Subsanador (Arg) (Fortify) didn't get much respect at 6-1 in the betting when throttling between rivals to seize a three-horse photo by a head in Saturday's GI California Crown S., and he likely won't be favored for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic in five weeks, either.

But make no mistake: There were no fewer than 10 aspirants for the Classic in the entries worldwide last week, and only Subsanador's score at Santa Anita resonated as a true status shifter that elevated this Richard Mandella trainee into the top tier among America's older dirt routers.

The betting public for the Classic will gravitate toward 'TDN Rising Star' Fierceness (City of Light), who boasts higher Beyer Speed Figures and more "headline horse" name recognition than a 5-year-old with Argentinian form (seven dirt wins, three at the Group 1 level) and only five starts in North America.

Debuting stateside last December out of trainer John Sadler's barn, Subsanador ran a subpar fourth as the 13-10 favorite in the GII San Antonio S. (a race in which he reportedly bled). But in the Mar. 3 Santa Anita H., Subsanador nearly wired the 10-furlong Grade I stakes at 22-1 odds before grudgingly yielding to 'TDN Rising Star' Newgate (Into Mischief). Cont., p3

RAIN OR SHINE? NO PROBLEM. WAYS AND MEANS GETS IT DONE IN GALLANT BLOOM

The weather did not bother 'TDN Rising Star' Ways and Means (Practical Joke--Strong Incentive, by Warrior's Reward) as she skimmed the Aqueduct slop and easily took home the GII Gallant Bloom Stakes on Sunday afternoon.

Last seen capturing the GI Test Stakes at Saratoga Aug. 3, that effort came on the back of a career best two back--at least on paper--over a Saratoga first-level allowance group June 6. She'd dominated those rivals by 8 1/4 lengths and earned a 104 Beyer, stronger than anything else this field had managed to produce. She'd run off the board before that May 3 in the GI Kentucky Oaks.


The heavy 2-5 favorite here, she exited the gate in good order and tracked **Nic's Style** (Uncaptured) up the backstretch.

Subsanador was privately sold to Wathnan Racing after the Big 'Cap, and in the process got transferred to Mandella. He then ran fourth in the 1 1/4-mile GII Hollywood Gold Cup S.

Mandella utilized the GIII Philip H. Iselin S. at Monmouth Park Aug. 17 as a well-orchestrated confidence-builder for Subsanador, who unleashed a powerful far-turn move to mow down the frontrunners and score by 1 1/2 lengths.

Both Mandella and jockey Mike Smith have acknowledged that Subsanador is a work in progress because of previous tendencies to wait on horses or sometimes think the race is over once he surges to the front.

But on Saturday, Subsanador had no problem with being covered up at the rail while latching onto a primo stalking spot, always within 2 1/2 lengths of a pressured pacemaker whose first four quarter-mile splits were :22.89, :24.30, :24.07 and :24.91.

Smith tipped Subsanador out to the two path at the top of the lane and relentlessly chased speedster National Treasure (Quality Road) the length of the stretch through a final furlong in :12.51. Subsanador pulsed ahead of National Treasure two strides from the wire while simultaneously holding off the onrushing Newgate, who had picked up the chase and surged late to finish a nose behind in third.

The winning nine-furlong time of 1:48.69 equated to a 102 Beyer awarded to all three horses in that blanket photo.

Subsanador will be expected to produce a slightly higher winning number if he is to prevail in the Classic. He's paired 102 ratings in each of his last two starts, but his wins at Monmouth and Santa Anita both caught the eye more for "how he did it" rather than "how fast," and both suggested there was room for additional improvement.

Subsanador gives the impression of a wave gathering serious momentum, and Mandella is honing a level of consistency in him that is has not been the hallmark of other A-listers who have taken turns atop the division this season.

Mandella has previously parlayed a win in this autumn Santa Anita stakes into a victory in the Breeders' Cup Classic. He trained Pleasantly Perfect to that sweep in 2003, when the California Crown S. was known as the GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H.

Farther back in the California Crown pack, fifth and six respectively, were Breeders' Cup aspirants Senor Buscador (Mineshaft) and 'TDN Rising Star' Muth (Good Magic). Both will be lacking a positive final prep if they press on to the Classic.

Later on Saturday, another Wathnan colorbearer, the just-acquired Hit Show (Candy Ride {Arg}), scored a neck victory in the GII Lukas Classic at Churchill Downs. **Cont.**

In other global stakes with Classic implications last week, Ushba Tesoro (Jpn) (Orfevre {Jpn}) ran second at 2-5 odds in the Listed Nippon TV Hai at Funabashi Race Track on Wednesday. Fifth in that stakes was Derma Sotogake (Jpn) (Mind Your Biscuits), who had been second at 26-1 odds in last year's Breeders' Cup Classic.

At Aqueduct on Saturday, 'TDN Rising Star' Tapit Trice rallied from last to win a four-horse, muddy-track renewal of the GII Woodward S. The deep closer needed a little help from a leg-weary Skippylongstocking (Exaggerator), who shortened stride when failing to sustain an open-length lead in deep stretch. The winning Beyer was 98.

