# FROM SPRINTING SENSATION TO BRILLIANT BROODMARE FOR MECCA'S ANGEL

Having confessed my love for one dual Nunthorpe winner, Borderlescott (GB), in a TDN feature published during York's Ebor Festival, it now seems only fair to revisit the story of another, the force of nature that was Mecca's Angel (Ire), successful on the Knavesmire in 2015 and 2016 and now one of the most exciting young broodmares on the planet through the exploits of her daughters, Content (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Bedtime Story (Ire) (Frankel {GB}).

For former owner David Metcalfe it's the story that just keeps on giving, even if his own direct involvement with the daughter of Dark Angel (Ire) came to an end when her private sale to Coolmore was announced on Tuesday, October 18, 2016. Fittingly, it was the same date on which she was bought by trainer Michael Dods for just 16,000gns at Book 2 of Tattersalls October Yearling Sale four years earlier.

"Michael knows I like sprinters and he had an order from me for a nice filly," Metcalfe says of that initial purchase. "I was flying back from somewhere and motoring down to Newmarket, but I wasn't going to be there in time to see her go through the ring." Cont. p3

#### **GROUP 1 WINNER FEED THE FLAME RETIRED**

Jean-Louis Bouchard's Group 1 winner **Feed The Flame (GB)** (Kingman {GB}) has been retired for stallion duty trainer Pascal Bary confirmed to *Paris Turf* on Thursday. Stud plans are pending for the 4-year-old.

Out of Knyazhna (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), the bay was bred by Monceaux, Lordship Stud and Clear Light SAS. Offered by Monceaux during the 2021 Arqana August Yearling Sale, he brought €270,000 from SAS Larrieu Gerard. A winner of his first two starts last spring with the former effort good for 'TDN Rising Star' status, Feed The Flame was fourth in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club prior to winning the G1 Grand Prix de Paris last July. He was second in the G2 Prix Niel, prior to running eighth in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. This term, he placed three times at the highest level--third-place finishes in the Prix Ganay, and Coronation Cup--and a runner-up effort in the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud in June from six starts. Fourth in the G3 Prix Gontaut-Biron at Deauville in August, he was pulled up in the G2 Prix Foy won by Iresine (Fr) (Manduro {Ger}) on Sept. 15. His records stands at 12-3-2-2 and \$746,820 in earnings. Cont. p5

He says, "I went to see her as soon as I got to the sales and there was no argument that I'd take her. I just loved the look of

her. As for how much, they laugh about it because I said I only wanted to spend 15 grand, so Michael came in as a partner. But we got on very well and were pals, so that didn't bother me."

It didn't take long for that to prove money very well spent, but first the filly had to be given a name by Metcalfe--better known as 'Mecca' to those closest to him.

"I used to go down to Shropshire and the Welsh Borders buying cattle," he continues. "The people down there would ask me to ring them

when my horses were running, but I knew I'd forget so I told them I'd do something better.

"From then on I christened all of the horses 'Mecca's' something. Then if they looked on the index and saw a 'Mecca's' running, it was likely to be mine. We decided to do it with all of the horses and then we just kept it going because it was lucky."

Mecca's Angel, a daughter of the Atraf (GB) mare Folga (GB), a six-time winner over sprint trips for James Given, made her first racecourse appearance at Thirsk in May of her two-year-old season, by which stage Metcalfe already knew he had a proper horse on his hands.

"She was that good I could see it for myself," he replies when asked about the reports of her ability from Dods. "We saw it before she ever ran. I remember telling somebody at one market I was at that you want to watch this horse because she's like nothing I've ever had before.

And she ended up winning by 12 lengths at Southwell as a two-year-old." Cont. p4

That Southwell demolition job was the second of Mecca's Angel's two wins as a juvenile when she was also runner-up in Listed races at York and Ayr. At three she was beaten just once in five starts, with Friday marking the 10-year anniversary of her first Group-race success in the G3 World Trophy at Newbury.

Having been carefully managed in those early years, avoiding fast ground--"We had to protect her a bit because her joints weren't the best in the world," says Metcalfe--Mecca's Angel was finally unleashed at the top table as a four-year-old when she contested the Nunthorpe for the first time.

The result was an emphatic two-length defeat of Wesley Ward's two-year-old rocket Acapulco (Scat Daddy), while her success in 2016, when beating the G1 July Cup winner Limato (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) by the same distance, was arguably better still, coming very close to breaking Dayjur's long-standing course record.

"We definitely appreciated the second one a lot," Metcalfe remembers. "I was on cloud nine--it's just something that you don't expect to happen. I'm pleased that we managed to do it.

"A lot of people don't even get a winner and we've had a lot of success over the years. Now, thank god, she's breeding good ones for Coolmore.


"We didn't want people to know what we got for her," he adds of the decision to sell Mecca's Angel privately, at the end of a career in which she won 10 of her 20 starts and earned £679,941 in total prize-money.

