



SUMMER HEATS UP AT FASIG-TIPTON SARATOGA SALE

If the weather in Saratoga Springs of late is any indication of what's to come at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion Monday and Tuesday evenings, the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale is poised for a volcanic renewal.

In 2023, a total of 154 yearlings sold for \$75,055,000, averaging \$487,370 with a median of 375,000. The gross jumped from \$66,955,000 generated for 143 sold in 2022.

"The vibe feels good here," confirmed Taylor Made's Frank Taylor. "Everybody you would want to see in the courtyard, you would have seen walk in. The horses have been showing well and the weather hasn't been too hot and they're doing pretty well."

Taylor continued, "Like always, we try to bring horses up here that are really good physicals, have good walks, vet well and have pedigrees."

A total of 240 yearlings have been cataloged this season, up from the 235 enlisted one year ago. According to Fasig-Tipton's Boyd Browning Jr., the quality remains on par with seasons' past, highlighted by a pair of its poster boys and Classic division alums--GI Preakness Stakes winner Seize the Grey (Arrogate), a \$300,000 Saratoga buy, and GI Toyota Blue Grass Stakes winner Sierra Leone (Gun Runner), also runner-up in the GI Kentucky Derby and third in the GI Belmont Stakes. **Cont. BIG WINS AT THE SPA SHOW ALVARADO ISN'T JUST ALONG FOR THE RIDE


Junior Alvarado wasn't among this year's class of inductees over the weekend at the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame. But the 38-year-old veteran put on a mini-clinic across the street at Saratoga Race Course that underscored his versatility as an unheralded rider on an ultra-competitive circuit who consistently coaxes the best out of his mounts, regardless of surface, distance, running style or odds.

Although the headline-grabber among his trio of victories was Saturday's decisive wiring of the GI Whitney Stakes aboard the older-horse division's newest phenom, **Arthur's Ride** (Tapit), Alvarado also orchestrated an impeccably timed, come-from-behind drive to narrowly capture Friday's GII Hall of Fame Stakes with **Neat** (Constitution). **Cont. 



There is no shortage of active pedigrees at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale, but this year Warrendale Sales has a draft of eight yearlings that includes several particularly eye-catching updates.

The latter topped the 2022 sale with a \$2.3 million final bid from White Birch Farm and M.V. Magnier.

Also gracing this year's catalog, 2023 Preakness hero National

Treasure (Quality Road), who returned at four to annex the GI Pegasus World Cup and the GI Met Mile. Rounding out the quartet, GI Del Mar Futurity scorer Prince of Monaco (Speightstown), runner-up in the June 8 GI Woody Stephens Stakes at Saratoga, realized \$950,000 in Saratoga in 2022.

"The success of our sales graduates has certainly made the sale," said Browning. "It's even increased its prominence when you have horses like we've got on the front cover this year. These

are some of the best stallions prospects in North America."

Browning points out that Saratoga shoppers have become accustomed to the quality that they find at the venue in upstate New York.

"The buyers have high expectations when they come to Saratoga," he explained. "Fortunately, our consignors continue to bring us horses that meet those expectations and that perform on the racetrack."

Taylor echoed that sentiment.

"You really have to bring a horse up here that really vets well, looks good, walks good, has a good mind and shows well," he said. "If you bring a horse that jumps through all the hoops, you'll get paid really well."

Commenting on the group of yearlings amassed for this summer's renewal, Browning said, "It's a fantastic group of yearlings on the sales grounds, and you know, that doesn't

just happen. It's not magic on our part. The consignors had to show us quality yearlings and feel confident in bringing them here and they brought us the best. I'm very enthusiastic. I'm very excited and I can't wait to kick it off." **Cont.**

The annual boutique sale has become a well-established source of million-dollar babies. Case in point, the 2023 renewal of the auction saw 10 yearlings surpass the seven-figure mark, headed by the \$4 million paid by Zedan Racing for a son of Curlin out of champion Beholder.

While it is true the sale routinely unearths the fancy pedigrees and physicals that go for big money every year, the venue has developed a reputation of offering prospects to those not shopping at the top level of the market as well.

"Our graduates are a testament to the fact that the sale can cater to different segments of the market," Browning said. "You have Sierra Leone running in the Classics, a top caliber horse. He was a topper here. Then you have Seize the Grey, a horse that wins the Preakness and he brought \$300,000 here. So that tells me a bit about the diversity of the horses that you have here."

He continued, "Honestly, I think it's a bit of a misconception about the Saratoga sale among some of the buyers. But I can tell you we've got 240 horses in this catalog and there are no fillers. They may not all be million-dollar horses, but every horse has been selected by their owners, consignors and lastly, by us. We start with 2500 yearlings in our process and we end up with 240 in the catalog. That's literally less than 10% of the horses we started with in the process and that actually ended up on the sale's grounds."

Underscoring that quality doesn't have to cost millions, Mill Ridge's Price Bell pointed toward a pair of the consignment's graduates who have exited the sale and gone on to excel.

"We sold Seize the Grey and [MGSW & GISP] Red Carpet Ready (Oscar Performance--\$180,000 purchase in 2021) here," he said. "Both were sold for well below the average of the sale. But both were sold for very good prices for our owners and breeders. So we always nominated a lot of horses to the Fasig sales in March and their team comes out to inspect them and we talk through each one. They might not be the most expensive yearlings, but we feel like we can bring athletes here."

After kicking off the yearling market at the July sale last month, Browning expects to see more of the same in Saratoga.

"I think that was an indication that there was interest and enthusiastic participation from a broad spectrum of buyers," he affirmed. "Of course, business is alive and well. You're always a bit concerned when you kick off a new sales cycle, yearlings, 2-year-old and broodmares, etc. But July reaffirmed that, hey people still want good horses. They want racehorses."

Bell concurred that the catalog offers many opportunities to buy a top-rung prospect and that can fit into almost any program.

"If the past is any indication, there are going to be four or five Grade I winners on the grounds," said Bell. **Cont.**

"So that's a great compliment to the Fasig recruitment team. It really is indicative of the quality that's here, that the owners, breeders and Fasig have worked to recruit and agree is the best place to showcase them. It's not for every horse, because it can be a long time to be here. It can give people an opportunity to fall out of love with them. But we hope that we do bring horses that people fall more in love with each time they see them."

Browning hopes the romance will start to flow in earnest come Monday at 6:30 p.m., affirming that many of the right players are already in place to produce fireworks over the next two evenings.

"We've got the right buyers here," he said. "I think we've got the right horses for those men and women who, hopefully, will pursue them aggressively and hopefully will achieve great results with them down the road."

And earlier that afternoon, he helped second-time-starter **Two Sharp** (Twirling Candy) attain '**TDN Rising Star**' status by guiding that 3-year-old filly to an 11 1/4-length tally in a maiden special weight (MSW) sprint.

Of those three, only Two Sharp was favored to win. Alvarado let this \$925,000 KEESEP filly roll out of the gate on the inside in a 6 1/2-furlong sprint, shrugged off mild early pressure, then

allowed her to open up at will on the far turn and kick clear through the lane under her own power.

"Absolutely devastating," was how track announcer Frank Mirahmadi described Two Sharp's victory at 1-2 odds.

The only thing that Alvarado might have hampered while keeping his filly under wraps as she sailed solo past the wire was her Beyer Speed Figure, which was assigned as 98 and certainly would have ticked into triple digits had Alvarado nudged her along a little faster. But what would have been the point?

Alvarado came from much farther back and had to go after multiple targets on the turf to nail the win with Neat in the Hall of Fame, rating from third-last in a field of eight.

That was a change in tactics from when he last rode the

3-year-old colt to a win in the GIII Manila Stakes June 29 at Aqueduct by pressing the pace in a five-horse race.

