



#### \$6-MILLION MCKULICK TOPS COMPETITIVE FASIG-TIPTON NOVEMBER SALE

LEXINGTON, KY - The Fasig-Tipton November Sale failed to
continue its streak of \$100-million plus gross results, but did
produce a day of vibrant trade from a diverse international
buying bench Monday in Lexington. Twenty-five mares sold for
\$1 million or more during the auction, matching the figure from
2023. Nine sold for \$2 million or more and four sold for \$3
million or over, compared to 16 and 10, respectively, a year ago.

"It was another tremendous November sale," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. "There was very, very competitive bidding and obviously tremendous support from an international buying base. Our friends from Japan continue to be major supporters of this sale. We also saw European participation. We saw Australian participation. And we saw strong American participation. It was a very broad market."

From a catalogue of 321 head, 172 horses sold for a gross of \$93,948,500. The average was \$546,212 and the median was \$250,000. With 64 horses reported not sold, the buy-back rate was 27.1%.

Those figures showed slight declines from the 2023 auction, which saw 154 horses sell for \$101,281,000 for an average of \$657,669 and a median of \$295,000. **Cont., p3** 

# ALL EYES TURN TO KEENELAND AS THE NOVEMBER SALE BEGINS ITS 9-DAY RUN

LEXINGTON, KY--With the Breeders' Cup squarely in the rearview mirror, the breeding stock sales take center stage this week, highlighted by the start of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale Tuesday.

This year's November Sale, which has cataloged 3,384 horses, spans a total of nine sessions through Nov. 13. The stand-alone Keeneland November Horses of Racing Age Sale will take place Nov. 14.

In 2023, a total of 2,128 horses had sold through the ring for \$176,571,000. The average was \$82,975, while the median closed out at \$32,000.



The buy-back rate a year ago was 24.9%.

"The market is certainly not easy and it's discriminating should you have what is viewed as--I'm not even going to call it a holebut if you might have a little age on a mare or you might have a little questionable produce, if you give them a reason not to bid, they don't bid," Browning said. "That's just the reality and that's what we've seen. It's a selective marketplace at all levels in everything we do. But when the stars line up, when you lead a

beautiful one in there and she has a good race record, and she's carrying a first or second foal and she's the right type, those horses were zooming past their reserves. And other times, it was very sticky to get to the reserve."

Emmanuel de Seroux's Narvick International, acting on behalf of Yoshiyuki Ito's Grand Stud, made the highest bid of Monday's sale, going to \$6 million to purchase McKulick (GB) (Frankel {GB}) from the Elite consignment. It was one of three seven-figure purchases for Narvick and was at the top of a powerful Japanese buying bench responsible for nine of the 25 million-dollar mares.

Eight of the million-dollar offerings were consigned by Hill 'n' Dale.

The November sale opened with an offering of 159 catalogued weanlings and action was slow to pick up with a number of buybacks in the first grouping of foals.

"After about the first 15 foals, it kind of found its feet,"
Browning said of the weanling market. "The trade was good, but
there were no 'Wow' moments in the weanling market. It was
very, very good for the quality weanlings, too."

The first weanling by champion Flightline to be offered at auction in the U.S. was the day's top-priced foal when selling for \$675,000 to the bid of bloodstock agent David Ingordo.

"The foal market was spotty," admitted bloodstock agent Ben McElroy. "There were a lot of RNAs. But I think quality sells and obviously, the quality is selling with these top mares."

The Fasig-Tipton November sale grossed over \$100 million for the first time in its history in 2021 when 149 horses sold for \$103,699,000. It reached that level again in 2022 and in 2023, but just failed to keep the streak going for a fourth year.

"Three years ago, we hit \$100 million for the first time and had \$100 million last year," Browning said. "Now we have a goal for next year because we just missed the \$100 million mark, which will keep us humble and hungry."

# Grand Stud Goes Back to Klaravich Well for \$6-Million McKulick

Yoshiyuki Ito's Grand Stud secured Grade I winner **McKulick (GB)** (Frankel {GB}) for \$6 million late in Monday's Fasig-Tipton November sale. Ito sat alongside bloodstock agent Emmanuel de Seroux during a prolonged bidding duel and saw off persistent challenges from a stubborn online bidder, as well as Kia Joorabchian of Amo Racing.

"She is a beautiful filly and she is by Frankel, the best stallion in the world," de Seroux said after signing the ticket on the racing/broodmare prospect.

"She is a Grade I winner. She is fantastic."


Asked if had considered quitting at any point in the bidding, de Seroux said with a smile, "Yes. Several times. Mr. Ito made the decision. He was next to me. Several times he stopped, but then he came back."

The \$6-million purchase was the second big ticket item of the sale that Grand Stud purchased from the roster of Seth Klarman's Klaravich Stables after de Seroux signed for **Surge Capacity** (Flintshire {GB}) for \$3.6 million earlier in the sale.

