

MEDIAN KEY TO MAINTAINING RECORD SEPTEMBER TIDE



\$5-million Keeneland sale topper | Keeneland

As most of us can attest from painful experience, this business will always be an exception to the axiom that "a rising tide floats all boats." Even a record, boomtime sale like the one just completed at Keeneland will inevitably have left many a vessel beached or taking on water. As usual, the September Sale extended a wide spectrum even among the losers, never mind between losers and winners, from the single colt that changed hands for as little as \$1,000, to the granddaughter of Take Charge Lady who fell short of her reserve even at \$1,450,000.

Overall, however, the single most instructive bloodstock auction of the year yielded gains sufficient that we can once again gratefully defer the revelation famously anticipated by Warren Buffet: "Only when the tide goes out do you learn who's been swimming naked."

While a \$5-million colt provided fresh entertainment for your friends outside the industry ("What do you mean, he's never had a saddle on his back?!"), the two most significant indices were embedded deeper in the sinews of the sale.

One was a median of \$70,000, back up from \$67,000 last year to match the sale record set in 2022, and maintaining an extremely wholesome consolidation relative to the years preceding the 2020 pandemic. **Cont. p3**

INTERNATIONAL BUYERS ENCOUNTER SAME STRONG MARKET AT KEENELAND

At a record-breaking Keeneland September Sale, there were very few hidden gems throughout the two weeks of trade and buyers shopping at all levels had to dig deep to land any of the treasures they came to find. 31 different countries were represented on the Keeneland results sheets, but just like some domestic buyers, there were also international buyers that came away without signing a ticket. The way Newmarket-based trainer Dylan Cunha chooses to look at it, leaving empty handed just means you're landing on the right horses.

"Our shortlist has been unbelievable," said Cunha on his final day of inspecting yearlings at Keeneland. "I think the cheapest horse off our shortlist has been about \$250,000 and we haven't been able to buy one of them. It's been that strong." **Cont. p8**

During what had been depicted as a bull run, the years 2016 to 2019 produced fragile and fluctuating medians of \$40,000, \$55,000, \$50,000 and \$47,000.

But while the median is always the key barometer, perhaps the most astounding metric of the whole auction was the one reported after its opening session, when the 21 highest prices were paid by 20 different entities. It's hard to believe that anything like that could ever have happened before in Book 1. And while geopolitical uncertainty continues to haunt the wider

world, with the next auction at Keeneland scheduled alongside a febrile election, our own parish is evidently feeling comfortable in raising the stakes. For we can do so in an environment favored, among other things, by a communal (if hardly unanimous!) effort to stamp out cheating and abuse and a purse structure, in places at least, that threatens to dignify many a yearling investment with viability.

The sheer range of the September Sale makes it uniquely informative, combining as it does every layer of the pyramid. As has been said, it isn't just a market, it is the market.

So while the overall picture will only be completed by blue-collar domestic auctions this fall, not to mention the premier yearling auction in Europe, we have certainly reached a point where we can validly quantify the vigor of current trade.

The accompanying table (Table A) charts the summer-through-September U.S. yearling circuit across the last decade, excluding the emergency calendar improvised for 2020. It shows that the overall value of the market, between Fasig-Tipton's July and Saratoga (Select and NY-bred) auctions and Keeneland September, reached its post-2008 crash/pre-Covid peak in 2018 at \$478.2 million. Having virtually matched 2019 trade as soon as 2021, at \$448.2 million, it surged 14.8% to \$514.4 million in 2022, when both houses set records. Having stabilised last year at \$510.8 million, this time round trade has reached a new peak of \$530.5 million.

These numbers having been realized from generally stable demand--3,230 American yearlings have changed hands this year, compared with 3,271 to this point in 2014--it stands to reason that the average price of an American yearling has behaved accordingly. Sure enough, having retrieved its 2018 high in 2021, at \$139,264, the average has jumped (\$152,774) and consolidated (\$153,039) before now making another 7.3% leap to \$164,225.

Privately, no doubt, the Keeneland team will be relieved by a record-breaking sale as the imperative response to the pressure being applied by their great rivals across town. Despite having sold 495 yearlings this summer, down from 584 last year, Fasig-Tipton actually achieved a marginal increase in gross for a significant hike in average, rounding out to \$240,000 from \$200,000.

That reflects a particular encroachment on the elite sector, precisely when the biggest spenders have been intensifying competition. As Table B shows, between 2016 and 2021, a total of 120 seven-figure yearlings changed hands at the auctions under review; of these, Saratoga accounted for 19 (15.8%). In just three years since, there have been 132--and its share has advanced to 36 (27.3%).

Both houses have prospered from this increased muscle at the top of the market. Yearlings selling for \$1 million or more have accounted for 12.7% of overall turnover, building on a tick over 11% in the two preceding years. These returns at least double the proportion of the market credited to seven-figure sales in 2016 and 2017. So much for all those complaints, over recent years, about the dilution of competition by partnerships between big spenders!

On the other hand, growth at the top could easily disguise what is always the consignors' greatest fear: a middle market hollowed out by polarization. It feels all the more crucial, then, that the September median should have proved so resilient. The median made year-on-year gains across all 12 sessions, sometimes only marginally, but peaking with a giddy 25% hike on day four. There is, moreover, far more coherence to the measuring of performance since Keeneland resolved to stop meddling with the sale format. However irritably consignors receive the distribution of their drafts, it does feel as though the structure is bedding down in such a way that buyers can reliably find big fish in the biggest pond. There is supposed to be give and take, though one major consignor just seems to pull its late allocation altogether. In total one-fifth of the catalogue was

scratched, a rate recently exceeded only in the exceptional circumstances of 2020 (22.3%).

