



POWER SQUEEZE BATTLES TO ALABAMA WIN



Power Squeeze besting favored Candied | Sarah Andrew

With the connections of the well-reputed 'Grizzley' Thorpedo Anna (Fast Anna) opting to wait another week to face the boys in the GI Travers S., **Power Squeeze** (Union Rags) took full advantage of the Kentucky Oaks winner's absence and stormed home a narrow winner in the 10-furlong GI Alabama Stakes at Saratoga Saturday.

MGSW Chatalas (Gun Runner) broke quickly, going to the front with a host of pursuers at her heels. Meanwhile, Power Squeeze tried to establish a clear path from Post 3, but was squeezed back as America's Vow (Constitution) and GISW Candied (Candy Ride {Arg}) tried to make headway to her outside. With the opening quarter flashing in :23.31, Chatalas continued to lead Miss Justify (Justify) and Intricate (Gun Runner) while Candied and Power Squeeze were still unhurried several lengths behind. Picking up the tempo approaching the 3/8ths pole, Candied bore down on the pacesetter as the 6-1 shot started to mount a rally of her own. Straitening for home, tiring Chatalas veered outward causing a chain reaction including Miss Justify and Candied who both seemed to lose some momentum. Meanwhile, Power Squeeze was moving best of all, closing down the center of the track, and while Candied did her best to get home first, it was the chestnut who got her head down at the wire. "She is not the best at breaking out of the gate. She always breaks a little slow, but she is OK," explained winning rider Javier Castellano, who was winning his fourth renewal of the Alabama. "That was my goal--it was a mile and a quarter race. Not too many horses face a mile and quarter in their 3-year-old campaign. I believed whoever had the most left near the very end of the race was going to win. I didn't want to hook up with speed or chase the speed. I wanted to take my time and develop the horse through the race to find her kick and finish."

The victory also represented the initial Grade I winner for winning trainer Jorge Delgado.

"An absolutely outstanding ride from Javier [Castellano]," said Delgado. "He measured the race perfectly. He said to me he felt the pace was going [to be] a little fast, but he wanted to keep her near the pace and close enough to make a run because there's enough talent in the race. Going to the stretch, he told me he couldn't see much but he could see number seven [No. 7, Candied] and he thought he was in a good spot. He kept coming and coming and he knows that the filly fights a lot--like in Delaware, but this time on the outside. On the head bob, she knows how to win. She wanted to win. She has so much determination to win."

As for the beaten favorite, trainer Todd Pletcher explained, "It was a good effort [by Candied]. Manny [Franco] said when the two [No. 2, Chatalas] came out it kind of bumped everyone and knocked him off rhythm a little bit. She regained her momentum late and she had her nose in front before and after the wire just not on the wire. Tough beat. She ran great."

Power Squeeze debuted in fourth sprinting at Delaware one year ago before coming home a distant second going six panels in the Monmouth slop in early September. Stretched out to a mile for the first time when returning to Delaware last October, she ran off a 4 1/2length winner before doubling up with a five-length victory in Gulfstream's Cash Run Stakes on New Year's Day. Extending her streak with victories in Tampa's Feb. 10 Suncoast Stakes followed by the GII Gulfstream Park Mar. 30. Let go at 21-1 in a sloppy

renewal of the Kentucky Oaks, the chestnut never got into the mix of things yet improved her position late to finish a far-back sixth. Facing that rival again in the June 7 GI Acorn Stakes at the Spa, she was third but bounced back to win last time out in the 1 1/16-mile GIII Delaware Oaks July 8.

"I rode her in the Delaware Oaks, and I liked the way she won that," added Castellano. "She finished really strong galloping out

really well. She gave me the impression that day she could go the mile and a quarter distance. I suggested to the trainer that day that he should put her in the Alabama because she had something to finish in the end. She is a fighter."

Power Squeeze came into this race off of four wins this season, with her sole 2024 defeats coming at the hands of Thorpedo Anna while trying Grade I company.

When asked about a potential next start versus Thorpedo Anna in the GI Cotillion Stales at

Parx Sept. 21, Delgado said, "Absolutely. The owner is a man of challenge--I am, too. We like to gamble and sometimes a problem, but we like to gamble [laughs]. You only have these kinds of chances so many times in your training career. We faced her twice we lost twice...but I feel like if it is the right surface and right distance for us, we might have a shot. We're going there [the Cotillion]. We might see each other there."



Pedigree Notes:

Lane's End stallion Union Rags is the sire of Power Squeeze and five other Grade I winners, including Express Train, Paradise Woods, Free Drop Billy, Union Strike, and Dancing Rags. Power Squeeze is the first of the stallion's 17 graded winners to capture a graded race at the Spa, something he did in the 2011 GII Saratoga Special Stakes before he went on to GI Champagne and GI Belmont glory. Union Rags also has 35 black-type winners worldwide, with Power Squeeze being his sole stakes winner out of an Awesome Again mare. The late Awesome Again has 105 stakes winners out of his daughters.

Forging Oaks Farm, breeder of Power Squeeze, bought her dam, Callmethesqueeze, in foal to More Than Ready for \$175,000 at the 2015 Keeneland November sale. Forging Oaks bred both Power Squeeze and listed winner Call On Mischief (Into Mischief) out of the mare before reselling her for \$50,000 to Athens Woods at Keeneland in 2022.

"She is as good as ever," McPeek said after Thorpedo Anna had her final Travers work, going five furlongs in 59.81 seconds (2/19) on the main track at Saratoga Race Course. "She is just hitting on all cylinders, like she has been all year. Danny (exercise rider Ramsey) seems to think she is better now than she ever has been. She is going to have to be."

Thorpedo Anna worked in company with Elko County (Gun Runner), who had jockey Julien Leparoux on board. The two horses walked down the horse path through the picnic area and made two laps in the paddock before hitting the main track around 7 on Saturday morning.

The work had one minor glitch when the two workers had to alter their course at the top of the stretch when they came upon a slower horse. McPeek said it was not a problem.

"That's all she needed," McPeek said of the work. "We just wanted something nice and steady, let her stretch her legs across the main."

Now, the final countdown to the Travers is on. McPeek said Thorpedo Anna will walk on

Sunday and, as long as it doesn't rain, will school in the paddock at the second race.

