





FIERCENESS TO STAND AT ASHFORD STUD UPON RETIREMENT; REPOLE SAYS PLANS CALL FOR HIM TO RACE AT FOUR

Champion juvenile and 'TDN Rising Star' MGISW Fierceness (City of Light) will join the ranks at Ashford Stud upon his retirement from racing, the farm announced via release Sunday.

The champion juvenile from 2023 is a leading GI Breeders' Cup Classic contender and will likely be one of the favorites at posttime. Of the others, Coolmore will have two other rooting interests as well with 'TDN Rising Star' GISW Sierra Leone (Gun Runner) and 'TDN Rising Star' MG1SW-Eng City of Troy (Justify) in the race. That group accounts for three of the first four in the wagering.

Trainer Todd Pletcher said that no decision had been made as to the horse's retirement, and that running him at four was certainly in the discussion. "I don't think any decision on his retirement is going to be made until after the Breeders' Cup, and I'm sure we'll have discussions as to what is the best route for the horse."

Nobody should have been to surprised when Tarifa (Bernardini) won Saturday's GII Mother Goose S. at the Belmont at the Big A meet, turning the tables on the favored Gun Song (Gun Runner). The same goes for Saturday's GII Fayette S. at Keeneland, won by the Cox-trained Hit Show (Candy Ride {Arg}). Starting one month ago, on Sept. 27, he's been on a tear, winning 12 of the 17 (70 % percent) stakes races he has entered in.


Overall, Cox is 20-for-63 (32%) for the month of October. He ran away with the fall meet training title at Keeneland with 14 wins from 37 starters. At Belmont at the Big A meet he's won 11 of 28 starts (39%).

"He was a fantastic two-year-old that has carried it on to three and is physically improving, so I would think that a consideration of a four-year-old campaign will be in the discussions."

Owner Mike Repole has retained a significant stake in the horse as a stallion.

"Even though this is breaking news, Fierceness's stallion rights were negotiated after the Breeders' Cup Juvenile to Coolmore America," said Repole in a statement released on X.

"I am staying in with a significant share in Fierceness's breeding rights. The plan is to win the Breeders' Cup and beat Coolmore's City of Troy. This negotiated deal also includes a provision for Fierceness to run back as a 4YO. Coolmore will receive 50% of Fierceness's racing rights for his 4YO campaign."


"When negotiating the deal a year ago, I was very clear with Coolmore that I wanted this horse, if healthy and sound, to run as a 4YO. Coolmore is also of the understanding that I am clearly for, and aggressively pushing, an industry-wide mare cap of 200 mares per stallion. Not to get too far ahead of myself, but I would love for Fierceness to start his 4YO campaign in the Saudi Cup."

Fierceness was a runaway winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Santa Anita by 6 1/4 lengths last year, and turned the GI Florida Derby into an exhibition early this spring, winning by 13 1/2 lengths en route to his start in the GI Kentucky Derby. Finishing 15th in America's premier Classic, he returned to the races in late July in the GII Jim Dandy Stakes with redemption in mind, and claimed it by a length over Sierra Leone. He was last seen defeating 'TDN Rising Star' MGISW Thorpedo Anna (Fast Anna) by a head in the GI Travers Stakes.

Out of Nonna Bella (Stay Thirsty), who has also produced the track-record setting full-brother GSW Mentee, Fierceness hails from a female line that has produced GISW Outwork (Uncle Mo) and MGSW Cairo Prince (Pioneerof the Nile). Cont.

Second dam Nonna Mia (Empire Maker) was a runner-up in the GI Frizette Stakes, and is a half-sister to the latter stallion.

"Fierceness hails from a young and hugely exciting family of his owner/breeder Mike Repole," commented Ashford manager Dermot Ryan. "He is an outstanding physical and has proven himself to be a champion on the dirt at both 2 and 3 years."

"We're tremendously excited to welcome Fierceness to Ashford, be it this year or next. We will discuss his future with Mike, Todd [Pletcher] and the team following what looks to be the race of the year in the Breeders' Cup Classic."

"You get a feel for when things are right and the horses are doing well and the entries are good," Cox said. "I always try to have a good Keeneland fall. Obviously, the horses are doing well, but a lot of them really figured. Idiomatic was 1-5 in the Spinster. (Mother Goose winner) Tarifa is a really good filly who always tries hard. But remember, she was 2-1. There are lots of times where you run horses in graded stakes level that are 2-1 or less. You run six or seven of them and only one wins. That happens all the time. Right now, everything is lining up just right."

Cox, knowing the cyclical nature of the sport, says he tries not to get too high when he goes through a good streak.

"I just know you won't always get head bobs like we got in the Mother Goose," he said. "When things don't go well I don't get down, but I also try not to get too high when we win. I try to stay as even as I can. And it's hard for me. I am a very competitive person. I try to take it all in and I always say play the next play." **Cont.**

Idiomatic leads the Spinster field for home | Coady Media

"Something doesn't go well, I always say get in the huddle, call the next play and try to execute the next play."

In the midst of his run of good fortune on the track, his stable suffered a serious setback when it was announced that Idiomatic (Curlin), the winner of the 2023 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff was injured and had been retired. Set to go in this year's Distaff, she appeared to be Cox's best chance to win a Breeders' Cup race.