Again tasked with a mile, the 7-2 Neat broke alertly but was rated towards the rear by Alvarado. He edged closer down the backstretch, tipped five wide for the drive, but didn't seem truly in it to win it until the final 50 yards when Neat surged with purpose to wrest control in a three-horse photo.

at both KEENOV and KEESEP, is now 6-for-9 lifetime, adding a

Neat, who sold for \$200,000 Grade II victory to two previous Grade III wins and two other non-graded stakes, all on the grass. He's won the three graded races by a neck, a nose, and three-quarters of a length.

Junior Alvarado and Arthur's Ride | Tod Marks

He earned a career-best 87 Beyer in the Hall of Fame Stakes. "When I turned for home, I tipped him out and he was so game, he kept fighting and grinding and kept going after the horse in front," Alvarado said. "Eventually, he put his head in

> front right in front of the wire. I love this horse. He is my kind of horse--you can feel he has the fire to win."

Arthur's Ride might turn out to be Alvarado's kind of horse, too. Maybe even the one that earns him his best shot yet in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

Alvarado has partnered with this gray for trainer Bill Mott in four straight races since the 4-year-old recovered from a tendon strain that sidelined him from February 2023 until March 2024.

This \$250,000 KEESEP colt

started his career with a pair of seconds in two seven-furlong MSW contests at Saratoga in the summer of 2022 before resurfacing at Gulfstream on Feb. 11, 2023, in a one-turn mile.



In that race, Arthur's Ride caught the eye by taking pace pressure at the rail from the 6-5 favorite for most of the race, then clawing back the lead not once, but twice, after losing it in the stretch.

That maiden-breaking effort earned him a berth in the TDN Derby Top 12 rankings, but the tendon trouble kept Arthur's Ride out of action until a Mar. 16, 2024, blowout return win at Gulfstream by 7 1/2 lengths in a first-level allowance, another one-turn mile.

On the Friday before the 2024 Derby, Arthur's Ride wanted no part of racing in the slop at Churchill Downs, finishing ninth, beaten 23 lengths, in a second-level, one-turn mile allowance.

Brought back at the same condition but at 10 furlongs during the GI Belmont Stakes festival at Saratoga June 7, Arthur's Ride rebounded with a 12 3/4-length drubbing that yielded a 111 Beyer.

Going into Saturday's Whitney, bettors had to balance Arthur's Ride's sharp comeback race and his affinity for the Spa with the knowledge that he'd once again have to deal with an "off" racetrack and Grade I stakes company for the first time, with several other projected speedsters, including the .95-to-1 favorite **National Treasure** (Quality Road), drawn to his inside.

The wagering public figured just a decimal point under 7-1 was a square mutuel for the prospect of Arthur's Ride out-gunning a

fairly deep field from post nine over a muddy, sealed surface.

Alvarado knew that he needed to seize control of the pace from the outset for Arthur's Ride to have his best shot. He outbroke National Treasure, but had to deal with the pesky presence of **Skippylongstocking** (Exaggerator) before clearing the field.

Arthur's Ride cranked out consecutive quarter miles of :23.26, :23.37 and :23.65 while under legit pace pressure, yet turned for home with his ears pricked through a fourth-quarter split in an understandably slower :24.88 while responding to Alvarado's rousing to stay strong on the lead.

Arthur's Ride then left some pretty accomplished stakes horses in his wake, finishing up with a final furlong in :13.38 and a nine-furlong clocking of 1:48.54 that translated to a 110 Beyer while 2 1/2 lengths in front.

Galloping out on the turn, Alvarado displayed another form of athleticism by sprinting alongside Arthur's Ride for half a furlong after the colt unexpectedly ducked out and dislodged him.

"He just decided to spook and dropped me," Alvarado said while being interviewed back aboard Arthur's Ride on the Saratoga simulcast feed, remounting as if nothing had happened. "But I still had a hold of the reins, and he made me run with him for a sixteenth of a mile."

The Whitney is a "Win and You're In" qualifying race for the Breeders' Cup Classic, a stakes that has been won twice in the past three years by grays who first captured that year's Whitney--White Abarrio (Race Day) in 2023 and Knicks Go (Paynter) in 2021.

Unlike White Abarrio last year, who did not race between the Whitney and the Breeders' Cup, Mott said post-win that his gray could start next in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Sept. 1.

If you can't wait another four weeks to see a Mott-trained offspring of that Tapit-Points of Grace mating in action, you're in luck: Arthur's Ride's younger sister, a 3-year-old filly named Genetics, is dual-entered in allowance races Monday at both Ellis Park and Horseshoe Indianapolis. The May 27 foal broke her maiden last time out at Indy in career start number seven, by four lengths at 1-10 odds.

Glassman Racing LLC, the same connections who own her older brother, bought Genetics for \$525,000 at KEESEP back in 2022 when Arthur's Ride was still a maiden.

SARATOGA NOTEBOOK: BAFFERT SAYS NATIONAL TREASURE JUST DIDN'T FEEL LIKE

RUNNING IN WHITNEY by Tim Wilkin

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.--The easy thing would be to blame the racetrack. Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert wasn't going to do that the day after his National Treasure (Quality Road) finished a non-threatening sixth in Saturday's \$1 million GI Whitney Stakes at Saratoga Race Course.

National Treasure, who had been at the top of most lists as the best older horse in the nation, laid an egg as the 4-5 favorite.

"He just didn't show up," Baffert said on the Saratoga backstretch Sunday morning. "Once he didn't get into the race early, that was it. I knew right there that he was going to lose interest and he did. He did not bring his 'A' game. It happens."

Arthur's Ride (Tapit, 6-1) from the Hall of Fame barn of Bill Mott, ran the way that Baffert hoped National Treasure would. He led the 1 1/8-mile race virtually gate-to-wire and won by 2 3/4 lengths.

In June, National Treasure won the GI Metropolitan Handicap by 6 1/4 lengths at Saratoga.

The Whitney was run over a track labeled "muddy (sealed)." National Treasure has finished off the board in the three times he has ran over an off track. He was fifth in the GI Travers Stakes last year at the Spa on a muddy track and fourth in the GI Awesome Again Stakes on a wet/fast surface at Santa Anita last September.

"I'm not blaming the track," Baffert said. "The track was in good shape. I knew it was over on the first turn."

Baffert said National Treasure will ship home to California on Tuesday. It remains to be seen whether Baffert will come back for the Travers Stakes Aug. 24.


He had said last week that it was possible that GI Arkansas Derby winner **Muth** (Good Magic) could make his first start since that March 30 race in the Midsummer Derby. He backed off of that, a little, on Sunday.

"I don't know," he said. "I am a little behind. If you go to the Travers, you have to have a horse that is pretty well seasoned. Muth is seasoned, but he hasn't run in a long time. I am leaving the door open, but it's just open a little bit."

Muth worked six furlongs out of the gate at Del Mar Sunday in 1:12 (1/4).

"We nominate everywhere and see who is doing the best," he said. **Cont.**

Brightwork OK The Day After Flipping In Paddock Caused Her To Miss Test

There was disappointment at the barn of trainer John Ortiz Sunday morning, but also a sense of relief.

Brightwork (Outwork) was doing fine the day after she flipped in the paddock and was subsequently scratched from the GI Test Stakes Saturday by track veterinarians.

"She is ok," Ortiz said outside his barn on the Saratoga backstretch. "She has some superficial small cuts around her ankle, but, other than that, she is fine. She's in good spirits, she ate her food. This was just unfortunate."

Brightwork, who won last year's GIII Adirondack and GI Spinaway at Saratoga, would have been making her 2024 debut. Her last start was the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies where she finished sixth.

