'ROBUST MARKET' AS BOOK 2 OPENS WITH TRIO OF MILLION-DOLLAR YEARLINGS

LEXINGTON, KY -- The momentum which began with a competitive Book 1 section rolled into Book 2 with a trio of yearlings bringing seven figures and continued increases over

last year during the third session of the Keeneland September Yearling Sale in Lexington Wednesday.

"We saw the same kind of momentum and trends just rolling over," said Keeneland Vice President of Sales Tony Lacy. "There was a great positivity around the grounds. Consignors were invariably very pleased. And buyers found it tough and a very competitive environment. There were a lot of good horses on offer today. And I think it will be the same tomorrow. There was just great even trade. I think it was very, very strong, robust market."

The Book 2 opener saw 220 yearlings gross \$69,917,000. The session average rose 3.74% to \$317,805 and the median was up 7.84% to \$275,000.

From a catalogue of 380 head, a total of 306 yearlings were offered Wednesday and 86 failed to meet their reserves for a buy-back rate of 28.10%. It was 28.4% a year ago. **Cont. p3**

Likewise, breeders, owners and agents do not always have access to pools of investors and some are actively looking to add more capital, so they can take money off the table to mitigate risk.


If you hadn't heard, racing a horse is expensive, and speed dating at the sales does not always yield a match.

A colt by Tapit, purchased by the SF/Starlight/Madaket partnership, and a filly by Gun Runner sold to Douglas Scharbauer, shared Wednesday's top price of \$1.05 million. A colt by Charlatan sold for \$1 million to Pin Oak Stud.

The three million-dollar yearlings brought the total for the sale so far to 34--second most in the history of the September sale-- and up from 28 at this same point last year.

During Wednesday's session, 47 yearlings sold for \$500,000 or over, up from 39 during the corresponding session in 2023.

"I think it was probably above our expectations," Lacy said of the results. "When you look at the figures last year, it was very strong, and we are up about 7% in the median over last year. And when you look at the \$500,000 and above, we went from 39 last year and we are 47 this year. That's consistently above the mark. I think that is a really good trend."

The diverse bench of buyers who were active in Book 1 remained competitive into Book 2 Wednesday, as the domestic bench dominated.

"We had a tremendously diversified buying bench," said Keeneland Director of Sales Operations Cormac Breathnach. "We had 34 seven-figure horses already, which is second most in the history of the September sale. But when you look at who has bought those horses, very few people have bought more than one. So there are a lot of people here with significant money to spend and a real thirst and hunger for competition at the top end of the market. Others are getting pushed back and they still have orders to fill. That's what is really buoying this Book 2 and creating the momentum. The median has gone up to \$275,000 for the session today, which is a really strong number. It's a very healthy market. The RNA rate is in step with last year's."

The Keeneland September sale continues Thursday with a final Book 2 session beginning at 11 a.m. Following a dark day Friday, the auction resumes at 10 a.m. Saturday and continues through Sept. 21.

Another Gun Runner for Scharbauer

Douglas Scharbauer has bought five fillies during the first three days of the Keeneland September sale and four of them were by Gun Runner. The Texan, who purchased a filly by the Three Chimneys sire (hip 24) for \$1.5 million on the first day of the auction, went to \$1.05 million to acquire another daughter of the stallion (hip 695) Wednesday from the Taylor Made Sales Agency consignment.

"I saw her this afternoon for the first time," Scharbauer said of hip 695. "My two advisors, Donny Denton, who manages Valor Farm for me, and Ken Carson, we all three looked at her, and liked her pretty much. I was hoping I could get her for a little less than a million, but I can see why she brought that. I really can."

The yearling is the first foal out of **'TDN Rising Star'** Always Carina (Malibu Moon), second in the 2021 GII Mother Goose Stakes. She was bred by Three Chimneys Farm.

"She was just a beautiful filly," said Taylor Made's Frank Taylor. "She had a good walk to her. Everybody was lined up on her. We knew she was going to sell well. She was a really nice filly. Her mind is great. She showed really well at the barn. Things lined up and she showed well."

Of the filly's placement in Book 2, Taylor said, "Three Chimneys had quite a few horses in Book 1 and they decided to hold back some nice ones and it worked well."

As for a trainer for his newest acquisition, Scharbauer said, "I am not sure. Steve [Asmussen] might get her, but we will probably send some to Brad Cox. I've never sent any to him before. So we will send some to him, but I don't know which ones."

Scharbauer's Gun Runner haul also includes hip 628, purchased for \$650,000 from Terrazas Thoroughbreds, as agent for Corser Thoroughbreds; and hip 153, purchased for \$500,000 from Denali Stud as agent for Bridlewood Farm. He also purchased a filly by Not This Time (hip 678) for \$500,000 from Taylor Made.

