BUCA CALLS ON GOFFS AND GORESBRIDGE TO ABANDON PLANS FOR NEW SALES

Uncertainty hangs over the breeze-up sector ahead of the first major yearling sale of the season at Arqana this week after the Breeze-Up Consignors Association [BUCA] instructed Goffs and Goresbridge not to go ahead as previously planned with its respective new sales in 2025.

Goffs chief Henry Beeby and Goresbridge boss Ed Donohoe revealed to TDN Europe back in May that they were planning to hold breeze-up sales in Ireland next year.

Both men explained that the decision had been taken after a number of consignors expressed views that there was demand for more than just the Tattersalls Ireland Breeze-Up Sale on the domestic circuit.

However, Grove Stud's Brendan Holland, who was voted in as the new chairman at BUCA's AGM a fortnight back, says there is only a finite number of horses that can pass through the breeze-up system every season and the addition of a new sale would be a backwards step for the industry.

THE ARQANA LOWDOWN: ECURIE DES MONCEAUX by Emma Berry


Twelve years the leading consignor at Arqana's August Sale, and usually in October, too, Ecurie des Monceaux will bring 39 yearlings on the short journey from its Normandy base to the sale paddocks in Deauville.

Regulars at Arqana cannot fail to be familiar with the Monceaux brand. Its draft occupies the courtyard alongside the Villa Pegase, giving the impression during the last few days of yearling inspection that one is temporarily entering a cloistered world with Monceaux founder Henri Bozo as president. One of the most entrepreneurial members of the French breeding community, Bozo has established a strong council of co-breeders as partners in the operation, many of whom have their own farms but have been happy to invest in the beau ideal of the commercial breeding world in France. 

BUCA Calls For No New Sales, cont. from p1

He explained, "There were 1,100 places offered to the main breeze-up sales in Europe this season and 960 turned up. Only 768 were sold and that follows on from the 760 that sold in 2023. The numbers that are being sold at the breeze-up sales is constant and the market is stable at that level. We can't see how there is room or demand to sell 100 more horses--or any more horses for that matter--and, until we get to a stage where the market expands, I think it is BUCA's responsibility to protect the marketplace that is already in place. We should not be saturating it."

Holland added, "We have spent the past 15 years promoting the breeze-ups as a source of quality. It took a long time to change people's perception of what a breeze-up horse is and what can be found at these sales. In that time, we've had champion two-year-olds, three-year-olds and champion stayers, so it is becoming an easier product to promote because of the success we have had on the track. But we need to protect that."

To that extent, BUCA provided a written mandate to Goresbridge and Goffs and stated "it was unanimously agreed" at the AGM that the number of horses offered at the main breeze-up sales in Europe should not exceed 1,000.

However, Donohoe has accused the association of misrepresenting some of its members and insists that the

mandate could not have been unanimous given he has fielded a number of calls from consignors stating that they would be supporting Goresbridge if the sales company re-enters the breeze-up market after a seven-year hiatus.

"A number of breeze-up consignors contacted me following that meeting to tell me that they didn't agree with the mandate and that they would be supporting our sale. I am not sure that the letter sent to me is representative of all BUCA members," Donohoe said.

He added, "I have replied to BUCA where I expressed my disappointment over the fact that no consignor contacted me to discuss the situation. Goresbridge is a family-run business and I don't see why BUCA feel that they can dictate how we run our business. The Tattersalls Ireland Breeze-Up Sale catered for 250 horses this year and--up until now--is the only breeze-up sale in Ireland.

"A large number of breeze-up consignors, particularly the smaller vendors, were unable to get their horses into this--or indeed any--sale. I intend to cater for this gap in the market and, as I said, I have had written and verbal correspondence from a number of BUCA members explaining that they would be supporting us next year and that they did not agree with the proposals that were raised at the meeting."

"Having said all of that, I am open to discussion with BUCA and am keen to come to some kind of an agreement as we fully intend on holding a breeze-up sale next year."

While the *TDN* understands that Goresbridge had been planning an earlier sale date next year, the idea behind the

Goffs Breeze-Up Sale at Naas racecourse was that it would be more reactive, in that it would be a small and select offering of later-maturing juveniles and some who had missed previous targets or failed to sell elsewhere.

Beeby revealed that, while he still harbours an ambition to stage a breeze-up sale in Ireland that would complement the company's breeze-up sale at

Doncaster, the Goffs chief executive said that he would be working closely with Holland and the rest of the BUCA committee members to find a resolution.

Regardless, no announcement as to whether Goffs would be staging a breeze-up sale in Ireland will be made until the Premier Yearling Sale at Doncaster later this month.

Beeby explained, "Goffs is in dialogue with BUCA and I plan to meet with Brendan over the next couple of weeks to have a chat. We're not going to make any definitive decisions now--I mean, the sale isn't happening until next June. Also, our AGM takes place after our Premier Yearling Sale, so that will be the

earliest that Goffs can announce whether the new sale will go ahead or not.

"BUCA has made some relevant points to us about the number of horses being catalogued next year. From a Goffs point of view, we have our established sale at Doncaster and have the opportunity to stage this new sale at Naas but we will obviously listen to our clients and will work collaboratively

with BUCA, as we always have done."

Asked how likely he felt it was for the new breeze-up sale to take place next year, Beeby said, "It will appear on our proposed sales dates for next year but, until it happens, it hasn't happened. The yearling sales will be a good time for us at Goffs to interact with breeze-up vendors." Cont.

"A number of people have called me and various views have been expressed. I'm told there was unanimity at the BUCA AGM but then there were people who didn't attend that meeting who have expressed contradictory views. Whether it was National Hunt stores or breeze-ups, everyone saw a tightening of the market and there is a concern that the appropriate measures are taken so that we minimise the impact of that. It's going to be up to sales companies and consignors--as ever--to work together on this."

When tasked with answering the same question as Beeby on whether he felt the BUCA mandate has thrown a spanner in the works with regards to plans for a new sale, Donohoe simply said, "I'd be taking short odds on our sale going ahead next year anyway. And that's from the horse's mouth."



While Platonic (GB) (Zafonic), a shrewd purchase from Fittocks Stud 20 years ago, developed a formidable foundation at Monceaux, with such luminaries as the Group 1 winners Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu (Ire)) and Magic Wind (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) among her descendants, more recently the Monceaux name has been kept in lights by Starlet's Sister (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), who died last November at the age of 14. In that relatively short life she made headlines as the dam of Arc winner Sottsass (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}) and seven-time Grade I winner Sistercharlie (Ire) (Myboycharlie {Ire}), while her offspring have topped this sale in 2020 (when run late as the Select Sale during Covid) and 2022, selling for €2.5m and €2.1m apiece to buyers from Bahrain and Japan.

Monceaux sold two of the four seven-figure lots at last year's sale, achieving the second- and third-top price for colts by Siyouni (Fr) and Dubawi (Ire), sold to Coolmore and Godolphin respectively. Cont.

The BHA therefore now has a significant opportunity to bring in a Chief Executive who understands deeply what it is to lead and implement long-term, sustainable, transformation inside an organisation – how to make it happen, how to embed it, the role of culture and perhaps, most importantly, how to pace it. The appointee will therefore be a proven senior leader, with experience in leading complex stakeholder environments, with the ability to influence external stakeholders, such as government, whilst representing the BHA in the consumer facing environment.

This individual will have an excellent track record delivering financial results, driving operational and workforce best practice and creating long-term value.

The international landscape in racing is driving huge commercial returns in the sport. This individual will need to bring experience in engaging with international markets to deepen the BHA's connections globally and represent Britain in the sport.

