POWERFUL GLORY STAYS UNBEATEN IN THE MILL REEF

Saturday's G2 Dubai Duty Free Mill Reef Stakes was hit with a spate of withdrawals following the heavy rain at Newbury, but Sheikh Rashid Dalmook Al Maktoum's **Powerful Glory (Ire)** (Cotai Glory {GB}--Wouldntitbelovely {Ire}, by Kodiac {GB}) stepped up to provide the rescue with a game win in the testing ground. So impressive on a contrasting good-to-firm surface at Pontefract last month, the 5-2 second favourite travelled strongly in his own rhythm as the race split into three pairs across the track.

Staying on strongly to enter contention approaching the furlong pole, the Richard Fahey-trained £190,000 Goffs UK 2yo Breeze Up purchase was tackled and briefly headed by the maiden **La Bellota (Ire)** (Mehmas {Ire}) but stuck to his guns for Oisin Orr to dominate the final 150 yards and prevail by a neck. "He could be top-class--that was only the second run of his career and I think he hated the ground today," Orr said. "His ability got him through it. He'll get faster the more he runs and he's a big, scopey horse."

The downpour meant that the G2 Gimcrack Stakes second and third Shadow Of Light (GB) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) and Symbol Of Strength (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}) and Wathnan's unbeaten supplemented colt Defence Minister (GB) (Too Darn Hot {GB}) all missed the gig, so the form should be treated with caution despite the winner's obvious promise. **Cont. p3**

SKY MAJESTY TAKES THE FIRTH OF CLYDE

Coming into Saturday's G3 Firth Of Clyde Stakes at Ayr as the 16-5 favourite having won a potentially deep maiden at Newbury last month, Tony Bloom and Ian McAleavy's **Sky Majesty (Ire)** (Blue Point {Ire}--Majestic Alexander {Ire}, by Bushranger {Ire}) continued her steep upward trajectory with a battling success to double her tally. Travelling strongly early settled in mid-pack by Callum Rodriguez, the William Haggas-trained 150,000gns Tattersalls Book 2 graduate worked her way into contention approaching the final furlong and after gaining a narrow advantage hung tough throughout the closing stages for a neck success from **Maw Lam (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}).

"She did really well and she had to be really tough," Haggas said of Sky Majesty, who had beaten the subsequent winner Hold A Dream (Ire) (Bated Breath {GB}) on her racecourse bow. "She's come a long way in a short time, she didn't win her first race by far and she hasn't won by far today. She did well because she had no experience against some experienced horses, so it was a very pleasing performance so it was good to see." Cont. p4

Sheikh Rashid Dalmook Al Maktoum's representative Philip Robinson revealed that the Mill Reef is his juvenile finale. He said, "We thought about not running, but as it was his last of the season we decided to take our chance. He's now won on extremes from firm to heavy and it's a big plus to know he can do that--it's onwards and upwards."

Fahey added, "It's great to see him win, he's a horse I do like but I was very worried about the ground as he's such a goodmoving horse. I had a chat with Sheikh Rashid but he said give it a go and I thought fair play, there was no pressure so he's been rewarded--the trainer might have bottled it if left to his own devices. He's on his holidays now, I did say if he ran that would be it, he's quite a scopey horse, he was prepped for a breeze so I'd love to leave him alone now. We think he's special, so we'll treat him as if he is."

Powerful Glory is the second foal and first runner for Wouldntitbelovely, whose family topically features Ruby Rocket (Ire) (Indian Rocket {GB}) who captured the Firth Of Clyde Stakes when it carried listed status. She is the dam of the high-class sprinter Maarek (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), whose career exploits include eight black-type wins headed by a G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp, G2 British Champions Sprint Stakes and G2 Duke of York Stakes. The family also features the G2 Gimcrack Stakes, G3 Sirenia Stakes and G3 Craven Stakes-placed Mystery Smiles (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}) and the G3 King George Stakes-winning champion and sire Anita's Prince (Ire).



"I actually think a bit more cut in the ground would suit her better too," he added. "I suspect she'll run again, but there's nothing set in stone, possibly the [G2] Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte [at Chantilly]. That's a Group 2 against the boys, but it might be worth a look on October 12."

Pedigree Notes

Sky Majesty, who becomes the fourth group winner for her sire, is one of five black-type performers out of the listed-placed Majestic Alexander including last month's Listed Beverley Bullet Sprint Stakes winner Democracy Dilemma (Ire) (Cotai Glory {Ire}) and the G3 Prix de Seine-et-Oise runner-up Angel Alexander (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}). The second dam Tshusick (GB) (Dancing Brave) also produced five of that type including the triple group 3-winning sprinter Majestic Missile (Ire) (Royal Applause {GB}) and the Listed Woodlands Stakes winner and dual group-placed Santo Padre (Ire) (Elnadim).

Majestic Alexander, who is also a half to the dam of the G1 Jebel Hatta runner-up Eqtiraan (Ire) (Helmet {Aus}), hails from the family of the GI Metropolitan Handicap-winning sire Forzando (GB). ELECTROLYTE TOO TOUGH IN THE PRIX

ECLIPSE by Tom Frary

Doubling the British tally at Chantilly on Saturday, Wathnan Racing's **Electrolyte (Ire)** (Hello Youmzain {Fr}) called on his battle-hardened experience to gain a narrow verdict in the G3 Prix Eclipse. Runner-up in the G2 Coventry Stakes at Royal Ascot, the Archie Watson-trained colt had been out of the frame in both the G2 July Stakes and G2 Vintage Stakes but came back refreshed from a break to wage war in this six-furlong contest. Soon at the head of affairs, the 8-1 shot needed the line as **Polyvega (Ire)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}) pushed hard late and found it a nose in front of that **TDN Rising Star** as the 19-10 favourite **Fraise Des Bois (Fr)** (Zelzal {Fr}) wound up 1 1/4 lengths further adrift in third.

LAZY GRIFF WINS THE PRIX DE CONDE

Returning to France having finished third in Deauville's Listed Criterium du FEE last month, Middleham Park Racing's Lazy Griff (Ger) (Protectionist {Ger}) put that experience to use by making all in the nine-furlong staging post. Sent up to control matters from the outset, the Charlie Johnston-trained 37-10 shot kept producing for Christophe Soumillon to earn a neck success from the only serious closer Gezora (Fr) (Almanzor {Fr}) as the 19-10 favourite Shandana (Ire) (Sea The Moon {Ger}) disappointed four lengths further away.

"He looked really well and gave me a great feel going down, so I had a lot of confidence beforehand," Soumillon said. "He travelled well, the idea was not to be caught for speed so I went and after the hill he picked up again nicely. I won with a hand ride, so I imagine he can do even better and the entourage will very probably think about coming back for the [G1] Criterium de Saint Cloud."

