



FUTURE IS NOW SETS NEW STAKES RECORD IN KEENELAND'S FRANKLIN



Future Is Now winning Sunday's Franklin Stakes | Coady Media

Sunday's GII Franklin Stakes was a tale of two trips. On one hand, Larry Johnson's Future Is Now (Great Notion), exiting post 5, benefitted from a rail-hugging trip that blossomed into a welltimed opening that propelled her to the front in early stretch and on to victory. On the other end, Godolphin's Star Of Mystery (GB) (Kodiac {GB}) didn't appear a touch sluggish while leaving post 1 and gradually got shuffled to the back of the 12horse field, necessitating a giant run if there was any hope to even get a piece of it. When all was said and done at the end of the 5 1/2-furlong test, it was Future Is Now on top by 3/4 of a length. However, the epic run of the crowd's more fancied runner up begs notice in three week's time. Away in good order despite a power outage that caused a 50-minute delay, Future Is Now, sent off at 6-1, quickly rushed to the fore but was allowed to settle back in a ground-saving third as Stone Silent (Adios Charlie) and Pipsy (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}) showed the way through a :21.17 quarter. Meanwhile, in a blink of an eye, the 4-5 choice Star Of Mystery was several lengths back in last, seemingly armed with some energy but with nowhere to go. Straitening for home, Future Is No moved into second, gradually wearing down the pacesetter, however, the favorite still had a half dozen rivals to overcome and several lengths to make up. Cont. p3

The Week in Review


With major Breeders' Cup prep races all in the books, this past weekend's stakes action focused on state-bred and -sired programs in West Virginia, Maryland and Louisiana. It wasn't difficult to find three standout horses who turned in headline-worthy efforts for smaller-scale outfits whose perseverance and accomplishments routinely fly beneath the radar. Leading the charge at Charles Town was breeder/owner/trainer Cyndy McKee's Beau Ridge Farm, which won four of Saturday's night's 10 Breeders' Classic stakes for West Virginia-breds, and ran second and third with two other entrants.

"It felt like I was in a dream," McKee told TDN Sunday afternoon. **Cont. p7**



Knifing her way through the pack like a Ginsu, the GIII Quick Call Stakes winner appeared on the scene in the dying strides,

and despite the favorite's gallant effort, the Godolphin homebred found herself 3/4 of a length shy of the winner at the wire. It was another half length back to Pandora's Gift in third. The filly completed the 5 1/2 trip in 1:01.47, surpassing the stakes record mark of 1:01 3/5 established by Chris's Thunder in 2000.

"The filly was so great today," said winning rider Paco Lopez.
"She was very comfortable during the race. She was perfect. After a little breather, I asked her and she passed between the horses, no

problem at all, and she gave me a big kick."

Of the beaten favorite, Flavien Prat explained, "She broke well, but I just wasn't fast enough. We got covered up. I found myself a bit too far [back] and had to make up that ground.

"When you come from behind, you have some [traffic]. I never ever stopped riding. I mean she had a run all the way down the

lane, but I had to pick a spot after spot."

Irish-bred Pandora's Gift was making only her second U.S. start, having finished a close-up second last time in the GII Preque Isle Masters at Presque Isle Downs Sept. 20.

"She was pretty good," said Adam Beschizza aboard the third-place finisher. "I think she's got her speed pretty dialed after that good run at Presque Isle Downs,"

A winner in her second start of 2024 in a Gulfstream fivepanel sprint in February, the

Mike Tombetta-trained filly was runner-up in the Captiva Island Stakes the following month before checking home fifth in the 5 1/2-panel King Leatherbury Stakes at Laurel Apr. 20. **Cont. p4**

Taking her next two in Pimlico's May 17 The Very One Stakes followed by the GII Intercontinental Stakes at the Spa June 7, the Maryland bred was third upstate behind Dontlookbackatall (Peace and Justice) in the GIII Caress Stakes July 25. In her latest start, she came home a 1/2 length winner over Star Guest (GB) and favored Roses for Debra in Saratoga's Smart N Fancy Stakes Aug. 23.

Future Is Now's Franklin victory becomes the eighth graded stakes score for Northview Stallion Station's Maryland-based sire Great Notion. Dam Past as Prelude is also responsible for SW Call Another Play (Audible) and MSP Continentalcongress (Constitution). The half-sister to Grade III winner Street Magician (Street Cry {Ire}) also has an unraced juvenile colt by McKinzie and a weanling filly by Audible. She was bred back to Charlatan.

The win gave four-time Eclipse Award-winning trainer Chad Brown--who also saddled runner-up Redistricting--a sweep of the weekend's graded events at the Big A after capturing the GII Sands Point Stakes with Spaliday Saturday.