No fewer than 804 hips, moreover, left the ring unsold-equivalent to 22.7%, up from 20.2% last year. In some cases, true, that might actually reflect the kind of ambitious reserves stimulated by a strong market, and post sales have evidently been brisk. Nonetheless the RNA rate must qualify our satisfaction with all these records, for the reality is that the conventional indices of median and average will always exclude the weakest elements of any sale.

That always feels especially pertinent to the performance of stallions. Sometimes, admittedly, vendors retain a horse as a sign of faith, persevering in the hope that it can get closer to a deserved value at the 2-year-old sales or even racing in their own silks. In other cases, however, cold horses will be dumped at a loss. So while there are duly no hard-and-fast rules, I always feel a little wary about "rewarding" a stallion, through a higher average yield, for failing to find buyers for a relatively high proportion of his stock.

Those caveats duly noted, let's take a look at how the new sires have been faring with their debut crops. (Table C)
As we all know, despite the certainty that the great majority will never again command so high a fee, these horses are the annual refuge for an appalling proportion of commercial mares.

Hard to blame the breeders, who are merely anticipating ringside demand, but history shows that a warm reception at the sales is no guarantee that a new stallion will actually sire runners. It's becoming pretty clear, however, which ones have (or have not) done their job to this point.

To their credit, the pair that most exposed clients to catalogue saturation have maintained demand in pretty emphatic fashion. Charlatan stands top of the class, by average and median alike, much as you would hope if you had paid the second-highest fee of the intake. He has already offered as many as 107 yearlings, finding homes for 88 of them, for a median four times the conception fee.

But even that pales next to Yaupon, whose next yearling to bring down the hammer will achieve his 100th sale of the crop! That's out of 112 offered to date, yet they have managed a median five times his \$30,000 opening fee. This horse impressed a lot of people on inspection and proves how some bandwagons can nowadays keep rolling even against the challenges of inundation. Next year, of course, we will have a record-breaking rookie coming to market, but Yaupon and Charlatan are giving supporters of that horse room for optimism.

Yaupon is actually matching the \$150,000 median of two pricier stallions, neighbors at Darley, who divide him from Charlatan in the averages. Of this pair, Essential Quality will for

now be avoiding Maxfield's eye around the barn--but these remain the very earliest of days.

Charlatan and Maxfield both landed a seven-figure sale at Keeneland, where Yaupon sold a colt for \$900,000. In terms of punching above weight, meanwhile, Tacitus has a pedigree that has become still more regal since his retirement, and is multiplying his \$10,000 fee very nicely on median and average alike. But the standout performer, strictly on yield, is Beau Liam. Priced at little more than a case of good bourbon, he is registering an eightfold yield by median--and hitting a factor of nearly 12 by average! The sensational speed he exhibited in a curtailed career make him a luminous candidate for the 2-year-old pinhookers, in particular, but he also has an auspiciously seeded family.

Among the established sires, the big guns remain Curlin (50 of 59 sold so far, at a median \$455,000, with his September sale-topper contributing to an average of \$610,800); Into Mischief (53 of 73 at \$450,00/\$593,679); and Gun Runner (74 of 87 at \$425,000/\$546,729). The venerable Tapit's diminishing output has been duly prized (26 of 32 at \$501,230/\$355,000). But it's the next in the list, Not This Time, whose supporters have most to celebrate. These yearlings were still only conceived at just \$45,000, remember, and he has processed 97 of 115 at \$300,000/\$388,855.

Given what he is also doing in Europe, meanwhile, it felt rather surprising at Keeneland that Justify did not beat a single sale of \$1 million (a very glamorous colt presented by Woods Edge), matching one son sold at Saratoga. I would willingly wager that one or two major European programs will end up reproaching themselves for missing a trick or two, among his less expensive sales. Perhaps Norman Williamson and Mags O'Toole will instead have to be rewarded for having the good sense to go back to the well!

Int'l Buyers at Keeneland, cont. from p1

Cunha, a Group 1-winning trainer in South Africa before relocating to Newmarket three years ago, was attending his first Keeneland sale this year and stayed on through Book 4. Shopping alongside his father Luiz Cunha and bloodstock agent Jamie Piggott, Cunha described his first experience as eye opening.

"Just the sheer number of horses and how strong the market is here, it's crazy," he noted. "In England at the type of sale with

this many horses, one would slip through the net. Here, nothing slips through the net. It has been really hard to buy, but we will definitely be back next year."

Cunha still had plenty to show for his trip despite not having signed any tickets. During his limited downtime in Lexington, he visited Coolmore's Ashford Stud to meet international superstar sire Justify and spent a morning of training with Wesley Ward and Andrew McKeever.

"It's really interesting because it's so different to England and South Africa," said Cunha. "It sort

of re-highlighted why we are here. I said straightaway to Jamie and my dad that we have to come back with a Breeders' Cup runner. That's the aim. Probably not this year, but definitely next year or the year after."

Based at the historic Phantom House Stables, Cunha's current stable roster features the likes of 2024 William Hill EBF Brocklesby Stakes victor Zminiature (GB) (Territories {Ire}), recent G3 Super Mile Stakes runner-up Prague (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Gogo Yubari (GB) (Havana Grey {GB}), who has won five races and placed in five more already this year.

Much of Cunha's early success has come with horses purchased on a limited budget. Gogo Yubari was a 5,000gns buy at the 2023 Tattersalls December Mare Sale. Zminiature and Prague were both 10,000gns purchases.

Cunha's operation had seven yearling purchases going into the September Sale. The trainer's goal ahead of this year's sales season was to focus on quality over quantity, but shopping on a tight budget limited their options at Keeneland.