"We thought we probably could make more at the sales, but it wasn't about how much we got for her. She'd done us proud and we wanted her to go somewhere where we knew she'd be looked after well. We've been over to see her at Coolmore and it's like being at The Ritz."

Now the dam of three winners from as many runners, Mecca's Angel has certainly rewarded the five-star care given to her by the Coolmore team. Her three-year-old daughter Content was last seen making the breakthrough at the top level in the Yorkshire Oaks, at the scene of her dam's Nunthorpe heroics, while her two-year-old Bedtime Story was unbeaten in four starts--including a nine-length win in the Listed Chesham Stakes at Royal Ascot--before her odds-on defeat in Sunday's G1 Moyglare Stud Stakes at the Curragh.

"I'm so pleased that she's got Content and Bedtime Story," says Metcalfe, who still has three horses in training at the Dods yard near Darlington. "The more success they have, the happier I am for Coolmore and the team."

He adds, "Content running was the reason we went to York [the day she won the Yorkshire Oaks], because we hadn't seen her in the flesh. And Bedtime Story looked out of the ordinary until her last run, but I read in the paper that the vet said she was lame after the race. They say she has a bit of Mecca's Angel's temperament. She likes to go fast and has to be anchored a bit.

"It sent a cold shiver down my back when she won at Ascot. You'd think we had shares in her. We don't, but you feel involved even though you're on the sidelines because Mecca's Angel was ours once--she's always been my mare."

#### MINOR SETBACK FORCES GOLIATH TO MISS **SUNDAY'S PREIS VON EUROPA**

Goliath (Ger) (Adlerflug (Ger)) has been ruled out of Sunday's G1 Preis von Europa at Cologne due to a minor setback, it was announced on Thursday.

Trained by Francis-Henri Graffard, Goliath has been off the track since his shock 25-1 victory in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Stakes at Ascot in July, with prominent American owner John Stewart subsequently purchasing a majority share in the four-year-old from Philip Baron von Ullmann.

Goliath had been set for a rematch with King George third Rebel's Romance (Ire) (Dubawi (Ire)) in Cologne, but his connections will now have to consider other options as they plot a path to the G1 Japan Cup at Tokyo on Sunday, November 24.

Von Ullmann told www.galopponline.de, "This morning I received a call from trainer Francis-Henri Graffard, who told me that Goliath had developed a small foot abscess after his final work.

"It's nothing long-term, but safety comes first and we don't think it's right to let him run in Cologne if he's not at 100 per cent and is causing the horse additional discomfort. Animal welfare is always our top priority.

"John and I were really looking forward to running in Cologne and he was planning to fly from America to Cologne, but that's horse racing. We're still aiming for the Japan Cup, but we'll have to see what the exact plan is now."

Graffard still hopes to give Goliath a prep run before his planned trip to Japan.

"He has a foot abscess and was not 100 per cent, so we won't take any risks any with him," said the trainer. "I'll have to look at the programme book and see. Hopefully, we'll have one run before he can go to Japan."

Graffard was able to provide a more positive update on star three-year-old **Calandagan (Ire)** (Gleneagles {Ire}), who is on course for a heavyweight clash with Economics (GB) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) in the G1 Champion Stakes at Ascot on Saturday, October 19. He was last seen filling the runner-up spot behind City Of Troy (Justify) in the G1 Juddmonte International at York.

"Calandagan is in top form and training to go to Ascot," Graffard added.

Sacred Spirit (Ire) (Kingman {GB}), a winner of the Listed Grand Prix de Lyon, anchors a quintet of wildcards that were

added to Argana's Arc Sale on Thursday.

Consigned as lot 15, the gelding was second in the G3 Prix de Reux and third in the G2 Grand Prix de Deauville and is rated 106. Joining the Andre Fabre-trained son of listed winner and Group 1 producer Sahrawi (Ger) (Pivotal {GB}) is lot 29, listed scorer Rosa Salvaje (Ire) (Maximum Security); multiple groupplaced and 109-rated Supercooled (Ire) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) (lot 42); Listed Prix des Jouvenceaux et Jouvencelles heroine La Guapisima (Fr) (City Light {Fr}) (lot 43); and G3 Prix de Lutece runner-up Chartwell (Fr) (Churchill {Ire}) (lot 49).

## SOTTSASS JUVENILE COLT TOPS TATTERSALLS ONLINE

**Defence Missile (Ire)** (Sottsass {Fr}) (lot 33), a half-brother to group winners Speak Of The Devil (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}) and Morando (Fr) (Kendargent {Fr}), topped the Tattersalls Online September Sale for 41,000gns on Thursday.

Consigned by Dullingham Park and purchased by Paul Corrigan, the bay placed in three starts this season and is out of the winner Moranda (Fr) (Indian Rocket {GB}).

