CITADEL LINE THRIVING FOR SMALL BREEDER WITH DEEP ROOTS

Depending on the era one first became immersed in racing, there are certain sets of colours that have particular resonance. For many, the brown and white hoops, white cap, carried by the late Gerry Oldham's horses, many of them homebred by his Citadel Stud, will be favourites. Over the years they have been worn by jockeys aboard such special horses as the brilliant stayer Sagaro (Ire) – who has the rare honour of having a race named after him at Ascot - and 2,000 Guineas victor Zino (GB), trained like Sagaro by Francois Boutin, as well as the Harry Wragg-trained Irish Derby-winning brothers Talgo (Ire) and Fidalgo (Ire).

The names of Oldham's colts always ended in an O, while his fillies ended in A. That theme, and those silks, have been continued by the owner-breeder's son James, with the distinctive hoops having most recently been carried to glory for him aboard Asinara (GB) (Harry Angel (Ire)) at Ffos Las. The three-year-old is the seventh generation of her family to have raced for the Oldhams.

"My father was always one for loyalty and sticking with things," says James Oldham. "He started out in the late forties, so it was a slightly different era back then, but obviously he had stints in the UK before mainly focusing on racing in France. Actually, the colours disappeared in the UK for quite a long time." Cont. p3

James Downey's stakes-placed Halfway Line (GB) (Zoffany {Ire}) took three tries, but came away with his first American win at Del Mar for trainer Phil D'Amato in late July (video).

Bred by Juddmonte Farms, the 4-year-old gelding won thrice and placed in the Listed Prix Matchem in France for Francis-Henri Graffard in the storied pink-and-green silks, and changed hands for 320,000gns at the Tattersalls Autumn Horses-in-Training Sale in 2023. Cont. p4

The dispersal of the Citadel Stud, consigned by Gerry Oldham's longstanding friend and manager Peter Kavanagh's Kildaragh Stud, took place a little over a decade ago. A number of graduates have gone on to do well for other breeders, including Bocca Baciata (Ire) (Big Bad Bob {Ire}), from Asinara's family, who became a Group 2 winner for the Niarchos family's Flaxman Stables.

"We had a big dispersal sale on my father's death because it was too much to manage for me at the time," Oldham says. "But I was very keen to hold on to one, which I raced briefly. That was the dam of Asinara and I got lucky. She got to Group 3 level before sadly she had to retire, but it was just important for me to keep something on.

"Now I'm doing it in a much, much smaller way than he ever was, but I love it, and I will never be anything other than small. My aim is to have three mares at any one time and leave it at that. At the moment I've just got the one but we'll see where we get to."

That one is Kalsa (Ire), a Whipper half-sister to Bocca Baciata and full-sister to fellow Group 3 winner Topeka (Ire), who also ran third behind Beauty Parlour (GB) in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and was sold to Japan's Eishin Stables from the 2013 dispersal. Now 13, Kalsa, winner of the G3 Prix Edmond Blanc

when trained by Robert Collet, is a permanent boarder at Watership Down Stud and has a Sea The Stars (Ire) colt heading to Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale.

"I started off by going to not particularly established stallions and yet we produced a few winners," Oldham notes. Kalsa has so far bred three winners from her first four foals, including the four-time winner Tamarama (GB) (Muhaarar {GB}).

"No superstars yet, but on the back of that and a few conversations with Simon Marsh and with my father-in-law, who until his retirement was deeply involved in racing and has helped me along the way, we've actually gone to my dream stallion. Sea The Stars was the best horse I've ever seen live, and it was the best Arc I've ever seen."

Oldham's wife Katrina is the daughter of Michael Goodbody, the former president of the Thoroughbred Breeders' Association who managed Sheikh Maktoum Al Maktoum's Gainsborough Stud for 25 years.

"We were all pretty much hooked on racing," he recalls.
"That's how my father holidayed a lot of the time. Every August we used to decamp to Deauville, which was one of his loves, and that's all we did for two to three weeks every single year. I kept a very keen interest the whole way. And obviously with Peter Kavanagh and Brendan Hayes in Ireland, where the mares were, I got more involved in the latter part of his life, but then work called, really, so it couldn't be my main focus." He added, "But I actually married into a family which had been very involved in racing as well.

"So I've got it from all sides. Michael's been great to me over the years and we're extremely tight."

To date, Oldham has raced only homebred fillies. "I haven't held on to any colts so far, but when I do they will end with an O. It came from my father's initials of GAO. That's how it all started out and we're continuing in that tradition," he says.

"Elsewhere, I've got a little racing syndicate of a few friends but really I just want to try and breed something where we can get a bit of black type. I don't think Asinara will ever be a superstar, but [her trainer] Charlie Hills likes her and it would be lovely to try and pick up some black type with her.

