



'AN ATTACK ON THE RURAL COMMUNITY' -REDVERS HITS OUT AT BUDGET DETAILS

Tweenhills owner David Redvers has applauded Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony for speaking out against the government's budget announcement that limits inheritance tax for farms to £1m.

Despite having just overseen another memorable sale at Park Paddocks, where a new record was broken for the highest-priced horse sold at the Tattersalls Autumn Horses-In-Training Sale at 1.3 million gns, Mahony used that platform to highlight changes made in the budget that he says will have a "negative impact on the whole racing and breeding sector" in Britain.

Agricultural property has been passed on to heirs tax-free for decades, but from April 2026, farms and other business property will fall within inheritance tax. Inheritors will have to pay 20% of the value of the agricultural and business property above $\mathfrak{L}1m$.

Redvers says that the announcement is "an attack" on Britain's rural economy and the changes made to inheritance tax is just the largest hammer blow to the thoroughbred breeders within the country. Mahony agrees. Cont. p3

DARK ANGEL UNCHANGED AT €60,000 AS YEOMANSTOWN ANNOUNCE FEES FOR 2025

Yeomanstown Stud has released its stud fees for next season, with champion sire-elect **Dark Angel (Ire)** unchanged at €60,000 and this year's G1 July Cup winner **Mill Stream (Ire)** introduced at €12,500.

It will be the fifth consecutive year that Dark Angel has stood for €60,000 and it follows a stellar season on the racecourse with the likes of Charyn (Ire), who registered three Group 1 successes in the Queen Anne Stakes, Prix Jacques le Marois and Queen Elizabeth II Stakes. Now 19, Dark Angel covered 134 mares earlier this year and is set to end it as Britain and Ireland's champion sire for the first time, with a margin of roughly £365,000 currently separating him from his closest pursuer, Dubawi (Ire).

Mill Stream, a half-brother to the G2 Richmond Stakes hero and sire Asymmetric (Ire), was trained by Jane Chapple-Hyam for owner Peter Harris and retired as the winner of five of his 16 career starts. Cont. p4

"I think that sums it up," Mahony said. "More immediately, the national insurance rise and changing of the minimum wage is

probably going to impact on studs and trainers in particular. The changes to capital gains tax and business property relief is more of a long-term problem. With the changes to business property not due to come in until April 2026, I am assuming there will be a period of consultation on that and hopefully sense will prevail. But look, it seems to be a budget that has gone completely in the wrong direction in terms of business, the cultivation of individual aspiration, economic growth-all the things they spoke

about before the election, really. That's where I was coming from [in highlighting the budget post-sale]."

For years, the APR tax relief has enabled small family

farms—including land used for crops or rearing animals, as well as farm buildings, cottages and houses—to be handed down through the generations. Redvers says that the changes made in the budget has the potential to render most of his life's work


pointless as there would be no other option but to put
Tweenhills up for sale, like a lot of his neighbouring farmers have been forced to do in recent years.

He explained, "Nothing has upset me and my apple cart more than this announcement in the budget. My entire life's work has revolved around keeping a family farm—which has been in the family for generations—going. Apart from Hartpury College, which obviously has over 4,000 students, we are the biggest

employers in our area. All of the smaller dairy farms have had to sell up because they weren't viable at 150 acres."

Redvers added, "I am very conscious that I am only a custodian of the place. That has been the driving force for me in business. I have three children, some of whom want to keep the business on and keep the link with the land that we have had for years. This announcement will undoubtedly change the look of the countryside and it's an attack on the rural community. The thing that makes it particularly galling is that the Prime Minister is on the record in saying that this wasn't going to happen before the election. The sense of anger that is building within the countryside is something that he will deeply regret causing."

Redvers and Mahony acknowledge that the changes made in the budget comes as the latest blow to what is an already struggling cohort of breeders in Britain. Mahony in particular was keen to highlight that, while the Book 1 and 2 sessions to the October Yearling Sale stole the headlines, he is acutely aware of smaller breeders who are on the brink.

Mahony explained, "There are a lot of breeders who are hanging on by their fingernails. It's great when you see Book 1 and 2 and all of the other sales taking all the headlines, but it's the guys in Book 3, Somerville-it's those sorts of sales that are representative of the smaller breeders who are the backbone of the industry. They are really struggling and this is another nail in the coffin if you like."

On top of the changes made to inheritance tax, thresholds for employers' National Insurance contributions will drop from £9,100 to £5,000 from April 2025. Employers' NI rate will increase from 13.8% to 15% in April 2025 while the employers' allowance (the amount an employer can deduct from their NI contribution to HMRC) will increase from £5,000 to £10,000. Meanwhile, the National Living Wage increased by 6.7% in April 2025, on top of a 9.8% increase in 2024.

Redvers concluded, "All you have to do is look at the number of British breeders, which is in steep decline, to realise that the future of the industry is in a perilous situation. I can think of a lot of British breeders in this industry who are close to going out of business. That's against a backdrop of a declining economy where people have less spare cash than they used to. I had conversations with two top-notch British breeders in recent days and they explained to me that they are down 20 mares and are barely breaking even. That's not even scratching the surface on the situation. This is a cataclysmic situation here."

As a three-year-old he gained his first Group-race victory in the G3 Prix de Meautry, while this year he also won the G2 Duke Of York Stakes and finished third in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes, before making the breakthrough at the top level at Newmarket.

The Yeomanstown roster is completed by first-season sire Shaman (Ire) and G1 Middle Park Stakes winner Supremacy (Ire), who was represented by his first yearlings at the sales this year. Shaman, the sire of 10 individual two-year-old winners in Europe at the time of writing, including the G3 Sirenia Stakes third Brian (Ire), remains unchanged at €5,000, while the fee for Supremacy has been reduced to €8,000 from the €10,000 he stood for this season.

"TOP-CLASS TWO-YEAR-OLD" BUCANERO **FUERTE RETIRED TO TALLY-HO STUD**

Group 1-winning two-year-old Bucanero Fuerte (GB) has been retired to stand at Tally-Ho Stud next season, owners Amo Racing announced in partnership with the County Westmeath operation on Thursday.

