Finally there's a feeling that Bradsell (GB) (Tasleet {GB}) is starting to get the recognition he deserves following his scintillating success in the G1 Nunthorpe Stakes at York's Ebor Festival. Already a two-time winner at Royal Ascot before that career high on the Knavesmire, he's quietly put together the sort of record which ought to earn him a queue of mares at his stable door by the time his racing days are over.

And if for whatever reason it doesn't work out for Bradsell as a stallion, then he'll surely always have a place at Tattersalls as the equine ambassador for the Somerville Yearling Sale, having been bought at Park Paddocks for just 12,000gns in its very first year in 2021. He's been the poster boy ever since.

"He's an absolutely outstanding advertisement for the Somerville Yearling Sale," Tattersalls marketing director Jimmy George said of Archie Watson's sprinting star on the eve of this year's sale. "He was immense in the Nunthorpe and he looks as if he's got all of the credentials to go on to more Group 1 glory. For a sale of this nature, it's fantastic to have flagbearers of this quality."

FANTASTIC MOON WINS THE GROSSER PREIS VON BADEN by Tom Frary

Recording his first elite-level success since last year's G1
Deutsches Derby, Liberty Racing's **Fantastic Moon (Ger)** (Sea
The Moon {Ger}) proved too strong for **Dubai Honour (Ire)**(Pride Of Dubai {Aus}) in Sunday's G1 Grosser Preis von Baden.
Anchored in rear early by Rene Piechulek, the Sarah
Steinberg-trained 2-1 second favourite surged to the front inside the final two furlongs en route to a 1 1/4-length success from the William Haggas raider.

"I don't really know what to say. We already had such great times with 'Fanta', I was so happy to see that Rene held him up in last place and he was able to relax, that was so important for today and it worked out beautifully," trainer Sarah Steinberg said. "He is the best horse in Germany and we will go straight to the Arc now where Rene will ride him. He needs good ground for his best form." Cont., p5

Bradsell certainly isn't the only one. This year alone the juveniles Arabian Dusk (GB) (Havana Grey {GB}), Enchanting Empress (GB) (Sergei Prokofiev) and Tropical Storm (GB) (Eqtidaar {Ire}) have all won Pattern contests after changing hands at this sale 12 months ago. Listed scorers Enchanting Empress and Tropical Storm sold for 62,000gns and 50,000gns, respectively, while Arabian Dusk, the winner of the G2 Duchess Of Cambridge Stakes, proved a successful pinhook after being picked up for 80,000gns.

"She emphasises two aspects to the sale, I think," George said of Arabian Dusk. "It shows the quality of the horses to be found in the Somerville Yearling Sale, but it's also been a very happy hunting ground for the breeze-up consignors. She was bought for 80,000gns last year and sold for 525,000gns at the Craven Breeze-up Sale--it was fantastic business for all concerned."

He added, "The consistent number of Group and Listed winners coming from the sale tell their own story. Don't forget Anisette, who is arguably the best turf filly in California at the moment. There are only three Grade I races for fillies in California these days and she's won every single one of them. She was purchased for 26,000gns [in 2021] and I think it emphasises the diversity and the depth of the quality available. It's not just a one-dimensional sale."

As well as being far from one-dimensional, the Somerville Yearling Sale is also no longer a one-day fixture. For the first time this year it will be held over two days, with over 430 lots-up from 305 offered in 2023--scheduled to go under the hammer. Selling begins at 10am on Tuesday.

Explaining the decision to move to two days, George said, "This sale has well and truly established itself as an important fixture in the European yearling sales calendar." Cont.

"It's a strong catalogue, obviously significantly larger than we've had before, and it's full of the sort of yearlings that buyers have come to expect from the sale. There are certain areas of the market which are stronger than others, but quality yearlings have always found buyers in abundance and I think we'll see that in the next couple of days."

Only time will tell whether there's another Bradsell to be found, but buyers will have the opportunity to get their hands on a half-brother to the filly who chased him home in the Nunthorpe, Believing (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}). Lot 279, consigned by Kildallan Farm, is an Inns Of Court (Ire) colt out of the unraced Kodiac (GB) mare Misfortunate (Ire) whose four-year-old daughter also won the G2 Sapphire Stakes at the Curragh in July.

Other potential highlights include lot 235, Hazelwood Bloodstock's half-sister to the GI Natalma Stakes heroine La Pelosa (Ire) (Dandy Man {Ire}) by Earthlight (Ire), while the pedigree of lot 204 received a significant update on Sunday when his half-brother, Aesterius (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}), ran away with the G3 Prix d'Arenberg at Longchamp. This colt from the Ballinafad Stud draft is by Tally-Ho Stud resident Cotai Glory (GB).

Last year's Deutsches Derby winner Fantastic Moon (Ger) (Sea The Moon {Ger}) was also in the news on Sunday when he doubled his Group 1 tally in the Grosser Preis von Baden. His breeder, Philipp Stauffenberg, is consigning for the first time at the Somerville Yearling Sale this year, with a pair of fillies set to be offered under the name of his Stauffenberg Bloodstock.


The Hello Youmzain (Fr) filly set to go through the ring as lot 223 is out of the German Group 3 runner-up La Merced (Ger) (Tiger Hill {Ire}), while the second dam, La Pilaya (Ger) (Pivotal {GB}), is a half-sister to five black-type performers.

The other Stauffenberg offering, lot 185, is from the first crop of A'Ali (Ire), who had eight yearlings sell at the Doncaster Premier Yearling Sale at an average of £57,125 and for an aggregate sum of £457,000.

Speaking of last week, it seems right to include a few lines from the leading buyer at Doncaster ahead of a sale where the clientele promises to include many of the same faces.

Anthony Bromley, acting on behalf of Classic-winning owner Phil Cunningham, signed for 10 yearlings for a total of $\mathfrak{L}1,010,000$ at the Premier Yearling Sale, but overall trade was down on the previous year--the average and median both dropped by 14%--and Bromley expects more of the same as we head into the autumn.

"As I thought the top quartile is very strong, but then there's chances," Bromley said of the market last week.





G3 Prix de Cabourg winner Daylight got him off to **a faster start at stud** than every other Shamardal line stallion with an early Group win.

Like father... Earthlight also won the Cabourg, on his way to the G1 Prix Morny. Like daughter... Daylight has since run third in the Morny.



"The lower end is a little bit sticky and there are moments to find value. I know the parameters are going to be a bit down, but it's not going to be any different anywhere else this autumn. All of the averages and medians are going to be down this year.

"We've got 450 fast yearlings this week [in Doncaster] and in a weeks' time we've got another 450 at the Somerville Yearling Sale, so it will be interesting to see whether it'll hold up through the whole thing."

Taken down the Arc route in 2023 following his success in the Hamburg Classic, Fantastic Moon captured the G2 Prix Niel but came up short in the main event before making a stuttering start to his current campaign. Regaining the thread when taking the 11-furlong G2 Grosser Preis der Badischen Wirtschaft rescheduled at Cologne in June, he was second to Calif (Ger) (Areion {Ger}) on unsuitably soft ground in Munich's G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis in July but had everything in place for his big moment here.

Ridden with utmost confidence, he went around the home turn as if he was on rails while Dubai Honour floundered for a few strides in the centre of the track and that natural agility made all the difference as they sprinted to the line.

"He has such an amazing turn of foot and he was so relaxed-he is really a great horse, awesome," Piechulek said.