Bloodstock agent Mike Ryan purchased McKulick on behalf of Klaravich Stables for 180,000gns at the 2020 Tattersalls October sale. Shipped stateside to the barn of trainer Chad Brown, the bay mare won the 2022 GI Belmont Oaks Invitational, as well as

five other graded events. On the board in 15 of starts, she won seven times and earned \$1,955,290.

McKulick was consigned Monday by Elite Sales.

"I wasn't expecting that," Elite's Brad Weisbord admitted after watching the mare sell. "The reserve was half that. All the credit goes to Seth Klarman, Chad Brown and Mike Ryan. They went over to Tattersalls and bought a beautiful filly. She won a Grade I and we got a chance to sell the only Grade I winner by Frankel. Chad and Seth have been our number one supporter since we started Elite. We have been waiting a long time to get a break out sale for them. We are really happy for Seth and Chad."

Earlier in the boutique auction, Grand Stud went to \$3.6 million to secure Surge Capacity (hip 197), also from the Elite consignment. In foal to Into Mischief, the mare is a Grade I winner herself and a half-sister to Grade I winner Ways and Means (Practical Joke).

"She was a collection item in our minds," de Seroux said. "She's a fantastic race mare with a fantastic pedigree. She's young and she's in foal to a great horse. She has everything going for her."

Bred and raced by Klaravich Stables and trained by Brown, Surge Capacity won last year's GI Matriarch Stakes, as well as a pair of Grade III events.

Surge Capacity followed her dam **Strong Incentive** (Warrior's Reward), also in foal to Into Mischief, into the sales ring Monday. Strong Incentive had been purchased by Jon Clay's Alpha Delta for \$2.15 million at last year's Fasig-Tipton November sale and was re-offered this year following the exploits of her daughter, Ways and Means, who won the GI Test S. over the summer. The mare was originally led out unsold at \$2.7 million Monday, but was later listed as a \$2.75-million sale to Coolmore's M V Magnier and Peter Brant's White Birch Farm.

"It's a tremendous privilege to be associated with a mare of her class and quality," said Price Bell of Mill Ridge, which consigned Strong Incentive on behalf of Clay. "For Surge Capacity to sell for \$3.6 million reinforces that this may be the most exciting pedigree in the American Stud book. Full compliments to Chad Brown and Mr. Klarman for developing it from the beginning. She has been purchased by the best in the business and we look forward to their continued success."

Klaravich Stable purchased Strong Incentive for \$200,000 at the 2014 OBS April sale. She sold again to dissolve Klarman's partnership with William Lawrence for \$40,000 at the 2018 Keeneland November and she is also the dam of graded winner Highly Motivated (Into Mischief). @JessMartiniTDN

#### Japanese Buyers Stay Strong at Fasig-Tipton


Yoshiyuki Ito's Grand Stud purchased two of the top four lots at the Fasig-Tipton November sale Monday, going to a sale-topping \$6 million to secure **McKulick (GB)** (Frankel {GB}) and \$3.6 million for **Surge Capacity** (Flintshire {GB}). The pair of seven-figure mares were at the top of a string of high-priced mares to sell to Japanese interests at the auction.

Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm purchased five mares, led by Adare Manor (Uncle Mo) for \$2.8 million and Queen Goddess (Empire Maker) for \$1.5 million. Shadai Farm purchased four mares, led by a pair of seven-figure purchases: the \$1.75-million Flying Connection (Nyquist) and the \$1.1-million Daddysruby (Frac Daddy).

Japan's Lake Villa Farm purchased the first mare through the ring Monday, **Neecie Marie** (Cross Traffic), for \$1 million.

# From Breeders' Cup Scratch to \$5.1-Million Filly

Group 1 winner and 'TDN Rising Star' Ramatuelle (Justify) has had an eventful 30 days. After romping over older males in the G1 Prix de la Foret at Longchamp Oct. 6, she was supplemented to Fasig-Tipton's 'Night of the Stars' and routed to the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile as one of Europe's stronger hopes. However, the day prior to the Breeders' Cup, a PET scan showed bone remodeling, forcing a scratch. Cont.

She looked like a million bucks in the sales ring, or more appropriately, like \$5.1 million. Her connections didn't get a chance at a Breeders' Cup trophy, but they did get a hefty consolation prize after she sold to Coolmore's M.V. Magnier late Monday night.

Consigned by Bedouin Bloodstock as Hip 310, the 3-year-old filly was trained by Christopher Head for a large partnership and is out of GSW Raven's Lady (GB) (Raven's Pass).

"She's a lovely filly and in fairness to Christopher Head, he's done an incredible job with her," said Magnier.

Ramatuelle had been through the ring once previously, when selling for €100,000 as a yearling at the Arqana August sale. Magnier tipped his hat to Arthur Hoyeau, who had purchased her as agent for MyRacehorse, Monceaux, Hollymount Stud, and partners.