Bucanero Fuerte, who was bred by Gestut Zur Kuste AG from the Elusive City mare Frida La Blonde (Fr), was bought by Robson Aguiar for €165,000 at the Argana August Yearling Sale and subsequently won four of his nine career starts for trainer Adrian Murray. Cont. p5

Bucanero Fuerte Cont.

Following a successful debut at the Curragh when winning the first two-year-old race of the Irish Flat season, the son of Wootton Bassett (GB) was sent to Royal Ascot where he finished third in the G2 Coventry Stakes, before returning to the Curragh to gain the two most significant victories of his career.

After beating the subsequent GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Unquestionable (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}) by a short head to win the G2 Railway Stakes, Bucanero Fuerte then made the breakthrough at the top level when winning the Phoenix Stakes by four lengths from top-class filly Porta Fortuna (Ire) (Caravaggio). He also won the G3 Lacken Stakes on his return to action as a three-year-old, lowering the six-furlong track record at Naas.

"Bucanero Fuerte is a hugely important horse for Amo Racing," said founder Kia Joorabchian. "His Group 1 win in 2023 where he dominated the Phoenix Stakes was a truly outstanding moment for us all.

"We are proud to retire him alongside King Of Steel at one of Europe's premier nurseries. As a top-class two-year-old who showed he had trained on superbly when breaking the track record at Naas on his comeback in May, we feel he has the requisite blend of qualities to excel in his new career.

"Significantly, he is the first Group 1-winning juvenile by his sire to retire to stud in Ireland and we are committed to supporting him fully on all fronts over the coming years."

Roger O'Callaghan of Tally-Ho Stud added, "Bucanero Fuerte possessed huge class, pace and durability. Few two-year-olds are able to win on the first day of the season and then go on to Group 1 success; Bucanero Fuerte was an easy winner on both occasions, especially when scoring so emphatically over a top-class field in the Phoenix Stakes.

"We are delighted to be standing such a talented two-year-old and look forward to working with Amo Racing in supporting him strongly at stud."

One of four winners from five runners out of Frida La Blonde, Bucanero Fuerte is a full-brother to the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye hero and first-season sire Wooded (Ire), as well as the G3 Sovereign Stakes runner-up Beat Le Bon (Fr). Frida La Blonde, in turn, is out of the Listed winner and G2 Premio Regina Elena runner-up Firm Friend (Ire) (Affirmed), whose other notable offspring include the Listed winners Fred Lalloupet (GB)--also by Elusive City--and Mon Pote Le Gitan (Thunder Gulch), both of whom were also placed at Group 3 level.

KING OF STEEL ANCHORS AMO ROSTER AT €20,000

Group 1 winner **King Of Steel** (Wootton Bassett {GB}) will stand for €20,000 at Tally-Ho Stud in 2025, Amo Racing announced via Instagram late on Thursday evening.

The grey, a winner of the G1 Champion Stakes in 2023, was second in the Derby earlier that year. He also soared at Royal Ascot with a victory in the G2 King Edward VII Stakes.

Joining King Of Steel at Tally-Ho is the Group 1-winning juvenile **Bucanero Fuerte (GB)**, another son of Wootton Bassett. The G1 Phoenix Stakes/G2 Railway Stakes hero will command \in 12,500 in his first season. Already a resident at the stud is **Persian Force (GB)**, a Group 2-winning son of Mehmas (Ire). He will have his first yearlings next year and is priced at an unchanged fee of \in 8,000. Rounding out the quartet is 2021 G1 Derby runner-up **Mojo Star (Ire)**, who will stand for \in 3,000 once again at Whytemount Stud. His first foals will arrive next year.

GROUP 1 STAYER TECHNICIAN JOINS KNOCKMULLEN HOUSE STUD

Group 1-winning stayer **Technician (Ire)** has moved from Manton Park to stand in Ireland at Knockmullen House Stud in Co Wexford for 2025.

The son of Mastercraftsman (Ire) will stand for $\[\in \] 2,000$ alongside fellow Group 1 winner **Mekhtaal (Ire)**, also at $\[\in \] 2,000$, and **Silas Marner (Fr)**, a Group 3-winning son of Muhtathir (GB), at $\[\in \] 1,200$.

"I am extremely grateful to Martyn Meade and the team at Manton Park for sending the horse to us," said Gordon Doyle of Knockmullen House Stud.

"Technician was a top-notch, Classic-winning racehorse of the Group 1 Prix Royal-Oak. He completed the Prix Royal-Oak and Prix Chaudenay double at Longchamp, a notable achievement also completed by top sire Turgeon. He was undefeated at Longchamp in three races and he loved soft ground, an attribute that is so important in National Hunt racing."

Now eight, Technician spent his first two years at stud in France at Haras de Montaigu before returning to the stallion operation of his former trainer Meade. His eldest crop will be two-year-olds in 2025.

Doyle said, "Technician has a wonderful pedigree to match, being out of a stakes-winning daughter of Sadler's Wells, the most important National Hunt influence of the last 20 years. It's the family of Group 1 winner Recoletos and top stayer Crimson Tide and further traces back to the Aga Khan family of Derby winner Shahrastani."

He added, "I hope our fees set for 2025 are very competitive as it gives breeders access to two Group 1 winners and a unique opportunity to access the Doctor Dino sire line."

BEEBY HAILS "TRULY INTERNATIONAL BUYING BENCH" AT GOFFS AUTUMN YEARLING SALE

Goffs chief executive Henry Beeby hailed a "truly international buying bench" at the conclusion of the Autumn Yearling Sale on Thursday. Turnover climbed by 15% to $\in 3,735,200$ while

average was up by 4% to $\le 8,748$. The median matched last year's figure of $\le 5,000$ while the clearance rate was up marginally [1%] to 77%.