McPeek also said that he expects that Thorpedo Anna will stay in Saratoga until she ships to California for the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, which will be run on Nov 2. She will also ship from Saratoga to Parx Racing next month for the GI Cotillion.

Gargan Confident Dornoch Can Overcome An Obstacle And Win Travers

There is no shortage of confidence in trainer Danny Gargan when it comes to talking about his stable star **Dornoch** (Good Magic). He boldly predicted that Dornoch would be the best horse he ever trained before the horse ever ran a race.

So far, so good. Dornoch comes into next Saturday's \$1.25 million GI Travers as perhaps the horse to beat as he is coming off victories in the GI Belmont Stakes and GI Haskell Stakes.

But he will have to conquer another Grade I race, something that is not lost on Gargan.

"It's hard to win three Grade I races in a row," Gargan said outside his barn on the Saratoga backstretch Saturday morning. "We are hoping he can do it; he has done so much for us. I mean, it's next to impossible to win three Grade Is in a row. If you win three in a row, you are a Hall of Fame horse."

Dornoch had his final Travers work on Saturday, working four furlongs in 47.65 (14/161) with Priscilla Schaefer on board. They worked in company with stablemate Ringy Dingy (Dialed In), a 3-year-old filly who was piloted by Carol Fisher.

"He looked great doing it," Gargan said. "It was just a normal maintenance work. We were trying to go in 48. This is a big-time race; you don't want to go in 51. It was ok. He will need to be fit for this, and he is. I thought he looked amazing."

Once the Saratoga meet ends, Gargan said that he will most likely have Dornoch stay and do his training up to the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at the Spa.

Pletcher Keeps Hearing the Same Question Over and Over About Fierceness

Standing outside his barn at the Oklahoma Training Track Saturday morning, Hall of Fame trainer Todd Pletcher was asked if he was sick of hearing the same question day after day.

The question: Why can't **Fierceness** (City of Light), the top 3-year-old in the barn, put two good races together back-to-back?

"I hope HE is getting tired of it, that's what I need," Pletcher said with a smile. "I need him to step it up."

Fierceness gets that chance next Saturday when he runs in the \$1.25 million, GI Travers at Saratoga. If he is able to find the winner's circle, the notion that Fierceness can't put consecutive wins together will finally be a moot point.

Fierceness has been near brilliant in his four career victories but not so much in the three career losses. When last seen, Fierceness impressed when he won the GII Jim Dandy at Saratoga by a length over Travers rival Sierra Leone (Gun Runner). The race before that, he was 15th in the GI Kentucky Derby as the favorite.

The beat goes on through his entire career although Pletcher will argue the third-place finish in the GIII Holy Bull at Gulfstream Park (which was right before he won the GI Florida Derby by a record 131/2 lengths}) wasn't so bad.

"On paper, it's in black and white," Pletcher said of Fierceness' resume. "I think the Holy Bull gets overly criticized. It was a pretty roughly run race and I don't think he ran that poorly. I think he is giving us all indications that he is sitting on another good race. He just has to go out and prove it."

Fierceness had his final pre-Travers work on Saturday, breezing four furlongs in :48.22 (32/161) with exercise rider Danny Wright. They worked in company with Bright Future (Curlin). "Super happy with it," Pletcher said. "He went well and finished up strongly and galloped out great. He did it seemingly effortlessly. He has always been a very good work horse."

Sierra Leone, Batten Down, Honor Marie Have Final Travers Works

Because he is from nearby Mechanicville, the \$1.25 million, GI Travers Stakes has always been a race trainer Chad Brown covets. So far, it has eluded him.

Maybe this year the trophy has his name on it. He says **Sierra Leone (Gun Runner)**, the \$2.3 million purchase at the 2022 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Yearling Sale, is his best shot.

"He has been pointed to this race for a very long time," Brown said outside his barn at the Oklahoma Training Track. "Going into the race, it sure looks like he is my best chance to win."

In the nine Travers Stakes that Brown has participated in, he has run 15 horses. Zandon, in 2022, and Miles D in 2021, both finished third. Those are the top results for Brown.

Saturday, Sierra Leone had his final Travers work, going four furlongs with exercise rider Kriss Bon in :49.20 (13/70) on the Oklahoma Training Track.

Two other horses had their final moves for the Midsummer Derby.

Batten Down (Tapit), with regular rider Junior Alvarado on board, worked five furlongs in 1:01.85 (4/15) for Hall of Famer Bill Mott on the Oklahoma. They worked in company with Bendoog (Gun Runner). Batten Down, the GIII Ohio Derby winner, was last seen finishing third in the GII Jim Dandy at Saratoga.

Trainer Whit Beckman sent **Honor Marie** (Honor Code) to his last Travers work Saturday morning on the Oklahoma. With jockey Tyler Gaffalione on board, Honor Marie covered four furlongs in :50.50 (54/70). "Just what we were looking for," Beckman said by phone. "Just something easy and smooth. Good work, nice gallop out. Nothing flashy."

The draw for the Travers will be held on Sunday. Two other horses--**Unmatched Wisdom** (Cairo Prince) and **Corporate Power** (Curlin)--had their final Travers works on Friday.

Unmatched Wisdom, also trained by Brown, went five furlongs in 1:00.41 (3/6) on the main track and Corporate Power, from the Hall of Fame barn of Shug McGaughey, had a bullet four-furlong breeze in :47.44 (1/45) on the Oklahoma.



ISCREAMUSREAM EXTENDS WIN STREAK IN

In her first start since a 33% share of her sold for \$330,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midsummer Flash Sale, Agave Racing **Iscreamuscream (Twirling Candy)** extended her record to a perfect four-for-four with a confident victory in Saturday's GI Del Mar Oaks.

Breaking from Post 1, the 3-1 second choice went to the fore with the leading group, carving out an opening quarter in sensible :24.20. Umberto Rispoli aboard recent Christiana Stakes winner **Whiskey Decision** (Into Mischief) decided the early pace was far too slow and rushed to the front, opening a slight advantage through a :48.10 half mile. Passing the 3/8ths pole, however, Hector Berrios drew his mount off the rail, taking her outside of the favorite and reemerging as the leader turning for home. confidently ridden from there, Iscreamuscream was challenged briefly by GIII Providencia Stakes winner Medoro (Honor Code), but had more than enough left in the tank to collect her first Grade I victory by 1 1/2 lengths. **Zona Verde (Ire)** (Calyx {GB}) rounded out the trifecta.

