



THE INSIDE STORY ON INDIA'S SUCCESSION OF STALLION IMPORTS



Ajay Anne: brokered the deal to take Territories to India | *Tattersalls*By Adam Houghton

It was announced on Wednesday that 1,574 of the world's best cricketers had registered their availability for the 2025 Indian Premier League, including a certain James Anderson, England's all-time leading wicket-taker who, in a surprise move, has put himself in contention to play in the competition for the first time in his long and illustrious career at the age of 42.

In equine terms, imagine Dubawi (Ire), arguably the most influential British-based sire of his era, being volunteered to move on to another major racing jurisdiction because he's been deemed surplus to requirements by Darley as he prepares to turn 23 on the first of next year.

Now, we all know that that's never going to happen to our beloved Dubawi, but the management team at Darley--think Ben Stokes, Brendon McCullum and Rob Key--were forced into making a tough decision with another member of their roster recently, namely Territories (Ire), who was put on the same flight Anderson will make early next year having been sold to continue his stallion career at Poonawalla Stud Farms in India.

It's been a common direction of travel in recent years when it comes to the next generation of stallion talent that Europe has to offer, both those who are already proven at the top level and those who haven't been given the opportunity to prove themselves at all. Cont. p3

AGA KHAN STUDS' SEA THE STARS AND ZARAK UP IN PRICE FOR 2025

Sea The Stars (Ire) will stand at his highest-ever fee of €250,000 at Gilltown Stud in 2025 after a season in which his 28 stakes winners included the G1 Grand Prix de Paris winner Sosie (Ire) and promising juvenile The Lion In Winter (Ire), who is currently favourite for next year's 2,000 Guineas.

His fellow Aga Khan Studs stallion Siyouni (Fr) headlines the roster at Haras de Bonneval in Normandy where his stud fee for next year will remain unchanged at €200,000.

Zarak (Fr), currently the second-leading sire in Europe with 11.8% stakes winners to runners this year, was represented by his first Classic winner this season in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains victor Metropolitan (Fr). He too has had his fee increased, to €80,000 from €60,000.

Vadeni (Fr) and Erevann (Fr), each of whom covered their first mares in 2024 and were fully booked, will remain at their starting fees of €18,000 and €8,000, respectively.

Like Territories, the sire of three individual Group 1 winners, including this year's Prix Maurice de Gheest hero Lazzaat (Fr), Tasleet (GB) had already produced an elite performer in Bradsell (GB) when he was moved on to pastures new. He covered his first book of mares at Dr. Anhad Sidhu's Star Born Stud in Punjab earlier this year, before Bradsell bolstered his reputation with two further Group 1 wins in the Nunthorpe Stakes and Flying Five Stakes.

Then in the other corner you have horses like Asymmetric (Ire) and Mutasaabeq (GB), both of whom have been announced as new additions to the Indian stallion ranks for 2025, before their first European-conceived foals have even hit the ground.

The reaction from many breeders to this succession of exports has been similar to that of many English cricket fans when Anderson's enforced retirement from Test cricket was announced earlier this year. And, like so often on the cricketing field, it's India who have come out as the winners in the eyes of many--or so it may appear.

"In India, it's a bit crazy because these investments don't actually reflect the true health of the racing industry," counters Gaurav Rampal, who is a leading bloodstock agent in India and did the deal to bring Mutasaabeq to Poonawalla, as well as

being the Indian representative for Tattersalls.

He continues, "The commercial angle to these investments might not justify this euphoria, especially at the kind of levels that Territories and Mutasaabeq were bought, but then they were bought by the Poonawallas, a wealthy family. They are commercial breeders and it's a prestige business for them.

"Foal numbers in India are down and the big studs don't share their stallions. And the other thing is that you're going out of fashion very quickly if you're not firing in the first crop. That's why some of the farms are not shying away from having a back-up stallion in place well in advance."

That last sentiment essentially sums up the approach of Surbirinder Singh Sidhu of Mebajeona Stud Farm and the Northern Lights Stallion Syndicate he's involved in, consisting of four farms who have joined forces to try and compete with the bigger operations.

Asymmetric, who won the G2 Richmond Stakes for Alan King as a two-year-old, is their latest addition to a roster which also features Cable Bay (Ire), the sire of Dragon Symbol (GB)--the first past the post in the 2021 edition of the G1 Commonwealth Cup--among others during his time at Highclere Stud in Britain.

"We have a syndicate of four partners, four different stud farms, who have teamed up together to find new stallions," Sidhu says of the syndicate's methodology. Cont. p4



"The reason we have teamed up together is so that we can support our stallions with adequate numbers for them to be able to compete well in the market. Before we were all buying individual horses and the numbers just weren't enough for the stallions to make a dent."

He adds, "We're clear that we want to keep adding a stallion every two years, even if we hit upon success, so that we can continue to improve the gene pool that we have. We want to reach a situation where we're never short of a stallion who is not proven.

"That's how we're managing the whole thing and we're also in the process of improving our broodmare band. We are bringing in better mares every year to support these stallions and to improve the operations of all four farms that are involved."