"I felt like she had never been as good," Cox said. "It's easy to say it now, but I felt like she was going to be very hard to beat. She breezed great last week. I thought she's moving better than she's ever moved. But by Tuesday there were some question marks with how she was moving. It was easy for us to do what we did. We took the x-rays to make sure she was in good shape. We saw more on the x-rays than we needed to see. It was an easy decision. We are very fortunate to have horses like this and I have to thank Juddmonte for giving us the opportunity with her. It was an easy decision once we saw the x-rays. I just loaded her up a few minutes ago, gave her a couple of peppermints and sent her home. It's easy to be excited about her as a broodmare."

Ironically, and especially after the Idiomatic injury, Cox doesn't appear to have a particularly strong hand for the Breeders' Cup. He has pre-entered five horse, but has said that one, Destino d'Oro (Bolt d'Oro) will not compete in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf.

That leaves him with Immersive (Nyquist) in the GI Juvenile Fillies; Highland Falls (Curlin) in GI Breeders' Cup Classic; Federal Judge (Army Mule) in the Sprint; and Saudi Crown (Always Dreaming). He has been pre-entered in the Classic and the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile.

When asked which of his horses is going to outrun its odds, he quickly came up with Highland Falls. Owned by Godolphin, he turned a major corner when winning the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup in his most recent start.

"I am really excited about Highland Falls," Cox said. "I think he is set up for a very big effort. His figures stack up. If he's close early and if he gets the trip he'll be right there at the wire."

Immersive also looks like a major threat. The leader of her division, she's undefeated in three starts and has won back-to-back Grade I's in the GI Spinaway S. and the GI Alcibiades S.

Cox will have to cool off eventually. No one can win with 70% of their stakes runners long term. He only needs to keep the mojo going for another week.

"I'm just hoping our racing luck doesn't run out before the Breeders' Cup," he said. "I hate to use the word 'luck' but with the racing Gods there is such a thing."

Next Move? The Classic

In a sport where too many people are afraid to take chances, you have to applaud trainer Doug Cowans and owner Michael Foster for entering Next (Not This Time) in the Classic. The thing is, no one knows quite what to make of him as there has never been a horses like him entered in the Breeders' Cup. For the last 14 months he has been running in nothing but dirt stakes, with the distances ranging from a-mile-and-three-eighths in the GII Brooklyn S. to a mile-and-three-quarters in the Birdstone S. He won one race (the 2023 GIII Greenwood Cup) by 25 lengths and another (the 2024 Birdstone) by 22 1/4 lengths.

He has been nearly unbeatable, but obviously against horses that are inferior to what he will face in the Classic. **Cont.**

That's one concern and the other is that he won't get the kind of slow pace he gets in his marathon races, where he can lope along at his own pace. Where will he be and what will happen if they go the opening half in :46?

So he may not win. In fact, the odds are against him, but there is absolutely no harm in running him in the Classic. There's not a single dirt "marathon" race left on the 2024 calendar, so it's not like he's missing out on something. And what if he does win or run a good second or third? That will open up so many new avenues for him to chase in 2025, races with far bigger purses than the races he's been running in. His career earnings are \$1,336,361. Just by finishing second in the Classic, which is worth \$3 million, he will have smashed that number in one race.

TOP DERBY POINTS GO TO SOVEREIGNTY IN A STREET SENSE ROMP

In a style not for the faint of heart, **Sovereignty (c, 2, Into Mischief--Crowned, by Bernardini)** went last to first, and claimed 10 points on the Road to the 2025 Kentucky Derby via the GIII **Street Sense** Stakes at Churchill Downs.

Debuting Aug. 24 at Saratoga sprinting on the main track, he managed to close from 10th to fourth against a maiden field which yielded 'TDN Rising Star' GISP Tip Top Thomas (Volatile) as well as Rookie Card (Adios Charlie), who broke his maiden Oct. 26 at the Belmont Big A meet, and two other next-out winners. Last out Sept. 27 on the increase to a mile over the Aqueduct main track, Sovereignty sat much closer in third and missed reeling in longtime leader Praetor (Into Mischief) by a neck.

Made the public's 7-5 favorite here, he broke a step slow and

found himself in a familiar spot as all eight of his rivals set up in front of him. Unrushed as the early leaders put up:23.57 and:48 early splits, he was nudged along to close the distance as they swung through the bend but was still last midway on that turn. Coming six wide and with a full head of steam, Sovereignty inhaled the inside competition and rolled home to an easy fivelength score over SW **Tiztastic** (Tiz the Law). **Sandman** (Tapit) got the best of a photo for third.

It was a stakes double on the day for owner Godolphin, whose homebred Good Cheer (Medaglia d'Oro) took the Rags to Riches Stakes the race prior to remain undefeated and claim 10 points toward the Road to the 2025 Kentucky Oaks.

"This is rare to see a horse break their maiden in a two-turn stakes race like today," rider Junior Alvarado said. "We knew that this horse had a lot of talent. He broke great today. When I turned for home, I just showed him the road and he took off. Things are coming together with his development. I think as the distances get longer, they will not be a problem for him."