"When I felt Rispoli behind me I thought 'Okay, let him go to the lead while I pick up second,' said Berrios. "I know she had the speed but I wanted to stay behind. She was strong. She went very comfortably in second, and when I asked her to move, she responded. Today, before taking the lead she looked around, she was aware of the other fillies. She is a very,

very good filly." Winning trainer Phil D'Amato added, "Hector [Berrios] didn't push the button early. He stayed patient and circled around that other filly and re-engaged. I thought at the quarter pole when he got head-and-head with the favorite he still looked like he had a lot of horse left. I was just hoping she'd draw off and she did. It's a testament to Hector. He gets along with this filly very well and keeps her energy level up at all times and she's able to finish

Grayosh upset the heavily favored She Feels Pretty to provide trainer Chad Brown with a fourth straight victory in the GII Lake Placid Stakes at Saratoga.

Backed at odds of 7-1, the rail-drawn Grayosh raced in an inside third behind a pair of longshot leaders through fractions of :24.22 and :49.67. The gray set her sights on the pacesetting Ori (Hard Spun) and was guided off the rail by Flavien Prat in the stretch. With Ori beginning to pack it in, Grayosh raced shoulder to shoulder with last year's aforementioned unlucky GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf third-place finisher down the lane and wanted it a little bit more to deliver a neck victory.

Grayosh, a maiden winner at third asking over the Big A lawn Apr. 20, was fourth in the GII Wonder Again Stakes May 27. She just got nosed out in her most recent attempt in an optional claimer at the Spa July 18.

"The more I saw her train, I just treated it [her last race] as a win," Brown said after recording a record-extending sixth win in the Lake Placid. "I was using it maybe as a prep for this race and I started to get past the fact that she got beat. She really was training super, and then I just entered to take a look. When she drew so well, I said, 'You know what, let's give it a go, I think she can at least be competitive and get a piece.' She showed a lot of heart there to find more and really out-finish a good horse."

On a potential next start in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Oct. 12 at Keeneland, Brown said, "She could be an interesting horse for the Queen Elizabeth. I know it's a big step, but I've had luck in that race and she fits."

Winning owner Flanagan Racing also campaigns **'TDN Rising Star'** Chancer McPatrick (McKinzie), a visually impressive debut winner at the Spa July 27.

Pedigree Notes:

Grayosh, a shrewd \$25,000 FTKOCT yearling purchase by Sean Flanagan, becomes the first graded and fourth stakes winner worldwide for former WinStar stallion Yoshida (Jpn), who now stands at Darley Japan. Subsanador (Arg), champion 2-year-old colt and a three-time top-level winner in his native land, recorded his first graded stakes victory on these shores in Saturday's GIII Philip Iselin Stakes at Monmouth Park. Backed as the 3-2 favorite, Subsanador chased in fourth beneath Mike Smith rounding the clubhouse turn. Traveling nicely in that same spot behind a pair of dueling leaders, he hit the gas with a flashy three-wide move on the far turn and blew the race apart approaching the quarter pole. He was well clear in the stretch and was never seriously threatened by the neversay-die II Miracolo, who cut the margin of victory to 1 1/2 lengths.

Subsanador made his two first starts in this country for Stud Facundito and trainer John Sadler, including a painful second, beaten only a head, in the GI Santa Anita Handicap Mar. 3.

Carrying the colors of Wathnan Racing for the first time, Subsanador faded to fourth after a freshening while making his first attempt for Hall of Fame trainer Richard Mandella in the GII Hollywood Gold Cup last time May 27.

"We thought it would be best to let him run out of there," Mandella said. "But I told Mike, 'once you break, do what you think is best.' He was able to work out a perfect trip. It was a good race, the timing was good, he was ready to run so we shipped him here for this. He has been working very well, so I knew he was ready. I'm liking him better and better. We're starting to see some of that Argentina form. We'll take him home and think about what to do next. There's a race at Santa Anita on Sept. 28 (GI California Crown) that we'll take a look at."

Pedigree Notes:

Subsanador is one of 42 graded/group winners worldwide for the Darley-bred and Godolphin-campaigned Fortify, who finished third in the 2012 GI Champagne Stakes and fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He is the first foal out of his unraced dam. She is also responsible for the 2-year-old filly Blind Date (Arg) (Nicholas {Arg}).

"We understand the disappointment for everyone who joined us today, including our great fans, but it was the right decision, one made in concert with the HBPA, jockeys, and veterinarians, to cancel the races.

"We want to thank everyone for their understanding of the decision that was made, and hope we can welcome you back this Friday, where we will crown another Plate winner and add their name to a list of great champions."

1,000 WINS IN NORTH AMERICA FOR TRAINER GEORGE WEAVER

When Beautiful Thief (Dialed In) won the 12th race at Saratoga Saturday, a maiden special weight on the turf for fillies three and up, she was doing more than visiting the winner's circle for the first time. Her victory pushed trainer George Weaver over the threshold of 1,000 career wins in North America.

"It feels good. It took a lot of years to get here, we've been working hard for many, many years," said Weaver. "You don't really think about these things until they happen. There was a little gap, it took us a couple weeks, we had some live horses run and just didn't get there. I knew it was going to come and was hoping it would happen here at such a special place." Weaver went out on his own in 2002--and got his first win that same year--after serving under D. Wayne Lukas, Todd Pletcher, and John Hennig. MGISW Vekoma was one of his trainees, as was GISW Lighthouse Bay and Dubai G1SW Saratoga County. Last year, he trained Crimson Advocate (Nyquist) to a win in the G2 Queen Mary at Royal Ascot, becoming only the third American conditioner to win a race there.

"Technically, we won the race at Ascot and one in Dubai, which didn't count, so I've already passed 1,000 wins," mused Weaver. "When they hold the sign up and announce it, and you look back on all the years we've worked so hard, and so many nice horses and owners, it makes you look back [fondly]."

