When Jon Clay bought Strong Incentive for his Alpha Delta Stables for \$2.15 million at last year's Fasig-Tipton November Sale, she had already produced Grade III winner and track-record holder **Highly Motivated** (Into Mischief), now a stallion at Airdrie Stud; two-time Grade III winner **Surge Capacity** (Flintshire {GB}); and an up-and-coming `TDN Rising Star'. *Cont.*

EUROS DESCEND ON KEENELAND IN SALTY QEII CHALLENGE CUP by Christina Bossinakis

Quite fittingly, a pair of group-winning European contenders have made the trip over the Atlantic for Saturday's GI Queen Elizabeth Challenge Cup Stakes, headed by Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's **Soprano (Ire)** (Starspangledbanner {Aus}). Trained by George Boughey, the 3-year-old filly was last seen finishing 1 1/2-lengths in third behind winner Porta Fortuna (Ire) (Caravaggio) and Fallen Angel (GB) (Too Darn Hot {GB}) in the one-mile G1 Matron Stakes at Leopardstown Sept. 14. That form alone would justify another look at this Irish-bred filly given that Porta Fortuna is a multiple Group 1 winner who is poised to take on the boys in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, while the runner-up has also won at the highest level and most recently finished a close-up fourth in contentious renewal of the G1 Prix de 'Opera at Longchamp. In her previous start, Soprano annexed the G3 Prix de Lieurey at Deauville in August.

Soprano arrived in the U.S. on Friday. She spent two days in quarantine at Churchill Downs before arriving at Keeneland Sunday.

"This is the main target," said Charles Eddery, who was aboard Soprano Wednesday morning. "We felt like she would take to American racing, and she likes warmer weather."

On Wednesday, Eddery took Soprano through the paddock before jogging around to the starting gate. *Cont. p5*

Fasig-Tipton Presents The November Mares

Strong Incentive, cont. from p1

That up-and-coming `TDN Rising Star' was named Ways and Means (Practical Joke), who had run second in the Grade I Spinaway Stakes. Within a month of his purchase, Surge Capacity won the Grade I Matriarch, and by the following summer, Ways and Means had established herself as a potential superstar, winning the Grade I Test at 3-5, and the GII Gallant Bloom at 2-5. Ways and Means will head into the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint as the likely favorite, and her dam will be one of the stars of the night at the November Sale two days later.

"It's hard to imagine a better producer in the world, much less on offer at public auction, than Strong Incentive," said Fasig-Tipton president Boyd Browning of the 12-year-old mare. "She is also the rare mare who has produced a Grade I winner on turf and dirt."

Clay, a cousin of Runnymede's late Catesby Clay, got into the breeding business somewhat later in his life. The New York City native bought his first horse in 2006 while maintaining a successful career in sports marketing. Seventeen years later, he is the breeder of the leading first-crop sire by winners, Vekoma, and of the two-time Breeders' Cup Sprint-winning champion Elite Power.

He said he realized early on that the best way to succeed was to invest in deep pedigrees at the top end of the market.

"I've been in the breeding business since 2007, and my goal has always been to be a commercial breeder," said Clay.
"Initially, I just wanted to try and see how the breeding business would work. So I bought three mares at my first sale back in 2006. And I just wanted to go slowly into it and see how it would work and see if it could be successful for me. And I realized after the first couple of years of acquiring mares that the best opportunity was to compete at the top end of the market, because that's where I think I could make some meaningful revenue. I decided to change my business plan a lot."

That change in strategy paid off quickly.

"I have been very fortunate and I've bred quite a few winners," said Clay. "My first was Lewis Bay, who was third in the (GI) Kentucky Oaks and was a multiple Grade II winner. But since then, I bred Vekoma, who's turned out to be a very successful stallion, and then most recently was Elite Power. I never thought when I got into the business that I would breed a champion, let alone a two-time champion."

His purchase of Strong Incentive last year was an example of his executing his business plan to perfection. *Cont.*

He works closely with his bloodstock advisor Reynolds Bell on how to breed successful racehorses by "an extensive examination of their dams' pedigrees," and he said he prefers to buy mares who are stakes winners or graded stakes winners.

Strong Incentive was a black-type winner herself with an extremely live page.

"I'm always looking to upgrade my broodmare band," he said.
"Naturally, I look at the breeding stock sales to see what's there.
I try to find broodmares that are highly proven on the racetrack,

and I had seen that Strong
Incentive had already produced
a couple of graded stakes
winners. And I knew that Ways
and Means was Grade I-placed.
And that just appealed to me. It
was a strong pedigree. I look
for mares that really have
depth of pedigree."

He checked with his trainer, Chad Brown, who also trains Ways and Means, and asked him if he thought the filly had the potential to win a Grade I stakes. Brown's answer: "All day long."

"That really gave me a lot of

confidence to buy a mare where I knew the pedigree could probably be upgraded very shortly," he said. "And I was hoping that I could get her for a price and she would definitely appreciate and her residual value would be much higher. So I paid \$2.15 million for her. I knew she was going to be a very expensive mare, and I kind of thought she'd be a little bit under that. But as you know, when you've got a couple of other big breeders competing for her, you have to dig a little bit deeper. I thought a lot of other potential buyers would probably reach their max at \$2 million, and I had to take that one last bid at \$2.15 million."

He was quickly proven right.

"The race Surge Capacity ran in the Matriarch was just breathtaking," said Browning. "She defeated the very best of the best and showed the guts and determination in all of her races that you hope a horse has." Surge Capacity will also be offered at Night of the Stars; like Strong Incentive, she is in foal to Into Mischief.

Clay maintains a broodmare band of 20 to 25 mares, which he keeps at Lane's End and Mill Ridge Farm. "I think they're two of the best farms in Kentucky, and I've been with them since I started and have been very happy," he said. "They're great people to work with and they really take care of the horse, which is important."

Strong Incentive will sell with Mill Ridge, and their general manager Price Bell commended Clay for putting her in the sale.

"Mr. Clay is a fantastic commercial breeder and really a part of our family," he said. "To have the opportunity to bring her to market after what could be a very exciting Breeders' Cup weekend and to share in the buzz of this time of year...I mean, this time of year is all about dreams, right? It's the conclusion of this racing season. It's the new hope of the next breeding and foaling season. And to have a mare like this at this kind of transition point is the stuff we all work for.