Paul Corrigan said of the 78-rated colt, "Sam [Haggas, bloodstock agent] said the time of his run at Salisbury was pretty quick so he could be rated higher than he is. I spoke to Eve, the trainer, and she didn't want to lose him and he looks like he'll be better as a 3-year-old from his pedigree. He'll go to Linda Perret and I'll try to get a run into him with cut in the ground in October, before gelding him and putting him away for the winter."

#### **Tattersalls Online Cont.**

Mohammad Al Owaimar shelled out 35,000gns for Mighty Nebula (Ire) (Saxon Warrior (Jpn)) (lot 67) from Roger Varian's Carlburg Stables. A winner on the all-weather, he is a grandson of star racemare and blue hen Serena's Song (Rahy). Malbay Madness (Ire) (Wings Of Eagles (Fr)) (lot 65) also found a new home, selling from Friars Lough Stables to Alan Smith for 20,000gns.

The sale's top-priced yearling was a daughter of Starman (GB) and Single Thought (GB) (Teofilo (Ire)) (lot 142), who was knocked down for 14,500 to Green Road Bloodstock from the draft of Riverside Bloodstock, Ltd.

A total of 70 horses were marked as sold for a gross of 386,700gns. The average was 5,524gns and the median was 2,700gns.

#### WILLIAM HILL RETURNS AS FUTURITY TROPHY STAKES SPONSOR

William Hill is the new sponsor for the G1 Futurity Trophy Stakes, the bookmaker announced on Thursday. The race will now be known as the William Hill Futurity Trophy Stakes, which will take place a Doncaster on Oct. 26.

Previously sponsored by the bookmaker in 1976, the race headlines the two-day meeting, where eight additional races will also bear the William Hill name. There have also been five Classic winners produced from the previous seven renewals of the Futurity Trophy, and trainer Aidan O'Brien is currently after his 12th edition of the race. The current ante-post favourite, The Lion In Winter (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}), is trained by O'Brien.

Racing sponsorship manager for William Hill, Mark Walton, said, "We're delighted to become the sponsors of the G1 William Hill Futurity Trophy Stakes, strengthening our relationship with Arena Racing Company as the curtain falls on the 2024 Flat season.

"It's fantastic to once again be associated with such a prestigious event, the final Group 1 of the British Flat campaign, made more special by the fact that William Hill were the sponsors of the race when it became the Futurity back in 1976. I'm tremendously excited to see which 2-year-old emerges as racing's next big star."

#### **BONE INJURY PREVENTION THE LATEST TOPIC AT IHRB SEMINAR**

A free seminar on reducing the risk of fractures and other bone injuries in racehorses will be hosted by the Irish Horseracing Regulatory Board (IHRB) in The Club at Goffs on Oct. 2. The seminar, which will be delivered by internationally renowned Professor Chris Whitton, is aimed at trainers, owners, veterinarians and anyone involved in the care of racing Thoroughbreds.

Whitton, who previously spoke on developing preventative training and management protocols for racehorses at Leopardstown in 2018, leads the Equine Limb Injury Prevention Programme, funded by Racing Victoria, the Victorian State Government and the University of Melbourne. The seminar will offer knowledge and valuable insight into how bone injury happens in the Thoroughbred and will outline best practice practical measures to reduce the risk of fracture.

The dam, whose yearling filly by Starman (GB) is in next week's Tattersalls Ireland September Sale, is kin to four blacktype performers including the G1 Prix Morny runner-up Gallagher (GB) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) and Showcasing's G1 Sussex Stakes-winning first-season sire Mohaather (GB) and GII Monrovia Stakes and GII San Clemente Handicap-winning daughter Prize Exhibit (GB). "She's a beautiful filly, who came highly recommended by Katie McGivern, and we loved her from the day we saw her in Argana at the breeze-ups," revealed trainer Patrick Harty. "We wanted to give her a nice day out at the Curragh first time but she was a little bit disappointing. We thought she would beat a few more home and finish mid division. She's a nice size, she is bred to probably stay a little bit further and I'm delighted with how well she relaxed. She did today what we all hoped she was capable of, winning a maiden and showing a bit of promise that she might be a stakes filly. While the ground is still on the nice side we might have a look and see what stakes races are around. A Listed race over six [furlongs], or a Group race, maybe stepping up to seven around a bend, and I wouldn't rule out running again this year." Carla Ridge is the third of four foals and first scorer out of an unraced half-sister to G2 Caulfield Autumn Classic third Top Ravine (Aus) (Redoute's Choice (Aus)) and G3 Albany Stakes and G3 Naas Juvenile Fillies Sprint placegetter Celtic Beauty (Ire) (No Nay Never). ## SATURDAY SIRES: NYQUIST

Unless you've been under a rock recently, you are well aware Darley's Nyquist has been the buzz horse the last few weeks. It's for good reason.

Just two Grade I races for 2-year-old fillies on dirt have been contested in North America so far this year, the Aug. 31 Spinaway Stakes at Saratoga and the Sept. 7 Del Mar Debutante Stakes in California. Daughters of Nyquist--Immersive and Tenma--won both.