"Tamarama we sold to Andrew Rosen and she was reasonably well rated in the end and went on to race in America. The dream of having my three mares would actually be to have three homebreds rather than buying them. So we'll see."

Based in Hampshire in the south of England, Oldham has so far resisted in following his father's lead in racing horses in France.

"I would love to, and commercially it obviously makes a bit more sense," he admits. "But France is just that much trickier to get to when you've got to fit it in with other things, although Charlie has sent me all around the country with Asinara. I've been to all sorts of places. But in practice I do like being able to see them race. I absolutely love it."

A son of the G3 Prix Imprudence second Midweek (GB) (Motivator {GB}), Halfway Line is a half-brother to the winning 3-year-old filly Mercury Day (Ire) (Time Test {GB}), the juvenile filly Midweek Break (GB) (New Bay {GB}) and a yearling filly by Bated Breath (GB). His extended family features the Group 1 winner Midday (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), GI Arlington Million hero Set Piece (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and G1 Oaks heroine Reams Of Verse (Nureyev) among others.

The late Zoffany has been represented by 29 winners out of 59 runners (49%) in the U.S. His six stakes winners there include GII Hollywood Turf Cup hero Oscar Dominguez (Ire), and Grade III winners Zofelle (Ire), Paris Secret (Ire), and Zoffarelli (Ire).

City Exile Prevails At Del Mar

City Exile (GB) (Cityscape {GB}) won for owners CYBT, Saul Gevertz, Michael Nentwig and Jeremy Peskoff at Del Mar (video). Trained by Phil D'Amato, the gelding was bred by Carson Francis and partners.

A 28,000gns Tattersalls Somerville yearling, the bay was winless in seven starts in Ireland for MRC International and David Marnane. After he was purchased by these connections, he won a Santa Anita maiden in January. Cont. p6

His dam, the seven-time winner Curious Fox (GB) (Bertolini), has a trio of fillies yet to race born in 2022, 2023, and 2024, by Time Test (GB), Ardad (Ire) and Dream Ahead, respectively. City Exile is kin to Group 1 winner Top Guest (Ire) (Be My Guest).

The strike rate for Cityscape's runners in North America stands at 75%, as he has three winners from four runners. The gradedwinning pair of Chili Flag (Fr)--the GI Just a Game Stakes heroine--and Avenue De France (Fr) are his best representatives in that locale.

Bated Breath Filly On Top At Del Mar

Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners' Hannah Buckle (Ire) (Bated Breath (GB) closed to take a Del Mar contest for Leonard Powell in early August (video). Bred by Irish Emerald Stud, the chestnut was making her fourth start.

From two starts at Leopardstown, the filly was third for trainer Barry Fitzgerald and owner David Granville before joining her current connections. The eighth foal out of Listed Garnet Stakes second Thoughtless Moment (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}), Hannah Buckle is her dam's seventh winner. Stakes winner Dancing Slippers (Nijinsky), the third dam of the winner, is also the ancestress of Zoftig (Cozzene) and her daughters Zo Impressive (Hard Spun) and Zaftig (Gone West), all three Grade I winners.

Juddmonte's Bated Breath boasts a strike rate of 69%, with 22 of his 32 North American runners finding the winner's circle. His 11 stakes winners include four at the graded level, among them GI Ballston Spa Stakes heroine Viadera (GB).

Repeat Winners

McKulick (GB) (Frankel {GB}) won the GII Glens Falls Stakes at Saratoga on Thursday evening (video). The Klaravich Stables' runner and Chad Brown trainee, a Grade I winner in 2022, is a regular on Making Waves.

The GII Saratoga Oaks Invitational Stakes went to Cinderella's Dream (GB) (Shamardal) at Saratoga on Aug. 2 (video). The Godolphin homebred had captured the GI Belmont Oaks Invitational Stakes earlier this year for trainer Charlie Appleby.

Godolphin's Silver Knott (GB) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) added his third Grade II in succession, when swooping in Saratoga's Bowling Green Stakes for trainer Charlie Appleby (video). The Breeders' Cup runner-up won his first U.S. stakes in the GII Elkhorn Stakes at Keeneland in April.

Denford Stud's Eastern Empress (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), a winner at Monmouth in June, added another tally to her ledger, this time at Colonial Downs in Virginia (video).

GROUP 1 WINNER ANMAAT EYES ROSE OF LANCASTER STAKES

Shadwell's Group 1 winner **Anmaat (Ire)** (Awtaad {Ire}) is aiming to make his long-awaited return to the races in the G3 Rose of Lancaster Stakes at Haydock on Aug. 10, according to trainer Owen Burrows.