The Classic division lost a 3-year-old contender to retirement Saturday. Dornoch (Good Magic), winner of the GI Belmont S. and GI Haskell S., was diagnosed with bone bruising, forcing him out of what would have been his planned final start prior to stud career at Spendthrift Farm.

Racing to the outside of her competition through: 22.65, :45.96, and 1:09.43 splits, she pushed for command on the far bend and had set her sights for home as they swung out of it. Urged on by Flavien Prat, the Klaravich Stables homebred inhaled that long time leader and splashed home a no-doubt winner by four lengths. The pacesetter held on for second while **Sterling Silver** (Cupid) picked up the last trifecta spot.

"It was impressive. Hopefully she comes out of the race good," said Chad Brown. "I was worried about the track because she didn't run [well] on an off track in the Kentucky Oaks, but there might have been a lot of factors for that, not just a wet track."

Brown added, "I love how Flavien [Prat] kept his position. It was kind of tight going down the backside, and I wasn't sure if he was going to tug her back or let her go. I'm happy that he went, and she put away a good filly--that filly on the inside [No. 2, Nic's Style] is pretty fast."

"It was a perfect prep, so long as she comes out healthy. I wasn't feeling comfortable with a 13-week layoff to the Breeders' Cup and that's going to be a real race going seven furlongs out there."

When asked about where Ways and Means will be making Breeders' Cup preparations, Brown confirmed all of his horses will be located either at Belmont or Keeneland as the dates get closer.

Pedigree Note:

Ways and Means is not the only accomplished offspring for her dam, herself a Listed winner in Canada, as she claims kin to multiple track-record setting Highly Motivated as well as GI Matriarch Stakes victress Surge Capacity. Since this most recent Grade I-winner, Strong Incentive has only produced a yearling filly by Good Magic and went back to Into Mischief for 2025. The mare is herself a half-sister to the dam of GII Penn Mile hero Wow Whata Summer (Summer Front) and hails from the immediate female family of G1 Prix Jean Prat-placed Monsagem.

HIT SHOW CAPS A DAY OF DAYS FOR WATHNAN RACING

Hit Show got up late to cap a huge day for Wathnan Racing with a win in the GII Lukas Classic at Churchill Downs Saturday night. The 3-1 shot angled to the rail under the wire the first time and into the first turn while many of his foes opted to angle outside over the sloppy going. Settled in fourth off the pace down the backstretch as Cooke Creek set a moderate pace, the gray began making forward progress approaching the far turn. He rolled up five wide approaching the stretch and reeled in the pacesetter and outbattled that game foe to the wire.

"That was a huge effort," winning jockey Florent Geroux said. "He had to battle late and really dug in to get his head in front. We were in a great spot early and I got to save a lot of ground. He has a lot of class. I think he's improving a lot this year."

Winning trainer Brad Cox added, "He ran great. Florent gave him a perfect trip and he was able to save ground in the first

turn and come home running. Once he tipped out, he really came with a huge run. We'll talk about next steps with the owners and make a plan. Whether it be the Breeders' Cup or races here locally is still up in the air."

Wathnan Racing of Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani, the Emir of Qatar, had a monster Saturday, with Subsanador (Arg) (Fortify) winning the Gl California Crown Stakes and Tumbarumba (Oscar Performance) and Cagliostro (Upstart) finishing two-three in the GIII Ack Ack Stakes.

Racing in the colors of his breeders, Gary and Mary West, Hit Show won the 2023 GIII Withers Stakes and missed by a nose when second in the GII Wood Memorial Stakes. **Cont.**



HOW SWEET SHE IS! SUGAR FISH KEEPS SWIMMING AND CLAIMS ZENYATTA

In the race named after America's sweetheart, it was **Sugar Fish (Accelerate--Madiera Park, by Langfuhr)** who saved her best stride for the stretch and took home her second piece of graded Arcadian hardware in the GII Zenyatta Stakes.

A modest auction buy with modest beginnings, the former \$40,000 maiden claimer has risen through the ranks on a noticeably sharp incline, having sailed through her conditions since breaking her maiden Mar. 29 by 10 lengths, and finally finding herself the 9 3/4-length GII Summertime Oaks victress by June 8. Stepping up into Grade I company for the GI Clement L. Hirsch Stakes Aug. 3, she could do no better than sixth as some familiar faces passed her in the stretch.

In no hurry from the rear of the field as the 5-2 third choice here, she watched **Alpha Bella** (Justify) take control into the first turn and set :23.65, :48.25, and 1:12.42 early fractions. On hold up the backstretch, Sugar Fish had plenty left in reserve and as the pacesetter tried to give them the slip, the eventual winner responded around the far turn with a bid of her own. With the rail open down the lane, she rallied up the inside and powered home under Tyler Baze for the win. That frontrunner held on to second as **Desert Dawn** (Cupid) rolled along for third.