Logically, success on the track should beget success in the sales ring. No where was that more evident than at the first few days of Keeneland's September sale last week, where Nyquist had not only his first career million-dollar yearling, but followed it up with another pair. Three millionaires in one sale is heady territory, indeed. Only Curlin, Gun Runner, and Into Mischief--all mainstays at that level--had more last week.

"It's been gratifying to see, but it's been an amazing ride for sure," said Darley's Darren Fox. "For us, he's the future. There's no two ways about it."

The leading freshman sire of 2020, the same year he got his first two 2-year-old Grade I winners, Nyquist has been among the top two spots in his sire crop ever since. He's held his own amongst all active sires as well, with an Eclipse champion, a Sovereign champion, a Breeders' Cup winner, 15 graded winners, and 26 black-type winners thus far. *Cont. p3* 

## WITH TWO DAYS REMAINING, SEPTEMBER SALE BECOMES HIGHEST-GROSSING AUCTION IN KEENELAND HISTORY


With two days of selling in Book 6 yet to come, the 2024 Keeneland September Yearling Sale became the highest-grossing sale in the history of the auction house.

When the gavel fell on hip 3634 not long after 6 p.m. Thursday evening, gross receipts totaled \$405,519,500 (not including post-sale transactions) for the first 10 days of trade, breaking the previous high-water mark of \$405,495,700 set in 2022. The cumulative average of \$174,342 represented a healthy 7.3% bump over the corresponding figure from 2023, while the median price of \$95,000 was up 11.8% over last year's figures.

Unbeaten 'TDN Rising Star' Knightsbridge (Nyquist), a jaw-dropping winner of his first two starts by a combined 19 1/2 lengths, has begun gearing up for a potential return to action this fall at Keeneland. Steve Sherack finds out more.

In 2024 alone, he's tied with Gun Runner for the top spot among all North American sires by number of Grade I winners for the current year. In addition to juvenile fillies Immersive and Tenma, he also has GI Ogden Phipps Stakes winner Randomized and GI Shoemaker Mile Stakes winner Johannes this year. For those keeping track, that's winners at the top level from ages two to four, seven to nine furlongs, on both dirt and turf, just in 2024.

Fox said the bay, a member of the first crop of stellar sire Uncle Mo, had his best book to date produce the 2-year-olds of this year. They were conceived following his breakout year as a freshman sire.

"Nyquist is somewhat of a unicorn in terms of his demand," said Fox. "In years two, three, and four, the market almost got stronger on him. It's very rare for a stallion to hold that performance every year. We've never sold a season for less than that original fee [\$40,000]. His book for what are now 2-year-olds had 14 Grade I winners, 31 graded stakes winners, and 72 black-type fillies or mares in a book of 160. He had a lot of quality and we've had faith in him and certainly had high expectations. It's exciting to see that starting to play out."

In addition to breeders, Darley has supported Nyquist as well, with about 8-10 mares from the home band each year, said Fox. The aforementioned Immersive is a Godolphin homebred, as is 'TDN Rising Star' Knightsbridge. The latter is an undefeated 3-year-old, who won each of his two starts by open daylight and is back in training with Hall of Famer Bill Mott after turnout to recover from what was reported as bone bruising. Fox said the team is extremely optimistic about his future. There's also the anticipation of what other delights might be awaiting among the other juveniles, not to mention the younger crops.

"It goes without saying Nyquist certainly represents the future lynchpin of our stallion roster," said Fox. "He's been so good to us and we're certainly hugely excited as we have high hopes for him going forward. He's made an amazing start for us thus far.

"He is a horse that has always experienced extraordinary demand. He's the bull's-eye in that there's nothing we have to compensate for or add to with him, so he fits a wide range of physicals."

Like his own sire, Nyquist was an undefeated Breeders' Cup winner at two and was named 2-year-old champion. But unlike his sire, who had to contend with a serious liver disease that kept him out of the Classics, Nyquist marched through the next spring unbeaten and went on to win the GI Kentucky Derby.

"A champion 2-year-old stays undefeated through the Derby; the last time a horse did that, it was Seattle Slew in 1977!

Nyquist's race record set incredible milestones. His sire line is an outcross and physically he fits a large pool of mares. He stamps them, gets nice horses that keep improving. They're rarely the finished articles--they're always improving and developing. They continue to race on.

"He hits that sweet spot: they're precocious and yet they train on at three."

Darley secured the breeding rights to Nyquist at the end of his juvenile season. Bred in Kentucky by Summerhill Farm, the now-11-year-old was picked up by Dennis O'Neill at the 2015 Fasig-Tipton Florida March 2-year-olds in training sale for \$400,000. Reddam Racing LLC campaigned him throughout his entire career with trainer Doug O'Neill. Fox said Darley now owns the horse outright. *Cont*.

"He's a horse that works great with our broodmare band and he fits a large cross section of the mare population. We probably could have filled [his book] twice over this year at \$85,000, and now he's hit a new stratosphere."