Runner-up in the G2 German 2000 Guineas and successful in the G3 Grosser Preis der Wirtschaft earlier this term, Eckhard Sauren's **Penalty (Ger)** (Frankel {GB}) upped his game on Sunday to capture Baden-Baden's G2 Oettingen Rennen. Only seventh in a strong renewal of Munich's G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis from which the afternoon's G1 Grosser Preis winner Fantastic Moon (Ger) (Sea The Moon {Ger}) and last week's G2 Grand Prix de Deauville winner Quantanamera (Ger) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) have emerged, the 11-5 second favourite tracked the leader **Geography (Ger)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) throughout the early stages. **Cont.**

Jockey Thore Hammer-Hansen was quick to deal out some praise. "He is the best horse I have ridden so far, my sincere thanks to the entire team at Henk Grewe's stable, to the trainer and Penalty's lad Memo who rides him every morning and led him up today, as he is not the easiest horse to deal with."

AESTERIUS WINS THE PRIX D'ARENBERG FOR WATHNAN by Tom Frary

Making amends for his defeat in Goodwood's G3 Molecomb Stakes in July, Wathnan Racing's Aesterius (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}--Jane Doe {Ire}, by Hallowed Crown {Aus}) led from start to finish in Sunday's G3 Prix d'Arenberg at ParisLongchamp.

Bagging the rail under James Doyle, the 9-10 favourite saw off

all threats to hit the line 1 1/2 lengths ahead of Kaadi (Ire) (Soldier's Call {GB}), with Treasure Isle (Ire) (No Nay Never) a short neck away in third.

"At Goodwood, I felt I rode him too quietly so today I wanted to let him run on this flat track and he was very responsive in front," the winning rider said of the Archie Watson trainee who had won the Listed Dragon Stakes at Sandown prior to finding Big Mojo (Ire) (Mohaather {GB}) too strong in the Molecomb. "He is very straightforward and physically he looks like he can develop into a nice 3-year-old."

Aesterius is the first foal out of the unraced Jane Doe, who is a half to the G3 Horris Hill Stakes winner Tawhid (GB) (Invincible Spirit (Ire)) and a daughter of the GIII My Charmer Handicap and GIII Suwannee River Handicap winner Snowdrops (GB) (Gulch). The third dam is the listed-placed Roses In The Snow (Ire) (Be My Guest), whose descendants include the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac heroine Tiger Tanaka (Ire) (Clodovil {Ire}). Jane Doe's yearling colt by Cotai Glory (GB) sells on Monday at the Tattersalls Somerville Yearling Sale, while she also has a colt foal by the same sire.

COLUMBUS CONTINUES ASCENT UP THE STAYING RANKS by Tom Frary

Showing instant improvement upped to this 15-furlong trip when taking Deauville's Listed Prix Michel Houyvet last month, Columbus (Ger) (Oasis Dream {GB}) took things up a notch again on Sunday when adding ParisLongchamp's G3 Prix Gerald de Geoffre to his tally. Following the early pace under Augustin Madamet, the 37-10 shot was committed soon into the straight and stayed on strongly to score by half a length from Chartwell (Fr) (Churchill {Ire}).

"He proved in Deauville that he has quality and I think the key with this horse has been to stretch him to 15 furlongs," trainer Christophe Ferland said. "He is also very straightforward and strong in his head, so has managed to improve with each race. We'll keep following the program for young stayers and he will come back in the G2 Prix Chaudenay on Arc weekend."

She can be a little bit keen, but settled lovely today with the pace that was on. She is a talented filly when things fall right for her. That's a career-best today and she's going the right way."

ASIAN RACING CONFERENCE: REFLECTIONS

SAPPORO, Japan -- "It's been a hard day's night," sang Masayuki Goto, vice-chairman of the Asian Racing Federation (ARF), as he took to the stage for his keynote speech during the closing exchanges of the 40th Asian Racing Conference (ARC). And it is plain that Goto, the former president and CEO of the Japan Racing Association (JRA), and his fellow ARF committee members are looking forward to the day when their counterparts around the world are singing along in perfect harmony, perhaps to the tune of Here Comes The Sun.

Those bred for stamina, who sat through all nine sessions across the three days, will hopefully have found plenty on which to cogitate on the flight home from Sapporo, whether betting or breeding, fan engagement or finance is at the top of your wish

list for racing.

The overriding theme was of the need for unity - both globally and locally. That is of course easier to achieve in countries such as Japan and Hong Kong, where the financial health of racing through strong tote monopolies enables areas in need of improvement to be addressed more readily.

Stakeholders within their fellow major racing nations of Australia and Britain are often at loggerheads internally over a range of issues. To a degree, Britain is seen as the fading aristocrat of world racing: sure, it has the heritage, the history and the titles, but the castle roof is leaking and there aren't enough buckets to go round.

It is not entirely fair to continue to portray British racing in this manner. At the top end at least, the combined efforts to push the available prize-money upwards through Premier Racing, the expansions of its marquee days in the World Pool, and roll out of a valuable maiden programme backed by some of the biggest breeders in the business, along with Tattersalls and the British EBF, it increasingly holds its own against its nearest neighbours of Ireland and France. In some instances, it outstrips them.

Is it too easy to make Britain the whipping boy? Maybe. But it doesn't help itself either, and an exodus of top executives over the coming months will naturally lead to some instability in the handover periods.

That was a side issue this week, as Britain, Ireland, France and Germany are not of course ARF members despite being strongly represented in Japan. "It's really a global racing conference," said Ascot's Nick Smith as he joined a lengthy debate on all matters betting, and he has a point. BHA chair Joe Saumarez Smith, HRI chief executive Suzanne Eade, Henri Pouret and Elie Hannau of France Galop, and Deutscher Galopp manager Daniel Kruger were all in Sapporo to forge important alliances with their neighbours in the Asia and the Middle East. Saudi Takes up the Baton

At the closing ceremony, just before The Beatles tribute band The Parrots bounced on stage and were commanded to play at least four encores, Prince Bandar bin Khalid Al Faisal, chairman of the Jockey Club of Saudi Arabia (JCSA), was handed ARF banner by chairman Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges in anticipation of the next ARC. That is to be held in two years' time in Riyadh.

It may be one of the newest ARF members but Saudi has certainly made its presence felt in the Thoroughbred business in recent times, with the introduction of the world's richest race, the Saudi Cup, in 2020 and a doubling of the number of races staged in the country in the intervening years. Winners from America, Britain, Japan and Saudi itself have given the Saudi Cup a truly international feel and Group 1 status. With the country's racing programme expanding in leaps and bounds, and millions being spent on recruiting runners to fill those races, all eyes will be on how the Saudi racing scene continues to develop. It was encouraging to see representatives from the JCSA at the IFAR conference on Tuesday for every racing jurisdiction, especially one with growing might, must make proper aftercare provisions

for those horses retiring from racing.

There was barely a presentation during the week that did not make reference to this subject. It was interesting to note that the Hong Kong Jockey Club ensures that each new owner sets aside an 'equine pension fund', which is a mandatory sum of HK\$100,000 (approximately €11,500) in order to finance the transition of horses in their retirement from racing to a new role.

Pattern vs Prize-Money

It shouldn't really be a case of either/or but that was the suggestion made by Widden Stud's Antony Thompson, who, as a guest on an international breeding panel, gave a positive overview of the robustness of the Australian racing industry, reminding those listening that the country hosts a million-dollar-plus race every week on average.

"Nick Smith said yesterday that the Pattern is cornerstone of the British racing system. We'd say prize-money is the cornerstone of the Australian racing system," he explained.

The combining of those two objectives would be the ideal situation and, clearly, many involved in the Australian industry consider the returns on offer in Britain to be derisory. But it is concerning that the Australian Pattern Committee has not held a meeting for some years - a situation that Arrowfield's John Messara is at the forefront of trying to resolve in order to keep Australia's group races under regular review.

