Anodin {Ire}), who followed a well-trodden path to this staging post with a repeat success in June's G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot; and Nurlan Bizakov's hitherto undefeated homebred Lazzat (Fr) (Territories {Ire}), who took his record to a perfect five-for-five with victories in this term's G3 Prix Diebel and G3 Prix Paul de Moussac. The ensemble cast also features G1 Commonwealth Cup fifth Classic Flower (GB) (Calyx {GB}), last month's G3 Prix de Ris-Orangis winner Shouldvebeenaring (GB) (Havana Grey {GB}), last year's third Saint Lawrence (Ire) (Al Kazeem {GB}), last term's G1 1000 Guineas third Matilda Picotte (Ire) (Sioux Nation) and dual Group 3 winner Exxtra (Fr) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}).

# RACING HONORS BEST OF THE BEST AT HALL OF FAME CEREMONY

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. - Much like he rides Thoroughbreds, jockey Joel Rosario turned in patient, thorough and well-timed remarks Friday during his induction into the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame.

Rosario was the closer of the nine-member Class of 2024 at the ceremony at the Fasig-Tipton Sales Pavilion. Dominican Republic diplomat and horse owner Jose Singer introduced Rosario, noting that he was the first jockey from their country to be elected to the Hall of Fame. After Singer helped him don his Hall of Fame blazer, Rosario stepped to the podium and delivered his speech, in English and some in Spanish.

"I am very thankful for the many opportunities that I have been given and for all the people that have supported me," he said. "I never thought as a young kid growing up in the Dominican Republic playing baseball and riding my horses really quickly to the grocery store that I would make it to the Hall of Fame. It has taken a lot of hard work, dedication and the support of many people in my life to be where I am today."



Rosario started his riding career in the Dominican Republic at the age of 14 and moved to Northern California six years later, in 2006. He quickly found success and switched to the higher-profile Southern California circuit within a year. After becoming a star while winning several meet titles, Rosario relocated to the East Coast with agent Ron Anderson in 2012. Rosario entered the week ranked just outside the top 100 in career victories at 3,632, but with \$322,237,757 he is fourth on the career earnings list. He has 95 Grade I victories.

Rosario, 2018 Triple Crown winner Justify (Scat Daddy) and 2017 Horse of the Year Gun Runner (Candy Ride), were all elected in the contemporary division in their first year of eligibility. Also inducted in the 90-minute ceremony were: jockey Abe Hawkins and racehorses Aristides and Lecomte, selected by the Pre-1900 Historic Review Committee; and from the Pillars of the Turf Committee, owners Harry F. Guggenheim and Clement L. Hirsch, and Joe Hirsch, the legendary turf writer at the Daily Racing Form. Hirsch's induction included a humorous video tribute by NFL Hall of Fame quarterback Joe Namath, who shared a Manhattan apartment with Hirsch during his early years with the New York Jets.

Rosario named all of the agents he has worked with the years, especially Anderson, with whom has become a national-level,

big-race rider.

"I would like to thank all the trainers and owners, he said.
"Without you I wouldn't be here today. Thank you very much. I also like to thank all the jockeys, valets, grooms, exercise riders. It's a lot of fun to work with you every day."

Rosario paused briefly and smiled.

"Thank you to all the horses," he said. "Without the horses, I wouldn't be here today."

Before Rosario's time on the stage, Justify and Gun Runner were saluted for what were distinguished but different careers. Gun Runner was bred by Ben Leon's Besilu Stables and acquired as a yearling in a 52-horse bloodstock deal by Three Chimneys Farm. The colt was being pointed for a 2-year-old sale in 2015, but Three Chimneys instead formed a racing partnership with Winchell Thoroughbreds owned by Ron Winchell. Hall of Famer Steve Asmussen trained Gun Runner, who compiled a 15-3-2 record in 19 starts and earned \$15,988,500.

"Gun Runner has not only excelled as a racehorse," said Rodrigo Borges Torrealba of Three Chimneys, "but has also become an extraordinary stallion, the cornerstone of our breeding operations at Three Chimneys Farm."

Torrealba saluted Leon's breeding and the partnership with Winchell on Gun Runner, who he described as a "once-in-a-lifetime horse." **Cont.**

"Of course, no mention of Gun Runner would be complete without praising the patient and brilliant training of Steve Asmussen and his team," he said. "Steve, your dedication and expertise played a pivotal role in Gun Runner's success. Additionally, Florent Geroux's smooth and confident rides were instrumental every time he was in the saddle."

Asmussen praised the owners for taking on the risk of running Gun Runner at four. The colt was at his best that season, with

five wins and a second in six starts, capped by a victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. In addition to Horse of the Year, he was the older male champion.

"Gun Runner did quite enough where he could have retired as a 3-year-old and gone on to a great career at stud," Winchell said. "However, running him as 4-year-old is what got him into the Hall of Fame."

Winchell said Gun Runner's 12 victories only tell part of the story. He pointed to the chestnut's Beyer Speed Figures as a 4-year-old.

"When you drill down and look at his race record, race by race, I've never seen a record where a horse got faster every start," Winchell said.

Justify earned his place in the Hall of Fame with a short, but brilliant career with Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert. He reached the wire first in all six starts and completed his Triple Crown sweep with a 1 3/4-lengths victory in the GI Belmont Stakes. Justify was owned by Kenny Troutt's WinStar Farm, China Horse Club, Head of Plains Partners and Starlight Racing.

"Justify took us all on a ride of a lifetime," said Elliott Walden, WinStar's president, CEO and racing manager. "When WinStar Farm started in 2000, we came up with the motto "Dream Big." This is a hard business. Seven days a week. A lot of discouraging news and disappointments. We've all been there." **Cont.**

"I don't know if you can speak something into existence, but every year from 2000 to 2018 Kenny Trout would dream about winning the Triple Crown. If the Derby winner didn't win the Preakness, Kenny would joke, 'that saves another Triple Crown, so we can be the first one in a while.' I would say, 'Kenny, that's not going to happen. You can't think like that. You've set your sights to high.' But that's who Kenny is and that's what makes it special and here we are inducting the 13th Triple Crown winner into the Hall of Fame."

Walden said Justify - the first horse since Apollo in 1882 to win the Derby without a start at 2 - never had a bad day on the track and had a special aura about him. He applauded the work of Baffert, who was at the ceremony.

"Bob, thank you for the incredible job you did with Justify to make the Kentucky Derby after making his first start on February 18," Walden said. "Breaking the curse of Apollo takes three things: A great horse, a little good fortune and a lot of experience. You have all three."

Walden said that during a dinner in Saratoga after the Belmont Stakes in June, the conversation turned to bucket list items. When it was Troutt's turn, his answer was: win another Triple Crown.

"We've had many great memories together," Walden said.
"It's been a magical ride from February 18 to June 9th. We will forever be grateful to our version of Big Red. So, thank you Justify for allowing us to dream big. The dream continues for all of us in this room."

# STEVE CAUTHEN: LOOKING BACK AT 'THE KID' WITH THE MAN by Chris McGrath

When he came to Europe, and rode them all to sleep, everyone said that Steve Cauthen had a clock in his head. If a Swiss watchmaker wanted to check his work, he could just ask Cauthen to go five-eighths in a minute flat. But all that precision seemingly ran askew when it came to counting his years, each of which might have compressed a decade. As Laz Barrera said, when the press asked him about keeping "The Kid" on his Derby horse: "Stevie Cauthen doesn't come from this planet. He's a 100-year-old man in an 18-year-old body."

By the following summer, mind you, Barrera had taken him off their Triple Crown winner: another year, another decade of experience. Already Cauthen had sampled highs and lows that would have felt extreme in the longest journey to the Hall of Fame-eligibility for which would prove the only way Time could hobble him to crawl along with the crowd. Sure enough, though only 34 on his eventual induction, he was already into a second year of retirement.

For Cauthen had done something that people always talk about doing, but never quite manage. He had quit at the top. The same composure that suppressed all immaturity, when denied anything resembling a conventional boyhood, had proved no less effective against those frailties that tend to menace the other end of a career.