Jonabell Farm, home of the Darley stallions in America, has long held court among the upper echelon of top stallion farms in the U.S. and has masterfully incorporated generations of sire lines. Fox pointed to the legacy of the farm's brilliant Street Cry (Ire), a son of Machiavellian, who stood at Darley's Dalham Hall Stud near Newmarket. Street Cry plied his trade primarily in America and now Street Sense, his Derby-winning son, is currently in the Darley stallion barn, as are two of his sons, Maxfield and Speaker's Corner. It's not often four sire generations stand for the same organization.

"There's a lot of pride and satisfaction about cultivating sire lines. We hope Nyquist continues that, mirrors what Street Cry has done," said Fox. "Putting a son of Nyquist's in our stallion barn would be the dream. The sire line has shown how potent it is, how good it is with American racing. We're very keen to have some colt who hits the mark to come back home and take up duties."

# APB STEVE SHERACK Tracks Down Top Horses on the Sidelines

## UNBEATEN 'RISING STAR' KNIGHTSBRIDGE AIMING FOR A FALL RETURN

Unbeaten **'TDN Rising Star' Knightsbridge** (c, 3, Nyquist--Tyburn Brook, by Bernardini), a jaw-dropping winner of his first two starts by a combined 19 1/2 lengths, has begun gearing up for a potential return to action this fall at Keeneland.

The Godolphin homebred posted a double-digit victory going seven furlongs on debut at Churchill Downs Nov. 4, then fired fresh off the bench with another dominating decision in an optional claimer going a one-turn mile at Gulfstream Park last out Mar. 28. The latter performance earned him a 96 Beyer Speed Figure.

Knightsbridge has posted three workouts at Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott's Saratoga base this summer, most recently breezing four furlongs in :49.77 (23/71) over the Oklahoma training track Sept. 15.

"We're delighted that he's in full training and doing well," Godolphin USA Director of Bloodstock Michael Banahan said. "Bill's very happy with him, slowly making progress. There was nothing structurally wrong--nothing surgical or anything--just a minor sort of juvenile-type issues and he just needed a little bit of time. We're hoping that if all goes well, maybe we can get a start into him in October towards the end of the Keeneland meet." *Cont.*

"If he makes it great, there's no real pressure. If he doesn't, he'll maybe have something a little bit later, Churchill in the fall or something like that."

Banahan added, "We're excited to get him back. He's a horse that we're all looking forward to seeing again."

Knightsbridge is a half-brother to young Darley stallion Speaker's Corner (Street Sense), winner of the 2022 GI Carter Handicap. Knightsbridge's second dam is GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine Round Pond (Awesome Again), who brought \$5.75 million from Sheikh Mohammed's global operation at the 2007 Fasig-Tipton November sale. Knightsbridge's unraced dam is a half-sister to this summer's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup winner Highland Falls (Curlin) and G1 Al Maktoum Challenge Round 3 winner Long River (A.P. Indy). The Nyquist x Bernardini cross is also responsible for GISWs Gretzky the Great and Immersive and unbeaten 'Rising Star' and MGSW Nysos.

Added Keeneland Vice President of Sales Tony Lacy: "We enjoy collaborating with our customers to create the best sales environment possible. The amazing energy and excitement we saw surrounding Book 1 created momentum that continues to flow through week 2 of the sale. With two sessions still to go, we've got many nice horses yet to be sold."

During Thursday's 10th session, Keeneland reported sales on 278 horses for \$9,306,000. The average of \$33,475 was ahead by 4.3% over 2023, while the median price of \$26,000 represented a 4% gain. A total of 65 horses were unsold for a buyback rate of 19%.

#### Beau Liam Filly The Icing On the Cake for Ledgelands

A filly from the first crop of Airdrie Stud's one-time 'TDN Rising Star' Beau Liam (Unbridled's Song) was knocked down to Tom Tatum for \$200,000 to top Thursday's second of two Book 5 sessions at the September Sale. A Mar. 5 foal, hip 3375 is out of the three-time maiden Moonlight Kiss (Malibu Moon) and was consigned to the September Sale by Shelley Ritter's Ledgelands LLC. The bay was bred by Ledgelands and Andrew C. Ritter.

"She was just an exquisite individual, very racey, big hip and well-balanced," Shelley Ritter said when reached by phone just prior to the end of the session. "She just hit the mark from a physical standpoint. She had a lovely walk, a beautiful ground-covering sort of walk."

Hip 3375 was the third first-crop yearling by Beau Liam to sell for a price of \$200,000 or more. Overall, some 19 yearlings have sold from 23 through the ring for an average of \$78,947 off an introductory stud fee of \$6,000.

"We have traditionally always supported the young stallions at Airdrie and we felt that he would be a good match for the mare," Ritter said. "He has a very lovely physique and we thought we'd give it a try."

Ritter said she acquired Moonlight Kiss off the racetrack after finishing unplaced in Turfway maiden company in March 2021.