"What is amazing to me is good horses are generally a little older. This filly as a 3-year-old and is really hitting the big level now, so I'm so excited about it," said Kim Lloyd of Sweetwater Stable, part owners of Sugar Fish.

"She loves this place. She didn't enjoy Del Mar, there's nothing wrong with Del Mar, but for her she wasn't that happy there. She loves it here, so she is on her game, and she wants to run. No matter where she is, if you are a little relaxed around that first turn and around the backside, when it is time to kick in at the three and a half pole, she is ready to go."

Lloyd added regarding a start on the first weekend in November, "I would love to run in a Breeders' Cup, Del Mar is my favorite track. But the horse has to make that decision."

A half-sister to SP Hartel (City Zip), Sugar Fish is the most accomplished runner for her dam, who herself hails from a very succesful family of racers and runner producers. Dam Madeira Park was a graded winner, and a full-sister to MSW & GSP-Can Langara Lass, who went on to garner further accolades as the dam of GI Kentucky Derby runner-up Lookin at Lee (Lookin At Lucky). That mare also produced MGSW Blended Citizen (Proud Citizen), and his fulls-sister SW & GISP Battlefield Angel, who herself produced GSW Manny Wah, earner of just north of \$1million in prize money.

Since this winner, Madeira Park has produced 2-year-old Mitole Park (Mitole) as well as a 2024 filly by Jack Christopher. She went to Mage for 2025.



STRAIGHT NO CHASER NEVER GAVE THEM A CHANCE IN SANTA ANITA SPRINT CHAMPIONSHIP



Straight No Chaser | Benoit

'Big' is an underwhelming word to describe the last couple weeks for MyRacehorse and their partners.

It started Sept. 21 when MGISW Seize the Grey (Arrogate) seized the lead in the GI Pennsylvania Derby and never looked back. In Sunday's co-feature in California, it was second verse, same as the first.


Looking every bit the speed of the speed, **Straight No Chaser** (**Speightster--Margarita Friday, by Johannesburg**) dominated the GII Santa Anita Sprint Championship in just his second start of the season.

The now-5-year-old had not visited a winner's circle since 2023 when he ran away with the GIII Maryland Sprint Stakes on the Preakness undercard by 7 1/2 lengths. Transferred to Juan Landeros's care for that jump, Straight No Chaser ran fourth in his lone effort this year, which was the GIII Runhappy Stakes during the Belmont at the Big A meet May 11.

Back in action for Dan Blacker here, the 3-2 choice got to the lead and entertained brief early pressure from competition through :21.83 and :44.28 splits. Shrugging that one away and well in control coming off the bend, the question was how much he'd win by and the answer was 6 1/4 lengths over **Roll On Big Joe** (Prospective) in second. **See Through It** (Curlin to Mischief) came on for third. The final time was 1:08.54.

"They were running," Blacker said. "He broke really quick today and when I saw him going into the turn, how easy he was going, and we were in the right spot, I felt pretty confident."

Jockey John Velazquez added, "He was ready from the start. If he breaks good, and loose reins, that's what he likes. He relaxes until somebody gets next to him." **Cont.**

MOST WANTED AGAIN CAUGHT ON CAMERA, THIS TIME IN OKLAHOMA

It's not easy to live in Life Is Good's shadow, but his halfbrother has been eking out a name for himself one photo finish at a time, and his most recent exploits had him in view all alone at the line.

It was a battle down the lane, but **Most Wanted (Candy Ride {Arg}--Beach Walk, by Distorted Humor)** would not be denied en route to securing his first graded black-type in the GIII Oklahoma Derby.

Undefeated in his career by a grand total of less than two lengths, the West colorbearer won first out June 21 beneath the Twin Spires by a neck after closing from midpack, and then held strong over a field of allowance competition July 21 at Ellis Park to win by three-quarters of a length. He was last seen on the fortuitous end of a photo in the Listed Ellis Park Derby Aug. 11, where he got his nose down in the shadow of the wire.

Crowned the 4-5 favorite and in a familiar spot as he pressed the pace initially set by **Indispensable** (Constitution), the top pair sailed along through :23.60, :47.48, and 1:11.30 splits while being all but attached at the hip. Launching a long drive to put that rival away, he was momentarily overtaken in the lane by **E J Won the Cup** (Omaha Beach), but found his second wind late to battle back to a length margin on the wire. Indispensable just missed second in a photo.

"It was his first time [racing] under the lights, first time shipping this far, first time around two turns," said rider Florent Geroux, who was picking up his second win in the race since guiding Owendale into the winner's enclosure for trainer Brad Cox in 2019. "[Most Wanted] had a lot to think about. He is going to be a very interesting horse moving forward."

