





HISA SUPREME COURT SHOWDOWN COULD HAVE MAJOR IMPLICATIONS FOR EVERYDAY AMERICANS

A contentious, years-long legal battle over the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) appears headed for a showdown in the highest court in the land. At the opposite ends of any future court ruling is one that could essentially impact just the future of horse racing, or one that could take a wrecking ball to various core pillars of modern life.

Industry players' stance on HISA can probably be boiled down into three main camps: those who are in ideological lock-step with the new federal body of governance; those who agree with the fundamental premise of federal industry oversight but have concerns with key aspects of the current program, especially when it comes to enforcement; and those who are completely opposed to what HISA represents.

Though industry opinions over HISA appear to have no hard and fast political demarcation, the latter camp has courted outside attention from a section of American society, typically from the far right, which believes the government has been far too liberal in the powers it has given federal agencies. They're buoyed by a Supreme Court sympathetic to their fears.

INAUGURAL CHAMPIONSHIP SALE 'A GATEWAY' FROM THE SALES RING TO THE WINNER'S CIRCLE by Jessica Martini

The inaugural Keeneland Championship Sale--part glitzy party, part horse auction--will be held in the Del Mar paddock Oct. 30, offering invitation-only attendees, as well as off-site bidders, the chance to become owners of horses running in the Breeders' Cup at the oceanside oval just days later. The catalogue for the auction was released Thursday, revealing full or fractional interests available in four Breeders' Cup contenders, as well as stallion share in a fifth championship starter. The 12 offerings in the auction also include a half-sister to a Breeders' Cup runner, a 3-year-old heading for a Grade I race later in the month and stallion share in champion Flightline. "We spend a lot of time talking about what's good for the market. What would be exciting for the market, what are ways to get new owners engaged, what is the market looking for," Keeneland President and CEO Shannon Arvin said. Cont. p7

Whichever camp you're in, chances are you're already feeling reverberations from these various HISA lawsuits. While HISA declined to say exactly how much to date the industry has spent defending the law, background sources put the cost at over \$5 million.

If the Supreme Court decides to take this case, however, the implications from the ruling could reverberate far outside the

sport. "It certainly is going to be a big deal beyond just horse racing," said Daniel Suhr, president of the Center for American Rights, which is spearheading the Fifth Circuit case on behalf of the HBPA.

In fact, the case makes up one of a sweeping set of lawsuits working their way up the Circuit Courts designed to fundamentally rethink the way that government operates, with pointed implications for the nation's finance and commerce sectors, some systems of which have been in place for nearly a century or more.

As Christine Chabot, who teaches administrative and constitutional law at Marquette University Law School, describes this scenario, "it's open season on the administrative state."

Fifth Circuit Case

At the heart of the Fifth Circuit's decision which catapulted the case up to the doors of the Supreme Court is the belief that because the HISA Authority has sweeping enforcement capabilities-from subpoenas to investigative powers to penalties-and because the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) only has authority to review the penalties on the backend (in other words, once they've already been meted out), that is insufficient to protect against the private non-delegation doctrine.

In a nutshell, the private non-delegation doctrine says "that

Congress or agencies cannot delegate extensive governmental authority to a private actor without being able to do oversight," said Todd Philips, assistant professor of law in the Robinson College of Business at Georgia State University. He also served as an attorney for the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, and the Administrative Conference of the United States.

The HISA Authority, of course, is an example of one of these private actors that perform extensive governmental functions. And the private non-delegation doctrine is one of the pillars of the administrative state targeted by groups led chiefly by powerful right-leaning organizations like the Heritage Foundation.

The Fifth Circuit case against HISA was originally led by the Liberty Justice Center, a nonprofit law firm that provides free legal services in constitutional cases. When Suhr splintered away from the Liberty Justice Center to start the Center for American Rights, he took the HBPA's case with him.

"When I left the Justice Center, I didn't take any other case with me. We were really trying to get a fresh start. The one exception was this case, and that was because we were going to trial something like two weeks after I changed jobs," said Suhr, who explained he had no background in horse racing prior to his involvement in the case.

The Liberty Justice Center-which recorded revenues of roughly \$2.3 million in 2022, according to Pro Publica-lists many current and prior cases targeting union powers, the administrative state, and public health and schooling, among others. The right-wing billionaire Charles Koch is among those who have supported the Liberty Justice Center, according to the Economic Policy Institute.


The only other cases listed on the Center for American Rights' website involve recent complaints filed with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and the Federal Election Commission (FEC) claiming biased news coverage by CBS and ABC detrimental to former president Donald Trump.

The Center for American Rights-which is working pro bono for the HBPA-is only required to disclose its donors to the IRS. "We don't disclose our donors by specifics. I can say in general that we receive support from corporations, from individuals and from philanthropic foundations," Suhr said.

For any industry stakeholders who might be interested, could Suhr disclose the identity of any of those donors? Maybe just the biggest?

"No," Suhr replied. "Could we? Yes. Do we? No."

If the Supreme Court does indeed take up the Fifth Circuit case, Suhr said he hoped the Supreme Court will use the case to, at the very least, significantly curtail the powers of private organizations like the HISA Authority and Financial Industry Regulatory Authority (FINRA), calling them "fundamentally

incompatible in my view with the structure laid out" in the constitution.

"I'm deeply skeptical in any industry setting you can have a nonprofit organization write the rules, enforce the rules and adjudicate violations of the rules. That is an incredible concentration of power and I'm skeptical you can concentrate all that power in a federal agency," Suhr said.

"The idea that you can concentrate all that power in a non-central, non-profit organization? Yeah, no way," he added.

What, however, would Suhr say to industry stakeholders uncomfortable with the industry's future potentially shaped by an organization that hold beliefs to which they're strongly opposed?

"Plenty of people on the left who have a strong civil liberty bent would say, 'oh my goodness, the idea that a regulator can show up and search my property without a warrant, seize evidence without a warrant, order me to take a blood test or draw blood on my horse without a warrant, that makes every civil liberty bone in my body shake in fear," said Suhr.