This year its draft includes four of the five Dubawi yearlings in the sale along with 10 by France's leading sire Siyouni, and a liberal sprinkling of youngsters by Wootton Bassett (GB), Frankel (GB), New Bay (GB) and Zarak (Fr) among others.

One sad absentee from Arqana this summer will be Lady Chryss O'Reilly, who died last August shortly after the sale had finished and was remembered on Sunday at the racecourse next door to Arqana where the Prix Minerve was run in her name. As well as running her own Haras de la Louvière operation, Lady O'Reilly had been a key partner in Monceaux from its early days.

Henri Bozo says: "I think all of us breeders are good at breeding and raising horses but we are not so good at predicting what the market will do, so we will see what happens this week.

"We have a strong draft consisting solely of yearlings from our mares and from our clients' mares who have been bred at the farm, so it is a joint effort between us and our partners. I think this year there is a good mix of yearlings from proven mares at the high end, and we have also been trying to invest in young mares and bring new blood to the farm, so there are a number of yearlings who are the first or second produce of young mares.

"We are lucky to have support from some very strong partners, and at the same time I am trying to increase the percentage that we own ourselves in the new mares. But the partnerships are very positive. It gives you extra input from different breeders.

"Lady O'Reilly was the beginning of the partnership policy that Monceaux had. We started investing in mares and yearlings and at the same time she was also investing and we had the same taste so we decided to go into business together. She was the ideal partner. **Cont.**

"We had a long talk with Patricia [Boutin, advisor to Lady O'Reilly] who came to see the stock here in the last few weeks and it will be very different without her. We have a great filly to sell out of Prudenzia from this special partnership. We always speak about Lady O'Reilly and remember her fondly, and I am very pleased to see that there is a race being run in her memory in Deauville.

"Our strategy is to keep things simple. I think it makes sense to sell horses that you know and that you've bred yourself. That was the first part of our strategy--to sell only homebred yearlings and not to consign for anyone else--and the second part was to keep things easy and understandable for people.

"I have a lot of respect for Tattersalls and Goffs but it was our choice in the beginning to have a clear signal to buyers and to clients that we offer all of our crop at the same place. Some will wait for October to give them more time, but all of them can be purchased in Deauville at Arqana and none of them is sold privately or elsewhere.

"We started Monceaux at the same time as Arqana started and there was a common dynamism. I thought it was nice to offer the result of teamwork on the local market, and thankfully it has managed to attract a wide audience. I am always very happy to go to buy a mare or a yearling at Tatts or Goffs, but we want to stick to that plan."

Draft highlights: Where to begin? Perhaps with Lot 178, the half-sister to G1 Grand Prix de Paris winner Feed The Flame (GB) (Kingman {GB}) from the first crop of St Mark's Basilica (Fr). But then we would have to mention Lot 270, another by the same young stallion and a half-sister to the Irish Oaks winner Chicquita and G1 McKinnon Stakes victrix Magic Wand, out of the aforementioned Prudenzia (Ire) Dansili {GB}). On Friday, Magic Wand's first foal Ecstatic (Jpn) (Lord Kanaloa {Jpn}) became a TDN Rising Star when winning easily at Tipperary.

"He was a hell of a racehorse," says Bozo of St Mark's Basilica, whose first yearlings will be put to the market test in Deauville. "He was very good at two and three, winning the French Derby, and with a strong pedigree by a stallion who has done us well. We think he has a good chance and we decided to give him a good chance with some proper mares. We are happy with the ones we have."

Along with the draft's four Dubawi yearlings is a colt by his son Too Darn Hot (GB). Offered as **Lot 306**, he is out of the dual Group 1 winner Simple Verse (Ire) (Duke Of Marmalade {Ire}) whose first foal, Queen Of The Pride (GB) (Roaring Lion), won the G2 Lancashire Oaks since the catalogue was published. **Cont.**

Lot 112 is a filly whose sire was also raised at Monceaux, Sottsass, and she is a half-sister to the G2 Prix de Royallieu winner The Juliet Rose (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}) and this year's G3 Classic Trial winner Arabian Crown (Fr) (Dubawi {Ire}).

"You can guess that we are delighted to see the promising debut of Sottsass's two-year-olds. They are good movers, they are not too heavy, and they are light on their feet," Bozo adds.

Claim to fame: In addition to the success of the aforementioned Sottsass, Sistercharlie, Chicquita, Magic Wand and Feed The Flame, Monceaux and its partners have also bred and raised the Group/Grade 1 winners Paddington (GB), Mangoustine (Fr), Angel Bleu (Fr), Sea La Rosa (Ire), Blowout (GB), Intellogent (Ire), National Defense (GB), Ectot (GB), Charm Spirit (Ire), Most Improved (Ire), and Ancient Wisdom (Fr).

Last word: "Our strategy is to try to offer yearlings by proven stallions. We do use a few unproven stallions but most of the yearlings we are offering, especially in August, are by the most proven stallions accessible."

'HE MADE ME CRY': VARIAN MOVED BY JACQUES LE MAROIS TRIUMPH FOR NURLAN BIZAKOV'S CHARYN by Tom Frary

While Inspiral (GB) (Frankel {GB}) was blowing her history bid at the start of Sunday's G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard Jacques le Marois at Deauville, Nurlan Bizakov's G1 Queen Anne Stakes hero Charyn (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}--Futoon {Ire}, by Kodiac {GB}) was getting ready to do his thing and wrap up another top-level triumph in contrastingly straightforward fashion.

After Cheveley Park Stud's mare had forfeited several lengths out of the gates, this was down to who would profit and the answer was the 9-10 favourite as he supplemented his Royal Ascot success under Silvestre De Sousa.

Positioned near the pace as usual, the grey took control passing the two-furlong marker and spread his wings for a three-length verdict over the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner Metropolitan (Fr) (Zarak {Fr}). Inspiral, whose profile becomes increasingly mercurial as her career progresses, was only a head further behind in third in what probably amounts to one of her most impressive performances given the distance she surrendered at the start.

Charyn's time dipped just under 1:34, which was testament to how tight the ground was riding on Sunday at a meeting that often offers going on the slow side. Since the start of the 1970s, only Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) and Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit (Ire) had managed that feat racing with less weight due to the sex allowance, so this was a notable performance regardless of Inspiral's free gift to her rivals.

Unsurprisingly, the winner's display brought Roger Varian to

shed tears of joy. "I don't know what else to say, he made me cry," he revealed. "He's such a beautiful horse. He was most impressive today in the way he put it to bed and he seems to be getting better and better. Some people forget he was a group 2 winner at two and now he's the finished article."

"It was a very comfortable watch--I just hope he stays sound as he's a super horse," he added. "You don't always know where you are with him, as he's very laid-back at home and carries a lot of condition. Most of the time I send him to the races I wonder if I've done enough with him. He has a great mind, he's very relaxed and he makes my job easy. Silvestre is striking up a good relationship with him and I'm delighted for Nurlan Bizakov and his family. They put so much into the game."

This was the second 'Win and You're in' prize for Charyn after Royal Ascot, but Varian doesn't have the Breeders' Cup Mile on the colt's agenda at present. "It's an option, but I'm not sure it's a route we'll go down," he stated. "We have a lot of ground to cover before then, but it's nice to be invited and it's nice to have it as an option at the end of the year. We'll have to see how he is after today's race, he's in the Moulin and he's in the QEII and we like the idea of Ascot on Champions Day--it's just whether we go to Longchamp on the way or not."