JONATHAN'S WAY A SECOND 'TDN RISING STAR' FOR VEKOMA

With a strong mid-race move, **Jonathan's Way** (Vekoma) took command at the top of the Saratoga stretch and came home impressively, becoming the second '**TDN Rising Star**' and 15th overall winner for freshman sire Vekoma (by Candy Ride {Arg}).

Facing a pair of well-backed runners in the coupled entry of Moment's Notice (More Than Ready) and \$1.35-million KEESEP first-timer Sansone (Uncle Mo), Jonathan's Way broke from the outer half of the gate in line with the field but got squeezed back to last in the first few jumps and had to work to stay in touch from the rear. Kept along the outside, he regained position into the far turn under Joel Rosario and promptly circled the field while widest of all, fanned out five wide with a quarter mile left to run. Despite drifting down towards the rail in the final furlong, Jonathan's Way was well clear and home free, checking in 4 1/2 lengths in front of Moment's Notice while Sansone was never involved, eased to the line and walked off.

A \$290,000 weanling purchase at Keeneland November in 2022 from the first crop of Vekoma, Jonathan's Way is the fifth to the races and fifth winner out of stakes winner Female Drama (Indian Charlie) whose most successful runner to date is Startdfromdabottom (Kantharos), MSP, \$275,642. The dam is herself a half to Argentinian MG1SW New Real Deal (Roy), the dam of MGSP Near You (Arg) (Remote {GB}). She produced a yearling Thousand Words filly named Dramatic Charlotte, reported a filly by Nashville this season and returned to the same WinStar Farm stallion for 2025.

JONATHAN'S WAY AN IMPRESSIVE WINNER ON CAREER DEBUT AT SARATOGA by Tim Wilkin

SARATOGA SPRINGS -- At the top of the stretch of the opener of the Saturday card at Saratoga Race Course, a 2-year-old colt named **Jonathan's Way** (Vekoma) was fanned six, maybe seven wide.

But he was moving and, like a giant tidal wave, gathering momentum with each long, powerful stride.

Out in California, Richard Rigney, who owns the colt, was watching the race on a cellphone along with bloodstock agent John Moynihan. They had hope, but they also were realists. After all, the six-furlong race was the first in Jonathan's Way career.

"I was thinking, 'this horse has to stop at some point'," Moynihan said by phone from the West Coast, "because he is going to get tired at some point."

Jonathan's Way stopped alright. After he won the \$100,000 maiden special weight by an emphatic 4 1/4 lengths. It didn't look like he was tired at all.

"This," trainer Phil Bauer said in the Saratoga winner's circle, "was very visually impressive."

"We have been really excited about this horse for a long time," Rigney said.

Moynihan has been working with Rigney for four years and picked out Jonathan's Way at the 2022 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. He was purchased for \$290,000.

"John bought this horse as a weanling," Rigney said. "We bought five or six weanlings at the time and got some real nice Vekomas out of it." **Cont.**

Bauer said that three of the young horses he has in the barn are from Vekoma's first crop. Moynihan was impressed with the look of the young weanling that would become Jonathan's Way when he saw him at the Keeneland sale.

"He is a beautiful, beautiful horse," Moynihan said. "He was the prettiest horse that sold day as I remember. He was later on in the book, by a freshman horse in Vekoma, but he was a gorgeous individual and we thought we would take a swing at him. We were lucky enough to get him. He was absolutely gorgeous; he has been gorgeous all his life."

On Saturday, Jonathan's Way was the third 2-1 third choice in the field of nine. Ridden by Hall of Famer Joel Rosario, Jonathan's Way had an auspicious start when he was taken up while being pinched back between horses and then had to come from off the pace.

For a young horse to go through that and then race wide, he showed Bauer, Rigney and Moynihan some raw talent.

He ran the six furlongs in 1:10.40 on a track labeled fast and returned \$6.40.

"He got a little green with the dirt and Joel got into him," Bauer said. "He put Joel in the backseat. He was fit enough, he was on the bridle and then he was just clearly the best."

Rigney said he named the horse for his 17-year-old son, Jonathan. In fact, he names a lot of his horses for his children. In addition to Jonathan, he has 14-year-old twin daughters Madison and Claire who get horses for their names.

Rigney and Moynihan were in California to run Buchu (Justify), a 3-year-old filly, in the \$300,000, GI Del Mar Oaks on Saturday.

There might be reason for another trip to California in November if Jonathan's Way earns his way to the Breeders' Cup. Of course, that is a long way off. Bauer said the next step for the colt could be the GIII Iroquois Stakes at Churchill Downs on Sept. 14 or the GI Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland on Oct. 5.

"We could not be any happier with how this went," Rigney said. "We are very fortunate."

CONCORD GREEN SPARKLES IN THE STRETCH FOR THE MAIDEN VICTORY

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. -- Hall of Fame trainer Shug McGaughey expected a solid performance from **Concord Green** (War Front) in his career debut at Saratoga Race Course Saturday and the bay colt delivered.

After breaking awkwardly from the gate that left him 11 1/2 lengths off the pace after a half-mile in :48.74, Concord Green and Dylan Davis moved into contention on the second turn and finished with authority to win by three-quarters of a length over Davy Crockett (Constitution). Concord Green completed the 1 1/16 miles \$100,000 maiden special weight race for 2-year-olds in 1:46.22. Sent off at 13-1, he returned \$28.40.

Stuart Janney bred and owns Concord Green, who is out of the Arch mare Mata Mua.

"He's a horse that I've liked all along," McGaughey said. "I like his pedigree. I like his mother. I like Arch mares and I love War Front. The War Fronts are really nice to train. This horse was a horse I liked all along. When I saw him in Ocala in the winter, he was sort of my pick of Stuart Janney's 2-year-olds. I'm not surprised he ran the way he did, not that he won, maybe, but the way he finished."

With the early troubles behind him, Davis worked to put Concord Green into competitive position in the run through the backstretch. Sam's Rocket (American Pharoah) was the pacesetter with the first quarter in :23.61, six furlongs in 1:14.93 and still was in front when the field reached the stretch. **Cont.**

Sam's Rocket and the others on the lead early paid the price in the stretch when the closers arrived to take charge. Though he was running erratically, Davy Crockett made a strong bid in the stretch and did make it to the front and looked to be in a position to continue on and win. Once Davy Crockett got past him and out of the way, Concord Green turned in a strong rally more toward the center of the course, passed Davy Crockett inside the sixteenth pole and prevailed.

