DEL MAR, USA — "If we get the horses we can deliver," said Ger Lyons after proving his point emphatically in the opening Breeders' Cup race on Future Stars Friday. "We have to up our game every day to take on Aidan. It's just fantastically competitive at home."

That second point was also proved, again and again, in the hours to follow as Lake Victoria (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) remained unbeaten in her taking of the Juvenile Fillies Turf and Henri Matisse (Ire) (Wootton Bassett {GB}) gave Aidan O'Brien a record-equalling 20th win at the Breeders' Cup with victory in the Juvenile Turf.

For Lyons, the tough little bullet that is Magnum Force (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}) provided a first win at the Breeders' Cup meeting and it is one which the trainer put right up there with winning two Classics within a month in his native Ireland during the early months of the Covid pandemic.

"The secret to training winners is sourcing the horses and that's just a very difficult job to do at the moment," he said. "But we got this horse and he's just been so professional from day one." Cont. p3

RAMATUELLE, DIEGO VELAZQUEZ OUT OF BREEDERS' CUP MILE

Leading European contenders Ramatuelle (Justify) and Diego Velazquez (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) have been withdrawn from Saturday's GI FanDuel Breeders' Cup Mile.

The Christopher Head-trained Ramatuelle, who races for owners including NBA Hall of Famer Tony Parker, was scratched on veterinary advice. She was last seen making the breakthrough at the top level with an emphatic victory in the Prix de la Foret at Longchamp, impressing with her turn of foot as she powered clear in the closing stages to win by three lengths.

Connections had been confident of a bold bid at Del Mar after being handed an inside draw but have now been forced to scratch the three-year-old.

A statement issued on behalf of Ramatuelle's connections said, "We are deeply disappointed that Ramatuelle has been withdrawn from the Breeders' Cup, especially with the anticipation surrounding her as a leading contender in this prestigious event." Cont. p5

All three of Friday's turf winners are homebreds – for Coolmore and Sheikh Abdulla Bin Isa Al Khalifa respectively – and that is, after all, what this meeting is all about. Sheikh Abdullah was represented in California by Jerome Hulin of Acorn Stud, where the powerful colt was raised prior to joining Lyons's Glenburnie Stables in Co Meath. He earned his right to a trip across the water for a start in the Juvenile Turf Sprint with his third-place finish in the G2 Flying Childers Stakes, and he had the winner of that race, Aesterius (Ire), and runner-up Big Mojo (Ire), behind him on Friday.

Lyons continued, "When they went by the line in Doncaster I said that the Breeders' Cup was made for this horse – not that I'd know but after watching it for so many years I thought fast pace, fast ground, it was made for this horse.

"It's great that it's down on my CV that I'm a dual Classic-winning trainer but it was Covid and we were on our own in a stand with no buzz. Now, I'll take it, don't get me wrong, but then you come here and you get that – that's what sportsmen want. You work hard and you get more losing days than winning days. Money can't but that."

Lyons had been successfully elusive during morning track work this week, deftly sidestepping the gathered press at the quarantine barn. When *TDN* finally caught up with him in the stands on Thursday morning as he watched Magnum Force jump from the gates and breeze past down the stretch he admitted that he preferred to avoid the hubbub. There was no avoiding it on Friday, however, and though the trainer who famously doesn't like to travel was clearly revelling in this momentous victory for his stable, he was also keen to heap praise on the man who on Sunday will be crowned champion jockey in Ireland for the sixth time. Colin Keane is particularly unassuming for a world-class jockey and the trainer who first signed him up and is

effectively his father-in-law is effusive in his praise of the 30-year-old. This was Keane's second win at the meeting after taking the Breeders' Cup Turf on Tarnawa (Ire) (Shamardal) for the Aga Khan in 2020.

"The icing on the cake is having Colin Keane riding as he is the most under-rated champion jockey on the planet," Lyons said. "Once you light that man up, the job is easy. I can't tell you all enough. He's the most understated man, he's so humble. He's come over here and won two Breeders' Cups and still nobody knows about him. He's a bit like the trainer in that the two of us like to stay on the farm and walk our dogs and mind our own business. But when he comes out and gets the right ammunition he can deliver, and he's proven that more than once. I'd personally like to see him on the big stage more. I need the world to wake up to him."

The world was certainly watching on Friday, though Keane did not have long to hang around and soak up the plaudits, even if it had been his style to do so. His flight left California at 7pm, bound, eventually, for Ireland, where on Sunday he'll take six rides at the Curragh and pick up his sixth champion jockey trophy.

"I wouldn't be in the position I am today without that man," he said, sitting alongside Lyons in the post-race press conference.

Added the reinsman, "He gave me my first job as an apprentice and a lot of people, me included, thought he was mad. I wouldn't be here without him and I'm glad I can repay him."

A clean sweep of Friday's turf races for Ireland was achieved through the subsequent double strike of Lake Victoria and Henri Matisse for team Coolmore. The latter was the second consecutive son of Wootton Bassett to win the Juvenile Turf after Unquestionable (Fr) last year. Seven of O'Brien's Breeders' Cup wins have come in this race, and his 20th success at this championship puts him on level footing with the legendary D Wayne Lukas.

"We all know what a special man Wayne is and it's an honour really to be anywhere close to him," said O'Brien in tribute to the 89-year-old Hall of Famer. "What can you say about Wayne? He's such a special man and he's always been such a help to us. He rang me during the week and told me all about this track, the way to ride it, and what to do and what not to do. He was explaining about the Classic and how he thinks we should ride

our horse. We're very grateful that he was so good to tell us everything."

Two wins on the slate, especially with the banker Lake Victoria, may have gone some way to assuaging the nerves in the Coolmore camp ahead of the bid for Classic glory of the most talked-about horse of the meeting, City Of Troy (Justify).