Ortiz said there was nothing that spooked Brightwork and caused her to rear up and flip and then roll on her side. She was able to get up and walked back to the barn after the scratch.

"She was just a little too excited," he said. "She reared up and lost her footing. I really believed she was going to do well."

Brightwork was checked out back at the barn Saturday night and Ortiz said he will begin looking into options for her next race. "We have to go find a Plan B," he said. "This all happened in a split second. The day can go from maybe being the greatest day of your life and then it goes to the most disappointing."

Thorpedo Anna Goes To Sunday School In Saratoga Paddock

If you were around the paddock before the seventh race on Sunday, you had the chance to get a peek at **Thorpedo Anna** (Fast Anna), the 3-year-old filly who is being targeted to face the boys in the GI Travers Stakes on Aug. 24.

Trainer Kenny McPeek schooled his filly in the paddock, something he plans to do for the next two Sundays. He wants to give Thorpedo Anna as much race-day experience as he can as she prepares for the Midsummer Derby.

"Look, it's going to be the toughest race of her life," McPeek said while sitting in his office at his barn in the Annex at the Oklahoma Training Track Sunday morning. "We want her to go over there as relaxed as possible. She is going to need every ounce of energy for that race."

McPeek said that Thorpedo Anna has a high energy level and schooling her in the paddock, he hopes, will calm her down heading into the Travers. **Cont.**

Ferocious Gobbling Up The Spotlight After Blowout Maiden Win

Ramiro Restrepo gets the credit for the name.

The horse did everything else when he blew away the competition in his maiden special weight win on Saturday at Saratoga.

That horse, the aptly named **Ferocious** (Flatter) won his sixfurlong race by 7 3/4 lengths, the most visually impressive win by a 2-year-old the Spa has seen in some time. Ferocious and jockey Javier Castellano were timed in 1:09.65.

He received a Beyer Speed Figure of 96, the best for a 2-year-old this year.

Restrepo and Gustavo Delgado Jr. spearheaded the \$1.3 million purchase of Ferocious at the OBS March sale. Restrepo came up with the name.

"All the cool horses have great names," Restrepo said at Gustavo Delgado Sr.'s barn on the Oklahoma Training Track Sunday morning. "You have to have a good, strong name."

It looked good on Sunday as Restrepo and Delgado Jr. received congratulations from well-wishers who came by the barn. Ferocious looked fit as he walked the shedrow, eyeballing those who stopped by.

Despite the hype and the price tag on Ferocious, Delgado Jr. said he did not feel any pressure before saddling him.

"We were talking about that before the race," he said.

"Sometimes, you find these horses for a certain amount of money and then you start breezing them and you don't see anything. That is when you feel pressure! This horse, from the beginning, oh, he was something."

Delgado Jr. said the decision on what comes next for Ferocious will be made when Gustavo Delgado Sr. comes back to Saratoga in the next few days. He was not here for the maiden breaker.

The GI Hopeful on Labor Day, closing day of the Saratoga meet, will be considered.

"That's on the table," Delgado Jr. said. "He seems to be fine this morning; a couple of days we will know for sure. Let's see what the real boss says when he gets back here."

He was referring to his father.

The ownership group was put together by Restrepo and Delgado Jr. It includes majority owner JR Ranch, owned by Jose Aguirre, Restrepo's Marquee Bloodstock, High Step Racing (Randy Guy, Joe Noble and Kevin Avera) and Delgado's OGMA Investments.

"When a horse like that comes into your barn and stars showing you the signs, it gives you more confidence," Restrepo said. "It's like you are going to battle with Mike Tyson in your corner rather than you having to face Mike Tyson."

Bauer Expected Two Sharp To Win, But Surprised With How She Did It

Trainer Phil Bauer was confident that Rigney Racing's **Two Sharp** (Twirling Candy) would run very well in Friday's first race.

He didn't think he would see what he saw though. Not that that is a bad thing.

Two Sharp romped to an 11 1/4-length 'TDN Rising Star' win in the 61/2-furlong maiden event for fillies and mares aged 3 and up. This was the second career start for Two Sharp, a 3-year-old filly.

She certainly lived up to her name.

"It's hard to expect that kind of performance," Bauer said at his barn on the Oklahoma Training Track. "I thought she would win. I told the owner (Richard Rigney) when he came in that I would be disappointed if she didn't win."

Ridden by Junior Alvarado, Two Sharp was never threatened as she skipped over the fast track to win on the front end in 1:15.81.

In her first start, at Churchill Downs on June 28, she finished second as the choice.

Bauer had been raving about this filly before the meet started and she met his expectations.

"She might be one of the better ones we have ever had," Bauer said.

Now, the question is what comes next? Bauer will let the dust clear for a bit before making a decision on that.


He could run in the \$300,000 GIII Dogwood Stakes at Churchill Downs on Sept 21 or the \$350,000, GII Raven Run Stakes at Keeneland on Oct. 19. Both races are for 3-year-old fillies and are run at seven furlongs. Another option could be an allowance race at Saratoga on Aug. 31.

"We are going to wait and see how some of the other ones that she beat runs back," Bauer said. "She is a very good doer, very hearty. A lot of these fillies kind of melt away on you the harder it gets."

ACTIVE PEDIGREES DRIVE WARRENDALE'S SARATOGA DRAFT


There is no shortage of active pedigrees at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale, but this year Warrendale Sales has a draft of eight yearlings that includes several particularly eye-catching updates.

Hunter Simms, Warrendale's Director of Bloodstock Service, can attest that landing a buzz horse in a yearling's pedigree is exactly what you're hoping for in the weeks leading up to a sale–especially at Saratoga where blacktype already abounds.

"People want to buy into young, active families," he said. "If it's fillies, there is hope that down the road you have some broodmare potential. You might get a half to something or the horse that you purchase at the sale is your graded stakes winner that you could eventually retire. With the colts up here, there are a lot of stallion pedigrees. A lot of end users shop this sale for those types of horses to run on Saturdays, get Grade I wins and eventually end up in their stallion barns."

Warrendale's Hip 57 could fit that bill. The Stonestreet-bred colt is from the first crop of Charlatan and is a half-brother to the talking horse among freshman sires, Complexity.

Standing at Airdrie Stud, Complexity currently sits atop the list of first-crop sires, most recently bringing in his first European stakes winner when Black Forest scored in the G2 Markel Richmond Stakes at Goodwood on Aug. 1. At the Saratoga Sale, Fasig-Tipton will be offering a share in Complexity as the first offering in the auction's second session on Tuesday, Aug. 6. The young sire will be represented by just one yearling at the sale in Hip 73, a half-sister to stakes winner Buckeye Magic (Trappe Shot) consigned by Mill Ridge Sales. Cont.



Meanwhile Warrendale's Charlatan colt is also a half-brother to Grade III winner and 2016 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies runner-up Valadorna (Curlin).

"Complexity is not the only horse in the pedigree," said Kitty Day, owner of Warrendale Sales. "It's Complexity but you've got some others there too and it's important for people to see that. Stonestreet gave us this Charlatan colt and they also gave us a Street Sense colt [Hip 157]. They're very similar horses with big hips and great walks."

Another Warrendale-consigned yearling with plenty of recent activity is Hip 62, a Nyquist half-sister to rising talent Vahva (Gun Runner). Trained by Cherie DeVaux, the 4-year-old filly Vahva has won four of her last five graded starts, most recently scoring in the GI Derby City Distaff and GIII Chicago Stakes.

Out of Grade I-placed Holiday Soiree (Harlan's Holiday), the Nyquist filly who was bred by Rock Ridge Thoroughbreds is also a half-sister to a 2-year-old City of Light filly that Warrendale sold to Belladonna Racing for \$400,000 at last year's Keeneland September Sale.