NO HALF MEASURES PREVAILS IN THE

One of the more progressive 3-year-old sprinters in Britain, **No Half Measures (GB)** (Cable Bay {Ire}) relished the heavy ground to upstage some established black-type performers in the category in Saturday's G3 Dubai International Airport World Trophy Stakes. **Cont. p8**

G3 Trophy Stakes Cont.

Successful in last month's six-furlong Listed Prix Moonlight Cloud at Deauville and sixth in the G3 Prix du Petit Couvert at ParisLongchamp on Sunday, the 6-1 shot was positioned in third near the front from the outset by Ryan Moore.

Staying on to gain the advantage 150 yards out, the Richard Hughes-trained filly continued her momentum to beat **Relief Rally (Ire)** (Kodiac {GB}) and **Annaf (Ire)** (Muhaarar {GB}) by 1 1/2 lengths and a nose.

Hughes was celebrating his first group success as a trainer and said, "She was rated 74 in May and just hadn't stopped improving. She's not even blowing. It's been some time getting to this and it feels great. She's in the [G1] Abbaye which is why I ran her at Longchamp before, but she would need luck with the draw. If she keeps improving anything can happen."

Having covered himself in glory when third in a red-hot renewal of Ascot's July showcase event, the winner of five top-flight events including a Breeders' Cup Turf and a Dubai Sheema Classic appears as good as ever and that should be enough despite the presence of Liberty Racing's G1 Deutsches Derby hero **Palladium (Ger)** (Gleneagles {Ire}), Gestut Rottgen's G1 Preis der Diana heroine **Erle (Ger)** (Reliable Man {GB}) and Gestut Ittlingen's multiple group winner Lordano (Ger) (Adlerflug {Ger}).

"Rebel's Romance heads back to Germany in great shape and we are hoping this can be a springboard for the Breeders' Cup again," trainer Charlie Appleby said. "Goliath not running changes the complexion of the race slightly, although we still have two German Classic winners in the field receiving a lot of weight from the older horses. You always have to respect the opposition at this level, but Rebel's Romance has won this race before and can hopefully go and do it again."

He rode the most brilliant race for us a few years ago (2017) on a horse called Fastnet Tempest (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) at Chester, when he came from last to first in a big-field handicap. La Grande Zohra (Fr) (Martaline {GB}) (lot 6) caught the eye of Horseracing Advisory at €80,000. The Ecurie Alexandre de Jesus-consigned 7-year-old mare is carrying to Saint Des Saints (Fr). She is a half-sister to star Grade 1 chaser Fastorslow (Fr) (Saint Des Saints {Fr}).

The first lot in the ring was the established stallion **Morpheus (GB)**, an Oasis Dream (GB) half-brother to none other than champion sire Frankel (GB). Offered by Haras de la Beauvoisiniere, he was purchased for $\in 18,000$ by Nigel Riley.

There were also a pair of prominent names in the unsold column--first, smart jumps sire **Martinborough (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), who was consigned by Haras de la Baie, with bidding reaching \in 390,000 as lot 97B. SCUDERIA INCOLINX BUYS TOP THREE LOTS AT SGA YEARLING SALE

Saturday's SGA Yearling Sale in Milan resulted in co-toppers as a colt and a filly each brought €70,000 when purchased by Diego Romeo's Scuderia Incolinx.

Just a handful of lots into the sale, a son of Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) already named Lethal Emperor (Ity) (lot 8) hammered for €70,000 to take the early lead on the bid of Scuderia Incolinx. Consigned by Societa Agricola Alessandrucci, the bay is out of the Lethal Force (Ire) mare Lethal Island (GB), who won three times in Italy. She is the dam of three winners from three to race, and is from the same family as G3 Greenlands Stakes heroine and stakes producer Moon Unit (Ire) (Intikhab).

Adaay (Ire) filly **Teheran (Ity)** (lot 19), from Azienda Agricola Rosati Colariati equaled that price when snapped up once again by Scuderia Incolinx. She is a half-sister to stakes winners Tawang (Ity) (Zelzal {Fr}) and Azzurro Cobalto (Ity) (Aussie Rules), with the later second in the G3 Premio Carlo d'Alessio. Both her second and third dams were stakes winners in Italy.



MANY OPTIONS BECKON FOR UNDERWOOD WINNER BUCKAROO by Renee Geelen

Champion international jockey Joao "Magic Man" Moreira gave **Buckaroo (GB)** (Fastnet Rock) a stunning ride to win the G1 Underwood S. with a 3.5l thrashing of his classy rivals. In a field littered with Group 1 winners, Buckaroo was sent out as a \$9 chance by punters, courtesy of his last start win in the G2 Chelmsford S. in Sydney.

The widest on the turn heading into the straight, Buckaroo started to fly home, chasing the leader **Pericles (Aus)** (Street Boss), then simply bolted past leaving all in his wake in a thoroughly impressive performance.

"It feels amazing, you know. That's what horse racing is about. When you get one up, the feeling doesn't get any better," he said post-race. "Impressive the way how he won, isn't it? He has a tricky manner in the gate, he wasn't really kind for me in there. He began a little bit worse than what we were hoping.

"(Buckaroo) found itself a little bit too far back. But as the race disenrolled itself, it kind of got him into the race. When I turned for home on the outside, with him having great momentum, I was always confident he was going to get up. Nice horse makes a jockey's life so much easier, isn't it?"

The win was Chris Waller's only one at Caulfield on Saturday, while he enjoyed a treble in Sydney. In second was the Peter Snowden-trained **Huetor (Fr)** (Archipenko) with Pericles holding on for third. Buckaroo is nominated for the three big Melbourne races, the G1 Melbourne Cup, the G1 Caulfield Cup and the G1 Cox Plate and the stable is yet to decide on which way to head.

"As a colt, he was actually too laid-back but now, as a gelding, he's actually got a bit of spring in his step and he's a bit more vibrant," stable representative Charlie Duckworth said. "Ozzie Kheir, he's a massive supporter of the game and a massive supporter of Chris, so it's pretty special to win a Group 1 for him."

Pedigree Notes

Buckaroo took his record to five wins (two in Australia, being his last two starts) from 20 starts with earnings over A\$1 million. A half-brother to Ciaron Maher-owned and Melbourne Cup-aimed Group 3 winner Middle Earth (GB) (Roaring Lion {USA}) and stakes-placed winning 3-year-old Siege Of Troy (GB) (Siyouni {Fr}), Buckaroo is out of Listed winner and Group 3-placed Roheryn (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), herself a daughter of Group 3 winner La Chunga (More Than Ready).