As for Territories, he is likely to cover between 50 and 60 mares with the crème de la crème of the Poonawalla

broodmare band queueing up to visit him next year. That's according to Ajay Anne of New Approach Bloodstock, the man who brokered the deal to bring the son of Invincible Spirit (Ire) to India, as well as Tasleet.

"He will get the best that Mr. Poonawalla has," Anne confirms. "He will get top-level mares so far as India is concerned and we've got a few top-class mares internationally as well. I bought [G3 City Of York Stakes winner] Nemoralia at Tattersalls last year and Mr. Poonawalla actually

bought [G1 Fillies' Mile runner-up] September yesterday from Keeneland for \$600,000. He's obviously on a mission to buy the best he can and enjoy his racing."

Expanding on the decision to buy Territories, he adds, "I think we're looking for proven quality and there are not many stallions you can buy who are already performing at the top level. Mr. Poonawalla was very clear in his instructions that he's trying to buy these quality horse who could not be faulted--internationally and not just by Indian standards, as such. He's been in breeding for 40-odd years, so he knows exactly what he wants and what he has to pay for them.

"There were two stallions in India, Razeen and Placerville, who were like the Northern Dancer and the Mr Prospector of India. They used to rule Indian racing for a long time, but there hasn't been a superstar stallion in India for a while--I really hope that Territories is a superstar. He has the credentials anyway, so we'll

find out if he is."

Rampal concurs. He says, "For the last few years there hasn't been a dominant stallion or dominant farm in the country and that's another reason for the influx of these stallions because these big farms are looking for another good one."

He also gives a positive mention to a former Aidan O'Brien trainee owned in partnership by Nanoli Stud and Equus Stud.

"Cougar Mountain is very encouraging," he says. "He's had three crops of racing age and he's produced three Derby winners, so for me he is the hottest young stallion we have in the country. Interestingly, his first crop and his third crop were really small because at the beginning of the breeding season he ran into problems. Despite that he's got Group 1 horses in all three crops."

Coming up with three Group 1 winners from his early crops wasn't enough to keep Territories in Britain, nor the performance of his yearlings in 2024, featuring a full-brother to

the G3 Railway Stakes third Masseto (GB) who sold to Sumbe for 750,000gns at the Book 2 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale.

As for those breeders who sent mares to Asymmetric and Mutasaabeq this year, they suddenly find themselves in a very difficult position. It's a situation both Sidhu and Anne can sympathise with, whilst acknowledging the opportunities it provides for those overseas clients looking to recruit a young stallion with untapped potential.

"For us to buy a horse like Asymmetric off the track would be impossible," says Sidhu. "It's great value for us, to have these top-performing horses who are untapped and who still haven't had a baby to race. They could turn out to be anything.

"But it's something that people who are invested in this industry in Europe have to be mindful of, because small breeders suddenly have a mare in foal to a stallion who has been exported to another country and they are left with a foal who is not going to make the kind of money that they thought they would."

Anne adds, "I think it's a very commercial market in Europe and people are breeding for the sales ring and not for racing. If you actually sit back and think, 'what do you want in a stallion?', there are a lot of stallions there who could probably do well, but if they don't do well in the ring, they're out." Cont. p5

He added, "That's when I think the opportunities are there for other countries to pick up those stallions. The likes of Tasleet and Prince Of Lir were doing pretty well, but they just weren't commercial enough for the European market. For us, they were the right type of stallions to buy at the right price.

"It's a vicious circle, but Territories stood for £10,000 and they could sell for 750,000gns. They could sell for 20,000gns or 30,000gns as well, but there are a lot of £10,000 stallions who don't make that kind of level."

As for the economic pressures on home soil, the heady days of Razeen and Placerville are said to feel a long time ago if you're one of those people for whom Indian racing and bloodstock is your life, with the GST [Goods and Services Tax] imposed on bets placed in the country seemingly taking a heavy toll on its finances.

"We're not in a very healthy position and that's because the government has come down very heavily on the GST which is imposed on the face value of the bet," Sidhu explains. "With that what happens is that 28% of the money is lost as soon as a person places a bet.

"The industry is trying to keep its head above water and there are a few good people who are supporting us, but the government needs to understand that the taxation is very heavy and they need to restructure it. If that can happen then this industry will grow because India is one of the most emerging markets in the world."

"The government need to help," Anne agrees. "If people can bet on sports such as cricket or football, and they're still considered as a sport, then I don't see why they look at racing as only a gambling product. We are participating in a sport as well and there's a lot of hard work that goes into breeding horses,

selling them, training them and the whole lot. I think that is a message that the industry needs to put across to the world.

"The number of horses has probably halved in the last three or four years. It has changed in such a way that the demand is more than the supply, because the supply is not what it would have been five years ago. The foal numbers were between 1,800 and 2,000 in the good days of Indian racing, but now they're down to 800.

"It's a struggle and I hope that people in the right places make the right decisions and don't let our sport die."

KAMEKO BACK TO £20,000 AFTER SUCCESS WITH FIRST RUNNERS

Kameko has had his fee raised to £20,000 for the 2025 season following a promising season for his first two-year-old runners.