"Regardless of how you think about the world politically," he added, "there are serious constitutional problems with HISA that people recognize and experience in their own lives."

In response to questions about HISA's warrantless authority, an agency spokesperson wrote that while HISA and HIWU have

access to "places of business of Covered Persons that relate to the care, treatment, training, and racing of Covered Horses," HISA and HIWU have not thus far accessed any private farms.

"If a Covered Horse has been selected for Out-of-Competition testing and is located on private property, HIWU will call the trainer for permission to enter the property. However, it can also be arranged for the Covered Horse to be moved to another location for testing, e.g., a racetrack, within six hours of notification," the HISA spokesperson wrote. They added that HISA and HIWU "have no authority to demand a blood test from a Covered Person."

Broader Concerns

The Fifth Circuit HISA case, said Chabot, forms one part of a broad, concerted attack on the government's involvement in key parts of everyday administrative life.

"These lawsuits are definitely designed to push back against regulation and make it harder to do the business of government that has been done for decades, if not since the founding fathers," said Chabot.

Still, Chabot questions whether the private non-delegation doctrine will prove the one issue the Supreme Court wants to make its "big bold constitutional ruling on." She sees a case to overturn "Humphrey's Executor"-which could see the president

afforded the unilateral authority to fire anyone under the government's employee-as a "far bigger target for them."

But if the Supreme Court does make a "big bold constitutional ruling" on the HISA case, a "very extreme" decision could see the government barred from relying on self-regulatory organizations (SROs)-another term for a private entity like the HISA Authority-to regulate industry, said Phillips. "As long as the Supreme Court takes the case, it could just fundamentally

re-write the private non-delegation doctrine if it wanted to," he said.

Because Congress in its current dysfunctional state struggles to write and re-write laws quickly and efficiently, that could spell trouble for many governmental agencies like FINRA, which makes sure the broker-dealer industry operates fairly and honestly.

"We could end up in a regime where illicit activities go un-enforced because the SRO can't enforce them, and Congress hasn't given the government the authority to enforce them... Again, I'm very concerned," said Phillips.

Industry Involvement

Among some of the key legal players in the fight over HISA, there appears to be something of an ideological divide.

Defending HISA is attorney Pratik Shah with the multinational law firm Akin Gump Strauss Hauer & Feld. While Shah's list of cases is varied, it includes multiple instances of defending key pillars of the federal administrative state. In his earlier legal days, he served as law clerk to liberal Supreme Court Justice Stephen Breyer.

Among the litigants is Texas Racing Commission executive director Amy Cook. With no prior experience in the racing industry, Cook in her position has been working with the Texas



Attorney General's office "to successfully attack the constitutionality of the HISA law," according to commission chairman Robert Pate.

According to Cook's Linkedin page, she does pro bono work for the Alliance Defending Freedom. While the organization says it is not involved in any of the suits against HISA, Cook represents an influential official with a far-right agenda who is trying to dismantle HISA. Designated a hate group by the Southern Poverty Law Center, Alliance Defending Freedom reportedly seeks "cultural renewal" through recovering "the robust Christendomic theology of the 3rd, 4th, and 5th centuries," according to its supporters.

But as NHBPA CEO Eric Hamelback sees it, from within the industry this case "is not and never has been" about politics.

"There were Republicans and Democrats who sponsored and pushed HISA through Congress, and there are R's and D's among my Full Board members and other groups that have opposed HISA," Hamelback wrote.

"This is a fight for and to protect basic American principles, like the people we vote for should be the people who make the law, or that the people who have power should be transparent and accountable with how they use that power, or how they use our mandatory fee dollars," he added.

When asked about some of the broader implications from the case, Hamelback wrote that "we do not feel as if this is our concern, because our concern is for the horsemen. Certainly, we hear the noise about FINRA and the SEC in this case, and if some stockbroker wants to sue FINRA and the SEC after we win and argue why our precedent applies to them, fine-that's not our issue. This is and will remain our focus-that being, making sure that horsemen's rights are respected and our regulators act in a constitutional way," Hamelback wrote.

As for the Center for American Rights' donor base, Hamelback wrote that Suhr is supported by "individuals who are inside and outside of the horse racing industry who care that this issue gets resolved."

According to Suhr, similar scrutiny should also be placed on the HISA Authority using monies accrued from mandatory fee assessments to pay for legal representation.

"While people may or may not agree with everything my law firm or my former law firm does in other cases, we've represented the HBPA for free throughout because they are patriotic, philanthropic supporters of our work," said Suhr. "On the other side, the Authority has taken millions of dollars in mandatory fees that are coerced from unwilling horsemen and spent it on high-priced DC lawyers to defend the law on the other side."

When asked to respond to Suhr's comments, a HISA spokesperson wrote that the equine fatality rate has recently declined markedly over four consecutive quarters, and that the HISA Authority will continue to do "everything in its power" to protect the "safety and integrity" of Thoroughbred racing.

"As part of this commitment, legal expenses have been incurred in response to serial litigation, primarily driven by the HBPA. Rather than filing a single challenge, the HBPA chose to initiate legal actions in five separate federal courts, significantly increasing the costs," the statement read. "However, we believe that these legal defense efforts are essential to uphold the Authority's mandate and protect the long-term future of the sport."

Arvin continued, "The more we talked, the more we thought it would be really fun to offer an opportunity to get engaged with a horse that obviously has a lot of action in the next days following the sale and potentially even the ability to roll it right back into the [Keeneland November] sales ring. It just seemed like a great opportunity to create a lot of excitement and fun around what is already a tremendous week for the sport with the Breeders' Cup championships."

Arvin admitted part of the inspiration for the sale came from the Goffs London Sale, an auction held on the eve of the Royal Ascot meeting which offers bidders the chance to buy entries for the legendary meet. But another inspiration was provided by a pre-Breeders' Cup party Keeneland hosted two years ago.