Andthewinneris settled in last as Siege of Boston (War Front) took charge past the wire for the first time as Fort Washington (War Front) held a close-up second through a :23.56 opening quarter-mile. Siege of Boston maintained the advantage down the backstretch through a :47.78 half as favored Redistricting hugged the rail with Reckoning Force fourth to his outside.

Fort Washington was given his cue after three quarters in 1:11.20, but spun his wheels as Reckoning Force flanked by Andthewinneris made some headway.

"The instructions were to get forward position because the main speed [Irish Prophet] scratched here," said winning rider Dylan Davis. "I came out the best I could with the distance given-you don't want to be too crazy--but everyone else was more intent and broke better than me, so I found myself last. I got first run, actually. I was able to get out when I needed to at the 2 1/2--three-eighths pole and that's really what he wanted."

As the top two tired, the duo left the oncoming Redistricting with nowhere to run entering the stretch, forcing the favorite's pilot, Manny Franco, to angle his charge around the leaders.

Meanwhile, Andthewinneris closed furiously down the center of the course, but shied from a left-handed crop and left a gap open for Redistricting to find his best stride in the final sixteenth. Andthewinneris, however, had already gotten the jump on his stablemate and proved best by a neck at the wire.

"Down the lane, he was really excelling," said Davis. "He ran very nicely and kept going. He ran a great race today. He did [drift away from the crop]. I started off right-handed on him and then I pulled the left when I got close to the competition, and he drifted away from it. He shied but I kept left-handed because was running from it--he was shying from it--but he was running from it, and it was enough for me to get past the leaders. I didn't want to have to switch back to the right and straighten him up. I think that really helped him a lot."

Of his two runners, Brown opined, "It was nice to run one-two, but it was very frustrating for Redistricting. I feel bad for his connections because that horse looked like he was probably best, but I'm very proud of Andthewinneris, who continues to improve for us."

Of the runner-up, Franco explained, "He was just a little bit unlucky there. I was riding the rail the whole way, but it never opened up. When I tipped out, I had two horses outside of me, so I had to wait. He ran a good race."

Redistricting, a winner in an 8 1/2-furlong allowance test at the Big A last October, capped off 2023 with an anti-climatic effort when pulled up during the GI Hollywood Derby at Del Mar in December.

"I'm relieved Redistricting has come back well," said Brown.
"We'll see how he comes out of the race after a bizarre bolting and pulling up episode in the Hollywood Derby at Del Mar. I still don't understand what that was about. He's never showed any signs of that before or after.

We gave him plenty of time off to get over it--mostly mentally. He had a couple minor things we found with a thorough evaluation we did on him post-race, but we gave him all the time in the world and Mr. Klarman [owner] is just so good with that with giving his horses time.

"He's been ready to run for a couple of months now and we were struggling to find the right race for him. He was more than ready to run, and my team did a good job off the layoff. He's an exciting horse going forward-but I don't know what I'm going to do with him yet."

Andthewinneris last visited the winner's circle when taking the Texas Turf Mile in January at Sam Houston while under the tutelage of Wayne Catalano, who was also at the helm when the gelding won last year's GII Bourbon Stakes at Keeneland.

The gelding was transferred to Brown this spring and earned his first win in his fourth start since the move. Sixth in a ninefurlong optional claimer at the

Spa July 20, the bay was a distant third in the restricted John's Call Stakes at 1 5/8-miles in August. Most recently, he was a nose back in second in a Saratoga optional claimer Sept. 20.

"[Andthewinneris] was a victim of a really bad trip in Saratoga and then got caught in a paceless race last time, so it was his turn to have the run of the race and have good luck," said Brown. "These two-turn turf races can be tricky, and he showed up today. I'm very proud of him."

One of five graded stakes winners for Oscar Performance, Andthewinners is the third foal out of Run Like the Boss. The 11year-old mare is out of Seekitana (Unbridled's Song), a half-sister to GSW Grand Hombre (Grand Slam) and a daughter to Chilean champion Santona (Chi) (Winning).

The grey mare most recently produced a colt by Raging Bull (Fr) last term followed by a colt by Medaglia d'Oro this season. She was bred back to Cody's Wish.

Catch the Humor (Girvin) won the \$75,000 Russell Road S. by $10 \frac{1}{2}$ lengths. It was the 3-year-old gelding's third career start.

Direct the Cat (Redirect) tallied by 9 1/4 lengths in the \$75,000 West Virginia Lottery S., giving the 3-year-old filly seven victories in her last eight starts by a combined 68 lengths.

Overnight Pow Wow (Fiber Sonde), the only filly to have beaten Direct the Cat in the last 14 months, prevailed as the 7-10 favorite in the \$125,000 Cavada S. as the lone 3-year-old against a field of older distaffers.

The 6-year-old gelding No Change (Fiber Sonde) captured the \$75,000 Onion Juice S. at 4-1 odds.

