



ARTHUR'S RIDE TAKES THEM ALL THE WAY IN THE WHITNEY



Arthur's Ride | Sarah Andrew

A 12 3/4-length winner of a rare 10-furlong allowance with a gaudy 111 Beyer Speed Figure during the Belmont Stakes Festival at Saratoga June 7, Glassman Racing's **Arthur's Ride** (Tapit) was well-backed at odds of 6-1 in Saturday's GI Whitney Stakes at the Spa despite the presence of GI Met Mile winner **National Treasure** (Quality Road) and other, proven handicap horses.

Making his stakes debut on top of everything else in the Breeders' Cup Classic 'Win and You're In' event, Arthur's Ride was intent on the lead, set a searching gallop and proved not for catching.

Hustled away from gate nine by Junior Alvarado, the \$250,000 Keeneland September graduate had to do a bit of work, but got there all the same through enervating splits of :23.26 and :46.63 prompted along by **Skippylongstocking** (Exaggerator) as odds-on National Treasure was forced to do his running from off the pace, though he was well-spotted in the box seat. Moving right along through three-quarters of a mile in 1:10.28, Arthur's Ride began to get away at the top of the lane, pinched an insurmountable advantage into the final furlong and held sway by 2 1/4 lengths as **Crupi** (Curlin) and **Post Time** (Frosted) made belated progress. National Treasure was sixth.

PRACTICAL JOKE FILLY 'MEANS' BUSINESS IN THE TEST

Klaravich Stables' **'TDN Rising Star' Ways and Means** (Practical Joke) looked like a winner every step of the way with a comfortable victory as the 3-5 favorite in Saturday's GI Test Stakes at Saratoga.

First to break the line for Flavien Prat, the homebred filly led through the opening exchanges, but was ultimately content to allow the rail-skimming **Emery** (More Than Ready) to come through and take up the running through fractions of :22.43 and :44.54 over the sealed, muddy main track. Held together into the final 2 1/2 furlongs, Ways and Means claimed Emery with consummate ease in upper stretch and kept on nicely to score by 2 1/2 lengths in the finish. Emery was a clear second ahead of **My Mane Squeeze** (Audible) in third. **Cont. p7**



Remarkably, Hall of Famer Bill Mott was celebrating his first win in the Whitney. He saddled future Horse of the Year Cody's Wish (Curlin) to a well-beaten third-place finish as the favorite in last year's renewal.

"There were a couple of good horses in there--nice field," Mott said. "I mean, first time in Grade I company, you couldn't be happier. I mean he has a lot of stamina. I figured if he could get to the quarter pole on the lead, he could put them away because he has a tremendous amount of stamina this horse."

Mott continued, "It is a very important race. It is a Grade I and probably one of the top two or three races that they run in Saratoga--it is really nice. I am really glad for the Glassmans.

We are going to run in hopefully one more stake here at the end of the meet. If he is good come November, hopefully we will be lucky enough to run in the Breeders' Cup. We were thinking to use the Whitney as a prep for the [GI] Jockey Club Gold Cup."

Arthur's Ride, second in a pair of live maiden races as a juvenile at Saratoga, made only one start at three, graduating going a mile at Gulfstream in February. He returned from a lengthy layoff with an eye-catching optional claiming victory over that same track and trip Mar. 16, then disappointed with a ninth-place finish as the favorite in an optional claimer in the slop on the Kentucky Oaks undercard. He couldn't have been any more impressive while making his two-turn debut in his

aforementioned daylight win at the Spa last time.

"The horse is named after my [late] father and to share that with my sister and my siblings [in the winner's circle] to watch it and my dad watching it [from above]--it doesn't get better than that," winning owner Karl Glassman said. "To be part of Bill Mott winning his first Whitney--my goodness, we'll wake up but I don't know when."

He continued, "He had a little bit of a tendon issue. Barry Eisaman at Eisaman Equine in Ocala nursed him back and said, 'He'll come back.' He just took care of him. He wouldn't be here without Barry. We gave him time, Barry gave him time and Bill gave him time. Bill Mott is as patient as they get. He's the kind of horse that's in the perfect hands with Bill. It doesn't get better than this."

Pedigree Notes:

Arthur's Ride is the second Whitney winner for Gainesway's inimitable Tapit, following 2016 victor Frosted. With 105 graded winners from his 166 black-type winners, there aren't too many major races in the U.S. not touched by Tapit in some way. The 23-year-old has better than \$210 million in lifetime progeny earnings.

The Whitney winner also is the second Grade I offspring out of Points of Grace, Canada's champion grass mare of 2009. Her

daughter Victory to Victory (Exchange Rate) won the 2016 GI Natalma Stakes en route to champion 2-year-old filly honors in Canada that year. The mare has also produced Alittleloveandluck (Arrogate), winner of the 2022 Ginger Brew Stakes at Gulfstream. Her stakes winners account for three of Point Given's 29 black-type winners as a broodmare sire. Points of Grace's most recent foal is the winning sophomore filly Genetics, a full-sister to Arthur's Ride, who brought \$525,000

from Glassman Racing--owner of the Whitney winner--at the 2022 Keeneland September sale. The mare was bred to Verifying for next term.



A jaw-dropping, double-digit debut winner at the Spa last summer, Ways and Means was sidelined after finishing a troubled second in the GI Spinaway Stakes on closing weekend. She was unlucky again in her first start off the bench to finish second as the heavy favorite in the GII Gulfstream Park Oaks Mar. 30 and tired to fourth after sitting right on a hot pace in the GI Kentucky Oaks. She shortened up to a mile with a

dominating first-level allowance win with a field-best 104 Beyer Speed Figure during the Belmont Stakes festival last time June 6.

The win marked the second Test victory for trainer Chad Brown, who conditioned Klaravich Stables' 2018 winner Seperationofpowers.

"We always knew she was a true Grade I horse and has had some bad luck along the way," Brown said. "She really showed a lot of heart and perseverance to overcome her injury last year and she dealt with a sealed track today, too. We weren't sure if she was going to like it, but she really showed up for us today. That Kentucky Oaks when it had a wet track was a little tough to figure out. It was a mile and an eighth and I really think she breezed too fast the week before the race and she ran into a monster horse [Thorpedo Anna]."

Brown continued, "Cutting back has been key for her. She definitely has an affinity to one-turn races and Saratoga. She showed that when she broke her maiden so impressively here. Really her only defeat at Saratoga was in the Spinaway when she had a ton of trouble, clipped heels and actually got seriously injured in the race. Fortunately, she was able to come back from it. She was all class and Flavien [Prat] gets along with her so well. I thought he did a really good job to assert himself early and from there she really had no excuse with that trip."

As for what's next, Brown added, "I'm really interested in

working backwards from the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint. She's going to have to face older horses in that race, but she showed today that she does good with good spacing between her races. She runs so fast and hard. I don't think she needs to run much between now and then. Maybe one start."

Brightwork (Outwork), who defeated Ways and Means in last year's Spinaway over the same course and distance, was scratched from what would have been her first start as a

3-year-old. Brightwork reared up and flipped in the paddock and landed on her side, resulting in minor abrasions. She was scratched as a precaution.

Pedigree Notes:

Ways and Means becomes the third North American Grade I winner for Practical Joke and 10th worldwide. Practical Joke, a three-time GISW, including Saratoga's GI Hopeful Stakes and GI H. Allen Jerkens S., was campaigned by Seth Klarman in partnership with William H. Lawrence.