BLOCKBUSTER KEENELAND SEPT. SALE CONCLUDES WITH RECORD GROSS, AVERAGE, AND MEDIAN



\$5-million Keeneland September sale topper | Keeneland

by Jessica Martini

The Keeneland September Yearling Sale, which surpassed its record gross Thursday with two sessions still to go, concluded its blockbuster 12-day run Saturday in Lexington with increases across the board over its 2023 renewal. In addition to its record gross, the sale produced its highest-ever average and tied its record median.

"The energy here was at times was reminiscent of another era," said Keeneland Vice President of Sales Tony Lacy. "When we were on inspections earlier this year, we saw quality and consistency among the crop, and it gave us a lot of excitement. And when the horses showed up at the sale, it verified our expectations. The market was very broad based. We saw new faces and welcomed back people we haven't seen in years from all over the world who returned because of their confidence in the U.S. industry and Keeneland being a global marketplace."

During the 12-day auction, 2,735 horses sold for a total of \$411,749,500. The average of \$150,548 was up 5.20% from a year ago and the median of \$70,000 was up 4.48%.

THORPEDO ANNA GUTS IT OUT IN THE

The previous record gross, \$405,495,700, and average, \$142,429, were both set in 2022, as was the record-setting median. The average and median records were broken in both 2021 and 2022, while the 2022 gross broke the sales record set in 2006.

A total of 36 yearlings--led by a \$5-million son of Curlin--sold for a million or more during the auction, up from 30 a year ago and second-most ever at the auction behind only 2005. The sale topper was the highest-priced colt sold at September since 2006. There were 185 horses who sold for \$500,000 or more at the September sale this year, versus 168 in 2023.

"The support of our breeders," Keeneland Director of Sales Operations Cormac Breathnach responded when asked what was responsible for the strength of the sale. "It's hats off to them."

Breathnach continued, "We rely, first and foremast, on the support of the breeders and consignors that bring the horses here. And then it's incumbent on us to reinforce the strength of the sale year on year and attract more and more buyers from around the world, as well as domestically. So we are very pleased with how this sale has gone. Not everyone has had an outstanding sale, but overall, this has been an extremely strong and a record September sale."

For the fourth year in a row, the September sale opened with a pair of elite Book 1 sessions, followed by two Book 2 sessions. The format has been steadily gaining traction with both buyers and sellers with a power-packed Book 1 setting the table for the rest of the auction.

"The diversity in the horses was what the buyers were looking for and they responded with the way the sale shaped up," said Lacy. *Cont.*

"The Book 1 format--putting the best athletes and best physicals forward--has been very well received. We received many compliments on the quality of the stock and I think you saw it in the results that followed as well. Which is very gratifying."

Lacy added the successful September market reflects a positive state of the industry as a whole and particularly the impact of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority.

"I think the new medication regulations have given a huge sense of confidence to the buyers," he said. "It's something they've been looking to for quite a while. I think the industry has responded well to it. It's not a perfect situation, but no growth is without pain. Seeing new people coming in and investing significant amounts of money in the last two weeks was sort of a great illustration of where the industry is going as a whole. It's a great sign of an upward swing and I think we are at the beginning of a potentially very large upswing for the industry and the sport in general. I think we have to be very optimistic as we go forward."

Among the happy consignors leaving Keeneland was Tom Hinkle of Hinkle Farms, which sold all 20 horses in its consignment for \$6,175,000, highlighted by a Curlin filly for \$1.2 million and a Constitution colt for \$1.1 million. "It's been an awesome sale," said Hinkle. "We budget every year for what we think our yearling crop is going to bring and we're fairly conservative, and it has considerably exceeded our expectations. As far as I'm concerned, Keeneland has done a fabulous job. The way they put together Books 1 and 2 has been really good and everybody has gotten used to it. They have done a heck of a job recruiting active buyers from all parts of the world. If you had the right horse and it met the criteria, you were greatly rewarded." **Cont.**

Broad Buying Base

The September sale, which as recently as five years ago was consistently dominated by just two buyers, featured a deep and diverse buying bench in 2024. At the top of the market, the 36 yearlings who sold for \$1 million or over were purchased by 24 unique entities. In addition, 96 different buyers spent \$1 million or more during the sale, compared to 82 last year.

"The stretching and the depth of the domestic market has been outstanding," said Lacy. "Having 24 individual entities buying a horse for a million dollars or above is an outstanding number. And 48 consignors sold a horse for \$500,000 or more. That shows a broadness of the market and how many people got rewarded for the quality product that they brought to the market."

Across the sale, the results sheets featured buyers from 31 different countries.

"Our international outreach, I think, is paying dividends," Breathnach said. "We have had sales team members go all over the world. We had three members in the Middle East for a long stint between the Saudi Cup and Dubia World Cup. We had members in Japan, Eastern Europe, South America and all over the country in the U.S., and also in England and Ireland. We sponsor races around the world. We are really putting our best foot forward, trying to engage the international community, as well as the domestic buying base. I think the most gratifying thing for us is seeing the number of countries that have bought from the September catalogue, which is a couple more than last year and heading in the right direction."

Celebrating the sale of a \$1.4-million colt and a \$975,000 filly, Blue Heaven Farm co-owner Adam Corndorf said, "We have had a few good ones over the years, but this was the first year we had two high-end horses that got up in the stratosphere. It was a dream come true. There was a good broad base of lookers, including pinhookers, international and domestic buyers. The top end of the market was what we expected, but we were pleasantly surprised with what our horses brought in that second tier, in Book 3."

Strength from Start to Finish

Demand, which started out at a fever-pitch in Book 1, remained strong throughout the September sale, with the median increasing year-over-year during each of the 12 sessions of the auction. The auction's fourth session--the second Book 2 session--saw the biggest percentage increase in median at 25% over 2023 figures.

"We look at the median because that's more indicative of the power of the middle market," Breathnach said. "The median and the RNA rate are what allow you to better compare year to year.

With our consistent format we can begin to identify trends. With this being the fourth year with the same format, the median has increased every single session."

The session average saw declines in just two sessions--with the auction's ninth session dipping marginally at 0.99% and the final session down 5.08%. The sale's second day average of \$611,038 established a session record, bettering the previous mark of \$589,814 from the same session in 2006.

"Book 1 had one of the strongest groups of physicals I've seen for a while," said Nick deMeric, whose deMeric Sales purchased eight yearlings for \$1,095,000. "Keeneland did a very good job managing it. It wasn't just reflected in the prices, but also in the momentum the sale got from the word go. As we all know, it carries over. It keeps the sale strong when you start off strong.

"When enough of us get shut out in the early parts of the sale, we're just going to work harder later in the sale. We got one Wednesday, we paid \$110,000 for and we thought we would get it for \$60,000. It definitely carried over. The better physicals were well received and hard to buy as a result."