"I've bought five fillies," Scharbauer said. "There were a couple of colts that we bid on, but that's just gone for too much money."

Always Carina, a half-sister to Grade I winner Structor (Palace Malice), produced a full-sister to hip 695 this year and she was bred back to Gun Runner. @JessMartiniTDN

Tapit Colt Shares Top Honors at KEESEP Wednesday

Keeping up the buying tempo that continued throughout Book 1, Tom Ryan signed for Wednesday's joint-topper, hip 674, a colt by Tapit. Extending to \$1.05 million for the son of Grade III winner Verve's Tale (Tale of Ekati), Ryan secured the grey on behalf of the SF/Starlight/Madaket triumvirate.

Consigned by Hunter Valley Farm, the Mar. 7 colt was bred by Charles Fipke, who also campaigned the yearling's 11-year-old dam and broodmare sire. A full-sister to GI Preakness runner-up Tale of Verve, Verve's Tale hails from the family of GISW Zoftig, herself responsible for GISWs Zo Impressive and Zaftig.

"He is out of a very good mare; a very deep family. Beautiful piece of (pedigree) paper," said Ryan. "And Tapit keeps on proving how good he is. He is a mainstay American star.

"[This colt's] temperament was great," said Ryan in regards to the stallion's known propensity to throw offspring with some spunk. "We've seen him several times and you've seen in the ring he was a gentleman."

Moments earlier, Ryan signed for hip 644, a colt by McKinzie. Offered by Gainesway, the bay colt came with a \$950,000 price tag. Out of Take Charge Angel (Will Take Charge), the colt is a grandson of Georgie's Angel (Bellamy Road), the dam of GI American Pharoah Stakes and GI Runhappy Del Mar Futurity scorer Cave Rock (Arrogate). Trained by Bob Baffert for Mike Pegram, Karl Watson and Paul Weitman, Cave Rock, a \$550,000 KEESEP yearling purchase, also finished runner up in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Keeneland.



"This colt is out of a half sister to Cave Run who is really one of the best 2-year-olds we have seen in the last couple of years," affirmed Ryan. "Physically, he was very straight forward horse."

The colt was bred by Gainesway Thoroughbreds and Brian Graves. Carrying this foal, Take Charge Angel RNA'd for \$575,000 at Keeneland November in 2022.

"We have a yellow [sales] ticket with a big number on it so clearly we loved the horse," Ryan explained. "There is quite a criteria for these horses to jump through from the team and our partnership group. We do quite a bit of work to qualify these horses and he qualifies in every measure."

Adding further padding to the page, the colt's 3-year-old full-brother to Cave Rock, named Assurbanipal, brought \$1.05 million at OBSMAR in 2023 after topping Fasig-Tipton's New York-bred sale in Saratoga a year earlier at \$700,000. He has won three of his four starts impressively in Japan.

Additionally, Furio, a full brother to this colt, brought \$400,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Select Sale last year.

As for the hot Gainesway stallion, Ryan explained, "McKinzie has really kicked off in a star fashion. McKinzie was a great racehorse and it looks like his stock is more precocious than he was himself. He has shown precocity with his 2-year-olds this year. Lots to look forward to with McKinzie."


Gainesway's Antony Beck added, "McKinzie's [offspring] are setting the track alight right now so I think [hip 644] will add to that."

Included among the team's purchases Wednesday, hip 634, a colt by Uncle Mo out of Sundaysatthebeach. Purchased for \$775,000, the colt was consigned by Woods Edge Farm.

"We are hitting plenty of targets but have to fight for them," he said.--@CBossTDN

Regan Reflects On Tapit Topper

Tapit had his second seven-figure yearling of the week when the SF/Starlight/Madaket partnership paid \$1.05 million for a son of the Gainesway stalwart (hip 674) Wednesday at Keeneland.

"With the way he's gone over the whole week, we were hoping, but you never know if you are going to get a million or not," said Adrian Regan of Hunter Valley Farm, which consigned the yearling on behalf of breeder Charles Fipke. "I think there are only 70 or so Tapits in this yearling crop, there are not that many of them anymore, and he's still a very popular stallion."

The yearling is out of Verve's Tale (Tale of Ekati), who won the 2016 GIII Comely Stakes in Fipke's colors. Fipke purchased Verve's Tale's dam Verve (Unbridled) for \$160,000 at the 2005 Keeneland November sale.

"He was a lovely horse," Regan said. "It's brilliant to do it for Mr. Fipke. We've sold for him for years. He has always been there for us."

