



FIERCENESS COMPLETES CLASSIC PREPARATIONS AT SARATOGA

Repole Stable's 'TDN Rising Star' Fierceness (City of Light), expected to vie for favoritism in next Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Del Mar, turned in his final breeze Friday ahead of the \$7-million centerpiece of championship weekend, going a half-mile in :48.98 over the Oklahoma training track.

With his regular work rider Danny Wright in the irons, the homebred began his work slightly behind a workmate, drew alongside at the entrance to the stretch and was in front at the line before galloping out five furlongs in 1:02 1/5.

"It was another good breeze from him. He is pretty consistent with the way he goes every time. He appears to be doing it effortlessly," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "I was happy with the way the breeze went and the way he's been doing.

"It was kind of the same thing we've been doing--sit right off his workmate, join up, finish together, and kind of gallop-out on his own," Pletcher continued.

The conditioner believes he has Fierceness--last-out winner of the GI Travers Stakes--as good as he can have him for the Classic.

"It's hard to imagine him training any better than he did from the Jim Dandy to the Travers, but I would say he has been every bit as good, if not better," Pletcher said. **Cont. p3**

CHAMPION IDIOMATIC RULED OUT FOR BREEDERS' CUP WITH LAMENESS, WILL RETIRE SAYS JUDDMONTE

Eclipse Champion **Idiomatic** (Curlin--Lockdown, by First Defence) was found to be lame in her left knee Friday morning with an issue that should heal readily, according to a Juddmonte Farms press release early Friday.

The homebred has been ruled out for the GI Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff where she was set to take on MGISW **Thorpedo Anna** (Fast Anna).

Juddmonte has decided to retire the 5-year-old mare to the breeding shed. This is the first time she has been sidelined over the course of three seasons of racing.

Idiomatic won the Breeders' Cup Distaff at Santa Anita in 2023 and prepped for this year's edition when she captured for the second time in a row the GI Juddmonte Spinster Stakes at Keeneland Oct. 6. The accomplished mare won a total of five top level races over the course of her career. **Cont. p5**

"It seems like he's put on some weight and filled out a bit since the Travers as well-- you always love to see that with a 3-year-old in the fall."

Fierceness is the full-brother to fellow Repole runner **Mentee**, who earned a free pass into the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint when winning the GIII Futurity Stakes, but will instead try a mile in the GI Juvenile Turf.

"He's finished with his breezes, he's all set for the Juvenile Turf," Pletcher said. "All the New York horses are going to ship on Sunday."

That shipment will also include Donegal Racing's Futurity runner-up **Gate to Wire** (Munnings), who draws into the Juvenile Turf Sprint with the withdrawal of G2 Lowther Stakes heroine **Celandine** (GB) (Kingman {GB}).

"I thought he worked very well with the addition of blinkers last week," Pletcher commented. "He, too, has all of his preparations done. We are happy that he drew in."

Pletcher said that the Classic-bound 'TDN Rising Star' Tapit Trice (Tapit) will likely breeze at Belmont Saturday morning.

Joseph Pair Work Over the Oklahoma

Skippylongstocking (Exaggerator) earned the four-furlong bullet at Oklahoma on Friday morning, stopping the timer in :47.93 in the company of GIII Adirondack Stakes winner The Queens M G (Thousand Words).

The 5-year-old, most recently second to Tapit Trice in the GII Woodward Stakes, was cross-entered for the Classic and the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile with a first preference for the main event, but with news breaking Friday that 2023 National Treasure (Quality Road) would not be entered, Skippylongstocking will take his place in the eight-furlong contest, *Daily Racing Form* reported. The multi-millionaire was third in last year's Dirt Mile at Santa Anita. **Cont. p4**

"I thought he worked good," said Washonn Rochester, assistant to trainer Saffie Joseph, Jr. "We worked him in company with a decent filly. He did what we wanted to do and galloped out nicely. He was outside of The Queens M G, and he did exactly what the rider asked. Just sit off--he can be a bit keen--and then when they get down the lane, just finish up together and gallop-out the five-eighths. I think we are on the right path."

Rochester also oversaw the work of **Batucada** (Union Rags), runner-up to Raging Sea (Curlin) in the GII Ruffian Stakes who covered her half-mile in :48.20 in splits of:12 3/5 and :23 3/5 before pulling up five furlongs in 1:01 2/5 according to NYRA clockers. She is entered for the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff.

"She worked excellent. We worked her alone," said Rochester. "The same thing, exactly what we wanted to do, she got it done. She can be a bit fast at times. She can be rank. Today, it was perfect and executed well."

Though she owns the credentals for the Breeders' Cup, The Queens M G is being pointed for the Nov. 2 Tempted Stakes going a mile at Aqueduct.



May Day Ready Tunes Up For Juvenile Fillies Turf

May Day Ready (Tapit), who punched her ticket to the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf in the GII Jessamine Stakes at Keeneland Oct. 4, went a half-mile in :49.60 alongside stablemate Change Your Name (Blame) over the Belmont dirt training surface Friday morning under the watchful eye of trainer Joe Lee.

"She backed up to the seven-eighths and galloped to the half-mile pole," Lee explained. "They were basically head-and-head the whole way. It was a good work, and I was happy with that.