Beeby commented, "All corners of the globe. 2025 will see Goffs Autumn graduates race all over the world following the last three days. Our job as Ireland's premier auction house since 1866 is to work in the best interests of Irish breeders and, for this week especially, that means driving the greatest number of buyers to Kildare Paddocks. In our endeavours we are lucky to have the team at Irish Thoroughbred Marketing to assist the work of the Goffs Purchaser Attraction Team as well as our network of overseas agents. It is clear that they have worked tirelessly with great success as we have welcomed a truly international buying bench that is the measure of any sale with horses heading to China, Czech Republic, Denmark, France, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Kazakhstan, Kuwait, Libya, Poland, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Serbia, Slovakia, Sweden, UAE and, of course, the UK."

He added, "A staggering 125 have been bought to go to Eastern Europe and we extend our particular thanks to Kishore Mirpuri who has coordinated an enormous group of enthusiasts who have added character alongside some serious bidding to the week. The home team have been proactive too with eight of the top 10 yearlings staying in Ireland, whilst one heads to the UK and another to Italy, a country that has also proved a major contributor accounting for a further 55 yearlings. Another 15 will race in China."

While Beeby was keen to pay tribute to the foreign buyers, the top end of the market was dominated by domestic spenders. Bloodstock agent Kevin Ross and Gavin Cromwell were the third busiest buyers with five yearlings added to the team for a total spend of €108,500. Cont. p7

Meanwhile, top lot of the entire sale, a Mohaather (GB) filly consigned by Derrinstown Stud, went the way of Jack Davison and Barry Lynch on Tuesday for €110,000. Fellow Irish-based handler Sheila Laver signed for the top lot on Thursday, a colt by first-season sire Pinatubo (Ire), who was consigned by Castlebridge and fetched €75,000 in the ring.

Beeby continued, "A marginally improved clearance rate of 77% is acceptable as it demonstrates trade and underlines the depth and breadth of buyers, but it must be noted that although the average has improved and the median held steady, they are hardly a cause for celebration and are at the lower end of the scale. In that context our overseas buyers have been absolutely vital as a market without them would be unimaginable so our investment in this sector has been more than justified and we repeat our thanks to each one as well as our appreciation of every vendor for the trust they have placed in us once again.

"We now turn our attention to our market leading November Sale which features the cream of the Irish foal crop and some beautifully bred mares and fillies in a fortnight."

Fanning wide into the straight, the 7-2 chance powered forward to go second passing the furlong pole and was ridden out to deny Mersea Island (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) by a short-head on the line. Palazzo Blu is the first of three foals produced by a winning daughter of G3 Prix Edmond Blanc victrix Kalsa (Ire) (Whipper), herself a fullsister to G3 Prix Miesque winner and G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches third Topeka (Ire). Kalsa is also kin to dual Groupwinning G1 Pretty Polly Stakes runner-up Bocca Baciata (Ire) (Big Bad Bob (Ire)), who is the dam of Listed Navigation Stakes victrix Foniska (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)). It is only the best horses who don't show any signs of stress backing on a short turnaround, and **Treasurethe Moment (Aus)** (Alabama Express {Aus}) showed there is not much that can faze her with a seamless victory in the A\$1-million G1 Crown Oaks.

Just five days since she saluted in the G2 Wakeful S. on Victoria Derby Day, the 3-year-old filly produced a masterful performance to prevail by 1.25l in Thursday's staying feature over 2500 metres.

With star jockey Damian Lane aboard for Matt Laurie,
Treasurethe Moment switched off with ease and was effortless
before the turn for home, before responding to Lane's urgings
with a brilliant turn of foot which saw her notch up her fourth
consecutive win. In second was John Sargent-trained Powers Of
Opal (NZ) (Ocean Park {NZ}) with Danny O'Brien trained Hurry
Curry (NZ) (Ocean Park {NZ}) making up for her fractious
behaviour on Saturday with a solid third placing. Waikato Stud
will be pleased to see their stalwart sire and G1 Cox Plate
winner Ocean Park (NZ) with two Group 1-placed fillies whose

Treasurethe Moment now has five victories from seven starts, with over A\$1 million in career prize-money.

Treasurethe Moment's ability to relax under pressure belies her young age, but testament to her strength after surviving the floods at Nagambie's Yulong Stud two years ago.

Indeed, connections are treasuring every moment of their filly's winning run after she was part of the crop that had a challenging start in the floods that hit Nagambie in 2022, and the 3-year-old seems to as well, given how much she thrives on big races.

"It's incredible," Laurie said. "It is 20 years of work really trying to achieve something like this. I'm just so grateful to my team at home and to Team Yulong. They are great for the industry and to have them in my corner with this, a homebred, and to watch her progress to win a Group 1, is incredible.

"I feel very privileged."



Laurie was confident Treasurethe Moment could back up after her Wakeful S. triumph last Saturday. "I thought her win at Sandown three back was very tough and I didn't have too many questions about her reaching 2000 metres," he said.

"She answered that pretty heavily over the weekend, and we were hoping that she would be able to slot in and Damian managed that perfectly. I was starting to get very hot and nervous before the race, but it was a painless watch really. It was almost a replica of the weekend, just an extra 500 metres tacked on at the end."

Thursday's win added considerable value to Treasurethe Moment's breeding future, and it gave Yulong rising young stallion Alabama Express his first Group 1 triumph as a sire.

"She is a beauty. Just kept improving this preparation. Matt said to me before I rode her last start, he thought that she was a really good horse in the making. She has proved them right. She is a bloody ripper," Lane said.

The jockey completed the same Wakeful/Oaks double on Aristia (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) in 2018.

"She actually gave me a very similar feel to Aristia on Saturday, but hopefully she can go on with it a little more. She is a beauty and has just kept improving this preparation."

Alabama Express now has three stakes winners from his first crop of 110 foals, with Treasurethe Moment lifting his record into the top echelon. He is also sire of Group 2 winning 3-year-old filly Alabama Lass, who is favoured to win New Zealand's G1 1000 Guineas soon.