"Hats off to John and his team to identify that and take a

chance," Bell continued. "At the time he bought her, she'd been a multiple-Grade-III producer. But it's a big step to go from that to the rarified air of being a multiple-Grade-I producer. Where she is now you have horses like Urban Sea, Leslie's Lady, Toussaud.

"These are horses of generations and producers of generations. There are books written about blue hen mares like her. She's carrying a full to Highly Motivated, and she's done all this and she's just 12. It's an incredibly exciting opportunity for her future."

Clay said he chose the mating to Into Mischief, who is Highly Motivated's sire and Ways and Means's sire Practical Joke's sire, due to the proven success of the nick. "Into Mischief is also a very commercial stallion," he said. "And since I'm in the breeding business to sell, I thought there would be a good opportunity to sell the foal." *Cont.*

Added Browning, "Clearly the cross has worked. It doesn't take a Tesio to figure out that a mare carrying a full-sibling to Highly Motivated and a three-part sibling to Ways and Means is going to be sought-after."

Not that it will be easy for Clay to part with her. "I'm in the commercial breeding business," he said. "And I said, `I think she's worth too much to continue to have in our broodmare band.' So I decided to put her in the sale. I wasn't planning on selling Strong Incentive, but since I've owned her, she has become a multiple grade I producer. And I also know that I have her (2024) filly by Good Magic, and so even if I wasn't going to keep Strong Incentive, I have the filly by Good Magic that would carry on the family for me and my breeding program."

With the early success that he has had, Clay is starting to be recognized for his breeding program, something of which he is justifiably gratified.

"I'm very proud to breed top-class racehorses," he said. "I've had a lot of very respected buyers buy my horses, and I think I've built a reputation over the years for breeding a very good racehorse that can be successful on the racetrack. I think now that when people see a horse of mine that is going through the ring, they know it comes from a very credible breeder. And that's important to me."

Clay said he is hopeful that some of the buyers he outbid last year will be back for another crack at her this fall. Browning said he was confident that she'll attract significant interest.

"It's very rare to have a mare that produces three horses of that quality being offered at public auction," he said. "It's very rare to have a mare that has produced three horses of that quality, period. And to think that she's still young, she's in foal to arguably the best stallion in the United States, it's the real deal."

"One thing that is different here is the bell at the gate," Eddery said. "I wanted to get her used to that, and she did very well."

The sole knock on her is this will be the first time she is being asked to negotiate farther than a mile.

According to Eddery, a good performance may prompt the connections to take a look at the GI Maker's Mark Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf at 1 3/8 miles at Del Mar on Nov. 2.

Also shipping in for the race, HH The Aga Khan's **Candala (Fr)** (Frankel {GB}) will attempt to get back in the winner's circle since last winning the G3 Prix de la Grotte at Longchamp in April. Since then, the homebred ran eighth in the G1 Prix de Diane at Chantilly before finishing runner-up behind Survie (Ire) (Churchill {Ire}) in the 12-furlong G2 Prix de Malleret in Paris in July. In her latest start, she was third, beaten only 2 1/2 lengths, by Friendly Soul (GB) (Kingman {GB}) in the G2 Prix Alec Head at Deauville Aug. 18. Her vanquisher that day went on to take the Prix de L'Opera last weekend. Locally based Florent Geroux gets the call.

Representing team America, Flanagan Racing's **Grayosh** (Yoshida {Jpn}) enters the fray off a narrow victory in the Aug. 17 GII Lake Placid Stakes. The grey is one of two entrants trained by Chad Brown, the other being **Oversubscribed (GB)** (Too Darn Hot), winner of the Wild Applause Stakes at the Big A in June before coming home second to the re-opposing **Pounce** (Lookin At Lucky) in the one-mile GIII Lake George Stakes July 20.

Trainer Cherie DeVaux sends out **She Feels Pretty** (Karakontie {Jpn}), runner up in the Lake Placid following a bang-up third in the 1 3/16-mile GI Belmont Oaks Invitational in July. Working like a fiend since her last start, the Lael Stables runner runs with blinkers for the first time.

"We just feel like she has been waiting on horses," DeVaux's assistant David Carroll said. "We like what we have seen from her in the morning [with blinkers] and, hopefully, it will translate to the afternoon." *Cont.*

Caitlinhergrtness (Omaha Beach), Canada's leading sophomore filly, attempts to build off of her Aug. 23 victory in the first jewel in the Canadian Triple Crown, the 10-furlong King's Plate Stakes. Runner up in the nine-panel Woodbine Oaks over the main track July 20, the WinStar Farm and Siena Farm representative also won her sole prior start on the turf, recorded in a 7 1/2-furlong Woodbine optional claimer July 6.

Saturday's graded action also features Aqueduct's GII Sands Point Stakes, headed by last-out dead-heat winner of the ninefurlong Virginia Oaks Style Points (Oscar Performance). North of the border, Woodbine presents the GIII Ontario Fashion Stakes, a six-furlong main-track test for fillies and mares.

OBSONLINE TO DEBUT WITH OCTOBER SALE

The Ocala Breeders' Sales company (OBS) will launch their new digital platform, OBSOnline, with a new auction for horses who failed to meet their reserve or were withdrawn from the 2024 October Yearling sale due to the threat of Hurricane Milton, the company announced via presser Friday.

Set to begin Oct. 24 and closing Oct. 30, entries for the timed online auction will close Oct. 18 and those who choose to participate will not have to pay any entry fee. There will also be reduced commissions with consignors being given the option of bringing their yearlings to OBS for inspection Monday, Oct. 28.

"We felt providing this opportunity to the horses that were either bought back or scratched from our yearling sale was important," said OBS Director of Sales Tod Wojciechowski. "I think it is obvious that Hurricane Milton impacted the travel of buyers to the sale. By placing these horses in the online sale format, it will give buyers a second chance.

"We are appreciative of the collaborative effort of the consignors, buyers, staff, board members and auction team to be able to react to the pending storm and allow us to conduct the sale a day earlier than originally planned. This was not an easy decision or a simple task to implement, so it was important for everybody to pull together to make it happen."

Entry forms for the auction can be found here or in hard copy at the OBS office.

In addition to the October debut, OBSOnline will also hold timed auctions in December and January, the former being open to all horses while the latter will be limited to 2-year-olds and horses of racing age. The January 2025 online sale will open for bidding during the 2025 OBS Winter Mixed sale live auction, which will run Jan. 28-29, and will close Jan. 30.