"She seems to have come out of the breeze in good order," Lee added. "We'll take a good look at her tomorrow and if all is well, she'll be leaving on Sunday."

May Day Ready is the mount of 15-time Breeders' Cup winner Frankie Dettori.



NATIONAL TREASURE OUT OF DIRT MILE, **MUSICAL CHAIRS ENSUES**

National Treasure (Quality Road), who gave eventual Horse of the Year Cody's Wish (Curlin) everything he could handle before going down grudgingly in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, will miss this year's event with a foot issue, Daily Racing Form reported Friday afternoon.

Winner of this year's GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational S. and GI Metropolitan Handicap either side of a close fourth in the G1 Saudi Cup, the 4-year-old may have struggled with an off track when sixth to Arthur's Ride (Tapit) in the GI Whitney Stakes Aug. 3 at Saratoga. In his lone start since, National Treasure made the majority of the running in the GI California Crown at Santa Anita Sept. 28 but was grabbed on the wire by Subsanador (Arg) (Fortify). National Treasure had not returned to the worktab since, and the Form reported that a work scheduled for Saturday was canceled.

DRF also reported that the connections of **Skippylongstocking** (Exaggerator) have elected to go in the Dirt Mile over their stated first preference in the Classic. Trainer Saffie Joseph, Jr. told the publication that Irad Ortiz, Jr. would have the call. That decision means that Pyrenees (Into Mischief) draws into the Classic with Brian Hernandez, Jr. to ride, according to DRF.

POSSIBLE SPRINT FAVORITE MULIKIN, KILWIN TURN IN BC WORKS AT KEENELAND

Siena Farm and WinStar Farm's Mullikin (Violence), perfect in four starts this term and one of the favorites for the GI Breeders'Cup Sprint, went a half-mile in :47.60 in the company of GII Amsterdam Stakes-winning 'TDN Rising Star' World Record (Gun Runner, :47.80) over the Keeneland main track Friday morning (video).

The 4-year-old colt, who demolished his rivals by 5 3/4 lengths in the GI Forego Stakes at Saratoga Aug. 24, was timed in fractions of :24.40 and :36.20 before galloping out five furlongs in 1:00.60.

"That is what we were looking for--nothing fancy," Brisset said. "He did it very easily with his regular exercise rider (Pedro Alvarez). We are where we need to be."

Earlier Friday morning, BBN Racing's Kilwin (Twirling Candy), perfect in two tries including the Untapable Stakes at Kentucky Downs, went a half-mile in :48.60 (video).

"The work was fine," trainer Rusty Arnold said. "Very smooth, no issues. Nice easy half. She did her major work last week (a half-mile on a fast dirt in :48.40). Today was just to keep her in good shape. We weren't looking for anything spectacular, just a maintenance work."

GUN RUNNER TO STAND FOR \$250K IN 2025

Three Chimneys has released its 2025 roster and fees and topping the list is Horse of the Year Gun Runner (by Candy Ride {Arg})--the sire of 13 millionaires and 10 Grade 1 winners--who after being listed privately in 2024 will stand for a fee of \$250,000 LFSN, the farm said via a release on Friday.

Currently second on the General Sire list with almost \$16 million in progeny earnings, Gun Runner is the sire of four Grade I winners this year including Sierra Leone, Vahva, Society and Gun Pilot, who are all are pointing to this year's Breeders' Cup. Sea Runner, a juvenile filly, is also pre-entered for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf.

In 2024, at the sales Gun Runner had 10 yearlings sell for \$1 million or more including a \$1.9 million colt at Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga Sale and a \$2.2 million colt at Keeneland September.

"Gun Runner is continuing to prove our dreams can become a reality, and Thee Chimneys and our partners continue to breed our best mares to him which we believe will further his influence on the breed," Three Chimneys Chairman Goncalo Torrealba said. "We are excited to also bring home one of his promising Grade I winning sons in Gun Pilot, who was bred and raised here at Three Chimneys."

As previously reported, Gun Runner's son GISW Gun Pilot, new to Three Chimneys for 2025, will have his stud fee announced after the running of the GI Cygames Breeders' Cup Sprint which will be his final start.

Into Mischief's son **Newgate**, who won the GI Santa Anita Handicap, will also be a new roster member. The current 4-year-old colt makes his next start in the GI Longines Breeders' Cup Classic. **Cont. p9**

Volatile (by Violence), who is the sire of 15 winners to date including two Grade I performers, will stand for a fee of \$12,500 LFSN.

"Volatile is a great value opportunity with a lot of up-side to breeders this year--he already has two legitimate Grade I horses that will be pointing for important races next year, and he has plenty of winners. I believe his runners are showing that they are like him--quick enough at two, but they will be even better as they mature as 3-year-olds," said Three Chimneys board member and advisor Doug Cauthen.

Sky Mesa (by Pulpit) will stand for \$10,000 LFSN while Funtastic (by More Than Ready), sire of First Peace (\$778,520), the recent winner of the GII California Crown Eddie D Stakes, will stand for \$5,000 LFSN.

PRINCE OF MONACO RETIRED TO CLAIBORNE, WILL STAND FOR \$30,000

Claiborne Farm will stand for \$30,000 LFSN the newly-retired **'TDN Rising Star'** Prince of Monaco (by Speightstown), during the 2025 breeding season, the stud farm said in a Friday press release.