"I'm delighted for everybody as a lot of people put in a lot of hard work to get them here, but tomorrow is another day," O'Brien said.

Ryan Moore, who now has 16 Breeders' Cup wins of his own, referred to O'Brien's frequent acknowledgement of the team behind the stable's success but insisted that the trainer must take much of the credit himself.

"I remember watching Johannesburg win as a kid and that was, what, 23 years ago," he said. "What he's done is incredible."

Johannesburg gave O'Brien his first winner at the Breeders' Cup and he remains his sole winner on the dirt. On Saturday, his great grandson will attempt to become his second and put O'Brien in the clear lead as the most successful trainer in the 41-year history of the meeting. Cont. p5

"Yesterday is yesterday and tomorrow may never come, and I've just won a Breeders' Cup," he said with obvious glee. "Normally when I leave Ireland shit happens and it doesn't work but it all worked today."

Indeed it did.

The statement continued, "She has been moving beautifully all week at Del Mar and is in peak physical condition, making today's outcome understandably frustrating for our team.

"We have immense respect for the Breeders' Cup's rigorous

protocols and the dedicated veterinary team, whose responsibility to protect equine athletes is essential to our sport.

"Although Ramatuelle's PET Scan report stated 'no definitive major concern for breakdown was identified', it showed signs of bone remodelling. While this is common in three-year-olds, it prompted the decision to proceed with an abundance of caution and withdraw her from the race."

The statement added, "As a Group 1-winning daughter of Justify, Ramatuelle remains nominated for the Fasig-Tipton November Sale, and we will take a day to carefully consider her next steps."

Head was quoted as saying, "Ramatuelle arrived in good order, she's been training well, and she's been eating up every day.

"This is obviously a disappointment and a bit of a shock for all of us, but at the end of the day, she's healthy and well, and that's what really matters. There will be more Breeders' Cups for the stable, and we'll look forward to those opportunities."

Diego Velazquez was scratched by Aidan O'Brien after track work on Friday morning.

"We just weren't 100 per cent happy with him this morning on the track so we decided to take him out ourselves," said the trainer. Cont. p6

TATTERSALLS BOSS OUTLINES CONCERNS ARISING FROM THE BUDGET AFTER H-I-T **SALE**

Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony outlined his concerns arising from the government's budget announcement when reflecting on what proved to be a memorable Autumn Horses-In-Training Sale that saw a record-high price paid for the 1.3 million gns Delius (GB) (Frankel (GB)) earlier in the week.

That Coolmore-owned three-year-old was sold on Wednesday to continue his career in Australia for trainers Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott and Mahony praised the large cohort of international buyers who made the trip to Tattersalls for what has been another successful sale at Park Paddocks.

Despite a smaller [86] offering of horses, turnover climbed 6% to 35,654,200gns. In fact, Tattersalls had already surpassed last year's turnover by close of play on Thursday. The average also climbed by 13% to 34,955gns, the median by 7% to 16,000gns while the clearance rate didn't budge at 88%.

The top price on the final day of the Tattersalls Autumn Horses in Training Sale was the three-year-old gelding Melon (Ger) (Adlerflug {Ger}), who will stay in training with Ollie Greenall and Josh Guerriero, but was bought by different owners within the yard at 68,000gns to go hurdling.

Reflecting on trade this week, Mahony said, "As ever this unique fixture, the largest and most popular of its type in the world, has attracted an extraordinarily diverse collection of buyers from all corners of the world. Australian buyers have enjoyed outstanding success purchasing at the Tattersalls Autumn Horses in Training Sale with graduates winning 48 Group/Listed races in the last three years, and they have again played a significant role, buying in excess of 30 lots for more than 6,000,000 guineas.

"They have been joined by the typically enthusiastic group of buyers from the Gulf region whose respective carnivals have buoyed the market in the Middle East for quality tried horses from Britain and Ireland. We have also welcomed a large contingent of European buyers, especially from Spain and Italy, who have made a significant contribution to the sale, and it was equally encouraging to see such strong domestic demand from both the Flat and National Hunt fraternities.

"A record price at the Tattersalls Autumn Horses in Training Sale for Delius and sale turnover that has only narrowly fallen short of the wide margin record set in 2022, have provided a fitting finale to what has been a remarkable month of sales at Tattersalls in October."

Agricultural property has been passed on to heirs tax-free for decades, but the chancellor, Rachel Reeves, announced on Wednesday that from April 2026 farms and other business property will fall within inheritance tax. Inheritors will have to pay 20% of the value of the agricultural and business property above £1m. Reeves said this would raise £1.8bn by 2030 which can be used to improve public services. Cont. p7

On that announcement, Mahony continued, "However, against this backdrop of positivity we can only express concern regarding the government's budget announced on Wednesday. The implications of it will have far reaching effects not only on all businesses in the racing industry but more long term on breeders and trainers who could now be liable for inheritance tax on their assets. The effects of these changes are surely going to have a negative impact on the whole racing and breeding sector in this country."

"We now look forward to the Tattersalls December Foal and Breeding Stock Sale, which annually showcases the very best of European bloodstock to a global audience."

TRIBUTES FLOW FOR LEGENDARY RACING WRITER ALASTAIR DOWN, WHO DIES AGED 68

Much-loved racing journalist Alastair Down has died, the *Racing Post* reported on Friday. He was 68 and recently attended the Showcase Meeting at his beloved Cheltenham for a ceremony to mark the renaming of the press room in his honour.

Speaking in an interview with *ITV Racing* on the day of the ceremony, Down said of that tribute, "It's a cliched way to put it, but it's very moving. By the end of the day I may have had a cup of coffee and a glass of champagne, and I may even shed a tear or two--or a bucket.