"The one I was really shocked by was Humor," McKee said of her 7-1 winner. "He had just broken his maiden in a field that looked like it was light. I figured, 'He's ready for it; if I get in I get in, and if I don't I don't.' I knew he wanted to run farther. We got in, and—that was it."

Direct the Cat, who won at 1-10 odds, remains the "big horse" in McKee's barn, however.

After Overnight Pow Wow stopped her stablemate's win streak back on July 27 in the \$75,000 Sylvia Bishop Memorial S. for state-bred 3-year-old fillies, McKee told TDN that Direct the Cat had been suffering from what was initially believed to be a superficial cut that happened when she won a July 4 seven-furlong, second-level open allowance at Charles Town by $15 \frac{1}{4}$ lengths.


"She got what everyone at first thought was a minor cut on her hind leg," McKee said on Sunday. "Another horse ran up on her and cut her."

But the laceration turned out to be trickier to treat than it looked like it would be.

"It ended up being about \$8,000 [in veterinary bills] getting her healed up," McKee said.

That meant missed training for most of August before Direct the Cat "got back on her game," McKee said.

"I would have loved to have had her in the [Aug. 23 GII Charles Town] Oaks with Pow Wow [who ran fourth at 44-1 odds]," McKee said. "But Direct the Cat missed all that with this 'minor' cut."

Direct the Cat earned an 83 Beyer Speed Figure on Saturday; Overnight Pow Wow a 77. McKee said she is contemplating shipping out of town for better money against open company.

"I don't know if I can find somewhere off the beaten track to try and get a shot at graded stakes placings for both these fillies," McKee said. "I'll start looking [Monday]."

Earlier this year, McKee told TDN that operating Beau Ridge has been challenging since her husband, John, died at age 83 in 2023. The 170-acre spread, just five miles from Charles Town, is

home to 80 horses spread across four stables, plus a foaling barn, a show ring, and a three-eighths-mile training track. Both Redirect and Fiber Sonde stand there for \$1,000 stud fees, as do three other stallions.

John had been a major force in establishing and being president of the West Virginia
Thoroughbred Breeders
Association, so the wins on
Saturday were particularly special for Cyndy.

"It's great not only for the farm and the stallions, but also for the

morale of the help-and the morale of me for continuing on without John," McKee said. "That makes it all worthwhile.

"I told my crew [Saturday] night, 'Guys, y'all better love this moment, because I'm not sure we can ever do it again," McKee said. "It's a once-in-a-lifetime experience—you better enjoy it." Homebreds Sweep Maryland...

A few hours earlier and 75 miles east of Charles Town, homebreds swept all eight of the stakes on the Jim McKay Maryland Million program at Laurel Park.

Brilliant Ice, a 5-year-old gelding owned and bred by Crystal Park Stables, uncorked a 5 1/4-length victory in the featured \$150,000 Classic S. He earned a 94 Beyer, a career best in what was his first win beyond a mile.

"He is the great-grandson of the first horse that we ever owned," said Phil Bartz, a principal of Crystal Park Stables, which was enjoying its first stakes win after several decades in the racing and breeding business. Stretching to nine furlongs was a little bit of a question, but, Bartz said, "His grandmother, who we owned, won at a mile and eighth here. And the way he was finishing at a mile, we thought he could do it. I didn't think he would be this dominant, but it was awesome."

Brilliant Ice was the first Maryland Million winner in 15 tries for trainer Annette Eubanks, who watched the race at home while recovering from a knee replacement. Earlier on the card she ran second in the \$100,000 Sprint with even-money favorite Band Camp (Bandbox), a homebred gelding she owns in

partnership with her son, Dan, of Rising Sun Racing Stables.

"It's very emotional because mom is not doing very good today. It's the biggest day of her career and she couldn't be here for it," Dan Eubanks said.
"[Brilliant Ice] ran huge. It's like a homebred for us and for them. We just missed with Band Camp, and it's just an awesome day. Mom's 80 years old and having her best year ever. This is amazing. These horses can break your heart, and sometimes they can make it."

Bartz said of Eubanks: "She's been our trainer for over 30 years. We met her when she claimed Ice's great-grandmother away from us," he added with a laugh.

"She's just phenomenal, She really cares about the animals, and that's why we stayed with her for so long.

"It just means everything," Bartz summed up. Let Freedom Ring...

Free Like a Girl (El Deal), a \$5,500 auction buy in Louisiana as a yearling, edged closer to the \$2-million earnings mark Friday night with career victory number 19 at 1-10 odds in the \$100,000 Magnolia S. at Delta Downs for Louisiana-bred distaffers.

Those purse winnings represent about 363 times the value of her modest sales price.