"Prince of Monaco has sustained minor bone bruising, preventing him from competing in the Sprint and Malibu races," said co-owner Tom Ryan of SF Racing. "As a result, we have decided to retire him. He demonstrated brilliance almost every time he stepped onto the racetrack."

The current 3-year-old colt, who will available for inspection at Claiborne in Paris, Kentucky during the November sales, earned his 'Rising Star' badge last year when he broke his maiden at first asking by eight lengths for trainer Bob Baffert over the Los Alamitos course that July.

A next-out winner of the GIII Best Pal Stakes at Del Mar a month and a half later, the 2-year-old delivered in the GI Runhappy Del Mar Futurity in early September. As a 3-year-old, Prince of Monaco raced twice and was the runner-up in both the GI Woody Stephens at Saratoga June 8 and in the GI H. Allen Jerkens Memorial Stakes over the same surface Aug. 24.

"Running a 103 Beyer as a 2-year-old is a significant achievement and a great barometer of talent and ability," said Walker Hancock. "Additionally, he was only beaten a combined three-quarters of a length in two premier Grade I races at Saratoga this summer, while dealing with troubled trips. We have a tremendous amount of respect for Stonestreet's breeding program and we are excited to add another one of their homebreds in Prince of Monaco to our stallion roster."

A \$950,000 purchase at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Select Sale, Prince of Monaco raced for the partnership of SF Racing, Starlight Racing, Madaket Stables, Stonestreet Stables, Dianne Bashor, Robert Masterson, Waves Edge Capital, Catherine Donovan and Tom Ryan.

"SF Bloodstock has been Speightstown's biggest fan and supporters for going on two decades now," said Ryan. "On the heels of having Charlatan, we are very excited to be associated with Speightstown's fastest 2-year-old ever in Prince of Monaco. You would be hard pressed to find a better-looking animal and we are staunch in our beliefs that he will fall into the successful footsteps of his father."

The only son of Speightstown to win a Grade I as a juvenile, Prince of Monaco was bred in Kentucky by Barbara Banke's Stonestreet program and is out of the Medaglia d'Oro mare Rainier, who is a half-sister to SW Laurie's Rocket (Bluegrass Cat) and SW Greeley's Rocket (Mr. Greeley).

"I am excited for what lies ahead," said Banke. "Prince of Monaco has been a standout since birth, with his natural talent and athleticism evident from the start. His speed, heart, and sheer brilliance on the track will make him an extraordinary stallion. He's the complete package, and I can't wait to see him pass on that exceptional talent to future generations."








KEENELAND BREEDER FOCUS: CLASSY SIENA MARES JUST A SAMPLE OF A WIDER LEGACY

So it turns out that there are last days, too.

It was axiomatic with Anthony Manganaro that every day in business should be treated like your first. "If it's the second day, you're falling behind," he would say. Because it was on your first day that you always asked: "What can we do different, what can we do better?"

But this questing, vital force was extinguished in August 2023, at 79, and it has meanwhile been the melancholy duty of those he left behind to package up his Turf legacy. Siena Farm itself is on the market, and the foals will follow next year, but another paragraph of its closing chapter will be written at the Keeneland November Sale with the dispersal, through Taylor Made, of its broodmare band.

A poignant process, plainly, for his family and team--not to mention a privileged opportunity for other breeders out there. But if Manganaro's legacy is to be properly valued, it will not be confined to these tangible assets, however expertly curated. To those who worked with him most closely, his true bequest is a mindset that the whole industry can emulate: to be always looking forward, always improving.

"Just because that's truly how he lived," says the farm's Chief Operating Officer Ryan Smith. "He would always be pushing for the future. He would joke about, 'Hey, this isn't for me. I'm going to be dead in five years. This is for you guys, for everybody else.' Because he truly cared about building things to last, so that everybody could continue to do what they love, continue to prosper."

That way, Manganaro could make his own story not just redemptive but exemplary. Son of a Sicilian plasterer, he was among six children raised in a two-bedroom flat in blue-collar Everett outside Boston. When he sought financing from a Baltimore bank, he met a wall of prejudice; he later became their biggest customer.

In the same way, the kid who fell in love with horses after joining his father and his buddies at Suffolk Downs, handicapping claimers, ended up as a co-owner of Flightline. In the meantime, in 2007, Manganaro had played up some of his business winnings (from real estate, self-storage and medical supplies) in a 225-acre farm outside Paris, Kentucky.

His partners in this new boutique breeding venture, David Pope and Ignacio ("Nacho") Patino, shared a similar heritage of striving. "We understand from life experiences how important it is to give employees and their families hope and dignity," Manganaro once told *TDN*. Pope was indebted to Polish immigrants who had toiled through the darkness of mines and factory night shifts to bring the light of opportunity and education to the next generation. And Patino had himself perilously crossed the Rio Grande to eke a way out of poverty as a teenager. "All three of us," Manganaro said proudly, "are living the American Dream."

But while the obituaries uniformly saluted him as far-sighted and driven by ideals, Manganaro understood that even the biggest picture ultimately reduces to pixels. The depth of his perspectives never distracted him from the detail of the foreground.