"I'm incredibly lucky to be able to write from a slightly different angle. Some people can run four-minute miles. I can't do that, but what I can do is bring events alive and say 'this is what it felt like to watch it and this is what it sounded like'. Because the noise here is just the greatest symphony in sport."

Down's self-professed ability to "bring events alive" was honed across four decades of writing professionally, initially for *The Sporting Life* and latterly for the *Racing Post*. His achievement in being crowned HWPA Racing Writer of the Year on five occasions sees him rightfully stand alone as the most successful member of the racing media in that category, having been awarded the Clive Graham Trophy in 1994, 1999, 2012, 2015 and 2018.

Down also became a familiar face on terrestrial television for much of the Channel 4 Racing era and was the lead presenter for over a decade from when he started in 2001.

Among those to pay tribute on Friday was Down's Channel 4 Racing colleague Mike Cattermole, who said on X, "So pleased Alastair Down was able to be there for the opening of "his" press room. A giant in our sport, admired and revered by all. A genius with words, both written and spoken, passionate, very funny and yet vulnerable and complicated. We all cared about him. Love to his family."

Derek Thompson, another member of the Channel 4 Racing team, said in his own statement on X, "Just a week ago Alistair Down was honoured in the most fitting way at @CheltenhamRaces and shared his sentiments so succinctly here [in the interview with ITV Racing]. No one could bring racing alive in print in such a tangible and electrifying way. I'm sure Big Mac will have one ready for you in that bar in the sky -RIP big fella. We'll miss you."

WALK IN THE PARK COLT AND NATHANIEL FILLY LEAD GOFFS BRITISH NH BREEDERS' **SHOWCASE**

A colt foal by Walk In The Park (Ire) (lot 7) and a Nathaniel (Ire) filly (lot 38) each brought a sale-topping price of £70,000 during Friday's Goffs British NH Breeders' Showcase.

The former, consigned by Swanbridge Bloodstock, Ltd., was sold to Gerry Aherne and is a grandson of Grade 1 hurdle winner Quevega (Fr) (Robin Des Champs (Fr)). His dam is a half-sister to Weatherbys Champion Bumper hero Facile Vega (Ire) (Walk In The Park {Ire}).

Aherne, a key member of the Coolmore team, said, "He's a

beautiful horse with a great pedigree. He's a very slick horse who'll be kept to race, so let's hope he's good. He's been bred and sold by some great people and he'll come back to Ireland now."

Another return customer was the Mariga family of Coolmara Stables in County Cork. Last year they purchased a pair of lots for £109,000. Cathal Mariga, who was joined by his father Kieran and sister Katie, returned to pay £70,000 and secure lot 38, a filly by Nathaniel. Presented by Mill House Stud on behalf of breeder Joss Hanbury, the filly is the third foal out of Atlanta Ablaze (GB) (Kayf Tara {GB}) who won three listed races over fences. This filly also claimed first in the Robert Chugg Fillies' Class during Thursday's British NH Breeders Showcase foal show.

Mariga said, "She's a gorgeous filly. She was the pick of the sale for us, and by the sounds of it she was the pick for a lot of other people as well. She's by Nathaniel and out of a good Kayf Tara mare, and there's plenty to happen in the pedigree too. The mare has two sons of Jack Hobbs to run and he's a sire we like. Hopefully those two can do the business and improve the pedigree even more."

Of the 79 horses offered this year, 48 sold (61%) for an aggregate of £929,500 (-27%). The average stayed fairly steady at £19,365 (-1%) and the median of £15,000 was flat.

Goffs UK managing director Tim Kent said, "Today's sale is still in its infancy, with the first edition of the British NH Breeders Showcase held just last year, and we would like to thank the vendors who trusted us with some of their best foals by the leading stallions and many out of some truly outstanding race mares. The feedback has been incredibly positive since the release of the catalogue and there was plenty of hype in advance of the sale including the excitement of offering the second foal out of the Grade 1 winning mare Put The Kettle On (Ire) (Stowaway {GB}).

"The strength of the catalogue prompted many of the leading buyers to travel to Doncaster and the yards have been busy throughout the day. This resulted in the top of the market remaining incredibly strong with many different purchasers active for the choice lots. Indeed, two foals selling for £70,000 and another for £62,000 are immensely satisfying results whilst the average and median for today are on a par with last year, but it wasn't all plain sailing and today's clearance rate is a graphic illustration of the increased selectivity within this market.

"It is too early to draw any firm conclusions, and we will watch with interest over the coming months before working with vendors to paint an accurate picture about the events of today and how best to navigate the challenges going forward."



NO BULL: INTO MISCHIEF LONGSHOT LEADS HOME BAFFERT ONE-TWO IN JUVENILE

DEL MAR, CA – Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert had three chances at a record-extending sixth winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Del Mar Friday. And none of them were favored.

Let go at odds of 15-1, Citizen Bull (Into Mischief) made every pole a winning one while leading home a one-two-four finish for Baffert's powerhouse stable. It was 1 1/2 lengths back to Gaming (Game Winner) in second. Irish raider Hill Road (Quality Road) rallied from last of 10 to tag 'TDN Rising Star' Getaway Car (Curlin) by a neck for third. Baffert's Breeders' Cup count now stands at 19.

"I told all my riders, your plan is to win the race," Baffert said. "So, they rode their horses the way they thought. Getaway Car, he has speed. We know Citizen Bull is very quick, very fast. Gaming, I don't think he got away as good as he could have. I was surprised to see him laying second. And I figured they weren't going too fast because Gaming, he was wanting to go."

Baffert continued, "But, in order to win these races, you need a good horse. And you have to have the right trip, the right luck. I wish they could dead-heat--one, two, three--but it didn't happen."

The complexion of the Juvenile--which figured to have a very contested pace--was changed dramatically at the start when favored GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity winner and 'TDN Rising Star' East Avenue (Medaglia d'Oro) stumbled badly from his rail draw.