"Arthur Hoyeau spotted her as a yearling and everybody else didn't," said Magnier. "She's a very good filly and well done to them."

In addition to her Prix de la Foret, Ramatuelle captured the G2 Prix Robert Papin and the G3 Prix du Bois Longines Fonds Europeen de L'elevage, as well as placing in three additional Group 1s.

#### 'Marvelous' Moira sells for \$4.3M at Fasig-Tipton

The racing world is chocked full of epic highs and lows and Donato Lanni has surely seen plenty of both. **Cont.** 



Always sure to be front and center buying many of the nation's elite bloodstock, Lanni latest masterpiece is none other than a Canadian bred that was purchased for what now seems like a bargain-basement \$150,000 as a yearling.

Now four years removed from that fateful day in September, the 2022 Canadian Horse of the Year **Moira** (Ghostzapper), a well-time winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare at Del Mar last weekend, capped what started off as a 'little Canadian experiment' to reel in a \$4.3 million final bid from Bayles, bidding online, at the tail-end of the Fasig-Tipton November Sale Monday.

"It was just time to move on and let her go," said Lanni, briefly overcome with the raw emotion of the moment. "She is a special filly. She brought us a lot of joy."

Offered as Hip 293 and sold as a racing or broodmare prospect, the Canadian-bred mare was consigned by Hill 'n' Dale at Xalapa acting as agent on behalf of the partnership of Madaket Stables, SF Racing LLC in addition to X-Men Racing, a collection of Lanni's friends and family that the filly was initially purchased for at Keeneland in 2020.

"We went in thinking she would be a little Canadian experiment, never thinking that she would take us on a wild ride," said Lanni.



"She was a COVID year yearling, so I think we got lucky buying her at the price we got her for because she was a beautiful filly."

Sent to Kevin Attard at two, Moira, named after the quirky character Moira Rose on the hit show Schitt's Creek, won Woodbine's Princess Elizabeth in her career debut before finishing runner-up in the GIII Mazarine. At three, she won three of five starts, highlighted by runaway score in the Woodbine Oaks and the Queen's Plate, the first leg of Canada's Triple Crown. Runner up in the GI E.P. Taylor, the bay rounded out the season with a fifth in the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf at Keeneland, earning Canada's Sovereign Award as the Champion 3-year-old Filly in addition to her Horse of the Year honors.

While her 4-year-old year was her least prolific, winning a single race in six starts, she did in fact finish runner up in a trio of Woodbine stakes before taking the GII Canadian. Third behind the 2023 Horse of the Year Fev Rover (Ire) while taking another run at the E.P. Taylor, she filled the same spot in the 10-furlong Filly & Mare Turf at Santa Anita.

Run through Fasig's ring in 2023, she realized a \$3 million final bid, however, was ultimately retained by her owners. That proved to be a very wise decision.

"Last year, I took a chance and bought her back because I felt she had another year in her," he admitted. "We got lucky. It doesn't always work out that way."

A close-up second in her 5-year-old bow in the GI Diana in July, she turned the tables on Fev Rover in the GII Beverly D at Colonial this summer before finishing second in her penultimate start in the E.P. Taylor. Sent off at 5-1 for her career finale on last weekend's Breeders' Cup card, she came from just off the pace to triumph by a half-length over Cinderella's Dream and Didia.

"I am happy for Kevin and for everyone involved," he said. "She is a horse of a lifetime."

For a man who has purchased so many top-level horses that have competed at the highest level throughout the continent, he was pragmatic when asked whether the sale was bittersweet.

"It's a sad day but it's good for her. She needs to move on and be a broodmare," he concluded as an elated Tom Ryan from SF Racing walked up and engulfed Lanni in a bear hug for the ages.

"This is my man!" Ryan said.

Clearly, Lanni fills that bill for a great many in the industry.-- @CbossTDN

# Adare Manor to Japan After Michael Lund Petersen Does It Again

One of the more anticipated offerings of the evening was the recently retired broodmare prospect Adare Manor (Uncle Mo). Consigned by Hill 'n' Dale at Xalapa, agent as Hip 214, she'll be headed to Japan after Shingo Hashimoto bought the multiple Grade I winner from Bob Baffert's barn for \$2.8 million for Katsumi Yoshida of Northern Farm.

"She looked gorgeous," said Hashimoto immediately after signing the ticket. "I thought she was one of the best fillies in the market this time, so we're very excited. We're going to take her back to Japan."

When asked if Adare Manor would remain in Kentucky to be bred before shipping to Japan, he added, "We haven't decided that yet. We'll see how it goes after we buy everything."

Before the night was done, Hashimoto and Yoshida also bought GI American Oaks winner Queen Goddess (Empire Maker) (Hip 179) for \$1.5 million and an additional three mares for total receipts of \$6,350,000.