"We hosted a party the Tuesday or Wednesday before the Breeders' Cup when it was here in 2022 and we hosted it out at

Castle & Key [Distillery]," said Arvin. "We found it was a really unique and fun experience. We started with that. We say all the time, many of the people involved in this sport at the highest levels as principals are great businesspeople and work really hard at other things. And part of the reason that they want to be involved in our sport is for fun. We want to provide that unique, top-level experience for our people."

Once the concept for the auction was in place, the Keeneland

team moved on to logistics. With limited capacity in the Del Mar paddock, on-site participation for the party/auction will be by invitation only.

"The people who are there will be some of our sellers and accredited buyers who are pre-registered and have gone through the paper work," explained Keeneland Vice President of Racing Tony Lacy. "They are green-lighted for the sale itself."

The party in the paddock will begin at 5 p.m. PT, with the sale

starting at 6:30 p.m. After the dozen horses are offered, the party will resume.

"It's a party. And we want it to be party," Lacy said. "We want it to be fun. The experience is very much a part of, and leading into, what the world championships are. And that is a celebration."

Days after hosting the Breeders' Cup in 2022, Keeneland opened its November Breeding Stock Sale by offering a share in recently retired GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Flightline. In front of a packed pavilion--and with plenty of fanfar--the share sold for \$4.6 million. The Championship Sale is an extension of that sort of energy-creating initiative, according to Lacy.

"As you see at the sales, we are all about trying to create an environment where everybody is enjoying themselves," Lacy said. "It creates the synergy that allows people to feel a part of the action. This allows people to potentially be a part of the action at the Breeders' Cup on some horses or in the future endeavors of some very high-class horses. I think that in itself creates a lot of buzz."

While on-site attendance will be limited, those interested can take part in the festivities--and the bidding--remotely. FanDuel will provide coverage of the sale on its racing channel and on its app from 6:30-7:30 p.m. Fans can also watch the action on Keeneland's YouTube channel and Gabby Gaudet will provide coverage from the paddock.


Keeneland will also offer phone and on-line bidding to registered buyers.

The dozen horses catalogued for the auction include 25% interests in GI Breeders' Cup Mile/Turf contender Gold Phoenix (Ire) (Belardo {Ire}) (hip 2) and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf contender Kilwin (Twirling Candy) (hip 8); and a 50% interest in GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile hopeful Mufasa (Chi) (Practical Joke) (hip 9). Pandora's Gift (Ire) (Churchill {Ire}) (hip 11), heading either for the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint or GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint.

Also on offer will be a stallion share in GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint contender **Cogburn** (Not This Time) (hip 5).

"We threw a wide net out to the industry at large, looking primarily for horses with connections to the Breeders' Cup," Keeneland Senior Director of Sales Operations Cormac Breathnach said of the recruitment process for the inaugural event. "We are very excited with the 12 horses in the catalogue. We've got four shares--between 25% and 100% interest--in four different Breeders' Cup contenders. We've got five big-time stakes performers that could go anywhere in the world from here. We are very excited with the diversity and the relevance and the variety of what is on offer on Wednesday the 30th."

Of the team's initial expectations for the catalogue's numbers, Breathnach said, "It actually is right where we want it to be. We

kind of figured it could be eight or it could be 20. We just really didn't know where it was going to land. But we have been very well supported by the customer base and by the clientele. People are very excited about this and they want to be part of it "

The catalogue, as well as relevant bidder registration forms, for the Championship Sale, are available at championship.keeneland.com.

"It's a very interactive catalogue," Breathnach said. "There is a lot of information on there on the various offerings and the percentage interests for horses that are not selling in whole. The prospective bidder form is housed there and that is going to be an important part of the process. In order for people to inspect horses that are on the backstretch at Del Mar and in order for people to participate remotely via the phone or via the online platform, we ask them to fill out the perspective bidder form, so that we have the information we need to make this as seamless as possible."

In order for Wednesday's buyers to be participants on championship weekend, officials from the California Horse Racing Board will be on hand at the sale to make sure the licensing paperwork is handled expeditiously.

"We would encourage anyone who is interested in registering, that they are registered as owners and licensed as owners in California if they want to bid on any of these horses that are participating over the Breeders' Cup weekend," Lacy said. "Just to make sure the paper work is in place, so it makes it as seamless as possible. The CHRB will be there to help complete the transfer and get everything organized."

Of the expected buying bench for the auction, Lacy said, "We want this to be a gateway for people that are looking at this sport as a potential investment or a potential interesting activity for them to get involved. This can be a way that they can come in at the highest level and be able to participate and enjoy the sport. We have gotten interest from potential buyers we didn't have in our system that are completely new to the game and are pretty serious punters."

The auction can also appeal to established owners, Lacy added.

"You could have somebody who has a horse who didn't make it or didn't have a horse good enough for the Breeders' Cup this year, and really wants to be a part of it," he continued. "This is something that can support California racing, can support new fans and new investors, as well as current investors. It's a way of sort of spreading the love a little easier for people who want to."

The auction's main attraction will be going from the sales ring Wednesday to the winner's circle Friday or Saturday.

"Hopefully the successful bidders will be successful at the weekend," Breathnach said.

WITH JOCKEY CLUB GOLD CUP DISAPPOINTMENT IN REAR VIEW, ARTHUR'S RIDE 'TRAINING WITH GOOD ENERGY' FOR

Arthur's Ride (Tapit), a disappointing fifth in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes Sept. 1 after posting one of the more impressive performances of the year in the GI Whitney Stakes Aug. 3, remains on target for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Del Mar Nov. 2.

The stunning gray breezed five furlongs in 1:02.87 (1/2) for Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott over Saratoga's Oklahoma training track over a surface labeled as "good" on a rainy Sunday morning Oct. 13, his fourth workout since the Jockey Club Gold Cup.

"Everything's been normal," Mott said standing outside of his office at Barn 80. "He's been training with good energy, eating well. All the things you want to see. There are no negatives that I see at the moment."