"Dylan rode a good race," McGaughey said. "He saved the ground. He said he was a little spotty kind of down in there. He got him to the outside, he found his stride and he finished up well."

Through the years, McGaughey trained the dam and the granddam, Impressionism (Broad Brush) and their families for Janney. Concord Green is a half to graded stakes winner Scarlett Sky (Sky Mesa).

McGaughey said Concord Green has flourished during his time in Saratoga this summer.



"I've been happy with the way he's trained up here," McGaughey said. "I think he's matured a lot since we've been here, which I like. I think that the older he gets, the better, body-wise and stuff he's going to get. I think his future could be in front of him."

McGaughey said Concord Green may go on to the GII Pilgrim Stakes on Sept. 28 at Aqueduct Racetrack or possibly to a 2-year-old stake at Keeneland.

"If everything's okay," McGaughey said, "I'll try to pick out the right spot for him."

They were 1-2 in the gate and they finished 1-2 here with Sunset Glory (Ire) reeling in Linda's Gift in the shadow of the wire to win the CTT and TOC Stakes at Del Mar Friday.

Always improving since her move from Ireland to the States, she made a lone runner-up start in 2022 after being imported to California.

She missed all of 2023, and broke her maiden with a winning return Apr. 27 this year going this distance for the first time and on first time Lasix. She followed that up with a 3 1/4-length victory over optional claiming company July 21 last out, and produced another Beyer figure jump to 87, putting her in clear contention here.

Away well and keen as Linda's Gift took up her customary position at the head of affairs, the 2-1 second choice watched that one establish :24.87, :48.98 and 1:13.15 splits with a clear margin on her competition. Stalking from her rail position but taking aim on the far turn as the tempo picked up for the charge home, she'd come on even terms with that longtime leader outside the eighth pole and refused to be denied late, edging clear in the final yards to win by a half-length.

"[Linda's Gift] is so good. She's been dominant when she gets the kind of leads like that, so I was a little concerned," said trainer Michael McCarthy. "But, this filly [Sunset Glory], in both of her victories, has been coming late running underneath the wire, so I had a sneaky suspicion that she'd be able to get the distance. It's nice to get it done."

SEA THE STARS FILLY LEADS THE WAY AT 730K AT ARQANA - BUT OVERALL TRADE TAKES A DIP

DEAUVILLE, France — Just 24 hours after John Stewart's Resolute Racing lit up Arqana when snapping up a Wootton Bassett (GB) filly for €1.4 million, it was another American-based buyer who commanded top lot status at the August Yearling Sale when bloodstock agents Alex Solis and Jason Litt struck the winning bid of €730,000 for lot 187, a Sea The Stars (Ire) filly out of an unraced half-sister to the multiple Group 1 winner The Fugue (GB) (Dansili {GB}).

While Solis and Litt signed for five yearlings worth \in 1.25 million on behalf of leading American owner Mike Repole, the pair couldn't be drawn on who the Saturday top lot had been purchased for.

"It's Sea The Stars, a big-name stallion, and she was a beautiful filly," Litt said of the purchase. "We're happy to have her and hopefully we can get lucky."

He added, "Nothing is decided at this point [in terms of future plans]. They always have good horses here and we were just fortunate to acquire her." **Cont. p3**

ARQANA WELCOMES JAPAN'S FIRST FEMALE TRAINER KYOKO MAEKAWA

DEAUVILLE, France — An important marker in the history of Japanese racing was passed in December 2023 when Kyoko Maekawa becameT the first woman to be granted a training licence in the country.

Now 47, Maekawa has worked at Ritto Training Centre in the Shiga Prefecture in western Japan for 21 years. As she completes her apprenticeship alongside the internationally successful trainer Yoshito Yahagi, Maekawa is in Deauville this week to expand her knowledge of the racing and breeding world in other jurisdictions.

"I was granted my licence last year and have not yet started my own training operation but expect to do so from next March," she told *TDN* on Saturday. "I have worked as an assistant trainer for several different trainers and after being granted my licence I have to complete a one-year internship so I decided to learn from Mr Yahagi."

Maekawa is one of almost 200 licensed trainers in the Japan Racing Association (JRA) and will remain at Ritto as she establishes her own business. **Cont. p11**

The filly was consigned by Haras de Castillon and is the first foal out of the Shalaa (Ire) mare La Vie (Fr), whose exceptional sibling The Fugue won four races at the top level for John Gosden and Lord Lloyd Webber, including the Irish Champion Stakes and the Prince Of Wales's Stakes when taking on the boys.

The second dam is the G2 Ribblesdale Stakes runner-up Twyla

Tharp (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), who is in turn a half-sister to the G1 Queen Elizabeth Stakes scorer Summoner (GB) (Inchinor {GB}) and the G1 Coral-Eclipse winner Compton Admiral (GB) (Suave Dancer).

While no yearling managed to reach the seven-figure mark on Saturday, there was at least a much better clearance rate of 82% posted compared to Friday's 72%.

However, on comparative figures to this day last year, the average dropped by 18% to €199,343 and the median fell from €185,000 last year to €150,000 on Saturday. All told, the turnover of €13,356,00 was down 20% on the equivalent day last year.

Second Foal out of Tasleet Sibling Commands \in 620k

It's fair to say that Lady Light (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) packed a lot into a relatively short space of time in a racing career spanning just two starts as a juvenile, first making a successful debut at Yarmouth and then gaining black type when finishing third in the Listed Bosra Sham Stakes at Newmarket.

Whatever the reason for it, the decision to then draw stumps after that promising two-year-old campaign can't have been a difficult one, with no need to take risks when you're dealing with a filly with a pedigree like hers. **Cont. p4**

You have Battaash and The Antarctic, a very good two-year-old for Coolmore.

was very good, so that's why he made that price. He's probably going to spend two weeks on his holidays and then we'll break him in before we see where he goes."

John Stewart followed his headline purchase on the opening day with another significant buy in the shape of Lot 233, a Dubawi (Ire) colt out of the winning Kingman (GB) mare Mulan (Ire).