Britain does not act unilaterally when it comes to its Pattern races and liaises closely with its European neighbours in establishing a progression of races both through the distances and throughout the season. And with that in mind, it is worth heeding the words of Shadai Farm's owner Teruya Yoshida in an interview in TDN last year.

"We are looking for good horses from anywhere in the world and buying the good-quality mares from Europe is very important," he said. "European classification of the racing is very correct. If we buy Group 2 or Group 3 mares in Europe, that is their true level." Cont.

"In some other countries, we can't believe in it, but if we buy them in Europe we know that they are good-class horses."

Rise of the Sons

Prior to the international breeding panel came one focused solely on the Japanese industry and featuring Tetsuya and Shunsuke Yoshida along with Hirokazu Okada, the sons respectively of Teruya and Katsumi Yoshida of Shadai and Northern Farms, and Shigeyuki Okada of Big Red Farm. The succession plan appears strong in Japanese breeding.

Of the 7,796 foals born in Japan in 2023, 98% of those were on farms in the Iburi and Hidaka regions of Hokkaido, not far from where the conference was taking place. A good percentage of those are the offspring of mares recruited internationally, primarily but not only by the Yoshida family, with Japanese breeders often putting a premium on racecourse form.

The most recent luminary of that breeding programme was the horse deemed to be the world's best racehorse of 2023, Equinox (Jpn), whose rapturous finale in the Japan Cup in turn lifted that race to be rated best in the world last year. It was a twin triumph for Japan as the JRA commenced celebrations of its 70th anniversary.

Asked to explain the extraordinary rise in success of Japanese horses on the world stage, Shunsuke Yoshida, vice-president of Northern Farm, replied simply, "I think we paid attention."

Having learned from the established top nations in the business in Europe, the Americas and Australasia, Japan in now teaching all of them a lesson. The cycle of life for a racehorse, from conception through rearing, breaking, training, racing and retirement, is properly funded at every step of the way and, crucially, is well explained to the racing public, including on posters around racecourses.

Whatever one's specific interest in racing, it never hurts to be helped to join up the dots and understand just what it takes to get that gleaming Thoroughbred to its peak condition on race days. In turn, those fans betting through the JRA facilities at the racecourses, are doing their bit in putting money back into breeding and prize-money. What goes around comes around.

Okada, president of Big Red Farm, which has been in operation since 1982 and stands Benbatl (GB) and Gold Ship (Jpn) among other stallions, explained, "Up until 2010 the yearling sales turnover and production was declining but it has improved since then. Horseracing anime [a mobile game-turned-popular TV series] has really expanded the knowledge of the sport. Young business people are becoming owners. Star jockeys like Yutaka Take led the second Japanese racing boom and with Japanese horses becoming very successful overseas, these owners recognise that racing is popular internationally."

Enhancing fan engagement and recruiting more young fans to the sport was another theme that loomed large in the various presentations throughout the week in Sapporo. Even this 55-year-old big kid could not resist the lure of the plushie stall in the Turfy Shop at Sapporo racecourse on Saturday. A fluffy replica of Nassau Stakes heroine Deirdre (Jpn) is on the way home to Newmarket.

Effective Communication

One of the most engaging speeches of the week came from Vicky Leonard, owner of the marketing agency Kick Collective and the Australasian daily publication The Thoroughbred Report, which, in the interests of transparency, is a sister publication of TDN.

Plenty at the conference took notice of Leonard's compelling talk which impressed upon the delegates the need to have the relevant facts to hand to help combat the sport's detractors. She has been practising what she preaches with the launch in 2022 of the website and campaign Kick Up For Racing, which is a fact-based resource to correct falsehoods so easily spread about racing on social media and beyond.

"If an industry isn't talking it is assumed it has something to hide," she said, divulging that the most read article on the website is What happens to the slow horses?

Again, this links back to an obvious public concern with regard to the second part of a racehorse's life. The growing drive to have visible and proactive aftercare programmes around the world of racing is clearly necessary for what Engelbrecht-Bresges referred to in his opening speech as "social acceptability".

By No Means Least...

Lastly, all of those who attended the 40th ARC are in the debt of the unfaltering courtesy and helpfulness of those many people from the JRA and ARF charged with making sure the

many attendees got the right bus to the right place at the right time, and ensured the slickest of presentations akin to a night at the Oscars. Arigato gozaimasu.

COOLMORE AUSTRALIA ANNOUNCE WOOTTON BASSETT'S FEE AT A\$192,500

Wootton Bassett (GB) will command a fee of A\$192,500 in 2024 when he covers his fourth book of mares at Coolmore's Jerry Plains operation in New South Wales, Australia, it was announced on Sunday.

The son of Iffraaj (GB) is on the brink of having his first Southern Hemisphere-bred runners hit the track. He is already well-established as one of the leading stallions in Europe as the sire of nine individual Group 1 winners, including the European champion three-year-old colt Almanzor (Fr) and last year's G1 Champion Stakes hero King Of Steel.

From his initial Southern Hemisphere crop, Wootton Bassett served an impressive array of mares, including the nine-time Group 1 winner Avantage (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}). The resulting filly from this mating commanded A\$2.1 million at this year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale.

"Wootton Bassett continues to go from strength to strength," said Coolmore Australia's Tom Moore. "He produced two Group 1-winning two-year-old colts last year and through Henri Matisse, Ides Of March and others, he's well on track to emulate that incredible feat in consecutive years.

"From his current two- and three-year-old crops he's already yielded 14 stakes winners, a number which is sure to grow."

Moore added, "Given the quality of mares he's been patronised by in his initial seasons in Australia and the way they were received at the sales this year, we think he represents a great opportunity for Australasian breeders with quality mares this season, particularly those elite mares looking for an outcross option."

HIGHLAND FALLS ROLLS TO VICTORY IN JOCKEY CLUB GOLD CUP

Godolphin's **Highland Falls** (Curlin) outdueled favored **Arthur's Ride** (Tapit) and strode home an easy winner of the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Sunday at Saratoga. The 4-year-old earned his first top-level victory, as well as an automatic berth in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, and gave jockey Flavien Prat his recordsetting 13 graded win of the meeting.

Arthur's Ride, coming off a win in the GI Whitney Stakes, rushed up and over from his outside post and had a clear advantage heading into the first turn through an opening quarter in :23.25, but Highland Falls inched up to be a menacing presence just to his outside and hounded the flashy gray through a half in :47.67 and three-quarters in 1:11.31. Highland Falls rolled up to put his head in front midway on the far turn and, while Arthur's Ride attempted to fight his way back to the lead in upper stretch, the 7-1 shot found another gear with a furlong to run and strode home a four-length winner. **Pyrenees** (Into Mischief) closed to be second while never threatening the winner. **Disarm** (Gun Runner) just nipped **Tapit Trice** (Tapit) for third and Arthur's Tale tired to fifth.

"I thought if one horse could handle the distance, it was him," Prat said of Highland Falls, who was making his second try at 1 1/4 miles following a fourth-place effort in the GI Santa Anita Handicap in March. *Cont. p3*



"We wanted to break running and then try to make a good pace," Prat continued. "That was the case, and we got past the wire for the first time, it felt like Arthur's Ride was going a bit quicker, easier than me, so I don't need to go on, but I was able to get him outside after that and give him another push. He was just a well of stamina.

"I wanted to get him into a good rhythm and get him running going into the first turn, and I didn't want to let Arthur's Ride get an easy lead. And then, that was it."

Arthur's Ride was made the 4-5 favorite in the Gold Cup off of a pair of dominant front-running victories, so winning trainer Brad Cox admitted to some anxious moments watching the battle up front.