It was the third consecutive year Michael Lund Petersen, who campaigned Adare Manor, sold a multi-million dollar offering and Grade I winner at Fasig-Tlpton's 'Night of the Stars' Sale. Last year, he parted with Faiza (Girvin) for \$4 million and the year prior, it was champion Gamine (Into Mischief) for \$7 million.--@JillWilliamsTDN

Offered as Hip 240, the \$500,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga purchase was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency.

"She is a great looking filly," said Spendthrift's Ned Toffey, who was bidding from the back of the main pavilion. "She is talented, great family and we obviously love the sire."

He added, "What's not to like. She will be a nice addition to the broodmare band."

The mare represented the sole purchase by Spendthrift Monday.

"The competition has been strong," he said when asked about Monday's actiity. "We have been outbid on two so far. But for this caliber mare, the market has been very strong."

When asked who the mare might visit at Spendthrift, he said, "We're not sure what the plan is right now but we have lots of options."

Outlining the game plan for this week, he concluded, "We'll sell a few mares [this week] and try to add a few to the top of our broodmare band. She's a really nice filly that could go to several of our stallions."--@CbossTDN

#### Lyon Looks to Replenish at FTNOV Monday

Summer Wind's Jane Lyon has assembled a broodmare band that many in the breeding industry would give their right arm for. Already responsible for producing the likes of Horse of the Year and the highly in-demand sire Flightline, Lyon arrived at Fasig-Tipton looking to add a mare or two to her broodmare band.

Early in the broodmare session, Lyon extended to \$2.6 million for Hip 177, Private Mission (Into Mischief), in foal to stalwart Curlin.

"I hoped I wouldn't have to spend that much. We never do. But Bobby [Spalding] was in favor of her too. He'll tell me real quick if I like one and he doesn't," she added with a laugh.

Out of the multiple graded stakes-winning mare Private Gift (Unbridled), herself a \$2.3 million FTKNOV purchase in 2008, the 6-year-old mare is a half-sister to MSW Secret Someone (A.P. Indy) in addition to Gift List (Bernardini), the dam of GI Alabama Stakes heroine Dunbar Road (Quality Road). Private Mission realized \$750,000 at Fasig-Tiptin Saratoga Sale in 2019.

# Amo Buying Spree Continues with \$2.55M Eda

Kia Joorabchian's Amo Racing continued its worldwide buying spree with a pair of seven-figure acquisitions at Fasig-Tipton Monday. The Amo team went to \$2.55 million to purchase Grade I winner Eda (Munnings) (hip 244), in foal to Justify, from the Hill 'n' Dale at Xalapa consignment and purchased Agartha (Ire) (Caravaggio) (hip 215), in foal to Frankel (GB), for \$1.4 million from the Hunter Valley Farm consignment.

Eda, purchased by Charles and Susan Chu's Baoma Corp. for \$550,000 at the 2021 OBS March sale, won that year's GI Starlet Stakes and added three additional graded victories to her career before being bred to Justify last year.

"She was a Grade I-winning 2-year-old with a tremendous physical and she's in foal to a stallion who is going from strength to strength," bloodstock agent Ben McElroy said after signing the ticket on the mare. "She fits the bill for a good long-term investment for Amo."

As for plans for Eda, McElroy added, "We are all going to sit down as a team and decide what the plans for her are. She will stay in the U.S. and we will figure out who she is going to go to next year. We think she is going to have a lot of options."

While Eda will be staying in the U.S., McElroy said Agartha, a three-time group winner in Ireland, will be heading back to Europe.

"Kia has some horses racing at the moment and he obviously has some stallions in Europe," McElroy said. "The plan is, as we go along, we will have some nice horses to retire here. I think getting our foot in the door with mares like this is good to have so they are already in the system."


Rounding out a trio of purchases by Amo Racing Monday was **Kaufymaker** (Jimmy Creed) (hip 277) who was purchased for \$300,000 from the Paramount Sales consignment.

Seeing action at the yearling sales, Amo Racing purchased 17 head for over 19.5-million guineas during Book 1 at the Tattersalls October sale and purchased eight head for \$5,710,000 at the Keeneland September sale.

#### 'Can't Be Happier with What We're Getting' Ingordo Strikes for \$675k Flightline Colt

The first weanling by champion Flightline (hip 26) to be offered at auction in the U.S. sold for \$675,000 to the bid of bloodstock agent David Ingordo Monday at Fasig-Tipton. The colt, who was consigned by Lane's End, was bred by Jan Vandebos's Ran Jan Racing and is the first foal out of Star of India (Medaglia d'Oro). That mare is a daughter of Up (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), who was purchased by Vandebos for \$2.2 million at the 2015 Keeneland January sale.

"I got to watch that horse grow up on the [Lane's End] farm," Ingordo said of the weanling. "I really liked him. We really like the stallion. We believe in Flightline. So when there is a good one, we are going to try to buy them. And that horse fit what we wanted."

Ingordo is a bloodstock advisor at Lane's End, which stands 2022 GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Flightline.