"The Charlatan colt and the Nyquist filly are both great physicals," said Day. "They're big, stretchy horses with beautiful necks and great walks. This filly is a little more compact. I would say she does kind of look like Vahva. We had the City of Light last year and she was a very similar type of horse as this filly. Very strong-hipped. It's all about the physicals."

Simms added that at the Saratoga Sale, there is a unique emphasis on in-person presentation because buyers have so much time to examine horses between the time when inspections starts on Friday and the sale begins on Monday.

"You want to bring the right horse here because they have three or four days to pick horses apart—whether it's X-rays, conformation or demeanor," he explained. "All that stuff, they have the time. So you want to bring the right horse that fits. It's always nerve wracking to bring a horse up here because it's a long way home if you RNA and don't get them sold, so we try to bring the right horse with the right physical and sire power. I think this year's draft represents that across the board."

Also in Warrendale's consignment, Hip 93 is a Maclean's Music colt bred by Ashview Farm from the family of recent GI Bing Crosby Stakes winner The Chosen Vron (Vronsky). Along with the Charlatan colt, their draft includes two others yearlings by first-crop sires in Hip 137, a colt by Raging Bull (FR) who is a half-brother to Grade II victor Andthewinneris (Oscar Performance), and Hip 231, an Essential Quality colt bred by Sandra Sexton & Silver Fern Farm.

The Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale will be held on Monday and Tuesday at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion. Bidding starts at 6:30 p.m.

Saturday's big winners at Saratoga Race Course all came out of their races in good order Sunday. 4-year-old **Arthur's Ride** (Tapit), provided a timely update to his family tree for his breeders Joe and Helen Barbazon with a win in the GI Whitney Stakes.

"Oh, we're just tickled to death," said Joe Barbazon. "We've got two of his half-sisters and of course this helps their value. We still have his mama here and it's a huge plus for us. It was very exciting, and there was a lot of yelling. Me and the wife were very happy."

With his 'Win and You're In" effort, Arthur's Ride will get the Barbazon's back to the Breeders' Cup for the first time since the they were second with Presious Passion (Royal Anthem) in the GI Emirates Airline Breeders' Cup Turf in 2009.

"It's just great. It was a thrill when Presious Passion went to the Breeders' Cup, and I think now we're getting another thrill," continued Barbazon. "For small people like us, it's just an honor. I'm so happy for Mr. Glassman."

GI Whitney runner up **Crupi** (Curlin) posted a career best 106 Beyer Speed Figure Saturday for Todd Pletcher as he finished 2 1/4 lengths behind Arthur's Ride.

"He came back good, and I thought he ran super," said Pletcher. "I thought for a second he was going to still have a shot, but we're very pleased with the effort. It put him over the million-dollar mark yesterday, so it's pretty cool to see him achieve that."

Pletcher noted that the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup may be in play for the 4-year-old.

The other Grade I winner on the day, **Ways and Means** (Practical Joke) found victory in the GI Test Stakes en route to a 98 Beyer Speed Figure for trainer Chad Brown as a homebred for Klaravich Stables.

"She broke good, and [jockey Flavien Prat] put in her a good spot and then it was her race to lose from there," Brown said. "Luckily, she gave a great performance, and everything worked out good. She looks good this morning."

Another on track towards the Breeders' Cup, Ways and Means will look to have one more start between now and the first weekend in November.

"We've spaced her races out and she's doing better with less," Brown said. "We'd like to get her to the [GI Breeders' Cup] Filly and Mare Sprint, and we'll probably run her one more time between now and then, but I'm not sure where or when."

Friday's GII National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame Stakes winner **Neat** (Consitution) also bounced back well after his win for Rob Atras and had already shipped back to his Belmont Park base.

"He came out of the race really good," said Atras. "We gave him a day and then sent him back down to Belmont where he got ready for that last race. We'll give him a couple of days and then get him back to the track. So far, so good."

Neat could be in line for a next start in the Gun Runner Stakes at Kentucky Downs Sept. 8.

"Nothing for sure yet. With him being Kentucky-bred, we will definitely take a look at the Kentucky Downs race on the eighth of September, but that's not for sure yet," Atras said.

Linda Rice, who had the top two finishes in the Fasig-Tipton Lure Stakes Saturday, noted that a bump back into graded company was possible for winner **Film Star** (Flatter).

"We are going to take a look at the [GI] Jockey Club Gold Cup. I opted out of the Whitney with him," Rice said. "I felt like he was coming off a layoff. He had one race earlier in the meet and I felt like he wasn't up to that yet. Instead, I opted to be an MTO in the Lure and that worked out pretty well for us, but we are going to take a strong look at the Gold Cup."

Rice also confirmed that runner up **Pioneering Spirit** (American Pharoah) would return to the turf.

"Back to the grass with him. I think his best distance is 1 1/8-miles. He won the Bernard Baruch here last year, so we are going to go try and defend that," she said.

Out at Del Mar, GI Clement Hirsch Stakes winner **Adare Manor** (Uncle Mo) was also doing well after successfully defending her title from last year.

Pasqual Rivera, longtime barn foreman for trainer Bob Baffert, noted that she was "super good" Sunday morning but that no further discussions had been had on where the mare will race next.

Also confirmed to be no worse for wear Sunday were fellow Clement Hirsch starters **Pretty Mischievous** (Into Mischief) and **Scylla** (**Tapit**) who will both ship back to their Kentucky bases this week.

A ROYAL PROCESSION FOR THE QUEENS M G IN ADIRONDACK VICTORY

Safe to say you won't be seeing long odds on **The Queens M G** (Thousand Words) any more. Off her shocking win at odds of 44-1 in the Schuylerville Stakes July 11, the Saffie Joseph, Jr. runner took serious money Sunday and rewarded her backers again at 5-2 with an impressive victory in the GIII Adirondack Stakes to become her freshman sire's (by Pioneerof the Nile) first graded winner.

An unlikely debut winner at Keeneland Apr. 7, The Queens M G outlasted Kentucky Juvenile Fillies Stakes winner West Memorial (Caracaro) to bring the 45-1 upset for then-trainer Israel Acevedo before joining the Saffie Joseph, Jr. barn. Favored in the Astoria Stakes on Belmont weekend at Saratoga June 6, she faded badly to seventh and bettors responded to that effort with those long odds again in the Schuylerville. And so, coming into Sunday's Adirondack, The Queens M G needed to prove she could run at short odds and safe to say, the message was delivered.

Breaking from the outside under Dylan Davis, who was also aboard for her Schuylerville win, 5-2 second choice was able to sit a nice trip in fourth as a trio of rivals pushed each other up front led by 'TDN Rising Star' Anakarina (Vekoma). Close to the speed of a :21.42 opening quarter, she began to inch up, taking third into the far turn while still outside in the clear and, under only a shake of the reins from Davis, it was game on. As the pacesetters wilted along the fence, The Queens M G tipped down to the inside and came home in style with only race favorite Italian Soiree (Uncle Mo) doing any running late to fill the exacta.

"I think she improved a lot from her last start," said Davis. "She got a little more aggressive and she knew what she had to do again today. She showed more. Outside post again, and I could really sit off it and let her do what she wants. She was more aggressive coming out of there on a hot pace. She's able to settle and she's really versatile. She just waits for my cue and responds. She's really nice to ride and the team did a good job with her again today."

Saffie Joseph, Jr. added: "She wasn't 40-1, so the pressure was on. I thought today we would see if we had a legit horse, or not. We were hoping to get back-to-back wins and get through it. The way she ran--she had a pace scenario--this was the first time she wasn't really pressing, she had to sit a little bit. We worked her the other day inside of a horse in case she drew inside. Thankfully, we got a good post again. She's drawn outside all three times, so that's been to her advantage. She showed a new dimension because she sat off a couple horses and she quickened. Today, was her best by far. Last time, she won but today was a different level."