"He was certainly a visionary," Smith says. "But he did understand the bits and pieces that went into it. To him, people were the cornerstone and that's what you have to focus on. Because nothing will get done unless everybody's aligned, and everybody is secure. Not just financially secure, but intellectually, so that they feel respected, that they are working towards something that is motivating. To me, this is what was most impressive. He had such intuition for the inner workings of things, even in fields totally unrelated to any experience that he'd ever had."

Take technology. Smith, who started on the farm as a college intern, never expected a man half a century his senior to be as conversant with its functioning and potential.

"But I would always be surprised," Smith recalls. "Even though it was a field that was basically foreign to him, and there might be a little miscommunication on the way, at the end of the day I always realized that, wow, he really understood how this specific thing needed to come together or what was required to get it done."


So while Manganaro always navigated to the horizon, he knew to follow the trail one step after another. Day-to-day decisions and conduct had to be consistent with the ambitions of years or decades. That way, ends and means would become seamless.

"He pushed us to be our best, here at Siena Farm," Smith reflects. "But everything we did, we tried to do with the industry in mind as well. We wanted to be the best: that's what we pushed ourselves for, that's what we worked on every day. But we were also trying to participate with the community, with the initiatives pushing the industry forward, for instance with Maryland. It was all about helping to revitalize the sport, and find a new look for it: improve racetracks, improve Thoroughbred care, improve every facet."

And, actually, these final duties take the Siena Farm team precisely to that margin between overall impact and highly specific responsibilities.

"It's been a bit of a process," Smith concedes of the past year. "We've had more time to digest it now, but it has certainly been very difficult. Parts of it are sad, but parts are just amazing and beautiful, too: to look back and reflect on everything that has been achieved here at the farm. It's definitely coming to a head now, with the farm listed for sale and seeing these mares in a catalogue. Nothing ever feels quite real until it happens. **Cont.**



"So a difficult time, for sure, but we have been incredibly grateful to have Anthony's son Todd assisting us through this process. We would not have been able to do this without his help. And also Anthony's grandson Nick, who's a tremendous person and a true fan of the sport. They're ensuring that we handle these next steps as best as possible and with the dignity that we would hope."

There's that word, again. Dignity. And that, as it happens, is the name of the prodigious bronze sculpture that greets visitors to the farm: a 30' x 10' x 20' plowhorse. Manganaro was inspired to commission sculptor Zachary Oxman by the 1981 papal encyclical *Laborem Exercens*, in which Pope John Paul II celebrated the relationship between work and human dignity. As Smith remarks of the statue: "It was very important to Anthony--and the story behind is incredibly fitting for everything that he championed, everything that has been done here at the farm."

At least one Siena horse, then, is not going anywhere! But what of those to be dispersed at Keeneland next week? What kind of brand will breeders be tapping into, if they manage to land one of these mares? The sheer quality is manifest simply in the covering sires listed through the first session: a mare apiece pregnant to Justify, Flightline, Not This Time, Nyquist and Life Is Good, plus two carrying Good Magic foals.

"There's a lot to it," says Smith. "But what we hope everybody gets to see is just a piece of the Siena program. And this is really to the credit of Nacho. He's not just the general manager, doesn't just take the absolute best care of the horses, but he's been instrumental in all the decisions that have built up a really tremendous program over the years. When you look at our percentages of black-type horses and winners, we have done very well for a farm of our size. So we're hoping that everybody

gets to see what the bigger picture was, how these mares fit into that program, and then how they could find a spot in theirs too."

There's an auspicious template already. One of the first stars of the Siena Farm program, homebred Angela Renee (Bernardini), won a Grade I winner before being sold for \$3 million. Her first five yearlings through the ring have already cleared \$4 million.

"We've had some pretty strong success producing foals over the years, and still have quite a few of those families throughout our broodmare band," Smith says. "And over more recent years, we've also been looking to acquire mares of value, whether for their pedigrees or because they can really produce top-notch physicals. For example, Joyful Addiction [1036] (by Munnings, first two dams both Grade I winners) has already produced a very nice Constitution. A more recent purchase, Medaglia Mo (Medaglia d'Oro) [684], is another where we really like the foal. We think mares like this will be a tremendous asset wherever they end up. And I must say that Taylor Made, a tremendous partner to us over the years, have done a very thoughtful job in helping us position these mares appropriately."

Already before the penultimate crop of yearlings were sold, in September, a commitment was made to maintain the Siena brand in racetrack partnerships. And that gives everyone a forward focus as they contemplate how their individual paths might continue from here. For Smith, certainly, Manganaro's influence will never fade.

"It was funny, he basically poached me out of college," Smith recalls. "I was here one summer in the middle of school. Two weeks in, he said, 'Hey, how about you help us form this technological research company, and just stay here full time?' And I have been here ever since.

"I am incredibly grateful to have had him as mentor. I just had so many eye-opening, enlightening moments with him. He was an incredibly intelligent, generous, motivated, and hardworking person. And he truly cared for people. He was passionate about education, about helping people to learn. He helped people complete things bigger than themselves. And that helped not just them, but also their families, the spheres around them. Everything he did, his whole life, was about pushing people to be better."

Sent off at odds just shy of 3-1, Poolside With Slim was produced through a narrow opening at the fence in the homestretch by Frankie Dettori and after a moment's hesitation, kicked on and outgamed pacesetting Pharoah's Wine to win Friday's GII Bank of America Valley View Stakes on the penultimate day of racing at Keeneland.