The 30th anniversary of his Hall of Fame induction finds a boyishly familiar figure, a happy counterpoint to his precocious

maturity. Cauthen welcomes *TDN* to a farm that might share description with its proprietor as modest, neat and ever grounded in this hard-working recess of Kentucky, an hour or so north of the manicured Bluegrass nurseries. From these gentle hills, too, might Cauthen have borrowed the dry undulations introduced to that familiar low drawl by a ready chuckle or some colorful reinforcement of language.

In other words, you'd know him anywhere--much as did Affirmed.

"I don't know that when I went and petted him on the nose, he said, 'Oh, here's Steve'," Cauthen says. "But when I was on his back, yes, he knew it was me. We just related. We had a rapport. It was really cool. If you're a jockey, this is like the best thing you can ever get."

Try to take us into his head, then. For instance: do you think Affirmed knew who Alydar was, as well?

"Oh, I do, yeah."

Like, even eyeing him across the parade ring, before the race? "I don't know about that. But when they hooked, definitely.

'Oh, not that \*\*\*\*er again. He's a tough one, time to dig in."

Certainly you'll never get closer to what separates a champion from the herd than asking a horseman whose empathy so elevated him from his own competition that he rode a bewildering 487 winners in 1977, his first full year. **Cont**.

So, yes, take us into their heads: what does a champion feel about other horses?

"Confidence," Cauthen replies immediately.

Simply because they can trust their mechanics? Or are they drawing on something more elemental, something we might call desire or arrogance?

"A lot of it's within," Cauthen explains. "Horses are like people, right? You got good ones, bad ones; smart ones, dumb ones.

And you got some that want to compete, and others that don't. Some of the smart ones are so smart that they realize, 'I don't have to do that, screw those guys.'

"When you talk about the best horse I ever rode, Affirmed, first of all you're talking about ability. He had gears, he could switch on and off. I could creep up and then get him to shut off again. But what he really had was heart. It was boring to him just to win for fun, like he was doing in the Derby: I had to keep him going, because I knew Alydar would be coming and he could pull up in the stride or two when he thought he'd done his job."

But that same asset, confidence, is also the key differential for the jockey--and it's a double-edged sword.

On the one hand, there was the unprecedented rise. From River Downs to Chicago to Churchill, he proved an immediate match for the colony veterans; then he beat Cordero on his debut mount in New York. One week at Aqueduct, he rode 23 winners. Even his first setback, a fall at Belmont, saw him compressing time as usual: the doctors said three months, Cauthen was back in one.

His comeback ride, aptly named Little Miracle, was his first for Barrera. So when Cordero got off that horse's half-brother in the Sanford Stakes at Saratoga, and Pincay stayed in California, Barrera turned to The Kid.

They won--Cauthen is still tickled that Cordero was second-and proceeded to the Hopeful where this horse Alydar came alongside, and Cauthen discovered something new about what a Thoroughbred could do.

"You don't know where all this is going to lead you," Cauthen reflects. "It's like, maybe it'll be good, maybe it won't. All I'm doing is living my life and trying to keep it all down. Because my parents had taught me well."

Which proved just as well, once the blade of confidence was

reversed. Within months of the Triple Crown, The Kid was a bust. He broke a knee, his agent had a heart attack. Somehow everything that had been so easy now became proportionately difficult.

"Confidence is huge in any sport, and life in general," Cauthen remarks. "And it's easily lost. I had Laz's horses, but they really weren't in form yet. And literally not one trainer out there was willing to help me, except for Jack Van Berg who had a bunch of claiming horses. So one thing built on another. Definitely I lost confidence. Never the willingness to try. But I just didn't know what the hell I was doing wrong."

And presumably that communicates itself to your horse, and becomes a self-fulfilling spiral?

"I'm sure it does, yeah," he agrees. "Should I wait, should I go? Before, everything felt natural. You didn't even think about it, you just did it. And when you get like that, everybody else loses confidence. And then you're really screwed."

To the extent that, yes, they even took him off Affirmed.

"I remember when I got beat by Seattle Slew in the Marlboro Cup," he says. "Basically a great 4-year-old is always going to beat the 3-year-old, right? The next year Affirmed beat Spectacular Bid, the year after that Spectacular Bid blew everybody away."

"But anyway I heard it through the grapevine: 'Mrs. Wolfson thinks they put something in your drink!' Like I was drugged or something. Like I'd done something terribly wrong."

To Cauthen, the horse just hadn't retrieved his form yet. But then of course he bounced back the first time Pincay rode him.

"It's life," Cauthen says. "Swings and roundabouts. You just carry on. I wasn't too worried. But yeah, it was one of the great lessons I learned about human nature: people can be cruel, don't expect too much from most of them. All these guys that had been kissing my ass, begging me for time--and now they were all burying me. That's their job, I guess. If they don't do it, they get fired. So they want a salacious story about this guy who's washed up at 18. But Laffit came out to New York one summer, rode 220 horses, and won two races. And nobody said a freaking word! Deep down, I understood it. But still, it stung. You could tell some of those guys had enjoyed the twist."

At one stage Cauthen went 110 rides without a winner.

"You do want to pull your hair out," he says. "But I never gave up--and the horse that broke the streak was for Laz. He'd already dumped me from Affirmed. But Aaron Jones took me fishing up in Oregon, and I think he must have said, 'Laz, at least offer him the ride.' It was no special horse, but he won. Though they damn near disqualified me! I just wanted to get on some good horses again. And I knew that eventually, somehow, I would."

Sure enough, next thing he knew, he was having dinner with Robert Sangster and accepting a job in Britain. He was still growing: 5'1" at 17, 5'5 1/2" at 20. And if the trajectory of his weight made Europe appealing, so did the chance of a reset. Because by now he really must have felt like that 100-year-old teenager.

So what a blessing, arriving in Britain, to find a mentor as redoubtable as Barry Hills. At 42, the trainer was old enough to

be a father figure; but young enough, too, to empathize with his protege and share the good things in life.

"Barry and Penny took me in like family," Cauthen enthuses. "They were huge in my life. We made a great start, but then the horses got a virus. And after a while I was like, 'Okay, screw it, let's just have fun.' Nobody was giving me any outside mounts, but I wasn't too worried. I was enjoying a little bit of a rest, breathing for a change. Because for the past three years, I had been like Michael Jackson. I literally didn't have a second to myself.

"Barry was such a trier, one of those who made it on their own. Built himself up from nothing, and I was the same sort of deal. So I could really relate to him, as opposed to some of those high-and-mighty types handed everything on a plate. And in the end he said, 'What the hell are you doing? Get off that golf course and get your ass going.' He just motivated me. 'Hey, let's do this, let's rev it up.'"

They did so to such effect that when Lester Piggott left Henry Cecil, it was Cauthen who got the call.

"It was the hardest thing I ever did, leaving Barry," Cauthen confesses. "I think he understood. Penny had a hard time with it, for a while, just because they had been so caring with me. But I won four Classics the first year I went to Henry. So really after a short while, we were cool. That's why I respect Barry so much. You know when somebody's in your corner: even if it's maybe hurting them a little, they're still rooting for you."

That partnership with Cecil defined an era of the European Turf. Its definitive moment perhaps came when Cauthen sent Slip Anchor into Tattenham Corner 10 lengths clear in the 1985 Derby. Everyone knew--the crowd, the other jockeys--that he had yet again roped the dopes.

Much like Tod Sloan at the turn of the century, he was introducing a whole new dimension to the British scene. There were times he pulled up and looked over his shoulder, thinking, "You muppets, how could you let me do that?"

"Sometimes I even knew beforehand that it was probably going to happen," he says. "Because I knew that I could pace this horse and that nobody was going to screw with me."

When he rode Slip Anchor into the winner's circle at Epsom, Cecil patted him on the leg and said, "Well done, old fruit." A one-off, Cecil: an inscrutable blend of frivolity and genius. But Cauthen got on his wavelength.

"A little eccentric, sure, but a very intelligent guy," Cauthen ponders. "Always thinking. You'd be sitting with him and could tell his mind was elsewhere, trying to figure what some horse was trying to tell him. He was so good at knowing when they were ready to step up, or needed to get some confidence back. Of course he had good horses, but he knew pretty quick which were which, and placed them so well. **Cont.**

"And he had a great team. They were all characters, these guys sitting round the breakfast table. There's nothing better. Because if you're not part of a team, really you're not going to get very far with anything in life."