"A friend of mine called and asked if I might be interested in a Malibu Moon filly and I said, 'sure, great, why not?'" Ritter offered.

The first foal from Moonlight Kiss is the 2-year-old filly Many Mo Kisses (Mo Town), who was bought back on a bid of \$6,500 at last year's Fasig-Tipton October Sale.

"We were going to try to make the 2-year-old sales with her, but we've retained her and she's in training at The Thoroughbred Center," Ritter said. "[Former jockey] Jimmy Bruin is galloping her and he told us we would not be sorry we kept her."

Ledgelands offered the first horses through its own consignment at the 2016 September Sale, selling two yearlings for a mere \$30,000 combined. By any metric, the consignment's results for this year's sale have exceeded any conceivable expectations. After selling four horses on Thursday, Ledgelands has now accounted for \$1.47 million in turnover for eight horses sold, good for an average of \$183,750.

Their biggest result came on day three of the sale, when a filly by Yaupon fetched \$475,000 from Selective LLC/Cary Bloodstock. Other name buyers to patronize the draft included BSW/Crow, Albaugh Family/West Point/Barry Berkelhammer and Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, while Ledgelands also sold a horse to Saudi Arabian interests.

"It's been unbelievable," Ritter said. "It's super gratifying to have raised such a filly (Yaupon) and to be recognized for it and this result today is just great." *Cont.*

## WITH PLANS TO BUILD A HOTEL, RESIDENCES AND MORE, A NEW LOOK FOR MONMOUTH PARK by Bill Finley

Monmouth Park sits on 310 acres of land in Oceanport, NJ, but, as is the case with most tracks in a modern era where on-

track crowds have dwindled, much of the property includes

empty stands and parking lots. But that is about to change as real estate developer and horse owner Morris Bailey has unveiled plans to develop 80 acres of the property that will be used to for a 298-unit residential building, a 200-room hotel, a youth sports center and, perhaps, a concert venue.

Dennis Drazin said it has yet to be determined when construction will begin, but there have been reports that it will start in the fall of 2025.

"We are embarking on the next phase of a journey that began over a decade ago when we developed plans to reimagine and reinvent the Monmouth Park experience that has brought so much joy to generations of horse racing enthusiasts," Bailey said. "We have always been staunch advocates for returning the area to its rightful place as the premier destination for horse racing and family entertainment while including important components that serve the community at large. After an intensive, complex and lengthy process, our plans will create a vibrant lifestyle destination for future generations and will put the racetrack on a trajectory for enormous growth."

The project actually began to take shape in 2012 when Bailey, the owner of Resorts Casino Hotel in Atlantic City, sought to buy Monmouth when the state of New Jersey put it up for sale. Ultimately, he could not work out a deal and the plans were put on hold as the New Jersey Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association took control of the track. Dennis Drazin, whose company, Darby Development, has assumed full custody of the property under a new 85-year lease agreement, said that Bailey had waited for the real estate market to change before launching the project.

"At that point in time the economics just weren't there," Drazin said. "But the real estate market has changed so much over the past several years. It has just exploded here in Monmouth County. The prices are unbelievable. If you would have told me 20 years ago that there were going to be multi-

million-dollar condos in Long Branch, I never would have believed it. But that's the reality."

Darby Development and Bailey have worked out a revenue sharing agreement which equates to more purse money and the ability to address other racing-related expenses. The guarantee is that racing at Monmouth Park remains a viable business for years to come.

"Monmouth Park Racetrack is an iconic New Jersey attraction,"

Governor Phil Murphy said. "We are thrilled to see this project move forward, which will bolster the local economy and ensure that the area is a popular destination for years to come. Through this important development, the history and llegacy of this racetrack will not only be solidified but expanded and enhanced so that more New Jerseyans can experience its excitement."

While Drazin has said that several additional projects, including the concert venue, are still being considered, the hotel and the

residential building are seen as the most important facets on the project. The residential building will be built on the large parking lot across the street from the track, which, on most days, sits empty. Drazin said it will be a 55-and-over residence so as not to overwhelm the local schools. It has yet to be decided where the hotel will be built. Drazin said that the concert venue and other "entertainment type projects" will also be considered.

With Monmouth not receiving anything in the way of revenue from slot machines or casino gaming, Drazin and his team are always on the lookout for new sources of revenue. The state gives the track an annual subsidy of \$10 million to go toward purses, but more money is needed for Monmouth to be able to improve its racing product and solidify its future. The new projects will help.

"There's a requirement in the lease, basically a 50-50 split on the revenue," Drazin said. "Thirty-five percent of the total revenue will get spent on racetrack-related expenses and 20 percent of that will go into the purse account. It's all positive. Morris has always had racing foremost in his vision."

Drazin said that the global sports and event architecture firm Populous has signed on to handle the project. Populous is the same firm that is behind the rebuilding of Belmont Park and Pimlico.