Both the OBSOnline December and January sales will be an optional under tack show. Additional information, including deadlines, requirements, and start/closing dates for the respective auctions, is available here.

DESPITE POOR EFFORT IN CHILLINGWORTH, SWEET AZTECA ON TARGET FOR BREEDERS'

On paper, it didn't look like Sweet Azteca (Sharp Azteca) could lose in last Saturday's GIII Chillingworth Stakes at Santa Anita. Instead, the Grade I winner was last in the field of four, losing to One Magic Philly (Good Magic) by 8 3/4 lengths in what was the worst start of her career.

Trainer Michael McCarthy reports that he can find no reason why she ran so poorly and is still aiming for he GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint.

"She is fine," McCarthy said. "There's no issues. All the diagnostics were pretty much unremarkable. I'm just going to draw a line through the race. She got a little irritated and a little agitated down in the saddling enclosure. It was a hot day. But that race was certainly not anything we were expecting."

McCarthy was relieved to see that his filly came out of the race in good order.

"My first concern is for her overall health and you worry that maybe you missed something," he said. "Going into any race you're always dotting your I's and crossing your T's and we did that. A race like that just comes out of left field. She's on schedule right now for the Breeders' Cup. I think she's as good right now as we could ask her to be." Cont.

It was a head-bobbing thriller in the GIII Sycamore Stakes at Keeneland Friday with the improving Highway Robber (Hard Spun) outdueling defending Sycamore winner Bold Act (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}). Highway Robber's nose stopped the clock in 2:26.08, a new course record time for 1 1/2 miles on the Keeneland lawn.

A Jim and Susan Hill runner, Highway Robber eased back during the early stages of the Sycamore and looked comfortable on the rail while in the rear flight of the strung-out 11-horse field. Cathkin Peak (Ire) (Alhebayeb {Ire}), intent on the lead, showed the way up front with :23.16 and :46.51 first fractions. With about 15 lengths separating the field from front to back on

the backstretch, Highway Robber remained patient until Gaffalione asked him to get involved on the final turn. He factored in a matter of strides, weaving through traffic to engage Bold Act, who had also emerged from the fray, and battled down the lane with determination all the way to the photo finish.

"He's a very fun horse to ride," said winning rider Tyler Gaffalione, who captured four races on the card. "He's a tremendously talented horse. He does everything you ask. He's push button, with a tremendous turn of foot. Obviously we had to battle a little bit down the lane, but I never really was worried. He just kind of waited when he got up to [Bold Act].

"My horse was in a nice, even tempo. I was happy with where I was, and that was my main concern at that point."

A \$65,000 RNA at Keeneland September in 2021, Highway Robber went through the OBS Spring ring in 2022, where the Hills picked him up for \$30,000. He broke his maiden on debut at two in a six-furlong maiden special weight on the dirt at Churchill and placed in the nine-furlong KY Downs Preview Dueling Grounds Derby on the Ellis Park grass at three, but it's this year he has really put it together. After opening his 4-year-old season with a one-mile turf win at Churchill in May, he's consistently raised his Beyer Speed Figure with every start, culminating with a 98 Beyer last out in his runner-up finish in the GII Kentucky Turf Cup Stakes. It was his first try at the Sycamore's 12-furlong distance. The chestnut gelding won his first black-type event two back, in the KY Downs Preview Turf Cup Stakes, and now owns both a graded win and a Keeneland course record.

"[Highway Robber] is certainly trying to get better, and he's certainly found his niche in these marathon races," said conditioner Brian Lynch. *Cont.*

Sycamore, cont.

"We really look forward to him as a 5-year-old. He's still only a very lightly raced horse. At Gulfstream, we've got the Pegasus [World Cup] Turf, so hopefully he can continue on that level. We really look forward to him next year as a 5-year-old."

Pedigree Notes:

Darley's venerable Hard Spun, a source of 107 black-type winners among his 14 crops at the races, recorded his 52nd graded winner with Highway Robber's Sycamore victory. Responsible for more than \$156 million in progeny earnings, Hard Spun is one of the last remaining immediate conduits to the legendary sire of sires Danzig. Perhaps surprisingly, Highway Robber is Hard Spun's only stakes winner out of a Lemon Drop Kid mare, who has 105 stakes winners out of his daughters, although Hard Spun has a great many out of Lemon Drop Kid's sire line (Mr. Prospector), including all four of his North American champions. Yabba, the Sycamore winner's dam, is inbred 3x3 to Mr. Prospector.

Bred in Kentucky by Foxpointe Thoroughbreds, who bought Yabba as a \$40,000 Keeneland September yearling in 2015, Highway Robber has three younger half-siblings: the 2-year-old filly Madam Mitole (Mitole), a yearling colt by Yoshida (Jpn), and

an April-foaled filly by Silver State. The 2-year-old, sold for \$50,000 to JPG2 at OBS March, was second at Gulfstream for trainer Gerald Bennett Sept. 21, and the yearling hammered for \$45,000 at Keeneland September to the Hills, who also own Highway Robber. The mare sold for \$30,000 to Blandford Stud in 2022 at Keeneland November and was bred back to Annapolis for next term.

WORLD OF TROUBLE TO BRAZIL

GI Carter Handicap and GI Jaipur Invitational Stakes winner World of Trouble (Kantharos--Meets Expectations, by Valid Expectations) has reportedly been sold to a partnership of three Brazillian farms and will stand at Haras Rio Iguassú, according to the South American publication Turf Diario. The other two farms involved are Haras Cifra and Haras Palmerini.

World of Trouble has stood since 2020 at Hill 'n' Dale Farms near Paris, Ky. and has 46 winners in his first two crops to race. His four black-type horses include Puerto Rican stakes winner Touch of Trouble. The 9-year-old's dam is a half-sister to MGSW and New York sire Bucchero, who, like World of Trouble, is by Kantharos.

GRADE I-PLACED CHEWING GUM TO STAND AT ROCKRIDGE STUD

A winner of the GII Joe Hernandez Stakes, GISP **Chewing Gum** (Candy Ride {Arg}--Shared Heart, by Forestry) will take up residence at Rockridge Stud for the 2025 season and will stand for a partnership including Wachtel and Pantofel Stables, the farm announced via presser Friday.