"It's a true honor and testament to [Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum] to let us develop these horses as 2-year-olds and get them ready to go in even bigger races as 3-year-olds," said Michael Banahan, director of bloodstock for Godolphin. **Cont.**

"He trained very impressively in New York and it's not the easiest thing to bring a horse into a stakes race to break their maiden. But we had the confidence from how he ran in the two maiden races that he'd run a top effort here. It's very special for us all to win a race like this and hopefully get him some experience for some even bigger races as a 3-year-old next year here at Churchill Downs."

Pedigree Note:

Sovereignty is out of an unraced daughter of GISW Mushka (Empire Maker), whose most notable offspring was stakesplaced Whenthedawnbreaks (Ghostzapper). Dam Crowned has produced one other winner, a full-sister to the victor named Jane Grey, and her last registered offspring is a 2024 colt by Nyquist.

This is the female line of MGISW Lakeway, herself a runner-up in the GI Kentucky Oaks, and MSP American Monarch (American Pharoah).

WATCHTOWER SPOTS THE OPPORTUNITY, POUNCES LATE TO CLAIM AUTUMN MISS

With a strong turn of foot late in the game, **Watchtower** (Demarchelier (GB)--Zloty, by Exchange Rate) won the GIII Autumn Miss Stakes at Santa Anita, and in the process handed her second-crop sire his first black-type score.

A two-time winner earlier this year when she was in the barn of Chad Brown, Watchtower moved west after changing hands for \$310,000 at KEEAPR from owner Peter Brant to the partnership of Abbondanza Racing, LLC, Omar Aldabbagh and Michael lavarone, who placed her into the Richard Baltas program. A back-to-back runner-up against optional claimers Sept. 2 at Del Mar and Sept. 29 at this venue, Watchtower broke through in a big way for her new connections here.

Sent off at 8-1 and settling in eighth as the frontrunner turned into a loose leader--building up a seven-length margin at one point on the backstretch--through :22.61, :45.59, and 1:10.76 splits, that one came back to the field quickly when they closed ranks through the far turn. Flashing speed after getting clear of traffic trouble at the quarter pole, she took aim at 4-5 favorite **Medoro** (Honor Code) and **Zona Verde (Ire)** (Calyx {GB}) with a furlong left as the gap between them rapidly shortened. Even with the former in deep stretch, Watchtower got her head down first at the wire, winning by a nose.

This victory was the first Thoroughbred graded-stakes win for jockey Diego Herrera.

"It's pretty exciting, I wake up every morning and work hard. These are the moments I dreamt about as a little kid and now I get to live them, so I'm excited," said Herrera.

"I think the pace helped today. We ran into really slow paces the last two starts and today, given the quick pace, I had a perfect trip." **Cont.**

"I had a little bit of traffic, but I overcame it and the filly did her job. She showed up for us and she has a big future ahead of her."

Baltas added, "She is getting better. With that being said, she got a good setup. Diego gave her a good ride. She's kind of a one-paced filly. I told him, 'Don't rush her.' She broke really well, but he did a great job getting her to settle down."

"I think last time she was a little too close because there wasn't much speed in there. You can't really change her style. She tries really hard. She has a lot of grit. I think she has a future. She's only 3 and still young."

Pedigree Notes:

Watchtower is the first black-type winner for Demarchelier (GB), and is the first for her multiple stakes-placed dam as well. Zloty has produced four winners thus far counting this victress, and was barren in 2022 on a return trip to that one's sire. She has since produced a yearling colt by Basin as well as a 2024 colt by Tap Back. She visited Dads Caps for 2025.



The Aidan O'Brien-trained star is scheduled to make a first appearance on track Tuesday morning.

Many of the European horses used the weighing scale in the quarantine barn and connections are reporting positive prognoses for their runners. The arrivals will remain in quarantine until Monday afternoon and most are expected to be on track Tuesday. Many owners and trainers will begin arriving at Del Mar after the weekend with the master of Ballydoyle himself scheduled to land Monday evening ahead of overseeing his several-strong team Tuesday.

Among those still waiting to clear quarantine is Charlie Appleby-trained multiple Group 1 winner **Notable Speech (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}). The European Classic hero comes into the GI Breeders' Cup Mile as a looming figure to accompany his trainer's 50% World Championship win rate en route to attempting a four-peat in the Mile. **Cont.**

"If he ticks all the boxes this week and gets a good draw, he's going to be dangerous," Appleby said. "That's a word that I use and that's a word that's been documented, but I can't get away from it. He's a Guineas winner, he's a Sussex winner and he's probably one of the most high-profile horses to ever turn up at a Breeders' Cup Mile in what he's achieved in his 3-year-old career."

"He deserves to be favorite, in my opinion, and has produced a tremendous turn-of-foot in his Group 1 wins."


Appleby continued, "He's traveled well today to California, so the next few hours will be crucial to see how he's adapted to it all. I'm pleased with his training. He had a racecourse gallop last week and I was delighted with it. He came out in good order and then on Thursday, he worked really well before he jumped on the plane. If you have a good draw, you ideally want a nice run around there and to be able to pounce. He travels so well in his races and we've always had this in the back of our minds that the Breeders' Cup would suit him."