With 804 yearlings reported not sold during the auction, the buy-back rate was 22.72% in 2024. It was 20.22% a year ago.

"The RNA rate tended to be a tick higher through the books through each session, which might be a sign that there might be a few more sellers who might not be getting what they wanted out of this," Breathnach said. "Which is obviously something we will be working on. Also, with the stronger market, you can tend to set a higher reserve. So it's a bit of both."

At the conclusion of Saturday's session, an additional 153 yearlings were reported as post sales for a gross of \$16,050,500. Those post sale transactions are not included in the sale's final figures.

"Our post sale RNA-to-sale activity is up at least 10% from last year," Breathnach said. "So we are well north of \$15 million in post sales."

Trainer Eddie Kenneally, who purchased 14 yearlings for a total of \$1,077,000, agreed there was plenty to attract his attention throughout the auction.

"All the way through the sale there were quality horses distributed throughout the books," Kenneally said during Session 10. "Obviously, there was more pedigree in Book 1 and into Book 2, but there were nice individuals all the way to [the end of the sale]. There is a horse for everybody. There are buyers getting shuffled back every day and they can't get the number of horses they need to get. They're having to spend more time here because it is so competitive with the quality coming through. I think the strength of Kentucky racing right now is a big part of what's driving it all." **Cont.**

The increases can be traced, at least in part, to the depth of quality in a diminishing foal crop, according to Breathnach.

"The floor--meaning the bottom sector of the horses coming to market--is so much higher than it was even five or 10 years ago," Breathnach said. "A lot of older mares whose produce record has shown they are not successful are no longer being bred, or those yearlings are not coming to market. There really is quality right through the end of the sale. The breeders, and we say this all of the time, are very sophisticated. Production costs are high, they cannot afford to raise horses that won't be commercial. So there really is a very high floor and a high ceiling in what is there."

The strength in the middle market reflects Keeneland's commitment to breeders in that segment of the sale, according to Lacy.

"That's the core of what we all do," Lacy said. "That's why we are here. We know the responsibility that Keeneland as an organization has towards the breeders and to the industry as a whole. A lot of the breeders are friends or colleagues over the years. We put a lot of pressure on ourselves knowing that the success of the September sale is a big factor in how their year turns out. They are farmers bringing their crops to market. That is something that is critical to the core of what Keeneland is. We are here to support the market. Everything we do is put back into the market and breeders at all levels, and especially the core breeders in the middle market, are the fabric of what we exist for."

SF/Starlight/Madaket on Top Again

For the second year in a row, the stallion-making partnership of SF Racing, Starlight Racing and Madaket Stable was the leading buyer at the September sale. With Donato Lanni as agent, the group purchased 18 yearlings for a gross of \$11,330,000. Last year, it purchased 20 head for \$12,590,000.

"It was one of the strongest sales I've ever seen at Keeneland," Lanni said. "It was great to see so many people here buying horses and it was extremely competitive. If we wanted to buy a horse, it cost more. You had to be ready to give more than you expected. There were some people at this sale I hadn't seen in long time, so Keeneland did a good job bringing them in as well."

Belladonna Racing, with trainer Cherie DeVaux as agent, was the auction's second leading buyer with 20 head purchased for \$9,845,000.

Mike Repole, who alone was the second leading buyer at the 2023 auction, and in partnership with St. Elias Stable was the leading buyer in 2022 and 2021, was the third leading buyer this year with 25 purchased for \$9,755,000. A year ago, Repole purchased 35 yearlings for \$11,835,000.

Taylor Made Leading Consignor

Taylor Made Sales Agency was the leading consignor at the September sale for the 25th time since 1988, regaining the title after having an eight-year streak halted by Gainesway in 2023.

Taylor Made sold 333 horses for a total of \$53,133,200 and an average of \$159,559. The gross is the highest for a September sale consignor since Taylor Made grossed \$57 million in 2007.

"It's been crazy good," Taylor Made's Frank Taylor said of the sale. "This sale was really, really good. It was way better than I anticipated. It's amazing how strong the market is, with everything that's going on in the world. Racing is good, and there is a lot of enthusiasm. People want to buy racehorses."

Gainesway was the auction's second-leading consignor with 125 sold for \$39,854,000 and an average of \$318,832. *Cont.*

Sire Power

The diversity in the buying bench was mirrored in the sire ranks, with Curlin--in a tight three-way battle--earning top honors with 44 head sold for an average of \$579,432. Into Mischief was second with 42 sold for an average of \$535,476 and Gun Runner was third with 62 sold for an average of \$526,855.

In 2023, Into Mischief was the sale's leading sire with 53 sold for an average of \$698,019. His nearest pursuer was Tapit, who had 25 sold for an average of \$441,480.

Among Curlin's five million-dollar yearlings was the auction's top-priced offering, a son of Cavorting and full-brother to Clairiere, who sold for \$5 million to Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm.

Gun Runner had seven million-dollar yearlings, led by a \$2.2million colt also purchased by Pope. Into Mischief had four yearlings bring seven figures and Constitution, Nyquist and Not This Time had three. Tapit had two.

A group of first-crop sires broke into the headlines with million-dollar yearlings of their own. Both Charlatan and Maxfield had a pair of yearlings from their first crops break the seven-figure threshold, while Yaupon came close with a \$900,000 colt.

Charlatan had 74 through the ring sell for an average of \$263,649, while Maxfield had 56 sell for an average of \$234,446.

"It was a great crop of first-season sires," Lacy said. "The young stallions with their first runners this year are getting results on the track and gaining a lot of traction in the ring as well. When you look at the beginning of the sale, through the first week, we had a great variety of stallions gaining attention in the market. Having Maxfield and Charlatan having multiple million-dollar-plus horses is a testament to that. It's exciting for the future."

Rock Your World Yearlings Top Final Session

A colt by Rock Your World (hip 4228) topped the final session of the September sale when selling for \$85,000 to Zap/Murphy for California Racing Partners and Ciaglia. The yearling was consigned by Stoneriggs Farm, Agent III. A filly from the first crop of the GI Santa Anita Derby winner (hip 4337) brought the session's second highest price when selling for \$55,000 to Tom Tatum. The bay was consigned by Vinery Sales.

During Saturday's final session, 203 yearlings grossed \$2,662,000 for an average of \$13,113 and a median of \$10,000. The average dipped 5.08% from the final session of last year's sale, while the median rose 11.11%.

The conditioner is fresh off shopping the Keeneland September Sale, where he signed for 37 horses for nearly \$5.7 million in search of the next Thorpedo Anna.

He added, "She runs the turns the best, but they had her blocked in the whole turn. Thank God I didn't ride her. The good ones overcome everything."

There was plenty to unpack in the Cotillion.