Arthur's Ride, a \$250,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase by Glassman Racing, posted a breakthrough performance with a career-best 111 Beyer Speed Figure in a double-digit victory in an optional claimer going 1 1/4 miles at Saratoga June 7. He ran nine rivals off their feet following an aggressive ride from Junior Alvarado while making his stakes debut over a muddy track in the 'Win and You're In' Whitney. He tired to fifth, beaten 9 1/2 lengths, as the 4-5 favorite after facing some early pressure from eventual winner Highland Falls (Curlin) in the Jockey Club Gold Cup.

"I guess the biggest step was coming out of the allowance race into the Whitney," Mott said. "That was a huge jump, then we ran back in four weeks and probably as big of a race that he ran

in the Whitney, I could see that he could possibly regress a little bit in the Jockey Gold Cup. Although I thought he was probably good enough to do it, he regressed a little bit, and now he's had a little more time to recover."

Mott added, "I look for him to come back in the Breeders' Cup a little bit."

While not ready to talk race strategy for Arthur's Ride in the Classic this far out--pre-entries for the Breeders' Cup will be announced Wednesday, Oct. 23--Mott said that his takeaway from the Jockey Club Gold Cup was that, "The horse doesn't need to be on the lead."

Other potential 2024 Breeders' Cup runners for Mott include the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf-bound War Like Goddess (English Channel). The 7-year-old mare worked four furlongs in :51.66 (70/84) over the Oklahoma training track Oct. 12. This will be the fourth and final trip to the Championships for the popular two-time GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic S. heroine, who has been entered by owner George Krikorian for the Fasig-Tipton November sale. She was third as the favorite in the 2021 Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf at Del Mar, third against males in the 2022 GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Keeneland and a troubled seventh in last year's Turf at Santa Anita. She came within a halflength of making it three straight wins against the boys in the Joe Hirsch Turf Classic at the Big A Sept. 28.

Juddmonte homebred and 'TDN Rising Star' Scylla (Tapit) worked a bullet four furlongs in :48.21 (1/31) for Mott over the Oklahoma training track Oct. 11. The well-related daughter of Close Hatches (First Defence) heads to the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint following second-place finishes in the 1 1/16-mile GI Clement L. Hirsch Stakes at Del Mar Aug. 3 and seven-furlong GI Ballerina Handicap at Saratoga Aug. 24, respectively.

Lawrence Goichman homebred **Scythian** (Tiz the Law)

punched her ticket to the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf with an 11-1 upset in the 'Win and You're In' GII Miss Grillo Stakes at the Belmont at Aqueduct meet Oct. 6. The New Yorkbred, one of four stakes winners for her freshman sire, is now two-for-two for Mott on the turf.

"They're all nice enough to warrant giving them a chance and seeing what we've got," Mott said.

Recognized as Outstanding Trainer at the 2023 Eclipse Awards, Mott had three winners--Cody's Wish (Curlin) (Dirt Mile), Elite Power (Curlin) (Sprint) and Just F Y I (Justify) (Juvenile Fillies)--at last year's Championships held at Santa Anita. Cody's Wish and Elite Power were also Breeders' Cup winners at Keeneland in 2022.

"We wanted a good, solid work today, and I thought we got that," Pletcher added. "I think physically, he's done really well. He's gotten bigger, stronger, and put on weight. You can see him maturing into a fall 3-year-old. I'm very pleased with his overall condition."

Shortly after Fierceness wrapped up his work, GIII Futurity Stakes winner Mentee breezed a half-mile in company with Breeders' Cup possible and maiden of three starts Noble Confessor (Quality Road) in :49.39 (3/14).

"I thought it was a good work from him," Pletcher said. "It looked like he was moving well. He's got a great personality and is very laid back and easy to train."

The victory in the Futurity awarded Mentee a berth into the five-furlong GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint, but Pletcher said that his preference is the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at one mile.

"I think right now the plan would be to enter the Juvenile Turf first preference and the Juvenile Turf Sprint second preference, just to keep our options open," Pletcher said.

LSU Stables' three-time GISW and 'TDN Rising Star' Far Bridge (English Channel) posted a five-furlong breeze Thursday over the Oklahoma turf training track, covering the distance solo in 1:01.47 (1/1). He is a leading contender for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf.

"I'm very happy. It was a typical work from him," said Miguel Clement, son of and assistant to trainer Christophe Clement. "He had his ears up, playing and looking happy. His next work will be in company next Friday. He does it so naturally and he enjoys it out there. Every furlong he was picking it up--he's enjoying it, he's thriving, and that's what we like to see."

Bregman Family Racing and Swinbank Stables' three-time stakes-winner Governor Sam (Improbable) returned to the worktab Thursday at Saratoga for the first time since winning the Listed Indian Summer Oct. 6 at Keeneland. He breezed four furlongs in :50.66 (1/1) over the Oklahoma turf.

"We're 15 days out and he just ran 11 days ago--turf sprinters need to be on their toes, so we'll leave it at that," trainer George Weaver said.

'IT'S ABOUT THE HORSES': RYAN MOORE, THE RELUCTANT SUPERSTAR

All season we seem to have been marvelling at 'another brilliant ride by Ryan Moore.' But the man himself chuckles at the idea that this has been a special year for him.

"I suppose looking back there've been good days, but you only remember the last day," he says. "We didn't win the Arc – so it doesn't feel satisfying at the moment." As he says it, he really is laughing at how a recent disappointment can obscure the glories.

This is life in the super-elite of world sport, where Moore belongs. Parts of racing have been slow to see that he shares the same small bracket of stars as Joe Root (cricket) or Antoine Dupont (rugby) – the ones several lengths clear of their contemporaries, and destined for reputational immortality. Moore is the best Flat race jockey on the planet: dedicated and deadly, relentless and artful.

We sat down at Moore's home in Newmarket a few days after he had been beaten into third on Los Angeles in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. It was still eating at him. Had he expected to win? The Havana Grey filly was reported to have compared favourably with the Group 1-placed Arabian Dusk (GB) (Havana Grey {GB}) at the same stages in their development by Elliott.