The same partnership campaigned her Ontario-bred dam, Strong Incentive (Warrior's Reward), who registered a career high in Woodbine's Jammed Lovely S. She brought \$2.15 million from Alpha Delta Stables in foal to Good Magic at last year's Fasig-Tipton November sale.

Ways and Means is the third graded winner from her dam, who is also responsible for Klaravich's graded winner Highly Motivated (Into Mischief) and Grade I victress Surge Capacity (Flintshire {GB}). She produced a filly by Good Magic in 2024 and was bred back to Into Mischief.

"Anything with a homebred is extra special, and she's got a brother and sister [Highly Motivated and Surge Capacity], who are also phenomenal performers," Klarman said. "It's her first stakes win even though she's done so much, and to win not just



a Grade I, but the Test, is extremely special."

Brown added, "The Klarmans are such wonderful clients of mine. They owned and I trained both the father and the mother of this horse and we don't breed many horses, so we decided to take a chance on this mare because we really liked her and she's been so good to us. [Ways And Means] looks a lot like Practical Joke--almost a spitting image."

SARATOGA NOTEBOOK: ONE-EYED WHITE SANDS, FAVORED IN ADIRONDACK, WON'T

RUN by Tim Wilkin

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.--There is a good reason why **White Sands** (Into Mischief), the 3-1 morning-line favorite for Sunday's \$200,000, GIII Adirondack for 2-year-old fillies at Saratoga Race Course, isn't going to run.

She's not here.

Trainer Wesley Ward said Saturday morning on the Saratoga backstretch that White Sands is at Keeneland and likely waiting for one of two races at Del Mar next weekend: the \$150,000 GIII Sorrento for 2-year-old fillies on Aug. 10 or the \$150,000 GIII Best Pal Stakes for 2-year-olds on Aug. 11.



White Sands, owned by Mrs. John Magnier and Linda Shanahan, has won both of her career starts at places you don't normally see Ward youngsters run. She broke her maiden at Belterra Park in Cincinnati on May 25, winning by 9 1/2 lengths.

She then went to Prairie Meadows in Iowa and beat colts in the Prairie Gold Juvenile Stakes on July 6. That seemed even easier as she romped by 13 3/4 lengths.

The impressive victories are not what you would first notice

Ward said the right eye is missing on the filly, who is a half-sister to 2021 champion sprinter Jackie's Warrior (Maclean's Music).

"We took it so carefully with her," Ward said. "We always trained her with a friend."

Ward decided not to have White Sands run in baby races at Keeneland or Churchill Downs or Belmont (at Aqueduct) because of her handicap.

"I just thought I would wait and let her come and try to get her maiden broke at Belterra where you would not expect, with the purse structure there, to be anything of consequence like there would be at Churchill or Keeneland or Belmont," Ward said. "She got in there and was a heavy favorite and won convincingly which is what we wanted."

After dominating the competition in her first two starts, that handicap has become a distant memory.

"She bounced out to the front (in the race against colts) and off she went," Ward said. "Now, she just trains like any other horse."

Ward said there is some talk of maybe bringing White Sands to Saratoga for the \$150,000 Bolton Landing, a 5 1/2-furlong race for 2-year-old fillies on the grass on Aug. 18. However, Ward said that where he trains in Lexington, there is no turf breezing

available.

If the Bolton Landing were to be an option, White Sands would come to Saratoga to train. "That would take us away from going to California, so we are kind of stuck," Ward said. "We have to make a decision in the next few days."

Trainer Beckman Not Worried No One Is Talking About Honor Marie

As the Saratoga meet barrels towards the \$1.25 million GI Travers Stakes, all--or most of--the attention is on horses named **Thorpedo Anna** (Fast Anna) and **Dornoch** (Good Magic), **Fierceness** (City of Light), **Seize the Grey** (Arrogate) and **Sierra Leone** (Gun Runner) and, most recently, **Muth** (Good Magic). It seems like **Honor Marie** (Honor Code) has been the forgotten horse.

He hasn't gone anywhere. He's still over at trainer Whit Beckman's barn and he's working just as hard as the others to get ready for the Midsummer Derby.

It's just that no one is talking about him.

Maybe it's because Honor Marie hasn't won a big one yet. He is 0-4 this year with a second in the GII Louisiana Derby being his best finish. He was eighth in the GI Kentucky Derby and fourth in the GI Belmont Stakes with less than ideal trips.

"That's ok," Beckman said outside his barn Saturday morning when asked about the lack of attention his horse has gotten. "Some people have lost interest a little bit. He has been out of sight, out of mind. You have a lot of high-profile horses coming in here, like those that ran in the (GII) Jim Dandy or a horse like Muth that is super flashy and super strong."

Beckman is confident that his horse fits with these. And he'll get his chance to prove it. He is scheduled to have a five-furlong work Sunday morning on the Oklahoma. Beckman said that Tyler

Gaffalione will be on board for the work.

Gaffalione has worked the horse twice at Saratoga and he has also been teamed with Irad Ortiz Jr. and Manny Franco in the mornings.

Beckman is still waiting to see who will ride Honor Marie in the Travers.

"We will have someone lined up soon," he said. "I want to get the best fit for the horse."

SARATOGA DERBY INVITATIONAL AND TROY SHIFTED TO SATURDAY, AUG. 10

The New York Racing Association, Inc. (NYRA) moved Saturday's GI Saratoga Derby Invitational [Race 7] and the GII Troy Stakes [Race 10] due to heavy overnight rainfall and will shift the races to Saturday, Aug. 10, the track said in a release Saturday morning.

Any multi-race wagers that include Race 7 and Race 10 have been canceled and will be refunded.

The two-day All Turf Pick 5, which kicked off Friday with the GII Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Oaks Invitational and GII National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame Stakes, will pay out to 'all' for the final three legs: the Saratoga Derby Invitational [Race 7], Fasig-Tipton Lure [Race 9], and Troy [Race 10].

The graded races that were cancelled Saturday will join an Aug. 10 card that includes the GI FanDuel Fourstardave Stakes, a "Win and You're In" qualifier for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile; as well as the GII Saratoga Special and the Galway Stakes.

ADARE MANOR DEFENDS TITLE IN CLEMENT HIRSCH, EARNS BC DISTAFF BERTH

She did it again. Michael Lund Petersen's **Adare Manor** (Uncle Mo), who was coming off wins in the GI Apple Blossom Handicap and GII Santa Margarita Stakes, made it three straight in winning the GI Clement L. Hirsch Stakes at Del Mar for the second year in a row. She earned a 'Win and You're In' fees-paid berth to the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, which will be contested over this same surface in three months.

Adare Manor broke nicely in the Clement Hirsch, content to let 58-1 longshot **Olivia Twist** (Mshawish) take command despite previously setting all the pace in the majority of her wins.

Unbothered in third while under a snug hold, she bided her time as Olivia Twist set the first quarter mark in :23 before relinquishing the lead to June's dual Churchill graded winner and 'TDN Rising Star' Scylla (Tapit), who notched the second quarter in :46.52. As the field bunched up before the final turn, Adare Manor got pinned in by 2023 Eclipse champion 3-year-old filly and 'TDN Rising Star' Pretty Mischievous (Into Mischief) and two-back GII Santa Maria Stakes winner Coffee in Bed (Curlin) to her outside as Olivia Twist began slowing, giving her no where to go. Shuffled back a few spots, she re-rallied, tipped out, and circled around Pretty Mischievous. Still several lengths back on the turn while Scylla had daylight on the field, Adare Manor found her best stride and ran down the shipper to prevail by 2 3/4 lengths. Scylla held second by two lengths over another shipper in MSW & MGISP Flying Connection (Nyquist), who served as runner-up to Adare Manor in the Apple Blossom.