With \$1,979,978 in purses, the 5-year-old is the highest Louisiana-bred earner of all time. She was bred by sisters Kim Renee Stover and Lisa Osborne.

Free Like a Girl's multi-track tour over the spring and summer included Grade 1 placings in the Apple Blossom H. in April at Oaklawn Park (third) and in the La Troienne S. in May at Churchill Downs (second). She also won the \$500,000 Pink Ribbon S. at Charles Town in August.

BROWN'S BREEDERS' CUP-BOUND WORKERS LED BY SIERRA LEONE



Sierra Leone working at Saratoga in August | Sarah Andrew

Trainer Chad Brown sent out a quartet of Breeders' Cup aspirants to work over Belmont Park's dirt training track, led by GI Toyota Bluegrass Stakes winner **Sierra Leone** (Gun Runner), who covered a half-mile in :48.67. Runner up in the GI Kentucky Derby and third in the GI Belmont earlier this spring, the \$2.3 million yearling purchase races for Mrs. John Magnier, Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith, Westerberg, Rocket Ship Racing and Brant.

"He looks super, and the horse is really training well," Brown said of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic contender. "He's continuing to improve in his works and he's very professional," Brown said. "I'm very happy with him."

Most recently, Sierra Leone finished runner-up in the GII Jim Dandy Stakes in July before coming home third in the GI DraftKings Travers at Saratoga Aug. 24. Also working for Brown, GI Dirt Mile contender in Klaravich Stables' **Domestic Product** (Practical Joke), who was last seen capturing the seven-furlong GI H. Allen Jerkens Memorial in August at the Spa. The dark bay worked a half-mile in :48.50.

"He's been doing great and is going into the Breeders' Cup the right way," Brown said.

Like his Brown-trained sire, Domestic Product's campaign includes wins in the GIII Dwyer and the Jerkens.

Klaravich will also be represented at Del Mar by **Ways and Means** (Practical Joke), who is targeting the GI Filly and Mare
Sprint. The bay filly won the GI Test Stakes in August at the Spa
and was a last-out winner of the GII Gallant Bloom on Sept. 29
at the Big A. Ways and Means posted her first work back from
the Gallant Bloom with a half-mile in :48.70.

"[It was] a little maintenance work. She's not a real flashy work horse when you work her by herself," Brown said. "It was her first work back and she looks good. I'll do something a little more serious next week."

Rounding out the set of Breeders' Cup workers was Madaket Stables, Michael Dubb, William Strauss and Michael Caruso's dual graded stakes-winner **Zulu Kingdom (Ire)** (Ten Sovereigns {Ire}), who had his first work back since winning the GII Pilgrim Stakes on Sept. 28 at the Big A. The bay worked a half-mile in :49.50 in company with Pilgrim third-place finisher Early Adopter.

"He's doing great, and I've been really impressed with his development," Brown said. "He's only two and is well-traveled. He's impressive, that horse."

Zulu Kingdom, whose perfect three-for-three record includes a debut win in France for trainer Andre Fabre and a successful American debut in the GIII With Anticipation Stakes in August at the Spa, earned a berth into the GI Juvenile Turf for his Pilgrim victory as part of the "Win and You're In" Challenge Series.

Brown also noted that Klaravich's **Idea Generation (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who earned a berth into the GI Filly and Mare Turf with a win in the GII Flower Bowl Stakes in August at the Spa, will not be making a trip to the Breeders' Cup this year. The daughter of Dubawi was last seen finishing last-of-six in the GIII Waya Stakes at the Big A Oct. 4.

DEVAUX RULES OUT BREEDERS' CUP FOR **QEII WINNER SHE FEELS PRETTY**

Trainer Cherie DeVaux achieved Saturday what many trainers work a lifetime to attain when taking Keeneland's GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup with Lael Stables' She Feels Pretty (Karakontie {Jpn}). After having a day to digest the watershed moment, she summed up the experience succinctly.

"Awesome ... amazing."

According to DeVaux, a couple of changes factored in the filly's second Grade I win and DeVaux's first at the Lexington oval.

"We expected her to run a good race," DeVaux said. "She was training well... she always trains well. She has a couple quirks, but adding the blinkers and [jockey] Johnny V [Velazquez] keeping her covered up made the difference."

DeVaux ruled out a possible Breeders' Cup run in three weeks but indicated the 2024 campaign for She Feels Pretty might not be done.

"[The QE II] was the goal for the year, even at the start of the year," DeVaux said. "The Breeders' Cup would be too close, but maybe a race like the [\$300,000] [GI] American Oaks."

The American Oaks, run at a mile and a quarter, is scheduled for Dec. 26 at Santa Anita.

Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's Soprano (Ire) (Starspangledbanner (Aus) is scheduled to return to England on Tuesday, according to Charles Eddery, who has overseen the filly's preparations at Keeneland for trainer George Boughey.