Martin Garcia put Citizen Bull, a last-out front-running winner of the GI American Pharoah Stakes Oct. 5, on the lead and it was lights-out from there. He was allowed to coast through fractions of :23.44 and :47.89 with his stablemates chasing from second and third and was in control on the turn for home as the likes of

East Avenue and 'TDN Rising Stars' Chancer McPatrick (McKinzie) and Ferocious (Flatter) were making no serious impact.

Citizen Bull turned them in, began to kick clear from Gaming in

the stretch and was firmly in front into the final furlong to pull off the upset.

The well-documented suspension of Baffert from racetracks owned and operated by Churchill Downs Inc. was rescinded over the summer. With the win, Citizen Bull earned 30 points toward next spring's GI Kentucky Derby.

"It means we don't have to discuss that situation again," Baffert said when asked about returning to the Derby at the post-race press conference.

"Right now, it's too far out,

and you really don't know if you have a Derby horse until about February, January, etc. Things happen. So, I don't get too far ahead of myself. I just focus on what's in front of me this week

or next week. It's good to be in the conversation. But it's still a long ways off."

Citizen Bull, a 3/4-length debut winner going 5 1/2 furlongs at Del Mar Aug. 17, was third as the favorite behind his previously

> mentioned stablemate Gaming in the GI Del Mar Futurity Sept. 8. Citizen Bull was making his twoturn debut in the American Pharoah.

All four of Garcia's previous Breeders' Cup winners--Bayern (Classic), Drefong (Sprint), New Year's Day (Juvenile) and Secret Circle (Sprint)--were also trained by Baffert.

"My horse was just running easy early and the other horse (Gaming) was just cruising in second," Garcia said. "And, when it was time to go, the horse just

took off."

This is also the extended female family of Favorite Trick, who capped his 1997 Horse of the Year campaign with a win in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Freshman sire and GI Belmont Stakes winner Tiz The Law appears further down on his page as well.



DEL MAR, CA--Immersive (Nyquist) capped a perfect four-forfour championship season with a powerhouse performance in Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Del Mar. Off as the 2-1 favorite, the Godolphin homebred was away in good order from post three. The GI Spinaway Stakes and GI Darley Alcibiades Stakes heroine settled in mid-pack beneath Manny Franco, racing inside of impressive GI Frizette Stakes winner and second-choice Scottish Lassie (McKinzie) as \$1.8- million OBS March breezer and 'TDN Rising Star' Nooni (Win Win Win) sped off through fractions of :22 and :44.99 with Japan's American Bikini (Jpn) (American Pharoah) in closest pursuit.

Franco began to go to work on Immersive, now racing in fifth, three furlongs from home. Narrow GI Del Mar Debutante Stakes runner-up **Vodka With a Twist** (Thousand Words) and Scottish Lassie, meanwhile, made runs in unison to strike the front as Nooni backed out of it into the lane, but Immersive, widest of all in the four path, was absolutely rolling now.

Immersive switched over to her right lead right on cue and exploded from there to win going away by 4 1/2 lengths. Vodka With a Twist stayed on to finish second while making her two-turn debut. **Quickkick** (McKinzie) rallied from last of nine to round out the top three.

Immersive is the 11th Breeders' Cup winner for trainer Brad Cox and his second in this race. He also saddled champion British Idiom to a victory in the Juvenile Fillies in 2019. **Cont.**

"Obviously, they were rolling pretty quick up front and Manny (Franco) did a great job putting her in a great position," Cox said. "She broke well. Showed her stamina and ability to handle two turns. I think the further the better. She's a very good filly and showed it today, again. That was a huge performance."

Cox added, "I think 2-year-old fillies, she's the best we've had. To accomplish what she has, we've not had one win three Grade Ones at two. Excited about what she accomplished, proud of her, and looking forward to next year."

Immersive, a debut winner at 10-1 odds at Saratoga July 21, earned a career-best 83 Beyer Speed Figure in the Spinaway in the mud at the Spa Aug. 31. She handled two turns with aplomb in the Alcibiades at Keeneland last time Oct. 4.

"She was there for me and she responded pretty well," Franco said after collecting his second career win at the Championships. "She doesn't have a big turn of foot and she's a grinder, but at the same time, I feel like I'm going to get there. It means a lot. These are the races we dream of and that's what we're here for. I think she's the best 2-year-old filly right now, no doubt. I'm just blessed."





The only O'Brien runner in a which the trainer has taken six previous editions of, the son of Wootton Bassett likely would have been a shorter price if not for his last-out fifth as the beaten favorite in the G1 Prix JeanLuc Lagardere at Longchamp, a race in which he wore blinkers for the first time over soft going. Otherwise sporting a nearly unblemished record including a second by just three-quarters of a length two back in the G1 Vincent O'Brien National Stakes in Ireland, Henri Matisse brought a two-time group-winning form line to Del Mar where he tried firm turf for the first time.

Favored in now five of his six lifetime starts, the 7-2 chalk drew the unfavorable 13 hole for this one-mile affair, the longest distance the colt had tried to date. Guided expertly as one would expect by Ryan Moore and racing without the blinkers that O'Brien admitted may have affected his performance in France, Henri Matisse broke in stride but was happy to let nearly the entire field go ahead of him. Able to shift down to be two wide into the first turn, he had just Aomori City (Fr) (Oasis Dream (GB)), who briefly delayed the start after breaking through the gate, behind him as 15-1 longshot Dream On (Not This Time) rushed up to lead through the opening quarter in :22.65. Shifted out to be three wide nearing the half-mile marker, the favorite began a gradual charge up along the outside but still had a lot of ground to make up as he swung widest of the field off the far turn. Coming down the crown of the track, Henri Matisse stayed outside of drama as jockey James Doyle almost came out of the saddle when Al Qudra (Ire) (No Nay Never) hooked legs with New Century (GB) (Kameko) at the furlong marker. All runners stayed up and the favorite, who began to drift down to the inside, sealed the deal narrowly over 29-1 American hopeful Iron Man Cal (Collected) while a late run from Aomori City netted third.