The five-time winner claimed the aforementioned graded contest at Santa Anita in 2022 but had made an appearance at the highest level the year prior, finishing two-lengths second to Casa Creed (Jimmy Creed) in the GI Jackpocket Jaipur Stakes the summer of 2021. He'd run third in the GII Belmont Turf Sprint Invitational Stakes and the Listed Aqueduct Turf Sprint Championship Stakes that year. His first black-type appearance had been in that Turf Sprint the year prior, where he'd run second.

The only son of Candy Ride (Arg) standing in New York, Chewing Gum is a half-brother to GIII Aristocrat Ladies Marathon Stakes-placed Sinfiltre (Uncle Mo). Their dam Shared Heart was herself stakes-placed and is a half-sister to the dam of GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf runner-up SW & GISP Billy Batts (City Zip). This is the extended female family of GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf victress Hard to Justify (Justify).

"We are planning to purchase mares to support Chewing Gum and help him get started. Chewing Gum is a big, beautiful horse that was able to win sprinting and middle distances on turf and on dirt against top competition. I think that New York breeders will love him," says Adam Wachtel of Wachtel Stable.

His 2025 stud fee will be private, and a limited number of shares will be offered to approved breeders. He will be available for inspection in a few weeks.





DESERT FLOWER DOMINANT IN THE FILLIES' MILE

Taking another step forward from her G2 May Hill Stakes success, Godolphin's **Desert Flower (Ire)** (Night Of Thunder {Ire}--Promising Run, by Hard Spun) emphatically established herself at the head of the pecking order among the stronger-staying juvenile fillies of 2024 in Friday's G1 Fillies' Mile at Newmarket. Having mastered Ballydoyle's **January (Ire)** (Kingman {GB}) by 1 1/2 lengths at Doncaster last month, the Charlie Applebytrained **TDN Rising Star** made it 5 1/2 this time as she opened up with the rising ground to the line bringing out her superior stamina.

Settled behind Aidan O'Brien's other runners **Dreamy (Ire)** (American Pharoah) and **Ballet Slippers (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) by William Buick, the 10-11 favourite looked second choice to come up with the goods moving to two out as Ryan Moore sat pretty on January. Drawing alongside to take control soon after, it was quickly evident that Desert Flower had what it takes and her final-furlong *tour de force* saw to it that she boasts the widest winning margin in this race since it was switched to Newmarket. January paid the price for putting it up to the winner, finishing tired a half-length ahead of Ballet Slippers.

SYNONYMOUS WITH EXCELLENCE, DAYLESFORD RETURNS TO CONSIGNING

"I'm not usually right, but I did say to William beforehand that the way she conducts herself in the mornings, don't be surprised if she gets lost in that dip and that was the way it played out," Appleby said of the impressive winner, who will be up against another Rosegreen obstacle in Lake Victoria (Ire) (Frankel (GB)) back over this course and distance next May. "She's still very raw, but once she hit the rising ground he struggled to pull her up. She was a bit of a handful at Doncaster and challenged herself that day, but I was happy with the way she paraded today and hopefully she'll be a more mature filly in the spring."

"She is scopey, but won't take much to get fit then--she hasn't put a kilo on since midsummer--so I don't see any reason why she can't go straight to the Guineas," he added. "We'll see what she does in the winter, but she's kept pleasing us all the way. She's not an exciting filly in the morning, but it's the way she does stuff and the way she pulls up that gives you encouragement. Could she stretch out to 10 furlongs? Possibly. She's a nice horse to go into winter with and we will be back in the spring."

Aidan O'Brien said of his trio, "I'm delighted and they all ran great races really. They ran as we thought they might and ran nice races. They are three to look forward to next year and they are all Classic-type fillies."

Desert Flower's dam Promising Run captured four group 2 contests, with this track's Rockfel as a juvenile preceding her others in the Al Rashidiya, Cape Verdi and Balanchine. He says, "The staff are excited and very pleased to be going to the sales. We've consigned previously with Castlebridge, but the team is very keen to get up to Tattersalls and show their horses, take them through the ring and see the job through."

Lock continues, "We are going back to that traditional owner-breeder profile of mostly selling the colts, racing the fillies. To a certain extent, we've got to keep the numbers to a sensible level.

"We feel we've got a good draft to take to market and hopefully show the world what Daylesford is producing."

Through Watership Down Stud, Lady Bamford sold a Frankel colt out of the Listed winner Queen Of Love (GB) (Kingman {GB}) to John Ferguson during Book 1. Daylesford will itself be presenting the sole Dubawi yearling in Book 2 (lot 1205), a colt out of another of the operation's Classic winners, the G1 Prix de

Diane victrix Star Of Seville (GB) (Duke Of Marmalade {Ire}). His 97-rated full-brother Lord Of Love (GB) has won twice for Lady Bamford this season.

"We felt that sending just one to Book 1 didn't make much of a splash, so we consigned [the Frankel colt] through Watership Down this year and then we'll go ourselves with the Book 2 horses under our banner," Lock explains.

"We wanted to stand out, going our first year, and we have colts by good stallions that have all got deep pedigrees. They are all attractive horses with good walks and hopefully they tick the boxes."

An easy-moving Dubawi colt with a Classic winner for a mother is certainly a good way to stand out.

"He's a nice horse," Lock says. "And he could have been a Book 1 horse, but again we kind of thought it would bring a lot of attention to the draft with him as the jewel in our crown. He's very strong, and a very good walker."

The draft also includes a colt by Wootton Bassett (GB), who, during Book 1, was responsible for the most expensive yearling colt ever to sell in Europe. Daylesford's son of Wootton Bassett (lot 1216) is out of the Group 3-winning Frankel mare Suphala (Fr), herself a granddaughter of the G1 Coronation Stakes winner Sophisticat from the family of the champion racemare and producer Serena's Song.

The sire power continues with lot 976, a colt by New Bay (GB) from the great Anna Paola (Ger) dynasty which includes the 1,000 Guineas winner Billesdon Brook (GB) and the colt's granddam, G3 Prix d'Aumale winner and Oaks d'Italia runner-up Middle Club (GB).

"The Wootton Bassett is a lovely lad; he goes very well. And the New Bay... I mean it would be hard for me pick out one. I like them all," says Lock, with the utmost loyalty to the youngsters he has overseen through their formative years on the rolling Gloucestershire pastures of Daylesford, where the yearlings have completed a solid prep of in-hand walking.