A troubled fourth to Valley View favorite Les Reys (Fr) (Penny's Picnic {Ire}) when last seen in the Winter Memories Stakes at Aqueduct Sept. 13, Poolside With Slim--who carried Dettori to a victory in the Penn Oaks earlier this season--was first away from the machine and led through the opening exchanges, but came back nicely to the Italian and sat the box-seat from fourth as 25-1 Pharoah's Wine took them along at a steady gallop.

Poised if good enough turning for home, Poolside With Slim was asked for her best and went for the rails run as Pharoah's Wine vacated the fence. She took a few strides to hit her top gear, but she dug in bravely and kept on determinedly to become the first North American graded winner for her Coolmore Stud-based stallion. Buttercream Babe, prominent throughout, just held third, while Les Reys could manage only a fifth placing.

GUN SONG IN MOTHER GOOSE, TRIKARI IN BRYAN STATION LEAD GRADED STAKES SATURDAY

With less than a week until the Breeders' Cup World Championships, you can pregame with a bevy of graded stakes races across three tracks and two types of surfaces on Saturday.

Heading up to the Belmont At The Big A meet, the New York Racing Association has carded a trio of graded contests. Chief among them is the GII Mother Goose Stakes for 3-year-old fillies going nine furlongs on the dirt.

At first glance, this appears to be a street fight between the pair that ran second and third to MGISW **Thorpedo Anna** (Fast Anna) in the GI Cotillion Stakes at Parx Sept. 21. **Gun Song** (**Gun Runner**) nearly upset the 'Grizzly' only to lose by a neck and '**TDN Rising Star' Tarifa** (Bernardini) completed the trifecta.

"That was a huge effort [against Thorpedo Anna]," Gun Song's trainer Mark Hennig said. "I've always felt like she's got a lot of ability if she puts it all together on the right day. She came close, but [Thorpedo] Anna is tough and found a way.

"If someone could have just held her inside there a little longer, we might have pulled off a stunner."

A potential wild card against these two is lightly-raced **Headline Numbers** (Gun Runner). The Chad Brown trainee earned **'TDN Rising Star'** honors on debut at the Big A July 4 when she won by an eye-catching 11 3/4 lengths. At the Spa against optional claimers Aug. 22, the filly was the runner-up before being elevated to the top spot on the podium after a disqualification.

The other pair of graded races on the docket are GII Bold Ruler Stakes which has GIII Vosburgh Stakes runner-up **Scotland** (Good Magic), and the GIII Forty Niner Stakes with 'TDN Rising Star' and MGSW Messier (Empire Maker).

Keeneland is due to close out its fall meet over the weekend and they card two higher level races with the GII Hagyard Fayette Stakes going nine furlongs for older males over the main track and for 3-year-olds over the grass at a mile in the renewal of the GIII Bryan Station Stakes.

The Fayette includes morning-line favorite **Hit Show** (Candy Ride {Arg}) who rolls into town off a pair of wins in the West Virginia Governor's Stakes at Mountaineer in early August and a score in the GII Lukas Classic Stakes at Churchill Downs Sept. 28. The 4-year-old will face nine others, which includes the tactically-inclined MGSP **Tumbarumba** (Oscar Performance).

On the Haggin Course for the Bryan Station, look for the accomplished Graham Motion trainee **Trikari** (Oscar Performance) to take money. The colt received a huge resume builder when he took home the GI Belmont Derby in early July and then won the GII Secretariat Stakes at Colonial a little over a month later. If the bay is near the pace, it could spell trouble for the rest of this group.

Still, it is not going to be a cakewalk for Trikari since he is facing Canadian champion 2-year-old My Boy Prince (Cairo Prince), and the runner-up in the aforementioned Secretariat, Brilliant Berti (Noble Mission {GB}). Add a runner like Evade (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}), an up-and-coming Irish import trained by Michael Maker who made his first U.S. start when fourth in the GI Franklin Simpson Stakes at Kentucky Downs, and the final furlong is going to be customarily contentious.

The action is not done yet, as 3-year-olds go nine furlongs on the turf in the GII Twilight Derby at Santa Anita Park.

The morning-line favorite is GSW **Stay Hot** (Summer Front), who owns three wins over the local course for trainer Peter Eurton. The bay's bread and butter is to offer a well-timed ride from off the pace, but that strategy resulted in a runner-up finish last time out in the GII Del Mar Derby Sept. 1. Also exiting that very race is the horse that ran third, **Atitlan** (The Factor).

Looking to win his first stakes race is **Cathal (Ire)** (No Nay Never) for trainer John Sadler. The colt surged late to clear the optional claiming ranks at the seaside oval Sept. 1, and he is going to have the services for the first time of top jockey Juan Hernandez.

In a four-horse field where trainers Bob Baffert and Tim Yakteen accounted for the entire group, it was Silent Law (f, 2, Tiz the Law--Southern Silence, by Dixie Union) who put the pedal to the metal and never gave her foes a chance in the Anoakia Stakes at Santa Anita.


There was a Stewards' Inquiry involving the entire field focusing on the shuffle shortly after the jump, but no change was made to the running order.