"We came over here because obviously we are wanting to upgrade the whole time," he said. "Our ambition is not to grow in numbers, but grow in quality. What makes us unique, and it's pretty unique in England, is we continually are doing well with a ten-grand budget. The idea is to try to buy horses that can run in group races so we can also come race in America, Dubai and places like that. We're trying to attract bigger owners to support us and be able to buy the horses we want, like this week."

Breeze-Up Shoppers Abound at Keeneland

A few handfuls of European trainers like Cunha attended this year's Keeneland September Sale, but there was also no shortage of breeze-up pinhookers. Newmarket-based agent and bloodstock editor Nancy Sexton shopped the September Sale

> with Powerstown Stud's Tom Whitehead, who purchased Black Forza (Complexity) for \$65,000 at last year's Fasigwent on to fetch £220,000 at the Goffs Breeze-Up Sale and then claim the G2 Richmond

Sexton said that every year, it seems that more European breeze-up pinhookers are making the trip to shop at the September Sale.

Tipton July Sale before the colt Stakes.

"You used to get quite a few trainers going over, with the likes of trainers like Mark

Johnston, but it's more the pinhooking now," she explained. "That's not to say owners don't buy in America. There will be plenty that do come over especially at the higher end, but of those signing on to their own name, it's mainly pinhookers. They've had a lot of success doing it."

In some years, the later part of the Keeneland Sale overlaps with the Tattersalls Ireland September Yearling Sale. This year the Tattersalls Sale did not start until Sept. 24, giving European buyers plenty of time to stay through Keeneland. Sexton said many pinhookers took advantage of the opportunity and she also noticed several coming out earlier in the sale than they have in past years.

"Some of them have done very well buying out of Book 1 and Book 2," she said. "If something can fall through the net, which doesn't happen very often, they'll probably be there. Then there are others who would rather come out the second week. I think they have their set patterns. Alan Hannigan came out earlier. He signed under Sideways Bloodstock. Donal Keane came out earlier than he did last year and he got a fair bit done. I think they were always trying to stay as long as they can, but this year it was made easier because they didn't have to choose between Fairyhouse and Keeneland."

Sexton said that during her time shopping at Keeneland through Book 2, she was amazed by the number of conversations surrounding the Kentucky Downs race meet.

"We're getting more and more Europeans going over there now, but it was all anyone could talk about was how much money someone won with a maiden," she reported. "It just generated a lot of buzz with people making serious amounts of money. The prize money here makes it so much more easier for trainers and agents to dive in."

Along with Black Forza, who makes his next start since performing at Kentucky Downs this coming Saturday in the G1 Juddmonte Middle Park Stakes, Powerstown's other recent success stories include Ribaltagaia (Blame), a \$40,000 Keeneland September buy who brought 225,000gns at the 2023 Tattersalls Craven Breeze Up-Sale, and Almurtajiz (Good Magic), a \$60,000 Keeneland September yearling who later fetched € 280,000 at the Argana May Breeze-Up Sale and is currently performing well in Saudi Arabia.

Powerstown Stud's five purchases from this year's Keeneland sale are all bound for the breeze-up sales. They went to \$100,000 for a Twirling Candy colt out of Grade II-placed Show Stealer (Eskendereya) and then landed on a colt from the second crop of McKinzie and from the family of Grade I victress Paulassilverlining (Ghostzapper) for \$92,000.

Of the market overall, Sexton said it was one of the strongest sales she has attended.

"I remember one of my first September Sales was in 2005 and it reminded me of that because the strength at the top was phenomenal," she said. "There were 36 million-dollar yearlings from 24 entities. That's only something we can dream of over here. It's good to see the Japanese participating at a high level as well. It was the breadth of market that was quite astounding. Nothing was getting missed."

CHARGE IT RETIRED TO GAINESWAY

Whisper Hill Farm's multiple graded stakes winner Charge It (Tapit--I'll Take Charge, by Indian Charlie) has been retired from racing and will begin his stud career next season at Gainesway.

Charge It followed a 'TDN Rising Star' maiden victory with a runner-up effort in the 2022 GI Florida Derby. He demolished the field with a 23-length victory in the GIII Dwyer Stakes and returned as a 4-year-old to win the GII Suburban Stakes.

"Winning any graded race by 23 lengths, as Charge It did in the Dwyer, takes an immensely talented horse. Charge It's ability was at the Grade I level," said trainer Todd Pletcher.

Charge It registered Beyer Speed Figures of 100 or higher on four occasions and retired with four wins and earnings of \$887,270.

A homebred for Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm, Charge It's second dam is broodmare of the year Take Charge Lady (Dehere), making his dam a half-sister to champion Will Take Charge (Unbridled's Song) and Grade I winner Take Charge Indy (A.P. Indy), as well as to the dam of champion Take Charge Brandi (Giant's Causeway) and multiple Grade I winner Omaha Beach (War Front).

STAY THIRSTY COLT TOPS STEADY FASIG-TIPTON CALIFORNIA SALE

POMONA, CA - The Fasig-Tipton California Fall Yearlings Sale, held Tuesday at Fairplex in Pomona, produced figures largely in line with its 2023 renewal, which given the uncertainties in the state's racing industry, was satisfactory, according to Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr.

"I thought the sale was fine," said Browning. "The median is the same and the average is basically down slightly. All things considered, it was a productive exercise. It got the vast majority of the horses sold and there will be brisk post-sale activity tonight and tomorrow as well."

A total of 163 yearlings sold during the one-session auction for a gross of \$4,781,400. The average was \$29,334 and the median was \$15,000. From a catalogue of 279 head, 250 went through the ring with 87 failing to meet their reserves for a buy-back rate of 34.8%.