Making his bids online, on the

advice of Irishman Gavin O'Connor who has been representing the Resolute Racing team at Arqana this week, Stewart eventually emerged victorious in the battle for the Monceaux colt with an offer of €550,000. **Cont. p5**



Moa Sundstrom led the colt through the ring and was in tears as she returned him to his stable following the fall of the hammer. "I've no idea what just happened," she exclaimed. "We love Mastercraftsman and she was an

outstanding mover of a mare, lovely bone and width to her, but I didn't think there would be €420,000 coming from her. But this colt is special. He was a lovely foal and a bit careful about everything but then he turned one and my mum said, 'He's going to take over the world.'" **Cont. p7**

She added, "Something we believe in strongly is that there's no better team than family, and Conor is a big part of our family now. This is what we're meant to do."

Nolan added, "This is unbelievable. You don't get these sorts of things coming round every day. We got on so well with our pinhook yesterday--we pinhooked a Blue Point filly from €150,000 into €500,000 and we said 'That will never happen again' and now it's after happening again.

"We're very proud of the whole team at home who did such a good job with the prep. Let's hope he goes and does it now, that's the main thing. The mare has a lovely Churchill colt on the ground but she might be going back to Victor Ludorum."

The G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere and G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner Victor Ludorum, who started his stud career at Haras du Logis at a fee of \in 15,000, has had seven yearlings sold over the last two days for an average of \in 152,143.

Talking Points

- The strength of the American buying bench has been one of the major themes in Deauville. After John Stewart's Resolute Racing signed for the €1.4 million top lot filly by Wootton Bassett on Friday followed by his €550,000 spend on the Dubawi colt on Saturday, various US-based buyers got in on the action. In fact, two of the top four lots were bought for export to America on Saturday.
- Just a few hours after Al Shaqab's last-minute swoop to sign Simmering paid off handsomely when the Ollie Sangster-trained filly scooped the G2 Prix du Calvados, the powerful outfit continued its recruitment drive when signing for five yearlings to the tune of €1.635 million, bringing the total outlay to €2.615 million over the past two days. Most notably, Al Shaqab signed for two fillies by St Mark's Basilica (Fr) for €550,000 (Lot 178) and €225,000 (Lot 160) respectively. Saturday's haul also featured a €420,000 Wootton Bassett filly (Lot 225) from Haras d'Etreham.



- St Mark's Basilica has enjoyed a pretty solid couple of days in France. Along with the €550,000 filly by the multiple Group 1 winner that was sold to Al Shaqab Racing, Coolmore's newbie stallion has had six of his first crop yearlings sell for an average of €261,667. Buyers included French-based trainer Gavin Hernon and Japan's Yoshito Yahagi.
- Sumbe has been riding the crest of a wave with Charyn (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) emerging as one of Europe's leading older milers, so it was no surprise to see Nurlan Bizakov's operation stretch to €420,000 to secure a filly by Yeomanstown Stud's evergreen stallion. Offered by Ecurie des Monceaux, Lot 215 is from the family of Hong Kong star Romantic Warrior (Ire). Tony Fry, general manager at Sumbe said, "Dark Angel has been good to the boss. Dark Angel is a superstar sire and this is a lovely-looking filly by him."

Gowans Gets On The Scoreboard

Continuing the American theme at Arqana, Gainesway's Ben Gowans and Corbin Blumberg of Starlight Racing, went to €310,0000 to secure a Showcasing (GB) filly (Lot 164) to bring back home to trainer Mark Grier in the States.

While Gowans has bought horses at Argana previously, this

week represented the first time shopping in France for Blumberg, with the pair visibly delighted with their new acquisition.

Gowans said, "We bought her for Mark Grier, who is a client of mine, and Corbin works for Starlight Racing. She'll come back home to America and is a lovely filly with great body. We loved her every time we saw her and were very happy to be able to bring her home."

He added, "I bought a Churchill filly for Mark here last year. She's in training now and this is a trip I enjoy. It's a sale that would have a little bit more variety compared to any sale we have back home in America. There are a lot of different types, a lot of different levels to play at, so there are a lot of horses here that we like and they are pretty obvious."

Born in Tomisato in the Chiba Prefecture which neighbours Tokyo, her equine interest was first piqued by the presence of some prominent stud farms in that area. Subsequent riding lessons eventually led to a career in horseracing.

There is no doubting Maekawa's commitment to her chosen way of life. Her email address begins 'ilovehorse', but she is impressively phlegmatic in acknowledging her role as a history-maker in her home country.

"Since I was born I have been female so it doesn't feel very special to me," she said with a laugh. "But since I passed my examination to be given my licence lots and lots of people have contacted me and have said that as I am the first female trainer they would like to support me. So now I feel that I am very lucky to be the first."

Though she has previously visited Kildare and Newmarket on a JRA-organised tour, Maekawa had not attended a yearling sale outside Japan until this week and she has had the perfect guide in Yahagi, who has become a regular visitor to the Arqana August Sale. Two years ago he bought the full-brother to Sottsass (Fr), who, now named Shin Emperor (Fr), is a Grade 3 winner and was third in the G1 Japanese Derby. Yahagi is now planning a raid on the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in October, and he added a new recruit to his stable when buying a Frankel (GB) filly for €800,000 during the opening session of this year's sale.

"This has been a great experience for me," said Maekawa of her first to an Arqana sale. "I have managed to see some yearlings by Frankel and it is a great opportunity to see yearlings by the top European stallions." And, like her mentor, she has designs on a globetrotting career when she launches her training operation in 2025.

She added, "In future I would love to be competitive on all the international stages like Mr Yahagi. When I start training, if I find a suitable race for a horse outside Japan I wouldn't hesitate to go there, and this is why I wanted to learn with Mr Yahagi, as he has so much experience of this."

SIMMERING WINS THE CALVADOS FOR AL SHAQAB by Tom Frary

Relishing the step up to seven furlongs on Saturday, Al Shaqab's G3 Princess Margaret Stakes winner **Simmering (GB)** (Too Darn Hot {GB}--Cashla Bay {GB}, by Fastnet Rock {Aus}) mastered her peers with a degree of comfort in Deauville's G2 Prix du Calvados to suggest she can enter elite territory sooner rather than later. Always travelling easily under Dylan Browne McMonagle tracking the pace, the Ollie Sangster-trained 7-5 favourite cruised to the front two out and once committed soon after gave generous response to inflict a three-length defeat on the previously unbeaten **Fraise Des Bois (Fr)** (Zelzal {Fr}).