"She broke good and relaxed, so I was happy," said winning rider Juan Hernandez. "This wasn't a perfect trip for her, but it was fine. She's not bothered by the kick back so where we were OK. I rode her with a lot of confidence; she was running with a lot of confidence. We made our way through that little bit of trouble we had and she was off and running. She is one of the best fillies I've ever ridden."

With eight graded wins to her name, including three Grade I scores, Adare Manor joins Stellar Wind (Curlin, 2016-17), Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}, 2008-10), and Azeri (Jade Hunter, 2002-03) as repeat winners of the Clement Hirsch since it was restricted to fillies and mares in 1981. The latter two were named Horses of the Year; the former was a champion 3-year-old filly. With three wins out of four starts in 2024--her sole loss this year a close second in her seasonal debut, the GI Beholder Mile in March--and a ticket punched to the Breeders' Cup, Adare Manor is making her own case for an Eclipse this year.


Pedigree Notes:

Adare Manor is one of 50 graded winners and one of 102 black-type winners for her Coolmore America sire, Uncle Mo. The champion 2-year-old colt turned leading freshman sire is now annually one of North America's leading sires. She is not only Uncle Mo's only stakes winner out of a Giant Gizmo mare, but the only black-type winner out of a Giant Gizmo daughter. Uncle Mo does have five black-type winners out of daughters by Giant Gizmo's sire, Giant's Causeway, including Grand Mo the First, who won his first stakes race, Gulfstream's Bear's Den Stakes, Saturday after placing in the GI Florida Derby and GIII Tampa Bay Derby and running in the GI Kentucky Derby this spring.

Brooklynsway, dam of the Clement Hirsch winner and herself winner of the 2016 GIII Doubledogdare S. at Keeneland, was a

2020 Fasig-Tipton Winter Mixed Sale purchase by Town & Country for \$95,000. Adare Manor sold at the same sale as a short yearling to Walmac Farms and Gary Board for \$180,000 before Donato Lanni picked her up at OBS as a 2-year-old the next year for \$375,000. Brooklynsway's 2-year-old filly, Nosleeptilbrooklyn (Ghostzapper), made her first start Saturday, finishing seventh at Ellis Park for trainer Brian Lynch and Boardshorts Stables, who bought her as a \$500,000 Keeneland September yearling. Brooklynsway, a \$1.2-million RNA at last year's Fasig-Tipton November sale, has a yearling full-brother to Adare Manor. The mare aborted her 2024 foal and was bred to Curlin for next term.

DRAGOON GUARD LOOKS FOR FOUR STRAIGHT IN WEST VIRGINIA DERBY

Juddmonte Farms' progressive **Dragoon Guard** (Arrogate), a neck away from being unbeaten in his young career, carries a three-race winning streak and should jump a slight favorite in Sunday's \$500,000 GIII West Virginia Derby at Mountaineer Park.

The homebred son of the talented turf mare Filimbi (Mizzen Mast) was beaten a neck by future stakes winner Otto the Conqueror (Street Sense) on his seven-furlong debut at Churchill last September, but is perfect since, including an all-the-way victory over GI Santa Anita Derby hero Stronghold (Ghostzapper) in the GIII Indiana Derby July 6.

Henro (Collected) was runner-up to the aforementioned Otto the Conqueror in a June 5 sprint allowance in Louisville, but made the most of his first two-turn assignment last time with a head defeat of Just a Touch (Justify) in the July 6 lowa Derby at Prairie Meadows. A repeat of the 96 Beyer Speed Figure earned on that occasion makes him a very tough customer right back.

Two other graded winners are among Sunday's field of eight.

Society Man (Good Magic) is the lesser-known stablemate of MGISW Dornoch (Good Magic) who earned his own berth in the GI Kentucky Derby with a runner-up effort--at 106-1--in the GII Wood Memorial Stakes in April. Down the field at Churchill, he rebounded with a 6-1 upset of the GIII Matt Winn Stakes June 9. 'TDN Rising Star' Agate Road (Quality Road) earned his graded success on the turf in last year's GII Pilgrim Stakes, but was also runner-up in this year's GIII Sam F. Davis Stakes on the dirt. He exits an even fifth in the grassy American Derby June 29.



No Longshot Price This Time For The Queens M G

Having returned a fat \$91 to her backers when skipping home a 2 3/4-length winner of the opening-day Schuylerville Stakes July 11, **The Queens M G** (Thousand Words) will start at a fraction of that price when she leaves from the outside gate in a field of nine juvenile fillies in Sunday's GIII Adirondack Stakes at the Spa.

Having lit the Keeneland tote to the tune of 45-1 on debut Apr. 7, the dark bay filly was the 21-10 choice for the June 6 Astoria Stakes at this venue, but she backed out of it abruptly to finish a distant last of seven. Then she blew up the board in the Schuylerville.

"Going into that race, I didn't know what to expect," said trainer Saffie Joseph, Jr. "I was just hoping to run a decent race and have something to build on, but she exceeded expectations. That was a big improvement. The race before was disappointing because she had trained decent into the race, and we thought she was a good filly."

The Queens M G should get the right race flow, as the field includes several fillies that want to be part of the action.

Whatintheliteral (Lord Nelson) belied 13-1 odds in the Astoria after setting a pressured pace throughout, but tossed Javier Castellano at the start of the Schuylerville. Dare to Breeze (Daredevil) earned a good figure when taking out a local auction maiden by better than six lengths July 13, while Italian Soiree (Uncle Mo), a \$600,000 OBS March breezer, exits a 5 1/4-length graduation from just off the pace downstate July 4 and will hope the speed comes back to the field as well.

Sunday's other graded action features the GIII Pucker Up Stakes at Ellis Park, where GIII Regret Stakes winner **Pin Up Betty** (Constitution) looks to bounce back from a fourth in the GI Belmont Oaks against the likes of **Mo Fox Givin** (Mo Town),

while in the GIII West Virginia Governor's Cup, Hit Show (Candy Ride (Arg)) squares off with 'TDN Rising Star' Extra Anejo (Into Mischief).

YATES STILL PLOTTING PATH FOR TOP

The fastest 2-year-old so far this season didn't graduate at either Del Mar or Saratoga.

That honor belongs to--at least on the Beyer Speed Figure scale (through Friday, Aug. 2)--St Elias Stable homebred Rated by Merit (c, 2, Battalion Runner--Banner Waving, by Speightstown), who earned a 92 rating when airing by 9 3/4 lengths for trainer Michael Yates going six furlongs on debut at Gulfstream Park July 13. That is four points higher than the cosecond fastest duo of Mentee (City of Light), the younger fullbrother of champion Fierceness, and Colloquial (Vekoma), who ran one-two at the Belmont at Big A meeting June 15.

"It was a very visually impressive race, for sure," Yates said. "He had worked well and I expected that he would run well. It was a little bit of a 'Wow' for me."

Wow, indeed.

Backed as the second choice at odds of 2-1, Rated by Merit was gunned to the front from his inside draw and was hounded by 4-5 favorite and fellow firster Forged Steel (Vekoma) through an opening quarter in :22.27. Traveling nicely while under a snug hold approaching the quarter pole, the Florida-bred kicked for home with authority, and, despite hanging on his left lead for most of the stretch, increased his advantage to the wire to win for fun.

Rated by Merit returned to the worktab with a four-furlong breeze in :50.04 (5/7) at Gulfstream Park July 30. A target for his next start is still to be determined, according to Yates.