Thorpedo Anna was able to secure a forward position beneath her regular rider Brian Hernandez, Jr., but she found herself tightly at the fence as GII Charles Town Oaks runner-up **Mystic Lake** (Mo Town) set the pace from the two path while Gun Song, winner of the local prep in the Cathryn Sophia Stakes Aug. 24, prompted three deep down the backstretch. Shuffled back to be clearly third before they reached the turn, Thorpedo Anna appeared to be full of run, but **'TDN Rising Star' Tarifa** (Bernardini) further complicated things by rolling up outside the favorite, keeping Thorpedo Anna in search of somewhere to run.

Making use of her athleticism and agility, Hernandez sent Thorpedo Anna three wide into the lane, quickening better than Tarifa to her outside, and she now had the better part of the final furlong to land the final telling blow. Thorpedo Anna hit the front with better than a sixteenth to race and looked on her way to a comfortable score, only to allow Gun Song to come back at her in the waning strides. Tarifa ran on at one pace for third.

Added Hernandez, Jr.: "We were having a tough trip the whole way around there, because looking at it on paper, it looked like (Mystic Lake) was going to be fast enough to clear us, and then we were going to be able to hop out and just get a nice cruising trip.

"But Johnny (Velazquez) had other plans. He got his filly (Gun Song) to leave there good, and he put us in a box, and we were just stuck there behind him for a long, long time. Then we finally got a little seam turning for home. She lengthened her stride, and she was able to just put her neck in front. She just showed how game she was from the eighth pole home."

After tasting defeat for the first time in the GII Golden Rod Stakes last November, Thorpedo Anna resumed with a smooth success in the GIII Fantasy Stakes before making all the running to take the GI Kentucky Oaks by open lengths. So easy were her subsequent wins in the GI Acorn Stakes and GI CCA Oaks that McPeek decided to pass the logical next step in the GI Alabama Stakes in favor of a meeting with the boys in the GI Travers Stakes. Relegated to an off-the-pace trip on that occasion, she stuck her neck out and came after **'Rising Star'** Fierceness (City of Light), just missing out while losing absolutely no admirers in defeat. *Cont.*

TIZ THE 'SEIZE'-N: SEIZE THE GREY GIVES LUKAS ANOTHER PIN-UP SUCCESS IN PENNSYLVANIA by Alan Carasso

BENSALEM, PA -- Consider it a belated birthday present, Coach.

Having turned 89 less than three weeks ago, the legendary Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas pulled yet another rabbit out of his hat, saddling GI Preakness Stakes hero **Seize the Grey** (Arrogate) to a victory in Saturday's GI Pennsylvania Derby, a result arguably more surprising than his off odds of 4.30-1 might suggest.

The \$300,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga purchase was only seventh to 'TDN Rising Star' Sierra Leone (Gun Runner) in the GI Toyota Blue Grass Stakes in April, failing to amass enough points to make the gate for the GI Kentucky Derby, but he made a Derby Day appearance in the GII Pat Day Mile Stakes, scoring a 9-1 upset. Accorded a similar chance at Old Hilltop, the gray colt made all the running to best Derby winner Mystik Dan (Goldencents) by 2 1/4 lengths. Never bashful about running

his horses, Lukas allowed Seize the Grey to take his chance in the GI Belmont Stakes, but he could muster no better than a distant seventh, and he was ruled out of the GI Travers Stakes after finishing a well-beaten fourth in the GII Jim Dandy Stakes. The conditioner told anyone who'd listen that Seize the Grey

was rounding back into his spring form, and for what seems like the billionth time in his career, he was proven correct. Favored early in the wagering at 2-1, Seize the Grey still had

> plenty of market support as the third choice and hit the ground running from the two hole, taking pressure from Just Step On It (Accelerate) and a threewide 'TDN Rising Star' **Unmatched Wisdom** (Cairo Prince) through an opening quarter in :23.89. The outposted Stronghold (Ghostzapper) raced very wide into the first turn and remained deep on the backstretch while tracking from midfield, while the streaking Dragoon Guard (Arrogate) pinched ground at the inside

approaching the half-mile pole.

Seize the Grey continued to lead around the turn and towards the quarter pole, but he looked in some trouble as Stronghold loomed a wide threat and even stuck his head in front in upper stretch. *Cont.*

But Seize the Grey battled back gamely down towards the inside to reclaim the lead entering the final furlong and drew clear. Dragoon Guard made good progress along the rail to complete a 1-3 finish for his much-missed sire.

"I was very confident," Lukas insisted. "I have been that confident with him three times and all three times he won. I was very confident in the Preakness. I told my wife it was the best bet in the 20th century. I didn't tell her that today because I wasn't as confident because of the racetrack. I have never won on a racetrack that deep. When I walked out there, that damn thing was deep! I was really surprised at how deep it was and how well he handled it."

Lukas was celebrating his second Pennsylvania Derby, having won his first with Will Take Charge (Unbridled's Song) at the age of 78 back in 2013.

Lukas already has the next target picked out for Seize the Grey for the first Saturday in November.

"I will give them my vote. I don't like to make decisions in the winner's circle," he said. "I am thinking (Breeders' Cup Dirt) Mile, but a mile and a quarter is well within his scope, especially on that track. If you are ever going to get a mile and a quarter, you will get it there."

Pedigree Notes:

Seize the Grey's stakes-placed dam, who is also responsible for the SP Shoppingforpharoah (American Pharoah), is a daughter of SW Shop Again, who was purchased by Nicoma as agent for the late Audrey Otto for \$450,000 in foal to First Samurai at the 2007 Keeneland November Sale.

In the name of her Jamm Ltd., Otto bred Grade I winner Power Broker (Pulpit) and SW Fierce Boots (Tiznow), the dam of GSP Portos (Tapit). The third dam is replete with top-class runners bred and/or raced by Hobeau Farm, including GISW Miss Shop (Deputy Minister) and GSW/GISP Trappe Shot (Tapit).

Smart Shopping is also represented by the 2-year-old filly Cirque Lodge (Justify), a weanling filly by Life Is Good and returned to the latter stallion this season.



ROUTINELY BRILLIANT NEXT REPEATS IN GREENWOOD CUP by Alan Carasso

BENSALEM, PA -- The winning margin wasn't close to the 25 lengths he finished in front of his outclassed rivals last September, but it was just another day at the office for America's premier dirt stayer **Next** (Not This Time), who took over when jockey Luan Machado gave him his cue entering the last of three turns and the 6-year-old lengthened clear in the final furlong to take the GIII Greenwood Cup Stakes by a comparatively 'measly' 10 lengths.