"I bought him for a partnership I put together," Ingordo said of Monday's purchase. "We are going to buy a number of them, if we can, and some of them might come back next year [to resell] and some may go racing."

Flightline had three weanlings go through the sales ring in Japan earlier this year for an average of \$974,057, with a top price of \$1,305,651. A share in the stallion sold for \$2.5 million to top Keeneland's inaugural Championship Sale last week at Del Mar


"They all look like him," Ingordo said of Flightline's first foals. "I am obviously partial to him. But they are a uniform bunch, with plenty of size, scope, and stretch. I don't think they will be 4 1/2-furlong horses, but they have these big hind ends. Like that horse looks like he will have some get up and go, as do a lot of them. All in all, I couldn't be happier with what we are getting. If we didn't like them, we wouldn't be buying them."

"It's a bittersweet moment when you see some of the very well established programs dispersing their stock for various reasons, like the sad passing of Mr. Manganaro and John Hendrickson," said Lacy. "And Ed Selzter is dispersing after many years and of course Stuart Janney. It's significant."

He continued, "That is something that obviously brings an added level of attention, so additional buyers. People like buying out of those dispersals because they are going through without reserve and it is genuine reason for selling. And the stock represents many generations of curation and they're well documented."

"They're not culls and there is a genuine reason to sell and that typically brings a certain level of attention. We're honored to represent them. It's bittersweet, but we look forward to seeing the fruits of their labor come through the ring the next couple of weeks."

In the 2023 renewal of Keeneland's November sale, Puca (Big Brown), carrying a full-sibling to GI Kentucky Derby winner Mage (Good Magic) and to GI Belmont Stakes hero Dornoch (Good Magic), was initially led out of the ring unsold only to be secured by John Stewart afterward for what would have been a sale-topping \$2.9 million.

Overall, there were 91 post-sale transactions at the 2023 November sale, resulting in an additional \$12,265,000 in gross. In 2022, an additional 84 post sales grossed \$6,402,500.

"They can [skew] the final figures," explained Lacy when asked about the impact of the post sales on the bottom line. "That's why to include the post sale numbers. It's hard to create consistency with some outliers like that."

"Last year was a little bit of an odd year in that some of the highest priced horses were sold after the fact. We have to be consistent in our reporting and we can't just be picking and choosing how we choose to report them." **Cont.**



#### JUSTIFY TOPS COOLMORE AMERICA **ROSTER, TO STAND FOR \$250,000 IN 2025**

The sire of 19 stakes winners on four different continents in 2024, Justify (Scat Daddy--Stage Magic, by Ghostzapper) will command a service fee of \$250,000 in 2025, the Versailles, Kentucky-based nursery announced Monday. Alongside Into Mischief and Gun Runner, Justify will stand for the joint-highest covering fee in the United States.

The rising 10-year-old stallion is the sire of a trio of Group 1 winners this season, including City of Troy, winner in succession of the G1 Betfred Derby at Epsom, the G1 Coral-Eclipse Stakes at Sandown and an all-the-way success in the prestigious G1 Juddmonte International Stakes at York. His eight American black-type winners this term include GII Appalachian Stakes heroine Buchu and Alpha Bella, victorious in the GII La

Prevoyante Stakes. The unbeaten Awesome Result and Yuttitham (Jpn) struck at listed level in Japan, while Storm Boy (Aus) scored for the third time at group level in Australia in August.

Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie) is the farm's other six-figure stallion and will stand for \$125,000 in 2025. The 16-year-old sire has been represented by Grade I winners Kingsbarns and Adare Manor, who was to sell at the Fasig-Tipton Night of the Stars' on Monday. Uncle Mo has been represented by 14 black-type winners in 2024.

Domestic Product will stand alongside his successful sire Practical Joke beginning in 2025 at a fee of \$30,000. Winner of the GI H. Allen Jerkens Stakes, emulating his sire, the son of Goods and Services (Paynter) also won the GIII Lambholm South Tampa Bay Derby going 8 1/2 furlongs around two turns and cut back to one bend to crush by 7 1/2 lengths in the one-mile GIII Dywer Stakes. He was a sound third in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile and retires with a record of 4-2-1 from 10 starts and earnings of \$819,200.

"Domestic Product is a striking individual," said Coolmore's Charlie O'Connor. "He was a top-notch racehorse and is by a very good sire in Practical Joke who has enjoyed another great year highlighted by his two new Grade I winners at Saratoga (Ways and Means). Cont.

## HISA ASKS HIWU TO LIMIT PROVISIONAL SUSPENSION IMPOSITIONS DURING REVIEW

The Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) board of directors announced Monday an important change to a controversial aspect of the federal program's enforcement approach.

The HISA board have requested that the Horseracing Integrity and Welfare Unit (HIWU) limit the circumstances under which they issue provisional suspensions. These are the temporary suspensions imposed before a trainer or other allegedly guilty party has had a chance to argue their cause during a formal hearing and relate to cases associated with banned substances.