"She just bumped into a good one [Saturday]," Eddery said of the runner-up. "George was able to watch the race and was delighted with the way she ran for her first time in North America."

Soprano might return to the U.S. for the GI Maker's Mark Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf at Del Mar on Nov. 2.

"There will be a discussion later [Sunday] with George and Harry [Herbert of Highclere], and it might be on the card to go [to the Breeders' Cup]," Eddery said. "She normally runs every three weeks and takes to racing well."

Plans remain undetermined for third-place finisher Caitlinhergrtness (Omaha Beach).

"We were very proud of her effort," trainer Kevin Attard said of the filly, who is owned by Siena Farm and WinStar Farm. "I'm going to have a discussion with Elliott [Walden of WinStar] and decide on that."

Gufo will stand the upcoming breeding season for \$5,000 S&N. Incentives will be available for qualified mares.

Gufo, who stood his first season at stud this year, will welcome first foals in 2025. He is owned by Dr. John Little, who co-bred the multi-millionaire in partnership with longtime friend Dr. Stephen Cainelli. The latter campaigned Gufo under the nom de course of Otter Bend Stables.

"We're excited to add Gufo to our roster for the upcoming breeding season," said Stuart Fitzgibbon, stallion director at Darby Dan Farm. "Gufo was a top-class racehorse with a physical that commands attention. His powerful physique is matched by his incredible talent and durability that he demonstrated over four seasons on the racetrack."

Gufo won or placed in 12 graded stakes, including back-to-back renewals of the \$750,000 GI Sword Dancer Stakes in 2021 and '22, and the GI Belmont Derby Invitational Stakes in 2020. Gufo also set a new nine-furlong course record at Delaware Park in 2020, winning his graded stakes debut in the Kent Stakes, covering the distance in 1:46.94.

Gufo finished in the top three in 18-of-21 lifetime starts and retired with earnings of \$2,176,530.

Trained by Christophe Clement, Gufo raced from ages two to five. The chestnut broke his maiden at two in just his second start, winning a maiden special weight at Gulfstream Park.

In addition to his Grade I success, Gufo also finished third in the GI Hollywood Derby at three; was second in the GI Man O' War Stakes and third in both the GI Manhattan Stakes and the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Stakes. He was runner-up again in the Man o' War at five, as well as third in the Manhattan.

Gufo, whose name originates from Northern Italy where the sighting of a Gufo bird (owl) traditionally brings good luck, is the leading earner for his multiple Group I-winning sire Declaration of War (War Front). Champion Older Male in England and Champion Older Male twice in Ireland, Declaration of War is the sire of three champions and seven Grade I/Group 1 winners.

Gufo, who is from Declaration of War's second crop, is produced from the Petionville mare Floy, making him a half-brother to MGSW and millionaire Hogy. In a career that spanned nine seasons, Hogy banked more than \$1.3 million and set a 5 1/2-furlong track record of 1:01.56 on the turf at Fair Grounds.

IRAD ORTIZ JR. POSTS 4,000TH CAREER WIN

Irad Ortiz, Jr., a five-time Eclipse Award winner for Outstanding Jockey, captured his 4,000th career win aboard Good Temper in Sunday's first race at Keeneland.

Trained by Will Walden for owner Mark Stanley, Good Temper showed the way in the 1 1/16-mile dirt route for juvenile fillies, drawing off to win by 1 3/4-lengths as the odds-on favorite.

"I just have to thank God first. I started in New York in 2011, and they opened their home for me, supported me big time every day," said Ortiz, Jr. to Keeneland publicity. "I feel like they respect me as one of them, so I have to thank all the trainers and owners who gave me the opportunities. Without them nobody would probably know me right now."

Ortiz, Jr., represented by agent Steve Rushing, reached the milestone just three years after notching his 3,000th winner with Saratoga Kisses on Oct. 7, 2021, at Belmont.

According to records provided by Equibase, the 4,000 victories include 95 wins from the 32-year-old rider's homeland of Puerto Rico.

Ortiz, Jr. has enjoyed success on the NYRA circuit, winning the year-end title on three occasions [2014, 2015 and 2017]. His individual NYRA meet success includes winning the Angel Cordero, Jr. Riding Title as top Saratoga jockey six times [2015, 2018, 2020, 2022, 2023, 2024]; as well as leading at the Belmont spring/summer meet [2014, 2018, 2020, 2022]; the Belmont fall meet [2014-2018, 2021-22]; the Aqueduct fall meet [2015, 2017, 2019, 2021], the Aqueduct spring meet [2017, 2018] and the former Aqueduct inner track title [2012-13, 2013-14, 2017].

He has topped all North American jockeys in wins since 2017 and has shown the way in total purse earnings on five occasions [2018-20, 2022-23].