Hammered down to odds of 1-20, Next broke alertly from a wide gate and was content enough to sit second as Ridin With Biden (Constitution) set off at a decent clip over a deep and tiring strip, while 12-1 third choice Magic Michael (Dramedy) also raced close in tow. Held together into the final half-mile by Machado, Next was allowed to stride into the lead entering the final bend, opened up without being asked into the final furlong and, for the eighth time in 10 tries at marathon trips, proved a handy winner. His final quarter-mile over a surface that very few horses were finishing well over was a spectacular :24.58.

Claimed by his current connections for \$62,500 in April 2022, Next's renaissance occurred when the 2022 Cape Henlopen Stakes came off the turf and he romped by better than 18 lengths. Winner of three of his four outings in 2023, including the GII Brooklyn Stakes a couple of starts before winning by a furlong here, the gray gelding had won his three starts this season by an average of 14 1/4 lengths--the Isaac Murphy Marathon by 11 1/4 lengths May 1,a defense of the Brooklyn by 9 1/4 lengths July 5 and Saratoga's Birdstone Stakes by 22 1/4 lengths Aug. 4.

So what's next for Next? With a marathon option at the Breeders' Cup having been canceled, trainer Billy Cowans and owner Michael Foster are faced with something of a good problem to have. Knowing they have a horse with supreme stamina, a race like the GI Breeders' Cup Classic over 10 furlongs has limited appeal, outside, perhaps, its \$7-million purse.

But it isn't the money that Cowans and Foster are focused on, but rather giving their horse his best chance. And that comes in the 12-furlong GI Breeders' Cup Turf, a surface over which Next was a stakes winner during the early portion of his career.

"For me, my gut tells me to stay with the distance and give up the surface," Cowans said. "I know you have to face the Europeans who have a good turn of foot. But going the mile and a quarter on dirt, I worry about the pace scenario the horse might get into. He was kind of tugging today a little bit at the bridle and if you put a :23 and :46 up there, he'll get to tugging pretty good.

"The thing for us is to have fun with him, the money doesn't matter," Cowans said. "We found something the horse likes to do and we'd like to keep doing it with him."

Cowans said a decision on Next's Breeders' Cup status would not come until he breezes back in 15 to 17 days' time.

Pedigree Notes:

Next is one of 16 graded winners for the outstanding Not This Time, whose son Cogburn figures to be one of the favorites for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint on Nov. 2. Next is bred on the same cross over Awesome Again-line mares that has been responsible for two of his six Grade I winners, namely Up to the Mark and 'TDN Rising Star' Princess Noor. Next is the last of three foals, all winners, for his dam.

Soul of an Angel earned a berth in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint with a last-to-first dominating victory in the GIII Princess Rooney Stakes at Gulfstream Park Saturday. The 2-1 shot dawdled at the start and was last in the early strides. Completely out of the picture as the quarter went up in :23.10, the dark bay mare was inching closer, but was still far back through a half in :45.79. Tipped to the center of the track into the lane, Soul of an Angel produced a powerful rally to reel in favored Beth's Dream, who was drifting out, at midstretch and surged clear to an easy victory.

"We're going to give her time off now. She's not Breeders' Cup nominated, but we're going to pay that fee to do that. Her entry fee is paid for with this, so we're going to go there for sure," coowner Mark Cornett said. "It gives us some nice spacing."

Cornett and his brother Clint, principles of C2 Racing Stable, visited the Santa Anita winner's circle last year with GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner White Abarrio (Race Day).

The hard-knocking Soul of an Angel, making her 40th lifetime start and her fifth in the C2 Racing colors, was acquired by the brothers from James Gerald and Hall Performance following her sixth-place effort in the Mar. 9 GII Azeri Stakes. The mare captured the one-mile GII Ruffian Stakes at Aqueduct in May in her first start for the Cornetts. **Cont.**

Princess Rooney, cont.

She was fifth in the June 8 GI Ogden Phipps Stakes before giving champion Idiomatic all she could handle when a head runner-up in the July 20 GIII Molly Pitcher Stakes. She was cutting back to seven furlongs following a 10th-place effort in the nine-furlong GI Personal Ensign Stakes at Saratoga Aug. 23.

"When we bought her, we thought she was going to be a one-turn horse. That's why we ran her in the Ruffian the first race after we bought her, and she confirmed what we thought. She ran so good, it's hard to pass up Grade Is at Saratoga, so we kind of got that goal accomplished," said Cornett. "She was Grade I-placed up there, so we said, 'Let's go back to why we bought her,' which is the one-turn, seven-eighths to a mile type races."

Pedigree Notes:

Soul of an Angel is the lone graded stakes winner to date for her sire, Atreides, who currently stands in Oklahoma.

She is the first foal out of Factor One, who has a yearling filly by Basin and a weanling colt by Army Mule. The mare, a half-sister to Grade I winner Homeboykris (Roman Ruler), was bred back to Essential Quality this year.

Factor One was purchased by Watershed Bloodstock for \$2,500 at the 2017 Keeneland November sale.

Third at King Abdulaziz Racecourse in February in the G3 Saudi Derby behind Forever Young (Jpn) (Real Steel {Jpn}) and Book'em Danno (Bucchero), who have each distinguished themselves on the world stage since that day, Bentornato took advantage of his own moment to shine Saturday in the GII Gallant Bob Stakes at Parx. **Cont.**

Gallant Bob, cont.

The Florida-bred and Leon King Stable Corp. colorbearer captured his first graded stakes after a string of black-type wins in Florida last year while also keeping his unbeaten streak at six furlongs intact.

Bentornato wasn't quickest out of the gate, but stayed glued to the inside of July's Concern Stakes winner Sunny Breeze, who held a head advantage at the :22:01 first quarter marker. Ohiobred Alwaysintomischief (Maximus Mischief) joined the pair before the :45.08 half, looking every bit a threat, and the three came off the turn together. It wasn't long before Alwaysintomischief waved the white flag as Bentornato and Sunny Breeze matched strides down the lane, separating themselves from the field and brushing in the sort of pulsing stretch battle that doesn't deserve a loser. A dead heat was not to be, as Bentornato finished a determined neck to the better of a very game Sunny Breeze. Buccherino, the Aug. 24 winner of the Salvatore M. Debunda Sprint Stakes over both this surface and over Sunny Breeze, who was third that day, finished evenly for the show spot.

"At the farm, he acts like a little baby," said winning trainer Jose D'Angelo of Bentornato. "When he is supposed to run or train, he is very professional. That is why I went over to Saudi, because he is a horse that is all business when he trains. He is strong, and when you have a strong horse, they can do whatever they want. They help to make things easier for you. When you have the one [post], you have to go from the start and sometimes you have to make fast fractions. We didn't want to use him too much because we knew we had to have horse at the end. The key to the race was the second fraction when he made :45 and he brought it home. He is a nice horse. I am very proud of him. My plan is the Breeders' Cup for him. We have a plan, always. This horse fights all the time and he never gives up."