The 6-year-old gelding has been out of action with a foot issue since winning the G1 Prix d'Ispahan at ParisLongchamp in May of 2023. A multiple group winner, Anmaat was successful in the 2022 edition of the Rose of Lancaster.

"All being well, he's going to run, we've had this in mind for him for a bit now, so fingers crossed we don't have any last-minute hiccups. It will be nice to get him back," said Burrows.

He added, "His form has really worked out. He worked the Saturday before last year's Eclipse and worked the best I've seen him work.

"Obviously, he was up against Paddington (GB) and Emily Upjohn (GB), so it wasn't as if I was thinking we were going there and definitely winning, but I thought he'd run a big race.

"He just picked up a very complex foot issue and obviously he's had plenty of time, so it will be so good to get him back.

"He wouldn't want the ground very quick. Not because he can't handle it, in France they called it good to soft but it was more like good to firm, it's more the fact with him being off so long. Looking at the forecast, there is a drop of rain due on Thursday, so good ground will be perfect, we'd have no qualms then."

ENTRIES REVEALED FOR THE FIVE GROUP RACES ON QIPCO BRITISH CHAMPIONS DAY

A total of 227 entries have been received for the five Group contests scheduled to take place on QIPCO British Champions Day at Ascot, it was announced on Tuesday. This is the largest number since 2018 and includes a record 56-strong entry for the G1 QIPCO Champion Stakes, the feature race on the card slated for Saturday, October 19.

The 56 horses entered for the Champion Stakes have won 37 Group 1 races between them, with **Auguste Rodin (Ire)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) boasting the most decorated CV as a six-time winner at the top level. Aidan O'Brien has also entered star three-year-olds **City Of Troy** and **Opera Singer**, both by **Justify**, while another leading Irish-trained contender is **White Birch (GB)** (Ulysses {Ire}), who defeated Auguste Rodin when winning the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at the Curragh in May.

Goliath (Ger) (Adlerflug {Ger}), a spectacular winner of the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Stakes, is one of six French-trained entries. The others include Mario Baratti's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains scorer Metropolitan (Fr) (Zarak {Fr}), while the pick of the home team could be William Haggas's Economics (GB) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}), a wide-margin winner of the G2 Dante Stakes at York when last seen in competitive action in May.

Metropolitan also holds an entry in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Stakes (Sponsored by QIPCO) in which his rivals could include Godolphin's G1 2,000 Guineas and G1 Sussex Stakes hero Notable Speech (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}). Fallen Angel (GB) (Too Darn Hot {GB}), who won May's G1 Irish 1,000 Guineas at the Curragh, is another Classic winner in contention, but battle-hardened older horses such as Roger Varian's G1 Queen Anne Stakes victor Charyn (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) should ensure that the three-year-olds don't have things all their own way.

Opera Singer is one of 10 entries for Ballydoyle in the G1 QIPCO British Champions Filles & Mares Stakes, while last year's runner-up, **Bluestocking (GB)** (Camelot {GB}), could attempt to go one place better, having found only Goliath too strong when contesting the King George on her most recent start. 2022 winner **Emily Upjohn (GB)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}) is another notable entry, despite disappointing in the G1 Nassau Stakes won by Opera Singer at Goodwood last time.

The contenders for the G1 QIPCO Champions Sprint Stakes feature a number of horses who have already tasted success at the top level in 2024, including Lockinge Stakes winner Audience (GB) (Iffraaj {GB}), Commonwealth Cup hero Inisherin (GB) (Shamardal) and July Cup scorer Mill Stream (Ire) (Gleneagles {Ire}).

In the G2 QIPCO British Champions Long Distance Cup, **Kyprios** (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) can be expected to take star billing if allowed to take his chance, having returned to the top of the staying tree this year with his back-to-back Group 1 victories in the Gold Cup and Goodwood Cup. Royal Ascot runner-up **Trawlerman** (Ire) (Golden Horn {GB}), who beat Kyprios by a neck when winning this race in 2023, could be in opposition once again, along with three-time winner **Trueshan** (Fr) (Planteur {Ire}) and last year's Gold Cup victor **Courage Mon Ami** (GB) (Frankel {GB}).

The second entry stage for the Group races on QIPCO British Champions Day is on Tuesday, October 1. The supplementary stage is on Monday, October 14.

The Newmarket contest, set for Saturday, Oct. 5, also features Nassau fourth Elmalka (GB) (Kingman {GB}), a winner of the G1 1000 Guineas for trainer Roger Varian. The Aidan O'Brientrained filly is one of several in the race for the Coolmore partners, who also run G1 Fillies' Mile heroine Ylang Ylang (GB) (Frankel {GB}), G1 Irish Oaks runner-up Content (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and maiden winner Wingspan (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}).