John Gosden said of Inspiral, "I don't think you can give horses of that class a six- or seven-length start." Cont.

"She's always been slow out of the gate, but today she was looking and decided to give them all plenty of lengths and you can't get away with that in a group 1 race. She's run a huge race from an impossible position and she didn't have a hard pace to run at. She's a great character, as was her mother, and she has shown that she's in very good form so let's hope she doesn't do it again next time."

Mario Baratti was delighted with the run of Metropolitan. "It was another great performance from the horse, doing so well against the best European milers as a 3-year-old," he said. "In the immediate aftermath, I felt that maybe now we should run him over further but after discussing it with Alexis [Pouchin] I'm not so convinced and neither is he. He is in the Moulin and the QEII, so we have time to make a decision."

Pedigree Notes

Charyn, whose 2-year-old full-sister Shinara (Ire) was a 850,000gns purchase by his owners at Tattersalls Book 1 in October, is the second foal out of Futoon with the first being his G2 Mill Reef S. and G3 Sirenia S.-winning full-brother Wings Of War (Ire).



Proving that the mile-and-a-half trip holds no fears, Al Riffa (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}--Love On My Mind {Ire}, by Galileo {Ire}) made his first start in the Masaaki Matsushima silks a resoundingly impressive one as he got back on the group 1-winning trail in Sunday's Grosser Preis von Berlin. Always happy in the box seat under Dylan Browne McMonagle, the Joseph O'Brien-trained Arc hopeful stayed on powerfully to take control 300 metres from the finish and stormed to a five-length success from Narrativo (Ger) (Adlerflug {Ger}), with Best Of Lips (Ire) (The Gurkha {Ire}) beaten another 4 1/2 lengths in third.

The win was Al Riffa's first at this level since the G1 Vincent O'Brien National Stakes at two and added ballast to the G1 Eclipse Stakes in which he had pushed City Of Troy (Justify) close last month. "It means a lot to get a winner on my first ride in Germany and he's such a special horse," the winning rider said. "He was my first group 1 winner as a 2-year-old and he had a little setback last year but has come back as good as ever. It's his first time over a mile and a half and he was very good--we always thought he was going to improve for the step up in trip."

Joseph O'Brien added, "It's been a wonderful day here today and Al Riffa put up a really good performance and we're really proud of him. Dylan gave the horse a fantastic ride and we've had a great day. He's had quite a busy season so far--e's raced in France, the UK, America and now also he's raced in Germany so I think he will have a little rest and probably then he will be prepared for the Prix de l'Arc."

Finding his true trip at Deauville on Sunday, the Joseph O'Brien-trained **Cowardofthecounty (Ire)** (Kodi Bear {Ire}--Hawaajib {Fr}, by Elusive City) turned around recent fortunes to gain a first black-type success in the opening seven-furlong G3 Prix Francois Boutin. Running below expectations when seventh in the G2 Coventry Stakes and G3 Anglesey Stakes having made such a big impression on debut when beating Whistlejacket (Ire) (No Nay Never) at The Curragh in April, the colt who represents

Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Stables, Tracy Farmer and John Oxley was again sluggish away from the stalls but quickly into racing rhythm under Ryan Moore.

Looming on the front end passing two out, the 7-1 shot stayed on strongly to score by 1 1/2 lengths from the 9-10 favourite **Houquetot (Ire)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}) in race-record time. "He was impressive the first time and ran well at Royal Ascot and at The Curragh last time in a race that has worked out well," Moore said. "The step up to seven suited and he feels like a good horse with a nice future."

Joseph O'Brien, who was in Berlin, was represented by Shane Crosse who said, "He's not a slow horse, but the extra furlong really helped him today and Ryan said he relished the seven furlongs. He's straight and is a fine, big colt so hopefully there are big days ahead of him."

NEW KENT COUNTY, VA -- After sending out the beaten favorites in both the GI FanDuel Fourstardave Handicap and GI Saratoga Derby Invitational Stakes at Saratoga, the operation's **Nations Pride (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) struck for chalk players hundreds of miles to the south as he quickened up beautifully in the stretch to take out Sunday's GI Arlington Million Stakes at Colonial Downs.

Scheduled first post for Sunday's big card was 1 p.m. ET, but satellite issues meant that the race did not jump until 1:52 p.m. A visit from Virginia Governor Glenn Youngkin that followed a parachuting demonstration and a airplane flyover further delayed the proceedings, so that when the six horses entered the Million gate around 8 p.m.--fully 80 minutes later than programmed--Colonial Downs better resembled a night game at the minor league baseball stadium up the road in Fredericksburg.

With the lights taking full effect as dusk set in over New Kent County, Nations Pride was ridden towards the back of the pack as longshot **Sugoi** (Karakontie {Jpn}) went off on a wing and a prayer, opening a long lead despite an opening half-mile that was timed in :50.03. *Cont. p3*

Still the better part of 10 lengths clear at the midpoint of the second turn, having required just 1:14.27 to complete six furlongs, Sugoi began to toss out some distress signals and the

peloton began to quickly close ranks. He proved a sitting duck for a class animal like Nations Pride, who shot right past the spent front-runner, then easily held a mild late bid from 2023 GIII Virginia Derby winner and 6-5 second choice Integration (Quality Road). Ancient Rome (War Front) loomed a threat inside the final furlong, as he dove down inside with a menacing bid, but he ultimately was forced to settle for third.

It was the third Million win for Sheikh Mohammed's

operation, who took the first 'post-Arlington' Million with Santin (Medaglia d'Oro) at Churchill Downs in 2022. Sulamani was the outfit's first winner in 2003.

"Look, (Nations Pride) was the best horse in the race and we knew that," said winning rider William Buick, who had to hotfoot it away from Colonial to try to catch a flight bound for Europe at Dulles Airport outside Washington, D.C. "Actually at Saratoga

last Friday, I got to ride him for a breeze on the Oklahoma track so I knew he was coming here in great form and he really impressed me. He's an exciting horse and he's won four Grade Is now. The leader was getting a lot of rope and he was getting it cheap, so I just wanted to have everything covered as well as I could."

Nations Pride is part of a large Godolphin contingent that has been stabled in this country, but he is no stranger to North American stamps on his passport. Winner of the GI Saratoga Derby and GIII Jockey Club Derby ahead

of fifth behind stablemate Rebel's Romance (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) when favored in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Keeneland in 2022, he added elite-level scores in the Bayrisches Zuchtrennen and Canadian International Stakes last season. *Cont.*

He was looking for his first win this term, having finished third in the GII Man O'War Stakes in May and second to Rebel's Romance's high-class half-brother Measured Time (GB) (Frankel (GB) in the GI Manhattan Stakes at Saratoga June 8.

Pedigree Notes:

Kildangan Stud stallion Teofilo (Ire), a Group 1 winner in both England and Ireland in 2006, is the sire of Nations Pride and 65 other graded or group winners worldwide. While 115 of his runners have scored in black-type events around the world on most of the continents, Nations Pride is Teofilo's only GISW in North America, although Naval Power (GB) also came close this year when second in both the GI Turf Classic Stakes at Churchill and the GI Maker's Mark Mile Stakes at Keeneland. The son of Galileo (Ire) has had runaway success when mated with Oasis Dream (GB) mares, coming up with Nations Pride, G1 Melbourne Cup winner Twilight Payment (Ire), G1 Prix Saint Alary winner Tawkeel (GB), Italian GSW Brasilian Man (Ire), and listed Australian winner Aktau (GB). Oasis Dream has 108 stakes winners out of his daughters.