"They are a top-flight, really great company," Drazin said. "They created the vision." *Cont.*

Drazin said that the construction will not create any problems for on-track fans other than that Monmouth will need to find additional parking space for the late crowd that shows up each year for the running of the GI Haskell Stakes.

## STILL REELING FROM ARLINGTON CLOSURE, ILLINOIS RACING SEES FAIRMOUNT EVOLVING AS SOURCE OF OPTIMISM

Thursday's Illinois Racing Board (IRB) meeting, at which 2025 race dates were awarded, yielded almost the exact same headline and summation of how the very same commission meeting unfolded last year: Illinois racing is still struggling to recover from the twin blows of the 2021 closure of Arlington International Racecourse and the inability of the state's two surviving Thoroughbred venues--Hawthorne Race Course and Fairmount Park (AKA FanDuel Sportsbook & Horse Racing)--to follow through with building their proposed racinos that were legalized back in 2019.

Yet while last year's IRB annual dates meeting was conducted with a noticeable tone of statewide optimism for the near future, this year's marathon 5 1/2-hour meeting Sept. 19 painted a hopeful outlook primarily only at Fairmount.

That's because the Collinsville track's just-approved new ownership group, Accel Entertainment, asked for and received IRB permission to switch some November race dates into October this autumn so Fairmount (280 miles southwest of Hawthorne and just over the Mississippi River from St. Louis, Missouri) can begin construction on a temporary racino that it

hopes to have operational before GI Kentucky Derby Day in 2025

By contrast, the ownership at Hawthorne Race Course, which has faced numerous delays and setbacks to the construction of its own racino, frustrated already-stressed Chicago horsemen by leading off its presentation at Thursday's meeting by having an attorney inform the IRB and everyone in attendance that no one from Hawthorne would publicly share any details of that track's racino development because of purported confidentiality issues related to the project.

Tim Carey, Hawthorne's president and general manager, stuck to broad generalities when outlining the potential future of the racino, which he said has already absorbed "tens of millions" in investment money, yet sits uncompleted right near the racetrack, in some spots blocking traditional grandstand views of the races.

"What I will say is that we remain steadfast in our efforts to completely redevelop Hawthorne and to revitalize Illinois horse racing. I believe the information that we've privately shared with the board is unquestionable evidence of that commitment and our continued progress in the effort," Carey said.

Both David McCaffrey, the Illinois Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (ITHA)'s executive director, and ITHA president Chris Block, decried Hawthorne's decision to keep the horse racing community in the dark about the racino.

(It's worth noting that none of the eight IRB members present for the meeting questioned, challenged or spoke up about Hawthorne management's desire to stay publicly silent on such an important issue).

Both ITHA leaders went on record as saying that Hawthorne's racing management team is great to work with, but that its racino leadership continues to exasperate horsemen.

"The cooperation level that we have on the racing side is second to none, and those guys are to be commended," McCaffrey said. "Whoever the hell's running the casino show, it's an outrage. They try to blindfold all of us, and not give us details on how to proceed with our businesses...

"The racino side is abysmal," McCaffrey continued. "To be blindfolded like this is inexcusable.... The racino side is killing us."

Block said Hawthorne's lack of direction on the future of the racino, which is supposed to eventually provide the main economic engine for purses at the Chicago-area track, is preventing the sport's stakeholders in Illinois from making plans about their livelihoods.

"I need to let this board know that this racino [was] needed a long time ago," Block said. "So every day that goes by, you can't appreciate the pressure that Dave and I are under, and the questions we get from horsemen, breeders, jockeys. I mean this is just endless on when this is going to happen." *Cont.*

As far as the awarding of dates is concerned, Fairmount was granted its requested 55 programs for 2025, a cut of seven race dates from what had been awarded for 2024.

Hawthorne applied for 80 race dates, technically an increase of two over what had been awarded for 2024. But Hawthorne already received permission earlier this season to abandon a series of Saturday cards from mid-July onward, so the actual

total of 2024 dates will be closer to around 64 programs when the current season ends Oct. 13.

And that figure of 80 dates for 2025 comes with "an asterisk," McCaffrey pointed out, referring to the likelihood that, just like this season, Hawthorne next year will not be able to sustain the three-days-a-week racing schedule that it proposes for portions of the 2025 Thoroughbred calendar.

Fairmount will retain its two-day race weeks in 2025, with the season going from Apr. 22-Oct. 28, slicing a little bit of

time off of the start and end of the meet compared to this year. Tuesday afternoons and Saturday nights will remain the race days.

Hawthorne, which has tried to make a number of different post times and days of the week work for the past few years, will try adding Monday twilight racing to the mix in 2025.

Hawthorne was granted dates from Mar. 20-July 3 (two days per week on Thursdays and Sundays, with Saturdays replacing Thursdays on the weeks of Triple Crown race simulcasts). Adding in a third date per week (Mondays) will start Aug. 4 and run through Nov. 3, with the racing days being Sundays, Mondays, and Thursdays.

Block did state that Hawthorne's willingness to extend the meet into early November will be helpful to horsemen.