After her Saturday morning work was cancelled due to fog, **Soprano (Ire)** (Starspangledbanner {Aus}), who is pre-entered for the GI Maker's Mark Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf, was able to get one in Sunday morning on the turf. She was clocked going three furlongs over firm going in :39.60. Charles Eddery was in the saddle and was very happy with the work.

"Soprano has done everything right since landing in Del Mar," Eddery said. "We were hoping to go on the turf yesterday but unfortunately the mist meant we had to wait until today. She felt in good shape this morning and I'm very happy." **Cont.**

"She is 7 and we are keeping our options open [for racing next year]. We have not made a decision yet."



NEWGATE AMONG FOUR BREEDERS' CUP CONTENDERS TO WORK AT SANTA ANITA

GI Breeders' Cup Classic contender 'TDN Rising Star' GISW Newgate (Into Mischief), along with three other horses preentered in this weekend's championships at Del Mar, worked Sunday morning at Santa Anita.

Firing his second bullet in a row going five furlongs, this time in :58.80, the Bob Baffert-trainee shared the top ranking on the morning with John Sadler runner GSP-Arg & GISP **Full Serrano** (Arg) (Full Mast). In the Classic, Newgate will be making his second start since returning from a six-month layoff after a ninth-place finish in the G1 Dubai World Cup. He was last seen running third in the GI California Crown Stakes. According to a release from the Breeders' Cup group, Newgate is expected to ship to Del Mar Monday.

"I have always worked [Newgate] with blinkers, and I am going to leave them on for this race," said Baffert. "He had them earlier in his career; I want him to be a little more focused. Very happy with the work; he looked great today. I just wanted to sharpen him up. We're all good."

Full Serrano is an Argentinian import turned Grade I-placed runner in North America after he came within a half-length of winning the GI Pacific Classic Stakes in just his second U.S. start for Hronis Racing. He is pre-entered in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile.

MyRacehorse's MGSW **Straight No Chaser** (Speightster) went to the track for Dan Blacker, working four furlongs in :47.20 (2/62). Pre-entered in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, he was last seen exiting a stylish 6 1/2-length win in the GII Santa Anita Sprint Championship. **Cont.**



Rounding out the Breeders' Cup workers was MGSW & GISP Cabo Spirit (Pioneerof the Nile), who is an also-eligible for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf but expected to get in. Trained by George Papaprodromou, he worked five furlongs in :59.80, the sixth fastest on the morning.

The post position draw for the Breeders' Cup is Monday, Oct. 28 at 4:00 p.m., and will be broadcast live on FanDuel TV.

PUBLIC TO VOTE FOR 'TOP MOMENTS' IN SANTA ANITA'S HISTORY AS IT NEARS 90TH ANNIVERSARY

Santa Anita Park is approaching its 90th anniversary Dec. 26 with the opening of the Classic Meet, and the track is calling on the public to vote for the 13 'top moments' in track history, it was announced via presser.

- Mar. 11, 1966--John Longden wins the San Juan Capistrano Handicap by a nose in this final ride
- Mar. 4, 1979--Triple Crown winner Affirmed wins the Santa Anita Handicap in track record time
- Jan. 5, 1980--Spectacular Bid wins the Malibu Stakes in track record time
- Mar. 7, 1982--John Henry wins the Santa Anita Handicap via DQ, becoming the first two-time Big 'Cap winner
- Mar. 14, 1987--Laffit Pincay Jr. wins seven races on nine-race Santa Anita card
- Mar. 6, 1988--Kentucky Derby winners Alysheba and Ferdinand run 1-2 in the Santa Anita Handicap
- Apr. 9, 1988--Winning Colors wins the Santa Anita Derby before taking the Kentucky Derby
- Feb. 3, 1990--Bill Shoemaker retires as the world's winningest rider in "The Legend's Last Ride"
- Nov. 6, 1993--Arcangues wins the Breeders' Cup Classic at 133-1
- Oct. 25, 2003--Trainer Richard Mandella wins a record four Breeders' Cup races
- Nov. 7, 2009--Zenyatta becomes the first and (to date) only female Breeders' Cup Classic winner

The Bob Baffert trainee gave chase heading into the far turn and was not at all done. At the top of the lane, the filly fanned three wide and began to uncork. Cipriani proceeded to run up the score and was home by 8 1/4 lengths in the end. American Blessing was second.

The latest list-making 'Rising Star' is out of Salamera. This dam is also responsible for a yearling filly by Gun Runner, who Mike Repole took home for \$300,000 at this year's Keeneland September Sale. Salamera foaled a colt by Early Voting Apr. 26 and she was entered in Gunite's book for next term. The winner's extended female family includes MSW/GISP Outadore (Outwork) and that gelding's older sister, MSW/GISP Piedi Bianchi (Overanalyze).

Cipriani is the 21st **'TDN Rising Star'** for the impactful Bernardini (by A.P. Indy), who we lost in 2021.