Of course, Cauthen himself brought much to the equation. That clock in the head was no less useful on the gallops, and arguably he created the parameters for what became the Frankie Dettori era. Cauthen remembers giving the young Italian lifts to the races, trying to take a nap against a torrent of questions.

"The mornings are a big part of it," Cauthen agrees. "Being able to get off a horse and say, 'Okay, he's ready.' Or not. Because you can feel it. If you know what you're doing, know how fast you're going, it doesn't matter if you're working with another good horse or a donkey."

More than some of his generation, he is complimentary about current riders: admires the Ortiz brothers, Saez, Rosario. But how about those of his own day?

"Cordero was the guy," he replies. "He was really pretty on a horse, and strong. But he was messing with everybody, mentally. You always felt like he was riding the whole field. We were good friends, but in a race he was a nemesis. If he could win by five, he'd beat you a neck--and then go see the owner of your horse!"

All along, however, Cauthen's biggest adversary was his own body.

"I was never built to be a jockey, really," he admits. "I was always skinny and long-armed, and it was obvious I was going to grow. I knew when I started that my time was probably limited. So if I got offered California on Sunday, hell yeah, I was going. Same when I was in Europe, I'd go to Paris Sundays. I'd go six months without a day off."

He wonders whether he might have hung in there another year or two, had he known that Godolphin was round the corner. But Amy was expecting their first daughter, and already the last couple of years he had been asking himself by midsummer whether he would see it out. "Because with weight," he says, "it's more what it does to your head than your body."

But the great thing is that the urgency imposed on his career had been anticipated by its runaway inception. As can also be seen in his siblings, themselves so esteemed in our community, he had the best of starts via nature and nurture alike. Even as a toddler he would lie down with horses in the field. "I always tried to think a horse," he says. "Tried to get a horse to do what you wanted without making him, getting him to want it for himself."

And until the shackles of weight closed, he could elude even those of Time itself.

"I had nothing like a normal childhood," he reflects. "I realized that myself. With somebody my own age, I didn't know what to say. We had nothing in common. So it was weird. But like everything, it all pans out. You start to realize what's what."

So if his flesh ultimately conspired against him, he remained ever comfortable in his own skin. And that has sustained his fulfilment in the decades since, away from the limelight: with his family, his mares and yearlings, his clients at Dixiana Farm.

"It's nice to feel like you're back in the game," he says. "As breeder or owner, it's only the odd horse, but at least you're talking to your trainer and you're involved. And that's what I always felt I was good at. I was a team guy, good at thinking stuff through. The sad thing, when you quit, is that you know you'll never be as good at anything else in your life. But I've always loved what I do, and I still love it today."

# HALL OF FAME OUGHT TO TAKE ANOTHER LOOK AT GULCH by Mike Kane

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.--In early June, while I was working on a story about the GI Met Mile for the *TDN*, one question led me to another.

First: What year did two-time Met Mile winner Gulch go into the Hall of Fame?

Second: How could Gulch, who won seven Grade I races, finished in the top three in 25 of 32 career starts and earned over \$3 million in the 1980s not be in the Hall of Fame?

"Yeah. You've got it. You're right," breeder-owner Peter Brant said. "They don't always do the just thing. My first horse in the Hall of Fame was Waya, who was also a great mare. It took her years to get into the Hall of Fame."

Gulch retired in 1988, became eligible five full seasons after his last race and could be considered in the contemporary division for 25 years. Now he belongs to the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame Historic Review Committee. That committee, which meets annually, is in the midst of looking at specific time periods: pre-1900 this year, followed by 1900-1959 in 2025 and 1960-2000 in 2026.

As a result, Brant and fans of Gulch will have to wait at least two years before the son of Mr. Prospector could be a candidate for selection by the committee. It's been about 30 years since he was first eligible in the contemporary division and for roughly half that time, the Hall of Fame rules restricted the number of horses that could be inducted each summer. Meanwhile, they required one trainer and one jockey to be elected. It was a well-meaning but disjointed approach. Fortunately, the museum's trustees changed things in 2011, which helped loosen the logjam of talented runners, especially in the female divisions. That first year, Safely Kept, Sky Beauty and Open Mind were elected.

With the policy that was adopted, the nominating committee is now tasked with compiling a list of trainers, horses and jockeys for the ballot to be send to voters in the contemporary division. To be elected, a candidate must receive 50 percent plus one of the votes cast. This year there were 17 names on the ballot and three--Joel Rosario, Gun Runner (Candy Ride) and Justify (Scat Daddy)--made the Hall of Fame. Each of them was in their first year of eligibility. Under the old policy, one of the horses would have had to wait until next year.

With the number of inductees limited each year, Gulch was unable to make the grade, though he certainly had strong credentials. He won at distances from five furlongs to 1 1 1/8 miles and was third in the 1 1/2 miles Belmont Stakes. If he was competing in this era, he might be a first-ballot inductee. Gulch won two Grade I races as a 2-year-old in the 1986; two more as a 3-year-old and three in his 4-year-old season. He closed his career with a victory in \$1 million Breeders' Cup Sprint in 1988 and was voted the Eclipse Award as champion sprinter.

Jay Privman, who retired as the national correspondent for *Daily Racing Form* in 2022, has done some research on Gulch and said he is a worthy candidate.

Privman points to the Met Mile wins as a significant achievement: "As a two-time winner of the Met Mile, including at age 3, his success in that race stands alone. Gulch is the only horse in the more than 125 runnings of the race who has won it at age 3 and again at age 4. No horse has won the race twice since him, a span now of more than three decades. The horse who preceded him winning it twice was Forego, at ages 5 and 6. Forego and Gulch are the only horses to have won the Met Mile twice since Stymie in 1947-48, more than 70 years ago."

Forego (1976-77) and Stymie are in the Hall of Fame. So are multiple winners Devil Diver (1943-44-45) and Equipoise (1932-33). Gulch and Mad Hatter (1921-22) have not made it yet. **Cont.**

Gulch secured his first Met Mile win while in the midst of the Triple Crown series. He was sixth in the Derby on May 2, fourth in the Preakness on May 16, won the Met Mile on May 25 and had his third in the Belmont on June 6. Four GI races in five weeks. His foal crop of 1984 headed by Alysheba, Bet Twice, Cryptoclearance and Java Gold, was one of the deepest in modern times.

Given the chance to make the case for the Hall of Fame for Gulch, Brant said his past performances tell the story.

"I don't have much to say, just his record," Brant said. "He was what he was. He was a great horse. He was great from the time he was a 2-year-old."

Gulch won his first five career races in New York for trainer LeRoy Jolley, headed to California where he was second to Capote in the GI Norfolk and was fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

D. Wayne Lukas trained Gulch as a 4-year-old, when he was 5-4-2 in 11 starts at five distances over eight tracks in six states. One of those seconds by 1 1/2 lengths to the never-beaten Personal Ensign in the three-horse GI Whitney.

"He was always right there. He'd run short, long," Brant said.
"He was third in the Belmont Stakes. He won the Breeders' Cup Sprint. He was just a really good, sound horse. He ran a number of times, won a lot of money and bred a Kentucky Derby winner, Thunder Gulch."

# NEAT STEALS THE SHOW IN NATIONAL MUSEUM OF RACING HALL OF FAME STAKES

It took the entire stretch, but he got there, and **Neat** (Constitution) surged in the shadow of the wire to claim the GII National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame Stakes at Saratoga on the day the Class of 2024 was officially celebrated.

Last seen winning the GIII Manila Stakes June 29 at the Belmont Big A meeting, he'd yielded to seven May 4 two back in the GII American Turf Stakes at Churchill Downs behind eventual GI Belmont Derby winner Trikari (Oscar Performance). Before that he's been the nose spoiler back in April in the GIII Transylvania Stakes at Keeneland and had started his season trouncing runners in the Bob Bork Texas Turf Mile Stakes by 5 1/2 lengths.