With the win, Aidan O'Brien earned his 20th Breeders' Cup victory, a number that equals him with the legendary D. Wayne Lukas. Ryan Moore added his 16th win after earning the victory in GI Juvenile Fillies Turf earlier in the card.

Of matching that record, O'Brien said: "It's incredible (to get to 20 Breeders' Cup wins and equal D. Wayne Lukas), obviously, and we all know what an unbelievably special man Wayne is. I'm honored to equal his record. He's the most special man and always been such a help to us. He rang me during the week and he spoke to me about this track and the way to ride; what to do and what not to do. He was explaining about the Classic and the way he thought we should ride it, so we feel very grateful and privileged that he was so good to tell us everything; honored really."

Of the winner, Moore added: "He was very easy today and did it beautifully, we've been learning about him. He needed stepping up to a mile on a turning track on some nice ground helped him. We've just had to figure him out a little bit and I said to Aidan (O'Brien) before the race I thought he was by far the best horse in the race and he's done it easily. He just traveled into it. I was wide on the bend but he just took me there very comfortably. At home we race a lot in straight lines so on the turn some horses appreciate that. Everyone does such an amazing job at home and back at the stud to get these horses here. I just had to keep him out of trouble and not mess it up. He's showed today what an incredible horse he could be."

Pedigree Note:

Coolmore's Wootton Bassett has now sired three winners from seven starters in the Breeders' Cup. Immortal Verse (Ire), a MG1SW, sold at the end of her racing career to BBA (Ireland) for a sales-topping 4,700,000gns at the 2013 Tattersalls December Mares Sale. From six foals to race, five have won including the likes of MG1SW and 'TDN Rising Star' Tenebrism (Caravaggio) and GSW Statuette (Justify). This is the family of French champion sprinter Last Tycoon (Ire) (Try My Best) and there is plenty of international top-level success to be found under the third dam with the likes of G1 French One Thousand Guineas winner Valentine Waltz (Ire) (Be My Guest) and GI Matron Stakes winner Sense of Style (Thunder Gulch). Immortal Verse is not represented by a yearling this season but reported a colt by Justify, a full-brother to the aforementioned Statuette, this spring and is due back to the Triple Crown winner for 2025.



MAGNUM FORCE GETS EUROPE ON THE BOARD FIRST IN JUVENILE TURF SPRINT

Europe drew first blood Friday, albeit with an upset choice, as Magnum Force (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}) came from off the pace to win the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint and kick off the Future Stars Friday action at Del Mar.

The Irish-bred son of Tally Ho Stud's Mehmas came through at second asking going five furlongs at Cork in Ireland before having two near misses to rivals he lined up against again Friday

(second in the Julia Graves Roses Stakes and third in the G2 Flying Childers Stakes behind both **Aesterious {Ire}** {Mehmas [Ire]} and **Big Mojo {Ire}** {Mohaather [GB]}.

Lined up inside for trainer Ger Lyons with regular pilot (and Ireland's champion jockey for the sixth time this season) Colin Keane aboard, the 12-1 shot broke with the field but was swarmed on both sides in the opening jumps and quickly fell back to be one of the last three runners as American hopeful **Governor Sam** (Improbable) rocketed out to pace the field. Situated against the fence but stymied behind a wall of horses in front of him midway around the turn, Keane stayed committed to the inside route, letting his runner hug the fence as he navigated a turn at race speed for the first time. As room opened ahead of him but with Governor Sam still finding in his way, Keane tipped Magnum Force outside at the sixteenth pole to dive past the pacesetter in the final jumps to seal the win for Abdulla Al Khalifa. With the ride, Keane earned his second Breeders' Cup victory from five starters. It was also the first Breeders' Cup winner for Lyons from three attempts. Arizona Blaze (Ire) (Sergei Prokofiev) also stormed home from off the pace to grab second while Governor Sam won the photo for the trifecta.

"Listen, I knew the horse was the right horse for the job, but if he was good enough, we didn't know until today," admitted Lyons. "When you have Colin Keane riding for you, probably the most underrated jockey in the world just because he's a little bit like his trainer and likes to stay at home and walk his dogs and stay at the farm and not go around the world. Believe me, he's had two rides and two wins in the Breeders' Cup and it's about time the world opened up to him. It's fantastic. It's huge credit to the horse, my team and Abdulla my owner. There's plenty of us guys at home who could do this if we get the horses. And the secret to training winners is getting the horses--it's as simple as

that. If a clown like me can train a winner of a Breeders' Cup [race], anybody can."

Lyons noted that Magnum Force would return home in preparation for a 2025 campaign, adding: "Hopefully we'll get him home safe and sound, we let him down and the sky's the limit next year because it was all about next year. We came here to teach him how to sprint. So, fast ground, five furlongs, I don't know where it leads him, but we've won a Breeders' Cup. So I presume we've just semi made a stallion. So we're going to go enjoy him."

Race favorite, American-bred Japanese runner Ecoro Sieg (Twirling Candy) got checked out at the break and never found his stride, coming home eighth.

"Other horses were a little bit quicker than him at the very first yard," said Christophe Lemaire, jockey of Ecoro Sieg. "They came inside very quickly and I had to check out. Never been in that position before. He didn't take a breath and couldn't quicken at the bend. We were in a good spot. Just a lack of experience."