A two-horse race in the wagering played out exactly as the public saw it going with Sacrosanct getting the best of his GSW/GISP rival Mo Plex in Sunday's Sleepy Hollow Stakes to kick off the stakes action for Empire Showcase Day at Belmont's Aqueduct meet. A debut winner at Saratoga, Sacrosanct unleashed on the field in the Bertram F. Bongard Stakes last out Sept. 22, wiring an over-matched group by 12 lengths to set up Sunday's showdown in a step up in distance facing Mo Plex who was a last-out third in the GI Champagne Stakes over this course and distance. Content to sit behind that rival early, the 2-5 favorite was eased along to keep pace in second into the far turn past the half in :46.21. In a duel past the quarter pole, the top pair threw down into the final sixteenth with Sacrosanct having the most left late to clear off for the score.

"I thought he could get the mile today, but he really had to work for it," said assistant trainer to Brad Cox, Dustin Dugas. "I was worried about Mo Plex as he already had a mile start under him and I knew he'd be a tough one to beat. Manny [Franco] rode a good head's-up race, and we were fortunate to have the outside advantage on Mo Plex. Our horse had been training really well and I thought he could get the mile, and he did."

While her connections passed on an opportunity in the Breeders' Cup next weekend, 'TDN Rising Star' With the Angels kept things rolling in New York with yet another stakes win in Sunday's Maid of the Mist Stakes. Dubbed a 'Rising Star' at Saratoga with an 11 1/2-length romp against New York-breds Aug. 22, she stepped out an additional furlong and put 9 3/4 lengths on the field in the Joseph A. Gimma Stakes Sept. 22. The no-doubt favorite at 1-9 trying the flat mile Sunday, With the Angels didn't miss a beat as she once more jumped to the lead from the middle of the gate and put a length back to eventual runner up Boston's Phinest. While never supremely ahead as in her previous starts, With the Angels was never truly challenged here either and responded to stretch urging by Jose Ortiz to come home 3 1/4 lengths clear.

"She passes another test," said winning trainer Linda Rice. "We decided against the [GI] Frizette. We wanted to give her a chance to get a few more races under her belt before she meets open company - that was the plan, and that's what we did today. She's a very good gate horse. He [Jose Ortiz] didn't want to use her too much early in the race and he saved something for the end." **Cont.**

Rice noted that the GII Demoiselle at nine furlongs could be a next start for her filly, saying: "We're considering the Demoiselle. That's our mark if we're going to step into open company. That, or we'll wrap her up for the year and start her up again in the spring. Time will tell."

Ortiz added: "I think today the mile got to her a little. I made her run a little bit from the eighth pole to the wire, but I knew she was home so then I left her alone. I encouraged a little bit, to let her know the race was not over yet. It is 2-year-olds."

From the second crop of Omaha Beach, With the Angels was a \$350,000 OBS April grad and is a half to another stakes runner in Maggy's Palace (Palace Malice). "She was really impressive again today," said Saez. "I took her back off horses down the backside and saved ground. She relaxed and handled that very well. Around the turn when I asked her for her best run, she was loaded. She's a very impressive prospect with not a lot of seasoning behind her."

After making short work of her rivals with a flashy 8 1/4-length victory while going a mile at Indiana Aug. 5, the bay proved it was no fluke when blasting home a gaudy 17-length winner while negotiating an extra sixteenth in the Churchill slop Sept. 28.

Good Cheer is out of dual Grade I winner and \$1.4 million earner Wedding Toast, who is also responsible for listed winner Ya Hayati (Dubawi {Ire}). Barren in 2023, she produced a full-sister to Good Cheer this season and was bred back to Into Mischief. This represents the extended family of MGISW Congaree. 



With over 100 horses boasting Timeform ratings of 100 or greater in a catalogue that includes high-quality drafts from Coolmore, Juddmonte and Shadwell, is it any wonder that buyers flock from all over the world to get in on the action at the Tattersalls Autumn Horses-In-Training Sale?

If there is one jurisdiction that has flexed its buying power more than any other at this sale in recent years it's Australia. And it's easy to see why. In the past decade alone, 13 Group 1 races have been won Down Under by horses who were sourced directly at this sale.

Just Fine (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) is one of those. Sold for 300,000gns by Sir Michael Stoute's Freemason Lodge Stables on behalf of the Queen in 2022, he landed the G1 Metropolitan for Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott. Bigger things could yet be to come for Just Fine, who is on course to run in next Tuesday's Melbourne Cup, and the stable will be busy trying to unearth the next quality import at Tattersalls this week.





Speaking about the appeal of the sale, Rob Waterhouse, giant of the bookmaking industry in Australia and husband to the

legendary trainer, said, "The reality is that Europe--in particular Britain and Ireland--is much better at producing stayers than we are here in Australia. That's the long and the short of it. I am sure that it is all to do with climate--it's easier to produce sprinters in a hotter climate. Europe produces great stayers and we're dreadful at it!"


Neither Rob nor Gai will be in attendance at Tattersalls but the team will be in safe hands in the shape of Claudia Fitzgerald, bloodstock manager for the stable, and leading bloodstock agent Johnny McKeever.

"We're lucky to have Claudia Fitzgerald who goes over there on my wife's behalf," Waterhouse said. "She does a great job at inspecting the horses and is assisted by a good Irishman in Johnny McKeever. They do a great job for us. We're lucky enough to keep a significant database of British, Irish and French

> form, which is a bit different to Timeform and Racing Post, but similar. We go through that database and try to find the ones that are of a certain standard. From there, we target the ones we like on type."