"It's a beautiful setting," Lock agrees. "They were born here so they're nice and relaxed walking around the farm. It's very calm. They drop their heads and sort of bowl along and head up the hills. There may be red faces on some of the staff by the end of the exercise though!" Cont. p6

Completing the Book 2 quartet is a the sole colt by an unproven sire and he will be the first to sell, as lot 728. By St Mark's Basilica (Fr), he is a half-brother to the Listed winner Mutaraffa (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}) and is one of four youngsters bred at Daylesford by the first-season Coolmore stallion.

Lock says of St Mark's Basilica, "He's such a good-looking horse. Everybody you speak to that's got one loves them, and we'd be the same. We're very happy with all four. Great temperaments, good walking horses and we'll use him again next year. We loved him. He was such a good racehorse, great pace. We went all in on him."

The St Mark's Basilica yearlings were certainly given a good reception during Book 1, where 12 sold for an average price 296,667gns, and he had already provided the sale-topper for the Arqana August Sale in the €1.7 million half-brother to Chicquita (Ire) and Magic Wand (Ire).

Lock says of Lady Bamford's mission as a breeder, "The Classics will always be the aim. Lady Bamford's been very lucky to breed two Oaks winners and a Prix de Diane winner as well. It's quite addictive and a fantastic thrill, and they have been great days out for the whole team. Lady Bamford has everybody there -

vets, farriers, all the staff and their wives and husbands.

"It's what we aspire to. We did buy a few speedier yearlings and speedier mares just to try to open up different distances at different times of the year. Ultimately, though, the best interest of the horse come first. Lady Bamford is a horsewoman and cares about them deeply. So that will always be the main priority here."

He adds, "All of our decisions are made with the horse coming first, even now that we're selling a few that we'd be happy to race. So our matings won't change. We'll still be breeding the horses that we'd like to run ourselves."

Daylesford's latest Classic winner, Soul Sister, returned to the farm earlier this year and is now in foal for the first time to Sea The Stars (Ire).

"It was very exciting to welcome her back," Lock says as he admires the four-year-old mare in her spacious paddock. "And we can't wait until next April."

Colt or filly, whichever Soul Sister ends up producing next spring, her first foal will be exemplary of those Classic aspirations which have served Daylesford Stud well over the years.

NO STOPPING TOPGEAR IN THE CHALLENGE

Coming into Friday's G2 Thoroughbred Industry Employee Awards Challenge Stakes at Newmarket off a confidenceboosting win in ParisLongchamp's G3 Prix du Pin last month, Hisaaki Saito's **Topgear (Fr)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}) put up a command performance to show that seven furlongs is his bag. Tried mainly at a mile since his 2-year-old campaign which saw him capture the G3 Prix Eclipse over six, the Christopher Head trainee is still unexposed at this trip and showed what he is capable of with a 5 1/2-length success from **Royal Scotsman** (Ire) (Gleneagles {Ire}).

Settled in second from the outset by Stephane Pasquier, the 3-1 favourite was set alight two out and surged away for the emphatic score.

"Stephane said he is not blowing a candle and he is a very nice horse. I am pleased to see his progress," Head commented. "He has always been full of speed and we overtried him over the mile. We are now sure he is better at this distance, so we will keep him at that and we will now have a strong discussion about next season's programme. This horse could go anywhere and it is going to be very interesting."

MERRILY EXTENDS BALLYDOYLE STREAK IN THE OH SO SHARP by Tom Frary

Proving yet again that Aidan O'Brien's second string is never to be discounted in pattern races, the 25-1 shot **Merrily** (No Nay Never--Caponata, by Selkirk) swooped to conquer in Friday's G3 Godolphin Lifetime Care Oh So Sharp Stakes at Newmarket. Anchored in rear early by Wayne Lordan, the relative of Sunday's Arc heroine Bluestocking (GB) (Camelot {GB}) was a touch free early in response to the switch in tactics from her latest fifth in the G3 Weld Park Stakes.

Saving her energy for the finale this time, the \$325,000 Keeneland September graduate reeled in the 3-1 favourite and family relative **Cathedral (GB)** (Too Darn Hot {GB}) with 150 yards remaining en route to a half-length success, with **Flight (GB)** (Siyouni {Fr}) 3 1/4 lengths behind in third. Her win now makes it 13 in black-type races for Ballydoyle's juvenile fillies in 2024.

Off the mark over five furlongs at Naas in June and fourth in the Listed Marwell Stakes back over that course and distance the following month, Merrily had moved up to this sevenfurlong trip to finish an unlucky third in Goodwood's G3 Prestige Stakes in August. Ridden positively in the Weld Park, she faded out of contention late prompting this change of tack which saw the kind of leap forward that has come to be expected of this stable's fledgling performers. "She was very unlucky in Goodwood, she had to kind of jump two or three hurdles up the straight there," O'Brien explained. "Wayne rode her the last day and thought it all went wrong then for him too, and he didn't get any cover and she did too much. That's why she was here. She's a fine, big filly and Wayne gave her a lovely ride today. She won very nicely and I think she is a Guineas filly now, looking at her. It will be interesting as she is a big, rangy filly with lots of class and she handles dig in the ground."

At the end of a momentous week, Kia Joorabchian was on hand to witness the effort of Cathedral and said, "That was a big ask on her second start and her first time on turf. We asked her a big question and she has given it an amazing try. She is definitely next year's filly, but we had to give today a go because she was so well at home and we wanted to give her the experience on here, because she could be a Guineas filly. She has done us proud there and she's picked up with the winner and drawn clear of the third. It was a great run."

Pedigree Notes

Merrily is the first black-type performer out of Caponata, who captured the Listed Naas Oaks Trial and Listed Victor McCalmont Memorial Stakes and was placed four times in group company

including when second in the G2 Blandford Stakes. Bought out of the Juddmonte draft at the 2020 Tattersalls December Sale, she has a yearling colt by Charlatan and was bred back to that sire and to Practical Joke this year.