"He came out of the race good," Yates said. "Just had an easy half-mile maintenance breeze. He's doing very well."

He continued, "We're just gonna go one step at a time. Right now, we're not exactly sure what race we're gonna point to. He's gonna breeze a couple more times before we decide."

Rated by Merit hails from the third crop of Battalion Runner, who carried the Viola family's colors to a pair of in-the-money finishes in the 2017 GII Wood Memorial Stakes and GIII Dwyer Stakes. The son of Unbridled's Song stands for \$2,500 at Ocala Stud. The W.S. Farish-bred and -raced Banner Waving won one of 11 career starts. She brought \$19,000 from St Elias while in foal to Catalina Cruiser at the 2020 Keeneland November sale.

"This is the first horse that I've trained for them," Yates said. "He's a Florida-bred and a homebred and they were looking for a Florida-based trainer to place some horses like that with. I'm happy to have him. He's the only one that I have for them."

Yates, represented in back-to-back renewals of the GI Kentucky Oaks with Dorth Vader (Girvin) and Fiona's Magic (St Patrick's Day) in 2023-24, took out his trainer's license in 1991. The native of Ocala is also the owner and operator of the 50acre Shadybrook Farm, the home of his dozen broodmares and a five-furlong training track. Yates currently has 28 horses in training at Gulfstream Park.

"It's always nice when you have a young horse with a lot of raw talent," Yates concluded. "That's what we do this for. You just never know where one like this is gonna come from."

LOUISIANA-BRED STAR OVA CHARGED EUTHANIZED

Brittlyn Stable's **Ova Charged** (Star Guitar--Charged Cotton, by Dehere), winner of this year's GIII Unbridled Sidney Stakes and owner of the year's top Beyer Speed Figure, fell leaving the

eighth pole during the running of Saturday's Kentucky Downs Preview Ladies' Turf Sprint Stakes and was subsequently euthanized. According to the track's Kevin Kerstein, the 6-yearold mare suffered a right front fetlock injury. Jockey Corey Lanerie walked back to the jockeys' room under his power.

Bred in Louisiana by Evelyn Benoit's operation, Ova Charged won eight of her first nine starts, including five state-bred stakes events while under the care of trainer Jose Camejo. Turned over to trainer Shane Wilson at the tail end of 2023, Ova Charged had rattled off another seven black-type wins, including her first such success in open company in the Feb. 13 Mardi Gras Stakes at the Fair Grounds. In her very next appearance, she thrashed her fellow Louisiana-breds by 12 1/2 lengths in the Page Cortez Stakes, running the 5 1/2 furlongs in 1:01.90 which translated into a massive 113 Beyer Speed Figure. She won the Chicken Fried Stakes at Lone Star Park June 29 in her most recent appearance.

Ova Charged amassed a record of 15-1-0 from 19 starts for earnings of \$918,575. Her passing comes just a month after the tragic death of Louisiana-bred Grade I winner Alva Starr (Lord Nelson) in a training injury.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR: THE IMPORTANCE OF THE RETIRED RACEHORSE PROJECT

As September arrives every year, we get excited about our homebred yearlings and future purchases that might come along, all for hopefully finding the Derby winner. But October is also something to look forward to with the Retired Racehorse Project, which we have been involved in since 2017. This year is a unique one; our former veterinarian Dr. Brittland Hughes has our homebred Town Of Gold in the Hunter-Jumper and Competitive Trail divisions; Am Prepared, a homebred out of the GI mare Tannery; and In the Loop, a \$150,000 Keeneland purchase who won first time out for Colts Neck Stables. As I joined Mr Santulli's operation back in 2014 from my return from Saudi Arabia, I learned the importance of proper re-homing for all of our horses once retired, from monitoring horses we lost in claiming races and talking to connections when their forms are tailing off, inquiring for future re-homing plans, to being a big supporter of Second Call in New Jersey. In all my years at Colts Neck, I think RRP is one of my favorite events to watch, with my former horses growing and developing in new disciplines off the track. This year I am excited to be attending for the first time-both participating in two days of volunteering and obviously cheering on my three old trainees. Horse racing is in a crucial transition with HISA where we are seeing lots of positive stats but the general public should also understand that the reason we get up every day, 365 days a year, is for the love of the horse. Being able to watch these horses compete, whether it's on the track, in the field, or in the ring, is a treat every horse lover should appreciate.

Every year, there is excitement about the new two-year olds starting training in a racing yard. Who will be the next big stakes horse, Derby contender, Breeders' Cup candidate? But when I saw Town of Gold, aka Townley, I thought, gosh, he could be a really great show horse. With a flashy heart on his head, compact but correct conformation, and a curious but smart mentality, I thought this horse has potential to be an athlete-whether on the track or in the show ring. I loved his name, Town of Gold, which his Colombian trainer Jorge Duarte named after the Colombian mythical gold city 'El Dorado.' I quickly gave him the nickname Townley after my dad's middle name. As a twoyear-old, he showed promise as a turf sprinter. Bred out of Speightstown, a multiple graded stakes dirt sire and Spunderful, a Medaglio D'oro turf sprint mare, Town of Gold was a well-bred homebred of Colts Neck Stables. He broke his maiden as a two-year old at Laurel Park where he put his nose down and refused to let another horse pass him. He then ran big at Aqueduct, placing in a black type stakes his first time in New York. He traveled to Florida for a winter at Palm Meadows Training Center where I was able to gallop him, enjoying the sunrise view between his pricked ears. He had a confident, safe disposition and a desire to please. After riding him, I knew he'd love the challenge of jumping someday. As I continued to watch his racetrack career progress, he unfortunately developed an intolerance to heat. Heat stroke can be a combination of environment and genetics and his mother had had similar issues with the heat. He did well in the cooler weather, however, turf season is primarily in the heat of the summer. As he got older,

he still appeared game, but there was reservation in his drive to win. Many horses learn from experience and his experience with heat stroke had made him conservative compared to his rivals. In July of 2023, he ran his last race at Monmouth. I was crossing my fingers that he did not get claimed. Luck was on my side that day. Following his race, it was decided that he would be retired and I could finally start my project with this 6-year old I had loved since the age of 2.

When he came off the trailer to meet me at the farm, he still thought he was a racehorse. He was high-strung, hungry, and almost impossible to catch in the field. I was excited but also worried. I had never had a thoroughbred straight off the track. Initially, I doubted myself--what had I got myself into?! But as I put in the time and patience, we started making baby steps. He would spit out an apple but he loved carrots. He could trot over ground poles, at first hitting one or two then gliding through them like a pro. He learned to pick up both leads at the canter, not just the left like most racehorses prefer. In the barn, he started to recognize me and welcome me with his characteristic nicker. Even after a long day at work, I was still excited to see my boy, my Townley. The day finally came when I decided we were ready to pop over a cross rail. I let him sniff it, and he didn't seem bothered. I gave him a nudge and we picked up a trot to the tiny cross rail. As we got to the base, he picked up his legs, tucked his knees and jumped the neatest little jump. He landed with a look like, "hey, that was kinda different but fun!" After the introduction to jumping, I knew that not only could he do it but even more so that he enjoyed doing it, which made me want to jump the moon. From that day forward, I made a goal--to compete in the Retired Racehorse Project Thoroughbred Makeover. When I was in undergraduate studies at The University of Kentucky, I had volunteered when the RRP had first started. There were only about 50 horses competing and no one really knew about the concept of competing in second careers for retired racehorses. The Thoroughbred makeover now has over 400 entries yearly and has incentivized interest in OTTB competitions throughout the country. It has made people realize that just because a horse has retired off the track as a five-, six-, or seven-year old doesn't mean the horse's athletic abilities stop there. So as I prepare for my dream to compete in the Thoroughbred makeover project this October, I have learned so much about the heart of a Thoroughbred and the relationship you can shape with a racehorse to achieve dreams you never thought possible. I hope my story inspires others to adopt racehorses and promote the Thoroughbred for the great breed they are both on and off the track.