The G1 Falmouth Stakes one-three Porta Fortuna (Ire) (Caravaggio) and A Lilac Rolla (Ire) (Harry Angel {Ire}) have been entered, while John and Thady Gosden have six entered, including Group 1 winners Nashwa (GB) (Frankel {GB}) and Inspiral (GB) (Frankel {GB}). Of the two French-trained runners, the Wertheimer brothers' Kelina (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) is aiming to bounce back to the form that saw her win the 2023 G1 Prix de la Foret.

LINK BETWEEN CHROMOSOMAL ERRORS AND PREGNANCY LOSS IN MARES REVEALED IN NEW STUDY

Chromosomal errors are a common cause of pregnancy loss in mares, researchers from the Royal Veterinary College (RVG), as part of a team from Cornell University, have discovered in a new study.

In humans, chromosomal errors are a common cause of miscarriage, accounting for up to 82% of pregnancy loss. Due to the similarities between human and horse chromosomal

structures and other pregnancy characteristics, this research supports the use of horses as a novel model organism to study miscarriage in women. The findings of this study mean it is possible to now account for potential causes in 60-70% of equine early pregnancy loss--previously this figure was only around 20-30%.

The study investigated the prevalence of aberrations in chromosomes in 256 cases of pregnancy loss--collected from 244 mares between 2013 and 2023--finding that triploidy (three haploid sets of chromosomes), was the most common aberration (42%). Other abnormalities identified included trisomy--the presence of one extra whole chromosome--and monosomy--the loss of one whole chromosome, in almost 12% of pregnancies.

The team behind the study was overseen by Dr Amanda de Mestre, from Cornell's Baker Institute for Animal Health and included the RVC's Dr Jessica Lawson as well as other researchers from Texas A&M University and University of California Davis. Other lead authors included Dr Shebl Salem, a postdoctoral fellow at Cornell and Mr Don Miller, laboratory manager of the Cornell Equine Pregnancy Laboratory.

Dr. Jessica Lawson, Research Fellow at the Royal Veterinary College, said, "In addition to the significant findings in the early stages of the equine pregnancy we, for the first time, have identified sub-chromosomal aberrations in an aborted fetus and a stillborn foal. These aberrations likely constitute a rare but important cause of later term pregnancy loss, and we look forward to continuing to investigate the clinical significance of these genomic changes."

SARATOGA SALE A RECORD SMASHER; \$2.4-MILLION INTO MISCHIEF TOPS DAY 2



Session-topping Hip 183 | Fasig-Tipton

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY - The Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale, which opened Monday with figures on pace for a third year of records, concluded Tuesday with an electric session which demolished the sale's previous high for gross, average, and median. At the close of business Tuesday, 154 yearlings sold for \$82,160,000-highest ever in the auction's 103-year history, surpassing the previous record of \$75,055,000 set last year. The average of \$533,506 also improved on the 2023 record figure of \$487,370, while the median of \$425,000 bettered the previous mark of \$375,000 reached in both 2022 and 2023.

"You start off tonight with the [Complexity] share and that was really good," Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. said Tuesday night. "But we almost went back-to-back with million-dollar horses with the first two horses to go through the ring. And that momentum carried throughout because of the quality of horses. The success of the sale is completely dependent on the quality of the horses that our consignors give us the opportunity to sell. We felt very confident that the quality of horses in this catalogue was the best we ever had. I think that the buyers proved us right."

Browning continued, "It's a rewarding and fulfilling situation where there is a tremendous level of confidence in the marketplace. And there is a tremendous level of confidence in Saratoga. It's a magical place. It's unbelievable racing. Unbelievable community support. It's a great feeling."

Tuesday's session of the

auction opened with the sale of a share in freshman sire Complexity, purchased for \$510,000 by the Heider family and the action only escalated from there, with Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm purchasing the day's first million-

dollar yearling just two hips into the session. Bloodstock agent Marette Farrell, on behalf of Speedway Stable, made the day's highest bid when going to \$2.4 million for a son of Into Mischief.

Through the two-day sale, 12 horses sold for seven figures, up from 10 in 2023. The 12 million-dollar yearlings were purchased by nine unique buyers. While 52 yearlings sold for \$500,000 or more in 2023, 70 reached that mark this year.

"What it really shows you is the depth of the quality of the horses that were here on these sales grounds," Browning said of the strength of the market during the two-day auction. "And I think the buyers responded. It's not because the buyers decided they

were going to pay a lot of money for them. The buyers decided they were really good horses. There was really competitive bidding and it reflected the quality of horses on the grounds."