DRAGOON GUARD TOO GOOD, WIRES WEST VIRGINIA DERBY

Make that four in the row. Dragoon Guard (Arrogate), who just last time out won the GIII Indiana Derby, added another state's Derby to his resume Sunday night in taking the GIII West Virginia Derby in gate to wire fashion to stretch his win streak to four.

Raced just once as a 2-year-old, the juvenile did well to finish second by a neck to SW Otto the Conquerer (Street Sense) at Churchill Downs during the September meet. Sidelined after that start, he returned as 3-year-old in April, breaking his maiden at Keeneland before taking his show on the road, winning an optional claimer at Churchill in early June and the aforementioned Indiana Derby last month all by clear margins.

The 3-5 favorite in this scratched-down field of six, Dragoon Guard easily assumed the front under regular pilot Florent Geroux after out-sprinting only a brief pace challenge from a

pair of runners to his outside. Stretched out to a single-file line for the run up the backstretch, Dragoon Guard rated through fractions of :23.32 and :47.62 before rivals began to bunch up behind him led by Society Man (Good Magic) who looked to come through against the rail. That door was slammed shut, killing that runner's momentum now shifted to the outside and Dragoon Guard was left to outrun only a late-charging Dimatic (Gun Runner) who had to settle for a valiant second.

"It was a solid performance," said winning trainer Brad Cox, who won his first West Virginia Derby. "He took another step forward, and we're very proud of him. We're not sure about the future schedule for him. We'll have to discuss that with the owner."

Pedigree Note:

From the last crop of the great Arrogate, Dragoon Guard is one of is sire's 25 stakes winners. First dam Filimbi was a stakes winner in France and GSW/MGISP in the United States. From five foals to race, she's produced four winners, including this runner's full-brother, with Dragoon Guard being the most talented of the bunch to date. Second dam Flute, who took both the GI Kentucky Oaks and the GI Alabama Stakes, also produced the dams of GSW Current (Curlin), GISW Weep No More (Mineshaft) and GSW/G1SP Qabala (Scat Daddy). Filimbi does not have a 2-year-old but will be represented by a yearling Into Mischief filly and reported a filly by Constitution this year.

Hit Show leads the field home | Coady Media

A major player on last year's Triple Crown trail, Gary and Mary West's homebred **Hit Show** tasted his first graded success since winning last February's GIII Withers Stakes at Aqueduct when he snuck through along the rail to take the GIII West Virginia Governor's Stakes at Mountaineer Sunday evening.

Fifth in last year's GI Kentucky Derby and fourth in the GI Belmont Stakes, Hit Show finished his 3-year-old season fifth in GII Jim Dandy Stakes at Saratoga and sixth beaten just 2 1/2 lengths in the GIII Oklahoma Derby at Remington Park in September. Off a long break, the son of Candy Ride (Arg) returned to win an optional claimer at Churchill Downs May 11 but was never involved in last month's GIII Cornhusker Stakes at Prairie Meadows, finishing seventh as the favorite.

Away at 7-5 even off that effort, Hit Show was caught up mid pack as 33-1 longshot local Play Chicken (Square Eddie) rocketed from the gate in a clear ploy to steal away on the front end. Outside and near the back of the main pack up the backstretch, he chased through moderate fractions but needed room into the far turn as the pacesetter was already beginning to throw it in. Play Chicken blinked past the quarter pole and took several outside runners wide as he lugged out leaving the rail wide open for Florent Geroux to tip inside and get the first jump into the straightaway. It was a sprint to the finish but Hit Show had more than enough to lead home a calvary charge of runners behind him and get his second win of the year.

"It was the only option I really had, and the only spot that was not taken," Geroux said. "He was traveling great the whole race, and I had a decision to make."

Pedigree Note:

One of 114 stakes winners for Candy Ride, Hit Show is out of MGSW Actress (Tapit) who earned over a half-million on the track and is a perfect three-for-three for runners to winners thus far in her second career. Second dam Milwaukee Appeal was Canadian champion 3-year-old filly in 2009 with Actress being her best runner to date. Hit Show has a 2-year-old half-sister named Blind Faith (Medaglia d'Oro) who has yet to make the races for Gary and Mary West.



It took her every single stride of the stretch to get there but Waves of Mischief just edged out race favorite Pin Up Betty (Constitution) to take Sunday's GIII Pucker Up Stakes at Ellis Park. Making her fourth start over as many tracks for Brendan Walsh and Qatar Racing, the \$575,000 OBS March grad came out a winner on debut at Keeneland in April, just managed to hit the board in the Hilltop Stakes at Pimlico May 17 and was well out of it after racing keen early last out in the GIII Selene Stakes in her first try on the Tapeta at Woodbine June 29. Back on the grass and trying 1 1/8 miles for the first time, the 7-1 shot also raced without blinkers Sunday under Brian Hernandez.

As the more experienced race favorite shot out to an easy lead, Hernandez kept Waves of Mischief covered up against the rail, enjoying a cozy trip from third through an opening quarter in :24.19. Tipped out to the clear for the run into the far turn as the field still had plenty of work to do to keep up with the pacesetter, she got first jump to the outside past the quarter pole and really got running late to nail Pin Up Betty in the final jump of a driving finish.

"It was my first time on her and Brendan told me to find her some cover early in the race," said Hernandez. "Into the first turn, I got her covered up but she pulled me out of that spot down the backside. So I let her do her own thing, and it worked out perfectly."

"She was a little keen at Woodbine last time, so we decided to take off the blinkers today," added Walsh's assistant Paul Madden. "Brian gave her a masterful ride, and his confidence is soaring right now. Turning for home, he waited just a moment before asking her to catch Pin Up Betty, and it was the winning move."

Pedigree Note:

The 76th individual graded stakes winner for perennial leading general sire Into Mischief, Waves of Mischief is one of two foals (and two winners) for her late un-raced dam. Second dam Ain't She Sweet, though un-raced herself, is a full-sister to champion 2-year-old filly Sweet Catomine (Storm Cat) and MGISW Life is Sweet (Storm Cat). This is also the family of MGSW and sire Modernist (Uncle Mo). Pearl River, lost in 2023, has an un-raced 2-year-old named Stars and Stripes (Not This Time) and a now yearling Nyquist colt still to represent her on track.

Light Up Racing has retained Amy Brin as a contracted interim Executive Director through Envision Consulting LLC. Brin brings over 20 years of national experience in building non-profit organizations and programming. Bell said, "Another thing we learned is that we need someone running the daily operations to really push things forward. It is important in a build that we capitalize on momentum." A full-time executive director will be recruited during Phase 2.

Hill Stable, was the 2015 Prince of Wales Stakes winner and took the GIII Seagram Cup Stakes a 4-year-old while also placing in the GI Clark Handicap, the GI Whitney Stakes and the GI Stephen Foster Handicap.



QUIETSIDE LOUDLY RINGS 'TDN RISING STAR' BELL ON DEBUT AT SARATOGA

Clearly ready for her unveiling, it was **Quietside (Malibu Moon--Benner Island, by Speightstown)** who used her
breakaway ability to envelop a field of juveniles and garner **'TDN Rising Star'** honors after the opener at Saratoga on Sunday.

Sent on her way as a 7-2 shot here, the homebred initially vied for the lead up the backstretch between Insight runner First Class Lady (Uncle Mo) and Ivory and Ebony (Spun to Run). Well-handled by Luis Saez, Quietside backed off and allowed the pacesetters to trade blows. The dark bay was then roused three wide around the far turn and she entered the lane full of gusto. Cruising by her opponents, the filly took control and graduated at first asking by 6 1/4 lengths.