"It was a much easier watch than the Princess Margaret," Sangster said. "She travelled smoothly and put the race to bed really nicely. The step up to seven seemed to bring about improvement and I think the added racing also helped, there was an element of greenness there when she won at Ascot. I also think she will improve for some better ground and she's a scopey filly and I don't think she will just be a two-year-old."

G2 Prix du Calvados Cont.

Simmering, who had finished runner-up to Fairy Godmother (Ire) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) in Royal Ascot's G3 Albany Stakes on her second start, is set to go up in trip again according to her trainer. "She will have a maximum of two more starts and the Breeders' Cup is a possible option," he added. "We've also got the Prix Marcel Boussac--obviously Arc weekend is sponsored by Qatar, so it's an option we will consider."

Simmering's dam Cashla Bay is a daughter of Rose Blossom (GB) (Pastoral Pursuits {GB}), who captured the G3 Summer Stakes and the Listed Flying Fillies' Stakes. DIANE FOURTH AVENTURE SURGES FROM LAST TO FIRST TO CLAIM POMONE VICTORY

Alain and Gerard Wertheimer's '**TDN Rising Star**' and G1 Prix de Diane fourth **Aventure (Ire)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}--Balladeuse {Fr}, by Singspiel {Ire}), who had dazzled with a seven-length triumph in June's G3 Prix de Royaumont, bounce back in style and surged from last to first for a second pattern-race success in Saturday's G2 Prix de Pomone at Deauville.

The 3-5 favourite, the lone sophomore in a seven-strong field, was tucked in behind all six rivals upon leaving the stalls and employed patient tactics racing off a sedate tempo for the most part. Angled out wide for a clear passage passing the quartermile marker, she quickened in style to seize control with 300 metres remaining and was pushed out in the closing stages to hold overseas raiders **Trevaunance (Ire)** (Muhaarar {GB}) and **One Evening (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) by a short-neck and a short-head.

"She is such a lovely filly and, after she won the Royaumont so nicely, we tried the [G1] Prix de Diane where she ran a great race again, but it maybe came a bit too soon," said trainer Christophe Ferland. "She is better over a longer distance, she is a Group 3 and a Group 2 winner now and we will try to win a Group 1 with her. The obvious target is the [Sept. 15 G1] Prix Vermeille [at ParisLongchamp] if she comes out of this one in good form."

Getting back on the winning trail in the G3 Royal Whip Stakes at The Curragh on Saturday, Ballydoyle's G1 St Leger hero **Continuous (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}--Fluff {Ire}, by Galileo {Ire}) served notice that he is ready for some serious autumn action with options open. Badly needing his reintroduction when fifth in a strong renewal of Royal Ascot's G2 Hardwicke Stakes in June, the 4-7 favourite shadowed the leader **Trustyourinstinct** (Ire) (Churchill {Ire}) before edging ahead three out and forging a workmanlike half-length success under Ryan Moore in a fast time.

"Ascot didn't work for him and he could go to the Irish Champion after this, finish in the first four and then go to the Arc and the English Champion on soft ground," O'Brien said. "He could go for the [Irish] Leger, but we have Kyprios. He can do a Japan Cup. He's a very versatile horse, a great horse to have. He can do next year, he has so many options. He has had a nice easy time and he was always going to be a horse for the backend this year. He could even go two miles, we've never went that far but he could, I'd say. He's an unusual type of horse. He's genuine and classy and his head is always down."

BALLYDOYLE'S GROSVENOR SQUARE SENSATIONAL IN THE LEGER TRIAL

Stamping his authority on Saturday's G3 Irish St Leger Trial Stakes, **Grosvenor Square (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}--Wadyhatta {GB}, by Cape Cross {Ire}) added serious ballast to Ballydoyle's Doncaster Classic team with a scintillating 20-length romp. Out on his own from the outset, the 1-2 favourite, who had been overhauled in dramatic fashion late on by his top-class stablemate Tower Of London (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G2 Curragh Cup over this 14-furlong trip last month, gave Ryan Moore an armchair ride as he came home on his own with the yawning gap to the 80-1 shot **Courageous Strike (GB)** (National Defense {GB}). Aidan O'Brien may well have found the natural successor to Kyprios (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) when that stayer makes way, but either the G1 Irish St Leger or the G1 St Leger look to be the immediate aim. "He has serious stamina when he gets into a rhythm. He's an exciting horse and we always felt he was one who wanted to be let go," he said of the winner, who had taken the G3 Eyrefield Stakes at two and was third in the G3 Chester Vase and seventh in the G1 Irish Derby prior to his impressive Curragh Cup effort.

"We let him float around at Chester and the last day was the first time we let him go and it took Tower Of London to come and get him. Ryan said he was very chilled today and happy to do whatever. It's a quandary for the other jockeys whether you follow him or don't follow him, as he has a big stride and he doesn't come back to them. I said to Ryan 'was he finished at the line?' and he said he wasn't, that he galloped through the line."

"It's very hard not to go to Doncaster, we'll see what the lads want to do but it's 3-year-olds there and not at The Curragh," O'Brien added. "He's so uncomplicated, you go out there and let him go. He handles soft ground as well. He's going to be a lovely horse for next year as well--he has a big frame and there's no doubt he has to be a better horse next year."

BLACK-TYPE REVIEW

There was a pulsating finish to Saturday's G2 BetVictor Hungerford Stakes at Newbury, with just inches separating the first three at the line, and it was Jon and Julia Aisbitt's homebred dual Group 3 winner **Tiber Flow (Ire)** (Caravaggio--Malabar {GB}, by Raven's Pass) who got the verdict in the Berkshire venue's seven-furlong feature. The 5-year-old William Haggas trainee was in front where it mattered most and claimed a career high by a nose from **Witch Hunter (Fr)** (Siyouni {Fr}), with short-head back to **Jumby (Ire)** (New Bay {GB}) in third.

"He's an absolute legend, he's such a star and I couldn't be more proud of him," beamed Maureen Haggas. "He wants to win and that's a pretty hard trait to find in a lot of horses. I thought he was dead [after falling in the G2 Duke of York]. I took my shoes off and went running down the track and he just came cantering past me with his ears pricked. I promise you, we went back to the stables after and it didn't seem to bother him, he must be as hard as nails. He's as tough as old boots and he prefers softer ground in an ideal world, but you just wouldn't know. He just keeps surprising us."