Caponata is a half to the G2 Ridgewood Pearl Stakes winner Brooch (Empire Maker), in turn responsible for the Kentucky Derby and Haskell hero Mandaloun (Into Mischief) and whose dam Daring Diva (GB) (Dansili (GB) is a full-sister to the G1 Matron Stakes heroine Emulous (GB). That mare achieved huge notoriety this term with her aforementioned daughter Bluestocking excelling in the ParisLongchamp showcase having already won the G1 Prix Vermeille there and the G1 Pretty Polly Stakes. Bluestocking's unraced half-sister War And Peace (GB) (Frankel (GB)) is the dam of this year's G3 Ballyogan Stakes runner-up Firebird (GB) (Lope De Vega {Ire}), and more pertinently this race's runner-up Cathedral (GB) (Too Darn Hot {GB}).



SIOUX NATION'S COTO DE CAZA MAKES BLACK-TYPE BREAKTHROUGH IN THE CORNWALLIS by Sean Cronin

Mohammed Sultan's **Coto De Caza (Ire)** (Sioux Nation--Coto {Ire}, by Fast Company {Ire}), last seen finishing third in Ayr's Sept. 24 Listed Harry Rosebery Stakes, stepped forward to claim a career high with a determined effort in Friday's G3 Newmarket Academy Godolphin Beacon Project Cornwallis Stakes.

The Simon and Ed Crisford trainee, who posted clear-cut wins

at Beverley and Goodwood in July, accepted a tow racing second in the smaller stands' side grouping, and third overall, after a slick getaway in this five-furlong dash. Easing to the fore with a quarter-mile remaining, the 13-2 chance came under pressure soon after and was forcefully ridden inside the final furlong to deny **Grande Marques (Ire)** (Starspangledbanner {Aus}), who flashed home on the opposite side of the track, by 3/4-of-alength.

"She did that really well and travelled superbly," reflected Ed Crisford. "She came down the stands' side and it was hard to know if she was in front or not, but she's a talented filly and she did it very gamely in the end.

"At Ayr, she just jumped a bit slow and the race got away from her a little bit. She made her ground from the two-furlong pole to the one and by the time she got to the winning line, she had sort of tired a bit. She's a talented filly and it's just about keeping the lid on her really, as she's highly strung. If we can keep the lid on her, then she can put up performances like that.

"I think she still has some growing to do and she's a quick filly, but we will have to see how she winters and how she comes through that and then make a plan from there. I would say she would be done [for the season] now."

Looking to the future, he added, "You have all those good fivefurlong races you can aim at next year, she's a Group 3 winner now and we can aim high. Whether she ends up in a [G1] King's Stand or something like that, I don't know, but we will just see how she does over the winter."

Coming of age in Friday's G3 Newmarket Pony Academy Pride Stakes, Andrew Rosen and Barry Schwartz's **Lady Boba (GB)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}) relished the slight ease in the ground to register a career-best success. Runner-up in the G3 Lester Piggott Fillies' Stakes and third in the G2 Lancashire Oaks at Haydock on summer going, the Ralph Beckett-trained 4-year-old

had been last in Goodwood's G1 Nassau Stakes in August and fifth behind **Sound Angela (GB)** (Muhaarar {GB}) in the Listed John Musker Fillies' Stakes at Yarmouth last month but found the necessary improvement to make her pattern-race breakthrough in this competitive affair.

Held up halfway down the field early, the 5-1 shot was coaxed to the front by Rossa Ryan 1 1/2 furlongs out and stayed on tenaciously to gain her revenge on Sound Angela by a length.

"We have always thought highly of her and today she got her ground and the perfect trip and Rossa knows her well--he did a great job on her," Andrew Rosen said. "She ran great at Haydock a couple of times and just didn't get her ground at Goodwood and last time also. A little softer going today was perfect for her. She is in the Sceptre Sale in December and this is a nice victory to head there on."

SIYOUNI'S VERSE OF LOVE POWERS TO TON RISING STARDOM AT NEWMARKET

Godolphin contributed to a succession of fireworks at Newmarket's Park Paddocks sales venue during the earlier part of the week and, with action firmly centred on the nearby Rowley Mile racetrack, continued in similar vein as the operation's 2-year-old filly Verse Of Love (GB) (Siyouni {Fr}-Vercelli {GB}, by Shamardal) powered to a 'TDN Rising Star' rosette in Friday's Godolphin Under Starters Orders Maiden Fillies' Stakes. She becomes the 14th Rising Star for her sire, whose roll of honour includes this month's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac runner-up Zarigana (Ire).

The March-foaled homebred found a modicum of cover, racing in an overall seventh, after breaking on the far-side wing. Inching forward from halfway, the well-backed 2-1 favourite loomed large on the bridle passing the quarter-mile marker and powered clear in style once quickening to the fore approaching the final furlong to easily outclass stablemate **Wild Angel (GB)** (Too Darn Hot {GB}) by an impressive five lengths.

"She's a scopey filly, who we have given time, and she has sort of just been on the back burner," explained trainer Charlie Appleby, whose prior winners of this contest include Spring Of Love (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and Dream Of Love (Ire) (Shamardal). "It has only been the last few weeks we've begun to bring her through the ranks and every time she has a done a bit of work she's pleased us, so we stepped her up a groove. We came here confident that she is a filly who should have a nice future. It was handy we had our other filly beside her in stall two and she kept her company. She knew her job, but you often find those good horses do that. It's nice to go into the winter with the experience she has had there and, as William [Buick] said, she deserves to have the winter now. We'll stick her in a [Classic] trial in the spring and see where we are. I don't see any reason why we wouldn't be going down the route of a trial."

Verse Of Love is the first of three foals out of a half-sister to three-time Group 1-winning Australian champion miler Avilius (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), dual Group-winning G1 Prix du Jockey Club and G1 Grand Prix de Paris placegetter Saint Baudolino (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}), dual Group-placed three-time Listed winner Well Of Wisdom (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) and the multiple Group-placed Listed Prix de Suresnes victor Army Bulletin (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). The March-foaled homebred bay's third dam is G3 Prix de Cabourg victrix and G1 Prix Morny and G1 Moyglare Stud Stakes placegetter Tereshkova (Mr. Prospector). Verse Of Love is kin to a yearling filly by Oasis Dream (GB) and a weanling filly by St Mark's Basilica (Fr).

WINTER DREAMING STARTS WITH THE DEWHURST AS THE LION STALKS

On the eve of Saturday's G1 Darley Dewhurst Stakes, we are in familiar territory anticipating a show of force from Ballydoyle's latest golden prospect in what seems to be a permanent autumnal ritual. Newmarket's cherished jewel is still the ultimate juvenile contest in the European calendar and its appeal to the Rosegreen establishment is as potent as ever. Where Dr Vincent O'Brien supplied seven winners, Aidan's haul of eight is set to grow exponentially starting possibly (and probably) with TDN Rising Star The Lion In Winter (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) here.