Speedway Gets a 'King'

Bloodstock agent Marette Farrell handled bidding alongside Zoe Cadman out back, while on the phone with her clients.


"We absolutely loved this colt," Farrell said. "I felt he commanded the room, as they say. He was the king. He is by Into Mischief, who we all know is an amazing stallion. He is from very good breeders, very good consignors and was raised at an amazing farm in Lane's End, with very good land."

Consigned by Lane's End, the yearling was bred by Pam Wygod and her late husband Marty, who passed away this spring.

"We would love to honor Marty Wygod and have bought a really good horse because he was such a big supporter of our Thoroughbred business and was so successful," Farrell said. "And I cannot thank Peter and K.C. enough. I am still shaking because I loved this horse, but I really had hoped we wouldn't have to go to this amount of money. And they knew that we loved the horse. So I hope he's a lucky horse. I hope he's a good horse. They deserve this."

Of the colt's final price tag, Farrell admitted, "We were on our absolute last bid a couple of times. Zoe gave me the elbow to go on. We are thrilled we got him, but hate that we had to pay that kind of money. He is a stallion in the making and I really think he's a fabulous horse."

The bay colt is out of stakes-placed Sweet Sting (Awesome Again), who is a daughter of champion Perfect Sting (Red Ransom). The mare is a half-sister to graded winner Smart Sting (Smart Strike). *Cont.*

Wygods Rewarded With \$2.4M Into Mischief Colt

Prominent horse owner and breeder Marty Wygod passed away a week after a Wygod homebred, Resilience (Into Mischief), punched his ticket to the Kentucky Derby with a victory in the GII Wood Memorial. While the colt would finish sixth in the Run for the Roses, the Wygod family would find themselves in front on Day 2 of Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga Sale when another colt they bred (Hip 183), also by Into Mischief, realized \$2.4 million from Speedway Stable. The colt was consigned by Lane's End.

"He was a rockstar foal at the home," said Emily Bushnell, the daughter of the late entrepreneur and philanthropist who also co-owns Resilience. "He came up [to Saratoga] and was very professional and did everything right every step of the way. We couldn't ask for anything more."

Seated in the back row of the pavilion, Bushnell erupted with emotion as well wishers descended on her moments after the yearling was knocked as the session's leading price.

"This is really special," said Bushnell. "He was very busy and had a lot of looks every day. We were just hoping people really liked him when he came out into the ring. We're so happy that so many people liked him as well."

Out of SP Sweet Sting (Awesome Again), the Mar. 28 foal is a grandson of champion grass mare Perfect Sting (Red Ransom).

"We've had the family for a little bit. We bought [Sweet Sting] during COVID when we were all house bound," Bushnell recalled. "She's been a part of our broodmare band since then. We also have a 2-year-old that we love that is a full-brother [named Reverse Merger] and hopefully this one will be just as nice for his new owners."

While a nifty score for the Wygods by any measure, Tuesday's Into Mischief colt was a long way off from the record sale price by a Wygod-bred horse. The mark was registered by GSW Jalil (Storm Cat--Tranquility Lake) and who brought a staggering \$9.7 at the Keeneland September Sale in 2005.--@CbossTDN

Coolmore, Brant Strike for \$1.9M Gun Runner

This past May, Sierra Leone (Gun Runner) came within a nose of taking the GI Kentucky Derby for a partnership including Coolmore and Peter Brant. The partners were back in action Tuesday evening to secure Hip 146, also by the Three Chimneys stallion, with the hope the chestnut colt might find his way into the starting gate the First Saturday in May in 2026.


With the volleys coming fast and hard from the main pavilion and from the back ring, where the Coolmore team assumed its regular position of attack, the bidding finally ended with M.V. Magnier locking it down with a \$1.9-million bid.

"For us it's all about the Classic horse," said Magnier. "It's all about the Epsom Derby and Kentucky Derby. That's what these guys really want to achieve."

In reference to this season's heartbreaking Derby miss, Magnier explained, "When Sierra Leone got beat in the Kentucky Derby, Derrick Smith decided that's all he wants, to win it." *Cont.*

In addition to the Coolmore partners and Brant, Sierra Leone was also campaigned by Westerberg and Rocket Ship Racing and trained by Chad Brown.

The colt won the GII Risen Star Stakes and GI Toyota Blue Grass Stakes earlier in the spring prior to his Derby second. He subsequently finished third in the GI Belmont Stakes and most recently was runner-up in the GII Jim Dandy Stakes at Saratoga.

"Gun Runner is a very good stallion. We've been very fortunate with that," Magnier added. "He was very popular [at the Saratoga Sale] last year. Everyone really liked the horse, so we were hoping to get him."

Brown, who was standing next to the Coolmore team during the bidding process, is likely to train the new acquisition.