\$1.3M OBSMAR GRAD FEROCIOUS RUNS TO HIS NAME, BECOMES A 'RISING STAR'



Ferocious | Tod Marks

The money came late for **Ferocious (c, 2, Flatter--Napier, by Midnight Lute)**, who was available at 4-1 for a good deal of the betting, and when all was said and done, was the 3.45-1 favorite making his career debut in Saturday's sixth race at Saratoga. And the money proved right on, as the colt exploded through the final eighth of a mile to become a no-brainer **'TDN Rising Star'**.

Things did not go especially well at the break for the \$1.3-million OBS March purchase, as he reared slightly, costing him a length or two. He very quickly made up for lost time, scooting through at the fence to be all the way up into a share of second as the well-bet **El Prestigio** (Practical Joke) took the field through an opening quarter in :22.02.

Ferocious continued to travel strongly on the turn, but El Prestigio was still going great guns, opening an imposing advantage nearing the stretch, with Javier Castellano getting more serious aboard Ferocious some four lengths behind. But, put to a drive by the Venezuelan--whose history with this trainer and some of these connections includes the 2023 Gl Kentucky Derby aboard Mage (Good Magic)-- Ferocious quickly raced up to the front-runner to his outside approaching the eighth pole and careered away to score by 7 3/4 lengths. El Prestigio held for second ahead of **Praetor** (Into Mischief) in third.

The winner's dam was purchased by Tom Bozarth's Arch Bloodstock for \$130,000 as a horse of racing age at the 2018 Keeneland November Sale after breaking her maiden at first asking for Juddmonte and Brad Cox over the Ellis turf course that August. She made two additional starts in the colors of Gentry Stable finishing fourth and seventh in Churchill allowance

company before being retired. The mare's first foal, the New York-bred 3-year-old filly Strong Play--by Flatter's champion son West Coast--was claimed out of a debut victory at Aqueduct June 27. Napier is also the dam of a yearling colt by Maxfield, and, in something of a full-circle moment, was most recently bred to Juddmonte's two-time champion sprinter Elite Power.

That she might go to a son of Curlin is not surprising, given that her stakes-winning dam Uno Duo produced GI Derby City Distaff winner Obligatory. The third dam is peppered by high-class Juddmonte runners, including Group 1 winner Etoile Montante (Miswaki)—the dam of MGSW Starformer (Dynaformer)—MGISWs Tates Creek (Rahy) and Sightseek (Distant View) and GSW/MGISP Bonny South (Munnings). This is also the family of champion Chief's Crown, Winning Colors and one-time stallions Bowman's Band and Pollard's Vision.

Ferocious is the sixth **'TDN Rising Star'** for the late Flatter and first since 2019.

FEROCIOUS LIVES UP TO HIS NAME IN SPA MSW

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N. Y.--Ferocious's (Flatter) blowout victory in the sixth race at Saratoga Race Course Saturday produced a series of backward and forward moments in the winner's enclosure. **Cont.**

Ramiro Restrepo and Gustavo Delgado, Jr., principals in Mage's (Good Magic) rise to prominence and victory in the 2023 GI Kentucky Derby, held court following the \$100,000 2-year-old maiden special weight race that might be the first big step for another standout.

Restrepo and Delgado spearheaded the purchase of Ferocious for \$1,300,000 at the OBS March sale and they were appropriately excited about the way he launched his career. Despite breaking a tad slow from the rail, eighth of nine, he quickly put himself into the race, grabbed the lead at the top of the stretch and cruised to a 7 3/4-lengths score under Hall of Fame jockey Javier Castellano. They completed the six furlongs over the muddy sealed track in 1:09.65 and paid \$8.90 as the 3-1 favorite. El Prestigio (Practical Joke), the early pacesetter, was second, a nose ahead of Praetor (Into Mischief).

Delgado, who trains the colt with his father, said his agility enabled Ferocious to overcome the tardy start.

"I don't think you can ask for a better debut," he said.

Gentry Stable bred the colt and Restrepo and Delgado Jr. put together the partnership with JR Ranch, owned by Jose Aguirre; Restrepo's Marquee Bloodstock; High Step Racing and the Delgado's OGMA Investments. JR is the majority owner.

Restrepo said that Ferocious, out of the Midnight Lute mare Napier, could not be ignored.

"It's very difficult to find a horse with four generations of Juddmonte breeding like that at a 2-year-old sale. Usually, you find those things gone at the yearling sales," he said and named some of colt's assets: "Physically so mature. His attitude. His attitude at the sale, like an older horse."

Ferocious's fourth dam, Nijinsky Star (Nijinsky) was purchased by Juddmonte and joined the broodmare band, establishing a female family line that led to third dam Willstar (Nureyev) and second dam Uno Duo (Macho Uno).

Then it was Delgado's turn.

"I think the credit goes to JR Ranch," he said. "When we were trying to buy him, he wouldn't stop. That's what you need in those cases, some guy that has got that to carry on, in the bidding. That was good for us."

"Then since the horse is in the barn, so nice to be around. He's very chill. Any rider can ride, that kind of thing. We were pretty confident, though. I have to be honest."

Ferocious had some experience on wet conditions in training and Restrepo noted that when Gustavo Delgado Sr. saw the weather forecast a couple of days ago, "He goes, 'Don't worry about it, he's a duck."

In May 2022, Restrepo and Delgado Jr. were so impressed with the 2-year-old Mage at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Sale that they went to \$290,000, well beyond their budget, to buy the colt.



Then they scrambled to find investors for what turned into a very successful venture. The 4-year-old stands at Airdrie Stud.

"Mage is the gift that keeps on giving for us," Restrepo said. "Its let myself go out and purchase horses that I could only dream of. Before it was just fantasy football."

With the credibility and the resources that a Derby win and the sale of a stallion can produce, they have been busy.

"You know, Gustavo and his father are more than capable of, from the test into the Derby, to have a barn for these horses, and they're deserving of the opportunity as well," Restrepo said. "We have 20-plus really nice 2-year-olds at the barn. Mage took us on this incredible ride, has given us a ton of experience to kind of be present in the moment. Now, hopefully, Ferocious takes the torch."

Said Delgado Jr.: "Because of him, we have this one." Restrepo called Ferocious "a total package" and said he behaved like a seasoned pro at the sale.

"He was taken out 100-plus times and always acted mature and confident and never lost any weight; actually toughened up at the sale, put up some good size," Restrepo said. "When you see a horse thriving in those environments, mentally, you start saying to yourself up, 'maybe he can handle the big stage.'
Today was Step One. Episode One. Chapter One. Page One. It's a cool start, right?"

Sent of as the 27-10 second choice in the Saturday opener from Del Mar, Jack's Magic Girl (f, 2, Good Magic--Stargirl, by Medaglia d'Oro) turned in an exceptionally strong and professional debut, kicking on smartly through the final furlong to win by a space and become the afternoon's second 'TDN Rising Star'.