Unleashed in an important Curragh maiden on Irish Oaks day, the relative of Inchinor (GB) who was second in this to Zafonic in 1992, led home some significant peers in a smart time on fast ground in York's G3 Acomb Stakes when last seen in August and has assumed the mantle of his stable's leading 2-year-old colt ever since. Bred for a Triple Crown, it is no exaggeration to say that he is as exciting a prospect as any of the yard's previous Dewhurst favourites.

O'Brien, who also saddles fellow **TDN Rising Star Rock Of Cashel (Ire)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}) and last Saturday's Curragh maiden winner **Expanded (Ire)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}), is on his customary scouting mission with The Lion In Winter. "Everything seems good and he's had his two runs now--everyone knows about him," he said. "No doubt it is important he comes here, if he is a Guineas horse it is very important to have experience of the track and you know they are going to handle it, so if there is any ironing out you have to do, you have to do it." **Cont. p14**

"We feel Rock Of Cashel is better than we have seen and we feel he is a little bit like his sister Snowfall--we could only win a maiden with her at two, but we always thought she was good," he added. "We think he's a bit like that and there is plenty there we haven't seen yet. Whether that comes in the Dewhurst or whether we have to wait until next year we will find out."

Despite the admirable qualities of the G2 Superlative Stakes runner-up and G1 Vincent O'Brien National Stakes third **Seagulls Eleven (Ire)** (Galileo Gold {GB}), this is a renewal exclusively for the world's elite operations. Like his owners, the Hugo Palmer trainee presents as a talented and plucky upstart much in the guise of their football club Brighton & Hove Albion, but this is akin to entering the Etihad or the Santiago Bernabeu so good luck to them.

"We couldn't be happier with him going into the race and they say dogs are like their owners, but horses are like their owners," Palmer said. "He is owned by 11 Brighton footballers and he's Brighton taking on Liverpool, Manchester City and Arsenal. He's a lovely horse, we think the world of him, he's proved he's capable of mixing it at this level and he's a big horse who's still improving."

The truth is that this Dewhurst brings into sharp focus how condensed the selection of the best thoroughbreds has become, just as Friday's Fillies' Mile did, bringing back the old days of match races with Godolphin the only realistic alternative to another Coolmore triumph. **Shadow Of Light (GB)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}) beat Ballydoyle's Whistlejacket (Ire) (No Nay Never) all ends up in the Middle Park, but he has a lot more on his plate with an extra furlong to deal with and a stronger rival in The Lion In Winter.

His supplementary may tell us something about connections' view of their unbeaten Superlative winner **Ancient Truth (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), but we will find out very soon.

"I'm delighted with the pair of them coming into it," Appleby said. "Shadow Of Light has everything to gain and nothing to lose. If he goes and wins, then fantastic, he adds an extra dimension to his 3-year-old career and do we look at a Guineas route. If he gets beat, like Blue Point did, then we just cement he's a sprinter and you can tailor your training programme in the spring. It's a win-win situation, really."

"Ancient Truth is three-from-three coming into it and we haven't seen him since the Superlative. We were toying with the idea of running in the National Stakes in Ireland, but I felt he was a horse who would be better given more time and I didn't want to have two cracks at group 1s and this one, the Dewhurst, is an important group 1 for us. He looks great, he's strengthened and has done everything we have asked for."

Saturday's other 2-year-old pattern races are Newmarket's 10-furlong G3 Palace Pier Zetland Stakes, where Ryan Moore has picked the Curragh maiden winner **Shackleton (Ire)** (Camelot {GB}) of the Ballydoyle pair, and the G3 Emirates Autumn Stakes over a mile with the stable's **TDN Rising Star** and G2 Champions Juvenile Stakes runner-up **Delacroix (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) looking to provide more poignancy to the recent loss of his dam Tepin (Bernstein). Chantilly's six-furlong G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte sees Gousserie Racing and Sandrine Gavrois's G1 Cheveley Park Stakes runner-up **Daylight (Fr)** (Earthlight {Ire}) take on Tony Bloom and Ian McAleavy's G3 Firth Of Clyde Stakes winner **Sky Majesty (Ire)** (Blue Point {Ire}).

AUTUMN PLAYGROUND FOR EUROS

In this series, the TDN takes a look at notable successes of European-based sires in North America. This week's column is highlighted by the victory of La Mehana in the GIII Waya Stakes in New York.

Al Wukair Mare Takes Waya

LSU Stables' La Mehana (Fr) (Al Wukair {Ire}) broke her American duck in the GIII Waya Stakes during the Belmont at the Big A meeting last week (video). Trained by Christophe Clement, the bay was third in both the GIII Orchid Stakes and GIII Sheepshead Bay Stakes earlier this year.

Bred by Haras du Mezeray, La Mehana was a €55,000 buy-back out of the Argana September

Sale and she placed at two for Henri-Alex Pantall in the colours of the Moussac Family in 2021. She would go on to take the Listed Prix Michel Houyvet in 2023 for Jean-Claude Rouget and Selina Fernandez-Shaw Alvarez & Noir and Or Elevage. Kept in training at four, she added the Listed Prix Pawneese, Listed Prix des Tourelles and placed third in the G1 Prix de Royallieu last autumn before heading back through the Deauville ring and selling for €400,000 to Clement.

Her dam, Oceanie (Fr) (Dansili {GB}), has also foaled German Group 3 winner Ocean Fantasy (Fr) to the cover of Make Believe (GB). Oceanie, herself, is a half-sister to multiple Group 2 winner and sire Watar (Ire) (Marju {Ire}).

Haras de Bouquetot's Al Wukair has sired three starters and three winners in the U.S. La Mehana is the best of them.

'Charm'ing Win For Minoushka

Ecurie des Charmes runner Minoushka (GB)

(Starspangledbanner {Aus}) cruised to a Keeneland allowance win on Oct. 10 (video). Previously trained by Carlos and Yann Lerner, she changed hands for €170,000 as an Arqana October yearling when selected by Meridian International.