LEXINGTON, KY - Solid trade continued right through the conclusion of the second and final Book 2 section of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale Thursday, with the 3-year-old broodmare Finesse (Street Sense) bringing the section's top price of \$900,000 when selling to Dixiana Farms.

"It was really solid today," said Keeneland Vice President of Sales Tony Lacy. "It was very competitive. I was speaking to a lot of buyers out there, and they were finding it very difficult to buy the foals that they liked. And the young mares were very competitive in the market. I followed a few up myself, just out of interest, and they were bringing probably 30-40% more than I would have expected them to bring. Which was great. It shows the demand for that quality through the market. It's really encouraging. When the right ones come up, they are all over it."

Over the two Book 2 sessions, 413 horses grossed \$63,236,500 for an average of \$153,115 and a median of \$125,000.

MOIRA'S RACING DAYS MAY NOT BE OVER

by Bill Finley

After the Australian farm Yulong Stud paid \$4.3 million to acquire GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare winner Moira (Ghostzapper) at the Fasig-Tipton November sale, it was widely assumed that she would be immediately retired and join the farm's broodmare band. But while that remains a possibility, so does a return to racing, perhaps in North America.

The story was first reported in the *Canadian Thoroughbred*. Yulong Stud's General Manager Vin Cox told the *TDN* that the farm has yet to decide what's next for Moira.

"We haven't made any decisions," he said. "We've only had the mare for 48 hours or so. We'll get her back to the farm and have a look at her. We're considering all our options, including retirement and going to stud, racing in North America or potentially racing here in Australia. No decisions have made yet."

During last year's Book 2 section, 444 horses sold through the ring for a total of \$69,520,000 for an average of \$156,577 and a median of \$120,000. Three Witches (Into Mischief) brought the book's highest price when selling for \$1.7 million. The racing prospect was one of 10 during the section to sell for \$500,000 or more. Five hit that mark this year.

Through both Book 2 sessions, 157 weanlings sold through the ring for an average of \$135,395 and a median of \$110,000.

During last year's Book 2, 148 weanlings sold through the ring for an average of \$147,378 and a median of \$120,000. A colt by Constitution and a filly by Justify shared the section's top price of \$525,000.

Foals from the first crop of Breeders' Cup winner Life Is Good topped both Book 2 sessions this year, with a filly by the sire going the way of Classic Equine for \$410,000 Wednesday and a colt selling for \$400,000 to Flying Dutchmen late in the day Thursday.

Eight of the top 10 priced weanlings in Book 2 were by first-crop sires. A filly by Life Is Good shared the section's second highest price of \$385,000 with a colt by first-crop sire Jackie's Warrior. Olympiad also had a pair of weanlings in the book's top 10, while Jack Christopher and Golden Pal each had one.

"I think the demand for first-crop sires is always high, but it's true that with the entry-level stud fee and some of the glitz and glamour that came with this class, it looks deep," said Keeneland Senior Director of Sales Operations Cormac Breathnach. "There are several really well-credentialed first-crop sires this year and they are obviously throwing very good physicals because people are really responding. It bodes well. Hopefully they can run to their looks."

Through three sessions, 556 head have sold for \$125,606,500. The average of \$225,911 is up 2.87% from the same point at last year's sale and the median of \$170,000 is up 13.33%.

The buy-back rate through three days is 27.23%. It was 30.80% a year go.

"That's what we look for, more than anything, significant improvement in the median," said Breathnach. "And the RNA rate through the ring is four points lower than last year through two books. Those are the best indicators of a healthy marketplace."

Post-sale activity is brisk, according to Lacy.

"There are a lot of RNAs-to-sales that we are getting through," he said. "So even though they might be listed as RNAs on the sheets right now, you will see those filtering in and there will be some really healthy numbers. There is a balance between the reserve set and what people want to pay for certain things. That then gets mitigated in the RNAs-to-sales. I think that is good and healthy." *Cont.*




The Brunacinis have 11 broodmares, many in partnerships at Taylor Made Farm, and are focused on breeding to sell.

HONG KONG RACING INSIGHTS

RISING STARS ABOUT TO TAKE CENTER STAGE

The 2024 edition of the LONGINES Hong Kong International Races will be held at Sha Tin on December 8 and the fields look to be as deep and talented as ever. Let's hope the record purses encourage more American participation since Sha Tin's turf course is wide, flat, usually firm and the races are conducted left-handed just like they are in America. Turf races with rich purses and over a month after the Breeders' Cup should be on many of these horse's tentative schedules.

Usually, much of the attention is on the international raiders and rightfully so. But this season, we are seeing some local horses that are developing rapidly and could be achieving Group 1 status very soon.

Galaxy Patch did most of his development last year in races he was not winning. Pierre Ng sprinted him in his first seven career starts then not only stretched out to 1400m but did it against Group 1 company when he ran second behind California Spangle in the Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup (G1). The son of Wandjina showed Ng that no matter what the distance, he could settle behind horses and save his best for when the running gets most serious.

Only two weeks later, Ng sent him out for the BMW Hong Kong Derby at 2000m and after trailing the field, he made a brilliant run through the stretch to finish an agonizing-close second to hot import Massive Sovereign. He finished up last season with a win in the Lion Rock Trophy H. (G3) going 1600m and the Premier Plate H. (G3) going 1800m.





Off for three months, Ng debuted Galaxy Patch this season in the Sha Tin Trophy H. (G2) which he won going away with another devastating finish. He has carried 129 pounds in his last two starts and 1600 meters looks to be his best distance. A start in the BOCHK Private Wealth Jockey Club Mile (G2) on November 17 should have him ready for the LONGINES Hong Kong Mile (G1).



Ka Ying Rising has won his last six starts and his rating had gone from 66 to his current 127. Last March, he won a Class 3 spring going six furlongs in 1:08.19 seconds while carrying a hefty 135 pounds. After a win in Class 2, he finished up last season with a win in the Sha Tin Vase H. (G3) going 1200m in 1:08 flat with only 115 pounds.