Pedigree Note:

Tally Ho's Mehmas, champion first and second-crop sire in Europe in 2020 and 2021 respectively, is represented by his first Breeders' Cup winner here. First dam Tropical Rock (GB), a daughter of Australian champion Fastnet Rock (Aus), sold to Melchoir Bloodstock for 38,000gns at the Tattersalls December Mares Sale in 2020 carrying her second foal, a filly by Ribchester (Ire). From three to race, she's produced two winners as her first foal, Tropical Talent (GB) (Nathaniel (Ire) was victorious over jumps in England. Second dam Tropical Treat (GB) was a stakes winner in England and also picked up a placing in the G3 Cuisine de France Summer Stakes. Tropical Rock has not been reported bred since producing Magnum Force in 2022.

It was a frustrating few days in the lead-up to the Breeders' Cup meeting for Team Ballydoyle, with the likes of Ylang Ylang (GB) (Frankel {GB}) and Diego Velazquez (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) forced to miss the event, not to mention Jan Brueghel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) having to forego an appearance even farther afield in the G1 Melbourne Cup next Tuesday.

Their biggest moment comes Saturday with City of Troy (Justify) in the \$7-million Classic, but Lake Victoria (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) was first to strike for the Irish-based outfit in the GI John Deere Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf under a typically savvy steer from Ryan Moore.

Pounded into 7-10 favoritism to add the Juvenile Fillies to her previous elite-level conquests in the Moyglare Stud Stakes at the Curragh and in the Cheveley Park Stud Stakes at Newmarket just 13 days apart last month, Lake Victoria was taken in hand and made best use of her inside draw to save every inch of ground as top American hope **Thought Process** (Collected)--the only other of Lake Victoria's rivals to jump at single-digit odds--led from Kilwin (Twirling Candy) and a three-wide Abientot (Not This Time). She was nursed along into the second turn by Moore, who went for her in earnest at the five-sixteenths marker as Thought Process continued to hold the call as the Juvenile Fillies Turf field faced the judge. Threading the needle from there, Lake Victoria took a gap between Kilwin and Abientot and just in advance of May Day Ready (Tapit) shortly after turning into the lane stormed down the center and easily took care of business from there.

It was a second Breeders' Cup winner in as many years for Juddmonte's Frankel following Inspiral (GB) at Santa Anita last year, a 15th for Moore and the 19th for trainer Aidan O'Brien.

"She did quite well there," O'Brien said. "She got crowded and bumped a bit on the first bend, so Ryan (Moore) was very cool on her and obviously ended up farther back than he wanted to be. It was her first time on a turning track and she was uneven on the straight and it was her first time over a mile. We're so delighted for everybody. Just wanted to say our very best wishes to Clem Murphy (Bloodstock consultant for Coolmore), who is usually here. Without him, none of this would ever be happening."

Of the valiant runner-up, trainer Joe Lee said, "She always shows up, there is no doubt about that. She always seems to find some trouble here and there. That's OK. That's racing. (Lake Victoria) is the best in the world for sure, now. I thought she was the best in the world coming into it, to be honest with you. A real nice horse. No disgrace in defeat."

Lake Victoria unsurprisingly won her maiden at first asking over seven furlongs at the Curragh June 28, leading home a Frankel 1-2 over Red Letter (GB) and proved a ready two-length winner of the Aug. 10 G3 Sweet Solera Stakes at Newmarket. With Moore opting for Bedtime Story (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) in the Moyglare, Wayne Lordan was in the irons for Lake Victoria's 11-2 upset, but Moore was back in the boot when the bay came away to take the Cheveley Park by a resounding three-length margin.

Pedigree Notes:

One of 35 Group 1/Grade I winners for Juddmonte's Frankel, Lake Victoria is one of three winners from four to race out of Quiet Reflection, popular winner of the 2016 G1 Commonwealth Cup at Royal Ascot and a multiple champion at five to seven furlongs. On behalf of Coolmore, M.V. Magnier went to 2.1 million guineas (\$2,971,899) for Quiet Reflection at the 2017 Tattersalls December Mares sale.

Quiet Reflection is also the dam of Lake Victoria's yearling full-brother and a weanling full-brother.

Champion British Idiom winning the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Santa Anita | Horsephotos

FROM MAIDEN-AUCTION WINNER TO BREEDERS' CUP CHAMPION, BRITISH IDIOM MAY HAVE COMPANY SOON by Steve Sherack

DEL MAR, CA--Maiden Special Weight, for 2-year-old fillies that sold or RNA'd for \$45,000 or less in their most recent sale.

British Idiom (Flashback), a \$40,000 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearling graduate, met that criteria and successfully kicked off her career with a stylish, 3 1/2-length debut victory as the 7-2 favorite for trainer Brad Cox at Saratoga in the summer of 2019. The Madaket Stables, Michael Dubb and The Elkstone Group colorbearer, of course, followed up with a win in the GI Darley Alcibiades Stakes at Keeneland and concluded her three-forthree championship campaign with a dramatic win in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Santa Anita.

"We're very fortunate to have some high-priced horses, but when you see a horse get off the van and walk into your barn, one of the first things you do is check Equibase or check with the owner," Cox said. "Where did you get the horse and what did you pay for them? And when you see \$50,000 or less, I immediately perk up and think to myself, 'Alright, mental note, horse is eligible for an auction race.' It's *very* nice to have that. And it doesn't mean anything in regards to what they're gonna end up being."

Cox continued, "British Idiom, I could remember her working out of the gate with an older horse and holding her own and feeling very confident about shipping her to Saratoga and being competitive in that race. I will tell you this, I do think people really do look for it now when buying horses."

"A lot of good horses have found their way through those auction races," Cox concluded.

Trainer Kenny McPeek would certainly concur.

Four-time Grade I winner and 'TDN Rising Star' Thorpedo Anna (Fast Anna), the 4-5 morning-line favorite for Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, also launched her career with a win in a maiden-auction race at Keeneland last fall. She romped by 8 1/2 lengths that day at odds of 4-1.