Not breaking all that quickly, but settling well, Neat found himself near the rear of the field in territory he didn't always win from. Facing familiar foe **Lagynos** (Kantharos) again in this contest, he had that runner in his sights from sixth as the field rolled through: 24.43 and: 49.38 early splits. Responding well as they swung through the final bend and into upper stretch, Neat had to come from five off the fence via the overland route, but was closing relentlessly as Lagynos and the filly **Buttercream Babe** (Twirling Candy) were produced for that final rally. With the line coming and lengths still to make up, Neat nailed Lagynos in the final strides to return to the winner's enclosure for the sixth time in his career as the 7-2 second choice.

"He doesn't have 100 Beyers but he shows up every time," said winning trainer Rob Atras. "He's one of those horses that is improving. Mentally, he's getting better, and he seems more dialed in every race. He runs more professional. I know he got a little rank on the backside, but Junior [Alvarado] was testing him to make sure [he had horse]--he's the kind of horse you love, cause they win."

Atras conceded that Neat was further back than he'd expected the horse to be, but that fighting to the wire is nothing unusual given what they see in the mornings. It was sentiment Junior Alvarado echoed.

"It has been pretty amazing. Rob Atras has done a hell of an amazing job with this horse. Today, he settled very well behind the couple of speed horses. When I turned for home, I tipped him out and he was so game. He kept fighting and grinding and kept going after the horse in front. Eventually, he put his head [down] right in front of the wire."

"I love this horse. He is my kind of horse--you can feel he has the fire to win. You can't beat the feeling to win a graded stakes here in Saratoga."

#### **Pedigree Notes**

Neat is a half-brother to multiple Graded-placed Louder Than Bombs (Violence), who was a staple on the Gulfstream Park black-type ranks in his day. In addition to that sibling, their dam Orabella can also claim a winning 2-year-old in Burning Pine (Nyquist), who tried her luck at Royal Ascot last month but only managing a distant 16th in the G3 Albany Stakes after breaking her maiden at Keeneland Apr. 26 by 3 1/2 lengths. **Cont.**

Since then, the mare has produced a yearling filly by Medaglia d'Oro. After aborting her 2024 American Pharoah, she was bred to Practical Joke for 2025.

This is the female family of GI Spinaway Stakes winner R Heat Lightning (Trippi), who would be purchased by, and exported to, Japan before ultimately producing GSW Aster Pegasus (Giant's Causeway). That mare's half-sister GSP Chocolate Coated (Candy Ride {Arg}) would also go on to produce a black-type earner in SP Chocolateaddiction (Pioneerof the Nile).

Her lone losing race was a head-scratching effort in the G1 Qipco 1000 Guineas May 5 at Newmarket, where she was briefly in contention but ultimately faded to finish seventh.

Sent to America for the GI Belmont Oaks Invitational July 6, she proved she was back to her winning ways and in style, claiming her first trophy at the highest level and setting a new course record in the process.

On the back of that effort, with no sign telling them otherwise, the betting public enthusiastically supported Cinderella's Dream here to the tune of 1-5 favoritism, and she again proved there was no stopping her. Settled in the back of a short field of five, the eventual winner was in no hurry early as :24.75 and :49.80 early splits were posted, and only moved closer to the leading flight at about the half-mile mark. The looming danger coming four wide off the far bend, William Buick could not have been any more confident as he called on the filly to uncork her ferocious turn of foot.

As the distance between her and **Kathrynmarissa** (American Pharoah) rapidly shortened, Cinderella's Dream overhauled that rival outside the sixteenth pole and cleared away under a hand ride to win by 1 1/2 emphatic lengths. **Dancing N Dixie** (Neolithic) came late on the scene to pick up third.

"She's obviously a classy filly and the class of the race," said Charlie Appleby. "The only reservation I had is that she put up such a big figure there last time, that I was always concerned whether there would be a bounce out of that. To be fair to the team, they were always confident that she was in good order."

"Going forward, I would say we would look to maybe the [GI] E. P. Taylor [Sept. 14 at Woodbine] or give her a little more of a break and go for the [GI] Queen Elizabeth [II Challenge Cup] at Keeneland [Oct. 12] and then take a view of a Breeders' Cupbut we'll see and we'll see what's around. What she would take to that meeting would be plenty of experience and, as you know in the Breeders' Cup, you need that and a draw."

Buick, confirming the ease his mount's performance suggested, mentioned never really having a moment of worry despite the slow fractions in front of him. **Cont.**

"It was a bit messy, the pace, and it was slow, and obviously Johnny [Velazquez, aboard No. 4, Macanga] opted to stay off the fence and then Frankie [Dettori, aboard No. 3, Kathynmarissa] nipped up the inside and made a race of it."

"I was always comfortable with my filly, I never really had a moment's worry. She responds so quickly to anything I ask her. Once I got in the back of Tyler's [Gaffalione, aboard No. 7, Movin' On Up] filly into the stretch, she had a double handful."

It's a Grade I bonanza Saturday afternoon at Saratoga Race Course, as the track plays host to a trio of elite-level races--short and long, turf and dirt.

The richest of the three events is the \$1-million Whitney Stakes, offering the winner a fees-paid berth into the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Del Mar on the first Saturday of November. National Treasure (Quality Road) is the 9-5 favorite on David Aragona's morning line and can further tighten his grip on the handicap division with a victory. The \$500,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling is perfect in his two starts in this country this season, having held off Senor Buscador (Mineshaft) in the GI Pegasus World Cup Stakes in January ahead of a battling fourth to that foe in the G1 Saudi Cup half a world away a month later. Sent cross-country for the GI Met Mile H. on Belmont Day here June 8, he cut out a strong pace and skipped home to finish some 6 1/4 lengths ahead of **Post Time** (Frosted). "He's matured and he's an older horse now," said trainer Bob Baffert, who won back-to-back Whitneys in 2019-20 with 'TDN Rising Stars' McKinzie (Street Sense) and Improbable (City Zip). "I think he's just getting better and I'm pretty happy with him right now."

Fellow 'Rising Star' First Mission (Street Sense) was dominant in winning this year's GIII Essex Handicap by five lengths and the GII Alysheba Stakes by four lengths, both from just off the speed, but he found himself atypically on the lead when odds-on in the GI Stephen Foster Handicap and weakened to fourth to Kingsbarns (Uncle Mo), three-parts of a length behind the third-placed Skippylongstocking (Exaggerator). Still, trainer Brad Cox is refusing to use that as an excuse.

"That is why we find ourselves running back here in the Whitney," said the conditioner, who sent out Knicks Go (Paynter) to win this in 2021. "He's trained well enough for us to give him another opportunity at the Grade 1-level, we'll see how it goes."

Frosted (Tapit) gave Godolphin its only Whitney to date in 2016.

National Treasure is not the only Whitney starter with a previous top-level tally at the Spa. **Bright Future** (Curlin) really came to life last summer, winning a nine-furlong allowance before defeating future GI Breeders' Cup Classic third Proxy (Tapit) in the Jockey Club Gold Cup over 10 furlongs. A sneakygood sixth at Santa Anita, the chestnut exits a fast-finishing score in the GIII Salvator Mile June 15 and will relish the added eighth of a mile here. The same connections are represented by **Crupi** (Curlin), winner of the GII Suburban Stakes over the mile and a quarter on June 8 and a distant second to Next (Majestic

Warrior) in the 11-furlong GII Brooklyn Stakes July 5.

#### Cugino Scratch Leaves Seven For Saratoga Derby

As reported by *TDN*'s on-site correspondent Tim Wilkin in Friday's edition, Audubon Stakes winner Cugino (Twirling Candy) will miss Saturday's GI Saratoga Derby, leaving Irish raider and 'TDN Rising Star' Diego Velazquez (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) as an even stronger post-time selection.

A Group 2 winner at Leopardstown last season, the 2.4-million gns (\$2.89 million) second-priciest horse at Tattersalls October in 2022 was sent across to France for his first two runs this term, finishing a close fourth in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (2000 Guineas) May 12 ahead of an eighth in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club (French Derby) the next month after leading with as little as 300 meters to race. The bay dropped away abruptly to finish 10th as the 2-1 favorite in the 12-furlong G2 King Edward VII Stakes at Royal Ascot June 21, but he most recently gave six rivals a seven-length beating in the G3 Meld Stakes back at Leopardstown July 18.