"That's the plan at the moment," Magnier said. "We'll bring him to Ashford and figure that out."

White Birch and Coolmore also secured a colt by Into Mischief out of Distorted Music (Distorted Humor) (Hip 300 for \$1 million) on Day 1.

The colt was consigned by Lane's End on behalf of his breeder, Jane Lyon's Summer Wind Equine.

Out of the unraced Secret Sigh (Tapit), the Feb. 27 foal is a grandson of dual graded stakes winner India. The daughter of Hennessy is responsible for G1 Yasuda Kinen and G1 February Stakes scorer Mozu Ascot (Frankel {GB}) in addition to SW Kareena (Medaglia d'Oro). The family also represents the family of Grade I winners To Honor and Serve and Angela Renee.

"For somebody like Jane Lyon who has such a wonderful operation it is like a dream," said Lane's End's Allaire Ryan. "It's what every commercial breeder looks for. So it's nice to see everything come full circle and be rewarded." *Cont.*



Commenting on the colt's appeal prior to last night's sale, she explained, "We knew he would sell really well and was received by the top-end users of the market, so we knew we had a top product to offer. But you can't always know how the seller and the buyer will fare in a situation like this."

Secret Sigh's 2021 colt by Uncle Mo realized \$1.5 million at this venue in 2022 and the mare produced a colt by Into Mischief this season.

"Honestly he surpassed our expectations," said Ryan of the session topper's final price. "Obviously, we had a top quality horse here but it's impossible to predict what they will actually bring. It just comes down to how somebody values them in their own program and if they're willing to go to the end stakes for it."

During the Day 2 session, Lane's End also sold a colt by Into Mischief (Hip 183) on behalf of Pamela Wygod and the Wygod Family Trust for \$2.4 million.

"It's been a super healthy market for us," said Ryan. "We try to bring quality individuals here, across the spectrum. We bring the horses that show themselves well and are good representations for the breeders and for us and we're rewarded for it."

She concluded, "There is great traffic on the sales grounds. We give a lot of credit to Fasig-Tipton for the recruitment here. I think we've been the busiest we've ever been at Saratoga. That has to be a reflection of the sale company's efforts, too. If you bring quality at any point in the spectrum, you will be rewarded for it."--@CbossTDN

Pope on the Board with Gun Runner Filly

Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm made its first--and only-purchase of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale early in Tuesday's second session of the boutique auction, going to \$1.5 million to acquire a daughter of Gun Runner (hip 123). The filly is out of multiple Grade I winner Pure Clan (Pure Prize) and is a half-sister to Grade I placed Princesa Carolina (Tapit). *Cont.*

She was bred by Three Chimneys Farm and was one of three seven-figure yearlings consigned to the Saratoga sale by Antony Beck's Gainesway.

"Obviously, her mom was a great race mare and we are hoping she will inherit those genes," Pope said after signing the ticket on the yearling. "It's a young family with some other half-sisters in there that might really go on and produce and build the pedigree as she goes."

Pope was represented this spring by GI Central Bank Ashland Stakes winner Leslie's Rose (Into Mischief), a \$1.15-million Keeneland September purchase. The sophomore was second in the GI DK Horse Acorn Stakes.

Pope is hoping her newest seven-figure yearling purchase will follow a similar trajectory.

"She is gorgeous," Pope said of the yearling. "She's big and strong. She is very sensible from what we could see. We are just hoping for another GI Kentucky Oaks and an Ashland."

Pope admitted she had plenty of competition in bidding during Monday's first session of the auction.

"It's extremely difficult," she said. "We were outbid quite a bit yesterday, but you have to value them and stick to your guns. And some of them we get and a lot of them we don't."

Whisper Hill was on the other side of the ledger later in the evening, selling a colt by Into Mischief out of Unrivaled Belle (Unbridled's Song) (hip 199) for \$700,000 to Resolute Bloodstock. @JessMartiniTDN

Stewart's Saratoga Buying Spree Continues

John Stewart's Resolute Bloodstock, which purchased five yearlings during Monday's first session of the auction, was quick to get back into the action at Fasig-Tipton Tuesday evening, going to \$1.2 million to acquire a filly by Ghostzapper (hip 147).



The Resolute broodmare band already includes a daughter of Ghostzapper in champion Goodnight Olive, who was purchased by the operation for \$6 million at last year's Fasig-Tipton November sale. Stewart admitted his newest yearling reminded him of the two-time GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint winner.

"She reminds me of Olive," Stewart said. "We got Goodnight Olive in foal with a Not This Time colt, which is really exciting after what Not This Time has done here. We are trying to start to build families. We are starting to concentrate around families and we really like Ghostzapper and how he matches up with some of our other breeding program. She fits right into that. And then from a racing standpoint, we think there is some speed in that horse and has a good physical. We've already got some trainers lined up for her. So we are pretty excited."