McPeek purchased Thorpedo Anna for just \$40,000 out of the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearling sale. The GI Kentucky Oaks heroine is campaigned in partnership by Brookdale Racing, Mark Edwards, Judy Hicks and McPeek's Magdalena Racing.

"The foundation of my business has been middle- and lower-market buyers," McPeek said. "My first yearling purchase was \$8,500 back in the late '80s. I try to do the best I can with sometimes modest budgets, but I've been able to sharpen my eye doing it. I think I'm unique in that because I like picking my own horses and I get to see what works and what doesn't work."

The 2020 champion 3-year-old filly **Swiss Skydiver** (Daredevil), a \$35,000 Keeneland September Yearling purchase by McPeek on behalf of owner Peter Callahan, also debuted with a victory in a maiden-auction race at Churchill Downs in the fall of 2019. The chestnut's stacked resume was headed by wins in the GI Preakness Stakes and GI Alabama Stakes.

"I'm thrilled they invented those races because it does make sense to give those owners and those horses an opportunity," McPeek said. "I like those races, and when we have one that fits it, great. I do wish they'd raise the level a little bit because I do think those races would fill even more if they raised it to \$75,000. It's a unique place to start a horse and like I said, it's worked out well."

McPeek added with a laugh, "I think I won three out of the first four of them they ever ran. And the only reason I didn't win the fourth one was that I didn't have one in it."

Saturday's Breeders' Cup program also includes **Tumbarumba** (Oscar Performance), a 30-1 longshot for Wathnan Racing and trainer Brian Lynch in the Dirt Mile and maiden-auction graduate at second asking at Churchill Downs back in 2022. Tumbarumba, runner-up in the GIII Ack Ack Stakes last time, brought \$30,000 as a Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall yearling.

Who do you like? TDN's Senior Racing Editor Steve Sherack makes his picks for Breeders' Cup Saturday at Del Mar.

Race 4: GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint--#10 Scylla (10-1)

Scylla ran a very good second going two turns in Del Mar's GI Clement L. Hirsch, then returned to Bill Mott's Saratoga base and cut back to this distance with another solid second-place finish in the GI Ballerina just three weeks later. She's been freshened since, is drawn nicely on the outside and is more than capable of running a fast enough race to pull off the upset. Will be making a sizeable exacta box with Ways and Means, who is a very deserving favorite.

Race 5: GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint--#2 Motorious (GB) (8-1)

I really hate backing deep closers in any race--especially turf sprints--but horse-for-course **Motorious** will likely go off too big of a price for me to stay away. The beaten favorite in last year's Turf Sprint is coming in under the radar for Phil D'Amato. Will be boxing with the most likely winner and very imposing Cogburn.

Race 8: GI Breeders' Cup Classic--#13 Newgate (20-1)

Newgate has form that makes him a player at a big price for Hall of Famer Bob Baffert in this loaded Classic and he has every right to move forward off his very good third in the GI California Crown off the layoff. Fired two visually impressive bullet workouts at Santa Anita for this and made a fantastic impression during training hours at Del Mar this week.

Race 12: GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile--#9 Domestic Product (7-2)

Domestic Product has really taken it to the next level since turning back in distance and should get another fantastic set up here. Would prefer this to be contested around one turn, but not letting that keep me away. Post Time always shows up and is an interesting option to consider for the gimmicks at double digits.

TAPITURE TO RELOCATE TO CANADA'S HIGHFIELD STOCK FARM

Tapiture will relocate from Darby Dan Farm in Lexington, Kentucky to stand at Highfield Stock Farm in Alberta, Canada for the 2025 breeding season, the farm announced Friday.

The son of North American leading sire Tapit has stood at Darby Dan Farm since his retirement to stud in 2016, and stood for a fee of \$7,500 in 2024. His stud fee for 2025 will be \$6,000 Canadian, the farm said.

"Tapiture previously stood at Darby Dan Farm in Kentucky, where he passed down his speed and durability to his progeny," said Highfield's Adrian Munro. "With 40 black-type winners and average earnings per starter exceeding \$68,000, Tapiture will be uniquely positioned in the stallion market in Alberta to provide breeders with exceptional quality."

Tapiture earned over \$1.5 million on the track, including graded stakes victories at ages 2, 3, and 4, and finished second behind Goldencents in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile. He won or placed in 11 graded stakes.

Tapiture's progeny have earned over \$35 million, and over \$7 million in 2024. He has sired 40 black-type winners from six crops, including millionaire and Grade I performer Jesus Team. He sired a career-high 162 winners in 2023 and has had 157 in 2024.

SAFETY WOES DELAY START OF SEASON AT

TURF PARADISE

On the eve of the start of the 2024-25 racing season at Turf Paradise, track management announced late on Friday that Saturday's opening day card has been called off.

"In order to address some final track maintenance issues, there will be no live racing at Turf Paradise on Saturday," the track's social media feed on X stated late in the day Nov. 1.

The news comes on the heels of a Thursday recommendation by the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority (HISA) that the Arizona track-which has a well-documented recent history of safety concerns--delay the Nov. 2 start of the racing season because of problems with the dirt surface.

"Live racing is expected to commence as soon as these track maintenance issues are resolved," Turf Paradise stated in a separate X posting. "That could be as soon as next week. We will have updates as soon as there is new information."

The next scheduled day of live racing at Turf Paradise is supposed to be Tuesday, Nov. 5, with cards for Wednesday and Thursday also already drawn.

A HISA press release on Thursday evening stated: "Based on recent reports and assessments from racetrack surface experts, concerns raised by on-site racing participants, and first-hand observations of HISA staff, HISA is not confident that the main track racing surface at Turf Paradise is ready for racing to begin as currently scheduled this Saturday.