After an easy win in the HKSAR Chief Executive's Cup (H.) where he covered 1200 meters in 1:08.03 seconds carrying 135 pounds, Ka Ying Rising showed a deceptive improvement in his running style when he ran a bit closer to the pace but still finished as strong as ever. Despite being eased a bit nearing the wire, he threatened Sacred Kingdom's track record at 1200 meters with a devastating time of 1:07.57 seconds. He covered his last 800 meters in 43.99 seconds and did it with 128 pounds.

If all goes well, we could see Ka Ying Rising in the BOCHK Private Banking Jockey Club Sprint (G2) then the LONGINES Hong Kong Sprint (G1) three weeks later. Hayes has indicated that Ka Ying Rising might try the Hong Kong Classic Mile at the end of January. He is already one of Hong Kong's top sprinters and can soon take his place on the world's stage.

Two of the mare's half-brothers are expected to see graded action this weekend, with 3-year-old Cugino (Twirling Candy) entered in the GIII Hill Prince Stakes and 4-year-old Battle of Normandy (City of Light) entered in the GIII River City Stakes.

"I thought she was one of the best mares in the sale today," said Elite's Liz Crow. "She has two half-brothers that are running in stakes this weekend. She's in foal to Justify, a tremendously good cover. She could run herself, she was stakes-placed behind a Grade I winner in New York. She's by Tapit. I just thought it was one of the better families in the catalogue today. She looked tremendous coming in here, so we were kind of expecting that she would be one of the top mares today."

The Brunacinis warmed up for their big purchase just two hips before Veronica Greene went through the ring, purchasing **Urgence** (Into Mischief) (hip 836), in foal to Taiba, for \$160,000 from the Gainesway consignment. @JessMartiniTDN

Shimokobe Extends to \$525K for Connect's Witwatersrand

Midway through Thursday's session, Yukio Shimokobe, stationed by the back bidding stand, went up to \$525,000 for Hip 861, Witwatersrand from the Bluewater Sales consignment.


A daughter of the graded stakes winning Carta de Oro (Medaglia d'Oro), the 3-year-old filly is a granddaughter of MGSW and GISP Communique (Smart Strike).

"First of all, I saw the father, Connect, and she was very exactly like that--smooth-moving and light," said Shimokobe, signing on behalf of Shimokobe Farm and Nobu Araki's Polo Green Stables. "I love that and she moves the same way. That is what I love.

"She had a good breeder and a good pedigree so everything was perfect to me, "he continued. "We will see what stallion fits her. We will breed her [in the USA] and then take her back to Japan."

Life Is Good Weanling Heads Book 2 Finale

Late in Thursday's session, a colt by Life Is Good (Hip 1050) brought a \$400,000 final bid from Flying Dutchmen. Consigned by Taylor Made Sales on behalf of breeder China Horse Club, the Feb. 18 foal was the highest-priced foal of the day. Hunter Rankin signed the ticket.

The bay is the first foal out MGSP Lady Aces (Constitution), purchased by China Horse Club for \$200,000 at this venue in 2022. This represents the family of MGISW Paradise Woods.

"We are really excited with what the mare has produced right away," said China Horse Club's Christie DeBernardis. "We are looking forward to a lot greater produce from her."

Standing at WinStar for \$75,000 in 2025, the four-time Grade I winner entered stud in 2023.

"We are excited that it is an Life Is Good since we raced him with WinStar and continue to partner with them," DeBernardis continued. "His first crop has been impressing us one right after the other. *Cont.*

"We still have six of them ourselves and each one is better than the next."

China Horse Club sold a pair of horses at Keeneland this week, including Tawaret (Hip 432), who sold for \$175,000 shortly after exiting the ring. Also during Thursday's session, a colt by the sire (Hip 1074), consigned by Denali Stud, brought \$300,000 from Rafey Racing.

Grandview, Solis/Litt Return to the Well for Olympiad Weanlings Thursday

Grade I winner **Olympiad** (Speightstown) has been gaining traction since entering stud at Gainesway in 2023. Earning over \$3 million on the track while collecting five graded races, highlighted by the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, the 7-year-old was responsible for Thursday's second highest-priced weanling of the day, Hip 795, who brought \$350,000 from Grandview Equine.

"I like everything about him," said Grandview's Robert Clay. "Like the sire, like the dam, like the family, like the colt. I thought he would be about that [price] range."

Seated next to agent Jason Litt during the bidding, Clay signed the ticket on the colt out of MGSP Special Event (Arch), herself a daughter of GSW La Reina (A.P. Indy). The Mar. 7 foal was consigned by Gainesway, agent.

"We're all in with [Olympiad]," said Litt. "That foal was the spitting image of the sire." **Cont.**

Bred by Emory Hamilton, the colt is a half-brother to the unraced Gun Carriage (Gun Runner), who sold to M.V. Magnier for \$1.25 million at Keeneland September in 2023.

Grandview also purchased a weanling colt by Into Mischief, Hip 98, on Tuesday for \$275,000. Additionally, it secured another Olympiad colt (Hip 313) for \$185,000 at Fasig-Tipton Monday. During Book 1, Solis/Litt bought a filly by the sire (Hip 66) for \$450,000. It represented the highest price for the sire at Keeneland this week.

"We bought [Olympiad], we raced him and we kept a good piece of the horse as a stallion," explained Litt. "We have supported him each year with over 20 mares and we'll do the same for the third year. We're here to buy the ones that we think look good."

A \$700,000 KEESEP yearling purchase by Jason Litt and Alex Solis from the Gainesway consignment in 2019, Olympiad won eight of 13 starts through three seasons, including wins in the GII Stephen Foster and GII Alysheba, in addition to a runner-up finish behind Horse of the Year Flightline (Tapit) in his career finale in the 2022 GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

Owned by the partnership of Grandview, Cheyenne Stable and LNJ Foxwoods at the time of his retirement, the son of GSP

Tokyo Time (Medaglia d'Oro), a homebred for Hamilton, stood for \$35,000 in his first season at stud and will stand for the same amount in the upcoming season.