Hawthorne, in Stickney on the gritty southwest outskirts of Chicago, for decades had a decidedly blue-collar reputation on the Illinois circuit. But for the past three years it has been thrust into only-game-in-Chicago status after the devastating exodus of the more opulent and suburban Arlington, which was sold and has been razed, but has yet to be redeveloped.

Although it was not explicitly stated at Thursday's IRB meeting, it appears as if Accel might be intending to go back to calling the first horse track in its gaming portfolio by its nearly century-old former name, Fairmount Park.

Fairmount had been rebranded as FanDuel Sportsbook & Horse Racing in 2020 when FanDuel took over as the track's owner. Accel bought the track in July, and the IRB approved the ownership change at Thursday's meeting.

No one who spoke at the Sept. 19 meeting, including executives from Accel, referred to the racetrack as anything other than "Fairmount." The only time the name "FanDuel" came up was when Accel executives confirmed that a

partnership with the sportsbook would continue.

Fairmount received IRB permission to change its scheduled Nov. 5, 9 and 12 dates this autumn to three Thursdays in October (17, 24 and 31) and to vacate the Nov. 16 program by means of adding extra races on other days.

Closing day for 2024 will now be Nov. 2, dovetailing with the second day of the Breeders' Cup simulcast

The request was made to get a jump on racino construction. A temporary gaming facility will go

up before the permanent one at a later date.

Melissa Helton, the president and general manager at Fairmount, acknowledged "there's not a lot of horse experience" in the new ownership group, "so all of us have been helping out, [and] I think we're finally at that point where we're going to see slots."

Purses for 2025 at Fairmount are projected to be \$5.5 million, Helton said

No corresponding 2025 purse figure for Hawthorne was stated at the meeting.

Illinois Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association president Jim Watkins, who represents horsemen at Fairmount, told the IRB that his organization concurs with the new Fairmount regime on race dates and a vision for the future.

Watkins said a contract is in place through the current year, and that a renewal is in the works that he believes will include keeping Fairmount open for off-season training.

"I'm very confident that with the resources available to Accel, the new ownership, the backside is going to look a lot different" in 2025, Watkins said.

#### FORMER OWNER RON PAOLUCCI SENTENCED TO 52 MONTHS FOR TAX FRAUD AND EVASION by Bill Finley

According to a press release issued by the U.S. Attorney's Office, Northern District of Texas, Ron Paolucci, once among the winningest owners in the sport, has been sentenced to 52 months in prison and ordered to pay more than \$38.9 million in restitution to the IRS.

The story was first reported by the *Blood-Horse*.

Paolucci, the 55-year-old co-founder of American Management Staffing (AMS), was charged by felony information in January 2023 and pleaded guilty a month later to conspiracy to defraud the United States and making and subscribing a false tax return. He was sentenced Monday by U.S. District Judge Sam A, Lindsay. The prosecution alleged that--over a seven-year period--Paolucci failed to turn over more than \$13 million to the Treasury Department that came from withholdings he took from employees for taxes, Medicare and Social Security taxes.

Paolucci's employees allegedly received false W-2 statements from Paolucci's companies that showed that taxes had been withheld from their pay and sent to the IRS. Instead, Paolucci pocketed the money.

"We are proud to partner with IRS-CI on this important case," said U.S. Attorney Leigha Simonton. "We stand ready to prosecute any employer who pockets employees' payroll taxes and those who otherwise refuse to meet their tax obligations."

According to court documents, AMS provided temporary staffing services to business clients. Paolucci was employed by AMS from approximately 2011 through 2020 and had control over the business's affairs, including approving payments and controlling AMS bank accounts.

"Nearly 70% of total U.S. revenues collected by the IRS are collected through employment taxes. When the employer withholds the payroll taxes but fails to pay the taxes over to the IRS, they may be criminally investigated and prosecuted for failing to withhold, collect, and pay over the tax. This was the case with Mr. Paolucci, his failure to remit withheld taxes is not only a breach of trust but a serious crime with severe consequences," said Christopher J. Altemus, Jr., special agent in charge, IRS Criminal Investigation, Dallas Field Office. "In addition to failing to meet payroll tax obligations, Mr. Paolucci failed to report his personal compensation and was ordered to pay approximately \$10 million in restitution for his personal tax obligations. Let this sentence serve as a stark reminder: tax compliance is not optional; it is the law."

In February 2023, Paolucci pled guilty to two counts of tax fraud and tax evasion in a federal court in Texas. He could have been sentenced to as many as eight years in prison.

Paolucci's Loooch Racing Stables finished second nationally in wins in 2017 and 2018. The outfit operated from 2011 to 2018 and piled up hundreds of wins, many of them on the Ohio racing circuit. He had 160 victories in 2017 and 215 in 2018. Loooch won a total of 871 races. At times, Paolucci branched out and was a partner on a handful of top horses, among them Ria Antonia (Rockport Harbor), the winner via disqualification of the 2013 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies.