The announcement states that the HISA board has determined the need for "further analysis and review" on the issue of provisional suspensions "to determine whether any modifications to the current rules are appropriate."

While this review takes place, the HISA board has requested that HIWU impose provisional suspensions only under the following circumstances:

- When a Covered Person has more than one horse test positive for the same banned substance.
- When a barn search leads to the discovery of the same banned substance for which the Covered Person is being charged under the anti-doping and medication control (ADMC) program.
- When the alleged violation presents a substantial risk to the integrity of racing and/or the welfare of horses.

HISA states how all provisional suspensions "that do not fall within any of these defined categories" will be lifted Monday.

According to HISA, the following trainers will see their provisional suspensions lifted Monday: Mike Pupye, Gerald Butler, Dr. Larry Rickman Overly, Phil Serpe, Christopher Fung and Alvin Taylor

Carlos Lopez, Paul Valery and William Pribble are also currently under provisional suspensions. According to HISA, these three trainers will not have their suspensions lifted.

The lifting of these provisional suspension does not constitute a stay of the charges levelled against the alleged parties, said HISA. "HIWU will be moving forward with these matters under the applicable ADMC Program Rules," the announcement states.

HISA and HIWU had already stayed the issuance of provisional suspensions in cases concerning Metformin positives.

The board's request reportedly followed a resolution proposed by HISA's Horsemen's Advisory Group, which was also supported by the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (THA).

Alan Foreman, THA CEO and national ombudsman on behalf of HISA and HIWU, had previously voiced during a TDN Q&A his concerns about the way HIWU issues provisional suspensions.

"As we have articulated to HISA, we believe that provisional suspensions should be limited to the most serious cases involving threats to the integrity of the sport or the health and welfare of the horse, and that provisional suspensions not be issued in cases that do not fit into that category," Foreman told the *TDN* back in August.

"We're only dealing again with banned substances here," Foreman added. "We're not dealing with controlled therapeutic substances. But again, unless you're dealing with the most serious threats to the industry, I think that a trainer should be given the opportunity to defend himself, to have and enjoy all of the privileges of due process that is provided."

The THA was one of a number of regional and national horsemen's groups to issue a joint statement on Monday's announcement.

These groups--which included representative organizations from states like California, Kentucky and Pennsylvania--said they were working with HISA on other potential rule modifications, including a review of the banned substances list to determine if certain substances should be separately categorized, and a possible modification to the banned substance penalty structure to "allow for objective standards to be used in exercising discretion."

"It has been our view since the inception of HISA that our best approach for horsemen, and the industry-at-large, is to engage with them to fix the new system where it is flawed and make recommendations that will cause improvements. While we have been criticized at times for not appearing to be fighting for our horsemen, nothing could be further from the truth," their statement read.

"Effecting change is sometimes difficult and time-consuming, but we have been listening and working every day to do so. We are engaged with HISA regularly and can assure you that they, too, are listening and engaging with us in our collective effort to protect our horses and our sport. We believe that is the best course."

The racing season at Turf Paradise in Phoenix, AZ, which was supposed to open Saturday, Nov. 2 before an 11th-hour intervention from HISA, is now set to begin next Monday, Nov. 11, according to a joint release sent out late Sunday evening from the track and the Arizona Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (HBPA).

On Thursday, Oct. 31, HISA issued a press release, expressing concerns over the condition of the racetrack surface. Track officials postponed the start of the season, and an inspection team from HISA was expected to be on site Monday to conduct testing on Tuesday. Training could begin as soon as Wednesday and would continue through the weekend before the first live racing program next Monday.

Arizona HBPA President Lloyd Yother said, "The horsemen and Turf Paradise management are working hand and hand with HISA and the Arizona Racing Commission to ensure we have a safe meet."

Turf Paradise General Manager Vince Francia said, "Sincere thanks to our track maintenance crews, the horsemen, and everyone involved in getting us ready to start another great season of racing." **Cont.** 

The two stakes races scheduled for Nov. 2--the \$40,000 Jack Coady Sr. Handicap and \$40,000 Hank Mills Jr. Handicap--will now run on Wednesday, Nov. 13 and Thursday, Nov. 14, respectively.



# STARLUST SUDDENLY A COLT IN DEMAND AFTER BREEDERS' CUP GLORY

Alex Cole, racing manager for owners Jim and Fitri Hay, has paid tribute to their "superstar" **Starlust (GB)**, who has reportedly attracted plenty of interest from Australia with a view to a stallion career following his victory in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint at Del Mar.

Trained by Ralph Beckett, Starlust is now the winner of six of his 18 career starts, having thrived on his racing in 2024, notably winning at the Breeders' Cup on his tenth run of a three-year-old campaign which began at Meydan back in January.