He enjoyed a tremendous 2023 campaign by surpassing his own purse earnings record when banking \$39,193,365 through a 1560-366-269-248 ledger topped by Breeders' Cup wins with Elite Power [Sprint], Goodnight Olive [Filly & Mare Sprint] and White Abarrio [Classic] to earn his fifth Bill Shoemaker Award as the outstanding rider at the 2023 Breeders' Cup.

So far in 2024, he is leading all riders in wins with 256 and also in purse earnings with more than \$27 million in the bank. He has posted Grade I wins this year with Leslie's Rose [Ashland], Vahva [Derby City Distaff], Chili Flag [Just a Game], Book'em Danno [Woody Stephens], Cogburn [Jaipur] and Howard Wolowitz [Franklin Simpson].

Ortiz, Jr., a two-time Belmont Stakes winner, has also been associated with are 2019 Horse of the Year Bricks and Mortar, 2019 Champion Older Dirt Male Vino Rosso, 2017 Champion Turf Female Lady Eli and 2022 Champion 3-Year-Old Filly Nest.

Supa Speed, exiting a second in the Del Juvenile Fillies Turf Sept. 7, drilled five furlongs on the main track in 1:02.00 for trainer John Sadler. Motorious, winner of the GIII Green Flash Stakes at Del Mar last out on Aug. 31, worked three furlongs on the training track in :59.60 for trainer Phil D'Amato. It was the fastest of 16 works at the distance.

At 30 years of age, Hamish McCalmont has already experienced two different worlds. Having spent seven years working in finance in London, and enjoyed the delights that comes with city living, McCalmont made the decision to return home to his family's Norelands Stud in County Kilkenny and immerse himself in the world of bloodstock.

In fairness, he picked a good time to change career path and come home. Norelands was one of three consignments selected by the Niarchos family to offer some select mares at the Goffs November Breeding Stock Sale, including the \in 6 million Alpha Centauri (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}), and returned to that sales house earlier this month to sell a \in 900,000 Sea The Stars colt.

The momentum continued at Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale last week with three yearlings selling for almost 1.6 million gns. Even a self-proclaimed rookie like McCalmont was left gobsmacked by that record-breaking trade and the youngster is hoping for more of the same at Book 2 this week.

ECONOMICS "VERY WELL" AHEAD OF CHAMPION STAKES CLASH WITH CALANDAGAN

Williams Haggas has issued a positive bulletin on star three-year-old **Economics (GB)** as he prepares for his showdown with French challenger Calandagan (Ire) (Gleneagles {Ire}) in Saturday's G1 Qipco Champion Stakes at Ascot.



He said, "We knew we had three very nice fillies but obviously you never know what's going to happen until you get there. Especially with a sale like Book 1, where everyone is always a little bit guarded at the beginning, you don't take anything for granted. The great thing about last week was there seemed to be a floor to the market. The footfall was great and we never went through as many cards than we did last week. A lot of that was down to the American influence at the sale, which helped push up the market, and then obviously we had the massive players Kia [Joorabchian]--who isn't new to the market but never spent as much at a sale before--and Godolphin. Everyone was pleasantly surprised, really."

Norelands has targeted Book 2 with a nine-strong draft. There are two colts by Sea The Stars (Ire), a filly and a colt by No Nay Never along with fillies by New Bay (GB) and Night Of Thunder (Ire) to get excited about. But McCalmont knows better to be getting ahead of himself at this early juncture.

"I'm relatively new to working full-time in the business but, from what I learned from my Dad, Matt [Gilsenan, farm manager] and lots of other people in the industry, you have to remain cautious. But you have to be optimistic about the fact a lot of people were blown out of the water in Book 1. Hopefully those people who weren't able to fill orders in Book 1 will continue shopping at Book 2."

He added on the draft, "We're very strong on the sire side of things for Book 2 this year. We're a bit like everyone else in that we wanted to send a lot of our own homebreds to Book 2 because it's a sale that everyone goes to. You're really getting your horse in front of all of the eyes. These matings were planned a long time ago but thankfully all the sires of the horses we have are going extremely well. We don't have a huge number of horses but we're more concentrated on keeping the quality really high and the quantity low. Let's see how they get on."

The majority of the people working in this industry have had to work from the bottom up.

However, McCalmont's trajectory in the industry is a little different. His family may be steeped in racing history, but he has relatively little hands-on experience working with horses. It's only now that he's keen to make up for lost time.

He said, "I've always had an interest in bloodstock but studied finance at university and spent seven or eight years in London working with Hambros. It was about a year ago when I made the difficult decision to leave that job. I was trying to juggle going to the sales whilst working in London but I just found I was missing a lot. I was trying to balance my passion with my job but I couldn't do both. It got to the stage where I wanted to follow my passion. This is very much a game about people as much as it is about horses and you need to be at the sales and you need to be getting involved. I found that I wasn't there when I needed to be and wasn't there when I wanted to be so that's how I made that decision. It wasn't easy but, as I had a bit of money saved up, I went and bought a few fillies and a few broodmares and really immersed myself in it. I'm going to see how that goes and I've already spent the whole foaling season at home and have been heavily involved with the yearling prep as well."