Diego Velazquez blew out over the Saratoga main track Friday morning to the satisfaction of T J Comerford, the traveling assistant to trainer Aidan O'Brien.

"He's just gone a little bit quicker today," Comerford said. "He went easy for four [furlongs] and then a little bit quicker the last four over a mile. He's done very good. He's a great traveler."

Ryan Moore retains the ride.

White Palomino (Kitten's Joy) all but wired the GI Belmont Derby July 6 and Flavien Prat is likely to hit the gas from gate seven here as well. He could have this field over a barrel from a pace standpoint and will try to hold off the likes of Legend of Time (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}), who could do no better than third off the sedate tempo last time at Aqueduct. #### Ways and Means Rates Slight Favorite In Test

A competitive field of six sophomore fillies is set to face the starter for Saturday's GI Test Stakes over a seven-furlong trip that is widely regarded as a 'specialist' distance.

Four of the entrants already own at least one victory going seven-eighths of a mile, but one of the fillies that does not figures to go off favored in the Test. Klaravich Stables' homebred 'TDN Rising Star' Ways and Means (Practical Joke) has a single try at the distance, resulting in a near-miss second to Brightwork (Outwork) in last year's GI Spinaway Stakes. Tried over two turns in her first couple of outings this season, the half-sister to GISW Surge Capacity (Flintshire {GB}) and GSW Highly Motivated (Into Mischief) was second in the GII Gulfstream Park Oaks and fourth in the GI Kentucky Oaks, but walloped her rivals in a one-mile allowance here June 6, good for a 104 Beyer that would win the Test.

"She's doing well. We've spaced her races out purposefully for this race," said trainer Chad Brown. "She's in a good rhythm working. Some speed in there would help her."

Which of the six fillies will lead in the race is an open question. Emery (More Than Ready), winner of the seven-furlong Leslie's Lady Stakes two back, was handy enough to a strong pace in the July 6 GIII Victory Ride Stakes last time before edging front-running Mystic Lake (Mo Town), and she may be ridden positively from the rail by Tyler Gaffalione. Her stablemate Denim and Pearls (Into Mischief) romped by better than nine lengths in Keeneland's GII Beaumont Stakes over an extended seven-eighths of a mile, but was well beaten by My Mane Squeeze (Audible) in the GII Eight Belles Stakes in the Churchill slop May 3.

Brightwork failed to build on her Spinaway success, finishing fifth in the GI Darley Alcibiades Stakes and sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies.

She's got the layoff to overcome if she is to remain unbeaten at sprint distances.

Saturday's program also features the GII Troy Stakes, in which the record-setting **Cogburn** (Not This Time) figures a hot favorite in a race that includes the in-form **Grooms All Bizness** (Fed Biz) and Godolphin's consistent **Mischief Magic (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}).

#### Distaff Berth On The Line In Clement L. Hirsch

An exceptionally deep field of eight heads to the post for Saturday's GI Clement L. Hirsch Stakes at Del Mar, a 'Win and You're In' qualifier for the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff going another sixteenth of a mile in early November.

Michael Lund Petersen's **Adare Manor** (Uncle Mo) is the defending Hirsch champion, having bested soon-to-be-millionaire **Desert Dawn** (Cupid) by a length in last year's renewal. Seventh in the Distaff, she was second in the GI Beholder Mile on seasonal debut in March, but has since downed **Flying Connection** (Connect) in the GI Apple Blossom Handicap Apr. 13 and **Coffee in Bed** (Curlin) in the GII Santa Margarita Stakes May. 26.

In 2021, trainer Brad Cox sent out the previous year's GI Kentucky Oaks winner Shedaresthedevil (Daredevil) to take the Hirsch, and Brendan Walsh will look to repeat the dose with 2023 Oaks victress and 'TDN Rising Star' Pretty Mischievous (Into Mischief). Also victorious in the GI Acorn Stakes and GI Test Stakes, the homebred is winless in her last three, including a third to Randomized (Nyquist) in the GI Ogden Phipps Stakes at Saratoga June 8.

Hall of Famers Mike Smith and Bill Mott teamed to win a Breeders' Cup Distaff in 1997 with Allen Paulson's Ajina and another with Royal Delta in 2012 and the pair reunite with Juddmonte's 'TDN Rising Star' Scylla (Tapit) this weekend. Cont.

The full-sister to Tacitus and Batten Down rides a three-race winning streak into her first Grade I assignment, including a neck score in the GII Fleur De Lis Stakes at Churchill June 29.

### FEDERAL JUDGE WON'T GRANT **'EMERGENCY' RESTRAINING ORDER TO** STOP HISA ENFORCEMENT IN OKLAHOMA

A federal judge on Aug. 1 refused to grant an "emergency" request for a temporary restraining order that eight licensed racetrackers in Oklahoma requested on July 29 to keep the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) from being enforced in that state before the Remington Park meet begins there Aug.

Chief Judge Timothy DeGiusti of United States District Court of Oklahoma (Western District) wrote in an order issued Thursday that, "Upon review, the Court finds the Application is facially insufficient to satisfy the requirements of Rule 65(b)(1) for issuance of a temporary restraining order without notice.

"Specifically, Plaintiffs have not provided 'specific facts in an affidavit or a verified complaint [to] clearly show that immediate and irreparable injury, loss, or damage will result to [Plaintiffs] before the adverse party can be heard in opposition," the order stated.

Instead, a hearing on the plaintiffs' application has been scheduled for Aug. 7.

The judge could still issue an injunction against the HISA rules after hearing from all parties at next Wednesday's hearing. The primary difference between a temporary restraining order and a preliminary injunction is that a temporary restraining order may be issued without notice to the opposing party and that a temporary restraining order is of limited duration.

The plaintiffs are individual owners, trainers and other Thoroughbred industry licensees who intend to compete at the upcoming Remington meet. They are: Joe Offolter, Danny Caldwell, Elizabeth Butler, Randy Blair, Bryan Hawk, Scott Young, Boyd Caster and Michael Major.

As in seven previous federal lawsuits initiated around the country since 2021 that have similarly targeted the HISA Authority and Federal Trade Commission (FTC) as defendants, the Oklahoma plaintiffs want declaratory judgments, injunctions, and restraining orders imposed that would invalidate HISA rules and prohibit the HISA Authority, the FTC, and the Horseracing Integrity and Welfare Unit (HIWU) from enforcing the regulations that govern the sport.

Earlier this week, a different judge in that same Oklahoma federal court cancelled a Wednesday hearing in the case after learning that seven of the plaintiffs in this lawsuit last year filed a substantially similar complaint but voluntarily withdrew it three months later. The July 24, 2024, case was then reassigned to chief judge DeGiusti, the same federal judge who had handled that 2023 case.

Last year, DeGiusti had similarly ruled that the plaintiffs' motion for a temporary restraining order was "facially insufficient." The plaintiffs subsequently withdrew their motion and voluntarily dismissed their complaint.

#### QUICK TURNAROUND FOR INTO MISCHIEF COLT AT FASIG-TIPTON SARATOGA SALE

A colt by super sire Into Mischief (hip 30) returns to the sales ring for the second time in six months when he sells through the Darby Dan Farm consignment during the first session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale Monday. The yearling holds the distinction of having the highest previous sales price in the Saratoga auction's 240-head catalogue after selling for \$650,000 as part of the Lothenbach dispersal the Fasig-Tipton Winter Mixed Sale in February. A colt by Constitution (hip 59) has the next highest previous price, having sold for \$525,000 at last year's Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale.

"He was just a lovely short yearling," said Darby Dan's Renee Logan, who signed the ticket on the Into Mischief colt in February on behalf of an undisclosed client. "He had a beautiful balance and a lovely walk. He was very, very correct with nice feet and I just liked the way his neck tied into his shoulder and with a really good hind leg. All of the the things you want in a young horse. We can buy them that way and they don't always end up that way, but that's the way you want to start."