The Qipco 2,000 Guineas winner stands alone among this year's first-season sires in being the only member of that class to date to have sired a Group/Grade 1 winner. Kameko's breakthrough came with the win of New Century (GB) in the GI Summer Stakes at Woodbine. The Qatar Racing colt went on to finish fourth in Friday's G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf for Andrew Balding.

Kameko is also the sire of the G2 Royal Lodge Stakes winner Wimbledon Hawkeye (GB), who, with a mark of 114 is the highest-rated juvenile among the offspring of the freshman sires. He has also been placed in the G1 Futurity Trophy, G2 Superlative and G3 Acomb Stakes. Cont. p6

Tweenhills Cont.

A son of the late leading American turf sire Kitten's Joy, Kameko started his stud career at Tweenhills at a fee of £25,000, which was reduced to £20,000 then £15,000 in subsequent seasons.

His stud-mate and fellow Group 1 winner at Tweenhills, Lightning Spear (GB), remains at a fee of £5,000.

Tweenhills is set to continue its 'Your Success' = Our Success' scheme in 2025, whereby any breeder who produces a stakes winner by a Qatar Racing-owned stallion at the stud will be offered a credit for use with any Qatar Racing-owned stallion in the following year to the value of the nomination paid.

NIETZSCHE HAS AND CLOTH OF STARS JOIN MONTAIGU ROSTER; FEES ANNOUNCED

Haras de Montaigu has released the fees for its stallion roster which is boosted to six for 2025 with the arrival of Cloth Of Stars (Ire) from Haras du Logis. The Group 1-winning son of Sea The Stars (Ire) will stand for a fee of €4,000.

The popular National Hunt stallion No Risk At All (Fr), sire of the Champion Hurdle winner Epatante (Fr), leads the Montaigu roster at €20,000. **Beaumec De Houelle (Fr)**, by the late Montaigu resident Martaline (GB), has had his fee reduced to €5,000, while **Flintshire (GB)** is priced at €4,000 and **Dschingis Secret (Ger)** at €3,000.

The fee for the stud's other new recruit, the Grade 3-winning hurdler Nietzsche Has (Fr), is yet to be decided. The three-year-old son of Zarak (Fr) out of the Martaline mare Nice To Meet You (Fr) has won three of his five starts over hurdles for Marcel Rolland.

All stallions are advertised on live foal terms.

NOMINEES ANNOUNCED FOR 2024 HORSE RACING IRELAND AWARDS

A total of 38 individuals have been nominated for the 2024 Horse Racing Ireland Awards, HRI announced on Wednesday. Among the Horse of the Year candidates are a trio horses who were unbeaten this season: jumpers State Man (Fr) (Doctor Dino (Fr) and Teahupoo (Fr) (Masked Marvel (GB)), and topnotch stayer Kyprios (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), while other nominees are Derby winner City Of Troy (Justify), mile specialist Porta Fortuna (Ire) (Caravaggio), and Cheltenham Gold Cup hero Galopin Des Champs (Fr) (Timos {Ger}). STARMAN FILLY HEADS THE SECOND SESSION OF THE GOFFS AUTUMN YEARLING SALE

A filly by young sire Starman (GB) (lot 325) topped the second session of the Goffs Autumn Yearling Sale at €50,000 on Wednesday.

Secured by Peter and Ross Doyle Bloodstock from The Castlebridge Consignment, the chestnut is out of the placed Frankel (GB) mare Beloved (Ire), who is a half-sister to G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) winner and sire Deep Brillante (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}).

Ross Doyle said of his purchase, "She's a very nice racy filly--we've bought three or four Starmans already and we like what we see physically. It's a strong pedigree on the dam's side, and she's out of a Frankel mare which might give a further boost. She will go into training with Richard Hannon."

Four lots made €40,000 or higher, with lot 391, a daughter of Kodiac (GB), making €45,000 from Tally-Ho Stud where her sire stands. The Knockatrina House Stud draft member is out of a half-sister to the multiple group-placed Black Mambazo (Ire) (Statue Of Liberty) and fellow stakes winner Diglett (Ire) (One Cool Cat).

Lot 462 went to Andy Oliver for €44,000 from the Staffordstown consignment. The son of Lope De Vega (Ire) is a half-brother to G3 Prix des Chenes third My Kurkum (GB) (Dariyan {Fr}). His dam is a full-sister to dual listed winner Green Sweet (Smart Strike), and a half to two-time group winner Shaman (Ire) (Shamardal), second in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois and G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and third in the G1 Prix Ganay.

The fourth and final lot priced at €40,000 was lot 429, a son of Starman that changed hands to Oak Tree Farm. The relative of

G2 Duke of Cambridge Stakes heroine Duntle (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and her son, three-time Group 1 winner and sire Circus Maximus (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was offered by Abban Farm. Starman has averaged €18,077 and grossed €235,000 for 13 yearlings sold.

Overall, 190 yearlings sold from 243 offered (78%). The gross was \in 1,491,400, while the average was \in 7,850 and the median was \in 5,500.