Pedigree Note:

Kin to the aforementioned 'TDN Rising Star', Most Wanted hails from a busy female family. While his dam was only placed in her career, and her greatest works coming as a broodmare, she is herself a daughter of the multiple Grade I-placed Bonnie Blue Flag (Mineshaft). That second dam can claim her own fleet of accomplished siblings, as her multiple Grade I-winning halfsister Diamondrella (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) tallies a group winner in Australia to her broodmare record, and their halfbrother Highest Honors (Tapit) was three-times graded placed in his career.

An unraced half-sister to that group produced GI La Brea Stakes-placed Brilliant Cut (Speightstown) and another still can claim GSW Nikkis Smartypants (Smarty Jones) to her list of accolades.

Beach Walk's most recent offspring include a 2-year-old fullbrother to Life Is Good named Lifes Reward (Into Mischief) and two full-sisters--a yearling and a 2024 filly. Their dam went to Gun Runner for 2025.

The dark bay's latest form cycle over four races--starting with the GI Churchill Downs Stakes on the Derby undercard--has not included any in-the-money results. The 7-year-old was last seen running fifth behind Saudi Crown (Always Dreaming) in the R.A. Cowboy Jones Stakes at Ellis Park Aug. 11. That Grade I stakes winner scratched out of the Ack Ack earlier on Saturday.

Set to face three others as a 5-1 shot in this truncated field here, Three Technique tracked the trio of pacesetters from the second flight out of the chute and onto the backstretch. Saving all the ground as the battle continued up front around the far turn, the dark bay began to show some life at the top of the lane by switching to the extreme outside. Three Technique gained the advantage at the sixteenth marker and punched his ticket to Del Mar.

"This is unbelievable, and I wanted to win this race for a very long time," trainer Jason Cook said.

Roscar, under a perfectly timed ride from Justin Stein, led home a one-two-three finish for Chiefswood Stables in the Breeders' Stakes at Woodbine Sunday. Roscar was vying for the lead with favored Hurricane Clair (Silent Name {Jpn}) into the first turn, but settled just off the pace as the Chiefswood trio lined up in behind the leaders as Thor's Cause (Brody's Cause) took the lead up the hill. Thor's Cause slowed the pace down up front, with Hurricane Clair tugging just to his outside and Roscar raced along the rail in cover of stablemate Side Street. Steadied off heals behind the pedestrian splits down the backstretch, Roscar was perfectly positioned when the pace quickened entering the bend and he skimmed the rail into the stretch to take the lead at the top of the lane. He scampered clear before holding off Saccharine to the wire. Hurricane Claire tired to last in the seven-horse field.

"We really liked this horse today," said Stein. "And he's been showing a lot of talent, and we kind of thought he'd be sharp early leaving the gate due to being off for seven weeks. And it took a minute to settle him in to stride, and he was literally towing me, in behind traffic, just waiting for his chance to turn free and then he did the rest."

Roscar, a maiden winner over the Woodbine all-weather surface last November in his only previous victory, was a well-beaten sixth in his lone stakes start in the Queenston Stakes in June. Switched to the lawn after that effort, the bay gelding was seventh going 1 1/16 miles July 19 and was making his first start since a third-place finish going 1 1/4 miles Aug. 11.

"Obviously, he's [Roscar] had a bit of a mixed up year and we haven't been able to get into a smooth rhythm with him," said winning trainer Rachel Halden. "The Plate was on the radar to begin with, but after the Queenston, then it kind of threw us off path a little bit, and then we had to wait, aim for this race. So, it's just great. It's so deserving for the owners, everybody involved. When you kind of give up the opportunity of other races to wait for this, when it works out, it's just really, really great.

Of the runner-up, Halden added, "[Saccharine] has just barely done anything wrong all year outside of win. You know she's going to get the distance. I'm so proud of her as well today. She ran great again."

Roscar, one of 12 stakes winners for Oscar Performance, is the first foal out of stakes-placed Rosemere, who has a yearling filly by Mendelssohn. The mare was bred to Midshipman this year.

RAINFALL FORCES AQUEDUCT'S MISS GRILLO TO SUNDAY OCT. 6 SAYS NYRA

The New York Racing Association, Inc. (NYRA) has moved Sunday's featured GII Miss Grillo Stakes [eighth race], a 1 1/16-mile turf test for 2-year-old fillies at Belmont at the Big A, due to significant rainfall and is now scheduled for Sunday, Oct. 6, the track said in a release early Sunday morning.

The Miss Grillo offers a "Win and You're In" berth to the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf Nov. 1 at Del Mar.

The graded race, which will be offered as an extra and redrawn, will join a card that also includes the GII Beldame Stakes and GIII Matron Stakes. Entries for the Sunday, Oct. 6 card will be taken on Wednesday, Oct. 2.

On Saturday, NYRA said that the four other turf races on Sunday's card [Races 3,5,6 and 9], which was originally scheduled for nine races, had been moved to the main track.

The Sunday eight-race card will kick off as scheduled with the first race at 1:05 p.m. ET. Post time for ninth, initially scheduled for 5:13 p.m. ET, has been moved to 4:48 p.m. ET.

Any multi-race wagers that include the eighth race have been canceled and will be refunded.