Though his biggest success before Saturday had come at just Group 3 level when winning last year's Sirenia Stakes at Kempton, he'd since finished third in a pair of top-level races--last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint at Santa Anita and the latest edition of the Nunthorpe Stakes at York--giving his connections the belief that local odds of 33-1 were not an accurate reflection of his chance when he lined up at Del Mar in a race featuring old rivals Big Evs (Ire) (Blue Point {Ire}) and Bradsell (GB) (Tasleet {GB}), plus home favourite Cogburn (Not This Time).

## GROUP 1 WINNER HENRY LONGFELLOW TO RETIRE TO COOLMORE STUD

Group 1 winner and unbeaten juvenile **Henry Longfellow (Ire)** has been retired and will take up stallion duties at Coolmore Stud in Ireland next year.

The Dubawi (Ire) colt ran out an impressive winner of the G1 National Stakes at two and, while he failed to register a victory as a three-year-old, he was just a neck behind Rosallion (Ire) (Blue Point {Ire}) in a pulsating renewal of the St James's Palace Stakes at Royal Ascot.

Trained by Aidan O'Brien, Henry Longfellow also filled the frame in the G1 Prix du Moulin earlier this year, and retired having earned a career-high rating of 121.

Coolmore's director of sales, David O'Loughlin, said, "He went unbeaten in three starts at two, including the Group 1 National Stakes, just like his sire Dubawi, who is becoming a very significant sire of sires.

"He again showed top-class form at three over a mile when beaten just a neck by Rosallion in the St James's Palace Stakes. He's arguably the best-looking son of Dubawi to go to stud and he's out of one of the best Galileo race mares ever." Cont. p5

"We knew he'd outrun his odds, because between the favourite [Cogburn] and Bradsell they were going to go hell for leather," Cole summed up. "He's been placed in a Nunthorpe, he's a multiple stakes winner, and he was Group 1-placed at the Breeders' Cup last year. He didn't deserve to be the price he was--we wouldn't have sent him all that way and he wouldn't have been Ralph's only runner if we didn't fancy him a little bit.

"This horse has never really let us down," he added. "We started off the year at Meydan, he's run 10 times in four countries, and he's only a three-year-old. He's a superstar."

Neither the Hays nor Cole were in attendance at Del Mar, instead forced to suffer from afar in the anxious moments afterwards when Starlust had to survive a stewards' inquiry before his success, by a neck from Motorious (GB) (Muhaarar {GB}), was made official.

"No!" was Cole's emphatic response when asked whether he was confident that the result would stick. "You never know what the stewards are going to do, do you? But he was the best horse in the race at the end of the day.

"We watched it for the first time in multiple different locations. They [the Hays] had business commitments which meant they couldn't make it and I'm in Dubai, organising our horses out here. But that was a very special moment--they're all

great [Group 1 wins], but that was very special.

"For me there is no better owner in racing than Fitri Hay. She supports a lot of people, feeds a lot of mouths, and deserves everything she gets."

How the Hays got their hands on Starlust is a story that goes back to 2022 when the son of Zoustar (Aus) was the final lot through the ring on the second day of Book 2 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale. Bred by Steve Parkin's Branton Court Stud, he is out of the G3 Prix de Saint Georges winner and G2 Lowther Stakes runner-up Beyond Desire (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), the dam of four winners from seven runners, with the others including the Listed scorer Queen Of Desire (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}).

"I remember him well," Cole said of the colt he bought with Dermot Farrington for 55,000gns. "He was the last lot in the ring. It was around a quarter past nine at night and there were about five people left at Tattersalls--Dermot and I were two of them.

"The stallion was quite cold at the time, at least in the Northern Hemisphere, but he's very well-bred--the mare was brilliant. I think at the time Ralph had Lezoo [winner of the G1 Cheveley Park Stakes] and one other by Zoustar, so that's why he got him."

Beckett might have a monopoly on Zoustar's top-level winners in the Northern Hemisphere through Lezoo (GB) and Starlust, both conceived during the stallion's time in Britain when shuttling to Tweenhills Stud, but his influence has been felt much more widely at home in Australia where his tally of individual Group 1 winners now stands at seven.

This year his fee at Widden Stud was increased to A\$275,000

(around €167,000), making him the joint most expensive stallion standing in Australia, while in June a 1/60th share in the sire went for A\$1,300,000 (€787,000), breaking the record for the most expensive stallion share ever sold at public auction.

Little wonder, then, that Starlust has caught the imagination of stallion bosses in Australia following such a significant success on the global stage at the Breeders' Cup. Not only did that triumph more than double Starlust's career earnings, now standing at over £700,000, but it also has his connections minded to tread a bit more carefully with him in 2025, even if the horse himself might resent it.

"If only you could see my phone!" Cole said of the interest the colt has received, "Mainly from down under."

He continued, "The horse changed his entire profile on Saturday night. He's gone from being a horse you run 10 times a year to one you've actually got to think about a bit, but then he loves racing. [Next year] I'd have to work back from the King Charles III and he loves York. He's won twice and been placed in a Nunthorpe there, so the Nunthorpe would have to be very much on the agenda.