The dispersal, organized just months after the passing of longtime owner/breeder Bob Lothenbach, provided a unique opportunity for buyers. The colt, who is out of Distorted Music (Distorted Humor), sold some 10 hips after his half-sister, graded winner She Can't Sing (Bernardini) brought \$1.1 million from Hill 'n' Dale at Xalapa. He had been rerouted to auction-instead of his breeder's racing stable--after Lothenbach passed away last November.

"I like the fact that he wasn't overly prepped," Logan said. "He was just in really good weight, but not overweight. His hair wasn't overdone. You could just tell that he was basically always kept well and kind of basically pulled out of the field and cleaned up a little bit. He was just always in good condition from the time he was born until February."

In addition to the colt's physical attributes, the Darby Dan team was also attracted to the Into Mischief/Distorted Humor cross which is responsible for Grade I winners Life is Good and Practical Joke.

Logan knew she would have to pay for the colt when he walked into the ring in Lexington.

"I knew the players who were interested in him and I knew I was up against [Randy] Hartley and [Dean] DeRenzo and other people who also liked that horse that had plenty of money to spend on him," she said. "I had told my client that we were going to have to be minimum of \$500,000 or \$600,000."

Since the colt was purchased over the winter, the family has continued to prove popular in the sales ring. His half-brother by Tapit sold for \$1.2 million after galloping at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's March 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale.

"I don't know that it has a whole lot of impact, but it certainly doesn't hurt," Logan said of the seven-figure juvenile. "He had two siblings bring over \$1 million. And that colt, from what I understand, is a very, very good colt. They have a lot of high hopes for him."

Logan said the plan was always to bring the colt to Saratoga for Fasig-Tipton's boutique summertime auction and everything has gone to plan from February to shipping to upstate New York Thursday.

"He's a beautiful colt," Logan said. "He hasn't disappointed us in any way. I am confident that he is going to be extremely well received. His vetting is beautiful--you can't get it any better. And he is just a bigger version of what he was in February. He's just a more mature version of that."

Of the risks of a high-priced pinhook prospect, Logan said, "That's a lot of money. But our client just loves this and loves the game. You've got to be tied on to do this, win, lose or draw."

Darby Dan brings a four-horse consignment to the Saratoga sale. In addition to hip 30, the farm will also offer a filly by Munnings (hip 54) out of stakes winner Ghoul's Night Out (Ghostzapper). Bred by Hill 'n' Dale at Xalapa, the yearling was purchased by Red Devil Bloodstock for \$120,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale.

"She's absolutely lovely," Logan said of the filly. "She's beautifully balanced with a lot of leg, where some Munnings don't. She's not heavy fronted. She's just really, really pretty with good vetting."

During Tuesday's second night of the auction, Darby Dan will offer a homebred colt by Omaha Beach (hip 192). The bay is out of Tip at Tapit (Tapit), a full-sister to Grade I winner Time and Motion who traces back to many of the historic farm's stars, including Memories of Silver, Winter Memories, Sunshine Forever and Brian's Time. The colt's half-sister by Gun Runner sold for \$1.5 million at the 2022 Keeneland September sale.

"Our Omaha Beach colt, out of Tip At Tapit, it's a family that goes back to all the great Darby Dan horses," Logan said.

Rounding out the Darby Dan consignment is a colt by Candy Ride (Arg) (hip 197) who was bred in Virginia by Wayne and Susie Chatfield-Taylor's Morgan's Ford Farm. He is a half-brother to graded winner Chess Chief (Into Mischief). Morgan's Ford purchased his dam, Un Blessed (Mineshaft), for \$110,000 at the 2014 Keeneland November sale, but she's another one with deep ties to Darby Dan Farm. Her dam is Grade I winner Plenty of Grace (Roberto) and the family includes champion Soaring Softly.

"He's a really good Candy Ride," Logan said. "He is big and very substantial with a lot of bone. And he has a beautiful walk on him."

Logan said she expected to see plenty of competitive bidding at the Saratoga auction, which consistently represents the top of the yearling market.

"I think the demand is going to be very strong," she said. "Very, very strong. Of course, you always have to get through your vetting."

"Fortunately we have four horses who vet very well. But that's our opinion and what we think is kind of irrelevant. It's what someone else thinks that's going to matter."

The Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale will be held Monday and Tuesday at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion. Bidding begins each evening at 6:30 p.m.

#### HELICITY HEADLINES SECOND INGLIS **DIGITAL USA SALE**

Coming off a strong runner-up performance at Saratoga in his second lifetime start, Helicity (The Factor) will sell in Inglis Digital USA's second online auction since it was rebranded from the Wanamaker platform. The one-horse flash sale closes at noon ET on Tuesday, Aug. 6.

Trained and campaigned by Jack Sisterson in partnership with David Grund and Amanda Oster, Helicity was purchased for \$120,000 at the OBS March Sale. Sisterson said he was drawn to the son of The Factor because of the good fortune he has had with another son of the sire, GSW and GISP Bandua.

"He reminded me a lot of the way Bandua looked and moved," Sisterson explained. "From day one I've always liked him and when we got him back in the barn at Palm Meadows, he was very straightforward. Great mind on him, very athletic. He's got a lot of scope to him. We always had Saratoga in mind for him when we picked him."

Helicity finished a closing third in his debut at Gulfstream Park on June 7 going five furlongs on the turf. From there, he stretched out to a mile and a sixteenth at Saratoga on July 20. After racing in the three path around the far turn, the juvenile took the lead at the quarter pole and gave way to Cherie DeVaux trainee Without Caution (Without Parole {GB}) in the final strides.

"He was only 50% or 60% fit at Gulfstream," said Sisterson. "We wanted to give him one run at Gulfstream to give him experience sprinting and get some added fitness in him. In Saratoga we just bumped into a good one of Cherie's, but we were over the moon with the way he ran. We expected him to run a winning race and he just got ran down late. It was his first time around two turns and I think he'll improve again in his third start."

Sisterson reported that Helicity came out of his last race in good order. The trainer is pointing the colt to the Kentucky Downs meet for his next start, where maiden special weight purses run to \$170,000. Helicity could also target the \$1 million Kentucky Downs Juvenile Sprint on Sept. 1 or the \$1 million Kentucky Downs Juvenile Mile on Sept. 8.

After Helicity's runner-up performance in Saratoga, Sisterson received several inquiries about buying the colt. Cont.

The partnership decided to present the horse to the market with the thought that since he still has his maiden conditions, Helicity offers a variety of opportunities for potential buyers.

"Obviously I don't want to loose a horse, but it's a business and the majority owners are willing to keep the horse, but they will sell at the right price," said Sisterson. "He has a bright future, so we'll see how the market values him. He looks like he'll improve again. He's a now horse, but he looks like he'll get better at three as well with some size and scope to him."

Helicity is currently stabled at Saratoga Race Course in Barn 84 and he will breeze on the Oklahoma track on Saturday, Aug. 3 at 7:30 a.m. weather permitting for potential buyers to watch.

Inglis Digital USA CEO Liza Hendriks said that Helicity's presentation to the market is a perfect example of how digital sales offer sellers the opportunity to use timely updates to their advantage.

"It's great for people to be able to capitalize on that and be able to sell throughout the year," she said. "Jack Sisterson owns part of the horse himself, so it's great for him to help with cashflow and add liquidity. Really it helps in each different part of the market."

Last month, Inglis Digital conducted its first sale since the platform re-brand. The auction closed on July 17 and was led by Lucky Girl (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Ire}), a 5-year-old multiple stakes-winner that sold for \$235,000 to Beagle Bloodstock on behalf of Australia's Kia Ora Stud. The sale saw 22 horses sell from 50 offered for a gross of \$450,000, with an average sale price over \$21,000.

Hendriks said that the Inglis busy team has been planning for the future of their digital platform.

"Mark Webster, the managing director for Inglis globally, was just in Saratoga and Lexington and we had a bunch of meetings with clients and we're getting great feedback," said Hendriks.

"People are starting to catch on more and more to the digital way of doing things. People have been really engaged in giving feedback so we've been able to tailor our platform to what our clients are wanting and we will be able to make those changes before our next sale in September."