The \$1 Pick 6, which was to include an \$83,911 carryover, has been moved to Thursday, Oct. 3, and will begin in the third race at 1:42 p.m. ET.

Grade I-winner **Didia (Arg)** (Orpen) worked Sunday at Keeneland as she began her final preparations for the GI Maker's Mark Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf. She went a half-mile on the main track in :49.60, the track labeled as 'good', and was the ninth fastest of 11 others on the morning.

Also going was SP Ready for Peace (More Than Ready) and **Give Life** (Caravaggio), both of whom worked five furlongs on the main track.

SUBSANADOR 'DOING GREAT' AFTER CALI **CROWN WIN, BC CLASSIC CIRCLED**

The morning after his thrilling win in a three-way photo on the wire in the GI California Crown Stakes, Subsanador (Arg) (Fortify) was bright and alert and is on a path to the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, trainer Richard Mandella said Sunday.

"He's doing great. All is well."

"We saw a lot of courage [Saturday]," Mandella said of the effort which not only earned his stable star an automatic berth in the Classic but also garnered a reported 102 Beyer figure, as according to Daily Racing Form's Brad Free. "He was in tight. We hadn't had him in that position before, so it was really nice to see him fight that hard."

When asked his thoughts on the first-ever California Crown Day, Mandella said, "They put on a hell of a show. It might take a year or two to introduce, but I think it can be a success. I was sure impressed with the effort they made."

In the George Papaprodromou camp, Cabo Spirit (Pioneerof the Nile), the 24-1 shocker in the GII John Henry Turf Championship, is likely for a crack at the GI Breeders' Cup Turf after snapping his 11-race skid with a frontrunning theft of the contest.

"I don't know yet," Papaprodromou said of the Breeders' Cup. "I still need to talk to the owners, but most likely."

Should he go, Cabo Spirit will attempt to do what last year's winner of the John Henry--Balladeer (Distorted Humor)--could not, as that one led the 2023 BC Turf until the final quarter mile before fading to ninth. Papaprodromou has never won a Breeders' Cup race.

While the parade of Breeders' Cup confirmations and 'likelys' roll in for other camps, trainer Mark Glatt is not so sure if his GII California Crown Eddie D Stakes winner First Peace (Funtastic) will be among them. A sharp winner Saturday, the Eddie D was his charge's third stakes win and his first at the graded level, but the distance of the Turf Sprint makes it unlikely that First Peace will take that path.

"He pulled up great," Glatt reported from Clockers' Corner Sunday morning. "[In regards to going to the Breeders' Cup] I don't think so. I'm not sure that really fits him best, but we'll take a look at it."







Le Moine has a placed 2-year-old Mitole filly who was a \$285,000 buy at OBS April and a weanling Game Winner filly. She was bred to Forte for next term.



Blood, sweat and tears. That is what it took Michael Halford to turn Copper Beech Stables from a green field site into one of the most renowned racing yards in Ireland. One from which Group 1 and Royal Ascot winners were sent out and where the trainer managed the careers of over 100 steeds in his pomp.

Halford has trained more than 1,000 winners in his 41-year career, almost 500 of which were managed from Copper Beech during 16 full seasons there, but dwindling numbers during Covid and the separation from his second wife Louise meant that it was no longer viable to continue training from the purpose-built facility just 15 minutes off the Curragh.

That is the sort of double-whammy that would leave most men on the canvas. But the 62-year-old, who has a history with bouncing back from the brink, went away and hatched a plan that proved pivotal to his survival within the training ranks.

Since approaching Conyngham Lodge-based trainer Tracey Collins about the prospects of holding a joint-licence together, the team have sent out 44 winners in less than two seasons operating as a partnership. **Cont. p3**



That's what you call thriving, not surviving, and Halford is hoping to build on that momentum by sourcing some new talent to the team at Orby Part 1 and 2 at Goffs this week.

"I'm slowly getting my confidence back," the trainer said. "Feeling better recently and the horses have been running well as well which is a big help. What happened to me would have dented anybody's confidence. Between losing the business and the marriage, either one of those things would have to have an affect on you. For the two of them to happen at the same time was particularly hard. To be honest, the whole thing only really hit me back in January and February of this year. That's the part of the year when things slow down a little so I had time to reflect. That was tough enough going, just trying to get my head around things for what they were but, as I said, I had wonderful support and I was just happy to be able to continue training. I have a lot to be thankful for. It feels like we are back to square one. I started training 41 years ago about 200 yards down the road from Conyngham Lodge so it's gone full circle."

In many ways, Halford and Collins were destined to do well together. Both practitioners are renowned for their patient approach with horses and, given Collins' numbers had dipped to an all-time low, the idea of joining forces became something of a win-win.

"I didn't just wake up one morning and think that joining forces with Tracey was a good idea," Halford explained. "It was in my head for a long time. Covid put me on the back foot and it gave me a chance to see how bad things actually were because everything ground to a halt. There was no racing so it gave me time to pause and see things in the cold light of day. It was obvious that our numbers dipped below a certain level which meant it wasn't viable to continue in Copper Beech. So I knew that I was in trouble.