"His foals have good size, strength and length," said Litt. "They have all the good qualities you want to see in them."

Late in the session, another colt by Olympiad (Hip 1054) brought \$325,000 from Whisper Hill Farm. On Thursday, a total of five weanlings by the sire sold for gross receipts of \$1.02 million.--@CBossTDN

Perrine, who has just four broodmares, also sold a filly by Oscar Performance (hip 316) during Wednesday's second session of the Keeneland November sale for \$120,000. The foal is out of Noetic (Ire) (No Nay Never), who was purchased by Perinne while in foal to Oscar Performance for \$130,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton February sale. That in-utero colt sold for \$85,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale and resold for \$310,000 at Keeneland this September.

"She's had two very nice Oscar Performance babies that both sold really well," Foley said.

Foley's first purchase for Perrine, who is involved in real estate, was Kansas Kis (Constitution). Acquired for \$57,000 at the 2019 OBS April sale, the bay was multiple stakes-placed and earned \$272,307 on the racetrack. The 7-year-old mare has a yearling colt by Munnings and a weanling filly by Nyquist and she was bred back to Uncle Mo this year.

"He has kept all of Kansas Kis's foals," Foley said. "Probably the commercial [breeding] is new for him. This is all done to supplement the racing stable." @JessMartiniTDN



- With figures staying relatively consistent on the third day of selling, a total of 212 head (231 in '23) realized a gross of \$33,796,500, down slightly from \$35,092,000. Comparatively, average rose 4.94% to \$159,417 (up from \$151,913 in '23), while median showed a significant jump (20.45%) to \$132,500 from \$110,000 one year ago.
- Gross figures through three days of selling rose to \$125,6060,500 from \$123,860,000 in 2023, while average rose 13.33% to \$170,000, up from \$150,000 last year. Median also increased from \$225,911 from \$219,610 (2.87%) last year. RNA's fell 17.13% from 251 (2023) to 208 this year through Books 1&2.

- A colt by WinStar stallion Life Is Good led all first season sires when Hip 1050 brought \$400,000 late in Thursday's session. Consigned by Taylor Made Sales, the Feb. 18 foal was purchased by Flying Dutchmen, the third leading buyer through Books 1&2. During the session, another colt (Hip 1074) by the WinStar stallion realized \$300,000 from Rafey Racing. Life Is Good also led his contemporaries through three days, drawing \$2,605,000 for eight sold and an average of \$325,625.
- Once again showing the diversity of the buying bench, eight of Thursday's top 10 sellers were purchased by unique buying entities. The sole operation to buy more than one was Shimokobe Farm/Polo Green Stables, the second leading buyer of the session, purchasing broodmare prospects Witwatersrand (Hip 861) for \$525,000 and Unifying (Hip 833) for \$400,000.
- Medaglia d'Oro led all sires on Day 3 with eight head selling for a gross of \$1,675,000 and an average of \$209,375. Tapit heads all stallions through three days of selling, grossing \$5,185,000 for 16 head sold while averaging \$324,063.

The Australian breeding season starts Sept. 1 and wraps up in early December, making it unlikely that Moira would be pushed into broodmare service so quickly. If that turns out to be the case, there's a large window of opportunity to race her during the first eight months or so of 2025.

"We're considering all the logistics, including whether we should keep her racing in North America," Cox said.

When asked if trainer Kevin Attard would be considered should Moira resume her racing career in North America, Cox said that he would.

"That would be a possibility," he said. "Again, we haven't made any decisions but he clearly he did a very good job with her and knows her idiosyncracies."

Moira is known to have many quirks and can de difficult to train. In one example, she won the Woodbine Oaks by 10 3/4 lengths with two fewer shoes than she had on when she left the barn. She was so rambunctious in the paddock that she lost one hind shoe and bent the other. She would race with no hind shoes.

The \$4.3-million bid was made over the phone by Yulong's owner Yuesheng Zhang. Cox said Moira is the type of high-quality horse that Yulong likes to acquire for its breeding band.

"She was a Horse of Year in Canada and is a Breeders' Cup winner," Cox said. "She's the sort of horse we like to add to our breeding band. We are putting together a very good broodmare band and she'll fit right in."



DAWSON HOPING TO STRIKE STALLION DEAL FOR RICH STRIKE by Bill Finley

Acknowledging that Rich Strike (Keen Ice) will soon be

"officially" retired," owner Rick Dawson said Thursday that he has been talking to stallion farms in both Kentucky and New York and hopes to strike a deal shortly so that his 2022 GI Kentucky Derby winner will be available for the upcoming breeding season.

"The only reason I haven't officially announced his retirement is that I'm waiting to come to an agreement for stallion rights," Dawson said. "Then I can do it all at once, make the announcement that

he has been retired and that he's going to stand at XYZ farm. But for all intents and purposes he has been retired."

Following the stunning victory at 80-1 in the Derby, nothing has gone right for the now 5-year-old. He failed to win in six

tries after the Derby and was beaten by 16 3/4 lengths in what will be his last career start, the 2023 GII Alysheba Stakes. It was later discovered that he was battling tendon issues in his front legs.

Dawson sent the horse to
Margaux Farm to recover from the
injury with the intent of bringing
him back to the races. He also fired
trainer Eric Reed, over a dispute
involving the rights to a movie
about Reed and Rich Strike, and
turned him over to Bill Mott.

He made progress under Mott's care, working four times at Saratoga for the Hall of Fame trainer.

"He came close to running again," Dawson said. "He had four official works and Bill was real excited about his conditioning. Bill visited

Rich Strike two, three months before he started training him and he was pleasantly surprised that he had not gotten fat and lazy looking. He keeps his form really nicely. He's an athlete, for sure. Bill was optimistic." *Cont.*

However, after an Aug. 7 work, Mott noticed a new problem with the ligament. Dawson said the two injuries, though to the same ligament, were unrelated.