Away without incident from gate six, the \$100,000 OBS April purchase took up a ground-saving position three back on the fence in midfield and switched off nicely when the pace dropped away through the middle furlongs. Patiently handled into the turn, she continued to scrape paint on the turn, came off the fence into the three-wide line, punched through and sprinted away to score by a widening 3 1/4 lengths over the once-raced Caitlin Fever (Caracaro). Favored Sea Runner (Gun Runner) rounded out the trifecta on her career debut. The winner's final two furlongs were timed in a very sharp and race-best :23.40.

Bought back on a bid of \$100,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale, Jack's Magic Girl worked an eighth of a mile in :10 1/5 at this year's OBS April Sale and changed hands in a private transaction for that same six-figure price. The bay filly trained well ahead of the debut, both at Pleasanton and over the local strip, where she most recently outworked 119 other horses to earn the half-mile bullet in :46 3/5 July 28.

William Shiveley's Dixiana Farms acquired Stargirl carrying the filly that would become Jack's Magic Girl for \$107,000 at the 2021 Keeneland November sale. A half-sister to a pair of stakes winners, Stargirl--also the dam of the stakes-placed Thedingoateyourbaby (Bernardini)--is responsible for a yearling filly by Audible and a colt foal by Justify. She was bred to Omaha Beach this season. Third dam Pacific Squall won the 1992 GI Hollywood Oaks.

Jack's Magic Girl is the fourth 'Rising Star' for Good Magic.

UNCAGED HAS NO PROBLEM WITH SIX FURLONGS, WINS FIRST TIME OUT

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. – Uncaged (Curlin) was unleashed in front of a big house at Saratoga Race Course on Whitney Day at Saratoga Race Course.

And, at the end of the six-furlong \$100,000 maiden special weight, Uncaged left no doubt. He and jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. began revving up just outside the eighth pole and won going away by 1 3/4 lengths.

Afterwards, Hall of Fame trainer Todd Pletcher and the ownership group of Repole Stable and WinStar Farm were more than pleased.

Pedigree wise, you don't see Curlin progenies flourish running six furlongs.

"I entered this horse at six furlongs and the whole goal was you hope he is third by three (lengths) and coming," Mike Repole of Repole Stable said in the crowded winner's circle. "I don't know how many Curlin colts going six furlongs have won at this track as a 2-year-old. That is pretty impressive."

Curlin, a member of the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame and a two-time Horse of the Year, was bred to Dark Nile by WinStar Farm and Uncaged was the result.

When he was sent to the 2023 Keeneland September Sale, Repole bought him for \$450,000.

"I went to Elliott [Walden, WinStar CEO and Racing Manager] and Kenny Troutt [WinStar owner] right before he went into the ring and I said, 'would you guys stay in at 25 percent if I buy him?" Repole said. "They both said yes and I thought that was a good sign, so I bought him. I thought it was really cool they wanted to stay in."

Walden said that, as a foal, Uncaged was well balanced and athletic, two of the musts for a young horse. Walden, like Repole and Pletcher, had some doubts about Uncaged being successful at six furlongs.

The horse, obviously, had no such issue.

"To win the first time out at six furlongs is good," Walden said. "We weren't sure about the six furlongs. The mare won at two turns, Curlin won at two turns. We left it up to him."

Uncaged was entered in a race here last week but was scratched.

While running at six furlongs was the great unknown for the son of Curlin, he passed the test.

"Today was more about trying to get him an education," Walden said.

He began getting his momentum outside of the eighth pole and found his best stride inside the sixteenth pole.

He went off at odds of 5-1 and paid \$12.60 while being timed in 1:10.55 over the muddy track.

"He is a colt we have had high hopes for," Pletcher said. "He is a beautiful horse and has trained well. I thought he really finished off the race well and put himself in a good stalking position. He kicked on when he needed to."

With the maiden win on the resume, what comes next is the question.

Walden smiled when he was asked about it.

"Hope-fully, we will see," Walden said, emphasizing the first syllable. "Hope-fully."

The \$300,000 GI Hopeful Stakes at seven furlongs is run at the Spa Sept, 2--Labor Day--which is closing day of the 40-day meet.

Repole also mentioned the Hopeful but said the \$500,000 GI Champagne Stakes at a mile is a possibility.

As the races get longer, Uncaged should get better. That's what his breeding suggests.

"It's nice to have a dream." Walden said. "That is what this business is all about."

MISSION ACCOMPLISHED FOR RAMSEY'S REACH FOR THE ROSE

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.--With his romp through the mud in the opener at Saratoga Race Course Saturday, Reach for the Rose (Audible) hit the target that owner-breeder Ken Ramsey and trainer Saffie Joseph were aiming at.

The 5 1/2-length victory in a \$100,000 maiden special for 2-year-olds that had been taken off the turf gave colt his first career win and earnings of \$55,000. Far more important for Ramsey and Joseph, the win in the one-mile race against three foes is a stepping stone to the \$1 million Kentucky Downs Juvenile Sept. 8 at Kentucky Downs.

Heavy rain overnight in upstate New York decimated the Whitney Day program. Turf racing was moved to the main track,

leading to an avalanche of scratches, and two graded turf stakes (the GI Saratoga Derby Invitational and the GII Troy) were cancelled and re-scheduled for next Saturday, Aug. 10. Race 1, carded for 1 1/16 miles on the inner turf course was moved to the dirt, forcing Ramsey and Joseph to make what they said was an easy decision.

"When Saffie and I talked this morning, it was a no-brainer," Ramsey said. "We both agreed that if we could win the race, great, then we'll put him in the stakes race at Kentucky Downs. If we don't win, we'll put him in the maiden race at Kentucky Downs. The next goal for him is to win the big stakes race at Kentucky Downs. The purses are insane down there."

Reach for the Rose stalked the early pace set by Dew (Frosted) of :23.92 and :47.20 before taking over the stretch and winning as he pleased under Jose Ortiz. They hit the wire well ahead of Insubordination in 1:39.80 and paid \$3.70. Assertiveness (Into Mischief) brushed the gate, was never really a factor in the going over the sloppy sealed track and was eased by jockey Flavien Prat.

"I thought that the horse showed enough on the dirt to stay on the dirt," Joseph said. "In these scenarios, you never know. They have to do it. You can show it in a morning, then come off the bridle and it's different. We're thankful to get the win."

Ramsey and his late wife Sarah bred the colt and he said Reach for the Rose is even more special to him now. He was prepared for his debut May 11 in the five-furlong Royal Palm Juvenile--an automatic qualifier for the Windsor Castle at Royal Ascot--but ended up second by 1 1/4 lengths at Gulfstream Park. He was closing well but could not reel in Gabaldon.

Then there was a plot twist when Royal Ascot officials reached out to Ramsey. **Cont.**

"Since the race at Royal Ascot was farther than the one down there," Ramsey said, "they told me if I bring the horse over, they would pay half of everything for ours and pay everything for the other horse because the other horse won it and we ran second."

Ramsey said he did not spend much time considering the offer. "I thought that was a hell of a deal to get a half-paid expense trip to Royal Ascot since that's on my bucket list to try to win a stakes race over there," he said. "I told them, 'absolutely, mark it down, make the arrangements' and we would be there. We started training on the horse to get him all honed up for Royal Ascot and honed him a little too much, I guess, because he bucked his shins. That was the end of the trip to Royal Ascot, so I called them to tell them, 'sorry, but the horse has bucked his shins and we're going to have to back off of him for a few weeks."

Gabaldon finished second in the Windsor Castle, further flattering Reach for the Rose.

Joseph said that even though the Royal Palm's conditions didn't suit Reach for the Roses, he performed well.