The sale continues at 10 a.m. on Thursday, Nov. 7 and includes 27 supplementary entries to be offered as lots 791 to 820. Among them are 13 yearlings eligible for the 2025 Goffs Two Million Series which offers a guaranteed prize fund of €2,000,000 in the Goffs €1-Million Bonus Race Series, as well as Europe's richest two-year-old race, the Goffs Million. Lot 800 meanwhile is eligible for the lucrative Harry's Half Million at York next year.

DURING 'SOLID DAY'S TRADE,' FLYING DUTCHMEN SECURES SMASH TICKET FOR \$600,000 AT KEENOV BOOK 2 OPENER



Wednesday's \$600k topper Smash Ticket | Keeneland

LEXINGTON, KY - The Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale produced a day of solid trade with the opening session of its two-day Book 2 section Wednesday in Lexington. For the session, 201 horses grossed \$29,440,000. The day's average of \$146,468 dipped 9.38% from the corresponding session in 2023, while the median remained unchanged at \$120,000.

"It was a good, solid day's trade," said Keeneland Vice President of Sales Tony Lacy. "I think it was fair. There were some sticky spots, it was a little selective in areas. And the RNA rate ticked up at the end of the day. It was consistently in the mid-20s for much of the day and then kicked up at the end."

From 400 catalogued offerings, a total of 201 horses sold with 93 failing to meet their reserves for a buy-back rate of 31.63%. It was 34.06% a year ago.

Through two sessions of the nine-day auction, 344 horses have sold for \$91,810,000. **Cont. p3**

MGISW NATIONAL TREASURE RETIRES TO SPENDTHRIFT, WILL STAND FOR \$40,000

National Treasure (Quality Road--Treasure, by Medaglia d'Oro), a three-time Grade I winner, has been retired from racing and will take up residence at Eric and Tamara Gustavson's Spendthrift Farm in Lexington, Kentucky, where he will stand stud in 2025 for an introductory fee of \$40,000 S&N, according to a post on the farm's website.

A Classic winner of the GI Preakness Stakes and victor in this year's GI Pegasus World Cup and GI Metropolitan Handicap, National Treasure is now available for inspection by appointment. Spendthrift acquired the breeding rights to the colt, which was announced back in early February.



The average remained fairly constant at \$266,890, while the median of \$200,000 is up 11.11% from the same point in the 2023 sale. The two-day buy-back rate is 28.03%, compared to 34.45% a year ago.

"The median, as we say each sale, is the measure of the health of the market, through the middle of the market," said Keeneland Senior Director of Sales Operations Cormac Breathnach. "Averages are great for headlines, but the median really is a better indicator of what the level of trade is. So when your median is healthy and your RNA rate is acceptable, or particularly good, in the case of yesterday, that means people are getting horses moved for acceptable numbers. And so, for the median to be up a little more than 10% over two sessions is very encouraging. Our RNA rate is significantly lower than it was last year as well. Those are great indicators of a healthy market."

The November sale continued to feature a diverse buying bench with the top 15 lots going to 15 different buyers Wednesday.

"We still have a lot of participation from Japanese groups and Australian visitors are here in large numbers and finding horses that they want to bring home," Breathnach said. "And we have a diverse group of domestic buyers on the results sheets as well. So it all feels really good. With seven sessions to go, we are looking forward to what is to come."

Hunter Rankin made the highest bid of Wednesday's session, going to \$600,000 to acquire Smash Ticket (Midnight Lute) on

behalf of Flying Dutchmen. The session topper was consigned by Legacy Bloodstock.

A filly from the first crop of Life Is Good (hip 287) attracted the highest price for a weanling during Wednesday's session when selling for \$410,000 to Randy Hartley and Dean DeRenzo, who signed under the name Classic Equine. Out of Mezinka (Bodemeister)--a half-sister to Pioneerof the Nile (Empire Maker)--the weanling is a half-sister to graded-placed Harlocap (Justify), a horse Hartley and DeRenzo consigned to the 2022 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May Sale.

Hip 287 was consigned by Runnymede Farm, as agent for the complete dispersal of her breeder, Breed First.

"We all know the weanling market is one of the most stable and strong markets," said Runnymede's Romain Malouitre. "It's always good, but I never expected she would make that at that level. Coming in this morning, we had all the right people, so we're thankful for all of them to be there for a nice filly."

The Keeneland November sale continues through next Wednesday with sessions beginning daily at 10 a.m.

'A Running Family:' Flying Dutchmen Goes to \$600k for Smash Ticket

The Boersma family's Flying Dutchmen missed out on buying graded-stakes winner Slammed (Marking), who sold for \$1.1 million at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale Monday, but the operation was still able to get in the family when purchasing that mare's half-sister **Smash Ticket** (Midnight Lute) (hip 383) for \$600,000 Wednesday at Keeneland.

"We tried to buy the sister the other night at Fasig and got outrun there," said agent Hunter Rankin. "We wanted to have some of that family. It's a running family and we liked the mare physically. We are just really happy we got her."

The 5-year-old Smash Ticket, who sold in foal to Nyquist, won the 2022 Weather Vane Stakes and was third in the 2021 GIII Sorrento Stakes. Her half-sister Slammed, who was purchased Monday night by Stonestreet, won the 2022 GII Thoroughbred Club of America Stakes.

Both mares were campaigned by the partnership of breeder Brad King, Stan and Suzanne Kirby and Barbara Coleman.