Using Just Fine as an example, that horse arrived at the sales off the back of three wins for Stoute, in races that carried winning purses of £5,175.20, £6,442.50 and £7,851. The winning cheque for the Metropolitan came to a cool £245,762.71 while the same

horse provided his connections

That is far from an isolated example of a horse providing its owners with a return on investment in Australia. Fellow sale graduates Fawkner Park (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}), Herman Hesse (GB) (Frankel {GB}), Royal Patronage (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}), Future History (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) and more have done similarly well for their connections this year alone.

With such riches on offer, it would be easy to forgive the Waterhouse and Bott team for stretching the budget every now and again. So how will the outfit be approaching bidding on prospective stars this week?

"Very sensibly," comes the reply from Waterhouse. "Gai tries to be conservative in what she spends at the sales. Unfortunately, she is beaten far more often than she is successful and we try not to get involved in bidding wars. By the same token, she can be very inventive. We knew of a particular horse who was very much in demand a few years ago and we loved this horse. Our competitors also loved this horse. We knew the vendors wanted 300,000gns for the horse and we surprised the auctioneers on the day because, when they called for an opening bid of 20,000gns, we bid the 300,000gns. They were a little flummoxed by these unusual tactics and initially refused to take the bid. They said, 'we're only asking for

20,000gns'. But we bought it for 300,000gns and, after the sale, our competitors told us that they were going to go to the 300,000gns mark so it had the potential to make a lot more. Gai is very audacious in what she does."

He added, "We're looking forward to running Just Fine, who came from this sale, in the Melbourne Cup on Tuesday week. There are a lot of valuable races in Australia but there has to be a limit on what you spend at the sales if you want to get your money back. The way we approach it is, we'd rather buy more horses at a lower average than less horses for a greater sum. There are 104 races with prize-money of a million Australian dollars or more every year. That is a huge number.

"I'm not sure what the figures are for this year, but last season there were 724 horses imported from Britain, Ireland, France and more. That number will definitely be over 800 this year so there are a lot of horses being bought to continue their careers in Australia. The majority of those would be mile-plus horses, too."

This week's sale will take place off the back of a record-breaking October Yearling Sale and, while it's hard to draw too many parallels between the that and the H-I-T market, Waterhouse says it can only be a positive that so many wealthy people have had their interests piqued by the game in recent times. He said, "It's not apples and apples but, by the same token, the rich people in today's world are spending a lot of money on horses in recent years. There is a lot of money about. But Gai normally has no orders. She will hopefully buy half a dozen horses at Tattersalls and then offer them to clients. That's the way it works. But we love shopping at Tattersalls and I must say Jason Singh is always a great help to us."

Waterhouse concluded, "Claudia and Johnny know the types of horses that Gai likes to buy. She likes horses who are a bit taller and leaner than average. Of course, they have to be sound. They have had great success buying that model and hopefully they can find some more this week."

As expected, the unbeaten 3-5 favourite Maranoa Charlie (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}) set off in isolation as he had previously when winning the course-and-distance G3 Prix Thomas Bryon but it was soon evident that he was tanking in the hands of Aurelien Lemaitre and merely setting it up for the closers. With the leader's goose cooked two out, it was left to the Irish colts to come to the fore and the 53-10 shot Twain had more gears than his stablemate from 300 metres out.

At the line, Twain held a 1 1/4-length margin over Mount Kilimanjaro, with the Joseph O'Brien-trained Goffs Million scorer Apples And Bananas (Ire) (Wootton Bassett {GB}) 4 1/2 lengths away in third and a tired Maranoa Charlie a further five lengths back in fourth. "He must be very good horse and must have a lot of pace, as he broke from the stalls fast and could have gone forward but we wanted to take our time with him," Moore said of the descendant of Urban Sea (Miswaki), linking him to some of the Turf's recent greats.

"He was a bit inexperienced and green around the turn, but quickened up very well, got to the front a long way from home and then shut down on me and was very green in the last furlong and a half. I never really got into him and he's obviously a very talented horse to do that a week after breaking his maiden. He's a beautiful-looking horse by a sire who is doing unbelievable things with his 2-year-olds."

Aidan O'Brien added, "This probably wasn't fair to him, as he only ran a few days ago so he's obviously a very good horse. We always rated him highly and thought we were running him too early at Leopardstown, but we decided to run him with this in mind just in case he was as good as we thought he was and there was only one group 1 left this season. Ryan had to teach him and give him a chance there and he thinks he ended up getting there too soon." Cont. p6

"He's a very good mover who points his toe and has a low action, so he'd have to be better on better ground and he obviously has a big engine," he said. "He is a big baby, as he was ducking at the cones on the way down to the start. We think he's very special. He's a legitimate Guineas horse."

Pedigree Notes

The dam Wading was one of Moore's earlier winning rides for Aidan O'Brien and it is notable how blown away he was by her impressive G2 Rockfel Stakes win which unfortunately proved to be her last. She is now responsible for seven winners including the fellow Rockfel scorer Just Wonderful (Dansili {GB}), who also took the G3 Flame of Tara Stakes and was third in the G1 Matron Stakes and second in the GI Belmont Oaks Invitational, and the G3 Mercury Stakes-placed Lost Treasure (Ire) (War Front).