The greatest names in sport share a characteristic. Winning a lot isn't good enough. They want to win every time. That

insatiability burns in Moore's eyes as he looks back to
Longchamp and ahead to a late autumn of mighty challenges:
"Champions Day, Breeders' Cup, Melbourne Cup, Japan Cup.
We've still got plenty to get done."

Part of my intention in interviewing him was to place him in that special worldwide category of 'boss' athletes who could all fit round one dinner table, if you could organise it. It seems obvious that Moore is in that class. But you can guess how his modesty collided with

my mission. He was having none of it.

"I dunno. The way I see it is that I ride for the best trainer who's given the best horses by a very supportive bunch of

owners, at a fantastic facility," he said. "So, it's what's behind me really – that's the proof of it. It's horseracing. It's about the horses, I always feel. They're the ones that will take you there."

No problem. The praise can be ladled out on his behalf. A

random sample might include Wigmore Street surging from near last to first in the Irish Cambridgeshire, Luxembourg's victory in the Coronation Cup, Kyprios holding off Trawlerman in the Ascot Gold Cup, or Fairy Godmother veering the width of seven backsides to fly up the stand-side and win the Albany Stakes.

"Every year he's ridden for us he's got better," O'Brien said at that Royal Ascot meeting. "He's the complete package in every way. He puts it all in, in every way. He's so committed, he's so

straight, so dedicated, such an athlete."

If Moore, now 41, is reserved in his public utterances it's largely because he has no interest in performative chat. Cont. p5

To see him at rest on an early midweek day is to realise how grounded he is in the challenge of working out in his head each

race, each horse. The rolling conundrum, he says, is "different circumstances, different horse, different course, different ground, different jockeys." The goal though never changes: "to get from here to there as fast as possible."

With all that to consume him. he has little interest in the abstractions of greatness, stature or the skills involved in what he does. Which is fine. because there are plenty of specific topics to keep us occupied, starting with the

three horses I try to cite as evidence that it has been a stellar year: Kyprios, City Of Troy, Auguste Rodin.

The mountain tops laid out in front of Moore are Breeders'

Cup Classic (City Of Troy), Melbourne Cup (Jan Brueghel) and Japan Cup (Auguste Rodin). This is Coolmore and Ballydoyle in full globetrotting mode. To be this intrepid, Moore will need to dash from Del Mar and the Classic on a 16-hour flight to

> Melbourne. Not forgetting of course Champions Day at Ascot.

Landmark tests abound. City Of Troy and Auguste Rodin will both retire after America (2 Nov) and Japan (24 Nov). And of the few defining races to have eluded Coolmore and O'Brien. The hype is building. It draws another smile from Moore: "The only thing I do when I get on the horse is it is irrelevant. We have to go


"Yeah, he did," Moore agrees. "Ok, the Eclipse wasn't too pretty, but the form didn't work out too bad. His Derby win was good. We got it wrong in the Guineas. I thought his performance in the Juddmonte was top class. Everyone wants to see the next Frankel – but I've only seen one of them. That's the reality of it. I've seen a lot of good horses, but I've only seen one that's..." He waves his hand as if to say – beyond compare.

From Moore's view in the saddle, City Of Troy's front-running performance at York was an insight into his chance at Del Mar: "He has that speed going forward. That's a good thing to have in his arsenal for America. It's a good trait to have." And the encore of his jockey trying to pull him up after the line is for real: "Once he gets into his rhythm he can maintain his gallop. When he gets it right he will keep going. It's like an elite athlete who can keep going at 800m pace and keep timing it out."

Mechanically, Moore says, City Of Troy "has an extraordinary action. He seems to throw his front legs out and almost extend them – from the shoulder. Aidan was telling me how straight he is behind. He's almost like a deer. They think that's what makes him so brilliant."

So can he transplant Yorkshire form to California? "You don't know. Aidan has trained him since York with America in mind, and has been tweaking things, mentally preparing him. We don't know if we will handle the surface because we just don't know. Del Mar is a unique surface. He [Aidan] has gone close with horses in the past and he feels he can prepare him and give him the best shot he can have."

Moore speaks with equal fondness of Auguste Rodin, who is way too good to be called an enigma but has his quiet days. Wins in the Derby, Irish Derby, Irish Champion Stakes, Breeders' Cup Turf and this year's Prince of Wales's Stakes will be remembered long after his no-shows have been forgotten.

"Auguste Rodin is a horse I rate really highly. I was annoyed with myself in the Irish Champion Stakes [where he was narrowly beaten by Economics]. He won the Prince of Wales which was great. I sat on him last week before the Arc and Aidan said – 'gun to your head now, which one do you want to ride?' And I said I'd like to ride him [Auguste Rodin]. But the way the weather came it was the right thing not to run him.

"I'd love to see him finish off well in Japan. He is a very good horse. Very good horse. He has everything. He's always shown that he has everything. I saw him in that February when he was a two-year-old, and the first time I sat on him I told Aidan – this will be the Derby horse. He's been beaten but he's come back and won. Aidan's not afraid of him being beaten, so he's run him. It's going to happen."

Recent conversations with ex-jockeys suggested that many think, like O'Brien, that Moore continues to improve, year after year, even from an already extraordinarily high level: another idea he would rather not dwell on.

He says: "I don't know, really. All I can do every day is try my best, eliminate mistakes. Riding the horses has always been the same. I've always enjoyed the actual race riding. I've always enjoyed riding good horses and I've always enjoyed riding in big

races. So I suppose I'm probably doing more of that now than Mondays and Tuesdays at Windsor and Brighton. Now it's more focused on the Ballydoyle horses at the weekend, I suppose."

Ah, Brighton, his birthplace. Can we expect him back there for a cameo? Here he vents his frustration with race scheduling that condemns quiet mid-week days to only low grade racing (he thinks racing has an opportunity there to fill an entertainment void).