Important Time, dam of the Million winner, is out of 2007 G1 Prix de l'Opera winner Satwa Queen (Fr) (Muhtathir {GB}) and is a half to the dams of 2023 Australian champion 2-year-old colt Militarize (NZ) (Dundeel {NZ}) and 2020 Irish G1SW Lucky Vega (Ire) (Lope de Vega (Ire)). She has an unraced 2-year-old fullsister to Nations Pride named Good Old Days (Ire) and a yearling colt by Ghaiyyath (Ire).



From a catalogue of 100 yearlings, 87 went through the ring Sunday for a gross of \$6,860,000. The session average was \$103,939 and the median was \$89,000. With 21 horses reported not sold, the buy-back rate was 24.1%.

During last year's opening session, 53 horses sold for \$5,999,000 for an average of \$113,189 and a median of \$100,000. The buy-back rate was 34.6%.

"We don't make any bold predictions or comparisons with just one night," Browning said. "We have 200 more to go [Monday]-we are a third of the way through the sale. There was very, very good trade tonight and we are looking forward to tomorrow."

Early in the session, Jacob West and Eddie Rosen, acting on behalf of Mike Repole, paid \$300,000 for a colt by Constitution from the Elite consignment. That session-topping price was matched late in the day when trainer Christophe Clement purchased a son of Vekoma from the Taylor Made Sales Agency consignment.

A total of 29 horses brought \$100,000 or more during the session—the same number as last year's opening session.

"We didn't have any "breakouts" tonight, but a bunch of horses sold for over \$100,000," Browning said. "We are pleased with the start and look forward to continue the positive momentum tomorrow."

The Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Yearling Sale continues with a final session Monday with bidding beginning at noon.

Constitution Colt Takes the Early Lead

A colt by Constitution (hip 315) helped get the Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Yearling Sale off to a strong start when selling to Mike Repole for \$300,000 early in Sunday's session. Consigned by Elite, the yearling was bred by Ten Strike Racing. He is out of See the Forest (Forestry) and is a half to stakes winners Whittington Park (Midnight Lute), Critical Value (Bodemeister) and Looms Boldly (Goldencents).

"Mike has been a great supporter of the [New York-bred program]," said Repole's advisor Eddie Rosen while seated alongside bloodstock agent Jacob West. "We breed here, we've stood stallions here. We are also hoping in this case that he is a horse who will compete in open competition. Being by Constitution makes you hope that he will be more than a New York-bred."

Ten Strike Racing's founding partner Marshall Gramm claimed See the Forest for \$12,500 in 2010. Looms Boldly won the John Morrissey Handicap in the Ten Strike colors just three days ago.

Of the process that led the team to bid on the yearling Sunday evening, West said, "When it all gets whittled down and whittled down, he was one that was near the top [of our list]."

West came back 40-some hips later to acquire a colt from the first crop of Galilean (Uncle Mo) (hip 350) for \$220,000 from the Eaton Sales consignment. The yearling is out of Three AM Tour (Ire) (Strategic Prince) and is a half-brother to stakes-winner Set (Oscar Performance).

Clement Strikes Late for Vekoma Colt

Trainer Christophe Clement got into the action late in Sunday's first session of the New York-bred Yearling sale, going to \$300,000 to acquire a colt by fast-starting freshman sire Vekoma (hip 386) from the Taylor Made Sales Agency consignment. *Cont.*

The chestnut is out of the unraced Alana's Allure (Shackleford) and is a half-brother to multiple stakes winner Allure of Money (Central Banker). The mare's 2-year-old Leon Blue (Mo Town) was a late-closing second in his debut at Saratoga July 24.

"He looked fast," Clement said when asked about the yearling's appeal. "It was probably too much money, but we are keeping the dream alive. I liked him very much. He looked very athletic. My son Miguel told me about him. At the moment, I bought him on spec, so I need to find some owners to help me and support me and we will go from there. He is a lovely horse."

In addition to his 13 winners, Vekoma's first crop of 2-yearolds includes stakes winner Louisiana Jess and stakes-placed Bella Sorella and Fortuna Mia.

"I train one Vekoma who I like," Clement said. "But this is a very live family. One horse just won very well from the same family. And unfortunately that's the way it is. You always have to overpay for what you like."

Good Luck Farm purchased the yearling for \$100,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton New York Mixed Sale.

- First-crop sire Galilean, who stands at Hidden Lake Farm for \$3,500, had a pair of seven-figure colts Sunday. Repole Stable purchased a half-brother to stakeswinning Set (Oscar Performance) by the sire for \$220,000 from Eaton Sales and JCE Racing purchased a colt from Indian Creek for \$160,000. The stallion, a sixtime stakes winner, topped the 2018 Barretts sale as a juvenile when selling for \$600,000.

fractions after SW **Money Supply** (Practical Joke) blew the start with a leap into the air. Strong Quality looked strong on the lead as Carl Spackler kept a clear-cut second and everyone else gave them space. Carl Spackler collared the frontrunner at the top of

the stretch, then went by in a matter of strides to open up and put the race to bed in short order, kicking clear to win by 3 1/2 lengths under a hand ride. More Than Looks (More Than Ready), making his first start since a sixth in last year's Breeders' Cup Mile, closed from the penultimate spot to nab second over favored Ottoman Fleet (GB) (See The Stars {Ire}), who won a pair of graded events at Churchill in his last two and nosed out Strong Quality for the show.

"This sure looked like the g number," said winning traine

horse that was sitting on the big number," said winning trainer Chad Brown. "He was capable of it, he had flirted with running a monster number before. He wins." *Cont.*

Brown continued: "I had a feeling today, and then with just a little bit of cut in the ground, I think he's even just a little bit better--or sometimes with soft turf races, it is that the other

horses can't handle it is the issue, which really makes the ones that can stand out. I really felt today would be his day and it was."

The Fourstardave is named for the beloved 'Sultan of Saratoga,' who won a remarkable eight years in a row at the Spa. This race has regularly provided special wins, including the last two years with just-retired fan favorite Casa Creed (Jimmy Creed). This year was no exception. Not only did Carl Spackler's win mark the first victory in the

Fourstardave for trainer Brown, who has won just about every other major turf race in the country, but it also gave a special score to the Edwards family. Jockey Tyler Gaffalione is the son-

in-law of e Five Racing principal Bob Edwards, who bred Carl Spackler through his Fifth Avenue Bloodstock. Carl Spackler's dam was one of the first horses Edwards bought when he made his first forays into racing.

"This is why we do it," said

"This is why we do it," said Edwards. "For us, it is a family affair. Tyler now is part of the family and to be on a horse that we bred, my son-in-law wins a Grade I in Saratoga--the Fourstardave. Our lawn jockey gets put in front of the Fourstardave, it's special. I get to see it for another year. It's just an unbelievable event for us.

"A special horse for us, a homebred out of Zindaya. My first win ever was with Zindaya." Like the aforementioned Casa Creed and Fourstardave, Carl Spackler seems to have an affinity

for Saratoga. In addition to his Kelso win last out, the handsome chestnut won his first career stakes event last year in the GII National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame Stakes. *Cont.*

He followed it up with a win in the GIII Saranac Stakes, also at the Spa.

Pedigree Notes:

Ballylinch Stud's Lope de Vega (Ire) is the sire of Carl Spackler and 72 other graded/group winners from his 134 black-type winners worldwide. His 20 black-type winners in 2024 put him in a tie for second in that category this year with Dubawi (Ire) among all sires standing in the Northern Hemisphere. The European pair are just two behind the U.S.'s Into Mischief. Interestingly, Carl Spackler's broodmare sire is the late More Than Ready, who also is the sire of Fourstardave runner-up More Than Looks. More Than Ready has 179 stakes winners out of his daughters.