During last year's auction, which included a horses of racing age section, 185 head grossed \$5,751,500 for an average of \$31,089 and median of \$15,000.

A colt by Stay Thirsty brought Tuesday's top price of \$250,000 when purchased by John Moroney from the Lovacres Ranch consignment. The sale topper was one of eight to bring six figures--down from 12 a year ago--and one of three to top \$200,000.

With the California racing industry dealing with the closure of Golden Gate Fields and questions about the viability of racing in the northern part of the state, the sale's steady results offered some positives, according to Browning.

"There were certainly some bright spots and there were certainly some areas of concern going forward for the entire industry in California," Browning said. "For you to tell me that we would be this close to last year given the state of things, I would probably have been satisfied with that. You always want to have increases in your averages and medians and so forth, but I think that would have been unrealistic to expect that at this sale. It was similar and consistent to what we have seen in recent years in the California marketplace."

Moroney Makes a Run for Stay Thirsty Colt

John Moroney, who owns several Taco Bell franchises in St. Louis, made good use of a trip to the West Coast with the purchase of a colt by Stay Thirsty (hip 96) for \$250,000 during the Fasig-Tipton California sale Tuesday.

"This colt looked really, really good to us, so we decided it was a good opportunity to try and get him," Moroney said after signing the ticket on the youngster. "So we did."

The yearling is out of My Fiona (Ghostzapper) and is a full-brother to stakes winner and Grade I-placed Finneus and a half to stakes winner Fi Fi Pharoah (American Pharoah).

Moroney said Terry Lovingier, who bred the colt and consigned him under his Lovacres Ranch banner, recommended the yearling to him and he will likely be part of the partnership that will campaign him.

"I've been in the [racing] business about 25 years," Moroney said. "And I've been with Terry about five years. It's been a great partnership. They are just great people."

Of his trip out west, Moroney admitted, "I am in the Taco Bell business back home. I have 23 franchises. My son is kind of running the show now, which is kind of nice. So I can come out here and play."

McKinzie Filly to Blinkers On

Scott Sherwood of Blinkers on Racing Stable was underbidder on a filly earlier in the auction, but would not be denied for a daughter of McKinzie (hip 180), going to \$200,000 to acquire the yearling from the Barton Thoroughbreds consignment Tuesday in Pomona.

"Greg Gilchrist is my bloodstock advisor and he short listed the horse for me," Sherwood said. "She's a big pretty filly with a big walk, by the right sire. The dam is pretty strong, too, with a couple of runners."

The yearling is out of Tap Tap Ur It (Tapit), who is also the dam of stakes winner Tap Back (Einstein {Brz}) and multiple stakes placed Cholly (Mo Town).

From his first crop to hit the track this year, Gainesway stallion McKinzie is already the sire of GI Hopeful Stakes winner Chancer McPatrick and GI Del Mar Futurity runner-up McKinzie Street.

Sherwood admitted he had missed out on a filly earlier in the sale, with the \$190,000 daughter of City of Light selling to Slugo Racing.

"We put this filly in the same category [as hip 86]," Sherwood said. "I was the underbidder on that horse. We actually liked this one a little better, but if I could get that one, that was the one I was going to take. I didn't know if I would be able to get this one. We actually liked this horse's physical a little more, there was a little more to her."

Of his Blinkers On partnership, Sherwood added, "I've been doing it for so long, now it's just a private partnership. There are about 11 or 12 people that are automatically just in on the horse."

Brocklebanks Stay Busy at Fairplex

John and Tari Brocklebank, just back from the Keeneland September sale, hit the ground running at the Fasig-Tipton California sale Tuesday, with Tari Brocklebank ultimately signing for 15 yearlings. While most of the group may be destined for resale next year, three of the yearlings were signed for on behalf of a racing partnership.

"There is a partnership that we are forming right now," Tari Brocklebank said. "There are about three or four people in a partnership that John has put together. They got four or five horses in the partnership and hopefully they will do well."

Leading the Brocklebanks purchases for the partnership was a colt by Mitole (hip 104) purchased for \$130,000 from the Woodbridge Farm consignment. The yearling is out of stakes winner Obey (Desert Code). Also on behalf of the partnership, Brocklebank signed for a colt by Army Mule (hip 98) from the Rancho San Miguel consignment for \$120,000.

All of the Brocklebanks' yearling purchases will head to the couple's base in Utah and will be trained by Luis Mendez.

"They will train there until the races start in March or April," Brocklebank confirmed.

The Italian rider was injured in the last race of the Sept. 19 card, a maiden turf sprint.

Dettori will be based at Keeneland this fall, starting with the Lexington oval's kick off date of Oct. 4.

McCONNELL, BARR, TONKO ADVOCATE FOR **HISA IN SUPREME COURT BRIEF** by T.D. Thornton

Three federal legislators who were instrumental in getting the Horseracing and Safety Integrity Act (HISA) passed into law in 2020 on Tuesday submitted a "friend of the court" brief to the United States Supreme Court in support of the HISA Authority's application for the stay of an unconstitutionality mandate that is pending but currently administratively stayed out of the Fifth Circuit court of appeals.

Senator Mitch McConnell (R-Kentucky), who introduced HISA when he served as the Majority Leader, plus Congressmen Andy Barr (R-Kentucky) and Paul Tonko (D-New York), who both sponsored HISA and similar precursor bills, on Sept. 24 advocated for the Supreme Court to grant a stay of the Fifth Circuit mandate pending the filing and disposition of a petition for a writ of certiorari that the HISA Authority will be seeking to get the Supreme Court to take the case.