Smash Ticket, who was consigned Wednesday by Legacy Bloodstock, followed her weanling by Jackie's Warrior into the sales ring Wednesday. The colt was purchased by Todd and Shawn Hansen's HX3 Incorporated for \$30,000.

Flying Dutchmen has been building up its broodmare band to fill its recently acquired farm in Kentucky. Through two session of the Keeneland auction, it had purchased five mares, including the \$875,000 Fast and Shiny (Bernardini) (hip 177).

"We are just trying to get some really nice, fast mares that were good on the track," Rankin said. "We are trying to develop them both through here at the sales and also through the yearling program that we've got. These guys are really committed to the long-term and they want to breed to race and have a lot of fun. I think ideally they would like to get to 30 or 35

mares. We bought a farm just off of Old Frankfort and we are excited about that. So, we are trying to populate that a little bit."

Flying Dutchmen's activity at the yearling sales this year included a \$1.5-million son of Tapit (hip 97)--one of five purchased for \$3,435,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale in August; and a \$675,000 daughter of Uncle Mo (hip 453), who was one of eight purchased for \$2,715,000 at Keeneland in September. @JessMartiniTDN

Tramontin Buys \$500K Street Sense Mare at Keeneland Wednesday; Finalizing Plans to Buy Siena Farm

After first dipping his toe in racing in the early 1990s, Greg Tramontin pressed pause for a time to focus on his business interests. However, since his return to the game, he has achieved success with the likes of GI Woody Stephens Stakes winner and 'TDN Rising Star' No Parole (Violence) (raced in partnership with Maggi Moss), and most recently with Quickick (McKinzie), who broke her maiden in Saratoga this summer before finishing third in last weekend's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. And while competing at that level of the game might represent a career-high for many, Tramontin is poised to take his investment in the industry to the next level with the

imminent closing on the famed Siena Farm in Paris, Kentucky. In preparation for the day that the deal is finalized, the now retired automobile insurance developer was active at Keeneland Tuesday and Wednesday, purchasing a trio of mares to add to his new farm. Buff Bradley handled the bidding duties for Tramontin at Keeneland.

Early in the Book 2 opener, Tramontin purchased a pair of mares–Hip 298, Moody Woman (Gormley) and a few hips later,

he secured Hip 307, Music Street (Street Sense). The former was purchased for \$325,000, while the latter brought \$500,000. In Book 1, he bought Hip 21, Night on the Town (Street Sense), in foal to hot sire Good Magic. Tuesday's purchase was a member of the Siena Farm dispersal, conducted by Taylor Made.

Julie Cauthen and Ignacio 'Nacho' Patino, Siena's longtime GM, helped advise on Tramontin's most recent purchases at Keeneland.

All three of his latest acquisitions will be sent straight to Siena, which will be ultimately renamed to honor his biological father, Greenwell.


"[Cauthen and Patino] spotted some nice really nice, well-bred mares over the past couple of days, but we just weren't able to land some of the higher-priced ones [in Book 1]," he admitted. "But we bought some nice ones."

Music Street is a 5-year-old out of unraced Sudden Heat (Congrats), a daughter of champion 3-year-old filly and \$2.1 million earner Xtra Heat (Dixeland Heat), who produced SW & GSW Southwestern Heat and SW Elusive Heat. Consigned by Grovendale Sales, the bay is in foal to Taiba.

His other Book 2 purchase, also 5-years-old, is out of GSP A.J.'s Gal (Monashee Mountain). Also consigned by Grovendale, the 5-year-old mare is in foal to Uncle Mo.

Asked what drew him and his advisory team to the recent acquisitions, he said, "I like [Street Sense] and the fact that he was a powerful, two-turn horse. I'm not looking for sprinters. I'm looking for Classic-type stock, so he fits the bill."

According to Tramontin, he had already been considering buying his own farm following his retirement, but Siena only recently came into the frame. Co-founded by Anthony Manganaro in 2007, Siena was put on the market following his death in the summer of 2023.



"[Siena] came on my radar at Saratoga this summer and I went out to see it and it's pristine, just beautiful," explained Tramontin. "Mr. Manganaro did a great job along with Nacho. It's turn key. There is nothing that needs work. It's just perfect."

Presently a resident of Miramar Beach in Florida and Baton Rouge, in Louisiana, the 70-year-old looks forward to adding a third touch point in his life.

"I'll spend quite a bit of time [at the farm], so I can be there for foaling and when Keeneland and Churchill are running," he said.

Tramontin founded and developed three separate automobile insurance companies, commencing with his initial foray in 1982. His latest company, launched in 2009, was sold to an investment group in 2022.

"I was a one horse owner for quite a while and then I had to get out for a long time because racing and an automobile regulated insurance company didn't mix," he explained. "So when I got close to retirement, I decided to get back into it."

He added, "It's my retirement business. I've retired from the insurance business. I'm 70-years-old and I like to play golf. I am interested in racing and breeding, so the farm was a logical step."

Since his return to racing in 2020, Tramontin has meticulously added to his equine holdings. Tom Amoss has been his sole trainer since his introduction to the sport.