Like her Fourstardave-winning son, Zindaya raced for e Five Racing. She won four black-type events in the U.S., including the 2016 GII Goldikova Stakes at Santa Anita. The mare has a 2-yearold full-brother to Carl Spackler named Sandtrap (Ire), who sold as a yearling in Book 1 at Tattersalls October last year for 450,000gns to A.C. Elliott. The mare delivered an Uncle Mo colt Feb. 15 and was bred back to Justify.

FAIRY TALE CONTINUES AS CARSON'S RUN WINS SARATOGA DERBY

In a story reminiscent of 2023 Horse of the Year Cody's Wish (Curlin), Carson's Run (Cupid) found a sequel to his own fairy tale Sunday, detailed last year here and here. The West Point Thoroughbreds and Steven Bouchey runner, a winner June 23 of the Tale of the Cat Stakes at Monmouth Park, doubled up on his juvenile form, adding the GI Saratoga Derby Invitational Stakes Sunday to his GI Summer Stakes victory last year at Woodbine. He crossed the Saratoga wire Sunday under a rainbow.

"To walk out in front of the big screen and to see that rainbow...it was good," said an emotional Terry Finley of West Point.

After tossing his head several times in the gate, Carson's Run left cleanly and was taken back to his customary spot at the rear. The chestnut trailed early as Izzy d'Oro (Get Stormy), fourth behind Carson's Run in the Tale of the Cat, set a :23.83 and :48.30 pace while opening up on the field. As they bunched up on the final turn, Carson's Run tipped outside to circle the field several paths out. Despite GII Pennine Ridge Stakes winner and GI Belmont Derby third Legend of Time (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) getting first dibs on the front, Carson's Run ran him down in the final strides to prevail by three-quarters of a length. Legend of Time outfinished GSW and 'TDN Rising Star' Deterministic (Liam's Map), who was making his second start on the turf after a runner-up finish last out in the GIII Manila Stakes, at the wire. Final time for the 1 3/16 miles was 1:55.81. After originally slated for Aug. 3, the Saratoga Derby had been rescheduled twice due to rain.

"I can't put it into words," said jockey Dylan Davis. "I've known him since the beginning, so I knew he handled the course well. He gets a little nerve built up this year, but just working with him, talking him out of it, I was able to take him, ease him back, and then tuck him in, then he switched off for me very nicely. I loved going into that second turn, he was getting into the bridle nicely, in a good rhythm, just trying to work out a trip nice and easy for him, working my way to the outside. Once I got to the outside, I was rooting for him, I was like 'Come on Carson, let's get going,' and he responded very nicely."

The Saratoga Derby marked the first Grade I at Saratoga for Davis, who also won the Mahony Stakes earlier on Sunday's card with Fandom (GB) (Showcasing {GB}). Davis was aboard Carson's Run for the Summer score at Woodbine and the duo also placed in last year's GIII With Anticipation Stakes at the Spa. The 9 1/2 furlongs of the Saratoga Derby marked the colt's longest foray yet.

The race earned Carson's Run an invitation and an automatic berth into Australia's \$5-million G1 Cox Plate, which will be held Oct. 26. Trainer Christophe Clement was not ready to commit, but said he would consider the trip.

Pedigree Notes:

Cupid, who originally stood at Coolmore America, spent the 2024 breeding season at Atlanta Hall in Maryland. Sire of 2021 Canadian champion 2-year-old God of Love and another six black-type winners, he also has additional 2024 Santa Anita GSW Desert Dawn and Saratoga's Aug. 7 Johnstone Mile Handicap winner Sterling Silver. Cupid has four graded winners overall.

West Point had picked up Carson's Run for \$170,000 at OBS Spring last year after he had twice sold for lesser amounts at Keeneland and Fasig-Tipton.


"I guess that's the beautiful thing about the partners and in particular David Ingordo, our bloodstock agent," said Finley. "We go to the sales and we have the freedom to take shots and to buy horses that other people don't buy. That's a beautiful thing."

Finley continued, "Often times they don't work out, but when they work out like this there's a sweetness to this business that you can't match in anything else in life that you do."

Hot N Hectic, dam of Carson's Run, has a yearling colt by Volatile, a Jan. 24-foaled filly by Maxfield, and was bred back to Flightline. A half-sister to MGSW & GISP Rated R Superstar (Kodiak Kowboy), she's by Henny Hughes, whose daughters have produced 25 stakes winners, including champion Monomoy Girl (Tapizar).

MOIRA OUTLASTS DEFENDING CHAMP FEV ROVER IN BEVERLY D. by Alan Carasso

NEW KENT COUNTY, VA -- For the second consecutive year, the trophy for the GII Beverly D. Stakes will go back to Canada after the country's reigning Horse of the Year Moira (Ghostzapper) got just the better of an entertaining final-furlong tussle with defending champion **Fev Rover (Ire)** (Gutaifan {Ire}).

The Tracy Farmer runner left there running and although she had a bit of pesky early pressure from **Libban** (Laoban), Fev Rover was a clear leader turning up the backside as Moira set up camp three deep in the breeze. Allowed to slow the tempo through the middle furlongs, Fev Rover was still going very well approaching the stretch, holding a clear tactical advantage over Moira, who was consigned to a ground-sacrificing move around the bend. Moira rolled up to Fev Rover and looked as if she was going to speed right on by, but Fev Rover dug in doggedly, only to go down by a short head at the wire.

With the victory, Moira earns a fees-paid berth into the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf, a race in which she was a brave third in 2023.

"It's always nerve-wracking when you hook Fev Rover," said trainer Kevin Attard. "She's a great horse and Mark (Casse) has done a great job with her. Last year at Woodbine, we hooked a couple times on soft turf. I think Fev Rover gets the edge over us on softer ground but Moira prefers the harder turf. We contemplated not coming here because of Tropical Storm Debby but we rolled the dice. I've never been (to Colonial Downs) but I had heard great things about this turf course that it drains well"

"I know Woodbine has got a great turf course but Colonial is probably one of the best in North America as well. We've got the E.P. Taylor at home. I think that's a race we are going to take into consideration and that would take us right into the Breeders' Cup."

Moira, who defeated the boys in the 2022 Queen's Plate, made the GII Canadian Stakes her lone victory of 2023, but her season could hardly be characterized as fruitless. Second in the GIII Belle Mahone Stakes on the synth and in the GII Nassau Stakes and GII Dance Smartly Stakes on the grass prior to her lone win, she was third to Fev Rover in the GI E.P. Taylor Stakes and filled the same spot behind the world-class Inspiral (GB) (Frankel {GB}) and Warm Heart (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the Filly & Mare Turf.

She changed hands for \$3 million at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale a few days later and was kept in training at five, returning to run home a game second to the repeating Whitebeam (GB) (Caravaggio) in the GI Diana Stakes July 13.

Pedigree Notes:

Adena Springs acquired dam Devine Aida for \$120,000 at the 2014 OBS June Sale and raced her to four victories, including the Herecomesthebride Stakes and Ginger Brew Stakes, while also hitting the board in the GII Mrs. Revere Stakes, all of which took place on the grass. A daughter of Grade III winner Passion, Devine Aida sold for \$400,000 carrying a full-sibling to Moira at the 2020 Keeneland November Sale and she is also the dam of a yearling filly by Constitution.