# NEXT UP FOR NEXT: GOING FOR BACK-TO-BACK WINS IN SPA'S BIRDSTONE by Tim Wilkin

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.--Here is what's next at Saratoga Race Course.

Next (Not This Time) is.

The 6-year-old gelding is the best long-distance dirt horse in the country, and, on Sunday, he'll attempt to prove it again when he runs in the \$150,000 listed Birdstone Stakes at the Spa. If you want to see it, get to Saratoga early. The Birdstone is race No. 2 and has a scheduled post time of 1:44 p.m. A field of five is entered in the 1 3/4-mile Birdstone and Next is the overwhelming 1-9 favorite on the morning line.

Next doesn't just win these marathon races. He pulverizes his competition. He has won his two starts this year by a combined 20-1/2 lengths. Dating back to last year, he has won five in a row by a combined 59-1/2 lengths. His personal best was a 25-length romp in the GIII Greenwood Cup at 1-1/2 miles at Parx last year. That came after he won the Birdstone for the first time, by 11-3/4 lengths.

"He is so good at going that far," trainer Doug Cowans said by phone from his base in Kentucky. "He doesn't really get into gear until later in the race. The further the better. He just runs them off his feet the last quarter of a mile. I have never had a horse like that, and I have been training since 1993."

In his 21-race career, Next has won 11 times. Cowans, who claimed the horse in 2022, has had him for his last 11 starts. The dominating wins for the grey flash have almost come to be expected, although Cowans knows there are no guarantees.

"There are times when we think this will be his test," Cowans said about Next's past starts. **Cont**.

"There have been situations where he'll be tested but he just seems to overcome all the things that come into play."

Fatigue has never been an issue for Next, who is owned by Michael Foster and will be ridden by Luan Machado, one of the leading riders at Ellis Park.

"No," Cowans said with a laugh when asked if Next ever gets tired. "I tell people he is the best horse I have ever trained and the most unusual horse I have ever trained."

As Next continues to flourish with the marathon distances, Cowans said there is no thought of shortening him up.

"(Foster) is all on board," Cowans said. "Look, you run him at a mile and a quarter and he is on a different path the rest of his life. Some of the plan is just to have fun with the horse. We claimed the horse for \$62.5 and he doesn't owe us anything. It would be nice to have him around for another two or three years."

#### Antonucci Hoping For Better Luck For Whatintheliteral In Adirondack

Whatintheliteral (Lord Nelson) had plenty of luck in the opening day Schuylerville Stakes at Saratoga.

All of it was bad.

Trainer Jena Antonucci is hoping for better on Sunday when she saddles Whatintheliteral in the \$200,000, Grade III Adirondack Stakes, the second stake for 2-year-old fillies at the meet. It will be run at 6-1/2 furlongs.

"She is great," Antonucci said outside her barn on the Oklahoma Training Track Friday morning. "She is such an honest filly, that is the cool part of her. She shows up any time she is running. I'm excited to get her back in the game and take a crack at it."

In the Schuylerville, Whatintheliteral had no chance as she stumbled after the gates opened and jockey Javier Castellano was pitched over her head. The filly ran all the way around riderless and was ok.

Now, she gets another chance.

"It sucks," Antonucci said about the Schuylerville. "It's a lot like golf. Once you hit the ball, it's out of your hands. We can't go back and put the milk in the container. We are moving forward."

Whatintheliteral broke her maiden in her third start, the Astoria Stakes during the Belmont Stakes Festival at Saratoga in June at 13-1. Despite that win, she was dismissed at 25-1 in the Schuylerville. Her morning-line odds for the Adirondack are 8-1. She drew the rail for the third time in five career races.

Whatintheliteral is owned by horseOlogy Racing and Craig Steinhart. Katie Miranda, co-owner of horseOlogy with Antonucci, is also looking forward to seeing what her young filly can do.

"We are thrilled she is ok and was athletic enough to get herself out of a sticky situation in the last race," Miranda said at the barn. "We're ready to go."

John Velazquez will replace Castellano in the saddle for this one. Both jockeys are in the Hall of Fame. Castellano chose to ride another horse, Aguas de Cristal (Volatile), in the Adirondack. Castellano had ridden Whatintheliteral in her first four starts.

"Having Johnny is definitely not downgrading," Antonucci said.

#### Despite His Recent Dominance At Saratoga, Irad Ortiz Does Not Feel Pressure

One thing Irad Ortiz Jr. will not do is put pressure on himself. He has been the most consistent jockey on the Saratoga circuit the last half dozen summers. And, as the 40-day Saratoga meet gets closer to the halfway point, he is putting himself into position to get his sixth career riding title.

"So far, so good," Ortiz said on the backstretch at Saratoga Friday morning. "I would say we have had a great start. I'm glad for all the support I have gotten from the owners and trainers."

Ortiz has won the last two Saratoga riding titles and has claimed the top spot in four of the last six years. Ortiz won three races on Friday and now has 22 winners, two more than Flavien Prat.

"Whatever has happened already, we just try to turn the page and try to win another title," Ortiz said. "I don't feel any pressure."

Ortiz respects the jockey colony in Saratoga, which is arguably the best in the country. Besides Prat, Ortiz deals daily with the likes of Tyler Gaffalione, Luis Saez, Manny Franco, his brother Jose, Junior Alvarado and the up-and-coming Dylan Davis. And there is also the veteran presence of Hall of Famers John Velazquez and Javier Castellano as well as Joel Rosario, who was inducted into the Hall of Fame on Friday.

"We all want to do the same thing, we all want to win," Ortiz said. "I have had success the last few years, but I don't think there is a target on me. I just go out and do my job."

### MAXIMUM SECURITY DISQUALIFIED FROM 2020 SAUDI CUP, MIDNIGHT BISOU DECLARED WINNER

Maximum Security (New Year's Day) has been disqualified from his victory in the inaugural \$20-million Saudi Cup and Midnight Bisou (Midnight Lute) has been promoted to first, the stewards committee of the Jockey Club of Saudi Arabia (JCSA) announced on Friday.

The change in finishing order of the Feb. 29, 2020 race was the result of an inquiry into the charges brought by the JCSA against Maximum Security's trainer Jason Servis, who is currently serving a four-year prison sentence for doping horses under his care. The inquiry took place on May 22-23 at King Abdulaziz Racecourse in Riyadh. The charges issued against Servis were proved and sanctions were imposed by the stewards committee 1,616 days after the race was run.

"It's been such a long wait, now that it's here it is such a relief and so gratifying to officially be recognized as the winner," said Jeff Bloom, the head of Bloom Racing. "More than anything, I am so proud of our mare and her accomplishments. Now she put the final stamp on a career that was more than we ever expected. She had a Hall of Fame career.

"To take down the inaugural world's richest races against the best male handicap horses in the world, it's all special. I'm glad we have now crossed the finish line." Bloom added, "The people in Saudi Arabia have done a great job keeping us up to speed throughout this process. It was a long drawn out process but we were kept in the loop. I'm still in sort of in a dream state right now, but it's certainly a good one."

In respect of Maximum Security and the race, it was ordered that the placings be altered to reflect Maximum Security's disqualification and the prize-money for the race be re-distributed accordingly. Bloom Racing, whose partners include Madaket Stables and Allen Racing, will now get \$10 million for winning the race. Second-place was \$3.5 million, so this is a \$6.5 million payday for them.

Servis has been given a lifetime ban from racing in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

The revised 2020 Saudi Cup finishing order is now as follows: first: Midnight Bisou, second: Benbatl (GB), third: Mucho Gusto, fourth: Tacitus, fifth: Gold Dream (Jpn), sixth: Chrysoberyl (Jpn), seventh: Mjjack (Ire), eighth: Magic Wand (Ire), ninth: Gronkowski, 10th: McKinzie, 11th: Great Scot (GB), 12th: North America (GB), and 13th: Capezzano.

A JCSA spokesman said, "The JCSA is satisfied that, following a full disciplinary process, the charges affecting the outcome of the 2020 Saudi Cup have now been determined by the Stewards Committee following a proper investigation. The JCSA will abide by the decision of the Stewards Committee.