A possible decision by the Supreme Court has long been speculated as the final destiny for the 3 ½-year legal odyssey in which the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and 12 of its affiliates are trying to nullify HISA as an allegedly unconstitutional law.

Three federal appeals courts (the Fifth, Sixth and Eighth Circuits) have already opined in three different lawsuits that HISA's rulemaking provisions are constitutional. Only the Fifth Circuit has opined that HISA's enforcement mechanisms are unconstitutional.

"The Authority easily satisfies this Court's standard for a stay of the court of appeals' mandate," the three legislators wrote in their brief.

"First, there is a 'reasonable probability' that four members of this Court will deem [that the case is] 'sufficiently meritorious' for a grant of certiorari, given that the decision [by the Fifth Circuit] both invalidates important federal legislation and creates a split with the Sixth and Eighth Circuits.

"Second, there is a 'fair prospect' that a majority of this Court will vote to reverse, given the Fifth Circuit's failure to heed this Court's instructions about the difficulty of a facial challenge to an Act of Congress, and given as well HISA's many procedural safeguards.

"Third, it is 'likely that irreparable harm will result from the denial of a stay,' given the dangerous patchwork of regulatory regimes-or, even worse, regulatory voids if states were not prepared to step in immediately or state rules remained preempted

by HISA's still-valid rules-that would ensue for horseracing if HISA were rendered unenforceable by the Authority," the brief stated.

GRANTED STAYS FOR 'NEGLECT OF HORSES'

TRAINER AND ASSISTANT AT DELAWARE

PENALTIES by T.D. Thornton

An owner/trainer and an assistant trainer/groom at Delaware Park on Tuesday both were granted stays of penalties imposed last Friday for alleged neglect of horses their care.

Owner/trainer Ney Pessanha, 38, had appeared at a hearing before the Delaware stewards Sept. 17 to respond to allegations of "improper or inhumane treatment of horses" after the stewards "had received complaints from horsemen, outriders, the Safety Steward, private veterinarians, and regulatory veterinarians," according to a Sept. 20 Delaware Thoroughbred Racing Commission (DTRC) ruling.

On the same date, assistant/groom Nilo Pessanha, 44, had also been asked to testify before the Delaware stewards regarding nearly identical complaints.

Ney Pessanha, the ruling stated, "failed to provide adequate food, water, bedding, sanitation, exercise, and veterinarian care for his horses." The Delaware stewards suspended his license for one year, fined him \$1,000, and deemed him ineligible to apply for a Delaware license in any capacity until Jan. 1, 2030.

In a near-verbatim explanation in a separate ruling, Nilo Pessanha was suspended for 99 days and also had a five-year period of ineligibility stipulated before he can apply for licensure in Delaware.

Both licensees had waived their rights to legal counsel at the hearings, the rulings stated. Each of the stays will be in effect until the DTRC adjudicates the appeals for the Pessanhas.

A trainer since 2007, Ney Pessanha's record on Equibase shows a 48-62-109 mark from 1,002 starts, with purse earnings of \$1,759,652. So far in 2024, he has saddled 16 starters, with none of them hitting the board at Delaware, Penn National and Parx.

Breanna Moore and Raines Gammon both found immediate success in their first forays in the TAKE2 Junior Rider Program, presented by Thoroughbred Charities of America. Moore led all Junior Riders in the Hunter division of the TAKE2 Thoroughbred League, and Gammon was the high-score Junior in the Jumper division.

In addition to trophies for the champions and saddle pads for the top five in each division, TAKE2 this year added a \$500 award to the high-score Junior Riders.

"Congratulations to Breanna and Raines for taking the top honors in the TAKE2 Junior Rider categories," said Erin Halliwell, executive director of TCA. "We are thrilled to once again support TAKE2 as they work to offer incentives to Hunter Jumper riders to select a Thoroughbred as their next mount. TAKE2 successfully highlights the versatility of former racers and the success that they can find after their racing careers."

Moore, the regular rider of 8-year-old Nickel Ride (registered as Candy Major by The Jockey Club), picked up 950 points this season. She finished fourth overall in the 2024 TAKE2 Thoroughbred League Hunter Standings, and was the Reserve Champion against 23 rivals in the \$10,000 TAKE2 Hunter Finals at the Kentucky National Horse Show Sept. 22.

Nickel Ride (aka Nicholas), a \$100,000 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearling Sale purchase, is an unraced son of the stallion Candy Ride (Arg). Adopted from New Vocations in 2019 by Jamie Barkau, the Florida-bred was subsequently purchased by the mother and daughter team of Brooke and Breanna Moore.

"It's been a really amazing experience," Moore said of her first experience with Take2. "It's nice to have that Thoroughbred connection and be competitive and broadcasting that to everyone else that Thoroughbreds can be competitive after their racing careers. It's been awesome."

With the help of veteran The Girl Next Door (registered as A P Jet Stream by The Jockey Club), Gammon also capped off the 2024 season as the divisional leader, heading the Junior Jumpers with 316 points, 118 points clear of her nearest competitor.

"We were looking for something for me to do and we came across [TAKE2]," explained Gammon. "I had fun, so we just did it for the rest of the year. It really worked out."

The 14-year-old Maryland native joined forces with 'Dinky' in October of 2023. Leased from West Coast-based Patty Arnett, the 21-year-old mare stands just over 14 hands.

"It took me a little bit to figure her out. She's very opinionated," Gammon said of the New York-bred. "She knows her job and she likes to do her job, but it just took me a little time to figure out how to ride and work with her."