The filly, consigned by Gainesway, is out of Seeking the Blue (Arch) and is a half-sister to multiple graded-placed Janis Joplin (California Chrome) and multiple stakes-placed Vino Rouge (Vino Rosso). She was bred by Payson Stud.

Of his first foray at the Saratoga sale, Stewart said, "This has been fantastic. I've been up here a couple of times for the races. My first time here, the first race, we won the GI New York Stakes with Didia. Saratoga is always going to be kind of special because it was our first Grade I. The people are really nice, the facilities are great and it's a great atmosphere.

"Everyone from all over the world is here and it's exciting to see all of these top-quality horses. We experienced it in Australia with the Inglis sale and now to experience it here has been a lot of fun."

At the close of the two-day auction, Resolute Bloodstock had purchased 11 yearlings for \$9,085,000. Three of the group were seven-figure purchases, led by a colt by Gun Runner sold Monday for \$1.7 million. @JessMartiniTDN

Clay's Grandview Equine purchased a colt by Twirling Candy (hip 49) for \$500,000 during Monday's first session of the auction.

"I bought a couple, but I missed several," Clay said. "It's very difficult to buy. Everybody is here and you just feel lucky to come away with one. I have never seen so many people at the sale. It's amazing how many people are here. So given that, I'm not that surprised. But it's difficult to buy."



Heider Pays \$510,000 For Share In Leading Freshman Sire Complexity

A share in Airdrie Stud's hugely successful first-crop sire Complexity (Maclean's Music) was the first lot on offer during Tuesday's second session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Selected Yearling Sale, and was hammered down to David Lanigan, bidding on behalf of Scott Heider, for \$510,000. Representing a 2.5% interest, the share is not subject to syndicate clearance, according to a pre-sale announcement from Fasig-Tipton's Grant Williamson before the bidding began.

"We bought a Nyquist filly off Airdrie last year, so there is a connection to the family and the farm," Lanigan said. "The horse is off to a very good start to his career and Mr. Heider was very interested in him. We just decided to watch him go through and see what he would bring.

"I thought that [the price] was reasonable. If he continues to go on and if his fee is where we estimate it may be next year, this will be sensible enough."

The 8-year-old stallion, whose Charlatan half-brother was purchased by John Stewart's Resolute Bloodstock for \$1.5 million Monday evening, is already the sire of 13 individual winners, leaving him in a share of the top spot in that particular category with Vekoma. *Cont.*

Complexity is the leading freshman sire by progeny earnings and has already accounted for three black-type winners, including GIII Sanford Stakes hero Mo Plex, recent G2 Richmond Stakes victor Black Forza and Stewart's Mensa, who romped in the Victoria Stakes, giving the stallion stakes winners on dirt, turf and synthetic surfaces.

He is also the leading general sire of 2-year-olds with winners in five different jurisdictions, including Shin Forever, who broke his maiden impressively at first asking at Niigata in Japan on Aug. 3.

ARQANA FOR AMERICANS: DIVERSITY, SIRE POWER, AND SOME OF THE BEST EUROPE HAS TO OFFER IN JUST 325 HIPS

Next week, when the international sales scene shifts to France for the Arqana August Yearling Sale, a good chunk of American agents, owners, and trainers will head on over for the party. No one ever needs an excuse to go to Deauville, but if you're looking to justify your trip to your principals or partners, look no further. We've got you covered.

The selected sessions of the Arqana sale run from the 16th to the 18th, Friday to Sunday, and are followed by the V2 sale on Monday.

"This is the sale that, pound for pound, produces the most Group 1 winners in the world," said Michel Zerolo, whose Haras des Capucines will have the largest yearling consignment in the first three select days of the sale--45--and another 17 in the V2.

Only three American sires--Kitten's Joy, Justify, and Maximum Security--are represented at the sale, but Americans don't come to Arqana to buy what they could buy at home, says Freddy Powell, Arqana's CEO, who sums up the appeal of the sale succinctly. *Cont.*

"We have the best sires in Europe represented at the sale," he said. "It's a really good way to have a feel for what's going on in Europe. As well as having a good time, in Deauville you will see-in quite a short time without too much hard looking at 600-700 horses--a very good representation of what is done the best in Europe. You will quickly see a very good diversity of stallions, a way of breeding, and pedigrees. If anyone wants an introduction to European racing, it is a wonderful one in Deauville."

