



TUESDAY'S BREEDERS' CUP REPORT: CLASSIC CONTENDERS TAKE THE 'CITY' BY STORM

DEL MAR, CA – With the rising sun attempting to make its way out of a dense cloud cover, contenders for Saturday's \$7-million GI Breeders' Cup Classic were out in force during about a 30-minute window following the renovation break at Del Mar Tuesday morning.

'TDN Rising Star' Newgate and Pyrenees, a pair of blaze-faced, 4-year-old sons of the all-conquering Into Mischief, both entered on their toes and filled the frame nicely while training with good energy.

Newgate, listed at a very generous 20-1 on the morning-line, adds blinkers for Hall of Famer Bob Baffert following a fantastic third with a wide trip off the bench in the inaugural \$1-million GI California Crown Stakes at Santa Anita. The Cherie DeVauxtrained Pyrenees was last seen finishing second behind **Highland Falls** (Curlin) in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup.

Into Mischief has been represented by seven Breeders' Cup winners, led by 2020 Classic hero Authentic.

The gates are scheduled to open at 9:30 a.m. on Friday. Post time for the first race is 11:35 and the first Breeders' Cup race goes off at 2:45. But long before those bright-eyed Breeders' Cup attendees begin filling the grandstands of Del Mar, the backside will have been awake for hours.

For those back in the barns as Breeders' Cup morning dawns, in many ways it's just like any other day. It is the same routine of raking barn aisles, topping off water buckets, checking temps, preparing feed, wrapping legs, walking hots and passing out peppermints.

And in other ways, it is very much *not* like any other day. It's the grand finale of a year's worth of highs and lows, celebrations and disappointments, sweat, sore muscles and impossibly long hours, all to get a horse to the Breeders' Cup. *Cont. p4*

Mike Repole's homebred full-brothers 'TDN Rising Star'
Fierceness (City of Light) and Mentee (City of Light) (Juvenile
Turf)--more on the Todd Pletcher-trained duo in a feature in
Saturday's Breeders' Cup Preview Edition--hit the track together
sporting their white bridles just before 8:00 a.m. The heartstopping GI Travers Stakes winner seeks to become the first GI
Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner to double up in the Classic. It is
yet to happen from eight previous attempts.

Speaking of white bridles, the aforementioned Highland Falls made a nice impression in his first local spin over the surface after arriving from Brad Cox's Churchill Downs base Monday. Fellow chestnut **Rattle N Roll** (Connect), the lone Classic entrant stuck on the also-eligible list, was under a snug hold by Danny Ramsey while galloping down the stretch.

You didn't need to wait to see their yellow Classic saddle towels to help identify stunning grays **Arthur's Ride** (Tapit) and **Next** (Not This Time) during their morning exercise. The runaway GI Whitney Stakes winner looks to bounce back after a disappointing fifth as the favorite in the Jockey Club Gold Cup. The streaking marathon man will put his well-documented, seven-race winning streak on the line while cutting back to the 1 1/4-mile Classic distance.

'TDN Rising Star' and \$2.3-million Fasig-Tipton Saratoga

yearling topper **Sierra Leone** (**Gun Runner**), along for third in the Travers, was reaching out very nicely during his easy gallop for Chad Brown. Tacked up with no shortage of red-and-white equipment for Yoshito Yahagi, Sierra Leone's closely related, rail-drawn rival **Forever Young (Jpn)** (Real Steel {Jpn}) wasn't far behind while breezing five furlongs in 1:04 (5/8). The two finished just noses apart in second and third after racing shoulder to shoulder in the GI Kentucky Derby.

Yahagi put on a show winning two Breeders' Cup races with Marche Lorraine (Jpn) (Distaff) and Loves Only You (Jpn) (Filly & Mare Turf) the last time the Championships were held at Del Mar in 2021.

And how about this to close out the morning?

Classic morning-line favorite and 'TDN Rising Star' City of Troy (Justify) left the quarantine area and followed his GI Breeders' Cup Turf-bound stablemate Luxembourg (Ire) (Camelot {GB}) as part of an 11-deep brigade from trainer Aidan O'Brien, who was on hand to watch. Porta Fortuna (Ire) (Caravaggio) (Mile), trained by Aidan's son Donnacha, capped the group to make it a dozen.

The team walked and jogged one clockwise lap before having an easy gallop of the same mile circuit. The G1 Epsom Derby winner did get a bit warm, but not at all uncommon for O'Brien's runners, especially during their first morning of trackwork. *Cont.*

"It's the pinnacle of the racing year," said Lee Vickers, an assistant trainer for Christophe Clement who works with Breeders' Cup Turf starter Far Bridge (English Channel). "It's the culmination of the year. When you're going into these big races, that's where the year ends and that's where you want to go."

"There are tears of joy because it's very exciting for this team to get to send a horse to a race like that."

The *TDN*'s Breeders' Cup Connections project was about the horses, yes. But more than that, it was a tribute to the individuals behind the athletes. It was created to celebrate the horsemen who live for grandiose days packed with Grade I racing, but also quiet afternoons in sleepy stalls and an unexpected win from the barn's favorite claimer.

"I love racing and I love everything about what we do, but I just really love horses," said Katie Tolbert, an assistant trainer for Brad Cox who is also the exercise rider for Classic contender Highland Falls (Curlin). "It's fun just to be in the barn and see them grow and learn and be successful, to see them do what they're bred to do."

"One thing about me is I'm going to try to do my best, it doesn't matter what kind of horse you put me on," said Carlos Rosas, the exercise rider for Turf Sprinter Cogburn (Not This Time) who has worked for trainer Steve Asmussen for the past 21 years. "It can be a really cheap horse, like a \$5,000 claimer, or a stakes horse."

In an industry that can oftentimes appear to be rather uniform, this project organically wound up featuring people from a multitude of backgrounds. Jeramie Fennell and Lee Vickers are both former jockeys. While Fennell grew up in South Dakota and started riding Quarter Horse races at age 16, Vickers is from Yorkshire, England and followed in the footsteps of his father and grandfather in becoming a jockey in England before he moved to the U.S. to work for Christophe Clement in 2010.

Exercise rider Damian Hinds and assistant trainer/groom Erma Scott have formed a fast friendship during their time working for Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott and that bond has only strengthened this year through their shared adoration of Classic contender Arthur's Ride (Tapit). While Hinds discovered a passion for the sport while attending the races in Jamaica with his uncle, Scott was working at a restaurant in New Orleans when she landed a job with Mott. Now in her 70s, she has been a beloved member of Mott's racing stable for decades.

Then there was Byron López and Edgar Revolorio, both grooms from Guatemala who shared their story with us in Spanish, but the passion they have for their horses broke through any language barriers.


"I am motivated by the horses," said López, who is the groom of Classic contender Fierceness (City of Light) and has been responsible for other Grade I winners like Malathaat (Curlin) and Life at Ten (Malibu Moon) during his 24 years of working for Todd Pletcher. *Cont.*

"They are so affectionate and I get along with my horses well. I never really liked to work, but I like working here. It has been a lot of years and I just got used to it. It became home. I feel good working at the stable with everybody around."

Of course, the thing that brings this wide assortment of horsemen and women together is their passion for the horse. At one point or another, every one of them discovered a love for the animal and never looked back.





Carlos Rosas had just moved from his home in Mexico to work a landscaping job in Texas when he spotted horses grazing in nearby pastures. He asked his boss if he could stop trimming hedges and instead, start looking after the horses on the farm. Over the 30-plus years since, Rosas has ridden champions like Curlin, Gun Runner and Midnight Bisou.

Katie Tolbert grew up in South Carolina looking for any opportunity she could find to get her hands on a horse. She never had one of her own as a kid, but would clean stalls in exchange for time on horseback. After working at Juddmonte Farm and Sagamore Farm, she landed a job with trainer Brad Cox and has ridden stars like Essential Quality, Cyberknife and Idiomatic.