"What really happened was, I was harvesting the PAYE and the PRSI, as I am sure half the country was at the time, just to keep

people in a job. You were just hoping in the back of your mind that something or somebody would come along and get you out of trouble. But I soon realised that wasn't going to happen."

He added, "After Covid, I was left with whatever I had and then a big tax bill at the end of it all. It was an impossible task and, the longer I buried my head in the sand, the worse the outcome was going to be for me. I faced up to it and managed to save the sport horse side of Copper Beech the kids are based, but the racing

side of the yard had to go. What really kept me going was the support I was getting from owners."

Not one owner turned their back on Halford. The 40-something horses who had been with him at Copper Beech Stables made their way to the other side of the Curragh where, along with Collins, he made the best of what he had.

> Approaching 60 years of age at the time, Halford had the unenviable task of reinventing himself as a trainer. But this is a man who has been at rock bottom before and he knows exactly what is required to get out from the depths of despair.

"I was down to about seven horses 30 years ago and things were tough," he revealed. "I gave up the drink. I needed to get some help with that. I've never said that in any interview or anywhere in the was another low point in my

life. I was training in Pollardstown on the Curragh and the numbers had dropped. Things weren't great. But, as I said, I got off the drink, put my head down and did what I do best, which is work hard.

"So I've been at rock bottom before. That was pretty much the lowest point of my life. My first marriage went at that point but, again, I just had to roll up my sleeves and work my way out of it. Things started to happen. Slowly. It was probably no coincidence that, when I gave up drinking, things started to go well. Now, it was slow. But we got to a point where I was asked to train for HH the Aga Khan and that was a huge boost. That gives you a bit of confidence that you're doing something right. I know that some people wouldn't think so, but I always suffered with a lack of confidence. Even though it mightn't come across that way, but I do."

He added, "But getting back to that time of my life, we built up a string of horses over the course of about 10 years, and when the numbers started to get bigger, we were training out of two yards and it was clear we needed to expand. I bit the bullet and that's why I went and built Copper Beech Stables. It was a huge decision at the time. A huge undertaking. I was aware of the dangers but I was willing to do it and I did it. It worked and it was successful. I ended up training for some big owners including Godolphin--trained a Group 1 winner [Casamento], a Royal Ascot winner [Portage] and built up a string of over 100 horses with plenty of staff, a big number of jockeys and apprentices. It was a lot of hard work. Honesty and hard work."

And then it was gone. As Halford points out, a lot of top-class trainers have exited the stage in recent years. Some on their own terms. Others weren't as fortunate. The training ranks would have been lesser for his untimely departure but he remains determined to keep that thought at bay.

"Nobody is entitled to a living," he says frankly. "Even looking at Ireland alone, John Oxx trained Sea The Stars and, within a few years, he retired with a small string of horses. It's a tough game. That's why you have to reinvent yourself every few years in order to survive. I've been very lucky to know Noel Meade for a long time and was actually assistant trainer to him for a short period when I was younger. Noel was once the dominant force over jumps but, when his numbers dwindled, he went back training horses on the Flat and is still very successful because of that. To be doing what he's doing, with the same enthusiasm, is great to see but that's what you need to be doing if you want to stay in this game."

To that extent, the recruitment drive continues apace at Goffs this week. This has been a lucky place for Halford down through the years. Lord Church, who has won three times this season, was purchased at the Orby for €40,000 in 2022 while other bargain buys have been sniffed out here with the help of BBA Ireland agent Mick Donohoe.

"I'm 62 so I'd like to think that I could get back to where we once were but you need orders. If you would have asked if that was possible six months ago I'd have said no. Today, I have my bite back again. The love of training horses and being around horses has been a constant. I've always tried to do the best I can with what I have."

Halford added, "It's been an honour to train for HH the Aga Khan and Godolphin but I often wondered whether some people thought that, when I was training for the bigger outfits, maybe they wouldn't be looked after or get the same attention in the yard. That used to get to me a little bit. I think I was more adamant to get the best out of every horse as a result of that because every horse is important irrespective of who owns it. I love training horses and I want to continue training horses. I still feel I have a lot to offer. In relative terms as a trainer, 62 is not old. If anything, you should be coming into your prime as you've seen it all before at this stage.

"The biggest problem is sourcing them, though. Getting your hands on the raw material. Looking at the sales recently, we're probably back at a point where there's a certain level of overproduction so you could say that there is value to be had. There are opportunities at the sales. There is a huge emphasis on speed and two-year-old races, which is fine, but some of those slower-maturing horses that we have done so well with down through the years could come to the fore.

"A very good example would be Lord Church. I bought him off Lady O'Reilly, God be good to her, for €40,000 at the Orby a couple of years ago. When I bought him, she congratulated me and just said that he needed plenty of time. We gave him the time and he paid us back in spades. He's the exact type of horse I'd like to buy this week."