Commenting on Casalu's performance, Baffert added, "My other horse [Casalu], the dirt hit her, and she didn't like that, so we will put her back on the turf. I just had to know for sure if it was turf or dirt with her."

Silent Law, who brought \$400,000 as a 2-year-old in-training at OBSOPN this summer, is the fifth stakes runner for her dam, whose other black type horses found their success on the Ohio circuits. Her half-sister Esplanande foaled a 2024 filly by Flightline this season. Southern Silence most recently produced a 2024 colt by Uncle Mo and went to Practical Joke for 2025. 



Top sprinter **Big Evs (Ire)** will stand at Tally-Ho Stud next season. The son of Blue Point (Ire) will retire following his run in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint at Del Mar, a race he is a general 8-1 chance for.

Big Evs is the leading sprinter of his generation, a Group 1-winning two-year-old who has beaten some of the best older horses in a series of top-class efforts this season at three for trainer Mick Appleby.

Sourced by Conor Quirke on behalf of Paul and Rachael Teasdale's RP Racing Ltd from Micky Cleere early in his juvenile year, he was a dominant winner at Royal Ascot when running out a three-length winner of the Listed Windsor Castle Stakes.

From there, he won the G3 Molecomb Stakes at Goodwood and then the G2 Flying Childers Stakes at Doncaster before heading to Santa Anita for the Breeders' Cup, where he landed the Juvenile Turf Sprint with fellow Royal Ascot winners Valiant Force and Crimson Advocate in behind.

Tally-Ho Stud commented, "We are delighted to be standing a horse with such pure speed and consistent class. He looked very special the day he won the Windsor Castle Stakes and his performances since have confirmed his place as an elite sprinter of recent years." Cont. p3

'I KNEW WE HAD TO HAVE HIM'-MILL STREAM BOUND FOR YEOMANSTOWN STUD NEXT YEAR

This year's G1 July Cup winner **Mill Stream (Ire)** will begin his stallion career at Yeomanstown Stud next season, the stud announced on Friday. A stud fee will be revealed at a later date.

Raced by Peter Harris and trained by Jane Chapple-Hyam, the 4-year-old was a juvenile winner and took the Listed Prix Moonlight Cloud and G3 Prix de Meautry in succession at three. However, he enjoyed his best season on the track this term, which began with a second-place finish in the G3 Abernant Stakes, and a victory in the G2 Duke Of York Stakes. Third in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes in June, he clawed out a neck victory in the July Cup. His current record stands at 16-5-3-2 and \$859,650 in earnings.

'IT'S A MASSIVE RACE FOR US': OWEN DREAMING AHEAD OF HAWKEYE'S FUTURITY BID by Tom Frary

In a year that has seen the famous Gredley colours spring back to prominence, Saturday's G1 William Hill Futurity Trophy at Doncaster hosts their exciting 2-year-old Wimbledon Hawkeye (GB) (Kameko) who bids to emulate his sire's success in this mile feature and lift the James Owen stable to the heights. Relishing the step up to this trip and an easier surface when upstaging the re-opposing Royal Playwright (GB) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) in Newmarket's G2 Royal Lodge Stakes last month, the homebred is one of an intriguing renewal's standard-setters.

"He looks a hugely exciting horse with a bright future and not only were we thrilled with him in the Royal Lodge, but thrilled with him all season and how he has progressed," Owen said of the likely favourite, who was previously second to The Lion In Winter (Ire) (Sea The Stars (Ire)) in the G3 Acomb Stakes on fast ground over seven at York in August. "I'm excited and nervous at the same time and it's a massive race for us."

"He's training great and we couldn't be happier with him at home. We've got our fingers crossed for a big run and if he can put up the same performance as he did at Newmarket, then hopefully he will have a good chance."

Also successful in one of Newmarket's autumn pattern races was Ballydoyle's **TDN Rising Star Delacroix (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who despite winning the G3 Autumn Stakes gave the impression yet again that he is a work in progress. He would make it a dozen wins for the stable in a race that fits the kind of colt in which they specialise, but two runs back he was on the receiving end of a beating from the Jessie Harrington-trained Green

Impact (Ire) (Wootton Bassett (GB)) in Leopardstown's G2 Champions Juvenile Stakes and it is notable that the trainer is here with Silverton Hill's G2 Beresford Stakes and G3 Tyros Stakes winner Hotazhell (GB) (Too Darn Hot {GB}).

This is a race that has yet to feature on John Gosden's honour roll, so it is up to the two unbeaten colts in Juddmonte's **Detain** (Ire) (Wootton Bassett (GB)) and Imad Al Sagar's Nebras (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) to put that to rights. The former, who has won his two starts at Kempton by a cumulative margin of nine lengths, is a half-brother to the soft-ground lover Arrest (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) while the latter who earned TDN Rising Star status on debut at Newmarket earlier this month is kin to the owner's outstanding Nashwa (GB) (Frankel {GB}).

Barry Mahon, European racing manager for Juddmonte, said of the former, "I think his future probably is ahead of him, he's a big horse and physically he was a little weak during the year. It looks a cracking renewal of the Futurity with a deep field. James Owen's horse and Aidan O'Brien's horse both looked good when winning at Newmarket and I thought Andrew Balding's horse [Royal Playwright] was a big price the way he finished off behind Wimbledon Hawkeye the last day."