Created for the 2018 season in partnership with TCA, the TAKE2 Junior Rider Award recognizes the juniors competing on Thoroughbreds in nationwide TAKE2-affiliated Hunter and Jumper classes. In addition, all who are enrolled for the award and compete in TAKE2 classes are eligible for a drawing for a \$1,000 scholarship grant from TAKE2. The grant can be used to pay tuition and expenses for higher education anywhere in the U.S.

Individuals are eligible as TAKE2 Junior Riders until the end of the TAKE2 season in which they reach the age of 18.

"Since we joined forces with TCA to start this program, it has grown every year, with the young horsewomen and men getting more and more interested in riding Thoroughbreds," said TAKE2 Executive Director Andy Belfiore. "That's no surprise, as they are fun and exciting to ride. Congratulations go out to Breanna and Raines, and all our Junior Riders."

DAVID ERWIN TAKES BEAT BYK CONTEST

David Erwin of Charlottesville, Virginia took home the grand prize of this year's Beat Byk NHC Challenge, earning his first-ever berth to the National Horseplayers Championship next March. This year's contest drew more than 12,000 entries throughout the eight weeks of competition, which saw entrants "Beat Byk" 14 out of 17 times. The Beat Byk final qualifier Sept. 14 had 918 individuals who played for the winning ticket.

"I've been trying to qualify for the NHC for a few years, but I do not have time to put the work in to play in very many contests," said Erwin. "I started playing in contests about 10 years ago and have played in several Beat Byk challenges. I'm very happy to get to go to the NHC this year and thank Steve Byk for offering this contest."

Together with the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, Steve Byk, host of the Thoroughbred radio news magazine "At the Races" on Sirius XM, partnered to send one NHC Tour member to Las Vegas. RETIRED RACEHORSE PROJECT ANNOUNCES **FORMAT CHANGES FOR 2025 THOROUGHBRED MAKEOVER**

The Retired Racehorse Project (RRP) announced format changes to its flagship event, the Thoroughbred Makeover and National Symposium, beginning with the 2025 competition year.

Beginning in 2025, which also marks the 10th anniversary of the Thoroughbred Makeover's move to Kentucky, the Finale Championship event will be replaced by individual discipline championships, welcoming back the top 10 highest-placed horses after preliminary competition.

Discipline championships will take place in the same locations as preliminary rounds, and will call back twice as many horses to participate as the current Finale format; horses will go into the championship round on a clean slate score. Prize money previously awarded to the overall Thoroughbred Makeover Champion will be divided across all 10 disciplines, allowing the RRP to pay out through sixth place.



TATTERSALLS IRELAND SALE-TOPPER BY SEA THE STARS ON HIS WAY TO GEORGE SCOTT

Quality came to the fore on day one of the Tattersalls Ireland September Yearling Sale when one of only two Sea The Stars (Ire) colts on offer this week went the way of agent Billy Jackson-Stops and trainer George Scott for €130,000.

The Castlebridge-consigned colt was one of five yearlings to break the six-figure mark on a day where an 86% [down 2% on 2023] clearance rate provided some encouragement to middle to lower tier operators.

However, many of the key metrics dipped further, most notably the 17% drop in the median to \in 25,000. Despite 24 more lots on offer for the corresponding day's trade, turnover also dropped by 4% while the average was down 8% to \in 29,906.

The sale of the Sea The Stars colt at €130,000 carried on from a familiar theme to the bloodstock market in recent times where the quality offerings are holding their own and Scott was in no doubt that lot 201 fitted that brief. Cont. p3

ANDRE FABRE UNABLE TO SPLIT ARC PAIR SOSIE AND MQSE DE SEVIGNE

Andre Fabre has issued a positive bulletin on his pair of contenders as he seeks a record-extending ninth win in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp on Sunday, October 6.

Fabre is responsible for the ante-post favourite in the shape of the three-year-old **Sosie (Ire)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}), who has won his last two starts over the Arc course and distance, first making the breakthrough at the top level in the Grand Prix de Paris in July and then returning from 10 weeks off with a comfortable victory in the G2 Prix Niel.

Mqse De Sevigne (Ire) (Siyouni {Fr}), on the other hand, is yet to prove herself over the Arc trip, but Fabre expects the step up to a mile and a half to play to the strengths of a mare who is already a five-time Group 1 winner. This summer she returned to Deauville to repeat her 2023 victories in the Prix Rothschild and Prix Jean Romanet. Cont. p8

Kodiac features prominently in the pedigree of lot 157, being the dam of Marriage Material (Ire), an unraced sister to Ardad (Ire), and Keatley revealed that he has high hopes for his new acquisition.

He said, "Trade was strong enough at Newmarket and in Doncaster and we didn't get many. This is a fine stamp of a horse and he's out of a Kodiac mare so should be all speed. We'll be hoping for big things from him. It's a cracking pedigree and, if the sire can do it, the rest will look after itself."

He added, "We're looking forward to him and he's for existing owners in the yard. We're having a good year and are doing our best so hopefully we can keep doing it. There are plenty of nice horses at home in the yard and we're trying to add to the stock all the time."

Along with Joey Logan, Keatley also added an Australia (Ire) colt (lot 154) from Brook Lodge Farm to his shopping cart at €85.000.

Viva Italia - Razza Latina Continues Tattersalls Ireland Love Affair

Italian buyers have played an important role in the success of this sale, most notably the exploits of Razza Latina, who teamed up with Fabrizio Cameli to purchase an Invincible Spirit (Ire) colt from the Irish National Stud for $\le 110,000$.

The fact that one of the most expensive lots sold on day one of the September Yearling Sale will be heading to Italy shows how far the relationship has come and Cameli, who owned the Endo Botti-trained Italian Derby winner Goldenas (Ire) (Golden Horn {GB}), is understood to be dreaming of repeat success.