He added, "I didn't do pony club or anything like this when I was growing up so I really want to get my fingers under it and understand how the whole breeding side of the game works. I just want to understand the horse, really. I could follow the industry from London and read all the stallion stats—and I'm big into that—as I wanted but I couldn't get my eyes on enough horses. That's what I have been trying to do for the past year and I've loved every minute of it."

To that extent, McCalmont has looked on at Norelands through a unique prism. A fresh set of eyes if you will. While he brings a certain youth and enthusiasm to the operation, there's no angling to fix something that clearly isn't broken.

He explained, "I'm very lucky that I had the support of my parents to go and follow what I thought I wanted to do. But the thing I couldn't wrap my head around for years, the business I was in, people would applaud you if you produced a five per cent return on your investment every year. In this game, if you make five per cent on your pinhook, you're miserable!

"I love the farm, love being home and working alongside my parents so, given it was always the direction that I was going to go, I thought rather than spending all my time working for somebody else, it was probably wise to come back and channel my energies into the family business."

He added, "But I'm definitely not trying to bring in new tech or new marketing strategies. The farm is a very established name and all of our clients in the past and hopefully in the future come to us purely through word of mouth. Norelands is a boutique operation and we want to keep it that way. If you were to try and change how that works, you could ruin the brand, so we're very mindful of that."

What McCalmont does bring to the operation is a mathematical brain and strong understanding of statistics. That can come in handy when predicting what the market might want and, while he may lack hands-on experience, he's not afraid to back his own judgment.

A case in point being his purchase of Kingman (GB) filly Rathmore (Ire) at the Tattersalls December Mares Sale last year for 50,000gns. That looks pretty decent value now since the half-sister Idea Generation (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) landed the G2 Flower Bowl Stakes at Saratoga for Chad Brown.

"When I was going into the office in London, I used to be on the bus reading TDN sires' lists, the Bill Oppenheim report, the return of mares and things like that," McCalmont recalled. "My passion is for long-term and middle-distance breeding and I love all of those German, Irish and English Classic-type pedigrees. Even if the market goes a certain way, I like being a contrarian to a certain degree and I'd always be following statistics in the hope of figuring out what the market will be looking for in two years' time. I think every breeder is like that and my Dad has been very receptive to that as well. He was always doing it that way, as was my Mum, so now we just put our heads together on the matings. Obviously the most important thing is to get a nice horse to the sales but, if you don't have the right sires on the door, it's a real problem. We've seen that with the selectivity of the market in recent times so hopefully we're vindicated by our matings during Book 2."

He added, "All the fears I had when I made the decision haven't come to fruition." **Cont.**

"Not yet anyway. But this doesn't feel like work to me. Working on stallion statistics on a Sunday morning, or delving into the form late at night, that doesn't feel like work. It's something I really enjoy doing and, because it's the family farm, I feel we are all working towards something together. I do more hours now than when I was working in London but it's very different work and it's really enjoyable. This is not a nine to five job and you don't survive in this business unless you are passionate. I've followed that passion and I'm very happy that I did."

Addeybb then went one better the following year to give his Newmarket trainer a first success in the race, with Economics poised to try and double that tally at the weekend.

"His form is there and he seems very well," Haggas said of the son of Night Of Thunder (Ire). "As long as he can stay well and run to his best, I think he is sure to run a good race. He battled well in Ireland and was tactically good. He fought hard when he had to in a top-class race and I was pleased he won a Group 1 as that makes things a lot easier."

Haggas has had his fair share of difficult calls to make with Economics in 2024, including the decision to skip the Derby after the imposing colt had put himself firmly in the picture for Epsom with a six-length success in the G2 Dante Stakes. Instead, he spent three months on the sidelines after that York win, before warming up for Leopardstown with victory in the G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano at Deauville.

"It's history and you can't worry about it," Haggas added of the decision to miss the Derby. Cont.



Golden Eagle on Radar for Fallon and Lake Forest

Champions Day at Ascot might be one of the final acts of the Flat season in Britain, but Haggas has international targets in mind for some of his other stable stars beyond Saturday, including the three-year-old **Lake Forest (GB)**.

Haggas is no stranger to big-race success in Australia, notably winning back-to-back editions of the G1 Queen Elizabeth Stakes with the aforementioned Addeybb, and the trainer now has the A\$10 million Golden Eagle in his sights with last year's Gimcrack winner.