"I'd like to go back [to Brighton] one day," he says. "It's the quality of the race programme. If there's good horses to ride at those places you'd go. If the races aren't there for the better horses it's hard to have a reason to go there, which is a problem.

"It is frustrating. Race programming...it's irritating when you have so many meetings on a Saturday afternoon, and it's competing with every other sport, no one seems to notice it. We've made changes, maybe some of them aren't working, so maybe we try others."

Forty-one is a late age in most sports but Moore's extended prime is a long way from fraying. A reminder though of time's inexorable march came with Sir Michael Stoute's decision to retire at the end of the current season. Stoute was the main mover behind Moore's graduation to the heights he occupies now.

"Sir Michael is a lovely, lovely man," he says. "He gave me great advice. He still does. I learned so much riding for him, and he gave me an opportunity very young, which took me to the next level. He developed me a lot. He'd say the things at the right time. He'd reassure you, if you needed it. He'd ring me up if I had a good day, ring me up if I had a bad day."

He believes Stoute will stick around in Newmarket but has no plan for himself when race riding leaves him behind. He does

however speak of that day with gallows humour. "I certainly don't have an idea when it will end. It will end one of two ways. Either I'll get told I'm not good enough, or I'll get carried off. I doubt it will be my decision. I wouldn't put any date or goal on it. I'll just disappear." He's laughing again – enjoying the darkness of it.

"I used to see lads retire and think - you've got to be organised, you've got to know what you're going to do. You start work [in a new job] the next day. I really believed that was the way to do it. I've now reached the point where I don't have the energy to put into thinking what I'm going to do next.

"But I do spend a lot of time thinking about what I'm actually doing now, rather than thinking too far ahead. You have to think about the next race, that's the immediate one. You can't get too far ahead. Or, I can't any more."

The amount of thought he puts into it couldn't be more apparent, as Ascot, Del Mar, Melbourne and Japan swarm in his mind. Generational supremacy is a full-time job, and Moore's grip on it remains unbreakable.



Time Test Colt Lives Up To Billing

The Time Test (GB) half-brother to the Group 1-placed juvenile Simmering (GB) was billed as one of the star acts at Book 3 and the WH Bloodstock-consigned colt did not disappoint when knocked down to Najd Stud for 110,000gns.

Trained by Ollie Sangster, Simmering has emerged as a teak-tough juvenile this season, winning a Group 2 and Group 2 before chasing home Lake Victoria (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) in the G1 Moyglare Stud Stakes.

Bloodstock agent Nico Archdale commented, "He is a half to a very smart horse this year in Simmering and by a sire who does very well in Saudi. He goes to Saudi from here, and I am delighted to purchase him for Prince Faisal and Najd Stud."

On the business carried out on behalf of Najd Stud, he continued, "We bought another by Time Test in Book 1 [Lot 150], and seven yearlings in Book 2--they are all going to Saudi, apart from the Sea The Stars [Lot 748] colt who goes to Roger Varian.

"Time Test is doing very well out in Saudi, he is flying out there and has had a top rated two-year-old. It has been a very strong market here over the two weeks, there have been some lovely horses here."

This colt is out of the Fastnet Rock (Aus) mare Cashla Bay (GB),


the dam of two winners from three runners, bred by Lofts Hall Stud. Breeder Hugo Lascelles was at Tattersalls to see the sale and said, "Simmering has done us well this summer, she has been very well trained by Ollie Sangster. I am very pleased with that price, he is a very nice horse."

Browne Reinvests Pinhooking Riches In Blue Point Colt

A number of leading breeze-up buyers struggled to get in on the action at any real significant level at Tattersalls during Book 1 and 2, but legend of the game Willie Browne was rewarded for sticking it out to the bitter end when going to 150,000gns to secure a Blue Point (Ire) colt from New England Stud.

"It was all breeze-up money on this colt, but I think he is a good horse," Browne afterwards. "The sire is very good. I have had a good price for one by the sire before. For me this is the best horse here today--you are just trying to buy a quick horse if you can and I think he looks quick."

Browne was reinvesting some of the riches earned at Park Paddocks on Wednesday, where a Territories (Ire) colt that he part-owned with Mark Dwyer sold to Sumbe for 750,000gns having been sourced for just 65,000gns. **Cont. p10**

Commenting on trade, Browne added, "It has been very tough to buy--this is the sixth I have managed to buy. The Territories is a gorgeous horse and it was a great result yesterday. That result was way above expectations--and the money has all been spent on this lad."

Pinhooking Fortunes On Thursday

Of the 311 horses catalogued during Thursday's session, 71 were pinhooks, and after three withdrawals, 68 horses visited the ring. Nine lots did not meet their reserves and were buy-backs, leaving 59 yearlings marked as sold. Of the latter group, 14 lots made a profit ranging from 1,600gns to 35,908gns.

Winning the day with a profit of 35,908gns for his connections was lot 1461, a son of Coulsty (Ire) and the Art Connoisseur (Ire) mare Nora Batt (Ire). A €14,000 Goffs November foal when purchased by Rathasker Stud, the J. W. Nicholson-bred yearling was sent through the ring by that operation on Thursday and picked up for 60,000gns by Harrowgate Bloodstock. This is the family of Turkish stakes winner Another Batt (Ire) (Windsor Knot {Ire}).

Forty-five lots lost money. The 59 pinhooks marked as sold were acquired for 2,031,583gns as foals (plus costs) and made 1,529,000gns on Thursday representing a -24.7% return.

We have multiplied the price of the foal by 1.1 and added a running cost of 12,000gns (for foals bought in guineas) or €15,000 (for foals bought in euros) for keep, feed, veterinary, shoeing, sales prep and sales entry fees. Depending on whether someone has their own farm, or where they choose to board a horse, will obviously mean that costs for each individual can vary significantly.

It is worth noting that sometimes a horse can appear to be

bought and sold by different names but have actually not changed ownership at all.