Halford speaks with a heavy helping of perspective. He may not have been able to save his business, nor his marriage, but the outcome could have been a lot worse. He could have lost himself.

"I get great satisfaction out of seeing the kids riding. It was a great boost to see Josh ride a few winners of late while Tommy has ridden a few placed horses on the track as well. Holly was with us all summer and has done a bit of pony racing while Leah is teaching in Dubai and loves it out there as well."

He added, "The simpler things mean a lot more to you when you've been through what I have. I'm stronger for it and I feel as though I'm training as well if not better than ever. The confidence is coming back and I'm hungry. Am I happy with my lot? I'd like to get back to where I was before. Is that possible? It is with support. I still think I have a lot to offer and I'm not going to lie down."



Already this year Whatton Manor have offered 16 lots at the Premier Yearling Sale and 15 at the Somerville Yearling Sale, with another 37 to come across Books 2 and 3 of the October Yearling Sale. That juggling act is just one of the reasons why Player found himself at Kildare Paddocks on Sunday morning for the first time in this capacity, seemingly with less time to put his feet up than he might have anticipated.

"It's been extremely busy today, far busier than I was expecting," he summed up. "There's plenty of people about and a lot of new faces, people I don't know and people from America. We're very pleased with the footfall and as always, Goffs do a fantastic job. It's great to see their hard work paying off with lots of people coming.

"We decided to come to Ireland because we have lots of horses and we had to think outside the box a little bit. We're bringing horses by English sires to Ireland where there won't be so many of them. We've got two Palace Piers and I think there's six in the catalogue, in total. If you go to Newmarket, I don't know the numbers exactly but there's probably 26 or 36 Palace Piers. It's just trying to find things that we think might suit the sale over here."

He added, "We've got 19 for [Tattersalls] Book 2 anyway and people struggle to get around them all. They don't have the showing time and horses can get knocked off the list. These horses might have been lesser lights at Book 1, but we've decided to bring them here instead. People are certainly looking at them and hopefully it will translate into some half-decent prices."

Recent events on the racecourse might also have something to do with it should the two yearlings by Palace Pier (GB) achieve the kind of results Player is hoping for, with the pedigrees of lot 251, a colt out of the Frankel (GB) mare Ghalyah (GB), and lot 276, a filly out of the Dansili (GB) mare Initially (GB), both having received significant updates since the catalogue was published.

"Scenic won the Galtres by three and three-quarter lengths," Player said of the half-sister to lot 251 by Lope De Vega (Ire). "She possibly ran back a little bit quick in the Park Hill, but she's a very smart, progressive filly.

"And Point Lynas [a half-brother to lot 276 by Iffraaj] won his Listed race by 5 1/2 lengths and got a Timeform rating of 117. Again, he proved himself a top-class horse. It's lovely to get those updates and, hopefully, people will take that into account."

The Whatton Manor consignment is completed by lot 233, a filly by Bated Breath (GB) out of the unraced Folk Song (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) whose dam, Folk Opera (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}), won the GI E. P. Taylor Stakes.

"The Bated Breath filly is a homebred from the farm," Player continued. "Bated Breath has been a very lucky stallion for us. He gave us Worth Waiting, who won the Group 2 Dahlia Stakes, amongst other good fillies. He's been very successful in America and that was why we decided to bring her here.

We felt she'd suit the American market. She's a very strong, forward filly who moves well and people seem to like her."

The team at Whatton Manor narrowly missed out on another notable update on Sunday when their homebred Fiery Lucy (GB) (Without Parole {GB}) was beaten just a neck in the G3 Weld Park Stakes at the Curragh, filling the runner-up spot at that level for the second start in succession. A half-brother to that filly by Ulysses (Ire) will be offered at Book 3 of the October Yearling Sale.

"Fiery Lucy came there to win, but Aidan O'Brien and Ryan Moore can do no wrong at the moment. That was a cracking run for a filly who we only sold for 38,000gns," Player said of that performance, before highlighting a few other successes in 2024 for horses born and raised at Whatton Manor.

"We've got a two-year-old called Fiction who has won five races on the bounce in France--we didn't get a bid for her at 6,000gns last year," he continued. "Scenic and Sound Angela have both won Listed races and Miriam's Fire won in America very impressively. She's going for a stakes race and if she wins that they're talking about the Breeders' Cup.

"We've got lots of nice horses running well from the farm and that's part of the reason why we do it. That's where we get the buzz and the enjoyment."

The Tally-Ho Stud resident has already made quite the impression this year, notably at Doncaster where he was responsible for two of the five highest-priced lots.

"Starman is one of those lovely stories," said Player. "He was the second horse David Ward ever bred and when he won the July Cup it was an incredibly special day for us all. He was such a good-looking horse himself, a big, strong, good-moving horse. We always really believed in him and we've got some lovely stock at home by him, homebreds of David's.