Nebras's jockey Hollie Doyle said of the supplemented colt, "It's exciting, he's got so much ability but obviously this is a big step up into group 1 company. It won't be easy to win, but it will be very interesting as I think he's got a big engine. It's just whether he can apply himself at that level at this stage of his career after just one run."

Also in the mix is Godolphin's unbeaten Anno Domini (GB) (New Bay {GB}), last seen beating Windlord (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) under a penalty at Sandown in July. That form looked better when the runner-up went on to finish just over a length behind Hotazhell in the Beresford and Charlie Appleby is making all the right noises about the relative of Alpinista (GB) (Frankel {GB}) et al. "He's two from two and he's a breeze-up horse who won well on debut and went and backed it up with a cosy performance at Sandown," he said. "I think he might appreciate slower conditions as long as it's not heavy, because he is a horse I'm stepping up in trip and coming off the back of a bit of a lay-off. It's always a race where you need to see it out well in conditions, but his homework has been good and we're going there with a bit of confidence behind him."

Benevento Goes For The Horris Hill...

Saturday's other juvenile pattern races are Newbury's G3 Horris Hill Stakes and Chantilly's G3 Prix Miesque over seven furlongs, with the former featuring Amo Racing and Giselle De Aguiar's Listed Flying Scotsman Stakes winner **Benevento (Ire)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}) and the latter Everest Racing, Qatar Racing and Barbara Keller's **Lhakpa (Ire)** (Siyouni {Fr}) who was sixth in a hot renewal of the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac last time.

DECLARATIONS FOR SAINT-CLOUD'S GROUP 1 JUVENILE CONTESTS REVEALED

With an aggregate 104 engaged at the beginning of the week, contestants for Sunday's two juvenile Group 1 contests at Saint-Cloud have been whittled down to 10 after declarations were confirmed Friday morning.

The one-mile G1 Criterium International has six declared for a mouthwatering renewal which features 'TDN Rising Stars'

Maranoa Charlie (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}), the lone Frenchtrained runner remaining, and supplementary entry Twain (Ire) (Wootton Bassett {GB}). The latter, who makes a swift return to action after debuting in style at Leopardstown last Saturday, is set to be accompanied by his Aidan O'Brien-trained stablemate Mount Kilimanjaro (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}), who was the joint highest-priced lot when knocked down for €420,000 at last year's Arqana October yearling sale. The line-up is completed by Goffs Million victor Apples And Bananas (Ire) (Wootton Bassett {GB}), G3 Solario Stakes runner-up Matauri Bay (Ire) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) and the Andrew Balding-trained maiden Spirit Of Summer (GB) (Mohaather {GB}).

The 10-furlong G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud has just four engaged with those remaining all from overseas. Aidan O'Brien relies on G1 Fillies' Mile third and supplementary entry **Ballet Slippers (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), the lone filly across both fields, while son Joseph will saddle G2 Beresford Stakes runner-up **Tennessee Stud (Ire)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}). The quartet also includes Peter Chapple-Hyam trainee **Harvey (Fr)** (Le Havre

{Ire}), who ran third behind Maranoa Charlie in last month's G3 Prix Thomas Bryon, and Charlie Johnston representative **Green Storm (Ire)** (Circus Maximus {Ire}). With five runs under his belt, the latter is the most experienced left standing and was last seen running second in this month's G3 Zetland Stakes at Newmarket.

France's final Group 1 contest of the season, the G1 Prix Royal-Oak, takes place later on the card and has attracted a field of eight. Last year's winner **Double Major (Ire)** (Daiwa Major {Jpn}) will return off a fifth in the G1 Prix du Cadran on Arc weekend and his rivals include mud-loving Cadran runner-up **Trueshan** (Fr) (Planteur {Ire}) and G1 St Leger fifth **Grosvenor Square (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}).

OSTRAKA CAUSES MERCURY UPSET

Sent off at 66-1 for Friday's G3 Mercury Stakes at Dundalk, Ostraka (Ire) (Profitable {Ire}) was able to up her game sufficiently to record a career-best back on the Polytrack. Successful in five-furlong handicaps at The Curragh and Navan this summer, the Daniel Murphy-trained 4-year-old was up with the pace from the outset and after edging ahead inside the final two furlongs toughed it out to deny the two-years-younger Powerful Nation (Ire) (Sioux Nation) by a head.

"I don't know what to say--I'm shellshocked, but I did fancy her. I did like the mare and she was working great," her trainer said. "I believe a lot of these sprints are all in the break. We've had a disappointing year, but they are coming right now. She is staying around for sure. She will be a nice mare next year and I could even travel with her I'd say, she likes firm ground."

Pedigree Notes

Ostraka is a daughter of the Listed Abergwaun Stakes-placed Ostatnia (Ire) (Amadeus Wolf {GB}), whose unraced dam Ostrusa (Aut) (Rustan {Hun}) also produced the Irish cult hero sprinter Osterhase (Ire) (Flying Spur {Aus}). Successful in the G3 Phoenix Sprint Stakes, he also captured multiple listed races and was a stalwart on the scene. DETTORI TO REPLACE SHOEMARK ABOARD EMILY UPJOHN IN BREEDERS' CUP TURF

John Gosden has revealed that Frankie Dettori will ride **Emily Upjohn (GB)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}) in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf rather than tackling the Filly & Mare Turf which had been the original target.