His best horse to date, No Parole was initially campaigned by Maggi Moss, and Tramontin purchased a stake in the colt before his Woody Stephens victory in 2020.

"I was just getting back in the business," he recalled. "In January of his 3-year-old year, I bought a 49% share in No Parole. He's a tremendous horse."

He continued, "I have two mares in foal that I already owned and bought in 2022--[GISP] Alys Beach [Omaha Beach], in foal to

Flightline and Natalie Would [Into Mischief], who is in foal to Gun Runner. So those two and the three we bought at Keeneland will be a nice little start."


Last year, Tramontin secured eight yearling colts and eight fillies, including Quickick (McKinzie). The bay was purchased for \$550,000 at Keeneland September. In her last two starts, she placed second behind Immersive (Nyquist) in the Oct. 4 GI Alcibiades Stakes at Keeneland before coming home third behind the likely divisional champion on Breeders' Cup Friday at Del Mar.

In 2024, Tramontin added seven more yearling fillies in addition to one colt. In total, his interests stand at 34, however, he made it clear that the plan is to focus on quality over quantity.

"I don't want it to be about volume," he said. "I'd rather be smaller but high quality. I shoot for the higher end of the business."

He added, "Ultimately, we'll take a look at being buyers at the sales but also sellers. The goal is to create the page on the track and them bring them back to the farm to breed them."

When asked what the long-term plan is for his fledgling breeding operation is, he said, "I did not know Mr. Manganaro, but to a person, the stories I have heard about his kindness, generosity and intelligence and what a wonderful man he was, I

Nursery Place purchased Madera Dancer, with this filly from the first crop of two-time Breeders' Cup winner Golden Pal in utero, for \$45,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale. The mare had already produced graded winner Legends of War (Scat Daddy) and stakes-placed Tahoma (Justify).

"Typically, we like mares that have already done it and she had already proven herself," Nursery Place's Griffin Mayer said of the mare's appeal. "She had a nice graded stakes horse and an update at Kentucky Downs at the time and she was in foal to a first-crop horse. We were kind of getting shut out that week, luckily she slipped through the cracks. It was just a little bit of luck."

Asked for his impressions of the weanling, Mayer said, "When we bought the mare for this and this thing came out, I thought, 'wow. we are going to do well here.' She is a beautiful filly. Coming in here, we thought she would bring \$200,000, but the weanling market is strong. But she was beautiful."

Hip 271 is the priciest of seven weanlings by Golden Pal to sell at Keeneland so far this week. The seven averaged \$162,143. The Coolmore stallion, who stands for \$30,000, had three sell at Fasig-Tipton November Monday for an average of \$158,333.

"I have seen a handful of Golden Pals," Mayer said. "I really like what I've seen so far. I'd have to put her up there with one of the better ones I've seen, though."

The 5-year-old Madera Dancer is back in foal to Up to the Mark.

"National Treasure comes to Spendthrift with the credentials to become an important sire, and we are very excited for him to enter the next chapter in his already tremendous career," said Ned Toffey, Spendthrift general manager. "This horse was precocious enough to place in a very competitive Breeders' Cup Juvenile, he's an American Classic winner at three, and he was one of the top older horses this year with wins in premier races like the Pegasus World Cup and the Met Mile. National Treasure was fast, possessed tremendous grit, and is an exceptionally good-looking colt with outstanding sire power and pedigree--a truly special package."

Trained by Bob Baffert, National Treasure was scheduled to make his final start in last Saturday's GI Big Ass Fans Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile at Del Mar. However, he came out of last month's runner-up effort in the GI California Crown Stakes at Santa Anita with a minor foot bruise, which ultimately forced him to miss the Dirt Mile.

"National Treasure was one of the most consistent and reliable horses I have ever worked with," said SF Bloodstock's Tom Ryan. "In addition to his elite race record--competing in 13 Grade I races over 28 months--he completed 75 published workouts in California, demonstrating an insatiable appetite for training. His physical makeup contributed to his longevity: he is very streamlined--almost light--but possesses great power and efficient motion with a high cruising speed. It's unfortunate that we missed the chance for a third Breeders' Cup appearance due to the bruised foot. It was just bad timing. We are very proud that he will now begin his stallion career at the famed Spendthrift Farm."

The \$500,000 yearling purchase at the 2021 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale began his career at two with a successful unveiling. The juvenile later finished as the runner-up in the GI American Pharoah Stakes at Santa Anita before traveling to Keeneland where he ran third behind champion 2-year-old Forte (Violence) in the GI FanDuel Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

As a 3-year-old, National Treasure became Quality Road's first Classic winner, when he scored in the Preakness. He concluded his sophomore season with a loss by a nose to Horse of the Year Cody's Wish (Curlin) in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile.

To kick off his final season of racing, National Treasure delivered in the Pegasus World Cup at Gulfstream Park and on the Belmont Stakes undercard the 4-year-old took home the Met Mile at Saratoga.

An earner of \$5,578,000, National Treasure was campaigned by owners SF Racing, Starlight Racing, Madaket Stables, Robert Masterson, Stonestreet Stables, Jay Schoenfarber, Waves Edge Capital, and Catherine Donovan. Bred by Peter Blum, the 4-year-old colt is out of the Medaglia d'Oro mare Treasure.