After making a splash in Florida at two last summer and fall-winning his first four straight, including three black-type events, all at Gulfstream--Bentornato took 2 1/2 months to prepare for the Saudi Derby. He showed the way early in the \$1.5-million world event, finally finishing six lengths behind the top pair. While Forever Young went on to win the G2 UAE Derby and finish third in the GI Kentucky Derby, and Book 'em Danno's victories since have included the GI Woody Stephens Stakes at Saratoga, Bentornato took a more modest approach, returning for a runner-up finish and a career-high 99 Beyer last month in the Robert Hilton Memorial Stakes at Charles Town in his first start since Saudi. The Gallant Bob marked his first try in a graded event domestically. The dark bay, never been worse than third in his eight career starts and three-for-three at six panels, was named Florida's champion 2-year-old male of 2023.

Pedigree Notes:

Ocala's Bridlewood Farm stands Valiant Minister, a \$680,000 OBS 2-year-old buy who won his only career start prior to a stall accident that ended his racing career. The son of Candy Ride (Arg) has had two black-type winners from his four small crops. Bentornato is his first graded winner.

Berntornato is also one of 40 stakes winners out of a mare by the late Put It Back. Her Special Way has a 2-year-old fullbrother to Bentornato, as well as a yearling filly by Saketini. She was bred to Oscar Performance for next term. The year after Tanma Corp. bred Bentornato, Terry Dyer bought the mare at the 2022 OBS Winter Mixed Sale, carrying the now-juvenile, for \$2,500, while Bentornato himself was a pinhook, picked up by Pro Racing Stables at the 2022 OBS Yearling sale for \$45,000 and turned around to Champion Equine at the 2023 OBS March sale for \$170,000.

Flying the flag of the Empire State, New York-bred My Mane Squeeze ran like a well-backed favorite as she got the money with a statement surge to take home the GIII Dogwood Stakes under the Twin Spires on Saturday.

The William Butler homebred returned to the Louisville main track which she mastered back in May when she won the GII Eight Belles Stakes on the Oaks undercard. Though she was wellbeaten when fourth at Saratoga June 7 in the GI Acorn Stakes to GI Cotillion Stakes winner Thorpedo Anna (Fast Anna), My Mane Squeeze finished third in the GI Test Stakes upstate Aug. 3 and was the runner-up in the GII Charles Town Oaks Aug. 23.

Sent off at 3-2 here, the chalk had some targets to run at after an early scramble for the lead forced her to be shuffled towards the rear of the field up the backstretch. Gobbling up ground just before the far turn, My Mane Squeeze began to get underway and the filly built up a head of steam in the three path by the top of the lane. Rolling like a freight train, the dark bay cleared at the eighth pole and pulled into the station right on schedule. "Today the plan was to try to break and be a little closer than last time," said jockey Luis Saez. "The track is pretty tight, and the plan was to put her in the clear as soon as possible. Everyone wanted to be up front early. She was in a good spot, and when she got to the top of the stretch, she was loaded. Last time when she ran at Charles Town, the track was a little deep and their turns are a little tight. That's why today the plan was to break sharply and put her in the clear."

During her career, Ocean Club has switched barns, she's switched surfaces, and she's even switched coasts, but Saturday she switched up her CV by adding her first graded win to a pair of black-type events already nestled there. The Glen Hill Farm homebred won the GIII Noble Damsel Stakes at Belmont at the Big A in her first win both in New York and while under the tutelage of Jack Sisterson.

Under Ricardo Santana, Jr., who was winning his fourth race on the card, Ocean Club jumped smartly from the inside post. With a loose rein, she immediately went to the front with ears pricked and stayed there despite pressure off her flank from last season's G3 Oh So Sharp Stakes winner and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf fourth Midnight Mile (Ire) (No Nay Never). After :23.93 and :47.87 fractions, the chestnut turned for home full of run and set her sights on the wire as Santana got busy. Despite SW & MGSP Five Towns (GB) closing relentlessly and SW & GSP Breath Away (GB) threatening from the middle of the course, Ocean Club held sway to cross the line a neck the best for a pillar to post victory.

"Ricardo [Santana, Jr.] watched her replays," said the winning trainer, "and we both thought that drawn the rail, just let her jump and go forward and allow her to be comfortable whether going :46 for the half--just give her her head. It paid off perfect this afternoon."

Last seen finishing third Aug. 31 in the GII Ladies Turf Sprint Stakes at Kentucky Downs, Ocean Club won the Monroe Stakes at Gulfstream in May for in her sole start under conditioner Bethany Baumgardner. Previously in the barn of Tom Proctor, who also trained her dam, Ocean Club won the Martha Washington Stakes for him and placed in the GII San Clemente Stakes, as well as the Honey Ryder Stakes.

"Considering we shipped her all the way to Kentucky Downs," said Sisterson, "she came out of that race well and came back to Saratoga bouncing out of her skin. When horses are doing well, I think you have to listen to them and run them. It worked out."

Pedigree Notes:

Ocean Club is the 61st graded winner for Hill 'n' Dale's allconquering Curlin, who also sports a plethora of champions and 106 black-type winners. The two-time Horse of the Year has four stakes performers out of War Front mares, while his runners out of other Danzig-line stallions include his champion and top sire son Good Magic (out of a daughter of Hard Spun). As a broodmare sire, Claiborne's War Front has 42 stakes winners out of his daughters.

Glen Hill Farm bred the Noble Damsel winner in Kentucky and has her unraced 2-year-old full-sister named Sonja Henie, who was a \$325,000 RNA at last year's Keeneland September sale. Theatre Star, who won the 2015 Justakiss Stakes for Glen Hill as well as twice placing in graded events, gave the operation a Justify filly Apr. 28 and was bred back to Not This Time. The mare is a half to **'TDN Rising Star'** and GI Humana Distaff Stakes winner Taris (Flatter), the dam of GSW King Fury (Curlin).

TURF MONSTER TRANSFERRED TO DIRT FOLLOWING EARLIER INCIDENT

Officials at Parx Racing abruptly moved the GIII Turf Monster Stakes--one of five graded events on the GI Pennsylvania Derby and GI Cotillion Stakes undercard--to the main track after Freedom Eagle (Hoppertunity) suffered an unspecified injury and was vanned off the track following the running of the Alphabet Soup Handicap, an 8 1/2-furlong grass race restricted to Pennsylvania-breds earlier on the program.

A statement from the track read: "Parx Racing management moved Saturday's Grade III Turf Monster Stakes from the turf course to the main track out of an abundance of caution. The \$250,000 stakes, carded as the 10th race on the Pennsylvania Derby Day card with post time of 4:04 p.m., will be run at five furlongs on the main track."