Golden Touch

It was at this sale 12 months ago that Luke Coen of 1-Cross Stables turned water into wine when Invincible Spirit (Ire) filly, who he sourced for €23,000, sold to Joseph O'Brien for 115,000gns. The young head on wise shoulders was back near the top of the table at Book 3 on Thursday when his Without Parole (GB) colt kept the consignor in profit. Bought for 21,000gns, the Without Parole went the way of Stuart Williams for 70,000gns.

Buy of the Day

You can't beat a pocket rocket and the Jack Channon-co-bought lot 1378, an A'Ali (Ire) filly consigned by Newsells Park Stud, was exactly that. She was bought by agent Armando Duarte and Channon for 15,000gns. She looks an early type and, given she is GBB 100%, could be capable of bagging plenty of prize-money and bonuses in the first couple of months of the season.

ECONOMICS AND CALANDAGAN HEAD DOZEN FOR THE CHAMPION STAKES

Ascot's Qipco British Champions Day took its final shape on Thursday morning, with the middle-distance heavyweights **Economics (GB)** (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) and **Calandagan (Ire)** (Gleneagles {Ire}) heading a 12-strong cast for Saturday's £1.3-million G1 Qipco Champion Stakes. Isa Salman Al Khalifa's G1 Irish Champion Stakes winner and The Aga Khan's G1 Juddmonte International runner-up are joined by the G1 Irish Derby third **Los Angeles (Ire)** (Camelot {GB}), one of two for Ballydoyle, and another French raider in **Iresine (Fr)** (Manduro {Ger}) who gives to provide Marie Velon with a first winner in Britain.

In the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Stakes, 13 milers will line up headed by Nurlan Bizakov's multiple group 1 winner **Charyn** (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) and the David Menuisier-trained G1 Sun Chariot Stakes winner **Tamfana** (**Ger**) (Soldier Hollow {GB}).

In the G1 Qipco British Champions Fillies & Mares Stakes sees a field of 14 featuring Juddmonte's impressive G3 September Stakes scorer **Kalpana (GB)** (Study Of Man {Ire}) and Ballydoyle's G1 Yorkshire Oaks heroine **Content (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}).

In the G1 Qipco British Champions Sprint Stakes, 20 sprinters include the G1 July Cup hero Mill Stream (Ire) (Gleneagles {Ire}) and the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup winner Montassib (GB) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}) while Kyprios (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) looks to extend his winning streak and win the G2 Qipco British Champions Long Distance Cup for the first time. His eight opponents include the horse that defeated him 12 months ago in Godolphin's Trawlerman (Ire) (Golden Horn {GB}).

Ascot confirmed on Thursday that the three races staged on the round course would be switched to the inner flat track due to heavy ground. The Long Distance Cup, Fillies & Mares Stakes and the Champion Stakes will now take place on a surface officially described as soft. Cont. p12

Champions Day Draw Cont.

Clerk of the course Chris Stickels explained, "The Long Distance Cup decreases in trip by 82 yards and the mile and a half Fillies & Mares Stakes decreases by 78 yards. If the forecast is accurate, I expect conditions to remain the same and we're expecting some rain Friday night into Saturday. We're generally dry up until then and we may see a slight improvement in conditions before then, and with rain Friday night and Saturday morning, I would imagine conditions will end up similar to how they are now."

ZARAK FILLY GRADUATES IN NEW YORK

In this series, the TDN takes a look at notable successes of European-based sires in North America. This week's column is highlighted by the victory of Zarak's Laurelin during the Belmont at the Big A meeting.

Big Apple Flavour For Laurelin

Newstead Stables' Laurelin (Ire) (Zarak {Fr}) won her career debut for trainer Graham Motion during the Belmont at the Big A meeting last week (video). Bred by M. H. Dixon and Mount Coote Estates, the chestnut filly cost Form Bloodstock €160,000 as a Goffs Orby yearling.

NEW CENTURY "FLYING" IN PREPARATION FOR BREEDERS' CUP

New Century (GB), the full-brother to the colt who topped Book 2 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale when selling to Godolphin for 1,000,000gns, is said to be "flying at home" following his success in the GI Summer Stakes at Woodbine, with a trip to the Breeders' Cup next on the agenda for the son of first-season sire Kameko. Cont. p14

Like Kameko, New Century is trained for owners Qatar Racing by Andrew Balding, who said "He's got a great constitution and has taken everything in his stride, from travelling to Canada and winning to preparing now for the Breeders' Cup. He's been flying at home since he arrived back from Canada."

The Summer Stakes was a "Win and You're In" for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf and all roads now lead to Del Mar where New Century will try to double his top-level tally when he lines up on Friday, November 1. Balding acknowledges that the sharp track might not be ideal, but he considers it a challenge worth taking on with a colt who continues to go from strength to strength.

"He's a horse that learns and improves and he's turned into a fantastic competitor," the trainer added. "It's probably not the ideal track for him, but this is the Breeders' Cup--a million-dollar Grade I--and we're going for it. We'll need a bit of luck with the draw, but he's taken international travel in his stride."

David Redvers similarly hailed the temperament of New Century after selling the full-brother at Park Paddocks on Thursday in his role as owner and managing director of Tweenhills Stud where Kameko stands. He also serves as the racing and bloodstock manager for Sheikh Fahad Al Thani and his brothers' Qatar Racing.

"New Century was bred at Tweenhills, he's by Kameko and he's trained by Andrew [Balding]--the whole story has come full circle," said Redvers. "Winning at the Breeders' Cup is one of Sheikh Fahad's unfulfilled ambitions and to have a genuine contender in New Century gives the whole operation a huge boost."

Boughey Fillies set for Breeders' Cup

The New Century team will be joined in San Diego by Newmarket trainer George Boughey, who is looking forward to travelling with both **Believing (Ire)** (Mehmas {Ire}) and **Soprano (Ire)** (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) in his quest for a first winner at the Breeders' Cup.