Jeramie Fennell knew he wanted to dedicate his life to the industry from a young age, but he came close to giving up his career because addiction was taking over his life. He learned about a program called Stable Recovery, where men in the early stages of recovery from addiction are placed in a supportive, therapeutic community that was centered around horses.

"I talked to a guy there named Christian Countzler, and he asked me, 'Are you ready to change your life?' And I said, 'Yes, I am,'" recalled Fennell. "I said, 'I'm open minded and willing to do anything, go to any length, to change my life because I just want to be on the backside of a racetrack on a horse." *Cont.*

Fennell graduated from Stable Recovery this spring and landed a job with Will Walden. Now, he is the exercise rider for Walden's first Breeders' Cup contender, Minaret Station.

Getting a horse to the Breeders' Cup is no easy task and oftentimes, it takes a lot of luck. Some of the stars of this series will be snug in their stalls this weekend, but the stories of their caretakers are just as inspiring. Priscilla Schaefer, who grew up working cattle on horseback on her family's ranch in Idaho, rode this year's GI Belmont and GI Haskell hero Dornoch (Good Magic). Zurdo Estrada, the groom of GI Beholder Mile victress Sweet Azteca (Sharp Azteca), spends hours in the barn after morning training has wrapped up each day simply because he loves being around the horses. Taylor Cambra, an assistant for Richard Mandella who shares a bond with GI California Crown victor Subsanador (Arg) (Fortify), works every day toward his dream of becoming a trainer.

Through this series, we've learned tiny details about each Breeders' Cup star that only those closest to the horse would know. Like how Minaret Station often teases Jeramie Fennell as he walks down the barn aisle, playfully nipping at the saddle Fennell is carrying. Or how Fierceness is always in a better mood if Byron López gives him a peppermint before he starts working with him each morning. And how Arthur's Ride can sometimes have some toddlerish tendencies, but loves when Erma Scott sings and dances with him.


"He's just like a baby," Scott said. "He likes to play. He likes to eat his carrots. If I call him, he looks up at me. He's special. We all love him. We love all our horses and we take care of our horses. They're our hearts."

"I think that's the only reason I do it," said Katie Tolbert. "I mean, there are plenty of jobs where you can make more money or have a better schedule or whatever, but it's the only thing I want to do."

"This job is no days off," said Carlos Rosas. "If you love it, you're going to do it. I want to do this for as long as I can. I just love racing, I love the horses and I don't want to do anything else.

GISW AND BC CLASSIC CONTENDER TAPIT TRICE TO GAINESWAY UPON RETIREMENT

GI Blue Grass Stakes winner **Tapit Trice** (**Tapit**--Danzatrice, by Dunkirk) will return to his birthplace, Gainesway Farm, to enter stud upon his retirement from racing, the Central Kentucky nursery and stud farm announced Tuesday afternoon. **Tapit** Trice's next scheduled engagement is Saturday afternoon in the \$7-million GI Breeders' Cup Classic, where he will break from post 10. He races for the partnership of Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm, LLC and Gainesway Stable.

"Winning the Grade I Blue Grass Stakes in partnership with Gainesway has been a real highlight for our racing stable," said Pope. "We are extremely excited about Tapit Trice's potential at stud and will be supporting him with some of our best mares."

Bred by Gainesway, the 4-year-old gray is out of a half-sister to 2018 champion 2-year-old filly and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Jaywalk (Cross Traffic). He realized \$1.3 million as

a yearling at the 2021 Keeneland September sale. Although he was a 2-year-old winner at Aqueduct, it was in the first start of his 3-year-old year he captured the collective imagination, romping by eight lengths at Gulfstream to earn 'TDN Rising Star' honors. Victories in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby and the aforementioned Blue Grass followed. Although he didn't win as the favorite in the 2023 GI Kentucky Derby, he placed in both the GI Belmont Stakes and GI Travers Stakes to close out his sophomore campaign. *Cont.*

He's won two of three as a 4-year-old this year, including the GII Woodward Stakes and GIII Monmouth Cup Stakes. Hall of Famer Todd Pletcher has campaigned Tapit Trice to three triple-digit Beyer Speed Figures, earnings of more than \$1.7 million to date, and six wins from 12 career starts.

"I could not be prouder or more excited to partner with Mandy [Pope] and bring this exciting homebred son of Tapit back to Gainesway Farm," said Gainesway's Antony Beck. "Tapit Trice is line-bred 3x4 to both A.P. Indy and Unbridled, two of the most influential stallions of this era. Our hope is he follows in his father's footsteps."

Gainesway stands Tapit Trice's perennial leading sire, Tapit. A stud fee for Tapit Trice will be announced at retirement.

The catalogue includes:

- A 50% ownership interest in impressive GIII Vosburgh Stakes winner and GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile contender **Mufasa (Chi)** (Practical Joke) (Hip 9). The interest is consigned by I. C. Racing, LLC, agent. He is trained by Ignacio Correas.


The auction also includes stallion shares (2.5% fractional interest) in undefeated 2022 Horse of the Year **Flightline**, consigned by Lane's End Farm as **Hip 12**; and GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint 7-5 morning-line favorite **Cogburn** (Not This Time), consigned by ELITE, agent for Cogburn Syndicate, as **Hip 5**.

A share in Flightline sold for \$4.6 million at the 2022 Keeneland November sale, just two days after his jaw-dropping win in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. The Lane's End stallion welcomed his first foals this year.





Carrying a foal by hot sire Justify on Southern Hemisphere time, stakes-placed **April Vintage** (Vino Rosso) topped the Inglis Digital USA October Sale Tuesday when selling to Widden Stud of Australia for \$180,000. More details on the mare and her consignment by WinStar Farm are available here.

"She is an outcross to our traditional Australian sire lines and the fact that she showed good, natural speed as a 2-year-old was important," said Antony Thompson of Widden Stud.
"Physically, she looks suitable to plenty of our own stallions, and buying through a digital platform is something we have become very comfortable with thanks to Inglis's platform in Australia. She made a bit more than we thought, but she was an appealing offering and it makes sense that there was good demand for her. We'll now be bringing down two mares in foal to Justify from America as we also bred to him."

WinStar's Elliott Walden added, "We're excited about the result and glad she's headed to Widden. It makes sense that the Australians wanted her. It is great to be able to market our horses to a global audience without them leaving their office."

Inglis Digital USA offered 67 horses in Tuesday's online auction, grossing \$417,250 with an average of \$16,990. The highest-priced horse of racing age was **Wake Surf** (Classic Empire), who was offered by Tareq Moubarak and sold to G.O.A.T. Racing Stables for \$55,000. G.O.A.T. Racing Stables, a New York-based partnership managed by Shawn Klotz with trainers Robert Falcone, Jr. and Wayne Potts, bought six horses Tuesday for a total of \$122,500.

Among the purchases made by Craig and Carrie Brogden's Machmer Hall were a racing/broodmare prospect named **Splashy** (Flatter), who was sold by Adelphi Racing Club for \$50,000. *Cont.*

GII Oak Leaf Stakes winner **Non Compliant** (Tiz the Law) and Skidmore Stakes winner **Out On Bail** (Tiz the Law) were both declared from their respective Breeders' Cup engagements on Tuesday afternoon. Non Compliant, unbeaten in two starts and 9-2 on the morning line, was slated for the GI Juvenile Fillies, while Out On Bail, winner of two of six and never off the board, was scheduled to run in the GI Juvenile Turf Sprint and was tagged at 20-1 on the morning line.

Campaigned by Georgia Antley Hunt, Jeff Giglio, and John L. Rogitz, Non Compliant is trained by Hall of Famer Bob Baffert. Antley Hunt took to Facebook to announce the scratch, saying, "Well, the highs are like mountains in this game, and the lows are pretty low. We're going to scratch Non Compliant from the Juvenile Fillies. Something came up on a pet scan that wasn't right, and her safety is the most important thing! She'll get 60 days of vacay, and then we'll embark on the KY Oaks trail. Thank you to everyone for the well wishes and loving support."