Bred by Le Thenney - Pearl Champs Elysses, the daughter of Mouille Point (GB) (Motivator {GB}) placed in both the Listed Prix Volterra and G3 Prix de la Grotte this year before moving to the U.S. This is the family of German Group 3 winner Turning Light (Ger) (Fantastic Light) and her son, stakes-winning son

Surrey Star (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), who was placed three times at group level. G1 German Oaks third Noble Heidi (Fr) (Intello {Ger}) is also under the second dam.

Coolmore's Starspangledbanner is responsible for 14 winners from 27 runners (52%) in America. His seven stakes winners in that jurisdiction are anchored by Grade I winners Rhea Moon (Ire) and young stallion State Of Rest (Ire).

Brisbane (Fr) (Zelzal {Fr}) closed to take a Belmont at the Big A race for Chad Brown, Madaket Stables, Michael Dubb and Michael Kisber (video). The Haras d'Haspel-bred bay was purchased for €170,000 out of the Arqana October Yearling Sale by David Redvers and Meridian International.

Already a half-sister to the stakes winner Be Beautiful (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}), Brisbane is out of Be Released (Ire) (Three Valleys), while her dam is a half-sister to three-time Group 1 winner Gordon Lord Byron (Ire) (Byron {GB}). She made four starts for Francois Rohaut and owner Laurent Dassault, winning two of them, including her April 2023 French finale. Cont. p16

James and Donna Daniell's Half Dome (Ire) (Zoffany (Ire)) made his third start a winning one at Keeneland on Thursday (video). He made his first two starts at Ellis Park.

The Michael McCarthy trainee was bred by Rockhart Trading, Ltd. and sold to West Bloodstock for €110,000 at the Goffs Orby Sale in 2022. The second foal for Tissiak (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), the bay is from the extended family of G3 Prix de Flore winner In Clover (GB) (Inchinor {GB}), the dam of no less than seven stakes winners, among them a quartet of Group 1 winners including Friendly Soul (GB) (Kingman (GB)), who won the G1 Prix de l'Opera on Sunday.

The late Zoffany has sired 30 winners in North America from 59 runners (50%). His quintet of stakes winners contain four graded winners with GII Hollywood Turf Cup winner Oscar Dominguez (Ire) the best of the lot so far.

No Nay Never Filly Prevails In Delaware

Brindi (Ire) (No Nay Never) graduated at Delaware Park for trainer Christophe Clement on Oct. 9 (video). A colourbearer for Bridlewood Farm, eFive Racing Thoroubhreds, Madaket Stables and Michael Dubb, the daughter of Salamah (Ire) (Shamardal)

was making her third start.

A product of the Framont, Ltd. breeding programme, the second foal of her dam was an €180,000 Argana August yearling. Granddam Spirit Of Dubai (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) also foaled Salamah's full-brother Emaraaty Ana (GB) (Shamardal), who won the G1 Sprint Cup and was second in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, G1 Nunthorpe Stakes and another edition of the Sprint Cup Stakes.

Coolmore Stud's No Nay Never is credited with 54 winners from 97 runners (55%) in the U.S. His trio of graded winners include GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf heroine Meditate (Ire) and multiple group winner Nay Lady Nay (Ire), who was also third in the GI Flower Bowl Stakes.

Repeat Winners:





CLASSIC WINNERS BATTLE IN SHUKA SHO

As autumn tightens its grip on racing nations in the Northern Hemisphere, one of the year's final Classics takes place, Kyoto's G1 Shuka Sho (Japanese Fillies' St Leger) over 2000 metres. Handed ante-post favouritism is Sunday Racing's G1 Yushun Himba heroine **Cervinia (Jpn)** (Harbinger {GB}).

The 2023 G3 Artemis Stakes heroine finished well back in the G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas) field to rival **Stellenbosch** (Jpn) (Epiphaneia {Jpn}) in April, and the last time she was seen on a racecourse was in the May 19 Oaks, defeating that aforementioned rival by a half-length with the duo closing from out of the clouds. The Katsumi Yoshida colourbearer will break from stall five in the 15-horse field.

Said Sunday's pilot Christophe Lemaire, "The Kyoto inner 2000 meters is a tricky course. But, she's able to get a good position easily. I don't think the right-handed track will be a factor. She's capable of handling anything. The most important thing is that she is relaxed. She was a bit on edge in the Oka Sho and that caused her to tire in the end."

Booked in stall 14, the consistent Stellenbosch has been first or second in all six of her starts to date. Second in the G1 Hanshin Juvenile Fillies at two, she claimed the Oka Sho in April before her Oaks defeat. However, that is also the last time Stellenbosch has raced, and this field is full of late bloomers who have already graced the racecourse in the past couple of months. Cont. p23

Trainer Sakae Kunieda said, "I've had her train at Ritto again, because we got good results before. And, we avoid having to ship right before the race and she can go to the gate in a much calmer frame of mind. Her weight is up and she has matured mentally. I'll leave the rest up to [Keita] Tosaki."

Another Oaks runner, the fourth-place finisher Queen's Walk (Jpn) (Kizuna {Jpn}) is a half-sister to Group 1 winner Grenadier Guards (Jpn) (Frankel (GB)) and has already been seen in action this autumn when winning the G2 Rose Stakes at Chukyo over this trip on Sept. 15.

Yuga Kawada has the call on the Sunday Racing runner, and said, "She was in great shape for the Rose Stakes. She ran well and it was an excellent prep. Her overall balance is better. She's the kind of horse you get on, canter, and then the moment she picks up the speed, you know how good she is."

Bond Girl (Jpn) (Daiwa Major {Jpn}) has yet to race in a fillies' Classic, and ran second in the G3 Saudi Arabia Royal Cup as a juvenile. Second again, this time in the Apr. 6 G2 New Zealand Trophy, she filled that position again two starts later in the 1800-metre G3 Hokkaido Shimbun Hai Queen Stakes on July 28. Warming up for this test, she ran third to Christmas Parade (Jpn) (Kitasan Black {Jpn}) and G3 Flower Cup victress Mi Anhelo (Jpn) (Duramente {Jpn}) in the G2 Shion Stakes going 2000 metres for the first time at Nakayama on Sept. 7.

Said trainer Takahisa Tezuka, "In her last race, the Shion Stakes, we did the same as the race before, and kept her best for the last. She tied for the fastest time over the final three furlongs and really gained ground, but she was just a bit too late. I think the track will be fast so it'll come down to how the race unfolds. She will definitely have good late speed and I do think she measures up to the contenders."