During the first session of the auction, Shadwell Farm purchased a filly by Tapit (hip 81) for \$1.2 million.

Charlatan Colt Brings Seven Figures in Book 2 Opener

Sporting a markedly different pace than just one day earlier, Book 2 kicked off with plenty of activity of its own, highlighted by several yearlings by in-demand freshman sire Charlatan.

Marking the first seven-figure sale of the day was hip 509, who brought \$1-million from Jim and Dana Bernhard's Pin Oak Stud, bidding over the internet.

Consigned by Hill 'n' Dale at Xalapa, the chestnut is out of Mike Pegram's GI Acorn Stakes and GI Humana Distaff Stakes winner Midnight Lucky (Midnight Lute). The Apr. 26 foal was bred by Pegram, his recognizable partners Karl Watson and Paul Weitman and Hill 'n' Dale.

An earner of \$565,022 on the track while under the care of Bob Baffert, the colt's 14-year-old dam, who was purchased by Pegram for \$220,000 at Fasig-Tipton Saratoga in 2011, is out of a sister to Grade I winner Hookedonthefeelin, herself the dam of three-time Grade I scorer Pussycat Doll and GI Malibu Stakes victor Jimmy Creed.

This represents the second seven-figure yearling for the mare following a colt by Curlin that brought \$1.2 million at Keeneland September in 2020.

Also receiving a timely update to the page, a half-brother to the chestnut, Into Midnight (Into Mischief), finished a close-up second for Baffert at Del Mar Sept. 7.

"Bob is high on [Into Midnight]. Charlatan is flying at the moment, he looked the part and the stars aligned," said Hill 'n' Dale's Jared Burdine. "He was our most popular horse for Book 2."

Hill 'n' Dale's General Manager continued, "You never know until you get up here. Things have to line up. A couple of people lock horns and it's a little bit of magic. **Cont. p9**

He continued, "it exceeded our expectations. He was a nice colt so seven figures in Book 2 is impressive."

Giving a nod to Hill 'n' Dale's hot young sire, John Sikura said, ""I want to thank Mike Pegram, Karl Watson, and Paul Weitman for their support. They committed a Grade I winner to a freshman sire. It all goes back to the beginning when we committed top, top mares to the horse. I think it's a commitment you have to make when you stand a horse, to have a commensurate quality mare. Charlatan was a superstar and provided the ammunition. [Charlatan's offspring] have certainly sold well in the market. The sale result is not the most important result: it's at the racetrack and the table is set."

Later Wednesday, Pin Oak paid \$625,000 for hip 538, a colt by Not This Time. Out of multiple stakes winner New York Groove (Verrazano), the dark bay was consigned by Denali Stud, agent.--@CBossTDN

Yaupon Colt to St. Elias





Monique Delk, bidding on behalf of Vinnie Viola's St. Elias Stables, went to \$900,000 to acquire a colt from the first crop of Yaupon (hip 571) Wednesday at Keeneland. The colt was consigned by Highgate Sales as agent for his breeder, Terry Green's Jackpot Farm.

"He is just a beautiful colt," Delk said. "We loved his physical. He looks just like his sire. He really stamped him. He's quite a lovely horse."

The bay yearling is out of stakes-placed Q Go Girl (Quality Road) and is a half-brother to graded-winner Stretch Ride (Street Sense).

"He was an incredible horse," Highgate's Jacob West said of the colt. "We just happened to be lucky that Jackpot entrusted us with him. We knew he was a star from the day we saw him.



When we went through all their yearlings, he was one of the ones we earmarked. Terry Green and John Gray, their farm manager, wanted to support us with a nice horse."

Jackpot purchased Q Go Girl for \$147,000 at the 2019 Fasig-Tipton July Horses of Racing Age Sale. Her first foal, Stretch Ride, was third in last year's GII Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes. The mare produced a colt by Speaker's Corner this year and was bred back to Into Mischief.

Her yearling colt by Yaupon had plenty of admirers at the sales barn, according to West.

"He had the hair looked off him at the barn," West said. "I think every vet on the sales grounds had vetted him. He handled everything with nothing but class. He's a really, really good horse. He deserved that price. Those are good people who bred him and even better people that bought him."

Foals from the first crop of 2021 GI Forego Stakes winner Yaupon (Uncle Mo) were in demand last fall, with 47 weanlings selling for an average of \$127,702, led by a colt at Keeneland November who sold for \$450,000.

With 31 yearlings sold this year for an average of \$198,774, Tuesday's colt was the Spendthrift stallion's highest-priced sale success so far.