The Breeders' Cup entries page also listed Out On Bail as scratched Tuesday afternoon, although details on his situation were not yet forthcoming. Trained by Mike Maker, Out On Bail runs for Case Chambers, Paradise Farms Corp., and David Staudacher.

Tiz the Law, sire of both Non Compliant and Out On Bail, currently leads the first-crop sire list. He has two more chances in Friday's Breeders' Cup races with Scythian and Tigerish, both in the GI Juvenile Fillies Turf.

Another Breeders' Cup entrant was reportedly scratched Tuesday evening. Commentator Nick Luck shared via X that 'TDN Rising Star' and last year's G1 Fillies Mile winner Ylang Ylang (Frankel {GB}) had been vet scratched from Saturday's GI Filly & Mare Turf. The Aidan O'Brien trainee races for Mrs. John Magnier, Michael B. Tabor, Derrick Smith, Westerberg, and Peter Brant. Ryan Moore was scheduled to ride.

LITTLE RED FEATHER COLLECTING FOR HOMETOWN BREEDERS' CUP by Chris McGrath

"Boy Trapped in Refrigerator Eats Own Foot."

Well, that got your attention, didn't it? Devotees of a certain spoof disaster movie may recall the spinning front-page story-but few will be aware that it may yet, in a roundabout way, lead to genuine headlines at the Breeders' Cup.

Bret Jones of Airdrie Stud was at a dinner a few years ago when someone passing behind his seat overheard him saying how much he enjoyed Airplane!

"I was in that movie," said Billy Koch.

On the face of it, it seemed unlikely. Airplane! came out in 1980, and it was plain to Jones that this guy could only have been a kid back then. But Koch explained that the film was produced by his grandfather Howard, who had asked to borrow a picture of young Billy.

"My second-grade picture," recalls Koch, shaking his head. "My hair was a disaster. I had cut it myself. But I didn't even know what it was for, so I gave him this picture."

Next thing he knows, he's gazing out of the newspaper as the face of an unusually hungry boy. Naturally Koch protested that he would have provided a much better picture, had he only known what it was for. But that, of course, was precisely the point of not explaining. And by now Koch is glad to accept and enjoy the notoriety-especially as the incidental benefits include a friendship that itself contained, with no greater calculation, a latent opportunity for shared professional success.

Three years ago Jones approached Koch, who operates Little Red Feather Racing with boyhood buddy Gary Fenton, about four Airdrie yearlings that had fallen short of their reserves. Jones was confident they would prove nicer than the market had recognized, not least a colt from the first crop of Collected out of GI Kentucky Oaks winner Believe You Can (Proud Citizen). Sure enough, with Madaket having also come in for a third, last year Phil d'Amato trained Conclude to win the GII Del Mar Derby and this time round the GII Del Mar Mile.

Suitably encouraged, last fall Little Red Feather and Madaket entered a similar deal for four Airdrie graduates-including another by Collected, a filly out of stakes winner Creative Thinking (Creative Cause), duly named **Thought Process**. She joined d'Amato, where her neighbors included a Collected colt bought from Airdrie at the September Sale, for \$130,000, by Little Red Feather's regular bloodstock agent John Dowd. He was named for Koch's pal, baseball Hall of Famer Cal Ripken Jr., as Iron Man Cal.

Both Thought Process and Iron Man Cal broke their maidens at the Del Mar summer meet, where Little Red Feather ended up leading owners. (Madaket, evidently enjoying their partnership in the other horses, bought a minority stake in Iron Man Cal after his maiden success.) And a few days ago, both added graded stakes on the same Santa Anita card.

Some advert, for a \$10,000 sire! "I can't speak for everyone else, of course," Koch says. "But the Collecteds we've got all have really great minds. They're so smart. You can have a really good racehorse that might just be fast, right? But these horses have class, as well."

D'Amato is now preparing Thought Process and Iron Man Cal for the juvenile turf racing at a Breeders' Cup staged at Little Red Feather's spiritual home-potentially the biggest thrill for the program since its breakout success, with the bargain Singletary, in the Mile at Lone Star in 2004.

"This game is a rollercoaster," Koch says. "We know that we're going to have highs, and we're going to have lows. But it so happened that we had an outstanding summer at Del Mar. We really do point for that meet. Our pre-opening day party is a real highlight of the summer. We like to say that LRF stands for Little Red Family, our clients all know each other and everybody loves to get together at Del Mar. I mean, they wear flip-flops and shorts, they just relax and have a great time. So when you have a memorable meet like that, it really makes your year."

Fenton explains that much of their 400-strong clientele is drawn from the vicinity.

"Generally, and this goes for a lot of partnership groups, it dissipates as you get farther from the racetracks," he says. "Half of our partners are in California and the rest are spread through Oregon, Washington, Denver, Arizona. So we set up our year for Del Mar, and keep our fingers crossed. And this year we hit it in every which way you could: with a sales purchase, with a European import, and especially with this partnership with Bret, which has just knocked it out of the park twice in a row."

Fenton admires how Jones put together a package that could work for all parties. "I think maybe one reason we get along so well is because Bret's doing some of the things that Little Red Feather did 20 years ago," he reasons. "Partnerships weren't really the thing when we first started. It was the Sport of Kings, and you owned your own horse. But gradually the communal experience has really taken over as the best way to own a racehorse. So just as we were bucking the trend back then, Bret is continuing to think in a very forward-thinking way."

These juveniles, moreover, can look up to a real senior pro on the program. This summer Gold Phoenix (Ire) (Belardo (Ire)) became the first triple winner of the GII Del Mar Handicap, and now returns to the GI Breeders' Cup Turf after his longshot fourth last year.

"He's an amazing creature," enthuses Koch. "No horse has ever won the same stake at Del Mar three straight years, so the Breeders' Cup will be his home turf. He loves it round there, and it's so exciting for our group to head into it with an old warrior like him."

And then there was the horse of the meet, Iscreamuscream (Twirling Candy), a \$145,000 OBS 2-year-old who was one-third cashed out (at a \$1 million total valuation) through a Fasig-Tipton Flash Sale.

"After the [GII] San Clemente, we got with Boyd Browning and our friends at TaylorMade, and decided just to try out a digital sale and see what we could do," Koch explains. "We want to be

financially savvy with our partners. Listen, does it change anybody's life? No. But is it the responsible thing to do, sometimes to take money off the table? Absolutely. And Mark Martinez, a good friend of ours from Agave Racing Stable, bid \$330,000. Then two weeks later she went out and won the Del Mar Oaks, so his investment proved very smart. To have a Grade I winner at Del Mar and win horse of the meet, that's the pinnacle for us."

As chairman of the

Thoroughbred Owners of California, however, Fenton does not confine himself to a parochial perspective. He's an ardent evangelist for the past, present and future of Californian racing, while candidly acknowledging its current problems.

"We love hosting the Breeders' Cup and welcoming the world to our amazing racetracks," Fenton says. "Sure, California is under pressure. Purses are becoming a little more competitive

> in other states and we're falling a little behind. But the leaders in California have been actively looking for ancillary revenues, the same way that Kentucky found it, the same way that New York found it. Yes, Golden Gate closed last year. But we're working on consolidating the industry. We believe that instead of a north and the south, one circuit incorporating both could fuel better purses for all the horsemen."

Naturally he appreciates the suggestion that the rest of the American industry cannot detach

itself from California's issues. After all, it was not so long ago that Santa Anita found itself in the front line, in terms of our sport's exposure, and responded with astounding improvements.