"We're just really excited and delighted that his stock has been so well received at the sales. Everything Tally-Ho touches turns to gold, so I wouldn't be at all surprised if he could do it as well. They've just got bombproof minds and they want to please you. Hopefully, he could be the leading first-season sire next year and the dream can continue."

The Whatton Manor team sold three Starman yearlings of their own at the Somerville Yearling Sale where the market was "tricky" in the words of Player. Nevertheless, he remains optimistic about what's ahead in the coming weeks and months, both in the sales ring and on the racecourse.

"Doncaster started better than we were expecting," he explained. "There was good trade at Doncaster and things went well there for us. The Somerville Sale was tricky. It wasn't easy for us, but we got most of them sold and you move on. We've got a lovely draft for Book 2, so hopefully people are saving some money for that sale--we've got some really nice horses to go there.

"It's tough. We all know we're in a downturn in the industry at the moment and you hope some horses get you out of jail by making good prices to cover the others that have been disappointing. The most important thing is that we try and get them into good homes so that they can come back and be racehorses next year and give us some more updates. That's the dream."

CHURCHILL'S HEAVENS GATE DIGS DEEP TO CLAIM STAKES BREAKTHROUGH AT THE CURRAGH by Sean Cronin

Coolmore's **Heavens Gate (Ire)** (Churchill {Ire}--Itqaan, by Danzig), with a half-dozen prior outings under her belt, was the most experienced of nine contenders entering Sunday's G3 Weld Park Stakes at the Curragh and her ringcraft was a telling factor in the seven-furlong contest as she delivered a display of power to claim a career high.



She had previously hit the board in the G3 Albany Stakes and G2 Duchess of Cambridge Stakes and annexed a valuable pot at Naas in her penultimate start before running fourth in York's G2 Lowther Stakes last time. Sent postward as the 11-8 favourite here, Heavens Gate settled into smooth rhythm, tracking the leaders in fifth, through the early fractions. Shaken up in traffic passing the quarter-mile marker, she charted a passage to the front approaching the furlong pole and came under a late drive to withstand the ominous late threat of Fiery Lucy (GB) (Without Parole {GB}) by a neck. Useful yardstick Barnavara (Ire) (Calyx {GB}) finished 1 1/4 lengths adrift in third.

"She's a lovely filly and she's been working very well," said Aidan O'Brien after matching John Oxx's record haul of seven renewals. "She was pitched in a load of times this year, but never up to seven [furlongs] before. We always felt that, when she stepped up to seven, she'd be way more classy. Ryan [Moore] said she relaxed and dropped in. She quickened, she got there very easy and just waited in front. When I asked Ryan if she would get a mile, he thought she would. Being by Churchill, I imagine she should get a mile. She could be a filly for the [GI] Breeders' Cup Juvenile [Fillies Turf]. She is a lovely quality of filly and she's a big, strong filly that quickens very well."

DURAMENTE'S LUGAL TOPS SPRINTERS

Let go at odds of 28-1 while looking to collect his first victory at the highest level, **Lugal (Jpn)** (Duramente {Jpn}) came from just off the pace to take Sunday's G1 Sprinter Stakes at Nakayama. Cruising in a ground-saving spot just behind a free-running **Puro Magic (Jpn)** (Asia Express {Jpn}) with **Win Greatest (Jpn)** (Secret Hero {Jpn}) within striking distance, Lugal overtook the latter straightening for home and closed the leader's advantage passing the 200-meter mark. Hitting the front late, the 4-year-old had enough left in reserve to hold off the fast-closing **Toshin Macau (Jpn)** (Big Arthur {Jpn}) by a neck with **Namura Clair (Jpn)** (Mikki Isle {Jpn}) a similar distance back in third.

Lugal, winning for jockey Atsuya Nishimura and trainer Haruki Sugiyama, ran 10th in a rain affected G1 Takamatsunomiya Kinen (1200m) Mar. 24. He won Kyoto's G3 Silk Road Stakes in his seasonal debut in January.

"I'm so happy, I'm so thrilled to be able to win a Group 1 race for the first time. I'm happy for Lugal as well because it's his first Group 1 win as well. I don't remember anything in the straight," Nishimura said.

The winning time of the race was 1: 07, the fastest run edition since Lord Kanaloa in 2012 (1:06.70).

Sugiyama mentioned post-race that he is open to campaigning Lugal overseas.

Pedigree Notes:

Sunday's Sprinters victory represents the seventh Group 1 winner for the late Duramente, who died in 2021. The winner's

dam Atab is out of unraced Moon's Whisper (Storm Cat), a daughter of French champion and Classic winner East of the Moon (Private Account), herself a half sister to Classic winner and leading sire Kingmambo. A half to Group 3 winner Moon Driver (Mr. Prospector), the stakes-producing Moon's Whisper also hails from the family of European champion 3-year-old Alpha Centauri (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}), in addition to Group 1 scorers Alpine Star (Ire) (Sea The Moon {Ire}) and Discoveries (Ire) Mastercraftsman).