Dawson then sent Rich Strike back to Margaux Farm near Midway, Kentucky and started the process of trying to make a deal with a stallion farm. The process, he said, is ongoing.

"Right now, I'm entertaining a number of stallion opportunities," Dawson said. "Just trying to find the right spot for him. Hopefully, something will get done pretty quickly.

"We certainly want to make the 2025 breeding season and have an opportunity with some of the better mares. They're going to start committing pretty quickly, so we want to get into the loop. Just a few weeks ago, I thought I was within hours of getting that done and it all fell apart. That's the horse business. You think you have a deal set and then something comes up to change it."

Dawson said his preference is that Rich Strike stands in Kentucky. New York, he said, is his second option.

"I am not interested in international markets, just because I'd like to keep him in America," Dawson said. "It's mainly Kentucky and second would be New York. I just want to find a good spot for him. I have no interest in him covering 150 mares. But I'd like

to see him cover 25 or 30 really good ones. He's going to have to build his legacy now through his offspring versus what he could do on the racetrack."

VET AND THREE TRAINERS AT PENN NATIONAL SUSPENDED BY STATE RACING COMMISSION, INVESTIGATION ONGOING

In the midst of what is an ongoing investigation at Penn National Race Course, private veterinarian Dr. Allen Post Bonnell, and three trainers, Kimberly A. Graci, Marlin Arthur "Joe" Miller and Michael S. Zalalas, were summarily suspended by the Pennsylvania State Horse Racing Commission (PSHRC) this week according to rulings by the board of stewards posted on the Commission's portal.

After appearing before the board Nov. 5, Dr. Allen Bonnell was suspended after being found under section 185.2 to have engaged in inappropriate, illegal or unethical conduct at Penn National, which violates the Commission's rules and regulations of racing. Ruling No. 24128PN goes on to state that Bonnell is denied access to not only to the track, but any state racing facility under the jurisdiction of the PSHRC.

The state's website also lists the three trainers based at Penn who were summarily suspended under Section 185.2 and are barred from the grounds of any Pennsylvania-controlled racing site by the board of stewards.

Kim Graci (Ruling No. 24122PN), who also holds an owner's license, on the advice of her attorney waived her right to a hearing before the board Oct. 29, and based on Ruling No. 24120PN, she was suspended on that date. According to Equibase, the trainer won with **Tiz Speedy** (Tiznow) at Penn Oct. 24, but three of her horses were scratched by the stewards Oct. 31.

Marlin Miller (Ruling No. 24126PN) was suspended as of Nov. 1 and according to the portal was scheduled to have a hearing on Tuesday, Nov. 5. He last entered 5-year-old mare **Let's Go Mo** (Super Saver) at the track Oct. 25 and had a horse scratched Oct. 30.

Finally, Michael Zalalas was summarily suspended Nov. 6 (Ruling No. 24130PN) and is not allowed to enter the track until his hearing, which is scheduled for Nov. 12 at 10:00 a.m. ET.

Zalalas had three horses entered in races at Penn National on Wednesday, Nov. 6, but all were scratched by the stewards. They included in race three **My Redemption** (Milwaukee Brew), in race four **Forever Fifi** (Cuba) and in race seven **Ensuing Grace** (Well Spelled).

The trainer has entered in claimers 7-year-old mare **Stormy Spell** (Well Spelled) in race six at Penn on Friday, Nov. 8, and A T M Awesome (Awesome of Course) on Wednesday, Nov. 13.

AUTHORITY TELLS SUPREME COURT THAT OF THREE HISA CONSTITUTIONALITY CASES, FIFTH CIRCUIT DISPUTE SHOULD TAKE

With three separate requests involving three different federal appeals court cases pending before the Supreme Court of the United States to take up the question of whether or not the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) is constitutional, the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority on Wednesday told the nation's highest court that the one involving a lawsuit spearheaded by the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (NHBPA) is the one that should take precedence.

In two separate legal filings Nov. 6, the Authority made its case for the Supreme Court to grant the "writs of certiorari" that the Authority and the federal government have both requested to re-examine a Fifth Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals opinion that had struck down the constitutionality of HISA's enforcement provisions.

One of the Authority's Wednesday filings involved a different lawsuit out of the Sixth Circuit, in which the states of Oklahoma, West Virginia and Louisiana are the entities asking for the Supreme Court to intervene.

Those two cases--plus a third one out of the Eighth Circuit--are similar in nature in that they all want clarification on whether HISA is constitutional.

But they differ on details, such as which party is making its plea for the Supreme Court's attention and exactly which legal questions the Supreme Court should rule on.

"Beside this [Sixth Circuit] rehearing petition, the Court now has before it certiorari petitions from the Fifth and Eighth Circuit cases presenting the same question regarding the facial constitutionality of HISA's enforcement provisions," stated the HISA Authority's response to the Sixth Circuit petition backed by Oklahoma, West Virginia and Louisiana. *Cont.*

"Although the Authority welcomes consideration of that question presented through any of the three cases, the petitions filed by the Authority and the Solicitor General in [the NHBPA case] present the best vehicle for resolving it," the filing continued. "Granting [the Fifth Circuit] petitions would allow for direct review of the reasoning of the only court of appeals that has held the Act facially unconstitutional."

Although the NHBPA and the HISA Authority are at odds over whether the federal law that regulates the sport is constitutional, both organizations have stated for months now in

court filings and media interviews that the Supreme Court needs to be the entity that resolves the current "circuit split" in which different U.S. appeals courts have issued conflicting opinions.

How the Supreme Court will handle the multiple cases filed by different petitioners is a legal hurdle that first must be cleared before the Supreme Court makes any decision on HISA's constitutionality.

The Supreme Court could

choose to individually hear (or deny hearing) any of the HISA constitutionality cases. Or, if it deems the questions of law are similar, the Supreme Court could decide to combine or consolidate them into one larger case and come up with one common judgment that addresses all of the issues that have been raised.

A Fifth Circuit appeals court panel opined July 5, 2024, that even though HISA's rulemaking structure is constitutional, HISA's enforcement provisions are unconstitutional.