"I was hopeful. I don't know if I would use the word 'confident,'" Cox said of Highland Falls's match-up with Arthur's Ride. "[Arthur's Ride] has been awful impressive up here in his last two races. If you don't get any pressure [on Arthur's Ride] and you're on a loose lead--he's obviously proved he's a Grade I horse. We weren't going to let him just walk the dog. We wanted to be aggressive, and it paid off for us."

Cox added, "We were head-and-head with him and I thought, at the three-eighths pole, Flavien gave him every chance to win the race. When they straightened up, it looked like he was getting the better of him and then I started watching the horses coming from the back--watching Disarm, Pyrenees and the horses I thought might be closing late. He held them at bay. I was very proud of the effort."

Of the beaten favorite, trainer Bill Mott said, "The horse ran hard last time. Now we have 60 days back to the Breeders' Cup. We'll have time to regroup. Hopefully, he comes back good, and we can move forward and try to train for that.



"I knew they would try to keep him [Highland Falls] up in the race. I don't think it was any secret. Frankly, I was a little surprised they were able to keep him there that close. He took it to us. I don't have any big excuse."

In addition to the graded-stakes record, the win gave Prat a record-extending 17th stakes win of the Saratoga meeting. He had set the record with his 16th stakes win of the season in the GIII Saranac Stakes Friday.

"It's a great honor," Prat said of the records. "It's obviously a great group of riders and very talented riders. I've been learning a lot around them and it's a team effort. My agent Brad [Pegram] has done an incredible job to book me on very good horses, and trainers and owners give me the opportunity. I'm very thankful."


The lightly raced Highland Falls, making just his ninth career start Sunday, opened 2024 with an optional-claimer win at Fair Grounds in January. He made his stakes debut while fourth in the GI Santa Anita Handicap in March and he was second in the Apr. 20 GII Oaklawn Handicap before earning his first graded victory in the June 1 Blame Stakes at Churchill Downs. He was a distant second behind Tapit Trice (Tapit) in the July 20 GIII Monmouth Cup last time out.

The Gold Cup is a 'Win and You're In' challenge race for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic in November at Del Mar.

Asked if he had a plan to get to championship weekend, Cox said, "I don't know. I know he's getting on a van tomorrow and going back to Churchill. We'll come up with a game plan, but he's a cool horse. He's a really nice colt and he's been in training since last summer--or maybe even late last spring. We've spaced his races because he was rolling along this winter. We gave him a shot this winter in a Grade I going 1 1/4 miles and I don't think he was quite seasoned enough. He's continued to move forward throughout the year."

Formidable Man, favored off a win in the Oceanside Stakes at Del Mar July 20, stormed to the lead and held off Stay Hot late to earn his first graded victory in the GII Del Mar Derby at the oceanside oval Sunday. The 6-5 favorite was away smartly before settling off the pace as longshot Sketchy (Uncle Mo) set a pedestrian pace. The tempo quickened noticeably on the far turn and Formidable Man rolled up three wide into the lane to hit the lead at midstretch. Stay Hot tried in vain to reel in the favorite late.

"When it's a small field like that, it's always tactical," said winning rider Umberto Rispoli. "My first intention was to go outside and lead and I know at some point I need to get a jump on him [Stay Hot] but thanks to [trainer] Michael [McCarthy], we did it. He has been improving race by race, with credit to the McCarthy team. The key was to get the jump on Stay Hot and I think it worked okay for us. I am certainly happy with that."



McCarthy, who trained the winner's multiple Grade I-winning sire for these same owners, added, "A salty bunch of horses like this, there's not a whole lot separating the top three. I wouldn't say I was confident; I just was very happy with the way the horse had trained."



Formidable Man | Benoit

Formidable Man, a maiden winner over the Del Mar lawn last September, took a nine-furlong optional claimer over the Santa Anita turf in March and set the pace before settling for second behind Trikari (Oscar Performance) in the May 4 GII American Turf Stakes at Churchill Downs. Sixth in the June 1 Audubon Stakes, he returned to the West Coast to win the one-mile Oceanside last time out.

Pedigree Notes:

Formidable Man is the fourth graded winner for City of Light. His dam, Fanticola, won the 2015 GII Royal Heroine Stakes and was second in the GI Gamely Stakes. The 14-year-old mare has a yearling filly by Knicks Go and produced a filly by Jack Christopher this year. She was bred back to Star Guitar. She was purchased by Clear Creek Stud for \$60,000 while in foal to Flatter at the 2021 Keeneland November sale. Her unraced 2-year-old Cc Cola (Flatter) RNA'd for \$37,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton July sale.



Four of those five seconds came in 2-year-old maiden special weight races, which Lukas said may show that his youngsters are on the verge of producing some victories.

"I didn't get that one, **Ripped** (City of Light), even started, and he's one that we really think is special," Lukas said. "I hope, to have a big fall. We should come up strong in the fall, and then I'm comfortable, if I can just develop them at Hot Springs over the winter."

Ever the optimist, Lukas was promoting his 2-year-olds last summer and predicting great things for 2024. One of the colts he was touting was My Racehorse's Seize the Grey (Arrogate). Seize the Grey, who broke his maiden in July and was third in the Skidmore Stakes. In May, Seize the Grey won the GI Preakness Stakes, making Lukas the oldest trainer to win a Triple Crown race.

"Laurie reminded me of that today," he said. "She reminded me that we won a Classic this year. I was complaining. I have a tendency to think that they all have to win."

Seize the Grey was seventh in the GI Belmont Stakes at Saratoga on June 8 and finished fourth in the GII Jim Dandy Stakes on July 27. The decision was made to bypass the GI DraftKings Travers Stakes on Aug 24 and prepare him for the \$1-million GI Pennsylvania Derby on Sept. 21 at Parx.

"We've got to sneak over there with him," Lukas said. "That would be another nice one to get."

Lukas has always been forward-looking and he said another Seize the Grey scenario is possible.

"I think that we've got a great shot to win some Classics next year," he said. "I really like our 2-year-olds. I know I've been saying that right along, but we bought horses that are definitely Classic-type horses, and we've asked them to do some things that aren't in their wheelhouse like, 5 1/2 furlongs, six furlongs and stuff like that. I think that as they develop this fall, and they look like they're going in the right direction to me, that they're big, sound horses, I think we have a chance to really step up and have a big spring. I'm hoping for a big spring, and turning 90."

When he was at the top of the sport, Lukas managed a nationwide stable stocked with dozens of horses. At this point in his career, he feels that 40 horses is enough.

"I was concerned five, six years ago," he said. "When you get a little age on you, people start turning to the younger people. I thought that was coming, but before I came up here, I turned down 17 new ones."

Lukas said he did accept four more from MyRacehorse.

"My major clients that have got a large stable already haven't backed up a bit," he said, referring to BC Stable. "They're going right into the sale this fall with a vengeance."

Lukas's final starter of the season will be **Innovate** (Authentic) in the GI Hopeful Stakes--a race he has won a record eight times from 35 starts--the 10th race Monday.



"He's a maiden, but he ran a nice second," Lukas said. "He's a developing horse. The way I looked at that, he doesn't know he was second. He was flying at the end there. If he won, we would have said, 'Well, we got to point him for the Hopeful.' He didn't win, but we're still pointing for the Hopeful. I've done that before."

End of An Era as Rice Approaches Retirement

Although he hasn't made it official yet, Harry Rice thinks Monday might be his final day as a NYRA valet at Saratoga Race Course. He has talked about retirement before, but he said this could be the year he steps away from a job he has had--working with and for jockeys--for nearly 50 years.

"I've had a great run," he said.

Rice, 66, said he has been aiming to retire at the end of the 2025 Saratoga season. He said he likely will leave sooner if a contract with the union that represents valets and the people who work in the silks room completes negotiations on a new contract with NYRA. The contract may include incentives for him to retire. Rice is the shop steward.