"We knew we were asking him for a tall task, running five eighths, but he's doing it on talent" Joseph said. "He broke on top, dropped back, then ran on really well that day. It took them a while to post the Beyers, but for a 2-year-old on the turf, a 78 that's up there among the best turf Beyers for 2-year-olds."

Ramsey, 88, underwent a kidney transplant on June 20 and is spending the summer recuperating at his home in Saratoga Springs that overlooks the Oklahoma training track. He watched Reach for the Rose prevail and said he is looking forward to the start next month.

"This should set this horse up nicely for that. It will be the third time in his form cycle, which I believe is a horse's best race," Ramsey said. "The timing is perfect for the race. We're all set."

Assertiveness (Into Mischief), the only insighted runner to remain in the race, came home eased to be fourth as the 7-5 second choice. Reach for the Rose is her dam's first and only

Film Star, who finished third behind Warrior Johny here July 11 in an allowance race over a fast main track, benefitted as the sole main track only entrant in this four-horse field. Because of the change in surface from turf to sealed mud, six horses were scratched. Under Irad Ortiz Jr., Film Star comfortably stalked Swiftsure's pace set in fractions of :23.98, 46.83 and 1:11.48. The 3-5 favorite seized command before reaching the quarter pole and gradually increased his advantage through the stretch. Pioneering Spirit stayed on to gain second, four lengths behind the winner.

Afterwards, trainer Linda Rice said, "Irad [Ortiz, Jr.] did a beautiful job. I was a little concerned that the number three horse [Swiftsure] has a big pedigree to love the mud, he's got a lot of natural speed, and he might run away from us early. But he was sharp, and Irad just told me he was full of a ton of horse the whole way."

Film Star, who finished second behind Zandon (Upstart) in the GII Woodward Stakes at Aqueduct last Oct. 1, is out of the winning mare Rebelle, a half-sister to both Kid Cruz (GSW, \$792,985) and Three Witches (GSW, \$428,470), third in last year's Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint. Rebelle has a 2-year-old Authentic filly named Trading Secrets and a yearling Authentic colt. She was bred to Elite Power for this season. Sixth but beaten just three lengths in the Royal Palm Juvenile Stakes on debut at Gulfstream May 11, Governor Sam returned to the races at Saratoga to break his maiden going gate to wire over 5 1/2 furlongs July 19. Jumping into stakes company again at five furlongs Saturday, he became the first stakes winner for his freshman sire (by City Zip) with a narrow victory in the Tyro Stakes at Monmouth. Up close to the early speed of Johnny Come Lately (Hootenanny), the 1-5 favorite and the only runner in the field with any turf experience stayed prominent into the

stretch, tipped outside of Jet Sweep Joe late and dueled that runner to the line to just narrowly prevail.

"I did not really like the trip," admitted winning rider Paco Lopze. "He was hanging out a little bit and I just let him go. It was a good thing it was just the [longshot Jet Sweep Joe] with no one else really close. We needed a good trip. I had to get out from behind a couple horses. I just needed to get out. We had a late push. He's a fighting horse and [Jet Sweep Joe] made us fight. Anything can happen in racing. Sometimes a horse just races unbelievable."

A half-sister to GSW Pin Up Betty (Constitution), Governor Sam was a \$275,000 OBS April buy for his current connections. I'm Betty G, herself a stakes winner, has a yearling City of Light filly and is due to Constitution this year after losing her 2024 Jackie's Warrior foal. Back in action for the first time since finishing 18th in the GI Kentucky Derby, Grand Mo the First annexed the Bear's Den Stakes at Gulfstream Saturday. He settled comfortably on the rail as Baytown Parfait (Flameaway) and Prevent battled up front through :23.10 and :45.09 fractions while as many as seven lengths clear of the field. In tandem, Grand Mo the First and Brawn reeled them in and continued past, with the former outslugging the latter to the wire.

Grand Mo the First won his first two at Gulfstream last year, then moved exclusively to stakes company with four placings before the Derby: the GI Florida Derby, the GIII Tampa Bay

Derby, the GIII Zuma Beach Stakes, and the Swale Stakes. The Bear's Den marked his first try on the turf since last year's Zuma Beach.

"I think he will run on turf from now on," said winning trainer Victor Barboza, Jr., who also said the colt will likely target the Kentucky Downs meeting next.

The winner's dam has an unnamed 2-year-old filly by American Pharoah, who sold to Avaz Ismoilov for \$70,000 at Keeneland September. Henry de Bromhead trainee **Term Of Endearment (GB)** (Sea The Moon {Ger}--Miss You Too {GB}. by Montjeu {Ire}) accounted for **Night Sparkle (Ire)** (Postponed {Ire}) and **River Of Stars (Ire)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}) in May's G3 Bronte Cup at York and doubled up in game fashion to lead home a repeat trifecta in Saturday's G2 Qatar Lillie Langtry Stakes at Goodwood.

Positioned behind the leaders in fourth until well beyond the halfway mark in this 14-furlong stamina test, the 15-2 chance made continued headway in the straight to gain control soon after passing the quarter-mile marker and was ridden out in the closing stages to defeat the Bronte Cup vanquished by 3/4-of-a-length and the same.

"It is my first runner here, we've had a lovely time, we've been well looked after and we're having a great day," said trainer Henry de Bromhead. "I am not sure I ever go anywhere with confidence, but Term Of Endearment had won a couple of Group 3s, so it seemed like the natural progression. She is probably settling much better, so we can ride her closer to the pace. Before, we always felt she needed soft ground, but I think that was more to bring out her stamina. I was concerned about the [good-to-firm] ground here today, but she seemed to love it." Cont. p3

MILL STREAM BIDS FOR SUMMER DOUBLE IN THE MAURICE DE GHEEST By Tom Frary

Having beaten the best sprinters around in the G1 July Cup, Peter Harris's Mill Stream (Ire) (Gleneagles {Ire}) returns to familiar territory as he bids for a prestigious double in Sunday's G1 ARC Prix Maurice de Gheest. Starting to blossom into the top-flight performer he now is at Deauville last summer, Jane Chapple-Hyam's project thrived in this Normandy air to record a brace of black-type successes in the Listed Prix Moonlight Cloud and G3 Prix de Meautry prior to his coming-of-age campaign this term. There is a danger that his July Cup form could be criticised, with the 3-year-olds failing to make a serious impact, but the fact was that he was the fastest on the day at Newmarket and he has a rock-solid profile heading here.

Unbeaten so far and another who has performed to a high standard over this straight course, Nurlan Bizakov's Lazzat (Fr) (Territories {Ire}) drops in trip from the seven furlongs over which he dominated the G3 Prix Djebel here in April and the G3 Prix Paul de Moussac at ParisLongchamp in June. 

"All options are open," the trainer continued. "She's in the [G1] Irish St Leger and I think there is a nice race at York, so we'll see."

Rider Billy Lee added, "It's my first time here and Term Of Endearment has done it well. She jumped nicely and got me into a good rhythm the whole way. I tracked Oisin [Murphy] and this filly picked up well down the hill. My only worry was this is the quickest ground she has been on, but she cruised into the race. I was probably there a bit too soon, but I knew that she would stay as she is as fit as a flea. I committed and, to be fair, she galloped all the way to the line. She just drifted left a bit, as she did in York, but I had no worries and she wasn't going to stop. I think she is maybe improving and a step up to two miles might not be out of her reach. It would be nice to see how far she can go."

Andrew Balding, trainer of runner-up Night Sparkle, said, "She has run a great race and I am very pleased. She has put in three really good efforts this year and deserves to win a stakes race at some stage. She's got York options, so we'll have a look. Top of the ground is important to her."