Earlier on the card, Shadwell homebred **Al Aasy (Ire)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}--Kitcara {GB}, by Shamardal) initiated a pattern-race double for the Haggas team, and struck for the sixth time at Group 3 level, with a two-length triumph in the G3 BetVictor Geoffrey Freer Stakes. Sent off as the even-money favourite, the 2021 G1 Coronation Cup runner-up was largely untroubled in the extended 13-furlong stamina test and came from off the pace to easily defeat **Al Qareem (Ire)** (Awtaad {Ire}) with panache. It was his second Group 3 victory of the month and arrived off the back of a one-length tally in Goodwood's G3 Glorious Stakes.

"He has always been a talented horse and has probably been better since he's been gelded," said Maureen Haggas. "It's only four weeks since he had his first run of the season and he's had two weeks from then till Goodwood and another two weeks till today. It was a big ask, but we couldn't pass up an opportunity like today and had to come. He enjoyed it today and it was a good pace, which he enjoys. He's run over all sorts of trips, from a mile up to a mile-and-five, but he just likes a good pace. He used to be very keen and he's not as keen now, but can still be very strong when he wants to. This lad goes on any ground and these older horses, if you look after them and they are sound, then they are just wonderful to have around."

'THEY ARE TWO EXCITING COLTS': BURKE KEEN ON HOTSHOTS ARABIE AND SHAREHOLDER IN THE MORNY

Deauville's G1 Sumbe Prix Morny has proven a happy hunting

ground for Royal Ascot winners in recent years and Wathnan Racing's G2 Norfolk Stakes winner **Shareholder** (Not This Time) is the latest to try a unique double on Sunday. The trouble for that unbeaten colt is that he faces a real threat not just from outside his own yard but also from within. Karl Burke saddles a live second contender in Mohamed Saeed Al Shahi's G3 Prix du Bois and G2 Prix Robert Papin winner **Arabie (GB)** (Dandy Man {GB}), who may just pose the biggest danger to his stablemate having given the impression he has more in the tank despite his admirable achievements.

"They are two exciting colts," their trainer said ahead of this GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint qualifier. "With Shareholder, it has been well-documented what we think of him and hopefully he can prove it, but I wouldn't dismiss Arabie as he is so tough. He's not a flashy horse and I think he has gone under the radar a bit--he's as hard as nails. They go there in great form and have travelled over well – they have taken it in their stride."

Fourth in the Norfolk before winning the G2 July Stakes and finishing runner-up to TDN Rising Star Babouche (GB) (Kodiac {GB}) in Sunday's G1 Phoenix Stakes, Ballydoyle's **Whistlejacket** (Ire) (No Nay Never) goes again which may be significant given the quick turnaround. It could be that Team Ballydoyle feel that he has come on for his effort seven days ago and Aidan O'Brien is positive about his prospects. "He came out of the race very well and his canters have been getting stronger all week," he explained. "The plan was always to go for the two races, we were thinking of that before the Curragh--he's a big,

uncomplicated strong horse and we're looking forward to it." Also successful at Royal Ascot was Manton Thoroughbreds' **Rashabar (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), who is proven over this six-furlong trip having conquered the G2 Coventry Stakes when last seen. **Cont. p17**

He joins Gousserie Racing and Sandrine Gavrois's G3 Prix de Cabourg winner **Daylight (Fr)** (Earthlight {Ire}), the Wertheimers' **TDN Rising Star Polyvega (Ire)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}) who was runner-up in the Cabourg, and Shaikh Duaij Al Khalifa's supplemented G2 Duchess Of Cambridge Stakes winner **Arabian Dusk (GB)** (Havana Grey {GB}) in a strong renewal.

Brian Meehan, who has won the Morny twice, believes that Rashabar is made of the right material and Sam Sangster agrees. "He's in incredible form at home and Brian feels he has improved," he said. "It's a big day for the syndicate and everyone involved and we're incredibly excited. He's got the French premiums, which was definitely part of our decision to come here. He had the option of running in the Phoenix, but with the premiums this was too big of a temptation."

"Brian feels this horse is the ideal candidate and straight after the Coventry, the first thing he said to me was 'Prix Morny'. It's a stallion-making race as well, so we have to bear that in mind and I feel he is a horse who after this is going to step up in trip and if he keeps going the way we think he is, then the Breeders' Cup could be on the ticket for later in the year," he added.

LEGENDARY AUSTRALIAN SPRINTER BLACK CAVIAR DIES FOLLOWING LAMINITIS DISEASE

Australia's darling racemare **Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}), who carved out a reputation as being one of the world's best sprinters following an unbeaten 25-race career, has died one day shy of her 18th birthday following laminitis disease.

The winner of 15 Group 1 races was humanely euthanised at the Scone Equine Hospital on Saturday morning after giving birth to a foal.

"You don't think it affects you, but you are being stupid not to think it doesn't," her trainer Peter Moody told reporters at Caulfield, as reported by *Racing.com*.

"It's impossible not to get attached to most animals, let alone one like her. She had the foal this morning, a colt foal by Snitzel and they put her down shortly after that on humane grounds.

"They scanned her feet yesterday and there was no blood flow at all to her feet. There was minimum blood flow to her feet

anyhow but there was none and she's such a big girl. I rang all the staff and told them. They were all very upset."

Black Caviar was added to the Australian Racing Hall of Fame after retiring in 2013, amassing nearly \$A8 million for prize-money. But perhaps she will be best remembered in Europe for her victory in the 2012 Diamond Jubilee Stakes, where a stunningly-cool Luke Nolen stopped riding towards the finish, with the 1-6 favourite holding on to win by just a head from the fast-finishing Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}).

Nolen, who guided Black Caviar to the majority of her wins, commented, "It's a hollow feeling. You could say she was just a horse, but she was more than a horse and that's why we're feeling a bit blue. She meant a great deal to us.

"She was an integral part of my career but, more importantly, she was so important for racing itself. She was one of our equine heroes. It was great to be a part of her story, but I always felt a bit guilty because anyone could've done the job."