With a friendly, outgoing personality, Rice is a well-known figure at the NYRA tracks. That is especially true at Saratoga where jockeys and valets walk through the crowd to the paddock and back to the jocks' dressing room after each race. It

often seems that everyone knows Rice and vice versa.

Rice knows his time to leave is approaching, but isn't anxious to go.

"I enjoy it," he said. "I enjoy the people I work with."

Rice's father was a pressman at the *New York Times* and had a part-time job with the Pinkerton security company at the NYRA tracks. Rice said he could have followed his father into the newspaper business, but opted for racing.

"I started out as a Pinkerton for like a day and then I went to the White Caps," he said. "I stayed there until I graduated high school and then I started at NYRA. My first day in the jock's room was January 6, 1976. I've just enjoyed it so much. And the people you meet and friendships you make, it's good, and it will be sad. I'll always come back up here."

Through the years, Rice has gotten to know dozens of jockeys who have competed at the NYRA tracks.

"I got to work for a lot of great guys, and then work for a lot of great jockeys," he said. "It goes all the way back to Jean Cruguet, then Mike Smith, Mike Luzzi and I'm working for Frankie Dettori now. I've had relations with these guys for 30 years. I'm still very close with Cruguet, Chris McCarron, Corey Nakatani, Rajiv Maragh. I don't want to leave any of the guys out. They were all good. And steeplechase guys."

Rice has already started the transition toward retirement and recognizes that he will have more flexibility in his life.

"I tend bar two days a week in a place, Lee's Tavern, in Staten Island," he said. "It's a very famous neighborhood bar with tremendous pizza. Then I'm going to make some trips. I'm going to go visit some racetracks that I haven't been to. And I'd like to go to Oaklawn and Del Mar, and some other ones. And then I will always come up here. I want to sit with the guys I've known for years from all over the place underneath that tree with a

cooler. I'm looking forward to that. And just looking forward to take it a little easier because it's a grind."

While people who know him wonder whether Rice may postpose retirement until next year, he said the settlement of the contract will be a bittersweet turning point for him.

"It's not only your livelihood," he said, "but the racetrack is your life."

Stewart Has a Pair in the Hopeful

Trainer Dallas Stewart has had a solid Saratoga season with a 3-3-4 record from 20 starts. He will try to pick up a big prize Monday with a pair of runners in the closing-day GI Hopeful Stakes

Stewart will saddle **Tough Catch** (Complexity) and **Smoken Wicked** (Bobby's Wicked One) in the seven-furlong test. Tough Catch won a July 13 maiden special weight and, in his only local appearance, Smoken Wicked was third, beaten 3 1/2 lengths, in the GII Saratoga Special on Aug. 10.

The veteran trainer is a partner in Tough Catch with S.O.K. Racing, Gervais Racing, On Our Own Stable and Zak Stables.

"Very nice horse," Stewart said.
"Trained great at Churchill. Came in here, I don't even think we worked here, but walked over there and

beat a nice field. Did it the right way. He's just been training steady with a nice work pattern going up to the race. We know

it's a great race. Lot of good horses in there. He's ready."

Tough Catch was purchased for \$280,000 at the OBS April sale of 2-year-olds.

"We had others that we had liked, too," Stewart said. "Then we got to him, and he was an extremely nice-looking colt. Just

moved good, worked good. Kind of what we were looking for and hopefully we would get him in the price range. He fit what we wanted."

The unexpected bonus for Stewart and his partners is that Complexity has emerged as a top first-class sire.

"We didn't know much about the Complexitys at the time," Steward said, "and then they just started popping: boom, boom, boom."

Smoken Wicked is a Louisiana-bred who sold for

"He's a horse that Murray Valene bought," Stewart said. "I've been training for him for a long time. I've had like seven or eight champions, for him, Louisiana-breds. He's an ex polo player, so he picks his own horses out. He knows horses, and he saw this horse as a yearling at a sale in Louisiana and bought him.

After the colt broke his maiden by 7 1/2 lengths at Evangeline Downs on June 1, Valene sent him to Stewart in Kentucky. He finished second in the Bashford Manor Stakes at Churchill Downs on June 30 at 32-1 and earned a spot in the string of 10 Stewart brought to Saratoga to start the meet.

"He ran good there, comes here runs good in the Special and pushes on to the Hopeful," Stewart said. "He's had a race over the track. Good work. Big, strong, impressive looking. Looks like a 3-year-old, matter of fact. Should run well. Seven furlongs should fit him very well."

SARATOGA COULD HOST EXTRA WEEKEND OF RACING IN 2025 by Mike Kane

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. – There could be another weekend of racing at Saratoga Race Course in 2025, if a plan being considered by the New York Racing Association is adopted.

Although the racing would take place at the historic upstate facility, NYRA officials said it technically would not be an expansion of the 40-day Saratoga season. If the proposal is approved, the Fourth of July weekend--July 4 falls on a Friday--at Saratoga would be the final days of the Belmont of Aqueduct meet. The Saratoga season would begin on Thursday, July 10.

"That requires Board approval. That requires state approval," NYRA president David O'Rourke said. "You're just asking me, what's on the table, what we're thinking about? That's one of the things we're thinking about."

The changes, most notably moving the GI Belmont Stakes to Saratoga this year and in 2025, is due to the reconstruction of Belmont Park.



For the second consecutive year, the GI Belmont Stakes will be held in 2025 at Saratoga on June 7. This year, it was surrounded by a four-day festival.

NYRA spokesperson Patrick McKenna said that, under the proposal being discussed, racing would return to Aqueduct for three more weeks and then move back to Saratoga Race Course for the final weekend of the Belmont at Aqueduct meet.

McKenna said that if such a plan is approved to finish the Belmont at Aqueduct meet at Saratoga in 2025, it may be for just one year pending the re-opening of Belmont Park.

Although there has been a great deal of speculation in Saratoga this summer that NYRA would stay upstate after the 2025 Belmont Stakes, O'Rourke said that would not happen. However, O'Rourke noted that the field for the GI Belmont Derby this year might have been negatively affected because more of the horse population was already upstate due to the Belmont Stakes at Saratoga Festival. Closing the Belmont at Aqueduct meet at Saratoga in 2025 and running the Belmont Derby there might mitigate that problem.

"We pretty much have to go back after the Belmont for access to the grass," O'Rourke said. "There is one race that might be interesting to move up here. That would be the Belmont Derby, because that's the last weekend down there.

"What we saw when we went back from a racing aspect is it was great to get a lot of divisions, specific divisions, access to the turf, but some of the higher-quality horses were waiting for Saratoga and might have impacted the Belmont Derby a little bit. The Belmont Derby belongs to Belmont Park, but in the near term, that might be one thing, but that's a far cry from not going back down south."

FEROCIOUS READY TO RUMBLE IN HOPEFUL

The holiday weekend of stakes action--and the Saratoga meet--conclude in style when morning-line favorite **Ferocious** (Flatter) faces eight rivals in contentious renewal of the GI Hopeful Stakes. Campaigned by JR Ranch, Ramiro Restrepo, High Step Racing and OGMA Investments, the \$1.3-million OBS March graduate romped to a 7 3/4-length debut win and earned a 'TDN Rising Star' label Aug. 3. Off a step slow in that unveiling, Ferocious settled in a good stalking position behind an opening quarter-mile in :22.06 over a muddy and sealed main track. Tipped out to the three path at the quarter-pole through a half-mile in :45.61, he was in command with a furlong to run, scoring in a final time of 1:09.65 for six furlongs. The winning effort earned a 96 Beyer Speed Figure--the highest number recorded by any 2-year-old this year.