"I think people realized in the last couple years how important California is--not only for American racing, but for their bottom lines as well," Fenton remarks. "Kentucky is capped out, unless they're going to use some of that money to build racetracks and add races. If California doesn't get better, then everybody's going to contract. People recognize that. I get calls almost every day: 'What can we do to help?' So I believe people will come together and make sure that California stays around for a long time."

And that, he believes, will be true even if the elephant in the room-the value of Santa Anita as real estate-gets up and leaves. "We have a beautiful racetrack run by a nonprofit down in Del Mar, on state-run property," he says. "They have a long-term lease. We already run basically the second half of the year at Del Mar. So we're prepared to run more dates there, hopefully with high enough purses to attract a lot of Midwest and East Coast trainers."

But nor should Little Red Feather itself be viewed in isolation as any kind of narrow, local program. They prospect in Europe as well as America, and in recent years have also developed a

pinhooking portfolio for about 60 partners. This has proved something of a revelation.

"When we first started, we thought we would say that this should be your business money," Fenton explains. "Racing is supposed to be your fun money, this would be more about your savings; about trying to do the same as the markets or better, with a little more risk, a little more reward. What we didn't anticipate was the hammer falling on one of our very first pinhooks, a \$100,000 Broken Vow colt, at \$1.2 million. And the euphoria, striking it like that, was like winning a stakes race."

"Now we were not just providing healthy returns, on a consistent and annual basis. We were also providing a fun and unique experience, involving our people in the whole process: picking a yearling, developing it over the following months. It's become something that mirrors the thrills that go along with the racing side."

With Tom McCrocklin's help, Little Red Feather has pinhooked seven horses for \$700,000 or more; and six that have gone on to either win or place at graded stakes level.

"We want people to look at us and say, 'We can buy good stock from them," Fenton says. "The Amestoys, who finished second in the [GI] Futurity at Del Mar [with McKinzie Street] had a maiden winner the same day, and both of those horses were pinhooked by us. That's something we really take a lot of pride in, and hopefully that kind of relationship continues."

Perhaps it's no coincidence that both Koch and Fenton first worked in Hollywood before reverting to the obsession they had shared as kids. Koch had started out in the family trade, working on his father's production team for Wayne's World before starting Little Red Feather in 2002; while Fenton, who came aboard in 2005, started as an attorney with the William Morris Agency. In other words, they were fully immersed in the daily functioning of the Hollywood economy, before transitioning to a parallel challenge on the Turf: making sure that the machinery will sustain the magic.

"My father's a producer, my grandfather's a producer, and I was on that path," says Koch, whose sons have inherited a flair for the world of performance respectively as actor, editor and musician. "But I just had something inside of me that said, 'Be in the horse business.' My grandfather used to take me to the races when I was five years old. I mean, that's almost 50 years now, so I have a lot of historical perspective. I always just loved the sport, and I love the people.

"Maybe I didn't love the people in the entertainment industry!

They just weren't my style. Perhaps I might have been too honest for them, but it's a choice I made. And I really thank my lucky stars. I've been really blessed. Put together a great crew: brought in Gary; Phil has been amazing, as trainer; John, as bloodstock agent; and then Tom McCrocklin, who's one of my favorite humans on earth. My dad always said, 'Put people around you who are smarter than you are, and they'll make you look smarter too.' And I think I've done that."

And, really, the process is analogous: all the morning trackwork being rehearsal for the day the curtain goes up.

"Oh, absolutely," Fenton agrees. "But in the morning, when our partners are there, again it's all about servicing that partner-just like I did at William Morris. Whether you were servicing an actor or writer or director, your job was the same: to make their lives better. And it's the same, with these horses. Our job is to provide a first-class ownership experience."

"I think there's a lot of pride," adds Koch. "There's an adrenaline rush with this sport you don't get elsewhere.

Koch continued, "Whether it's bidding on a horse, or watching a race, my heart will go 1,000 miles an hour. We do fractional shares, so we're going to have 12 to 15 people in a partnership. They bring their family, they bring their kids. So when we win a big race, you say: 'Oh my gosh. Look at these people. Look at their joy.' And that's what this sport does. It can bring that kind of energy, and that's what I feed off."

But however dynamic the vibe, it needs a stable base. And that's where all these relationships come in: whether with the partners, or within the management team, or with men like Jones who share the imagination to turn a world of challenges into one of opportunity.

"It's very special to do these things with people like Bret and Ben Henley at Airdrie," Koch says. "Just good people. That's hard

> to find. I mean, there's some sport. Let's leave it at that. But I can tell you that Bret is a very

"He was a genius at what he

interesting characters in this good man, a kind man who really cares about his horses and his team."

did," Koch says. "I went to his celebration of life, and it was so moving. He was so loved.

When you leave something like that, you just look at yourself, you look inward, and say, 'Okay, how can I be a better person?"" And it's that kind of attitude that underpins the whole Little Red Feather culture. These guys know the business: they understand that streaks like the one they have enjoyed this year won't last forever.

"We like to sleep well at night," Fenton says. "Horses may win, horses may lose. Our partners have to leave the track losing 80 percent of the time. But 100 percent of the time we want to make sure they have a great experience."

"We know this game is very, very difficult," Koch agrees. "And it's hard financially, as well. So we're going to try to give these people the best possible experience we can. If we can't always be successful on the racetrack, we damned well better be successful off it."

East Avenue (Medaglia d'Oro) was all but crowned a champion when he glided home the easiest of winners in the GI Claiborne

Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland Oct. 5 in just his second career start. The Godolphin homebred, who earned 'TDN Rising Star' status when he opened his career with an eight-length romp at Ellis Park Aug. 24, has yet to be tested and will be favored to cement his status as champion of his division Friday at Del Mar.

"Since Day One, you couldn't help but love him," trainer Brendan Walsh said of the colt. "He's always been a lovely looking horse."

While East Avenue has been first at every call in his two

outings, fellow 'TDN Rising Star' Chancer McPatrick (McKinzie) has won his three lifetime starts while racing from off the pace. The bay colt will get his first try at two turns Friday after toplevel victories in the seven-furlong GI Hopeful Stakes and one-

> mile GI Champagne Stakes. Distance is unlikely to faze the strapping bay with the Classic pedigree, especially considering his dramatic last-to-first win in the Champagne and he continues to impress trainer Chad Brown with his progress.

"I'm very excited to get him over two turns," Brown said. "Every time I've run him, I've been looking ahead to more distance. He's doing super right now, this horse. The way the track plays could work against him, but the distance will certainly help him. I do think

that maybe he could very well be a little more forward coming out of these one-turn races. I hope so."

He has been training forwardly, including a best-of-51 five furlongs in :58 4/5 at Santa Anita last Saturday.

NETJETS BREEDERS' CUP JUVENILE FILLIES


In the waning weeks of summer and the beginning weeks of fall, prime time each year for the 2-year-old cream to rise to the top with 'Future Stars Friday' as a target, there were eight graded stakes on the dirt from coast to coast specifically for juvenile fillies. Seven individual fillies won those eight stakes with five of the seven entered in Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, making it a true championship event.

While each filly is full of promise and has shown enough to her connections to warrant a spot in the gate here, the edge has to go to Godolphin's homebred Immersive (Nyquist). The undefeated GI Darley Alcibiades Stakes and GI Spinaway Stakes winner stands head and shoulders above the rest on sheer accomplishments. With just four domestic Grade I contests in the books for this division, Immersive has taken down two of them. She's already won at the distance, while her Beyers stack up nicely against most of the field. Trainer Brad Cox, who won the Juvenile Fillies in 2019 with British Idiom, looks to win his 11th Breeders' Cup race since 2018.

Immersive may have the most glittering CV, but it's impossible to ignore the looming presence of Scottish Lassie (McKinzie), whose win in the GI Frizette Stakes stamped her as the 5-2 favorite here. After a debut third at Saratoga behind fellow Juvenile Fillies entrants Quickick (McKinzie) and Snowyte (Good Magic), she trounced all comers in the Frizette to break her maiden by nine widening lengths. It was the manner in which she did it, as well as her 90 Beyer--which no one else in the field can hold a candle to--that made the sport sit up and take notice.