"He's a son of Uncle Mo, who is one of the most brilliant horses we've seen probably in my generation, if not in the entire industry," West said of the stallion. "He himself was a gorgeous horse who was incredibly fast. This is not shocking that we are starting to see these things come through and light up the tote board. It wouldn't shock me at all if they light up the racetrack. He's a well-bred horse who was very fast. To me, this is something you'd almost expect, to be honest. People have to be excited about them and let's see what they can do."

Delk agreed she was impressed with Yaupon's first crop.

"So far, I love what I am seeing [of Yaupon]," she said. "They are very athletic looking, very attractive. They are very agile and light on their feet with a beautiful walk. Just the whole package." @JessMartiniTDN

Lieblong Lands Charlatan Half-Brother to GISW Klimt

Earlier in Wednesday's session, Alex Lieblong, riding solo in the main pavilion, extended to \$800,000 for hip 454, a ridgling by Charlatan.


"I liked everything about him except the price," said Lieblong shortly after the purchase. "But it didn't shock me; he is from a heck of a family."

"Evidently [his status as a ridgling] did not affect the price. I was hoping it would a little bit but it didn't," Lieblong admitted. "I am spending more than I want to but I guess everyone feels that way going to the grocery store or anywhere."

According to Lieblong, a trainer has yet to be decided for his latest acquisition.

In Book 1, the Arkansas resident secured Hip 33, a \$500,000 Quality Road filly out of GISW Embellish the Lace, a filly that ran in his colors. Also during Wednesday's session, Lieblong paid \$450,000 for hip 401, a filly by Justify out of Emily B--@CBossTDN

Mike Ryan Parts With \$800K for Uncle Mo Colt

Early in Wednesday's opening Book 2 session, agent Mike Ryan signed the ticket on hip 468, a colt by Uncle Mo. Consigned by Lane's End, acting agent on behalf of breeder Jane Lyon's Summer Wind Equine, the bay is out of Irish listed winner Key to My Heart (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), a daughter of GI Frizette Stakes scorer and 'TDN Rising Star' A Z Warrior (Bernardini). This is the family of GSWs and GISP Jojo Warrior and E Z Warrior, both former 'Rising Stars'.

"The first time I saw him was at Summer Wind Farm about three weeks ago and he immediately reminded me of Nyquist," said Ryan, referring to the GI Kentucky Derby-winning son of Uncle Mo. "He has an aura about him that only a handful of horses have. He's got size, depth, quality and an unbelievable pedigree."

Key to My Heart, a 525,000gns purchase at Tattersalls February in 2018, was purchased by Lyon for \$1.75 million at Keeneland later that November while in foal to War Front.


Despite sporting a female family that leans toward early precocity and speed, Ryan anticipates the colt will show a different dimension as well.

"He looks like a horse that will ge a mile-and-an-eighth and a mile-and-a-quarter," he said. "And he looks like he will run at two as well."

According to Ryan, the colt, who has been purchased by a new undisclosed client, will be trained by Chad Brown.

"I thought he was very special," he said. "He would have stood out on any day. We were thrilled to get him."--@CBossTDN



Bonus Depreciation


- 60% bonus depreciation for qualifying horse, farm equipment and farm depreciable asset (land improvements, fencing, barns) purchases through 2024
- Property must be purchased and placed in service before January 1, 2025
- · Property may be new or used
- Bonus depreciation is phased down by 20% per calendar year and will be fully phased out after 2026

Section 179 Expense Deduction

- Expense allowance for horse, farm equipment and farm depreciable asset (land improvements, fencing, barns) purchases is permanent at \$1.22 million for 2024 (having started at \$1 million and indexed for inflation beginning after December 31, 2018)
- · Limited to taxable income
- Property must be purchased and placed in service to qualify
- Applies to new or used property
- Reduced by \$1 dollar for each dollar of eligible property purchased that exceeds \$3.05 million in 2024 (having started at \$2.5 million and indexed for inflation beginning after December 31, 2018)

Commonwealth, the micro-share company behind the partnership in 2023 GI Kentucky Derby winner Mage (Good Magic), G1 Dubai World Cup hero Country Grammer (Tonalist) and GSW We the People (Constitution), thinks they have the answer to these questions because they say they know how to harness the crowd. With a multi-faceted track record behind them, the company is leading the revolution to transform partnership opportunities in horse racing. Now the only crowdfunding syndicate in the world with its own funding portal and full platform, Commonwealth can offer anywhere from 5% to 50% of an equine athlete through its website.

Most importantly, their new model allows owners to harness a 20,000-strong community--hence the company's binding moniker--which is a direct avenue to those who want to fund a racehorse. Guiding these owners through the proprietary fundraising process allows them to list and sell shares to the public. Commonwealth makes it happen.