Last seen filling the runner-up spot in the G3 Hackwood Stakes at Newbury in July, Lake Forest is set to be ridden by Cieren Fallon when he makes his next appearance at Rosehill on Saturday, November 2, with regular rider Tom Marquand likely to be in action at the Breeders' Cup.

"We'll need a lot of luck and a nice draw," Fallon said of the challenge. "It's a big race worth a lot of money and hopefully he acclimatises well. He's got a lot of speed and it's round a bend, not just a straight. He can be a tad slow away, which isn't ideal in a big field like that as they tend to go two-by-two, so we'll need a bit of luck with a couple of gaps up the home straight.

He added, "Racing is a roller-coaster ride and I've had some highs and some lows this year, but it's a great opportunity and hopefully he can perform on the day and things go our way."

NO STOPPING CERVINIA IN SHUKA SHO, FINAL LEG OF JAPANESE FILLIES' TRIPLE **CROWN**

Cervinia (Jpn) (Harbinger {GB}) produced a dominant performance to justify favouritism in Sunday's G1 Shuka Sho at Kyoto Racecourse, the final leg of the fillies' Triple Crown in Japan.

She became the fifth winner of the G1 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks) to follow up in this race in the last decade, with the others including the same owner's Liberty Island (Jpn) (Duramente {Jpn}) when she won all three legs of the fillies' Triple Crown last year.

Trained by Tetsuya Kimura for Sunday Racing, Cervinia's hopes of emulating Liberty Island fell by the wayside when she finished down the field in the G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1,000 Guineas) at Hanshin in April, but she proved her true worth when beating the winner of that race, **Stellenbosch (Jpn)** (Epiphaneia {Jpn}), by half a length to win the Yushun Himba at Tokyo the following month.

The Shuka Sho brought Cervinia and Stellenbosch together for a third clash, while the form of two key trials was represented by the likes of Queen's Walk (Jpn) (Kizuna {Jpn}), successful in last month's G2 Rose Stakes at Chukyo, plus the first three from the G2 Shion Stakes at Nakayama, won by Christmas Parade (Jpn) (Kitasan Black {Jpn}) ahead of Mi Anhelo (Jpn) (Duramente {Jpn}) and **Bond Girl (Jpn)** (Daiwa Major {Jpn}).

Cervinia broke alertly before finding a position in mid-division under Christophe Lemaire as Sekitoba East (Jpn) (Declaration Of War) took the 15-strong field along in the early stages. Sekitoba East's lead had grown to seven or eight lengths with less than 600 metres to run, ahead of Christmas Parade, who raced a couple of lengths in advance of the main pack. However, it was all change in the straight as that pair gradually came back to the field, with Cervinia emerging from between runners to hit front inside the final furlong. From there she kept going well to win by a length and three-quarters from Bond Girl, who ran on strongly on the outside to snatch second from Stellenbosch, having had just one rival behind her on the home turn.

It was a first success in the Shuka Sho for Kimura, while Lemaire was winning the race for the third time, having won consecutive renewals with Deirdre (Jpn) (Harbinger {GB}) in 2017 and Almond Eye (Jpn) (Lord Kanaloa (Jpn)) in 2018.

"As always, it's not easy to win a Group 1 race, but Cervinia ran an incredible race today and everything went smoothly," said Lemaire afterwards. "The distance was right for her and we were able to sit in a good position. She found her own rhythm and was very calm throughout. The fast pace was also a good factor and she responded beautifully."

Cervinia and the runner-up have history as they made their respective debuts in the same race at Tokyo in June last year when Bond Girl came out on top by three quarters of a length. Cervinia later opened her account at Niigata and won the G3 Artemis Stakes at Tokyo as a two-year-old, before returning this year in the Oka Sho.

Pedigree Notes:

Cervinia's dam, Cecchino (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}), who filled the runner-up spot in the 2016 Yushun Himba, has now produced three winners from as many runners. The others include the G3 Niigata Kinen victor Nocking Point (Jpn) (Maurice {Jpn}) and the two-year-old Arlecchino (Jpn) (Bricks and Mortar), who registered his first success at Niigata in August. Cecchino has since produced a yearling colt by Epiphaneia (Jpn). She was bred to Efforia (Jpn) for this season.

Cecchino is a full-sister to Codino (Jpn), who ran second in the G1 Asahi Hai Futurity Stakes and third in the G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2,000 Guineas), in addition to being a multiple Group winner. She is also a half-sister to Pastophoria (Jpn) (Symboli Kris S), who produced last year's G2 Hanshin Himba Stakes runner-up Sublime Anthem (Jpn) (Lord Kanaloa {Jpn}).

The second dam, Happy Path (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), was a multimillionaire racehorse in her own right, while this is also the immediate family of Japanese champion older mare Shinko Lovely (Caerleon).