The guestion has to be whether she was a one-hit wonder and if she'll regress after such a monster effort. Even though trainer

Jorge Abreu won his first graded race in the Frizette, he's no stranger to the top as a former assistant to both Nick Zito and Chad Brown. He also nearly captured this race last year with 17-1 neck runner-up Jody's Pride (American Pharoah). Abreu co-owns Scottish Lassie with Sportsmen Stable, Parkland Thoroughbreds, Photos Finish LLC, and Corms Racing Stable.

Despite the exploits of Immersive and Scottish Lassie, it's impossible to ignore the home team, especially when the Breeders' Cup is held in California. Bob

Baffert's powerhouse stable lost GII Oak Leaf Stakes winner Non Compliant (Tiz the Law), who was withdrawn Tuesday, but is still represented by 'TDN Rising Star' Nooni (Win Win Win).

Nooni, who backed up her \$1.8-million OBS price tag with a GIII Sorrento Stakes win at this track before weakening in a GI

> Del Mar Debutante Stakes duel. redeemed herself with a second to Non Compliant in the Oak Leaf. The Zedan Racing Stables runner is 15-1 on the morning line, but we've seen Baffert win big races with a lesser-regarded part of his entry more than once.

> The aforementioned Quickick and Snowyte have been playing bridesmaids, each second to Immersive and Scottish Lassie, respectively, in the Alcibiades and Frizette. Neither has ever finished off the board and while their speed figures are just a cut below the leaders here, they may still have room to improve. It wouldn't be a giant leap to see either one

blossom at this time of year.



While the Juvenile Fillies Turf division is stacked heavy on the firepower from Europe, the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf has a bit more grace to give as Japan, the U.S., and Europe all have entries in here with strong arguments to make in their favor for

this Friday nightcap of Day One of the World Championships. It will be tough to overlook Godolphin's SW-Eng & GISP AI Qudra (Ire) (No Nay Never) for Charlie Appleby, especially given that he's been in the States since at least late August with his first recorded work being Aug. 23 over the Saratoga turf training track. A stakes-winner at Ascot in the Listed Pat Eddery July 27 over returning rival, Qatar Racing's SW-Eng & GISW New Century (GB) (Kameko), he's one of several Europeans to have come early enough to acclimate to the North American racing scene, and a closer shipping distance--he was stabled at Keeneland all of October--can be a huge boon for horses who don't enjoy traveling.

Granted, the last time Al Qudra and the Andrew Baldingtrained New Century faced each other in the States, the latter came out the winner by 1 1/4 lengths in the 'WAYI' GI Summer Stakes at Woodbine after the pair spent most of the race never more than a couple of lengths apart. New Century came eight wide en route to victory and earned a 93 Beyer for the effort while the former was given a 91. Neither had the cleanest trip in the Canadian Grade I, but Breeders' Cup races infrequently provide those as well.





Hailing from New York, and with his full-brother set to do battle with City of Troy in the Classic, GSW Mentee (City of Light) will fly the flag for Repole Stables and Todd Pletcher after securing his spot via the 'Win and You're In' GIII Futurity Stakes at the Belmont Big A meet. This one was very green on debut-opening up a massive margin only to have it eaten away to a nose on the wire--but also fast, as that effort in the June maiden broke the track record for five furlongs over the Aqueduct main

To the outside of the rush for positions, MGSW & G1SP-Ire Henri Matisse (Ire) (Wootton Bassett (GB)) will be the Aidan O'Brien representative here racing in the Coolmore-navy colors. A winner of three straight at the Curragh in Ireland, including two Group 2 races, he took his first step up into elite company two back Sept. 15 in the G1 Goffs Vincent O'Brien National Stakes and begrudgingly yielded in the closing yards to finish second by three-quarters of a length. He took his show on the road Oct. 6 to France, finishing fifth in the G1 Qatar Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere after being knocked around early on and finding himself farther back than ideal. They're removing the blinkers for this start, and Ryan Moore is back in the irons.

The closest to the rail, and arriving with a strong fleet of Japanese runners, is G3 Hakodate Nisai Stakes winner Satono Carnaval (Jpn) (Kitasan Black {Jpn}). A blow-out maiden score by seven lengths going left-handed at seven furlongs back in June, and then a 1 1/4-length win last out July 13 in the aforementioned group race going right-handed are thus far his entire career. And yes, he last ran in July. Still, Team Japan has the uncanny ability to pull off the seemingly impossible when the time calls for it, and it would not surprise me at all to see this one defy expectations in a big way.

Like Thought Process in the Juvenile Fillies Turf, GSW Iron Man Cal (Collected) is another who could turn his experience over this Del Mar turf course into the ultimate boon, as he too enjoys an open-lengths victory over it from back in September. True it was against maidens, and he'll need to improve a lot more than he already has to beat this bunch, but the importance of prior experience in young horses cannot be overstated. Iron Man Cal was last seen being elevated to victory in the GIII Zuma Beach Stakes at Santa Anita. -- Patrycja Szpyra

JOHN DEERE BREEDERS' CUP JUVENILE FILLIES TURF

Team Europe almost always brings some nice horses for a crack at this championship match, but almost surprisingly, they are 3-for-16 in the race. However, to ignore their presence is a fool's errand, and they shipped over some titans this year for just about every turf division, as well as the Classic. Combined

with the American hopefuls in this race, the 2024 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf is shaping up to be one of the most exciting races of the World Championships.

It's hard to knock a juvenile multiple Group 1-winner, and 'TDN Rising Star' Lake Victoria (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) is the deserving favorite in this race. Drawn on the rail, she's undefeated from four starts in her young career, but has already ascended the highest level of the sport on two occasions with a stylish threelength win last out Sept. 28 in the G1 Juddmonte Cheveley Park Stakes and two back Sept. 15 in the G1 Moyglare Stud Stakes. As of Sept. 30, she is Timeform's highest-rated 2-year-old filly in Europe and her victory in the Cheveley Park gave conditioner Aidan O'Brien a record-breaking fifth in that contest.

As a side thought, said trainer has gone on record saying that Lake Victoria looks to be a 'G1 1000 Guineas filly', and when the man who consistently breaks records every year says that, then who are we to argue otherwise?

Lake Victoria may not be quite as unconquerable as it seems, given she does have some hurdles to overcome here, one of those being the oft-referenced lack of experience on turns, as well as shipping and new surroundings.





She's only ever raced on straightaways, which might pose a problem for her come the first turn when the pack descends on the fence to secure a good path for the race. It's going to be loud, and busy, and when it's show time, it's show time...whether you're ready or not.

The second of the two-sided advance of the O'Brien camp-and leaving gate eight at the center of the field--comes from Irish group winner **Heavens Gate (Ire)** (Churchill {Ire}). Like Lake Victoria, she has only ever run in a straight line, and in seven starts has only been off the board once. This is a consistent filly, and she's been the favorite in her last four consecutive races, including last out Sept. 29 in the G3 Weld Park Stakes.

Facing each other for the second time, she gamely fought off a challenge in the final yards from MGSP-Ire Fiery Lucy (GB) (Without Parole {GB}), who has also drawn into this Juvenile Fillies Turf to the far outside. Heavens Gate's regular rider Ryan Moore went to Lake Victoria while she picked up Wayne Lordan for this trip.

From the American front, GSW Thought Process (Collected) is a serious contender from the Southern California circuit, as she's a two-time winner over this turf course and doesn't need the lead to win for fun. Her maiden-breaking victory Aug. 17 was by 3 1/2 lengths, the Sept. 7 score in the Listed Del Mar Juvenile Fillies Turf Stakes was by two lengths, and she picked up her first graded black-type last out Oct. 6 at Santa Anita. Dominating the GIII Surfer Girl Stakes by 4 1/2 lengths, her Beyer figures have steadily increased with each successive effort to a current high of 86. The experience at Del Mar, along with her good early foot, might help her get the jump on the Europeans, who will no doubt be coming like a train, late.