"Our goal is simple--giving owners and breeders access to capital partners for high-quality racehorses and continuing to provide our customers with the once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to take the ride of a lifetime," said Commonwealth co-founder Chase Chamberlin.

Through a Portal Darkly

According to Chamberlin, who co-founded Commonwealth with his good buddy a few years ago--finance and start-up veteran CEO Brian Doxtator--the challenge that has existed are SEC regulations.

The rules force companies that want to offer shares in horses to purchase a 51% stake or higher, and most importantly they must have complete management of the horse. That translates to buying fewer horses, which means less of a chance of finding a bona fide star. To put it another way, the risk can be high since

enormous amounts of cash are needed and in the end it can be tough to get approval.

The original model that Commonwealth started with worked, but it did limit the number of offerings and rolling them out became cumbersome. Still, stellar results like Mage were home runs. Since 2022, Commonwealth collected a pair of Grade I wins, five GI placings and they hit the board in 13 graded stakes with a stable of less than 15 runners.

"We've been incredibly fortunate not only to win races like the Dubai World Cup and the Kentucky Derby, but also to compete convincingly in graded stakes worldwide," said Chamberlin. "We're even more excited about the new partnerships and horses that will develop through our new model, which allows owners to offer their horses on Commonwealth. It's not just about the horses you choose, but the partners you make the climb with."

Up until this year, offerings have fallen under SEC Regulation A+ and that is where the red tape has blocked widespread owner opportunities. Months can pass by under Reg A+, and in the end, the SEC can issue a denial which can derail all the hard work Commonwealth poured into developing a specific deal. On their website, the phrase "coming soon" does not particularly age well in a business like this one.

"Our former regulatory framework worked great for our members, but we knew there was a better way to increase the volume of high quality racehorse offerings for them," he said. "Challenges spark innovation, and these recent challenges have led to a faster, simpler model that unlocks entirely new partnership opportunities."

The Right Owner For the Crowd

The freeing mechanism that Commonwealth has switched to is through Regulation CF, which is what is called crowdfunding. Under their new process Commonwealth has become the only syndicate that can crowdfund a minority position and that is where offering 5% to 50% on their platform comes in. What could take months before, now can be flexibly be cut down to just two to three weeks.

According to Chamberlin that translates to being able to broker even more timely partnerships with industry titans. Elite horse owners can enter into their very own syndicate for a specific amount and it allows them to maintain their management rights to their equine athlete. The ability to take money off the table is an attractive opportunity, especially if they have a Derby Trail participant or a hot yearling prospect by a leading sire.

Those types of horse offerings generate interest among the crowd and it turns Commonwealth's community into shareholders instead of burdening them with the onus of significant ownership. In turn, it's the platform who manages finances, operations and marketing, and keeps customers updated so owners can focus on their bread and butter--racing, training and managing equine athletes.

"By switching to Regulation CF, we've cut the process down to weeks, not months, while letting owners keep control and offer 5% to 50% stakes," Chamberlin said. "It's a game-changer for striking fast partnerships with industry giants and those new to the game, and we handle all the logistics so owners can focus on winning races and enjoying the magic of horse racing."



How They Meet

The test run for this crowdfunding initiative arrived in 2024 when Gandharvi Racing offered a 25 percent stake on Commonwealth's platform in 'TDN Rising Star' Parenting (Justify). The \$507,000 offering went like hotcakes and sold out in an hour.

Like all of their offerings at \$50 a share, the platform just funded **Asean (Ire)** (Ten Sovereigns {Ire}) for Ocean Reef Racing, who is in-training with Philip D'Amato, and full investment in a yearling named **Coco G** (Caravaggio) that started last week is already nearly complete. That filly was selected by Kim Valerio at this year's Keeneland January Sale. More opportunities are already in the pipeline with Parenting's three-quarter weanling brother by Justify up next and a partnership with Team Valor on a filly by **Gun Runner** out of the GISW **Oleksandra (Aus)** (Animal Kingdom) is in the offing, just to name a few.

Commonwealth's master plan will give its community of investors the chance to put their money into a Thoroughbred that is headed to race and what Chamberlin says is a real chance of winning at the highest levels. Any horse globally can be considered, which broadens the pool of owners and shareholders even more.

"Our first offering flew off the shelves, selling out in just an hour," he said. "With \$50 shares, fans of all income levels are now backing elite horses with real opportunity at top-tier wins. It's not just investing--it's a front-row seat to racing success. And don't underestimate our community; we have quite a few members who could afford to buy stables of their own horses, but they enjoy the ease, fun and low-risk of racing with Commonwealth."