The second dam is the G3 Blue Wind Stakes-placed dam Cherry Hinton (GB) (Green Desert), one of the aforementioned legend Urban Sea's quartet of fillies who did more than her fair share for the family by producing the G1 Irish Oaks heroine Bracelet (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and the GI Belmont Oaks heroine Athena (Ire) and G3 Snow Fairy Stakes winner Goddess, both by Montjeu's son Camelot (GB). Athena has since produced the G3 Ballylinch Stud 1,000 Guineas Trial Stakes and G3 Silver Flash Stakes winner and G1 Prix de Diane runner-up Never Ending Story (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}). Cont. p7

Sea The Stars had the pace to win a 2,000 Guineas and Masar was third in the Newmarket Classic, so it could be that Ballydoyle have saved the best of their 2-year-old colts until last. WOOTTON BASSETT'S TENNESSEE STUD PREVAILS IN SAINT-CLOUD MATCH



Tennessee Stud | Scoop Dyga

Just three lined up for Sunday's G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud and it went to form as Coolmore and Westerberg's G2 Beresford Stakes runner-up **Tennessee Stud (Ire)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}--

In My Dreams {Ire}, by Sadler's Wells) upstaged Ahmad Al Shaikh's G3 Zetland Stakes runner-up **Green Storm (Ire)** (Circus Maximus {Ire}) in the match it looked on paper. In a renewal marred by the dismal lack of appetite for competition among the country's trainers, the Joseph O'Brien-trained 3-5 favourite only had to follow around the British raider and wear him down 100 metres from the line for a 1 1/2-length success. **Harvey (Fr)** (Le Havre {Ire}) enjoyed the easiest piece of group 1 black-type conceivable nine lengths away in third in a race that is surely asking to be stripped of its status by the EPC.

"He's a really tough colt," Joseph O'Brien said of the winner, who was beaten by Saturday's G1 Futurity Trophy winner Hotazhell (GB) (Too Darn Hot {GB}) in the Beresford having won his maiden at Tipperary last month. "Dylan [Browne McMonagle] said he was really labouring in conditions most of the race and it is a testament to his attitude he was able to fight all the way to the line and win the race. He's a very exciting horse for the future. He is probably a middle-distance horse and I imagine he will be trained with Derbys in mind next summer."

This race was sorely missing Ballydoyle's G1 Fillies' Mile third Ballet Slippers (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), who was revealed by Aidan O'Brien to have suffered a fracture during her last piece of work.

DOUBLE MAJOR DOUBLES UP IN THE ROYAL

OAK by Tom Frary

Relishing the heavy ground at Saint-Cloud on Sunday, the Wertheimers' **Double Major (Ire)** (Daiwa Major {Jpn}--Dancequest {Ire}, by Dansili {GB}) successfully defended his crown in the feature G1 Prix Royal-Oak. Tracking the leader **Trueshan (Fr)** (Planteur {Ire}) from the break, the 13-2 shot was committed by Maxime Guyon with 300 metres remaining and stayed on strongly to deny the 23-10 favourite **Sevenna's Knight (Ire)** (Camelot {GB}) by 1 1/4 lengths, with Trueshan a head away in third.

"I am very proud of him," trainer Christophe Ferland said. "Last year, we made the mistake of returning him to the stud for winter and he enjoyed his holiday too much. He lost all his muscle and it was hard to bring him back to form."

Making all to win this by 7 1/2 lengths at its traditional home of ParisLongchamp 12 months ago, Double Major who had also won the G2 Prix Chaudenay looked set to place himself among the leading stayers this term but it was not until the G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil back at ParisLongchamp that he regained the winning thread in July. After following up in Deauville's G2 Prix Kergorlay in August, he was expected to be a big player taking on Kyprios (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Prix du Cadran but failed to see out the marathon trip and beat no rivals.

This was a step back in the right direction and a Spring campaign in Dubai now beckons according to Ferland. "He came back over the summer in the Maurice de Nieuil and now he's hit top form," he said. "In the Cadran the jockey respected him when he felt the distance was too long--he pulled back and knew there was this race three weeks later. He is going to stay at home and will do some hacking around and probably lead the babies as well. He will stay in the stables for the winter and I think we will prepare him for Dubai."

DO DEUCE ACES TEST IN TENNO SHO

by Alan Carasso

Already an elite-level winner at 1600, 2400 and 2500 metres, **Do Deuce (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) jumped out of the ground in the Tokyo straight and rattled home down the outside to add Sunday's G1 Tenno Sho (Autumn) over the metric mile and a quarter. Fellow G1 Tokyo Yushun hero **Tastiera (Jpn)** (Satono Crown {Jpn}) could not resist the winner's flying finish and settled for second, while pacesetting **Ho O Biscuits (Jpn)** (Mind Your Biscuits) was a valiant third.

Ho O Biscuits won the break from gate nine and set modest sectional times of :24.3 for the opening 400m and :47.9 for the first 800m as Do Deuce was settled one from the tail by the legendary Yutaka Take. **Liberty Island (Jpn)** (Duramente {Jpn}), favored in her first start since a third in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic in March, was handy enough to the pace, though deep on the course, beneath Yuga Kawada, while third choice **Lebensstil (Jpn)** (Real Steel {Jpn}) provided some cover for Do Deuce down the back of the track.