KEVIN ATTARD JOINS TDN WRITERS' ROOM PODCAST

It was quite a few days for Canadian-based trainer Kevin Attard.

On Saturday, he won his first Breeders' Cup race with Moira (Ghostzapper) in the GI Maker's Mark Filly & Mare Turf and some 48 hours later she went through the ring for \$4.3 million.

Knowing he'd have plenty to say, we invited Attard to join us on this week's TDN Writers' Room Podcast presented by Keeneland.

He admitted that saying goodbye to the best horse he has ever trained was difficult.

"Well, right now it's extremely difficult, no doubt about it." Attard said. "You know, for our stable, our barn, these type of

horses don't come by often. Then you get a horse that did so many firsts like she did. There's obviously that sentimental attachment and love for her. Cultivating it all in the Breeders' Cup was a dream come true in a sense. Now to have to kind of watch her go, that has been one of the most hardest things I've had to do in horse racing. The love and the bond that you grow for these horses, it's hard to explain. And I don't think people realize how much we care for these animals, how much we

Moira gave Attard his first win in the Queen's Plate (now the King's Plate), his first Canadian Horse of the Year and is in a strong position to win this year's Eclipse Award for North America's champion turf filly and mare. Ironically, she is not eligible for any Sovereign Award in Canada because she did not compete the minimum of three times in her home country, which is the requirement.

When asked if he thought the rule was fair, Attard said that he did not.

"I don't, to be honest," he said. "Unfortunately, under the criteria, as you mentioned, for the Sovereign Awards, she is not eligible. I'm hoping that the Jockey Club of Canada that looks after the Sovereign Awards does something to honor and recognize her. Obviously, the seventh Canadian bred to win a Breeders' Cup race in history is pretty special. I think that alone tells you the significance and how important of a Canadian bred she is.

"As it stands right now, she has a very good opportunity to become the Eclipse Award winner," Attard said. "Who would have ever imagined that when Donato Lanni put this group together to buy a Canadian-bred to try to win a Queen's Plate that this would happen? Here we are winning a Breeders' Cup race and now, possibly, an Eclipse Award. Like how surreal is that? I almost want to pinch myself to make sure I am not dreaming."

Apparently Moira has her quirks and Attard has mentioned that she can be a handful. She must also be pretty smart because she can tell when it's a race day, he said.

"On a regular day when you get her ready to go out and train in the mornings, you can put the saddle on easily," Attard said. "I can throw the bridle over her head very easy. On race day, after let's say 12 o'clock, anytime after 12, you try to put that bridle on, she just knows it's game time. It's a fight getting it on her, getting the tongue tie on, too. She just knows on race day she's doing something different.

"And we've even tried to trick her," said Attard. "We've literally put the saddle on her before sending her over just to try to trick her into thinking she's just going out to train. And still, she's just smarter than we are. She knows. She's just a real cool horse, a real special horse. Just a top performer that was so consistent and brought it each and every time."

In our breeding spotlight section, we looked at the WinStar stallion Life Is Good (Into Mischief).

Elsewhere on the podcast, which is also sponsored by the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders' Association, West Point Thoroughbreds, WinStar, XBTV.com, and the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association, the team of Randy Moss, Zoe Cadman and Bill Finley reviewed several Breeders' Cup races, including the eventful GI Longines Breeders' Cup Classic.

While all three applauded the effort of race winner Sierra **Leone** (Gun Runner), the conclusion was that runner-up Fierceness (City of Light) was the best horse that day because he held on so well after chasing a brutally fast pace. In trying to understand why **City of Troy** (Justify) ran so poorly in the Classic, Moss said it was simple because he is a grass horse who wanted no part of dirt racing.

The team also congratulated **Thorpedo Anna** (Fast Anna) for her win in the GI Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff, where she likely clinched the Horse of the Year title.

Finally, Moss returned to the subject of using GPS tracking for fractional times--like at Del Mar--and how the numbers are often incorrect.

FTC APPROVES \$80M HISA BUDGET FOR 2025

The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) on Nov. 6 issued an order approving the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority's \$80-million budget for 2025.

The Authority's proposed 2025 budget garnered only three public comments after it was first submitted to the FTC on July 31 and subsequently published in the Federal Register. The public commentary period closed Sept. 12.

According to the FTC's order, "Two of the comments were brief and did not address the Decisional criteria that the Commission must apply in determining whether to approve a

proposed budget. A third, anonymous comment raised points relevant to the Authority's proposed 2025 budget, although it did not speak to specific provisions in the budget or address how they were or were not consistent with--or whether they would serve the goals of--the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act."

The Budget Oversight Rule provides that after the close of the comment period, the Commission must either approve or disapprove the proposed budget.

"The Commission will approve the proposed budget if the Commission determines that, on balance, the proposed budget is consistent with and serves the goals of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act in a prudent and cost-effective manner and that its anticipated revenues are sufficient to meet its anticipated expenditures," the FTC order explained.

"Commission staff reviewed the proposed budgetary line items and accompanying narratives and found that these conditions were met," the FTC order stated.