The winner is her dam's first to the races. Benner Island was purchased by John Ed Anthony's outfit at the 2015 Keeneland September Sale for \$200,000 and her subsequent campaign included a win in the 2017 GII Eight Belles Stakes. Sent to the breeding shed after a third-place finish in the GI Acorn Stakes that same year, this dam produced a filly by Bolt d'Oro Feb. 28 and she was bred back to him for next term.

Out of GSW Spacy Tracy (Awesome Again), Benner Island is a half-sister to both MSW High North (Midnight Lute) and GISP Ohana Honor (Honor Code). She is a full-sister to two-time GIII Vagrancy Handicap heroine Victim of Love, and her extended female family includes champion 2-year-old filly Eliza (Mt. Livermore).

Quietside is the 24th **'TDN Rising Star'** for the late Malibu Moon and his first since 2021. The last Shortleaf color bearer to earn the badge was Caddo River (Hard Spun) in 2020.



MAY DAY READY SURPRISES EVERYONE WHEN BREAKING MAIDEN BY A NOSE

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. -- If you believed the tote board before the seventh race at Saratoga Race Course Sunday afternoon, it was best to move right on by the No. 8 horse in the \$100,000 Maiden Special Weight for 2-year-old fillies.

May Day Ready (Tapit) had no chance to win her debut, a 1 1/16-mile race on the inner turf. At least that's what the betting public thought. She was dead on the board at odds of 25-1; second longest shot in the field of 10.

"The horse didn't know that," owner Larry Doyle of KatieRich Stables LLC said with a big grin.

Indeed, May Day Ready did not. She showed grit, determination, courage ... take your pick ... and found her way to the winner's circle, much to the delight of Doyle and trainer Joe Lee.

Doyle, who owns KatieRich Farms in Midway, Ky with his wife, Karen, was celebrating his first-ever win at Saratoga after May Day Ready and jockey Frankie Dettori powered to the finish line to edge the fast-closing Love Tempo (Ire) (Churchill {Ire}). The margin of victory was the slimmest of noses. It was also the first Spa victory for Lee, a former assistant to former trainer Kiaran McLaughlin, who is now the jockey agent for Luis Saez and Hall of Famer John Velazquez.

Doyle, from Long Island, bought May Day Ready with an eye towards a breeding career for her. She is by the More Than Ready mare Nemoralia and Doyle bought her for \$325,000 at the Ocala Spring Sale of 2-year-olds in training.

"The breeding," Doyle said about why he bought her. "We think that down the road she will be a broodmare. Tapit. More Than Ready. We are commercial breeders, and we really liked the bloodlines. We just thought we would take a shot and thought the residual value was there."

Getting a win the first time out certainly won't hurt the breeding possibilities. Who knows what might come next?

Doyle estimates he has run maybe a dozen horses at Saratoga. Before Sunday, his best finish was a second in the then GII Schuylerville in 2002 with Miss Mary Apples, a filly he owned with Christopher Connors.

Lee, 62, began his career working for future Hall of Famer D Wayne Lukas with McLaughlin when he graduated fromm the University of Kentucky in 1989. In 1993, he went to Dubai with McLaughlin and worked there for seven years. From there, he went to Japan for 11 years.

He worked with plenty of champion horses. Now, he has a modest stable of five horses, all of them stabled at Belmont Park. Lee has been in the winner's circle, just not as a winning trainer. Until May Day Ready got him there. The result caught him by surprise.

"I was hoping she would be laying seventh, eight, maybe eight or nine lengths off," Lee said. "And we would finish third or fourth, beaten three lengths, to be honest with you. I am really happy."

In the winner's circle, Doyle and Lee got to see first-hand the traditional flying dismount from Dettori. They thought they were dreaming. May Day Ready was timed in 1:46.35 and paid \$53.50. **Cont.**

Lee said the celebration would probably be short-lived. May Day Ready would be on a van back to Belmont Park by 7 p.m. and he would be right behind. He has four other horses he tends to at Belmont; he plans on running some of them in the coming weeks at Saratoga.

"I really thought this one had a shot," Lee said. "She has always showed class in the mornings and today she did what she had to do to do what she did."

MAY DAY READY (f, 2, Tapit--Nemoralia (GSW & G1SP-Eng, MGISP-USA, \$544,633}, by More Than Ready), cold on the board at 25-1 for this unveiling, pulled the shocker in the end as she held off all challengers late to win in a photo. Racing along in ninth just off the fence once the field got on their way, she had to be tipped out five wide for room and was in the clear with seven-sixteenths left to travel before she tucked in along the rail into the far turn. That, in turn, caused a chain reaction which left several horses in tough spots, but May Day Ready was still moving forward and she had taken command by the eighth pole. Shying away from the right hand stick but gamely hanging tough as the favorite Love Tempo (Ire) (Churchill {GB}) loomed the late danger, she just denied that rival by the thinnest of margins on the wire. There was a jockey's objection by one of the riders involved in the traffic trouble, and after a review, the objection was dismissed with the result allowed to stand.

Out of multiple Grade I/Group 1-placed Nemoralia, who was also a group winner in England in addition to being placed in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf, May Day Ready is her most recent to the races. Her elder brother Bosque Redondo (War Front) is a course record setter at Tampa Bay Downs.

In a wild finish, it was Charcoal--whose grey head came down on the wire first--to take the KY Downs Preview Turf Sprint Stakes in a 26-1 shocker.

Winless since last May, where that neck victory broke a two-year long drought, the elder statesman of the field confirmed his knack for good timing en route to securing his first career black-type victory. Pursuing the leading pack as Coppola pushed the issue to the outside of the early pace in :21.03 and :43.34, Charcoal set his sights on the new leader at the top of the lane, and found himself herded out multiple paths as Coppola started drifting in midstretch. Relentless in the closing stages, he narrowly held off a charge from Arrest Me Red while Coppola faded to third in a dead heat with Mo Stash.

Charcoal is the only runner for his dam to achieve black-type status, and has only one winning younger sibling from six to be born after him that have reached racing age. In a stylish defense of his title--though the word feels underwhelming to describe the ease--Next did what Next does best in the Birdstone Stakes: turning a marathon into a runaway.

Racing on appointment only the last couple of seasons, his smallest margin of victory came in his first appearance in the GII Brooklyn Stakes last year, where he defeated SW & MGSP Calibrate (Distorted Humor) by 2 1/4 lengths. His largest came when he wrapped 2023 a 25-length winner in Parx's Sept. 23 GIII Greenwood Cup, but this margin came close to breaking that personal record.

In 2024, he's been equally as spectacular, dominating the Isaac Murphy Marathon Overnight Stakes May 1 by 11 1/4 lengths beneath the Twin Spires, and successfully defended his crown as the king of the Brooklyn when he coasted home 9 1/4 lengths best over GSW & MGISP Crupi (Curlin) last out.

Breaking well, Next found himself briefly sitting off the slow pace set by Time for Trouble (English Channel), who offered an opening quarter in :25.12 but was pulled up coming off the first bend as he made his way to the center of the course and was walked off. **Cont.**

Slip Mahoney assumed command and was in the lead across the wire for the first time after a half in :51.09. The trio bunched together through the second bend and into the backstretch, but Next was already keen to get going as he ranged up on the outside of that leader. Masqueparade was content to watch it all unfold and even tried to launch a bid entering the final bend as Slip Mahoney threw up the white flag, but Next had yet to be asked.

When the time finally came, the 1-9 overwhelming favorite ran like the sure thing his odds suggested, shrugging off the would-be challenger entering the lane for the final time and cruising to an effortless 22 1/4-length Tour de Force over that runner-up. It would be a daunting 96 1/4 lengths back to Slip Mahoney.