In just the past few years, the sale has produced the French Derby and Arc winner Ace Impact (Ire), the French Derby winner Look de Vega (Fr), the French 2000 Guineas winner Metropolitan (Fr). Two 2023 graduates won races at Royal Ascot this year--Rashabar (Ire), who won the G2 Coventry Stakes, and Highbury (Fr), the winner of the G2 Queen's Vase.

"Obviously, the success of the sale is a very good reason to come and buy horses in Deauville," Powell stressed, "but when you go to some sales in

Europe at the end of the year, you have to look at a lot of horses to see what's best and the diversity of product is not as wide as it is in Deauville for only 325 horses catalogued."

Young sires have been making headlines in Europe lately, Powell said, and most of the exciting young sires will be on offer next week.

"In Europe in general we have a very good generation of new sires coming out, with sires like Blue Point (Ire) (seven on offer), and Too Darn Hot (GB) (six)," whose Oversubscribed (GB) was second in the GIII Lake George at Saratoga last week. "Zarak (Fr) (16 in the sale) is doing well, and we're pretty happy with the Zaraks we have."

Powell mentioned three sires with first 2-year-olds that he said Americans would find interesting.

"Some stallions to look at would be Hello Youmzain (Fr), a strong, powerful, well-balanced type of horse who throws horses with big hips. They are good models. Sottsass (Fr) had two very good runners here in France for Peter Brant two weeks ago--a winner and a second, both very impressive. And don't forget that his sister, Sistercharlie, won five Group 1s in the U.S. He produces those well-balanced horses who can adapt. I'm getting quite excited about that sire. And then there are a couple of Kamekos. He's a son of Kitten's Joy who is off to a

good start at stud, and I think people will be interested in seeing them."

Among first-crop yearling sires, there is St Mark's Basilica (Fr), who Powell said was throwing well-balanced yearlings, and Victor Ludorum (GB). "He's by Shamardal, who has always worked on both sides of the Atlantic." Among established sires, there are 30 Wootton Bassetts (GB), "who is working everywhere," he said, 22 yearlings by perennial leading French sire Siyouni (Fr), and five from leading European sire Dubawi

(GB), including the half-brother to last year's sales topper.

Haras des Capucines offers three yearlings by American sires this year, a filly by Maximum Security and two fillies by Justify. The latter two were purchased as weanlings for \$200,000 apiece at the Keeneland November sale.

Lot 200, says Zerolo, "is out of a good Argentinian filly, Lucevan, who has already produced a good grass filly by Street Sense," he says, referring to GII Gulfstream Park Oaks winner Champagne Anyone.

"Here," says Zerolo, "we have the Mr. Prospector cross again, and she's a nice, big, strong filly and a good mover."

Lot 294 is a Justify filly out of San Saria (Ire). "I have an affinity for that pedigree because we used to own the second dam, San Sicharia (Ire), who became a nice filly, a Grade III winner, and this filly is lovely, with a old Lagardere pedigree that has been revived. If I recall, Vadsa (the fifth dam) and Vadsa Honor came out of the Newstead Farm dispersal in 1985."

"They are pretty similar," said Zerolo of the two Justify fillies. "(Lot 294) has a little more white, two white socks, a very attractive head. She's a nice, attractive chestnut filly with an attractive walk.

"I'm not an expert on Justify, but to me they look like what Justifys should look like," Zerolo continued. "Having said that, City of Troy and the Nassau winner, Opera Singer, are light bays. These two are chestnuts--big, strong, athletic American-looking horses. The success of Justify is amazing, which is why he stands for what he does. The appeal is going to be across the board. The Europeans, Americans, Japanese and Australians will be interested in them."

Not that Americans need to cross the pond to buy Justifys, he said. "I would imagine Americans coming to Europe are looking to buy European horses. Otherwise, what's the point?"

And to that end, he said, "the sire that I really, really like here this year is St Mark's Basilica. They remind me--and only the old guys like me will remember this--of the good Nureyevs, five generations back. He is producing lovely, lovely fillies. I'm quite taken by what I've seen. A lot of class."

Arqana charters a plane every year on the Wednesday after the Saratoga sale, flying from Albany straight to Deauville. "It's nearly full, so that's exciting," said Powell. "Every year, we've got more people showing interest, people who came the previous year and sent back good reports. Some who came on their own are now bringing friends."

The Saratoga Sale and the Arqana August sale pair back-toback events with great quality in a great environment. What's not to love?

"Deauville is a wonderful way to discover Europe," he said, "and we love showing the way. I'm pretty confident the French breeders and consignors have done a great job with their prep work because the horses we saw in the spring were quite exciting. There are a lot of good vibes and people are in good spirits."

Runner-up July 20 in a Saratoga maiden special weight, Helicity raced for the partnership of David Grund, Amanda Oster, and Sisterson after hammering for \$120,000 at OBS March. 