GII Jessamine Stakes victress May Day Ready (Tapit) has three wins from as many jumps to her name, and never in the same place. Her debut at Saratoga Aug. 4 was decided in a photo, where she won by a nose after going a route of ground, and then relished the Kentucky Downs turf Sept. 8, winning the Kentucky Downs Juvenile Fillies Stakes over a course considered an enigma and a mystery to many. She followed that performance up with another nail-biter at Keeneland last out Oct. 4, getting the best of SW Totally Justified (Justify) by a nose. That one returns here as well, and while she will be jumping from the middle of the gate, May Day Ready has drawn two spots in from the far outside. Considering she has shown the flexibility to come from the clouds or mid-pack, that 12 slot might be the least of jockey Frankie Dettori's concerns here. - Patrycja Szpyra

BREEDERS' CUP JUVENILE TURF SPRINT

The GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint, the first offering over two days of championship racing at Del Mar, last year served as the coming-out party for fan-favorite Big Evs (Ire) (Blue Point {Ire}). The colt held the lead from the top of the lane to the wire after rating just off the speed up the backstretch and around the far turn. It's always difficult to predict whether being forwardly placed while turf sprinting is a help or a hindrance. Big Evs exhibited his tactical strength and uncorked at the right opportunity. What is guaranteed in this year's race is that a scamper down the lane will create another exciting contest for these juveniles.

Coming into the seaside oval's shortest distance on the grass, look for 5-1 Whistlejacket (Ire) (No Nay Never) and 8-1 Ides of March (Ire) (Wootton Bassett (GB)) to potentially outrun their respective morning-line odds. The Aidan O'Brien runners have the services of superstar jockeys Ryan Moore and Frankie Dettori, respectively. How many great duels have these two engaged in?

Whistlejacket's dossier got a nice boost when the colt won the G1 Prix Morny Stakes at Deauville two races back Aug. 18, while Ides of March scooped up his first stakes score in the G3 Round Tower Stakes at The Curragh Aug. 31.

Standing in their way are other continental players like Aesterius (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}), Big Mojo (Ire) (Mohaarther {GB}) and Magnum Force (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}). The trio finished the trifecta in the G2 Flying Childers Stakes at Doncaster Sept. 13.

Also present is Shareholder (Not This Time), who notched a signature win in the G2 Norfolk Stakes at the Royal Meeting in mid-June for owner Wathnan Racing and the intriguing breeder at Skyfall Thoroughbreds.

Toss in the ultra-consistent Arizona Blaze (GB) (Sergei Prokofiev) for Amo Racing and this is a good bunch of Europeans.

Let's not overlook, though, the 7-2 morning-line favorite, **Ecoro Sieg** (Twirling Candy). The \$250,000 OBS March grad is owned by Masatoshi Haramura and trained by Hideyuki Mori. The dark bay broke a record that stood for over 20 years when he won the open-class Canna Stakes at Nakayama Racecourse Sept. 21. The colt posted the fastest 2-year-old time at six furlongs (1200m) in Japanese Racing Association history and if he can replicate his performance from that day, then the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint might be his for the taking.

Though outnumbered, the Americans are not on idle here and are certainly up for defending their own turf. Governor Sam (Improbable) is coming out of the Indian Summer Stakes at Keeneland Oct. 6 where he outbattled the Juvenile Turf Sprint scratched Out On Bail (Tiz the Law) all the way to the wire. Partowned by MLB star Alex Bregman and his family, Governor Sam had just enough left in the tank after leading from the break, but Out On Bail certainly made it interesting.

With turf underneath on his dam side, the Todd Pletcher trainee is going to be a massive price, but he gets the services of multiple Eclipse winner Irad Ortiz, Jr. In a race where anything can happen, Gate to Wire could do just that in the end. --@campbellparlay

WATERHOUSE AND BOTT TO TRAIN RECORD-PRICED 1.3 MILLION DELIUS FROM TATTERSALLS

Another record was broken at Tattersalls on Tuesday when Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe eighth Delius (GB) (Frankel {GB}) became the most expensive horse ever sold at the Autumn Horses-In-Training Sale when knocked down from Coolmore to Hubie De Burgh and a range of other buyers to join Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott.

A delighted De Burgh explained that Delius, who has won three of his six starts and was beaten a little under nine lengths by Bluestocking (GB) (Camelot {GB}) in the Arc, had been on his radar for a long time. By teaming up with owner Sir Owen Glenn of Go Bloodstock, along with the buying team of Johnny McKeever and Claudia Fitzgerald, he landed the potential Melbourne Cup candidate.

"It's a joint-venture and he goes to Gai Waterhouse and the team," De Burgh said. "He's been bought for Sir Owen Glenn of Go Bloodstock. He's had a lot of great horses, including Lady Of Camelot (Aus) (Written Tycoon {Aus}), who Gai trained for him. He wanted a Cup horse for next year, and obviously Gai did as well, so it's a joint venture between Gai and Sir Owen." Cont. p3

JOHANNESBURG TO CITY OF TROY: THREE GENERATIONS ON AND BACK TO THE DIRT

DEL MAR, USA -- October 2001 was a sobering time to be in New York. Some seven weeks on from the devastating attack on the World Trade Center, the city was shrouded in sadness and America was a nation united in grief for the thousands who lost their lives on 9/11.

Horseracing, often referred to as the great triviality, doesn't usually feel like that to those who work in the sport, but it did feel trivial, almost intrusive, to be at Belmont that year for what was a first visit to the Breeders' Cup for this correspondent.

There arguably could not have been a more emotive race call than "Tiznow wins it for America" as that great horse claimed, by a nose, his second Breeders' Cup Classic, seeing off the British-trained Sakhee, who had won the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe just three weeks earlier. Cont. p7

Deep into the bidding, auctioneer Alastair Pim described Delius as "a Group 1 horse who can run in any Group 1 race anywhere in the world." That statement wasn't lost on the Australian buyers, with Chris Waller and Ciaron Maher involved in the bidding war along with one unnamed bidder online.

"What else can I say? He's a Frankel, has raced six times and has a 118 Timeform rating and he's won over 1m2f and 1m4f. He has the perfect profile for Australia and the only bad run he had came in the Arc on ground he hated. It was a lot of money but unfortunately that's what they are making."


De Burgh was decisive in his bidding and it paid off. Explaining how Delius had been on his radar ever since he made a winning debut for Coolmore and trainer Jean-Claude Rouget at ParisLongchamp back in April, and that any deal to source the colt was put on the back burner due to the handler's poor health, the agent said, "I had Stevie O'Connor on [the phone]. He's Sir Owen's racing manager and we've been trying to buy this horse for a long time. I actually tried to buy him after his first and second starts and we really wanted the horse but unfortunately Jean-Claude wasn't very well and MV [Magnier] didn't want to sell the horse."

He added, "It was only after the Arc when Jean-Claude was happy to let the horse go. It was hard to buy the horse on our own--it was a lot of money--so joining forces gave us the opportunity to bid against Chris Waller, Ciaron Maher and all of the other people who were involved in the bidding."

Delius was purchased by Magnier for 675,000gns from breeders Furnace Mill Stud at the Tattersalls December Foal Sales. Cont. p4

It wasn't the only good piece of trading carried out by Coolmore on the day with Ollie Sangster going to 330,000gns on behalf of Wesley Ward for Mountain Bear (Ire) (No Nay Never) while McKeever also sourced Irish Cesarewitch winner The Euphrates (GB) (Frankel {GB}) on behalf of Waterhouse and Bott earlier in the session for 250,000gns.