Ralph Beckett was also satisfied with the performance of third home River Of Stars and commented, "She ran very well, but I think they go quicker in three-mile chases. She ran a sound race and we're pleased with her. We will wait for the [G2] Park Hill [at Doncaster], probably."

Pedigree Notes

Term Of Endearment, one of her sire's 19 Group-race winners, is the leading performer from four scorers produced by stakeswinning G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud third Miss You Too (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}). Miss You Too is a full-sister to G3 Killavullan Stakes runner-up Vitruvian Man (GB) and a granddaughter of Starlight Smile (Green Dancer). Starlight Smile is also the second dam of G1 Irish Oaks G1 Prix de l'Opera heroine Covert Love (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}) while her half-sister Summer Trysting (Alleged) produced three Group winners headed by multiple Group 1 winner Designs On Rome (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}). Summer Trysting is also the second dam of G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois-winning freshman sire Romanised (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}). Miss You Too has a 2-year-old filly by Ardad (Ire) to come.

Second on the latter occasion was White Birch Farm's **TDN Rising Star Havana Cigar (GB)** (Havana Grey {GB}), who went on to fill the same spot behind another of the Jean-Claude Rouget stable's **TDN Rising Stars** in **Puchkine (Fr)** (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) in last month's G1 Prix Jean Prat here.

Set free by the change in tactics in that contest, Puchkine dominated from start to finish but he may struggle to do the same to a host of hardened sprinters. The third **TDN Rising Star** to fill the frame in the Jean Prat was Philippe Allaire and Haras d'Etreham's **Beauvatier (Fr)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}), who may finally be granted the pace scenario he has been crying out for.

Others to note are last year's winner **King Gold (Fr)** (Anodin {Ire}), who beat the re-opposing **Exxtra (Fr)** (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) in ParisLongchamp's G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot. **Cont. p5**



Darnation Bids For Classic Double...

Sunday also sees the G1 Henkel-Preis der Diana take place at Dusseldorf, where Newtown Anner Stud's homebred **Darnation** (Ire) (Too Darn Hot {GB}) bids to become the latest filly to complete the G2 German 1000 Guineas-German Oaks double in the 11-furlong Classic. Again partnered by Adrie de Vries, the Karl Burke trainee who has subsequently been second in Newcastle's G3 Hoppings Stakes is part of an overseas contingent which includes Australian Bloodstock's acquisition **Bubble Gum (Fr)** (Cloth Of Stars {Ire}) who was sixth for the Fabrice Chappet stable in the G1 Prix de Diane.

Germany's best chance of keeping the prize at home may come from Gestut Rottgen's G3 Diana-Trial winner Erle (Ger) (Reliable Man {GB}) from a favourable draw against the rail, while Sarah Steinberg has two live prospects in Gestut Brummerhof's Diya (Ger) (Dubawi {Ire}), a daughter of the 2019 Diana heroine Diamanta (Ger) (Maxios {GB}) who captured Mulheim's Listed Diana Trial last month, and Gestut Ebbesloh's New York City (Ger) (Sea The Moon {Ger}) who was beaten less than a length when fourth behind Erle at Hoppegarten in June before running third in the G3 Hamburger Stutenpreis over this trip last month.



YOUNG GUNS: CASSIE TULLY

Cassie Tully is head of research and pedigrees at Coolmore. Previously a bloodstock columnist for Sporting Life, she is currently halfway through studying for an Executive MBA degree.

How did you first become involved/interested in racing and bloodstock?

I used to event when I was much younger but my Dad loved racing so it actually began through being a huge Barry Geraghty fan. A fascination with pedigrees dictated the way forward from there.

What does your role at Coolmore entail?

I'm over research and pedigrees but without wanting it to sounding cliched, no two days are actually ever the same. The role adapts with the racing and breeding seasons and encompasses everything from mating plans to nominations to preparing for sales. Items on the agenda can vary greatly day to day. We all know that Coolmore is a world-class operation and wherever you can or want to add value, there is an opportunity to do so.

Are you personally involved in breeding and/or pinhooking?

Yes, my mum and I have a farm at home in Galway and have a small, growing breeding operation of three broodmares. They are back in foal and our first homebred yearlings are heading to auction this autumn so there's a lot to look forward to.

If you were handed a hypothetical €100,000 sales voucher to be spent at any of the sales--be that yearlings, foals or mares--what would you look for?

I'm all about the middle-distance pedigrees and the long game. There's just so many more opportunities for success in the Pattern for the middle-distance horses--both black-type and prize money-wise. It's where the most value can be found, their pedigrees hold the most residual worth, and they are the most coveted product for resale and export.

And if you could own any broodmare in history, who would that be?

Hate to be boring here but it's impossible not to say Urban Sea or Hasili, isn't it?

How do you feel the bloodstock industry could encourage more of the younger generation to get involved in breeding?

I actually think that is a natural desire for most young people who are already interested in the sport. The real issue is encouraging people, from any generation, to engage with horse racing full stop.

Engagement is consistently declining and I find it beyond infuriating listening to the blame get put on the cost-of-living crisis, the fixture disruption, the weather, the domination of big owners and trainers, and so on. The country had circa 3% increase in consumer spending earlier this year which was apparently largely driven by entertainment. It's close to impossible to get GAA or large concert tickets; Meanwhile, racing's attendances, field sizes and betting turnovers were all down.

I think the popularity of the major jumps festivals is papering over the cracks in Irish racing and the overall figures, creating an illusion of prosperity while Flat racing is in a state of decay. Why is there such an acceptance of mediocrity and excuses rather than proactive growth strategies and clearly communicated targets?

The nature of our structure means that if any of the trio of owners, engagement, and entertainment decline, so will the other two, and along with them goes our funding streams. It's already happening. Look at the bookmakers in Britain pulling back from certain tracks in dissatisfaction with how the sport is not being grown with their levy inputs; and they are right to question. Where is the communication here and, really, where is the urgency?

It is frustrating and I think the longer we bury our heads in the sand, the further it is going to decline. If we lose this generation, racing's future sounds like fiction and its history will be relegated to folklore, so I think we need to start there.

Is there enough being done in regard to gender equality in the industry?

That is a big topic and not one that I would succinctly capture in one thought, but I would doubt that there is a woman who wants succeed in any profession that hasn't experienced gender bias or disparity in some form.

The industry is significantly male-dominated and probably lags behind on broader societal awareness on topics like these. That saying 'A woman has to work twice as hard to be considered half as good' probably reflects a reality for many.

The decades of research all shows that more balanced, diverse workplaces lead to better decision-making and increases in innovation and financial performance--all the things we want. And oftentimes it's an unconscious bias in the way.

The governing bodies' strategic plans are emphasising the need for gender balance at senior levels and while that is so important, I do think it's also crucial that every position remains based on merit and aptitude. Those targets and discussions should enhance, never compromise, the standards of professionalism.

I suppose it's creating awareness and recognition on both individual and organisational levels within our bubble. We are such a niche, focused industry with so many facets that we can become guilty of only looking inwards. Slow, evolutionary change in a fast-changing world is, as it was for the dinosaurs, a path to the bone yard. They can be uncomfortable topics and it's easy to be dismissive, but fostering inclusive practices that elevate the best talent regardless of anything else isn't something there is an option about any more.

What is the best advice you have ever been given?

To welcome criticism. I think it's just a mindset re-frame to embrace other perspectives and see all feedback as an opportunity for growth and improvement.