"As always, he showed up with his 'A' game. The horse outdoes himself every time and he's just a nice horse. Fun to be around and I enjoy training him," said Doug Cowans.

Cowans would not commit to going when asked about the potential of trying his marathon star in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Sept. 1, which is a 'Win and You're In' race for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

"Well, we will see how things go. When we get home, we will make a plan. I stick to what I've always said, the horse, you can watch him in the races, he really enjoys himself out there, loves doing what he's doing. So when I start to shorten him down, I don't know how well he will like it, but maybe we will have to try it at some point."

It was sentiment owner Michael Foster echoed, "I have no comment. As I've said before, I'm just the guy who writes the check. His team and Doug will make the decision."

"Of course, Doug and I will talk about it. If you ask me if I'd love to see him in the Gold Cup is something I'd say yes to, but we don't have any plans right now."

"We'll see how he comes back home tomorrow."

Next is the last registered offspring for Bahia Beach, who only produced three foals and all of whom were winners including Just Hattie (Quality Road)--now a broodmare with her most recent being a 2024 Mind Control colt--and the nine-time winning English Challenge (English Channel). 





'MAYBE HE'S AS GOOD AS WE'D HOPED' -HAMILTON EXCITED ABOUT HOT PROSPECT

Over a decade on from Pathfork recording a memorable Group 1 triumph in the National Stakes at the Curragh, the American-based Bonnie and Tommy Hamilton of Silverton Hill Farm are dreaming of further big-race riches in Europe with Hotazhell (GB) (Too Darn Hot {GB}).

If it has been a while between drinks for the Hamiltons in Ireland, Hotazehll appears as though he was worth the wait. Like Pathfork, Hotazhell is trained by Jessica Harrington.

He announced himself as a pretty serious colt with genuine Classic aspirations when landing the G3 Tyros Stakes--a race that has been won by Teofilo (Ire), New Approach (Ire), Gleneagles (Ire) and more--at Leopardstown last Thursday.

Bonnie Hamilton is rightly excited about what the future might bring for the son of Too Darn Hot, who was shrewdly sourced by Harrington from Eddie Linehan's Lackendarra Stables at the Tattersalls Craven Breeze-Up Sale for 200,000gns in the spring.

"As Christophe Clement always says, the dream is still alive until it's not,'" Hamilton said. Cont. p3

'A PURE CHAMPION': REYNIER HAILS NURLAN BIZAKOV'S LAZZAT AFTER MAURICE DE GHEEST WIN by Tom Frary


Maintaining his unbeaten sequence in style, Nurlan Bizakov's Lazzat (Fr) (Territories {Ire}--Lastochka {GB}, by Australia {GB}) proved the slight drop in trip to be no problem as he dominated Sunday's G1 ARC Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville. Having captured the seven-furlong G3 Prix Djebel here in April and the G3 Prix Paul de Moussac at ParisLongchamp in June, the Jerome Reynier-trained homebred had a question to answer taking on the pure sprinters over this niche 6 1/2-furlong distance but travelled equally as strongly as them all from the outset.

Looming on the front end approaching the 300-metre marker, the 100-30 second favourite stayed on powerfully to the line where he had three lengths to spare over Exxtra (Fr) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}), with Beauvatier (Fr) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) 3/4 of a length behind in third. The G1 July Cup winner Mill Stream (Ire) (Gleneagles {Ire}) held every chance, but could only manage fifth. Cont. p5



She added, "From a distance, and from talking to Richie [Galway] and Jessie, they feel like Hotzhell is really only starting to tap into what he could be as a racehorse. It would be great if

he turned out to be a Classic horse. That's what we're after."

Hamilton added, "We've always dealt with really great people in Ireland who have made the whole experience really special. I feel like they are honest with us as well. The Irish really appreciate racing and there are very good horses over there. The whole experience is so good."

Things could get even better for Hotazhell, who Harrington reports to be under consideration for the Futurity and the National Stakes at the

Curragh. He would not look out of place in the line-up for Group 1 races this term judging by how he accounted for some well-touted rivals at Leopardstown and Hamilton has even

pledged to be there in person for his next appearance.

She said, "You'd always be wishing that maybe he could come over here for the Breeders' Cup at some point but, the type of ground that he likes, I don't think that would lend itself to the


Breeders' Cup in California this year. I think we're pretty good owners—we think it's best to listen to the trainer who knows best. If you have trainers you trust and stay out of their way, you will probably do much better in the long run. We're going to try and get over to see him run come hell or high water."

Linehan is another man keeping a close eye on what Hotazhell can go on to achieve. One of the leading young handlers on the breeze-up circuit, the County Cork native

describes Hotazhell as just the type of colt that he had been searching for in order to get his consignment to the next level.

"We were very bullish about this lad at the sales," Linehan explained. "We knew he was a very special horse from day one and, as soon as we pressed a button, we knew he was different to anything we had before. I've sold nine black-type fillies in nine years at the breeze-ups but this is the type of horse we have been searching for and hopefully he can elevate us to the next level at the breeze-ups. I think he's the horse we've needed to try and get up the ladder."

Linehan added, "They seem to be very bullish about him at Jessica Harrington's. We were probably a bit disappointed that he only made 200,000gns at the Craven, but it was early in the sale, so maybe that counted against him. But when we heard he was going to Harrington's, I couldn't have been happier. The best horse my father ever sold was a horse called Oscars Well, who won two Grade 1s over hurdles for Jessica Harrington, so that was my first thought when Hotazhell went there.


"Before he ran in the Tyros, they were listing out some of the horses who had won the race down through the years on Racing TV. I was thinking to myself, 'if he can win this, he really could be anything. Sure enough he did and I think he could be a proper Group 1 horse now."

It is Galway, a key cog in the wheel at Harrington's world-famous yard, that has been credited by Hamilton for finding Hotazhell at the sales. However, the instruction to go and find another Pathfork only came about by chance.

Hamilton explained, "It's really interesting because we've been to Royal Ascot four or five times with runners and of course we love that. We said a few years ago, why don't we try and get a runner ready for that again. We have a homebred two-year-old here in the States and he is out of a mare who ran respectable at Royal Ascot so we thought he might fit the bill. We asked Richie last autumn if they would take him and he said they'd love to have him. Well, I think I put the jinx on the horse

because he was just not an early two-year-old. Of course, I was disappointed and when I rang Jessie and Richie, they said, 'why don't you just let us buy you something?'"

She added, "We weren't going to be spending seven or eight hundred thousand on something but they went to Newmarket for the Craven Breeze-Up Sale and called us with their list. The first one went through for too much money and I was pretty bummed. Then Hotazhell came through and Richie just said, 'you got him'. Really all of the credit needs to go back to Richie."

Those renowned pink Silverton silks are regularly sighted at the big meetings in America but, make no mistake, Hotazell's emergence as a genuine Group 1 contender in Ireland means just as much to the owners.

"We've been doing this long enough to know how difficult it is [to find good horses]," Hamilton said. "We've had runners in the Kentucky Derby and, you know what, we probably didn't appreciate that enough at the time. It's very special to have a horse like Hotazhell because there is such a high level of racing in Ireland. There's a fine line between being excited and expecting but maybe he really is as good as we were hoping he would be. It's truly just as exciting watching him in Ireland as it would be if we had one over here in Kentucky. A good horse is special anywhere in the world, especially in Ireland."

"Today he proved he belongs in the top league," Reynier said, before revealing the gelding's big aim later in the year.

"The Golden Eagle in Australia is his target against local 4-yearolds with a weight allowance," he explained. "It was won last year by a Japanese horse who had the same conditions. He has to have two weeks' quarantine in Newmarket and two more locally, so we will see but it looks like a race designed for him. He doesn't need much work, he's just a good horse and a pure champion, I think."