OSCAR PERFORMANCE COLT COMPLETES **GRADED HAT-'TRIK' IN SECRETARIAT**

NEW KENT COUNTY, VA -- It would have been no surprise had trainer Graham Motion elected to run Amerman Racing's Trikari (Oscar Performance) in Sunday's rescheduled GI Saratoga Derby Invitational Stakes as opposed to the GII Secretariat Stakes at Colonial Downs. After all, the long-barreled bay was exiting a victory in the GI Belmont Derby over a mile and threesixteenths, but Trikari proved more than capable of handling the step back down in trip with a powerful victory in the eightfurlong Secretariat.

The second betting choice when all was said and done behind the rail-drawn **Brilliant Berti** (Noble Mission {GB}), Trikari took up a spot in fourth in the two-wide line as General Ledger (Summer Front) was pushed along by the stretching-out Mattingly (Bucchero). Asked to improve his position and ridden along to take closer order by John Velazquez with better than three furlongs to go, Trikari was poised to strike and was produced four wide off the final corner. Lengthening his stride beautifully while getting first run on American Derby hero Brilliant Berti, Trikari proved a convincing winner as the chalk gave vain chase. In a Jam (Preservationist) rounded out the triple.

The winner's sire was victorious in the 2017 Secretariat, then a Grade I and run over a mile and a quarter at Arlington.

"Johnny was super impressed with his turn of foot," said winning trainer Graham Motion. "Down the backside he was so relaxed and when he asked him, he just took off. I think as (Trikari) matures now and starts to run against older horses--now he's going to have to step up his game against older horses--I think (one mile) is really going to be his game.

"I've been trying not to think about the Breeders' Cup, because

it's tough for 3-year-olds, a race at Keeneland maybe against older horses, something along those lines is something we will have to consider."

Victorious in the Rushaway Stakes over the Turfway Tapeta Mar. 23, Trikari--and not Endlessly (Oscar Performance)--carried the Amerman blue-and-white in the May 4 GII American Turf Stakes and caused a 47-1 boilover. Third and beaten just a neck in the GIII Penn Mile Stakes May 27, he was along in the final strides in the Belmont Derby, while Endlessly trailed home in fifth.

Pedigree Notes:

On behalf of Augustin Stables, Graham Motion trained Trikari's dam to four wins and earnings of better than \$267,000, including the GIII Herecomesthebride Stakes at Gulfstream Park. A half-sister to GSWs Lift Up (Ghostzapper) and Varenka (Ghostzapper), SW & MGSP Appealing Cat (Successful Appeal) and a full to SW Cat's Holiday, Dynamic Holiday was acquired by Michael Slezak for \$14,000 carrying the foal that would become Trikari at the 2021 Fasig-Tipton February Sale. She is also the dam of the 2-year-old filly Miavana (Jimmy Creed) and a yearling colt by Beau Liam, and changed hands for \$3,500 in foal to Mind Control during the Fasig-Tipton Digital October Sale last fall.

'TDN RISING STAR' GETAWAY CAR AN EASY WINNER IN BEST PAL

He faced just three rivals but, with the way he ran, **Getaway Car** (Curlin) looked as though a full field wouldn't be a problem in taking the GIII Best Pal Stakes at Del Mar Sunday afternoon. Honored as a **'TDN Rising Star'** for his 3 1/4-length debut performance over five furlongs July 20, the 1-5 favorite had an extra furlong to work with in the jump up to graded stakes company for trainer Bob Baffert.

Keen from the outside gate, Getaway Car had plenty of speed to clear down to the inside with **Mischief River** (Into Mischief) poised just off his flank for much of the running. The top pair put up fractions of :22.20 and :45.77 but, by the quarter pole, it was clear that Getaway Car was a runaway winner. Running up the score into that last furlong, he came home under a motionless Juan Hernandez to win under wraps.

"You know what, going into the gate it looked like he was going to have a lot of speed against him," said Hernandez. "But in my mind I am going to take advantage of my position. The gate opened, my horse broke in front, and I just decided to let him go. He was very comfortable on the lead. He is really fast, so he cleared everybody. I just waited till the quarter pole, where his ears went up. I asked him to pick it up again and he did. Can't wait for the next one."

Baffert added: "This guy's been a lot of fun. Great name and he's fast. He wasn't slowing down. He's got a beautiful stride. Just a beautiful way of doing it. He's by Curlin and Curlins usually get better with age. The good horses can get the distance."

Pedigree Note:

The 60th graded stakes winner for Curlin, Getaway Car is the first foal out stakes winner Surrender Now, who sold as a 2-year-old for \$220,000 and earned over \$280,000 on the track. She is a half to GIII Bob Hope Stakes winner Red Flag (Tamarkuz). She has a Charlatan yearling colt who brought \$285,000 as a weanling at Keeneland November last year and, after not producing a foal this year, was bred to Nyquist for next season.

COLONIAL TO ADD SPRING DATES, VA DERBY TO BECOME DERBY POINTS RACE

NEW KENT COUNTY, VA -- Prior to the running of Sunday's third race on the Colonial Downs 'Festival of Racing' program, Virginia Governor Glenn Youngkin announced that the track, which has run summer dates since its return to the racing calendar five years ago, would be conducting a 'spring' meeting at the New Kent County track.

Youngkin also told the crowd on hand that the Virginia Derby, previously held on the turf, would be contested during the new meeting and that it is to become a points-earning race on the Road to the Kentucky Derby.

"Churchill Downs has worked with partners throughout the Commonwealth to reinvigorate Virginia's proud legacy of Thoroughbred racing and secure our place as a world-class destination for racing fans and equine talent from around the world," said Governor Youngkin. "The future for Thoroughbred racing in Virginia has never been brighter and this opportunity will allow us to shine on horse racing's biggest stage."

This year's Virginia Derby will be held as scheduled on turf on Sept. 7. In 2025, as part of a 50-point race on the Road to the Kentucky Derby, the Virginia Derby will be held Mar. 15 on the dirt track and will anchor a new four-day spring meet at Colonial Downs.

"We are thankful for the investment of Churchill Downs in the Virginia horse racing industry. In 2025, Colonial Downs will race 47 days, which is up from 27 days in 2022, the last race meet before Churchill Downs acquired Colonial Downs," said Secretary of Agriculture Matthew Lohr, who joined the Governor for the announcement. "Besides adding prestigious and lucrative races for horsemen, more race days drives significant economic impact throughout Virginia's entire agricultural sector leading to a healthy breeding industry, stronger equine infrastructure, and more employment opportunities across the Commonwealth."

Churchill Downs CEO Bill Carstanjen also addressed the crowd, voicing his satisfaction with the progress made at Colonial Downs on the occasion of the second Festival of Racing since Churchill purchased the track in November 2022.

Dates for the Colonial Downs spring meet are contingent on approval of the Virginia Racing Commission.

SARATOGA NOTEBOOK: LUKAS WANTS TO RUN SEIZE THE GREY IN TRAVERS, NO DECISION HAS BEEN MADE by Tim Wilkin

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. -- If it was up to Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas, **Seize the Grey** (Arrogate) would be running in the \$1.25-million, GI Travers Stakes at Saratoga Race Course on Aug. 24.

On Sunday morning, all Lukas could do was shrug his shoulders when asked if the GI Preakness Stakes winner would be taking a place in the Travers starting gate.

"I don't know," he said at his barn on the Oklahoma Training Track. "I am going to vote to run him in it."