Ferocious has worked twice since that debut win, going four furlongs in :50.88 (48/64) Aug. 18 and five furlongs in 1:02.63 (3/6) Aug. 24.

"Since his first race, everything has been pretty straightforward with him," said Gustavo Delgado, Jr., son and assistant to trainer Gustavo Delgado, Sr. "He's had a couple of breezes--both of them very easy and all the signs you want to see with a horse after his first race are there. It's hard to say after a 96 Beyer Speed Figure first time out that he's going to

improve, but it's more about getting the foundation that young horses at this time of the year need. Everybody is excited to see him run again."

Ferocious will have another furlong to work with in the Hopeful and Delgado said the added distance will be a benefit to the colt, who will break from post two Monday.

"I think the extra furlong will help him. He will have more time to relax," Delgado said. "He seems to be a very nice horse. We don't know how good he is yet, but it's just a matter of putting him out there. We're aware of the horses he's going to face this time and there's a few horses everybody is high on, and they can improve a lot from one race to another."

Ferocious was the second-highest priced offering following a :9 4/5 work at the OBS March sale.

"Everybody--not just us--liked this horse and that's why we had to pay that price for our clients," Delgado said. "Apart from that, he did have one of the best, if not the best, breeze for that sale. His physique, his conformation and family all suggested he was a really nice horse. He's got a classy way about him and when he walks, he's very elegant."

Flanagan Racing's Chancer McPatrick (McKinzie), who earned his own 'TDN Rising Star' label with his late-running debut victory going 6 1/2 furlongs July 27 for trainer Chad Brown, will break from post eight and is 5-2 on the morning line.

"Based on his morning works, I expected him to be a mid-pack type of horse if he broke well," Brown said of the colt's debut effort. "But then he got shuffled back and found himself in a very challenging position early. I was quite impressed with the way he overcame it. Flavien [Prat] went to 'Plan B' and was very patient and the horse really came through. It's his talent that really prevailed."

Chancer McPatrick most recently worked four furlongs in :49.00 (19/94) over the main track at Saratoga Aug. 25.

"He looks super. He's been training very well," Brown said.

Brown will also saddle Klaravich Stables' Incentive Pay

(Volatile) in the Hopeful. The chestnut breaks from the outside in the nine-horse field and is 8-1 on the morning line. He was a debut winner with a rail-skimming rally going six furlongs at Saratoga July 20.

"I was quite impressed with him that he was able to come up the rail and run like a horse that has done it before," Brown said. "I know he's really got to come forward on his figures--there are some fast horses in this race--but he ran early in the meet, and I feel I only had the horse 80% fit. I'd never breezed him past a half-mile and I think there's a lot of room for improvement there. He's really done well [since]."

The Hopeful is the 10th of 12 races on Saratoga's closing-day card with a post time of 5:43 p.m.

KEENELAND STAKES ASSIGNMENTS LIKELY NEXT FOR BRIGHTWORK, IMMERSIVE

Brightwork (Outwork), who returned from a 10-month layoff to win the GIII Prioress Stakes at Saratoga Saturday, could make her next start in the GII Raven Run Stakes at Keeneland Oct. 19, if all goes well, according to trainer John Ortiz.

"We'll let her tell us where to go next," Ortiz said. "This is the biggest effort I've seen her lay out in the afternoon--she was running against 3-year-olds that have been running and I want to make sure she comes out of it in good shape and has enough time to recover."

Brightwork opened her career last summer with four straight victories, including wins in the GIII Adirondack Stakes and GI Spinaway Stakes. She suffered her first loss when fifth when trying two turns in the 1 1/16-mile GI Darley Alcibiades Stakes and had not been seen since finishing sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies last November.

"She just proved us right that she's an athlete," Ortiz said of Saturday's return win. "She looked so tired coming down the stretch and [runner-up] **Two Sharp** (Twirling Candy) was so game with her, and they had a really good horse race. But you could just see the class and the heart that she has for this game-she loves it. She starts nickering any time you put the saddle on for training. She loves her job, and she definitely proved it yesterday."

Brightwork's winning effort in the Prioress matched her career-best 89 Beyer Speed Figure and capped an impressive Spa season for Ortiz, who sports a 11-6-1-1 record at the meet. *Cont. p15*



"It's always great to come to Saratoga," Ortiz said. "It's one of the biggest stages in the world and it's a place where you want to be seen and recognized to be doing well. Having success at Saratoga is something you want on your resume, but when you crush the meet like we did this year, it speaks volumes about our team."

Ortiz also has a Keeneland stakes assignment on the calendar for Shortleaf Stable's **Quietside** (Malibu Moon). Tabbed a **'TDN Rising Star'** following her 6 1/4-length debut win Aug. 4, the dark bay filly was runner-up in the GI Spinaway Stakes Saturday. Caught four wide after exiting post 11 with Luis Saez aboard in the Spinaway, Quietside made an early move for the lead through the turn, opening up by 2 1/2 lengths at the stretch call, but had to settle for second, landing 1 1/4 lengths back of the rallying **Immersive** (Nyquist).

"We got a little unfortunate with the post, which I initially loved, but we did get caught widest the whole race," Ortiz said. "Luis tried to cut the corner coming out of the turn to get the jump on the girls, but we just got caught. It was a great ride, great effort and we're happy to see she has real ability to come back and repeat a good effort after winning first time out. She proved she is some quality."

Ortiz continued, "She came out of the race in great form-bright eyed. She ate up her dinner last night and she jogged up sound for us this morning. We're super happy with the winning effort she put out there. Getting caught at the wire is just part of horse racing."

Ortiz said Quietside will now target the Oct. 4 GI Darley Alcibiades Stakes at Keeneland.

"We think she'll like the two turns in the long term," Ortiz said. Trainer Brad Cox confirmed Sunday that the Alcibiades is also the likely next start for Godolphin homebred Immersive.

"She looked good," Cox said. "We expected her to run big and she did. We always thought she showed the potential to stretch out. She got the seven-eighths and she should handle two turns. We will ship her back to Kentucky on Monday, and zero in on the Alcibiades, and go from there."

Immersive, who was a two-length winner going six furlongs in her July 21 debut at Saratoga, broke from the rail while making her second career start in the seven-furlong Spinaway.

"She showed she has a tremendous amount of class to overcome the one hole," Cox said of the filly's effort Saturday. "Manny [Franco] did a good job of putting her in a good position of tracking the frontrunners. Then she was able to show her stamina and class late to get by a very good filly inside the final sixteenth. She had a big gallop-out and I'm looking forward to getting her around two turns."

Saffie Joseph, Jr. collected his 10th Gulfstream Park training title in a row, while Edgard Zayas regained the top spot in the jockey standings when the Royal Palm Meet concluded Sunday.

Joseph broke his own Royal Palm Meet record with 93 victories, eclipsing the 71 winners he sent out during the 2021 stand.

Zayas, who won the Royal Palm Meet title in 2020 and 2021, was third in the standings in 2022 and 2023. During this year's meet, he regained the top spot in the standings with 112 winners.

Ken Ramsey, Vicente Stella Stables LLC and Moshe Mark ended the meet in a three-way tie for the leading owner.

Gulfstream Park's 2024 Sunshine Meet will get underway Friday and run through Nov. 24.

GUN RUNNER COLT BULLARD SOUNDS BUGLE, EARNS 'TON RISING STAR BADGE AT DEL MAR

Some say the Boy Scout bugle merit badge is one of the toughest to collect. In Thoroughbred racing it is winning a dirt race from way off the pace.

In his Sunday debut at Del Mar, the 'TDN Insighted' Bullard (Gun Runner--Reve d'Amour, by Warrior's Reward) sounded his bugle and charged home to graduate, which earned the 2-year-old a 'TDN Rising Star' merit badge for his effort.