Now six-for-six, the Sumbe homebred has come a long way since his debut at Cagnes-sur-Mer in January and his trainer was keen to herald his efforts in turning around the mindset of what was a tricky character at the outset. "This horse would not be what he is had he not been gelded," he explained. "He was very difficult to be around and impossible to train early on--heavy and mean and gelding him has transformed him. The team at home has done a great job."

"We trained him early this year and he had three races in Cagnes, quite close together but easy like morning gallops and they were necessary to build him up," Reynier added. "It is unbelievable the way he was physically and mentally today, he was so strong and it gives you so much confidence. He's a bit like Facteur Cheval, he never lets you down and he is exciting for the coming months and years--he is going to run forever hopefully, if he can stay safe and sound. He goes on any ground and on left, right or straight courses so he ticks many boxes."

Nurlan Bizakov simply said, "Some horses don't know how to win, but Lazzat doesn't know how to lose!"

Yann Lerner said of Exxtra, "She has put up a great performance again in a particularly tough field. Ever since she ran such a good race last year in the Prix de la Foret, we mapped out a program to bring her to this race in top form and her whole programme has been geared towards this race. She has improved with every run this year, she has backed our judgement and she should again tackle the Foret."

Yann Barberot said of Beauvatier, "I'm delighted with the performance and I think we can say for sure now that he doesn't stay and is a speedy type. His dam's pedigree speaks of stamina, but he's inherited his speed from his sire. On this type of course, he is a straightforward ride and has a sharp turn of foot at the end. I was toying with running him in the Prix de la Foret, but that seven-furlong trip will certainly be too far for him. He could maybe go straight to Ascot for the six-furlong Group 1 on Champions Day."

Pedigree Notes

Lazzat, who becomes the third Group 1 winner for his sire, is currently the only known foal out of Lastochka (Ire) (Australia {GB}), a granddaughter of the G1 1,000 Guineas heroine Sleepytime (Ire) (Royal Academy). Her four black-type winners include the G3 Winter Derby winner Gentleman's Deal (Ire) (Danehill) and the G3 Superior Mile winner Hathal (Speightstown), while her dam is the top producer Alidiva (Ire) (Chief Singer {Ire}) who also produced Sleepytime's G1 Sussex Stakes-winning full-brother Ali-Royal (Ire) and the four-times Group 1 winner Taipan (Ire) (Last Tycoon {Ire}).

SEVENTH HEAVEN FOR ROTTGEN WITH ERLE THEIR LATEST DIANA HEROINE

Flying the flag for Germany on Sunday, Gestut Rottgen's homebred **Erle (Ger)** (Reliable Man {GB}--Kizingo {Ire}, by Oasis Dream {GB}) made the most of her favourable inside draw and her abundant ability to lead at every step in Dusseldorf's G1 Henkel-Preis der Diana. Always happy navigating the tight circuit under Martin Seidl, the Maxim Pecheur-trained 6-1 shot turned it on from the top of the straight and was soon beyond recall. At the line, the homebred had a length to spare over the closing **Spanish Eyes (Ger)** (Zarak {Fr}), with 3 1/2 lengths back to **Lady Mary (Ger)** (Lawman {Fr}) in third.

This was a seventh renewal of the 11-furlong Classic for the historic and esteemed operation and the fourth since Diu (Ger) captured it in its first year as a group race in 1972. Keeping it in the family, Erle is also the first to win this prestigious Classic since her second dam Enora (Ger) (Noverre) in 2010. In the end, the form that mattered in this was ultimately Hoppegarten's G3 Diana Trial in June, where the winner had narrowly denied Lady Mary.

"The race was absolutely ideal," Seidl said. "Her last piece of fast work really impressed me and she had improved again since Hoppegarten. "It is fabulous to have achieved this Classic victory for Gestut Rottgen."

Pecheur, who was also celebrating his first Classic and Group 1 victory as a trainer in his first year saddling the establishment's horses, had ridden Diamanta (Ger) (Maxios {GB}) to success in this five years earlier but could hardly express the magnitude of the moment. "I am lost for words to describe my feelings," he said. "We already enjoyed a great season, but winning the German Oaks is absolutely awesome. A great thank you to all of the team who have made this possible." Cont. p7

BLACK-TYPE REVIEW

Aside from the Group 1 action on Sunday, Deauville and Dusseldorf also staged a Group 3 contest with the Normandy venue's Prix Daphnis heading like the card's feature to Nurlan Bizakov. The Christopher Head-trained Ramadan (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}), who had been found wanting in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Prix du Jockey Club, was back in calmer waters and showed tenacity to ward off the G2 German 2000 Guineas third **Ghorgan (Ger)** (Study Of Man {Ire}) by a neck. "He's a miler and he had his old fighting spirit there," his trainer said. "He will be back trying for a Group 1 race before the end of the season and there are many options."

Dusseldorf's other pattern race was the Fritz Henkel-Preis and the mile contest was also won by a 3-year-old colt who had previously been in Classic action. Stall Hanse's 2023 G3 Preis des Winterfavoriten winner Geography (Ger) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) had been only seventh in the German 2000 Guineas but turned that around when making all for a 1 1/4-length verdict over the British raider Molten Rock (Ire) (Fascinating Rock (Ire)).

Back at Deauville, the Brits were in their customary position in the two listed sprints and the Prix du Cercle saw the welcome return of last year's G1 King's Stand Stakes hero Bradsell (GB) (Tasleet {GB}). Positively-ridden by Hollie Doyle despite this being his first start since September, Victorious Racing's 4-yearold is on course for a return to the big time.

"I've never known a horse as tough as him and all credit to [trainer] Archie [Watson] and Mike Murphy, who rides him every day," Doyle said. "He has so much natural speed, I just sat on him and held him where he is comfortable and he quickened away nicely. He's had a good blow so I'm sure he will come on for it. He stayed on well and hit the line hard and took a bit of pulling up, which is a really good sign. It's an incredible training performance."

"I'm not saying he's going to win it, but I hope he can be competitive at least. Hopefully he can go there and not be too far away. He's a good old stick and the sort of horse you need to give everyone some good days out."

Alflaila also the 2022 editions of the G3 Strensall Stakes and G3 Darley Stakes to his credit. After his 2023 York Stakes triumph, he ran fifth in the G1 Irish Champion Stakes. Put away for the year, he resumed behind Auguste Rodin (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) once again when fourth in the June 19 G1 Prince of Wales's Stakes at Royal Ascot.

HBLB'S PAUL DARLING OBE KC DIES AT 64

Horserace Betting Levy Board chairman Paul Darling, OBE, KC, died on Friday. He was 64.

Darling chaired the HBLB during the Covid-19 pandemic and ably met the associated challenges, as British racing resumed. A King's Counsul who specialised in commercial and construction law, he also acted as treasurer of the Middle Temple at the time of his passing.

The HBLB released a statement that read, "The board members and staff of the Horserace Betting Levy Board are devastated to learn of the sudden death of our chairman, Paul Darling.

"Paul was a hugely respected and popular colleague and friend. He was devoted to the Levy Board, combining great ability with extraordinary enthusiasm, energy and a sense of fun.

"He was initially a Levy Board member from 2008 to 2014. This, with his past membership of the Tote Board and chairing of the Association of British Bookmakers and the Sports Grounds Safety Authority, contributed to his recognition with an OBE in 2015 for services to safety at sports grounds and to horseracing. He began his chairmanship of the Levy Board in April 2020 in the midst of the Covid-19 outbreak and guided the organisation through the challenges of that period.

"His passing will leave a gap in the lives of everyone at the Levy Board. We will miss him deeply but will remember his love of racing and all that he did for the Levy Board and for the sport over many years. Our thoughts are with his family and in particular his wife Camilla."