The Commission vote to approve the proposed budget was 5-0.

methamphetamine. The 4-year-old filly **Thebestisyettobe (Ire)** (Elzaam {Aus}) tested positive following an Aug. 1 workout at Los Alamitos.

Before HIWU/HISA made changes to its rules regarding its Anti-Doping Medication and Control program, D'Amato would have been facing a suspension of up two years. Over time and in the face of criticism that it was charging trainers who had horses test positive for drugs like methamphetamine but did nothing wrong, HISA/HIWU has amended its rules. Only recently it largely abandoned the idea of provisional suspensions, which meant that a trainer could be charged and suspended before the case had been fully adjudicated. Its critics called it a matter of "guilty until proven innocent."

D'Amato and lawyer Drew Mollica decided to leave nothing to chance and Mollica said that the trainer has spent thousands of dollars doing his own investigation, which also involved Mollica devoting over 100 hours to the case.

"When we found out in September that the horse had allegedly tested positive, we worked tirelessly and we found the source and provided all the information we compiled and sent it to HIWU and worked with them," Mollica said. "We spent tens of thousands of dollars and this took up hundreds of hours. We

tested every employee, traced everything back, and we found the source.

"We also sent them documentation to show that since the inception of HISA/HIWU, Phil has had monthly meetings with his staff regarding protocols," said Mollica. "Subsequent to this happening he has put up cameras at his Los Alamitos location. We provided them with expert opinions and provided them with all the history of Phil's due diligence. We worked with HIWU/HISA. I am glad they have taken the draconian and unconstitutional provisional suspension off the table. The horsemen's advisory group got that done. The other way, the old way, he's out the gate and that's not fair."

With provisional suspensions, for the most part, no longer being implemented in cases like these, D'Amato has been able to train since the meth positive. But Mollica said he could still eventually be handed a 60-day suspension.

"We feel Mr. D'Amato should be found to have no fault as he did everything humanly possible to protect horses in his care from human contamination," Mollica said. "We feel he should not be punished at all. He did get a charge letter. I know they're working to change the rules. But we feel whatever the rules are, he is not at all at fault and should not be penalized."



Mollica believes that HISA/HIWU must do more when it comes to horses testing positive for illicit human drugs and find a solution where trainers can be exonerated when the facts point to a positive being a matter of human contamination.

"We will continue to work with HIWU regarding this issue, but remain steadfast in our belief Mr. D'Amato bears no fault and should not be sanctioned for what we all know are trace findings of illicit human drugs which have no effect on a racehorse and no trainer would ever administer," Mollica said. "In the final analysis the scourge of Methamphetamine is a reality not only on the backstretch of racetracks but in society.

"The scourge of methamphetamine at the levels they test for, no matter what you do, will never go away," said Mollica. "As for the industry, there's no way to trace amounts of illicit drugs, which are prevalent everywhere in society and at the racetrack, won't keep coming up. You can't blame someone for lightning hitting a tree."

bronchodilator Clenbuterol.

According to a final decision by the Horseracing Integrity and Welfare Unit (HIWU), Ramos apparently requested a B sample analysis but did not pay for it, which meant the B sample was ultimately waived. Ramos also reportedly failed to respond to the equine anti-doping charges levelled at him within the allotted time frame, therefore the charges were issued to him by default. The two-year ban started on May 30 this year.

Veterinarian Nicola Hardgrove has been suspended for 18-months and fined \$12,500 after she was found in possession of Arsil, a banned substance, at Los Alamitos on July 23. According to HIWU, Arsil is an arsenic-containing pharmacological substance manufactured in Mexico. It's reportedly used in the treatment of stomach problems like ulcers.

The case was resolved without a final hearing. Hardgrove's ban started on Sept. 11.

And trainer Emma Jimenez Sanchez has been banned 18-months and fined \$12,500 after she was found in possession of Adenosine Monophosphate (AMP)--a banned substance that is used as a dietary supplement to boost immune activity-during a barn search at Horseshoe Indianapolis Racetrack on July 30.

The case was resolved without a final hearing. Her ban began on Sept. 24.

FRANK CALABRESE PASSES AWAY, ILLINOIS HORSEMAN AND BREEDER OF FAST ANNA

Breeders' Cup-winning owner Frank Calabrese, who won 10 consecutive leading owner titles at Arlington Park starting in 2000 and bred late sire Fast Anna (Medaglia d'Oro), passed away on his 96th birthday, Monday, Nov. 4, at his home in Park Ridge, Illinois.

A pioneer in printing, Calabrese founded FCL Graphics in 1973 and sold the business in 2004. The avid horseplayer ran under FCC Stables and paired primarily with trainer Wayne Catalano.

With homebred Dreaming of Anna (Rahy), the duo won the 2006 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Woodbine, which earned her an Eclipse Award. The champion 2-year-old would go to the breeding shed for Calabrese where she was responsible for Fast Anna, the sire of MGISW Thorpedo Anna.

According to Equibase, Calabrese alone started 6,180 horses and visited the winner's circle 1,853 times, which put him in the top five among all North American owners on eight occasions. His career earnings over 24 years are listed at over \$34 million.