"He is a very good model for a first foal. Everything is special and he is our pick of the sale--he stood out when we were viewing yesterday," Cristiana Brivio, who buys under the banner of Razza Latina, said of lot 101. "I have been very lucky with the horses bought from this sale last year and this is a sale I particularly like to come to."

Talking Points

- Breeze-up handlers didn't take long to make their mark with Ryan Conran of Lacka House snapping up the second horse that went through the ring before Mark Grant landed lot seven. All told, there were well over 30 yearlings bought to go breezing next year.
- One of the most unique pinhooking stories for some time met with a fitting result when Bartek Radzikowski, who told *TDN Europe* on the eve of the sale of how he prepped his Lucky Vega (Ire) colt (lot 206) back home in Poland, sold to Jason Kelly for €50,000. The colt was bought by the Polish native at Goffs last year for €30,000 and Tuesday's sale represented a shrewd piece of business for the man who has been on the shank showing his pride and joy as part of the Baroda Stud draft all week. - It was a big day for Lucky Vega. Early on Tuesday morning, a colt by the Irish National Stud-based stallion shaped well when winning a barrier trial in Australia and things got even in the ring as the day progressed. Along with Radzikowski's colt turning a nice profit, Mark Dreeling of Coole House Farm enjoyed a big result when his filly (lot 244) by the stallion sold to trainer Gemma Tutty on behalf of Kings Bloodstock for €80,000. That sale rounded off a hugely respectable €39,125 average for eight yearlings sold on the day.
- Sarah Dempsey was another pinhooker to turn a nice profit, with her Sergei Prokofiev filly's share price [lot 196] rocketing from just €4,000 as a foal to €22,000 to Italian buyers Rolla Edwardo / Botti Stefano.
- Pedigree updates don't come more timely than that of lot 231, Grangemore Stud's Shaman (Ire) colt whose half-sister Rebel Diamond (Ire) (Cotai Glory {GB}) took the Listed Blenheim Stakes across the road at Fairyhouse less than 24 hours before the sale. Alex Elliott purchased the colt on behalf of owner Gary Gillies for €110,000 with the agent admitting that the pedigree update forced him to stretch the budget. "The update killed us a little bit," Elliott admitted. "We were hoping to pay a bit less! He was on our radar very early yesterday as he is out of a Teofilo (Ire) mare and they

are like gold dust. It is great for Barry as the first foal out of the mare is now a Listed winner. The stallion is a bit slow getting there, but they are getting there now and he had the favourite for the Mill Reef Stakes [Brian (Ire)]. This horse has size, scope, strength, great action, comes from a very good home and a great touch for them—but they kind of deserved a good touch with everything lining up. This is the only horse I have bid on all day and I am delighted to get him." Cont. p6

Golden Touch

Luke Bleahen proved himself a chip off the block when turning €10,000 into €75,000 with his Hello Youmzain (Fr) colt. The Bleahen family are renowned for unearthing top-notch National Hunt horses and the 24-year-old showed that the same modus operandi can be replicated on the Flat when his French recruit sold to Cormac Farrell.

Indeed, the transaction represented some repeat business between Farrell and the Bleahens, as the Kildare-based operator sourced one of the most exciting National Hunt prospects in training Dancing City from the family some years ago before selling to Willie Mullins after the chestnut won his point-to-point.

Farrell has already had some joy at the breeze-up sales with Hello Youmzain, the sire of recent Group 3 winner Electrolyte (Ire), and his latest acquisition is set to chart a similar path.


"The plan is to see how he develops over the next three months and perhaps go to breeze in France next spring to take advantage of the premiums," Farrell said. "I think he is going to take a bit of time, but I like the horse. I bought some very nice horses from the Bleahens before so hopefully this horse will be lucky as well."

Farrell added, "I had a very nice colt by Hello Youmzain [who sold for 200,000gns at the Craven Breeze-Up Sale]. I think the stallion is very good so it all made sense. We will find out next spring whether this was a good bit of business or not."

Young Bleahen went on to sell a colt by first-season sire Victor Ludorum to Spanish buyer Mediteraneo for €31,000. Lot 29 had initially been sourced for €10,000 at the same Arqana December Breeding Stock Sale as the Hello Youmzain colt and capped a memorable afternoon for the pinhooker. Cont. p7

He commented, "I am over the moon--it is the stuff that dreams are made of. Cormac Farrell also bought Dancing City from us so it is great to get the repeat business. We have been very lucky with Hello Youmzain because in the last fortnight alone he has had two Group 3 winners and is the leading first-season sire in Europe and has a 39 per cent strike-rate."

He added, "The Victor Ludorum [Lot 29] is going to Spain, so it just shows the strength of the buying bench and the great work that Tatts have been doing. We have been flat out since we got here and had 79 shows here on Sunday and 80 yesterday; there was a great buzz but the place. I found having the premiums for these two horses a huge draw for a lot of buyers. It is a very attractive addition to the international and European buyers here."

Buy of the Day

Few horses generated as much debate prior to the sale than lot 103, a Golden Horn (GB) colt who was knocked down to dual-purpose trainer Richard O'Brien through budding agent David Skelly at 30,000gns. In a sale that is usually dominated by breeze-up and foreign buyers, who tend to value precocity above all else, O'Brien and Skelly may have sniffed out a bit of value with the Golden Horn colt. For starters, the stallion has to go down as one of the most underrated at stud, with talented stayers Trawlerman (GB), Gregory (GB) and Caius Chorister (GB) continuing to fly the flag at a high level for Golden Horn this season. Lot 103 has good action, enough size and looks a nice prospect for his new connections.