Lukas, though, apparently doesn't have the only say. MyRacehorse, which owns the horse, lists 2,570 partners who got involved with a payment of \$127 per share. Of course, 2,570 people don't get to give their opinion on where and when Seize the Grey runs.

That would fall on Michael Behrens, the founder and CEO of MyRacehorse. He did not return a message left on his cellphone on Sunday.

Last month, MyRacehorse sold the breeding rights to Gainesway Farm in Lexington. According to a release from MyRacehorse in July, the deal has a base value of \$3.5 million with additional incentives.

The final value of the breeding rights would balloon by \$3 million if Seize the Grey wins the Travers and \$4 million more if he were to win the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. If Seize the Grey wins a Grade I other than the Travers of Classic, it's a \$2-million bonus. That would include the GI Pennsylvania Derby at Parx on Sept. 21.

Lukas said he believes that Gainesway is involved with the decision on Seize the Grey's next start.

Brian Graves, the general manager at Gainesway, said that is not the case.

"The owners will decide where he runs next; it's their call not mine," Graves said by phone Sunday. "I am not sure where they are running the horse next. The horse is limited to a certain amount of runs before the retirement."

How many races that is was not made clear. Seize the Grey has raced seven times this year and has three wins and a third.

Since winning the Preakness, he was seventh in the GI Belmont Stakes on June 8 and fourth in the GII Jim Dandy Stakes on July 27. Both of those races were run at Saratoga.

"There is some thought that maybe he doesn't care for this racetrack," Lukas said. "I don't quite buy into that."

Lukas said there is talk that MyRacehorse would rather wait for the Pennsylvania Derby and give Seize the Grey more time between races. Lukas would like to run in both the Travers and Pennsylvania Derby.

"I never trained afraid to run them when they are good," Lukas said. "I have made a living doing that. So many times, we overreact to the time off and whether he is ready and all of that. I have run a lot of horses in a lot of stakes--I mean a lot of stakes--and I run them back in short time."

Lukas said he will continue to train Seize the Grey as if he were going to run in the Travers. He plans on working him on Monday.

"It's a no-win situation for me," Lukas said. "If he runs well (in the Travers), I'm a hero. If he runs poor, it's like, 'I told you so; you should not have run him.' But I am bulletproof to that stuff. If he doesn't run (in the Travers), I'll just keep right on training him for the next one."

Gaffalione Has Been Riding As Good As Anyone Lately At Saratoga

Over the past four days, no one has been hotter than jockey Tyler Gaffalione at Saratoga Race Course. He has won 10 races over that period to give him 26 winners. Sixteen days of racing remain in the 40-day meet.

Irad Ortiz, Jr. is the leader with 33 wins, and he is followed by Gaffalione with 26 and Flavien Prat with 25. *Cont.*

The question is can Gaffalione--or anyone else--knock off Ortiz, Jr., who has won four of the last six titles, including the last two? Ortiz, Jr. will be sitting out three days next week as he serves a suspension Wednesday-Friday.

"You always come into these meets with the confidence that you can win," he said. "Everything has to go your way and you have to get a little bit of luck. Who knows?"

Better Days Ahead For Romans And Keep It Easy

Trainer Dale Romans was hoping for big things from **Keep It Easy** (Hard Spun) in Saturday's Grade II Saratoga Special Stakes at Saratoga. It didn't happen.

Keep It Easy, the 5-2 second choice among the eight 2-year-olds, was never a factor. Ridden by Junior Alvarado, Keep It Easy stumbled badly coming out of the gate. For them, game over.

"(Alvarado) said he was standing good, and the ground broke out from under him behind and he went to his knees," Romans said outside his barn on the Saratoga backstretch Sunday morning. "He lost all chance and cut himself up a little bit."

After the stumble, Keep It Easy bumped with Good Directions (Liam's Map), further making this a horrible Saratoga Special for the Romans barn.

"He fell into (Good Directions); that probably kept him up," Romans said. "It kept him from going all the way down. Junior is lucky he stayed on. After that, he said he gave him a little chance down the backside, and he could tell he was rattled and then he just let him gallop around there."

Romans said Keep It Easy was in good shape Sunday morning after the ordeal.

Keep It Easy broke his maiden in his second start, at Churchill Downs on June 27. Romans was encouraged with the effort even though the public dismissed him at odds of 23-1.

The Saratoga Special became the goal and Romans expected something, well, special. So, for sure, on Sunday there was disappointment.

"He was the focus of the meet, he was the big horse in the barn," said the Kentucky-based Romans, who has 10 horses stabled at Saratoga. "I know he is a good horse. The good side of it is that he looks sound this morning, he is healthy and it looks like there is a lot of ground in front of us."

There is no specific race that Romans will target Keep It Easy to. He will likely resurface at Keeneland in the fall.

"He'll live to fight another day," Romans said. "This shows how tough it is to win a big race. Everything has to go right, and you can't stub your toe in a graded stakes race at Saratoga."



SIERRA LEONE BACK WORKING AT SARATOGA; SHOWCASE EXITS SPECIAL IN **GOOD ORDER**

GI Blue Grass Stakes winner and 'TDN Rising Star' Sierra Leone (Gun Runner) returned to the work tab Sunday morning for trainer Chad Brown ahead of an expected next start in the GI DraftKings Travers Stakes Aug. 24. The \$2.3-million FTSAUG grad, last seen second to another 'Rising Star' and champion in Fierceness (City of Light) in the GII Jim Dandy Stakes July 27, covered a solo half mile in :49 flat over the Oklahoma training track.

"He worked super," said Brown. "He's come out of his last race well and I'm happy with where he's at."

The Jim Dandy marked Sierra Leone's first start with a ring bit under Flavien Prat. He had also been training solo ahead of that start.

"It's an area of his training that he's kind of graduated into," added Brown. "He's got a lot of experience now and fitness, so at this stage of his career, it seems to be working good for him. We'll see where it takes us. For right now, he's fine doing that. We're very much so on target for the Travers."

Also breezing over the weekend was champion **Idiomatic** (Curlin) for Brad Cox who went five furlongs in 1:00.40 (3/12) Saturday morning. She'll target a title defense in the GI Personal Ensign Stakes Aug. 23.

"Really good breeze on the Oklahoma. She will have one more before the Personal Ensign," Cox said.

'TDN Rising Star' Showcase (Uncle Mo), a winner in Saturday's GII Saratoga Special, rebounded well from his efforts Sunday according to Todd Pletcher.

"He's excellent. He looked really good this morning," said Pletcher. "We will play it by ear [where to run next]."

After Saturday's race, Pletcher indicated that the GI Hopeful Stakes Sept. 2 may be a little quick back. He said he may prefer to wait until the fall and stretch out in the either the GI Champagne Stakes at Aqueduct or the GI Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland.

The same races are also under consideration for **Tenacious** Leader (Not This Time), who graduated at second asking Saturday.

"I thought that was good," said Pletcher. "We knew he'd appreciate stretching out. It allowed him to get into a good rhythm. He finished up well. We were happy."

Meanwhile **Subsanador (Arg)** (Fortify), one of two Argentine-breds thought to be headed to the Pacific Classic, will instead run in the GIII Iselin Stakes at Monmouth Park Aug. 17, according to trainer Richard Mandella.

Parenting (Justify), Newgate (Into Mischief) and Reincarnate (Good Magic), all from the Baffert barn, have been mentioned as possible runners in the Pacific Classic. Reincarnate, runner-up to Midnight Mammoth (Midnight Lute) in the GIII Cougar II, put in a five-furlong work Saturday, stopping the clock in 1:01.4. (1/4). Newgate, who hasn't raced since returning from the Middle East where he ran ninth in the G1 Dubai World Cup, returned to the work tab Friday, posting a three-furlong bullet in :36.40 (1/8).