"It's very simple, she is going to run in the Turf, Frankie is based in America, he's ridden Del Mar hundreds of times, so to that extent it is very clear he will be riding the filly, he knows the filly and he knows the track," Gosden told the *Nick Luck Daily* podcast. Cont. p8

He added, "Kieran (Shoemark) knows the filly, but has never really ridden much in America and certainly hasn't ridden at Del Mar.

"You've got to remember about this track that it is built inside the old main Jimmy Durante turf course, it is the tightest and certainly has the shortest straight of any course I ever knew in America.

"When you straighten up you only have just over a furlong to run. It's all about tactical position on a turning track, it's not exactly a place you want to go unless you are fully aware of how it works and Kieran is fully understanding of that.

"We're leaning towards the Turf because it's a longer run to the first bend and she's better at a mile and a half on the track."

DERBY WINNER MASAR RELOCATES TO SUNNYHILL STUD IN IRELAND FOR 2025

A statement released by Darley read, "Masar made history in 2018, becoming the first horse to ever carry the Godolphin blue silks to victory in the Derby and has enjoyed success as a sire since, with a number of promising horses from his first two crops."

Just one lot later, an Ulysses (Ire) filly caught the eye of Meridian International for €45,000. Consigned by Haras d'Haspel, she is out of Verandah (GB) (Medicean {GB}), a full-sister to Dimension (GB), a three-time graded winner in Canada, and a half-sister to G2 May Hill Stakes and G2 Windsor Forest Stakes heroine Spacious (GB) (Nayef). 


Overall, 26 lots sold from 46 offered (56%), for a gross of £104,350. The average was £4,013 and the median was £2,750.

AUTUMN FLAVOUR TO TENNO SHO, AS LIBERTY ISLAND MAKES HER RETURN

Japanese horses returning from overseas exploits and melding back into the local population with more Pattern race glory is not a rarity, and 2023 Japanese Triple Tiara heroine **Liberty Island (Jpn)** (Duramente {Jpn}) aims to do just that in the 2000-metre G1 Tenno Sho (Autumn) at Tokyo on Sunday.

A winner of the 2022 G1 Hanshin Juvenile Fillies in addition to her Classic heroics (Oka Sho, Yushun Himba and Shuka Sho) last term, the bay found only superstar Equinox (Jpn) (Kitasan Black {Jpn}) too good in the G1 Japan Cup last November. Only seen once in 2024, the now 4-year-old filly was third to Rebel's Romance (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. Set to be ridden by Yuga Kawada, the Sunday Racing runner leaves from post 12.

"Traveling abroad has definitely had an effect on her mentally," said Kawada. "The experience of flying in an airplane and of racing in unfamiliar surroundings, has made her much stronger." Cont. p14

He added, "This will be her first race since March and she did have some trouble with her legs earlier. So, after being allowed to slowly recover, she was also allowed to slowly come back up to her best. I watched her workout this week and was told she was far more relaxed. She gets work every day and this week's fast work showed her improvement. I'll head to the gate with no worries."

One of the filly's biggest hurdles is the quality of her rivals, and she faces not one, but two G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) winners with Do Deuce (Jpn) (Heart's Cry (Jpn)) (2022) and Tastiera (Jpn) (Satono Crown {Jpn}) (2023). Last year's G1 Arima Kinen winner, Do Deuce also traveled to Dubai, winding up fifth in the G1 Dubai Turf to Facteur Cheval (Ire) (Ribchester {Ire}). However, he was in action in June when sixth in the G1 Takarazuka Kinen, behind 2023 G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas) winner Sol Oriens (Jpn) (Kitasan Black {Jpn}) in second, one better than G1 Osaka Hai scorer Bellagio Opera (Jpn) (Lord Kanaloa (Jpn)). Legendary reinsman Yutaka Take will be aboard, and if the duo find themselves in the winner's circle, Take will have piloted a record-equaling seventh Tenno Sho (Autumn) winner.

Trainer Yasuo Tomomichi said, "His preparation has gone well since his return to the training center. On Oct. 17, he worked over the woodchip course in a group of three. As always, his footwork was fabulous. His body has also gotten bigger. He can do well over 2400 and 2500 meters, but I think the Tokyo 2000 meters is his best trip."

Although he is only third favourite in the antepost betting, **Lebensstil (Jpn)** (Real Steel {Jpn}) is poised to cause a stir in his first Japanese Group 1. The Carrot Farm runner never tried his hands in the Classics, but two of his three 4-year-old starts have resulted in victories--the G3 Epsom Cup at Tokyo in June, and the G2 Sankei Sho All Comers Stakes at Nakayama over 2200 metres on Sept. 22, defeating the dual Classic-placed Stella **Veloce (Jpn)** (Bago (Fr)) in the latter. Paired with Christophe Lemaire, the duo are booked in stall 14 in the 15-horse field.

Trainer Hiroyasu Tanaka said, "I have the impression that the horse has matured mentally. Physically, he is slowly getting stronger. This morning [Oct. 23], his time did get a little fast, but not enough to spell overwork. He had a good air about him and I think he's at the level of fitness for him to be able to respond as he needs to. It'll be his first time over the course but I don't think that will be a problem."