With racehorse ownership, the implication is that a high-level of financial commitment is around every turn. According to Commonwealth, by streamlining the process, accessing the top bloodlines and doing so on a budget, all the while extending a hand to owners, they have the potential to offer a massive win for the sport.

Providing a one-of-a-kind experience, Commonwealth says their new funding platform for owners around the creation of syndicates is even more exciting and they know how to harness the crowd.

AIDAN O'BRIEN JOINS TON WRITERS' ROOM PODCAST

Aidan O'Brien has never won the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. But it hasn't been from a lack of effort. He's had 13 starters in the race and has run some very good horses, including Galileo (Ire)

(Sadler's Wells) and Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat). But his luck could very well change this year as he will take aim at the Classic with one of the best horses of this generation.

The O'Brien trained **City of Troy** (Justify) has had an outstanding campaign in Europe, winning six of seven starts, including four Group I races. City of Troy would probably be a cinch if O'Brien were to run him in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, but the trainer has picked the bigger challenge, the Classic. O'Brien was the guest of the week on the latest edition of TDN Writers' Room podcast presented by **Keeneland**, to explain his decision, and much more.

"(Running in the Classic) was always on our minds," O'Brien said, "We've never won Classic. It's obviously a race that we'd love to win, but we know that you need an exceptional horse to do it really. Obviously he's by Justify, which makes it very exciting and always made it look like he could be very special for us. He's handy, he stays, he's determined; has all the things you need to make this happen. It's a big ask to run on the dirt first time and with a horse that's not trained on it."

O'Brien is not taking anything for granted and has been doing everything he can to prepare the Justify colt for his first ever dirt start. That includes sending him to England on Sept. 20 to have a trial race over a synthetic surface at Southwell Race Course.

"He'll fly over there," he said. "It will be like a race dy for him. It will be on an artificial surface. Obviously, it's not dirt, but it's as close as probably we can get from here. It's a little bit of a change off of what he is used to. We'll be bringing an American stye starting gate that we have and the horses. We'll probably go a mile and we'll probably do as much as we can to have him as ready as he can be. This is going to be a big change for him. We're trying to do it gently rather than having one big shock."

O'Brien said he will bring between five and eight horses to challenge City of Troy in the mock race.

That City of Troy's sire is Justify is a huge factor. He's an exceptional sire and his progeny can handle the dirt. What does O'Brien think of Justify?

"When we saw him first, like he looked a different breed, O'Brien said. "He looked like a big quarter horse. When we saw him at first, we could not believe the amount of muscle and the power and the scope and the strength that he had. He was able to go a mile-and-a-half in the Belmont and the distance was no problem for him. His stock has a lot of class. They're very high cruisers, they're very genuine. They're very like Galileo's but they have more speed. I suppose what he did as a racehorse was just out of this world. That's why we're so excited about him. He looks like a massive big powerful dirt horse."

In our breeding spotlight section we looked at the WinStar stallion Constitution.

Elsewhere on the podcast, which is also sponsored by the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders' Association, West Point Thoroughbreds, WinStar, XBTV.com and the KTA/KTOB, the team of Randy Moss, Zoe Cadman and Bill Finley, discussed a closing weekend at Del Mar that was dominated by Bob Baffert and the races at Kentucky Downs, where the purses have risen to levels that once were unfathomable. They also took on the story of Churchill Downs making changes to its 'Road to the Derby' schedule, noting that races with five horses or less will now have fewer points than those with six or more horses.

SANTA ANITA PARK'S AUTUMN MEET UNVEILS NEW WAGERING MENU

Horseplayers will find a revised wagering menu for this year's 16-day Santa Anita Autumn Meet, which opens Friday, Sept. 27, 1/ST Racing said in a press release on Wednesday.

The Pick Six is now has a \$2 minimum after previously being a \$1 base wager, but will continue to pay out 70 percent of each day's pool to tickets that have all six winners with the remaining 30 percent going to consolation payouts. If there are no tickets with six winners, 70 percent of the pool will carryover to the next race day with the remainder paid out in consolations.

New to the Santa Anita wagering menu this year is a \$5 minimum Late Daily Double and a \$3 Late Pick Three--both feature a 15 percent takeout. Santa Anita and Gulfstream Park will combine forces to offer a \$1 Coast-to-Coast Pick 5 on Saturdays and Sundays, and the \$1 Super Hi 5 will only be offered on the final race of the day.







'THE POTENTIAL TO SAVE WORLD RACING': VIEWS ON WORLD POOL EXPANSION



German racing first featured in the World Pool in 2023 | *Emma Berry By Emma Berry*

From its launch in 2019, covering the five days of Royal Ascot, the World Pool has grown gradually to 33 race days this year across eight different countries. It is fair to expect to see that expansion continue apace.