Under pressure from the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority (HISA) and local horsemen, turf racing was discontinued at the Bensalem oval on Aug. 28. That action occurred in the immediate aftermath of the Aug. 24 Parx Dash Stakes in which one of the participants broke down. The trainer of the injured horse Causes Trouble, Harold Wyner, took video footage of the turf course that showed numerous holes. PTHA President Bob Hutt demanded that the course be shut down and that the necessary repairs be undertaken, a request that first fell on deaf ears but was later acceded to once HISA CEO Lisa Lazarus became personally involved.

The following day it was announced that the course would be tested and on Sept. 5, HISA announced that any divots/holes on the course had been filled in, but that the surface was noticeably dry. The course appeared to be similarly dry on Saturday.

The Alphabet Soup incident was not the only one during the early portion of the program. In race five, the state-bred

restricted Miss Blue Tye Dye Stakes, first-time starter Carousel Queen (Uptowncharlybrown) was bounced around bilaterally at the break and unseated jockey Dexter Haddock. Later in the race, 2-5 Anabam (Weigelia) appeared to take a bad step and was eased out of the race. An update on Anabam was not immediately available.

Smooth B pushed his earnings over the million-dollar mark with a much-the-best victory in the Turf Monster Stakes, which lost its grade and was scratched down to five runners when it was taken off the turf Saturday at Parx. The 9-year-old, coming off a win in the off-turf Marshall Jenney Handicap over this same track and distance Aug. 26, chased the early pacesetters through an opening quarter in :22.02. He skimmed the rail to take the lead out of the turn and surged clear and was unchallenged to the wire.

"It was awesome," winning rider Mychel Sanchez said of his trip. "It played out almost the same [as the Marshall Jenney]. He loves to be on the rail, loves the competition. With the one-hole, we liked it. I had a lot of horse. He feels good and hopefully they don't retire him. He's like wine. He's a cool horse to ride. He likes to play around but he has a lot of body. He's a cool, sound horse. It's like he has to get his game-face on, like, ok, it's time to go."





The Turf Monster was the 62nd career start for Smooth B and gave him two wins in a row following his score in the Marshall Jenney, which broke a 12-race losing streak. He was making his third start in the Turf Monster after finishing fifth in 2022 and second in 2023.

"The old man had to show them how to do it," said winning trainer Butch Reid. "I didn't expect it was going to be off the turf until an hour ago. It certainly helped him. Him against a bunch of turf horses is a pretty good combination. Even though he handles the turf fine, I think he is a little bit better on the dirt. When it happened, it was a pretty good thing for us. It is so

TWIRLING CANDY COLT SETS JAPANESE 2YO RECORD, EYES BC JUVENILE TURF SPRINT

Ecoro Sieg (Twirling Candy), a smashing five-length debut winner when unveiled over 1200 meters at Niigata Aug. 17, remained perfect in two starts with a 2 1/2-length success at Nakayama Saturday, stopping the clock in 1:07.2. The final time shaved 0.6 seconds off the 2-year-old track record and was 0.3 faster than the Japanese record time for a 2-year-old at the distance.

Sent off the 2-5 favorite with Christophe Lemaire once again at the controls for Hideyuki Mori, the \$95,000 Keeneland September yearling turned \$250,000 OBS March breezer was not the fastest away from the inside stall, but mustered for speed inside to claim command inside the opening 200 meters.

He was made to work for it, however, as the first 400 meters--from a standing start--was timed in :21.8 as he took heat from an outside rival. Maintaining a narrow advantage for the run around the turn, but still taking a fair amount of pressure, Ecoro Sieg was past the 400-meter marker in :43.8, but nevertheless kept on strongly through the wire to score comfortably.

"He was a bit slow to begin, but he was amazing after that," the winning trainer told the Japanese publication Chunichi.co.jp. "It was a bit fast!"

The victory has connections thinking big for the colt's next start.

"For now I will consult with the owner and I would like to consider the [GI] Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint [at Del Mar Nov. 1]."

Added Lemaire: "He can run at his own speed, he's set a record and he's got the ability and it's home for him. I think I'll be able to go and I'm looking forward to it."

Mori is not bashful about pointing his runners towards overseas targets, and was the first Japanese trainer to saddle a Group 1 winner on foreign soil when sending out Seeking the Pearl to victory in the 1998 Prix Maurice de Gheest in France. He saddled his first runner at the Breeders' Cup in 2000 (Agnes World in the Sprint) and has since been represented by an additional eight starters, including Jasper Krone (Frosted) in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint.

When the Breeders' Cup was last staged at Del Mar in 2021, the Japanese were represented by its first two winners at the Championships--Loves Only You (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the Filly & Mare Turf and Marche Lorraine (Jpn) (Orfevre {Jpn}) in the Distaff.

Coastal Mission, runner-up in a pair of graded events this summer, earned his second stakes win of the year in the Parx Dirt Mile Saturday. The gray was outfooted out of the gate and raced near the back of the pack as the six-horse field split in two down the backstretch. He rolled up four wide into the lane and pounced to the lead with a furlong to run, jostling Repo Rocks between rivals. Repo Rocks came back on in the final strides, but couldn't overtake Coastal Mission on the line.

"He broke a little slow," said winning rider Arnaldo Bocachica. "We were expecting to break a little better, so once he broke slow, I had to use him a little more than I wanted to. Once we got on the backside, we got into a nice rhythm. I was waiting for a time to go, and looking at the horses in front of me they were going head to head, so I liked what I was seeing. At the quarter pole, I had a lot of horse. I made my move and when he passed everybody he was waiting a little, but he was never going to let them by." **Cont.**

Ruben Silvera, aboard Repo Rocks, said, "That was his first time two turns and I got scared in the beginning because he tried to get out. Today he made the corner pretty easy. There was a lot of pressure on the outside, so I tried to be quiet in the beginning. Coming to the half-mile, I tried moving but the favorite [Coastal Mission], he was too close."

Coastal Mission, who won the Frank Y. Whiteley Stakes in April, was second in the GIII Salvator Mile at Monmouth in June and again in the GII John A. Nerud Stakes in July. He was most recently a well-beaten fourth when stretched to nine furlongs for the first time in his career in the GII Charles Town Classic Aug. 23.

"I told my wife we need to get this guy a 'W,'" said winning trainer Jeff Runco. "We liked this spot here. We were looking at the [GI] Vosburgh next Saturday [at Aqueduct] and this came up good and we decided to come here instead. Seven-eighths and a mile are his best [distances]. These are the conditions he really likes. We are looking at the [Oct. 26] Forty Niner at Aqueduct, but there are a couple other spots we are looking at.