Trailing from the bell, the \$675,000 Keeneland September grad watched from the rear of the field as 60 cents on the dollar favorite **Kalea Bay** (Authentic) carved out the fractions. Unwilling to accept the order to retreat in a situation like this one, the colt blew a ruffle and a flourish around the far turn and began to execute a mounted raid on the field. Picking off competitors the dark bay got clear to the outside at the top of the lane and set his sights on the pacesetter. With a massive kick, Bullard collared the fading leader in the final jumps and earned the equivalent of a Boy Scout bugler.

Acquired by Borges Torrealba for \$310,000 at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Select Yearling Sale, Reve d'Amour is responsible for six foals, five to race and four winners. So far, her most accomplished offspring is SW Mundaye Call (Into Mischief), who OXO Equine took home for \$950,000 during the 2018 Fasig-Tipton Yearling Sale. The winner is his dam's last registered foal of record, but he does have a 4-year-old half-brother in Chad Brown's care named Cascais (Into Mischief).

Digging into this extended female family, Bullard's French multiple groups stakes winning second dam is responsible for MSW Martha's Moon (Malibu Moon) and GSW Can the Man (Into Mischief). While under his third dam we find MGISP Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister), who produced champion 3-year-old filly Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy) and her older half-brother GISW Jazil (Seeking the Gold).

Bullard represents the 15th 'TDN Rising Star' for the accomplished Gun Runner.

IN SECOND START, DUBAWI'S OPULENT RESTRAINT COMES THROUGH

The word was out when the Chad Brown-trainee **Opulent Restraint** (Dubawi {Ire}) made her first career start on July 28 at Saratoga. She was sent off as the 7-10 favorite but couldn't come through. She finished fourth, beaten 1 1/4 lengths.

On Sunday at Saratoga she made amends. Sent off this time at 3-2, she won a stretch battle with Good Long Cry (Long On Value) to win the mile-and-a-sixteenth turf maiden by a half-length.

"She has shown ability from day one and Chad liked her a lot," wining rider Irad Ortiz Jr. said. "First time out, she ran well, but just got beat. We regrouped, turned the page and she ran today the way we expected."

Opulent Restraint is owned by Stephanie Seymour Brant and was bred in Ireland by her husband Peter Brant's White Birch Farm. She is the first foal of Significant Form (Creative Cause), a five-time stakes winner whose list of wins includes the GII Ballston Spa S. and three Grade III stakes. She was also owned by Seymour Brant and trained by Chad Brown.

The win Sunday wasn't exactly easy. A half-mile into the race, Opulent Restraint was stalking the pace in fourth. She took the lead at the three-sixteenths pole, but Good Long Cry, who set the pace, would not go away under Manny Franco. After a spirited stretch duel, Opulent Restraint prevailed.

"I was right behind Manny and was full of horse," Ortiz said. "I tipped her out and she responded well. She was still a little green, a little inexperienced. I think she still has something in the tank. We need to keep an eye on her. She can be a nice horse."

The GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf will likely be in Brown's plans. He has won the race six times.

Magenta (Into Mischief) finished third for trainer Todd Pletcher and Repole Stable. The winner paid \$5.10 and covered the distance in 1:44.17.

OPULENT RESTRAINT (IRE) (f, 2, Dubawi {Ire}--Significant Form {MGSW, \$817,216}, by Creative Cause) was fourth as the 3-5 choice in her career debut here July 28 and was installed the 3-2 second choice to make good this time. Settled in a stalking position early after sitting back a hair at the break, the Irish bred was under a tight hold by Irad Ortiz Jr., who tucked her in along the hedge rounding the first turn. Continuing to pull her rider along as Good Long Cry (Long On Value) carved out a quarter in :23.91 and a :49.16 half, the grey eagerly advanced as a seam opened up turning for home. Taking aim at the pacesetter down the stretch, she collared her rival midstretch and inched clear late to graduate by a half length. Good Long Cry was second with Magenta (Into Mischief) rounding out the trifecta. Favored Love Tempo (Ire) (Churchill {Ire}) rallied to be fourth. A halfsister to Grade III winner Hay Dakota (Haynesfield), Significant Form was a \$75,000 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July yearling that was secured for \$575,000 by Peter Brant's White Birch Farm the following year at the OBS Spring 2-year-old Sale. A multiple graded stakes winner on the turf for Chad Brown, the grey mare produced Sunday's winner on her first try and followed up another filly by Dubawi (Isadora Duncan) in 2023 and a filly by Kingsman earlier this season. THANKS TO MORE AGGRESSIVE TACTICS, QUICKICK GETS JOB DONE IN SPA MAIDEN

In her debut, **Quickick** (McKinzie) ran well to be third but couldn't overcome a slow beginning as she dropped 15 lengths off the pace in the early going. So trainer Tom Amoss added blinkers and jockey Dylan Davis made sure to stay close to the early pace. That made all the difference as Quickick broke her maiden in Sunday's seventh race at Saratoga, winning by 2 1/2 lengths.

Amoss also told Davis to try to get the filly to the outside where she wouldn't be bothered by the kickback. She broke from post one.

"I told him if she's not taking that dirt in the face move her out," Amoss said. "Dylan did just that. When he did she kicked home nicely."

Quickick was sent off as the 4-1 third-choice in the race as the money kept rolling in on two first-time starters, favorite **Scottish Lassie** (McKinzie) and second-choice **Snowyte** (Good Magic). Both ran well as Snowyte set the pace and Scottish Lassie was never far back in third. By mid-stretch Snowyte had taken a one-length lead and Scottish Lassie was right behind her. But the more experienced filly, Quickick, outran them all in the final sixteenth to earn the win.

"Having a race under your belt, knowing what to tell the rider and the rider having experience with the horse," Amoss said.

"That's the advantage of having a race under your belt."

Owner Gregory Tramontin bought Quickick for \$550,000 at the 2023 Keeneland sale. Amoss had some inside knowledge on the dam, as he trained her. She made 17 starts and won five races, including the GIII Winning Colors Stakes.

"Her mom, Graeme Six, was a little bitty girl," Amoss recalled. "She came up to New York and placed in a Grade I stakes (the 2007 Prioress) and that made her a momma. She's been a really prolific momma. Quickick is is a great example of the babies she's had. Quickick is the polar opposite of her mom. She's tall and lengthy."

Graeme Six (Graeme Hall) has had 11 foals and 10 of them are winners. The list includes Cali Star (Street Cry {Ire}), the winner of the 2015 GIII Rampart Stakes, and Delightful Joy (Tapit), the winner of the GIII Monmouth Oaks, also in 2015.

Amoss is eager to test his filly against tougher competition.

"We talk about it all the time," he said. "I'll talk to the owner, Greg Tramontin. I know he is excited about her too. We would like to see how she competes with the other 2-year-old fillies in the nation going a little further distance and going two turns."

Quickick covered the seven furlongs in 1:23.78 and paid \$10.40. She was also sold at the 2022 Keeneland November sale, where she brought \$275,000.