The international commingling of betting pools was the brainchild of Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges, CEO of the Hong Kong Jockey Club, which powers World Pool. Twenty-eight jurisdictions can now bet into that pool.

"It is our vision to bring the world's finest racing to domestic customers all year round," states the World Pool website, but it is not just punters who are benefiting from this increased liquidity in the betting pools. The racecourses included in the World Pool programme, which this year has covered fixtures in Australia, Argentina, Britain, Germany, Ireland, Saudi Arabia, South Africa and the UAE, stand to gain around £500,000 in extra funding per race day.

At the Asian Racing Conference, held a fortnight ago in Sapporo, Michael Fitzsimons, executive director of wagering products at the HKJC, outlined how further expansion of World Pool could help to combat the threat to racing's future from the rapid growth of illegal betting markets. Cont. p3

Gouache (Ger), dam of G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth QIPCO Stakes winner Goliath (Ger), is to be sold at the Goffs November Breeding Stock Sale

A Listed-winning daughter of Shamardal, Gouache is a half-sister to the G2 Gerling-Preis winner Guardini (Fr) (Dalakhani {Ire}), and she will be offered in foal to Baaeed (GB). The 12-year-old mare will be consigned by Millennium Stud.

Bred by the Ullmann family of Gestut Schlenderhan, the mare passed through a sale ring only last December when sold at Arqana for €200,000 to Agrolexica International Trading in foal to Blackbeard (Ire). Goliath was her second foal and she is also the dam of a three-year-old filly named Galaxy (Ger) (Cloth Of Stars {Ire}), while the mare's current two-year-old Go Flying (Ger) is a full-sister to Goliath from the final crop of the late Adlerflug (Ger). Gouache also has a yearling filly by Magna Grecia (Ire). Cont. p7

He drew a comparison with the collaborative efforts within the music business which have been deployed in the battle against piracy.

Fitzsimons said, "As with the music industry, we must innovate together in a manner more compelling than the illegal alternative. To do this, our goal is for World Pool to provide coverage of the IFHA's top 100 races.

"To meet the challenge of the illegal market, we can't and won't stop until we too have a convenient product with all the world's best races in one place, available to a global audience, through the national pool operators in every country."

staged in the country, at Ascot, Epsom, Goodwood, Newmarket and York. Seventeen of the IFHA's top 100 races were run in Britain last year, according to the Longines rankings, while Ireland had three on that list and hosts four World Pool days.

France does not yet have World Pool fixtures but Germany's Grosser Preis von Baden card was included in 2023 and there are now six German meetings on the schedule. With World Pool having grown from 27 to 33 race days in the last year, there is speculation that it could double in number before long.

Horse Racing Ireland's CEO Suzanne Eade said during a panel discussion at the ARC, "World Pool makes our good days great days."

Its presence will be felt this weekend in particular, with both days of the Irish Champions

Festival included, while the sole remaining fixture in the UK this season is British Champions Day at Ascot next month. Cont. p4

The appearance of Japanese contender Shin Emperor (Fr) in the Irish Champion Stakes on Saturday will surely only reinforce the desire from the HKJC to encourage the Japan Racing Association (JRA) to get on board with World Pool.

"If the Japanese were to amalgamate with the global pools it would increase fivefold," said Alex Frost, CEO of the UK Tote Group, who was also in attendance at the ARC and described the expansion of the World Pool to date as "breathtaking".

Racing's Silver Bullet?

That gathering of racing's leaders included a debate on the relative strength or otherwise of the world's betting markets, along with

the looming spectre of the aforementioned competition from the illegal markets, which are believed to be worth an estimated US\$1.7 trillion.

Peter V'Landys, the CEO of Australia's Racing New South Wales, joined the panel with Eade and was unequivocal in his

view of World Pool.

He said, "I think it has the potential to save world racing because it really highlights the major events in every country, it puts the focus on that event and punters from all around the

world can bet on that particular race."

Frost was particularly encouraged by his comments.

"There is a silver bullet for global horse racing and that is tote betting done properly," he said.
"That's the most powerful message that I took out of the conference - that there is a solution."

He continued, "People have been living off steady growth but suddenly there is a bit of a wobble. Betting turnover is down in Hong Kong and Australia and everyone is

suffering from a bit of a pull back other than the JRA. I sense that people are really concerned, and when you get the likes of Peter V'Landys standing up and saying there is only one solution, and Japan showing that you need a proper level of reinvestment in the racing product, I felt very invigorated by that." He also is of the view that Britain is well positioned to benefit further from any expansion.