A Sixth Circuit appeals court panel opined in a different case Mar. 3, 2023 that Congressional changes to the law in 2022 made all of HISA completely constitutional. The plaintiffs in that case already once asked the Supreme Court to hear the case, but were denied on June 24, 2024. Then, after the Fifth Circuit opinion was issued, creating a circuit split of differing opinions at the appeals court level, the Sixth Circuit plaintiffs on July 18 asked the Supreme Court to reconsider hearing the case.

Separately, a group of plaintiffs led by Bill Walmsley, the president of the Arkansas HBPA, and Jon Moss, the executive director of the Iowa HBPA, on Oct. 15, 2024 filed a writ of certiorari in a different case asking the Supreme Court to review judgment by the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit. That Eighth Circuit opinion had affirmed a ruling out of a lower federal court in Arkansas denying a preliminary injunction the horsemen had sought to halt HISA and its Anti-Doping and Medication Control program.

The Fifth, Sixth and Eighth Circuit appeals courts have all agreed that HISA's rulemaking structure is constitutional. Only the Fifth Circuit has disagreed, in part, by opining that HISA's enforcement provisions are unconstitutional.

"The Court should grant the petitions [in the Fifth Circuit case] and hold the petition in this [Sixth Circuit] case pending

> resolution of the merits in those cases," the Authority's Sixth Circuit filing stated.

> The three states in the Sixth Circuit case disagreed with this line of reasoning when they filed their July 18 petition for rehearing. They wanted their writ of certiorari acted upon ahead of any others.

"This case also presents a clean vehicle to resolve the constitutional question," the three states had argued. "There is a threshold jurisdictional issue in the Fifth Circuit case concerning the finality of the district court's decision which could prevent this Court

from reaching the merits. And a similar challenge to the constitutionality of HISA [that was at the time] pending in the Eighth Circuit arises in an interlocutory posture. This [Sixth Circuit] case, by contrast, cleanly presents the constitutional question after a final judgment on the merits without any complicating vehicle issues."

The Authority's Nov. 6 filing relating to the Sixth Circuit writ offered an alternative.

"If the Court does grant certiorari in [the Sixth Circuit] case, it should reformulate the question presented to limit its review to the only issue on which the courts of appeals are divided: whether HISA's enforcement provisions are facially unconstitutional under the private-nondelegation doctrine," the Authority's filing stated.

A separate Nov. 6 reply brief filed in the Authority's case out of the Fifth Circuit stated that, "The case for this Court's review is about as clear as it gets.... The only remaining point of dispute [is] whether to inject additional constitutional claims the lower courts have rejected uniformly [and] there is no need to complicate this case by incorporating those peripheral issues."

The Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.) recognized the top Thoroughbreds at the 2024 Dutta Corp United States Eventing Association's (USEA) Young Event Horse (YEH) East Coast Championships, held Oct. 17-18, 2024, in Elkton, Maryland, at Fair Hill, the Jockey Club of America said in a Thursday press release.

Emily Bradford won the 5-year-old championship title riding her Thoroughbred mare Rose Traveler (registered as Rossie'slastdance), securing a victory over 41 other 5-year-old horses of all breeds. The pair were also awarded the T.I.P. high point Thoroughbred award. Rossie'slastdance, who was unraced, is a 2019 bay mare by War Dancer.

Margaret Goodale claimed the T.I.P. high point Thoroughbred title in the 4-year-old division on Ema Klugman's Thoroughbred gelding Wood's Hole. Her mount is registered with The Jockey Club as Super Salvatore--a gelding by Super Saver--who raced twice as a juvenile for owner Bloom Racing Stable LLC (Jeffrey Bloom).

The YEH championships are for horses four and five. Riders are asked to compete in three sections: Dressage, Conformation/ Type, and Jumping Test/Gallop/General Impression.

Walden, who has served as the RTCA National President for six of the last seven years, was named the RTCA 2024 Community Service Award recipient. Among his other efforts, he was instrumental in establishing both the first full-time chaplain at Churchill Downs and the permanent chapel on the backstretch. The awards presentation featured tributes from Chaplain Humberto Chavez from New York, Chaplain John Shumaker from Turf Paradise and Arapahoe Park, RTCA Board Vice President Corey Johnsen, and a video message from Hall of Fame Jockey Pat Day.

Butler was honored with the 2024 RTCA White Horse Award after defusing a dangerous situation at Fonner Park Mar. 3. With horses and jockeys down after clipping heels during a race, he sacrificed his own safety to keep a horse running the wrong way from colliding with the field and endangering the stricken riders and horses further. When he awoke in the hospital, his first thought was for his pony, who lost his life.

"I was doing my job and we were doing the best that we could to prevent worse things happening," said Butler in a moving video.

CONSTITUTION'S ADMIRAL DENNIS EARNS 'RISING STAR' TAG IN CHURCHILL FINALE

Downs Sept. 19, ran to the money as the 3-5 choice with a **'TDN Rising Star'** performance for trainer Brad Cox in the Churchill Downs nightcap Thursday.

Drawn widest of all in post nine, the \$425,000 Keeneland September yearling graduate tracked the early leaders from an outside third through an opening quarter in :22.92 in the one-turn mile contest. Admiral Dennis revved up three deep with a flashy move to reach even terms on the far turn as jockey Luis Saez opted for a fresh pair of goggles.

The pacesetting **Mischievous Time** (Not This Time), however, still held a narrow advantage and turned them in. He fought on gamely along the inside down the lane, but Admiral Dennis was just getting started. Admiral Dennis hit the front in deep stretch and powered clear from there to win going away by 3 1/2 lengths. Mischievous Time was second.

Admiral Dennis, featured in these same pages in a 'Second Chances column' on Sept. 26, becomes the 12th 'Rising Star' for Constitution.

The Albaugh Family Stables colorbearer is the first foal out of the stakes-winning Gulf Coast, who hails from the extended female family of the legendary A.P. Indy. 