With an inside trip that had her poised for a run off the turn, Quickick tipped outside of that pacesetter to get first jump with race favorite Scottish Lassie (McKinzie) moving with her, got up on even terms past the eighth pole and spurted clear late to deny the early leader by 2 1/2 lengths. The seventh winner for her freshman sire (by Street Sense), Quickick is out of \$950,000 broodmare buy Graeme Six, already the producer of this winner's half-siblings Seymourdini (Bernardini), SW, \$242,027, Cali Star (Street Cry {Ire}), GSW, \$348,080 and Delightful Joy (Tapit), GSW, \$179,200, who herself has produced GSW Window Shopping (American Pharoah). Graeme Six returned to McKinzie two subsequent times but after Quickick but failed to catch for both 2023 and 2024. She was bred to Olympiad for 2025. Chasing Liberty was a smart 1 1/4-length winner at 3-1 odds in his 5 1/2-furlong Ellis Park debut July 28 but took considerably less money in this step up in class, breaking as a 22-1 longshot. With an extra furlong to work with over the undulating Kentucky Downs course, Chasing Liberty was caught mid pack and dealt with traffic trouble around the far turn as Under Who's Radar handled fractions of :22.03 and :45.20. Swung out to the center of the course at the top of the stretch, he was coming with plenty of run just as the pacesetter abruptly changed paths and was forced to check to avoid a collision. While he wound up three-quarters of a length behind Under Who's Radar on the wire, an objection and steward's inquiry into the events of the stretch reversed the order of finish and awarded Chasing Liberty the victory.

"I thought we ran a winning race and the steward's decision was up to them," said winning trainer Rob Atras. "Our horse just showed up today regardless of if we were first or second. He ran an awesome race and Flo [jockey Florent Geroux] did a great job. He was still a little bit green, but he showed his ability. He has a lot of talent. I knew it was going to be tough and it was a big ask coming off a maiden win. I was worried it would be too soon to ask for this, but, hey, he showed up."

The 68th stakes winner for WinStar's Constitution, Chasing Liberty is the first foal out of a stakes-placed dam. His yearling full-sister sold for \$160,000 at Fasig-Tipton July earlier this summer while Peaceful foaled an Epicenter filly this year and was bred back to both Oscar Performance and Up to the Mark for 2025. Earning a his most recent score via dead heat in the ninefurlong GIII Monmouth Stakes June 15, Running Bee earned the distinction outright Sunday when taking the Bernard Baruch Stakes at Saratoga.

Steady On (Pioneerof the Nile) moved fluidly to the front as Taking Candy and a hedge-riding Running Bee pursue about a length behind rounding the first turn. With Steady On still showing the way through a half in :49.27, favored Running Bee continued to save ground along the inside as Taking Candy started to turn the screws on the frontrunner rounding the far turn. Needing to pick it up in early stretch as Taking Candy and Steady On exchanged blows through the lane. Running Bee was ignited late and mowed down the top pair to gain a confident victory over Taking Candy with a closing Fort Washington third.

"It was a beautiful trip," said Irad Ortiz Jr. who was winning his fifth race on the card. "What can I say? Everything went the right way, to be honest. He kicked. He was push-button today. He was so relaxed out there. When I asked him, he was full of horse to run."

The win also marked Ortiz, Jr.'s 51st of the meet, adding to his lead in the jockey standings that has clinched him the riding title at the meet that closes Monday. Ortiz, Jr. notched his other wins on the card with Montalcino [Race 1], Opulent Restraint [Race 2], Critical Threat [Race 5] and Paros [Race 8].

In addition, Calumet Farm builds upon their weekend after winning Saturday's GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar with Mixto in addition to an impressive debut win by Correto at Kentucky Downs Sunday.

Winning trainer Chad Brown added, "I'm very appreciative of Calumet Farm---Mr. Brad Kelley and his team--for letting me run here. He was also nominated for very lucrative race at Kentucky Downs next week but it's only a mile and I just felt like this horse really has a future. I didn't want to put him in an unknown situation in a big, messy field even if it was for a lot of money. I felt this horse could put it together today and really move forward--polish this race off well was my hope and really move forward. These English Channel horses certainly get better as they get older, we've seen that over and over. I really have high hopes for this horse."

Kicking off the season with a runner-up finish in the GIII Tampa Bay Stakes in February, the 5-year-old won an 8 1/2-furlong allowance at Keeneland Apr. 6 before coming home third in the nine-furlong GIII Dinner Party Stakes at Pimlico May 18. Following his Monmouth Stakes win, Running Bee weakened to sixth last time out in the 11-furlong GII United Nations Stakes July 20. Early Kentucky Derby favorite Muth faced several twists and turns earlier in the 2024 season. Despite winning the GII San Vincente Stakes in January and the GI Arkansas Derby in March, Muth was precluded from running on the First Saturday in May due to his trainer's forced exclusion from the Classic over the past three seasons. Shipped to Pimlico two weeks later for the GI Preakness, the colt spiked a temperature which forced him out of the second jewel of the Triple Crown, shuttling him to the sidelines. Given plenty of time, he returned to the worktab June 10 and the \$2-million OBS March topper began his steady preparation for this first race in five months.

Breaking sharply from post 3, the 1-5 choice settled behind Pony Express (Gun Runner), who carved out an opening quarter mile in :22.57. Passing the half-mile pole, the chestnut inched closer as the pacesetter began his steady retreat and soon hit the front. While stablemate Imagination challenged briefly to his outside in the stretch, Muth proved too good, spurting away late en route to a geared down two-length win over closer Indispensable with Imagination third.

"I asked a lot of him today, but he responded really well," said winning rider Juan Hernandez. "I think all the credit goes to Bob [Baffert] because they were putting a lot of work towards this horse. In the race this horse showed up."

Aboard all seven of Muth's lifetime starts, Hernandez continued, "He is a different horse [now] because when he started out he was very fast, but he didn't want to settle. The last couple races he has relaxed really well, you know, he rode very sharp today. He stayed behind the pace just like I asked of him. He is a very special horse."

Earning TDN Rising stardom following a scintillating debut at Santa Anita last June, he had to settle for second behind stablemate Prince of Monaco in the GIII Best Pal Stakes a Del Mar In August but rebounded to take the GI American Pharoah Sakes back at The Great Race Place in October. Well supported for his seasonal finale, he was second behind subsequent juvenile champion Fierceness in the GI Breeders' Cup in November.

Attempting to win his fourth consecutive start of the season, Dean Delivers once again lived up to his name by coming from just off the pace to win Sunday's Rumson Stakes at Monmouth.

The winner of last season's GIII Smile Sprint is now four-forfour since moving to the Ned Allard barn.

"How good is he? I think his form speaks for itself right now," opined Allard. "I'm not sure what's next. We've got visions of grandeur but I don't know whether they're realistic or not. We'll see."

Breaking alertly, the heavy favorite battled exchanged blows with Five Dreams, who cut out a quarter in :22.42, and Speaking (Mr Speaker), who followed with a :45.67 half. Still trying to get back to the front as Downtownchalybrown forged to the front turning for home, Dean Delivers clawed his way back to the front in deep stretch to gain a half-length victory.

"He had to work for this one. He hasn't run five furlongs for a while, since he broke his maiden. But nothing seems to bother him," said winning ridre Jaime Rodriguez. "Once I got to the quarter pole I asked him and he went. When we broke I was going to wait and see how things played out.

"He broke sharply but he did not need to be on the lead. I just wanted to be within a half-length or next to the other speed because I knew I had horse. I just had to wait for the moment. Once I saw a horse coming outside coming out of the turn I said 'okay, let's go.' I maybe only hit him twice in the stretch. I was pretty confident with him today."

"Every time he runs now he gets better. I love the way he is running now. He can run anywhere. When he broke sharply I didn't want to take him back. I just wanted him to be free and comfortable because I know how good he is right now."

Runner up in the GIII Swale Stakes at three, the gelding hit the board in six of eight starts last term, including a third behind ultimate sprint champion Elite Power and Gunite in the GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt at the Spa. This season, he finished off the board in his first two starts in Florida before posting consecutive wins in Monmouth's Mr Prospector Stakes May 27, the July 8 Alapocas Run Stakes at Delaware and most recently in the Frank J. DeFrancis Memorial Dash at Laurel July 28.