"Therefore, out of concerns for the safety of horses and riders, HISA has communicated a recommendation to Turf Paradise and the Arizona Department of Gaming to delay the start of the upcoming meet and cease all training and racing activities on the main track racing surface until such time as adequate adjustments and preparations have been made and the track has been retested to verify conformance with industry standards.

"HISA will continue to monitor the situation and may initiate an enforcement action if necessary," the HISA statement concluded.

Prior to the start of the 2023-24 season, horsemen had complained to state regulators that the main track rail was not up to spec even after HISA had issued a non-compliance warning to Turf Paradise and track management had made what it thought were adequate repairs at the end of the previous meet. A HISA inspection in the spring of 2023 turned up "numerous gaps and exposed edges in the railing material that could inflict serious harm upon jockeys."

The homebred was instead re-routed for Friday's Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance Stakes, heretofore a race for dirt marathoners, but switched to something of a consolation event for the Juvenile Turf.

Sent off at odds of 34-5 and trying two turns for the first time off a troubled fourth in the 5 1/2-furlong Indian Summer Stakes at Keeneland Oct. 6, Chasing Liberty was able to get down into the three path after departing gate nine in a scratched-down field, traveled nicely in hand and went up to the leading duo three wide at the final corner. Roused to the lead a furlong from home, he kept on well and was saved by the wire, as Test Score--who overcame trouble of his own to graduate on opening day at Keeneland Oct. 4--took a dive at him, but just missed. Favored Cavallo Bay finished a non-threatening third.

"We had a beautiful trip," said winning jockey Irad Ortiz, Jr. "He broke well and he was a little closer than in his last couple or races. The field was bunched, so I was comfortable going three wide. When I asked him to run turning for home, he responded. I felt that other horse coming on the inside, so I asked a little more and he fired."

A smooth winner of his 5 1/2-furlong unveiling at Ellis Park July 28, Chasing Liberty was bothered badly and crossed the line second in the Sept. 1 Juvenile Sprint at Kentucky Downs before being promoted to the victory. Last through the early exchanges in the Indian Summer, he was eight wide at the head of the lane and was bumped, but rallied strongly to be fourth, two lengths behind GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint hopeful Governor Sam (Improbable).

Chasing Liberty is the 71st worldwide stakes winner for his sire, his 44th in the Northern Hemisphere. He has a yearling fullbrother, a weanling half-sister by Epicenter and his dam was bred to both Oscar Performance and Not This Time this past season. On the Breeders' Cup undercard at Del Mar, Twirling Queen held off the final charge of Just Nails in the Senator Ken Maddy Stakes, giving their shared sire the top two of the trifecta.

Handed her first defeat--since starting her 2024 season--last out Oct. 19 in Keeneland's GII Lexus Raven Run, Twirling Queen had rattled off four-straight victories on the turf and synthetic after moving to the barn of Jose D'Angelo from Norm Casse as well as making a surface change from the main track. Three of those four wins were in stakes races--the Melody of Colors Stakes in March over Gulfstream synthetic; Mamzelle Stakes May 11 on Churchill turf; and the Coronation Cup Stakes July 12 over Saratoga grass.

Made the 3-2 favorite by the betting public here, Twirling Queen set up shop in fourth as she chased the top flight from along the fence through :21.80 and :44.85 splits. Saving ground as the field swung through the bend, she got her seam turning for home and had surged to a clear lead in upper stretch as Just Nails gave pursuit. As her advantage slowly shrank, the eventual winner held tough in the final yards to win by a neck over that challenger. It was two lengths back to Stay and Scam for third. The final time was :56.42 for the turf dash.

"I was pointing her to this race to put her back on the turf," said D'Angelo, who was winning his first stakes race at Del Mar. "Last time she ran on the dirt trying to get a graded stakes. She's a nice filly. She's not big but she has a big heart. I'm very sure that next year she's going to be in the best races [in] the country for fillies on the turf."

"I was waiting for the two fillies to go to the lead and she could sit and make her move. The trip was perfect and I'm very happy."

Jockey Luis Saez, who also won his first stakes at Del Mar in this race, echoed those sentiments, "It was a beautiful trip. That was the trip we were expecting. We knew the inside was the speed, and it came on the outside too. We just picked the right horse to follow. When we came to the top of the stretch, we had a lot of horse."

Warheart soared home to take the Atlantic Beach Stakes at the Belmont Big A meet and pick up his first black type victory.

Unplaced last out Oct. 6 in Keeneland's GII Castle & Key Bourbon Stakes going longer on the grass, he returned to the sprints here, where he'd done his best work including on graduation from the maiden ranks two back Sept. 5 at Kentucky Downs.

Off at 3-1 and immediate up to take control, he cruised through :22.23, :45.17, and :56.61 splits on an uncontested lead. Opening his advantaged when asked at the quarter pole, Warheart emphasized his superiority by putting four lengths on Super Swift by the time he hit the wire. That runner-up claimed second despite hitting the gate at the break and not changing leads in the stretch. Dumb Money rounded out the trifecta.

"Rodolphe [Brisset, trainer] told me he was very fast from the gate," said winning rider Julien Leparoux. "We had the outside post, and I didn't really need to be on the lead, but he broke so sharp he put me there. He relaxed beautiful and finished up very strong--1:08 and change is big time."

"He was doing it very comfortably, and I was traveling nice the whole time--that's the main thing in these kinds of races."

A detached last of 10 after a bobble at the start behind an opening quarter in a wicked :20.94, the homebred caught the eye with an inside run approaching the entrance to the stretch and was angled sharply off heels inside the quarter pole. Warming up to the task midway on the bend, he confronted the front-runner at the head of the lane, but Troubleshooting proved a stubborn rival down to the inside and the duo battled shoulder to shoulder into the final furlong.