The consistent Believing is set to take her chance in the Turf Sprint following a series of near-misses at the top level in Europe, while Soprano is an intended runner in the Filly and Mare Turf, having filled the runner-up spot on her most recent outing in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Stakes at Keeneland.

"She's a dream filly to train," Boughey said of Believing. "Her rider Holly Walker has done a fantastic job with her and we've kept her work light. She's danced every dance and kept improving. We were unlucky not to win the Nunthorpe at York and we were drawn on the wrong side in Ireland, but she's been knocking on the door and, hopefully, it will open at the

Breeders' Cup."

Believing will reportedly wear cheekpieces for the Breeders' Cup, a decision influenced by her performance at Ascot last year when she contested the Champions Sprint Stakes.

"We put a set of cheekpieces on her for Ascot last year and I think that was as well as she's ever travelled--she was pretty much the last horse off the bridle," Boughey continued. "That race was a defining factor in our decision to send her to America, because she travelled so well in the early stages of the race. It's a fast five [at Del Mar], but I've heard it can suit closers. As long as she's not too far out early, I think we'll see her finishing very strongly."

Meanwhile, Soprano is said to have come out of her race at Keeneland last weekend in excellent shape as she prepares to step up in distance for the Filly and Mare Turf.

"She's put on muscle and weight and has turned into a big, strong filly--if she stays, she'll be a live each-way chance," said Boughey, who has gone close at the Breeders' Cup before when Cachet (Ire) (Aclaim {Ire}) was beaten just a length into fourth in the 2021 Juvenile Fillies Turf at Del Mar.

"To have runners there is special," he added. "The Breeders' Cup has always been an important event for everyone involved and we're excited to be part of it again."

OISIN MURPHY SECURES FOURTH CHAMPION JOCKEY TITLE

Oisin Murphy will officially be named champion Flat jockey in Britain for the fourth time in his career on Saturday. This year

the jockeys' championship began on Saturday, May 4 and ends with QIPCO British Champions Day at Ascot where Murphy will receive his prize.

Before racing at Chelmsford on Thursday, Murphy had ridden 162 winners and held an unassailable lead over his closest pursuers, Rossa Ryan (108) and Tom Marquand (103). The 29-year-old succeeds dual champion jockey William Buick, adding to his three consecutive championship wins in 2019, 2020 and 2021. He also becomes the first Flat jockey since Kieren Fallon, who won the last of his six titles in 2003, to be crowned champion in Britain more than three times.

Murphy has ridden two Group 1 winners on British soil this year and they both came at Royal Ascot where he partnered Asfoora (Aus) (Flying Artie {Aus}) to win the King Charles III Stakes and Khaadem (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) to win the Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes. He added to those victories on the international stage when recently winning the GI Summer Stakes at Woodbine on the Breeders' Cup-bound New Century (GB) (Kameko).

"I feel much more appreciative winning this championship," said Murphy. "As I am now older it means much more to me. I am thankful to many people who have helped me in achieving the title for the fourth time. My agent Gavin [Horne] has been booking my rides in all my championship victories and for many years. My uncle Jim [Culloty] marked out my career from the very beginning on whose stables I was sent to, [including] Tommy Stack, Aidan O'Brien and Andrew Balding.

"This season winning the Summer Stakes on New Century in Canada would be a highlight. I used to ride his sire and I have had success on his half-brother. I have ridden him a lot at home so seeing his career start gave me great pleasure."

World Pool's contribution to British and Irish racecourses has surpassed £50 million since its inception in 2019, the Hong Kong Jockey Club (HKJC) announced on Thursday.

A total of 580 races across nine different tracks in the UK and Ireland have been globally commingled by the HKJC since the World Pool's inaugural fixture at Royal Ascot in 2019, with the Curragh, Epsom Downs, Goodwood, Leopardstown, Newbury, Newmarket, Sandown Park and York all hosting World Pool racedays.

Since its inauguration, the number of World Pool races has increased dramatically, from 30 races held at Royal Ascot in 2019 to 135 races held across the nine different racecourses this year. The landmark £50-million figure comes as World Pool builds towards its final fixture of the 2024 British and Irish Flat season at Ascot this Saturday on QIPCO British Champions Day.

Michael Fitzsimons, Executive Director, Wagering Products at the HKJC, said, "World Pool has come such a long way since we first launched at Royal Ascot in 2019. It's been incredibly rewarding to see how much it has grown over the past six years and everyone at the Hong Kong Jockey Club is thrilled to see so much money going back into racing in so many different ways.

"As World Pool continues to grow its presence and popularity, further investment will flow back into the sport, continuing to boost prize money, which in turn should have a positive impact on the size and quality of fields. Healthy field sizes and high-quality racing is what grabs the attention and interest of punters across the globe."

In addition, the HKJC and partners have helped fund the World Pool Moment of the Day initiative for the past three seasons, which supports racing's grassroots by giving back to grooms. Each Moment of the Day winning groom receives a £4,000 cash prize and is also in with a chance of a VIP trip to Hong Kong.

The inaugural World Pool UK & Ireland Jockeys' Championship was also launched this year, with the winning rider receiving £50,000 to donate to a charity of his or her choice. Points are awarded based on the World Pool win dividend for every World Pool race in the UK and Ireland. With one meeting left to go, Billy Loughnane (187.50 points) has a commanding lead over his nearest pursuer, Oisin Murphy (97.25).

"We've both still got fire in our bellies and it looks the perfect fit," said Kelleway, who has saddled 11 winners in Britain so far this season. "I've always been tempted to go up north because I've had a lot of winners up there and that's where many of my owners are based."

Duffield, wife of former jockey George, cited the difficulties trainers face today as one of the driving forces behind the move.

She said, "It just makes more sense to share a business 50 per cent between us and go places than to keep 100 per cent and not go anywhere. Racing's a tough game and getting tougher--both our numbers were dwindling and this is a great way to be competitive moving forward. You have got to have the ammunition to go to war and this way we have the facilities, experienced and talented staff and a great environment to get back competing."