Other candidates for Del Mar's marquee race of the summer meet all put in works this week.

Dr. Venkman (Ghostzapper) worked Saturday on the main track going four furlongs in :47.60 (9/92). It was his first work since his victory in the GII San Diego last month. Trainer Mark Glatt indicated he was pleased with the work and is pointing to the Pacific Classic.

Katonah (Klimt), runner-up in the San Diego, is also being pointed to the Pacific Classic. He put in his first work since the San Diego Saturday going four furlongs in :47.40 (6/92).

Midnight Mammoth is pointing to the Classic off of his victory in the GIII Cougar II. Trainer Craig Dollase worked him Saturday, going four furlongs in :48.00 (19/92). Cont.

Express Train (Union Rags) is another probable participant off of his third-place finish in the San Diego.

"He came out of the race fine," trainer John Shirreffs said. "I thought he ran a credible race and we're looking forward to the next one."

Trainer John Sadler is still uncommitted to running **Full Serrano** (Full Mast) in the Classic.

"He came out of the race well," Sadler says. "We'll start to breeze him back next week and look for something here, whether it's that (the Pacific Classic) or not, we haven't decided."

Josie Carroll recorded her 1,000th career win as a trainer in Sunday's fourth race at Woodbine when the 4-year-old Tapit gelding Spinzar won for LNJ Foxwoods. Carroll, who became the first woman to train a King's Plate winner in 2006, also trained this year's Woodbine Oaks winner. Horses racing out of the Josie Carroll barn include names such as two-time Canadian Horse of the Year Mighty Heart (Dramedy), Careless Heart (Stormin Fever), champion 2-year-old colt Avie's Flatter (Flatter), Ami's Holiday (Harlan's Holiday) and champion 3-year-old colt Ami's Gizmo (Giant Gizmo). Carroll has earned nearly \$59 million in purse earnings with 176 stakes wins and 59 graded wins. She was inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame in 2019.

CASSE CONTINUES TO HAVE SUCCESS WITH HIS 2-YEAR-OLDS AS LA CARA GETS TO WINNER'S CIRCLE

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.--The baby train continues to chug along for Hall of Fame trainer Mark Casse at Saratoga Race Course this summer.

The latest stop came Sunday and 2-year-old filly **La Cara** (Street Sense) hopped on board as she pulverized the field in the eighth race maiden special weight. Ridden by Ricardo Santana Jr., La Cara went to the lead at the start of the seven-furlong race and stayed there.

She won by eight lengths, and it could have been more as Santana Jr. brought her home with a hand ride.

"That was impressive," Casse said by phone.

Casse watched this race from home with his wife, Tina. Nothing against the Spa, but he had horses running all over the country--including the big card at Colonial Downs--and decided it would be easier to keep track of them from the comfort of his couch.

"I have my TV going, my laptop and my iPad ... we are going all over the place," Casse said. I am in air traffic control."

Casse was going to be back at the track to saddle **Strong Quality** (Quality Road) in the GI Fourstardave Handicap (he finished fourth). Before that, though he was more than happy to talk about his most recent Saratoga success with the juveniles.

La Cara became the sixth horse to win a baby race for Casse, who has 10 winners overall, at this meet. For the year, Casse has started 123 2-year-olds and has 25 wins, 13 seconds and 20 thirds.

"We came up with this plan, and we had a lot of people who

believed in us," Casse said. "We went out and got the best bunch of yearlings we have ever got. I said we were going to be ready like never before ... when a plan comes together, it's nice."

La Cara is owned and bred by long-time Casse client Tracy Farmer. Casse also trained the dam, Casa Caterina and said this is her first foal. Casa Caterina is a full sister to To Honor and Serve, a multiple graded stakes winner.

However, Casse said, Casa Caterina could not run at all. "I could outrun her," he said.

Fortunately, for Casse, La Cara did not inherit the slow genes of her mother.

"She is a beautiful homebred," Casse said. "As impressive as she was running, she is just as impressive to look at."

La Cara was making her fourth career start Sunday. The experience, Casse said, worked to her advantage. The only other filly to run before this race was 18-1 **Going Steady** (Constitution) and she finished second for Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas. But she was no match for La Cara.

La Cara, the 9-2 third choice, carved out fractions of 22.45, 45.44 and 1:10.43 before coming home in 1:23.58. She paid \$11.20.

Casse said he expected good things from La Cara when he had her on his farm in Ocala, Fla. over the winter. After two starts at Churchill Downs (a sixth on a sloppy track and a second on a fast one) he sent La Cara to Saratoga.

However, he did not bring her up early, like he did with many of his young horses. Because the Belmont Stakes Festival was held at Saratoga, Casse left a string of horses here after that four-day meet ended in early June.

La Cara showed up in time to run on the third day of the meet and she bombed as the even-money favorite, beaten six lengths while finishing fourth. *Cont.*

"I was pretty mad at myself for running her because this is a good filly," Casse said. "Sometimes, when you have too much confidence, you run a horse and that is what happens."

In hindsight, he would have gotten her better acclimated to Saratoga. After that race, she had two good works and Casse expected her to run better. She sure did.

LA CARA (f, 2, Street Sense--Cara Caterina, by Bernardini) may have been inconvenienced by a wet track when sixth on Churchill debut May 17, but was forgiven for the effort and was a much-improved second over fast dirt June 21. A disappointing fourth on her first local run July 14, the homebred was sent off at 23-5 to make amends and soon led from her low draw beneath Jose Ortiz. By the half-mile on her lonesome in :45.44, she continued to build a big lead approaching the eighth pole and had eight lengths on Going Steady (Constitution), the only other member of the eight-strong field with previous racetrack experience. The winner's dam is a daughter of Pilfer (Deputy Minister), making her a full-sister to MGISW To Honor and Serve and GISW Angela Renee and a half to SW & GISP Elnaawi (Street Sense). Pilfer is in turn a half-sister to GSW India (Hennessy), the dam of Japanese dual Group 1 winner Mozu Ascot (Frankel {GB}) and the stakes-winning 'TDN Rising Star' Kareena (Medaglia d'Oro). La Cara hails from the same family as a Gun Runner colt out of Secret Sigh (Tapit) that sold to Coolmore and Peter Brant for \$1.9 million at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale earlier this week. Bred on the same cross that resulted in GISWs Maxfield and Speaker's Corner and other graded winners like Shared Sense, La Cara has a yearling full-brother. Lifetime Record: 4-1-1-0, \$86,575. So Sandy's extended female family includes SW Vodka With a Twist (Thousand Words) and MGSW Midcourt (Midnight Lute).

Finally, **Authentic Strike** (Authentic) makes the races for partners Ann Harrison and Renata Hendrickson, and is trained by Rodolphe Brisset. The colt brought \$450,000 during OBS March--the second highest juvenile price for his first-crop sire in 2024. Sporting the hot pink silks of his owners, Most Wanted kept his perfect record intact and added the first black-type score of his late-starting career. Prior to this, the colt broke his maiden at first asking at Churchill Downs June 21 and followed that by clearing the allowance ranks at the Pea Patch July 21.

The 3-1 third choice here blazed out of the gate, which immediately handed him the advantage. Well-handled up the backstretch, the 3-year-old effectively controlled the pace around the far turn, but several in the field were beginning to apply pressure at the top of the lane. 