"When you consider our level of reputation and integrity, and the time zone we are in, it is perfect for Asia," he said. "It is more of a challenge in America."

York's Prize-Money Boost

William Derby is the chief executive and clerk of the course at York racecourse, a shining beacon among tracks in the UK. Its recent Ebor meeting featured 28 races across four days, none of which offered less than £100,000 in prize-money. York's rising purses have been aided by the returns from its three World Pool days.

"We're delighted to have been involved since the second wave, alongside Goodwood, in 2021," said Derby. "That global approach is really appealing to us as a racecourse, and having people engaging in betting on our festival racing is something that we really want to encourage.

"The York Race Committee took the view that we would invest all that we received in World Pool returns and put that all back into the prize funds. So our prize funds since 2019, which was our last proper Ebor without World Pool, have gone up by what we receive from World Pool. We would love for the Saturday of

the Ebor Festival to be a World Pool day as we feel that the Ebor, the Melrose, the Strensall and the City of York Stakes would be really engaging content."

And in a trickledown effect, those big days at York now help to shore up some of the lesser meetings during the year.

Derby added, "It has boosted the strength of our entire race programme, not just World Pool days. No race at York is worth less than $\mathfrak{L}20,000$ and all grades of racing have benefited, so the sport has benefited as whole, and everyone connected to it – be they owners, trainers or jockeys."

Along with the racecourses receiving a financial boost from World Pool fixtures there is value to be found for punters too. *The Racing Post*'s betting expert Tom Segal referred to the benefits in his column this week.

He said, "I invariably find that the horses I'm interested in start at much bigger prices on the World Pool than they do with the traditional bookmakers or on the exchanges, given that the majority of them aren't ridden by William Buick or Ryan Moore and aren't trained by the Gosdens or Aidan O'Brien.

"Of course World Pool betting isn't going to suit everyone, with its each-way terms sometimes not that favourable. But the sizeable group of punters who like a medium-sized win bet should certainly consider the World Pool when having a wager at the big meetings." Cont. p6

Unsurprisingly, this is a view which is wholly endorsed by Frost.

"I would like people to really get behind it now," he said.
"There are lots of people who like a bet in the UK and Ireland.
We've gone beyond the stage of proving the concept. It has shown that it can help enormously, and if we are going to see the roll-out that was talked about at the Asian Racing
Conference then we need to be doing everything we can to get behind it."

He continued, "That's the one thing that I would like to impress upon people, that there is a solution. And if people don't believe that the world is moving fast, it's pretty remarkable to have the next [Asian Racing] conference in Saudi. That in itself is a message. To think that wagering is going to be discussed openly in Saudi - who would have thought that even two or three years ago? It's a definite barometer of change."

Having beaten the re-opposing **Flight (GB)** (Siyouni {Fr}) convincingly on debut on Newmarket's July Course, she returned to defy a penalty in style last month and trainer Charlie Appleby has no concerns about the hike from seven furlongs.

"We feel that the step up to a mile here should hopefully bring about some more improvement, which will be needed at this level," he said. "We have been pleased with her preparation and are looking forward to seeing how she gets on in this company. Like much of the field, we will be a lot wiser after the race."

Ballydoyle's juvenile fillies have carried all before them so far in 2024 and it could be that **TDN Rising Star Ecstatic (Jpn)** (Lord Kanaloa {Jpn}) is ready to join the best of them. **Cont. p6**

HOWDEN AND MCGIVERN BACK EVENTING CHALLENGE FOR EX-RACEHORSES

Owner-breeders David Howden and Jayne McGivern, both of whom are also heavily involved in the eventing world, have unveiled plans for a valuable class for former racehorses at Howden's Cornbury House Horse Trials.

The Cornbury Racehorses Eventing Challenge is a joint initiative which will be run at the Oxfordshire event in 2025, offering a first prize of £45,000. The duo hopes that it will help to raise the profile of the suitability of Thoroughbreds for eventing.

Horses must not have competed at CCI4* level or above in the past two seasons. Riders will be restricted to two entries each, and horses do not need to have raced or to have been in training, but must be registered with Weatherbys or the appropriate Thoroughbred studbook of their country of origin.

Howden, the founder and president of Cornbury House Horse Trials whose homebred filly Running Lion (GB) won this year's G2 Duke of Cambridge Stakes at Royal Ascot, said, "I am so excited that we will be introducing this very special class at CHHT in 2025. Jayne McGivern and I share a joint-passion for both eventing and racing and for the amazing horses in those sports, and we hope to draw attention to the wonderful versatility of Thoroughbred – and to encourage our best riders to recognise their suitability for eventing and to reward them for the correct training of them."