Unsurprisingly, the record sale of Delius on Tuesday highlighted another strong day of trade overall, with all of the key figures significantly up on the corresponding session from 12 months ago. Turnover climbed 16% to 13,890,000gns, the median was up 7% to 23,500gns and the average was also up 16% to 52,218gns. The clearance rate stood at 93% [up 3%].

Another Big Payday For Elliott's Imperium Draft

The strength of the Australian buying bench was one of the major themes of the Tuesday session, with Alex Elliott of Imperium Sales one of the major beneficiaries, after selling two horses--Hutchence (GB) (Frankel {GB}) and Mr Monaco (GB) (Territories {Ire})--in quick succession for 870,000gns combined to go Down Under.

First up was Hutchence, a winner of a 2m handicap at Ascot for Ralph Beckett in the Valmont silks, who boasts a rating of 97. He was bought by Guy Mulcaster on behalf of Chris Waller for 460,000gns.

Mulcaster said, "He came highly recommended from the Beckett stable and we liked the horse. We thought he'd good form and he's probably done it all on one preparation so we thought there was a little bit of juice left in the lemon. We'll take him home, take a punt and see how we go."

Asked if he would be going to Chris Waller, Mulcaster said, "Well we're not sending him to Ciaron Maher are we? I don't think we're in any mad rush with the horse."

He continued, "I thought he'd make that sort of money because some of the lesser horses have been making good money and it's been hard to buy horses. This sale has been good to us but you've got to keep digging and finding the next one under a rock, don't we?"

Ironically, it was Maher [along with Astute Bloodstock] who purchased the next lot into the ring, the 98-rated Mr Monaco at 410,000gns. All told, Imperium sold nine horses for a combined sum of 1,576,000gns, and Elliott, whose debut consignment came at this sale 12 months ago, commented, "They all made about what I thought--there were a couple of nice surprises as well."

He added, "There was a lot of pressure after last year and I wanted to back those results up. The team did it and horses did it. Again, I was very proud to stand there and see the horses sell well for the clients. It will keep the clients happy as there are a lot of yearlings to pay for!"

Atlantic Coast Also Off To Australia

Henry Dwyer enjoyed a momentous summer in Britain with star mare Asfoora (Aus) (Flying Artie {Aus}) winning the King Charles III Stakes at Royal Ascot and the Australian-based handler was on hand at Tattersalls to snap up Atlantic Coast (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}) alongside Sam Haggas of Hurworth Bloodstock for 340,000gns.

Owned by Al Shira'aa Racing, the Joseph O'Brien-trained Atlantic Coast won the G3 Killavullan Stakes at two. He has clearly trained on a three-year-old given he was last seen winning a Listed contest at Saint-Cloud for that outfit. Cont. p5

Dwyer said, "We generally come over here to look for horses who are going to get 1m4f up to 2m, but he is just such a lovely horse and we think that his form over a mile and 7f will stretch out to 1m2f in Australia.

"He is just a lovely horse, has a lovely head on him, Kodiacs have done well in Australia and Joseph has trained him well. For a horse who has had a bit of racing at three and a bit of travelling, he looks in such good order. There is a beautiful nature to him. We are so pleased to have him and be able to take him back to Australia. He is going to be a great bit of fun."

520k Caviar Heights To Stay In Britain

On a day where the majority of the top lots were sold for export, Sam Haggas managed to strike late in the session to secure the 104-rated Caviar Heights (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) to continue his career at Somerville Lodge with his father William.

International targets will come under the radar for Caviar Heights, who won at Listed level for trainer Karl Burke and owner Sheikh Mohammed Obaid Al Maktoum.

"He is staying in Newmarket and going to my parents," Haggas explained. "I hope the horse can develop into an international campaigner. My parents have had a lot of success taking horses to Sydney for the Autumn Carnival and I hope he can develop into that sort of horse--that would be the dream."

Kirk Lands 'Sexy' Prospect For Mullins

Willie Mullins, who has Absurde (Fr) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) and Vauban (Fr) (Galiway {GB}) to look forward to in this year's Melbourne Cup, might just have sourced a candidate to chart a similar path in years to come in the shape of 330,000gns buy Too Bossy For Us (Ire) (Golden Horn {GB}).

Trained by Kevin Philippart De Foy, Too Bossy For Us won over 1m2f at Ascot and reached a rating of 89 on the level. The immediate plan for the three-year-old colt will be to go over hurdles, top agent Harold Kirk revealed, before explaining that Mullins could always target those major staying handicaps further down the line.

He said, "I did not expect to have to pay that. I knew he was going to be very popular and I think he has been vetted seven times and [buyers from] Australia were going to be very strong on him. He is a beautiful horse--is very progressive, looks as if he is going to stay a good trip and can only improve. I have not seen a nicer horse in a long, long time."

Kirk added, "He is by Golden Horn, who is very sexy. Even for jumping prospects, Golden Horn is very sexy and his stats on the Flat are excellent. This is the first one by him that I have bought.

"This horse is also out of a High Chaparral mare so he is almost guaranteed to stay longer distances. We have bought him to be a Royal Ascot and Melbourne Cup horse, but he will go jumping first. He is a long-term project and he is a super model of a horse."

Buy of the Day

Today's buy of the day comes from press bench colleague Nancy Sexton, who made a pretty strong case for Miss Cynthia (GB) being very well bought at 100,000gns. It's hard to argue against Nancy at the best of times but there's no reason to disagree with this observation. Sold as part of the Sir Mark Prescott draft, the daughter of Sea The Moon (Ger) was last seen finishing fourth in the G1 Prix du Cadran and had already picked up black-type in a Listed race over 2m earlier in the season. On top of all that, Miss Cynthia is a pretty well-bred filly, being out of a sister to Lush Lashes (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Good shout, Nancy. Cont. p6

The year before, Tiznow had thwarted the efforts of Giant's Causeway, who would have given his trainer Aidan O'Brien the most audacious entrance to Breeders' Cup folklore had he not gone down by just a neck that day.

Instead, on October 27, 2001, Johannesburg became the first Breeders' Cup winner for both O'Brien and jockey Mick Kinane when winning the Juvenile on dirt, with the widely-touted odds-on favourite Officer some five lengths behind him in fifth.

Only one horse in the first three generations of Johannesburg's pedigree had been bred outside North America, but this was an Irish victory, and one which set the tone of what was to come from Ballydoyle. Eighteen Breeders' Cup wins later, we find

O'Brien again seeking that elusive victory in the Classic, this time with Johannesburg's great grandson, City Of Troy, who is just one of 11 runners for the trainer at this year's championship.

O'Brien has trained one member in each of the first three generations of City Of Troy's family, Johannesburg being joined by the colt's dam Together Forever (Ire) and her sire Galileo (Ire). The latter was of course present the day of Johannesburg's great triumph, finishing sixth of 13 in the Classic behind Tiznow. It was the last time we'd see Galileo on the racecourse but, boy, have his exploits since then ensured that he will never be forgotten.

What, then, does O'Brien recall about that first triumphant Breeders' Cup meeting, with two horses who would become so genetically entwined in one of this year's most intriguing runners?

"It was very special, and that was the most incredible of all," he said of that breakthrough win. "Johannesburg was the most unbelievable horse because he ran in four countries and won four different Group 1s, and to come out here and win on the

dirt first time was amazing. And he dropped in, and they said you couldn't drop in and come from where he did, but he followed them round and Mick [Kinane] gave him an incredible ride. He just quickened past them."

Twenty-three years later, O'Brien and the Ballydoyle first eleven are back at the Breeders' Cup and the questions in most minds are how well City Of Troy will break to handle the early pace and, if needing to be dropped in, how he will cope with the kickback on his first time racing on dirt.