"The JCSA looks forward to continuing with preparations for the The Saudi Cup 2025 and the 2026 Asian Racing Conference with this matter concluded. We extend our congratulations to the connections of Midnight Bisou, who is the only mare to win the Saudi Cup to date."

#### SCHAEFER LIVING THE DREAM WITH

**DORNOCH** by Katie Petrunyak

For many people, their passion for racing started with a horse. They watched Zenyatta dance to two Breeders' Cup victories, they had a strong opinion in the rivalry between Affirmed and Alydar or maybe they cheered American Pharoah on to a Grand Slam score when he won the 2015 Classic.

For Priscilla Schaefer, her love of racing all started with a backstretch. She was in high school when she attended her first horse race at Emerald Downs outside of Seattle, Washington. Watching as the horses entered the starting gate, Schaefer knew there was more to the story of how those equine athletes were trained up to the races. She looked past the track to the barns, where even at a quiet facility like Emerald Downs, the hum of activity was palpable from afar. Schaefer decided that the backstretch was where she wanted to be.

Schaefer had no familial connection to racing, but she had spent her childhood riding and working cattle on horseback on her family's ranch in Idaho. After graduating high school, she started searching for equine-related professions online and stumbled upon the North American Racing Academy, a community college-based riding program in Lexington, Kentucky that prepares students to pursue careers as jockeys, exercise

riders, assistant trainers and other racing-related professions. Her family and friends were shocked when Schaefer announced that she would be moving to Kentucky to pursue a career in an industry that up until then, they had never really heard much about.

"They were all surprised about it," Schaefer admitted. "It was pretty out of the blue and I kind of made the decision fairly quickly. I'm very much a spur-of-the-moment kind of person. I didn't want to go to a normal four-year college with no idea what I wanted to study, but I knew I wanted to do something with horses. When the North American Racing Academy popped up and I started looking into it more, I knew that was it for me."

In 2016, Schaefer packed her bags and moved to Kentucky. She was taking a chance on a dream, but never in her wildest imagination could she have dreamed up that eight years later, she would be the exercise rider for a horse like GI Belmont Stakes and GI Haskell Stakes winner Dornoch (Good Magic).

After graduating from the racing academy, Schaefer got her first job in the sport as an exercise rider for Mike Maker. Two years later, she began working for Danny Gargan. A few years into her time with the New York-based trainer, she was honored when Gargan assigned her to ride his stable star Tax (Arch). The multiple graded stakes-winning barn favorite retired shortly after, but just a few weeks later, another special horse arrived at the barn.

The 2-year-old son of Good Magic was a full-brother to Mage, who at the time had just run a well-fought second to champion Forte (Violence) in the GI Florida Derby.

"I started riding Dornoch immediately and I liked him right from the start," recalled Schaefer. "We all did. He has always been big and he's got a lot of personality. He knows what he is and he's not afraid to show it."

The anticipation for Dornoch's debut grew after Mage won the GI Kentucky Derby. It took three tries for the bay colt to break his maiden, but from there he reeled off wins in the GII Remsen Stakes and GII Fountain of Youth Stakes. Things went a bit sideways when Dornoch finished fourth in the GI Blue Grass Stakes and then, after drawing the one hole, never showed much run in the Kentucky Derby. After that, Schaefer could tell that her mount was frustrated.

"He's one that likes winning and I swear he knows when he wins or when he doesn't win," she explained. "You could tell going back to the track afterward that he was ready to go again. He was mad about it. So I was pretty confident going into the Belmont because of the way he was training."

Schaefer's assertion proved correct in the Belmont as Dornoch handed his trainer a first career Grade I win and gave his partnership--which includes World Series champion Jayson Werth--plenty to celebrate. **Cont.**

From there it was on to the Haskell, which is a "Win and You're In" qualifier for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Del Mar on Nov. 2.

"We were very excited coming out of the Belmont and knowing that this race was a Win and You're In," said Schaefer. "I have never been on a Win and You're In possibility, so this was big for me. He came out of the Belmont I think even better than going into the Belmont and his confidence was high."

Despite drawing Post 1 again, Dornoch went to the front easily and was poised to fend off 4-5 favorite Mindframe (Constitution) as he led the field to the top of the stretch.

"It was a little nerve wracking going around the turn because he did get passed a little bit, but he wasn't giving up," Schaefer said. "He did his usual thing where he looked them in the eye and said, 'Nope, not today.' Once he got past Mindframe again in the stretch and just started going, I knew he had it because he just digs in and he goes. I was there standing with Danny and Carol [Fisher, assistant trainer] and we're all jumping around screaming. It was so exciting. It was such a good feeling knowing that there was no real excuse that day. After the Belmont, people were saying it was a speed-favoring track and he got the perfect trip and all that, but I think Haskell Day he really showed that he is the real deal."

Schaefer reported that Dornoch's self-confidence is at an alltime high now that he is back in Saratoga training up for the GI Travers on Aug. 24, but his laid-back personality around the barn is still intact.

"He is a goofy horse in general," Schaefer said. "He can always spot a camera on the track. If you ever see pictures of him out there, he's always got one eye on the camera. He's just a big, happy horse."

"He goes out there every day and he wants everyone to know that he's there and he's not scared of anything."

Schaefer recalled how one morning over the winter as they were training at Palm Meadows, a horse spooked and was running toward Dornoch and Schaefer as they were jogging along the rail.

"He goes to square up with the horse thinking he's going to get into a fight with him," she said with a laugh. "He wasn't scared of him at all. He's funny because he can be very sweet, but he's very assertive at the same time. He's like, 'I am who I am. Don't mess with me."

There's a certain amount of pressure that comes with riding a horse like Dornoch, who Schaefer said is easily the best horse she has ever sat on. She explained that the key to handling such a major responsibility has been to focus on her work and let the rest fall into place.

"Just coming into the barn early and being around these animals, it's something I love and to be paid for doing something I love, I couldn't ask for anything better."

Back in Idaho, there is a pocket of new racing fans tuning in to each of Dornoch's races. Schaefer said that her family and friends now understand a bit more about why she took a chance on pursuing something that she has always been so passionate about.

"They say once horses get in your blood, that's kind of it," she said. "It's hard to get away from them. Just growing up with horses, I guess they've always been a part of my life. The satisfaction you have of working with these animals every single day and putting in the work, it's hard work but at the same time it's so satisfying when everything comes together and you see them cross the finish line ahead of everybody else. It's one of the most rewarding feelings I've ever had in my life."

In addition, all Churchill Downs content will be immediately available to NYRA Bets customers.

The impasse between the pair was reignited on Wednesday, July 31 when NYRA said that it was cutting off pari-mutuel wagering, live video and race replays to TwinSpires customers. The reason given was NYRA was seeking financial terms from Churchill Downs's platform that were similar to those currently in place with all national advance deposit wagering sites offering NYRA content.





## TWO SHARP TOO GOOD IN 'RISING STAR' WIN AT SARATOGA

Coming in with the benefit of a race under her belt, Two Sharp (Twirling Candy) was just too good for the field of maiden fillies at Saratoga Friday to became a new 'TDN Rising Star'. Favored in her six-furlong debut at Churchill June 29 after bringing a cool \$925,000 as a yearling at Keeneland September in 2022, the Rigney Racing runner spotted the field a step at the field and, while ultimately no match for the race winner, did well to get up into second. With the addition of experience and an extra halffurlong, Two Sharp was bet down to 1-2 by the Friday Saratoga crowd and certainly showed she was worth every cent, running to the front inside of Quiet Confidence (Nyquist) early before putting even her closest rival on the back foot into the far turn and making the stretch run looking like a procession, coming home under wraps to win by 11 1/4 lengths. Pricey first-time starter Lady Pink (Into Mischief), a \$720,000 FTSAUG yearling buy for Peter Brant, brought home the rest of the pack in second.

Two Sharp is the fifth 'TDN Rising Star' for Twirling Candy, who also was one himself back in 2010. She is the first and only foal to date out of the winning Distorted Humor mare Double Sharp, herself a daughter of MGSW/MGISP Bsharpsonata (Pulpit). Woods Edge Farm purchased Double Sharp for \$255,000 at the Keeneland November Sale in 2017.