Ho O Biscuits was still enjoying a fairly leisurely time of things on the pointy end and was first to face the judge, with Liberty Island poised about four off the inside and Tastiera close enough if good enough.

The pacesetter carried the Tenno Sho field into the final furlong, but by this time, Take had peeled Do Deuce off the heels of Lebensstil and covered his final 600 metres in an otherworldly:32.5, outfinishing Tastiera for the victory. Ho O Biscuits held for third ahead of a closing Justin Palace (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), racing at a distance short of optimal. Liberty Island remained in contention into the final 250 metres, but dropped away to beat just two home.

Do Deuce becomes the seventh horse to win Group 1 contests in four consecutive seasons, having taken out the Asahi Hai Futurity in 2021, the Tokyo Yushun the following season and last year's fan-voted Arima Kinen. It was a 20th JRA Group 1 for trainer Yasuo Tomomichi and an 82nd for Take, his first since the aforementioned Arima Kinen.

"I wanted to show the true ability and strength of Do Deuce today, so I was really happy when he was able to display his usual powerful kick in the last stretch and crossed the wire first," said Take, winning the Autumn Tenno Sho for the seventh time overall and for the first time since piloting Kitasan Black (Jpn) in 2017. "The pace was not very fast and I was relying on his strong finishing speed, so I didn't want to make any unnecessary moves in the first half of the race and settled him second from last."

Seventh to Kitasan Black's Equinox (Jpn) in last year's event and fourth to that Horse of the Year in the G1 Japan Cup, Do Deuce ran on strongly for fifth in this year's G1 Dubai Turf where he was hampered by fallen rival at a crucial stage. In his lone appearance since, Do Deuce may have struggled with easy underfoot conditions when sixth as the favourite in the G1 Takarazuka Kinen at Kyoto June 23.

Pedigree Notes

Do Deuce is one of a dozen Group 1 winners for Heart's Cry, who was lost to the Japanese breeding industry in March 2023. Two of the stallion's sons--Suave Richard (Jpn) and Cheval Grand (Jpn)--count the Japan Cup among their top-level conquests, a race that figures the next landing spot for Do Deuce.

A Grade III winner for Satish Sanan's Padua Stable in September 2012, Dust and Diamonds was runner-up in that year's GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint and was acquired days after for \$900,000 by Borges Torrealba Holdings at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale. For her new owner, she added the GIII Sugar Swirl Stakes prior to her retirement.

The mare was subsequently sold to Katsumi Yoshida for \$1 million in foal to the late Pioneerof the Nile at the 2016 Keeneland November Sale and her stock increased when her foal of 2016, Much Better (Pioneerof the Nile), was placed twice at Grade III level as a 3-year-old in 2019.

Dust and Diamonds is also the dam of a 2-year-old colt by Real Steel (Jpn) that was purchased by Do Deuce's owner for a salestopping ¥94.6 million as a foal at the 2022 Northern Farm Mixed Sale. She produced a filly by Silver State (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in 2023 and her colt by Triple Crown winner Contrail (Jpn) fetched ¥286 million from owner Ozora Kikaku at the Northern Farm Sale on Oct. 22.

RACE UPGRADES ANNOUNCED AHEAD OF **2025 SAUDI CUP MEETING**

The Sports Boulevard Riyadh Dirt Sprint and Longines Red Sea Turf Handicap will be run as Group 2 contests for the first time in 2025, it was announced by the Jockey Club of Saudi Arabia (JCSA) on Sunday. Both races take place during the Saudi Cup meeting, which is scheduled for Saturday, February 22 as part of the 2024/25 Riyadh season.

The Riyadh Dirt Sprint, won this year by Japanese raider Remake (Jpn) (Lani), will see its prize-money boosted by \$500,000 to \$2 million, while the Red Sea Turf Handicap, which went to the Aidan O'Brien-trained Tower Of London (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), will once again be worth \$2.5 million.

Several race upgrades have also been announced for the domestic Riyadh season, which began at King Abdulaziz Racecourse on Thursday, October 17.

These include what will be the first international Thoroughbred Group race staged outside of the Saudi Cup meeting, the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques Cup, which is set to be run as a Group 3 for the first time on Saturday, January 25. The race serves as a qualifier for the Saudi Cup and was won last season by Power In Numbers (Girvin) when run as a Listed contest.

Another qualifying event for the Saudi Cup meeting has also been upgraded in the form of the Prince Khalid Abdullah Cup, a qualifier for the Group 2 Howden Neom Turf Cup. Scheduled for Friday, January 24, the race has been promoted to Listed status.

Meanwhile, the newly-promoted Listed King Abdulaziz Racetrack Championship Cup on Saturday, March 15 will bring the curtain down on the 2024/25 Riyadh season, which includes 710 races, run across 62 racedays, more than ever before. Prize-money across the season has also hit a new high with a total of SAR84,628,000 (around \$22.5 million/€20.8 million) on offer, excluding the Saudi Cup meeting.