The sales are never boring when Alistair Pim is on the rostrum. Pim rarely disappoints and, when Jamie Insole landed lot 224 for the good doctor [Richard Newland], he came out with another great line. "Jamie Insole," the auctioneer announced, before qualifying it with "like the shoe!"

Pinhooking Fortunes On Day 1

Of the 277 horses catalogued during Tuesday's session, 97 were pinhooks, and after eight withdrawals, 89 horses passed through the ring. A total of 25 did not meet their reserves and were buy-backs, leaving 64 yearlings marked as sold. Of the latter group, 32 made a profit, one yearling broke even, and 31 lots lost money.

We have multiplied the price of the foal by 1.1 and added a running cost of €12,000 for keep, feed, veterinary, shoeing, sales prep and sales entry fees. Depending on whether someone has their own farm, or where they choose to board a horse, will obviously mean that costs for each individual can vary significantly.

And it is worth noting that sometimes a horse can appear to be bought and sold by different names but have actually not changed ownership at all.

"They are doing well," Fabre said of his potential Arc runners. "They just worked this morning and I was very pleased with them.

"I fancy the mare. So many people seem to think the Arc may be a bit far for her, but I have exactly the opposite opinion. I actually think an extra two furlongs will help her. She loves soft ground and her ability is not in question. She will adapt to the course and distance very well and she's in very good shape."

He added, "Sosie is a nice horse as well and he is coming forward at the right moment. If it goes very heavy ground, that won't help him, but soft ground will be fine. He's like a few horses I've had who have won the Arc, in that he is coming good at the right moment.

"I would not like to say one in front of the other, but I think both have a good chance of being in the first four, say it like that."

LAZZAT TARGETS GOLDEN EAGLE INSTEAD OF FORET

Nurlan Bizakov's undefeated Lazzat (Fr) (Territories {Ire}) will forego the G1 Prix de la Foret on Oct. 6 and instead target Australia's Golden Eagle, trainer Jerome Reynier revealed.

The Sumbe homebred is a perfect six-for-six in his career, with group wins in the G3 Prix Djebel in April followed by the G3 Prix Paul de Moussac in June and the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest in August. The gelding will shortly travel to Newmarket and begin quarantine.

"He's going for the Golden Eagle in Sydney, so he's not going to run in the Foret," Reynier confirmed.

"Tomorrow [Wednesday] morning he's going to Newmarket to start his quarantine, he stays in quarantine before taking a flight to Sydney on Oct. 13, he will be there on the 15, he will be released from quarantine on the 29 and will be racing on Nov. 2.

"It's quite exciting. It will be a change of environment and he needs to adapt to so many variables, but if he arrives safe and happy there, I think he will have a good chance.

"He's one of the best sprinters in Europe and is unbeaten in six starts, so it's a very exciting prospect and an exciting challenge."

Two-time UAE champion **Lord North (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who raced for His Highness Sheikh Zayed bin Mohammed Racing, has been retired to Godophin's Rehoming after a lengthy career at the highest level.

Trained by John and Thady Gosden, the bay's biggest claim to fame was a trio of victories in Meydan's G1 Dubai Turf in 2021, 2022 and 2023. He also won the 202 G1 Prince of Wales's Stakes at Royal Ascot and a pair of Group 3s, including the 2023 Winter Derby. He was second in the 2022 and 2024 editions. The 8-year-old gelding, out of Najoum (Giant's Causeway), retires with a mark of 24-10-4-2 and \$8,148,646 in earnings. His career finale was an eighth-place finish in the 2024 Prince of Wales Stakes.

Jonn Gosden told *Racing Post*, "Lord North has been retired to join Godolphin Rehoming after an illustrious career. He retires a sound horse, but the years have caught up with him.

"He's been a pleasure to train over the years and he's a horse who has always had a lot of character. He's provided his groom

EQUINOME LAUNCHES CHECKMATE TO REDUCE INBREEDING RISK IN THOROUGHBREDS

Equinome today announced the launch of Checkmate, a new online tool that checks potential matings in real-time for genomic inbreeding risk.

Recently published research led by the Royal Veterinary
College showed an association between higher genomic
inbreeding levels and abortions and stillbirths in Thoroughbreds.
High levels of genomic inbreeding have also been shown to
significantly impact durability for racing, with published studies,
led by University College Dublin and Equinome, showing a clear
link between genomic inbreeding and the likelihood of a
Thoroughbred horse to ever race.

Checkmate is designed to provide real-time predictions of genomic inbreeding in a hypothetical foal by matching the DNA profile of a mare with the genetic profile of up to 10 stallions of the breeder's choice. Using proprietary bioinformatics algorithms, it calculates the potential impact of each mating on a foal, returning a risk score and flagging high-risk matings.

"The goal with Checkmate is to help our clients protect the health of their mares, reduce the number of lost foals and see more healthy foals progress to the racecourse," said Professor Emmeline Hill, chief science officer. "The loss of a foal can have a considerable impact on any breeding operation, large or small, but by using genomics to assess inbreeding levels breeders can now reduce unnecessary risks."

Stallion owners can also use Checkmate to check and manage mare allocation in advance of final breeding decisions. Reducing overall genomic inbreeding in a book of mares has the potential to significantly increase the number of live foals, improving both the health of the breed and stallion revenue.

Hill added, "Using return of mares data, we looked at the relationship between genomic inbreeding and the production of a healthy foal from a mating. In 1,000 matings for 28 stallions we found that had Checkmate been used to flag and avoid high risk matings, the percentage of live foals per stallion could be increased from 59% to 76%. Producing more foals would increase stud fee returns for stallions if Checkmate was applied to mare nominations."