"He's going to have to be managed, but as I say, he's a three-year-old who has raced in four countries this year--it's an incredible feat, both from the horse and the trainer."

Group 2-winning juvenile and 'TDN Rising Star' Sakheer (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}) has been acquired by Ballyhane Stud and will take up stallion duties at the County Carlow outfit in 2025.

Sakheer topped the Argana Breeze-Up Sale in 2022 when bought by Oliver St Lawrence on behalf of KHK Racing for €550,000. He won his maiden second time up at Haydock

before running out an impressive winner of the Mill Reef Stakes just 16 days later where he had Charyn (Ire) and Shouldvebeenaring (GB) behind him.

Sakheer won two of his seven starts for trainer Roger Varian and reached a career-high rating of 114.

Varian commented, "Sakheer was an exceptional two-year-old and we were all devastated when injury prevented him from fulfilling his potential as a three-year-old. He really had the wow factor and we were privileged to have him in our yard."

## GALIWAY REMAINS AT A FEE OF €30,000 AT HARAS DE COLLEVILLE IN 2025

**Galiway (GB)**, the busiest stallion in France this year, will stand for an unchanged fee at Haras de Colleville in 2025, the *Jour de Galop* reported on Monday. It will be the fourth consecutive season that he has commanded a fee of €30,000.

The son of Galileo (Ire) reportedly covered 250 mares in 2024 and it's been another successful year for his sons and daughters on the racecourse, headed by the Irish Derby runner-up Sunway (Fr) and G2 Lonsdale Cup hero Vauban (Fr), a leading contender for Tuesday's G1 Lexus Melbourne Cup at Flemington.

Galiway's stud-mate **Kendargent (Fr)**, who is the broodmare sire of Sunway, will stand at a reduced fee of €12,000 (from €15,000) next season, while his son **Goken (Fr)** and dual-purpose stallion **Soft Light (Fr)** have had their fees dropped to €10,000 (from €15,000) and €4,000 (from €5,000), respectively.

Jour de Galop also had news of the stud fees for the four stallions standing at Haras des Faunes in 2025, including a new addition to the roster in the G2 Prix Eugene Adam winner My Prospero (Ire). The son of Iffraaj (GB), who also finished third in both the G1 St James's Palace Stakes and G1 Champion Stakes as a three-year-old, has been introduced at a fee of €3,000.

**Born To Sea (Ire)** has had his fee reduced to €3,500 (from €4,500), while **Gutaifan (Ire)** will stand for €2,500 (from €3,500) and **Marianafoot (Fr)** remains at €2,200.

Thady said, "The Bahrain International Trophy is an event that has gone from strength to strength over the past five years. To date, we have run three horses in the race, all of whom have finished second.

"Lead Artist is a horse who has always had a lot of natural speed, as such he was running over a mile and also over seven furlongs this summer. He won a Group 3 at Goodwood over what is a pretty slick mile but he improved again for the step up in trip in the Darley Stakes and the fast ground in Bahrain should suit. It's a race where you need a bit of pace.

"Kieran Shoemark will ride. He's ridden him in all his starts, knows him very well and he has had riding contracts in Bahrain before, so he knows the track well too."

He added, "Lead Artist is a three-year-old, whereas our previous runners were older horses, but he has not had a hard season. He has been relatively lightly raced and travelling a horse when they're turning from three to four can help them mature a lot, it can be a really good experience for them ahead of their four-year-old season."

#### **EUSTACE KEEN FOR DOCKLANDS TO HAVE ANOTHER CRACK AT VIA SISTINA**

Trainer Harry Eustace says that he is eager for a rematch between his runner Docklands (GB) (Massaat {Ire}} and impressive Cox Plate winner Via Sistina (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}).

Docklands was beaten 11 lengths when fifth in the Cox Plate late last month, with the ex-British runner Via Sistina chalking up a fourth Australian Group 1 success in style, beating runner-up Prognosis by eight lengths.

Despite the margin of defeat, Eustace would prefer to clash again with Via Sistina in Saturday's Champions Stakes rather than drop back for the Champions Mile on the same Flemington card.

"Docklands is really well. We're very happy with him and he almost certainly goes to the mile-and-a-quarter Champions Stakes on Saturday at Flemington. It might surprise a few people that we're keen to take on Via Sistina again, but I very much feel he's improved since the Cox Plate," Eustace told Grosvenor Sport.

"I think Via Sistina will scare a lot of horses into the Mile, which ought to make the Champions Stakes into a smaller field and more tactical affair, which I think will suit us."

The Chris Waller-trained Via Sistina was previously handled by George Boughey in Britain, winning last year's Pretty Polly Stakes at the Curragh and finishing second in the Champion Stakes before her 2.7million guineas sale to owner Yulong Investments at the end of 2023.