Tuesday morning saw the O'Brien squadron unleashed from quarantine to trot a lap of the dirt in their customary snake-like fashion before turning for a steady canter back round the other way. Though the team includes the Group 1 winners Luxembourg (Ire), Content (Ire), Ylang Ylang (GB) and

Whistlejacket (Ire) there is of course the greatest focus on City Of Troy. The son of Justify was easy to pick out, not just because of his yellow saddle cloth but for the branded jacket carried by rider Rachel Richardson. He has one race left to run but the stallion campaign is already under way.

"He's just had his first vet check and everything seems to be fine," O'Brien reported after watching his team exercise, and that's more than can be said for his erstwhile favourite for the Melbourne Cup,

Of the situation in Australia, he said, "There comes a point when it becomes ridiculous. The horsemen and women have been taken out of the picture. In this part of the world, it's horsemen who decide."

Returning to the Breeders' Cup Classic, O'Brien said that bringing City Of Troy to America had been the plan before he had ever set foot on a racecourse.

"That was always the dream," he said. "It was the dream about getting Justify originally. The dream for us was to have a dual-purpose stallion, who could produce runners on grass and dirt."

In that regard Justify has justified the outlay, though he was himself untried on grass. The question now will be how City Of Troy can cope with racing on the surface on which his father landed his Triple Crown. Justify's best turf son will attempt to do what no Derby winner has done before from stall three. Cont. p8

"In is probably better than out," said his trainer of the draw. "I suppose the danger when you are in is are you going to be quick enough away? We don't know that. We have done everything we can do. When he ran the way he did in the Guineas, we had to go back and restructure a lot of stuff. We had to go back up slowly through the gears because we were thinking of the Derby. We had to get him to relax and slow down and, at the same time, we had to be preparing him for the Classic for the whole year."

He continued, "At York, we went a little bit forward with him. He is very happy to be forward but we knew if we did that in the Derby, we would have been in trouble. We were very happy with what he did at York but he still wasn't opened up properly. That's why we went to Southwell, rather than an Irish Champion. We wanted the pace to be very strong but we didn't want him to be in front. Southwell was all about the first part of the work rather than the second. He was very comfortable following a very strong pace.

"We think we have him prepared to go forward. Whether he is quick enough to go forward from that slot, in this type of race -I'm not sure.

"He can only break as quick as he is prepared to break, and when that happens Ryan will make his own mind up where is going to sit. We think we have done as much as we can to ask him to break well, it's going to be very interesting."

Out on the track in second place in the Ballydoyle string behind Luxembourg, the trace-clipped City Of Troy sweated up a little, as did Diego Velazquez behind him, but O'Brien was not concerned.

"I'd rather they were sweating than not because it means they're up for it, rather than coming here and floating around," he noted. "The Classic is going to be ferocious and he is going to have to be on his game. If he is in any way laidback you'll get wiped out, so I'd rather he was a little bit edgy.

"It won't be a problem. His canters will ramp up a little bit each day - they'll never really open up but they will ramp up a little bit more. I'd be very happy with what we saw today."

And after Giant's Causeway's near miss almost a quarter of a century ago, how much does it remain a burning desire to add that particular Grade I race to the many that have already been ticked off around the world by O'Brien?

"If we didn't do it we'd probably say forever 'why didn't we do it?" he said. "Obviously we fail all the time but if we don't fail we don't get better, and you always learn more from your failures than your wins."

HAVANA GREY FEE LISTED AS PRIVATE AND WITH HEIGHT RESTRICTIONS FOR MARES IN 2025

Havana Grey (GB), one of the most exciting young stallions in Europe, has had his fee made private as he prepares to stand his seventh season at Whitsbury Manor Stud in 2025.

The sire of the dual Group 1-winning juvenile Vandeek (GB) and this year's G2 Duchess Of Cambridge Stakes winner Arabian Dusk (GB), Havana Grey stood at a fee of £55,000 when covering 139 mares this season--down from 164 in 2023--and his book for the upcoming breeding season will be restricted to mares considered to be a suitable height. Whitsbury Manor Roster Fees Cont.

Joe Callan, head of bloodstock and sales at Whitsbury Manor, said, "Although Havana Grey is still very much open for business for a restricted number of outside mares, we have decided to make his fee private. This is due to the importance of managing his mares to be of suitable height for him in the covering shed and for his own welfare and continued good fertility.

"After another fantastic year including 11 individual stakes winners and phenomenal yearling sale results, we know that demand for him will once again be high."

The fee for Havana Grey's stud-mate **Showcasing (GB)** has been dropped to £35,000 after he covered 114 mares at a fee of £45,000 this season. The Karl Burke-trained Swingalong (Ire) has been his flagbearer on the racecourse in 2024, filling the runner-up spot in a trio of Group 1 sprints in Britain, while Showcasing is also the broodmare sire of leading two-year-old filly Lake Victoria (Ire) (Frankel {GB}).

Sergei Prokofiev has had his fee increased to £8,000 (from £6,000) following a strong start at stud, with his first crop of two-year-olds yielding 18 winners in Europe so far, including the G3 Marble Hill Stakes scorer and G1 Phoenix Stakes third Arizona Blaze (GB). He was sent 166 mares this season, while Dragon Symbol (GB), a newcomer to the Whitsbury Manor roster for 2024, covered 140 mares. The fee for the son of Cable Bay (Ire), who was first past the post in the G1 Commonwealth Cup, remains at £8,000.

JAN BRUEGHEL FORCED TO MISS MELBOURNE CUP AFTER FAILED VET CHECK

Aidan O'Brien's **Jan Brueghel (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) has been ruled out of the G1 Lexus Melbourne Cup after failing a pre-race veterinary check.

The unbeaten St Leger winner had been among the ante-post favourites in his quest to provide O'Brien with a first victory in 'the race that stops a nation' at Flemington next week, but Ballydoyle will now be without a runner in the race as a result of the ruling made by the Racing Victoria Stewards.

A statement from Racing Victoria said, "Racing Victoria Stewards, acting on specialist veterinary advice, have today withdrawn Jan Brueghel from the entries for the 2024 Lexus Melbourne Cup to be run at Flemington next Tuesday, 5 November.

"In accordance with the conditions of the race, Jan Brueghel was presented at the University of Melbourne Equine Centre in Werribee on Saturday, 26 October for compulsory CT scans of its distal limbs.

"Reports received from an expert panel of internationally renowned equine surgeons and diagnostic imaging specialists,

who reviewed Jan Brueghel's CT scan results, indicate that the horse is currently at heightened risk of injury.

"Following advice from RV Veterinary Services in relation to the specialist opinions from the independent imaging panel, RV Stewards ordered the withdrawal of Jan Brueghel from the Melbourne Cup on the basis that he was unsuitable to compete."

Tom Magnier, representing owners Coolmore, told *SEN Track*, "We've learned this morning that Jan Brueghel won't be taking his place in the Melbourne Cup this year.

"He went through all the protocols in Ireland before departing to come down here. The lads have been very happy with the horse--he's been bouncing out there in quarantine [at Werribee].

"But the vets have come up with the decision that has been made that he doesn't pass the veterinary inspection to run in the Melbourne Cup.

"We're very disappointed. Obviously I'm extremely disappointed for the staff, all our team that have put in so much work both at home, travelling down and getting him here. I really feel for them because they were excited about this.

"But at the end of the day at Coolmore the horse comes first. A decision has been made and that's that."

O'Brien will re-route the Classic hero to the G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase during the Longines Hong Kong International Races in early December.

"Everything was perfect with him, he went through all the hoops and scans. Our vets were happy, but the Australian vets were not happy with them," said the Ballydoyle handler.

"It's easy to say now, but we thought he was a massive handicap blot as a classy, unbeaten horse with 8st 7lb to carry and Ryan Moore riding him." Cont. p10

He added, "We will go for the race in Hong Kong now. Most scans are open to opinion, they gave him another in the last few days and found a shadow on the hind leg, but with all horses you can get shadows.

"Everything was properly done with the horse and it's all getting a little bit ridiculous."
